TEAM NOTES

ABOUT KENTUCKY

- John Calipari once again heads a strong Kentucky team, which was picked to win the SEC this year by the media during the preseason.
- The Wildcats currently rank 16th in the latest RPI standings. With a 17-6 record entering the matchup, UK holds wins over ETSU, Harvard, Virginia Tech, Louisville, Georgia and at West Virginia this season.
- After losing two of its previous three, Kentucky fought back from a 15-point halftime deficit on the road at No. 7 WVU to beat the Mountaineers, 83-76, as part of the Big 12/SEC Challenge on Jan. 27.
- Freshman Kevin Knox, the team's leading scorer on the season at 15.1 ppg, led the charge vs. West Virginia, with a career-high 34 points on 11-of-17 shooting.
- Shai Gilgeous-Alexander is arguably Kentucky's most versatile player, averaging 12.7 ppg, 4.4 apg, 3.6 rpg and 1.7 spg in 31 minutes of action per game.
- Preseason first-team All-SEC guard Hamidou Diallo (12.0 ppg, 4.3 rpg) and PJ Washington (10.3 ppg, 5.1 rpg) round out UK's double-digit scorers.
- The Wildcats enter Tuesday's matchup coming off a loss at Missouri, 69-60. Kentucky struggled to connect from beyond the arc, converting on just two of its 20 attempts from three. Gilgeous-Alexander led the Wildcats with 15 points and six assists.

FAST BREAK

The Volunteers under head coach **Rick Barnes** are a perfect 3-0 at home against bitter rival Kentucky, defeating the Wildcats in Thompson-Boling Arena in 2016, 2017 and 2018.

SERIES NOTES

- The Kentucky series is UT's oldest and most-played among SEC opponents. The Vols and Wildcats first met on Feb. 5, 1910, and have clashed 223 times over the years.
- It has been 10 years since the last time Tennessee came to Rupp Arena ranked higher than Kentucky.
 The third-ranked Vols lost to the unranked Wildcats,
 72-66, at Rupp on Jan 22, 2008.
- No program in college basketball has logged more wins over Kentucky than Tennessee (70).
- Kentucky is one of only four SEC schools (along with Alabama, Arkansas and Missouri) to lead its all-time series against the Volunteers.
- Four Tennessee All-Americans were Kentucky natives: Allan Houston, Chris Lofton, Danny Schultz and Paul "Lefty" Walther.
- Tennessee has 14 all-time wins over the Wildcats at Thompson-Boling Arena, including three straight.
- The Vols have beaten the Wildcats just four times at Rupp Arena, posting victories in 1977, 1979, 1999 and 2006.

LAST MEETING KENTUCKY

- Admiral Schofield scored 20 points and recorded nine rebounds to lead the 23rd-ranked Tennessee Volunteers to a 76-65 victory over No. 17 Kentucky on Jan. 6, 2018, at a sold out Thompson-Boling Arena.
- The Vols shot 54 percent from the field in the second half while using a strong defensive effort to outscore the Wildcats in the final period, 47-28, and earn their first conference victory of the season.
- **Grant Williams** stepped up offensively down the stretch, scoring 16 of his 18 points in the second half on 7-for-9 shooting.
- UT was also fueled by great team play, as it recorded 23 assists on 25 made field goals, led by six assists from James Daniel III.
- After going into halftime trailing by nine, the Vols went on multiple runs in the second half, including a 10-0 burst that lasted more than three minutes, to reclaim the lead and defeat Kentucky for the third consecutive year at Thompson-Boling Arena.
- Kentucky was efficient throughout the first half, shooting 55 percent from the field and 4-for-8 from behind the 3-point arc. PJ Washington knocked down his first four shots and finished the period with 11 points to lead the Wildcats to a 37-29 advantage at the intermission.
- UT stormed out of the gate in the second half, going on a quick 6-0 run highlighted by a Schofield breakaway dunk. The outburst continued with a Lamonté Turner 3-pointer three minutes in that put the Vols ahead for the first time since the 16:00 mark of the first half.

