The Streaks

- Florida's 31-game winning streak against Kentucky is fourth-longest streak in an uninterrupted series in NCAA history (more perspective on Pages 6-8).

 The streak is far and away the longest in program history, long ago eclipsing the previous record of nine (1954-1962).

The Mullen Era Opens on Strong Note

- **Dan Mullen**'s first game as Florida head coach was a resounding 53-6 victory over Charleston Southern.
- Mullen is back on the Gators' sideline, where he was Florida's offensive coordinator from 2005-08 and helped them win two BCS National Championships.

Slumping Offense? Mullen's Fixed One Before

- Florida finished the 2017 season outside the top 100 in total offense, passing offense, and scoring offense.
- The Gators have not finished in the top 100 in scoring offense since 2014, have not finished higher than 96th in total offense since 2010 (when they were 83rd), and their only passing offense to rank higher than 85th after the 2009 season checked in at 79th (2016).
- Florida appears to have the perfect man for the job of reviving its offense, though. Mississippi State ranked 42nd (420.4 yards per game) among FBS teams in total offense from 2009-17. The nine seasons before Mullen's arrival, the Bulldogs were 114th (313.3 yards).
- Mullen inherited the 114th-ranked total offense (276.0 yards per game) and 106th-ranked rushing offense (101.7) in Starkville, but Mississippi State finished the 2009 season ranked 69th in total offense (367.7) and 9th in rushing offense (224.58)--two huge upticks.
- On a plus side, Florida's offense rushed for 200plus yards three times last season. Mullen coached Mississipppi State to 44 games of 225-plus rushing yards--and won 36 of them.

GATORS RETURN NUMEROUS STARTERS FOR 2018

- Florida's 20 returning starters (10 off., 9 def., 1 specialist) from 2017 are tied for 3rd-most among FBS teams.
- Only Baylor (22) and Michigan State (22) return more, while Michigan, UAB, and Utah State bring back 20 just like the Gators.
- Florida and Michigan State are the only FBS teams in the country returning 19 position starters, as both bring back 10 on offense, nine on defense.

GATORS EXTEND NATION-LEADING STREAK

- Although Florida's 27-game winning streak in season openers was snapped with its loss to No. 11 Michigan in Arlington, Texas last year, the Gators won their 29th consecutive HOME opener last Saturday.
- Florida's 29-game winning streak in home openers longest active streak in the country, ahead of Oklahoma State (23), Wisconsin (23), Illinois (21), Arizona State (20), and Michigan State (20).
- Prior to 2017, Florida's last loss in a home or season opener came on Sept. 8, 1989, when the Gators lost to Ole Miss. 24-19.

NOTABLES FROM FLORIDA-CHARLESTON SOUTHERN

- **Feleipe Franks** threw five passing touchdowns in the first half, joining Rex Grossman (five in 1st half Oct. 14, 2000 - Auburn), Doug Johnson (seven in 1st half - Sept. 6, 1997 - Central Mich.), and Terry Dean (seven in 1st half - Sept. 3, 1994 - New Mexico St.) as the only Gators in history to throw five touchdowns in a half.
- It also marked the fifth time in program history UF threw five touchdown passes in a half, as Jesse Palmer (two) and Doug Johnson (three) combined for five in the first half versus Kentucky on Sept. 26, 1998.
- Florida's defense held Charleston Southern to three passing yards--the lowest total in the nation for Week 1, and Florida's second-lowest opponent passing total since 1996.
- With three makes from Gators kickers Evan McPherson (2 of 2) and Jorge Powell (1 of 1), Florida has made 19 consecutive field goals--a streak that dates back to last year's opener against Michigan.
- The Gators also blocked two kicks (blocked field goal and PAT) for the first time since the 2013 Sugar Bowl.
- **Dan Mullen** improved to 8-2 in season openers as a head coach, and improved the record of Florida head coaches in their debut game to 20-7.

