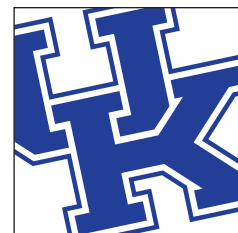

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Ole Miss and Kentucky will be meeting for the 43rd time in a series that dates back to 1944.
- The Rebels lead the all-time series vs. the Wildcats 27-14-1.
- Kentucky holds a 11-9-1 edge in games played in Lexington, Kentucky.
- This is the first meeting between the two schools since 2011.
- The home team has won the last four contests in the series.
- **Matt Luke** is in his 10th season at Ole Miss but first season at the helm, taking the reins of his alma mater as the 38th head coach in program history.
- Making the start for an injured **Shea Patterson**, junior QB **Jordan Ta'amu** completed 20-of-30 passes for 368 yards vs. Arkansas, all career highs ... It was the most passing yards ever by an Ole Miss quarterback making his first career start.
- The four rushing touchdowns by Ole Miss against Arkansas were the most this season and the most since last year vs. Memphis (4).
- The Rebels lead the SEC and rank eighth nationally in passing offense (338.1 ypg).
- Ole Miss is tops in the SEC and 15th nationally in kickoff return average (25.44 ypr).
- Sophomore WR **A.J. Brown** leads the SEC in multiple receiving categories: yards (765), yards per game (95.6) and receptions per game (5.1).
- Senior DE **Marquis Haynes** is third in the SEC and 16th nationally in sacks (6.5)

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE: Ole Miss holds its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season at 11:15 a.m. CT in the Burns Team Meeting Room at the Manning Center. Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will take the podium first and will be followed by Coach Matt Luke at approximately 11:30 a.m. Defensive coordinator Wesley McGriff and offensive coordinator Phil Longo will follow Coach Luke at the podium. Members of the media unable to attend the Monday press conference may participate via the telephone beginning at 11:30 a.m. The number for the two-way teleconference may be obtained by contacting the Athletics Communications office. The press conference is streamed live on SEC Network+.

PLAYER/ASSISTANT INTERVIEWS: Coordinators will take part in the Monday press conference. Select players and assistant coaches will be available after practice on Tuesday. Coach Luke and select players will be available after practice on Wednesday. All media interviews will be held in the team meeting room. There is no availability on Thursday or Friday.

PRACTICES: All practices are closed to the public and open to media for select periods on Tuesdays. Media are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything related to practice until the post-practice interviews. This includes media who leave practice early. On available days, media will be alerted which periods are available for video. Live video is prohibited, and use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. Videographers and photographers must use tight shots and not formations. If you have not previously attended practices, please contact the Communications office for prior approval and daily alerts on practice locations and times.

AUDIO/VIDEO RESTRICTIONS: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content attained via FTP, which should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions. Ole Miss offers free FTP downloads of practice footage, interviews and game highlights for television stations to use during regularly scheduled news/sportscasts. WEEKDAY PARKING: Parking permits are required for everyone on campus Monday through Friday between 7:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Media that plan to regularly attend practices, press conferences and other on-campus events may purchase a Vendor Permit from Campus Parking (www.olemiss.edu/parking), which is good for the full academic year. Those without parking permits are advised to park in a metered spot in the east lot of the Manning Center and feed the meter. Day passes are also available online at www.olemiss.edu/parking/visitors.html.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Per NCAA rule, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must agree to the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: 1) daily newspapers; 2) network affiliate television stations; 3) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; 4) magazines, weekly newspapers and non-broadcast radio stations. All season credential requests need to be submitted by August 18. Credential demands are heavy, and we hope you understand the space limitations we must deal with each year. For those of you who are not credentialed for all of the games you requested, we hold onto your request and will contact you if space becomes available on a game-by-game basis. Media wishing to cover the Cal game on Sept. 16 should email their credential request to Daniel Snowden at desnowde@olemiss.edu.

GAMEDAY DRIVING DIRECTIONS: Media traveling to campus should take the Chucky Mullins Drive exit off of Highway 6 and travel north toward the 4-way stop. Those with garage parking passes should turn right onto Hill Drive, and those with Tad Smith Coliseum passes should continue straight on Chucky Mullins Drive. Both lots are located on the right side of their respective streets.

GAMEDAY PARKING: Gameday media parking is located in two locations: 1) garage adjacent to The Pavilion; and 2) lot near Tad Smith Coliseum. Media should check their pass to indicate for which lot they are designated. For passes marked for the garage, each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Passes marked for Tad Smith Coliseum are for a lot located west of the old arena.

MEDIA GATE: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three and a half (3.5) hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located there, and photographers will exchange their photo ticket for an armband at this location. Parking passes may not be picked up at media will-call and must be requested at least seven days prior to gameday to ensure delivery.

RECRUITS: Media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect – from when they check in until after they have checked out or concluded their visit and are no longer inside our facilities. Media are also forbidden from having direct contact with the prospects' family members who are present at the visit. In addition, media may not be present during any recruiting contact and may not video or photograph a prospect during a visit.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST KENTUCKY

November 5, 2011 • Lexington, Ky. • Kentucky 30, Ole Miss 13: - Freshman Nickolas Brassell totaled 96 all-purpose yards and a touchdown, but Ole Miss fell to Kentucky 30-13 at Commonwealth Stadium. Ole Miss used two field goals (31, 37) by junior Bryson Rose to take a 6-0 lead after the first quarter but UK scored 20 points in the fourth quarter to close out the win.

October 2, 2010 • Oxford, Miss. • Ole Miss 42, Kentucky 35: Quarterback Jeremiah Masoli wasn't amazing, but thanks to some help from his defense, he was certainly opportunistic as Ole Miss beat Kentucky 42-35. Ole Miss pulled away in the second half, putting together drives of 75 and 60 yards, respectively, to take a 35-20 lead by the end of the third quarter. The Rebels added another touchdown early in the fourth quarter on a 4-yard pass from Masoli to Ferbia Allen for a 42-20 lead. Ole Miss' Brandon Bolden rushed for 108 yards and a touchdown on 23 carries. It was his first 100-yard rushing game against an SEC opponent.

