# Kentucky Makes First Trip to WVU Since 1970 in Big 12/SEC Challenge

- WVU is 1-3 in the Big 12/SEC Challenge. WVU defeated Texas A&M in Morgantown last season, lost at Florida two years ago, fell to LSU at home three years ago and lost at Missouri four years ago.
- WVU was 1-1 in the Big East/SEC Challenge. WVU defeated Auburn in Birmingham (2007) and lost at Miss. State (2011).
- With a win at Oklahoma State on Dec. 29, Bob Huggins moved past Jim Phelan for seventh place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. Huggins' record now stands at 835-334 in his 36th season as a head coach.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- On Dec. 21, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced that Huggins is one of six collegiate coaches eligible for the Class of 2018. Huggins is the only active coach in the group.
- Jevon Carter is the only player in the country to average more than 16 points, six assists and three steals per game.
- West Virginia is 129-33 at the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 65-29 mark in league games.
- WVU is 538-153 (.782) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 170-39 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 14 seasons.
- West Virginia is 98-6 at home against non-conference teams in the last 16 years, including 79 of its last 83.
- West Virginia is 113-27 in non-conference regular season games under Bob Huggins, including a 64-4 mark at home.
- West Virginia is 144-33 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 15 seasons.
- West Virginia is 173-37 in its last 210 games against unranked teams, including 90 of its last 101 at the WVU Coliseum.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 616 consecutive games.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 41 ranked teams at WVU, including 16 wins over Top 10 teams and three over No. 1.
- WVU is 10-8 in its last 18 games vs. AP Top 25 teams, with two wins over No. 1, one vs. No. 2, two wins over No. 6 and one win over No. 7.
- Jevon Carter leads the country in steals with 68, and he has played in 127 career games, the second-most games played among active college basketball players this season.
- In the latest NCAA stats, WVU ranks second in turnover margin (7.0), is fourth in forced turnovers (19.1), is seventh in steals per game (9.3) and is second in offensive rebounds per game (14.6).
- West Virginia is forcing its opponents to turn it over on 25.5 percent of their possessions, second in the country.
- West Virginia has nearly forced more turnovers (382) than its opponents' made field goals (423).
- Carter and Daxter Miles Jr. have played more games (247 combined) than any other Power 5 backcourt in the country.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 91 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 37 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 47 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 64 of the last 67 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked 67 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- This is WVU's second longest streak of ranked weeks in the AP poll, behind 56 weeks from March 1956 to March 1960.
- WVU's streak of 47 weeks in the AP rankings is the fourth longest active streak in the country.
- In the last two seasons, WVU has finished second in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tourney.
- WVU has had back-to-back seasons of single-digit season losses. The last time that happened was in 1982-83.
- Jevon Carter was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year last year. Carter was named to the All-Big 12 Defensive Team for the third year in a row. Carter is just the third player in Big 12 history to earn three selections on the All-Big 12 Defensive Team. Carter was the NABC Defensive Player of the Year and the Lefty Driesell Defensive Player of the Year.
- Jevon Carter became West Virginia's 51st 1,000-point scorer on Feb. 27. He now ranks 19th all-time with 1,456 points.
- Daxter Miles Jr. became WVU's 52nd 1,000-point scorer on Dec. 20. He now ranks 39th all-time with 1,108 points.
- Sagaba Konate has already posted 62 blocks this season. He had 53 his entire freshman season a year ago.
- Konate has had at least five blocks in six games this season, one of five players nationally to complete that feat.
- The Mountaineers have won 72 of their last 74 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU is 193-31 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 82 of its last 85 and 138 of its last 150 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 61 times under Bob Huggins (368 games).
- West Virginia is 64-4 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 191-34 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 198-22 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 169-11 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 182-35 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 181-43 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
  - WVU is 12-13 all-time on Jan. 27. The Mountaineers are 508-325 in the month of January.

# **Bob Huggins**

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 835 games in 36 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks seventh among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 31 of 35 seasons, including 23 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 35 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.9 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 66 allconference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.

# Scouting Kentucky

- Kentucky is 15-5 overall and 5-3 in the SEC following a 78-65 win over Mississippi State on Tuesday.
- The Wildcats are 2-2 in road games this season and 1-2 on neutral courts.
- John Calipari is 264-58 in his ninth season at Kentucky and 677-196 in his 26th season as a head coach.

# Series Record

- Kentucky leads the series with WVU that began in 1923-24 by a 15-5 margin.
- The last meeting took place on March 26, 2015, a 78-39 Kentucky win in the 2015 NCAA Sweet 16 in Cleveland.
- The two teams met on March 19, 2011 in the NCAA Third Round in Tampa, Florida, a 71-63 Kentucky win.
- The two teams met in 2010 with the Mountaineers defeating the top-seeded Wildcats, 73·66, in the Elite
  Eight in Syracuse, New York, sending the Mountaineers to their first Final Four since 1959.
- · Kentucky has won nine of the last 10 meetings in the series.
- Kentucky's last visit to Morgantown was a 106-100 Wildcat win on Dec. 7, 1970.
- UK's only other visit to Morgantown was on Jan. 11, 1941, a 56-43 WVU win at Mountaineer Field House.
- Bob Huggins is 8-3 all-time against John Calipari (I-2 at WVU). When Huggins was at Cincinnati, he had a 2-0 record against Calipari's UMass teams and a 5-1 record against Calipari's Memphis teams.
- Huggins is 1-5 all-time against Kentucky (1-3 at WVU and 0-2 at Cincinnati).
- Calipari is 12-7 against WVU (10-6 while at UMass and 2-1 at Kentucky).

# WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 109th season and 115th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,746-1,072 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 22nd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 28 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 20 times, including an
  amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 13 years, WVU has reached the Sweet 16 in 2017 & 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012,
   NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America
  first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in
  2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former
  Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations Rod Thorn and former
  Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was closed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

# Winning Non-Conference Mark

- West Virginia has finished with a winning non-conference mark for the 26th consecutive season.
- West Virginia is 144-33 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 14 seasons.
- The last time WVU did not post a winning non-league record was 1990-91, when WVU went 4-4 outside of conference.
- WVU is 113-27 in non-conference games under Bob Huggins.
- WVU has finished with one loss during non-conference play in eight different seasons. They were: 1981-82 when West Virginia went 11-1 out of the Atlantic 10, 1957-58 when WVU lost only to Duke in going 11-1, 1996-97 when the Mountaineers were 7-1, losing the season opener at Minnesota, 2004-05 when WVU went 10-1 outside the Big East, 2006-07 when the Mountaineers went 12-1 with their only loss to Arkansas, 2009-10 when WVU was 11-1 with its only loss at Purdue, 2014-15 when the Mountaineers had a one point home loss to LSU, finishing 12-1 and in 2016-17 when WVU finished 12-1 with a four-point loss to Temple in Brooklyn, New York.
- WVU has had one perfect non-conference regular season, 10-0, in 1997-98.

