- Kentucky was picked to win the SEC regular-season title by the league's media members, Hamidou Diallo was tabbed to the preseason All-SEC First Team while Kevin Knox was a second-team nick
- · Four Wildcats were named to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame preseason positional award watch lists. Diallo (shooting guard), Knox (small forward), Nick Richards (center) and PJ Washington (power forward) were all selected
- The Wildcats will begin the season ranked No. 4 in the USA Today Coaches Poll
- Kentucky has the No. 1 ranked recruiting class once again, and the **Recruiting Services Consensus Index** pegs it the best ever
- The Wildcats return just 7.4 percent of their scoring and 23.4 percent of their rebounding from 2016-17

Last Time Out

- Kentucky won its opening exhibition game 103-61 over Thomas More
- It marked the seventh consecutive exhibition in which UK topped 100 points
- Knox led all scorers with 27 points on an efficient 10 of 12 from the field
- PJ Washington and Wenyen Gabriel both recorded double-doubles. Washington had 15 points and 10 boards, while Gabriel had 11 points and 10 rebounds
- Five players scored in double figures • UK started five freshmen. It's the first time five freshmen have started since the 2014 national championship game
- UK shot 55.1 percent from the floor and 73.3 percent from the charity stripe

Wildcats Roll Past Thomas More 103-61

- Kevin Knox scored 27 points and classmate PJ Washington added 15 points and 10 rebounds as Kentucky rolled past Thomas More 103-61 in an exhibition game on Friday night at Rupp Arena.
- Nick Richards had 14 points for the Wildcats and Hamidou Diallo added 12. Sophomore Wenyen Gabriel was the fifth Wildcat in double figures, scoring 11 points to go with 10 rebounds.
- Kentucky exploited its height advantage, outrebounding the Saints 49-26. The Wildcats shot 55.1 percent (38 of 69) from the floor, including 5 of 16 (31.3 percent) from 3-point range.
- The Wildcats jumped out to a 7-2 lead early behind three points from Washington. Quade Green then hit back-to-back 3-pointers to extend Kentucky's lead to 13-4.
- Kentucky extended its lead to 21-6 on a layup by Diallo. But after a Thomas More timeout, the Saints went on an 11-2 run to cut Kentucky's lead to 23-17. The Wildcats responded with a 17-3 run to take a commanding 40-20 lead. Kentucky would lead 53-30 at the break.
- In the second half, Kentucky pulled away, building the lead behind a balanced offensive effort and 60.6-percent shooting. The 42-point margin of victory was Kentucky's largest lead of the game.
- The Wildats started five freshmen vs. Thomas More. The last time a UK team started five freshmen in a regular-season game was the 2014 national championship game vs. UConn
- UK held Thomas More without a field goal for 10:57 in the first half
- It was the seventh straight exhibition game Kentucky has surpassed 100 points, dating back to the 2013-14 season

• The Wildcats dominated the specialty stats, smashing Thomas More in the paint (58-14) in second-chance points (26-9) and fast-braek points (26-2)

Cats Show Talent, Long Road Ahead in Blue-White Game

John Calipari has preached patience every chance he's had. Coaching his youngest team to date, Coach Cal has warned fans to expect bumps on Kentucky's road to March. The reasons why were apparent during the Blue-White Game on Friday night. So was the fact that fans are going to have plenty of fun watching these Wildcats along the way.

UK looked far from a finished product in its annual intrasquad scrimmage in Rupp Arena. Turnovers and fouls came in bunches, but so did thunderous dunks and impressive drives. Potential, albeit raw, was on full display as Blue downed White in front of a crowd of 15,530 – the second largest in the history of the event – by a score of 88-67.

Not coincidently considering the result, the stars of the evening both suited up exclusively for the Blue team. Versatile freshman forwards Kevin Knox and PJ Washington were a handful throughout. Knox had 22 points and seven rebounds and Washington had 21 points and five rebounds, the pair shooting a combined 18 of 26 from the field.

UK's two returning forwards – Wenyen Gabriel and Sacha Killeya-Jones – showed improved form from a season ago. Gabriel scored 19 points, while Killeya-Jones had 10 points and six rebounds.

Quade Green split his time between the two squads and didn't hesitate to shoot. He scored a combined 18 points, but made time for passing too. The 6-foot point guard had a game-high seven assists. His point-guard opposite, Shai Gilgeous-Alexander, had 14 points and five assists.

All nine active players expected to contend for spots in UK's rotation scored in double figures, the balance of this year's roster on display. Hamidou Diallo scored 15 points and Tai Wynyard and Nick Richards had 10 apiece. Richards stuffed the stat sheet elsewhere as well, grabbing 13 rebounds and blocking eight shots in serving as an intimidating defensive presence.