CROSSING PATHS

- Greg Knox coached with Kentucky's Eddie Gran (assistant head coach offense / running backs) at Ole Miss (1995-98) and Auburn (1999-2008)--under Tommy Tuberville--for the exact same timeframes. Knox was the receivers coach and recruiting coordinator at both stops, while Gran was the special teams coordinator and running backs coach.
- Sal Sunseri coached with Kentucky's defensive line coach Derrick LeBlanc at LSU (2000), defensive coordinator Matt House at Michigan State (2001) and the Carolina Panthers (2008), and assistant coach Darin Hinshaw at Tennessee (2012).
- Billy Gonzales also coached with LeBlanc at LSU (2010-11), along with the Wildcats' defensive backs coach Steve Clinkscale at Illinois (2012).
- **Charlton Warren** coached with Kentucky's outside linebackers coach Brad White at Air Force (2010-11).
- UF does not have any players from the state of Kentucky, while the Wildcats have 18 players from Florida.
- Florida's **Khairi Clark** and Kentucky's Josh Ali both attended Chamindate-Madonna College Prep.

ADDITIONAL ACTIVE / HISTORICAL STREAKS

- UF has scored in 373 consecutive games—which is an NCAA record. The Gators broke Michigan's record of 365 consecutive games (1984-2014) against LSU on Oct. 7, 2017.
- Since 2008, Florida and Alabama are the only FBS teams that have not lost a game to a team which finished the season with a losing record. In addition, the Gators are one of seven teams since 2013 to stave off such a loss (Alabama, Auburn, LSU, Michigan, Navy, Ohio State).

FLORIDA 50, OKLAHOMA STATE 7 (Gainesville, Fla.) -- The Gators opened the Steve Spurrier era with a runaway victory over Oklahoma State. Spurrier's Fun-N-Gun offense debuted to the tune of 567 total yards, with sophomore quarterback Shane Matthews throwing for 332 yards and a touchdown in his first career start. Receiver Tre Everett, also making his first start, made seven catches for 110 yards and a touchdown. Florida's defense forced the Cowboys into three turnovers.

CHRIS HARRY'S HISTORY LESSON

FloridaGators.com Senior Writer Chris Harry rewinds the tape to November 15, 1986—the last time the Gators lost to Kentucky

GAINESVILLE, Fla. -- The events of that day carried painful ramifications for the Florida football program.

They also taught a young athletic administrator a painful lesson.

If it's September then it must be time to revisit the Florida-Kentucky football series and the Gators' run of dominance over the Wildcats. UF has defeated UK 29 consecutive times, dating to 1986, the longest active winning streak for one FBS program over another. It's a given that no Florida players were alive for that game, but neither were a handful of graduate assistants, quality control and support personnel, either.

UF athletic director Jeremy Foley was around for that game. At the time, he probably wished he wasn't.

You see, Foley had been named interim AD, after Bill Carr resigned. The Gators were bowl-eligible for the first time in three years after serving two seasons on NCAA probation. The bowl system was in its backroom-deal heyday and Florida was locked into the inaugural Hall of Fame Bowl in Tampa.

It was going to be triumphant. It was going to be a sellout. It was going to be glorious.

The Gators just had to win at Kentucky.

"I had gotten everybody together before the game and I had actually handed out our bowl assignments for Tampa. You know, 'You do this, I'll do that, here's how we'll handle logistics.' ... Then we got beat," Foley recalled in a 2005 interview with Tampa Tribune writer Joey Johnston looking back at the game's (now the Outback Bowl) 20-year anniversary. "I was the jinx."

It probably had more to do with a dismal blustery Bluegrass State day and a UF offensive display to match.

Nonetheless, the fallout of a terrible 10-3 loss has stuck with Foley since. No longer does he dive nose-deep into securing plans on speculation. Might be good advice to Gator fans who dare making any assumption about Saturday night's showdown with the Cats at the "Swamp."

LEXINGTON. Kv. -- Where were you Nov. 15. 1986?

I was writing high school sports for The Tampa Tribune, still four years from my first go-around covering the University of Florida. One thing I know for certain: I was not watching the Gators football team that day because they weren't on television, thanks to NCAA probation sanctions.

For Florida fans, perhaps that was for the best.

Kentucky 10, Florida 3.

It marked the last time in the series that dates to 1917 the Wildcats defeated the Gators. The streak of UF wins, which began with a 27-14 victory at Gainesville in 1987,

stands at 29 straight. That's tied for the longest run in Southeastern Conference history (Tennessee beat Kentucky every year from 1985-2010) and also tied for sixth-longest in NCAA history.

After that game, UF's edge in the series was just 20-17. Now it's 51-17.

