UNDEFEATED CATS, BULLDOGS SQUARE OFF IN PRIMETIME

Kroger Field promises to be at full volume on Saturday night as Kentucky has a chance to move to 4-0 for the first time in 10 years while also starting Southeastern Conference play 2-0 for the first time since the 1977 team finished league play undefeated. The Cats host No. 14 Mississippi State in a matchup of undefeated teams. Kickoff is 7 p.m. ET and the game will air on ESPN2.

Junior running back Benny Snell Jr. has continued his assault on the record books this season, piling up 375 yards on 63 carries with three scores. He has moved into fifth place on the school's career rushing list and now is second with 14 career 100-yard games. He hasn't been a one-man show either, as sophomore running back A.J. Rose and sophomore quarterback Terry Wilson each have added a 100-yard rushing game through the first two weeks, with Wilson averaging 74.3 yards per game.

The last time UK and Miss. State met in Lexington (2016), the Cats scored a 40-38 win on Austin McGinniss' 51-yard field goal as time expired.

QUICK NOTES

- UK Athletics will honor its 2018 Hall of Fame class during halftime on Saturday. Former tight end Jacob Tamme is one of the six members who will be honored. More information is located on page 5.
- UK moves to 3-0 for the second straight season. That is the first time that has been accomplished since the 2007-08 seasons.
- UK is 11-3 in its last 14 home games.
- UK is 12-5 in its last 17 regular season games.
- UK is 20-5 in September over the last five seasons.
- With UK scoring 48 points vs. Murray State, the Wildcats have scored at least 38 points in one game for 22 consecutive seasons, since 1997. It is the second-longest such streak in the SEC. LSU has a longer streak, since 1993, but has not scored 38 in a game so far this season.
- Kentucky ended a 31-game drought against Florida with its 27-16 win in Gainesville on Sept. 8. UK's last win in Gainesville had been in 1979.
- Sophomore QB Terry Wilson is the first quarterback to begin his UK career 3-0 as the starting quarterback since Mike Hartline in the first three games of the 2008 season.
- With 245 rushing yards vs. Murray State, UK has 847 for the season. That's the most for the Wildcats through three games since 1987 (892 that year).
- The Cats have rushed for an average of 282.3 yards per game, third in the SEC and 12th in the nation in that category.
- Junior RB Benny Snell Jr. ranks 11th nationally in rushing yards per game (125.0) and total rushing yards (375) this season.
- Snell ranks ninth among active FBS players in career rushing yards with 2,799. He currently ranks fifth all-time at UK and needs just 93 more to move up to No. 4 with Mark Higgs (2,892/1984-87). To become UK's all-time leading rusher, Snell needs 1,036 yards to tie and 1,037 yards to break Saturday's Honorary Captain, Sonny Collins (3,835/1972-75).
- UK has allowed only 917 total yards this season, the fewest in the first three games since 2010 (773 that year).
- UK has allowed zero points in the third quarter this season, first time to do that in the first three games since 1991.
- Junior linebacker Kash Daniel ranks third in the SEC in tackles per game at 8.3.
- Through three games the defense ranks 23rd nationally in scoring defense (15.3) and 28th in total defense (305.7).

- This is coach Mark Stoops' sixth season in Lexington and the Wildcats have either matched or exceeded the previous season's win total in each of the past five seasons.
- UK is one of only two schools in the nation that has tied or improved its win total in each of the last five seasons. The other is New Mexico State.
- Last season, the Wildcats finished 7-6, overall 4-4 in the SEC. It marked the first time in 40 years that UK has won at least seven games and finished at least .500 in the SEC in back-to-back seasons.
- It was UK's second consecutive 4-4 league mark, the first time the Wildcats have achieved that since 1998-99.
- UK finished third in the SEC Eastern Division in 2017 and second in 2016, marking UK's highest finishes since the league split into division in 1992.
- The Cats have appeared in back-to-back bowl games for the first time since 2009 and 2010.
- Five Wildcats have received preseason all-conference recognition, led by the sturdy legs of junior running back Benny Snell Jr. and the explosive playmaking of senior tight end C.J. Conrad on offense as well as the dynamic pass rushing of senior linebacker Josh Allen and Mr. Consistency senior safety Mike Edwards on defense. Sophomore all-purpose player Lynn Bowden Jr., has also been recognized as a receiver and return specialist.
- Six Wildcats are on national award watch lists. Josh Allen - Bednarik Award and Butkus Award; Lynn Bowden Jr. - Paul Hornung Award; C.J. Conrad - Allstate FCA Good Works Team, Mackey Award; Wuerffel Trophy; Mike Edwards - Bednarik Award, Thorpe Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy; Benny Snell Jr. - Doak Walker Award, Maxwell Award, Walter Camp Player of the Year; Max Duffy - Ray Guy Award
- The Wildcats are scheduled to face a challenging schedule as all eight SEC opponents are either in the Top 25 or receiving votes.
- UK had a new starting quarterback in the opener for the fourth consecutive season (2015 - Patrick Towles, 2016 - Drew Barker, 2017 - Stephen Johnson, 2018 - Terry Wilson) and eighth time in the past nine years (2010 - Mike Hartline, 2011 - Morgan Newton, 2012 Maxwell Smith, 2013 Jalen Whitlow).
- Kentucky entered the 2018 season without a quarterback who had thrown a pass in an FBS game.
- The UK defense is a deep and experienced unit, returning 14 of its top 19 tacklers from last season. Those returnees totaled 573 tackles, 40.5 tackles for loss and 19.5 sacks. The unit held six opponents under 100 yards rushing last season, the most in a given year since 1949.

HANGING WITH THE HOME-IES

- When Kentucky broke through under former coach Rich Brooks from 2006-08 it was done in large part because of a home-grown nucleus led by quarterback Andre' Woodson (Radcliff), wide receiver Keenan Burton (Louisville), tight end Jacob Tamme (Danville), defensive tackle Corey Peters (Louisville) and others.
- It's notable that the team once again has a strong group of young men from the Commonwealth.
- The offensive line that has paved the way for 282.3 rushing yards per game is coached by home-grown John Schlarman and piloted by center Drake Jackson (Versailles). The team's leader in touchdown receptions in Lexington's David Bouvier, the leading tackler is Kash Daniel (Paintsville) and the game-clinching defensive score vs. Florida came from Davonte Robinson (Lexington).