UK to Play Morehead State in Exhibition for Disaster Relief Funds

In light of recent disasters around the country, UK Athletics will play a small part in helping those affected by adding a third men's basketball exhibition game to Kentucky's 2017-18 schedule. The NCAA has granted a special waiver for the Wildcats to host Morehead State.

- UK will host the Eagles coached by former Kentucky staff member Preston Spradlin for the inaugural "Kentucky Cares Classic" on Monday at 7 p.m. in Rupp Arena to raise funds for those affected by the devastating hurricanes in Florida and Puerto Rico and wildfires in California.
- Net proceeds from the game will go to Team Rubicon, a non-government 501(c)(3) organization that unites the skills and experiences of military veterans with first responders to rapidly deploy emergency response teams. Team Rubicon is currently active in Florida in response to hurricanes in Florida and Puerto Rico and is soon to begin work in response to wildfires in California.
- The Kentucky Cares Classic will not be televised or streamed, but the game will be broadcast on radio on the UK Sports Network and its affiliates. Tickets for the game are at Ticketmaster.com and by calling Ticketmaster at (800) 745-3000. Fans may also purchase in person at the Rupp Arena box office. Tickets will range from \$10 to \$100 with net proceeds going to victims of the recent natural disasters.

The two schools last played in the regular season in November 2012 with UK owning a 10-0 all-time advantage.

Not only will the exhibition games pair a couple of in-state schools for charity, it will also be a homecoming of sorts for Morehead State's Spradlin. Spradlin spent five seasons at Kentucky, first as a graduate assistant (2010-11) and then as the assistant director of basketball operations (2012-14).

UK Leads the Nation with 27 Players on NBA Opening-Day Rosters

Kentucky's unprecedented success with helping players reach the NBA has surpassed a new level of extreme. At the start of the 2017-18 NBA season, a whopping 27 players on NBA opening-day rosters played and finished their college basketball careers at the University of Kentucky, the nation's most prolific NBA player-producing program in the country. UK's 27 players are once again far and away the most of any college basketball program. Duke is in second with 20 former players and North Carolina and Kansas each have 16 on opening-day rosters.

Of the 489 players in the NBA to start the 2017-18 season, more than 5.5 percent played and finished their college basketball careers at UK. Seven NBA teams feature multiple Wildcats.

All told, UK's 27 players are represented on 15 of the league's 30 teams. Of the 27 Wildcats on an opening-day NBA roster, head coach John Calipari has coached 25 of them. With Tyreke Evans (Memphis Grizzlies) and Derrick Rose (Cleveland Cavaliers), who played for Calipari at Memphis, Calipari has coached 27 players on 2017-18 opening-day rosters, the most of any coach

Kentucky has experienced unprecedented success at putting players in the NBA under Calipari. In the eight seasons of the Calipari era, 31 players have been selected in the NBA Draft, more than any other school. Included in the recent run are 24 first-round picks, three No. 1 overall selections (Anthony Davis, Karl-Anthony Towns and John Wall), seven top-five picks and 17 lottery selections.

Using figures compiled by basketball-reference.com and spotrac.com, Calipari-coached players only (which includes Rose and Evans but not Meeks or Rondo) have amassed nearly \$1.5 billion in career NBA contracts (\$1.455 billion). In the eight seasons Calipari has been the head coach at Kentucky, his players have totaled more than \$1.09 billion in NBA contracts.

In just the 2017-18 season alone, UK players are slated to make more than \$178 million. Calipari-coached players only (which includes Rose and Evans but not Meeks or Rondo) will make more than \$177 million.

UK's growing NBA continengent is already off to a fast start to the 2017-18 season. Accroding to Basketball Reference, Davis is the only player since 1983-84 to post 95-plus points and 50-plus rebounds in the first three games of a season.

Kentucky Picked to Win 49th SEC Title

The Kentucky men's basketball program finds itself in familiar territory under the direction of ninth-year head coach John Calipari. A select panel of media voted the Wildcats to once again win the Southeastern Conference championship. Should Kentucky achieve that standard, it would mark the sixth regular-season title under Calipari and the program's 49th overall.

It's the 13th time since the 1998-99 season the Wildcats are the overall preseason favorite. UK was picked to win the title a season ago and did not disappoint. Calipari has directed his teams to regular-season SEC crowns in 2010, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

Each school selected media members that cover their team and additional media from across the nation were selected by the conference office to comprise the voting panel. Points were compiled on a 14-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis. Each media member also voted for two All-SEC teams.

UK Starts Season at No. 4 in USA Today Coaches Poll Preseason Top 25

Despite losing nearly 93 percent of its scoring and almost 77 percent of its rebounding from a season ago, the panel for the USA Today Coaches Poll once again believes the Kentucky men's basketball team will be among the top teams competing for a national title in 2017-18.

