LEXINGTON, Ky. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team dips back into non-conference play when it heads to Lexington, Ky. to square off with the University of Kentucky Saturday, Sept. 30. Kickoff from Kroger Stadium is set for 4 p.m.

Both teams enter the contest hoping to shake off heartbreaking home setbacks in conference play. The Eagles (2-1, 0-1 MAC) were stung in double overtime by Ohio, 27-20, while the Wildcats (3-1, 1-1 SEC) came up just short on a 57-yard field goal attempt as time expired against No. 20 Florida, 28-27.

The contest will be broadcast on the SEC Network. The game will also be aired on WEMU (89.1 FM) with veteran broadcasters **Matt Shepard, Rob Rubick** and **Chad Bush** calling the action on the field.

EMU IN THE BLUEGRASS: Saturday's game marks just EMU's fifth venture into the Commonwealth of Kentucky and its first since 1999 when the team battled Louisville. Eastern Michigan has an all-time combined record of 3-6-1 against Eastern Kentucky (0-3-1), Kentucky State (2-1), Louisville (0-1), and Western Kentucky (1-1).

ALL-TIME VS KENTUCKY: This will be the first all-time meeting on the gridiron between the Eagles and Wildcats in their respective histories. EMU has a history with the Wildcats in a host of other sports though, having met them on the hardwood twice in both men's (0-2) and women's (0-2) basketball, as well as five times in volleyball (1-4). EMU and UK have met the most times in baseball with 27 meetings on the diamond (4-23). They have also met once in gymnastics earlier in 2017, when Kentucky took the meet, 195.075-192.050.

Requesting Credentials

Credentials can be obtained by contacting **Greg Steiner** in the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office. Requests must be received at least two days prior to the game. Passes that are not mailed will be available at the Will Call window at the Convocation Center. Parking for media will be at Oestrike Stadium.

Practice Procedures

Most practices are open to the media. However, all media are required to make an advance call to the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office to check on the status of practice for a particular day. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue.

Head Coach **Chris Creighton** is available to speak to the media via phone Monday-Thursday mornings. Coach Creighton will be available on the Mid-American Conference weekly conference call on Monday mornings. Individual players are available for interviews Monday-Wednesday. Please contact the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office at least 24-hours in advance to set up interviews. Players should not be contacted for interviews at their residences, on their cell phones, via e-mail, Facebook, Twitter and all other social networking entities.

During regular season practices, still photographers and videographers will be allowed to shoot only during pre-practice individual drills, which usually last approximately 15 minutes at the beginning of practice.

Media members covering practices or scrimmages will not be permitted to report any scouting information (formations, personnel groupings, etc.) without first speaking with a member of the EMU coaching staff or the media relations office. Failure to adhere to this guideline could result in the closing of all practices and scrimmages to the media.

First-year players, including freshmen and transfers, will be made available to the media only after they have made a significant contribution or at the coach's discretion.

Interview Policies (Postgame)

Post-game interviews for EMU will be conducted in Media Room A in the Convocation Center at the south end of Rynearson Stadium. The visiting coach will do interviews outside their lockerroom. Both head coaches will be available to the media after a 10-minute cooling off period. Individual players may be available for interviews at the conclusion of the game. **The lockerroom is closed to the media at all times.**

In conjunction with NCAA and College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) policies, there is to be absolutely no cheering and/or criticizing players, coaches or other game officials at any point before, during or after the contest. Failure to abide by this will result in your removal from the press box.

HOYING GOING THE OTHER WAY: Sophomore **Brody Hoying** has been a menace to opposing offenses so far this season, as he has at least one turnover in each of the first three games. The safety notched an interception in games one and two, and forced two fumbles in game three against Ohio. **As of Sept. 24, he is just one of three players in Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) ranks with at least two forced fumbles and two interceptions.**

His efforts have him ranked tops in the conference and country in multiple categories, including: fumbles forced (MAC 2/NCAA 3), fumbles recovered (MAC 2/NCAA 14), interceptions (MAC 3/NCAA 12), passes defended (MAC 5/NCAA 30), solo tackles (MAC 4/NCAA 34).

STINGY DEFENSE: In the first three games of the season, the Eagles' defense has been the catalyst for the team with its stingy play. The Eagles' D has given up just two regulation touchdowns, including one against Charlotte in its first possession, and one at Rutgers. In the 27-20 overtime defeat to Ohio, the Bobcats scored three times, but one came in regulation on a pick-six, and the other two came on a short field in OT.

THREE-AND-OUT: The EMU defense has been one of the best nationwide at getting of the field in 2017. Defensive coordinator **Neal Neathery's** crew is averaging 6.0 three-and-outs per game, which ranks 12th in the FBS.

TURNOVERS GALORE: A huge part of EMU's hot start on defense has been the turnover battle. In three games, EMU has five picks, which is 16th most in the country. They also have forced three fumbles, recovering two of them, which is 62nd in the nation. The seven total turnovers is 41st in the FBS, while EMU's +3 turnover margin comes in at 21st in the nation.

SACK LUNCH: EMU's defense was in the backfield all-day against Ohio, as the Eagles tallied four sacks, seven tackles-for-loss, and 10 QB hurries against the Bobcats. Leading the way was senior **Luke Maclean**, who had a career-best two sacks, 2.0 TFLs, and three hurries.

Coming into the contest, Ohio's line had given up just two sacks in its first three games.

WHAT A TURNAROUND: Now in year two of **Neal Neathery's** system, the Eagle defense has made great strides in several key statistical categories from last season, including points allowed per game. Overall, EMU has posted the 14th-best improvement nationally.