MEMORABLE VOL PERFORMANCES AGAINST KENTUCKY

- Kevin Punter Jr.'s 27 points were the most scored by a Vol against the Kentucky in 10 years as Tennessee defeated the Wildcats, 84-77, Feb. 2, 2016, in Knoxville. The senior point guard made three 3-pointers and was 11-of-12 at the free-throw line.
- Chris Lofton reeled off 31 points, Major Wingate scored 12 and current Orlando Magic guard C.J. Watson added 10 as No. 11 Tennessee beat Kentucky 75-67 at Rupp Arena on Feb. 7, 2006.
- Beating the Wildcats was three times as nice during the 1978-79 season. UT notched program win No. 900 in Lexington on Jan. 20, 66-55, before topping UK 101-84 in Knoxville on Feb. 17. Then the Vols won the 1979 SEC Tournament with a 75-69 win over UK in Birmingham, Alabama, on March 3. Current Vol Network radio analyst Bert Bertelkamp was a junior on that Tennessee team.
- As Bernard King walked off the court at Memorial Gym after a deflating 88-82 loss on Jan. 13, 1975, a Kentucky fan flipped a lit cigarette into the Tennessee legend's hair. Outraged, King vowed he would never lose to Kentucky again. He vigorously carried out that promise, finishing his career 5-1 against the Wildcats.

BARNES & CALIPARI: 1,300+ WINS

- Saturday's game features the two winningest coaches (total career Division I wins) in the SEC.
- John Calipari is the league's active leader in career wins, with 669. **Rick Barnes** is a close second with 652 victories to his credit.
- Among all active Division I head coaches, Calipari and Barnes rank fifth and seventh, respectively, in total head coaching wins.
- Barnes and Calipari became friends while working a Pitt basketball camp in the late 1970s. The star player at that camp? Current Arizona head coach Sean Miller.

JANUARY KENTUCKY WIN SPARKED HOT STREAK FOR SCHOFIELD

- Tennessee head coach Rick Barnes said that junior wing Admiral Schofield had his best game as Vol when UT defeated Kentucky on Jan. 6. That win started a streak of stellar play for Schofield.
- Over the last nine contests, Schofield is averaging 12.8 points, 7.6 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.6 steals per game. He is shooting .467 overall and .442 from 3-point range during that span.
- In this year's first meeting with Kentucky, Schofield totaled 20 points, nine rebounds, four assists, four steals and a block.
- In five career games vs. Kentucky, Schofield averages 13.4 points, 6.8 rebounds and 1.4 assists while shooting .500 from the field.

UT HAS BESTED 2016-17 WINS TOTAL

 Tennessee has already exceeded last season's total of 16 wins, and the Vols have eight regular-season games remaining.

TRENDING NOW

- In SEC play, Tennessee leads the league in assists per game (16.8) and assist/turnover ratio (1.5) while ranking second in scoring offense (79.0 ppg), scoring margin (+8.4), field-goal percentage (.474), 3-point percentage (.401) and rebounding defense (33.1 rapg).
- The school record for 3-point percentage is .3912, set during the 1989-90 season (Allan Houston era).
 Tennessee's current 3-point percentage is .398.
- Excluding any postseason games, UT is on pace to total 533 assists during the regular season. That would stand as the fourth-highest single-season total in school history.
- The Vols also are on pace to finish the regular season with 155 blocked shots. That would rank as the sixth-highest single-season total in school history.
- During SEC play, junior wing Admiral Schofield ranks second in the league in 3-point percentage (.458) and fifth in rebounding (7.4 rpg) and tied for seventh in steals per game (1.4 spg).
- Sophomore guard Lamonté Turner has made 20 consecutive free throws dating to Tennessee's Jan.
 6 win over Kentucky. In SEC play, his .949 free-throw percentage (37-of-39) leads the league.
- Junior forward Kyle Alexander has 19 blocks over UT's last seven games (2.7 bpg).

WILLIAMS WORKING THROUGH DOUBLE-TEAMS

- Despite being the focal point of opponents' scouting reports, Tennessee leading scorer Grant Williams has remained efficient offensively.
- Facing regular double-teams, Williams is shooting .472 in SEC play, ranking seventh in the league.
- Williams' 17.8 points per game in SEC games ranks sixth in the conference.
- He has scored 15 or more points in seven of Tennessee's 10 SEC games, including a career-high 37 in UT's win at Vanderbilt on Jan. 9.

