QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is in its 44th season of varsity women's basketball with a 791-518 (.604) all-time record.
- The Wildcats have had great success in Memorial Coliseum, sitting at 436-152 (.741) overall in the historic building, including a 146-23 (.863) mark under head coach Matthew Mitchell.
- UK enters Sunday's game on a two-game losing skid, falling on the road last weekend at Florida
 Gulf Coast and Miami (Fla.), who both have been receiving votes a majority of the season in the
 USA Today/Coaches Top 25. The losses ended a stretch of five games in 11 days for the Wildcats,
 who went 2-3 during that stretch with all three losses coming on the road to teams that have
 been or are currently ranked/receiving votes in the national polls.
- The Wildcats are also in the middle of stretch where eight straight opponents are either ranked/receiving votes or have been ranked/receiving votes this season. The stretch includes at FGCU (rv), at Miami (rv), vs. No. 3/4 Louisville, No. 24/rv Cal, at MTSU (rv), vs. No. 7/7 Tennessee and at No. 19/22 Texas A&M. UK is 0-1 vs. ranked foes this season, falling at top-10 ranked Baylor.
- Maci Morris has hit a team-best 30 3-pointers this season, which ranks her high nationally. Morris' 30 total 3s hit rank her 24th in the nation and first in the SEC, while her 53.6 percent from long range this season ranks her fifth best nationally and first in the league.
- Morris is making her way up the all-time 3-point field goals made list at Kentucky. The native of Pineville, Ky., has hit 132 career 3s which ranks her seventh all-time in UK history. Morris needs 30 more to tie Jenny Pfeiffer (2003-07) for sixth all-time. Morris recently hit nine straight 3 attempts, going 3-for-3 in the second half vs. Baylor, 2-for-2 vs. TTU and 4-for-her-first-4 vs. UE.

QUICK NOTES CONTINUED...

- Taylor Murray rank fourth in the SEC in assist-turnover ratio (2.5) and 10th in the league in total assists with 40. Murray is an impressive 38-of-43 from the free-throw line this season, which rank her 38th in the nation and first in the league at 88.4 percent.
- UK is 27th nationally as a team and first in the SEC with a 1.28 assist-turnover ratio. The Wildcats are also 29th in the nation and first in the SEC in 3-point field goal percentage at 38.7 percent and 14th in the nation and second in the SEC in fewest turnovers per game at 12.5.
- Kentucky is hitting 7.0 3s per game this season. If that hot shooting continues, the Wildcats will come
 close to breaking the school record for 3s in a season. The 2012-13 team hit a program-record 240 3s.
- Kentucky started the season with a 6-0 record for the first time since the 2015-16 season when UK began the year 11-0. This was the fifth time UK started a season 6-0 under Mitchell and the ninth such start in program history.
- Matthew Mitchell became the all-time winningest head coach in Kentucky women's basketball history
 in March of 2013 with his 139th win at UK. He is one win away from his 250th at Kentucky. Including
 the storied history of the UK men's basketball program, he would become the fifth Kentucky Basketball
 head coach to win 250 games with the Wildcats joining Adolph Rupp, Joe B Hall, Tubby Smith and John
 Calipari.
- Kentucky's offense has been very efficient to start the season. UK is hitting 44.1 percent from the field and 38.7 percent from long range. The Wildcats are averaging 75.9 points per game and have a 1.3 assist-turnover ratio.
- UK has scored 80 or more points four time this season, including 100+ twice. The Wildcats have scored 100+ points 18 times under Matthew Mitchell with a 18-0 record in those games. This was the first time since 2013-14 that UK has scored 100+ points in at least two of its first nine games.
- All 13 eligible Wildcats this season have not only played but scored this season. That is the most players to score in a game for a UK team since 2012-13.
- Kentucky has played 11 or more players in every game but four this season, including 12 or more in five games. The Wildcats have had a balance scoring attack as six of its first nine games saw 10 or more players score a point.
- The Wildcats showed their potential for an explosive offense in the season opener vs. Sacramento State
 by scoring a program-record 31 first-quarter points before breaking that record with 35 first-quarter
 points against Evansville. The 35 points scored is the most in any quarter for UK since the new four-quarter program was created in 2015-16.
- Conversely, against Gardner-Webb the Wildcats showed they can play some elite defense, limiting the Bulldogs to just 34 points in the game, including four points in both the second quarter and fourth quarter. GWU hit only one field goal in the fourth quarter.
- Kentucky went on two separate 19-0 runs against Gardner-Webb and have been on nine runs of 10-0 or
 more this season while only allowing opponents to go on four such runs. UK started the Evansville game
 with a 19-0 run.
- The Wildcats had an impressive two-game road trip out west posting wins over Montana and Washington State, who was receiving votes in the preseason AP Top 25. The Wildcats used a come-frombehind effort in both games, sitting tied with Montana at halftime before outscoring the Lady Griz 44-27 in the second half to earn the win. UK had its slowest start of the season at Washington State, falling behind by 11 points in the second quarter after starting ice cold from the field. It was a different story late in the second quarter and the rest of the game, as UK erased a 11-point deficit to have a 10 point lead late in the third period thanks to hitting seven combined 3s in the second and third periods combined. UK's defense came through late at Washington State as the Wildcats had two steals late in the game that helped build up a 73-68 win.
- Junior forward Ogechi Anyagaligbo will miss the 2017-18 season due to sustaining a torn ACL in Kentucky's exhibition game vs. Southern Indiana.
- Kentucky has won 71 consecutive regular-season non-conference games in Memorial Coliseum, dating back to Dec. 19, 2008 vs. Alabama A&M. The Wildcats are 6-0 in non-conference games inside Memorial Coliseum this season.
- For the eighth straight year, UK began its season ranked or receiving votes inside in the USA Today/ Coaches' and AP Preseason Top 25, receiving votes in both listings. The Wildcats' highest ranking this season was No. 20 in the AP Top 25 and No. 23 in the USA Today/Coaches Top 25. Currently, UK is receiving votes in both listings.
- Kentucky is 0-1 this season against ranked opponents. UK is scheduled to play 10 more games against teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national rankings.