OVERTIME HEARTBREAK: The 27-20 double-overtime defeat to Ohio was the 11th overtime game in EMU history, and just the fourth multi-OT contest. EMU is now 5-6 all-time in extra time, including 1-1 in double-OT and 2-2 in multi-OT. The game marked the first multi-overtime game for the Eagles since a four-overtime affair at Ford Field against Central Michigan in 2004, in which EMU was victorious, 61-58.

HEAD COACH
CHRIS CREIGHTON

FOURTH YEAR AT EMU • KENYON, 1991 • @COACH_CREIGHTON

Chris Creighton was named the 37th Head Football Coach at Eastern Michigan University on Dec. 11, 2013. Creighton will start his fourth season as the head man at EMU in the

2017 season.

During his 20-year head coaching career, the 48-year-old Creighton has accumulated eight conference titles and an all-time record of 150-73 (.672 winning percentage).

Voted as a finalist for the 2016 American Football Coaches Awards' first-ever Comeback Coach of the Year, Creighton led EMU to the program's winning season since 1995 and its first bowl appearance since 1987.

The 2016 Eagles finished in a seven-way tie for the most improved program in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in 2016, bettering its win total from one win in 2015, to seven this season. Creighton led the Eagles to their first bowl appearance in 29 years following one of EMU's most successful seasons in its 125-year history. The turnaround is tied for the largest in school history, equaled only by the 1924 and 1977 teams. The then-Hurons went 8-0 under Head Coach Elton J. Rynearson in 1925 after going 2-5-1 in 1924. Meanwhile, the 1977 club finished 8-3 following a 2-9 campaign in 1976 for Head Coach Ed Chelbek.

As an offense, EMU ranked 35th in the FBS in total offense, posting 455.2 yards per game in 13 contests. The team also shattered the school record for total offense with 5,917 yards, breaking the previous record of 5,010. Other notable offensive highlights for the Eagles this past season include ranking 16th nationally in third down conversions, 18th in passing offense, 21st in red zone offense, and 25th in first down offense.

On defense, the Eagles saw a remarkable improvement in its first season under defensive coordinator Neal Neathery. EMU allowed 86.5 yards per game less in 2016 (432.7 per game) than it did in 2015 (519.2 per game) to rank 83rd in the country and seventh in the MAC. The team also took a huge step forward in stopping the run, as the defense gave up 149 yards per game less on the ground in 2016 than it did a year earlier. Overall, EMU was nationally ranked seventh in fumbles recovered, 32nd in turnovers gained, 58th in interceptions, and 59th in rushing defense.

During the 2015 campaign, the Eagles finished the regular season ranked nationally in the top-60 in seven statistical categories to go along with 11 top-five rankings in the Mid-American Conference. EMU finished the year with 39 touchdowns, a mark that is tied for the fifth-most in a single-season during the squad's 124-year history, while its 4,560 yards of total offense is also the fifth most.

On the ground, EMU churned out the 14th-best single-season rushing total at 1,894 yards. Through the air, EMU quarterbacks combined for 2,666 yards passing, ranking seventh in program single-season annals. EMU's passing attack spread the wealth with seven different receivers having 20-or-more receptions, Eastern Michigan was one of just three schools nationally to accomplish that feat.

Individually, Darius Jackson turned in one of the finest seasons in Eastern Michigan history in 2015, setting the school's single-season record with 16 touchdowns. He also became the first EMU tailback since Bronson Hill in 2013 to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season and is just the 13th player in program history to do so.

In his six seasons at the helm of the Bulldogs, Creighton racked up a 35-13 (.729) record in Pioneer Football League action and a 31-9 (.775) record the last five seasons. Just the seventh DU coach to win 40-or-more games and the fastest to do so, Creighton needed just 60 games to accomplish the feat.

In his time at Drake, Creighton boasted a 30-5 home record and a 21-2 home conference record, going undefeated against five conference opponents. Drake had an 11-game home win streak during Creighton's tenure as well as winning 16-straight home conference games with him at the helm.

The energetic but veteran coach was named a winner of the Giant Steps Award presented by the National Consortium for Academics and Sports as part of National Student-Athlete Day on April 6, 2011. Creighton, awarded in the Coaching category, was one of just five 2011 winners of the Giant Steps Award, given annually to individuals who use sport to positively affect social

change, actualizing the mission of the NCAS. The awards honor student-athletes, athletic administrators, civic leaders, coaches, parents, organizations, and other individuals who demonstrate an outstanding ability to manage life on and off the field, and who demonstrate a commitment to the betterment of society.

As an All-America quarterback, Creighton led Kenyon (Ohio) College to its only North Coast Athletic Conference title in 1989 and was named conference player of the year after setting single-season conference records for passing yardage (2,843) and touchdowns (29). He was inducted into the Kenyon College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

Creighton earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Kenyon College in 1991 and a master's degree from Concordia (Ill.) University in 1993.

Creighton is the first active head coach to be hired at Eastern Michigan since Jim Harkema in 1983. Harkema was the head coach at Grand Valley State University (1973-82) before taking over the EMU program and leading it to its only Mid-American Conference Championship in 1987 and last bowl appearance.

Chris and his wife, Heather, have two daughters, Hallie and Kate, and a son, Luke.

HOT, HOT, HOT: The game time temperature at kickoff against Ohio, Sept. 23, was a steamy 93 degrees, with it feeling even hotter on the gray turf inside 'The Factory.' It marked the warmest temperature during an EMU game since modern records began being tracked during the 1999 campaign. The previous record was 88 degrees in the Eagles' Sept. 30, 2006, contest in Lafayette, La. against the University of Louisiana-Lafayette. EMU also played in a humid 87-degree contest at Navy in 2003.

In EMU's last 146 games dating back to the start of the 2005 campaign, the average temperature at kickoff has been 59.39 degrees. A total of 14 of those games have been played in conditions above 80 degrees. Meanwhile, six have occurred below the freezing mark with a low of 24 at kickoff.