September 16, 2006 • Lexington, Ky. • Kentucky 31, Ole Miss 14: Myron Pryor caused three key turnovers and Dicky Lyons Jr. caught his fifth and sixth touchdowns of the season as Kentucky defeated Ole Miss 31-14 to win its first SEC opener in 19 years. Ole Miss got on the board first after Rafael Little fumbled, giving the ball to the Rebels near midfield.

October 22, 2005 • Oxford, Miss. • Ole Miss 13, Kentucky 7: Micheal Spurlock passed for 198 yards and a touchdown and Mico McSwain had 104 yards rushing as Ole Miss held off Kentucky 13-7. The Wildcats were held to 47 yards in the first half, lost three fumbles and punted eight times. Matt Hinkle hit field goals of 45 and 18 yards, but the Rebels missed four field goals. The Rebels forced two turnovers in an 11-second span in the second quarter, but scored just three points off them.

September 29, 2001 • Lexington, Ky. Ole Miss 42, Kentucky 31: Eli Manning completed 19 of 36 passes for 268 yards and two TDs as Ole Miss held off Kentucky 42-31. Chris Collins had seven receptions for 119 yards, including a 26-yard TD catch, and scored on a 38-yard reverse.

KENTUCKY HEAD COACH MARK STOOPS

Mark Stoops (Iowa, 1989) is in his fifth year as the Kentucky head coach after successful stops at Arizona and Florida State as defensive coordinator. After inheriting a program that had produced a 2-10 record the season before his arrival, Stoops has markedly improved the team's performance. In 2014, UK won five games – more than the previous two seasons combined. In 2016, Stoops led the Wildcats to the TaxSlayer Bowl; Kentucky's first bowl game since the 2010 season. Stoops was raised in Youngstown, Ohio. Like his brothers, Mark played in the secondary at the University of Iowa for Hall of Fame coach Hayden Fry. He participated in four bowl games as a player. Fry hired Stoops as a graduate assistant coach at Iowa in the 1990 and '91 seasons. The Hawkeyes won the 1990 Big Ten title and played in the Rose Bowl, duplicating feats Stoops also achieved as a player. Stoops went on to coach four years in high school before entering the collegiate ranks.

KENTUCKY SCOUTING REPORT

The Kentucky Wildcats currently sit at 6-2, 3-2 in the SEC and are off to its best start since 2007. The Wildcats are coming off a 29-26 home win over Tennessee to help Kentucky earn bowl eligibility for the second consecutive season. Offensively, Kentucky averages 341.0 yards per game, with 154.3 coming on the ground and 186.7 through the air. Sophomore Benny Snell, Jr. leads the ground attack, averaging just over 90 yards rushing per game. His nine rushing TDs ranks fourth in the SEC and 21st nationally. Snell is coming off a season-high 191 rushing yards and three-touh-down performance against the Volunteers. It was Snell's fourth 100-yard game of the season and ninth of his career. Senior quarterback Stephen Johnson also showed he's a threat to pull the ball and run after a career-high 84-yard rushing game vs. Tennessee. Tight end C.J. Conrad, a third-team preseason All-SEC selection, is a redzone threat, hauling in three TD receptions off just nine catches all season. Junior Josh Allen leads a Kentucky front seven that ranks sixth in the SEC in total sacks. Allen is second in the SEC and 12th nationally with seven sacks on the year. Allen sits third in career sacks amongst active SEC players. Junior safety Mike Edwards leads Kentucky with 64 tackles and has accounted for half of the Wildcats' six interceptions. The Wildcats possess a strong kicking game with Lou Groza Award candidate Austin MacGinnis. On the year, MacGinnis is 13-of-18 on field goal attempts with a long of 53 yards.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH MATT LUKE

Matt Luke (Ole Miss, 2000) is in his 10th season at Ole Miss but first season at the helm, taking the reins of his alma mater as the 38th head coach in school history. The Rebels are 66-54 with Luke on staff as a full-time coach, including 3-5 with him leading the program. He was born a Rebel as his family has ties to Ole Miss that span three generations. During his 23 years as a player and coach at the collegiate level, Luke has risen through the ranks while learning from a number of successful veteran coaches. He has worked alongside national champion Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer, Duke head coach David Cutcliffe and former Ole Miss head coach Tommy Tuberville, among others. On the field, he has mentored 17 all-league selections as well as All-Americans and first-round draft picks Laremy Tunsil and Laken Tomlinson. Luke, a four-year center for the Rebels (1995-98), spent the past five seasons as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. During his first stop in Oxford (2002-05), he served four seasons coaching the Ole Miss tight ends and offensive line under Cutcliffe.

A FIRST CAREER START FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

Making his first career start for an injured **Shea Patterson**, junior college transfer QB **Jordan Ta'amu** completed 20-of-30 passes for 368 yards, all career-highs and the most passing yards ever by an Ole Miss quarterback making his first career start. Ta'amu also ran for 76 yards on nine carries. His 444 yards of total offense (368 passing, 76 rushing) are the fifth-most yards in a single game in Ole Miss history. The 49-yard touchdown scamper in the first quarter by Ta'amu was the longest rush by an Ole Miss QB since Bo Wallace had a 59-yard scamper vs. Auburn (Nov. 1, 2014).

WILKINS RUNNING FREE

Senior RB **Jordan Wilkins** started the season slow, but has helped add another weapon to the potent Ole Miss offense. Wilkins recorded his fourth-straight game with a rushing touchdown after a 64-yard TD against Arkansas. After rushing for just 103 yards (34.3 ypg) during the Rebels' first three games, Wilkins has averaged just over 96 yards per game on the ground over the last five contests. On the year, Wilkins has rushed for 586 yards and five scores. Earlier this season, Wilkins became only the 12th player to exceed 100 rushing yards during the Saban era, after running for 101 yards on 12 carries against Alabama.

