» UT is No. 1 nationally in three statistical categories, including winning percentage (100.0), free throws attempted (339) and free throws made (240).

TEAM NOTES

TENNESSEE VS. KENTUCKY

■ No. 7/7 Tennessee (12-0) opens Southeastern Conference play on the road, facing Kentucky (8-6) at Rupp Arena in Lexington on Sunday. Tip-off is slated for 12:02 p.m. ET.

■ The UK men are slated to host Georgia at 6 p.m. in a Bluegrass New Year's Eve hoops doubleheader.

■ **This will mark UT's third straight road affair, with the Big Orange winning at Long Beach State (90-61) and at #18/24 Stanford (83-71) on Dec. 17 and 21, respectively.**

■ **The win at Long Beach was UT's first there in three tries, dating back to 1983, and the triumph at Stanford was the Lady Vols' first at Maples Pavilion since Dec. 4, 2005, snapping a five-game road skid vs. the Cardinal. Incidentally, that was the last time UT started a season 12-0.**

■ After the eight-day West Coast swing, Tennessee's players and staff had five days off for winter break before returning to campus on Dec. 27 to begin preparations for the Wildcats.

■ **The Lady Vols will be aiming to go 13-0 for only the fifth occasion in school history and for the first time during the Holly Warlick era.**

■ The last time Tennessee began a season 13-0, the Lady Vols extended the streak to 18 games before finally falling during the 2005-06 season en route to a 31-5 overall record.

■ Kentucky enters Sunday's match-up at 8-6 after dropping a 62-57 decision to Middle Tennessee in Murfreesboro on Thursday night.

■ The Wildcats have lost five straight and six of their last eight after opening the year 6-0.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

■ Pam Ward (play-by-play) and Gail Goestenkors (analyst) will describe the action for the Tennessee-Kentucky television broadcast on the SEC Network.

■ Mickey Dearstone is handling the call for IMG College/Lady Vol Network radio/online broadcasts for the 19th season. A link to the live audio stream can be found on each game's Hoops Central page or the Lady Vol schedule on UTSports.com.

■ Air time for games on the Lady Vol Radio Network generally occurs 30 minutes prior to tip-off.

COMING UP ON THE SCHEDULE

■ The Lady Vols will be back in action at home on Jan. 4, as Auburn comes to town for UT's first game of 2018 and the second contest of the SEC schedule. Tip time is 7 p.m., and the game can be seen on SECN+ (WatchESPN).

■ Vanderbilt travels to Knoxville on Jan. 7 to face the Lady Vols at noon. The SEC Network will have the telecast.

After that two-game homestand, the Lady Vols begin what appears to be their most grueling stretch of the season, playing at #22/21 Texas A&M (Jan. 11), at #4/5 South Carolina (Jan. 14), at #2/2 Notre Dame (Jan. 18) and at home vs. #5/3 Mississippi State (Jan. 21) during an 11-day span.

THE LADY VOLS IN SEC OPENERS

■ Tennessee is 29-6 all-time in SEC openers, including 16-3 at home and 13-3 on the road.

■ UT has won three straight SEC openers and has triumphed in its last 10 league lid-lifters that were played on the road.

■ The Lady Vols are 31-4 all-time in the first SEC game that is played at home during a season and 27-8 in the first one on the road.

■ Tennessee and Kentucky are meeting for the fourth time in an SEC opener, with UT winning the previous meetings (all three in Knoxville) on Jan. 11, 1987 (76-64), Jan. 8, 2009 (69-64) and Jan. 1, 2017 (72-65).

■ The Lady Vols are 4-1 in SEC openers under Holly Warlick, including 2-1 at home and 2-0 on the road.

■ #12/13 UT won at #18/15 South Carolina in the first SEC opener for Warlick, 73-53, on Jan. 3, 2013.

■ #5/5 UT lost at home to #16/16 LSU (80-77) on Jan. 2, 2014, #8/9 Tennessee won at home over Missouri, 63-53, on Jan. 2, 2015; #12/11 UT took down #20/RV Missouri in Columbia, 71-55, on Jan. 4, 2016; and the unranked Lady Vols beat #17/23 Kentucky in Knoxville, 72-65, on Jan. 1, 2017.

TENNESSEE IN SEC PLAY

■ UT is 377-64 in SEC regular-season games through 2016-17, winning 18 championships and capturing 17 SEC tourney titles.

■ **During the Holly Warlick era, Tennessee is 60-20 in league games, making Warlick the top-ranked active SEC coach in terms of winning percentage in league play at .750.**

■ South Carolina's Dawn Staley is the next coach behind Warlick at .678 (97-46), followed by UK's Matthew Mitchell at .658 (102-53).

■ In only her sixth year as a head coach, Warlick already ranks fourth in total league wins among active SEC coaches and has won regular season titles in 2013 and 2015, and a tourney crown in 2014.

■ Warlick's record stands 80-26 in non-conference games.

PLAYING ON NEW YEAR'S EVE

■ Tennessee is 3-0 in games played on New Year's Eve, winning all three of those games on the road.

■ This is the second SEC game UT has played on Dec. 31, with the #1/1 Lady Vols edging #8/9 Vandy on New Year's Eve 1994 in the first NYE appearance for the Big Orange.

■ No. 1/1 UT beat No. 12/12 Notre Dame, 62-51, on 12/31/05 in the most recent NYE tilt.

■ The other NYE match-up came on 12/31/95, when #5/4 UT beat unranked Memphis, 84-63.

TENNESSEE RESET

■ At 12-0, the Lady Vols are in the midst of their longest winning streak since reeling off 25 in a row from Dec. 18, 2010 to March 28, 2011.

■ **UT is one of only six undefeated teams remaining in NCAA Division I basketball. The other squads are Ball State, Connecticut, Louisville, Mississippi State and West Virginia.**

■ On Dec. 21, the Lady Vols beat the #18/24 Cardinal, 83-71, and halted a five-game, 10-year losing skid at Stanford's Maples Pavilion that began on Dec. 22, 2007 (L, 73-69 OT).

■ On Dec. 10, UT got its biggest home win since beating (then) No. 3/2 Stanford on Dec. 19, 2010, as the Lady Vols outlasted No. 2/4 Texas, 82-75.

■ The Big Orange women have won 10 of 12 games by double-digit margins, including by 43 vs. Central Arkansas and 53 vs. Alabama State,

62 vs. Troy and 29 vs. Long Beach State in four of their last six games.

■ They've scored 100 or more points three times in a season for the first time since doing so in 2010-11. UT hasn't had more than three 100+ games in a campaign since hitting that mark four times in 2000-01. The Big Orange record for 100-point efforts in a year is seven in 1987-88.

■ Holly Warlick has started the same five players every game thus far. That quintet includes Jaime Nared and Renna Davis at the forward positions, Mercedes Russell at center and Evina Westbrook and Meme Jackson at guard.

■ **It's the longest Tennessee has opened a season with the same starting five through 12 games since at least the 1977-78 season.** Box scores that season and prior do not indicate who started.

■ In modern Lady Vol history, the previous long streak for the same starting five reached 11 games in 2007-08, when Pat Summitt chose the same lineup of Candace Parker, Angie Bjorklund, Nicky Anosike, Shannon Bobbitt and Alexis Hornbuckle to report for the opening tip. UT went 10-1 in that span and went on to win the NCAA title with a 34-3 record and the SEC title with a 14-0 mark. In game 12, in the team's visit to Chicago, Parker missed curfew and didn't get the starting nod vs. DePaul on Jan. 2, 2008.