- In 44 years of varsity women's basketball, Kentucky has 88 wins over ranked opponents, including 47 of those wins coming under Mitchell.
- UK is scheduled to play three regular season games inside Rupp Arena this year for the first time since the 2007-08 season when UK played five games inside the historic building.

SERIES HISTORY VS. LOUISVILLE

- Kentucky owns a 34-19 all-time record against Louisville in women's basketball, including a 22-4 mark in games played in Lexington. This is the first time the two teams have met in Memorial Coliseum since UK posted a 74-54 victory over the Cards on Dec. 4, 2011.
- Louisville has not defeated Kentucky in Lexington since earning a 80-65 victory over the Wildcats on Dec.
 20, 2007 in Rupp Arena. The Cardinals have not defeated Kentucky in Memorial Coliseum since a 68-67 victory over the Wildcats on Feb. 6, 1979.
- The Wildcats have won five of the last six meetings in the series.

SERIES HISTORY VS. CURRENT ALIGNMENT OF THE ACC

- Kentucky holds a 52-39 all-time record against teams from the current alignment of the Atlantic Coast Conference. Miami (Fla.) is the second straight ACC opponent UK has play. The Wildcats lost at Miami (Fla.) on Dec. 10.
- UK's record against teams from the ACC: 0-1 vs. Clemson, 2-6 vs. Duke, 1-0 Florida State, 34-19 vs. Louisville, 6-2 vs. Miami (Fla.), 0-5 vs. North Carolina, 2-3 vs. NC State, 1-1 vs. Notre Dame, 1-0 vs. Pitt, 3-0 vs Syracuse, 1-1 vs. Virginia Tech, 1-1 vs. Wake Forest.

LAST TIME VS. LOUISVILLE

- Makayla Epps had 22 points, 16 rebounds and six assists, but No. 17 Kentucky came up just short, falling to seventh-ranked Louisville 69-67 in overtime on Sunday, Dec. 4 2016 at the KFC/Yum! Center. Taylor Murray had a career-high 21 points in the game for the Wildcats and Maci Morris added 10 as Kentucky lost to Louisville for the first time in six years.
- Kentucky shot 42.1 percent from the floor in the game, but the Wildcats committed 19 turnovers and lost the battle of the boards 49-40.
- Kentucky had a pair of chances to win at the end of regulation, but Epps missed a jumper with five seconds
 left. Louisville got the rebound and called a timeout with 4.2 seconds left. The ensuing inbound pass was
 stolen by Alyssa Rice who got the ball to Epps, but her 3-pointer at the buzzer hit the front of the rim and
 bounded away, sending the game to overtime.
- Louisville got off to a fast start in overtime when Asia Durr hit a three-pointer and Myisha Hines-Allen made a jumper, giving the Cardinals a 61-56 edge. The Cards would not look back, earning the two-point win.

SCOUTING LOUISVILLE

- Louisville enters Sunday's game with a perfect 12-0 record, earning three wins already over ranked opponents. The Cardinals have defeated No. 5 Ohio State, No. 24 Michigan and No. 10 Oregon. UofL has one win over an SEC team already this season, taking down Vanderbilt, 79-57, on Dec. 7 in the KFC YUM!
- Most recently, Louisville defeated Tennessee State, 92-56, on Dec. 12 inside the KFC YUM! Center with seven different players scoring in double figures. The Cardinals shot 54.3 percent from the field, 47.1 percent from long range and outrebounded TSU, 52-31.
- Asia Durr is the leading scorer for the Cardinals this season averaging 17.8 points per game. Durr is hitting
 44.8 percent of her shots, including 46.1 percent (35-of-17) from 3. Myisha Hines-Allen is averaging 13.1
 points per game with 9.3 rebounds per game, while Jazmine Jones is posting 9.8 points and 4.8 rebounds
 per game. Dana Evans has a team-best 52 assists this season to go along with a team-high 23 steals.
- As a squad, the Cardinals are hitting 50.4 percent from the field, 40.0 percent from 3 and averaging 84.4
 points per game, while opponents are scoring just 55.3 points per game. UofL has a +11.7 rebounding
 margin and a +5.8 turnover margin.

2017-18 GAME NOTES

CATS SHOWING POTENTIAL FOR HIGH-POWERED OFFENSE

The Kentucky offense has shown it has a chance to have a high-powered offense this season, scoring 70+ points in every game but four, including 80 or more points four times. Kentucky's best offensive showings have come against Sacramento State and Evansville. The Wildcats scored a season-best 101 points against Sacramento State, including a then-program record 31 first-quarter points. That record was broken against Evansville as UK scored 35 first-quarter points. The 35 points vs. UE is the most points scored in a quarter for UK since going to the four-quarter format in 2015-16.