# In The Rankings

- West Virginia is ranked No. 7 in the Associated Press poll and No. 7 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- WVU's No. 2 AP ranking on Jan. 8 was its highest since a No. 2 ranking on Dec. 29, 1959.
- WVU began the season ranked No. 11 in the Associated Press poll and No. 10 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 91 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 37 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 47 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 64 of the last 67 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked 67 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- This is WVU's second longest streak of ranked weeks in the AP poll, behind 56 weeks from March 1956 to March 1960.
- West Virginia has been ranked 111 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll, and 225 weeks total in school history.
- WVU was No. 6 in the final AP poll in 2010, its highest final ranking since a No. 5 ranking in 1959-60.
- In 2010, WVU was ranked in the Top 10 for nine straight weeks the most consecutive weeks in the Top 10 since 1960.

- The Kansas game marked the 305th time in school history WVU played a team ranked in the AP Top 25.
- Bob Huggins has 41 wins over ranked teams at WVU: No. 7 Oklahoma, No. 15 Virginia (2017-18), No. 1 Baylor, No. 2 Kansas (No. 1 in USA Today Coaches Poll), No. 6 Virginia, No. 14 Notre Dame and No. 24 lowa State (2016-17), No. 1 Kansas, No. 6 Oklahoma, No. 13 Iowa State, No. 15 Baylor, No. 17 Iowa State and No. 19 Baylor (2015-16), No. 8 Kansas, No. 12 Maryland, No. 17 UConn, No. 18 Oklahoma and No. 22 Oklahoma State (2014-15), No. 8 Kansas, No. 21 Oklahoma and No. 11 Iowa State (2013-14), No. 9 Georgetown (2011-12), No. 8 Notre Dame, No. 8 Purdue, No. 11 Louisville, No. 13 Georgetown and No. 16 UConn (2010-11), No. 2 Kentucky, No. 9 Villanova, No. 15 Ole Miss, No. 19 Georgetown, No. 21 Ohio St., No. 22 Georgetown and No. 22 Pitt (2009-10), No. 2 Pitt, No. 12 Georgetown, No. 13 Villanova and No. 15 Ohio St. (2008-09) & No. 9 Duke, No. 10 Marguette & No. 15 UConn (2007-08).
- WVU's win at No. 6 Virginia last season was its first non-conference road win over a Top 10 team since winning at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 1957.
- WVU became the fourth team in the AP poll to beat an AP No. 1 and No. 2 team by at least 15 points each in a season.
- Last season, West Virginia became the first team since Indiana in 2011-12 to beat No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.
- Last season marked the first time WVU had defeated three AP Top 10 teams in the same season, and the first time WVU had ever beaten three AP Top 6 teams in the same year.
- WVU owns 97 wins over AP-ranked teams.
- Since 1995, the Mountaineers have played 192 nationally ranked teams. WVU has played 305 total games against nationally ranked competition. That means more than 63 percent of the games against the best teams in the country have come during the last 24 seasons.
- WVU has played 143 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 55 of those games.
- Bob Huggins has faced 93 ranked teams during the regular season in 11 years, the most in school history. Gale Catlett faced 66 ranked teams during the regular season in 25 years, while John Beilein faced 34 ranked teams during regular season play in five years.













# **AdvoCare Invitational Champions**

- West Virginia defeated Missouri, 83-79, in the championship game of the AdvoCare Invitational in Lake Buena Vista, Florida. on Nov. 26.
- The Mountaineers also defeated UCF, 83-45, Marist, 84-78, and Long Beach State, 91-62, in a non-bracketed game during the event.
- WVU has now won four in-season tournaments under Bob Huggins: 2009 76 Classic in Anaheim, California, 2014 Puerto Rico Tip-Off, 2015 Las Vegas Invitational and the 2017 AdvoCare Invitational.
- Jevon Carter was named MVP of the AdvoCare Invitational, while Daxter Miles Jr. was named to the All-Tournament Team.

# **Preseason Bits**

- West Virginia was predicted to finish second in the Big 12 Conference preseason coaches' poll.
- Last year, the Mountaineers were predicted to finish second and finished second in the Big 12 regular season and
  conference tournament. WVU has finished second in the regular season and conference tournament for two consecutive
  vears.
- In 12 of the last 15 seasons, the Mountaineers have finished higher than or equal to their preseason prediction.
- Senior guard Jevon Carter was a unanimous selection to the Preseason All-Big 12 Team.

# Academic Success

- Thirty-nine of the last 40 seniors on the WVU men's basketball team have graduated on time or early since 2004.
- Jevon Carter was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District II First Team in 2016-17.

- WVU has won at least 25 games for three consecutive seasons. WVU is 95-32 since the beginning of 2014-15 season.

- West Virginia is 110-78 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games (Big 12 and Big East).

# **Press Virginia**

- Press Virginia is back for the Mountaineers for the fourth season in a row.
- In 2016-17, WVU led the country in turnover margin (7.7), turnovers forced (20.0), total steals (371) and steals (10.0). WVU
  ranked third in scoring margin (14.8), fifth in offensive rebounds (14.3), 21st in assists (16.4) & 23rd in scoring offense (81.5).
- The Mountaineers forced their opponents to turn it over on 27.0 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- WVU nearly forced more turnovers (740) than its opponents made field goals (826).
- WVU attempted 385 more shots than its opponents last season -- 2,333 to 1,948.
- West Virginia forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan last season.
- In 2014-15, the Mountaineers led the country in forced turnovers, steals and offensive rebounds. In 2015-16, West Virginia led the country in forced turnovers.

- Derek Culver, a 6-foot-10 forward from Boardman, Ohio, currently attends Brewster Academy in New Hampshire.
- Trey Doomes, a 6-foot-3 guard from Acworth, Georgia, currently attends University School in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.
- Andrew Gordon, a 6-foot-10 forward, from Clearwater, Florida, currently attends Northwest Florida State College.
- Jordan McCabe, a 6-foot guard from Kaukauna, Wisconsin, currently attends Kaukauna High.

# **Huggins Receives Contract Extension**

- On Nov. 6, 2017, Director of Athletics Shane Lyons announced a four-year contract extension to 2021-22 for Bob Huggins.
- It will extend his relationship with the University until 2027.
- Under the agreement, following the 2021-22 season, Huggins will assume a five-year Emeritus status within the WVU
  Department of Intercollegiate Athletics, which concludes June 30, 2027.
- Huggins will be paid \$3,750,000 this season, \$3,850,000 in 2018-19, \$3,950,000 in 2019-20, \$4,050,000 in 2020-21 and \$4,150,000 in 2021-22

# Recap

No. 25 Texas A&M used 23 points each from Tyler Davis and Admon Gilder to roll to an 88-65 victory over 11th-ranked West Virginia in a season-opening game in the Armed Forces Classic at Ramstein Air Base in Ramstein-Miesenbach, Germany.

