



"We did an analysis of goals by minute and the number of goals this team has given up in the last ten minutes of games dwarfs the amount of goals that they have scored. If late in games the other team is stronger than you, you are not fit enough. That is both physically and mentally."

In the past, Lipsitz says that it has been his teams that have scored the goals late and that is something that he will make sure continues.

"I expect to totally turn that around and that takes us knowing that we can flat out run more and harder than the other team and that we are physically stronger and able to deal with adversity better than the other team. That is really what we have been working on."

Leadership could play a factor in UK's success this season. Although, Kentucky will return a total of 17 letter winners from last season, eight of which were starters, the Wildcats only have 10 upperclassmen on the team with four seniors and six juniors. In contrast, UK has 21 underclassmen with 10 sophomores, some which have no gameday experience and 11 freshmen.

"I am a firm believer in a lot of leadership training," Lipsitz said. "If you have an older group at the same time, it can be easier to start new with a younger group who have never known another way. I don't know if there is a right or wrong, but you can find positives in both directions."

This year the upperclassmen have to learn a different style of soccer which involves taking repetitive risks even if you fail. Lipsitz said that it was a challenge to get some of the players to understand that he doesn't care if you mess up, but he wants to see if you are willing to take the risk.

"I felt like the biggest issue we had on the field (this spring) was the lack or willingness to take risks. The players are not risk takers and are concerned about making mistakes. In order to play the style that I coach, you have to be willing to make mistakes. You have to be able to play over the top and fast and take risks and play skillfully."

Lipsitz said that right when the players started to take more risks and play the style that he wants, the spring was over. He hopes the team will pick up where they left off when they hit the field for fall practice.

"The players were getting into position to do special things, and then pulling away from them because they didn't want to take the risk. I felt

that at the end of the spring we were getting to a point where they really believed I wanted them to mess up. 'Go ahead, mess up! All I want is you to take the risk to mess up.' I felt that they were really getting to that point and were right on the cusps and then the spring ended."

UTLOOK

Lipsitz says that he and his coaching staff are excited about the upcoming year, but is realistic and understands that there will be a learning curve.

"The first season is about developing a culture and a base for the team, so that as future classes come in we are ready to be nationally ranked," said Lipsitz. "I am realistic. I don't see myself measuring wins and losses as our success. Our success this year is based on how much we improve and how much our culture becomes a permanent part of our program, because I am not here to build a team, but to build a program. When you are building a program, it is not about how many games you win this year, but it is about in five, 10 or 15 years, how many championships do we win, NCAA games do we win and are we competing for a national championship? That is a long process, which has steps along the way and this season is the first step in that process."

Goalkeepers

There seems to be lots of depth at goalkeeper for Kentucky with both junior Sydney Hiance and sophomore Laura Burton returning to fight for playing time in the net for the Wildcats, but questions remain about who will step up and be not only the leader in the net, but the leader of the team.

"What we are waiting for in the goal is for someone to step up," Lipsitz said. "We have a couple of goalkeepers and we are waiting to see who has done the work over the summer and who wants to step up and become our leader."

Last year, Hiance got the bulk of the playing time for the Wildcats playing in 15 games for Kentucky gathering in 54 saves while allowing 27 goals and four shutouts. Burton, played in five games for Kentucky allowing eight goals while posting 15 saves. Combined, Kentucky allowed 35 goals posting a 1.77 goals against average with five shutouts. Burton and Hiance could share playing time again this year, although Lipsitz says at some point one is going to have to take charge over the other.

"There is only so long you can go with sharing that position. I will go as long as we need to, but in the end someone needs to put a stamp on that position and be in charge of this team. No one has done that yet. We keep asking the ques-

irst-year University of Kentucky women's soccer head coach Jon Lipsitz wants to change the culture. He wants to change the way his players think, run, walk, breathe – and most importantly – win.

After winning five games last season, the lowest win total in school history, the program could probably use a new culture. Since coming to Lexington in December, Lipsitz has changed the way the players workout, train and most importantly gel together. Coach says that he isn't for sure how different the system is from what it was before because he wasn't here, but going by what the players say it is a totally different level of expectations.

"I think that the first part of it was a real shock to their system. They talked about it being a totally different standard as far as fitness and the pace of training that we do. The first part was about seeing how they would react to that. The rest of it has been about building a culture. A culture that is based upon us being a family and a culture that is based upon us being known for our work ethic. Those are the two critical pieces and we continue to layer those things in every chance that we get and in everything that we do."