Such staggering mastery cries for one of my trips down Memory Lane.

If you don't believe me, ask The Lexington Herald-Leader, which ran the actual game story from that day on its website.

Like I often say, not all memorable games are memorable for good reasons, but they're in the history books and going nowhere.

To the time machine we go.

THE SETUP

The Gators had won four straight, including back-to-back defeats of rivals Auburn and Georgia, the former an 18-17 win at Florida Field that many a UF diehard still recall as one of the greatest wins -- certainly comebacks -- in school history.

Florida, after starting the season 1-4, was on a roll.

A year after the NCAA's postseason ban kept the 9-1-1 Gators home for the holidays, Florida (5-4, 2-3) went to Kentucky (4-4-1, 1-3) knowing it was the No. 1 choice for the upstart Hall of Fame Bowl in Tampa.

All the Gators had to do was beat the Wildcats.

The game marked the first trip to Lexington since UF celebrated a 25-17 win there in 1984, a victory that clinched the first Southeastern Conference championship in school history. That title, of course, was eventually stripped seven months after the fact by league presidents, who cited the NCAA sanctions and order the title vacated.

The stakes in this game weren't nearly as high, but Coach Galen Hall and his players, especially the seniors, wanted to exit the SEC season on a winning note and guarantee themselves the first postseason game since 1983.



In perhaps an ironic twist, Hoosiers--which today is one of the highest-regarded sports films in history--debuted in U.S. theaters the night before the 1986 Florida-Kentucky game.

THE GAME

For the Gators, it was a cold, wet and miserable day all the way around.

As if the 36-degree temperatures at kickoff and constant drizzle throughout weren't bad enough, Florida did next to nothing on offense, while a backup UK running back had a breakout game in a thoroughly frustrating eyesore of a defeat at Commonwealth Stadium.

Reserve tailback Mark Higgs ran 27 times for 97 yards, including the game's lone touchdown, and also caught six passes for 52 more yards. Higgs' TD in the first quarter gave the Wildcats a lead they never relinquished. A field goal from UF's Jeff Dawson in the second period marked the only points for the Gators and were countered by a Joe Worley field goal in the fourth.

Florida had one last chance for a miracle drive -- and tie -- but wide receiver Ricky Nattiel fumbled on the back end of a 17-yard completion. Kentucky recovered to ice the game.

UF quarterback Kerwin Bell, who hit just one of his first nine passes in the opening half, finished seven of 24 for 145 yards and two interceptions. The Gators, befuddled by Kentucky coach Jerry Claborne's signature "Wide-Tackle 6" defense, finished with just 220 yards of total offense, held the ball just 18 minutes, 58 seconds and ran only 49 plays to UK's 79.

The Wildcats were playing without star running back Ivy Joe Hunter, out of Gainesville Buchholz, who a week earlier had rushed for 238 yards and four touchdowns in a win at Vanderbilt before a late-game injury.

Enter Higgs.

Exit the Gators ... with the loss.

- > "I have to say this is the worst loss I've ever been through. You have to play this game with a lot of emotion and we've had trouble in the past getting up for Kentucky. I didn't think it would be a problem this year, but they just wanted it a little more than we did." -- UF offensive lineman Scott Armstrong
- > "It was wet and cold and the ball had a slick film on it. Two of the passes got away from me and I was never able to get my feet set on the slippery field. Give Kentucky credit. They played a great game and we just couldn't get anything going." -- UF quarterback Kerwin Bell

This game made our season." -- Kentucky tailback Mark Higgs, clearly enjoying the moment.



EPILOGUE

In case you're wondering what happened from there (and assuming you didn't stop reading about 20 paragraphs ago), the Gators went to Tallahassee the next week and stunned Florida State 17-13 to finish the season 6-5.

The Gators, however, were not invited to the postseason, as all the bowl games were already spoken for.

As for the Hall of Fame Bowl, Boston College defeated Georgia 27-24 in that one.

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- The streak is over. Wait, the streak lives!

It was that kind of night at Kroger Field on Saturday as the Gators won 28-27, the final play a 57-yard missed field goal by Wildcats kicker Austin MacGinnis as time

The No. 20-ranked Gators appeared in serious trouble when they fell behind 27-14 early in the final quarter. Instead, they responded to knock off the Wildcats and deflate a sold-out crowd at Kroger Field ready to celebrate an upset.

