CAROLINA VS. KENTUCKY: This is the 29th meeting between the Gamecocks and Wildcats in a series that dates back to 1937. Carolina leads the all-time series 17-10-1, including an 8-4-1 mark in Columbia and a 9-6 advantage in Lexington. The teams played just three times (1937, 1978 and 1981) before Carolina joined the SEC for the 1992 season. Since then, they have met every year. Since joining the league, the Gamecocks own a 16-9 record against UK, including wins in 13 of the 17 meetings in this century, but the Wildcats have won each of the last three contests, their longest winning streak in the series.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: Benny Snell capped an 11-play, 65-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown plunge early in the fourth quarter to break a 10-10 tie, and Kentucky held on for a 17-10 win over South Carolina in Lexington on September 24, 2016. The Gamecocks struggled to generate any offense in the contest, as they were limited to just 268 total yards. Brandon McIlwain went the distance at quarterback, completing 15-of-30 passes for 177 yards. Kentucky rushed for 216 of their 351 total yards in the contest.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET AT WBS: Kentucky opened up a 24-7 halftime lead in Columbia on September 12, 2015, then held off a late Carolina comeback in a 26-22 Wildcat win. The Gamecocks outgained Kentucky, 417-399 on the day, but three times had to settle for an Elliott Fry field goal from inside 30 yards. Brandon Wilds rushed 16 times for 106 yards, while Perry Orth completed 13-of-20 passes for 179 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

THE LAST CAROLINA WIN: The 13th-ranked Gamecocks opened up a 27-7 lead over Kentucky heading into the final stanza, but the Wildcats made it interesting with 21 fourth-quarter points before falling by a 35-28 count in Columbia on Oct. 5, 2013. Mike Davis rushed for 106 yards and two touchdowns and quarterback Connor Shaw added 312 yards of total offense, including 262 through the air on 17-of-20 passing. Damiere Byrd had one of the top days of his career, catching five passes for 94 yards, including a 62-yard TD catch on the first drive of the game.

**MUSCHAMP VS. THE CATS:** South Carolina head coach **Will Muschamp** owns a 4-1 record against Kentucky. He was a perfect 4-0 against the Wildcats as the head coach at Florida, winning by scores of 48-10, 38-0, 24-7 and 36-30 in overtime, before dropping last year's contest by a 17-10 score.

**BLUE GRASS TIES:** Carolina co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Kurt Roper** served as an assistant coach on Rich Brooks staff at Kentucky in 2005. Tight ends coach **Pat Washington** was on the Kentucky staff in 2012, working under Joker Phillips.

### A South Carolina win over Kentucky would...

- ◆ Snap the Gamecocks' three-game losing streak to Kentucky. The Gamecocks lead the all-time series, 17-10-1, including an 8-4-1 record at Williams-Brice Stadium. Carolina won 13 of 14 meetings between the two schools from 2000-2013, but Kentucky has won each of the last three games.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks a 3-0 start to the season for the first time since the 2012 campaign when they opened with wins at Vanderbilt and at home vs. East Carolina and UAB en route to a 6-0 start.
- ◆ Get the Gamecocks off to a 2-0 start in the SEC for the first time since the 2012 season when the Gamecocks opened with four-consecutive SEC victories, winning at Vanderbilt, vs. Missouri, at Kentucky and vs. Georgia before stumbling in back-to-back road games at LSU and Florida.

YOU ARE LOOKING LIVE: The 2017 home slate finally gets underway for the SEC Eastern Division-leading South Carolina Gamecocks (2-0, 1-0 SEC) when they host the Kentucky Wildcats (2-0, 0-0 SEC) in a divisional matchup on Saturday, September 16. Game time is set for 7:39 pm ET, and the contest will be televised on SEC Network.

TV COVERAGE: This week's contest will be televised on SEC Network with Tom Hart and Jordan Rodgers in the booth and Cole Cubelic on the sidelines.

A HISTORY LESSON: It's been 125 years since the University of South Carolina laced it up for a December 24, 1892 meeting in Charleston against Furman, a 44-0 setback. 2017 marks the 124th season of intercollegiate football at South Carolina. It is the 111th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 594-569-44, a .510 winning percentage.

SEC HISTORY: The South Carolina Gamecocks are in their 26th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned their lone SEC Eastern Division title in 2010. The Gamecocks are 86-114-1 (.430) alltime in SEC regular-season play, but are 31-26 (.544) in conference action since the start of the 2010 season.

SOMETHING'S GOT TO GIVE: This is a matchup of 2-0 teams. The Gamecocks opened the season with a 35-28 win over NC State in Charlotte, then pulled away for a 31-13 win over Missouri in a battle for the Mayor's Cup last Saturday in Columbia, Mo. Kentucky opened with a 24-17 win at Southern Miss, then posted a 27-16 win over Eastern Kentucky at home last Saturday.

SEEMS LIKE THE SECOND TIME: The Gamecocks have opened the 2017 season winning back-to-back games away from home for just the second time in their 124-year history. The only other time that occurred was in the 2011 season when the Gamecocks opened with a win over East Carolina in Charlotte, then went on the road to defeat Georgia. That team went on to post an 11-2 record and finish ninth in the country. South Carolina and Louisville are the only Power 5 schools to open with two wins away from home.

GETTING TO 3-0: The Gamecocks are looking to go 3-0 for the first time since the 2012 season. That 2012 team went on to win its first six games and finished with an 11-2 mark and a final ranking of eighth in the country.

ABOUT LAST WEEK: The Gamecocks got two touchdowns each from Deebo Samuel and Havden Hurst, while the defense held the highpowered Tiger offense to just 13 points, 59 below its season average, in a convincing 31-13 win at Missouri last Saturday night. Samuel scored on a kickoff return for the second-straight week and also found the endzone on a 25-yard carry. Hurst scored on a 39-yard pass reception from Jake Bentley and on a two-yard run, as the Gamecocks rallied from an early 10-0 deficit to win their second true road game in their last 11 tries. The Carolina defense allowed 423 yards, but stiffened in the redzone, allowing just one field goal in three redzone opportunities.