- The University of Kentucky Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2018 will be announced at halftime. The class includes Russ Cochran (men's golf), Anthony Davis (men's basketball), Victoria Dunlap (women's basketball), Dennis Emery (men's tennis coach), Eric Quigley (men's tennis) and Jacob Tamme (football).
- About Jacob Tamme (2004-07) >> Consensus first-team All-SEC as a junior and senior ... Career totals featured 133 catches for 1,417 yards, most ever by a UK tight end, along with 11 TD receptions ... Helped UK to Music City Bowl wins in 2006 and '07 ... Outstanding senior season featured 56 catches for 619 yards and six TDs, earning fourth-team All-America honors ... Won a National Scholar-Athlete Award from the National Football Foundation ... First-team Academic All-America ... SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year in football ... Named to the National Good Works Team for community service ... Received Bobby Bowden Award as FCA National Player of the Year ... Played nine NFL seasons with Indianapolis, Denver and Atlanta

of the team will make their way from the JCTF through Gate 12 and into the stadium. Fans are welcome to cheer the Wildcats as they enter Kroger Field.

SCOUTING MISSISSIPPI STATE

- Mississippi State is 3-0 on the season, all non-conference affairs.
The Bulldogs traveled to Kansas State in week two and pounded the Wildcats, 31-10, on their home turf, a historically difficult proposition.
Although Dan Mullen left for Florida, new head coach Joe Moorhead has been involved with winning programs at every stop of his coaching journey, most recently as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Penn State.
Moorhead won 38 games in four seasons as a head coach at Fordham, leading the Rams to their first winning season in five years and FCS playoff berths each of his final three seasons with the program.
The Bulldogs have 48 lettermen returning and 17 starters (9 offense, 8 defense).
Quarterback Nick Fitzgerald is in his third season as the starter and continues to be a dual-threat weapon. He accounted for 350 total yards in last week's win over Louisiana and ranks tied for SEC lead in rushing at 133.0 yards per game.
In two games against UK, Fitzgerald has accounted for six touchdowns (two passing, four rushing). He has rushed for 115 (2017) and 107 (2016) yards with two scores on the ground in each game.
Running back Kylin Hill has been dominant over the first three weeks of the season, rushing for 293 yards and three touchdowns while averaging 9.2 yards per carry. He also has two receiving touchdowns in as many catches.
The State defense has been stout and disruptive, dialing up 33 tackles for loss in the first two weeks of the season, including 10 sacks.

SERIES VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE

- Mississippi State leads the all-time series 23-22, but UK holds a 13-9 advantage in games played in Lexington.
Mississippi State won last year's meeting, 45-7, in Starkville.
The Cats won the 2016 meeting, 40-38, in Lexington when Austin MacGinnis drilled a game-winning 51-yard field goal as time expired.
UK scored 34 points in the second half of that game to erase a 14-6 halftime deficit and overcame a 10-point fourth quarter one to win the game.
The Bulldogs have rushed for 563 yards the past two seasons, with 282 last year and 281 in 2016.
State outgained UK 441-260 last season, as Benny Snell Jr. was held to a career-low 18 yards (not counting the Music City Bowl).
State has won nine of the past 11 meetings dating to 2007.
The winning team has scored at least 40 points in each of the past four meetings.
The teams met for the first time in 1914 and have squared off each of the past 28 seasons. Mississippi State is UK's permanent crossover foe from the SEC West.
The Wildcats won eight straight matchups from 1958 to 1990.

MILESTONES TO WATCH

- Junior RB **Benny Snell Jr.** has 2,799 career rushing yards and is fifth all-time on Kentucky's career rushing list. He needs 93 yards to tie Mark Higgs (2,892 from 1984-87) for fourth.
- Snell has 14 career 100-yard rushing games, which is second on UK's career chart. He needs four more to tie Sonny Collins (1972-75).
- Snell now has 35 career rushing touchdowns, second on the Cats' career list. He needs two more to tie Randall Cobb (2008-10) as the program's all-time leader.
- Snell had 1,333 rushing yards last season, which ranks third at UK for a single-season.
- Snell had seven 100-yard rushing games last season, which ranks tied for second at UK. The school record is eight set by Artose Pinner in 2002.
- Senior WR **Dorian Baker** has 93 career receptions and needs just seven more to become the 16th player to reach 100 for his UK career. He needs 36 to crack UK's career top 10 list.
- Baker has 1,061 career receiving yards, ranking 26th in school history. He needs 50 yards to tie Javess Blue (1,111 from 2013-14) for 25th.
- Senior TE **C.J. Conrad** counts nine touchdowns among his 58 career receptions, giving him a scoring grab once in every 6.4 catches.
- Senior S **Mike Edwards** has eight career interceptions. With two more he'd move into a tie for fourth with Larry Carter (1977-79), Buzz Burnam (1970-72) and Marcus McClinton (2004-08).
- Edwards has 249 career tackles and needs 51 to join the UK 300-tackle club. He would be the 19th member of that exclusive club.
- Senior LB **Josh Allen** has 16.5 career sacks. He needs one to tie Jeremy Jarmon (2006-08) for fourth on UK's all-time list. Allen needs 10 sacks in 2018 to overtake Oliver Barnett (1986-89) for the most in school history.

KENTUCKY-MISSISSIPPI STATE CONNECTIONS

- UK has one player from the state of Mississippi: Senior OL Bunchy Stallings (McComb).
- Mississippi State cornerbacks coach Terrell Buckley was on the Florida State staff at the same time as Mark Stoops, serving a role with the weight room staff in 2010 and 2011.
- Mississippi State does not have a player from the Commonwealth on its roster.
- Miss. State athletics director John Cohen was the head baseball coach at Kentucky from 2004-08.

CATS VS. THE RANKED

- Kentucky has played 247 ranked teams in the Associated Press Poll in its history. The Cats are 42-200-5 in those games.
- UK's last win over a ranked team was two weeks ago on the road at No. 25 Florida, 27-16.
- The Cats are 3-4 against ranked teams since 2015. The wins were over No. 25 Florida (2018), No. 11 Louisville (2016) and No. 25 Missouri (2015).
- UK is 1-6 vs. a ranked Mississippi State team. The lone win came in 1953, a 32-13 win vs. the 20th-ranked Bulldogs in Lexington.
- A win would give the Cats consecutive wins over ranked foes for the first time since 1976-77 (five).

THE STREAK IS BROKEN ...

On Sept. 8, Kentucky ended a 31-game drought against the Florida Gators.