The Wildcats' have scored 100 or more points twice this season in just nine games, marking the first time UK has done that to start a season since 2013-14. This was only the second time under Matthew Mitchell that UK has scored 100+ twice in its first nine games. Kentucky has scored 100+ under Mitchell 18 times and sit 18-0 in those games.

Kentucky has hit 41.3% from the field or better in every game but three this season, including 50 percent from the field against Sacrament State, 56.4 percent from the field against Morehead State and a season-best 57.1 percent from the field against Evansville. For the season, UK is hitting 44.1 from the field, which ranks 62nd nationally and seventh in the SEC .

UK has not shot the ball as well on the road. Against top-10 ranked Baylor, UK hit a then season-low 32.2% from the field. UK also struggled from the field against both FGCU and Miami. The Wildcats shot just 39.4 percent from the field against the Eagles and a season-low 31.7 percent against the Hurricanes. In all three of UK's losses the Cats have shot under 40 percent from the field and scores less than 65 points. The Cats are 8-0 this season when they score 65 or more points and shoot better than 40 percent from the field.

MITCHELL'S DEFENSIVE FUNDAMENTALS PAYING OFF

You don't have to spend too much time around Matthew Mitchell to understand his importance on defensive fundamentals. So far this season, the Wildcats have showed they aren't where they need to be but are improving every day. UK's best defensive performance came against Gardner-Webb, limiting the Running' Bulldogs to just 34 points on 14-of-55 shooting in a 72-34 win inside Memorial Coliseum. UK was also strong defensively against Marshall, limiting the Herd to just 29.8% from the field on 14-of-47 shooting. Marshall did not make a field goal in the fourth quarter. UK limited Tennessee Tech to just 33.3 percent from the field and posted a season-best 9 blocks.

HOME SWEET HOME

Kentucky is playing its best basketball this season inside Memorial Coliseum. The Wildcats are 6-0 at home this year and have some impressive offensive and defensive numbers. In its six home games, UK is averaging 85.0 points per game, hitting 49.1 percent from the field, 42.3 percent from 3, outrebounding teams by 15.2 rebounds per game, have a 1.9 assist-turnover ratio and +6.0 turnover margin. Defensively, UK is limiting opponents to just 52.0 points per game, 32.8 percent from the field and 25.3 percent from 3.

GUARDS TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

UK's guard have showed great ball control this season as Taylor Murray and Jaida Roper have combined to play 574 minutes over 11 games and only committed 34 turnovers. Murray has played 334 minutes and has 16 turnovers, while Roper has played 240 minutes and has 18 turnovers. Murray has an assist-turnover ratio of 2.5, which ranks 51st nationally and fourth in the SEC. Roper's 1.8 assist-turnover ratio ranks 138th nationally and 10th in the SEC. UK ranks 27th nationally and first in the SEC in assist-turnover ratio at 1.28. Murray has four games this season without a turnover, while she has one or less in six games.

ITS RAINING 3S

Kentucky returned 76.9% of its 3-point production from last season and a large part of that is due to junior guard Maci Morris and senior guard Makenzie Cann. Their strong shooting and the continued development of other players on the team has UK on pace for a monster season from long range.

Morris is 30-for-56 from 3 this season, which ranks 24th nationally and first in the SEC in total 3s hit and fifth in the nation and first in the SEC in 3-point percentage. Cann is 19-for-49 for 38.8 percent and has hit a 3 in every game but two this season. In all, eight Wildcats have hit a 3 this season. Murray is 8-for-22 for 36.4 percent, while Roper is 7-for-19 for 36.8 percent.

The Wildcats are on pace to get close to breaking the school record for 3s hit in a season. Currently, UK has 77 made 3s through 11 games, averaging 7.0 3s per game. If that per game average continued through UK's 30 game regular-season schedule the Wildcats would hit 210 3-pointers. The school record for 3s made in a season is 240 by the 2012-13 team. UK has hit eight or more 3s in five games, including a season-best 11 against Baylor.

Kentucky's 169 3-pointers made last season ranked sixth most in a season in UK history. The top six 3s hit in a season have all occurred under Matthew Mitchell.

CATS GOT BETTER IN LOSS AT NO. 9 BAYLOR

Although the Kentucky women's basketball team didn't get the result it wanted in a 63-90 loss at No. 9 Baylor, Coach Mitchell and Maci Morris both talked postgame about how the team got better and will improve even from the loss.

"Congrats to Baylor. They are a tremendous team," Mitchell said. "This was a very difficult game for us. Everything didn't show up in the game tonight, but it will eventually. What we have to do is go back and look at what are the areas that we can control and correct those. We didn't keep our poise like I know we will at the end of the season, but our players prepared to win. They worked hard and had a great attitude. We lost down here a few years back worse than this and ended up going to the Elite Eight. My spirits are high on this team because they come to work every day. We are going to be a really good basketball team. I believe in our players. I believe in their character."

The loss Mitchell is speaking about was a 85-51 setback to Baylor in November 2012. That 2012-13 Kentucky team ended up making it to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight after earning a No. 2 seed and finished with 30 wins.

"I told the team as soon as we got into the locker room that we got better today, even though we lost," Morris said. "I saw a lot of good things, especially how we battled in the fourth quarter."

COMEBACK CATS STRIKE IN PULLMAN

Kentucky erased a 11-point deficit in the second quarter to earn a hard-fought, come-from-behind victory at Washington State on Nov. 19. UK trailed by 11 with 3:26 left in the second quarter before Makenzie Cann hit three 3s in UK's next four possessions to help cut the lead to 35-34 at halftime. In the second half, junior Maci Morris answered the call scoring 17 points to power the Wildcats to the win. Cann ended the game with her first career double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds, while Taylor Murray had 13 points, eight assists and seven rebounds. The 11-point comeback tied the 12th largest come-from-behind victory in the Mitchell era at UK.

