2008 WOMEN'S SOCCER OUTLOOK

nly one year removed from their 2006 SEC Tournament Championship, the Wildcats are looking to return to form after a first round exit in the 2007 SEC Tournament. The Cats will be looking to contend not only in the SEC, but also nationally as they vie for their eighth appearance in the NCAA Tournament. After losing six seniors off last year's team, Coach Warren Lipka will look to the returning players to lead them to victory in 2008.

Coming off a season, which saw UK finish their last five SEC games with four wins and a tie, the Wildcats look to improve on their late season success heading into the 2008 fall season. The 2007 season ended with a loss to the Flori-

da Gators, the eventual SEC Tournament and regular season champions, in the first round of the SEC Tournament. Finishing with a record of 10-7-3 and eighth in the always competitive SEC, the Cats will need to be prepared mentally and physically from the beginning of the season to the end. With a record of 2-1-2 in the spring season, and wins over Morehead State and Charlotte, UK was able to gain valuable experience and playing time for some of its younger players. The strong showing by the Wildcats in the spring has 17th year head coach Warren Lipka positive that the 2008 squad will be able to compete regionally as well as nationally.

"Our expectations every year are to try to win our conference. If you win your conference or are in the top four of the SEC, you are going to go to the NCAA Tournament," Lipka said. "We haven't won an NCAA game here yet and our players want to play beyond November. I think having a young team gives you more of a desire to want to play far into the NCAA Tournament. We have an opportunity with the athleticism we have to do some good things this year."

In order to return to the NCAA tournament the Wildcats will rely heavily offensively on forward Giuleana Lopez, who was the leading goal scorer on the 2006 SEC Championship team. Lopez is returning from an ACL injury that kept her out of all of the 2007 season. The improvement of the mid-field during the spring season was also a key building block for a successful fall campaign. "I think that this spring has been good for Rachel Ulrich and Nicola Holdsworth," said Lipka. "Those two have come off of playing partially by starting some games and coming off the bench in others. Rachel is coming off of two torn ACLs and she is stronger than she has ever been. It has taken her over a year to get healthy. They had a great spring season and I look for them to compete for playing time in the fall."

However in order to be successful the Wildcats will need to fill the voids left by the graduating class.

"That senior group took us to an SEC Championship and a NCAA berth the year before. I think everything fell into place for them and I think last year was kind of a tough year for them to go out. But I think what we lose with those players is experienced players at certain spots on the field, because the majority of those seniors did play a lot," Lipka said.

The positions left by the departed seniors look to be filled by younger players and there's always the possibility of a few position changes.

"We are looking to put Katie Fahey into the middle of the midfield. She was a center back with Kate Hughes, but I think Katie can be very effective as a defensive midfielder because she is so dominant in the air and she is a tough tackler and can really destroy some things in the middle of the field for us," noted Lipka. Lipka also believes that the freshman class will provide some immediate impact players, who will help fill the void left by the departed seniors.

"Any of the freshmen can step up because they all have the athleticism to play and the body make-up to compete right away. They are physically solid players, so it is a matter of their confidence level and their mentality with battling with the returning players everyday. I feel it's a good freshman class coming in. Each of them can play at this level, it is just a matter of who can mentally overcome the battles and the fatigue when we come into preseason."

Lipka expects goalkeeper Laura Burton, forwards Emily Rogers and Ashley James as well as multi-dimensional player Jenna Goblirsch, the 2008 Kentucky State Player of the Year, all to be the main freshmen competing for playing time during preseason.

The teaming of young fresh legs with an experienced defense has Coach Lipka's expectations higher than ever before. By setting the goals higher than ones in previous years, the 2008 Wildcats will have to be mentally prepared, as well as physically, to compete in their brutal nonconference schedule as well as during SEC play.


GOALKEEPERS

One position that won't be lacking on the depth chart will be goalkeeper. Kentucky returns two sophomores, Sydney Hiance and Laura Baker, from last year's squad that saw time in the net. Kentucky also picked up a heralded recruit, Laura Burton, who will be looking to compete for playing time as a freshman. All three players might see time in goal throughout the season.

Baker began the 2007 season as the starter in goal, but a knee injury cut her season short after six games. The 6-0 redshirt sophomore had a stellar season before her injury, recording a 0.58 goals against average (GAA), three shutouts and a 4-0-1 record.

Hiance replaced Baker in the net following the injury and performed well during the season, recording four shutouts while leading the Wildcats through the SEC schedule. She was an integral part of Kentucky's late season surge into the SEC Tournament capped by a 1-0 tournament clinching shutout of Vanderbilt in the final game of the season.

"We were planning on red-shirting Syd, but we were obviously forced into playing her because of Laura's injury," said Lipka. "She gained a lot of experience because she was thrown into SEC play as a freshman and that is

a tough thing to handle. I think she did a great job. She made her mistakes, but that has to be expected from a freshman goalkeeper. However, towards the end of the season, Sydney was playing very, very well."

Also competing for time in the net will be freshman Laura Burton.

"Laura is going to put a lot of pressure on our veteran keepers. She was an ODP Northern California regional goalkeeper. She played on a very successful club team out of Northern California and has been around a lot of top players, so I think she could have an immediate impact," Lipka said.

