## QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is in its 44th season of varsity women's basketball with a 798-531 (.600) all-time record.
- The Wildcats have had great success in Memorial Coliseum, sitting at 439-156 (.737) overall in the historic building, including a 149-27 (.846) mark under head coach Matthew Mitchell.
- Kentucky is 35-38 all-time in the SEC Tournament. UK has appeared in the SEC Tournament semifinals eight straight season, which is the longest active streak in the league. This is the first time UK has had the No. 9 seed in the event since 2003. The last time UK was not a top-six seed in the event was 2009 when it earned the 10th seed and fell 82-64 to Georgia in the opening round.
- The Wildcats started postseason play with a 71-64 win over Alabama in the second round Thursday. The win secured the ninth straight year that UK has won at least one game in the event. UK trailed by 10 points in the first half vs. Alabama before coming back to grab the win.
- Maci Morris is the only player in the SEC to score 20 or more points in six straight league games this season. She is only the second UK player to ever accomplish this feat.
- Kentucky is the only team in the nation to play five games vs. the AP Top 25's top four teams (Louisville, Mississippi State (three times), Baylor).
- Kentucky won both of its games this season against Alabama, hitting 64.7 percent from the field against the Crimson Tide in the first meeting, which was the second best field goal percentage in a game in program history. UK shot 47.2 percent vs. the Crimson Tide yesterday.
- The Wildcats swept the season series with Arkansas following a 76-65 win in Fayetteville and 78-57 win on Thursday in Lexington. In the season series against Arkansas, UK averaged 77.0 points per game, shot 47.1 percent from the field and 40 percent from 3.
 Shined vs. South Carolina and Alabama at home with career-high 12 points in each game. Recorded a career high 12 boards at Arkansas, adding six points, two assists and two steals. Missed game vs. Alabama in the SEC Tournament as she woks through concussion protocol. \#4 MACI MORRIS G 6-0 Jr. $\quad$ Pineville, Ky.
- Has 1,196 career points and currently ranks 20th all-time in school history in points scored.
- Only player in the SEC to record 20 or more points in seven straight league games this year. Career high 35 points at South Carolina. Third player in UK history with $35+$ in SEC game.
\#22 MAKENZIE CANN G 6-1 Sr. Lawrenceburg, Ky.
- Shined in season opener with 17 points and six rebounds, hitting four 3 s .
- Had back-to-back double-doubles with 15 points and 10 rebounds vs. Wash. State and MSU. Has hit a 3 in every game but five this year, including three or more in four games.
\#24 TAYLOR MURRAY G $\mathbf{~ 5 - 6} \quad \mathrm{Jr}$. Odenton, Md. Scored 23 points against Missouri with six rebounds, four assists and three steals.
- Only player in program history with 20pts/10ast in SEC game, accomplishing the feat vs Bama. Had 18 points with six rebounds and five assists against Alabama in the SEC Tournament.
\#45 ALYSSA RICE C 6-3 Sr. Reynoldsburg, Ohio
- Recorded a double-double at Miami (Fla.) with 11 points and a career-high 12 boards.

- Kentucky shot 47.4 percent from the field against the Rebels scoring 79 points, which is the most points the Wildcats have scored in an SEC game this season. UK had 19 assists with a 22-7 edge on points off turnovers and 27-19 advantage in points in the paint. UK is averaging 70.6 points per game and hitting 46.7 percent from the field in its last 11 games.
- UK has had four of more players score in double digits in 10 games this year and are 7-3 in those game.
- Kentucky has had $14+$ assists in eight of its last 11 games and are $14-3$ this season with $14+$ dimes.
- UK is 12-3 this season when it scored 70 or more points and hits 40 percent or better from the field.
- The Wildcats are 6-1 this season when they score $20+$ points of turnovers. UK had 28 points off turnovers vs. Alabama and 25 at Arkansas. The Cats turned Auburn over 25 times and scored a season-high 32 points off those miscues. UK had 22 points off turnovers at Ole Miss.
- The win at Florida snapped a eight-game losing streak for the Cats. The streak came against stiff competition falling on the road at Florida Gulf Coast, Miami (Fla.), Middle Tennessee (who have all been receiving votes this season) and then-No. 19 Texas A\&M, and home setbacks vs. Georgia (currently No. 19 in AP Top 25), then-No. 3 Louisville, then-No. 7 Tennessee and then-No. 24 Cal.
- Fifteen of Kentucky's 16 losses this season have come to teams that have been ranked or receiving votes in the national rankings. Ten of the losses have come to teams that were ranked inside the top-25 at the time UK played in (Baylor, UofL, Cal, Tenn., TAMU, South Carolina ( $2 x$ ), Mizzou, Miss. St. ( $2 x$ ).
- Kentucky was the only team in the SEC to play six non-conference true road games this season.
- UK is 0-10 vs. ranked foes this season, falling to Baylor, UofL, Cal, Tennessee, Texas A\&M, South Carolina ( $2 x$ ), Missouri and Miss. State ( $2 x$ ). This is the first year since 2006-07 UK has zero wins vs. ranked foes.
- The Wildcats have played 17 games this season against teams that currently rank top 100 in the NCAA RPI, including 12 games vs. RPI top- 40 teams.
- UK is in rebuilding mode this season after losing 33.6 of the it's 70.9 points scored from last season with the loss of All-America honorees Makayla Epps and Evelyn Akhator. UK lost 47.4\% of its scoring, 42.0\% of its rebounding, $49.7 \%$ of its made field goals, and $35.3 \%$ of its assists.
- Kentucky entered the season with 11 of its 14 players having played only one season or less for the Wildcats. Rice, Murray, Morris are the only three that entered the season having played more than one season with the program. Cann, Hardin, Halsel, Poffenberger and Roper are in their second seasons, while the five newcomers and Anyagaligbo are in their first season.
- Maci Morris became the third player in program history to score 35 points or more in an SEC game with her career-high 35 points against South Carolina.
- Morris is making her way up the all-time 3-point field goals made list at Kentucky. The native of Pineville, Ky., has hit 176 career 3 s which ranks her tied for fourth all-time in UK history. Morris needs 1 more to tie A'dia Mathies (2010-13) for third all-time.
- Morris became the 33rd member of UK's 1,000-Point Club scoring the first six points of UK's win vs. Auburn. The native of Bell County, Ky., is the 17th Kentuckian on the list. She now has 1,196 points.
- Kentucky is hitting 6.13 s per game this season. UK's current total of 188 made 3 s ranks fourth most in a season in program history. The 2012-13 team hit a program-record 240 3s.
- Kentucky started the season with a 6-0 record for the first time since the 2015-16 season when UK began the year 11-0. This was the fifth time UK started a season 6-0 under Mitchell and the ninth such start in program history.
- Matthew Mitchell became the all-time winningest head coach in Kentucky women's basketball history in March of 2013 with his 139th win at UK. The win at Florida was Mitchell's 250th at Kentucky. Including the storied history of the UK MBB program, he is the fifth Kentucky Basketball head coach to win 250 games with the Wildcats joining Adolph Rupp, Joe B Hall, Tubby Smith and John Calipari.
- All 13 eligible Wildcats this season have not only played but scored this season. That is the most players to score in a game for a UK team since 2012-13.
- Junior forward Ogechi Anyagaligbo will miss the 2017-18 season due to sustaining a torn ACL in Kentucky's exhibition game vs. Southern Indiana. The loss leaves Kentucky with just one scholarship post player this season that is not a true freshmen.
- For the eighth straight year, UK began its season ranked or receiving votes inside in the USA Today/ Coaches' and AP Preseason Top 25, receiving votes in both listings. The Wildcats' highest ranking this season was No. 20 in the AP Top 25 and No. 23 in the USA Today/Coaches Top 25.
- In 44 years of varsity women's basketball, Kentucky has 88 wins over ranked opponents, including 47 of those wins coming under Mitchell.
- UK played three regular-season games inside Rupp Arena this year for the first time since the 2007-08 season when UK played five games inside the historic building. UK went 0-3 inside Rupp Arena this season.