DYNAMIC OFFENSE

Ole Miss has produced a dynamic offense through the first eight games of the season as shown by the numbers below:

- Ole Miss leads the SEC and ranks eighth nationally in passing offense averaging 338.1 yards per game.
- Sophomore WR **A.J. Brown** leads the SEC and ranks 14th nationally in receiving yards per game (95.6) and is 28th nationally in touchdowns (6), while fellow wideout junior **DaMarkus Lodge** is seventh in the league in receiving yards per game (63.9), and is tied with Brown in touchdowns.

PICK YOUR POISON

The Ole Miss receiving corps has been a nightmare for opposing defenses this season. The Rebels boast four receivers who have hauled in more than 28 catches this season. Only Washington State has more receivers with such numbers (5). **A.J. Brown, D.K. Metalf, DaMarkus Lodge** and **Van Jefferson** all rank in the top 15 in the SEC in receptions per game. Brown leads the SEC and ranks 14th nationally in receiving yards per game (95.6) and is 28th nationally in touchdowns (6), while fellow wideout Lodge is seventh in the league in receiving yards per game (63.9), and is tied with Brown in touchdowns. The Rebels have had at least one 100-yard receiver in six of the eight games this season. They've had two 100-yard receivers twice.

DEGREES IN HAND

Earning a degree from the University of Mississippi is one of the top priorities for Ole Miss student-athletes. Seven current Rebels have already accomplished that goal with eligibility remaining this fall.

FINAL CAMPAIGN FOR SACK-MASTER HAYNES

Preseason All-American DE **Marquis Haynes** continued to add to his school modern-era sacks and tackles for loss records with one sack and one tackle for loss against Arkansas. Haynes' career sack record total of 31.0 sits atop of the all-time record book ahead of Greg Hardy (26.5). His 45.0 TFLs are tops in Ole Miss history, passing former Rebel DE Derrick Burgess (42.0). Haynes led the Rebels in sacks as a freshman (7.5), sophomore (10.0) and junior (7.0). The Jacksonville, Florida, native is a unanimous preseason All-SEC first-team pick and made watch lists for the Bednarik, Nagurski, Hendricks and Lott IMPACT awards.

PUTTING THE 'SPECIAL' IN SPECIAL TEAMS

Sophomore kick returner **Jaylon Jones** is always a threat to take one back to the house. Jones, who had a 97-yard TD return during first game of the season vs. South Alabama, leads the SEC and ranks third nationally with 703 total kickoff yardage and is fourth in the SEC with 25.1 yards per return. Jones' 194 kickoff return yards against LSU were the second-most in a game in school history. As a team, Ole Miss is tops amongst the SEC and 14th nationally in kickoff return yardage (25.44).

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

WR **A.J. Brown** is off to a stellar sophomore campaign as he leads the SEC and ranks 14th nationally in receiving yards per game (95.6) and is third in the SEC in touchdowns (6). Brown's four 100-yard receiving games this season ranks fourth in the single-season record books for 100-yard games, just two shy of Laquon Treadwell's mark of six set during the 2015 season. Earlier in the year, the Starkville, Mississippi, native hauled in eight receptions for 233 yards and two scores vs. South Alabama, breaking Eddie Small's Ole Miss record of 210 receiving yards set versus Vanderbilt in 1993. Brown's total of 233 yards also tied Pharoah Cooper of South Carolina for the 13th most receiving yards in a game in SEC history. His two TD catches of 71 and 77 yards also marked the first time in school history a receiver posted two 70-plus yard touchdowns in the same game.

WUNDERLICH MOVING UP CAREER CHARTS

After a nearly flawless junior season, K/P **Gary Wunderlich** entered his senior season as one of the nation's top place-kickers. Wunderlich has made a field goal in 18 straight games in which he's played, the longest active in the NCAA, and surpasses Ole Miss kicker Josh Shene's streak of 16-straight back in 2008. Wunderlich continues to work his way up several Ole Miss career record lists. Wunderlich currently sits second on the Ole Miss all-time career record books in points scored (318), field goals made (59) and PATs made (141). In his last game, Wunderlich tallied three field goals. It was the eighth time in his career he's recorded three FGs in a game. A Lou Groza Award semifinalist last year, he has been named to the watch list this preseason, as well as to various preseason All-America and All-SEC squads.

TACKLING MACHINE

Senior LB **DeMarquis Gates** recorded a career-high in both tackles (15) and tackles for loss (3) in Ole Miss' last outing. Gates, a watch list candidate for the Butkus Award, currently leads the team and ranks second in the SEC with 72 total tackles. He is looking to become the first Rebel to lead in tackles for three straight years since Abdul Jackson did it from 1992-94. Gates has recorded double-digit tackles four times this season.

PATTERSON OUT FOR THE SEASON

Sophomore QB **Shea Patterson** is out for the season after tearing the posterior cruciate ligament (PCL) in his right knee during the second quarter against LSU. Patterson was on a blistering offensive pace, leading the SEC in total passing yards (2,259), passings yards per game (322.7), completions per game (23.7) and total offense (320.4). Patterson ranked in the top 20 nationally in seven passing areas. In just his fifth career start, Patterson threw for a school-record 489 yards and a career-best five touchdowns in Ole Miss win over UT Martin during week 2 of the 2017 season. He broke Chad Kelly's previous Ole Miss record of 465 yards set last season against Auburn and finished one TD shy of tying Eli Manning's school record six touchdown passes set against Arkansas in 2001. Despite not finishing out the final five games of the season, Patterson's 2017 season numbers will still allow him to etch his name in the single-season school record books in multiple categories.

