## MIZZOU HITS THE ROAD FOR FIRST TIME IN 2017

- Mizzou Football (1-3, 0-2 SEC) will make its first road trip of 2017 this Saturday as it takes on the Kentucky Wildcats under the lights at Kroger Field on SEC Network. Kick is at 6:30 p.m. (CT).
- Mizzou is coming off of a bye week and most recently in action on Sept. 23, a 51-14 loss to then No. 15/16 Auburn at Memorial Stadium. That concluded a four-game homestand for the Tigers to open 2017. Kentucky moved to 4-1 on the year following last week's 24-20 win over Eastern Michigan. Mizzou played Eastern Michigan a year ago, defeating the Eagles, 61-21.
- Mizzou is playing Kentucky for the sixth time since joining the SEC with the Tigers winning three of the first five meetings. However, Kentucky has won two straight in the series. Mizzou head coach **Barry Odom** is 0-1 vs. the Wildcats while UK head coach Mark Stoops is 2-2 against Mizzou.
- Saturday's game marks the first time Mizzou will play away from its home of Memorial Stadium in 2017. Since 2000, Mizzou is 11-6 in road openers, winning three of the last four. Mizzou had a streak of three straight wins in road openers snapped last year as it dropped a 26-11 decision at West Virginia in its season-opener. From 2005-2010, Mizzou won six straight road openers before losing two straight in 2011 and 2012. Of those 17 games, 10 have come against Power 5 teams with Mizzou holding a 6-4 advantage in those 10 contests. In road openers that happened to be against conference opponents, Mizzou is 4-1 with its lone loss coming to South Carolina in 2012. Mizzou is averaging a 30.3-27.5 score in those 17 games as well. The current senior class has lost just one road opener since joining Mizzou Football. A complete breakdown is below.

### Sophomore WR Johnathon Johnson

- Hauled in a career-high 10 grabs last time out vs. Auburn, good for a game-high 85 yards.
- He had just eight catches on the year coming into the game as he more than doubled his production.
- He was the first Mizzou receiver with 10+ catches in a single game since Bud Sasser hauled in 12 passes against Indiana in 2012.
- Now leads Mizzou in catches (18) and is second in yards (233) and TDs (two).

- Mizzou QB **Drew Lock** ranks eighth nationally in yards per completion while WR **J'Mon Moore** ranks fourth nationally, averaging 26.0 yards per catch.
- Moore is fifth nationally with three plays of 50+ yards this season.

### MIZZOU FOLLOWING A BYE

- Mizzou had a bye during week five of the 2017 season. Since joining the SEC in 2012, Mizzou is 4-3 following a bye, but has lost three straight following an idle week. Last year, Mizzou's bye came before traveling to Florida where it lost, 40-14.
- Since 2002, Mizzou is 10-9 following a bye week.
- When playing on the road following a bye week, Mizzou is 3-3 since 2002 as well. Its last road win when following a bye week was a 34-27 victory at Texas A&M en route to claiming its second consecutive SEC East title. Below is a breakdown.

### AERIAL ASSAULT

- As Mizzou comes off the bye week, it will look to keep its high-powered pass attack going. Through four games, Mizzou ranks second in the SEC in passing offense, averaging 278.8 yards per contest.
- The key to Mizzou's offense has been the big-play ability through the air. The Tigers are averaging 15.93 yards per completion, the ninth-best mark in the nation and the SEC's second-best.
- Mizzou QB **Drew Lock** ranks eighth nationally in yards per completion while WR **J'Mon Moore** ranks ninth nationally, averaging 26.0 yards per catch.
- On the year, Mizzou has six plays of 50+ yards, ranking ninth nationally. Of those six plays, half have gone for 60+ yards as Mizzou's offense continues to be explosive under second-year offensive coordinator **Josh Heupel**.
- Mizzou senior WR **J'Mon Moore** has three such plays, matching his total from a year ago while ranking tied for fifth in the nation. He trails only Stanford RB Bryce Love (seven), Notre Dame RB Josh Adams (five) and Baylor's Chris Platt and UNLV's Lexington Thomas (four each).
- Moore has six catches of 50+ yards in his career.