GOING THE DISTANCE: For the secondstraight week, Deebo Samuel took a kickoff return 97 yards for a touchdown. Against NC State, he became the first player in school history to open the season with a kickoff return for a score and earned SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors for his efforts. Against Missouri, his 97yard return changed the momentum of the game after the Tigers had taken a 10-0 lead. Samuel has tied the school record for kickoff returns for a touchdown in a season with two, matching King Dixon (1957) and Boo Williams (1997). Samuel and Dixon are the only players to have kickoff returns for scores in back-to-back games. Samuel now owns the school record for career kickoff returns for touchdowns with three, as he also took one to the house from 100-yards out last year against Western Carolina. The Gamecocks have had four kickoff returns for scores in their last 22 games after not having a kickoff return for a TD between 2002 to 2015.

GONE IN 30 SECONDS: After Missouri scored to take a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter, the Gamecocks struck quickly, scoring 14 points in the next 30 seconds to take a 14-10 lead and never looked back. Deebo Samuel needed just 15 seconds to cover 97 yards for a touchdown then, after Jamyest Williams intercepted Drew Lock's pass on the first play of the next possession, Samuel needed just nine seconds to race in from 25-yards out, completely changing the complexion of the

SPECIAL SPECIAL TEAMS: The Gamecocks special teams came up big in the win at Missouri. In addition to Deebo Samuel's kick return for a touchdown, Javon Kinlaw blocked a field goal attempt, Javon Charleston recovered a fumble on a muffed punt and Carolina got a 73-yard punt from Joseph Charlton, the longest by a Gamecock since 1992.

BEND BUT DON'T BREAK: After giving up three touchdowns on five possessions in the first half against NC State, the Gamecock defense has stepped it up. They held the Wolfpack to just one score on eight possessions in the second half, then limited Missouri to one touchdown on 11 drives last week. The Gamecocks have allowed just five scores on nine redzone penetrations this season.

GREAT FIRST STARTS: Sophomore linebacker **T.J. Brunson** and sophomore defensive end **D.J.** Wonnum each made his first career start for the Gamecocks in the win over NC State. Brunson responded with a game-high 16 tackles, while Wonnum logged a game-high 3.0 tackles for loss. Wide receiver Shi Smith and defensive back Jamyest Williams became the first true freshmen to get a start this season when they both got the nod at Missouri. Smith responded with four catches for 22 yards, while Williams logged six tackles, one pass break up and a key interception.

FRESH FISH: South Carolina has played six true freshmen this season. Those newcomers who have seen action for the first time in Division I football are Sherrod Greene, OrTre Smith, Shi Smith, Aaron Sterling, Chad Terrell and Jamyest Williams. Smith and Williams have each made a start.

MY QUARTERBACK IS A BENTLEY: Sophomore quarterback Jake Bentley is the key to the Gamecock attack. The 6-3, 220-pounder completed 17-of-29 passes for 215 yards and three touchdowns with one interception in the win over NC State, then hit on 18-of-28 passes for 187 yards with a TD and no interceptions in the win at Missouri. Bentley, who is 6-3 in nine career starts, has tossed a career-best three TD passes in two of his last three games. He set the school record for bowl games and Birmingham Bowl records for passes completed (32), yards passing (390) and total offense (381) while throwing three TD passes in the final game of the 2016 season against UCF.

FAMILY AFFAIR: Quarterback Jake Bentley comes from a football family. His father, Bobby, is the Gamecocks' running backs coach and previously was a highly-successful high school coach at Byrnes (S.C.) High and at Presbyterian College. Jake's step-brother, Chas Dodd (Rutgers), and brother, Shuler Bentley (Old Dominion/Murray State), both have started at quarterback in college.

ON TARGET: Quarterback Jake Bentley has completed 64.8 percent of his career passes (160of-247). That has him ranked second on the Gamecocks' career completion percentage list.

EXPERIENCE NOT NECESSARY: Despite getting seven starts last season from Jake Bentley, the Gamecocks entered the 2017 season as having one of the country's least experienced unit of signalcallers. The Carolina quarterbacks combined to appear in just eight career games entering the season, seven by Bentley and one by Michael Scarnecchia. The eight appearances ranked in a tie for ninth with Minnesota for fewest quarterback appearances at the start of the season. Despite his limited play, Bentley was named Co-MVP of the team as selected by his teammates, sharing honors with Deebo Samuel.

DA DO RUN RUN: The Gamecocks have a trio of running backs who will take the bulk of the snaps this season, all of whom are underclassmen. Sophomore Rico Dowdle (5-11, 220) is the top returning ground-gainer with 764 yards and six touchdowns scored as a true freshman last fall. Dowdle owns three 100-yard rushing games, including a career-best 226-yard performance against Western Carolina. He became the first true freshman to lead the Gamecocks in rushing since Marcus Lattimore in 2010. Redshirt sophomore A.J. Turner (5-10, 184) logged 497 yards and three scores on 116 carries last season. Included was a career-best 113-yard effort against Texas A&M. Redshirt sophomore Ty'Son Williams (6-0, 215) is eligible this fall after transferring from North Carolina. He turned in the best performance from a running back so far in 2017 when he carried 14 times for 78 yards, including a 32-yard burst, in the win at Missouri.

THE PRODIGAL (TY')SON: After spending the 2015 season at North Carolina, then sitting out last season per NCAA transfer rules, redshirt sophomore running back Ty'Son Williams, from Sumter, S.C., made his Gamecock debut against NC State, catching one pass for 5 yards, but did not get a carry in the contest. He came off the bench at Mizzou to lead the team with 14 carries and 78 yards in the win.