■ UT has four players averaging double figures in scoring, including seniors Jaime Nared (17.9) and Mercedes Russell (16.4), and freshmen Anastasia Hayes (12.3) and Renna Davis (12.0).

■ **Nared's current average is the highest by a Lady Vol since Candace Parker put up 21.3 in 2007-08.**

■ Russell and Nared have led Tennessee in scoring five times each, while Hayes has done so twice, and Davis and Meme Jackson once each.

■ Russell has scored in double figures in every game, while Hayes and Nared have done so 10 times and Davis has hit 10 or more in seven games.

■ **Holly Warlick's squad has led at the half of all 12 games, including a double-digit margin in nine of those.**

■ Tennessee has outscored its opponents in the points-in-the-paint category in 10 of 12 games, averaging a 44.0 to 30.0 difference.

■ **Tennessee has allowed only one opponent this season to shoot better than 40 percent (Marquette, .437, fourth game).**

■ The Lady Vols bested their foes in second chance points nine times and tied another time. UT averages 16.1 second chance points, while its opponents tally 10.9.

■ UT had an 18-0 fast break points edge vs. Long Beach St. and a 12-4 margin vs. Stanford, improving the team's season edge to 15.4 to 7.4 per game.

YEP, WE'RE A BASKETBALL SCHOOL

■ Tennessee is one of only seven schools to currently have its men's and women's basketball programs ranked in the AP 25, with the Lady Vols at No. 7 and the Vols at No. 19.

■ Other schools and their women's/men's rankings include: Baylor (6/18), West Virginia (9/7), Florida State (13/24), Duke (14/4), Villanova (18/1) and Texas A&M (22/5).

BEST STARTS

■ Tennessee has recorded its best start since 2005-06 and has one of the top five opening efforts in school history.

STREAK BUSTERS

■ Tennessee has put an end to some negative streaks this season and last, as the Lady Vols elevate themselves back into the national conversation.

■ The Lady Vols ended a three-game skid vs. Texas this season with a home victory over the No. 2/4 ranked Longhorns.

■ UT ended a five-game venue losing skid at Stanford's Maples Pavilion, winning there for the first time since Dec. 4, 2005, with an 83-71 defeat of the No. 18/24 Cardinal on Dec. 21.

■ Last season, UT ended a six-game losing streak in the Notre Dame series, defeating the #6/6 Fighting Irish in Knoxville.

■ UT has a three-game road losing skid at Notre Dame it will have an opportunity to end on Jan. 18.

■ The Lady Vols brought an end to two more bad jags a year ago, ending three-game dry spells vs. #3/2 Mississippi State and #4/4 South Carolina, both on the road.

UT STATISTICAL NUGGETS

■ Tennessee ranks No. 3 nationally and leads the SEC, pulling down 49.9 rebounds per game, with Jaime Nared (8.9), Mercedes Russell (8.8) and Rennia Davis (8.2) setting the tone.

■ As a note, UT's school record for season rebound average is 46.9, set in 1992-93.

■ The team is No. 2 nationally in defensive rebounds per game, grabbing 35.

■ The Big Orange women have won the battle of the boards in every game but one (Stanford), forging a +12.2 advantage on the glass that ranks No. 9 nationally.

■ The squad from Rocky Top has shot a higher percentage than 11 of 12 opponents (not Marquette) and stands at 48.1 for the season. That rate ranks Tennessee No. 18 nationally and second in the SEC.

■ Mercedes Russell continues to shoot at an very high percentage, connecting on 63.3 percent of her shots (81 of 128). She ranks No. 12 nationally and third in the SEC with that number.

■ The Lady Vols are No. 1 in the NCAA in free throws attempted (339) and No. 1 in free throws made (240).

■ Freshmen Rennia Davis and Evina Westbrook have started every game for Tennessee, and classmate Anastasia Hayes has been the team's first sub of choice.

■ Hayes and Davis are UT's third and fourth-leading scorers at 12.3 and 12.0 points per game, and Davis is the team's third-leading rebounder (8.2 rpg.). Westbrook is the team's fifth-highest scorer at 9.3 ppg. after netting a career-high 17 vs. Stanford and 15 earlier vs. Texas.

■ Hayes and Davis rank fourth and fifth in the SEC among freshmen scoring, while Davis is second in rebounding.

■ Hayes has gotten to the free throw line an average of 7.4 times per game, hitting 65 of 89 for 73 percent. She ranks ninth nationally for free throw attempts and 16th for makes.

■ Freshman Evina Westbrook has recorded at least six assists in five games and is leading UT with an average of 4.8 dimes per game while adding 9.3 points and 2.8 rebounds. Hayes is second at 4.0 assists per contest. They had career highs of 12 and nine vs. Troy, with Westbrook's total tying for seventh best ever at UT and matching Ariel Massengale's freshman record.

■ Westbrook (4.8) and Hayes (4.0) rank second and third in assists per game among SEC rookies.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

■ Tennessee faced foes who entered scoring 91.8 (Troy) and 93.0 (Texas) points per game and held those squads to 69 and 75, respectively.

■ Troy hit only 29 percent from the field vs. UT, while Texas shot 36.8 percent.

■ UT held Stanford to 39.7 on its home floor, making the Cardinal the 11th of 12 opponents to shoot less than 40 percent from the field.

■ Tennessee ranks 15th nationally and No. 2 in the SEC in field goal percentage defense at 33.9.

■ The Lady Vols are fourth nationally and first in the SEC in three-point field goal percentage defense at 23.2.

■ On the season, Holly Warlick's squad has held opponents to an average of 61.9 points per game, with seven foes failing to score more than 61 and only three scoring above 70 (Marquette, 99, in OT; Texas, 75; and Stanford, 71).

■ Tennessee set a school record for fewest points allowed in a second half, giving up only 10 to Central Arkansas on Nov. 30.

■ All 10 of those points came in the third quarter, as the Lady Vols shut out the Sugar Bears in the final stanza, marking the first time UT had "pitched a shutout" in a quarter.

■ UCA finished with 34 points for the game, marking the 10th-lowest total ever scored by a Tennessee foe.

■ UT's forced Central Arkansas and Alabama State into 24 and 23 turnovers, respectively. Those totals are the highest this season.

GETTING OFF TO A GREAT START

■ Tennessee has made a habit of getting off to great starts. A 282-155 first quarter tally over opponents backs that up.

■ Holly Warlick's squad surged to a 21-9 first quarter lead over Stanford en route to a 23-14 edge after the opening 10 minutes.

■ UT burst ahead 22-7 en route to a 27-16 first quarter advantage over Long Beach State.

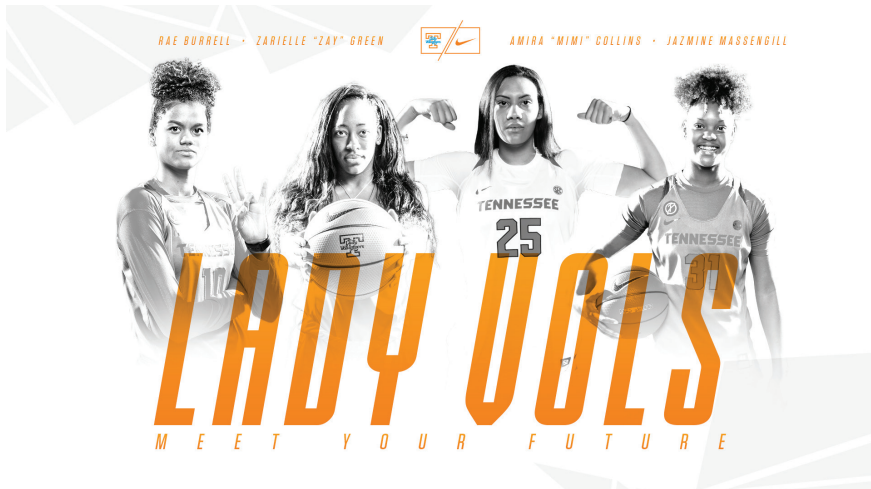
■ The Lady Vols got out to 6-0 and 12-2 leads early against Texas.