### MORE ON THE EXPLOSIVENESS

- In 2017, Mizzou has three different players who scored on their first touch of the season. Mizzou sophomore WR **Johnathon Johnson** scored on his first play from scrimmage this year – 65-yard TD pass from Drew Lock vs. Missouri State in week one was the first.
- Sophomore RB **Damarea Crockett** scored on his first carry – an 8-yard TD run vs. Missouri State in week one.
- Senior TE **Jason Reese** scored on his first catch of the year – a 10-yard TD pass from QB Drew Lock in week one vs. Missouri State.

### QUICK STRIKE

- In Mizzou's week two game against South Carolina, QB **Drew Lock** hooked up with TE **Jason Reese** for a 61-yard TD pass that put the Tigers up 10-0 at the time. That was Mizzou's second one-play scoring drive of 2017 and 10<sup>th</sup> dating back to last season. To put that mark into perspective, Mizzou had 10 total one-play scoring drives from 2013-15, which included seven alone in 2013.
- Since the beginning of last year when **Josh Heupel** took the reins of the offense, nine of the 10 one-play drives have been pass plays, five going to senior WR **J'Mon Moore**. Of the 10 one-play drives, six were of 50+ yards with three of them being of the 70+ yard variety. Sophomore **Johnathon Johnson** has two of the 10 scores as well.

## A PAIR OF EXPLOSIVE PLAYERS

- Mizzou sophomore RB **Damarea Crockett** ranks fourth in the SEC in total rushing yards per game (93.8) and yards per carry (6.36).
- On the year, Crockett has 375 yards through four games and a pair of scores. He will face a Kentucky defense this weekend that is holding opponents to just 74.0 rush yards per game.
- Sophomore WR **Johnathon Johnson** is coming off of a career-best 10-catch outing against Auburn, going for 85 yards in that game.

## MIZZOU AGAIN LIMITING NEGATIVE PLAYS

- Mizzou led the nation in tackles for loss allowed last season, allowing just 2.92 per game, the lowest mark in FBS since the NCAA began archiving the stat. Mizzou is off to a similar start this year, allowing just 14.0 total tackles for loss through the first four games (3.50 per game), the sixth-best mark in the nation. To put that mark into perspective, Mizzou has 27.0 tackles for loss through four weeks, nearly twice as many as it has allowed.
- A big key to that is Mizzou's offensive line, which has thrived under second-year OL coach **Glen Elarbee**. The group checks in at the biggest in the SEC, averaging 6-5.5 and 326 pounds. The Kansas City Chiefs offensive line averages 6-6 and 316 to offer a little perspective.
- The group has allowed just four sacks this season as well, a mark that ranks 12th in FBS. Last year, Mizzou allowed just 14 total sacks for an average of 1.15 per game, the 16<sup>th</sup>-best mark in the NCAA and the best mark in the SEC and fourth among Power 5 teams.

## LOCK AMONG ELITE QBs IN MU HISTORY

- Entering week six, junior QB **Drew Lock** has thrown for 5,846 total yards, which is already sixth in school history. He has a ways to go to catch fifth-place Blaine Gabbert (6,822). Should he pass for the same amount of yards as he did a year ago, Lock would rank third in school history at the end of 2017, trailing only legends Chase Daniel (12,515) and Brad Smith (8,799). It would be the second-best three-year total in school history if he did that, trailing only Daniel. Daniel threw for 8,180 yards in his first three seasons. Below is a breakdown.

- Worth noting is that of the company on the list above, Lock has the highest yards per completion average at 13.4 yards per completion.

## LOOK BACK AT LOCK'S CAREER DAY

- In Mizzou's season-opener against Missouri State, QB **Drew Lock** threw for 521 and seven touchdowns, both school records. The seven TDs tied the SEC record and he is just the sixth SEC QB to ever throw seven TDs in a single game. His 521 yards are the sixth-most ever thrown in a single game by an SEC quarterback. Lock earned Walter Camp National Player of the Week honors and took home SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his

efforts in that game. Lock is second in the SEC in passing through two weeks of play.

## GIVE CROCKETT THE ROCK

- Sophomore RB **Damarea Crockett** ranks among the nation's best and most dynamic running backs. He is one of just 10 active players in FBS to have two separate games of 200+ yards on the ground in his career and one of just three SEC backs who can make that claim.
- On the year, Crockett ranks 33rd nationally and fourth in the SEC with his 93.8 yards per game average.
- Crockett is averaging 6.36 yards per carry, which is 28th nationally and fourth in the SEC. The true sophomore now has six 100-yard performances in his career. He was named to the Doak Walker Award Preseason Watch List.
- Earlier this season, Crockett became the first Mizzou running back ever to post back-to-back 200-yard performances after rushing for 202 vs. Missouri State in the opener and 225 in his final game of 2016 at Tennessee.