UK's defense came up big late in the game. After a jumper by Amanda Paschal with just over two minutes to go, Alyssa Rice got a big-time block and was fouled on the ensuing possession. After Rice made 1-of-2 from the free-throw line, Morris came up with a huge steal near midcourt and was fouled making both foul shots to give UK a three-point lead. Taylor Murray followed suit with a steal at midcourt again to give UK another possession. The Wildcats iced the game after two free throws from Cann with 7 seconds to go after a missed 3 by Washington State. Paschal was huge in the game, playing 15 minutes going 4-of-7 from the field for a career-best eight points. She also added three assists and three rebounds.

CATS PASS FIRST TRUE-ROAD TEST AT MONTANA

Matthew Mitchell got exactly what he wanted out of Kentucky's first true road test of the season: a victo-

ry and a test. After Montana took its only lead of the game in the second quarter and a loud crowd got into the game the Wildcats were staring down a tough road ahead. But after evening the score going into the break, UK outscored Montana 44-27 in the second half to earn the win. The road win was important for the Wildcats, who did not have success on the road early last season. Kentucky didn't earn its first true-road win last season until Jan. 12 against Alabama going 0-5 before that in true road tests.

TOP TO BOTTOM SCORING

With five newcomers on the squad Matthew Mitchell knew before the season started that depth was going to be to his advantage this season after having a short bench the past two years. So far he has been correct. With 13 eligible players on the team - including five that have played in their first career games this season - UK has shown it has a balanced scoring attack with all 13 players already seeing playing time and scoring at least one point. Having 13 players score a point in a season is the most players to score at least one point in a season for the Wildcats since the 2012-13 season.

Kentucky has played nine or more players in every game, including 11 or more in seven games and 12 or more in five games. The bench has not only played key minutes, but scored key baskets. UK has had 10 or more players score a point in six games, including 11 or more in three games. All five newcomers not only played in the season opener, but scored, helping UK win the bench point battle 36-11 against Sacramento State. UK also won the bench point battle 28-0 against GWU and 33-13 against Morehead State. UK had a season-high 46 bench points against Evansville.

UK's freshmen posts shined against Tennessee Tech as KeKe McKinney started and scored a season-best nine points with five rebounds, while Dorie Harrison and Tatyana Wyatt came off the bench. Harrison scored seven points and seven rebounds, while Wyatt had 12 points, three rebounds, three blocks and two assists. All five newcomers combined to play 70 minutes against Evansville, scoring 37 points. Wyatt paced the squad with her first career double-double, earning 20 points with 10 rebounds.

- The Cats own a 436-152 (.741) overall in the historic building, including a 146-23 (.863) mark under head coach Matthew Mitchell.
- UK is 132-15 (.897) at home over the last nine seasons (including 7 games in Rupp Arena).
- The Cats have ranked in the top 25 nationally, and in the SEC's top four, in average attendance 14 straight seasons. UK ranked 14th nationally in average attendance with 5,213 fans per game last year.
- UK's 13-game home winning streak (the sixth-longest in school history) was snapped on Jan. 29, 2015 vs. Tennessee.



Rupp Arena (23,000)

- The Cats are 25-15 all-time in Rupp Arena (.625), including a 6-7 mark under Matthew Mitchell. (NOTE: UK's game against Washington in the 2016 Sweet 16 did not count as a home game, but does count in UK's record in the all-time building.)
- The second-highest attendance mark in school history was set on Nov. 17, 2014 when 22,075 fans witnessed UK's upset of No. 8/9 Baylor, 74-64.
- For the first time since the women's basketball Final Four in 1986, Rupp Arena and the University of Kentucky have been selected to host the NCAA regional tournament in 2016, 2017 and 2018 for women's basketball.
- Kentucky will play three games in Rupp Arena this season, squaring off against SEC foes South Carolina, LSU and Tennessee.

Team locker rooms, and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate University personnel.

CATS VS. RANKED TEAMS

Kentucky is 0-1 this season against teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national listings. The lone meeting so far was at No. 9 Baylor when the Wildcats fell, 90-63. UK does have a win against Washington State, who was receiving votes in the Preseason AP Top 25. In order to be one of the nation's best, you have to play against the nation's best. In 2016-17, Kentucky was 3-7 against ranked opponents with wins against then-No. 14 Miami (Fla.), then-No. 12 Oklahoma and then-No. 3 Mississippi State. In 44 years of varsity women's basketball, Kentucky has 88 wins over ranked opponents, including 47 of those wins coming under Matthew Mitchell.

TOUGH SCHEDULE AWAITS

UK will have a chance to move up the rankings all season long as it is currently scheduled to play 10 more games against teams either ranked or receiving votes in either poll, including six more against top-10 teams. In the AP Top 25, UK is scheduled to play at No. 3 Louisville, No. 4 South Carolina (twice), No. 5 Mississippi State (twice), No. 7 Tennessee, No. 16 Missouri, No. 19 Texas A&M and No. 24 Cal.

In the Coaches' Top 25, UK will play No. 3 Mississippi State (twice), No. 4 Louisville, No. 5 South Carolina (twice), No. 7 Tennessee, No. 16 Missouri, No. 22 Texas A&M and Cal and Ole Miss, who are receiving votes.