DEFENDERS

With all starters returning from the 2007 season, the defensive backline will again be the strength of the Wildcats this year. Holding opponents last year to a 1.10 GAA, the defensive line will look to improve that number through their experience and cohesiveness.

"I don't know how many coaches have said that defense wins championships and offense is entertainment," said Lipka. "It's so crucial in women's soccer that you have a solid goalkeeper and a good back line because it makes or breaks the game."

With a defensive line and a seasoned goalkeeper in second year starter, Sydney Hiance, the Wildcats will have those two crucial ingredients when the season kicks-off in late August. "The players that have a lot of experience are our back four," said Lipka. "They have been together for over two years now. I think that the strength of our team is going to be our goalkeeping and our back four."

The returning tandem of Julie Hull, Katie Fahey, Kate Hughes and Tara Herold will try to prevent oncoming attackers from getting shots. The defensive group which has been together for two years now under the tutelage of coach Lipka's defensive scheme looks to be the center piece of the team.

MIDFIELDERS

The main concern for Coach Lipka going into the spring was solved through the play of team captain Kristin Kover, junior Rachel Ulrich and senior Nicola Holdsworth. This group, which last year combined for 13 starts and three goals, should improve their stats due to increased playing time and experience that they gained during the spring season.

Lipka will need them to answer the call this fall after losing key senior midfielders; Sarah Gaunt, Kelsey Fenix and Megan Jones. Last year Jones and Gaunt started every game, while Fenix started 14 games and recorded two goals and an assist. However, help might be found with in-coming freshman, Adrianna Gallo. Gallo a native of Canada, played mostly forward prior to her arrival at Kentucky, but is likely to see time at midfield.

FORWARDS

One of the forward positions will most likely be filled by 2006 Freshman All-American Giuleana Lopez, who missed last season due to injury. Lopez, who recorded ten goals and five assists while starting every game in 2006, was a main reason why the Wildcats took home the 2006 SEC Tournament Championship. Her return is extremely important as it will take pressure off of other players to produce goals.

"I think with Giuleana being on the field it will allow our other goal scorers to have opportunities because the opposing defense will be focused on Giuleana and trying to prevent her from scoring," said Lipka.

Her return as well as the development of Laura Novikoff, Alicia Browning and Stefani Kildare during the spring season will give the Wildcats another solid area that will improve with the addition of the freshmen.

Freshmen looking to have an impact on the season will be Kentucky State Player of the Year, Jenna Goblirsch, as well as Ashley James and Kiondra McGee. All three players bring speed and ball-striking abilities that will allow the Wildcats to attack the opposing defenses and take pressure off of their own defense.

SCHEDULE

The 2008 schedule will test the Wildcats like never before. With matches scheduled against 2007 Sweet-16 representatives: North Carolina, Duke, Texas and West Virginia, the Wildcats will have plenty of quality opponents going into SEC play. The team opens their season at home against Texas on Aug. 21, and will also make a trip to UNC's annual tournament, followed by a trip to Morgantown, W.Va.

"I felt last year that our non-conference schedule wasn't tough enough," noted Lipka. "We didn't prepare ourselves enough to go into conference play and I might have gone over the deep end a little bit with the scheduling this year, but I think our players can compete at that level."

The battle tested Cats will then head into conference play where they have home dates this season against Auburn, Alabama, South Carolina, Florida and Mississippi State.

Senior night will conclude UK's regular season on Oct. 31 against Vanderbilt.

The stage will be set as the Wildcats make a bid to become the only school to qualify for its 16th straight SEC Tournament held in Orange Beach, Ala.

Interviews with Coach Warren Lipka, his staff and student-athletes will be available following the match after a 10-minute cooling off period. Media members wishing to interview coaches or any players other than on the day of a match should set up an appropriate interview time through John Hayden in the UK Media Relations Department. The best time to reach the coaching staff is 9 a.m. to noon ET, Monday through Friday. The best time to speak with the student-athletes is after practice during the week. Practice is usually 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. ET at the UK Soccer Complex. All interviews during the week must take place 30 minutes prior to the start of practice or immediately following practice.

17TH SEASON AS HEAD COACH WARREN LIPKA

The 2008 campaign marks the 17th women's soccer season at the University of Kentucky, and head coach Warren Lipka has been at the helm of the program every year since its inception in 1992. One of the pioneers responsible for the dawn of women's soccer as a varsity sport at UK, Lipka has ascended the program from club team status to its current level of national prominence.

Leading the Wildcats to their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance and the SEC Championship in 1995, he was awarded the 1995 SEC Coach of the Year, an honor he would repeat in 1999 and again in 2006. Lipka was also named the 1999 Great Lakes Region Coach of the Year as he led the Cats to a 16-3-2 record, the best record in school history. Now in his 17th season, Lipka has guided the Cats to the NCAA tournament seven times, including the most recent trip to the "Big Dance" in 2006.

Lipka, who holds a USSF "A" license, (the highest license in the federation) and the National Soccer Coaches Association premiere badge, started his college-coaching career as an assistant coach for the UK men's soccer team in 1991. He became the first coach of the UK women's soccer team when the program started in the fall of 1992 and currently holds a 177-127-28 overall record.