## TIGHT END PASSING GAME

- Mizzou's whiplash offensive attack under Offensive Coordinator **Josh Heupel** uses the entire field horizontally and vertically, and in his short time at MU, the tight ends have benefited greatly. Under the direction of TE Coach **Joe Jon Finley**, Mizzou boasts a group of big-bodied, strong blocking, and athletic pass catchers who create sizable mismatches all over the field.
- If the first four weeks of play are any indication, Mizzou's tight ends will loom large in the Tiger offense in 2017. The trio of redshirt freshman **Albert Okwuegbunam** (or Albert O for anyone who has to say it aloud), junior **Kendall Blanton** and senior **Jason Reese** have combined for 11 catches, 696 yards and three scores. It's just a four-game sample size of course, but that's a pace for 33 catches, 696 yards and nine touchdowns over a 12-game regular-season schedule.
- The increase in production is no surprise really, as Finley's tight end group played a much bigger role in the passing game in 2016, with a combined 48 catches for 540 yards and five touchdowns. It was the most catches and yards for Mizzou's tight ends collectively since 2010, and the most TDs by the group since 2008. Here's a look at the increased production from Mizzou's TEs since joining the SEC:

## MOORE WITH IMPRESSIVE STREAK

- Entering Saturday's game vs. Kentucky, Mizzou senior WR **J'Mon Moore** has an impressive streak intact, having caught a pass in 21 consecutive games dating back to 2015. Only 20 active players have longer such streaks, three of which play in the SEC as his streak is the league's fourth-longest active streak.

## THE NEW KINGS OF #DLINEZOU

- Mizzou has a long tradition of developing NFL-talent along the trenches of the defensive line and 2017 appears to be no different as a pair of standouts are primed for breakout seasons.
- Both senior DE **Marcell Frazier** and junior DT **Terry Beckner, Jr.**, earned Preseason All-SEC honors from the league's coaches and give Mizzou forces up front.
- Frazier finished his season with a flurry of production a year ago, totaling 7.5 of his 8.5 tackles for loss over the final three games, including 6.5 of his 7.5 sacks. He has nine tackles with a 1.5 sacks and 2.5 TFLs so far this season.
- Beckner saw his season cut short due to a knee injury for the second straight season in 2016. The former No. 1 overall recruit is back and fully healthy this year. He has 11 tackles and a 1.5 sacks through four weeks and had three tackles and a sack vs. Purdue in week three.

## GARRETT A TACKLING MACHINE

- Mizzou sophomore LB **Cale Garrett** has been a monster in the middle of the field this season. He leads the Tigers with 30 total tackles and had a career-best outing against Purdue during which he tallied 12 stops with his first career sack.
- Dating back to the finale last season when he had 10 tackles against Arkansas, Garrett has 40 stops over his last five contests.

## LOTS OF NEW FACES

- The old sales pitch of "You can't tell the players without the program" has seemed to ring true in Mizzou's first four games of 2017, as **Barry Odom's** team has featured 25 players who have seen the field for the first time in a Mizzou uniform.
- Included in that total were nine true freshmen who have seen the field: S **Joshuah Bledsoe**, LB **Jamal Brooks**, S **Tyree Gillespie**, LB **Aubrey Miller**, RB **Larry Rountree**, CB **Adam Sparks**, DE **Chris Turner**, S **Jordan Ulmer** and DT **Kobie Whiteside**. Ulmer started at safety in week one, making him the first true freshman defender to start Mizzou's season-opener since NFL standout Justin Smith in 1998.
- Ulmer was one of three Tigers seeing action for the first time ever who made starts, as he was joined by redshirt freshman C **Trystan Castillo**, and junior LB **Kaleb Prewett**. In all, there were six Tigers in the season-opener who made their first-ever start at Mizzou, with the aforementioned trio being joined by sophomore RG **Tre'Vour Simms**, sophomore DT **Markell Utsey** and junior LB **Terez Hall**. Five of those six players again made starts last week against Purdue.