WHEN WE WERE YOUNG: South Carolina was the only Division I school to have freshmen lead the team in both rushing yards (Rico Dowdle) and passing yards (Jake Bentley) in 2016.

SAMUEL IS KING: Despite playing in just 10 games in 2016, Deebo Samuel proved to be a playmaker. Samuel led the team with 59 receptions and 783 receiving yards. He ranked third in the SEC in receptions per game (5.9), fourth in receiving yards per game (78.3), third in kickoff return average (26.9) and second in all-purpose yardage per game (132.0). He shined most brightly in the Birmingham Bowl when he tied the school record with 14 catches against USF and set Birmingham Bowl records with 14 receptions and 190 receiving yards. Samuel topped the team with eight touchdowns in 2016, six on the ground, one receiving and one on a kick return.

MORE OF THE SAME: Deebo Samuel has picked up right where he left off last season. In the opener against NC State, he returned the opening kickoff 97 yards for a score, and caught five passes for 83 yards including a pair of scores. He finished the day with 185 all-purpose yards. Last week at Missouri, he returned another kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown, scored on a 25-yard rush and caught five passes for 45 yards, accumulating 167 all-purpose yards.

BY AIR, LAND OR SEA: Deebo Samuel has accounted for 15 career touchdowns. He has rushed for seven scores, caught four passes for touchdowns, returned three kickoffs for scores, and even has thrown one TD pass. He also leads the SEC in scoring with 30 points in 2017.

MOVIN' ON UP: Deebo Samuel moved into 24th place on South Carolina's career receptions list, passing Danny Smith, who logged 78 catches from 1984-87. Samuel now has 81 receptions in his Carolina career. Toby Cates is 23rd with 89 career catches.

TWO-FOR-TWO: Deebo Samuel has returned two kickoffs this season, both resulting in touchdowns. He is one of only four players in the country to have two kickoff returns for touchdowns this season, joining Keion Davis from Marshall (5 returns), Raymond Calais from Louisiana (7 returns) and Darius Phillips from Western Michigan (8 returns).

PLAYING WITH A PURPOSE: Deebo Samuel is second in the SEC and tied for ninth in the nation in all-purpose yards, averaging 176.0 per game. Of the players listed in the top-10, Samuel has the third-fewest touches (14) of the group.

HE PLAYS A GREAT SECOND FIDDLE: Bryan Edwards had the second-best true freshman season for a Gamecock wide receiver in 2016 behind only Alshon Jeffery's 2009 campaign. Edwards opened the 2017 campaign with five receptions for 55 yards against NC State and added five catches for 35 yards at Missouri. With 10 catches,

he and Deebo Samuel are both tied for sixth in the SEC with 5.0 receptions per game. The 6-3, 215-pounder from Conway, S.C., has 54 career receptions for 680 yards in his first 14 games.

DIAMONDS AREN'T FOREVER: Hayden Hurst played professional baseball in the Pittsburgh Pirates' organization after being selected in the 17th round of the 2012 draft. Now a 6-5, 253-pound junior, the 24-year-old Hurst turned in the school's best single-season receiving numbers for a tight end in 2016. His 48 receptions and 616 receiving yards topped the previous marks of 38 catches, set by Doug Hamrick in 1970, and 576 yards, set by Danny Smith in 1987. The former walk-on also served as the Gamecocks' punt returner against Georgia, becoming the biggest punt returner in Division I football in recent memory. He also was selected a permanent team captain in 2016, becoming the first sophomore to earn that distinction. Last week at Missouri, he caught three passes for 69 yards, including a 39yard touchdown pass. Hurst is now tied for seventh in career receptions by a tight end, matching Wesleye Saunders (60). He needs one to match Rory Anderson (61) for sixth and three to match Willie Scott (63) for fifth on the all-time list. With 789 yards, Hurst also passed Willie Scott (787) for receiving yards by a tight end and now ranks sixth in receiving yards by a tight end in school history.

O-LINE EXPERIENCE: The Gamecocks feature an offensive line that boasts a wealth of experience. Cory Helms (38 starts) and Alan Knott (31 starts) have logged the most starting assignments on the squad. Zack Bailey (20), Malik Young (11), D.J. Park (3) and Donell Stanley (3) also have gained starting experience.

IT'S A WONDERFUL LIFE: Junior offensive lineman Zack Bailey should be considered for All-SEC accolades this season. Bailey, the most consistent performer on the offensive line, was named to the 2015 SEC All-Freshman team. The 6-6, 311-pounder from Summerville, S.C., has played in all 26 games over the past three seasons with 20 starts, including the last 17 in a row. He was moved to right tackle in the spring after spending the 2016 campaign at left guard.

GETTING IN THE SACK: The Gamecocks logged four sacks, all in the second half, in the season opener against NC State and added one at Missouri. The five sacks ties the squad for fourth in the SEC after two weeks. Carolina recorded 21 sacks a year ago, with Darius English logging nine of those. Here are the individual sack numbers:

SAWYER STRIPS IT: Senior Dante Sawyer totaled seven stops, including 1.5 tackles for loss and a pair of quarterback hurries in the Gamecocks' 35-28 win over NC State, and made two of the game's most critical defensive plays. Early in the second quarter with the game tied at 14, Sawyer forced a fumble at the NC State 28-yard line, setting up a short field, which the Gamecocks converted into a touchdown and a 21-14 lead. With the Gamecocks on top 28-21 in the third quarter, the 6-3, 275-pounder from Suwanee, Ga., got to NC State quarterback Ryan Finley for an 18-yard strip sack, which the Gamecocks recovered, setting up another touchdown two plays later and a two-score lead. Sawyer was one of only four players in the country to log two forced fumbles in the season's first week.