The Wildcats are ranked fourth in the preseason Coaches Poll. Duke will begin the season at No. 1, followed by Michigan State, Kansas, UK and Arizona.

It's the ninth consecutive season under head coach John Calipari that Kentucky will begin the season ranked among the top 25 teams in the country, as voted on by a panel of Division I head coaches in consultation with the National Association of Basketball Coaches. As a matter of fact, the Wildcats have been ranked in the preseason top five in the USA Today Coaches Poll in eight of Calipari's nine seasons, including seven straight. Every team under Calipari has been voted a preseason top-10 team.

Five Kentucky opponents enter the 2017-18 season ranked, including three top-10 opponents in No. 3 Kansas (Nov. 14), No. 7 Florida (Jan. 20, March 3) and No. 10 West Virginia (Jan. 27). UK will also face No. 16 Louisville (Dec. 29) and No. 25 Alabama (Feb. 17).

Showcasing the league's strength, fellow SEC members Texas A&M (Jan. 9, Feb. 10), Missouri (Feb. 3, Feb. 24), Georgia (Dec. 31), Arkansas (Feb. 20) and South Carolina (Jan. 16) received votes in the poll. Virginia Tech, who UK hosts at Rupp Arena on Dec. 16, also received votes.

Four Players on Hall of Fame Watch Lists

Freshmen Hamidou Diallo, Kevin Knox, Nick Richards and PJ Washington were tabbed as members of the preseason watch lists for their positional player of the year awards presented by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Diallo is on the list for the Jerry West Award for the nation's best shooting guard. Malik Monk was the winner of the award a season ago, a first in program history. Knox was tabbed to the Julius Erving list for the best small forward. Richards is among the candidates for the Kareen Abdul-Jabbar list for the best center, and Washington is on the Karl Malone list for the best power forward.

By mid-February, each watch list of 20 players will be narrowed down to just 10. In March, five finalists will be presented to the various awards' committees and the Hall of Fame's selection committee. The winner of the 2017 positional awards will be presented at the ESPN College Basketball Awards Show in Los Angeles on April 7. Broadcast information will be released at a later date.

Two Wildcats Selected to Preseason All-SEC Teams

Two players were selected to the preseason All-SEC squads. Freshmen Hamidou Diallo was picked to the first team, while classmate Kevin Knox was tabbed to the second team.

Diallo is joined by Florida's junior guard KeVaughn Allen, Georgia's senior forward Yante Maten, Missouri's freshman forward Michael Porter, Jr. and Texas A&M's sophomore forward Robert Williams. Maten, Porter and Williams were voted in a three-way tie for the pick for SEC Player of the Year.

Knox was selected to the second team along with freshman guard Collin Sexton from Alabama, junior guard Terence Davis and senior guard Deandre Burnett from Ole Miss, junior guard Quinndary Weatherspoon from Mississippi State, junior center Tyler Davis from Texas A&M and senior guard Matthew Fisher-Davis from Vanderbilt.

Wildcats Banged Up

It feels like the Wildcats have already dealt with a season's worth of injuries before the regular season has even started.

Three Wildcats -- Jarred Vanderbilt, Jemarl Baker and Tai Wynyard -- have all dealt with various ailments over the last month.

It was announced at the end of September that Vanderbilt would be out

until at least January after suffering an injury to his left foot.

After consulting with his family and medical personnel, Vanderbilt has decided to delay surgery and re-evaluate his injury in the next couple of weeks. At that time, a decision on Vanderbilt's timetable and potential surgery will be determined.

Baker has been sidelined the last few weeks with a left knee injury. He underwent a minor procedure in his home state of California this weekend but his current status remains day-to-day. He is not expected to play in the exhibition game vs. Morehead State

Wynyard missed the Thomas More game with a facial injury that he suffered during the Blue-White Game. He is listed as day-to-day.

Forever Young

It seems like with every John Calipari team youth is the story, but this year's team is on a whole new level.

Zero seniors. Eight freshmen. Nearly 93 percent of last season's scoring and almost 77 percent of the rebounding gone. And the leading returner, Wenyen Gabriel, averaged just 4.6 points and 4.8 rebounds a year ago.

Even for a Calipari-coached team, this team could be historically young. Entering the 2017-18 season, the average age of the Wildcats' roster is just 19.43 years old.

Although all of Calipari's teams have been young, they've all had some sort of veteran presence. The 2010 team with John Wall and DeMarcus Cousins had Patrick Patterson. The 2012 national title squad featured Darius Miller. The unforgettable 2015 team that flirted with an undefeated season had Willie Cauley-Stein and Alex Poythress.

It remains to be seen where UK stacks up to the rest of the nation experience wise (KenPom.com has not yet released its annual experience rankings), but the Wildcats are expected to be among the youngest teams in the nation yet again.