RICE LOOKING TO END CAREER WITH BEST SEASON

Senior post Alyssa Rice is having her best season as a Wildcat so far in 2017-18. The native of Reynoldsburg, Ohio, has five or more rebounds in every game this season, including eight games of seven or more rebounds. Rice has two double-doubles this season with a career-high 19 points and 10 rebounds against Marshall before a career-high 12 rebounds and 11 points at Miami (Fla.) Offensively, she is hitting 51.2 percent from the field and has scored seven or more points in nine of UK's 11 games. Against Marshall, Rice shot a career best 72.7 percent from the field in games of five or more field goal attempts.

In the season opener vs. Sacramento State, Rice had four points and seven rebounds with a block. She followed that with a team-best 11 points against Gardner-Webb with eight rebounds and two blocks. Rice had a near double-double against Montana and Wash. State with 8 points, 9 rebounds vs. the Griz before 9 points and 8 rebounds vs. the Cougars.

The native of Reynoldsburg, Ohio, has played in 104 career games with 54 career starts, averaging 3.9 points per game and 3.7 rebounds per game throughout her career. So far this season, Rice is averaging 9.4 points and 7.8 rebounds per game.

MURRAY IS UK'S ALL-EVERYTHING PLAYER

Taylor Murray showed everyone last season that she is a special player and that has only continued to blossom this year. The junior is off to a great start this season by averaging 12.3 points per game and 5.9 rebounds per game. Murray has led Kentucky in scoring three times, rebounding once, assists six times, steals seven times and blocked shots once. Her overall stat lines show her versatility and ability to effect both sides of the floor.

Murray led all scorers with 22 points, adding five rebounds and three assists vs. Sacramento State in the season opener. She went 8-of-12 from the field, 1-of-3 from 3 and 5-of-5 from the free-throw line in the game. Murray posted her third career double-double at Montana with 18 points and 12

rebounds and followed that performance by flirting with a triple-double at Washington State with 13 points, eight assists and seven rebounds. Murray had 10 points, six rebounds and five assists at Baylor and an impressive 19 points and seven rebounds against FGCU.

"MA-MO" TURNING INTO LETHAL WEAPON

Junior Maci Morris - known by her teammates as "Ma-Mo" - knew she was going to have to increase her game overall to be the player that she and the staff wanted her to be this season. She's done just that by leading Kentucky in scoring with 15.8 points per game. Morris is also averaging 4.5 rebounds per game and has hit a team-best 30 3s already this season.

The guard has scored in double figures in every game but one this season. Morris really got her offense going in the second half vs. Washington State where she scored 17 points in the second half only, hitting three 3s. She followed that with 19 points and five 3s against Morehead State. Against Marshall, Morris hit three 3s to score 15 points with two assists and two steals. Morris really shined against Baylor, scoring a game-high 22 points with five rebounds and hit five 3s. She led UK in scoring again against Tennessee Tech with 16 points, 6 rebounds and three blocked shots. Against Evansville, Morris was lights off from the floor going 8-for-9 from the field, including 4-of-5 from 3 for 20 points and three assists. Morris had an off night against FGCU, going 2-for-4 from the field for six points.

In her last five games, Morris is averaging 16.4 points per game, hitting 50.8 percent from the field and 58.3 percent from 3.

Morris recently hit nine straight 3-point attempts after going 3-for-3 in the second half vs. Baylor, 2-for-2 vs. Tennessee Tech and hit her first four tries against Evansville.

Morris has been rebounding better and defending better this season evidence by her first career double-double against Gardner-Webb with 10 points and 10 rebounds. She also ranks second on the team in steals (11) and blocks 10 (10).

MORRIS TOP 10 ALL-TIME IN CAREER 3S

Maci Morris is making her way up the all-time 3-point field goals made list at Kentucky. The native of Pineville, Ky., has hit 132 career 3s which ranks her seventh all-time in UK history. Morris needs 30 more to tie Jenny Pfeiffer (2003-07) for sixth all-time. So far this season, Morris is 30-of-56 (.536) from long range. She has hit three+ 3s six times, including five or more 3s twice.

Morris is only the second player in school history to have 100 or more 3s made at the conclusion of their true sophomore season.

IF ANYONE CAN - MAKENZIE CANN - CAN

Last year, due to Kentucky's lack of depth in the post, Makenzie Cann had to play in more of a four position in the post when on the floor. And although she excelled by having a great season, she is much more comfortable this season having more flexibility to play around the perimeter.

Cann, who has started every game this season, has been huge for the Wildcats in the early going, averaging 8.9 points per game and 5.0 rebounds per game while sitting second with 19 made 3s. Cann has two double-doubles this season with 15 points and 10 rebounds each against Washington State and Morehead State.

ROPER FITTING RIGHT IN FROM THE START

Watch the Kentucky women's basketball team huddle together right before time expires on the 60-minute pregame clock and you will see guard Jaida Roper in the middle of the huddle getting her teammates pumped up for the game. That is just how the fiery guard operates, never shy and always looking to encourage her teammates. That mentality has spilled over to her development on the court as well.

The native of Memphis, Tenn., played in 32 games last season with two starts. She started her sophomore season strong by scoring a career-high nine points with three assists vs. Sacramento State. Roper was 3-for-6 form the field, 1-for-2 from 3 and 2-for-2 from the free-throw line. She followed by breaking

that career high with 10 points and two assists against GWU in 25 minutes. Roper recorded her third straight career game at Montana with 14 points, five rebounds and three assists, making several key shots late in the shot clock.