Lipka's first band of Cats finished 8-10-1 but the program has steadily improved. In 1995, the Cats posted a 17-7 record en route to the SEC Championship. UK reeled off 15 consecutive victories during the 1999 season as the Wildcats marched to a 16-3-2 record, the best overall record in school history.

While Lipka's teams have gained much success, so have his players. In his 16 years at the helm of the Wildcats, Lipka has coached 15 All-Great Lakes Region players (total of 30 selections), 20 All-SEC players (33 selections), 83 SEC Academic Honor Roll members (170 times), three Soccer Buzz All-Americans (Anne Ogundele, 2006; Allison Peppers, 1999; Keri Boyce, 1999) two NSCAA All-America selections (Anne Ogundele, 2006; Allison Peppers, 1999) and an SEC Women's Soccer Player of the Year (Kerri Landrum, 1995). Last season, the Wildcats landed an SEC best 18 student-athletes on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Lipka arrived in Lexington straight from the professional ranks. From 1989 to 1991, Lipka served as general manager and head coach of the Indiana Kick of the National Professional Soccer League. Before being a professional administrator, Lipka played professionally for the Ft. Wayne (Ind.) Flames of the American Indoor Soccer Association (1986-89). With the Flames, Lipka earned Most Valuable Player honors in 1987 and 1988. Lipka finished his playing career in 1991 with the Detroit Rockers in the NPSL, where he was an All-Star selection.

While playing professionally, Lipka helped coach the Bishop Dwenger High School soccer team in Ft. Wayne (1987-90) and was the head coach of the women's soccer team at Tri-State University (1989).

Making a name for himself in his native St. Louis, Mo., as a high school Parade All-American, Lipka made his mark in college as an All-America goalkeeper at the University of South Carolina. He earned *Soccer America* All-America honors in 1985 along with winning the adidas College Goalkeeper of the Year Award.

In 1986, he played in the United States Olympic Festival, and was part of the 1987 U.S. National Team Pool. At USC, Lipka received a Bachelor of Science degree in Hotel/Restaurant Management.

In the summer of 2003, Lipka took his coaching talents to the international level, serving as the goalkeeper coach for the U.S. Under-19 and Under-21 National Women's Soccer Teams. Under Lipka's tutelage, the Under-21 team allowed only two goals in four matches, leading Team USA to its fifth Nordic Cup Championship in as many years.

Furthermore, Lipka has been involved with developing Kentucky youth soccer. He has been a member of the coaching staff for the Region II Olympic Development Program and has also been director of coaching for the Kentucky Kickers Soccer Club, an advance staff coach for Joe Machnik's Number One Goalkeeping Camp. In addition, Lipka serves as the Camp Director for UK's Winter, Spring Break and Summer Camps.

Lipka, 43, has two sons: Warren Christopher (23) and Joshua Michael (19).

UK SOCCER AROUND THE WORLD

uring the summers of 2003 and 2004, UK Head Coach Warren Lipka took his coaching talents to the international stage, coaching a pair of U.S. National women's soccer teams.

Lipka led the U.S. Under-19 team to a berth in the 2004 FIFA Under-19 Women's World



Championships later that fall in Thailand by way of victories over the Dominican Republic and Trinidad and Tobago and a tie against Costa Rica.

In 2003, Lipka traveled with the U.S. Under-19 team to Germany and The Netherlands in June and headed back to Europe in July as the U.S. Under-21 team battled more rigorous European competition in the Nordic Cup.

Coaching in a tournament widely regarded as the top international competition for Under-21

women, Lipka's experience as a goaltender and his expertise at the position proved extremely beneficial to American goalkeepers Nicole Barnhart and Ashlyn Harris. In a four-match stretch of goaltending excellence, Barnhart and Harris shut-out host Denmark and Iceland and allowed one goal each in matches against Norway and Sweden to capture the fifth-consecutive Nordic Cup Crown for the United States.

Coach Lipka traveled with the United States Under-19 National Team to Germany and Holland.



2ND SEASON AS ASSISTANT COACH MATT KELLOGG

A ssistant coach Matt Kellogg is in his second season as an assistant on the UK coaching staff.

In addition to training the Cats on the field, Kellogg is in charge of video analysis and team academics as well as everyday operation of the office.

"I am excited for this upcoming season because we have put a lot of work into this team," said Kellogg. "Going into the preseason I feel more focused on the task at hand. I think this season we have a great blend of veteran leadership and incoming talent. Combined with the athleticism of the newcomers, the sky is the limit for this squad."

Prior to his arrival in the Commonwealth, Kellogg spent two seasons as an assistant at Western Michigan. He also worked with the Broncos' men's and women's teams on a volunteer basis in 2004 and played a key role in the program's summer camps for two years.

"I think Matt will continue to do a tremendous job training our team," said Wildcat head coach Warren Lipka. "He has also assumed a bigger role in the area of recruiting and the day-to-day operation of our soccer program. His hard work off the field will show in our success on the field." Kellogg had an active offseason as he was on staff for the 1991 Kentucky ODP state team, as well as the 1993 Region II ODP team.