Over the last few years one of the problems that Kentucky has faced, last year especially, is giving up goals late in a game. Kentucky allowed

tion, 'who wants to be in charge of this team?' Because it has to be a goalkeeper and we are waiting to see who it is."

Defenders

Although Kentucky has a new coach and new culture being built in women's soccer, the reliance on the defensive line is something that will not change, however the players that are familiar with being back there and how they defend will change.

"We really changed the back line tremendously," Lipsitz said. "We have changed the way that they have played, and where we hold our line and how our back line shifts. As part of that, it became easy to transition some new players into the back line into a new position. I think that we have developed some exciting backs as well. I feel that our back line is going to be the core of our team and the strength of our team this year."

Last year, Kentucky was led on the defensive line by four veteran defenders, two of which are expected to be back there again this season for Kentucky in seniors Julie Hull and Katie Fahey. Hull played in 18 games for the Wildcats last season, giving the Wildcats a lethal defensive presence. Fahey, played in every game for UK giving Kentucky a versatile player that could provide defensive and offensive help.

Lipsitz and the coaching staff expect a lot of new faces on the defensive back line for Kentucky this season with six freshman coming in with defensive experience and several sophomores having played on the back line already.

Midfield

For this year's Kentucky team, the "M" in midfield might stand for mystery. Kentucky lost

all three of its main midfielders last year with Kristin Kover, Rachel Ulrich and Nicola Holdsworth all gone. Kover played in 12 games for UK last season, missing some playing time due to injuries while Holdsworth played in every game for Kentucky and was a mainstay in the middle. Lipsitz believes for Kentucky to be successful they must have a strong midfield.

The Wildcats only have a few upperclassmen with midfield experience and it is a mystery as to who will step up and be that force in the middle for UK this season.

"I felt like in the spring it was sort of by committee and we are waiting to see who really steps us and takes over," Lipsitz said. "If we are going to be successful, our midfield must come back fit and ready to play."

Forwards

The front line might be the strongest part of the field for Kentucky, at least with the players and talent that returns. Kentucky will return three of their top four goal scorers from last year with juniors Laura Novikoff and Giuleana Lopez and sophomore Jenna Goblirsch.

"I feel that on the front line we have a lot of players with tremendous potential and we are trying to convince them that they are free again to take risks and make mistakes," Lipsitz said. "Part of the mentality of a forward is to be that of a goal scoring assassin. You have to be willing to miss and miss and miss and continue to push for that one chance and that takes a lot of mental strength."

Novikoff played in 18 games for the Wildcats last season, missing one game with a broken nose. The native of Madisonville, Tenn., posted six goals and one assist for the Cats last season which was good enough for a team-high tie in points with 13.

Lopez led Kentucky in shots with 40 shots. The Beach Park, Ill., native, had four goals last season including 16 shots on goal. Lopez totaled nine points on the season for Kentucky, tied for second most on the team.

Goblirsch, who was the other player with nine points, will also be counted on to give Kentucky an offensive spark this season. The sophomore had three goals and three assists for Kentucky last year with a team high .300 shooting percentage and one game-winning goal.

Lipsitz says that he is not necessarily looking for the most talented players to be on his front line this year, but the players who have the talent and mental toughness to play in his system.

"What we are continuing to work for, and I feel that players that are most successful will do, is to fail repeatedly but understand that as long as they keep doing the work they will end up successful. We will be looking for that in preseason to see who has that type of mentality. Who has the mentality that, 'you might stop me this time, but you are not going to stop me over the course of 90 minutes.' I feel like we have a couple of players that have potential to do that and then we will piece it together after that."

Schedule

The Kentucky women's soccer team's 2009 schedule includes five conference home dates and 11 total matches at the UK Soccer Complex. The schedule will bring several challenges to an underclassmen led squad, including playing nine teams that played in the 2008 NCAA Tournament.

"Our schedule is tremendously challenging," Lipsitz said. "We start out before the SECs and we know how strong the SEC will be, with many games that are against teams that will be nationally ranked. There isn't a lull and quite honestly we don't want there to be one. My philosophy is that we need to schedule the best and as many teams as we can that will be in the NCAAs. So we can find out where we stand, because if we are not good enough to play that schedule then we need to get better and not bring our schedule down."