Roper is currently averaging 8.8 points per game while sitting second on the team with 33 assists. Roper had five assists and five rebounds against Marshall before 12 points and one assist against Baylor. She had an impressive line vs. Tennessee Tech with seven points, six assists and four rebounds before 10 points and six assists against Evansville. Roper did not play at Miami (coach's decision).

MITCHELL CALLS JESSICA HARDIN A "GODSEND"

Matthew Mitchell has not shied away on his feelings about redshirt senior and Bellarmine transfer Jessica Hardin. The guard started her college career at Division II Bellarmine before transferring to UK academically. The native of Monticello, Ky., played intramural basketball for several years before trying out for the team in the summer of 2016 and being awarded a scholarship. Hardin played in 16 games, averaging 12.3 minutes per game with 3.1 points per game last season. She hit 12-of-33 from 3 and 15-of-52 overall. Hardin missed the first 13 SEC games as she went through concussion protocol. She returned vs. Florida, playing three minutes and hitting a 3. Mitchell calls Hardin, who came into the program at a time of upheaval, a "Godsend".

ANYAGALIGBO TO MISS 2017-18 DUE TO INJURY

Junior forward Ogechi Anyagaligbo will miss the 2017-18 season due to sustaining a torn ACL in Kentucky's exhibition game vs. Southern Indiana. Anyagaligbo, who missed the 2016-17 season due to NCAA Transfer rules, was expected to add depth in the post this season. She transfer to UK in the summer of 2016 after being named the America East Conference Rookie of the Year following her freshman season at Stony Brook. Anyagaligbo had successful surgery to repair her torn ACL on Wednesday, Nov. 22.

TAYLOR MURRAY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC SECOND TEAM BY LEAGUE COACHES

Junior guard Taylor Murray was tabbed to the Preseason All-Southeastern Conference Second Team by league coaches. Murray earned the honor due to her impressive sophomore season where she started all 30 games she played and averaged 12.2 points per game while leading the Wildcats with 3.9 assists per game. She has lived up the expectations, averaging 12.0 points per game this season while leading UK in assists and steals and sitting second with 5.6 rebounds per game.

RICE ON NCAA D1 WBB COMPETITION COMMITTEE

Alyssa Rice has been appointed to represent the Southeastern Conference on the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Competition Committee. Her term begins immediately and continues through June 30, 2018. The NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Competition Committee is comprised of 12 members and is responsible for reviewing specific areas, and as appropriate, develop and recommend strategic principles in order to maintain the women's college basketball game true to its original rules, playable, watchable, popular and relevant. The committee reviews the areas of student-athlete health and safety, sportsmanship, integrity, game operations, game presentation, technology, and statistical trends.

RICE NAMED CHAIR OF SEC LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

Alyssa Rice has been named by her peers in the league as the chair of the 2017-18 Southeastern Conference Women's Basketball Leadership Council. The SEC Basketball Leadership Council met in September in Birmingham with each men's and women's basketball program sending one representative. Rice was selected by the women's council as the chair and will represent the SEC as an SEC autonomy representative during the NCAA Convention in January. She will also attend a portion of the SEC Spring Meetings in May, and potentially the SEC Athletics Directors meeting in March. In 2016, the SEC introduced new Student-Athlete Leadership Councils in the sports of football and men's and women's basketball in which, in addition to the conference's longstanding Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC), provide student-athletes with additional opportunities to engage with campus leaders and conference office staff.

RICE ON LISA LESLIE AWARD WATCH LIST

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association announced Alyssa Rice as one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2018 Lisa Leslie Award. Named after the three-time All-American and 1994 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its inaugural year recognizes the top centers in women's NCAA Division I college basketball.

WILDCATS PICKED TO FINISH SIXTH IN SEC

The Southeastern Conference announced its Preseason Coaches Poll on Nov. 1, as voted by league coaches and Kentucky was picked to finish sixth in the league, while 2017 SEC champion South Carolina was tabbed as the top team in the conference. The complete poll and number of votes for each team is as follows: 1. South Carolina; 2. Mississippi State; 3. Missouri; 4. Texas A&M; 5. Tennessee; 6. Kentucky; 7. LSU; 8. Georgia; 9. Alabama; 10. NEWCOMERS TO ADD DEPTH IN 2017-18

Through its success in 2016-17 the Wildcats battled depth only regularly playing seven players. That appears to be fixed heading into 2017-18 as the Wildcats' roster is 13 deep and Coach Mitchell believes he will have all the depth he needs to be successful. Part of that fix is the emergence of five newcomers.

Kentucky's five newcomers are getting some quality time on the floor early this season. The five have combined to play 667 minutes so far this season, which is over 30% of the team's total minutes. That figure is more impressive when you consider Tatyana Wyatt, who played 15 minutes in the season opener, missed five games in November due to being in concussion protocol. All five newcomers played and scored in UK's season opener.

UK added junior college transfer Amanda Paschal, who won a national championship at Gulf Coast State College her freshman season before sitting out last year due to injury. Kentucky also adds four true freshmen who were stars in high school in Dorie Harrison (6-2, F/C, Nashville, Tenn.), KeKe McKinney (6-1, G/F, Knoxville, Tenn.), Kameron Roach (5-6, G, Hopkins, S.C.) and Tatyana Wyatt (6-3, F, Columbus, Ga.). Mitchell describes all five as extremely athletic with a strong work ethic and all four are expected to see minutes this season.