Conversely, the biggest run UT has given up in 2017-18 has been a 12-0 run by Marquette spanning the second and third quarters.

TENN. LAST TIME OUT (UT 83, STANFORD 71)

Senior Jaime Nared posted a 28-point effort to lead the No. 7 Lady Vols to an 83-71 victory on the road against No. 18 Stanford (6-6) on Dec. 21.

The win improved Tennessee to 12-0 on the season and broke a five-game Tennessee losing streak at Maples Pavilion dating back to Dec. 4, 2005. That season also marked the last time UT opened a season with 12 straight wins.

Senior Mercedes Russell contributed a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds on the night, while freshman Evina Westbrook posted a career high of 17 points.

In addition to her season-high 28 points, Nared also posted a career-best seven steals, dished out five assists, pulled down three rebounds and blocked two shots.

Brittany McPhee was Stanford's leading scorer and the only Cardinal player in double digits, notching 27 points on the night.

Tennessee connected on 31 of 36 free throws for the game, salting the contest away in the fourth quarter by knocking down 19 of 20 attempts at the charity stripe.

THE SERIES VS. KENTUCKY

UT enters this meeting with Kentucky holding a 54-11 all-time record in the series and has won five of the past six vs. UK.

The Lady Vols are 20-8 vs. Kentucky in games played in Lexington after dropping a 64-63 heart-breaker on Jan. 25, 2016 at Memorial Coliseum.

Kentucky holds a 1-0 edge in games played at Rupp Arena. The unranked Wildcats took down No. 1/3 UT, 66-63, on Jan. 26, 2006.

Holly Warlick was an assistant for UT at the time, and former Lady Vol aide Mickie DeMoss was head coach at Kentucky.

The Lady Vols own a 24-3 mark against UK in games played in Knoxville, with the Wildcats only winning on Rocky Top in 1983, 1985 and 2014.

Tennessee is 10-0 vs. Kentucky at neutral sites and 9-0 in postseason games.

UT is 3-1 in overtime games vs. Kentucky, including 3-0 in Lexington and 0-1 in Knoxville, with the last OT contest in the series coming in 1994.

Holly Warlick was 7-1 as a player vs. Kentucky from 1976-80, going 3-0 in Knoxville vs. the Wildcats, and she is 5-3 as head coach.

UT has faced only two other teams more times than the Wildcats - Vanderbilt in 78 meetings and Georgia in 66 games. UT-UK game 66 is Sunday.

Either Tennessee or Kentucky had taken turns winning four SEC regular season crowns until South Carolina won in 2014, with UT winning in 2013, 2011 and 2010 and UK prevailing in 2012. UT added another in 2015, tying with South Carolina, while the Gamecocks won outright the past two seasons.

From 2010-15, Tennessee, Kentucky or both were in the SEC Tournament title game.

Tennessee emerged victorious over Kentucky in the 2010 (70-62), 2011 (90-65) and 2014 (71-70) SEC Tournament championship games.

Kentucky's staff includes five members who previously spent time at Tennessee as players, staff members, students or all three.

Wildcats head coach Matthew Mitchell was on the Tennessee staff in 1999-2000 as a graduate assistant.

UK Associate Head Coach Kyra Elzy played at Tennessee from 1996-2001 and was an assistant coach and associate head coach at UT from 2012-16 in between stints working with Mitchell at Kentucky as an assistant coach and associate head

coach (2008-12, 2016-present).

Kentucky assistant Niya Butts played at Tennessee from 1996-2000.

Amber Smith, who played at Kentucky from 2008-12 and was a graduate assistant in 2013-14 at Tennessee, is back at UK in a player development role.

Lin Dunn, who joined the UK staff prior to the 2016-17 season with a wealth of experience at the WNBA and collegiate levels, earned her master's degree from Tennessee in 1970 after completing her undergraduate work at UT-Martin.

LAST MEETING BETWEEN UT & UK

Redshirt junior Diamond DeShields made a huge return to the hardwood in Tennessee's 72-65 win over No. 17/23 Kentucky last New Year's Day at Thompson-Boling Arena.

After missing the previous two games, DeShields scored 21 points on 50 percent (8-of-16) shooting to go along with four rebounds, two assists and a block. Fellow redshirt junior Mercedes Russell compiled another strong outing, scoring 22 points, grabbing nine boards and dishing out three assists with no turnovers in 38 minutes of duty.

Junior Jaime Nared scored in double digits for the 10th consecutive game, posting 18 points behind 5-of-10 shooting to go with five rebounds, two assists and a steal. She also was 5-of-6 from the charity stripe, making her last four within the final minutes of the game to ice Tennessee's fifth-straight win.

A trio of players led Kentucky (9-5, 0-1 SEC) in scoring. Taylor Murray finished with 23 points and six rebounds. Evelyn Akhator recorded the contest's only double-double, posting 11 points on 100 percent (5-of-5) shooting and 10 rebounds. Maci Morris finished with 15 points on the day.

The key story line for the second period was Tennessee's ability to hold preseason All-American Makayla Epps scoreless until 1:10 remaining in the first half, when she nailed a pair of free throws. She would finish the half with four points on 1-of-5 shooting. Russell fueled the Lady Vols, totaling 12 points and seven rebounds in the half. UT went into the intermission leading, 36-29.

LAST TIME AT RUPP

Kentucky and Tennessee are meeting in the first of three UK women's games being played this season at Rupp Arena in downtown Lexington. The Wildcat women's team usually plays at Memorial Coliseum on campus.

This will mark only the sixth time in program history and the first time since the 2007-08 season that the Wildcats have played three or more regular-season games inside Rupp Arena.

■ UK played five games at Rupp in 2007-08, four games in 2006-07 and 2005-06, three games in 2004-05 and three games in 1979-80. Kentucky played two regular-season games and one NCAA Tournament game in Rupp in 2015-16.

■ The Lady Vols and Wildcats last met in Rupp on Jan. 26, 2006, with unranked UK knocking off #1/3 Tennessee, 66-63, in front of a record crowd of 13,689 for the Big Blue's first win over UT since 1986.

■ After dropping a game at #2/2 Duke on Jan. 23 and following with a loss at Kentucky, the Lady Vols suffered their first back-to-back defeats in nine years.

■ Kentucky head coach Mickie DeMoss earned her biggest victory over her mentor, Pat Summitt, whom she had served as assistant coach for 18 years.

KENTUCKY RESET

■ The Wildcats started the season 6-0, but they have dropped six of their last eight and five straight games to fall to 8-6.

■ UK has not scored more than 64 points in its last five games.

■ Junior guard Maci Morris leads the Cats at 16.0 ppg. per game, draining 34 of 69 threes for 49.3 percent accuracy.

■ Also scoring in double figures are junior guard Taylor Murray (10.9) and freshman forward Tatyana Wyatt (10.4), who comes off the bench.

■ Kentucky hosted Cal on Dec. 21, and the Cats fell to the #20/25 Golden Bears by only 10, 62-52.