The Wildcats will kick off the Jon Lipsitz Era with four straight home games including the season opener on Friday, Aug. 21 against Cincinnati, followed by another home date against instate foe Louisville on Saturday, Aug. 29.

UK will also host ACC power Wake Forest on Sept. 4. The Demon Deacons finished the 2008 season ranked 24th in several polls. In addition, UK is making a trip to Austin, Texas to take on the powerhouse Texas Longhorns on Sept. 13.

The Wildcats will also host the Akron Zips as well in the UK Tournament which includes matches against Western Kentucky and Tennessee Tech.

In conference play, Kentucky is set to host Georgia, Tennessee, LSU, Arkansas and Ole Miss.

For the seventh straight season, the SEC will hold its postseason tournament in Orange Beach, Alabama. This year's tournament is scheduled for early November, running from Nov. 4-8.

Practice is usually 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. ET at the UK Soccer Complex. All interviews during the week must take place 30 minutes prior to the start of practice or immediately following practice.

FIRST SEASON AS HEAD COACH JON LIPSITZ

n Dec. 16, 2008, Jon Lipsitz became the second head women's soccer coach in University of Kentucky history. Lipsitz, who owns a career record of 101-33-8 (.739) in seven seasons, comes to Lexington after spending the last four seasons as the head coach at Charlotte where he guided the 49ers to a 58-23-4 (.706) record including three straight Atlantic 10 titles in 2006, '07 and '08. Each season, Charlotte increased their win total, going from 11 in 2005, to 13 in 2006, to 16 in 2007, to a school record 18 in 2008.

In his four seasons at Charlotte, he guided the 49ers to 34 A-10 wins with a Carolinas' Cup title, three A-10 regular season titles, two A-10 Tournament titles and two NCAA Tournament appearances. The 49ers' success on the field during Lipsitz's tenure translated into recruiting success, as well.

The two springs prior to his arrival in Lexington, he signed two of the highest-ranked recruiting classes in the program's history including the 19th ranked class in the nation according to Soccer Buzz in 2007.

While in Charlotte, he also coached seven Academic All-Americans and two athletic All-Americans. In 2007, Lipsitz was named Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year after leading the 49ers to 16 wins and a school-record nine Atlantic 10 wins en route to the program's third-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament. The 49ers captured their second straight A-10 regular season title which was the fourth regular season championship in the program's history. Charlotte also won their first A-10 Tournament Championship when they captured the title with a victory over Fordham. Lipsitz and the 49ers continued their momentum through the 2008 season where they finished with a school record 18-4-1 mark including a perfect 11-0 mark in conference play. The team won their second straight A-10 tournament title and capped the magical season with an NCAA second round appearance, defeating the Tennessee Lady Vols 2-0 in the first round. The 49ers finished the 2008 campaign ranked fifth nationally in scoring (3.00) and 19th in shutout percentage (56.5).

Before taking over the 49ers women's soccer program, Lipsitz spent four seasons (2001-04) as an assistant coach for national-power Ohio State. During his four seasons with the Buckeyes, he was the chief recruiter for a program that won 52 games, two Big Ten Tournament titles and made three straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. In 2004, Ohio State won a school-record 19 games en route to an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance. His efforts produced nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including players that earned freshman All-America honors in each of his last two seasons in Columbus.

Prior to his time at Ohio State, Lipsitz spent three seasons at NCAA Division III Denison University where he tallied a 43-10-4 record in three seasons.

No stranger to the UK women's soccer program, Lipsitz served as the Director of Coaching and Player Development for the Ohio Premier Girls' Soccer Club from 1993 to 2005, which produced former Kentucky standouts Annie Gage and Elizabeth Ramsey, as well as 2008 seniors Tara Herold and Kristin Kover.

Lipsitz has also served as a Regional Staff Coach for Region II and III Olympic Development Program, as well as the 1991 North Carolina ODP Head Coach. He holds the United States Soccer Federation "A" license.

The Chapel Hill, N.C., native graduated with a Bachelor's of Science degree in Business Administration from the University of North Carolina in 1993. He earned a Master's of Education from Ohio State in 1998.

Lipsitz and his wife, Kathryn, have two sons Zachary (12) and Max (5).