VOLS COMING OFF BEST HALF OF BASKETBALL THIS SEASON

- Tennessee put on a clinic during the second half of its 94-61 rout of Ole Miss on Saturday.
- The Vols scored 59 points in the half, during which they missed their first two field goals before making 20 of their last 26 attempts from the floor.
- The Vols shot .714 as a team during the half.
- The 59 points were UT's most in a half since scoring 60 in the first half of a 114-75 season-opening win over Chattanooga on Nov. 25, 2008.
- Tennessee had 17 assists and just one turnovers during the half.
- UT's 33-point margin of victory was its largest in a *regular-season* SEC game since beating Vanderbilt, 76-38, on March 1, 2014, by 38 points (in *postseason* play, UT beat Auburn by 38 points [97-59] in the first round of the 2016 SEC Tournament).
- During the final 20 minutes vs. Ole Miss Saturday, the Vols averaged 1.84 points per possession.

FAST BREAK

Tennessee has produced four of the top 10 all-time scorers in SEC history: **Allan Houston** (No. 2; 2,801 points), **Ernie Grunfeld** (No. 5; 2,249 points), **Tony White** (No. 6; 2,219 points) and **Chris Lofton** (No. 10; 2,131 points).

UT THIRD IN NCAA IN ASSIST RATE

- According to noted college basketball statistical analyst Ken Pomeroy of KenPom.com, Tennessee ranks third nationally with an assist rate of 64.9 percent (meaning that 64.9 percent of the Vols' made field goals have been assisted on).
- That is the highest assist rate among SEC teams.
- The Volunteers average 17.2 assists per game, which ranks first in the SEC and 19th in the country.

"GOOD" LOSSES

- All five teams who have defeated Tennessee this season occupy a top-45 spot in the latest NCAA RPI, and three of those teams— Villanova (2), Auburn (5) and North Carolina (10)—own a top-10 RPI.
- Missouri has an RPI of No. 33, and Arkansas lands at No. 41.
- Finally, three of those five squads are ranked in this week's AP top-25 poll: No. 1 Villanova, No. 8 Auburn No. 21 North Carolina.

TWO BLOCKS OF GRANITE, A BIG CANADIAN & A PAIR OF JORDANS

- Tennessee has used the same starting five since Dec.
 3 at Georgia Tech—a span of 16 games.
- Jordan Bone, Jordan Bowden, Admiral Schofield, Grant Williams and Kyle Alexander (the Canadian), have started 20 of UT's 22 games this season.
- Tennessee is 15-5 when that unit starts.

ALEXANDER, WALKER DON'T MISS

- While neither player looks to score first, Tennessee forwards Kyle Alexander and Derrick Walker are taking—and making—extremely high-percentage shots during SEC play.
- The duo is combining to shoot .886 (39-of-44) from the field during league games.
- Alexander, the starter at the five, is 27-for-30 from the field in SEC play (.900).
- Walker, a true freshman whose minutes have increased since mid-January, is 12-for-14 from the field against SEC opponents (.857).

MORE MINUTES FOR WALKER

- True freshman forward Derrick Walker has significantly bolstered the Vols' frontcourt depth since mid-January.
- The Kansas, City, Missouri, native is averaging 13.5 minutes off the bench over UT's last six games.
- In Tennessee's win at South Carolina on Jan. 20, Walker was 5-for-5 while finishing with a season-high 10 points, four rebounds and a block in a season-high 25 minutes.
- During SEC play, Walker is averaging 2.8 points and 2.6 rebounds while shooting .857 from the field.

TURNER MAKING STRONG CASE FOR SEC SIXTH MAN OF THE YEAR

- Vols sophomore Lamonté Turner has not started a game this season, but he has come off the bench to score 15 or more points seven times. And he has scored 20 or more in two of UT's last five games.
- Turner is the team's third-leading scorer both overall (10.7 ppg) and in SEC play (12.3 ppg).
- The Alabama native has held or shared the team lead in scoring in six times this season.
- Turner made a season-high six 3-pointers in UT's Jan. 27 win at lowa State while finishing with a team-high 20 points.
- In addition to his hot shooting of late, he also is riding a streak of 127 consecutive minutes played without committing a turnover, dating to the first half at South Carolina on Jan. 20.

ALEXANDER MUCH IMPROVED

- Junior forward **Kyle Alexander** is 17-for-20 (.850) from the field over UT's last six games. He is averaging 7.2 points, 5.5 rebounds and 2.7 blocks per game over that span.
- After scoring in double digits just one time in his first 66 career games, he has scored 10 or more points five times this season—including three times in UT's last seven games.
- The Jan. 27 win at Iowa State was Alexander's fourth game this season with 10 or more rebounds.
- Through 22 games, Alexandeer has essentially doubled his production from his first two seasons as an underclassman, tallying 6.2 points, 5.8 rebounds and 2.0 blocks in 20.7 minutes per game while starting every contest.
- Among all Division I players this season, Alexander ranks 50th in blocked shots per game (1.95 bpg) and 113th in offensive rebounds per game (2.55).