- Was UK's first win in Gainesville since 1979 and first time UK has defeated a ranked UF team in Gainesville.
• Was UK's first win over a ranked Florida team since 1976, when UF was ranked No. 15.
• Moved the Cats to 2-0 for the second straight season and fourth time in the past five years.
• Won SEC opener for the second year in a row, first time that has been accomplished since 2006-07.
• Won SEC road opener for the second year in a row, first time that has been accomplished since 1983-84.
• Was Kentucky's first win over a ranked opponent since winning at No. 11 Louisville in 2016.
• Was UK's first win over a ranked SEC opponent since No. 25 Missouri in 2015.
• Was UK's first road win over a ranked SEC opponent since 1998 at No. 21 LSU.
• Was UK's largest margin of victory in a road win vs. a ranked SEC opponent (11 points) since October 15th, 1977 at LSU (20 points)
• The 16 points scored by Florida was the second-lowest total for the Gators in the series since 1986. The Gators scored 14 in 2015 in a 14-9 win in Lexington.
• Kentucky was the first school to rush for at least 300 yards against Florida since 2002 (Miami (FL), September 7, 2002).
• Benny Snell was the fourth SEC player since 2000 to rush for 175+ yards at Florida (Travis Stephens, Marcus Lattimore, Trent Richardson).
• Terry Wilson is the only player since 2000 to have at least 150 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in a single game against Florida.
• Game balls were awarded to offensive line coach John Schlarman, who is battling serious illness, and sophomore defensive end Josh Paschal, who is currently out of action while receiving treatment for a malignant melanoma on his foot.
• Kentucky earned Reveal Suits National Team of the Week as selected by the Football Writers Association of America.

OFFENSIVE PREVIEW

- "Balance" has been the hallmark of the Kentucky offense the last two seasons under Eddie Gran, UK assistant head coach for offense.
• The Wildcats have rushed for more than 2,000 yards and passed for more than 2,000 yards in each of the previous two campaigns, the first time in school history that UK has done so in

- UK has a solid base for repeating that achievement for a third consecutive season in 2018. Five players return in the offensive line who have been full- or part-time starters during their careers. A deep set of running backs is led by Benny Snell, a two-time 1,000-yard rusher.
- There has been some re-tooling in the passing game following the departure of the starting quarterback and four senior receivers.

Quarterbacks

- Quarterbacks coach Darin Hinshaw had a big challenge this season, as no quarterback on the roster had thrown a pass in a major-college game.
- Junior-college transfer Terry Wilson (sophomore eligibility) has started every game this season, completing 69.5 percent of his passes for 392 yards and two touchdowns. He's also dangerous as a runner with 223 yards and two TDs. Wilson, who redshirted as a freshman at Oregon, threw for 2,133 yards and 26 touchdowns last season in juco.
- Sophomore Gunnar Hoak saw his first UK action vs. Central Michigan, entering the game in the second quarter and directing a touchdown drive just before halftime, capped by his own 24-yard TD toss to David Bouvier. He also threw a touchdown pass in the win over Murray State.
- Redshirt freshman Danny Clark displayed a strong arm in practice last season and scored a two-yard rushing touchdown on his first career rushing attempt in the Murray State game. Another redshirt freshman, Walker Wood, missed most of last year with an injury, but has displayed a penchant for making plays with his arm and his legs throughout his career.
- The quarterbacks are replacing Stephen Johnson, a tenacious leader who posted a 14-10 record as the primary QB and led UK to two bowl games in the last two seasons.
- Terry Wilson is on pace to have 1,568 passing yards, 892 rushing yards, eight passing touchdowns, and eight rushing touchdowns this season. Only one quarterback in school history has had at least seven passing and rushing touchdowns in the same season (Derrick Ramsey, 1976). No quarterback in school history has had at least 1,000 passing yards and 500 rushing yards in the same season.

PART OF THE GRAN-D DESIGN

- Since taking over the Kentucky running game upon his arrival in 2016, Eddie Gran has fashioned the Cats into one of the more physical and prolific rushing attacks not only in the SEC, but in the country. The Cats averaged 234.2 rushing yards per game in 2016, Gran's first in Lexington and then 161.7 yards per game last season. Those numbers are significant in that only twice in the previous 20 seasons had a UK offense rushed for more than 162 yards per game (2015 and 2009) and not for more than 200 per game since 1993 (210.5).





- Gran has mentored the likes of Benny Snell Jr. and Stanley “Boom” Williams at Kentucky, Chris Thompson, Devonta Freeman and James Wilder Jr. (Florida State), Montario Hardesty (Tennessee), Carnell Williams, Ronnie Brown, Kenny Irons and Rudi Johnson (Auburn) and Deuce McAllister (Ole Miss). During his 23 seasons as a running backs coach he’s spent 20 of those against top shelf competition in the SEC and Atlantic Coast Conference, making the numbers even more impressive.
- Some of the more compelling stats from Gran’s 23 seasons at Ole Miss (1995-98), Auburn (1999-2008), Tennessee (2009), Florida State (2010-12), Cincinnati (2013-15) and Kentucky:
 - 17 seasons averaging at least 150.0 rushing yards per game
 - 10 seasons averaging at least 172.0 rushing yards per game
 - 10 individual 1,000-yard rushers
 - Eight seasons with a running back who scored at least 10 rushing touchdowns
 - Three seasons averaging at least 200.0 rushing yards per game
 - Only once has his running attack averaged less than 100.0 yards per game
 - Only twice has his running attack averaged less than 125.0 yards per game

Running Backs

- The UK backfield is headlined by Benny Snell Jr., but goes much deeper than UK’s All-SEC ballcarrier.
- Snell is averaging 125 yards per game, third in the SEC and 11th in the nation.
- Snell (125 yards) and sophomore A.J. Rose (104) each surpassed the century mark and scored two touchdowns vs. Central Michigan. It was a career-high performance for Rose, who scored from 55 yards away on his first carry of the season. Rose has run for 146 yards this season with three touchdowns and is averaging 8.6 yards per carry.
- Snell (175) and QB Terry Wilson (105) each surpassed the century mark at Florida, giving UK back-to-back games with 100-yard rushers for the first time since 1979.
- Snell is the first player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons. He is already fifth in school history with 2,799 career yards and owns the school record for rushing TDs with 35. He is only two TDs away from Randall Cobb’s career record of 37 total touchdowns.
- Senior Sihiem King is a more-than-capable backup, with 630 yards, four touchdowns and a 5.6-yard average during his career. He has the speed to go the distance from anywhere on the field.
- Coaches also are eager to get extended looks at a pair of freshman signees, Chris Rodriguez and Kavosiey Smoke. Rodriguez made his debut against Murray State and showed burst and vision in two carries for 43 yards, including a 27-yard long.