Aggie coach Billy Kennedy began the game with starters Admon Gilder and D.J. Hogg sitting on the bench, but once he put them in Texas A&M's fortunes changed immediately.

A Lamont West 3 with 6:43 left in the first half had West Virginia comfortably ahead, 29-17, and seemingly in control of the game.

Then Hogg and Gilder took over, scoring six straight to quickly reduce West Virginia's lead to six. Five more from freshman guard T.J. Starks gave the Aggies their first lead of the game, 35-33, with 1:58 to go in the half.

Hogg went off by scoring the final 10 points of the half for A&M to give the Aggies a 45-38 lead at intermission.

It only got worse for the Mountaineers in the second half as they began shooting and missing 3s, which frequently turned into transition baskets for A&M.

A couple of WVU misses at the start of the second half led to four straight Aggie points and a quick Mountaineer timeout, but soon another nine-point flurry got A&M's lead to 17. WVU eventually reduced it to eight on two quick 3s by James Bolden and Lamont West, but A&M answered with seven straight to build its margin back to 15.

Soon it swelled to 20 and then to 25 as West Virginia continued missing from the outside.

In all, the Mountaineers tried 40 3-pointers, hitting just 12, while Texas A&M nearly matched WVU's 3-point field goal total (10) on 21 fewer attempts.

West Virginia's full-court pressure defense forced 18 Texas A&M turnovers, but the Mountaineers turned it over 16 times themselves and finished the game shooting only 34 percent from the floor.

Texas A&M, as expected, had a sizable advantage on the glass, outrebounding West Virginia 47-35.

Hogg added 19 for the Aggies.

Bolden, a sophomore backup guard, led West Virginia with a career-high 19 points; senior guard Jevon Carter scored 13 and sophomore forward Wesley Harris contributed 12.

# Notebook

- The 23-point loss was West Virginia's first 20-point defeat since Feb. 14, 2015, when the Mountaineers dropped an 80-60 decision at lowa State.
- WVU played outside the United States or Puerto Rico for just the second time in school history. WVU played in Cancun, Mexico in 2013.
- Coach Bob Huggins fell to 9-2 in season openers at WVU.

### Recap

Twenty-fourth ranked West Virginia used a 15·0 run to begin the second half in rolling to a 98·64 victory over American at the WVU Coliseum.

"It's a work in progress," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said afterward. Huggins earned his 820th career victory and his 230th as WVU's head coach.

"We've got the pieces, we've just got to get them put together," Huggins said.

Senior guard Jevon Carter scored 20 points, made nine steals, handed out seven assists and pulled down seven rebounds in an outstanding all-around performance.

West Virginia (I-1) got off to a slow start, the Mountaineers shooting less than 40 percent as they plodded through most of the first half. It was a two-possession affair until Carter's two free throws with 3:19 to go gave WVU an eight-point lead, 34-26.

A Lamont West free throw made it a 10-point game, 36-26, and then freshman forward Teddy Allen got it to 12 on a 3 from the wing following a James Bolden steal..

The Mountaineers' largest lead was 35, 93-58, with 2:36 remaining. "We go too fast and we get people with the ball in positions where they really shouldn't have the ball." Huggins said. "And then we don't get the ball to guys in a position where they ought to have it. But we

Sa'eed Nelson led the Eagles with 17; Larry Motuzis scored 15.

# Recap

Twenty-fourth-ranked West Virginia hit Morgan State with a fullcourt blitz that had the Bears running for cover and the home crowd of 11,698 completely satisfied with the Mountaineers' 111-48 victory at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia (2-1) got a career-high 32 points from Daxter Miles Jr., three nights after scoring 20 in the Mountaineers' 98-64 win over American. He made 12-of-15 from the floor, and all nine of his two-point field goal attempts, and hit 5-of-8 from the free throw line in just 22 minutes of action.

Senior guard Jevon Carter contributed 16 points, sophomore James Bolden came off the bench to score 13 and freshman Teddy Allen added 10.

"I thought we played hard. We played much harder than what we played, certainly in Germany and in the first home game here," Huggins said.

All 11 players who got into the game scored for the Mountaineers, which shot 58.4 percent from the floor. At one point late in the first half, West Virginia led the Morgan State 50-8 and had a 39-point lead at halftime

"All we talked about at halftime was we have to use this to get better," Huggins said. "We're going to win the game, obviously, and they were playing some pretty good 2-3 matchup and it gave us an opportunity to work on our zone offense and try some new things out and put some people in different positions.

"It helped us."

Morgan State committed 27 turnovers and shot 32.1 percent for the game.

"We shot the ball well and we did a better job in transition," Huggins said.

# Recap

Lamont West scored 22 points and sophomore center Sagaba Konate contributed a career-high 20 to lead 23rd-ranked West Virginia to a 91-62 victory over Long Beach State here at the WVU Coliseum.

The game was a non-bracketed matchup as part of the AdvoCare Invitational taking place later in the week at the ESPN Wide World of

"That's a lot better win than people realize," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "They're going to win their league and probably beat some other people as well."

West's 22 came on 6 of 11 shooting, five of those from 3, and he also grabbed eight rebounds.

Konate was equally impressive, hitting 8 of 10 from the floor, making all four of his free throws, grabbing seven rebounds and making four spectacular blocks that influenced Long Beach State's willingness to shoot more inside the paint.

Offensively, a number of Konate's baskets came away from the basket, including a couple beyond the free throw line from about 17 feet

Sophomore guard Chase Harler scored a career-high 12 by halftime and finished with 14 in 30 minutes of action.

Jevon Carter contributed 13, handed out seven assists and made three steals.

West Virginia forced Long Beach State (2-2) into committing 21 turnovers and wore down the travel-weary 49ers in the second half.

Long Beach State's Gabe Levin matched a career-high with 23 points while Gonzaga transfer Bryan Alberts contributed 20.

The 49ers had an early 9-3 lead tonight before West Virginia scored six straight to tie it at nine. The Mountaineers' first lead came on a Wesley Harris free throw with 13:05 remaining in the first half to make it 15-14. Here, a quick 6-0 spurt pushed the lead to seven, and then another 6-1 spurt got it to 12, 31-19, on a Jevon Carter baseline jumper.

West Virginia's biggest lead of the first half, 17, was also the margin it took into the locker room at intermission.

The 49ers got their deficit down to 15 with 11:50 remaining before running out of gas. Soon it was back to 20 and eventually to 31 before Jordan Griffin's jumper with 14 seconds left made the final margin 29.

Jevon Carter scored 20 points to lead 23rd-ranked West Virginia to an 84-78 victory over Marist in the AdvoCare Invitational at the HP Field House in Lake Buena Vista, Florida,

Winless Marist used a variety of zone defenses and dared West Virginia to shoot 3s the entire game. The Mountaineers complied and missed 30 of the 38 they attempted, two fewer than the 40 they tried in their 23-point loss to Texas A&M in Germany to open the season.