Here is more in our Quick Slant:

WHAT IT MEANS: Florida improves to 2-1, 2-0 in conference play. Oh, I know what you're waiting on. Yes, the Gators somehow found a way to defeat the Wildcats for the 31st consecutive year, the longest active streak in college football against an opponent in an uninterrupted series, and fourth-longest all-time. Florida tied the game on Luke Del Rio's 6-yard scoring pass to Freddie Swain with 43 seconds left and Eddy Pineiro's PAT provided the go-ahead point.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Freshman running back Malik Davis burst onto the scene in last week's win over Tennessee when he broke free for what appeared a 74-vard touchdown run. However, a Tennessee defender knocked the ball out of Davis' hands at the 2-yard line and the ball rolled out of the end zone. Davis came back Saturday and finished strong, carrying 21 times for a team-high 93 yards to help turn the momentum in Florida's favor in the fourth quarter. A freshman from Tampa, Davis proved he can run outside or pick up tough yards inside if needed.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: The Gators passed for 209 yards but no player had more than 85. Starter Feleipe Franks threw for 85, Luke Del Rio for 74, and freshman Kadarius Toney threw a 50-yard completion to Tyrie Cleveland on a reverse in the fourth quarter.

SUBPLOT: Redshirt freshman Franks had a performance reminiscent of his outing against Michigan when he didn't make a glaring mistake, but the offense just wasn't effective. This time the Gators turned to Del Rio, who completed 9 of 14 passes for 74 yards. Now the obvious question: Who will start next week against Vanderbilt?

- Mullen made Mississippi State one of 11 FBS programs to produce six different 1,000-yard rushers from 2009-17. The others were: Auburn (9), Nevada (7), Alabama (6), Army (6), Baylor (6), Boise State (6), Georgia Tech (6), Navy (6), Ohio State (6), and Wisconsin (6).
- Mississippi State produced 26 NFL Draft picks in Mullen's nine seasons. From 1996 through 2008, Mississippi State had 27 NFL Draft picks.

 Two of those NFL Draft selections from 2009-17 were First-Rounders. Before Mullen, the Bulldogs totaled two First-Rounders from 1983-2008.

In Perspective: Mullen Takes Mississippi State to No. 1

- Mullen led Mississippi State to a 9-0 start in 2014, enabling it to claim the No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25 for a five-week stretch from Oct. 12 through Nov. 9.
- The Bulldogs' hold on the No. 1 ranking ended after a 25-20 loss at No. 4 Alabama on Nov. 15.
- Since 2001, only 16 FBS programs--predominantly "blueblood" schools--have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Top 25.
- Since 2001, only 11 FBS programs have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Top 25 at least five weeks: Alabama, Clemson, Florida, Florida State, LSU, Miami, Mississippi State, Oklahoma, Ohio State, Oregon, and Southern California.
- Since 2013, only five FBS programs have been the No. 1 team in the AP Top 25.

In Perspective: Mullen as Florida's O.C.

- During Mullen's four seasons as the Gators offensive coordinator from 2005-08, Florida ranked 3rd in passer rating (155.9), 8th in scoring offense (36.3), 15th in total offense (418.9), 21st in rushing offense (185.6), 39th in passing offense (233.2).
- Coordinated an offense that ranked 4th nationally in points per game (43.6--also fourth in school history) and 15th in yards per game (445.1), eventually helping the Gators win the 2009 BCS National Championship Game.
- Coordinated a Gators offense that scored 41
 points to rout Ohio State--which had the nation's
 top scoring defense--in the 2007 BCS National
 Championship Game.
- Coordinated the 2007 offense to 457.2 total yards per game, which ranks eighth in UF history.
- Helped Chad Jackson garner Biletnikoff Award semifinalist status after he set UF's single-season record with 88 receptions in 2005. Jackson led the SEC and ranked 6th nationally in receptions.
- Also in 2005, center Mike Degory was named a Rimington Trophy finalist.

