BEAR NECESSITIES

The Cal women's basketball team (8-2, 0-0 Pac-12) will close out the 2017-18 non-conference campaign in the eastern time zone, visiting Kentucky (8-4, 0-0 SEC) on Thursday at 12 p.m. ET/9 a.m. PT. Cal's final tune-up before opening Pac-12 play, the Golden Bears – ranked 24th in the latest AP Poll – enter the matchup a five-game winning streak. The Wildcats, who have been ranked as high as No. 20 in the AP Poll this season and has made eight consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, will be looking to snap a three-game losing streak, dropping an 87-63 decision vs third-ranked Louisville their last time out.

Thursday's game will be the first ever matchup between the Kentucky and Cal, and will be the Bears' second game this season against and SEC foe. Cal suffered its lone home loss of the season on November 25, falling to then-No. 23 Missouri, 55-52, in the Cal Classic championship game. The Bears have won three of their last five meetings against SEC opponents, including a 55-52 victory over LSU in the First Round of last year's NCAA Tournament. Kentucky is 1-0 against the Pac-12 this season with a 73-68 victory at Washington State on November 19.

Cal's second trip to the east coast this season, the Bears are 3-1 on the road this season, their only road loss coming on November 17 against top-ranked Connecticut at Gampel Pavilion.

The Bears are coming off a 70-45 victory over BYU on Sunday that saw a balanced effort on both ends of the floor. Senior guard Mikayla Cowling had a season-high 21 points to lead the Bears, who held the Cougars to just five points in the first quarter and 30.5 percent (18-59) shooting from the field on the game. Cowling is one of five players averaging at least eight points per game for the Bears this season, led by 18.7 points per game from junior forward/center Kristine Anigwe. A two-time All-American honorable mention and preseason candidate for the 2018 Wade Trophy, Anigwe is expected to return to action after sitting out Saturday's contest vs the Cougars. Anigwe is averaging nearly a point per minute in her last four outings (96 points in 104 minutes) and leads the Pac-12 in both scoring (18.7 PPG) and rebounding (8.8 RPG) this season.

BEARS BY THE NUMBERS

21 After averaging just 7 points per game through Cal's first nine games of the season, senior guard Mikayla Cowling scored a season-high 21 points on Saturday against BYU. Cowling, who entered the game with just four made threes on the season, went 4-5 from beyond the arc while also adding a season-high eight rebounds.

11 Freshman forward Alaysia Styles grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds on Saturday against BYU, leading the Bears in rebounding for the fourth time this season. Styles is the third Cal player to record double-digit rebounds this season and finished just two points shy of her first career double-double.

5 Cal enters Thursday's game on a five-game winning streak, the team's longest since going 13-0 to open the 2016-17 season and tied for the longest active win streak by any team in the Pac-12. All but one of the wins during Cal's win streak have come by 20 or more points. The Bears have also won three straight on the road, tied for their longest road win streak since 2015-16.

18.7 Junior forward/center Kristine Anigwe is leading the Pac-12 in scoring this season, averaging 18.7 points per game. Anigwe is also tied for the conference lead in rebounding (8.8 RPG), making her the only player in the Power Five to leadher conferencein both scoring and rebounding this season.

30.5 Cal held BYU to just 30.5 percent shooting (18-59) on Saturday, the lowest field goal percentage the Bears have allowed this season. Cal held BYU to just five points in the opening quarter, the fewest points the Bears have allowed in any quarter all season. BYU finished with 45 total points, the second time Cal has kept an opponent below 50.

INSIDE THE SERIES

Series Record: First meeting

- Thursday's meeting between the Golden Bears and Wildcats will be the first ever between the teams
- Cal is 0-1 against the SEC this season, falling to No. 23 Missouri, 55-52, on November 25
- The Bears are 2-2 against the SEC over the last five seasons, including a 55-52 win over LSU in the first round of the 2017 NCAA Tournament
- Kentucky is 1-0 against the Pac-12 this season, with a win over Washington State on November 19
- The Wildcats are 4-3 against the Pac-12 over the last five seasons, winning their last two games against Pac-12 foes
- Thursday's game will be the eighth match-up between Pac-12 and SEC schools this season, with the SEC holding a 5-2 lead so far in the series. Both Pac-12 wins have been by Oregon

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

- Kentucky enters Thursday's game looking to snap a three-game losing streak, the team's longest losing streak in the last two seasons
- The Wildcats suffered their first home loss of the season on Sunday, falling to No. 3 Louisville, 87-63, at Memorial Coliseum
- Junior Maci Morris, a 6'0" sophomore, leads the Wildcats in scoring this season, averaging 15.8 points per game and had 16 points in the loss to Louisville
- Taylor Murray (11.9 PPG) and Tatyana Wyatt (10.7 PPG) are also averaging double-figures
- Senior center Alyssa Rice leads the team on the boards, 7.5 RPG this season to go with two double-doubles
- Kentucky went 22-11 and reached the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament last season

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS CONT.