MITCHELL MOVES INTO ELITE SEC COMPANY

Kentucky's dominating 89-57 victory over Ole Miss on Jan. 26, 2017 was an historic one for Kentucky head coach Matthew Mitchell. The win was his 97th all-time in SEC play as a head coach, which ranked him 10th all-time on the SEC's career wins list. UK's win at Arkansas on Feb. 16 was Mitchell's 100th career SEC win.

Since arriving in Lexington in 2007, Mitchell has led Kentucky to unprecedented success. On top of leading UK to its first SEC Regular Season Championship in 30 years in 2012, Mitchell has four SEC Tournament title game appearances, nine top-four finishes in the league and has coached 18 all-conference performances, including four SEC Player of the Year honors.

SHOOTING WORK CONTINUES TO PAY OFF

After the 2014-15 season, Coach Mitchell put a point of emphasis on Kentucky becoming a better shooting team, asking his Wildcats to increase their field goal percentage from that season - which was 38% - to 42-45%.

The 2015-16 team responded by putting in a ton of offseason work and working hard on their shooting during preseason practice. It worked as the Wildcats shot 45.5% from the field that season, which was the highest field-goal percentage for a UK team since 1989-90, while its 35.6% from 3 was the highest since 2002-03. Overall, UK ranked top-10 in single-season UK history in points, scoring margin and field goals made, while its 154 3-pointers made and 475 assists just missed the top 10 by two 3-pointers and five assists.

The offensive showcase was noticed on the national level in 2015-16 as Kentucky ranked 24th in the nation in scoring offense, 16th in scoring margin, 18th in field goal percentage and 26th in 3-point field goal percentage. And although the turnovers and steals didn't come in at the pace they had in the past, UK's defense stayed fundamentally strong, limiting opponents to 60.6 points per game and a .372 mark from the field with 131 blocks, 507 turnovers forced and 222 steals.

The Wildcats strong shooting continued last season as UK hit 42.7% from the field, which was the third highest field-goal percentage since 2005-06. UK hit 169 3s last year, which was the sixth most in a single season in program history.

So far this season, UK is hitting 44.7 percent from the field and 38.7 percent from 3.

AKHATOR, EPPS SELECTED IN WNBA DRAFT

Evelyn Akhator and Makayla Epps began their professional careers in the Women's National Basketball Association as both were selected in the 2017 WNBA Draft. Akhator was selected third overall by the Dallas Wings, becoming the highest draft pick in school history. Akhator is the third player in program history to be a first-round selection and the first since A'dia Mathies in 2013. Epps became the fifth Matthew Mitchell coached player to be selected, going 33rd overall to the Chicago Sky.

Akhator and Epps are the first Kentucky players selected in the WNBA Draft since DeNesha Stallworth was taken 25th overall in the 2014 draft. In his 10-year tenure with the Wildcats, Matthew Mitchell has had five players selected in the WNBA Draft. Victoria Dunlap was the second-ever UK player selected back in 2011, while Mathies was previously the highest pick in school history going 10th in 2013.

MITCHELL INKS 2 HIGH SCHOOL STARS TO NLIS

Matthew Mitchell continues to sign some of the best high school basketball players in the country to

play at Kentucky as he inked high school stars Blair Green (Harlan, Ky.) and Rhyne Howard (Cleveland, Tenn.) to National Letters of Intent on Nov. 8.

Green is a four-start prospect by ESPN.com which ranks her as the ninth best wing in the 2018 class. Green had a great junior season for Harlan County High School averaging 23.1 points per game, 7.2 rebounds per game and hit 53.8% from the field, including 43.8% from 3.

All-Star Girl's Report ranks Howard as the eighth best player overall in the 2018 class while ESPN tabbed her the 10th best guard in the class. Howard averaged 19.6 points per game, 7.2 rebounds per game, 4.6 steals per game, 3.8 assists per game and 1.2 blocks per game as a junior at Bradley Central High School. She scored 647 points last year for the Bears, hitting 55 percent from the field, 40 percent from 3 and 74 percent from the free throw line.

HOWARD, GREEN ON NAISMITH HS WATCH LIST

University of Kentucky women's basketball signees Rhyne Howard (Cleveland, Tenn.) and Blair Green (Harlan, Ky.) have been named to the 2017 Naismith Girls' High School Watch List, which annually names the top player in high school basketball. Howard and Green are two of just 50 players nationally to make the list.

MITCHELL TURNS PROGRAM AROUND

In 2009-10, Coach Mitchell implemented the "40 minutes of dread" style of play. Although UK doesn't play that style as much anymore, it started Kentucky on an impressive run of success.

- Recorded an impressive 216-70 overall record, including a 132-15 mark at home.
- Won 20-plus games every year, averaging 26.5 wins over the last seven years.
- Advanced to a school-record eight straight NCAA Tournaments, including three Elite Eight trips during that span with 15 NCAA Tournament wins.
- Nine top-four SEC finishes, including winning the SEC regular season title in 2012, its first in 30 years.
- Advanced to the SEC Tournament championship game four times
- Four SEC Player of the Year Award Winners
- Two SEC Freshman of the Year Winners

THE MAGIC "80"

The Wildcats hold a remarkable 341-23 (.936) record since 1974 when scoring 80 points or more. The last loss came at South Carolin on Feb. 26, 2017 when the Cats fell 95-87 in the regular-season finale. UK is 95-5 (.950) under Mitchell when scoring 80 points or more, including a 3-0 mark this season.