FIRST SEASON AS ASSISTANT COACH MICHELLE RAYNER

A ssistant coach Michelle Rayner is in the first year of her second stint with the UK women's soccer program.

Rayner served as an assistant in the program from 2001-04. During her time in Lexington, Rayner helped coach five Wildcats to seven All-SEC honors.

"Coming back to UK with the staff we have is tremendous, and the decision was not a hard one to make," said Rayner. "Having lived in Lexington and worked at UK before, you grow to love it. I know (UK Athletics Director) Mitch (Barnhart) is doing some tremendous things here, and with what he's accomplished and his vision for the future the decision was that much easier to make. Jon (Lipsitz) is a tremendous coach whom I've known for many years. I think we have a lot of the same similarities and philosophies and it was an honor to be asked by him to return to UK as a part of his staff. We'll do what's required to get the job done and get the program moving in the direction it should be, and that includes winning championships."

Rayner returns to Lexington after serving as head coach at High Point for the last four seasons where she led the Panthers to a 33-38-12 record, including a 19-13-11 mark in her last two seasons. In 2007, Rayner guided High Point to the Big South Tournament Championship and made the school's second appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Along the way the team matched the program's Division I record for season wins with 11. In 2008, she equaled the all-time program record for fewest losses in a season with five.

During her time at High Point, she produced 14 All-Big South performers and recruited and developed three Big South All-Freshman selections. Rayner's insistence on excellence in the classroom showed results as well, producing two Big South Women's Soccer Scholar Athletes of the Year and four CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District honorees.

Prior to her coaching tenure at UK, Rayner began her collegiate coaching career as the top assistant for the men's and women's soccer programs at Lincoln Memorial University in Harrogate, Tenn. She earned her bachelor's degree in physical education with a minor in coaching from Lincoln Memorial in 2001.

In addition to her collegiate coaching experience, Rayner served as the Director of Coaching for the Knoxville (Tenn.) United Stars Girls club, where two of her teams won Tennessee State Championships and other squads captured titles in numerous tournaments around the region.

Rayner, who played professionally in Australia and England for several years before coming to the United States to pursue a college education, was a member of the New Zealand National Team that competed in the first Women's World Soccer Championships in China in 1991.



FIRST SEASON AS ASSISTANT COACH AARON RODGERS

o stranger to the Southeastern Conference, Aaron Rodgers is making his third stop within the SEC, having previously coached at Florida and Alabama.

"I'm excited about the opportunity to remain in the SEC at a traditionally strong program like Kentucky," said Rodgers. "Additionally, working with Coach Lipsitz will give me an opportunity to learn from one of the great minds in the game."

Rodgers spent last season as a volunteer coach with the University of Florida soccer team, serving as the goalkeeper coach. During his time in Gainesville, the Gators captured the 2008 SEC championship, while reaching the NCAA Sweet 16 as well.

"Aaron is such a wonderful addition to the staff and our program," said Lipsitz. "He is one of the bright young minds in this game and is going to be a great contributor to our success."

His other SEC stop in Tuscaloosa occurred in the 1998 season. The Crimson Tide won the Southeastern Conference's Western Division and earned a NCAA Championship berth that season. Rodgers coached 1998 All-SEC first team selection Rachel Brown, who is currently the goalkeeper for the England National Team.

Rodgers brings knowledge from the collegiate and club coaching ranks as well as experience as a player to the Wildcat program.

A volunteer coaching position for the University of North Florida for the 2001 season followed, and the Ospreys finished the 2001 year nationally ranked. He spent the 2005, 2006 and 2007 seasons as an assistant coach for the Flager College men's team.

Rodgers played collegiate soccer at both Arkansas-Little Rock (1991) and North Texas (1992-1993). He also played four seasons with various United Soccer League (USL) teams in the southeast - Texas Toros (1993-1994), Dallas Rockets (1995) and Mobile Revelers (1997).

A University of North Texas graduate, he received his bachelor's degree in political science in 1996.

Rodgers and his wife, Mandi, have a two-year old son, Luke, and are currently expecting their second child.

For his years of commitment, he was recently awarded the Lifetime Achievement award at the 2008 Catspy Awards.

For the first 22 years of Cropp's athletics career he was involved in coaching football. His first head coaching position came at Tennessee High School in Bristol, Tenn. Cropp's squads compiled an impressive 48-15-3 record with two state AAA titles (1971-72) and the '72 mythical national championship.