COACH TO CURE: For the 10th-consecutive year, American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) members nationwide will join in support of the Coach To Cure MD program. EMU coaches will wear the traditional Coach To Cure MD logo patch on the sidelines.

ALL-TIME VS THE SEC: EMU will look to add another notch in its belt after defeating its first 'Power 5' opponent in program history earlier this season against Rutgers, by trying to knock off its first Southeastern Conference Team in its 10th try. EMU is winless against six teams from the Birmingham, Ala.-based conference.

EMU has tangled with an SEC team in each of Head Coach Chris Creighton's four years in Ypsilanti. The Eagles battled Florida in 2014 (L, 0-65), No. 9 LSU in 2015 (L, 24-44), and Missouri last year (L, 21-61).

HE CAN DO IT ALL, FOLKS: Not only is senior quarterback **Brogan Roback** one of the prolific passers in the conference and country, he has also discovered another talent that has been put to good use on the field this season. That skill is punting. The veteran has seven "pooch" style punts for an average of 44.86 yards this season, including a team-long of 61 yards, three of 50+ yards, and two that were downed inside the 20.

ROBACK RISING: Senior quarterback **Brogan Roback** has put up standout numbers in his four seasons in the Green and White, placing him near the top of the EMU record books for numerous categories. For his career, he has 6,561 passing yards and 40 passing touchdowns, which ranks third all-time in program history for each category. Meanwhile, his 569 completions and 6,828 total yards are both fourth in the EMU annals.

HOYING ROLLING UP THE HONORS: Accolades continue to roll in for **Brody Hoying**, as the Eagles' defensive back was named the MAC's Scholar Athlete of the Week for the period ending Sept. 24. Plus, after already earning the MAC's West Division Defensive Player of the Week honor, he also garnered honorable mention Player of the Week accolades from the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award.

Hoying led EMU's defense in a double-overtime game against Ohio, Sept. 23. Hoying paced the Green and White with a career-best 10 tackles, eight solo and two assisted, while also making his presence known in the turnover game as he has done all year. Having already registered a pair of interceptions in EMU's first two games of the season, Hoying recorded a career-high two forced fumbles against the Bobcats. The Coldwater, Ohio native also recovered a fumble, running it back 40 yards to set the Eagles up with prime field position, ultimately leading to a field goal.

BECK NAMED A SEMIFINALIST FOR NFF CAMPBELL TROPHY: The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) has announced its 181 semifinalists for the 2017 William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments. The Campbell Trophy is recognized as college football's premier scholar-athlete award. The 181 individuals come from all divisions of college football. EMU senior linebacker **Jason Beck** is one of the individuals nominated for this year's award. Beck is currently pursuing his bachelor's degree in sport management, in which he maintains a 3.28 grade point average.

EAGLES IN TIGHT GAMES: Eastern has become accustomed to playing in games that go down to the wire. Since the start of 2016, the Eagles are 6-4 in games decided by seven points or less.

Last year, the Eagles bested Wyoming, 27-24, Bowling Green, 28-25, Ohio, 27-20, Ball State, 48-41, and Central Michigan, 26-21. This year, EMU eked out a 16-13 win at Rutgers, Sept. 9. Two of those blemishes have come in overtime (2016 - Northern Illinois, 24-31; 2017 - Ohio, 20-27).

HUNNID TIMES 10: With his 1,135 career yards, senior wideout **Sergio Bailey II** (@JustHunnids) sits at 19th on the all-time receiving yardage list in just his second season in the program.

SPREADING THE LOVE: In the first three games of the season, senior quarterback **Brogan Roback** has spread the ball around to a multitude of targets, finding 10 different receivers against Charlotte, eight different receivers against Rutgers, and then 12 different targets against Ohio.

ON THE HORIZON: Eastern returns to Mid-American Conference play when it has its first conference road battle against MAC West favorite the University of Toledo Saturday, Oct. 7. The kickoff time against the Rockets from the Glass Bowl is set for noon.

PICKING OFF A POWER 5: With the thrilling 16-13 win over Rutgers, Sept. 9, Eastern Michigan defeated a 'Power 5' program for the first time in program history in 59 tries. In addition, it was also EMU's first win over a Big Ten Conference team in 39 attempts.

BECK ON THE STOP: A name Eagle fans have become accustomed to hearing in on tackles over the last four years is senior **Jason Beck**. The Indianapolis, Ind. product, who transitioned from safety to linebacker this season, has racked up 285 so far for his career, placing him 19th all-time at EMU. Should Beck replicate his 104-tackle output from a season ago, he will finish in the top-five in program history.

HARRIS EARNS POW HONORS AFTER STRONG SHOWING IN PISCATAWAY: Junior defensive lineman **Jeremiah Harris** wreaked havoc on the Rutgers offense all night in a thrilling 16-13 win over the Scarlet Knights, Sept. 9. For his efforts, he was named the MAC West Division Defensive Player of the Week for the second time in his career.

The Lambertville, Mich. native had the game-sealing sack on the final play of the game to clinch the first victory over a 'Power 5' program in program history. In addition to the sack, Harris added a tackle for loss, a pass breakup at the line, a QB hurry, as well as an interception to halt a potential Rutgers scoring drive. While not showing out in the box score, Harris was the catalyst for a defense that held Rutgers to just 128 yards rushing, 198 passing, and 15 first downs. The game-winning sack was the 6.5 of his career, while the pick was his second.

MR.CLUTCH: In the 16-13 win over Rutgers, Sept. 9, quarterback **Brogan Roback** led EMU on a seven-play, 77-yard scoring drive early in the fourth quarter that resulted in what ended up being the game-winning field goal from **Paulie Fricano**. It was the fifth game-winning drive Roback has led in his EMU career, as well as being the third-longest yardage wise.