They did a great job, they really did," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said of Marist. "They changed defenses on us, but we rely so much on making 3s that we never threw the ball inside."

If not for Carter and sophomore Chase Harler knocking down three 3s during a two-minute stretch late in the game, the Mountaineers could have been on the other side of this one.

West Virginia (4-1) led 65-50 with 9:21 remaining before the Red Foxes went on a 17-2 run to tie the game at 67. Marist made five straight shots during the run but could never get the lead.

When the game was tied, Carter answered Brian Parker's jumper with a 3 and Harler hit another 3 from the corner a minute later. Harler's second 3 from the same spot came right after Kristinn Palsson's 3 to keep it a two-possession game.

Marist got the deficit to four twice with 11 and five seconds remaining but both times West Virginia got free throws to go down to hang on.

The Mountaineers won this one at the free throw line, hitting 24 of 29 compared to Marist's 16 of 25, and by forcing 24 turnovers.

Sophomore center Sagaba Konate posted his first career doubledouble with 14 points and a game-high 10 rebounds, but he got into early foul trouble and spent a good portion of the second half sitting on the bench.

Daxter Miles Jr. contributed 12 despite missing all five of his 3-point tries.

WVU's other two top scorers, Lamont West and James Bolden, also struggled to find their shooting strokes. West made 4 of 10 from the floor and missed all four of his 3s to finish with nine while Bolden was 3 of 11 and 2 of 7 from 3 to score eight.

David Knudsen led Marist with 19, making 7 of his 11 shot attempts including 5 of 9 from 3.

Brian Parker added 14.

Twenty-third ranked West Virginia used a smothering defense to blow out previously undefeated UCF, 83-45, in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational played at HP Field House in Lake Buena Vista,

After a slow start, West Virginia used a 28-3 run to turn an early 6-2 deficit in into a 30-9 lead midway into the first half. UCF shot 19 percent in the first half, the Knights hitting just four-of-21 field goals to fall behind by 23, 43-20, at the intermission.

The second half wasn't much better for the Golden Knights as they shot just 28.6 percent while committing 27 turnovers against West Virginia's constant full-court pressure.

"We played with a lot of energy," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "We're pretty good when we play with energy and we're bad when we don't play with energy."

Ten of the 11 players who got into the game scored while four reached double figures.

Sophomore guard James Bolden came off the bench to score 17, senior guard Jevon Carter contributed 16, senior guard Daxter Miles Jr. had 14 and sophomore center Sagaba Konate scored 14 points, grabbed nine rebounds and blocked six shots, or five more blocks than UCF's 7-foot-6-inch, 295-pound center, Tacko Fall.

Fall was the only Knight player to reach double figures with 11. West Virginia tried 13 fewer 3s than it night the previous night against Marist, making one more than it did against the Red Foxes (nine to eight).

Carter had another outstanding all-around performance with five steals, five assists, three rebounds and a block.

"Jevon Carter was really good and everybody knows that," Huggins said. "But Beetle (Bolden) keeps coming in and makes shots for us. I thought Beetle was good and he didn't hurt us defensively. Sags was really good around the rim. The difference when he goes out of the game and the way people look at attacking the basket it's night and day. He changes and blocks so many shots."

West Virginia's bench, led by Bolden's 17, gave Huggins 26 points. The Mountaineers scored 27 points off of turnovers and took 21 more shots than the Golden Knights. West Virginia's largest lead was 42 points with 4:52 remaining in the game.

# Recap

West Virginia came back from 16 points down in the second half to knock off Missouri, 83-79, in the championship game of the AdvoCare Invitational played at HP Field House in Lake Buena Vista, Florida.

West Virginia's senior guards, Jevon Carter and Daxter Miles Jr., were the difference in the impressive comeback victory. Carter scored West Virginia's first nine points and finished with a career-high 29, while Miles Jr. added 26.

It was Carter and Miles who keyed West Virginia's frenetic finish, harassing Missouri's ball handlers into committing nine turnovers over the final 7:19. Missouri turned it over a total of 20 times for the game.

A Jontay Porter layup with 7:58 left gave the Tigers a 68-52 lead and forced Huggins to call timeout.

"We tried 1-3-1; we had tried some pressure before; we tried to double ball screens; we tried to push up ball screens; we tried to string out ball screens and none of it worked," Huggins explained afterward. "I said, 'Fellas, I guess we are what we are so let's just go get 'em and let the thips fall where they may."

So they did.

Carter picked guard Jordan Geist's pocket after Geist tried to throw the ball off him on an inbound pass and drove in for a layup.

That play lit the Mountaineers' fuse.

Another Carter steal led to a pair of free throws with 4:39 left to reduce Missouri's lead to 73:64. Two more Carter steals turned into four straight transition points and a five-point deficit with 4:11 to go.

Another Mizzou turnover, this one coming from forward Kevin Puryear, led to a Miles Jr. jumper to make the score 73-70. Miles Jr. then took the ball away from Geist and drove in for a layup to make it a one-point game with 3:18 left.

Following two Wesley Harris free throws with 1:28 remaining to keep it a one-point game, Harris got a piece of Kassius Robertson's shot attempt at the other end and Lamont West grabbed the rebound. He got the ball to Carter, who worked his way to the top of the key and hit a contested 3 to give West Virginia a 77-75 lead, its first of the second half.

After missing a free throw, Geist fouled Miles Jr., who added two more free throws at the other end to make it 79-75.

It became a free throw shooting contest after Puryear's uncontested layup with eight seconds left. Miles Jr. and Carter hit two each to ice the Mountaineers' best win of the young season.

# Recap

Jevon Carter scored 25 points and became West Virginia's all-time steals leader in the Mountaineers' 102-69 victory over NJIT of the Atlantic Sun Conference at the WVU Coliseum.

Carter surpassed Greg Jones as WVU's top thief, the senior hitting the milestone with 56 seconds left in the first half when he took the ball away from NJIT's Zach Cooks. The Maywood, Illinois, resident finished the game with five giving him 254 for his career - three more than Jones got during his four-year career which ended in 1983.

West Virginia scored only eight points through the first seven minutes of the first half and trailed the Highlanders by four points before finally awakening. A Carter 3 from the top of the gave WVU a 13-12 advantage, and another Carter triple pushed the margin to four, 18-14

A Bolden 3 with 8:08 remaining made it a five-point lead, 25-20, and then a quick flurry got the advantage to 10, 36-26, on Daxter Miles Jr.'s layup.

West Virginia (7-1) finished the half on a 13-7 spurt to take a 16-point lead into the locker room at the break.

A fast start to the second half got the margin to 20, 55-35, and it quickly swelled to 29 on a Lamont West 3.

The Mountaineers' biggest lead was 37 before things got sloppy when Huggins began to empty his bench. Ten of 11 players scored for West Virginia in the game.

Carter's 25 came on 7-of-14 shooting, 5-of-11 from 3. He also grabbed a team-best nine rebounds and handed out six assists in 30 minutes of action.