Cropp returned to his alma mater, Vanderbilt, in 1973 as an assistant coach under Steve Sloan. He followed Sloan as an assistant to Texas Tech (1975-77), Ole Miss (1978-82) and Duke (1983). In 1984, Cropp returned to Vanderbilt under head coach George MacIntyre. He entered private business for two years (1986-88) before returning to Vanderbilt for a third time. Cropp served as Assistant Athletics Director for Compliance at Vanderbilt for three years before coming to Kentucky.

Cropp earned three varsity letters at Vanderbilt as a guard/linebacker. He received the Wade-Looney Memorial Award as a senior and graduated in 1961. He earned his masters of arts in teaching in 1962.



SEC TOURNAMENT

The best women's soccer teams in the Southeastern Conference travel to the beach each year to battle it out for the top spot in the league tournament. This November, the site of the always-competitive event will once again be in Orange Beach, Ala., at the Orange Beach SportsPlex.

2009 marks the sixth year Orange Beach has been the site of the SEC Women's Soccer Tournament. With average temperatures bordering 65 degrees in November, the Orange Beach Soccer Complex places itself at the fore front of host sites for collegiate soccer conference tournaments.

Teams that qualify for the post season tournament are put up in condos on the beach while enjoying some of the best cuisine the South has to offer. Being a neutral host also allows the city of Orange Beach an opportunity to boast that they are the only neutral site host

to a conference tournament in women's DI soccer.

The top eight teams in the conference with the best regular season records will face off in Orange Beach for a chance to advance to the NCAA Tournament. First round games begin on Wednesday, leading up to the championship game on Sunday, which will be televised by ESPNU.

K has enjoyed success in the postseason since the program's inception in 1992. Kentucky is the only team in the Southeastern Conference to qualify for the postseason tournament every season since the 12-team league sanctioned women's soccer in 1993.

In 1995, the SEC championship found its home in the Bluegrass as Coach Warren Lipka and the Cats capped off a 14-6-0 regular season by winning three straight matches to claim the conference crown.

Kentucky's quest for the title was complete with a 2-1 win over Alabama in the finals after defeating LSU, 4-0, and blanking Vanderbilt, 1-0, in Auburn, Ala. It took the Cats just four years to be tabbed the SEC's champions and Coach Warren Lipka earned his first of three (1995, 1999 and 2006) SEC Coach of the Year honors for UK's accomplishments. In 1997, 1998, 2001 and 2002, the Wildcats came within one game of once again playing for the championship, advancing to the semifinals of the SEC Tournament.

UK found its way back to the league's final game in 2006, claiming the SEC Tournament championship with a 2-1 upset of the 12th ranked Florida Gators.

The Wildcats opened the tournament with an exciting 3-2 first round victory over Ole Miss, a team the Cats played to a 0-0 tie earlier in the season. After neither team could strike for a goal in 110 minutes in Oxford, Miss. in October, the two combined for four goals in the first half. UK broke the 2-2 tie nearly 12 minutes into the second half and held on for the victory.

Awaiting Kentucky in the semifinals was 20th ranked Tennessee, a team Kentucky dispatched of 1-0 in Knoxville in the regular season. The Wildcats continued their defensive prowess, shutting out the Lady Volunteers for a second consecutive time and scored two second-half goals en route to the upset and a berth in the Sunday finals.

Kentucky struck early against the Gators scoring a goal nearly seven minutes into the match. Florida tied the game just before the half, but a Wildcat goal nearly two minutes into the second frame and stellar defense down the stretch earned the Cats their second tournament championship and the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The Cats have earned berths into the NCAA Tournament in five of the last 10 seasons, but are still searching for the program's first victory in the "Big Dance".

privilege at a major university is to be a studentathlete. Among the benefits that student-athletes enjoy are significant learning experiences that teach important life lessons. None is more important than learning to return that benefit to individuals in the community that have supported and cheered the student-athlete, win or lose.

The University of Kentucky has a community outreach program that, when initiated more than 15 years ago, was intended to provide support for young people. The program was viewed as a "oneway" effort with the student-athlete giving and the community and schools receiving. But as the "Cats That Care" program has grown, one of the most notable results is what the student-athletes learn about themselves – they really do receive by giving.