PICKS GALORE: The three interceptions in the 24-7 win over Charlotte, Sept. 1 were the most picks in a single game for the Eagles since the 2008 season opener, a 52-0 victory over Indiana State.

MADE IN MICHIGAN: The 2017 EMU squad boasts 36 players that hail from the Great Lakes State, 22 more than the next closest state.

DEFENSE KEEPING IT ON THE DOWN LOW: By holding Charlotte to just seven points in the 24-7 win, Sept. 1, EMU held its season-opening opponent to its fewest points since 2008, when it shutout Indiana State, 52-0. The Eagle defense only got stronger as the game went on as well, as Eastern held the 49ers to just 20 total yards over its final six possessions.

Furthermore, EMU did not allow Charlotte to venture into the red zone in 14 possessions. The last time EMU's defense held an opponent outside the 20-yard line for the entire game was Sept. 10, 2011, against Alabama State University. Coincidentally, that is also the last time the Eagles limited the opposition to just seven points in a game.

ERIKSEN EARNS MAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS: Running back **Ian Eriksen** was named the Mid-American Conference West Division Offensive Player of the Week for the period ending Sept. 2. It is the first weekly award of his career. Eriksen paced the EMU offense in a 24-7 win over Charlotte, Sept. 1. The Clarkston, Mich. native rushed for 37 yards on seven carries, averaging a team-best 5.3 yards per touch. He also punched in two scores, marking the fourth time in his career that he has found the end zone twice in a single game.

126 YEARS OF FOOTBALL: This is the 126th year for the EMU football team. The first year of intercollegiate football in Ypsilanti was 1891, when the team, then known as the Michigan Normal College Normalites, posted an 0-2 record. EMU has fielded a team every year since 1891 with one exception, when the 1944 season was canceled because of World War II.

BRODY TO THE HOUSE: In Charlotte's first drive, just its sixth play of the game, **Brody Hoying** jumped a pass and took it 35 yards the other way to the house to open the scoring in a 24-7 win over the 49ers. The first interception of Hoying's EMU career was also the first pick-six for the Eagles since **Jaylen Pickett** did so against the very same 49er squad, one season ago, Sept. 17, 2016.

In addition, it was the first time EMU's season-opening score came on the defensive side of the ball since 1995, when the Eagles housed a fumble recovery 45 yards against the University of Akron.

KICKING OFF THE SEASON AT HOME: With the victory over Charlotte, EMU moved 75-45-5 (.620) all-time in its home opener. Furthermore, the Eagles are now 42-17-1 (.708) when opening the season at home. This year's opener also marked the 10th time in the last 14 years that the Eagles have opened the season at home in Rynearson Stadium.

2017 CAPTAINS: Eastern Michigan University's football team announced its team captains for the 2017 campaign, April 24. Providing leadership for the squad will be seniors **Jason Beck** and **Brogan Roback**, as well as redshirt juniors **Jeremiah Harris** and **Shaq Vann**. Beck, Roback, and Harris earn the honor for the first time, while Vann received the distinction for the second consecutive season.

TACKLES ON TOP OF TACKLES: With eight defensive starters and 24 lettermen returning on the defensive side of the ball in 2017, EMU also returns 86 percent of its total tackles from a season ago. According to Phil Steele, this is the fourth-most returning tackles by any team in the country.

YARDS ON TOP OF YARDS: EMU also returns almost all of its skill position players, including the QB, five of its six top rushers, and eight of its top nine receivers. As a result of this, the Eagles have 81.4 percent of its yards back from a season ago, which ranks 26th best in the country according to Phil Steele.

RETOOLED OFFENSIVE LINE: After having one of the most experienced offensive lines in the country in 2016, with five fifth-year seniors seeing time, it was well known the Eagles would have to do some retooling in 2017. Coming into the year, Eastern returns 27 total starts, including two primary starters from a season ago in juniors **Jimmy Leatiota** and **Ka'John Armstrong**, who have 13 and 11 starts, respectively, in their careers.

SHAQ VANN BACK IN COMMISSION: A welcome re-addition to the offense this season will be redshirt junior running back **Shaq Vann**, who missed almost all of last season with an injury. In 2015, Vann was EMU's Offensive Newcomer of the Year after totaling 850 yards and six scores as a redshirt freshman. In 2016, Vann was expected to be Eastern's primary back, but a shoulder injury in game two of the season derailed that plan. Now in 2017, Vann, a two-time captain and two-time Doak Walker Award preseason candidate, will lead a deep stable of backs, who return four 100-yard rushers from a season ago.

42nd FOR THE MAC: The 2017 season marks the 42nd year that the Eagles have been a part of the Mid-American Conference football championship race. EMU was admitted into the league in 1971, but a complete league schedule was not available until the 1976 season.

#2 BACK ON THE FIELD: For EMU football one number has been held out of circulation since October 2013 – the No. 2. Wide receiver **Demarius Reed**, who passed away on Oct. 18, 2013, was the last Eagle to be issued the number.

Now nearly five years later with the blessing of Reed’s family and former teammates, his number will once again grace the field at Rynearson Stadium. Moving forward, Eastern Michigan will issue the No. 2 to the squad’s best/senior wide receiver as a way of remembering and honoring Reed.

Players will not get the opportunity to choose No. 2 by picking it out in the equipment room. They will earn it through their actions both on and off the field. This player will possess the integrity, character, and selflessness all of EMU’s football players and representatives strive to build within themselves. This season senior wide receiver **Sergio Bailey II** earned the honor to don the No. 2 jersey as part of the new tradition.