Reload

With everything the Wildcats lost last season to the professional ranks and graduation, help is on the way in the form of a historic recruiting class.

The Recruiting Services Consensus Index, which tallies major recruiting rankings and plugs them into a formula to calculate a consensus ranking, not only rated UK's 2017 class the best of the season - it measures this group as the best ever.

With 582 points in its recruiting calculations, this 2017 Kentucky group beat out another Wildcat class - the 2013 haul - to claim the title as the best recruiting class ever. That 2013 group had 557 points and consisted of Julius Randle, Andrew Harrison, Aaron Harrison, Dakari Johnson, James Young, Marcus Lee and Derek Willis. The RSCI rankings began in 1998.

The 2017 class consists of Kevin Knox (No. 10), Jarred Vanderbilt (No. 13), PJ Washington (No. 14), Nick Richards (No. 18), Quade Green (No. 23), Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (No. 30), Hamidou Diallo (No. 46) and Jemarl Baker (No. 72).

The RSCI includes individual player rankings from all of the major recruiting services, which this season featured Rivals, Scout, 247Sports and longtime recruiting analyst Van Coleman. The RSCI formula uses each of those services' rankings (only the top 100) players to assign a point value to each recruit. Using the point totals for all the five major services, it then adds the totals for all players in a class for the team's final score.

UK has ranked No. 1 in the RSCI in seven of Calipari's nine classes at Kentucky.

If all five RSCI sources had counted Diallo with the 2017 class, the Wildcats' score would have been closer to 630, according to the site.

Another Demanding Schedule

Kentucky's young team will be put to the test early and often with another formidable schedule.

Twelve of UK's 13 nonconference opponents in the upcoming season made a postseason tournament in 2017, including eight of which made the NCAA Tournament. Three of those advanced to the Sweet 16 or better.

Five nonconference teams finished the 2016-17 season with an RPI in the top 50 and four ended the season in both the Associated Press Top 25 and USA Today Coaches' Poll. All told, Kentucky's 2017-18 nonconference opponents combined for a record of 314-134 in 2016-17, a .701 winning percentage.

Kentucky's nonconference schedule will see the Wildcats play in premier venues such as the United Center in Chicago (vs. Kansas) and Madison Square Garden in New York (vs. Monmouth), take them to a Big Blue Nation favorite in New Orleans (vs. UCLA), and feature a difficult trip to Morgantown, West Virginia, to play the West Virginia Mountaineers.

And that doesn't even include an arduous league schedule in what is expected to be a much-improved Southeastern Conference. Twenty-four of ESPN's top-100 recruits in the 2017 class signed to play in the SEC. The league is coming off a season in which its teams combined to go 11-5 in the NCAA Tournament and had three teams advance to the Elite Eight.

Cup in Cairo. Sacha Killeya-Jones and Brad Calipari also traveled abroad this summer to play basketball.

Diallo and Washington, coached by John Calipari, captured a bronze medal for Team USA, while Wynyard was the star for the New Zealand Junior Tall Blacks.

Washington led Team USA in scoring at 12.9 points per game and added 5.1 rebounds and 2.2 assists. Diallo contributed 10.9 points, 3.9 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.1 steals per game. Wynyard led the Junior Tall Blacks in scoring at 14.3 points per game and rebounding with 9.3 boards per outing.

Kevin Knox made the final 16 cuts for Team USA before the roster was trimmed to 12, but he pulled his name from contention after suffering a minor hamstring injury. Shai Gilgeous-Alexander declined an invite to join the Canadian national team for its training camp.

Meanwhile, Killeya-Jones attended Great Britain's national training camp in August to compete for a spot on Great Britain's FIBA EuroBasket 2017 team, while Brad Calipari went on an international basketball trip with Global Sports Academy to Croatia. He averaged 14.3 points, 65. assists and 3.33 rebounds in four games.

Three is Better Than Two

Kentucky and UNLV went back and forth all season long last year for the claim of having the longest active streak of consecutive games with a made 3-pointer. Fittingly, both schools reached a historic milestone -- 1,000 straight games -- within a few hours of each other.

UK just beat out the Runnin' Rebels by mere hours, becoming the first school ever to hit a 3-pointer in 1,000 straight games with a trey at Alabama on Feb. 11. Freshman guard Malik Monk, fittingly UK's leader in 3-point field goals last season, got the Wildcats to 1,000 straight games with a 3-pointer from the right wing with 15:26 to go in the first half. UNLV would match it later in the day.

Kentucky passed UNLV for the nation's longest active streak of consecutive games with a made 3-pointer in its final game of 2015-16. UK has now knocked down at least one 3-pointer in 1,013 consecutive games. UNLV has hit one in 1,006 straight.