Kellogg was heavily involved in the west Michigan soccer community for several years. He held coaching positions with the Michigan Olympic Development Program, Kalamazoo Kingdom and Plainwell High School. He also served as an assistant coach for the 1989 birth-year ODP class, who he helped lead to the 2006 ODP regional championship as well as a third place finished at the 2007 ODP National Championship. He also spent the summer of 2007 with the 1994 birth-year Michigan ODP class.

Kellogg served as the head women's coach at Kalamazoo College in 2003. Eight of the student-athletes he recruited went on to earn all-conference accolades.

A native of East Lansing, Mich., Kellogg was a member of the men's soccer team (1996-98) at Butler University, where he graduated with a degree in marketing in 2000. He also earned a master's in sports administration from WMU in 2005.

Additionally, he is a member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and holds a National "C" License.



1ST SEASON AS ASSISTANT COACH TIFFANY GROENE

ssistant coach Tiffany Groene (pronounced GROW-knee) is making her first venture into the world of Southeastern Conference soccer as she joined the Wildcat coaching staff in June.

"I'm very excited to be joining such a well established program and having the opportunity to work under Warren Lipka," said Groene. "The University of Kentucky has a history of success and is a part of a great conference. I'm very honored and happy to be a part of it."

Groene comes to Lexington after working two seasons as a graduate assistant coach at Columbus State in Columbus, Ga., where she helped lead the Cougars to back-to-back Peach Belt Conference championships, conference tournament championships and NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2007, CSU posted a 20-3-2 record and was a lost shootout away from a spot in the NCAA Division II Final Four.

While at Columbus State, Groene worked with the goalkeepers as well as serving as the strength and conditioning coach, focusing on speed and agility.

"We were able to attract another highly talented coach to take care of our goalkeeping crew," said Lipka. "Tiffany not only has coaching experience, but extensive playing experience as well. She holds all the goalkeeping records at (her alma mater) Eastern Illinois and then helped coach Columbus State deep into the NCAA Tournament. She'll be a great role model for our players now and in the future."

Prior to her coaching career, she was the starting goalkeeper at Eastern Illinois University for four years, in which the Panthers made four consecutive appearances in the "College Cup" Division I tournament.

Groene was selected as an OVC all-conference goalkeeper, OVC alltournament team, and finished her career as the record holder for Eastern and OVC in shutouts. She also holds the EIU record in minutes played in the goal, and most saves in a game. Groene coached club soccer for three years in the Chicagoland area, and was the assistant coach at Rockford Guilford High School.

A four-sport athlete in high school (volleyball, basketball, synchronized swimming, and soccer), she holds the record for the most varsity letters earned by a female athlete. She was selected all-conference in volleyball, basketball, and soccer (all-sectional soccer also).

Groene received her bachelor's degree in psychology with a minor in art from Eastern Illinois University and obtained her masters degree in public administration at Columbus State.

She has also obtained her 'D' coaching license, as well as state and regional goalkeeping licenses.

2007 SEASON IN REVIEW

fter a surprising run to become the Southeastern Conference runner-ups in 2006, the University of Kentucky women's soccer program came into the 2007 season as a marked threat. In what could be described as a roller coaster of a season, there were many highs and lows for the Wildcats.

The lows began immediately when head coach Warren Lipka and the Cats learned that 2006 Freshman All-American Giuleana Lopez would not be with them for the entirety of the '07 campain. Lopez was recovering from offseason surgery on her knee.

However, inspired but their immediate challenge, UK posted an eight-game undefeated streak to start the season, going 6-0-2 prior to the start of Southeastern Conference play. The streak marked the third longest unbeaten streak in Wildcat history.

KELSEY FENIX

As was the case in the 2006 season, UK rode a strong defense and remarkable goalkeeping in their early season run. Posting a miniscule 0.46 goals against average in non-conference play, Kentucky entered SEC play with thoughts of another strong showing in their head; then came the lows.

What was originally a season of promise and high expectations quickly took a turn for the worst. Starting keeper Laura Baker was sidelined with a knee injury and the Wildcats dropped their first six matches in league play, four of which were by a mere goal. On top of the losing streak, the team was piling up injuries at a staggering pace and suddenly Kentucky's SEC record 14 consecutive SEC Tournament appearances was in jeopardy.

After starting the SEC slate 0-6, the Wildcats welcomed the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks to Lexington and after 90 minutes of play and two converted penalty kicks, Kentucky had come away with its first win in league play in the shape of a 2-1 victory. And then something happened...momentum started to form and the highs were back. Following the win over Arkansas, the Wildcats forged a 1-1 tie with the 24th ranked LSU Tigers.

Wins over Mississippi State and Ole Miss brought the Cats into its season finale at Vanderbilt needing a win to clinch its 15th straight SEC Tournament berth. Kentucky went back to its bread and butter, a large dose of hard-nosed defense and solid goalkeeping. The Wildcats turned away 22 Vanderbilt shots and senior Megan Jones, UK's offensive hero in the 2006 SEC Tournament, claimed her first goal of the season 23 minutes into the match, and the Cats came away with a 1-0 victory.

Over the five-game stretch, freshman goalie Sydney Hiance came into her own and recorded a miniscule 0.77 goals against average in helping the Cats reach Orance Beach.

In addition to clinching their SEC Tournament berth, Kentucky's win against Vanderbilt, was its 10th win of the season, marking the 10th time in program history the Wildcats have posted a 10-win season.