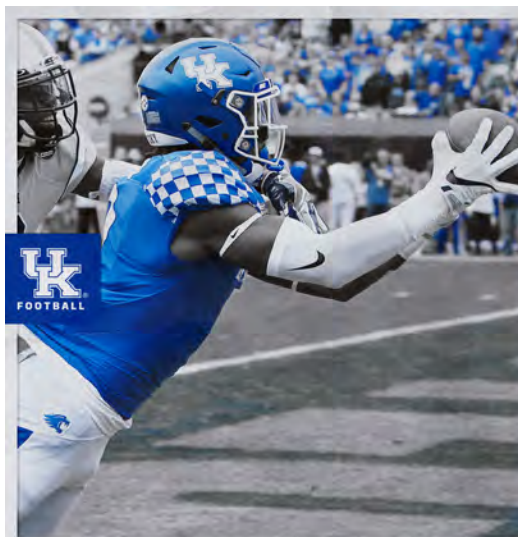

Tight Ends

- Kentucky returns a mixture of talent at the tight end spot in 2018, highlighted by All-SEC tight end C.J. Conrad. The 6-5, 252-pound senior returns in full force after suffering a season-ending foot injury vs. Georgia on Nov. 18. The valuable run blocker and pass catcher was second on the team in receiving yards with 16 catches and four TDs prior to his injury. He has now totaled 58 receptions for 733 yards and nine TDs in his three-year career.
- Conrad is joined by junior Justin Rigg (6-6, 257), who saw action in all 13 games last season in a backup role. Despite battling nagging injuries throughout his career, Rigg has shown he has the size and speed to compete at this position. Newcomers Brenden Bates (6-4, 240, Fr.-HS) and Keaton Upshaw (6-5, 234, Fr.-HS) add to the tight end talent pool in 2018.

Wide Receivers

- The Kentucky wide receivers are somewhat younger this season after the departure of four key contributors, but a pair of veterans and several gifted youngsters give UK the ability to have a capable receiving corps.
- It was bad news at the time, of course, but senior Dorian Baker's season-ending injury in August, 2017, has enabled him to return for a fifth year. Baker has caught 93 passes for 1,061 yards and six touchdowns during his career.
- Junior Tavin Richardson played his best ball at the end of last season with 11 of his 27 catches coming in the last three games. Appropriately, he had his career-best showing in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, with five catches for 88 yards.
- A set of sophomores, Josh Ali, Lynn Bowden Jr., Isaiah Epps, Zy'Aire Hughes and Clevan Thomas





Jr., all have seen game action. Bowden saw the most action last season, catching 17 balls for 210 yards. Four freshman signees could work their way into playing time. The “X” factor is Ahmad Wagner, a 6-5 transfer who played three years of basketball at the University of Iowa before deciding to return to football, where he displayed eye-popping ability in high school.

- Bowden posted career highs in both receptions (8) and yards (89) in the win over Murray State and is UK’s leading receiver this season with 17 catches.
- Hughes scored a 49-yard touchdown on his first career offensive touch, ironically not being credited with a catch on the play after Benny Snell Jr. took the direct snap, passed to quarterback Terry Wilson, who latered to Hughes.
- Freshman Allen Dailey Jr. (2 catches, 38 yards) scored his first career touchdown on an impressive 23-yard run and catch vs. Murray State.
- Freshman Akeem Hayes made his debut and recorded his first career catch vs. Murray State.

Offensive Line

- Offensive line coach John Schlarman enters his sixth season at Kentucky and once again his line is ready and able as they combine for 46 career starts among them, including 45 from 2017. The line boasts four returning starters who helped Benny Snell Jr., become the first player in school history with 1,000 rushing yards in back-to-back seasons.
- Sophomore Drake Jackson, out of Woodford County High School, took over the center position midway in the 2017 season and has been a fixture ever since. Backing him is junior Mason Wolfe.
- Stallings is a two-year starter in the offensive line, is currently stationed at right guard. He was named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week after the win at Florida. Behind him is redshirt freshman Austin Dotson.
- Senior George Asafo-Adjei (6-5, 315) has seven consecutive starts at right tackle. Behind him is true freshman Darian Kinnard (6-5, 357).
- The Wildcats got a bad break during August practice when junior Landon Young, a returning starter at left tackle, sustained a knee injury and is out for the season. Redshirt freshman Naasir Watkins and sophomore E.J. Price are sharing the position. It is Price’s first action at UK after sitting out a year via transfer from Southern California.
- Junior Logan Stenberg (6-6, 320) was a staple at left guard in all 13 games last season, while sophomore Luke Fortner (6-6, 293) provides depth in the rotation.

SPECIAL TEAMS PREVIEW

- Special teams coordinator Dean Hood brings a wealth of knowledge to the program as he is in his 31st year of college coaching.
- Senior kicker Miles Butler made his first two field goal attempts of the season vs. Murray State. He is succeeding four-year starter Austin MacGinnis (2014-17), UK’s all-time scoring leader with 359 points.
- True freshman Chance Poore as shown a long-distance leg and could be called upon for long field goals. He was the No. 1 punter/kicker in the 2018 class by ProKicker.com.
- For the second-consecutive season, UK has an Australian transplant handling the punting duties. Max Duffy as done very well, averaging 45.7 yards this season on nine punts with five punts inside the 20-yard line. He arrived in the United States as an early enrollee in January and used the off-season to learn American football rules, how to say “ya’ll” and how to put on his pads correctly. Another Aussie, Matt Panton, was UK’s punter in 2017. Duffy is currently on the watch list for the Ray Guy Award given annually to the nation’s top punter.
- Hood’s special teams blocked three kicks in 2017, two of which were crucial plays in Wildcat wins. UK special teams did not allow any blocked kicks nor allow a punt or kickoff return for a touchdown.
- Junior Grant McKinniss, the starting punter in 2016, is handling the kickoff duties this season.
- Senior Tristan Yeomans returns to handle the long snapping for punts, while junior Blake Best is the snapper for field goals and PATs.
- The kickoff return specialist, Lynn Bowden Jr., set UK records last season for most kickoff returns in a season (37), game (7 vs. Louisville) and most kickoff yards in a season (869). His 869 kickoff return yards ranked eighth most in SEC history. He is averaging 19.3 yards per return this season.
- Senior David Bouvier has been handling punt returns and is averaging 8.6 per return.

DEFENSIVE PREVIEW

- The Kentucky defense will be one of the most experienced in the Southeastern Conference and the nation this season, with depth and size at each level of the unit. Seniors Josh Allen, Derrick Baity Jr., Mike Edwards, Jordan Jones, Adrian Middleton, Darius West and Chris Westry all have extensive resumes of quality play and give UK a chance to continue building on last season’s successes.

Linebackers

- First-year outside linebackers coach Brad White inherited one of the nation’s top pass rushers, Josh Allen, when he came on board in the spring.

