## Game Notables

- Today's game matches up two of the three active SEC coaches who have recorded at least 100 regular-season league victories in Kentucky's Matthew Mitchell (107) and South Carolina's Dawn Staley (107). The two leaders, in their 11th and 10th seasons, respectively, are among just eight coaches all-time have amassed at least 100 SEC regular-season victories at one school.
- As national player of the year candidate A'ja Wilson closes in on the program's all-time scoring record (84 points away), it should be noted that she is just the 13th player since the NCAA began tracking stats (1981-82) to record 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds while playing her entire career in the SEC. The senior forward is also nearing the 1,000-point mark in SEC regular-season games only.
- Starting guards Tyasha Harris and Bianca Jackson have stepped up their offensive contributions and efficiency in the last five games as both average double figures and are shooting over 40.0 percent from 3-point range. Harris has been the most consistent, averaging 13.2 points over the stretch, including at least 15 points in each of the last three outings, during which she shot 7-of-12 from 3-point range. Jackson has been in double figures three of the last five games to average 10.2 points in that time, including 8 -of-19 3-point shooting and a 20 -point outing against \#1/1 UConn

## Kentucky Series Notes

Kentucky leads the series 33-29, but the Gamecocks have won the last seven and 10 of the last 12 contests. South Carolina is 13-9 against Kentucky in the Dawn Staley era.

In this season's earlier meeting in Lexington, the Gamecocks saw the return of A'ja Wilson after missing two games with an ankle injury, and she celebrated with 26 points, eight rebounds, four blocks and three steals. The Gamecocks opened the game cold from the field, hitting just 4 -of- 16 in the first quarter, but went on to hit 28-of-37 (.757) over the rest of the game. A 21-8 second quarter that saw Wilson and Alexis Jennings go a combined 6 -of-8 from the field established what proved to be an insurmountable lead.

## Holding Home Court

The Gamecocks are 433-157 all-time on their home court, including a 190-63 mark in Colonial Life Arena. South Carolina is $126-29$ at home during the Dawn Staley era and has lost just four times in its last 80 home games, including undefeated home seasons in 2013-14 and 2014-15. The Gamecocks have won 38 of their last 40 SEC regular-season home games dating back to the 2012-13 season.

## Ranked Readings

With a 5-5 mark this season, South Carolina is 55-50 against nationally ranked opponents under head coach Dawn Staley, although that record is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure as the Gamecocks are 40-11 versus ranked foes since the start of the 2014-15 campaign. South Carolina is 17-8 against top-10 opponents during that time.

Senior forward A'ja Wilson leads the Gamecocks against ranked foes, averaging 21.0 points and 12.7 rebounds. Sophomore Tyasha Harris' offense has been especially potent against the nation's best teams as she is second on the team with 13.8 points per game while still averaging 5.6 assists. All three of her 20-point games have come against ranked teams, including her seasonhigh 28 against \#6/6 Tennessee (Jan. 14).

## SEC Stories

Head coach Dawn Staley has built the Gamecocks into a consistent SEC contender with four straight regular-season titles, shirking decades of difficulty in the nation's best women's basketball conference.

In her 10th SEC season at the helm, Staley boasts a 107-48 (.690) conference regular-season record and has finished outside the league's top five just twice an unprecedented achievement for a program that had finished INSIDE the top five only two times in the previous 17 seasons. Staley's 107 wins include now seven seasons of double-digit league victories - 10 in 2012; 11 in 2013; 14 in 2014; 15 in 2015; 16 in 2016; 14 in 2017; and 10 in 2018 - and account for 62.5 percent of the program's all-time 171 league wins.

Staley's SEC regular-season record includes a 57-20 (.740) mark at home and a 50-28 (.641) slate on the road.

## WHAT THEY'RE SAYING

"She's so mobile, and she's long enough to get to places. Even if you're in great defensive position, she can still get to places. It makes it easy for her to get shots. We had to double her a lot, and that's a sign of respect from most coaches if they have to double you. You look at all the things she's done for her team. I don't think there's another player in the country like her from a collegiate or pro standpoint. Her ability to dribble the basketball, consistently make outside shots, rebound the basketball on both sides of the court." - Dawn Staley, South Carolina Head Coach

## Staley Staying Power

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley is in her 10th season at the helm after guiding the Gamecocks into the postseason seven times in her first nine seasons in Columbia, including the 2017 National Championship and five other Sweet 16 berths.