## KENTUCKY IN THE SEC TOURNAMENT

- Kentucky is 35-38 all-time in the SEC Tournament.
- UK has won at least one game in the event in each of the last nine years.
- This was the second straight season that Kentucky has defeated Alabama in the event with UK winning last season's battle in the quarterfinals, 65-55.
- Kentucky is 5-2 against Mississippi State all-time in the SEC Tournament, including 2-0 under Mitchell.
- The Wildcats are 15-12 all-time in the quarterfinals of the tournament.
- This is the second time UK and Miss. State have met in the quarterfinals of the event with UK winning both of the previous meetings. UK def. MSU 106-82 in 1981 and 76-67 in 2015.
- This is only the second time in Mitchell's 11-year tenure that UK hasn't finished top four in the league.
- Complete UK in the SEC Tournament records can be found on page 19 of the game notes.
- A win vs. Mississippi State would mark the first time since 1997 that a 9 seed defeated a 1 seed in the SEC Tournament (Auburn 75, Georgia 47).
- UK is 0-2 vs. No. 1 seeds in the SEC Tournament as the No. 9 seed falling to Tennessee 74-62 in 1995 and to Georgia 63-45 in 2000.


## SERIES HISTORY VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE

- Kentucky leads the all-time series against Mississippi St. 27-19, including a 5-1 mark in neutral-site games.
- The Bulldogs won both meetings this season against the Wildcats, defeating UK 74-55 in Starkville and 85-63 in Lexington. Prior to this season, UK had won 11 straight against the Bulldogs.
- Three of the last eight meetings in the series have gone to overtime.
- Matthew Mitchell is 12-3 all-time against Mississippi State as a head coach.


## SCOUTING MISSISSIPPI STATE

- Mississippi State ended the regular season 30-0 for the first perfect regular season by an SEC team since Tennessee in 1998. The Bulldogs are the regular-season conference champions and the No. 1 seed.
- The Bulldogs are coming off an 71-64 win over Kentucky in the regular-season finale last Sunday in Lexington. Five Bulldogs scored in double figures in the game with Teaira McCown leading the way with 20 points and 20 rebounds, adding five blocks. Victoria Vivians scored 18 points with 10 rebounds and five assists, while Roshunda Johnson hit three 3s and scored 15 points. Blair Schaefer had 12 points with four 3 s , while Chloe Bibby had 10 points and two rebounds. The Bulldogs shot 52.2 percent from the field, outrebounded UK 40-23, had 23 points off turnovers and 20 second-chance points.
- Vivians is averaging a team-best 19.7 points per game, adding 6.0 rebounds per game. McCowan is averaging a double-double at $18.7 \mathrm{ppg} / 13.5 \mathrm{rpg}$, while Johnson has hit 62 3-pointers and is averaging 11.9 points per game. Blair Schaefer leads the team with 81 made 3 s averaging 9.8 points per game.


## LAST TIME VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE

- Mississippi State led 21-18 at the end of the first quarter, but used a 25-13 edge in the second quarter to take control of the game. The second quarter was the only quarter in the game that the Bulldogs won by more than four points. MSU shot 52.2 percent from the field, hit 10 -of- 18 from long range and had a large advantage in nearly every statistical category. The Bulldogs won the rebounding advantage 40-23, points in the paint 38-20, points off turnovers 23-14 and second-chance points 20-6.
- UK shot 42.3 percent from the field with 14 assists but hit just 4-of-12 from long range in the game. Maci Morris led Kentucky with 22 points, going 3-of-5 from 3 with three blocks and three steals. Amanda Paschal had 11 points with three rebounds while Dorie Harrison had 13 points with two blocks.


## 2017-18 GAME NOTES

## MORRIS, MURRAY, RICE EARN ALL-SEC HONORS

Junior guards Maci Morris and Taylor Murray along with senior center Alyssa Rice have received recognition from league coaches as all three earned All-Southeastern Conference honors. Morris was named to the All-SEC Second Team, while Murray was on the All-Defensive Team and Rice was tabbed one of three ScholarAthletes of the Year.

This is the second All-SEC honor for Morris, who was selected to the SEC All-Freshman team in 2016, and the first for Rice and for Murray, who was named a preseason All-SEC Second Team selection earlier this season. Morris continues UK's stretch with at least one All-SEC First or Second Team honoree in every year under 11-year head coach Matthew Mitchell. Murray becomes the first UK player since Linnae Harper in 2015 to be named to the all-defensive team, while Rice is only the second scholar-athlete award winner in program history, joining Chelsea Chowning who won the award in 2008.

## 18 SECOND-HALF POINTS BY MORRIS LEAD UK PAST ALABAMA IN SEC TOURNAMENT

Maci Morris scored 18 second-half points, while Taylor Murray added 18 for the game and UK shot an impressive 66.6 percent from the field in the second half to earn a come-from-behind win against Alabama in the second round of the SEC Tournament on Thursday. Morris also led Kentucky with seven rebounds and six assists in the game. After trailing by as many as nine in the third quarter, UK used an 10-0 run to take a 48-46 lead with 35 seconds left in the period. UK never looked back, outscoring the Tide 21-16 in the fourth quarter to seal the win. With UK up 67-62 with under a minute to play, the Wildcats drained the shot clock with Morris hitting a big 3 late in the clock to all but seal the win.

## MORRIS JOINING ELITE COMPANY WITH 20-POINT PERFORMANCES

Maci Morris has scored 20 or more points in seven straight league games becoming only the second player in program history to accomplish that feat, joining former UK All-American Valerie Still (1982). Morris is the only player in the SEC to score 20 or more points in seven straight league games this season. More impressive is the stretch has come against tough competition as four of the six games were vs. top-15 teams. The stretch
includes 22 at Missouri, 21 at Mississippi State, 20 vs. Arkansas, 35 at South Carolina, 20 at Ole Miss, 22 vs. Miss. State and 25 vs. Alabama.