## #DLINENEW

- Mizzou's proud tradition of producing top-notch defensive linemen has continued in 2017, with senior DE **Marcell Frazier** and junior DT **Terry Beckner, Jr.** receiving the lion's share of accolades, and rightfully so.
- In Mizzou's first four weeks of play, there has been every indication that they'll be joined quite nicely by some new faces who should make an impact, including a trio of junior college transfers in juniors **Nate Anderson**, **Rashad Brandon** and **Walter Palmore**.
- That trio has been impressive for Mizzou through four weeks of play. They have combined for 19 total tackles with 5.5 of those going for a loss (19 total yards lost) with 2.0 sacks. Brandon has seven stops with 2.5 TFLs and a sack to his credit while Palmore has seven tackles with 1.0 tackles for loss. Anderson has a sack as well, coming in Mizzou's season-opener against Missouri State.

- In addition, a pair of true freshmen have made an impact this year in the defensive trenches - **Kobie Whiteside** and **Akial Byers**. Whiteside is coming off of a five-tackle outing during which he tallied his first career sack against Auburn. Byers missed the first two weeks of the season with an injury but has earned time in the last two games, posting a tackle.
- Mizzou also has a fresh face leading #DLineZOU this season in first-year DL coach **Brick Haley**. In all, Haley — an outstanding recruiter and developer of talent — has logged 26 years as a full-time defensive coach, including three as defensive coordinator, and two as an assistant in the National Football League. This is his 20th as a defensive line coach.

## HALL OF A PERFORMANCE THIS YEAR

- As mentioned earlier, junior LB **Terez Hall** made his first career start in the opener vs. Missouri State and through the first four weeks of play has been one of the Tigers' most consistent defenders.
- Hall ranks second on the team with 24.0 tackles with a team-high 4.0 tackles for loss from his linebacking position. He also boasts a sack and a QB hurry to his credit.
- Hall posted a career-high six tackles in each of Mizzou's first two games this season and had four solo stops vs. Purdue.
- He added a career-best eight tackles last time out against Auburn.
- Hall had just 2.0 tackles for loss a year ago as he has already doubled that production from a year ago through the first three weeks.

## PREWETT IS AN IMPACT TRANSFER

- Mizzou has inserted a new hybrid linebacking/nickelback position to its defense to adjust to the developing trends in college football.
- A key to Mizzou's hybrid linebacking position working this season will be Kansas State transfer **Kaleb Prewett**, who moves from safety to the new position. At 6-1, 210-pounds, Prewett fits the bill as far as size and athleticism are concerned as he is a great blend of size and speed needed to play the position.
- He had five tackles with a TFL in the season-opener against Missouri State. He followed that with seven tackles against South Carolina during week two and seven again vs. Purdue. The seven stops in those two games are the most he has had in a single game since posting a career-high 12 while playing safety at Kansas State against Texas Tech on Nov. 14, 2015.
- Prewett sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules but was productive during his time at Kansas State. Before

breaking his wrist in 2015, he was emerging as one of the Wildcats' top defenders, totaling 49 stops through eight games, including a career-best 12 tackles against Texas Tech on Nov. 14, 2015. In 10 career games, he has posted at least five tackles in eight of them.

## SHERRILS A STALWART IN SECONDARY

- While Mizzou's defense features a lot of first-year starters this season, one face should be familiar to Mizzou fans and that is senior S **Anthony Sherrils**. The Kansas City native actually leads all active Mizzou players in career games played (42) and has played in 42 consecutive games, the longest active streak of any Mizzou player. He has also started 24 games, the top mark of any player on Mizzou's defense. He is tied for second on the team with 24 tackles and has had at least seven tackles in each of his last three games, including a pair of TFLs.
- Sherrils has 154 career tackles, the most of any player on Mizzou's roster, with 7.0 for loss and two career picks.
- Sherrils is playing in 2017 as a graduate student, as he received his sociology degree from Mizzou in May.