Freshman Teddy Allen came off the bench to score a season-high 16 on 6-of-9 shooting.

West (13), James Bolden (12) and Wesley Harris (11) also reached double figures.

Sophomore center Sagaba Konate once again got into early foul trouble and spent most of the first half on the bench. He finished with 5 points, five rebounds and five blocks.

NJIT (4-3) got 13 points from Anthony Tarke and 12 from Diandre Wilson

# Noteboo

- WVU's 102 points was the second time the Mountaineers eclipsed the century mark in 2017-18. West Virginia scored 111 points in a victory against Morgan State earlier in the season.
- NJIT was the 174th different team to play a game against WVU in the Coliseum (non-exhibition). WVU is 138-36 against teams making their first appearance in the Coliseum.

# Recap

Senior guard Jevon Carter scored a game-high 23 points to lead the 18th-ranked Mountaineers to a 68-61 victory over No. 15 Virginia before 12,816 at the WVU Coliseum.

It was West Virginia's second straight victory over Virginia, the Mountaineers knocking off the sixth-ranked Cavaliers 66-57 in Charlottesville a year earlier.

"That was two teams that guarded," Huggins said afterward. "They guard different than us but they do a great job and that's what makes this game such a great game."

Carter out-dueled Virginia's Kyle Guy, a former Indiana Mr.
Basketball who missed his first six shots of the game before heating up in the second half. Guy made three straight 3s during a minute-and-a-half stretch, the third coming in transition, to give Virginia a 41-39 lead with 12:49 remaining.

Carter answered Guy's 3 with a 3 at the other end and then Daxter Miles Jr. made a pair of free throws to make it a three-point lead, 44-41.

Virginia (8-1) led 45-44 and tied the game at 51 and 56 with 4:51 remaining. Lamont West, who finished with 22, unknotted the score with a jumper. A Sagaba Konate block of Guy's layup try and a Carter rebound of Guy's 3-point miss gave the Mountaineers possession of the basketball with 3:11 remaining.

Huggins called timeout to draw up a play for West, who drilled his fourth 3 with 2:59 remaining to push West Virginia's lead to five, 61-56.

Ty Jerome hit a 3 to make it a two-point game with 2:34 to go.
Following another stoppage of play with 1:27 remaining, the
Mountaineers got more points when Jerome fouled West. He made both
free throws to make it a four-point advantage with 1:11 to go.

At the other end, Daxter Miles Jr. made a terrific steal and got the ball to Carter, who was fouled by Guy with 44 seconds to go. Carter's two free throws made it a six-point lead. Hall's 3 to halve the Mountaineers' lead was unsuccessful, Carter grabbed the rebound and was fouled by Guy with 27 seconds left.

He hit one of two this time to make it a seven-point lead. Following a Hall jumper and two more Carter free throws, Miles iced it with another steal underneath the basket.

The game was played at Virginia's pace throughout, but especially in the first half when both teams struggled to make shots and WVU led 29-26 at intermission.

WVU's biggest lead was eight, 29-21, with 1:29 when Wesley Harris followed Konate's miss, but Virginia scored five straight, two of those coming with 0.7 seconds left at the free throw line when Konate fouled De'Andre Hunter as he was scrambling to retrieve a loose ball.

# Notebook

 This was the first time Virginia has played in Morgantown since the 1985 NIT, and it was the first regular season appearance at the Coliseum since coach Bob Huggins was a WVU player 41 years ago.

West Virginia had little trouble with Pitt when guards Jevon Carter and Daxter Miles Jr. were in the game.

When they weren't, well, that was different story.

With Carter and Miles sitting on the bench with four fouls, Pitt nearly erased an 18-point second half deficit, but when Carter and Miles returned, so did the Mountaineers' lead.

Carter and Miles scored the game's remaining six points to power the 18th-ranked Mountaineers to a 69-60 victory in the renewal of the Backyard Brawl at the Petersen Events Center.

The Panthers had a 38-32 advantage on the backboard, and a much wider disparity at the free throw line.

Pitt used those fouls to pile up a 31-9 advantage in free throws, the Panthers hitting 22 of them to stay in the game.

In the first half, the free throw line was about the only way Pitt could score. The Panthers made five of their 22 first-half field goal attempts but hit 15-of-21 from the line.

In the second half, Pitt went on a 9-2 run after Carter was called for his fourth foul with 9:12 remaining. A Ryan Luther tip-in followed by a Marcus Carr four-point play pulled Pitt to within two, 61-59.

Harris fouled Carr on his made 3 and retired to the bench with his fifth foul with 5:31 to go.

Sophomore Sagaba Konate answered Carr's play when he rebounded a missed shot from the corner and scored from the baseline. Carter's only points of the second half came moments later to make it 65-59, West

After one Shamiel Stevenson free throw, Miles Jr. scored on a reverse layup with 2:32 remaining, forcing Pitt to use a 30-second timeout.

When play resumed, Luther couldn't get a tip-in to go down and Carter grabbed the rebound. At the other end, following a 30-second WVU timeout, Miles Jr. hit another driving layup with 1:39 to go.

Stewart and Luther missed 3s on Pitt's final two possessions. The Mountaineers never trailed.

Carter led everyone with 19; Miles Jr. added 15, West contributed 13 and James Bolden came off the bench to score 10.

West Virginia forced 10 turnovers in the first half but ended the game with just 14.

West Virginia was headed toward its worst shooting night at the Coliseum in nearly a decade when freshman forward Teddy Allen decided to take matters into his own hands.

His four-point play from the corner with 5:02 remaining in the first half briefly snapped the 10th-ranked Mountaineers out of their shooting funk and ignited them to a 77-38 victory over winless Coppin State in front of 8.102 in Morgantown.

Before Allen's 3-point basket and free throw, the rest of his teammates were shooting right around 20 percent, which is what the Mountaineers shot in a miserable 23-point loss to Cincinnati at the Coliseum back on Jan. 30, 2008.

Then Allen scored those four, plus 14 more to turn a slim 18-17 WVU lead into a 22-point halftime advantage. Coppin State (0-12) made just one free throw over the remaining five minutes of the first half and barely had more field goals (four) than flagrant 1 fouls were called for the game. The Eagles made only seven more field goals the rest of the night.

At the end of the first half, Allen followed up Miles Jr.'s miss from the corner just ahead of the horn.

He added six more points in the second half to finish with a career-

Allen took 19 shots for the game and was hunting for more points with 7:50 remaining and the Mountaineers leading by 36 when he tried a 3-point shot from about 45 feet.

After that miss, Huggins sent senior Daxter Miles Jr. back into the game to give his charismatic freshman a little breather.

Miles Jr. became the 52nd player in school history to score 1,000 points with his 3-pointer early in the second half.

Guard James Bolden came off the bench to score 12 and Miles finished with 11. Jevon Carter had 14 points and seven rebounds.