TACKLING MACHINE: Sophomore T.J. Brunson is the Gamecocks' top tackler and tied for second in the SEC through two games with 22 stops. Brunson made his first start as a Gamecock memorable. The 6-1, 230-pound linebacker from Columbia, S.C. posted a game- and career-high 16 tackles in the win over NC State. It was the most tackles in a game for a Gamecock since Antonio Allen logged 16 stops against ECU on Sept. 3, 2011, a game that was also played in Charlotte. He followed that up with a six-tackle performance at Missouri. Brunson logged just 12 tackles during the entire 2016 season.

SKAI RETURNS: Skai Moore is back after missing the entire 2016 season following surgery to address a herniated disk in his neck. The 6-2, 221-pound linebacker from Cooper City, Fla., was the Gamecocks' leading tackler in 2015 with 111 stops, tying for third in the SEC with 9.2 tackles per game. He also led the team with 6.5 tackles for loss and with four pass interceptions, tying for fourth in the SEC. Moore became the first Gamecock to reach the century mark in tackles since 2006, while his 111 tackles was the second-highest total recorded by a Carolina player in the last 25 years. He led the team in tackles for a third-consecutive season, becoming the first player to do so since 1992-94. Moore also has 11 career picks, tying for third on the all-time list. He got off to a solid start with eight tackles in the season opener against NC State and followed that up with a team-leading seven stops at Missouri.

With 158 unassisted tackles, he needs just three to match Ben Washington (161, 1994-97) for 10th in Carolina history.

MOORE FROM SKAI: Skai Moore can become the first player in school history to lead the team in tackles in four seasons. That accomplishment is rare across the country. Here are the players who have led their team in tackles in all four years:

NOSE FOR THE BAW(L): Bryson Allen-Williams recorded his third interception in the past four games with his pick in the fourth quarter at Missouri. Allen-Williams had interceptions at Clemson (Nov. 26) and against USF in the Birmingham Bowl (Dec. 29), in the final two games of the 2016 season.

PICK THIS: Carolina picked off its first two passes of the season in the win at Missouri. They recorded 15 interceptions in 2016, third in the SEC. Here are the individual numbers:

CHARLESTON REWARDED: Redshirt sophomore Javon Charleston was rewarded with a scholarship just before the start of fall classes. Charleston, a 6-0, 189-pounder from Gurnee, Ill., is a cousin to former Gamecock great Marcus Lattimore. He came to Carolina as a wide receiver but was moved to safety in the spring. He played in every game in 2016, primarily on special teams.

JUST FOR KICKS: The Gamecocks have had to replace the school's all-time leading scorer in placekicker Elliott Fry this season. Fry tallied 359 points over the past four seasons. Redshirt freshman Alexander Woznick came out of the spring as the odds on favorite to win the job, but was pressed by freshman Parker White in the fall. Both are walk-ons. Woznick has handled all nine of the PATs flawlessly this season, and is 1-for-2 in field goal attempts. Woznick will likely get the call on anything inside the 30, while White will handle the kickoff duties and the longer field goal attempts.

I'M NOT MISSING YOU: Elliott Fry was automatic when it came to extra point attempts. Fry connected on 161-of-162 extra points during his career, with his only miss coming at Georgia in the second game of the 2013 season. Since then, he was accurate on 155 consecutive PATs. Woznick has kept the streak going, hitting all nine of his extra point attempts to run the school record to 164 consecutive PATs made, the nation's sixth-longest streak.

THEY'RE ALL NEW: Whether Alexander Woznick or Parker White handles the placekicking job, he will be working with an entirely new unit, as Ben Asbury is the new deep snapper, replacing four-year starter Drew Williams, and backup quarterback **Danny Gordon** is the holder, replacing Sean Kelly.

KICKING IT WITH THE 'COCKS: Redshirt sophomore Joseph Charlton, who came to Carolina on a scholarship from A.C. Flora High School in Columbia, won the starting punting duties over redshirt sophomore Michael Almond. Almond got the nod in the 2016 Birmingham Bowl when regular punter Sean Kelly was out with an injury, and punted twice for a 44.0-yard average. Charlton was solid in his debut, punting six times for a 46.7-yard average, with a long of 64 against NC State. Last week at Mizzou, he averaged 42.4-yards on five punts, including a careerlong 73-yarder, the longest punt by a Gamecock since Marty Simpson had a 79-yard punt in the 1992 season.

WHO ARE THOSE GUYS?: The 112-man fall roster (as of August 31) consists of 13 seniors, 21 juniors, 30 sophomores, 16 redshirt freshmen and 32 true freshmen.

IT'S A NUMBERS GAME: The Gamecocks returned 63 percent of their total offense from a year ago, including 77 percent of their rushing yards, 53 percent of their passing yards and 97 percent of their receiving yards. The top returning rushers are Rico Dowdle (764 yards) and A.J. Turner (497). Jake Bentley (1,420 yards) is the top returning passer, while Deebo Samuel (59 catches, 783 yards), Hayden Hurst (48 for 616) and Bryan Edwards (44 for 590) are the top three returning receivers. Eight of the squad's top 13 tacklers return for the 2017 season, including the team's top two tacklers from 2016, D.J. Smith (80 tackles) and Bryson Allen-Williams (75). The Gamecocks also get a lift from the return of senior linebacker Skai Moore, who sat out all of last season with a neck injury. Moore was the squad's leading tackler in each of the previous three seasons.