The award honors the late **Chucky Mullins**, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. Haynes wears the No. 38 jersey in Mullins' honor this season.

NEW BLOOD

- With six offensive starters and five defensive starters gone from last year's team, the Ole Miss coaches are looking for younger players to fill some of those big shoes.
- Six of last year's starters are currently on NFL rosters: WR **Quincy Adebeyejo** (UFA, Ravens), TE **Evan Engram** (1st-round pick, Giants), DT **D.J. Jones** (6th-round pick, 49ers), RB **Akeem Judd** (UFA, Titans), QB **Chad Kelly** (7th-round pick, Broncos), WR **Damore'ea Stringfellow** (UFA, Dolphins) ... CB **Derrick Jones** (6th-round pick, Jets) and CB **Carlos Davis** (UFA, Rams) are also in the league.
- Record-breaking QB **Chad Kelly** is now in the NFL, but sophomore QB **Shea Patterson** gained crucial experience when he started the final three games last season after Kelly went down with a knee injury ... In his first game as starter, Patterson led a second-half comeback in a 29-28 win at No. 8 Texas A&M.
- Ole Miss lost three of its top four receivers from 2016 (Engram, Stringfellow, Adebeyejo), but the cupboard is still quite full at receiver with the likes of senior **Markell Pack**, junior **DaMarkus Lodge**, sophomores **A.J. Brown**, **Van Jefferson** and redshirt freshman **D.K. Metcalf**, among others.

LANDSHARK

At Ole Miss, Landshark is a term that was first adopted by the Rebel football team's defensive unit. As part of that identity, defensive players celebrate big plays by putting a hand to their forehead in the shape of a shark fin. A battle cry of "Fins Up" also contributes to the players' persona. With the popularity of both the players and the hand gesture, Ole Miss fans and student-athletes from other sports embraced the spirit of the Landshark, and in October 2017, the university announced the Landshark as the official mascot of the Ole Miss Rebels. The Landshark mascot is expected to be unveiled before the 2018 season.

Roots of the Landshark at Ole Miss date back to 2008. After four straight losing seasons, the Rebel football team returned to national prominence with a 9-4 record and a victory over 7th-ranked Texas Tech in the Cotton Bowl. Leading the charge was a defensive squad that ranked fourth in the nation in rushing defense and included All-American Peria Jerry and eventual All-SEC standout Jerrell Powe.

The term Landshark originated that season from senior linebacker Tony Fein, an Army veteran who served a one-year tour in the Iraq War before arriving in Oxford. A two-year letterman after transferring from Scottsdale (Ariz.) Community College, Fein was the 2008 recipient of the Pat Tillman Award by the Military Order of the Purple Heart. Fein passed away in October 2009, but his legacy at Ole Miss continues through the Landshark.

SOUTH ALABAMA NOTES

GENERAL NOTES: Today's attendance was 62,532 ... This game marked the kickoff of the 123rd season of football at Ole Miss and the first under head coach **Matt Luke** ... The Rebels now boast an all-time record of 661-511-35 (.563 winning percentage) ... Ole Miss' last five head coaches have all been victorious in their debut on the Rebel sideline ... The Rebels are now 91-27-5 all-time in season openers (.760 winning percentage) and have taken 18 of the last 22.

OFFENSIVE NOTES: The Rebels' 531 total offensive yards were the most since Auburn last season (570) and the 429 passing yards were also the most since the game versus the Tigers a year ago (465) ... Sophomore QB **Shea Patterson** connected with sophomore WR **A.J. Brown** on 71 and 77-yard touchdown passes in the third quarter ... The 77-yarder was Patterson's longest career completion and Brown's longest career reception, and the longest TD pass since Jevan Snead connected with Mike Wallace for 88 yards in 2008 versus Louisiana-Monroe ... It also marked the first time in school history a receiver recorded two 70-plus yard TD catches in the same game ... Patterson joined Eli Manning as the only two Rebel QBs with two 70-plus yard touchdown passes in the same game ... Manning recorded the feat against Vanderbilt in 2002 ... Patterson completed 28 of 35 attempts (80.0 pct.) for career-best 429 yards and four touchdowns ... The 429 yards passing was the most since Chad Kelly threw for 465 yards against Auburn last year and the third most in school history trailing only Kelly and Archie Manning (436) ... The four TD passes were a personal best and the most since Kelly tossed four scores against Florida State a year ago ... Brown's 233 yards receiving (eight catches) broke Eddie Small's school record of 210 yards set versus Vanderbilt in 1993 ... It is also the 13th most receiving yards in a game in SEC history and the most in the conference since South Carolina's Pharoah Cooper posted 233 versus Tennessee in 2014 ... Junior WR **DaMarkus Lodge** caught five passes for 51 yards and a career-best two TDs ... Sophomore RB **D'Vaughn Pennamon** rushed for 34 yards on seven carries including a touchdown.

DEFENSIVE NOTES: Junior DB **C.J. Moore** earned his first career start at free safety and led the Rebels with a career-high eight tackles (six solo) ... Sophomore DT **Josiah Coatney** earned his first career start and posted a career-best 5 tackles including a team-best 2.0 TFLs ... Senior DB **A.J. Moore** posted three stops (two solo) including 1.0 QB sack.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES: Sophomore **Jaylon Jones** returned a kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter ... It was Jones' first career kickoff return for a touchdown and the Rebels' first since Jaylen Walton pulled it off against Texas in 2012 ... Sophomore **D'Vaughn Pennamon** returned his first career kickoff for 46 yards ... Freshman **Luke Logan** made his Rebel debut as the kickoff specialist.