With a .715 (414-165) winning percentage over her 18 seasons as a head coach, Staley is 24th among active NCAA Div. I head coaches with at least 10 years of experience and is the best among SEC head coaches.

Staley is the third-longest tenured coach currently in the SEC, and her 10.8 league wins per season is best among the group. During the Gamecocks' quadrennial of dominance (SEC regular-season champions 201417), the program won 14.8 conference games per season.

With her 100th SEC regular-season victory coming against Auburn on Jan. 11, 2018, Staley became the eighth head coach all-time to record at least 100 such wins with one school.

## Rankings Review

South Carolina is ranked eighth in this week's Associated Press Poll, making it the 107th consecutive entry for the Gamecocks in the poll - the fifth-longest active streak in the nation.

The Gamecocks have spent 83 straight weeks in the nation's top 10 and are one of just three teams to have stayed among the nation's top 10 every week since the start of the 2014-15 season. In the 72 polls since the start of the 2014-15 season, South Carolina has spent 59 in the top five, trailing UConn's 71 and Notre Dame's 59 such weeks.

## Tough Road Ahead

South Carolina's 2017-18 schedule includes 11 games against teams ranked in this week's Associated Press and/or USA Today Coaches Poll. Just one of those games - at \#11/11 Tennessee (Feb. 25) - remain for the Gamecocks, who went 5-5 in the first 10 outings.

## Missing Persons Report

Beginning the season with a roster that returned just two starters and two other significant contributors to last season's national championship, South Carolina has played through a series of injuries to some of its primary players. Excluding senior guard Bianca Cuevas-Moore, who is out of the season, at least one Gamecock was out of the lineup with injury in 12 of the South Carolina's first 24 games. Leading scorer A'ja Wilson accounted for two of those 12 games with her ankle injury. Before she was deemed out for the season on Feb. 11, primary outside shooter Lindsey Spann missed a combined nine
games with separate knee injuries. Mikiah Herbert Harrigan missed three January games with a bone bruise.

In fact, the Gamecocks have had their full complement of players available in just five of their 10 games against nationally ranked opponents.

## RPI Rating

The SEC is once again among the best women's basketball conferences in the nation, leading the nation with seven teams among the top 30 in RPI, including South Carolina at 15 . Six of the seven are also ranked in both the AP and USA Today Coaches Poll this week.

Mississippi State has the top RPI in the league in third with Tennessee coming in 10th. Missouri (16), Texas A\&M (17), LSU (27) and Georgia (28) are also in the RPI top 30 .

## Buckets, Boards and Blocks

Few players in the country are as versatile as South Carolina senior forward A'ja Wilson. Averaging 22.6 points, 11.6 rebounds and 3.5 blocks, she ranks eighth, 12th and third in the nation in those categories, respectively, making her the only player in the nation's top 30 in all three of those categories.

Only eight players in the nation are among the top 50 in both scoring and rebounding with only Megan Gustafson, Iowa ( $24.8 \mathrm{ppg}, 1 \mathrm{st} / 12.8 \mathrm{rpg}$, 5th) outranking Wilson in both categories.

Reading defenses more quickly than before, Wilson has also responded to her head coach's challenge to expand her skill set, improving her ball-handling to allow her to rebound and immediately start the fast break and even run the offense from the point guard position at times and developing consistency on her outside shot, of which she has hit 5-of-11 from 3-point range. The growth in her game helps both the Gamecocks, as opponents will have a more difficult time locating her for double-teaming, and Wilson's preparedness for the next step in her basketball career.

## Youth Movement

Despite the long-time dominance and presence of this season's senior class of A'ja Wilson and Bianca Cuevas-Moore, the Gamecocks are, in fact, an extremely young team. With Wilson and Cuevas-Moore, only Doniyah Cliney had been in the program more than one season, and she averaged just 15.7 minutes over the first two seasons of her career.