TOUGH SLATE: The Gamecocks have one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2017. One national pundit considers Carolina's four non-conference opponents - NC State, Louisiana Tech, Wofford and Clemson - as the eighth-toughest non-conference slate in the country. The ESPN Football Power Index rates the Gamecocks' schedule as the fifth-toughest in the country, behind only Cal, Georgia, LSU and Florida. Ten of the 12 teams on the docket posted winning records in 2016, with only Missouri and Vanderbilt falling below that mark. Additionally, 10 of the 12 opponents on the 2017 schedule appeared in bowl games last season. Only Syracuse and Notre Dame, with 11 each, will face more teams that are coming off bowl appearances. That tough schedule has proven to be true, as the Carolina opponents have opened the 2017 campaign with a 17-6 record after two weeks, a .739 winning percentage, which improves to 17-4 and an .810 mark when you remove the two losses to the Gamecocks.

WHO DOES THAT? The Gamecocks are one of only three Power Five schools to have two games away from their campus before their 2017 home opener. Carolina opened with a neutral site game against NC State in Charlotte before traveling to Missouri. Louisville opened with a neutral site game against Purdue in Indianapolis, then traveled to North Carolina. Stanford has the toughest go of it. They opened in Sydney, Australia against Rice, then are on the road for their next two games, at Southern Cal and San Diego State.

WINNER, WINNER: The Gamecocks will face a dozen opponents that combined to win 61.6 percent of its games last season, going 98-61 overall. That ranks as the fourth-highest opponent winning percentage among FBS teams.

PICKS TO CLICK: The 14 SEC head coaches named junior tight end Hayden Hurst and senior linebacker Skai Moore to their preseason firstteam All-SEC squad. The coaches also tabbed junior offensive lineman Zack Bailey and junior Deebo Samuel as third-team selections. Samuel made the squad as both a wide receiver and as an all-purpose back. The media attending SEC Media Davs named Hurst and Moore to the second team and Samuel to the third-team unit as a wide receiver.

CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN: The Gamecocks will select captains each week before determining permanent team captains later in the season.

NC STATE: Bryson Allen-Williams, Cory Helms, Hayden Hurst, Skai Moore.

MISSOURI: T.J. Brunson, Alan Knott, Deebo Samuel, Taylor Stallworth

#### IN THE CLASSROOM:

- The Gamecocks were one of six teams that competed in a bowl game following the 2016 season that owned a Graduation Success Rate of at least 90 percent.
- The Gamecocks ranked first in the SEC and third in the country behind only Stanford and Northwestern in the latest Graduation Success Rate (GSR) released by the NCAA.
- The football team recorded its second-highest in-season GPA on record (2.847) during the fall of 2016. The team's spring 2017 GPA was 2.726.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: The Gamecocks have four student-athletes who have earned their undergraduate degree. The quartet includes Ulric Jones (interdisciplinary studies), Skai Moore (interdisciplinary studies), D.J. Park (criminal justice) and Dante Sawyer (interdisciplinary studies).

WORKING OVERTIME: The Gamecocks are 2-3 all-time in games decided in overtime. They won their first overtime game at Missouri, 27-24, in two overtimes on Oct. 26, 2013 in Columbia, Mo., and won in "The Swamp" over Florida by a 23-20 count in 2014. All three overtime losses have come against Tennessee by a field goal: a 23-20 setback on Sept. 27, 2003 in Knoxville, and a 27-24 loss in Knoxville on Oct. 27, 2007 and a 45-42 loss in Columbia on Nov. 1, 2014.

THEY PAY TO SEE THEM PLAY: South Carolina ranked 17th in the nation in home attendance in 2016, with an average home crowd of 76,920 attended seven games, just shy of the 80,250 capacity. That total came in spite of a lower than anticipated crowd that attended the Oct. 9 game against Georgia, a game that was moved to Sunday after Hurricane Matthew swept through the Palmetto State and much of the Southeast.

BIG ROAD CROWDS: South Carolina will play in three of the nation's 10-largest college football stadiums this fall, traveling to Texas A&M's Kyle Field in College Station (102,733), Tennessee's Neyland Stadium in Knoxville (102,455) and Georgia's Sanford Stadium in Athens (92,746).

UP NEXT: The Gamecocks will host Louisiana Tech, out of Conference USA, at Williams-Brice Stadium next Saturday. Carolina leads the all-time series with the Bulldogs by a 4-0-1 count. The teams tied the 1991 contest, then the Gamecocks won four-straight matchups from 1992-95.

## Notes of Interest from the Palmetto State's Flagship University

- ◆ South Carolina finished in 21st place in the Learfield Directors' Cup Standings in 2016-17, its highest finish since the 2002-03 campaign and the third-highest finish in school history.
- ◆ Since the inception of the Palmetto Series, the Gamecocks have captured the title both years, defeating Clemson in 2015-16 by a 10-5 count, and taking the 2016-17 crown in an 8-7 decision. The Certified SC Grown Palmetto Series is sponsored by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture (SCDA) and is a year-long competition between the two



schools in which points are awarded for the winners of head-to-head meetings in each sport. Points were also awarded for highest team GPA and for a food drive during the fall aimed at tackling hunger in their communities.