## MORRIS HAS CAREER NIGHT VS. SOUTH CAROLINA

Although the Wildcats didn't get the win at No. 8 South Carolina, it was a career night for junior guard Maci Morris who led all scorers with 35 points on 13-of-23 shooting, including 5-of-9 from long range. Here are some notes about the incredible performance:

- The 30-point scoring effort was the first for a UK player since Makayla Epps had 31 against the Gamecocks on March 4, 2017 in the SEC Tournament.
- Morris the first player to score 35 or more points in a game since Makayla Epps accomplished the feat with 42 points against Mississippi State on Feb. 12, 2015.
- Morris is only the third player in school history to score 35 points or more in an SEC game, joining Makayla Epps and Valerie Still on that list.
- Morris has hit five or more 3 s in a game five times this season.


## OFFENSIVE TRENDS TELL THE STORY

There are some key offensive stats that have helped tell why the Wildcats have been able to have more success the past few weeks. UK has won six of its last 11 games shooting 46.7 percent from the field in those games, including 39.4 percent from 3 and averaging 70.6 points per game. In its previous seven games before that, UK was shooting just 35.6 percent from the field, 27.4 percent from 3 and averaging just 56.1 points per game. UK has had at least four players in double figures in five games during that stretch, including five in both games vs. Arkansas. UK is 4-0 this season when five players are in double figures.

Other offensive trends that help tell UK's story are:

- Kentucky has had $14+$ assists in eight of its last 11 games and is $14-3$ this season with $14+$ dimes.
- UK is 12-3 this season when it scored 70 or more points and hits 40 percent or better from the field.
- The Wildcats are 6-1 this season when they score $20+$ points of turnovers. UK had 28 points off turnovers vs. Alabama, 25 at Arkansas and a season-best 32 vs. Auburn forcing the Tigers into 25 turnovers. The Cats had 22 points off Ole Miss turnovers.
- Seven of UK's best 10 shooting games this season have come in the past 11 games. In fact, UK shot $45 \%$ or better from the field just four times in its first 20 games while they have accomplished the feat seven times in the last 11 games.


## SECOND HALF CATS

The Wildcats have not come out of the gates the way Coach Mitchell would want them, but UK is getting it done in the second half this season. In its last 11 second halves, the Wildcats are shooting 49.8 percent from the field, 41.9 percent from 3 and averaging 38.9 points. Against Missouri, UK outscored the Tigers $46-42$ in the second half with $324 Q$ points and hit 54.8 percent from the field. The Cats outscored Alabama 45-25 (25-5 in the 4Q) in the second half hitting 72 percent from the field and followed that script vs. Auburn by outscoring the Tigers $36-23$ in the second half and hit 54.5 percent. UK outscored LSU $44-34$ in the second half. The Wildcats outscored No. 2 Mississippi State 21-16 in the third quarter and fell just short of outscoring the Bulldogs the entire second half, 33-34. UK continued its strong second half streak against Arkansas, outscoring the Razorbacks 39-25 in the final 20 minutes, including 21-10 in the fourth quarter. UK shot 66.6 percent in the second half vs. Alabama in the SEC Tournament Second Round, scoring 48 points.

## TOUGHNESS, MATURITY HELP UK SWEEP SEASON SERIES VS. ARKANSAS

Early in the second half of the second meeting against Arkansas, the Wildcats held a 45-34 lead and looked to be in complete control. Then adversity hit as the Razorbacks went on a 11-0 run to tie the game at 45. Instead of backing down, however, the Wildcats showed toughness and maturity according to Mitchell by ending the third quarter on a 12-2 run to retake the lead and then sealed the win with a 14-1 run in the fourth quarter. It was two Maci Morris free throws that stopped the Arkansas run and then a huge 3-pointer by Tatyana Wyatt and layup by Taylor Murray to push the lead to 7. After an Arkansas free throw, Wyatt hit another 3 to give UK a nine-point lead and after another Arkansas free throw, Wyatt hit connected on two foul shots to give the Cats a 57-47 edge at the end of the third quarter.

Five Wildcats scored in double figures in the game with Morris leading the way with 20 while Wyatt had 11 with a career-high three 3s. Alyssa Rice had 13 points, nine rebounds and three blocks, while KeKe McKinney had 11 points and Dorie Harrison had 10 points. UK won the battle in the paint 38-12 and had a 32-7 edge in bench points.

## DEFENSE, CLUTCH FOURTH QUARTER POWERS UK OVER AUBURN

Kentucky shot just 39.2 percent from the floor against Auburn, but thanks to outscoring the Tigers 23-10 in the fourth quarter the Wildcats earned their third straight double-digit victory. The win marked the first time this season that UK had won a game when shooting a lower percentage than its opponent. It was Kentucky's defense that helped the Cats earn the win, limiting the Tigers to just 48 points. UK forced a sea-son-high 25 turnovers in the game and scored a season-high 32 points off those Auburn miscues.

Although UK struggled in the fourth quarter at Arkansas to sustain a $25+$ point lead, the Wildcats have used strong fourth quarters against Auburn, Alabama and vs. Arkansas at home for wins. UK outscored Alabama 25-5 in the fourth and Auburn 23-10. The Wildcats outscored LSU 27-21 in the fourth quarter.

## UK'S OFFENSE EXPLODES VS. ALABAMA IN REGULAR SEASON

Kentucky had been putting in way too much hard work in practice everyone knew the Wildcats were going to have a breakout performance sooner rather than later. That performance came against Alabama as UK went 33 -of- 51 from the field for 64.7 percent - the second best field goal percentage in a game in program history. The Wildcats went on to win the game 79-54 thanks to a 25-5 edge in the fourth quarter. The 25-point margin of victory was UK's largest in a SEC game since defeating Ole Miss 89-57 in Jan, 2017.
6 UK outscored the Tide in the paint, 36-20, and off turnovers, 28-10, while four Kentucky players scored in double figures.

Taylor Murray recorded her fourth career double-double with 20 points and a season-high 10 assists, becoming the first player in program history to have at least 20 points and 10 assists in an SEC game. The performance marked the fourth 20-point, 10-assist performance in UK women's basketball history, and the first since Makayla Epps vs. Morehead State on Nov. 18, 2015. Her 10 assists marked the first double-digit assist performance from a UK player since she had 11 vs. Florida on Feb. 19, 2017.

Dorie Harrison and KeKe McKinney were also brilliant in the game. Harrison scored a career-high 15 points and grabbed five boards for UK, going 5-of-9 from the floor. She also made five free throws on six attempts. McKinney matched her career-high with 12 points to go with five rebounds in the victory. It was her second consecutive game scoring 12 points.

## KENTUCKY SHOWS OFFENSIVE POTENTIAL IN SECOND HALF VS. SOUTH CAROLINA (1/21)

Kentucky scored 28 points in the third quarter against South Carolina at home, which was its most points in a quarter in conference play this season. It was the type of performance Mitchell and Co. knew they could use to move forward. The Wildcats looked much more efficient on the offensive side against the Gamecocks, scoring 44 points in the second half on $42.5 \%$ shooting from the field, including four 3 s . The Wildcats also showed some improvement in some "hustle areas" as Mitchell calls them with a 15-9 edge in offensive rebounds and 17-7 edge in second-chance points. UK forced South Carolina into 17 turnovers and scored 23 points off those miscues. Although UK ended the game with 16 turnovers, the Wildcats only had two miscues in the second half.