PEARL ANNIVERSARY: The 2017 season marks 30 years since the historic 1987 season for EMU football. That season, the then-Hurons went 10-2, including 7-1 in MAC play, to capture the lone conference title in program history. With their efforts, EMU was invited to the California Bowl, just the second bowl appearance in program history, coming away victorious over San Jose State, 30-27, for the only bowl win to date for the program.

A CHANGE IN THE GUARD: College athletics has long been a male dominated world, but times are changing with Eastern Michigan standing at the forefront of it. **Jennifer Brown**, EMU’s Associate Athletics Director for Sports Medicine, is just one of nine female athletic trainers to oversee an FBS football team. In addition, she is one of just five females who is a head of a sport medicine department in the FBS. She arrived in Ypsilanti in 2015 following an 11-year tenure in the Northwestern University Athletics Department where she served as the Associate Athletics Trainer. At NU, Brown worked directly with the Wildcats’ football team.

LET THERE BE LIGHT! Fans flocking to “The Factory” in 2017 will notice a major lighting upgrade just in time for the upcoming season. Rynearson Stadium will be illuminated with high-performance energy-efficient LED stadium lights from Ephesus Lighting, Inc., the leader in providing LED lighting solutions for sports stadiums, fields and arenas. The new light towers are 40-feet taller than the previous 100-foot tall lights towers that were installed in 1974 when the Detroit Wheels of the World Football League used the stadium as their home field.

THE FACTORY

Toughness. Pride. Resilience. Those key words describe the EMU football program under Head Coach **Chris Creighton**. They are also terms befitting the proud residents of southeastern Michigan and their hard-working demeanor.

Inspired by this region of the state and the student-athletes' own backgrounds, the team has challenged itself to be "E Tough," committed to great effort, sacrifice and triumphing in the face of adversity. In this spirit, the team has nicknamed Rynearson Stadium "The Factory," a place where coaches and staff will go to work each day to help "E Tough" student-athletes become scholars, leaders, champions and impact men. "The Factory" will be highlighted by Division I Football's first gray FieldTurf playing surface.

Since taking over reigns of EMU Football in December 2013, Creighton has rallied the program to "close the gap" between its current status and the pursuit of its true potential. He has studied the school, its surroundings, recruiting base and the current student-athletes. The one common thread throughout has been an uncommon 'toughness' that permeates the program.

In this spirit, the program's E Tough mentality represents:

- Team first
- Obsessed with getting better
- Unwavering in adversity
- Great effort
- Heat

The concept of the "EMU Gray" field was born during one of the squad's notoriously intense winter workouts in 2014. The squad was challenged to an outdoor practice on the snow-covered Rynearson Stadium field rather than the warm confines of their indoor practice facility. True to their E Tough demeanor, the team accepted the challenge. Throughout each drill of the bitter cold practice, Creighton delivered the message that EMU Football has the will to compete against "anyone, anytime and anywhere... even on a parking lot covered with broken glass." Inspired by his team's toughness and commitment that day, Creighton's idea of an "EMU Gray" field was born and soon shared with administrators.

The new look within Rynearson Stadium, and moniker, "The Factory" serves as visual and name recognition for the program's ideals. They are a constant reminder to the student-athletes that being E Tough means coming ready to roll up their sleeves and to never give in or let up.

"Our colors are green and white but our collars are blue," said Creighton. "The Factory is where our coaching staff goes to work and our players develop. It is our home and one that we will protect. When opponents come to The Factory we want to make it known that they are in for a 60-minute fight. Our goal is to make it one of the toughest places to play in the Mid-American Conference."

Southeastern Michigan has long been viewed as one of the most significant manufacturing centers in the country, and the iconic 'Automotive Capital of the World.' Despite battling difficult times in recent years, local communities' toughness and resilience has been on display, as the region is experiencing a dramatic rebirth.

EMU football student-athletes come from these communities and have brought this toughness to the team. Ypsilanti has its own proud history in the automobile and manufacturing industries. The city was the home of Apex Motors, Preston Tucker and his Preston '48, and the last Hudson automobile dealership. The nearby Willow Run manufacturing complex played a critical role in producing B-24 "Liberator" heavy bombers in the early years of World War II. It was also at this location that Rose Will Monroe, the film and poster representation of "Rosie the Riveter," actually worked as a riveter before becoming the manufacturing icon of the era.

BUILDING BLOCKS

When Head Coach Chris Creighton came onboard in 2014 he helped establish some new EMU initiatives.

- **The Wrench** - a 51-pound pipe wrench given to Coach Creighton. It helps serve as a symbol of the team's mission to "close the gap." The tool's vices represent the gap.
- **The Wall** - prior to running onto the field at home games EMU will break through a cinder block wall.
- **Hammers of the Week** - the coaching staff will select hammers of the week for the big hit of the week. The selected players will have their number put on the sledge hammers used to knock down the wall.
- **Turn it Up, Turn It Green** - a pregame prep rally inside the Convocation Center. The football team will arrive along with a special performance by the EMU marching band.

CHAMPIONSHIP BUILDING PLAN

Eastern Michigan University is in the process of developing a comprehensive and transformative vision to enhance academic opportunities, improve health and well-being for all students, and update athletic facilities to positively impact the University.

The plan was articulated at the April 21 2017, Board of Regents meeting in the approval of the development of a comprehensive fundraising plan, which stated: "This transformational initiative will support, among other areas, student success, scholarships, and facilities. Facility investments will be identified based on an examination of all facilities, but will include: the Rec/IM complex; College of Technology and College of Health and Human Services; expanded athletics facilities; and improvements to other academic and student facilities to be determined as the campaign is developed and launched."

The intercollegiate athletics component to enhance facilities is the Championship Building Plan, which will consolidate department infrastructure, create academic opportunities, and strengthen student, fan, community and alumni experiences.