The athletic department's community outreach program began in 1990 when, in cooperation with the College of Education, UK student-athletes "adopted" the fifth-grade class at a local school. The program matched UK student-athletes one-on-one with school children, who in turn, set goals while the student-athletes monitored their progress and assisted the children in achieving their stated objectives.

The program was highly successful and continues today. "Cats That Care" has expanded and now includes many worthwhile projects, including:

Celebrity Hospital Visitor

Student-athletes visit patients at local hospitals, including rehabilitation facilities and veterans hospitals.

Cats Cultivating Character

Student-athletes teach character lessons twice a month to third grade students at a local elementary school.

Mentoring

Student-athletes serve as role models for many elementary and middle school students. A a mentor, they help younger students develop self esteem and promote academic success through weekly interaction.

Hospital Breakfast with Santa

Each year, UK student-athletes assist the UK Children's Hospital with a special Christmas breakfast for children at the hospital.

Kentucky Excel Mentor Program

UK student-athletes serve as mentors for high school students participating in the program. It provides scholarships for students who complete the program.

UK Children's Hospital

Student-athletes volunteer at least once a month to play games and visit with the patients.

School Speaker

Student-athletes visit a number of local schools, speaking to children on a variety of topics, including the importance of an education, staying off drugs and promoting reading.

Boys and Girls Club

Student-athletes mentor and interact with children and young adults on a weekly basis. They also volunteer for various holiday activities, such as the "Mountain of Love."

Food Drive

Student-athletes organize a food drive that benefits God's Pantry.

Great Leaps Program

Student-athletes volunteer on a weekly basis at various elementary schools to help students become better readers.

Ronald McDonald House

Student-athletes volunteer to bake dessert items for the families staying here who have a child in the hospital. They also help clean up the ground and take time to clean the inside of the House as well.

Hope Center

The Hope Center is a shelter for men serving the Lexington-Fayette County area. Student-Athletes volunteer at least once a month to serve lunch and/or dinner to those currently staying at the center.

Salvation Army

During the holiday season student-athletes volunteer their time ringing bells for the "Red Kettle Campaign" to help raise money. Students also purchase small gifts to stuff in Christmas stockings to be distributed to local families in need.

The Wildcats can often be found giving back to the Lexington Community, including this team trip to the Veterans' Affairs Medical Center.



DR. LEE T. TODD, JR., PRESIDENT



Lee T. Todd, Jr. became the 11th president of the University of Kentucky on July 1, 2001, after serving as senior vice president of IBM's Lotus Development Corp. President Todd is the sixth UK alumnus to hold the presidency.

President Todd has concentrated his efforts and energies on helping his alma mater achieve a greater level of national prominence. He launched the University of Kentucky's Top 20 Business Plan in December 2005. The plan is a quantitative analysis highlighting what it will take for UK to achieve its state-mandated goal of building a Top 20 public research university. Widely hailed as the first business plan by a public university in the nation, UK's plan garnered widespread national attention. It has been featured by national media outlets and recognized by peer institutions, as several higher education leaders have visited UK's campus to learn more about the Business Plan approach.

He continues to champion UK's outreach efforts. President Todd launched a universityfunded research program called the Commonwealth Collaboratives. The initiative features 36 of UK's top research teams, who are focused on solving the intrinsic problems that have held the state back from reaching its full potential. It is

part of UK's effort to ensure that its research hits the ground in Kentucky and changes lives throughout the Commonwealth.

President Todd has spearheaded an effort to revitalize health care in Kentucky. In June 2006, UK unveiled the Commonwealth's Medical Campus of the Future, a multi-phased project aimed at providing Kentuckians with cuttingedge, 21st century health care. As part of the revamped academic medical campus, UK will construct a new, one million square foot University of Kentucky Albert B. Chandler Hospital and a new College of Pharmacy.

President Todd is Chair of the Board of Directors and Executive Committee for the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU). He also is President of the Southeastern Conference (SEC) Executive Committee. President Todd serves on the Equitable Resources Board of Directors and is chair of the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education's STEM (Science, Te nology, Engineering, and Mathematics) Task Force. He is chair of the National Consortium for

Continuous Improvement in Higher Education's (NCCI) Leveraging Excellence Award selection panel. President Todd also is a member of the Business Higher Education Forum and the Council on Competitiveness.