## OTHER NOTES FROM LAST TIME OUT

- Sophomore WR **Johnathon Johnson** recorded a career-high 10 receptions. Johnson's previous high was five, which he reached twice, most recently vs. Missouri State.
- Johnson's 10 receptions were the first occurrence a Tiger has had 10 catches since Bud Sasser had 12 vs. Indiana on Sept. 20, 2014.
- Sophomore RB **Damarea Crockett's** 19-yard reception was his longest of the season and his career. Crockett's previous high was a 9-yard reception vs. EMU in 2016.
- Crockett took the 19-yard reception into the endzone for a touchdown, the first touchdown reception of his career.
- Junior QB **Drew Lock** completed 23-of-39 pass attempts in the game, with his 23 completions a season best.
- Freshman RB **Larry Rountree** rushed for 32 yards. Rountree's 15-yard run in the second quarter marked the longest rush of his career.
- RS sophomore WR **Richaud Floyd** caught two passes in the game, matching his career-high for receptions
- Junior TE **Albert Okwuegbunam** tied his career high in receptions with two, which he set against Missouri State (Sept. 2) earlier this season.
- Junior LB **Terez Hall** set a career-high with eight tackles. He previously had six tackles three times.
- Freshman DL **Kobie Whiteside** sets a new career-high with five tackles. His previous was one against Missouri State (Sept. 2). He also recorded his first career sack.
- RS freshman DB **Jerod Alton** and RS freshman DL **Tre Williams** each recorded their first career tackles.

## SHOW ME

### OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

One of the best stories on the team in 2017 comes from RS senior DE **Jordan Harold**. After not getting a single Division I offer out of high school, Harold wound up at Division II Powerhouse Northwest Missouri State but wanted to play Division I, so he transferred to Mizzou as a walk-on.

Harold, who is without a doubt one of the hardest workers on the team, earned a starting spot last year and was named a team captain in 2017.

### FLOAT IT LIKE FATONY

When Mizzou's offense can't get into scoring position, it knows it has a reliable partner with its punt game, led by junior P **Corey Fatony**, to help the Tigers maintain field position. Through four games, Fatony is among the nation's best flippers of the field, as he ranks fifth nationally in individual punting, with his season average of 46.7 yards per kick. He had a very strong outing against Purdue, where he averaged 48.2 yards on nine kicks, including a long of 65, with four boots ending inside Purdue's 20-yardline and zero touchbacks. The Boilermakers were able to attempt just one return on the day, and that went for minus-one yard.

He was constantly given short fields to punt against Auburn and tallied four kicks inside the 20 on six attempts without a touchback. That hurt his average as he had to drop punts in front of the goal line with the precision of a professional golfer making his approach shot.

On the season, Mizzou ranks No. 4 nationally through four games in team net punting, with an average of 43.62, which leads the SEC. Seven of Fatony's punts have gone for 50 yards or more, with seven fair catches and nine punts inside the 20-yardline.

A freshman All-American in 2015, Fatony is averaging 43.8 yards per punt in his career (168 total punts) and has 47 career punts of 50+ yards, including 57 inside the opponent 20-yard line and 50 fair catches. He was a big reason why Mizzou ranked 13<sup>th</sup> nationally in net punting a year ago.

Against Purdue in week three, Fatony surpassed 7,000 career punt yards and has now racked up 7,351 punt yards in 28 career games. That's the fastest any Mizzou punter has reached that mark in program history. The school record for punt yards in a career is held by Marlon Adler (1982-95), who finished with 8,316 career punt yards. For perspective, Adler had 4,428 punt yards through two full seasons (22 games). Fatony is well on pace to shatter the school record and if he maintains his current average, could end up with more than 13,000 career punt yards.

### THE FATONY EFFECT

With Mizzou having such a skilled punter at its disposal, it is no surprise to see Mizzou's punt defense numbers in elite company. After four games, Mizzou is averaging just 1.33 yards per punt return this season, ranking 20<sup>th</sup> nationally and fourth in the SEC.

Mizzou has allowed just four total return yards on 21 punts this season, averaging just 0.19 yards per punt.

The longest punt return against the Tigers this year was a four-yarder by Missouri State in the season-opener.

Mizzou did not allow a return yard against South Carolina, limited Purdue to -1 yard and allowed just one to Auburn last time out.



## SHOW ME

### JUST GIVE HIM THE RAY GUY AWARD

Junior P **Corey Fatony** ranks fifth nationally in punting, averaging 46.7 yards per punt.

Fatony has Mizzou ranked fourth nationally in net punting, allowing just four return yards on 21 punts this season.

While many judge a punter on yards per kick, it is Fatony's ability to float the ball, allowing his team to get under while still booming the ball that should likely allow him to pursue a punting career at the next level.