The vision will help unite nearly all of EMU Athletics on the University's West Campus with upgrades planned for training, practice, and competition for student-athletes. The project would be the first major athletics facility enhancement designed to enrich nearly every one of EMU's 21 varsity teams since the Convocation Center was completed in 1998.

A \$6 million gift from the Power2Change Foundation was the largest gift in the history of the University. As permanent recognition of the Power2Change Foundation's generosity, the cornerstone element of the Championship Building Plan will be called the Power2Change Center.

Once construction is completed, the project will include an outdoor track/soccer complex, a student-athlete performance center, a gymnastics/wrestling practice facility, and an indoor practice facility.

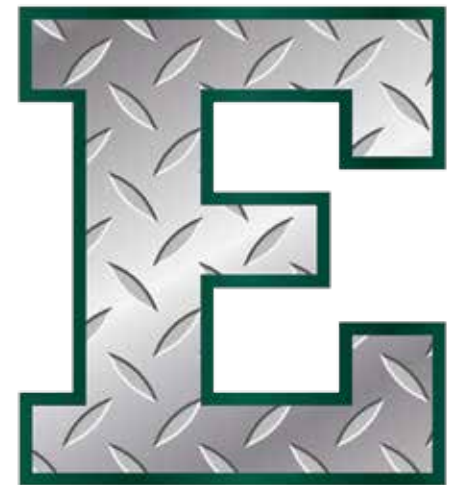

Defense Shines in Football's Season Opener

EMU rolled past Charlotte 24-7 as Head Coach Chris Creighton picked up career victory No. 150

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) - The Eastern Michigan University football team began its 2017 season under the lights of "The Factory" inside Rynearson Stadium, opening the year with a commanding 24-7 win over the University of North Carolina Charlotte Friday, Sept. 10. The seven points were the fewest EMU (1-0, 0-0 MAC) has given up in a season opener since 2005. The game also marked the 150th career win for Head Coach **Chris Creighton** in his 21-year career.

As a team, the Green and White got most of their offensive edge through the passing game, finishing with 267 yards. The run game added an additional 126 to its total for 393 yards in all. Meanwhile, Eastern's defense did their job limiting the 49ers (0-1, 0-0 C-USA) to 280 total yards, with only 114 yards in the air. As part of the excellent passing defense, the Eagles picked off three errant Charlotte passes, including a pick six from redshirt sophomore **Brody Hoying** to open the scoring. It was coincidentally the first interception returned for a touchdown since the Charlotte game last season.

Also getting in on the interception party were senior **Jason Beck** and junior **Justin Moody**, the third and first of their careers, respectively. As a whole, EMU disrupted the 49er offensive attack all night, totaling seven tackles for loss, as well as two sacks. Redshirt junior **Jeremiah Harris** led the way with nine total stops, including 1.5 for loss and a half sack.

On the offensive side of the ball, senior **Brogan Roback** led the EMU attack, throwing for 267 yards. In doing so, Roback surpassed **Andy Schmitt** for third all-time in career passing yards. The veteran spread the love, completing passes to 10 different wideouts, including three who had at least three receptions on the day. Senior **Sergio Bailey II** led the way with five catches for 78 yards, while fellow senior **Antoine Porter** had a solid game with three catches for 74 yards.

Redshirt junior **Shaq Vann** paced the rushing attack with 23 carries for 90 yards while redshirt junior **Ian Eriksen** picked up two rushing touchdowns to go along with his 37 yards on the ground. It was the fourth two-touchdown effort of his EMU career.

The Eagles started out promising, with a 20 yard scamper from Vann, followed by a 21-yard pass to Bailey II to get EMU into Charlotte territory. The drive failed to get any further though, as UNCC forced a fumble to end the momentum.

Charlotte began their first drive in their own territory, but it did not last long as on the sixth play Hoying intercepted a Hasaan Klugh pass. The Ohio native, with his first career interception, jumped the route and returned the ball 35 yards the other way for a touchdown to give EMU the early 7-0 lead.

Charlotte drove into Eagle's territory on the ground with a 51 yard rush on its first play from scrimmage on its next drive. With a third-and-nine, the 49ers completed a 21 yard pass into the end zone for a touchdown, knotting the score back up at seven apiece with just under eight minutes in the first quarter.

On the next drive, Eastern took advantage of a key Charlotte penalty on third down and used the new life to score its second touchdown of the game. Charlotte gave EMU a first down after a roughing-the-passer penalty was called. The Green and White took full advantage of the penalty as Eriksen dove the ball into the end zone for a touchdown six plays later, and with the extra-point, gave the Eagles a 14-7 lead.

As play turned to the second quarter, the Eagles were not able to maintain their rhythm. On the fourth play from scrimmage in the quarter, Roback threw his first



interception of the season, and the 49ers responded by putting together a long drive. Charlotte, struggling with penalties throughout the first half, seemed to break the yellow flag curse with a 26-yard pass that placed them in EMU's territory. The penalties continued to haunt the 49ers the rest of the drive though as it stalled and they were once again forced to punt.

Roback saw nothing but open teammates during the Eagles' next possession, connecting with four different receivers for 60 yards on the drive. The Eagles capped off the 74 yard drive with a 32-yard field goal from redshirt sophomore kicker **Paulie Fricano** to push the lead to 17-7. Charlotte did not get anything going in its final possession of the half to maintain the 10-point advantage.

Charlotte started with possession to begin the second half, as they looked to begin a comeback. They were able to move up the field into the Eagle's territory before the penalties once again hit the 49ers, stalling their drive. Eastern continued to use Charlotte's errors for their advantage as Beck picked his first pass since the 2015 campaign, giving the Eagles possession deep in their own territory.

The ball passed quickly between teams after the initial Charlotte drive, as each side failed to drive longer than three minutes. Moody, with the first interception of his career, broke up the 49ers 50 second drive before the Eagles had a turnover on downs less than two minutes later. Charlotte struggled to find their rhythm as the Eagles limited them to a three-and-out, keeping it 17-7 with 5:41 left in the third.