- The Wildcats return three starters and nine letterwinners from last season
- Kentucky has made eight straight trips to the NCAA Tournament, reaching at least the Second Round every time during that stretch
- Head coach Matthew Mitchell is in his 11th season at Kentucky

NEXT UP

- The Bears will open Pac-12 play on December 29, hosting USC (8-1, 0-0 Pac-12) at 6 p.m. PT at Haas Pavilion
- The Trojans opened the season on an eight-game winning streak before falling to No. 19 Texas A&M, 75-74
- The Bears won both meetings with the Trojans last season, including a 71-58 victory in the first round of the 2017 Pac-12 Tournament
- Cal was picked fifth in the 2017-18 Pac-12 Preseason Coaches' Poll while USC came in at number eight.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Cal women’s basketball team extended its win streak to five in a row with a 70-45 victory over BYU on Saturday evening at Haas Pavilion
- Mikayla Cowling led the Golden Bears with a season-high 21 points on 4-5 shooting from beyond the arc and also added a season-high 8 rebounds
- Freshman Kianna Smith added 12 points and five assists, her second consecutive game scoring in double-figures
- Freshman forward Alaysia Styles grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds as the Cal outrebounded BYU, 55-36, on the night.
- Cal started the game on a 15-2 run and held BYU scoreless for the first 3:34 of the contest
- Cal outscored the Cougars 22-5 in the first quarter, the fewest points the Bears have allowed in any quarter all season.
- The Bears used a 16-2 run to start the third quarter

COWLING COMES ALIVE

- After averaging just 6 points per game over the first 8 games of the season, senior guard Mikayla Cowling has scored double-figures in her last two outings, including a season-high 21 points against BYU
- Cowling went 4-5 from beyond the arc against BYU, matching her career-high for threes in a single game. Prior to Saturday’s game vs BYU, Cowling had connected on just 4 three-pointers (4-18) all season

- Cowling went 5-9 from the floor and 5-5 from the foul line against Pacific, scoring 9 of her 15 points in the second quarter alone
- On November 17, Cowling became the 29th player in Cal women’s basketball history to reach the 1000-point milestone, scoring her 1000th career point against UConn
- Cal now has a pair of active 1,000-point scorers on the roster, in Cowling and Anigwe
- Cowling also broke into the top-10 in Cal’s all-time assist list over the weekend, buyoed by an 8-assist effort against Brown.
- The senior from Benicia, California has made 102 consecutive starts for the Bears, a streak that began on December 13, 2014

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- Cal has won three straight on the road, tied for the team’s longest road winning streak over the last three seasons.
- The Bears last won 4 consecutive road games from Jan. 23 - Feb. 26, 2015

BIRD ON THE BOARDS

- Freshman forward Alaysia Styles - nicknamed “Bird” - had a career-high 11 rebounds vs BYU, the third different Cal player to have 10+ rebounds in a game this season
- The Bears finished with a total of 55 rebounds against the Cougars, Cal’s second game this season with 50+ rebounds
- Cal has outrebounded it’s opponents in every game this season and is outrebounding opponents by a +9.7 rebounds per game margin on the year
- The Golden Bears registered 58 rebounds on November 19 at Brown, Cal’s second-highest rebound total over the last three seasons
- The Bears boast two of the top rebounders in the conference this season in Kristine Anigwe (8.8 RPG; 1st) and Penina Davidson (7.5 RPG, 12th)

EFFICIENT ANIGWE

- A preseason nominee for the Wade Trophy, John R. Wooden Award, and Citizen Naismith Player of the Year Trophy, Anigwe has been highly efficient in her latest outings for the Bears, averaging nearly a point per minute over the last four games
- Anigwe has scored 96 points in her last 104 minutes of action (24.0 PPG and 26.0 Minutes per game over last four games)
- Anigwe was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week on December 11 after averaging 27 points and 10.5 rebounds per game in Cal’s two wins, also earning a spot on the NCAA Weekly Starting Five
- Anigwe is shooting 60.7 percent from the field this season, which ranks fifth in the Pac-12 and 21st overall in Division I
- Over her last four games, Anigwe is shooting 70.7 percent (41-58) from the floor, including an 11-14 performance on December 7 against San Diego
- As a team, Cal is shooting 48.9 percent from the field this season, good for third in the Pac-12 and ninth in all of Division I