He is married to the former Patricia Brantley, a UK graduate who earned her master's degree from Simmons College in Boston. They have two adult children, UK graduates Troy and Kathryn.



MITCH BARNHART, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



Mitch Barnhart is in his eighth year at the University of Kentucky, with unparalleled accomplishments in his past and unprecedented goals for the future.

When he arrived in 2002, Barnhart's first move was to totally support all 22 varsity sports with the maximum number of scholarships and coaches, along with the facilities, equipment and support staff needed to make those teams successful.

The commitment to fully fund every sport produced never-before-seen successes in UK athletics, with first-ever Southeastern Conference championships in baseball, men's golf and women's tennis.

Perhaps the biggest on-field turnaround has been in football, where Barnhart's hire of Rich Brooks has led the Wildcats to bowl wins in three consecutive years, the first time that has been accomplished in UK's 117 seasons in the sport.

In order to make the dreams a reality, Barnhart spearheaded record-breaking growth in philanthropic giving, ticket sales and a comprehensive multi-media rights agreement.

Barnhart's connection to UK student-athletes is evident by his individual interaction and dedication to provide the support services necessary to meet their needs. UK Athletics spends more than \$1.5 million annually on its nationally renowned Center for Academic and Tutorial Services. He also began the CATSPYs, an annual awards program that honors the best of UK Athletics.

Additional initiatives begun under Barnhart's leadership include the UK Athletics Hall of Fame and the Joe Craft Center, a \$30 million facility that includes new practice and administrative space for a variety of sports.

Barnhart's influence reaches far beyond the fields of competition. Despite athletics' urgent financial needs, Barnhart initiated a \$1.2 million annual contribution to the University's scholarship program, a contribution that is being increased to \$1.7 million this year.

Social responsibility in the Commonwealth of Kentucky is a priority for Barnhart, who has

been extremely active in community service and encourages the UK athletics staff to do the same.

Not content with past successes, Barnhart's ambitious course for the future was revealed with his recent announcement of the "15x15x15" plan. The goals are to win at least 15 conference or national championships and rank among the NCAA's top 15 athletic programs by 2015 – all of which would represent unprecedented achievements for UK Athletics – while continuing to expand UK Athletics' service to the local community and commonwealth of Kentucky. Another goal of the initiative is a cumulative 3.0 gradepoint average for UK's 500 student-athletes.

Barnhart arrived at Kentucky from Oregon State, where he served four successful years (1998-2002) as athletics director. Before his term at OSU, he worked in athletics administration posts at Tennessee (1986-98), Southern Methodist University (1983-86), Oregon (1983) and San Diego State (1982-1983).

Barnhart, 50, is a native of Kansas City, Kan. He received his bachelor degree from Ottawa University (Kansas) in 1981 and a masters in sports administration from Ohio University in 1982.

He and his wife, the former Connie Brown, have three children, Kirby, Blaire and Scott. Kirby is recently married to McKenzie Willoughby.



UK SOCCER COMPLEX



The University of Kentucky is committed to providing its student-athletes with the very best in athletics facilities. The University of Kentucky Soccer Complex is evidence of that dedication.

The stadium opened October 25, 1996, christened with a 2-1 victory over Vanderbilt. The stadium itself is part of a complex that houses a game field, a practice field, locker rooms and a training room. Since its opening, the Complex has played host to some of the largest crowds to see SEC soccer action, including the 1996 SEC Tournament as well as the the 1996 NCAA Tournament.

The Wildcats enjoy a nice home-field advantage at the complex having rolled up a 70-42-12 record at the home stadium.

The facility features grandstand seating for more than 1,500 fans. However, with temporary seating, the stadium's capacity exceeds 3,000.

In 2008, a state of the art scoreboard was added to the facility, providing fans with more information, including corner kicks and shots on goal.

The combination of practice field and lighted game field makes the UK Complex one of the nation's top soccer facilities.

The Complex features a lighted international regulation-sized playing field of lush Bermuda grass, overseeded with rye. The surface is a modified native-soil field with an in-ground drainage system to assist in the removal rain water to make the field safer and more playable in a rain-soaked game. The

field also consists of an in-ground irrigation system that allows the UK grounds crew to keep the field in top playing condition throughout the year.

The combination of sand, native soil and irrigation allows UK grounds keepers to maintain a healthy and vigorous playing surface.