- ◆ South Carolina is the only Division I athletics program this decade to have at least one Top-4 national finish (championships and/or polls) each in football, men's and women's basketball and baseball.
- ◆ The women's basketball program's national title in 2017 was the seventh overall in the athletic department's history. Four South Carolina programs now boast a National Championship, as the women join women's outdoor track and field (2002), baseball (2010, 2011) and equestrian (2005, 2007, 2015) on the list of Gamecock teams to win a national title.
- ◆ South Carolina's double Final Four this year in men's and women's basketball was only the 13th time in NCAA history and the third time in SEC history that this feat has been accomplished.
- ◆ Five South Carolina athletics teams have made the Elite 8 in NCAA Championships during the last 12 months: men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf and women's soccer.
- ◆ Sindarius Thornwell (men's basketball), A'ja Wilson (women's basketball), Savannah McCaskill (women's soccer-offensive) and Kaleigh Kurtz (women's soccer-defensive) earned SEC Player of the Year honors in their sports during the 2016-17 school year.
- ◆ South Carolina student-athletes have led the SEC in community service hours in each of the last four years. In 2016-17, Gamecock student-athletes performed 9,298 hours of community service. South Carolina men's tennis was named the Intercollegiate Tennis Association Carolina Region Community Service Team of the Year and Maya Evans, a junior on the women's track & field team, was named the SEC Brad Davis Community Service Leader of the Year. During her collegiate career, Evans accumulated over 700 hours of community service.
- ◆ A total of 379 South Carolina student-athletes made the 2016-17 SEC Academic Honor Rolls, first among league schools (90-Fall, 78-Winter, 118-Spring, 93-First Year). Carolina student-athletes posted a combined 3.23 GPA for the Spring 2017 semester, marking the 21st consecutive semester of more than a 3.0 GPA for Gamecock student-athletes.
- ◆ Fourteen of the 18 South Carolina athletics teams earned a 3.0 or better GPA this past spring. Women's Swimming & Diving (3.705) earned its second highest GPA to date, which not only led all of the Gamecock programs this spring, but it also ranked second nationally. Equestrian (3.488), Women's Soccer (3.567), Men's Track & Field (3.265) and Volleyball (3.673) also earned its second-highest GPAs ever recorded.
- ◆ South Carolina Football has three endowed scholarships. Recipients for endowed scholarships are selected each year by the head coach. The 2017 scholarships and recipients are:
- Marcus Lattimore Endowed Football Scholarship **Bryson Allen-Williams**
- Tommy Suggs Endowed Quarterback Scholarship Jake Bentley
- Wraellen and Larry Winn Endowed Tight End Scholarship Hayden Hurst

- ◆ Gamecock radio analyst **Tommy Suggs** is one of the longest tenured radio voices in college football. The former standout quarterback who led the Gamecocks to the 1969 ACC Championship, is in his 45th season as part of the Carolina radio crew.
- ◆ South Carolina is building a \$50 million Football Operations Center. The state-of-the-art facility is located adjacent to the Jerri and Steve Spurrier Indoor Football Facility, and will provide the coaches and student-athletes with the ability to train and compete at the highest level. It will feature: coaches' offices, locker room, meeting rooms, weight room, training room, dining room, players' lounge and equipment room.
- ◆ In the eight sports in which it competes that the NCAA keeps attendance statistics, South Carolina finished in the Top 25 in seven sports (average attendance), most of any school in the country.

### **Kentucky 17 South Carolina 10**





LEXINGTON, Ky. - South Carolina (2-2, 1-2 SEC) fell in a close contest at Kentucky (2-2, 1-1 SEC) on Saturday night at Commonwealth Stadium.

Kentucky retook the lead with 10:21 to play when Benny Snell capped an 11-play, 65-yard drive with a one-yard score. Snell ran for 50 of the drive's 65 yards on the drive on nine carries.

The Gamecocks had one last chance, getting the ball with 4:23 to go. Freshman quarterback Brandon McIlwain led the Gamecocks to three first downs, but Kentucky buckled down and stopped the drive.



Kentucky finished a drive that took the final third of the first quarter early in the second with Austin McGinnis' 30-yard field goal. Stanley Williams had three passes of over 10 yards as part of the 12-play drive, two coming on third down.

The Gamecocks answered on redshirt freshman A.J. Turner's 12-yard run with 5:44 left in the second quarter, taking a 7-3 advantage. The running back ran it five times on the drive, breaking free on the right side to cap the drive. Sophomore tight end Hayden Hurst set up the score with his 30-yard reception of McIlwain's pass.

The Wildcats started the second half fast, taking the 10-7 lead after Stanley Williams scampered for a 43-yard touchdown. Stephen Johnson completed two passes for first downs on the five-play drive, both to Jeff Badet for 28 and 11 yards, respectively. He also recovered his own fumble on the play before Williams' score.

South Carolina knotted things at 10-10 with seconds left in the third quarter on senior Elliott Fry's 35-yard field goal. McIlwain connected with tight ends Hurst and Jacob August on the drive, the latter hauling in a 29yard pass to get the Gamecocks deep into Kentucky territory.





### Kentucky 26 Kentucky **South Carolina 22**

COLUMBIA, S.C.— The Kentucky Wildcats (2-0, 1-0 SEC) would do just enough to hold off a furious second-half comeback attempt in a 26-22 win over Carolina (1-1, 0-1 SEC).

The nine-day break since the team's game against North Carolina would not slow down linebacker Skai Moore, who helped set up the game's first scoring drive of the day with his third interception of the season. Just one play later, Connor Mitch ran it in for his first career rushing touchdown.

The visitors would rally back for the game's next two scores and closed the first quarter with a 14-7 lead.

Brandon Wilds would be tasked with helping to boost the offense, and his effec-

tive running between the tackles would be its first spark of the night. With 7:21 to go in the first half, Wilds ran on four of the first five plays of the drive for 25 yards total. Connor Mitch would then hook up with Pharoh Cooper on a post route to put the offense in the redzone for the first time since its one-play scoring drive in the first quarter.

Just a few plays later, though, a botched option pitch would not only cost the Gamecocks seven yards on third down, but it would cost them their starting quarterback as well. Mitch would dive for the fumbled pitch, but injured his shoulder in the process.

A missed field goal ended Carolina's drive, and the Wildcats offense made quick work in the final three minutes of the half with a 76-yard touchdown drive. Towles set it up with a pair of long completions and capped it himself with a one-yard dive with seconds remaining in the half for a 24-7 lead.

The Gamecock defense came out on a mission to start the second half and quickly forced Kentucky's first punt of the game. A low, spiraling punt would be returned for 24 yards by Pharoh Cooper to set up the offense.

Perry Orth would take the reins of the offense after Mitch was diagnosed with a shoulder injury, and he and Cooper would connect to get the team back into the redzone. Carolina would later settle for a 27-yard field goal to get back on the scoreboard.