- Rush end/linebacker Josh Allen has been a force on the outside, improving his numbers each season even as he sees more and more attention from opponents. The senior could have left for the NFL Draft but decided to come back for his final year, giving the Cats one of scariest pass rushers in the country. Allen has begun his senior year with a bang, totaling 19 tackles, 4.5 for loss, two sacks, and he caused a fumble that UK returned for a touchdown to clinch the win over Florida.
- Weakside linebacker Jordan Jones has 16 tackles, including 1.5 for loss, and had four pass breakups vs. Murray State. He missed four games last season due to injury but is looking to return to his 2016 form when he totaled 109 tackles and earned All-SEC honors.
- Sophomore Jamar “Boogie” Watson started the opener at strongside linebacker and had a career-high six tackles, along with a pass breakup.
- Junior middle linebacker Kash Daniel is the successor to the graduated Courtney Love after a two-year apprenticeship. Daniel leads the team and is third in the SEC in tackles with 25 stops.
- Senior Kengera Daniel has shown the versatility to play both defensive end and outside linebacker but is slated to be mostly used as a linebacker in 2018. He logged his first career sack vs. Eastern Michigan last season and has 11 career tackles.
- Redshirt freshmen who could make an impact include Chris Whittaker and Jordan Wright outside, and Jamin Davis and Alex King inside. Also, keep an eye on true freshman inside linebackers Chris Oats and DeAndre Square.
- Davis recorded his first career interception in the Murray State game.

Secondary

- Coach Steve Clinkscale is in his third season as the secondary coach and is joined by Dean Hood, who is sliding from linebackers to work with the defensive backs. The pair has nine experienced players to utilize, which gives UK one of the deepest units in the SEC at cornerback and safety.
- Senior safety Mike Edwards has earned a reputation as one of the league’s top defensive backs, proving strong in run support while being an adept pass defender. He totaled 197 tackles the past two seasons (100 in 2016, 97 in 2017) with 9.5 tackles for loss and 8 career interceptions, including a team-high four last season. Edwards flirted with declaring for the NFL Draft a year early but returned and will be a stabilizing force on the back end of the defense.

five pass breakups. He also blocked an extra point against Eastern Kentucky and started the final five games of the season. With a year of experience he is considered an important piece of the defensive puzzle in 2018.

- The Wildcats have a great deal of talented youth in the defensive backfield, including sophomore Cedrick Dort Jr. and redshirt freshmen Tyrell Ajian and Yusuf Corker. Ajian and Corker made their career debuts vs. Central Michigan in the 2018 opener. Dort has has been hampered with injury.
- Freshmen Stanley Garner and Jamari Brown each made their debut vs. Murray State.

Defensive Line

- In his second season on the UK staff defensive line, coach Derrick LeBlanc likes what he sees this season. Despite not having a senior starter in 2017 the Cats held six opponents to less than 100 yards rushing, the first time a UK defense had done that since 1949.
- UK has played eight down linemen so far this season, the best depth the Wildcats have had on the front line in many years.
- Senior Adrian Middleton is in his third season as the starting defensive tackle. He has 70 tackles, including 9.5 for loss, during his career.
- Junior T.J. Carter really came on the second half of the 2017 season with three tackles for loss and three sacks over the final five games of the regular season. The defensive end started 12 games and recorded 18.0 tackles to go along with the tackles for loss and sacks. He also had two quarterback hurries and a pass breakup.
- UK was hit with heartbreaking news in fall camp when sophomore defensive end Josh Paschal was diagnosed with melanoma in his right foot. Paschal is undergoing treatment and his return is uncertain. Last season, he showed flashes of brilliance with 4.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks and had bulked up to 278 pounds in the offseason. He had a critical blocked punt in the win over Eastern Michigan and was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week.
- The towering presence on the UK defensive line is Calvin Taylor Jr., who stands 6-foot-9. The junior earned his first start against Northwestern in the Music City Bowl and finished the 2017 season with 22 tackles, 1.0 tackle for loss and 1.0 sack.
- Senior Tymere Dubose is part of the Youngstown-Lexington pipeline and should see significant time at tackle this season. In 23 career games he has 16 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack.
- Sophomore nose guard Quinton Bohanna opened some eyes in 2017 as a true freshman, stepping in and playing very well without having any collegiate experience. The

- Senior Darius West is second on the team in tackles with 19 and he grabbed an interception at Florida. He returned in full form last season after suffering a season-ending knee injury during fall camp of 2016. West ranked third on the team in total tackles with 86 and had a knack for producing turnovers and big plays in important moments. He twice had double-digit tackles, caused two fumbles and picked off a pass.
- Sophomore Davonte Robinson is a backup safety. He has five tackles this season and, on the final play of the game, returned a fumble

30 yards for a touchdown at Florida.

- Seniors Derrick Baity Jr. and Chris Westry are back together for a final season as two of the most experienced players in the SEC. The two have played in 80 combined games with 64 starts and snatched eight interceptions. Both players have more than 100 career tackles and at least 13 pass breakups. Baity was named SEC co-Defensive Player of the Week after having a hand in three turnovers in the second half of the Cats' 23-13 road win at South Carolina last season.
- Junior Jordan Griffin has been a luxury for the Cats the past two seasons, a player capable of starting who gave the defense three legitimate SEC cornerbacks against offenses increasingly deploying more receivers. Griffin picked off his first pass in a win over Vanderbilt and made 22 tackles in 13 games last season.
- Junior college transfer Lonnie Johnson Jr. showed big-time playmaking ability at cornerback in his first season at UK with 41 total tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack and





340-pounder started the final five games of the season and was credited with 14 tackles on the year.

- Junior Phil Hoskins and sophomore Kordell Looney showed flashes in 2017 and will provide much-needed depth on the interior of the line. Hoskins recorded his first career sack in the win over Florida.

LIVING ON THE EDGE

- Kentucky pass rushing aficionado Josh Allen has taken up residence in opposing quarterbacks' minds for several years but now has a young protege who is looking to be the Cats' next great edge rusher.
- Allen has 16.5 sacks and 23.0 tackles for loss in 41 career games. He also has forced seven fumbles, picked off a pass and registered 11 quarterback hurries.

- Josh Paschal, from Olney, Maryland, was promoted to full "Blitz Bro" status after a strong freshman campaign. Paschal finished with 17 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss this season, including 3.5 sacks, and blocked a punt. He is currently out due to a melanoma in his foot.

BENNY IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Throughout his career, Benny Snell Jr. has continued to etch his name into the Kentucky record books. Here's a snapshot of his records in each of his three seasons:

FRESHMAN:

- In 2016, earned All-SEC Freshman honors after rushing a team-high 186 times for 1,091 yards and 13 touchdowns, averaging 5.9 yards per carry
- The 1,091 rushing yards is a school record for most rushing yards by a freshman, besting Moe Williams who had 928 rushing yards as a freshman in 1993
- Had 13 rushing touchdowns, breaking Randall Cobb (2008)'s record for most rushing TDs by a UK freshman (7) and most total touchdowns (9)
- Had the most rushing TDs in a single season (13) since Artose Pinner had 13 in 2002
- With 152 yards against Austin Peay, he eclipsed 100 yards on the ground for the fifth time, setting the school's freshman record for most 100-yard rushing games in a season

BENNY THE BULLDOZER

- Benny Snell Jr., has earned a reputation as one of the nation's fiercest runners, flashing the speed to take it the house but also an ability and willingness to run through defenders for the touch yardage that moves the chains. The proof is in the YAC (yards after contact):
- Snell accumulated 897 rushing yards after contact in his his first two seasons, which includes yardage lost on negative rush plays.
- The total ranked eighth nationally in 2017 according to *Pro Football Focus*.
- Snell leads all returning SEC running backs with 44 missed tackles forced on his rushing attempts, 14 more than Alabama's Damien Harris and Mississippi State's Aeris Williams.