SMITH SHARES THE WEALTH

- Freshman guard Kianna Smith became the first Cal player to earn Pac-12 Weekly honors this season, being named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week on Nov. 27
- The freshman from Moreno Valley, Calif. registered her first career double-double with 17 points and 12 assists against Manhattan
- Smith’s 12 assists are the most by any Cal player in the last two season
- Smith is averaging 5.1 assists per game this season, the most by freshman in the conference and the third-most by any freshman in Division I this season
- Smith has dished out 5 or more assists in her last seven outings

LUCKY NUMBER SEVENTY

- Since the start of last season, Cal is 24-1 when scoring 70 or more points, the lone loss coming on January 29, 2017 in an 84-79 defeat at Washington State
- Conversely, Cal is 4-15 over that same span when scoring fewer than 70 points, with wins coming last season over Colorado, USC, Oregon, and LSU
- After allowing 70 points or more in each of its first three games this season, the Bears have buckled down on defense and held its opponent below 70 points in six of its last seven outings
- Cal is 22-7 over the last two seasons when holding teams to fewer than 70 points

DAVIDSON SEES DOUBLE

- After registering just one double-double through her first three seasons in Berkeley, senior Penina Davidson leads the Bears with three double-doubles this season
- Davidson's three double-doubles are tied for fourth in the Pac-12 this season
- The senior from New Zealand scored a career-high 22 points against Pacific, following up a 13-point outing against San Diego on December 7
- Davidson is averaging a career-high 7.5 rebounds per game this season, which ranks 12th in the Pac-12

THREE'S COMPANY

- The Golden Bears connected on a program-record 17 three-pointers in their 87-66 win over Manhattan on Day 1 of the Cal Classic
- Junior guard Asha Thomas set a program single-game record, making nine three-pointers against the Jaspers
- Thomas broke the 19-year-old record of 8 made threes, set by Paige Bowie on December 17, 1998
- Cal's 17 threes bested the previous record of 15 set on Nov. 22, 2015 against Cal Poly
- Prior to the game against the Jaspers, Cal had connected on just 14 three-point attempts through the first three games of the season, shooting 27.5 percent (14-51) from beyond the arc
- Thomas has connected on 134 career three-pointers, tied with current WNBA start Layshia Clarendon for the fifth-most in program history
- Of Thomas' 23 made three pointers this season, 22 have come when playing at home

- With her 28 points and 25 rebounds against Brown, Kristine Anigwe became the first Division I player in the last three seasons to have 25 points and 25 rebounds in the same game and the first since former Minnesota star Amanda Zahui B. had 27 points and 27 rebounds against Michigan on February 21, 2015.
- Anigwe's 25 rebounds came up one short of matching the program single-game record, originally set by Colleen Galloway on March 3, 1978 and matched by Gennifer Brandon on January 17, 2013

BABY BEARS

- While not on the roster, two other exciting additions joined the Cal women's basketball program this offseason: head coach Lindsay Gottlieb and fiance Patrick Martin welcomed their son, Jordan, to the world on May 7, while assistant coach Kai Felton and partner Takiyah Jackson welcomed son Weston on June 5.
- It is the first child for both Gottlieb and Felton, who coached the entirety of last season while pregnant.

HEAD COACH LINDSAY GOTTLIEB



Many coaches struggle to find the right balance between success on the court and success in the classroom while empowering student-athletes to enjoy their experiences and letting their individual personalities shine. In six years as the head coach at California, Lindsay Gottlieb has shown the ability to find that perfect balance in Berkeley and has taken the program to unprecedented heights since being hired on April 25, 2011.

Since Gottlieb earned her first head coaching job in 2008-09, only 14 coaches have taken their team to an NCAA Final Four appearance, with Gottlieb becoming the eighth coach on that list after leading her 2012-13 California squad to a 32-4 record that included the program's first Pac-12 regular season championship as well as the first Elite Eight and Final Four bids in 40 years of California women's basketball. Doing so in her second season in Berkeley, Gottlieb became just the seventh coach since 1990 to coach her team to the Final Four in her first two seasons at the helm of a program. The Bears followed the success of the historical 2012-13 season with an NCAA Tournament bid in three of the next four seasons.