"This team showed a lot of character to end the season," said head coach Warren Lipka. "To come from being 0-6 in the conference and go on the road and do it the way we did to make the tournament makes us very happy. As a coach, you always want more, but this certainly is something to build on and a learning experience for our younger players."

Not to be lost in the excitement of the furious late season rally, were the Wildcats many accolades, both on and off the field. Senior captain Kelsey Fenix was voted first team All-SEC,



by league coaches. Fenix, a senior from Westlake, Ohio, battled through an injury plagued senior season and finished with two goals and an assist, including the game-winning goal against the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks. The Wildcats posted a 10-2-2 record in games where Fenix saw action, and they were 0-4-1 in games without her.

In addition to her All-SEC honor, Fenix was named to the SEC Good Works team as well as being named an *ESPN The Magazine* Second Team Academic All-District performer. Joining her, were sophomore defender Julie Hull (second team) and senior midfielder Sarah Gaunt (third team).

Additionally Hull was placed on the Soccerbuzz Second Team All-Region team.

The best women's soccer teams in the Southeastern Conference travel to the beach each year to battle it out for the top spot in the league tournament. This November, the site of the always-competitive event will once again be in Orange Beach, Ala., at the Orange Beach SportsPlex.

2008 marks the fifth year Orange Beach has been the site of the SEC Women's Soccer Tournament. With average temperatures

bordering 65 degrees in November, the Orange Beach Soccer Complex places itself at the fore front of host sites for collegiate soccer conference tournaments.

Teams that qualify for the post season tournament are put up in condos on the beach while enjoying some of the best cuisine the South has to offer. Being a neutral host also allows the city of Orange Beach an opportunity to boast that they are the only neutral site host to a conference tournament in women's DI soccer.

The top eight teams in the conference with the best regular season records will face off in Orange Beach for a chance to advance to the NCAA Tournament. First round games begin on Thursday, leading up to the championship game on Sunday, which will be televised by Fox Sports South.



The Kentucky Wildcats are the only school in SEC history that has advanced to every SEC Tournament since the sports inception in 1993. The Wildcats won the tournament in 1995 and 2006 (below).



UK IN THE POST SEASON 2008 SEC BRACKET AND RECORDS

UK has enjoyed success in the postseason since the program's inception in 1992. Kentucky is the only team in the Southeastern Conference to qualify for the postseason tournament every season since the 12-team league sanctioned women's soccer in 1993.

In 1995, the SEC championship found its home in the Bluegrass as Coach Warren Lipka and the Cats capped off a 14-6-0 regular season by winning three straight matches to claim the conference crown.

Kentucky's quest for the title was complete with a 2-1 win over Alabama in the finals after defeating LSU, 4-0, and blanking Vanderbilt, 1-0, in Auburn, Ala. It took the Cats just four years to be tabbed the SEC's champions and Coach Warren Lipka earned his first of three (1995, 1999 and 2006) SEC Coach of the Year honors for UK's accomplishments. In 1997, 1998, 2001 and 2002, the Wildcats came within one game of once again playing for the championship, advancing to the semifinals of the SEC Tournament.

UK found its way back to the league's final game in 2006, claiming the SEC Tournament championship with a 2-1 upset of the 12th ranked Florida Gators.

The Wildcats opened the tournament with an exciting 3-2 first round victory over Ole Miss, a team the Cats played to a 0-0 tie earlier in the season. After neither team could strike for a goal in 110 minutes in Oxford, Miss. in October, the two combined for four goals in the first half. UK broke the 2-2 tie nearly 12 minutes into the second half and held on for the victory.

Awaiting Kentucky in the semifinals was 20th ranked Tennessee, a team Kentucky dispatched of 1-0 in Knoxville in the regular season. The Wildcats continued their defensive prowess, shutting out the Lady Volunteers for a second consecutive time and scored two secondhalf goals en route to the upset and a berth in the Sunday finals.

Kentucky struck early against the Gators scoring a goal nearly seven minutes into the match. Florida tied the game just before the half, but a Wildcat goal nearly two minutes into the second frame and stellar defense down the stretch earned the Cats their second tournament championship and the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The Cats have earned berths into the NCAA Tournament in five of the last 10 seasons, but are still searching for the program's first victory in the "Big Dance".

The Southeastern Conference has continued its rise as one of the top conferences in women's soccer.

The 2007 women's soccer season reaffirmed the SEC's prominence in the country. Six teams from the SEC were invited to the NCAA Tournament. Auburn, Florida, Georgia, LSU, South Carolina and Tennessee all made the 64-team field. The six teams combined for a record of 5-5-2 with both the Gators and Lady Vols advancing to the third round. The SEC now has a 41-47-8 (.469) NCAA Tournament record in 50 appearances.