UK IN OVERTIME

UK is 29-26 all-time in overtime games, including a 10-3 mark under Matthew Mitchell, who is 12-5 in his 11-year career as a head coach in extra minutes.

KENTUCKY ALL-TIME

Kentucky is 791-518 (.604) in its 43rd year of varsity women's basketball, including 249-103 (.707) in 11 seasons under Matthew Mitchell. Win No. 750 came against Auburn on Jan. 17, 2016 in Memorial.

20+ WIN SEASONS UNDER MITCHELL

The Wildcats have won 20 or more games 18 times in 43 years of varsity basketball, including a school-record eight in a row. It's important to note that UK had just 10 20-win seasons in its first 33 years of varsity women's basketball, but has eight in 10 seasons of the Matthew Mitchell era.

SEC TOURNAMENT SEMIFINAL STREAK

The Wildcats advanced to the semifinals of the SEC Tournament for the eighth straight season, which is the longest active streak in the league.

THE KENTUCKY WBB COACHING STAFF HAS ...

Combined the Kentucky women's basketball coaching staff has compiled over 80 years of experience at the Division I level, including coaching or playing in a combined 38 NCAA Tournaments with eight Final Fours, four national championships and a WNBA Championship. Elzy and Butts are in their second stint in Lexington after serving on Mitchell's staffs before. Butts was an associate head coach on Mitchell's first staff at Kentucky before Elzy joined the staff for four successful seasons. Dunn, who is a Women's Basketball Hall of Famer, has over 40 years of coaching experience, including three decades in the collegiate ranks.

CATS REPLACING 2 ALL-AMERICANS IN 2017-18

A key task this season will be replacing the All-America production of Makayla Epps and Evelyn Akhator, who combined to average 33.6 of the team's 70.9 points last season. Even with the loss of Epps/Akhator, UK still returns 52.6% of its scoring, 58.0% of its rebounding, 50.3% of its made field goals, 76.9% of its made 3-pointers and 64.7% of its assists from last season. In all, the Wildcats return eight of 11 eligible players.

RECAPPING THE 2016-17 SEASON

Kentucky is coming off a 22-11 record last season that saw the Wildcats make a school-record eighth straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats also hosted the first and second rounds of the event for the fourth straight season. UK finished No. 18 in The Associated Press Top 25 and No. 25 in the USA Today/Coaches Top 25. It was the eighth straight season the Wildcats have finished inside the top 25 of both national listings. Mitchell's 2016-17 squad, which finished with the No. 14 overall RPI in the final NCAA RPI report, played the second-toughest schedule in the nation in 2016-17 with 25 of its 33 games being played against teams that finished in the top 100 of the NCAA RPI report. The Wildcats played 13 games against top-25 RPI teams with four wins, while it had six wins against RPI top 50 teams.

CATS TABBED TO WBCA ACADEMIC TOP 25

UK ended the 2016-17 season with a 3.492 team grade point average, which ranked 24th nationally in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll. Kentucky is the only Southeastern Conference team to make the WBCA Academic Top 25 and one of only three teams to claim the honor while also sitting top 20 in the final Association Press Top 25.

Matthew Mitchell has put an emphasis on academics since arriving on campus as the Wildcats have had a 3.0 team GPA or better each of the last eight semesters. Last fall, the Wildcats posted a 3.517 team GPA, which was the highest GPA for a semester in the Mitchell era. UK followed that with a 3.464 team GPA in the spring with four players earning 4.0s. Under Mitchell, 34 Wildcats have been tabbed to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and 100 percent of Mitchell's players have received their degrees.

SIX CATS PLAYING OVERSEAS

Kentucky women's basketball currently has six alumnae who signed professional contracts to play overseas for the 2017-18 season.

- Makayla Epps will go overseas and play at some point this year.

A WINNING INSTITUTION

Both the Kentucky men's and women's basketball team have been national contenders the past few years with great success on the court. UK has tallied a 565-120 combined record between its two programs since 2009-10. That record includes a 268-21 mark in Lexington. UK was one of three schools to have both men's and women's programs as a top four seed in the 2016 NCAA Tournament.

Both the UK men's and women's basketball teams have posted an eighth straight 20-win season in 2016-17. Kentucky is one of just three institutions (Duke and BYU) in the NCAA that have seen both their men's and women's basketball programs tally 20 or more wins in the last eight straight seasons.

MATTHEW AND JENNA MITCHELL DONATE \$1 MILLION TO UK ATHLETICS

In June of 2014, Coach Matthew Mitchell and his wife, Jenna, pledged \$1 million over the next 10 years to the University of Kentucky Athletics Department. The donation will provide UK Athletics \$100,000 per year over the next 10 years to be used for a variety of capital projects, including updates and renovations for football. The donation is the largest ever given by a UK athletics employee to the athletics department.

Matthew and Jenna have been very active in the Lexington community since arriving in Lexington. In October 2016, Matthew and Jenna were presented the Community Service Award by the Urban League of Lexington.

RUPP ARENA CHOSEN FOR 3 STRAIGHT NCAA REGIONAL TOURNAMENTS

For the first time since the women's basketball Final Four in 1986, Rupp Arena and the University of Kentucky hosted the NCAA regional tournament in 2016 and 2017 and will again 2018 for women's basketball. In 2018, Lexington will again play host at Rupp Arena, joined by Albany, N.Y. (Times Union Center), Kansas City, Mo. (Sprint Center) and Spokane, Wash. (Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena), with regional play taking place March 23-26.