DAN MULLEN - FLORIDA HEAD COACH

In Perspective: Mullen's Quarterbacks Track Record

- In 2002 at Bowling Green, Mullen helped Josh Harris account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (41) among FBS players and 3,213 total yards.
- In 2004 at Utah, Mullen helped Alex Smith account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (42) among FBS players, and amass 3,604 total yards.
- Smith finished fourth in the 2004 Heisman Trophy voting and was the No. 1 pick in 2005 NFL Draft.
- In 2007. Mullen helped Tim Tebow account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (55--an SEC record) among FBS players, and amass 4,181 total yards.
- Tebow also became the first quarterback in FBS history to pass for 20+ touchdowns and rush for 20+ touchdowns in a season.
- Tebow won the Heisman Trophy in 2007, becoming the first underclassman to win the award.
- Tebow's numbers dipped slightly in 2008, but he still ranked 7th nationally in total touchdowns (42) and accounted for 3,419 total yards.
- In 2014, Mullen helped Dak Prescott finish tied for fifth nationally in total touchdowns (42) in 2014, in addition to totaling 4,470 yards (3,449 pass / 986 rush / 35 receiving).
- Prescott finished 8th in the 2014 Heisman voting and was a finalist for the Maxwell Award.
- Prescott's rushing production dipped in 2015, but he increased his passing production and finished the season ranked 15th nationally in passing yards (3,793). He also ranked 11th nationally with 39 total touchdowns.
- In 2016, Mullen helped first-year starter Nick Fitzgerald, a redshirt sophomore, tie for 14th nationally with 37 total touchdowns. Fitzgerald also ran for 1,375 yards--ranking 3rd among FBS quarterbacks.
- In 2017, Fitzgerald rushed for 984 yards and accounted for 29 touchdowns despite missing nearly all of the Egg Bowl and Mississippi State's bowl game due to a gruesome ankle injury.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- The Gators only surrendered one first down in the opening half (and only four through three quarters) against Charleston Southern.
- Of the 92 total yards Charleston Southern accrued by hafltime (and 139 total yards through three quarters), 70 of them came on a single rush.
- The nine first downs Florida yielded to Charleston Southern were tied for the sixth-fewest first downs allowed by an FBS team in Week 1.
- A total of 16 Gators made their first career tackle in the season-opening win over Charleston Southern.

RUSHING DEFENSE

 Of the 89 rushing yards Florida yielded to Charleston Southern in the opening half, 70 of them came on one rush--and the drive ended with a blocked field goal.

PASSING DEFENSE

- Florida allowed just three passing yards in the season opener--which was the fewest total allowed Week 1.
 Last year, only eight teams surrendered less than five passing yards in a game.
- The Gators' three passing yards allowed were the fewest they have ever given up in a season opener.
- Chauncey Gardner-Johnson entered the season opener with one career sack--and he tallied two last Saturday alone.
- Garnder-Johnson also set a single-game career high with 2.5 tackles for loss against Charleston Southern.
- On Charleston Southern's final drive of the game, reserve defensive back John Huggins nabbed his first career interception.

2017 NOTABLES

- Florida's 14 interceptions last season were tied for second among SEC teams, and its 1.27 interceptions per game ranked 19th nationally.
- The Gators returned three of those interceptions for touchdowns, a feat only 18 other teams (all of whom played at least 13 games to UF's 11) accomplished.
- Florida had a pair of three-interception games last season (Tennessee, at South Carolina), marking the first time the Gators accomplished that since 2014.
- The Gators (four), Alabama (five) and South Carolina

- (five) were the only SEC teams with more than three multi-interception games in 2017.
- Sophomore cornerback CJ Henderson had four interceptions, returning two for touchdowns. Henderson
 was one of five true freshmen in the country with four
 interceptions, and he was one of two true freshmen in
 the nation with two interception return touchdowns
 last year.
- Henderson's four picks were the second-highest total by a true frosh in UF history, with John Clifford's seven in 1970 being the UF true freshman record.
- Sophomore cornerback Marco Wilson--brother of current Indianapolis Colts and former Gators cornerback
 Quincy Wilson-- led Florida with 10 pass breakups
 last season. Wilson's 10 PBUs were one shy of tying
 Florida's freshman record of 11 held by since Vernon
 Hargreaves III (2013) and Janoris Jenkins (2008).
- Junior linebacker David Reese was one of eight SEC players to log a 100-tackle season last year. Reese finished with 102 tackles, led the Gators in tackles 10 out of 11 games, and had a career-high 14 against Florida State.
- Florida finished 31st nationally in total defense last season (349.3 yards allowed per game), marking the first time since 2014 it finished outside the top 10, and outside the top 15 for the first time since 2007.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Florida snapped a 15-game drought of scoring a touchdown on its opening drive with an 8-play, 75yard touchdown drive on the first possession of the win over Charleston Southern.
- Prior to last Saturday, Florida last found the end zone on its opening drive on Nov. 12, 2016 against South Carolina.
- A total of 18 Gators had either a rush or reception in the season-opening win over Charleston Southern.
- Florida amassed 444 total yards against Charleston Southern. The Gators only accrued more than 425 yards in six games from 2015-17.
- Last Saturday's win over Charleston Southern marked just the sixth time since 2011 the Gators scored at least six offensive touchdowns.