■ Matthew Mitchell's squad continues to play its traditional tough defense, allowing only 62.1 points per game, with only #6/6 Baylor (90) and #3/4 Louisville (87) tallying more than 70 points vs. the Cats.

UK LAST TIME OUT (MTSU 62, UK 57)

■ Maci Morris scored 13 points and Alyssa Rice added 11 points and eight rebounds, but the Kentucky women's basketball team fell to Middle Tennessee (8-5) 62-57 on Thursday night at the Murphy Center in Murfreesboro.

■ Kentucky (8-6) hit 11 of 20 shots in the first half, but the Wildcats connected on just eight of 28 shots after the break. Kentucky hit just four of its 17 shots from behind the arc in the game, while Middle Tennessee connected on seven of 17.

■ In the second period, the Blue Raiders cut Kentucky's lead to 16-14, but the Wildcats went on a quick 7-0 run, sparked by four points from Tatyana Wyatt, to make it 23-14 with 5:32 left in the half. Middle Tennessee would cut the lead to 23-17 before Kentucky finished the half on a 9-3

run, capped by a Jaida Roper three ball, to lead 32-20 at the break.

■ The Wildcats held the advantage in bench points (18-10) and points in the paint (20-18). But the Wildcats lost the battle of the boards 34-26.

FIRST NO. 1 SIGNING CLASS SINCE '08

■ **Tennessee's 2017 women's basketball signing class was ranked No. 1 in the nation by several recruiting services, including espnW HoopGurlz and Prospectsnation.com.**

■ The class is the highest rated of the Holly Warlick era, which was preceded by the No. 3 group from 2013 and a No. 6-rated class in 2014.

■ UT last signed a No. 1 class in 2008, when Glory Johnson (No. 3), Amber Gray (No. 4), Shekinna Stricklen (No. 8), Alicia Manning (No. 15), Alyssia Brewer (No. 20) and Briana Bass (No. 33) joined a program led by Pat Summitt with Warlick and current assistant Dean Lockwood as assistants.

■ UT signed four players, with each one ranked among the top 11 players in the country by Prospectsnation.com. Three of the four were rated in the top 12 by espnW HoopGurlz, with the other player ranked at No. 57.

■ New to the program are 6-0 guard Evina Westbrook of Salem, Ore./South Salem H.S. (No. 1 by All-Star Girls Report/No. 2 by Prospectsnation.com and espnW HoopGurlz), 5-7 guard Anastasia Hayes of Murfreesboro, Tenn./Riverdale H.S. (No. 6 by Prospectsnation.com/No. 9 by espnW HoopGurlz), 6-2 wing Renna Davis of Jacksonville, Fla./Ribault H.S. (ranked No. 9 overall by Prospectsnation.com and No. 12 by espnW HoopGurlz) and 6-4 post player Kasiyahna Kushkituah of Atlanta, Ga./St. Francis H.S. (No. 9 by All-Star Girls Report/No. 11 by Prospectsnation.com/No. 57 by espnW HoopGurlz).

■ **Westbrook was picked by Sports Illustrated as the preseason 2018 Freshman of the Year.**

■ Under Holly Warlick, the Lady Vols were No. 3 in 2013, No. 6 in 2014, No. 13 in 2015 (signed #12 & #49 players), not ranked in 2016 (three late signees, including JUCO All-American Cheridene Green), and No. 1 in 2017.

■ The 2013 class included No. 1 Mercedes Russell, while the 2014 group had No. 6 Jaime Nared.

UT FOLLOWS WITH NO. 3 2018 CLASS

■ After landing the nation's number one class in 2017, Tennessee followed that up with a class ranked as high as No. 3 by recruiting experts.

■ **These are the best back-to-back signing classes for UT since a No. 5-rated unit in Pat Sum-**

mitt's final season (2012 signing class) and a No. 3 collection in Warlick's first year as head coach (2013 signing class/Mercedes Russell - No. 1).

■ Zarielle "Zay" Green, a 6-0 guard from Duncanville, Texas (Duncanville H.S.); Jazmine Massengill, a 6-0 point guard from Chattanooga (Hamilton Heights Christian Academy); and Amira "Mimi" Collins, a 6-3 forward from Waldorf, Md. (Paul VI Catholic H.S. [Fairfax, Va.]) signed Nov. 8. Rae Burrell, a 6-1 wing from Henderson, Nev. (Liberty H.S.) made it official on Nov. 10.

■ Green is the highest ranked player, standing 9th by Blue Star, No. 13 by espnW HoopGurlz and No. 23 by ProspectsNation.com. She committed on Oct. 23 after making Knoxville her final visit.

■ Massengill is next, coming in 11th by ProspectsNation.com, No. 22 by Blue Star and No. 26 by espnW HoopGurlz. She made her intention to attend UT known on Jan. 15, 2017.

■ Collins, UT's first commitment of the group back on Dec. 7, 2016, is ranked No. 9 by ProspectsNation.com, while Blue Star and espnW HoopGurlz slot her at No. 50 and No. 69, respectively.

■ Burrell closed out UT's four-player class, committing on Monday following a visit to campus Nov. 3-5. A player whose stock is on the rise after an impressive summer tournament showing, she is rated No. 44 by espnW HoopGurlz and No. 119 by ProspectsNation.com.

■ **UT remains at No. 7 in the AP Poll and No. 7 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, released on Dec. 26 and Dec. 27, respectively.**

■ Nared entered the season fifth in career free throw shooting at .831.

■ Mercedes Russell has 36 career double-doubles, tying for third all-time at UT with Glory Johnson. Candace Parker (45) is second and Chamique Holdscraw (57) is first.

■ Russell became the 18th Lady Vol to reach 800 career rebounds vs. JMU. She has 888 through the Stanford game. Only 12 Lady Vols have pulled down 900 and just five have grabbed 1,000.

■ Russell now has 168 career blocks and moved past Nicky Anosike (161) into sixth place vs. Troy.

■ Entering the season, Russell stood fifth at UT in career field goal percentage (.564).

■ Russell stands 29th on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,290 points. Tonya Edwards is next at 28th (1,309). Nared is 35th with 1,125, just behind Lea Henry (34th, 1,128), Lisa Harrison (33rd, 1,135) and Ariel Massengale (32nd, 1,161).

■ If the season ended today, Evina Westbrook (4.8, 2nd) and Anastasia Hayes (4.0, 3rd) have assist averages that would rank them in the top five among all UT freshmen.

■ Rennia Davis' average of 8.2 rebounds would tie her for fourth among all-time UT freshmen.

UT IN TOP FIVE IN BOTH SEC POLLS

■ Members of the media picked Tennessee to finish fourth in the SEC this season, ranking behind South Carolina, Mississippi State and Missouri.

■ The coaches, meanwhile, have UT slotted at fifth, falling in line behind South Carolina, Mississippi State, Missouri and Texas A&M.

A CLOSER LOOK AT THE LADY VOLS

■ Tennessee returns two starters (Mercedes Russell, Jaime Nared) and another part-time starter (Meme Jackson) from last year's squad, which wound up 20-12 after falling in the NCAA Second Round. The Big Orange women were 10-6 in league play a year ago and finished fifth in the SEC standings.

■ Also back are 6-2 senior forward Kortney Dunbar and 6-3 sophomore center Kamera Harris.

■ This year's newcomers include the nation's No. 1 ranked recruiting class as well as a two-time JUCO All-American forward who redshirted last season due to a knee injury.