Metcalf** had a two TD game for the first time in his career after hauling in a 9-yard pass in the third quarter, and an 8-yard score in the fourth ... Sophomore WR **A.J. Brown** finished with a career high 10 receptions and 109 yards in his third 100-yard game of the season. It also marked the third time this season he's hauled in eight or more catches ... Sophomore WR **Van Jefferson** finished as the second-leading receiver with 89 yards off eight catches ... Senior RB **Jordan Wilkins** finished with 131 all-purpose yards after 65 on the ground (13 carries), and a career high 66 yards receiving off five catches ... Ole Miss & Vanderbilt is the third-most played series of all-time between the Rebels and its 2017 opponents (Mississippi State, LSU).

OFFENSIVE NOTES: For the first time since Nov. 7, 2015 (Arkansas), Ole Miss had a 300-yard passer (**Shea Patterson**-351 yards), 100-yard rushing effort (**Jordan Wilkins**-113 yards) and a receiver go over 100 yards receiving (**A.J. Brown**-174 yards) ... Patterson scampered in from four yards out during the second quarter for his first-career rushing touchdown ... Sophomore WR **A.J. Brown** finished with eight receptions and 174 yards in his fourth 100-yard game of the season. It also marked the fourth time this season he's hauled in eight or more catches ... Senior RB **Jordan Wilkins** finished with 150 all-purpose yards after 113 on the ground, with a career-high 18 carries ... It was the second time in the last three games that Wilkins has surpassed the 100-yard rushing mark ... It was the third straight game that Wilkins surpassed 100 yards in all-purpose yardage ... Sophomore RB **Eric Swinney** ran for career-highs in yardage (76yds) and carries (seven), while tallying his first-career touchdown ... The 35 first-half points were the Rebels' most in any half since Sept. 12, 2015 vs. Fresno State (38). Ole Miss also scored 35 first-half points vs. the Bulldogs in that same game ... Junior WR **DaMarkus Lodge** had a two TD game for the second time this season after hauling in a 35-yard pass and a 6-yard score in the second quarter ... **Lodge** finished as the second-leading receiver with 74 yards off five catches ... The seven sacks are the most by Ole Miss since Nov. 28, 2015 (7-Mississippi State) ... For the first time all season, the Ole Miss defense recorded multiple sacks in a game (7) ... The safety during the third quarter was the first safety recorded since Dec. 30, 2013 vs. Georgia Tech ... Ole Miss hasn't allowed a 300-yard passer since Oct. 1, 2016 (Riley Ferguson, Memphis, 343) and has held passers to 250 yards or fewer in 15 of the last 18 games ... Junior DT **Ross Donelly** tallied a career-high four tackles.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES: Senior **Gary Wunderlich** was not active for today's game having his streak of 16 games with a field goal snapped ... Freshman **K Luke Logan** tallied his first-career field goal (22 yards) and a career-high seven PATs. **Logan** would later add another field goal from 25 yards out.

D'Vaughn Pennamon ran for his third career touchdown ... Sophomore Jaylon Jones had a career-high in all-purpose yards (194) all coming from kickoff return ... Ole Miss converted a two-point conversion against LSU for the second straight year.

The Rebels tallied 30 or more first half points for the second time in the last three games (35 vs. Vanderbilt - Oct. 14) ... The four rushing touchdowns by Ole Miss were the most this season and the most since last year vs. Memphis (4) ... Junior QB Jordan Ta'amu completed 20-of-30 passes for 368 yards, all career-highs and the most passing yards ever by an Ole Miss quarterback making his first career start ... Ta'amu also ran for 76 yards on nine carries ... Ta'amu's 444 yards of total offense (368 passing, 76 rushing) are the fifth-most yards in a single game in Ole Miss history ... The 49-yard by Ta'amu was the longest rush by an Ole Miss QB since Bo Wallace had a 59-yard scamper vs. Auburn (Nov. 1, 2014) ... D.K. Metcalf was Ole Miss' leading receiver with four catches for 107 yards ... Sophomore TE Octavious Cooley recorded a career-best two receptions and 49 yards receiving ... Senior RB Jordan Wilkins led the Ole Miss rushing attack, finishing with 118 yards on the ground ... It marked Wilkins' fourth straight game with a rushing TD and the third 100-yard game of the season ... Eric Swinney ran for his second career touchdown.

DEFENSIVE NOTES: The four sacks by the Ole Miss defense were the second-most this season ... The Ole Miss defense recorded three or more sacks for the third straight game ... It was the third time this season that the Ole Miss defense forced two or more turnovers ... Senior LB DeMarquis Gates recorded a career-high 15 tackles for the Rebels ... It was the fourth game this season that Gates has recorded double-digit tackles and the fourth time this season he's led Ole Miss in total tackles ... Gates tallied a career-high three tackles for loss ... DB Javien Hamilton tallied his team-best third interception of the season ... Sophomore DB Myles Hartsfield tallied a career-high in tackles (10) ... For the second straight game, DT Breeland Speaks tied career-high with two sacks.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES: Senior Gary Wunderlich has now made a field goal in 18 straight games in which he's played. His streak was the longest active in the NCAA, and surpasses Ole Miss kicker Josh Shene's streak of 16-straight back in 2008 ... Wunderlich moved into second place on the all-time record books in points scored (318), field goals made (308) and PATs made (59) ... The three field goals by Wunderlich tied a career-high and was the eighth time in his career he's recorded three FGs in a game.

COACH MATT LUKE

Matt Luke was born a Rebel. His family has ties to Ole Miss that span three generations. Now, he has achieved a lifelong dream by taking over the reins of his alma mater. On July 20, 2017, Ole Miss announced Luke as interim head coach, making him the 38th head coach in program history

During his 23 years as a player and coach at the collegiate level, Luke has risen through the ranks while learning from a number of successful veteran coaches. He has worked alongside national champion Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer, Duke head coach David Cutcliffe and former Ole Miss head coach Tommy Tuberville, among others. On the field, he has mentored 17 all-league selections as well as All-Americans and first-round draft picks Laremy Tunsil and Laken Tomlinson.