# SHOW ME

## A STACKED OFFENSIVE LINE

- Mizzou's projected starting O-line averages 6-foot-5.5 and 326 pounds.
- To put that mark into perspective, the NFL's Kansas City Chiefs, who are right down the I-70 about two hours from Columbia, average 6-foot-6 and 316 pounds as Mizzou's offensive line checks in at about the same average height and about 10 more pounds per player.
- The group boasts 65 career starts and all seven O-linemen who made starts a year ago.
- Mizzou led the nation in fewest tackles for loss allowed last season, the best mark in college football history since the NCAA began archiving that statistic in 2005.

## DIFFERENT LOOK FOR O-LINE

- What a year a difference makes for the Tiger offensive line. Going into **Barry Odom's** first season as head coach in 2016, the Tigers featured the nation's least experienced offensive line, with a collective three career starts on the roster (all by **Alec Abeln** in 2015). Despite the new faces and the uncertainty in a brand new **Josh Heupel** scheme, MU's offensive line was a revelation as it developed under the guidance of OL Coach **Glen Elarbee** into one of the nation's best.
- Heading into 2017, the line presented a completely different feel. Elarbee's group returned all 60 starts from last year, and all seven players who started at least once in 2016 – a stark contrast to the meager total of three returning career starts going into last season.
- Physically, the line cuts a collective imposing figure. If the Tigers take the field with the projected starting five up front of senior LT **Tyler Howell**, junior LG **Kevin Pendleton**, redshirt freshman C **Trystan Castillo**, sophomore RG **Tre'Vour Simms** and junior RT **Paul Adams**, they would average 6-foot-5.5 and 326 pounds per man. Here's a look:

- Adams turned in an outstanding sophomore season as a first-time starter in 2016. According to Pro Football Focus, he ranked ninth nationally among all tackles in highest pass block efficiency, at 98.6%, which was the best mark among SEC tackles.
- Coaches always preach about the importance of depth, and the Tigers have that luxury on the front line in 2017, as four players can come off the bench who have started previously, including senior **C/G Alec Abeln** (9 career starts), junior T/G **Samson Bailey** (9), senior G **Adam Ploudre** (8) and sophomore C **Jonah Dubinski** (2).
- Dubinski is a former walk-on who earned a scholarship during the early stages of fall camp after being a key cog up front for the Tigers. He earned a pair of starts later in 2016 and has spent plenty of time running in the two deep at center during fall camp.

## SERIES VS. KENTUCKY

- Mizzou and Kentucky have met seven times over the years with the Wildcats owning a 4-3 lead in the all-time series after last year's win.
- Kentucky won the first two meetings between the two teams back during the 1960s. The first meeting came in 1965 in Columbia with Kentucky claiming a 7-0 win. The two teams met again three years later in Lexington as UK walked away with a 12-6 lead.
- The two teams did not meet again until Mizzou joined the SEC for the 2012 season. Mizzou won the first meeting between the two in 2012, 33-10, in Columbia. Mizzou then won again in 2013 en route to an SEC East Championship, torching UK in Lexington, 48-13. Mizzou claimed a hard-fought, 20-10 win in 2014 before dropping the 2015 meeting, 21-13, in Lexington.
- Last year, Kentucky earned a 35-21 win on Oct. 29s at Memorial Stadium. The Wildcats pounded out 582 yards of total offense and converted 10-of-18 third downs en route to the win. Mizzou got a pair of touchdowns from WR Dimetrios Mason and a third from FB Josh Augusta.
- Kentucky struck first on a 60-yard sprint to the endzone by Stanley 'Boom' Williams, giving the Wildcats an early, 7-0 advantage. UK appeared to be driving again, but Donavin Newsom forced a Williams fumble, recovered by Charles Harris, to stall the drive. The first quarter ended with UK on top, 7-0.
- Another big play, this time on third down, staked UK to a 14-0 lead after QB Stephen Johnson found Jeff Badet for a 65-yard strike over the top. The lead was extended to 21-0 with 8:46 remaining in the second quarter after a one-yard TD plunge by Benny Snell.
- Mizzou cut into the lead late in the second quarter as **Drew Lock** scrambled on third-and-11 and found Mason on a 27-yard strike down the right sideline for his first career score. That cut the lead to 21-7 heading into intermission.

- On its first possession of the second half, Mizzou drove all the way inside the UK 10-yard line, but the drive stalled forcing a 24-yard field goal attempt, which was missed. Kentucky took the ensuing possession and went 80 yards in 12 plays, capped by a 13-yard TD pass on a screen play to Williams. That gave UK a 28-7 lead with 5:17 remaining in the third quarter.
- Mizzou scored with 10:03 remaining in fourth quarter after a 63-yard punt return to the one yard line by freshman **Johnathon Johnson** set up a plunge by Augusta, good for his second career rushing TD. Mason capped the scoring less than six minutes later on a one-play heave from Lock to cover 57 yards.