SEC women's soccer will begin its 16th season in the year of 2008 deeply rooted in the national scene of collegiate soccer. Since the SEC initiated women's soccer as a varsity sport in 1993, the sport's popularity has grown through the country and especially in the Southeast. A definitive point in the SEC's women's soccer success came in 1995 when FOX Sports South broadcasted the SEC Tournament Championship match between Alabama and Kentucky on a tape-delayed basis, signifying the first appearance of an SEC women's soccer match on television. Southeastern Conference women's soccer continued to grow over the next couple of years as the conference made a name for itself nationally. In 1998, the SEC had its breakout season with Florida winning the conference's first NCAA title in women's soccer in just the program's fourth year of existence. The league led the nation with six NCAA Tournament teams that year, an accomplishment which firmly inserted the SEC as one the major conferences in women's soccer. The SEC also made bigger strides in its television coverage with three regular season matches and the SEC Tournament championship match shown live on the SEC-TV package. In 2007, SEC-TV's women's soccer coverage was four regular-season matches, in addition to the SEC Tournament championship match. That incremental growth combined with increasing exposure on the national and regional scene has SEC women's soccer looking to blossom to new heights in the year 2008 and beyond.

NOTES

• Florida's Stacy Bishop was named an NSCAA Scholar All-American. The SEC had seven schools receive NSCAA/adidas College Team Academic Awards (teams which maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher) - Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky and Vanderbilt.

• Florida's Melanie Booth and Georgia's Carrie Patterson were named Second Team All-America by the NSCAA in 2007 and Florida's Lauren Hyde and Tennessee's Jaimel Johnson were selected Third Team NSCAA All-Americans. The SEC placed six athletes on Soccer Buzz All-America teams. Booth and Patterson were second team members, while Kylee Rossi of Tennessee earned the lone third team honor. Bishop, Johnson and Blakely Mattern of South Carolina were fourth team selections.

• The Southeastern Conference placed 17 players on NSCAA All-Region squads. The SEC placed six athletes on first teams, five on second teams and six on a third team. LSU teammates Michelle Makasini and Malorie Rutledge were named to the Central Region first team. Florida teammates Melanie Booth and Lauren Hyde along with Georgia's Carrie Patterson and Tennessee's Jaimel Johnson were all named to the Southeast Region's first team.

 The SEC placed five players on the Soccer Buzz Freshman All-America team. Georgia's Kelli Corless was a first team pick. Georgia's Caroline Simpson, LSU's Taryne Boudreau and South Carolina's Brittiny Rhoades were third team members. Dani Abelson of Georgia was a fourth team choice. Corless was also a Soccer America First Team All-Freshman Team selection.

• The SEC has had at least two teams advance to postseason play for 12 of the last 13 years. Ten of the league's teams (Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU, Ole Miss, South Carolina, Tennessee and Vanderbilt) have made at least one NCAA Tournament appearance since 1994. Six teams (Auburn, Florida, Georgia, LSU, South Carolina and Tennessee) advanced to the 2007 NCAA Tournament.

• The SEC also had four CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-Americans, 12 Top Drawer National Team of the Season members and three Top Drawer All-Rookie Team selections.





ee T. Todd, Jr. became the 11th president of the University of Kentucky on July 1, 2001, after serving as senior vice president of IBM's Lotus Development Corp. President Todd is the sixth UK alumnus to

hold the presidency.

President Todd has concentrated his efforts and energies on helping his alma mater achieve a greater level of national prominence. He launched the University of Kentucky's Top 20 Business Plan in December 2005. The plan is a quantitative analysis highlighting what it will take for UK to achieve its state-mandated goal of building a Top 20 public research university. Widely hailed as the first business plan by a public university in the nation, UK's plan garnered widespread national attention. It has been featured by national media outlets and recognized by peer institutions, as several higher education leaders have visited UK's campus to learn more about the Business Plan approach.

He continues to champion UK's outreach efforts. President Todd launched a university-

funded research program called the Commonwealth Collaboratives. The initiative features 36 of UK's top research teams, who are focused on solving the intrinsic problems that have held the state back from reaching its full potential. It is part of UK's effort to ensure that its research hits the ground in Kentucky and changes lives throughout the Commonwealth.

President Todd has spearheaded an effort to revitalize health care in Kentucky. In June 2006, UK unveiled the Commonwealth's Medical Campus of the Future, a multi-phased project aimed at providing Kentuckians with cuttingedge, 21st century health care. As part of the revamped academic medical campus, UK will construct a new, one million square foot University of Kentucky Albert B. Chandler Hospital and a new College of Pharmacy.

President Todd is currently a member of the Board of Directors and Vice Chair of the Executive Committee for the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASUL-GC). He is President of the Southeastern Conference (SEC) Executive Committee. President Todd serves on the Equitable Resources Board of Directors and is chair of the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education's STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) Task Force. He is chair of the National Consortium for Continuous Improvement in Higher Education's (NCCI) Leveraging Excellence Award selection panel. President Todd also is a member of the Business Higher Education Forum and the Council on Competitiveness.

He is married to the former Patricia Brantley, a UK graduate who earned her master's degree from Simmons College in Boston. They have two adult children, UK graduates Troy and Kathryn.

MITCH BARNHART, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



Minhart is in his seventh year as Director of Athletics for the University of Kentucky, having set a clear course for making Kentucky one of the top athletics programs in the country. Hired July 15, 2002,

Barnhart has made the desire for overall excellence the cornerstone of Wildcat Athletics. His decision to fully fund all 22 varsity sports has produced a wave of firsts in a number of programs, while also allowing UK to achieve at a consistently high level.