QUICKEST TO 3,000

- Benny Snell Jr., has 2,799 career rushing yards through 27 career games with at least one rushing attempt. He's on pace to be the quickest player in school history to reach 3,000 career rushing yards. Moe Williams reached 3,000 career rushing yards in his 32nd game with a rushing attempt and Sonny

Collins reached 3,000 career rushing yards in his 33rd game with a rushing attempt.

- If Benny has at least 201 rushing yards within his next three games with a rushing attempt he would be the fifth SEC player since 2000 to reach 3,000 career rushing yards within their first 30 career games with a rushing attempt.

SNAP TO IT

- Kentucky entered the season without any quarterback on its roster having ever stepped on the playing field during a game, as none of the Cats' top four projected quarterbacks have taken an FBS snap. Furthermore, this is the first time since 2000 that the Cats open a season without a quarterback having thrown a single pass.
- The Cats are one of the few programs in the country in that position this season, with Minnesota and Nebraska also opening the year without any experience. For Kentucky, returnees Danny Clark, Gunnar Hoak and Walker Wood all watched the 2017 season, while signee Terry Wilson came from junior college after a redshirt season at Oregon. Nebraska will have a transfer with FBS experience on its roster but he is sitting out as a transfer, while Minnesota has only freshmen and redshirt freshmen.

- Although Kentucky had to replace quarterback Stephen Johnson, linebacker Courtney Love and kicker Austin MacGinnis, amongst others, the Cats still rank among the leaders in most starters returning for the 2018 season. BRING THE WHOLE CREW

- The UK defense will have arguably its most experienced and deepest unit yet since coach Mark Stoops took over, returning 14 of its top 19 tackles from 2017, including five of the top six. Led by senior safeties Mike Edwards and Darius West, the returning Cats totaled 573 tackles, 40.5 tackles for loss and 19.5 sacks a year ago. Edwards (97.0/4.0/1.0) and West (86.0/4.0 TFL) give the defense consistent playmaking and a presence at the back end of the unit.
- In addition to those two, All-SEC linebacker Josh Allen opted against entering the

EARNED NOT GIVEN

A trio of Wildcats earned the ultimate sign of respect from the coaching staff, being rewarded with full scholarships after arriving in Lexington as walk-ons. Senior wide receiver David Bouvier, senior kicker Miles Butler and junior running back Zach Johnson all were placed on scholarship in a

team meeting during training camp, sending teammates into a frenzy of happiness.

- Bouvier (Lexington, Ky.) is a local product who has shown an aptitude for special teams and caught a nine-yard pass in the 2016 TaxSlayerBowl. The 5-foot-9, 168-pounder is a three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll and three-time Dean's List honoree. He caught a scoring pass in each of the Cats' first two games of 2018.
- Butler (Paducah, Ky.) has the most playing experience of the three, having handled punt duties during the Vanderbilt game last season, when he averaged 38.7 yards on three kicks, with all three punts being placed within the 20-yard line. In 2015, he made all four of his field goal attempts and 11 of 12 PATs. His career long field goal is 46 yards. The 5-foot-9, 165-pounder has been named to the Dean's List for seven semesters and earned SEC Academic Honor Roll for 2015-17.
- Johnson (Cincinnati, Ohio) is in his third season with the program after opting to walk on out of Colerain High School. The 5-foot-10, 185-pound back saw action in eight games last season on special teams and returned a pair of kickoffs for 35 yards.

HERE, THERE, EVERYWHERE

- While most college football programs recruit regionally, Kentucky has expanded its reach as far west as Colorado, east to New Jersey,



north to Michigan and south to Florida. Furthermore, the Cats have a second punter/kicker in as many years from Australia, tapping into the ranks of young men who have a history with Australian rules football.

- The Cats' geographic roster breaks down in 17 different states and Australia: Ohio (28), Kentucky (27), Florida (19), Georgia (11), Maryland (3), Oklahoma (3), Tennessee (3), Alabama (3), Louisiana (2), Michigan (2), Colorado (1), Indiana (1), Mississippi (1), New Jersey (1), North Carolina (1), Virginia (1), South Carolina (1) and Australia (1).

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

- UK's uniform preparers have a little extra work to do this season and a little less space with which to do it. The Cats have 10 players whose names have "Jr." in it, two that are hyphenated and three that could stump even the top finishers in the National Spelling Bee.
- The 10 players who are a "Jr." include: Derrick Baity Jr., Lynn Bowden Jr., Allen Dailey Jr., Christopher Rodriguez Jr., Cedrick Dort Jr., Lonnie Johnson Jr., E.J. Price (Edward Junior), Benny Snell Jr., Calvin Taylor Jr., and Clevan Thomas Jr.
- The Cats also have Abule Abadi-Fitzgerald, who has 16 characters in his last name, as well as George Asafo-Adjei and three Berezowitz brothers (Brayden, Bryan and Zac).

COUCH NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HOF BALLOT

Former Kentucky quarterback Tim Couch has been named to the 2019 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame, the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame announced. Couch is one of 76 players and six coaches from the Football Bowl Subdivision and 100 players and 32 coaches from the divisional ranks.

- A storied name of the Kentucky program, Couch, was the team's quarterback from 1996-98. After giving up his senior season of eligibility, he was drafted as the No. 1 pick by Cleveland in the 1999 NFL Draft. In 1998, the junior quarterback was named a first-team All-American and consensus Southeastern Conference Player of the Year. Couch completed 400 of 553 passes for 4,275 yards and 36 touchdowns and led the nation in pass completions while ranked second in completion percentage, passing yardage and touchdown passes, and fourth in total offense. After guiding the Wildcats to the Outback Bowl, UK's first New Year's Day bowl appearance in 47 years, Couch finished fourth in Heisman Trophy balloting. He was also a finalist for the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award as a junior and sophomore. His breakout sophomore campaign featured 363 of 547 passes completed for 3,884 yards and 37 touchdowns while leading the nation in pass attempts, completions, yardage, and completion percentage. Also during his sophomore year, Couch earned second-team All-SEC honors and finished ninth in Heisman voting. He played in seven games as a true freshman, with two starts. Career wise, Couch completed 795 passes on 1,184 attempts for 8,435 yards and 74 touchdowns. The legend ended his career with seven NCAA records, 14 SEC records, and 26 school records.
- The announcement of the 2019 Class will be made Monday, Jan. 7, 2019, in Santa Clara, Calif. The city is serving as the host for the CFP National Championship, which will be played later that day at Levi's Stadium.