RUSHING OFFENSE

- Florida rushed for 203 yards in the season-opening win over Charleston Southern. The past three seasons, the Gators only broke 200 yards rushing in eight games, three of which came last season.
- The Gators had nine rushes of 10-plus yards against Charleston Southern. Last year, Florida's season high for 10-plus-yard rushes in a game was seven (against Texas A&M and Georgia.

PASSING OFFENSE

- The Gators threw five passing touchdowns in a game for the first time since Nov. 22, 2014 against Eastern Kentucky.
- Feleipe Franks threw all five touchdowns (to four different Gators), becoming the first Florida guarterabck since Chris Leak to throw for that many in a game. Leak threw six touchdown passes against South Carolina on Nov. 13, 2004.
- **Trevon Grimes**' first reception in a Florida uniform was a 34-yard touchdown. Grimes caught a pass in the flat and took it up the sideline for the score.
- Van Jefferson hauled in a pair of touchdown receptions against Charleston Southern. It was the first multi-touchdown game of his career, as he come to UF with four career receiving touchdowns.
- Jefferson joined Brandon Powell (Nov. 25, 2017 against Florida State) as the only other Florida player in the last three seasons to catch multiple touchdown passes in a game.

• Last Saturday also marked the first time since Sept. 10, 2016 against Kentucky that four different Gators caught a touchdown pass.

2017 NOTABLES

- Despite missing the final four games of the season due to a knee injury, sophomore running back Malik **Davis** posted the fourth-most net rushing yards (526) by a Florida true freshman since 1996: Earnest Graham (654 - 1999), Jeff Demps (605 - 2008), DeShawn Wvnn (540 - 2003).
- Junior **Lamical Perine**'s nine total touchdowns in 2017 were the fifth-most by a UF running back since 1996, behind Kelvin Taylor (13 - 2015), Ciatrick Fason (12 - 2004), Mike Gillislee (11 - 2012), Earnest Graham (11 - 2002).
- Even amid UF's offensive woes last season, it managed to rush for at least 165 yards in six consecutive games (Tennessee-Georgia) for the first time since 2009. UF also averaged 170.9 rushing yards over its final 10 games.
- Aiding Florida's ground game is the return of all five starters along the offensive line. The Gators are one of 18 programs returning all five starting offensive linemen for 2018. Tackles Martez Ivey (senior) and **Jawaan Taylor** (junior) return a combined 53 starts, and they were the only offensive linemen to start all 11 games a year ago.
- One thing the Gators did do well offensively last season was convert opportunities in the red zone. Florida went 30-for-31 (96.77%) on red zone chances last year, ranking third nationally.

June 9, 1992. Once The Gainesville Sun hit newstands that Tuesday, Ben Hill Griffin Stadium's fitting nickname came to life.

Steve Spurrier, entering season three as Gators head coach, called writer Mike Bianchi the day prior and pitched him the storyline. It was seven months after the Gators ended the 1991 regular season with consecutive wins over Kentucky (which clinched an undefeated SEC record and the first league title in school history) and a thrilling 14-9 defeat of No. 3 Florida State, snapping a four-game losing streak to the Seminoles. It also gave UF a perfect 12-0 home record under Spurrier.

"The 'Swamp' is where Gators live," Spurrier told Bianchi. "We feel comfortable there, but we hope our opponents feel tenative. A swamp is hot and sticky and can be dangerous."