WILLIAM T. YOUNG LIBRARY



- n addition to providing the finest in athletic facilities, the University of Kentucky also provides student-athletes with the best in academic facilities. One of the most recent additions to the educational landscape at UK is the \$58 million William T. Young Library.
- **Size:** The library covers 365,350 square feet more than six football fields. The building is five stories high, plus a basement.
- Shelf capacity: If laid end-to-end, the bookshelf space would stretch 198,828 linear feet that's more than 37 miles of shelf space. The shelves will house 1.2 million books.
- **Seating capacity:** The library can seat more than 4,000 patrons at one time, a 355 percent increase over the old library. The seating on the fifth floor of the new library equals the capacity of the former library.



- Computer connections: Every study table and study carrel in the library has an electrical outlet and a computer jack connected to the university's computer system. Virtually the entire library has wireless coverage.
- Flexibility: The library has a state-ofthe-art electronic infrastructure that will enable UK to take full advantage of current and emerging technology. In addition, the five floors and basement of the structure are designed as open, flexible spaces, enabling the library to adapt its services and facilities to the future changes in needs of UK students.
- Endowment: The UK Library has the nation's largest book endowment among public universities and ranks second only to Harvard.

OHIO CASUALTY CENTER FOR ACADEMIC AND TUTORIAL SERVICES

The University of Kentucky has made a commitment to put the student-athlete at the heart of the program.

The cornerstone of that commitment lies in the academic success of the University's student-athletes. And at UK, that success stems from the resources within the Ohio Casualty Group's Center for Academic and Tutorial Services (CATS).

UK opened CATS in 1981, the nation's first academic center dedicated exclusively to student-athletes. Over the years, as the services offered by CATS have grown, so did the need for additional space.

As a result, UK built a new facility - the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, thanks to a one-million dollar grant from the Ohio Casualty Insurance Group. The Ohio Casualty Center opened in 1998 at a total cost of \$2.4 million.

Much of the credit for UK's academic success goes to the Athletics Association's academic support system - the Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, or simply, "CATS."



The Carol Martin Gatton Computer Center houses 35 computer terminals. CATS also provides 1,000 hours of tutoring per week for student-athletes.



CATS, constructed in Memorial Coliseum, includes:

- 20,000 square feet of space more than double the size of the former CATS facility;
- a computer room housing 35 computers;
- a study area which accommodates 90-100 people;
- 24 tutoring rooms;
- a career development and life skills resource center; and
- · offices for the staff.

Certainly, a facility is a good start, but any program - especially in academics - is only as good as the people who run it. And UK is fortunate to have outstanding leaders in its academics support system.

Bob Bradley, Associate Athletics Director for Student Services, oversees the CATS program. Bradley was named National Academic Advisor of the Year in 1989 and 1992. In 2000 he was selected as the CHAMPS Life Skills Coordinator of the Year by the NCAA Division I-A Athletic Directors Association.

CATS has a full-time staff of 11. In addition to Bradley, they are:

- Barb Deniston, Director of Academic Services;
- Mike Haley, Director of Advising Services;
- Amy Craiglow, Dustin Lewis, Martina Martin, Jon Ross, Michael Stone, Academic Counselors;
- · Katrina Salley, Lifeskills Coordinator;

- D'Ann Blankenship, Administrative Support Associate

CATS also employs seven graduate assistants and numerous tutors, both from the University and the surrounding community. UK has budgeted more than \$1,000,000 for the operation of CATS in the coming year.

"We are extremely proud of what we have accomplished in the academic arena," Bradley says. "The CATS program is focused on winning in the classroom. We look at each student-athlete's individual needs, set goals, and develop strategies to attain those goals. Our center provides our student-athletes with a definite advantage over student-athletes at many other institutions. Our goal is to show that we care about the student as well as the athlete."

For the CATS staff, showing you care means more than helping athletes maintain eligibility, graduate, or win awards. The academics staff also prepares student-athletes for life after college with the Wildcat Career Development Program.

The Career Development Program helps student-athletes look to the future through a stepby-step process which includes:

- Mentoring and internships, which help determine career interests;
- · career counseling;
- resume writing; and
- forming a career plan.

The Wildcat Career Development Program works closely with the University's Career Planning and Placement Center in order to provide additional assistance when needed.