A total of 124 shots were attempted and 89 were missed. Coppin State shot 23.4 percent while West Virginia was not much better, hitting only 31.2 percent.

The two teams were credited with 97 combined rebounds. One positive tonight for West Virginia was its press, which forced 28 turnovers and generated 13 steals.

# Recap

Led by six players in double figures and a career-high 12 assists by senior guard Jevon Carter, No. 10 West Virginia took down visiting Fordham, 86-69, at the WVU Coliseum.

Carter finished with 10 points to go along with his dozen dimes, producing his fifth career double-double. Sophomore forward Sagaba Konate also recorded a double-double in the win, scoring 12 points and tallying a career-high 11 rebounds.

Carter took the unselfish approach from the opening tip against the pesky Rams (5-7), which are led by former WVU assistant coach Jeff Neubauer, registering back-to-back assists in the opening minutes of the game. The Maywood, Illinois, native sent a nice feed down to the low block for an easy finish by sophomore forward Lamont West, before finding senior guard Daxter Miles Jr. for a 3-pointer to give the Mountaineers a 10-7 lead.

The Mountaineers made six of eight field goals at one point in the first half, but they turned the ball over four times during that span. That allowed Fordham to hang around and even take a 16-15 lead at the 13:25 mark of the first half

Then, the Rams' shooting went cold. Fordham was held without a field goal for over six minutes, which allowed WVU to build a lead. The Mountaineers received three buckets by sophomore guard James Bolden, one of which came from beyond the arc, as well as a 3-pointer by sophomore forward Wesley Harris and a three-point-play by Konate.

Later on, it was the Mountaineers' turn to cool off from the field. WVU made just 2 of its last 11 shots to close the half, allowing Fordham to take a 9-2 run into the locker room. Carter got a layup to fall with just seconds left on the clock to give WVU a slim 46-39 halftime lead.

Fordham made just 10 first-half field goals, but five of them came from downtown. The Rams also went 14 of 16 from the free-throw line in the first half.

The Mountaineers stormed out of the gates to start the second half, though, scoring seven of the first nine points to bump their lead up to 53-41. Then, roles reversed a bit as WVU went without a field goal for over four minutes around the midway point in the half, sparking another opportunistic Ram run.

Miles finished with a team-high 21 points in the win.

From there, sophomore guard Chase Harler swished a 3 with 3:59 to play, giving WVU an 11-point lead that it wouldn't surrender. Then, Miles scored a pretty, fast-break bucket off a nice pass from Carter on the team's next possession.

With the win, WVU improved to 11-1 for the fourth consecutive season, while head coach Bob Huggins earned his 830th career victory, tying longtime Mount St. Mary's coach Jim Phelan for seventh place all-time on the NCAA Division I basketball wins list.

# Recap

Seventh-ranked West Virginia withstood some torrid first-half shooting from Oklahoma State to outlast the Cowboys, 85-79, before 8,257 at Gallagher Iba Arena in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

The game turned WVU's way midway through the second half when Bob Huggins made an offensive adjustment by putting freshman forward Teddy Allen in the soft spot of the Cowboy defense near the basket and he responded with a team-high 15 points, 13 of those coming in the second half when the Mountaineers had fallen behind 58-51 with 13:33 remaining.

Allen went to work in the lane where his teammates had struggled mightily for most of the night to score close to the basket. He converted a traditional three-point play and that loosened up the defense enough to allow teammate Sagaba Konate more room to operate along the baseline. Konate added three straight baskets during a three-minute stretch to tie the game at 60, and Daxter Miles Jr. added two free throws to give WVU a 62-60 lead.

Lindy Waters momentarily gave the lead back to Oklahoma State with a 3, but Allen responded with another dose one to key a 6-0 spurt to push the Mountaineer lead out to four, 67-63.

The margin swelled to seven when Jevon Carter banged a wide-open 3, one of just two field goals he made for the night. Maciej Bender grabbed a big offensive rebound ahead of Carter's triple when he secured Wesley Harris' wild 3-point try from the corner and the ball eventually got to Carter wide open on the wing.

Two Carter free throws with 3:11 remaining gave the Mountaineers a nine-point advantage, their biggest of the game. Oklahoma State forward Mitchell Solomon, who gave WVU fits all night, was called for his fifth foul and exited the game.

But the Cowboys (10-3, 0-1) fought back, OSU eventually getting a three-point play from Brandon Averette to reduce West Virginia's lead to two, 81-79, with 34 seconds remaining.

Sophomore guard James Bolden was fouled at the other end by Waters with 23 seconds left and made both free throws.

A missed 3 by Jeffery Carroll was rebounded by Konate, who was immediately fouled by Waters. Konate made his two free throws with 12 seconds left and then Harris stole the inbound pass, which allowed the Mountaineers to run out the clock.

West Virginia (12-1, 1-0) was 27 of 32 from the line (19 of 21 in the second half) and out-rebounded the Cowboys, 22-12, after halftime to finish with a plus-three margin on the glass. The Mountaineers also forced 21 Cowboy turnovers, although they committed 18 themselves.

### Recap

Bob Huggins reached back to his basketball past to help West Virginia win its 13th straight game at Kansas State.

He dusted off the old back-door play he once learned from his father Charlie Huggins and legendary high school coach Ed McCluskey to get the Wildcats moving on defense and the result was a 77-69 Mountaineer victory before 9,712 at Bramlage Coliseum.

WVU's two-game road swing through Oklahoma and Kansas resulted in a pair of significant Big 12 road wins for the now sixth-ranked Mountaineers, winners of 13 in a row following their season-opening, 23-point loss to Texas A&M in Germany.

West Virginia used 22 points off the bench from its sensation freshman forward Teddy Allen.

Allen's scoring in the second half, particularly at the free throw line where he made 6 of 7, kept Kansas State (II-3, 1-1) from getting any closer than four points with 3:32 remaining on Dean Wade's layup.

At the other end, Allen hit two free throws to push the lead back to six, and following a Kamau Stokes missed 3, Allen made two more charities when he was fouled by Brian Patrick with 2:18 to go.

The Mountaineers' biggest lead of the game was 11, 77-66, on a Daxter Miles Jr. driving layup with 37 seconds remaining.

West Virginia made up for its 18 turnovers by shooting 53.6 percent from the floor, hitting 13 of 16 from the free throw line, and out-rebounding the Wildcats 38-27.

Kansas State, which scored 91 three nights earlier at lowa State, struggled to make shots against West Virginia's half-court defense this evening. The Wildcats made just 28 percent in the first half and finished the game only slightly better at 35.6 percent.

Forward Xavier Sneed led Kansas State with 20, 17 of those coming in the second half.

Dean Wade, Barry Brown and Stokes scored 17, 14 and 6 points respectively.

In addition to Allen's 22, Lamont West contributed 19, while James Bolden and Miles Jr. added 10 each.

Senior guard Jevon Carter had a second-consecutive off night, hitting just 1 of 7 from the floor and finishing with 3 points. He did hand out 10 assists and grab eight rebounds.