The Cats' last game without a made 3-pointer came against Seton Hall on Nov. 26, 1988 a "three-point" loss in the Great Alaska Shootout. The streak began on Nov. 28, 1998, in an 89-71 win vs. California.

The Wildcats' record during the 1,013-game streak is 783-230.

Cats Deliver the Knockout Punch

UK is 214-4 (.982) in the John Calipari era when leading by at least 10 points at any time in the contest. Two of those three losses (a 21-point lead at Tennessee and a 12-point lead at Auburn) came during the 2015-16 campaign. The only other losses came during the 2012-13 season when UK gave up an 11-point first-half lead and lost 59-55 at Alabama and vs. Kansas in 2016-17 when the Wildcats failed to capitalize on a 12-point first-half lead. The loss to Kansas was the first and only to a nonconference opponent when leading by 10 or more in the Calipari era.

Perhaps most impressive of all is that 72.4 percent of games Calipari has coached in at Kentucky have produced 10-point leads at some point during the game for UK. The Wildcats have led by 10 points or more in a whopping 85.9 percent of Calipari's 249 career wins at Kentucky.

Big-Game Cal, Cats

John Calipari's teams aren't just good against the best teams in the country, they're great. Not only does Kentucky have a 50-22 record (.694) vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams, UK is 5-3 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five under Calipari.

All-time, Calipari is 11-7 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five. When both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25, Calipari's all-time record is 75-46, including a 44-18 mark at Kentucky. When both are ranked in the top 10 he has a 24-14 record, including 13-7 at UK.

Taking Care of Business

Kentucky's 50-22 record vs. opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 in John Calipari's tenture is impressive, but the Wildcats' ability to beat all-comers can't be overlooked. Under Calipari, UK is 199-31 vs. unranked competition, an .865 winning percentage.

The Wildcats' loss to Tennessee during the 2016-17 season was its first since falling at unranked Vanderbilt on Feb. 27, 2016.

Bounce Back

The Wildcats don't lose very often during the John Calipari era, but when they do, they almost always bounce back.

UK is 38-8 under Calipari following a loss. Kentucky's back-to-back losses to Kansas and Tennessee in 2016-17 were its first since also losing back-to-back games at Kansas and at Tennessee in 2015-16.

The Wildcats have only lost back-to-back games eight times during the Calipari era and they've never lost three in a row with Calipari on the sidelines -- including avoiding a threegame skid despite trailing by 14 to Georgia in the first half on Jan. 31, 2017. The last time UK lost three games in a row was in February 2009 when the Wildcats dropped four straight games to end the regular season.

Always Efficient

According to Ken Pomeroy's calculations on kenpom.com, UK's teams under John Calipari have consistently ranked among the most efficient teams in the country per possession.

A Winning Institution

Both the UK men's and women's basketball teams posted an eighth straight 20-win season in 2016-17. Kentucky is one of just three institutions (Duke and BYU) in the NCAA that have seen both their men's and women's basketball programs tally 20 or more wins in the last eight consecutive seasons.

S-E-C! S-E-C! S-E-C!

Kentucky has the unquestionable reputation as the league's gold standard. Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats have been the most dominant team in the league, recording a 972-270 mark (.783) in regular-season conference play. Only two other teams have won more than 700 regular-season SEC games (Alabama, Tennessee), and no other team has a better winning percentage.

- UK has averaged 11.6 wins and only 3.2 losses per season in 84 seasons in the SEC
- Kentucky has won 48 SEC titles and 30 SEC Tournament championships
- The Wildcats have won 15 of the last 25 SEC Tournament titles
- UK has won at least a share of five of the last eight SEC regular-season championships under head coach John Calipari

 Kentucky has played in the championship game of the SEC Tournament in seven of Calipari's seight seasons following its 2016 title

Hold Them to 55

Defense has always been a recipe for success for the Wildcats under John Calipari. The special ingredient: 55 points. UK is a perfect 63-0 under Calipari when holding the opponent to 55 points or fewer. The Wildcats are 146-5 under Calipari when limiting the opponent to 63 points or less.

Wall Inducted into UK Athletics Hall of Fame

John Wall was inducted into the UK Athletics Hall of Fame as a member of the 2017 class in September.

Wall was the first national player of the year in program history as winner of the Adolph Rupp Trophy. He was named 2010 USBWA National Freshman of the Year, a Consensus First Team All-American, 2010 SEC Player of the Year by Associated Press and SEC Coaches, SEC Freshman of the Year by the AP, First Team All-SEC and SEC Tournament MVP.

Wall led UK to a No. 1 national ranking, SEC regular-season championship and the SEC Tournament championship. He set the single-season assists record with 241 assists (broken in 2016 by Tyler Ulis) and averaged 16.6 points and 6.5 assists. He was the first No. 1 overall NBA Draft pick in UK history. A four-time NBA All-Star through his first seven seasons, he has averaged double-figure scoring every season. Wall was tabbed to the All-NBA Third Team in 2017. He is the Washington franchise career leader in assists and steals.