With Cuevas-Moore out for the season and several others missing various games due to injury, South Carolina has relied heavily on its three-member

freshman class of LeLe Grissett, Bianca Jackson and LaDazhia Williams.

In SEC play alone, that trio has been on the court 18.0 minutes per game. That is the most time a Gamecock freshman class has played since 2012-13 freshmen Asia Dozier, Tiffany Mitchell and Khadijah Sessions played 19.4 minutes per SEC game.

In the Gamecocks' 27 seasons in the SEC, only eight freshman classes have logged more minutes than the current group. Three of those eight have come under Staley - 2009-10 (20.9 mpg), 2012-13 (19.4 mpg) and 2008-09 ( 20.9 mpg ).

## Quarter Breakdown

Through 26 games this season, South Carolina has out-scored its opponent in all but 28 quarters and has out-paced its opponent by double digits 41 times in the 104 quarters, including a season-high differential of 22 points (27-5) in the first quarter against Alabama State (Nov. 10).

South Carolina has shot at least 50.0 percent from the field 49 times in its 104 quarters of action, led by a its 81.8 ( 9 -of-11) percent accuracy in the third quarter at Kentucky (Jan. 21).

Defensively, South Carolina has held an opponent to single digits in a quarter 17 times this season with five of those quarters resulting in five or fewer points, including a program-record low of three points by Savannah State (Dec. 17) in the third quarter. An opponent has shot to 20.0 percent or less from the field in 16 quarters, including a program-record low of 5.6 percent by College of Charleston (Dec. 5) in the second quarter.

Individually, A'ja Wilson leads the Gamecocks with 12 double-digit scoring quarters and has the highestscoring quarter this season with 18 points in the fourth against \#6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26). Alexis Jennings and Tyasha Harris each have three double-digit quarters with Harris' 13 fourth-quarter points against Florida the most in SEC play. Bianca Jackson and Lindsey Spann each have one quarter of double-digit scoring.

## Heart of a Champion

Among A'ja Wilson's 24 games played this season are 11 in which the margin was under 10 in the fourth quarter - at \#15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13), vs. Rutgers (Nov. 24), vs. \#6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26), \#22/21 Texas A\&M (Dec. 31), at Ole Miss (Jan. 4), at \#15/15 Missouri (Jan. 8), Auburn (Jan. 11), \#11/1 Missouri (Jan. 28), at \#2/2 Mississippi State (Feb. 5), Florida (Feb. 11) and at \#20/19 Georgia (Feb. 15). In those games, fans saw the senior forward step up to show why she impacts the game more than any player in the nation.

In the fourth quarter of those 11 games, Wilson averaged 7.3 points on 54.5 percent shooting to go with 3.1 rebounding, 1.0 block and 0.9 assist averages.

## Location, Location, Location

The Gamecock frontcourt simply reloaded this season, and South Carolina averages 39.4 points in the paint this season, making up 50.1 percent of its offense. In fact, 67.5 percent of the team's made field goals this season have come in the paint.

The Gamecocks are out-pacing their opponents in that space by 13.0 points per game, and their interior advantage has been at least 20 points six times, including twice with a season-high 48 - against Alabama State (Nov. 10) and Western Carolina (Nov. 30). Only six games have seen South Carolina out-scored in the paint this season - vs. \#6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26) 58-42, at \#15/15 Missouri (Jan. 7) 28-34, \#6/6 Tennessee (Jan. 14) 36-44, \#11/11 Missouri (Jan. 28) 18-26, \#1/1 UConn (Feb. 1) 24-36 and at \#20/19 Georgia 38-32 with four of those yielding losses.
South Carolina's starting frontcourt - whatever the combination has been (Jennings/Wilson, Jennings/ Herbert Harrigan or Jennings/Grissett) has accounted for 43.0 percent of the Gamecocks' scoring this season, averaging a combined 33.8 points per game.

## Blocking Scheme

South Carolina ranks sixth in the nation with an SEC-best 6.5 blocked shots per game. While the Gamecocks have been atop this category over the last few seasons, the formula this season is slightly different.