- The program's multi-year GSR of 89 percent is an all-time program record (besting the previous high by 16 percentage points).
- The UT men's basketball program has improved its multi-year GSR 29 percentage points in four yearsfrom 60 percent in 2014 to 89 percent in 2017.

TENNESSEE'S NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE RIPE WITH OPPORTUNITIES

- · A cursory glance at UT's non-conference schedule reveals a handful of "Power Five" opponents— Purdue (W), NC State (W), Georgia Tech (W), UNC (L), Wake Forest (W) and Iowa State (W)-that stand as potential RPI boosters. But dig a little deeper and one discovers additional opportunities for resumé-building wins outside of SEC play.
- Another Tennessee foe appears in the Jan. 29 update of the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25, with Furman landing at No. 19. Tennessee outlasted Furman, 66-61, at home on Dec. 20. That is UT's fifthbest RPI win of the season (No. 112).
- This article from HeatCheckcbb.com outlines why, based on their schedule, the Vols have more opportunities to log resumé-boosting wins than any other team in the country this season.
- As of Feb. 5, UT's strength of schedule was rated No. 3 nationally by ratings analyst Ken Pomeroy of KenPom.com.

VOLS IN THE NBA

- Tennessee alums enjoyed a noteworthy presence in the NBA during the 2016-17 season—highlighted by Tobias Harris (2010-11) leading the Detroit Pistons in scoring.
- In his sixth NBA season, Harris played in all 82 games for the Pistons. He made 48 starts but thrived in the team's sixth-man role during the second half of the season. His 16.1 points per game led the team. For his career, the forward averages 13.8 points, 5.6 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game.
- Miami Heat guard Josh Richardson (2011-15) completed his second NBA season with the Miami Heat in 2016-17, and he agreed to a new four-year, \$42 million contract in September 2017. In his first two seasons in the league, the 24-year-old has appeared in 105 games and averaged 8.4 points, 2.6 rebounds and 2.0 assists. He also shoots at a .374 clip from 3-point range.
- Point guard C.J. Watson (2002-06) completed his 10th NBA season in 2016-17 as a member of the Orlando Magic. He appeared in 62 games. with nine starts, and averaged 4.5 points and 1.8 assists. For his decade-long NBA career, Watson has seen action in 600 games and averages 7.2 points and 2.5 assists while shooting .373 from 3-point range and .812 from the foul line.
- Shooting guard Jordan McRae (2010-14), a member of the Cleveland Cavaliers 2016 NBA Finals championship team, saw action in 37 games with the Cavs last season before being released. In 59 career NBA appearances, the 2014 draft pick averaged 4.4 points and shot .384 from 3-point range.
- 2014 NBA Draft pick Jarnell Stokes (2011-14), who has played for three different franchises during his three-year professional career, appeared in two games with the Denver Nuggets last season before suffering a season-ending foot injury. Stokes owns a .581 field-goal percentage in 28 career NBA games played.
- A pair of Tennessee alums continue lengthy tenures as NBA front-office executives in 2017-18. Washington Wizards President Ernie Grunfeld (1973-77) completed his 14th season as the team's top executive last year. And New York Knicks Assistant General Manager Allan Houston (1989-93) continues to play a key insider's role with that storied franchise.

FAST BREAK

Tennessee has made five NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearances since 2000.

TENNESSEE PICKED 13TH IN THE SEC

- Tennessee was predicted to finish 13th in the 2018 SEC race by an SEC and national media voting panel.
- The Volunteers also were picked 13th last season before posting an 8-10 SEC record to finish ninth.
- The Vols have outperformed their preseason SEC projection every season under head coach Rick Barnes.

- In addition to their 2010 championship showing, the Vols also appeared in the 1992 and 2006 NIT Season Tip-Offs. The Big Orange defeated Rutgers before falling to Seton Hall in 1992. In 2006, UT suffered losses to Butler and North Carolina at Madison Square Garden.