## MITCHELL'S DEFENSIVE FUNDAMENTALS WILL PLAY OFF IN LONG RUN

You don't have to spend too much time around Matthew Mitchell to understand his importance on defensive fundamentals. The Wildcats have showed they aren't where they need to be but are improving every day. UK's best defensive performance came against Gardner-Webb, limiting the Running' Bulldogs to just 34 points on 14-of-55 shooting in a 72-34 win inside Memorial Coliseum. UK was also strong defensively against Marshall, limiting the Herd to just $29.8 \%$ from the field on 14 -of- 47 shooting. Marshall did not make a field goal in the fourth quarter. UK limited Tennessee Tech to just 33.3 percent from the field and posted a season-best 9 blocks. In league play, Kentucky limited Tennessee to just 63 points, which was the lowest scoring total of the season for the Lady Vols, who entered the game averaging 88.3 points per game. Against Georgia, the Wildcats limited the Bulldogs to just 56 points on 27.8 percent shooting, forcing 18 turnovers. The Crimson Tide hit just 39.2 percent from the field against UK scoring just 54 points, while Auburn scored just 48. Against Arkansas at home, the Razorbacks scored just 57 points.

## Memorial Coliseum $(8,000)$

- The Cats own a 439-156 (.737) overall in the historic building, including a 149-27 (.846) mark under head coach Matthew Mitchell.
- The Cats have ranked in the top 25 nationally, and in the SEC's top four, in average attendance 14 straight seasons. UK ranked 14th nationally in average attendance with 5,213 fans per game last year.
- UK's 13-game home winning streak (the sixth-longest in school history) was snapped on Jan. 29, 2015 vs. Tennessee.



## Rupp Arena $(23,000)$

- The Cats are 25-18 all-time in Rupp Arena (.581), including a 6-10 mark under Matthew Mitchell. (NOTE: UK's game against Washington in the 2016 Sweet 16 did not count as a home game, but does count in UK's record in the all-time building.)
- The second-highest attendance mark in school history was set on Nov. 17, 2014 when 22,075 fans witnessed UK's upset of No. 8/9 Baylor, 74-64.
- For the first time since the women's basketball Final Four in 1986, Rupp Arena and the University of Kentucky have been selected to host the NCAA regional tournament in 2016, 2017 and 2018 for women's basketball.
- Kentucky will play three games in Rupp Arena this season, squaring off against SEC foes South Carolina, LSU and Tennessee.

Team locker rooms, and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate University personnel.

The visiting team coach and select players will be available in the Memorial Coliseum media room following a 10-minute cooling off period. CATS HOME SHOOTING TOUCH HAS RETURNED

Prior to its game against Cal, the Wildcats were shooting 48.7 percent from the field at home, including 43.1 percent from 3 and averaged 81.9 points per game. Against Cal, Tennessee and Georgia, the Wildcats shot 26.1 percent from the field at home, including 25.4 percent from 3 and averaged just 47.7 points per game. UK was 6-1 at home prior to the Cal game with the lone loss coming to top-three ranked UofL, while the Cats have lost to Cal, Tennessee, Georgia and South Carolina since. Kentucky has come out of its home shooting slump as the Wildcats have hit 49.2 percent from the field in their last five home games and are averaging 71.0 points per game. Included in that is the 64.7 percent against Alabama.

## GUARDS TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

UK's guard have showed great ball control this season as Taylor Murray and Jaida Roper have combined to play 1566 minutes over 31 games and only committed 103 turnovers while dishing out 190 assists. Murray has played 1037 minutes and has 58 turnovers with 133 assists, while Roper has played 529 minutes and has 46 turnovers with 57 assists. Murray has an assist-turnover ratio of 2.3, which ranked 44th nationally and third in the SEC enter the tournament. Roper has a 1.2 assist-turnover ratio. UK ranked 89th nationally and sixth in the SEC in assist-turnover ratio at 1.0 entering the tournament. Collectively, Murray and Roper - the two guards who run the point the most - have a combined assist-turnover ratio of 1.84 . The national leader in team assist-turnover ratio is 1.83 (UCONN). Murray has six games this season without a turnover, while she has one or less in 14 games. As a team, Kentucky ranked 45th in the nation and fifth in the SEC in fewest turnovers per game at 13.3 entering the tournament.

## ITS RAINING $3 S$

Kentucky returned $76.9 \%$ of its 3 -point production from last season and a large part of that is due to junior guard Maci Morris and senior guard Makenzie Cann. Their strong shooting and the continued development of other players on the team has UK on pace for a monster season from long range.

Morris is 74 -for- 155 from 3 this season, which ranked fifth in the nation and second in the SEC in 3 -point percentage entering the tournament. If the season ended today, Morris would have the best 3-point field-goal percentage in a season in program history at 47.7, besting the previous record of 45.4. Cann is 45 -for- 133 for 33.8 percent and has hit a 3 in every game but six this season. In all, eight Wildcats have hit a 3 this season.

The Wildcats are on pace to have one of the best 3-point shooting years in UK history. The Cats have 1883 s , averaging 6.1 per game. Currently, that total is the fourth most hit in a season in program history. The school record for 3 s in a season is 240 by the 2012-13 team. UK has hit eight or more $3 s$ in five games, including a season-best 11 against Baylor. UK's 169 3s last year ranked seventh most in a season in UK history. The top seven 3 s hit in a season have all occurred under Matthew Mitchell.

## YOUNG CATS LOOKING FOR IDENTITY IN SEC

Kentucky entered the season needing to replace nearly 50 percent of its scoring and rebounding. UK has tried to replace All-America honorees Makayla Epps and Evelyn Akhator, with five newcomers - including four true freshmen - who have shown major potential but not enough consistency

yet. Epps and Akhator were responsible for $47.4 \%$ of UK's scoring, $42.0 \%$ of its rebounding, $49.7 \%$ of its made field goals, $23.1 \%$ of its made 3 -pointers and $35.3 \%$ of its assists. Kentucky entered the season with 11 of its 14 players having played only one complete season or less for the Wildcats. Rice, Murray, Morris are the only three that entered the season having played more than one season with the program. Cann, Hardin, Halsel, Poffenberger and Roper are in their second seasons, while the five newcomers and Anyagaligbo are in their first.

## CATS GET BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN AT FLORIDA

Kentucky used its defense and some clutch shooting to end an eight-game losing streak and get back in the win column with a $56-53$ victory at Florida. The Wildcats shot 58.3 percent from the field in the fourth quarter and 51.8 percent in the second half to earn the win. Murray scored a team-high 19 points with six rebounds going 8-of-12 from the field, while Paschal went 5-of-8 from the field to score 12 points off the bench. The Cats had a 22-18 advantage in paint points, $13-9$ advantage in second-chance points and 23-4 edge in bench points.