Eastern got the pace moving on its next drive, with four-straight first downs for 76 yards. Roback's 41 yard pass to A. Porter put the Eagles within striking distance. An Eriksen rush pushed the Eagles to within five yards of a score and, one play later, he dove into the end zone for his second touchdown of the game. With the extra point, the Green and White stretched their lead, 24-7.

EMU's defense, like they had all day, continued to hold the 49ers offense down the rest of the way, limiting them to just 20 yards total in their final six possessions. While neither team threatened to score, the efforts on both sides of the ball were enough to allow the Eagles to cruise to the 17-point win.

Eagles Pull Out Monumental Victory Over Scarlet Knights

The 16-13 victory is EMU's first win over a 'Power 5' opponent in program history

PISCATAWAY, N.J. (EMUEagles.com) - The Eastern Michigan University football team completed its first win over a 'Power 5' opponent in program history with a heart-pounding 16-13 victory over Rutgers University Saturday evening, Sept. 9, at High Point Solutions Stadium. With the win, EMU snatched its first win over a Big Ten Conference opponent in 39 tries, and moved to 2-0 on the season for the first time since 2011.

The defense carried the day for the Eagles, holding the Scarlet Knights (0-2) to 326 yards of total offense to EMU's 374. EMU won the turnover battle, 2-1, including two crucial interceptions from junior **Jeremiah Harris** and sophomore **Brody Hoying**. In addition to the pick, Harris kept the RU attack uneasy all game, finishing with two tackles for loss, a breakup, a hurry, and the game-sealing sack. On the season, EMU's defense has allowed just two touchdowns over two games.

Eastern Michigan did most of its offensive damage through the air, as senior Brogan Roback (Maumee, Ohio-Toledo St. John's Jesuit) finished his day 19-of-36 with 260 yards and a touchdown pass. He found nine different receivers, his favorite being senior **Sergio Bailey II**, who had his third career 100-yard day, catching five passes for 107 yards. Fellow senior **Antoine Porter** also saw plenty of targets, finishing with 62 yards on a career-best tying seven receptions, and the lone score.

On the ground, junior **Shaq Vann** led the Eagle rushing attack with 16 carries for 67 yards. Finally, sophomore **Paulie Fricano** was as steady as ever, converting three field goal attempts to tie his career-high.

The Eagles struck first after holding RU to just one first down on its first drive. Beginning at their own 27, Roback slung back-to-back passes to A. Porter and Bailey II for 14 and 31 yards to get EMU into Rutgers territory.

Another short pass to Porter, and a Vann eight-yard rush put Eastern into the redzone, where it took just one play for Roback to find Porter for the third time on the drive in the corner of the endzone for the score. The fifth TD of Porter's career gave EMU the early 7-0 advantage.

Rutgers came right back after the scoring drive to put up points themselves, scorching down the field to get into the redzone after just four plays. With first and goal, Rutgers mustered just three more yards as EMU's defense stepped up, holding them to a field goal, making it 7-3 with just under five minutes in the first quarter.

Following the consecutive scoring drives, both offenses did not get much momentum, including EMU's defense forcing consecutive three-and-outs, to keep the four-point lead. With Rutgers beginning to win the field position battle, they set up shop in EMU territory with 10:45 until the half looking to capitalize on the short field.

EMU's defense had other plans though, as on the second play, senior **Oddie Granger III** tipped the ball at the line, and it fell into the waiting arms of J. Harris for the second pick of his career, giving Eastern the ball right at midfield. The Eagles were unable to do anything with the turnover as RU's defense continued to stifle the EMU attack.

Eastern's defense kept returning the favor on the defensive side, forcing three more three and outs on Rutgers drives to make it six straight drives without a first down for the Scarlet Knights, and keeping it a 7-3 tally with three minutes until the break.

Starting a drive at the 3:02 mark, EMU got some momentum with 10-yard sophomore **Breck Turner** rush, followed by a pass interference penalty which put the ball at the RU 39. From there, with the clock running down, Roback fired completions to A. Porter and senior Jaron Johnson to get to the 16 with four seconds left.

Fricano drilled the 33-yard kick as time expired, putting EMU's lead at 10-3 at the half. Down the stretch, in addition to EMU not allowing a Rutgers first down in its final six drive, they held them to just 19 yard over those six drives, including three drives with zero net yards, and a total of 99 for the entirety of the half.

The defensive dominance did not carry over for EMU during the first drive of the second half, as Rutgers notched four straight first downs to race down to the Eastern 20. Eastern stood tall after that, not allowing RU to get any further, and holding them to a 39-yard field goal to make it 10-6 early in the second half.

Coming back the other way, Roback completed a long pass to Bailey II to get Eastern to midfield, and put him over



1,000 yards receiving in his EMU career. On the next play, EMU coughed up the ball on a rush, giving RU another short field. This time around, Rutgers used it to their advantage, scoring three plays later to give them their first lead of the game, 13-10, with 6:07 left in the third.

The lead was short lived, as EMU found its stride on the ensuing drive, with Roback slinging it around the field. Completing passes to three different receivers for 54 yards, Roback led EMU all the way down to the Rutgers three, before being stonewalled on the goal line. Fricano's second field goal, this one from 21 yards, knotted the game at 13 heading into the fourth quarter.

A three-and out from Rutgers got the quarter started, giving Eastern an opportunity to retake the lead. Airing it out on the first play, Roback completed a 37-yard bomb to sophomore **Mathew Sexton** the Rutgers 46.