UK ADEPT AT HOLDING THIRD-QUARTER LEADS

- Kentucky has won 40 of its past 42 games when staked to a lead at the end of the third



quarter, dating back to a 2008 loss vs. South Carolina.

- UK is 23-2 in the Mark Stoops era when holding a third-quarter lead. The only losses were in 2016 vs. Georgia and 2017 vs. Florida. The Cats avenged the 2017 Florida defeat in 2018 by ending a 31-game losing streak to the Gators.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Kentucky currently has two players on its roster who have already earned their undergraduate degrees in David Bouvier and Adrian Middleton.
- Twelve Wildcats (**George Asafo-Adjei, Dorian Baker, Blake Best, Miles Butler, C.J. Conrad, Tymere Dubose, Mike Edwards, Lonnie Johnson, Bunchy Stallings, Calvin Taylor, Darius West and Tristan Yeomans**) are all expected to graduate in December with their undergraduate degrees
- Last season, Kentucky had 20 total graduates, including three who earned a master's degree (Dylan Greenberg, Jacob Hyde, Austin MacGinnis).
- Last season, UK had 27 players on the 2017 SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.
- Several players have strong cume GPAs over their academic careers, including Miles Butler (4.0), Brayden Berezowitz (4.0), Bryan Berezowitz (4.0), Luke Fortner (3.965), Brett Slusher (3.881), Donald Smith (3.690) and David Bouvier (3.564).

During the week-long trip, they interacted with residents of impoverished communities, visited and helped paint a preschool, constructed wooden shoe-shining boxes, delivered blankets to widows.
- UK has taken football student-athletes to Ethiopia on a service trip since 2011. Due to the state department's travel ban to Ethiopia in 2017, the Cats visited the Dominican Republic.

ELEVEN-YEAR OLD LUKE KLAUSING SIGNS WITH UK FOOTBALL

- Head coach Mark Stoops announced the signing of 11-year-old wide receiver Luke Klausing of St. Agnes Catholic School in Louisville, Kentucky to a national letter of intent on Aug. 1.
- Klausing was named the newest member the Kentucky football team during an inspirational Team IMPACT Signing Day celebration at Kroger Field. The event was sponsored by Vertex Pharmaceuticals.
- Klausing is one of 30,000 patients in the United States living courageously with cystic fibrosis (CF), a disease predominantly diagnosed in children by the age of 2. He was diagnosed at five days old. By sponsoring Signing Days of children with CF, Vertex Pharmaceuticals helps spread awareness for the disease—and the life-long, positive effects Team IMPACT has on these children.
- Team IMPACT is a national nonprofit that connects children facing serious and chronic illnesses with local college athletic teams, forming lifelong bonds and life-changing outcomes. Through the support of Vertex Pharmaceuticals, children who have CF, like Luke sign with local college athletic teams and become an official member of the team to support the child's physical, social and emotional needs. By being a part of the Kentucky Football program, Luke will attend Wildcats practices, games, team dinners, events and more.
- His bio is located in the Player Bio section of the game notes.

COACHING CHANGES

- Dean Hood switched responsibilities from outside linebackers to defensive backs. He remains the special teams coordinator.
- Michael Smith, a 25-year coaching veteran, was hired as wide receivers coach, replacing Lamar Thomas. Smith had spent much of his career at Kansas State before the past five years at Arkansas as the receivers coach.
- Brad White, who spent the past six seasons as an assistant coach with the NFL's Indianapolis Colts, is the new outside linebackers coach. White

spent time on the Wake Forest, Murray State and Air Force staffs before moving to the NFL.

DID YOU KNOW?

- This is the 128th season of intercollegiate football for Kentucky.
- A picture of longevity, UK Equipment Manager **Tom Kalinowski** is in his 41st season in that role. A group of former players, staff



members and current UK coaches pitched in during the summer of 2017 to surprise him with a new Ford Escape.

- The Kentucky cheerleaders have won an unprecedented 23 national cheerleading championships, including 19 of the last 23, at the annual Universal Cheerleaders Association championships.
- Kentucky is one of only 10 schools that have won an NCAA men's basketball championship while also having a claim on a national championship in football.
- UK is one of only seven universities in the U.S. that have programs in agriculture, engineering, law, medicine and pharmacy on a single campus.



KROGER FIELD

On game day, Kroger Field often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.



- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 294 games within the friendly confines of newly-named Kroger Field. UK has a 158-132-4 record (.544), 22-16 under Mark Stoops.
- UK announced its first sellout since 2015 when 62,945 fans attended the Florida game on Sept. 23, 2017.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 62,382 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance in 14 of the last 16 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years.
- The playing surface is named C.M. Newton Grounds at Kroger Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

KROGER FIELD

Commonwealth Stadium was renamed to Kroger Field in May of 2017. The agreement--which is between Kroger and JMI Sports, UK's multimedia rights partner-- begins at approximately \$1.85 million annually with a term of up to 12 years. With the partnership, Kroger becomes the Official Fuel Partner of the University of Kentucky and the Official Grocery Partner of Move-In at UK while also providing additional engagement opportunities with UK students. Per the agreement, Kroger is also the Official Nutrition and

Pharmacy Partner of UK Athletics.

Kroger Field was transformed into a state-of-the-art facility after a \$126-million reinvention which was completed prior to the 2015 season. The project was handled by HNTB. The outside of the stadium underwent a dramatic external facelift, receiving a modern look, but one that remained uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Kroger Field was reduced over the course of the two-year project to approximately 61,000, but the value of all remaining seats were increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses were revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and security. Players and coaches reaped the benefits of the new Kroger Field as well, as home-team facilities were built, and a multi-purpose recruiting room hosts future Wildcats on their on-campus visits.

FACTS AND FIGURES

Seating Capacity: 61,000, including the Commonwealth Suites. New bench-back seating has been installed in the South upper level of Kroger Field.

Playing Field: UK switched from natural grass to synthetic turf for the 2015 season. Other SEC schools with a turf surface are: Arkansas, Mississippi State, Missouri and Vanderbilt.

Video Boards: Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage. The interior seating bowl also has LED ribbon boards.