Initially, the UF athletic department didn't embrace the nickname. No posters, bumper stickers or marketing campaigns were put together right away. But Spurrier continued to use it. Then he and then-UF communications director Norm Carlson did some research. Turns out, in 1930, UF President John J. Tigert selected the location for the school's football stadium and described the area as a "swampy depression." The school hired engineers to drain the area and install pipes that funneled water down the hill along North-South Drive and dumped it into what is now known as Graham Pond.

Needless to say, the nickname caught on, and Spurrier delivered the perfect quote for the athletic department to utilize once it eventually did embrace the moniker: "The 'Swamp' is a place where only Gators get out alive."

- Since 1990, Florida has outscored opponents 6,712 to 2,781 in 178 games inside The Swamp, putting the average outcome at 37.7 to 15.6 (22.1 points).
- The Gators had two significant win streaks in The Swamp in the 1990s: a 23game run from 1990-93, and a school-record 30-game streak from 1994-99.

- Florida's school-record crowd of 90,916 on Nov. 28, 2015 marked the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 15 Super Bowls, four BCS National Championship Games and the 2017 College Football Playoff National Championship Game.
- The largest crowd for a home opener was 90,707 (Sept. 3, 2005 Wyoming).
 The 2009 opener (90,621) remains the second-largest.

WHAT HAPPENED: Sophomore Feleipe Franks ushered in the Dan Mullen era by firing a career-high five touchdown passes, all in the first half, and the Florida Gators found next to no resistance in destroying FCS opponent Charleston Southern in the 2018 season opener for both teams Saturday night at Spurrier/Florida Field. Franks, who won a QB battle with fellow third-year sophomore Kyle Trask and true freshman Emory Jones in the preseason, tossed touchdowns of 34, 6, 6, 3 and 3 yards, including a combined three to transfer wide receivers Trevon Grimes and Van Jefferson, while true freshman Evan McPherson hit his first career field goal to open a 38-0 halftime lead. The UF defense, meanwhile, did not allow CSU to get a first down until Buccaneers tailback Ronnie Harris took off on 70-yard run on the team's seventh possession to the UF 8 with 36 seconds to go in the half. The Florida defense, though, forced CSU to settle for a field-goal attempt, but redshirt freshman Zack Carter blocked Tyler Tekac's 22-yard field goal attempt as time expired. The Buccaneers, trailing 51-0, eventually avoided the shutout when Terrell Wilson scored on a 22-yard run early in the fourth quarter, but Jeremiah Moon blocked the extra point and redshirt freshman Austin Perry picked up the ball and went the distance for a two-point conversion. Franks, making his ninth career start, finished 16 of 24 for 219 yards, the five scores and did not have a turnover. The Gators cranked out 444 yards of total offense, including 193 on the ground by way of 11 different ball carriers, and did not turn the ball over. The UF defense limited the Buccaneers and their triple option to 225 total yards, only three through the air, and forced three turnovers.

WHAT IT MEANS: After years (and coaches) of offenses that gave fans in the "Swamp" very little to get excited about, Mullen put on a show the likes of which he demonstrated during his time at Mississippi State, and let it be known he plans to be aggressive and had no problem turning Franks loose. Now, for some context: Charleston Southern is not a very good team and was grossly overmatched in size, speed and athleticism. The game must have looked a lot like the two times the Buccaneers faced Power Five conference foes last year, in losing to Mississippi State and Indiana, by a combined 76-0. The case can be made, though, the Gators did what they were supposed to do against an inferior foe. Good start and certainly appreciated by the fans. Meanwhile, UF extended its active NCAA-best winning streak for home openers to 29 in a row. The next-longest runs belong to Oklahoma State and Wisconsin at 22 straight. UF's last lost at home on opening day was a 24-19 defeat to Ole Miss on Sept. 9, 1989.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Franks, obviously, but his crew of wide receivers probably had some folks buzzing, most notably transfers Van Jefferson, by way of Ole Miss, and sophomore Trevon Grimes, who came from Ohio State. Grimes scored the first touchdown under Mullen when he took a sideline quick-hitter from Franks, picked up an excellent block from tight end R.J. Raymond that took out two defenders, and zipped up the sidelines for a 34-yard score. Jefferson, a junior and former standout for the Rebels, grabbed four passes for 34 yards and touchdowns of 6 and 3 yards.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: Franks threw five touchdowns in the first half. The Gators, as a team, threw a combined 10 last season. Let that one sink in.