Gottlieb's most recent season saw the Golden Bears re-write the Cal record books. The Bears started the season 13-0, including an undefeated non-conference campaign, setting the mark for the best start to a season in program history. Sophomore center Kristine Anigwe, an All-Pac-12 and All-America selection for the second consecutive season, set the school single-game scoring record on December 8, scoring 50 points in just 24 minutes of action against Sacramento State. Anigwe's 50 points marked the most by any player – male or female – in a single game in school history. The Bears registered key upsets over No. 20 Oklahoma and No. 13 UCLA, and earned an at-large bid to the 2017 NCAA Tournament, Cal's fifth tournament appearance in six seasons under Gottlieb. The nine-seed in the Waco Regional, the Golden Bears upset eight-seed LSU in the First Round, before falling to top-seeded Baylor on the Lady Bears' home court. Cal ended the season with an overall record of 20-14, Gottlieb's fifth 20-win season at Cal.

In 2015-16, a youthful Bears squad posted a 15-17 record, highlighted by a magical run to the semifinals of the 2016 Pac-12 Tournament. Kristine Anigwe was the near-consensus National Freshman of the Year, earning USBWA and CollegeSportsMadness.com honors, while also being named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year.

The 2014-15 Bears logged another 20-win campaign after finishing at 24-10 overall and 13-5 in Pac-12 play. Cal tied for third in the Pac-12, reached the championship game of the conference tournament, and earned a second-round berth in the NCAA Tournament. The season also saw Gottlieb notch her 100th Cal win, becoming the quickest coach in program history to reach the 100-win mark. She also became the third active Pac-12 coach with at least 100 wins at his or her respective institution.

Following Cal's 2014-15 NCAA Tournament run, seniors Brittany Boyd and Reshanda Gray became the first Golden Bear duo to be selected in the same year of the WNBA Draft, with Boyd going No. 9 to the New York Liberty and Gray selected by the Minnesota Lynx at No. 16.

In her third season in Berkeley, 2013-14, Gottlieb guided Cal to a 22-10 record and a third consecutive NCAA Tournament berth after finishing as the conference runner-up. With another 20-win season under her belt, Gottlieb became the winningest Cal women's basketball coach over a three-year period, notching a 79-24 record.

The 2012-13 season was a record-breaking season for the Golden Bears that culminated in Gottlieb being named a finalist for the prestigious Naismith National Coach of the Year award in addition to the media selecting Gottlieb as the Pac-12 Coach of the Year after she led her team to a 17-1 conference record.

Earning praise for her ability to gameplan and make in-game adjustments, 2012-13 also marked the year that Gottlieb became just the fifth coach to win a Pac-12 title in her first two seasons as a head coach in the conference. She was the first active coach in the conference to lead her team to a road victory at Stanford's Maples Pavilion, a feat she accomplished with a 67-55 victory on January 13, 2013 that ended the Cardinal's 81-game winning streak against conference foes and announced California's ascension into the conference and national championship discussions.

Gottlieb's Bears reeled off a program-record 16 consecutive wins to end the regular season and earn a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament. In a run that surpassed the combined NCAA Tournament win total of all previous California head coaches, Gottlieb led her team to victories over Fresno State, South Florida, LSU and Georgia to reach the 2013 Final Four. She holds a career NCAA Tournament record of 7-5 in five appearances – once as the head coach at UC Santa Barbara and four times at California.

Leading teams to success in the postseason isn't her only specialty though. In her five seasons at California, Gottlieb has amassed a 118-51 record – more California-bests by setting new marks for most wins in a two-year, three-year, and four-year period in Berkeley. Already the first coach to win 20 games in her first season with the Bears, her program-record 32 wins in the 2012-13 marked just the 12th time in conference history that a team surpassed the 30-win barrier.

Utilizing an up-tempo, attractive brand of basketball, Gottlieb's approach has helped revitalize West Coast women's basketball. In total at California, Gottlieb has five coached players to seven All-America seasons in five years with Layshia Clarendon earning honors in 2012 and 2013, Gennifer Brandon in 2013, Boyd in 2014 and 2015, Gray in 2015, and Anigwe in 2016.

In her first season at the helm in Berkeley in 2011-12, Gottlieb took Cal back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2009 with her Bears advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Gottlieb also led the Bears to a second place Pac-12 finish in her inaugural season, just the third time since joining the Pac-10 in its inaugural season (1985-86) that the Bears finished in second place and it was only the second time that Cal has finished with sole possession of second.