■ UT's consensus No. 1-ranked freshman class includes the No. 2 (6-0 guard Evina Westbrook), No. 7 (5-7 guard Anastasia Hayes), No. 12 (6-2 wing Rennia Davis) and No. 57 (6-4 center Kasiyahna Kushkituah) players in the nation, as ranked in the HoopGurlz espnW 100. All four players were McDonald's All-Americans and are expected to see extensive playing time in their first collegiate season. Davis and Westbrook, as a matter of fact, earned starts in the Carson-Newman exhibition game.

■ Redshirt junior Cheridene Green was a two-time All-American at ASA College in Brooklyn, N.Y., averaging 20.5 points and 16.5 rebounds per contest as a sophomore before redshirting at Tennessee last season. The power forward should offer immediate help inside.

■ The 2016-17 Lady Vols defeated three of the four teams in last year's NCAA Final Four (Stanford, South Carolina, Mississippi State) and also toppled Elite Eight squad Notre Dame as well.

■ The Big Orange women were 10-6 in league play a year ago and finished fifth in the SEC standings.

■ UT lost starting guards Jordan Reynolds (WNBA 2nd Round) and Diamond DeShields (signed pro contract in June) as well as reserve forward Schaquilla Nunn (WNBA 3rd Round) to

the professional ranks. Guard Alexa Middleton, a part-time starter, and redshirt sophomore guard Te'a Cooper are no longer with the program. Cooper missed all of last season with a knee injury.

■ Capacity at Thompson-Boling Arena is 21,678.

■ UT has led the nation in attendance 19 times in the past 26 years, finishing second the past three years after an 11-season run at No. 1.

■ Tennessee ranked second in the nation in home attendance last season with an average of 9,184 through 16 dates and currently ranks fourth at 8,056 per contest.

EVERY U.S. OLYMPIC TEAM HAS HAD A LADY VOL ON IT

10 MIL. ATTENDANCE MARK IN SIGHT

■ During the past 39 years, 9,858,831 fans attended Lady Vol games, both at home (5,615,310) and outside of Knoxville (4,243,521).

■ **The Lady Vols entered the 2017-18 campaign needing only 141,169 in attendance to reach the 10-million plateau.**

■ Last year, 222,332 watched Tennessee play at all venues, meaning the 10-million mark should be easily reachable this season.

■ **They stand at 63,357 through 12 games.**

■ In 2016-17, Tennessee finished second among all Division I women's programs in per game home attendance at 9,184, a mark that would have ranked 49th among all DI men's programs.

■ UT has led NCAA Division I women's basketball attendance 19 times.

FRESHMEN STARTERS

■ **Tennessee has started freshmen Evina Westbrook and RENNIA DAVIS the first 12 games this season.**

■ **Only four times in history have the Lady Vols started two freshmen in the season opener,** with that occurring this season as well as in 2008-09 (Glory Johnson, Shekinna Stricklen), 1985-86 (Sheila Frost, **Bridgette Gordon**) and 1980-81 (Pat Hatmaker, Mary Ostrowski).

■ Head coach Holly Warlick now has started five freshmen in season openers during her first six seasons, including Andraya Carter (2012-13 vs. Chattanooga), Alexa Middleton (2013-14 vs. Penn), Te'a Cooper (2015-16 vs. Central Arkansas) and RENNIA DAVIS and Evina Westbrook (2017-18 vs. ETSU).

■ Warlick said there may be instances this season when there will be three freshman starters.

■ There have been five previous years where multiple freshmen have been listed among the team's primary starters for the season, one of which included three newcomers (1984-85) in the starting lineup of record for the year.

■ Those years included 2008-09 (Glory Johnson, Shekinna Stricklen), 2004-05 (Nicky Anosike, Alexis Hornbuckle), 1997-98 (Tamika Catchings, Semeka Randall), 1985-86 (Sheila Frost, Bridgette Gordon) and 1984-85 (Karla Horton, Dawn Marsh, Kathy Spinks). The 2004-05 season would most likely have had a third rookie starter if Candace Parker hadn't sat out due to injury.

BREAKING DOWN THE RETURNEES

■ Senior Mercedes Russell, a 6-foot-6 center from Springfield Ore., and classmate Jaime Nared, a 6-2 wing from Portland, Ore., are Tennessee's top returning players and should be in the conversation for All-SEC and All-America honors.

■ Russell and Nared are preseason first-team All-SEC picks by the coaches this season.

■ Additionally, Russell was a member of the five-player All-SEC First Team, as chosen by the media, and was a third-team preseason All-America pick by College Sports Madness.

■ **Russell was named to the Preseason Lisa Leslie Award and Wade Trophy Watch Lists, while Nared was picked for the Preseason Cheryl Miller Award Watch List. Both players were on the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 30 and the Citizen Naismith Trophy Watch List.**

■ Russell was second on the team in scoring (16.1 ppg.) and led the squad in rebounding (9.7) a year ago while setting a Tennessee record for a junior with 19 double-doubles. She was named an honorable mention All-American by AP and the WBCA as well as earning second-team All-SEC.

■ **Russell now ranks third at UT with 36 career double-doubles, a total that ranks her second among active SEC players behind South Carolina's A'ja Wilson.**

■ Nared, meanwhile, was third in scoring and second in rebounding for UT last season with 15.6 points and 6.9 rebounds per contest. She was second on the squad with 37 three-pointers and had eight double-doubles as a junior.

■ A second-team All-SEC pick by the coaches last season, **Nared hit the game-winning shot vs. #6/6 Notre Dame and game-clinching free throws vs. #4/4 South Carolina and #17/23 Kentucky in 2016-17. She also had a career-high 30 points in UT's upset of #3/2 Mississippi State in Starkville and 28 vs. #13/12 Louisville in the NCAA Second Round.**

■ Junior guard/forward Meme Jackson started 19 games a year ago and averaged 4.7 points and 1.8 rebounds while ranking fourth on the team with 24 three-pointers. Jackson is one of the team's quickest defenders and should help set the tone on that end this season.

■ Also back are 6-2 senior forward Kortney Dunbar, who has hit 50 three-pointers over the past three seasons, and 6-3 sophomore center Kamera Harris, who saw limited action a year ago but hopes to add depth in the paint in 2017-18.

GREEN READY AFTER REDSHIRT YEAR

■ Redshirt junior forward Cheridene Green is ready to play after sitting out last season rehabbing a knee injury suffered in 2015-16.

■ The 6-3 Green was a two-time All-American at ASA College in Brooklyn, N.Y., averaging 20.5 points and 16.5 rebounds per contest as a sophomore before having her season ended prematurely. She redshirted at Tennessee last season, and the power forward should offer immediate help inside for the Lady Vols.

■ Green was a first-team All-America selection in 2015-16 and second team in 2014-15.

■ She ranked first in the NJCAA in rebounds, third in blocks and eighth in scoring in 2015-16.

■ Green, from London, England, is the first international player in Lady Vol history and the fifth junior college transfer for the program, joining Zandra Montgomery (1977), Shannon Bobbitt (2006), Alberta Auguste (2006) and Jasmine Phillips (2012).

NARED, RUSSELL REPRESENT USA

■ Seniors Jaime Nared and Mercedes Russell were members of the USA U23 National Team that won the U24 Four Nations Tournament over the summer in Tokyo, Japan.

■ The Lady Vol duo started all three games and helped the USA defeat Australia on Aug. 12, 78-60; Canada on Aug. 13, 107-61; and host country Japan, 103-71, on Aug. 15.