# Notebook

- WVU opened Big 12 play with two consecutive road games for the fifth consecutive year. During that stretch, the Mountaineers posted a 9-1 record. Their only loss was an overtime buzzer beater at Texas Tech during the 2016-17 season.
- WVU improved to 3-3 in games at Kansas State.
- The Mountaineers have now won eight of the last against Kansas State.

Earlier in the week, West Virginia coach Bob Huggins was so unhappy with his team's enthusiasm that he threw them out of practice.

Against Oklahoma, they got the message.

WVU sent wave after wave of defenders at Oklahoma's terrific freshman guard Trae Young and the result was a satisfying 89-76 victory over the No. 7-ranked Sooners at the WVU Coliseum.

Young got his average of 29 points per game, but it took him 22 shots and 13 free throws to get it. He missed 14, including 9 of 12 misfires from 3 and turned the ball over eight times.

Carter limited him to only nine first-half points before picking up three quick fouls in the second half to retire to the bench with 13:30 remaining and the Sooners leading 53-51.

But teammates Daxter Miles Jr., James Bolden and Teddy Allen were outstanding in Carter's absence, and West Virginia went on an 18-6 run over a six-minute span to take a commanding 69-59 lead when Sagaba Konate banged in an open jumper from the foul line with 7:42 left.

Then it was Allen, then Konate and then Allen again as WVU matched the nation's top-ranked scoring offense basket for basket.

A quick four-point burst did pull the Sooners to within six with 2:42 to go, but Carter now back in the game, answered with a layup to push the lead back to eight, 80-72.

Young's missed layup at the other end resulted in an easy basket for Miles Jr. at the other end on a baseball pass from Carter to return West Virginia's lead to double digits.

Once more, West Virginia was tremendous at the free throw line coming down the stretch, the Mountaineers hitting all four charities inside of a minute to go and converting 18-of-21 for the game.

The unheralded freshman in the game, WVU's Teddy Allen, continued his outstanding play in Big 12 action with a team-best 20 points on 9-of-11 shooting coming off the bench.

Carter finished with 17 points, 10 assists, seven rebounds and three steals. He scored 12 straight points for the Mountaineers during one stretch late in the first half and was on pace for a triple-double with 14 points, seven rebounds and six assists at halftime.

West contributed 17 points and sophomore forward Sagaba Konate finished with 16 points, a career-high 13 rebounds and five blocks. On several occasions in the second half, Oklahoma chose to back off of Konate and allowed him to shoot wide-open jumpers. Bolden finished with six but handled the point efficiently in the second half when Carter was on the bench in foul trouble.

 It was the sixth time WVU hosted a game when both teams were ranked in the AP Top 10. It was the third time since 2016 and fifth time under Bob Huggins.

# Recap

Second-ranked West Virginia didn't make a lot of shots, but it made just enough of them to hang on for a tough, 57-54 victory over upset-minded Baylor at the WVU Coliseum.

Jevon Carter's 3-pointer near the Mountaineer bench with 56 seconds remaining gave West Virginia a 54-51 lead. At the other end, Manu Lecomte missed his 3-point try, which was rebounded by James Bolden. Lecomte fouled Carter with 23 seconds left to send Carter to the line with an opportunity to give WVU a two-possession lead.

He missed the front end of the one-and-one but Sagaba Konate grabbed the rebound and got the ball out to Daxter Miles Jr. He was fouled by Lecomte with 16 seconds left and Miles Jr. only managed to get one of two to go down to make it 55-51.

Jake Lindsey's 3 with six seconds remaining allowed Baylor to call timeout to set up its defense, trailing by one. Tyson Jolly fouled Carter on the inbounds play and Carter sank both free throws with four seconds remaining

Baylor coach Scott Drew tried the old Valparaiso play his father Homer Drew once used successfully in the 1998 NCAA Tournament to defeat Ole Miss. Lecomte was the recipient of the mid-court relay pass from Jo Lual-Acuil Jr. but his 3-point shot to tie the game from near the Baylor bench hit the other side of the backboard.

West Virginia (15-1, 4-0) never led by more than four and didn't take its first lead until the beginning of the second half on a Lamont West jumper.

Baylor (II-5, 1-3) led by as many as nine in the first half when West Virginia was struggling to make shots, but the Bears weren't making many either and couldn't shake free.

Trailing 24-17 after Lual-Acuil Jr.'s stick-back basket, the Mountaineers got back-to-back 3s from West and reserve guard Chase Harler to make it a three-point game, 26-23.

Harler's 3 came after Konate made a fantastic block on Terry Maston's driving layup. Konate was able to grab the ball before it hit the glass and that basketball made its way down the floor to Harler standing wide open in the corner.

Konate eventually tied the game at 26 on a short jumper with 1:50 left and it remained tied at 29 at the break.

Both teams struggled close to the basket, West Virginia converting on 31.1 percent of its field goal tries (19 of 61) and Baylor connecting on 35.8 percent of its 53 field goal attempts. Both were considerably better away from the basket behind the 3-point arc, however; West Virginia made 10-of-25 for 40 percent and Baylor hit 8-of-21 for 38.1 percent.

# Recap

West Virginia's 15-game winning streak, the longest since 1988-89 and the longest of any team in the country in 2017-18, has ended.. Eighth-ranked Texas Tech made the plays down the stretch, West Virginia didn't, and the Red Raiders closed out the second-ranked Mountaineers, 72-71, at United Superemarkets Arena.

West Virginia hit its Iull at the 13-minute mark leading by 11. A three-minute scoring drought allowed the Red Raiders to pull to within two, 47-45, before two Esa Ahmad free throws ended Tech's 9-0 run.

West Virginia (15-2, 4-1) then led by five twice, at 53-48 and at 55-50 before the Red Raiders scored six in a row to take a 58-57 lead with 5:40 remaining.

The lead swelled to three on Keenan Evans' layup, but Wesley Harris answered with a wide open 3 to tie it at 60.

Twice, the teams exchanged baskets. Brandone Francis nailed a 3 to make it 63:60, but West Virginia answered with Ahmad's 3.

Jarrett Culver then got to the rim for two and Carter tied it 20 seconds later at 65.

An Ahmad foul marched Niem Stevenson to the line where he made both with 2:07 remaining. Leading 68-66, Evans made the game's biggest basket with 39 seconds left to put the Red Raiders ahead by four, 70-66 - this coming after Lamont West missed a 3.

Carter couldn't get his jumper to go down, leading to Konate's foul on Norense Odiase with 29 seconds remaining. He made one of two, but a missed Ahmad 3 led to another free throw by Zhaire Smith put the Red Raider ahead by six with 15 seconds remaining.

The two telling stats were West Virginia's field goal shooting (39 percent) and Texas Tech's free throw shooting (24 of 28 for 85.7 percent).