Instead of being dominated by two Gamecocks, nine different members of the team have recorded at least one blocked shot this season with four logging double-digit blocks.

Senior forward A'ja Wilson ranks third in the nation with an SEC-best 3.5 blocks per game. She has six games of five or more blocks, including a season-high eight at Temple (Dec. 21) and her SEC-season high of seven against Arkansas (Jan. 25).
Behind Wilson, sophomore Mikiah Herbert Harrigan is ninth in the league at 1.1 blocks per game with junior Alexis Jennings in 13th at 1.0 per game.

## They're Free, Take Two!

Built around an inside presence for the last three seasons, South Carolina retains its annual spot among the top teams in free throws made and attempted this season.

The Gamecocks are fourth in the nation in free throw attempts (591) and 11th in free throws made (403). The Gamecocks have attempted 25 or more free throws 11 times this season, including a season-high 35 at \#20/19 Georgia (Feb. 15).
Senior forward A'ja Wilson leads the Gamecocks' parade to the charity stripe, ranking 12th in the nation in free throw attempts (186) and 21st in free throws made (128).

## 52 Pick Up

Preseason All-SEC Second-Team selection Tyasha Harris has heeded her head coach's challenge to expand her game now that "the novelty has worn off," and the sophomore has answered the challenge, picking up her contributions in all aspects of the game this season.

## Starters vs. Bench Points



At 11.9 points per game, Harris is 27 th in the SEC and has more than doubled her freshman year average ( 5.6 ppg ). She has netted double figures 15 times this season with 11 of those coming in SEC play, including a career-high 28 points against \#6/6 Tennessee (Jan. 14). Her 14.2 points per SEC game are 19th in the league and have come on 47.8 percent field goal shooting. With 25 made 3 s already this season, she is just one shy of her 2016-17 season total.

Meanwhile, Harris continues to show great court vision and command of the offense, ranking 19th in the nation with an SEC-best 6.3 assists per game - a number that rises to 6.5 in league play. Her 2.8 assist-toturnover ratio is 15 th in the nation.

Harris has amassed six points-assists double-doubles, a number puts her among just three Gamecocks in the SEC era to record multiple points-assists doubledoubles. Cristina Ciocan leads the group with nine in her career ( 4 in 2002-03, 5 in 2003-04) with Shaunzinski Gortman joining the trio with two in 1999-2000.

Defensively, Harris has become a menace as well with 2.3 steals per game to rank third in the SEC. She has seven games of four or more steals, including a season-high six against Western Carolina (Nov. 30) and Savannah State (Dec. 17).

## Just Jennings

Junior transfer Alexis Jennings has strengthened the Gamecocks' frontcourt, providing a steady, physical presence in the lane. After averaging 8.9 points and 5.4 rebounds in her two seasons at Kentucky, the powerful post has elevated her play this season, posting 12.0 points and 6.9 rebounds per game to rank second on the team and among the SEC's top 25 in both categories.

Jennings is fourth in the SEC in field goal percentage (.605), 16th in the league in rebounding and 25 th in scoring. Two of her four double-doubles this season came against top-15 foes in \#15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13, $12 \mathrm{pts} / 13$ rebs) and \#14/16 Duke (Dec. 3, $21 \mathrm{pts} / 10$ rebs).

Jennings has 12 other double-figure scoring games this season, including three 20 -point outings -25 vs. St. John's (Nov. 25), 27 at Vanderbilt (Jan. 18) and 22
against Arkansas (Jan. 25).

## Utility Player

Junior guard Doniyah Cliney is one of the best examples of Dawn Staley's message to "trust the process." The 6-foot Newark, N.J., product redshirted her first season on campus, only allowed to practice with the team in the second semester. The next season (201516), a preseason hand injury kept her off the court until SEC play began. Still, Cliney worked and absorbed everything she could about what Staley wanted on both sides of the ball.

In 2016-17, she was finally able to participate in the full preseason, and her game was growing. The Gamecocks already had two future WNBA top-10 picks at her position, but Cliney did not let that affect her competitive fire. She figured out what the team needed beyond points, and she committed to excelling at those things.