Kentucky would go three-and-out again to set up the Gamecocks just shy of midfield. A 34-yard run for Brandon Wilds on the first play of the drive would keep sliding the momentum little by little. The drive would stall inside the 15 again, though, leading to another Fry field goal and a 24-13 game.

The Wildcats continued to be stymied on offense, going three-and-out on its third straight drive of the half with four minutes to go in the third and the Gamecocks took over with the comeback attempt thriving. Strong runs from Shon Carson would put them down to the two yard line, but a penalty would set them back.

As the third quarter came to a close, the Gamecocks held a 136-22 advantage in yards gained in the 15-minute span, but were still in search of that elusive touchdown. The penalty would ultimately come back to cost them and a third straight drive would be sealed by a field goal.

After a fourth-straight punt from Kentucky, the Gamecocks would use some clutch throws from Orth to finally hit pay-dirt. Facing a third-and-12 on their own 33, Orth hit Cooper for 16. Later in the drive, he connected with Deebo Samuel for 10 on fourth-and-two, and on the very next play Jerell Adams took a post route 33 yards for the score and a 24-22 game. It was Orth's first career touchdown pass.

On the team's two-point attempt to try and tie the game, Cooper would fumble and Kentucky took it 98 yards for two points of their own and a 26-22 advantage. It would be a game-defining play, as it meant the Gamecocks needed a touchdown to complete the comeback.

The Wildcats would convert their first first down of the half with eight minutes to go, trying to respond to Carolina's comeback. It would go no further than that, but put 89 yards in front of the Gamecocks with just seven minutes left to go. What started as a healthy drive would be stopped after Orth was intercepted at the Kentucky 23 after being flushed from the pocket. The Wildcats were able to seal the win after a pair of first downs burned Carolina's remaining timeouts.

Will Muschamp is in his second season directing the Gamecocks' football fortunes. Muschamp was introduced as the University of South Carolina's 34th head football coach in a press conference held at Williams-Brice Stadium on December 7, 2015.

In his first season in Columbia, Muschamp guided the Gamecocks to a 6-7 mark and a spot in the Birmingham Bowl. The Gamecocks doubled their win total from the previous season while increasing their SEC wins from one to three. The Gamecocks started as many true freshman (7) as any school in the country, and were the only Division I school to have true freshmen lead the team in both passing (Jake Bentley) and rushing (Rico Dowdle). Seventysix of the Gamecocks' 113-man Birmingham Bowl roster (67.3 percent) were either freshmen or sophomores in Muschamp's first campaign.

Regarded as an outstanding defensive mind, Muschamp is a 22-year coaching veteran, including 14 years in the Southeastern Conference. In five seasons as a head coach, all in the SEC, Muschamp owns a 34-28 record, a .548 winning percentage. His previous head coaching experience came at the University of Florida where he posted a 28-21 record from 2011-14. He led the Gators to three bowl games in his four seasons in Gainesville and was recognized as the SEC Coach of the Year in 2012 after guiding Florida to an 11-2 record and a Top-10 finish.

As an assistant coach, the Rome, Ga., native has worked in two national championship games (2003 and 2009), winning with LSU in 2003, and coached in a pair of BCS bowl games following the 2008 and 2012 seasons.



He has coached in and won three conference championship games, twice in the SEC and once in the Big 12. He was a finalist for the 2007 Broyles Award, presented to the nation's top assistant coach.

Prior to coming to Columbia, Muschamp most recently served as the defensive coordinator at Auburn University in 2015, his third stint as an SEC defensive coordinator. He also held that title with Auburn from 2006-07 and at LSU from 2002-04. In his six seasons as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp's units ranked among the nation's Top-10 in total defense and in scoring defense five times.

Muschamp's first full-time coaching experience in the SEC came at LSU. He was the Tigers' linebacker coach for one season before being elevated to defensive coordinator from 2002-04. His 2003 defense helped the Tigers to the national championship by leading the nation both in scoring defense (11.0 points per game) and total defense (252.0 yards per game), while finishing second nationally in pass efficiency defense (89.8) and third in rushing defense (67.0 yards per game).

Prior to taking the reins at Florida, Muschamp served as the defensive coordinator at the University of Texas from 2008-10. Under his guidance, the Longhorn defense ranked No. 1 in the nation with 119 sacks and ranked in the Top-10 nationally allowing 2.9 yards per rushing attempt (third), 96.7 rushing yards per game (fourth) and 297.4 yards per game (seventh), all Big 12 bests during that span. In 2009, the Longhorns played in the BCS National Championship game. Under Muschamp's tutelage at Texas, Brian Orakpo won the 2008 Rotary Lombardi, Bronko Nagurski and Ted Hendricks awards. In the 2009 and 2010 NFL Drafts, Muschamp had a combined eight players drafted, seven in the first four rounds, including first-rounders Brian Orakpo and Earl Thomas.

In four of his nine seasons as an FBS defensive coordinator, his teams have allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game and twice led the nation in rushing defense. His 2003 LSU defense led the country by allowing 67 yards per game on the ground, the best mark by an SEC team in the 2000s, while Texas gave up just 73.1 yards on the ground in 2009 to pace the nation.

A 1994 Georgia graduate, Muschamp moved immediately into coaching, working as a graduate assistant at Auburn from 1995-96, while earning his master's degree. He served as a secondary coach at West Georgia (1998) and Eastern Kentucky (1999) before moving into his first defensive coordinator position at Valdosta State for the 2000 season, where he helped the Blazers to a 10-2 record and the Gulf South championship.

Muschamp also logged a stint in the NFL, working as the Miami Dolphins Assistant Head Coach for Defense in 2005 under Nick Saban.