The Red Raiders (15-2, 4-1) also finished 50 percent shooting for the game (22 of 44) after shooting just 40 percent in the first half. Evans led Texas Tech with 20

Carter led everyone with 28 points on 10 of 22 shooting, while Ahmad, playing his first game of the season following his NCAA-imposed suspension, added 18.

# *Recap*

Svi Mykhailiuk scored 17 points and Devonte Graham added 16 to power 10th-ranked Kansas to a 71-66 come-from-behind victory over sixth-ranked West Virginia at the WVU Coliseum

For the second game in a row, West Virginia couldn't hang on to a double-digit lead in the second half. Two days earlier, the Mountaineers led Texas Tech 38-31 at halftime and had the Red Raiders on the ropes down 11 with 13 minutes to go. Tech stormed back to win that one 72-71.

This time, the Mountaineers had a double-figure margin with eight minutes remaining before hitting a lull that saw their nine-point lead evaporate to one in a matter of just 60 ticks of the game clock.

An Esa Ahmad two-point jumper, later changed to a three, gave the Mountaineers a 60-51 lead with 5:54 remaining. Then Mykhailiuk was left alone for a 3, his second in a row, a missed Ahmad 3 led to a pair of Malik Newman free throws and then an Ahmad turnover resulted in a Graham 3 to make it a one point game, 60-59.

Two Mykhailiuk free throws gave Kansas its first lead since the 14:53 mark of the first half, and then a Graham layup made it a three-point margin with 3:17 left.

Back-to-back baskets by Ahmad and Jevon Carter briefly put the Mountaineers back ahead, 65-64, but Mykhailiuk answered with another basket 18 seconds later.

When Carter couldn't get another jumper to go down, Mykhailiuk grabbed the rebound and was fouled by Wesley Harris. Two more Mykhailiuk free throws made it 67-64.

Additional Mountaineer misses were retrieved by Lamont West and Ahmad that eventually led to Konate getting fouled by Udoka Azubuike with 1:01 to go · his fifth.

Konate missed the free throw, but Daxter Miles Jr. slipped free to tip it in to make it a one-point game, 67-66. At the other end Mitch Lightfoot was credited with a goal-tend basket, and Malik Newman free throws eventually sewed it up for the Jayhawks.

West Virginia's second half was not nearly as good as its first when the Mountaineers built a double-digit lead and frequently had the capacity crowd of 14,115 out of their seats.

The Mountaineers (15-3, 4-2) turned the ball over 16 times and forced Kansas to commit 13, just three of those coming after halftime.

Sagaba Konate (7 of 10) and Ahmad (5 of 8) shot the ball effectively dose to the basket, but West Virginia's primary outside shooters struggled mightily.

# Notebook

 Kansas, which snapped its four-game WVU Coliseum losing streak, got points on all five of its remaining possessions while shooting 51.9 percent in the second half.

# Recap

Sixth-ranked West Virginia used 15-0 run during a four-minute stretch in the second half to run away with an 86-51 victory over Texas here at the WVU Coliseum.

Texas, 12-7, 3-4, hit a wall right after Dylan Osetkowski's dunk off of Kerwin Roach's steal that pulled the Longhorns to within eight, 45-37, with 11:32 remaining in the game.

Then, West Virginia (16-3, 5-2) hit its next nine shots, including 3s from Jevon Carter, James Bolden and Daxter Miles Jr., as the Mountaineers built their lead to 23, then to 26, 29, 31 and finally to 35 as the Longhorns continued to miss shot after shot.

Texas took 50 shot attempts for the game and missed 33 of those from just about everywhere  $\cdot$  12 out of 15 from 3, 21 out of 35 from two and the Longhorns even eight out of 22 from the free throw line.

It got so bad for Texas in the second half that 6-foot-11 center Mohamed Bamba jacked a 3 in frustration from the top of the key that ended up turning into three more points for the Mountaineers when Carter, who finished with a game-high 22 points on 8-of-18 shooting, banged in his fourth 3.

Before the Mountaineers got hot in the second half, it was a fairly dose contest with both teams struggling to make shots. The game was tied at 20 when WVU pulled ahead on free throws from Lamont West and a Carter field goal.

A Carter 3 boosted West Virginia's lead to eight, and Esa Ahmad's layup gave the Mountaineers their first double-digit advantage with 1:53 remaining in the first half.

Bolden did most of the damage before intermission by scoring nine of his 19 points on three 3s. He left the floor late in the first half when he limped into the training room, but he returned to play a good portion of the second half.

The Mountaineers, despite giving up several inches per man near the basket, outrebounded Texas, 45-29, including a 14-6 edge on the offensive glass which led to 22 second-chance points.

West Virginia also outscored Texas' bench, 33·14, with 27 of those coming from Bolden and Ahmad. One more interesting stat from today's game: West Virginia took more field goals (18) than Texas made (17) for the afternoon.

Miles Jr. contributed 15 points and sophomore Sagaba Konate continues to blossom with 10 points, a career-high 14 rebounds and six blocks while going head-to-head against Bamba.

Bamba finished with 9 points, 13 rebounds and four blocks in 32 minutes of action

# Recap

Alex Robinson scored 17 points, handed out nine assists and pulled down seven rebounds to lead TCU to an 82-73 victory over seventh-ranked West Virginia at Schollmaier Arena in Fort Worth, Texas.

TCU, coming off a five-point defeat at Kansas State and out of the top 25 for the first time this year, played like a team in desperate need of a victory with five Big 12 losses.

"A bad game," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said afterward. "I wish I had more answers."

Desmond Bane added 15 and Vladimir Brodziansky contributed 14 points and 10 rebounds.

West Virginia (16-4, 5-3) began the night making eight out of its first 16 shots from the floor to build a seven-point lead, 31-24, on Lamont West's 3

Then the lid went on the basket and it never came off.

The Mountaineers ended the half making only five out of their next 21 shots, and then began the first six minutes of the second half without a field goal as the Horned Frogs built their lead to 11.

It swelled to 15 on a Shawn Olden 3, then to 17 on another Olden 3 and eventually to 20 on a pair of Vladimir Brodziansky free throws with 7:14 remaining.

TCU, down to just one healthy ball handler after the season-ending injury to regular point guard Jaylen Fisher, was never really bothered by West Virginia's press because the Mountaineers simply couldn't make enough shots to get into it.

Robinson played 39 minutes running the point and turned the ball over five times, but almost had a triple-double in his head-to-head matchup against Jevon Carter, who finished with 16 points, seven assists and six rebounds. But Carter needed 18 shots to get his 16 points.

Senior Daxter Miles Jr. missed eight of his first nine shots before hitting four of his final seven during garbage time. He scored 12.

Sophomore forward Sagaba Konate was five-of-11 from the floor and finished with 14

Lamont West was three-of-seven shooting and just two-of-five from the free throw line for II.

"We're going to get better because we're going to try and make them get better, but they've got to want to," Huggins said. "It's not about the game; it's about the preparation for the game."