# BARRY ODOM

A longtime fixture at Mizzou, Barry Odom, 40, is in his second year guiding a program he has been immersed in at every level for some 15 years – including six in an administrative capacity (2003-08), four as a coach (2009-11, 2015) and four as a highly-successful student-athlete (1996-99). The 2016 season was his first as Mizzou’s head coach, and came after he had spent the previous four seasons as a defensive coordinator, including three at Memphis (2012-14) and one at Missouri, where his units were considered among the nation’s best.

Highly-respected among his coaching peers for his integrity and for his championship vision, Odom has his Tigers pointed in the right direction after a rebuilding year in 2016 that saw Mizzou win four games. They closed the season out in strong fashion, with wins in two of their final three games - with both coming against bowl teams in Arkansas and Vanderbilt. Those victories sent Mizzou into the off-season with a lot of momentum that Odom expects to capitalize on in his second year in command.

Odom was named the 32nd head football coach in program history in December of 2015, and his undeniable passion for Mizzou, coupled with his strong track record of success at each level of his career pointed to him being the right man to lead the Tigers into the future in the nation’s toughest conference.

In 2015, Odom turned in an outstanding season as first-year defensive coordinator for Mizzou under coach Gary Pinkel (who retired after that season), as his Tigers ranked ninth in the nation in total defense, allowing just 302.0 yards per game. Since the NCAA began tracking defensive statistics in 1978, that marked the first time in MU history that Mizzou had produced a top-10 defense. Odom’s defense was also ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense (16.2 avg.), seventh in pass defense (169.2 avg.) and second in tackles for loss (8.8 avg.).

Prior to that, Odom became one of the more highly sought-after coordinators in the country due to three stellar years directing Memphis’ defense from 2012-14. His 2014 defense was a key component of Memphis’ 10-3 season, as his unit finished the regular season ranked fifth nationally in scoring defense (17.1 avg.) and 22nd in total defense (343.3 avg.). That marked an impressive incremental improvement under Odom’s watch, as Memphis ranked 117th nationally in total defense the season prior to his arrival. In his first season at Memphis, the defense improved to 50th nationally (383.6 avg.), followed by a jump to 39th in 2013 (370.7 avg.). Memphis earned a share of the 2014 American Athletic Conference title, giving them a conference title for the first time since 1971.

Odom, a Maysville, Okla., native, played at Mizzou under former Coach Larry Smith, and starred as a linebacker from 1996-99. He ended his playing career with 362 tackles, which still ranks as seventh-most in school history. Odom was a captain for his senior year of 1999, and was a key figure on the Missouri teams which reached bowl games in 1997 and 1998, ending a 14-year postseason drought for Tiger fans.

Success followed Odom’s career path at each future stop after his playing days. After earning his undergraduate degree in December of 1999, he served as an intern with Mizzou’s Tiger Scholarship Fund while he worked on his Master’s in Education from the University of Missouri (which he would earn in May of 2004). He returned to his home state of Oklahoma in July of that year to serve as an assistant football coach for his alma mater Ada High School, which finished that season as runners-up for a state title.

Born Nov. 26, 1976, in Lawton, Okla., Odom and his wife Tritia (Tia) were married in July of 2000. Tia is a native of Kahoka, Mo., and is a graduate of MU’s College of Human Environmental Sciences. The couple has three children – sons James Trump and Garyt Robert, and daughter Anna Lockwood.