Luke, a four-year center for the Rebels (1995-98), enters his 10th season as a coach at Ole Miss. He spent the past five seasons as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. During his first stop in Oxford (2002-05), Luke served four seasons coaching the Ole Miss tight ends and offensive line under Cutcliffe.

Since returning to Oxford in 2012, Luke has helped the Rebels earn a bowl berth in four seasons, including a 10-3 record and Sugar Bowl victory to cap the 2015 season.

A former Rebel player and assistant coach, Luke spent the previous four seasons as Duke's offensive coordinator/running game while coaching the offensive line. His line ranked among the ACC's top five in fewest sacks allowed throughout his tenure, including finishing third in 2009 and 2010.

Luke came to Duke following two seasons at Tennessee where he served as recruiting coordinator while coaching the tight ends and assisting with the offensive line. During his two-year stay (2006-07) in Knoxville, the Volunteers went 19-8 with an SEC Eastern Division championship and two appearances in the Outback Bowl.

On the recruiting front, Tennessee's 2007 class was rated third-best nationally by Rivals.com and fourth-best in the country by Scout.com.

A native of Gulfport, Mississippi, Luke lettered four seasons (1995-98) as a center at Ole Miss. A starter in 33 career games for the Rebels, he served as team captain in 1998 as Ole Miss posted a 7-5 ledger and defeated Texas Tech in the Independence Bowl. He was named the 1998 Ole Miss Most Valuable Senior by the Jackson (Miss.) Touchdown Club and twice earned Academic All-SEC honors.

Following his playing career, he served as a student assistant coach at Ole Miss in 1999, helping the Rebels to an 8-4 mark with regular-season wins against Auburn, South Carolina, LSU and Arkansas as well as a 27-25 triumph over Oklahoma in the Independence Bowl. He graduated in May 2000 with a degree in business administration.

Luke then spent two years (2000-01) coaching the offensive line at Murray State before returning to his alma mater to guide the Rebel tight ends and offensive line for four seasons (2002-05). Ole Miss won two bowl games during that stretch, defeating Nebraska in the Independence Bowl to close the 2002 season and upending Oklahoma State in the Cotton Bowl a year later to cap a 10-3 campaign that included a share of the SEC Western Division championship.

Lexington, Ky. - Freshman Nickolas Brassell totaled 96 all-purpose yards and a touchdown, but Ole Miss fell to Kentucky 30-13 here Saturday at Commonwealth Stadium.

Ole Miss used two field goals (31, 37) by junior Bryson Rose to take a 6-0 lead after the first quarter. Rose has now made 17 consecutive field goal attempts dating back to last season, which is one shy of the SEC record and the nation's longest active streak.

With both teams looking for their first SEC win, Kentucky used a 9-play drive--resulting in a 2-yard TD run by CoShik Williams at the beginning of the second quarter--to get on the board.

The Rebels had the ball at the Kentucky 49 with 2:07 remaining in the half, but two plays later, quarterback Randall Mackey was intercepted by Wildcat linebacker Danny Trevathan, setting up a 48-yard field goal by Greg McIntosh to give the Wildcats the 10-6 lead heading into the locker-room.

Kentucky got the ball to start the second half, but the Rebel defense forced a three and out. Ole Miss, who had been outscored in the third quarter coming into the game, went 72 yards in 12 plays capped by a 21-yard pass from Mackey to Brassell to regain the lead 13-10 with 7:15 to go in the third quarter. It marked Brassell's second career touchdown and second TD in as many games.

Unfortunately, that would be it for the Rebels. Kentucky scored early in the fourth quarter on an eight-play 80-yard drive that resulted in a 38-yard touchdown pass from freshman quarterback Maxwell Smith to La'Rod King. The missed extra point made it 16-13 Wildcats.

The Wildcats added two late touchdowns for the final 30-13 score.

The Rebels started six true freshmen in the game, including Brassell, who got his first start on defense and Serderius Bryant, who finished with a career-high 10 tackles, including three solo. In addition to his 96 yards and one TD on offense, Brassell totaled three tackles, a pass break-up and a half a QB sack. Another freshman to start on defense, safety Cody Prewitt registered a career-best nine tackles and four solo stops.

OXFORD, Miss. - Turnovers set the forces in motion for a 24-point lead to evaporate in front of Ole Miss' eyes as Arkansas escaped Oxford with a wild 38-37 win in the latest chapter of this SEC West rivalry.

The most critical one came late in the fourth quarter. Ole Miss took the field with 6:01 remaining on the game looking to salt away a 37-28 lead that once was as high as 31-7. A zone read between Jordan Ta'amu and Eric Swinney went haywire and the football landed in the grass. It was scooped up by Arkansas's Kevin Richardson, who ran it into the end zone for a touchdown that altered the trajectory of the game more than any other. The Razorbacks trailed 37-35 with plenty of time on the clock.

It was a bitter end to an otherwise productive debut for the senior. An Ole Miss punt on the next drive paved the way for Arkansas to take the football down the field and win the game on a 33-yard field goal from the left foot of Connor Limpert. The Razorbacks led for a total of four seconds in the ballgame.

Both teams came into the game with back up quarterbacks, battered offensive lines and struggling defenses. The Rebels carried the advantage at signal caller thanks to the play of Ta'amu. He was 20-30 for 368 yards and a pair of rushing touchdowns and was a large reason why Ole Miss' lead ballooned to 31-7 in the first 25 minutes of the ballgame.

Jordan Wilkins scored on the second play of the game when he exploded through a hole on the far side of the field en route to a 64-yard touchdown. Wilkins had 16 rushes for 118 yards.

OXFORD, Miss. - Ole Miss blitzed South Alabama in the second half en route to a 47-27 win over the Jaguars to deliver Matt Luke his first career victory as a head coach.

The Rebels started fast with 10 quick points in the first 13 minutes of the game, but endured a sluggish end to the first half that saw South Alabama climb back into the game at 13-10.