■ Russell (6.3 rpg.) and Nared (5.0) were the team's top two rebounders on a 12-player roster with minutes distributed evenly.

■ Nared averaged 7.3 points per game, shooting 44 percent from the field, 33 percent on threes and 75 percent from the free throw line.

■ Russell tossed in 5.3 points per contest, shooting a team-leading 64 percent from the field.

■ It marked Russell's fourth appearance internationally with USA Basketball, while Nared enjoyed her first experience.

SENIORS DEVELOP LEADERSHIP SKILLS

■ Seniors Mercedes Russell and Jaime Nared had opportunities during the offseason to develop their leadership skills.

■ Nared capped a year of membership in the VOLEaders Academy with a leadership trip to Vietnam this summer, where UT student-athletes worked with children in orphanages, volunteered at sport skill camps and visited with university students.

■ The VOLEaders Academy, a first-of-its-kind program, is a dynamic partnership between the

UT Center for Leadership and Service, the Center for Sport, Peace and Society and the Tennessee Athletics Department.

■ Now in its second year, the program aims to inspire student-athletes to find ways to use their passion of sport and their influence to enact positive change that transcends their athletic success.

■ Russell, meanwhile, was one of 68 SEC student-athletes participating in a joint meeting of the SEC Student-Athlete Leadership Councils and the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) in July.

■ This marked the first joint meeting of these groups since they were introduced by Commissioner Greg Sankey in 2016. Leadership councils for the sports of football and men's and women's basketball were created to provide student-athletes with additional opportunities to engage with campus leaders and conference office staff.

ALWAYS A CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

■ Tennessee's 2017-18 regular-season schedule will include 21 of 29 games vs. teams that saw postseason action a year ago.

■ Sixteen of those games are vs. 2017 NCAA Tournament teams, including NCAA national champion South Carolina (home and away), NCAA runner-up Mississippi State (home) and a third Final Four team in Stanford (away).

■ UT will play three defending regular-season league champions in South Carolina (SEC), Notre Dame (ACC) and Central Arkansas (Southland) during the 2016-17.

■ The Lady Vols must face seven defending conference tourney champs in South Carolina (SEC), Notre Dame (ACC), Central Arkansas (Southland), Stanford (Pac-12), Marquette (BIG EAST), Long Beach State (Big West) and Troy (Sun Belt).

■ Tennessee opens the season with seven of its first 10 games at home and the other three taking place in the Riviera Division at the Cancun Challenge in Mexico Nov. 23-25.

■ UT made its second in-season trip outside the U.S. during the Holly Warlick era and third overall, winning the Cancun Challenge Riviera Tournament with a 3-0 record. UT went 2-0 to win the Lucaya Division championship at the Junkanoo Jam at Freeport, Bahamas, during the 2013-14 season and went 3-0 during a tour of Italy during the summer of 2015.

■ UT will have 15 televised games, including seven on ESPN networks, seven on the SEC Network and another on the Pac-12 Networks. The other 14 games will be streamed live by various entities, including 11 of them on SECN+.

SIX MCDONALD'S A-As ON ROSTER

■ Tennessee has six McDonald's All-Americans on its 2017-18 roster.

■ Those players are seniors Jaime Nared and Mercedes Russell as well as freshmen RENNIA DAVIS, Anastasia Hayes, Kasiyahna Kushkituah and Evina Westbrook.

■ This is the first time an entire Lady Vol signing class consisted only of McDonald's All-Americans.

■ The total of four McDonald's honorees ranks behind only the five in the 2004 and 2008 classes.

■ Russell was the 2013 McDonald's Game MVP, leading the West to victory with 16 points.

■ Nared led the West to a win in 2014 with 15 points but came up just short in MVP voting.

■ Davis, Hayes and Kushkituah helped the East defeat Westbrook's West squad, 80-74, in Chicago on March 29, 2017.

■ Tennessee now has had 31 McDonald's All-Americans on its rosters through the years.

■ Holly Warlick has signed nine McDonald's All-Americans as head coach and added another via transfer for 10 in her sixth season as head coach.

LADY VOL LEGEND JOINS STAFF

■ Women's Basketball Hall of Famer Bridgette Gordon, who helped Tennessee capture the first two of its eight NCAA titles as a student-athlete, returned to her alma mater as an assistant on July 20, 2017.

■ Gordon, a 1988 U.S. Olympic gold medalist with 15 years of experience in the coaching ranks, came to Rocky Top from Wichita State, where she spent seven seasons, including the last three as the recruiting coordinator.

■ Gordon, who served as associate head coach a year ago, helped WSU land the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history when Blue Star Basketball rated the 2012-13 signing group at No. 47 in the nation.

■ In addition to her work as a gifted recruiter, Gordon helped the Shockers make their first three appearances ever in the NCAA Tournament while capturing the program's first three regular- and post-season conference championships. The Shockers advanced to postseason play five times during her stint in Wichita.

■ Prior to her role at WSU (2010-17), Gordon was an assistant and recruiting coordinator at Georgia State (2007-10) and at Stetson (2001-06) as well as serving as a WNBA scout in 2006-07.

UT SAYS GOODBYE TO FIVE PLAYERS

■ UT lost 2016-17 starting guards Jordan Reynolds (WNBA 2nd Round) and Diamond DeShields (signed pro contract in June) as well as reserve forward Schaquilla Nunn (WNBA 3rd Round) to the professional ranks.

■ Guard Alexa Middleton and redshirt sophomore guard Te'a Cooper are no longer with the program. Cooper missed all of last season with a knee injury after averaging 8.6 ppg. as a freshman in 2015-16.

■ DeShields was a two-time All-SEC performer and the team's leading scorer at 17.4 points per game a year ago.

■ Reynolds averaged 7.0 points, 5.2 rebounds and 4.5 assists starting at point guard, leading the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.7).

■ Nunn averaged 4.8 points and 4.4 rebounds in 32 games after transferring from Winthrop.

■ Middleton played in 32 games, starting 13, and averaged 7.9 points and 2.3 rebounds while hitting 42 three-points last season.

UT CONTINUES WNBA PIPELINE

■ Jordan Reynolds and Schaquilla Nunn became the 43rd and 44th Tennessee Lady Volunteers to become WNBA players.

■ Reynolds was taken with the 19th pick of the second round by the Atlanta Dream, while Nunn was chosen 25th overall in the third round by the San Antonio Stars during the April 2017 draft.

■ They became the 38th and 39th players in UT history and the seventh and eighth coached by Holly Warlick to be drafted by a WNBA team.

■ Warlick's draftees include Reynolds and Nunn (2017), Bashaara Graves (2016), Cierra Burdick, Isabelle Harrison and Ariel Massengale (2015), Meighan Simmons (2014) and Kamiko Williams (2013).

■ Diamond DeShields, a 2017 graduate, signed with a professional team in Turkey, while 2016 graduate Nia Moore signed with a team in Poland.

LADY VOLS HAVE WON 35 SEC TITLES

■ Tennessee has won a combined total of 35 SEC Championships, claiming its 18th all-time SEC regular-season title in 2014-15.

■ That regular season co-championship came on the heels of Tennessee's SEC Tournament title during the 2013-14 campaign.

■ The Lady Vols have won SEC regular-season

championships in four of the past eight seasons.

■ UT has 17 league tournament titles to its credit, including three straight from 2010 to 2012 and four of the last eight.

■ Since 1985, there have been only seven seasons where Tennessee didn't win at least a regular season or tournament title. Those came in 1986, 1987, 1991, 1997, 2009, 2016 and 2017.