## SHOOTING HURT CATS DURING LOSING SKID

Prior to Kentucky's eight-game losing streak, the Wildcats were shooting 45.9 percent from the field, 40.9 percent from 3 and scoring 79.7 points per game. Those numbers dipped during the streak as the Cats shot 34.3 percent from the field, 29.1 percent from 3 and scored just 56.4 points per game.

## DIFFICULT STRETCH

Starting with the game at Florida Gulf Coast and ending with its game vs. Georgia, the Wildcats played eight straight teams that had been/are ranked or receiving votes in the national rankings this season. UK's losses have come to teams that are having success this season with 13 of the 14 teams currently having a winning record entering conference tournaments: Baylor (28-1), FGCU (274), Miami (Fla.) (20-9), Louisville (29-2), Cal (20-9), Middle Tennessee (17-11),

10 Tennessee (23-6), Texas A\&M (22-8), Georgia (24-5), South Carolina (23-6), LSU
(19-8), Missouri (23-6) and Mississippi State (30-0). Kentucky is the only team in the league to play six non-conference road games.

## COMEBACK CATS STRIKE IN PULLMAN

Kentucky erased a 11-point deficit in the second quarter to earn a hardfought, come-from-behind victory at Washington State on Nov. 19. UK trailed by 11 with $3: 26$ left in the second quarter before Makenzie Cann hit three 3 s in UK's next four possessions to help cut the lead to 35-34 at halftime. In the second half, Maci Morris answered the call scoring 17 points to power the Wildcats to the win. Cann ended the game with her first career double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds, while Taylor Murray had 13 points, eight assists and seven rebounds. The 11-point comeback tied the 12th largest come-from-behind victory under Mitchell.

UK's defense came up big late in the game. After a jumper by Amanda Paschal with just over two minutes to go, Alyssa Rice got a big-time block and was fouled on the ensuing possession. After Rice made 1-of-2 from the freethrow line, Morris came up with a huge steal near midcourt and was fouled making both foul shots to give UK a three-point lead. Murray followed with a steal to give UK another possession. The Wildcats iced the game after two free throws from Cann with 7 seconds to go after a missed 3 by Washington State. Paschal was huge in the game, playing 15 minutes going 4-of-7 from the field for a career-best eight points. She also added three assists and three rebounds.

## CATS PASS FIRST TRUE-ROAD TEST AT MONTANA

Matthew Mitchell got exactly what he wanted out of Kentucky's first true road test of the season: a victory and a test. After Montana took its only lead of the game in the second quarter and a loud crowd got into the game the Wildcats were staring down a tough road ahead. But after evening the score going into the break, UK outscored Montana 44-27 in the second half to earn the win. The road win was important for the Wildcats, who did not have success on the road early last season. Kentucky didn't earn its first true-road win
last season until Jan. 12 against Alabama going 0-5 before that in true road tests.

## TOP TO BOTTOM SCORING

With five newcomers on the squad Matthew Mitchell knew before the season started that depth was going to be to his advantage this season after having a short bench the past two years. With 13 eligible players on the team - including five that have played in their first career games this season UK has shown it has a balanced scoring attack with all 13 players seeing playing time this season and scoring at least one point. Having 13 players score a point in a season is the most players to score in a season for the Wildcats since the 2012-13 season.

Kentucky has played nine or more players in every game but three, including 11 or more in 11 games and 12 or more in eight games. The bench has not only played key minutes, but scored key baskets. UK has had 10 or more players score a point in seven games, including 11 or more in three games. All five newcomers not only played in the season opener, but scored, helping UK win the bench point battle 36-11 against Sacramento State. UK also won the bench point battle 28-0 against GWU and 33-13 against Morehead State. UK had a season-high 46 bench points against Evansville.

UK's freshmen posts shined against Tennessee Tech as KeKe McKinney started and scored nine points with five rebounds, while Dorie Harrison and Tatyana Wyatt came off the bench. Harrison scored seven points and seven rebounds, while Wyatt had 12 points, three rebounds, three blocks and two assists. All five newcomers combined to play 70 minutes against Evansville, scoring 37 points. Wyatt paced the squad with her first career double-double, earning 20 points with 10 rebounds.

UK had a 23-4 edge in bench points against Florida, including 12 from Amanda Paschal and seven from Dorie Harrison. UK was 31-10 in bench points against Arkansas and 17-10 against LSU. UK outscored Miss. State 50-21 in bench points during the season series.

## CATS VS. RANKED TEAMS

Kentucky is 0-10 this season against teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national listings, falling at No. 9 Baylor, No. 3 Louisville, No. 24 Cal, No. 7 Tennessee, No. 19 Texas A\&M, No. 10/No. 8 South Carolina (two losses), at No. 15 Missouri and No. 2 Mississippi State (two losses). UK does have a win against Washington State, who was receiving votes in the Preseason AP Top 25. In order to be one of the nation's best, you have to play against the nation's best. In 44 years of women's basketball, Kentucky has 88 wins over ranked opponents, including 47 of those wins coming under Matthew Mitchell.

## HARRISON NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Dorie Harrison was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Jan. 30. Harrison started her strong week by posting a then career-high 15 points with five rebounds, one block and one steal vs. Alabama.

The rookie went 5-of-9 from the field against the Crimson Tide, helping Kentucky shoot 64.7 percent from the field in the game. The native of Nashville posted another career night at Arkansas, scoring a career-high 16 points with four rebounds, two steals and one block. Her performance vs. the Razorbacks marked the first time this season she had led UK in scoring. Overall on the week, Harrison scored 31 points with nine rebounds, two blocks and three steals, hitting nearly 50 percent from the field. One major area for improvement was her free-throw shooting, going 11-of-12 from the charity stripe after entering the week shooting just 46.8 percent.

## RICE LOOKING TO END CAREER WITH BEST SEASON

Senior post Alyssa Rice is having her best season as a Wildcat so far in 2017-18. The native of Reynoldsburg, Ohio, has five or more rebounds in 19 games, including 14 games of seven or more rebounds. Rice has two double-doubles this season with a career-high 19 points and 10 rebounds against Marshall before a career-high 12 rebounds and 11 points at Miami (Fla.) Offensively, she is hitting 48.6 percent from the field and has scored seven or more points in 12 games. Against Marshall, Rice shot a career best 72.7 percent from the field in games of five or more field goal attempts.

In the season opener vs. Sacramento State, Rice had four points and seven rebounds with a block. She followed that with a team-best 11 points against Gardner-Webb with eight rebounds and two blocks. Rice had a near double-double against Montana and Wash. State with 8 points, 9 rebounds vs. the Griz before 9 points and 8 rebounds vs. the Cougars. She had another near double-double against Auburn with 14 points and nine rebounds. Rice had 13 points, nine rebounds and three blocks against Arkansas.

The native of Reynoldsburg, Ohio, has played in 124 career games with 74 career starts, averaging 4.1 points per game and 3.9 rebounds per game throughout her career. So far this season, Rice is averaging 6.6 points and 5.9 rebounds per game.