Sound System: Sportsound system delivers pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

GAME DAY EXPERIENCES

The "Cat Walk" on Talbott Todd Way: With the unveiling of the new \$45 million Kentucky Football Training Facility in August of 2016, the headquarters of the program moved next door to Kroger Field. That means the Cat Walk presented by Chevy will still begin outside Gate 1 two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff, but the team proceeds past Gate 1 and between Kroger Field and Nutter Field House which has been dedicated to former Wildcat Talbott Todd (1963-65). Todd, who passed away from ALS in August of 2017, was an avid supporter of the program. From Talbott Todd Way the team will walk to the locker room in the Joe Craft Kentucky Football Training Facility.

Pregame concerts: The Kentucky Football Pregame Concert Series has returned for the 2018 season. Concerts will begin on the stage outside Gate 12 immediately following the Cat Walk and last until 30 minutes prior to kickoff. The Cat Walk takes place two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff.

Coca Cola Fan Zone: Fans of all ages, but especially the younger Wildcats, will enjoy playing at the Fan Zone located in Nutter Field House. It will have inflatable games, free posters, face tattoos and more, available two hours before kickoff.

Looking ripe for an upset because it kept coughing up the football, Kentucky eventually tightened its grip on it as well as Central Michigan.

The Wildcats' depth on both sides of the ball also helped them avoid a potential disaster.

A.J. Rose and Benny Snell, Jr. each rushed for two touchdowns, Gunnar Hoak came off the bench to throw the go-ahead TD pass and Kentucky overcame four first-half turnovers to beat Central Michigan 35-20 in its season opener.

For a while the upset-minded Chippewas seemed poised to make the Wildcats their third Power Five victim in as many

seasons by building a 17-7, second-quarter lead and scoring all their points off two interceptions and two fumbles. Kentucky rallied with two TDs over the final four minutes of the half, including Hoak's 24-yard scoring pass to David Bouvier for a 21-20 edge with 14 seconds remaining.

Kentucky shut out CMU from there, limiting the Mid-American Conference team to 97 second-half yards while outgaining them 427-255 overall to improve to 7-0 in the series.

The Wildcats' offense in particular used strength in numbers to overcome those self-inflicted setbacks.

Snell had TD runs of 52 and 11 yards to finish with 125 yards rushing on 20 attempts. Rose, a sophomore, rushed for TDs of 55 and 4 yards on the way to 104 on eight carries and his first career 100-yard game as Kentucky dominated the ground game 299-118.

Hoak meanwhile demonstrated why it's good to have an able backup with a gutsy bailout after starter Terry Wilson left the game with a shoulder injury sustained while throwing his second interception. The sophomore led Kentucky 71 yards in 41 seconds and hit Bouvier down the middle for his first career TD that shifted momentum for good.

Stoops sidestepped a question about using both QBs next week at Florida but stressed the importance of having them ready after seeing it pay off when Kentucky needed it.

Benny Snell, Jr. rushed for 175 yards as Kentucky ended a 31-year losing streak against Florida, topping the Gators 27-16 in Gainesville.

Quarterback Terry Wilson completed 11 of 16 passes for 151 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while also rushing for 105 yards and a score.

The win was Kentucky's first over Florida since 1986, and the Cats' first win in Gainesville since 1979.

After the Kentucky defense forced Florida to punt on the opening possession of the game, the Wildcats got on the board. The Cats covered 91 yards in nine plays, capped by a 29-yard touchdown pass from Wilson to David Bouvier. Miles Butler nailed the point after and Kentucky led 7-0 with 5:07 left in the first quarter.

Florida answered with a scoring drive of its own, but the UK defense kept the Gators out of the end zone. Florida was on the UK three-yard line, but a sack by Phil Hoskins and a third-down stop forced the Gators to attempt a 29-yard field goal, which Evan McPherson converted, cutting the UK lead to 7-3.

After Kentucky was forced to punt, Florida went 63 yards in just four plays, scoring on an 18-yard pass from Feleipe Franks to Moral Stephens, giving the Gators a 10-7 lead.

Kentucky would get into Florida territory twice more in the first half, but both drives ended in turnovers. The Cats defense would hold on both occasions, and the Gators held a 10-7 halftime lead.

The Cats took the second-half kickoff and put together an impressive scoring drive. Leaning on Snell, Kentucky drove 90 yards in 10 plays, with Snell covering 36 of those yards. Wilson had a pair of big plays in the drive, with a 19-yard run on third down, and the drive capper, a 24-yard designed run for a touchdown. Butler's PAT was good and Kentucky led 14-10 with 9:49 left in the third quarter.

After a Florida punt, Kentucky struck again. This time, the Cats went 78 yards in just five plays, with Wilson connecting with Lynn Bowden, Jr. for a 54-yard touchdown. The PAT was good and Kentucky led 21-10 with 4:11 left in the third quarter.

Late in the fourth quarter, Franks hit Freddie Swain with a touchdown pass to cut Kentucky's lead to 21-16, after a two-point conversion failed.

The scoring ended when Davonte Robinson recovered a fumble and returned it 30 yards for a score on the game's final play.

Kentucky football coach Mark Stoops wasn't worried about his team overlooking Murray State following a 27-16 win at Florida.

Despite a slow start, the Wildcats (3-0) outscored the Racers 31-7 in the second half and rolled to a 48-10 victory Saturday. Murray had trouble stopping Kentucky quarterback Terry Wilson, who threw for 163 yards and rushed for 80 more to keep the Wildcats perfect on the season.

Coming off an 11-point victory over the Gators that ended a 31-game losing streak in their Southeastern Conference opener, the Wildcats (3-0) showed no signs of a letdown and

overwhelmed the Racers from start to finish. Leading 17-3 at the break, Kentucky pulled way in the second half.

Traditionally the Wildcats have struggled against FCS opponents and needed overtime to fend off Ohio Valley Conference member Eastern Kentucky in a 34-27 win in 2015. The task was much easier this time for Kentucky.

Paced by Wilson, the Wildcats used a balanced offense to defeat the Racers, amassing 528 yards of offense, including 245 on the ground. Wilson targeted nine different receivers, mainly Lynn Bowden, Jr., who caught eight passes for 89 yards. Wilson and backup Gunnar Hoak threw for 240 yards and one touchdown.

Benny Snell, Jr. collected 75 yards on 15 carries and added a score. In limited action in the second half, Snell had just four carries as A.J. Rose and Sihiem King collected a bulk of the carries in the second half.

In a surprise trick play, Snell completed a shovel pass to Wilson, who then handed the ball off to Zy'Aire Hughes for a 49-yard score to end the third quarter. Snell's block downfield created a wide-open path to the end zone for Hughes in his first career touchdown.

Murray avoided the shutout on Gabriele Vicente's 29-yard field goal at the end of the first half. Racers quarterback Drew Anderson competed 15-of-32 passes for 118 yards. Backup signal caller Preston Rice scored Murray's lone touchdown with a 21-yard run with 30 seconds remaining.

Overall, Stoops was pleased with the win and likes the where his team stands following the first three weeks of the regular season.