■ The Lady Vols have swept SEC regular-season and tournament championships on eight occasions. Those years included 1980, 1985, 1994, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2010 and 2011.

■ Tennessee stands first in regular season and tournament titles in conference history with Georgia ranking second with seven regular season trophies and Vanderbilt standing sixth in tourney hardware with six pieces.

LADY VOLS EARN POSTSEASON ACCLAIM

■ The SEC coaches postseason awards were announced on February 28, and each member of Tennessee's "Big Three" was voted to the 2017 Coaches All-SEC Team.

■ Redshirt junior Diamond DeShields garnered first-team accolades, while junior Jaime Nared and redshirt junior Mercedes Russell were selected to the second team. This marked the first time any of the trio had been selected to the coaches all-conference squad.

■ When the WBCA announced its 2017 All-America Team, DeShields and Russell were awarded honorable mention honors.

■ The AP named DeShields and Russell to its All-SEC Second Team.

■ Senior Jordan Reynolds represented the Lady Vols on the SEC's Community Service Team.

■ Nared was named SEC Co-Player of the Week on January 31 after posting a then career-high 27 points to go with five rebounds, three assists and three steals as the Lady Vols upset #4 South Carolina in Columbia.

■ Russell earned SEC Player of the Week honors on Jan. 3 after averaging a double-double of 21.0 points and 10.0 rebounds to help UT stretch its winning streak to five games.

SIX MAKE SEC ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

■ UT had six on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

■ The group included Diamond DeShields, Kortney Dunbar, Jordan Reynolds and Mercedes Russell, as well as newcomers redshirt senior Schaquilla Nunn and freshman Kamera Harris.

UT ONE OF THREE WITH FOUR TOP-10 WINS

■ Tennessee was one of only three teams during the 2016-17 regular season last year to beat four or more top-10 teams, and UT was unranked in all four wins.

■ Included are wins over two top-5 teams, marking the first time the Lady Vols have done that in a season since 2004-05 (two also).

■ The Lady Vols came from 11-down to defeat #10/10 Stanford in Knoxville on Dec. 18 (59-51). UT came from 15-down (14 in the third quarter) to beat #6/6 Notre Dame in Knoxville on Jan. 16 (71-69). UT also came from nine down to defeat #4/4 South Carolina in Columbia on Jan. 30 (76-74) and cruised past #3/2 Mississippi State on Senior Day in Starkville on Feb. 26 (82-64).

■ The other teams accomplishing that feat were South Carolina (5) and UConn (4).

■ UT's victory over #3/2 Mississippi State on Feb. 26 was the highest ranked team the Lady Vols have beaten since #6/6 UT defeated #3/2 Stanford in Knoxville, 82-72 in overtime, on Dec. 19, 2010.

■ The victory over #3/2 MSU was the highest ranked squad Tennessee has beaten in a true road game since #2/2 UT took down #1/1 Duke at

Cameron Indoor Stadium on Jan. 24, 2004.

■ The win over Notre Dame ended a six-game losing skid to the Fighting Irish. With victories over South Carolina and Mississippi State, the Lady Vols halted a pair of three-game losing streaks to their conference foes.

20 WINS IN 41 STRAIGHT SEASONS

■ UT finished with 20 wins in 2016-17, which was the 41st consecutive season the Lady Vols had reached the 20-victory plateau.

UT HAS MADE ALL 36 NCAA BRACKETS

■ UT is the only team to have played in all 36 NCAA Division I women's basketball tournaments.

■ The Lady Vols are 124-28 all-time in NCAA play, making the Elite Eight in three of the past five seasons.

■ UT has been to 34 Sweet 16s, 28 Elite Eights and 18 NCAA Final Fours in 36 seasons of NCAA play.

■ The Big Orange program ranks second in NCAA Division I women's basketball with eight national championships (1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007, 2008).

In year six at the helm of Tennessee women's basketball, Holly Warlick has built a very impressive résumé in her young head coaching career. Her worksheet contains accomplishments few coaches have achieved in their entire careers, much less as first-time head coaches.

Those successes verify that Warlick was the right choice to take the reins at Tennessee and that she and her staff have the acumen to run a championship program. A disciple of the legendary Pat Summitt, Warlick has maintained the core values of her former coach, co-worker and friend while at the same time employing her own personality, style and competitive energy to coach today's players.

Whether as an All-America player from 1976-80, an assistant and associate head coach for 27 seasons from 1985 to 2012, or head coach from 2012 to present, Warlick has thrived during her more than three decades in the spotlight at Rocky Top. She enters her sixth year as head coach and 37th season of overall affiliation with the program hoping to build upon last season's NCAA Second Round finish.

Warlick was announced as head coach of the Lady Vols on April 18, 2012, as women's hoops legend Pat Summitt stepped into the role of head coach emeritus. In a touching and symbolic gesture the following day at a press conference announcing the changes, Summitt presented her coaching whistle to her long-time aide and former floor general.

Since that day, Warlick and her staff have worked tirelessly to maintain the program's lofty expectations. Despite being picked to finish as low as fifth in the SEC and 20th nationally, her first squad won the 2013 SEC regular season title and made the NCAA Elite Eight, finishing 27-8/14-2 despite injuries that forced players to miss a combined 53 games. Her 2014 edition went 29-6/13-3, winning an SEC Tournament title and making it to the NCAA Sweet 16.

In 2015, her third team reached the 30-win plateau at 30-6/15-1, claiming a share of the regular-season SEC crown and charting the second NCAA Elite Eight appearance in her three seasons. Her last two units have finished 22-14 and 20-12, advancing to the NCAA Elite Eight and Second Round, respectively.

During Warlick's first five seasons, eight Lady Vols have been taken in the WNBA Draft. Jordan Reynolds (2nd Rd.) and Schaquilla Nunn (2nd Rd.) were selected in 2017; Bashaara Graves (2nd Rd.)

went in 2016; Isabelle Harrison (1st Rd.), Cierra Burdick (2nd Rd.) and Ariel Massengale (3rd Rd.) were chosen in 2015; Mercedes Simmons (3rd Rd.) was taken in 2014 and Kamiko Williams (2nd Rd.) was selected in 2013. Simmons was twice named SEC Player of the Year (2013, 2014) during her UT career.

On the international scene, Warlick is a gold medal coach, and two of her players joined her in earning that hardware. Warlick served as an assistant, while Mercedes Russell and Diamond DeShields played on the undefeated (6-0) 2015 USA World University Games Team in South Korea.

From 2012-17, Tennessee also has produced in the classroom, with 15 players earning a total of 32 spots on the SEC Academic Honor Roll. In 2015, Cierra Burdick became Warlick's first CoSIDA Academic All-American, garnering second-team honors and also being named a UT Torchbearer, the most prestigious accolade a student at Tennessee can receive.

Warlick has been recognized personally for her performance. In 2013, members of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association named her the Spalding Maggie Dixon Division I Rookie Coach of the Year. She was selected by the AP and league coaches as the 2013 SEC Women's Basketball Coach of the Year, and members of the Tennessee Sports Writers Association also chose her as TSWA Women's Basketball Coach of the Year that season.

In May 2017, Warlick was recognized for her years of distinguished leadership, volunteer activities, philanthropic work and professional accomplishments that have contributed to improving the quality of life in Tennessee. She was named the 2017 Tennessee Woman of Distinction at the 32nd annual Chattanooga Women of Distinction Awards luncheon.