Best in the Bluegrass

Kentucky has been dominant against teams in the state under John Calipari. UK is 15-2 against in-state foes with Calipari at the helm.

The mark also includes an 8-2 mark vs. Louisville. Two of the victories over the Cardinals came in postseason play. UK had its four-game winning streak snapped last season, but has won all four meetings played in Rupp Arena. Louisville's two wins have come by a combined six points.

Success Rate

The Wildcats received an NCAA award in the spring for placing in the top 10 percent of all men's basketball teams in the country in the NCAA's annual Academic Progress Rate. UK scored a perfect 1,000.

It's the third straight year the men's basketball team received the award and the fourth time since 2009.

The APR provides a real-time look at a team's academic success by the progress of each student-athlete on scholarship. The APR measures academic eligibility, retention and graduation. The scores are a four-year composite, covering the 2012-13 through 2015-16 school years.

Every Division I sports team across the nation calculates its APR each academic year, similar to a report card. Scholarship student-athletes each semester earn one point for remaining

eligible and one point for staying in school or graduating.

UK has received a perfect 1,000 mark in each of the last four single-year APR rates. The NCAA cut score to compete in the 2016-17 postseason is a 930 four-year APR. Teams scoring below 930 can face consequences intended to direct additional focus on academics. Those penalties can include practice restrictions and playing-season reductions.

Cats Rock at Rupp

UK has won 217 of its last 246 home games, including a 54-game winning streak in the venerable arena to begin the John Calipari era and a recent 42-game winning streak. All-time, the Wildcats are 561-66 (.895) in Rupp Arena.

Among the most notable marks of dominance in the nation's toughest venue to play include:

• The Wildcats are 302-40 (.883) in regular-season SEC games in the building

• Kentucky set a new program home record of 19 wins in 2014-15

• The Wildcats have gone undefeated at home in five of John Calipari's seven seasons, including 2014-15 and 2015-16

• Overall, UK has posted a perfect mark in 13 of Rupp Arena's 40 seasons

Cal Owns Longest Win Streaks in Rupp

With UK's 2011-12 season-opening victory over Marist, UK head coach John Calipari recorded his 34th consecutive win in Rupp Arena as UK's head coach. It broke former UK head coach Rick Pitino's longest streak of 33 games in the venue.

The winning streak reached as long as 54 games. Calipari didn't suffer his first loss in Rupp Arena until losing to Baylor in his fourth season. The 54-game run, however, was his longest career winning streak. He also had the second-longest streak in the arena as the Cats won 42 straight from March 4, 2014 to Nov. 25, 2016.

Pack the House

Kentucky has led the nation in average home attendance in 19 of the last 22 seasons entering this year, including a Rupp Arena record of 24,110 in John Calipari's first season (2009-10) as head coach.

• Kentucky averaged 23,461 fans during the 2016-17 season

• UK has averaged 23,000 or more fans in seven of Calipari's eight seasons

The Top-Ranked Team at Home

Kentucky has lost just three times at home as the Associated Press topranked team in the history of the program and just twice in Rupp Arena. Prior to the loss to UCLA by three on Dec. 3, the other two losses came by just one point.

The Wildcats are 53-2 all-time as the AP No. 1 team in Rupp Arena since its opening in 1976. The first loss was to Auburn, 53-52, on Jan. 9, 1988

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari added another first to his Hall of Fame career in 2017. When Kentucky clinched at least a share of the 2017 Southeastern Conference championship by beating Vanderbilt on Feb. 28, he made history as a head coach. Calipari is the first NCAA Division I coach to lead three different programs (ÜMass, Memphis, Kentucky) to five on-court regular-season league titles five different times. He won the Atlantic 10 at the helm of UMass in 1992, 93, 94, 95 and 96. Memphis claimed the Conference USA crown in 2004, 06, 07, 08 and 09. Kentucky has captured the SEC five times in 2010, 12, 15,

16 and 17. Perhaps more impressive is that Calipari has 29 combined regular-season and tournament championships. That trails only Mark Few

of Gonzaga (30 titles) among all active coaches. All-time, Calipari trails only the great Adolph Rupp (41), Dean Smith (30) and Few.

First-Ballot Hall of Famer

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in September 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on the first ballot.

103-100 Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate 97-92 honors in the sport. 69-48

The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Bevetta, Wildcat Louie Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and JoJo White.