The pants made intermittent appearances in the last decade but, thanks to **Rick Barnes**, are now worn for *all* games starting last season.

NOTES FROM "THE SUMMITT"

HOOPS FACILITY ENHANCMENTS OVER THE LAST DECADE

- Prior to the 2007-08 season, UT added a basketballonly practice facility, Pratt Pavilion, which houses two full-size gymnasiums (a men's court and a women's court) as well as an athletic training room, weight room and film-study room.
- Construction of Pratt Pavilion also marked the beginning of the "first phase" of renovations to Thompson-Boling Arena. This \$19 million phase included the addition of 32 luxury suites located in the north balcony, a loge area just below the suites that includes 166 side court seats, new seats for the entire arena, a \$3 million center-hung scoreboard and concourse refurbishments, such as graphics and other amenities.
- In the "second phase" of Thompson-Boling Arena renovations, the athletics department overhauled the men's and women's basketball offices during the 2010-11 campaign, creating a new and impressive "front door" for both programs.
- New to Thompson-Boling Arena for the 2013-14 season was a 360-degree LED ribbon board that runs along the bottom of the upper deck.
- In March of 2014, Thompson-Boling Arena became the third college basketball arena to install an LED lighting system, which features fixtures that are smaller, brighter, and up to 85 percent more efficient than conventional arena metal halide lights. The system—developed and manufactured by Oak Ridge-based LED North America at the Tech 20/20 incubator facility in Oak Ridge, Tennessee incorporates Oak Ridge National Laboratory technology and was installed by Knoxville-based Bandit Lites
- The weight room in Pratt Pavilion was renovated and expanded to 4,350 square feet in the summer of 2016. Additions include a full-court-length stretch of synthetic turf, a custom rubber floor, a 40-foot, steel-reinforced throwing wall, six Keiser Functional Trainers, four TRUEStretch Cages, three custom, 10foot Power Lift pulley units (ideal for taller studentathletes), seven sets of 90-pound PowerBlocks and a zoned, high-powered stereo system.
- Work is set to conclude in January on a \$5 million locker-room overhaul at Thompson-Boling Arena, which will feature the addition of a hydrotherapy athletic training facility.

- Thompson-Boling Arena is hosting its 31st season in 2017-18.
- The Vols have won nearly 75 percent of their games in Thompson-Boling Arena.
- The Vols have ranked in the top 10 nationally in average home attendance 12 times at TBA and own an active streak of 12 consecutive seasons ranked in the top 20.

BY THE NUMBERS

- Tennessee is 364-129 (.738) at Thompson-Boling Arena.
- Since the 1997-98 season, the Vols are 258-69 (.789) in Thompson-Boling Arena.
- The Vols are 122-50 against SEC teams at home over the last 12 seasons.
- Tennessee finished both the 2006-07 and 2007-08 seasons with a 16-0 home record.
- The Vols have won five of their last six home games against the defending national champions (wins over Kentucky in 2013, UConn in 2012, Florida in 2008, Florida in 2007, Kentucky in 1999).

HOME CROWDS OF 20,000+ NOTHING NEW FOR VOLS

- Tennessee has played in front of 52 home crowds larger than 20,000 dating to the 2005-06 season.
- The crowd of 22,326 for the 2009 Gonzaga game was the largest at Thompson-Boling Arena since capacity was reduced from 24,535 to 21,678 prior to the 2007-08 campaign.
- UT has hosted ESPN College GameDay twice at Thompson-Boling Arena, winning both games.

 James Nahikian painstakingly compiled a list of
 the youngest teams (based on class/eligibility) in
 college basketball this season, and Tennessee was
 one of three SEC teams to make the top five.
- With 10 underclassmen and only one senior, Tennessee is tied with Wofford and Toledo as the fifth-youngest team in Division I.
- Kentucky (12 underclassmen, no seniors) is the nation's youngest team, and Auburn is the secondyoungest (12 underclassmen, one senior).

FIRST-HALF DEFENSE STIFLING

- Through 22 games, UT has held opponents to an average 28.2 points during the first half.
- Tennessee's average lead at halftime this season is 8.5 points, and the Big Orange have trailed just three times at the break (vs. Auburn and Kentucky and at Vanderbilt).