The story of the second half - at least the early portion of it - was A.J. Brown and Shea Patterson. The two hooked up for a pair of long touchdown passes in the first two drives of the half from 71 and 77 yards, respectively. Brown had 8 receptions for 233 yards and the two touchdowns. Patterson finished the game 28 of 35 for 429 yards and four scores. He threw all over the Jaguars in a strong opening performance for the sophomore quarterback who is the centerpiece of Phil Longo's offense.

Brown broke the school record for receiving yards in a game. He and Patterson connected on a lot of broken plays when Patterson was flushed out of the pocket. It is a byproduct of their timing together and being on the same page.

Brown was one of seven Rebels to record catches on the day as the most explosive element of the Ole Miss offense dominated South Alabama's secondary.

DaMarkus Lodge had five receptions for 51 yards and a pair of touchdowns. D.K. Metcalf caught eight balls for 84 yards on the night.

Ole Miss kept pouring it on after the two early second half strikes between Patterson and Brown. Jaylon Jones took a kickoff 97 yards for a score to give Ole Miss a 33-13 lead midway through the third quarter. Lodge followed that with the second of his touchdown catches that put the game out of reach at 40-13.

OXFORD, Miss. -- An early kickoff was accompanied by a sluggish start for Ole Miss, but it persevered to a 45-23 win over UT Martin to improve to 2-0 on the season.

The Rebels finished the game in a much more appealing fashion than they started. UT-Martin jumped out to a 9-0 lead early on behind a rushing attack that tallied 67 yards in the opening quarter. Ole Miss was stopped on its opening drive, but the offense quickly gelled after that. Shea Patterson found A.J. Brown for a 58-yard touchdown pass. UT Martin answered that with a score of their own to go up 16-7.

Ole Miss proceeded to score 31 consecutive points after that highlighted by a 21-point third quarter in which the offense scored on every drive. Patterson found Brown on a two-yard touchdown pass for a second time just before halftime to give the Rebels a 17-16 lead.

For a second consecutive week, the Rebels hit the ground running in the second half. Jordan Wilkins completed a nine play, 80-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown rush on the first drive of the second half.

Both Brown and Lodge had touchdown catches on the day and both surpassed the 100-yard mark by the third quarter. Brown caught eight balls for 156 yards while Lodge had 6 receptions for a career-high 133 yards.

Ole Miss continued to show how dynamic it can be in the passing game. Patterson threw for 489 yards and five scores. He broke the school record for passing yards in a single game, completed 74.4 percent of his throws and threw passes to nine different receivers. Four different receivers caught touchdown passes.

BERKELEY, Calif. - Ole Miss faced adversity from multiple angles, and fell short in the second half in a 27-16 loss to Cal.

Nothing came easy for the Rebels in California after a fast start.

Shea Patterson and the offense marched the football down the field on the team's opening possession and settled for a Gary Wunderlich field goal. The senior kicker injured his hamstring shortly after and would not return to the game after missing an extra point later in the half.

Two drives later, Cal cashed in on a Patterson interception and took a 7-3 lead. That evaporated in the blink of an eye after Patterson found DaMarkus Lodge for a 72-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the ensuing drive. It was the first of two long touchdown passes as Patterson hit D.K. Metcalf in stride for a 71-yard score in the second quarter that pushed the Rebels' lead to 16-7.

C.J. Moore had two interceptions in the second quarter that kept Cal off of the scoreboard and gave the Rebels a 16-7 heading into the half.

The third quarter was not kind to Ole Miss as Cal outscored the Rebels 10-0 and took a 17-16 lead highlighted by a Ross Bowers 23-yard touchdown pass to Vic Wharton III on the Bears' opening possession of the half.

Penalties thwarted Ole Miss' momentum for much of the night, but particularly in the third quarter. The team was penalized 16 times for 113 yards in the game.

A bulk of the penalties were shouldered by the offensive line, who had to shift around after it lost veteran center Sean Rawlings to an ankle sprain in the first half. Luke did not know how long he will be out, but anticipated it being a couple of weeks.

Patterson was flushed out of the pocket often and was forced to try to extend plays with his feet. The offense sputtered for much of the second half as a result. The Rebels mustered just 131 yards in the second half. Cal had 201 by comparison.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - Alabama proved why it is the most dominant team SEC in more ways than one in its 66-3 win over Ole Miss. After the two teams exchanged three-and-outs to begin the game, Alabama took control in every facet of the game. Bo Scarbrough opened up the scoring with a six-yard touchdown rush. Levi Wallace made it 14-0 less than a minute later when he picked off a Shea Patterson pass and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown.

Gary Wunderlich added a 26-yard field goal to make it 14-3, getting the Rebels on the board. The Rebels' tumultuous opening quarter was capped off by the first of two Jalen Hurts touchdown passes, this one to tight end Hale Hentges that capped off an 85-yard drive. Hurts hit Josh Jacobs for an 18-yard score a short time later and capped off the half with a rushing touchdown to give the Crimson Tide a 35-3 lead at the break.

Alabama cruised the remainder of the way and piled on 31 second half-points. Hurts was 12-19 for 197 yards and two touchdowns. He rushed for 101 yards and compiled a passer rating of 185. Ole Miss struggled to find a rhythm offensively for much of the night, largely due to Alabama's pass rush that repeatedly flushed Shea Patterson out of the pocket and sacked him five times. Patterson was 14 for 29 on the night and threw for 165. Ole Miss was 0-13 on third down.

Jordan Wilkins had his best game of the 2017 season in a night where Ole Miss rushed the football with more effectiveness than it did in the first three games. The senior running back tallied 101 yards on 12 carries and broke runs of 21 and 44 yards. D.K. Metcalf led all receivers with three catches for 46 yards.

#12 AUBURN 44, OLE MISS 23

AUBURN, Ala. - A tumultuous three-game road trip came to an end for Ole Miss on the Plains in a 44-23 loss to No. 12 Auburn.