Numerous sports have reached never-beforeseen levels of success. Baseball won the school's first-ever Southeastern Conference title in 2006, following in the SEC championship footsteps of women's tennis, men's golf and men's basketball from 2005. Four Wildcat coaches earned SEC Coach of the Year honors in 2005-06.

The women's soccer and rifle teams added league titles in 2006-07, with conference Coach of the Year honors going to Warren Lipka and Harry Mullins, respectively.

Perhaps the biggest on-field turnaround besides baseball has been in football, where Rich Brooks has led the Wildcats to back-to-back bowl wins (2006 and 2007) for the first time in more than 50 years. Barnhart's support of Brooks and his staff has manifested itself in a string of wins over traditional football powers, including a victory over topranked LSU in October 2007.

Financially, Barnhart instructed his staff to seek out new revenue streams, and that resulted in a record \$80 million multimedia rights agreement with Host Communications (now IMG College). The additional resources allow UK to continue its commitment to its student-athletes, a commitment Barnhart takes personally. Athletics spends \$1.5 million annually on its nationally-renowned CATS Academic Center and each spring hosts the CAT-SPYs, an awards program designed to recognize the very best in UK Athletics.

Other initiatives begun under Barnhart's leadership include the Big Blue Caravan, which connects UK to its vast fan base, the UK Athletics Hall of Fame, which honors past greats across all sports, a revamping of UK's donor program that has resulted in record K Fund dollars, and a 10-year, \$10million commitment to help fund the University's general scholarship program. UK also completed the Joe Craft Center, a \$30 million expansion of Memorial Coliseum that includes new practice and office space for a variety of sports.

Barnhart's connection to UK's student-athlete is evident by his personal interaction and commitment to provide all support services necessary to meet the needs of these students.

Barnhart arrived at Kentucky from Oregon State, where he served four successful years (1998-2002) as athletics director. Before his tenure at OSU, he worked at Tennessee for 12 years (1986-98); served as assistant executive director of the SMU Mustang Club (1983-86); regional director for the Duck Athletic Fund at Oregon (1983); and was an intern for the Aztec Athletic Foundation at San Diego State (1982-1983). Barnhart, 48, is a native of Kansas City, Kan. He received his bachelor degree from Ottawa University (Kansas) in 1981 and a masters in sports administration from Ohio University in 1982. He and his wife, the former Connie Brown, have three children, Kirby, 20, Blaire, 17, and Scott, 14.

UK SOCCER COMPLEX

The University of Kentucky is committed to providing its student-athletes with the very best in athletics facilities. The University of Kentucky Soccer Complex is evidence of that dedication.

The stadium opened October 25, 1996, christened with a 2-1 victory over Vanderbilt. The stadium itself is part of a complex that houses a game field, a practice field, locker rooms and a training room. Since its opening, the Complex has played host to some of the largest crowds to see SEC soccer action, including the 1996 SEC Tournament as well as the the 1996 NCAA Tournament.

The Wildcats enjoy a nice home-field advantage at the complex having rolled up a 66-39-10 record at the home stadium.

The facility features grandstand seating for more than 1,500 fans. However, with temporary seating, the stadium's capacity exceeds 3,000.

The grandstand also houses a spacious press box for use by the media.

The Complex features a lighted international regulation-sized playing field of lush Bermuda grass. The surface is a modified sand-based field with an in-ground irrigation system for drainage of rainwater and a sprinkler system that allows the UK grounds crew to keep the field in top playing condition throughout the year. The system makes the field safer and more playable in a rain-soaked game.

The combination of sandy soil and irrigation allows UK grounds keepers to maintain a healthy and vigorous playing surface. The field is mowed every day with a mower designed for golf fairways, which results in a field that rivals those of professional soccer.

WILLIAM T. YOUNG LIBRARY

n addition to providing the finest in athletic facilities, the University of Kentucky also provides student-athletes with the best in academic facilities. One of the most recent additions to the educational landscape at UK is the \$58 million William T. Young Library.

• **Size:** The library covers 365,350 square feet more than six football fields. The building is five stories high, plus a basement.

• **Shelf capacity:** If laid end-to-end, the bookshelf space would stretch 198,828 linear feet - that's more than 37 miles of shelf space. The shelves will house 1.2 million books.


• Seating capacity: The library can seat more than 4,000 patrons at one time, a 355 percent increase over the old library. The seating on the fifth floor of the new library equals the capacity of the former library.

• **Computer connections:** Every study table and study carrel in the library has an electrical outlet and a computer jack connected to the university's computer system. Virtually the entire library has wireless coverage.

• Flexibility: The library has a state-ofthe-art electronic infrastructure that will enable UK to take full advantage of current and emerging technology. In addition, the five floors and basement of the structure are designed as open, flexible spaces, enabling the library to adapt its services and facilities to the future changes in needs of UK students. • **Endowment:** The UK Library has the nation's largest book endowment among public universities and ranks second only to Harvard.

200 KENTUCKY WOMEN'S SOCCER OHIO CASUALTY CENTER FOR ACADEMIC

AND TUTORIAL SERVICES

The University of Kentucky has made a commitment to put the student-athlete at the heart of the program.

The cornerstone of that commitment lies in the academic success of the University's studentathletes. And at UK, that success stems from the resources within the Ohio Casualty Group's Center for Academic and Tutorial Services (CATS).