VULTURE VOLS LOOKING FOR SCRAPS

- UT is +73 in points-off-turnovers this year and has logged at least 20 points off TOs in seven games.
- During their 84-60 rout of Southern Conference favorite Mercer on Nov. 29, the Vols scored a seasonhigh 32 points off 20 Bears turnovers.
- Tennessee's high in SEC play this season came against Ole Miss on Feb. 3, as the Vols scored 23 points off 17 Rebel turnovers.

DANIEL A DARN GOOD DISTRIBUTOR

- Graduate transfer James Daniel III is the first Vol to log multiple games of 10 or more assists in a single season in 24 years.
- LaMarcus Golden had two double-digit assist games during the 1993-94 campaign, dishing out 12 vs. UT Martin (11/26/93) and 14 at South Carolina (1/19/94).
- Daniel distributed a career-high 10 assists in the win over High Point on Nov. 14 (his second game as a Vol). He then recorded 10 assists during UT's victory over Mercer on Nov. 29. And he didn't have a turnover in either game.
- For the first time in his career, Daniel—a greenlight, volume shooter at Howard—has more assists (70) than made field goals (48).
- Daniel's assist-turnover ratio this season is an impressive +2.72. That ranks fourth in the SEC and 33rd nationally.

BOWDEN ON TARGET FROM DEEP

 While he no longer meets the SEC's "attempts per game" stat-ranking requirements, Tennessee sophomore **Jordan Bowden** would lead the SEC with a 3-point percentage of .474 (36-of-76) through 22 games this season.

TENNESSEE GOES 3-1 IN ACC PLAY

- Tennessee went 3-1 during its four games against ACC opponents over a 30-day span during preconference action, with all three wins coming away from Knoxville. UT's scoring margin in those four games was +7.5.
- The Vols defeated NC State, 67-58, in Atlantis.
 Tennessee then toppled Georgia Tech, 77-70, in Atlanta. UT fell at home to No. 7 UNC, 78-73, before routing Wake Forest, 79-60, in Winston-Salem.
- Additionally, Tennessee traveled to Clemson for a charity exhibition on Nov. 5. The Vols defeated the Tigers, 71-67.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- The Vols' 2017-18 roster features 16 players (13 scholarship student-athletes) representing nine states as well as Ontario, Canada, and France.
- There are five Vols who hail from the state of Tennessee, two from North Carolina and one each from Alabama, Delaware, Illinois, Missouri, Ohio, Texas and Virginia.
- This is the first time since 2006-07 that the Vols' roster has not included at least one player from the state of Georgia.
- Tennessee has one senior (a graduate transfer), five juniors, four sophomores and six freshmen (including three redshirt freshmen).
- This is the tallest roster third-year head coach Rick Barnes has had at Tennessee. This season's team includes six players listed at 6-7 or taller. For each of the previous two seasons, UT had just three players listed at 6-7 or taller.

VOLS LOOK TO EXTEND 13-YEAR STREAK OF TOP-20 ATTENDANCE

- Tennessee finished 20th nationally in average regular-season home attendance last year, drawing an average of 13,636 fans to 16 games at Thompson-Boling Arena.
- This season, UT ranks eighth in attendance with a home average of 15,981.
- The Vols have ranked among the top 20 in attendance for 13 consecutive years, including six seasons ranked in the top five nationally.
- Tennessee has played in front of 52 home crowds larger than 20,000 over the last 13 seasons.

LANIER GIVES VOLS ADDITIONAL HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE

- **Rick Barnes** isn't the only person on Tennessee's bench with Division I head coaching experience.
- Associate head coach Rob Lanier was the head coach at Siena from 2001-05.
- During that span, the Saints posted a 58-70 mark, and advanced to one NCAA Tournament and one NIT.
- Under Lanier, Siena also won the 2002 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Tournament Championship.

 • The lead would grow to as many as 15 with 1:39 left in the first half, and UT took a 46-34
- Advantage into the break. Tensessee enjoyed 50 percent shooting (17-of-34) in the first half while scoring 15 second-chance points.

 But Villanova shot out of the second-half gate, needing fewer than five minutes to level
- the score. The Wildcats scored the first 11 points of the second half. Forcing 12 second-half turnovers while shooting 52 percent from the field, Villanova extended its advantage to 15 points with 4:40 to play.
- Tennessee would not go away quietly, whittling the deficit to 79-76 with less than a minute remaining, thanks in large part to the combined efforts of Williams and Schoffield. It was as close as the Vols would come, though, as Villanova—which attempted 37 free throws on the afternoon—put the game away at the foul line.