## MURRAY IS UK'S ALL-EVERYTHING PLAYER

Taylor Murray showed everyone last season that she is a special player and needs to continue to improve her consistency for the Wildcats to be successful. The junior started strong and seems to have found her old self. Murray is averaging 11.4 points per game and 4.3 rebounds per game. Murray has led Kentucky in scoring seven times, rebounding three times, assists 22 times, steals 19 times and blocked shots twice. Her overall stat lines show her versatility and impact on the Wildcats.

Murray recently had a stretch of eight straight double-digit scoring games including three 20+ point games during that stretch. She regained that form against Ole Miss with her third double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 assists and had 18 points with five assists and six rebounds vs. Bama in the SEC Tournament.

The hot streak started against Florida, scoring 19 points on 8 -of-12 shooting including 2-of-2 from long range. The guard no doubt gained confidence in the game evidence by hitting a huge 3 with :54 left in the game to put Kentucky on top 54-49 and secure the win. She had a season-best 23 points at Vandy and followed with 17 points against South Carolina and an impressive 20 points and 10 assists vs. Bama becoming the first UK player to do that in a SEC game in program history. Murray had a great game at Missouri with a team-best 23 points adding six rebounds, four assists and three steals.

Murray led all scorers with 22 points, adding

five rebounds and three assists vs. Sacramento State in the season opener. She went 8 -of- 12 from the field, 1-of-3 from 3 and 5-of-5 from the free-throw line in the game. Murray posted her third career double-double at Montana with 18 points and 12 rebounds and followed that performance by flirting with a triple-double at Washington State with 13 points, eight assists and seven rebounds.

## "MA-MO" TURNING INTO LETHAL WEAPON

Junior Maci Morris - known by her teammates as "Ma-Mo" - knew she was going to have to increase her game overall to be the player that she and the staff wanted her to be this season. She's done just that by leading Kentucky in scoring with 17.5 points per game. Morris is also averaging 3.6 rebounds per game and has hit a team-best 74 3s this season.

The guard has scored in double figures in every game but three this season (the last two due to limited minutes due to injury). Morris really got her offense going in the second half vs. Washington State where she scored 17 points in the second half only, hitting three 3 s . She followed that with 19 points and five 3s against Morehead State. Against Marshall, Morris hit three $3 s$ to score 15 points with two assists and two steals. Morris really shined against Baylor, scoring a game-high 22 points with five rebounds and hit five 3 s . She led UK in scoring again vs. Tennessee Tech with 16 points, 6 rebounds and three blocked shots. Against Evansville, Morris was lights off from the floor going 8-of-9 from the field, including 4-of-5 from 3 for 20 points and three assists. She tied her season high with 22 points at Texas A\&M going 9-of-18 from the field with three rebounds and four assists.

Earlier this season she hit nine straight 3-point attempts after going 3 -for- 3 in the second half vs. Baylor, 2-for-2 vs. Tennessee Tech and hit her first four tries against Evansville.

Morris is hitting 47.7 percent from 3 this season which ranked second in the SEC and fifth in the nation at the start of the tournament. That percentage would be the highest in a single season in program history.

Morris only played 21 minutes against Georgia and 20 minutes at Florida due to a bruised knee she sustained in practice. She missed the game against Vanderbilt but returned against South Carolina scoring a team-high 19 points with two 3 s and four assists. She had 16 points and hit two $3 s$ vs. Bama and 11 points against Arkansas. Morris scored a game-high 18 points against Auburn, going 5-of-7 from long range and added 17 points -15 in the second half - against LSU. Morris had 22 points at Missouri, including 15 in the fourth quarter, and had 21 at Mississippi State with 17 in the second half. After 14 points in the first half, Morris ended the game vs. Arkansas with 20 points and going 7-of-11 from the field. She had a career-game with 35 points and hit five 3 s against South Carolina becoming the third UK player to score 35 or more points in an SEC game. Her fifth straight $20+$ point performance came vs. Ole Miss where she had 20 with two 3s, while she ended the regular season with six straight 20+ games with 22 against Mississippi State, including three 3 s . Morris scored 25 points -18 in the second half - against Alabama in the second round of the SEC Tournament. She is the only player in the league with seven straight $20+$ scoring games in league play this season.

## MORRIS TOP 10 ALL-TIME IN CAREER 3S

Maci Morris is making her way up the all-time 3-point field goals made list at Kentucky. The native of Pineville, Ky., has hit 176 career $3 s$ which ranks
her tied for fourth all-time in UK history. Morris needs 1 more to tie A'dia Mathies (2010-13) for third all-time. So far this season, Morris is 74-of-155 (.477) from long range. She has hit three+ 3 s 13 times, including five or more 3s five times.

Morris is only the second player in school history to have 100 or more 3 s made at the conclusion of their true sophomore season.

## MORRIS JOINS 1,000 POINT CLUB

Maci Morris became the 33rd player in program history to score 1,000 career points after hitting back-to-back 3 s to start the game vs. Auburn. Currently, Morris has 1,196 points. She currently ranks 20th all-time and needs 19 more to tie Stacy McIntyre (1989-92) for 19th all time.

## IF ANYONE CAN - MAKENZIE CANN - CAN

Last year, due to Kentucky's lack of depth in the post, Makenzie Cann had to play in more of a four position in the post when on the floor. And although she excelled by having a great season, she is much more comfortable this season having more flexibility to play around the perimeter.

Cann, who has started every game this season, was huge for the Wildcats in the early going. She is averaging 6.1 points per game and 3.5 rebounds per game while sitting second with 44 made 3s. Cann has two double-doubles this season with 15 points and 10 rebounds each against WSU and Morehead State. Cann hit three 3s scoring nine points with a teambest seven rebounds at Ole Miss.

## HARRISON. MCKINNEY SHINNING IN SEC PLAY

It has been a great few weeks for freshman posts Dorie Harrison and KeKe McKinney, who has been huge in Kentucky's success the past few weeks.

Harrison has scored in double figures in seven SEC games this season and had a stretch in late January where she improved her career high point total in all three games. Against South Carolina, Harrison had 11 points with seven rebounds before 15 points and five rebounds against Alabama. The native of Nashville, Tenn., topped those with 16 points and four rebounds against Arkansas. Harrison had 12 points and four rebounds against Missouri, going 6-of-7 from the field. Harrison had eight points and nine rebounds against Miss. State and 10 points and four rebounds vs. Arkansas. At Ole Miss, Harrison had 13 points with four rebounds, going 5-of-6 from the free-throw line, while she had 13 points and two blocks against Mississippi State.

McKinney has also performed well lately with two career-high performances recently scoring 12 points each against South Carolina and Alabama. Although she didn't score in double figures against Arkansas, she had a career-high 12 rebounds. McKinney has started the last eight games. Against Auburn, McKinney tied her career high with 35 minutes played and scored nine points with seven rebounds. She scored 10 points vs. LSU. Against Arkansas at home, she had 11 points with four rebounds. At Ole Miss, McKinney scored nine points with six rebounds.