UK opened CATS in 1981, the nation's first academic center dedicated exclusively to studentathletes. Over the years, as the services offered by CATS have grown, so did the need for additional space.

As a result, UK built a new facility - the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, thanks to a one-million dollar grant from the Ohio Casualty Insurance Group. The Ohio Casualty Center opened in 1998 at a total cost of \$2.4 million.

Much of the credit for UK's academic success goes to the Athletics Association's academic support system - the Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, or simply, "CATS."

In 1981, Kentucky was the first school to open an academic center dedicated exclusively to student-athletes.

The Carol Martin Gatton Computer Center bouses 35 computer terminals. CATS also provides 800 hours of tutoring per week for student-athletes.

CATS, constructed in Memorial Coliseum, includes:

- 20,000 square feet of space more than double the size of the former CATS facility;
- a computer room housing 35 computers;
- a study area which accommodates 90-100 people;
- 24 tutoring rooms;
- a career development and life skills resource center;
- a community outreach office; and
- offices for the staff.

Certainly, a facility is a good start, but any program - especially in academics - is only as good as the people who run it. And UK is fortunate to have outstanding leaders in its academics support system.

Bob Bradley, Associate Athletics Director for Student Services, oversees the CATS program. Bradley was named National Academic Advisor of the Year in 1989 and 1992. In 2000 he was selected as the CHAMPS Life Skills Coordinator of the Year by the NCAA Division I-A Athletic Directors Association.

CATS has a full-time staff of 11. In addition to Bradley, they are:

CATS also employs seven graduate assistants and numerous tutors, both from the University and the surrounding community. UK has budgeted more than \$1,000,000 for the operation of CATS in the coming year.

"We are extremely proud of what we have accomplished in the academic arena," Bradley says. "The CATS program is focused on winning in the classroom. We look at each student-athlete's individual needs, set goals, and develop strategies to attain those goals. Our center provides our student-athletes with a definite advantage over student-athletes at many other institutions. Our goal is to show that we care about the student as well as the athlete."

For the CATS staff, showing you care means more than helping athletes maintain eligibility, graduate, or win awards. The academics staff also prepares student-athletes for life after college with the Wildcat Career Development Program.

The Career Development Program helps student-athletes look to the future through a stepby-step process which includes:

- Mentoring and internships, which help determine career interests;
- career counseling;
- resume writing; and
- forming a career plan.

The Wildcat Career Development Program works closely with the University's Career Planning and Placement Center in order to provide additional assistance when needed.

Community Cats That Care

privilege at a major university is to be a studentathlete. Among the benefits that student-athletes enjoy are significant learning experiences that teach important life lessons. None is more important than learning to return that benefit to individuals in the community that have supported and cheered the student-athlete, win or lose.

The University of Kentucky has a community outreach program that, when initiated more than 15 years ago, was intended to provide support for young people. The program was viewed as a "oneway" effort with the student-athlete giving and the community and schools receiving. But as the "Cats That Care" program has grown, one of the most notable results is what the student-athletes learn about themselves – they really do receive by giving.

The athletic department's community outreach program began in 1990 when, in cooperation with the College of Education, UK student-athletes "adopted" the fifth-grade class at a local school. The program matched UK student-athletes one-on-one with school children, who in turn, set goals while the student-athletes monitored their progress and assisted the children in achieving their stated objectives.

The program was highly successful and continues today. "Cats That Care" has expanded and now includes many worthwhile projects, including:

Celebrity Hospital Visitor

Student-athletes visit patients at local hospitals, including rehabilitation facilities and veterans hospitals.

Cats Cultivating Character

Student-athletes teach character lessons twice a month to third grade students at a local elementary school.

Mentoring

Student-athletes serve as role models for many elementary and middle school students. As a mentor, they help younger students develop self esteem and promote academic success through weekly interaction.

Hospital Breakfast with Santa

Each year, UK student-athletes assist the UK Children's Hospital with a special Christmas breakfast for children at the hospital.

Kentucky Excel Mentor Program

UK student-athletes serve as mentors for high school students participating in the program. It provides scholarships for students who complete the program.

UK Children's Hospital

Student-athletes volunteer at least once a month to play games and visit with the patients.

School Speaker

Student-athletes visit a number of local schools, speaking to children on a variety of topics, including the importance of an education, staying off drugs and promoting reading.

Boys and Girls Club

Student-athletes mentor and interact with children and young adults on a weekly basis. They also volunteer for various holiday activities, such as the "Mountain of Love."

Food Drive

Student-athletes organize a food drive that benefits God's Pantry.

Great Leaps Program

Student-athletes volunteer on a weekly basis at various elementary schools to help students become better readers.

Ronald McDonald House

Student-athletes volunteer to bake dessert items for the families staying here who have a child in the hospital. They also help clean up the ground and take time to clean the inside of the House as well.

Hope Center

The Hope Center is a shelter for men serving the Lexington-Fayette County area. Student-Athletes volunteer at least once a month to serve lunch and/or dinner to those currently staying at the center.

Salvation Army

During the holiday season student-athletes volunteer their time ringing bells for the "Red Kettle Campaign" to help raise money. Students also purchase small gifts to stuff in Christmas stockings to be distributed to local families in need.