From there, a pass interference penalty moved the ball to the 27. After a couple of short rushes, EMU faced third down on the 24. Roback remained calm, completing a 15-yard pass to Bailey II to put him over 100 yards on the day, and setting up first and goal. Once again, Rutgers tightened up in the redzone, holding Eastern to another field goal, which Fricano split through the uprights from 24 yards out, to make it 16-13 with 10:13 to go.

EMU forced yet another three-and-out on Rutgers' next drive, giving them an opportunity to build on the lead. The next Eastern drive started off promising, as they got to midfield after a long run from Vann, but the one first down was all they could get, giving the ball back to RU on their own seven with just under seven minutes to play.

The Scarlet Knights then began to drive, steadily moving their way down the field with relative ease. Getting down to the EMU 27, Rutgers looked poised to at least tie the game, but Hoying had other ideas. For the second week in a row, the safety jumped a route, intercepting the ball with plenty of room to run. He hustled 71-yards the other way to set EMU up at the Rutgers five with 2:29 to go.

Despite the excellent opportunity, Eastern did not go forward any further, instead leaving on the leg of Fricano. The Rutgers defense blocked the kick, leaving the score at 16-13 with 1:34 to play, and RU taking over at the EMU 14.

With the hurry-up offense fully in effect, Rutgers completed back-to-back long passes to quickly get into Eagle territory at the 44 with just under a minute to go. A roughing the passer penalty one play later moved the ball up to the 27 and into field goal range.

Rutgers returned the favor one play later, as a hands to the face penalty moved the ball back to the 40. On what would be the final play of the game, Harris came through with the game-sealing sack, the 6.5 of his career, to clinch the thrilling 16-13 victory.

Eastern Michigan Edged in Double Overtime by Ohio, 27-20

Eastern Michigan is now 2-1 on the season

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team fell in double overtime to Mid-American Conference East Division favorite Ohio University, 27-20, Saturday afternoon, Sept. 23, at “The Factory” inside Rynearson Stadium. It was the first multi-overtime game for EMU since a four-overtime affair in 2004.

Defense once again anchored the Eagles’ (2-1, 0-1 MAC) effort, with the Green and White holding the potent Bobcats (3-1, 1-0 MAC) offense to 373 total yards, while forcing two turnovers.

Sophomore defensive back **Brody Hoying** led the EMU defensive charge with 10 total tackles, two forced fumbles, and one fumble recovery. Senior **Luke Maclean** finished the game with a career-high two sacks and two and a half tackles for loss. He was also responsible for three quarterback hurries. Senior **Chris Hendricks** collected two tackles-for-loss, the best single-game mark of his career.

On offense, senior quarterback **Brogan Roback** orchestrated the attack with 271 passing yards to 12 different receivers. Senior **Sergio Bailey II** led EMU in receptions with seven and had 82 yards and a score. Roback’s overtime TD to Bailey II marked the 40th of his career, making him just the third quarterback in EMU history to throw 40 touchdowns.

Ohio drove 46 yards on the game’s opening drive, but was forced to settle for a 41-yard field goal when Maclean came up with a third-down sack that stalled the Bobcats’ possession.

EMU struck back two drives later, capping off a 10-play, 39-yard drive with a sophomore **Paulie Fricano** 41-yard field goal, tying the score at three. The 41-yarder was the farthest of the season for Fricano.

Eastern Michigan’s key first half moment came with 5:07 remaining, when Hoying forced and recovered a fumble and then returned it for 45 yards. The defensive play set up EMU’s offense with terrific field position, but the Eagles were forced to settle for three points yet again. Fricano’s second field goal of the day, this one from 31 yards out, put the Green and White ahead 6-3 with 1:25 to go in the first half.

The Eagles looked poised to take a lead into the half, but the Bobcats seized the momentum just before the break, as they intercepted a Roback pass with 10 second left, and returned it for a touchdown to take a 10-6 lead at the halftime horn.

Ohio added to its lead on its first possession of the second half, putting the first points of the half on the scoreboard with a 44-yard field goal to push its lead to 13-6.

Eastern Michigan knotted the score at 13 with just under 11 minutes to go in the final period, when junior **Ian Eriksen** punched in a one-yard run to cap off a seven-play, 69-yard drive with a touchdown. After Roback turned in back-to-back completions for 12 and eight yards, respectively,



the Green and White reached into its bag of tricks. Facing second-and-two, Roback threw a screen pass to sophomore wide receiver **Isaac Holder**, who then fired a 34-yard pass to senior **Johnnie Niupalau**. The 34-yard reception was the longest of the season for Niupalau, and set the Eagles up for Eriksen’s one-yard leap into the endzone, his third touchdown of the season.

On Ohio’s first play from scrimmage following the EMU touchdown, Hoying forced his second fumble of the day, and sophomore **Kevin McGill** recovered it to give the Eagles the ball. Unfortunately, for the Green and White, the offense was unable to find its groove, keeping the score knotted.

After back-to-back three and outs, Ohio started a possession at the 6:30 mark, and began to march down the field. Chewing up two minutes of clock, the Bobcat drive stalled in EMU territory, forcing a 47-yard field goal. The kick sailed wide left, keeping the 13-all tally intact. Both teams wound having one more possession before the end of regulation, but neither drive resulted in points, forcing overtime.

In the first OT session, Eastern Michigan wasted no time to start its scoring, as Roback connected with Bailey II on the first play from scrimmage with a 25-yard strike to put the Eagles ahead.

The Bobcats struck right back with an eight-yard pass and catch, tying the score up at 20. On the ensuing possession for OU, quarterback Nathan Rourke connected with Cameron Odom on third down to put the visitors back ahead, 27-20. With its back against the wall, the EMU offense was stuffed on its last possession, gaining just eight yards and seeing a fourth down pass attempt flutter high and over the head of its intended receiver in the endzone, ending the game, 27-20, in favor of Ohio.