Calipari Wins 200th Career Game at UK in Record Time

With a thrilling 75-73 victory over rival Louisville on Dec. 26, 2015, John Calipari captured his 200th career win at Kentucky faster than any coach in UK history -- and nearly faster than anyone has ever done it at any school. Calipari reached the 200-win plateau in his 240th career game at Kentucky. Rick Pitino, previously the fastest to 200 wins at UK prior

- to Calipari, didn't capture his 200th Wildcat win until his 249th game. The legendary Adolph Rupp reached 200 during his 250th game. Not only did Calipari reach the 200-win mark in record pace at Kentucky, he also nearly set the all-time Division I mark. With the
- win over U of L, he became the second-fastest Division I men's basketball coach to reach 200 victories at a single school, behind only LIU-Brooklyn's Clair Bee, who achieved the feat in 231 games.

Calipari is one of just 11 head coaches in Division I men's basketball history with at least 200 victories at two different schools and just the fifth coach at Kentucky to reach the 200-win plateau.

- He's currently the only coach in NCAA history with at least 189 victories at three different schools.
- Here's a look at some of the more impressive numbers in Calipari's journey to 200 wins: • UK beat Florida more than anyone else during the first 200 wins, defeating the Gators 11 times
- Likewise, Kentucky beat Louisville (eight times) more than any other nonconference opponent
- Calipari defeated 89 different Division I schools (25.4 percent) of current Division I schools) during the run
 A total of 176 wins came with UK ranked in the AP Top 25, and 66 of them were while UK was No. 1

Approaching 700 On-Court Victories

With a win over No. 5 Kansas on Nov. 18, 2014, John Calipari claimed his 600th on-court victory as a Division I head coach. He became the 13th active Division I coach to achieve the feat.

He enters the 2017-18 season needing just six more wins to get to 700. Only 38 coaches have ever reached 700 and only eight active coaches

If Calipari were to win his first six games of the 2017-18 season, he would become the fourth-fastest coach to 700 on-court wins ever.

There's No Place Like Home

Since the 2000-01 season, John Calipari-coached teams have posted a 287-25 (.920) record at home. At UK, Coach Cal is 134-6 (.957) in Rupp Arena.

In five of Calipari's eight seasons at Kentucky, the Wildcats have posted an undefeated record at home, including a school-record 19-0 mark during the 2014-15 season.

Calipari owns both of UK's longest winning streaks in the arena. He began his career at UK with a 54-game winning streak at Rupp Arena. It was the longest winning streak since the arena opened in 1976. With a win over Georgia on Feb. 9, 2016, he secured the second-longest streak in the storied building at 34 games (which ended at 42).

As good as John Calipari's team's have been at home, they're nearly as good in hostile environments on the road. Dating back to the 2005-06 season, Calipari has recorded an 88-37 (.704) record on the road.

Calipari at No. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking. With UK's No. 1 ranking in 2016-17, Calipari has guided six of his last eight and seven of his last 10 teams to the No. 1 ranking (and the ninth time he's done it overall).

- When Coach Cal's teams have been at the top, they've been difficult to knock off:
- Calipari is 110-12 (.902) as the top-ranked Associated Press Top 25 coach in the country
- He's 69-7 (.908) when his team is at the top of the AP Top 25 as UK's head coach
 Calipari tallied a 32-4 mark at UMass when the Minutemen were No. 1 and he was 9-1 at Memphis when he had the Tigers at the pinnacle of the rankings

Among coaches who have owned a No. 1 ranking in at least 119 games, Calipari's winning percentage of .902 trails only Wooden (.952) and is ahead of active coach Krzyzewski (.870)

Calipari Unrivaled in Conference

John Calipari has won 15 league regular-season championships (including the 2010, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2017 SEC championships) eight more than the next-closest coach in the SEC (Ben Howland has seven conference titles). With a 2017 SEC Tournament championship -- Calipari's third straight and fifth at UK -- he now owns 14 conference tournament titles, nine more than his closest competitor (Howland)

Calipari's 29 combined championships (regular season and tournament) is just one shy of Mark Few (30) of Gonzaga for the most among all active coaches. All-time, Calipari trails only the great Adolph Rupp (41), Dean Smith (30) and Few.

He's tallied a 319-93 (.774) all-time record within conference play as a head coach and owns a 111-27 (.804) record since joining the SEC.

30 is the new 20

With a road win at Alabama on Feb. 11, John Calipari notched his 23rd consecutive season of 20 or more on-court wins as a collegiate head coach. He leads all active coaches with that streak, ahead of Mike Krzyzewski (21), Bill Self (19) and Jim Boeheim (17).

With a first-round win over Northern Kentucky in the 2017 NCAA Tournament. Calipari and the Cats clinched a 30-win season for the fourth time in his eight seasons as head coach. Calipari currently now has 10 seasons with 30 or more on-court wins. Only Krzyzewski (13) and Roy Williams (11) have more 30-win seasons as an active head coach. Calipari is the first coach in NCAA Division I history to record five straight on-court 30-win seasons, notching 30 wins in consecutive seasons from 2005-06 to 2009-10.