The Rebels dug themselves into a multi-score hole early on that was far too deep to climb out of. Kerryon Johnson opened the scoring with a 17-yard touchdown rush, his first of three in the first half. Johnson touched the ball 28 times and gained 204 yards on the day. Auburn as a team rushed for 326 yards. The defense struggled to defend the ground attack for much of the afternoon, and penalties only compounded that.

Ole Miss drove down the field and answered with a field goal, but it was quickly negated by a screen play that resulted in a 75-yard touchdown pass from Jarrett Stidham to Ryan Davis on Auburn's first play from scrimmage. Everything was set up by Auburn's ability to run the football at will. The Tiger offense picked up large chunks of yardage for most of the game and averaged 7.8 yards per snap.

The latter two of Johnson's touchdown rushes followed that, one from 48 yards out and one from five yards. Auburn had four 70 plus-yard drives in the opening half, and compiled 339 yards of total offense. It led 35-3 at halftime. The Tigers compiled 561 yards of total offense in the game.

Ole Miss found the end zone for the first time in the game early on in the third quarter when Shea Patterson found D.K. Metcalf in space for a nine-yard touchdown pass. It completed a 75-yard drive and brought the score to 38-10. The two found each other again early on in the fourth quarter, this one a five-yard strike to make the score 41-17. As much as the offense sputtered in the first half, it found its footing in the second half and totaled 429 yards in the game.

OXFORD, Miss. - It was a collective exhale and a breath of life after more than a month on the road. Ole Miss returned home and let out some frustration in its 57-35 win over Vanderbilt on Saturday, a game in which the Rebels looked rejuvenated from all angles.

The Rebel offense showed its best self in the first half, compiling 35 points behind Shea Patterson's four first-half touchdowns and Jordan Wilkin's 82 yards and a score. The first score of a game was a familiar site as Patterson found A.J. Brown over the middle for a 58 yard touchdown pass.

Two Ralph Webb touchdown runs followed, putting Vanderbilt ahead 14-7 and pushing Ole Miss' back against a proverbial wall yet again. The Rebels responded with 28 unanswered points that plopped them squarely in control of the game. Patterson hit wide open Damarkus Lodge for a 35-yard score on a busted coverage to tie the game at 14. The sophomore quarterback then rushed for a four-yard score to give the Rebels a lead at 21-14. Patterson finished the game 22-35 for 351 yards and four passing touchdowns and five total scores.

The barrage of scoring was capped off with a Wilkins 18 yard touchdown rush and a Patterson-Lodge connection from six yards out. The Rebels led 35-15 with just a couple minutes left in the first half. It held a 35-21 lead at halftime and never looked back. Wilkins ran for 113 yards and the Rebels rushed for 251 yards as a team, the most all season by a long shot. It took pressure off of Patterson and the offense.

The Ole Miss defense forced three turnovers and sacked Vanderbilt quarterback seven times, including five in the first half.

OXFORD, Miss. - Ole Miss had its Achilles Heel exploited defensively to the tune of 393 LSU rushing yards in a 40-24 defeat to the Tigers on Saturday evening.

LSU offensive coordinator Matt Canada handed the football to its bell cow running back Derrius Guice again and again daring Ole Miss to neutralize him. Guice ripped through the Rebel defense into the second and third level on his way to 276 yards and a score on 22 touches. Backup running back Darrel Williams also surpassed the century mark on the ground, compiling 103 yards on 22 touches. Guice averaged 21.5 yards per carry and LSU gained seven yards per carry as a team. The Tigers posted 593 yards of total offense in the game.

The Tigers averaged 8.7 yards per play and the Rebels struggled to find an answer for Guice and Williams for most of the night.

The team's traded field goals in the early minutes of the game before Guice ran for a seven-yard touchdown that aided in his 98 first-quarter rushing yards. LSU's Connor Culp banged home his second and third field goals of the first half in the second quarter from 38 and 26 yards out. That gave LSU a 13-3 just before halftime.

Luke and his staff got an injury scare late in the second quarter when Shea Patterson hobbled off of the field into a makeshift medical tent and eventually into the locker room after injuring his right knee on a play in which he was intercepted by Grant Delpit.

Jordan Ta'amu stepped in and led the Rebels down the field to three points in the final 90 seconds of the half in Patterson's absence to narrow LSU's lead to 13-6 at halftime. Ta'amu was 7-11 for 78 yards on the night. He re-entered the game and led a nine play, 66 yard touchdown drive late in the game.

OXFORD, Miss. - Turnovers set the forces in motion for a 24-point lead to evaporate in front of Ole Miss' eyes as Arkansas escaped Oxford with a wild 38-37 win in the latest chapter of this SEC West rivalry.

The most critical one came late in the fourth quarter. Ole Miss took the field with 6:01 remaining on the game looking to salt away a 37-28 lead that once was as high as 31-7. A zone read between Jordan Ta'amu and Eric Swinney went haywire and the football landed in the grass. It was scooped up by Arkansas's Kevin Richardson, who ran it into the end zone for a touchdown that altered the trajectory of the game more than any other. The Razorbacks trailed 37-35 with plenty of time on the clock.

It was a bitter end to an otherwise productive debut for the senior. An Ole Miss punt on the next drive paved the way for Arkansas to take the football down the field and win the game on a 33-yard field goal from the left foot of Connor Limpert. The Razorbacks led for a total of four seconds in the ballgame.

Both teams came into the game with back up quarterbacks, battered offensive lines and struggling defenses. The Rebels carried the advantage at signal caller thanks to the play of Ta'amu. He was 20-30 for 368 yards and a pair of rushing touchdowns and was a large reason why Ole Miss' lead ballooned to 31-7 in the first 25 minutes of the ballgame.

Jordan Wilkins scored on the second play of the game when he exploded through a hole on the far side of the field en route to a 64-yard touchdown. Wilkins had 16 rushes for 118 yards.