## ANYAGALIGBO TO MISS 2017-18 DUE TO INJURY

Junior Ogechi Anyagaligbo will miss the 2017-18 season due to sustaining a torn ACL in Kentucky's exhibition game vs. Southern Indiana. Anyagaligbo, who missed the 2016-17 season due to NCAA Transfer rules, was expected to add depth in the post this season. She transfer to UK in the summer of 2016 after being named the America East Conference Rookie of the Year following her freshman season at Stony Brook. Anyagaligbo had suc-
cessful surgery to repair her torn ACL on, Nov. 22.

## MURRAY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC 2ND TEAM

Junior guard Taylor Murray was tabbed to the Preseason All-Southeastern Conference Second Team by league coaches. Murray earned the honor due to her impressive sophomore season where she started all 30 games she played and averaged 12.2 points per game while leading the Wildcats with 3.9 assists per game. She has lived up the expectations, averaging 11.2 points per game this season while leading UK in assists and steals and sitting second with 4.2 rebounds per game.

## RICE ON NCAA D1 WBB COMPETITION COMMITTEE

Alyssa Rice has been appointed to represent the Southeastern Conference on the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Competition Committee. Her term begins immediately and continues through June 30, 2018. The NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Competition Committee is comprised of 12 members and is responsible for reviewing specific areas, and as appropriate, develop and recommend strategic principles in order to maintain the women's college basketball game true to its original rules, playable, watchable, popular and relevant. The committee reviews the areas of student-athlete health and safety, sportsmanship, integrity, game operations, game presentation, technology, and statistical trends.

## RICE NAMED CHAIR OF SEC LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

Alyssa Rice has been named by her peers in the league as the chair of the 2017-18 Southeastern Conference Women's Basketball Leadership Council. The SEC Basketball Leadership Council met in September in Birmingham with each men's and women's basketball program sending one representative. Rice was selected by the women's council as the chair and represented the SEC as an SEC autonomy representative during the NCAA Convention in January. She will also attend a portion of the SEC Spring Meetings in May, and potentially the SEC Athletics Directors meeting in March. In 2016, the SEC introduced new Student-Athlete Leadership Councils in the sports of football and men's and women's basketball in which, in addition to the conference's longstanding Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC), provide student-athletes with additional opportunities to engage with campus leaders and conference office staff.

## RICE ON LISA LESLIE AWARD WATCH LIST

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association announced Alyssa Rice as one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2018 Lisa Leslie Award. Named after the three-time All-American and 1994 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its inaugural year recognizes the top centers in women's NCAA Division I college basketball.

## NEWCOMERS TO ADD DEPTH IN 2017-18

Through its success in 2016-17 the Wildcats battled depth only regularly playing seven players. That appears to be fixed heading into 2017-18 as the Wildcats' roster is 13 deep and Coach Mitchell believes he will have all the depth he needs to be successful. Part of that fix is five newcomers.

Kentucky's five newcomers are getting some quality time on the floor early this season. The five have combined to play 2,074 minutes so far this season with Harrison, McKinney and Wyatt all earning starts. All five newcomers played and scored in UK's season opener.

UK added junior college transfer Amanda Paschal, who won a national championship at Gulf Coast State College her freshman season before sitting out last year due to injury. Kentucky also adds four true freshmen who were stars in high school in Dorie Harrison (6-2, F/C, Nashville, Tenn.), KeKe McKinney (6-1, G/F, Knoxville, Tenn.), Kameron Roach (5-6, G, Hopkins, S.C.) and Tatyana Wyatt (6-3, F, Columbus, Ga.). Mitchell describes all five as extremely athletic with a strong work ethic and all four are expected to see minutes this season.

## CATS HIT CENTURY MARK TWICE IN 2017-18

Kentucky's best offensive showings have come against Sacramento State and Evansville. The Wildcats scored a season-best 101 points against Sacramento State, including a then-program record 31 first-quarter points. That record was broken against Evansville as UK scored 35 first-quarter points. The 35 points vs. UE is the most points scored in a quarter for UK since going to the four-quarter format in 2015-16.

The Wildcats' scored 100 or more points in two of its first nine games, marking the first time UK has done that to start a season since 2013-14. This was only the second time under Matthew Mitchell that UK has scored 100+ twice in its first nine games. Kentucky has scored 100+ under Mitchell 18 times and sit 18-0 in those games.

## MITCHELL MOVES INTO ELITE SEC COMPANY

Kentucky's dominating 89-57 victory over Ole Miss on Jan. 26, 2017 was an historic one for Kentucky head coach Matthew Mitchell. The win was his 97th all-time in SEC play as a head coach, which ranked him 10th all-time on the SEC's career wins list. UK's win at Arkansas on Feb. 16 was Mitchell's 100th career SEC win.

Since arriving in Lexington in 2007, Mitchell has led Kentucky to unprecedented success. On top of leading UK to its first SEC Regular Season Championship in 30 years in 2012, Mitchell has four SEC Tournament title game appearances, nine top-four finishes in the league and has coached 18 all-conference performances, including four SEC Player of the Year honors.

Mitchell won his 250th game at Kentucky against Florida on Jan. 11, 2018. Including the storied history of the UK MBB program, he is the fifth Kentucky Basketball head coach to win 250 games with the Wildcats joining Adolph Rupp, Joe B Hall, Tubby Smith and John Calipari.

## SHOOTING WORK CONTINUES TO PAY OFF

After the 2014-15 season, Coach Mitchell put a point of emphasis on Kentucky becoming a better shooting team, asking his Wildcats to increase their field goal percentage from that season - which was 38\% - to 42-45\%.

The 2015-16 team responded by putting in a ton of offseason work and working hard on their shooting during preseason practice. It worked as the Wildcats shot $45.5 \%$ from the field that season, which was the highest field-goal percentage for a UK team since 1989-90, while its $35.6 \%$ from 3 was the highest since 2002-03. Overall, UK ranked top-10 in single-season UK history in points, scoring margin and field goals made, while its 1543 -pointers made and 475 assists just missed the top 10 by two 3 -pointers and five assists.

The Wildcats strong shooting continued last season as UK hit 42.7\% from the field, which was the third highest field-goal percentage since 2005-06. UK hit 169 3s last year, which was the sixth most in a single season in program history.

## AKHATOR, EPPS SELECTED IN WNBA DRAFT

Evelyn Akhator and Makayla Epps began their professional careers in the Women's National Basketball Association as both were selected in the 2017 WNBA Draft. Akhator was selected third overall by the Dallas Wings, becoming the highest draft pick in school history. Akhator is the third player in program history to be a first-round selection and the first since A'dia Mathies in 2013. Epps became the fifth Matthew Mitchell coached player to be selected, going 33rd overall to the Chicago Sky.

Akhator and Epps are the first Kentucky players selected in the WNBA Draft since DeNesha Stallworth was taken 25th overall in the 2014 draft. In his 10-year tenure with the Wildcats, Matthew Mitchell has had five players selected in the WNBA Draft. Victoria Dunlap was the second-ever UK player selected back in 2011, while Mathies was previously the highest pick in school history going 10th in 2013.

## MITCHELL INKS 2 HIGH SCHOOL STARS TO NLIS

Matthew Mitchell continues to sign some of the best high school basketball players in the country to play at Kentucky as he inked high school stars Blair Green (Harlan, Ky.) and Rhyne Howard (Cleveland, Tenn.) to National Letters of Intent on Nov. 8.