Now a regular in the Gamecocks' starting lineup, Cliney is the player Staley has marked as a "stat stuffer" because her versatility and athleticism allow her to impact the game in so many ways. Any single number may not jump off the box score, but she will contribute to nearly all of them.
So far this season, Cliney averages 7.8 points, 3.4 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.2 steals. She has nine doublefigure scoring games, including three against ranked opponents (12 vs. \#6/6 Notre Dame, 16 vs. \#22/21 Texas A\&M, 10 at \#2/2 Mississippi State), and nine games of three or more assists.

## Steady Start

The daughter of two NCAA Div. I basketball coaches, freshman guard Bianca Jackson has shown all the poise and development attributed to such progeny, even while thrust into the starting lineup just eight games into her college career due to injuries to seniors Bianca CuevasMoore and Lindsey Spann.
Jackson earned that starting job and her 28.8 minutes per game because of her ability to deliver solid play and contribute what the team needs when it is needed, including hit timely shots or lock down an opponent.

The Montgomery, Ala., native averages 7.2 points, 1.9 assists and 1.0 steals with six double-digit scoring games, including four in SEC action, and eight games of three or more assists.

Jackson showed signs of this clutch play early. She opened her career against her mother's team, Alabama State, with eight points, six rebounds, three assists and two blocks. She was steady in a hostile environment at \#15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13) and handed out seven assists in the rivalry game at Clemson (Nov. 16). In her first career start, she was equally balanced with seven points, four rebounds and three assists against just one turnovers. Against \#14/16 Duke (Dec. 3), the embraced the role of stopper against the Blue Devils' high-scoring 3-point shooter Rebecca Greenwell, limiting her to just eight points and 0 -of-2 from the 3-point line. Against College of Charleston (Dec. 5), she pulled down 10 rebounds, and against \#1/1 UConn (Feb. 1), she poured in a team-high 20 points on 8 -of- 11 shooting. Four days later, she grabbed eight rebounds at \#2/2 Mississippi State (Feb. 5). In a tight, back-and-forth game at \#20/19 Georgia (Feb. 15), Jackson closed strong with a pair of 3 s that opened up a double-digit, fourth-quarter lead.

## Spanning the Distance

Senior transfer Lindsey Spann brings solid experience and leadership to the Gamecocks' young roster, but the biggest impact the 1,000 -point scorer from Penn State had on the team prior to her season-ending injury was from 3-point range.

Claiming eighth place on the Lady Lions' career made 3 s list, the 5 -foot- 6 guard got off to a quick start from long range - leading the SEC in 3-point field goal percentage (.550) and ranking second in the league in made $3 s$ per game (3.1) before missing five games due to injury. Her first field goal attempt upon her return against \#22/21 Texas A\&M (Dec. 31) - was a 3.

After playing in 15 games, including 11 starts, Spann closed her brief Gamecock career shooting 45.2 percent from 3-point range to average 10.3 points per game on 2.53 s per game to go along with 1.5 assists per game.

With a career-high 34 points against No. 6/6 Notre Dame (Nov. 26) following a 32 -point outing at No. 15/13 Maryland (Nov. 13), A'ja Wilson became the first Gamecock to record three 30-point games against nationally ranked opponents. The most recent outing against the Fighting Irish broker her tie with Shannon Johnson, who is the only other Gamecock to record more than one such game against ranked opponents.

With just 10 such games in program history, Wilson and Kaela Davis each recorded one last season, the first new additions to the list since Feb. 15, 2996. Those two games along with Wilson's first entry this season are the only road games on the list. Davis' 37 -point showing at No. 7/6 Ohio State is the highest-scoring game against a ranked opponent in program history.

## Great Gamecock Fans

With over 10,000 season-ticket holders for the third-straight season, South Carolina continues to lead the nation in average attendance at 13,444 and is the
only program drawing at least 10,000 fans per game. The Gamecocks have registered one sellout of 18,000 so far this season (vs. UConn, Feb. 1).

The Gamecocks have posted the highest average attendance in the nation at the end of the last three seasons, averaging at least 12,000 fans in each of those seasons, during which they boast two sellouts of 18,000seat Colonial Life Arena.