The Success Rate

John Calipari has graduated 100 percent of the players (17 of 17) who have been eligible to receive their diploma by the end of their senior years and exhausted their athletic eligibility. Of that group, Patrick Patterson, Jarrod Polson and Alex Poythress completed their degrees in three years.

In the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, which measures eligibility, retention and graduation, UK has posted a single-year Academic Progress Rate of 977 or higher in every season under Calipari, including a perfect 1,000 in the last four single-year reports. Kentucky's four-year composite score in the most recent report, which was released in May, was a 1,000, earning the team an NCAA academic award for the third year in a row for finishing in the top 10 percent of Division I men's basketball programs. Under Calipari, the Wildcats routinely post a 3.0 grade-point average or better.

Dream Maker

As someone who prides himself on helping young men reach their dreams, Coach Cal has helped 42 players get selected in the NBA Draft during his college coaching career, including 31 over his first eight seasons at Kentucky, which is more than any other coach. • Four No. 1 overall selections (Derrick Rose, John Wall, Anthony Davis and Karl-Anthony Towns) during the nine drafts from 2008

- to 2016. No other coach has more than two No. 1 picks
- In 2010, five of his UK players were selected in the first round for the first time in NBA history
- His six players in the 2012 and 2015 NBA drafts are the most in the two-round era
- Churned out 31 NBA Draft picks, 24 first-rounders, three No. 1 overall selections, seven top-five picks and 17 lottery picks at

Developing Talent

John Calipari hasn't just signed the best talent in the country while he's been at Kentucky; he's been the best at developing that talent and getting it ready for the next level.

Of the 27 top-25 players Kentucky has signed and have completed their college eligibility, 24 were drafted and 21 were selected in the first round. Those draft numbers don't include Wenyen Gabriel, Sacha Killeya-Jones, transfers or the 2017 class, all of whom are still in school.

But that's only half the story. Calipari's players don't just make it to the pros; they're better prepared than anyone else. The proof is in the numbers

Over the course of his career, Calipari's more than 45 NBA pros have nearly \$1.5 billion in NBA contracts alone, which doesn't include endorsement deals and overseas contracts. Of his UK players in the NBA, they've earned more than \$1 billion in guaranteed contracts

Double-Digit Win Streaks

Kentucky's 38-game winning streak in 2014-15 was historic, but it wasn't completely out of the norm for John Calipari. With UK's 14-game winning streak at the end of the 2016-17 season, Calipari has 18 streaks in his career where his teams have won 10 or more consecutive games during the season.

They've won 15 or more straight games nine times, 20 or more six times, 25 or more more five times, and 30 or more one time. Kentucky 14-game winning streak before its season-ending loss last seeason was its longest since the 38-game winning streak in 2014-15

A "players-first" coach with a penchant for helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, has guided six teams to the Final Four, led one to a national championship and helped 42 players get selected in the NBA Draft during his 25-year college coaching career.

Calipari guided Kentucky to its eighth national championship and his first national title in 2012. In becoming only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four, he has racked up more than 600 victories, 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, six Final Fours and numerous national coach of the year honors.

In 2015, Coach Cal led college basketball's first ever 38-0 team, and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of the season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

While building a program out of obscurity at Massachusetts, laying the foundation at Memphis and restoring luster at the sport's greatest program at Kentucky, he has totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

Quite honestly, though, Calipari's on-court success overshadows a much more significant picture. In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped 42 players realize their dreams and guide them to NBA Draft selections, including a record five first-round draft picks in 2010. Two years later, six Wildcats heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. UK, with Calipari's help, would tie those six picks again in 2015, including a record-tying four lottery selections. His four No. 1 overall picks are twice as many as any other coach, and he's had 31 players drafted during his first eight years at Kentucky, including 24 first-round picks.

Calipari's players have entered the league NBA-ready. He's coached an MVP, four All-NBA players, three Rookie of the Year winners, and 10 players from Calipari's first six teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80 percent, Calipari has stressed academics. Fifteen of his last 18 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor's degrees, and all 17 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including three players who earned their degree in just three years. Calipari's teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point averages of 3.0 or better.

His foundation, The Calipari Foundation, has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need in the Commonwealth and across the country. In 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He organized another one in 2012 for victims of Superstorm Sandy and another one in 2017 for victims of Hurricane Harvey.

In 2013, Calipari came up with the idea of hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend (the game and the fantasy experience) has generated more than \$1 million for charity every year since, including in 2014 without the funds from an alumni game and 2016 with a celebrity softball game in place of the traditional basketball game.

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller "Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out," Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that "it's never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it's about how high you bounce back."