Warlick and her staff also continue to build for the future on the recruiting trail. They have welcomed 10 McDonald's All-Americans in five signing classes (through spring 2017) and feature two of the top players in the 2013 (Mercedes Russell, No. 1) and 2014 (Jaime Nared, No. 6) signing classes. All four members of the No. 1-ranked 2017 signing class were McDonald's All-Americans, including the No. 2 player in Evina Westbrook and the No. 7 rated standout in Anastasia Hayes.

After Warlick helped shape the direction of Lady Vol basketball as an assistant on Summitt's staff for more than a quarter of a century, the pupil took on greater responsibility and oversaw daily supervision of the basketball office during the 2011-12 season. She also handled a large measure of the media obligations after Summitt's Aug. 23, 2011, announcement regarding the diagnosis of early onset dementia, "Alzheimer's type."

Providing an excellent example of how people rally around each other, the Tennessee staff members pulled together remarkably in the face of that adversity. The end result was a 27-9 overall record, an SEC Tournament Championship and advancement to the NCAA Regional Final.

It's worth noting that Warlick was by Summitt's side, either as a player or an assistant, for 949 of the coach's NCAA-record 1,098 wins and all eight NCAA National Championships. Her value to the program has been evident for some time, as she had held the role of associate head coach since the 2005-06 campaign.

The WBCA also recognized Warlick's contributions to Tennessee's success through the years, naming Warlick the nation's top assistant coach after she helped lead UT to its seventh national title in 2007. The NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches also recognized Warlick as one of the nation's top assistants in 1998, ranking her prominently in The Women's Basketball Journal poll.

In addition to the NCAA title and coaching honor in 2007, Warlick also teamed up for the first

time with former fellow Lady Vol player and assistant Nikki (Caldwell) Fargas, the current head coach at LSU, to pursue her other passion. That pursuit is riding a motorcycle and raising money for the fight against breast cancer.

Warlick and Fargas created the Champions For A Cause Foundation, a long haul motorcycle ride dedicated to raising funds and awareness for a cure for breast cancer. The charitable organization has raised and donated more than \$150,000. Past trips include the inaugural ride from San Francisco to Knoxville as well as trips from the Badlands to Las Vegas and from Knoxville to Key West, Fla., New Orleans, Niagara Falls and, most recently in 2013 and 2014, Panama City, Fla.

On Feb. 10, 2008, Warlick and Fargas presented a \$10,000 check to the late N.C. State Head Coach Kay Yow and the Kay Yow/WBCA Cancer Fund. At Tennessee's "Live Pink, Bleed Orange" game vs. Vanderbilt on Feb. 17, 2013, three checks worth \$15,000 were presented by Champions for a Cause to the UT Breast Health Outreach Program, Kay Yow Cancer Foundation and the Brady James Foundation to help raise money for breast cancer research. Those presentations to organizations have become an annual event, thanks to fundraising efforts and the generosity of many.

Warlick also presented a special pink basketball to her sister, Marion Ferrill, prior to the start of that game in 2013. Ferrill was diagnosed with breast cancer in the fall of 2012 and was pronounced cancer free on Sept. 30 after undergoing surgery shortly after her diagnosis.

With all of her accomplishments in coaching and in her charitable endeavors, it might be easy to overlook the fact that Warlick left just as powerful a mark on women's hoops as a player at UT.

It doesn't seem that long ago that the charismatic Knoxville native was flying up and down the court as an All-America Lady Vol point guard.

For more than three decades, Warlick has been considered the finest point guard ever to play for the Lady Vols. In addition to being selected to the CONVERSE/Lady Vol Team of the Decade for the 1980s in January of 1994, five different halls of fame opened their doors to her.

WARLICK RANKS AMONG THE NATION'S TOP COACHES

On Feb. 27, 2004, she was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame. In October 2002, she became a member of the University of Tennessee Lady Vol Hall of Fame in the second class of inductees. In June 2001, the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame selected Warlick as one of 10 inductees enshrined into the Hall for the Class of 2001. For the hometown girl, who grew up in the Rocky Hill section of Knoxville and graduated from Bearden High School, it was a dream-come-true.

In the summer of 1994, Warlick gained admission to her first hall of fame. She was honored as one of the City of Knoxville's finest all-time athletes with her inclusion in the Greater Knoxville Sports Hall of Fame.

Including the 2016-17 season, Warlick has invested 36 years in the program, having helped shape UT into a national powerhouse with tenure as both a player and a coach. Warlick's expertise and major contributions to the team as an assistant came from her work with the guards. Simmons, Ariel Massengale, Shekinna Stricklen, Kara Lawson, Angie Bjorklund and Shanna Zolman are just a few of the successful players Warlick helped recruit and coach as an assistant coach.

Warlick's association with the Lady Vols started in 1976 when she joined the program as a scholarship 400-meter track athlete who ended up walking on to the basketball team. Soon, she would become the most prolific player in the history of Tennessee Lady Vol basketball.

Warlick was the first player in Tennessee athletics (men or women) to have her jersey retired (number 22) at the end of her career in 1980. Bearden, her prep alma mater in Knoxville, retired Warlick's high school jersey (also No. 22) prior to a home football game on Oct. 26, 2012.

Known as a play-making wiz during her four years as UT's point guard, Warlick was once tabbed the "best player in the South." As a rookie, Warlick helped lead the Lady Vols to their first Final Four appearance in school history in 1977. She had no trouble adjusting her enthusiasm and knowledge of the game into the coaching role.

In 19 of the past 36 years Warlick has been affiliated with UT, she has found herself at the Final Four as a player (1977, 1979, 1980) or as a coach (1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008). Her best Final Four showing as a player was national championship runner-up in her senior sea-

son. As a coach, she has helped the Lady Vols grab the brass ring all eight times (1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).

A three-time All-American while playing for Summitt from 1976-80, Warlick previously held UT records for most assists in a game (14), most steals in a contest (nine), most assists in a season (225) and most games in a career (142). She continues to hold the Lady Vol single-season steals record with 141 in 1978-79.

Warlick possesses vast international playing experience as well. In addition to being a member of the 1980 U.S. Olympic Team, which did not compete in the Moscow Olympics, Warlick and the 1980 U.S. team won gold at the 1980 FIBA Olympic Qualifying Tournament.

She also captured a gold medal playing for the USA at the 1979 FIBA World Championship, marking the first gold medal for the USA at the FIBA World Championships since 1957 and breaking a streak of five-straight golds by the USSR, a silver medal at the 1979 Pan American Games and gold at the 1979 R. William Jones Cup. Additionally, she served as a player representative on the USA BASKETBALL council and was a member of the USOC Advisory Council for Basketball.

In recognition of being a former Olympian, Warlick earned the distinct honor of running the Olympic torch through Knoxville as it made its way to the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Ga.

Post-collegiately, she was a WPBL All-Star, leading the Nebraska Wranglers to the championship of the Women's Professional Basketball League in 1981.

Prior to joining the Tennessee staff for the 1985-86 season, Warlick gained experience at two other stops on the coaching circuit. She was an assistant coach at Virginia Tech from 1981-83 and an assistant from 1983-85 at Nebraska.

A native of Knoxville, Warlick earned her B.S. in marketing from Tennessee in 1981 and her master's degree in athletic administration from Virginia Tech in 1983. Warlick added "biker" to her vitae in 2001. To commemorate her induction into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, a number of Warlick's friends got together and presented her with a Harley-Davidson "Sportster" motorcycle. Just six years later, Warlick already was using her love of the bike towards a greater cause, establishing the Champions For A Cause Foundation with Fargas.