During his playing career at Georgia, Muschamp earned his way from walk-on to scholarship player by the spring of his redshirt freshman season and eventually was named co-captain as a senior. A safety on the gridiron, he earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.

Born August 3, 1971, Muschamp and his wife, the former Carol Davis, have two sons, Jackson and Whit.



CHARLOTTE, N.C. — Behind a resurgent defensive effort in the second half and three touchdowns from junior Deebo Samuel, South Carolina (1-0) claimed a 35-28 victory over NC State (0-1) in the Belk College Kickoff at Bank of America Stadium.

The Gamecock defense came out on fire in the second half, shutting down an NC State drive after five plays with a pair of quarterback hurries and a sack by Keir Thomas. Chris Lammons made it a short field, returning the punt 26 yards to near midfield. Three plays later, quarterback Jake Bentley,



after escaping pressure, hit Deebo Samuel for a 39-yard score.

Defense set up the next Gamecock touchdown, as the Wolfpack fumbled the football on Dante Sawyer's sack. Bryson Allen-Williams recovered it at the NC State 13. Two plays later, Rico Dowdle sprinted seven yards to hand the Gamecocks a 35-21 lead.

NC State took back momentum after the Gamecocks were stuffed deep in their own territory and the Wolfpack took over at the SC 46 after the punt. The Wolfpack methodically went 46 yards in nine plays, with Ryan Finley hitting Jaylen Samuels from one yard out to close within a score. An interception by Wolfpack Johnathan Alston gave the ball back to NC State. But the Gamecock defense stood strong, keeping NC State from gaining a second first down. South Carolina punted the ball back to NC State, but the Wolfpack turned over the ball on downs after D.J. Smith tackled Samuels just short of the first-down marker with 4:34 remaining.

The Wolfpack got the ball back with three minutes to go and drove inside the Gamecock 10, but the Gamecocks batted passes away from NC State receivers, the final one by D.J. Smith, to close out the victory.

The teams battled to a draw in the second half, scoring three touchdowns each in the contest. Samuel got the Gamecocks off to a blazing start, returning the opening kickoff 97 yards for a score, his second career kickoff return for a touchdown. The Wolfpack answered with a 14-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by Finley's six-yard keeper.

South Carolina retook the lead on its next possession, as Bentley hit Dowdle out of the backfield for a 34-yard TD strike. Finley and the Wolfpack knotted the contest again, as Finley went 4-for-5 for 56 yards in a nine-play drive. Nyheim Hines capped the drive with a two-yard scoring run.

After SC went three-and-out, Sawyer forced a fumble, and Rashad Fenton recovered it to set up the next Garnet and Black points. Bentley kept the nascent drive going with a 13-yard scamper before hitting Bryan Edwards for a 26-yard strike to put the Gamecocks to first-and-goal. Bentley capped the drive with a six-yard pass caught by Samuel to put South Carolina ahead again, 21-14.

The Wolfpack missed a 29-yard field goal, giving the ball back to the Gamecocks with four minutes to go, but the NC State defense scuttled it around midfield, getting the ball back with 1:47 to play in the half. The Wolfpack marched to a tying score, with Finley hitting Jakobi Meyers with a four-yard scoring pass, tying the game at 21 at the half.



**COLUMBIA, MO.** — Deebo Samuel ran for two touchdowns to help South Carolina cruise to a 31-13 victory over Missouri on Saturday night in the SEC opener for both teams.

Missouri (1-1, 0-1) led 10-0 early in the second quarter when tight end Jason Reese slipped past linebacker T.J. Brunson, hauled in a Drew Lock pass and outran his pursuers. South Carolina (2-0, 1-0) trailed for only 30 seconds. Samuel returned the ensuing kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown - his second TD return in two weeks. After the Gamecocks' Jamyest Williams intercepted Lock. Samuel struck again, so



tercepted Lock, Samuel struck again, scoring on a 25-yard jet sweep. Samuel finished with five catches for 45 yards.

Jake Bentley was 18 of 28 for 187 yards passing and threw a 39-yard touchdown pass to Hayden Hurst to stretch South Carolina's lead to 21-10 midway through the third quarter. Hurst added a 2-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter.

Lock had 245 yards passing and a touchdown, but was intercepted twice.

#### **GAME CHANGER**

Missouri took a 10-0 lead with 13:07 remaining in the second quarter, but Deebo Samuel quickly changed that, returning a 97-yard kickoff for a touchdown for the second straight game. It was Samuel's Gamecock best third career kickoff return for a touchdown. Samuel then took advantage of Jamyest Williams'first career interception, scoring on a 25-yard run on the drive's first play, giving the Gamecocks the lead for good.

### **KEY STAT**

3 -- For the second straight game, the Gamecocks won the turnover battle, turning a trio of Tiger miscues into 14 points. Jamyest Williams' interception turned into a Deebo Samuelrushing touchdown. Then a fumble on a punt in the fourth quarter led to Hayden Hurst's second touchdown of the contest.

### NOTABLES

- South Carolina is 2-0 on the young season for the first time since the 2012 campaign.
- Hayden Hurst had a touchdown reception of 39 yards and a two-yard rushing touchdown on the night. It was his second and third career touchdowns (two receiving, one rushing) after putting his first one on the board in the 2016 Birmingham Bowl against USF. Hurst ended the game with three receptions for 69 yards.
- Bryson Allen-Williams recorded his third interception in the past four games with his pick in the fourth quarter. Allen-Williams had interceptions at Clemson (Nov. 26, 2016) and against USF in the Birmingham Bowl (Dec. 29, 2016).
- Samuel becomes the second player in South Carolina history to record a kickoff return for a touchdown in back-to-back games. King Dixon did the trick in games against Texas (Oct. 5, 1957) and Furman (Oct. 12, 1957). He has a school record three kickoff returns for touchdowns, all coming in the last five games.