## USA Basketball

At least one Gamecock has donned the red, white and blue for USA Basketball in each of the last four summers, and the group has helped six U.S. teams to gold medals. The streak will continue at least the next four years as head coach Dawn Staley was named the Senior National Team head coach for 2017-20.

Current Gamecocks how have contributed to that medal count are current National Team Pool player A'ja Wilson, who has gold medals with the 2013 and 2015 U19 World Cup teams and the 2014 U18 Americas Cup squad; and Alexis Jennings, who picked up bronze in the 2016 FIBA $3 \times 3$ World Cup.

South Carolina hosted the pool of players vying for spots on Staley's U.S. National Team for a minicamp Feb. 9-11 at its practice facility. There, former Gamecocks Allisha Gray and Tiffany Mitchell earned their way into the pool, joining Wilson.

When three-time Olympic gold medalist Dawn Staley took the reins of the University of South Carolina women's basketball program on May 10, 2008, the Gamecocks' stature immediately rose not just in the Southeastern Conference but on the national stage as well. Nine seasons later, Staley delivered on those expectations with the program's first NCAA National Championship in 2017. South Carolina has the fifth-longest active streak of appearances in the Associated Press Top 25, hitting the 100 -week mark on Dec. 25, 2017; and the Gamecocks boast six straight 25-win seasons, which include four SEC regular-season championships, three SEC Tournament titles, two NCAA Final Four appearances and three other Sweet 16 seasons, the program's first ever No. 1 national ranking and a school-record 34 wins in 2014-15. Staley's success has united every demographic in the state of South Carolina as the Gamecocks' fan base tripled over a span of three seasons, and three times led the nation in home attendance.

While her coaching career is blossoming, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified her legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012 and was one of the final nominees for induction to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame the same year. In the summer of 2011, the WNBA recognized her as one of the league's "Top 15," honoring the most influential players in the league's history.

In her 18th season as a head coach, Staley has amassed a 414-165 (.715) record, including her 242-85 (.740) slate in her 10th season at South Carolina. She has led her teams to eight 25 -win seasons, a total of 14 postseason appearances and 76 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 12 in the No. 1 spot. Also a force in USA Basketball, she was named the U.S. Women's National Team head coach for 2017-20 after leading three other U.S. teams to gold medals - 2015 FIBA U19 World Cup, 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Cup, 2007 Pan Am Games - and serving as an assistant on the Senior National Team 2006-08 and again 2014-16, during which the U.S. claimed gold in the 2014 FIBA World Cup and the 2008 and 2016 Olympic Games.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last 10 seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year, a Naismith National Coach of the Year Finalist three times, SEC Coach of the Year three times and BCA Female Coach of the Year. She became the fastest coach to 200 wins in program history, needing just 277 games at South Carolina to do it.

Under Staley's leadership, four Gamecocks have collected eight All-America selections, two have picked up four SEC Player of the Year honors, two have earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition, one has been the SEC 6th Player of the Year and three were named SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 10 Gamecocks who earned All-SEC honors 21 times, including 11 first-team selections, and five Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft, including Alaina Coates who, as the No. 2 pick in 2017, became the highest pick in program history, and three others who earned WNBA All-Rookie Team honors.

On Staley's watch, the Gamecocks are enjoying the most sustained success in program history. After posting back-to-back 25-win seasons in 2011-12 and 2012-13 for the first time in more than 30 years, the 2014-15 team broke the school record with 34 wins. South Carolina won more SEC games than the season before in each of Staley's first seven seasons, culminating in the 2015-16 team recording just the second 16-0 conference record in league history. Staley's 97 SEC wins are more than any other Gamecock coach, accounting for 60.2 percent of the program's total 161 wins over its 26 seasons in the league. She has delivered the only SEC championships in program history, lifting that trophy four times in as many seasons, and she has helped the Gamecocks to six of the program's seven top-four finishes in the SEC. Off the court, Staley's Gamecocks have been active in the community and thriving in the classroom. Every studentathlete who completed her eligibility under Staley at South Carolina has graduated or is on track to graduate, and the team GPA has been over 3.0 for seven of the last eight semesters.