Getting A Start At UCSB

Before returning to Cal where she spent three years as an assistant to Joanne Boyle, Gottlieb spent three seasons as the head coach at the University of California at Santa Barbara from 2008-11. In her three seasons with UCSB, Gottlieb led the Gauchos to two postseason berths and a pair of Big West Conference championships, amassing a 56-39 (.589) record. Previously, she spent two seasons as a Cal assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in 2007-08.

In 2010-11, Gottlieb guided the Gauchos to their second Big West title in her three seasons at the helm, amassing a 19-12 record (12-4 in the Big West) before falling in the first round of the WNIT to USC. Gottlieb's first team in 2008-09 amassed a 22-10 overall record and a 15-1 mark in the Big West, claiming the conference's regular-season and tournament crowns to earn an NCAA Tournament appearance. As a result, she was named the 2009 Big West Coach of the Year. Gottlieb was the first-ever coach at UCSB to win 20 games in her first season and became one of only seven active coaches nationwide to win 20 games in her first year and also be named Coach of the Year.

Other accolades for Gottlieb included becoming the first coach in UCSB history to win her first 11 conference games and the first coach in school annals to finish her inaugural season with a winning record.

In 2010-11, Gottlieb led the Gauchos to their 18th consecutive winning season and the team won at least 20 games for the 12th time in the past 14 years. The Gauchos led the Big West in both field goal percentage (43.2 percent) and field goal percentage defense (35.4 percent) as well as being tops in the conference in rebounding (40.2 per game).

Under her tutelage, UCSB ranked in the nation's top 10 in field goal percentage defense and the top 20 in points allowed per game while setting a school record in free throw percentage in the 2008-09 season.

Following her time at UCSB, Gottlieb became the ninth head coach for the California Golden Bears women's basketball program by replacing Boyle, who resigned her position to take over the head coaching duties at the University of Virginia.

First Run In Berkeley

Gottlieb initially joined the Cal staff as an assistant coach in 2005-06, a position she held for two seasons before being elevated to associate head coach in 2007-08. During her time in Berkeley, she worked with all aspects of the program, including recruiting and scouting, and served as the team's academic liaison.



Gottlieb was integral to the development of Cal's post players, including Devanei Hampton, the 2006-07 Pac-10 Player of the Year and a two-time All-Pac-10 selection, and Ashley Walker, an All-American and Cal's first player to be selected in the first round of the WNBA draft.

In Gottlieb's inaugural year as an assistant in Berkeley, Cal posted its first winning record (18-12) in 3 years and received its first NCAA Tournament berth since 1993. In 2006-07, Gottlieb helped Cal register a 23-9 mark - one win shy of equaling the school's win record at the time - and earn another bid to the NCAA Tournament. Cal's 2007-08 squad made the program's first-ever appearance in the Pac-10 Tournament championship game and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

East Coast Beginnings

Gottlieb spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Richmond under Boyle before the two came to Cal. The Spiders posted 20-plus wins each year and

advanced to the postseason three times. In 2004-05, Richmond finished with a 23-8 record and earned the program's first NCAA Tournament berth in 14 years. The Spiders were invited to the 2003 and 2004 WNIT.

Prior to Gottlieb's stint at Richmond, she served as an assistant coach at New Hampshire in 2001-02 under head coach Sue Johnson.

Before joining the New Hampshire staff, Gottlieb was an assistant coach for two years at Syracuse with Marianna Freeman at the helm. While at Syracuse, she earned her Master's degree in Philosophy of Education.

The Scarsdale, N.Y., native graduated from Brown in 1999 with a Bachelor's of Arts degree in Political Science and was a member of the women's basketball team. Gottlieb was a student assistant coach during the 1998-99 campaign.

Gottlieb and her fiancé, Patrick, live in Oakland and had welcomed their first son, Jordan, in May 2017

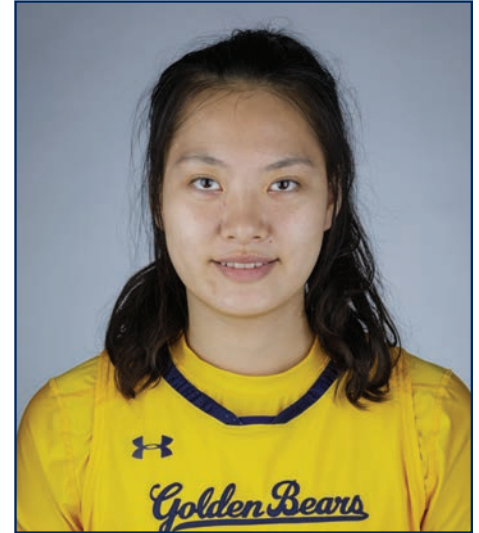