Green is a four-start prospect by ESPN.com which ranks her as the ninth best wing in the 2018 class. Green had a great junior season for Harlan County High School averaging 23.1 points per game, 7.2 rebounds per game and hit 53.8\% from the field, including 43.8\% from 3.

All-Star Girl's Report ranks Howard as the eighth best player overall in the 2018 class while ESPN tabbed her the 10th best guard in the class. Howard averaged 19.6 points per game, 7.2 rebounds per game, 4.6 steals per game, 3.8 assists per game and 1.2 blocks per game as a junior at Bradley Central High School. She scored 647 points last year for the Bears, hitting 55 percent from the field, 40 percent from 3 and 74 percent from the free throw line.

## HOWARD, GREEN ON NAISMITH HS WATCH LIST

Kentucky WBB signees Rhyne Howard
(Cleveland, Tenn.) and Blair Green (Harlan, Ky.) have been named to the 2017 Naismith Girls' High School Watch List, which annually names the top player in high school basketball. Howard and Green are two of 50 players nationally to make the list. Howard was named to the mid-season top 25 in early January while both have been tabbed nominees for the 2018 McDonald's All-American Game.

## THE MAGIC "80"

The Wildcats hold a remarkable 341-23 (.936) record since 1974 when scoring 80 points or more. The last loss came at South Carolin on Feb. 26, 2017 when the Cats fell 95-87 in the regular-season finale. UK is 95-5 (.950) under Mitchell when scoring 80 points or more, including a 3-0 mark this season.

## UK IN OVERTIME

UK is 29-26 all-time in overtime games, including a 10-3 mark under Matthew Mitchell, who is 12-5 in his 11-year career as a head coach in OT.

## KENTUCKY ALL-TIME

Kentucky is 798-531 (.600) in its 43rd year of varsity women's basketball, including 256-116 (.688) in 11 seasons under Matthew Mitchell. Win No. 750 came against Auburn on Jan. 17, 2016 in Memorial.

MITCHELL TURNS PROGRAM AROUND
In 2009-10, Coach Mitchell implemented the " 40 minutes of dread" style of play. Although UK doesn't play that style as much anymore, it started Kentucky on an impressive run of success

- Recorded an impressive 223-84 overall record, including a 135-23 mark at home.
- Won 20-plus games every year, averaging 26.5 wins over the last seven years.
- Advanced to a school-record eight straight NCAA Tournaments, including three Elite Eight trips during that span with 15 NCAA Tournament wins.
- Nine top-four SEC finishes, including winning the SEC regular season title in 2012, its first in 30 years.
- Advanced to the SEC Tournament championship game four times
- Four SEC Player of the Year Award Winners
- Two SEC Freshman of the Year Winners


## 20+ WIN SEASONS UNDER MITCHELL

The Wildcats have won 20 or more games 18 times in 43 years of varsity basketball, including a school-record eight in a row. It's important to note that UK had just 10 20-win seasons in its first 33 years of varsity women's basketball, but has eight in 10 seasons of the Matthew Mitchell era.

## THE KENTUCKY WBB COACHING STAFF HAS ..

Combined the Kentucky women's basketball coaching staff has compiled over 80 years of experience at the Division I level, including coaching or playing in a combined 38 NCAA Tournaments with eight Final Fours, four national championships and a WNBA Championship. Elzy and Butts are in their second stint in Lexington after serving on Mitchell's staffs before. Butts was an associate head coach on Mitchell's first staff at Kentucky before Elzy joined the staff for four successful seasons. Dunn, who is a Women's Basketball Hall of Famer, has over 40 years of coaching experience, including three decades in the collegiate ranks.

## RECAPPING THE 2016-17 SEASON

Kentucky is coming off a 22-11 record last season that saw the Wildcats make a school-record eighth straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats also hosted the first and second rounds of the event for the fourth straight season. UK finished No. 18 in The Associated Press Top 25 and No. 25 in the USA Today/Coaches Top 25. It was the eighth straight season the Wildcats have finished inside the top 25 of both national listings. Mitchell's 2016-17 squad, which finished with the No. 14 overall RPI in the final NCAA RPI report, played the second-toughest schedule in the nation in 2016-17 with 25 of its 33 games being played against teams that finished in the top 100 of the NCAA RPI report. The Wildcats played 13 games against top- 25 RPI teams with four wins, while it had six wins against RPI top 50 teams.

## CATS TABBED TO WBCA ACADEMIC TOP 25

UK ended the 2016-17 season with a 3.492 team grade point average, which ranked 24th nationally in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll. Kentucky is the only Southeastern Conference team to make the WBCA Academic Top 25 and one of only three teams to claim the honor while also sitting top 20 in the final Association Press Top 25.

Matthew Mitchell has put an emphasis on academics since arriving on campus as the Wildcats have had a 3.0 team GPA or better each of the last nine semesters. Last fall, the Wildcats posted a
3.517 team GPA, which was the highest GPA for a semester in the Mitchell era. UK followed that with a 3.464 team GPA in the spring with four players earning 4.0s. UK earned a 3.3 team GPA in the fall of 2017. Under Mitchell, 34 Wildcats have been tabbed to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and 100 percent of Mitchell's players have received their degrees.

## A WINNING INSTITUTION

Both the Kentucky men's and women's basketball team have been national contenders the past few years with great success on the court. UK has tallied a 582-140 combined record between its two programs since 2009-10. That record includes a 277-28 mark in Lexington. UK was one of three schools to have both men's and women's programs as a top four seed in the 2016 NCAA Tournament.

Both the UK men's and women's basketball teams have posted an eighth straight 20-win season in 2016-17. Kentucky is one of just three institutions (Duke and BYU) in the NCAA that have seen both their men's and women's basketball programs tally 20 or more wins in the last eight straight seasons.

## MATTHEW AND JENNA MITCHELL DONATE \$1 MILLION TO UK ATHLETICS

In June of 2014, Coach Matthew Mitchell and his wife, Jenna, pledged $\$ 1$ million over the next 10 years to the University of Kentucky Athletics Department. The donation will provide UK Athletics $\$ 100,000$ per year over the next 10 years to be used for a variety of capital projects, including updates and renovations for football. The donation is the largest ever given by a UK athletics employee to the athletics department.

Matthew and Jenna have been very active in the Lexington community since arriving in Lexington. In October 2016, Matthew and Jenna were presented the Community Service Award by the Urban League of Lexington.

## RUPP ARENA CHOSEN FOR 3 STRAIGHT NCAA REGIONAL TOURNAMENTS

For the first time since the women's basketball Final Four in 1986, Rupp Arena and the University of Kentucky hosted the NCAA regional tournament in 2016 and 2017 and will again 2018 for women's basketball. In 2018, Lexington will again play host at Rupp Arena, joined by Albany, N.Y. (Times Union Center), Kansas City, Mo. (Sprint Center) and Spokane, Wash. (Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena), with regional play taking place March 23-26.