- ▼ The first hire made by Barry Odom after taking over as Mizzou's 32nd head coach was Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach Josh Heupel. The move paid immediate dividends for Odom's program, as Heupel transformed Mizzou's offense in short time into arguably the nation's most improved attack a year ago.
- ▼ The improvement Mizzou saw on offense under Heupel's direction was eye-popping in 2016. Mizzou led the SEC and ranked 13th nationally in total offense last year (500.5 ypg), a year after Mizzou ranked 124th in 2015 (280.9 ypg). Other huge statistical spikes of improvement came in passing offense (20th nationally in 2016; Mizzou was 113th in 2015), rushing offense (38th in 2016; 119th in 2015) and scoring (48th in 2016; 126th in 2015).
- ▼ Additionally, Heupel oversaw the continued development of sophomore QB Drew Lock into one of the SEC's top signal callers. In only his first full year as a starter, Lock took to Heupel's comprehensive coaching and blossomed into a 3,000-yard passer. Lock led the SEC with his 283.2 yards per game average, and finished with 3,399 yards and 23 touchdowns.
- ▼ Heupel brought with him to Mizzou an impressive track record of success, including four national championship game appearances, seven BCS bowl games and coaching oversight of two Heisman Trophy winning quarterbacks. Including the 2016 at Mizzou, he has 14 years of coaching and recruiting experience at the highest level, including the last six seasons as offensive coordinator and play caller at Mizzou, Oklahoma and Utah State. Heupel finished his first season as assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2015 with Utah State.

When he was named Mizzou's head coach, Odom kept Walters on board to continue coaching the Tiger safeties. Thanks to his outstanding work on the field, as well as in recruiting circles, Odom named Walters Co-Defensive Coordinator prior to the 2016 season, and now in 2017, Walters will coach the entire secondary, as he brings the cornerbacks into his position room.
- ▼ Walters was a key factor in Mizzou's 2015 defense that finished in the top 10 nationally in total defense, scoring defense and pass defense. He also developed senior Ian Simon and sophomore Anthony Sherrills into two of the top safeties in the SEC in 2015.
- ▼ Walters, 31, came to Mizzou after spending the 2014 season as cornerbacks coach at Memphis, where he worked with Odom. At Memphis, the pair oversaw a defense that was among the most improved in the nation. Memphis went 10-3 in 2014, thanks in large part to its defense which ranked fifth nationally in points allowed (17.1 ppg) and 22nd in total defense (343.3 ypg) in the regular season.

His line finished first in the nation in tackles for loss allowed (2.92), the lowest in the nation for any team since at least 2005.



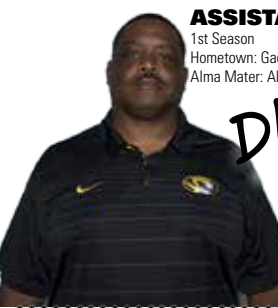

In 2015, Texas ranked fifth in the NCAA in sacks.

## THE \$98M FUTURE OF #TheZOU

▼ The University of Missouri Board of Curators unanimously voted on Aug. 25 to approve construction of Mizzou Athletics' \$98 million south end zone facility at Faurot Field/Memorial Stadium. This project will provide state-of-the-art training facilities for Mizzou Football, create additional premium seating opportunities and game-day enhancements for all Tiger fans to enjoy, and bring new jobs to Columbia.

▼ The Board of Curators' total approved project budget is \$98 million; to consist of campus infrastructure funds totaling \$800,000, long-term debt financing not to exceed \$57 million and private gifts covering the remainder of the project costs.

▼ The Tigers' new football operations area will include team and staff locker rooms, an enhanced sports medicine facility featuring a Hydrotherapy area with recovery pools, Hyrowork and lap pools, a weight room, nutrition oasis and equipment room, as well as team and position meeting rooms, and coaches offices. A grand lobby entrance at field level showcasing Mizzou's proud football tradition will greet visitors, and a recruiting lounge will allow the Tigers' staff to host recruits

- ▼ Since the athletics department received its first pledge toward the new facility last September, the generosity of 42 individuals, coupled with Sterk's visionary leadership, has generated more than \$50 million in pledges over the last 11 months to help this game-changing project come to fruition. Construction of the nearly 200,000-square foot facility, which includes more than 150,000 square feet of enclosed space, is expected to start in early 2018 with the demolition of the stadium's south end zone grandstands, and be completed ahead of the 2019 campaign.
- ▼ Memorial Stadium's capacity, currently listed at 71,168, will be around 65,000 when the largest capital project in Mizzou Athletics history is complete, according to school officials.
- ▼ Coach Odom: "Missouri is making a bold statement with today's announcement and I am confident that it not only will pay big dividends in recruiting, but it will help improve our game-day atmosphere throughout the stadium," he added. "I can't wait to get the shovels in the ground and get going. I am thankful to lead the Mizzou Football program and represent our University and State, and am pleased we have undertaken a project of this stature.

"When this facility is completed, not only will it be an incredible asset in recruiting, but our expectations are that it will enhance the game-day environment for our fans at Memorial Stadium, too."
