CATS OPEN SEC PLAY WITH TRIP TO GAINESVILLE

With a season-opening win against Central Michigan that tested its resolve right out of the gate, Kentucky heads south looking to end a frustrating drought. The Wildcats will take on No. 25 Florida in The Swamp in primetime with an opportunity to defeat the Gators for the first time since 1986. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. ET on the SEC Network.

The Cats return 19 total starters, the 11th most in the country, to a team that has won 14 games the past two seasons, including eight in league play. Led by All-America candidates Josh Allen (OLB), C.J. Conrad (TE) and Benny Snell Jr. (RB), and a defense that has 14 of its top 19 tacklers back, the Cats are primed for a breakthrough.

Snell continued his assault on the record books in the opener, piling up 125 yards on 20 carries with a pair of scores. A staggering 91 of those yards came after contact and he forced six missed tackles, including hurdling through a pair of defenders on his 52-yard scoring run.

QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is looking to snap Florida's 31-game winning streak against the Cats. UK's last win over Florida was in 1986, a 10-3 victory in Lexington. UK's last win in Gainesville was in 1979.
- Three of the past four meetings have been decided by six points or less. UK fell by one point last season in Lexington, 28-7, in triple overtime in 2014, 36-30, and lost 14-9 in Lexington in 2015.
- In the season opener, UK amassed 299 rushing yards, the most in a season opener since 1993 vs. Kent State (309 that game).
- The one-two punch of Benny Snell Jr., and Asim Rose Jr., provided 229 of those rushing yards. It marked the first time UK had two players rush for 100 yards since Snell and Boom Williams did it in 2016 at Missouri.
- This is coach Mark Stoops' sixth season in Lexington and the Wildcats have either matched or exceeded the previous season's win total in each of the past five seasons.
- UK is one of only two schools in the nation that has tied or improved its win total in each of the last five seasons. The other is New Mexico State.
- Last season, the Wildcats finished 7-6, overall 4-4 in the SEC. It marked the first time in 40 years that UK has won at least seven games and finished at least .500 in the SEC in back-to-back seasons.
- It was UK's second consecutive 4-4 league mark, the first time the Wildcats have achieved that since 1998-99.
- UK finished third in the SEC Eastern Division in 2017 and second in 2016, marking UK's highest finishes since the league split into division in 1992.
- The Cats have appeared in back-to-back bowl games for the first time since 2009 and 2010.
- Five Wildcats have received preseason all-conference recognition, led by the sturdy legs of junior running back Benny Snell Jr. and the explosive playmaking of senior tight end C.J. Conrad on offense as well as the dynamic pass rushing of senior linebacker Josh Allen and Mr. Consistency senior safety Mike Edwards on defense. Sophomore all-purpose player Lynn Bowden Jr., has also been recognized as a receiver and return specialist.
- Five Wildcats are on national award watch lists. [Josh Allen](#) - Bednarik Award and Butkus Award; [Lynn Bowden Jr.](#) - Paul Hornung Award; [C.J. Conrad](#) - Allstate FCA Good Works Team, Mackey Award; Wuerffel Trophy; [Mike Edwards](#) - Bednarik Award, Thorpe Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy; [Benny Snell Jr.](#) - Doak Walker Award, Maxwell Award, Walter Camp Player of the Year.
- The Wildcats are scheduled to face a challenging schedule as they will play two opponents ranked in the AP Preseason Top 25, including No. 3 Georgia, and No. 18 Mississippi State and three more who are receiving votes (South Carolina, Florida and Texas A&M).

- Three of UK's wins last season were against teams that finished with at least seven wins – at Southern Mississippi (8-5), at South Carolina (9-4) and vs. Missouri (7-6).
- UK had a new starting quarterback in the opener for the fourth consecutive season (2015 - Patrick Towles, 2016 - Drew Barker, 2017 - Stephen Johnson, 2018 - Terry Wilson) and eighth time in the past nine years (2010 - Mike Hartline, 2011 - Morgan Newton, 2012 Maxwell Smith, 2013 Jalen Whitlow).
- Kentucky entered the 2018 season without a quarterback who had thrown a pass in an FBS game.
- The UK defense is a deep and experienced unit, returning 14 of its top 19 tacklers from last season. Those returnees totaled 573 tackles, 40.5 tackles for loss and 19.5 sacks. The unit held six opponents under 100 yards rushing last season, the most in a given year since 1949.

IN THE OPENER

- The win over Central Michigan marked the eighth time under Stoops that UK has trailed by at least 10 points but rallied to win. That ties the school record and is the most in the SEC since 2014. Coach Rich Brooks also had eight such games.
- UK had two players rush for touchdowns of at least 50 yards against CMU, the first time since Randall Cobb and Derrick Locke did so vs. Vanderbilt in 2010.
- Benny Snell Jr. (125 yards) and A.J. Rose (104) both went over 100 rushing yards, the first time two UK backs have done that since Snell (192 yards) and Stanley "Boom" Williams (182) did so at Missouri on Oct. 29, 2016.
- UK allowed 255 yards, fewest in a season opener since WKU in 2011 (234 yards).
- 255 yards allowed is the fewest vs. an FBS opponent since Florida in 2015 (245 yards).
- UK allowed only 3.9 yards per play, fewest vs. an FBS opponent since 2014 vs. Louisiana-Monroe (3.3 yards per play in that game).
- 299 rushing yards is most in a season opener since 1993 vs. Kent State (309 that game).

SCOUTING FLORIDA

- Florida went out and lured former Gator assistant coach Dan Mullen away from Mississippi State, where he resurrected the Bulldogs and turned them into an annual bowl team.
- The Gators smashed FCS opponent Charleston Southern, 53-6, in the season opener.
- The Gators used a balanced offensive attack with Feleipe Franks at the controls. Franks threw for 219 yards and five touchdowns while rushing for another 34 yards.
- The run game was by committee with four players receiving at least five carries. Dameon Pierce was the most effective, rushing for 73 yards on nine carries.
- Ten different players caught passes, led by Van Jefferson's four for 34 yards and two scores. Four players caught touchdown passes from Franks.
- The Gators allowed just 225 yards of total offense, including a shocking three yards through the air.
- The Gators defense piled up eight tackles for loss, three sacks and forced three turnovers.

SERIES VS. FLORIDA

- Florida leads the all-time series 51-17, including 28-4 in Gainesville.
- UK's last win in Gainesville was in 31-3 triumph in 1979.
- Three of the last four meetings have been decided by six points or less, with one going to three overtimes.
- The Gators won last season's game 28-27, scoring the winning touchdown with just 43 seconds remaining.
- Florida has won 31 consecutive meetings dating to 1986.
- This will be the 10th consecutive season UK and Florida have been in the month of September.
- Each of UK's past three trips to Gainesville have been its first road game of the season (2014, 2016 and 2018).
- The teams have met annually since the 1967 season.
- The first-ever meeting was in 1917 with UK earning a 52-0 victory.
- Games decided by a touchdown or less: Florida leads 16-9.
- Biggest UK win: 52 (52-0) in 1917 in Lexington
- Biggest Florida win: 66 (73-7) in 1994 in Gainesville

During his time with the schools, they went a combined 64-13. Stoops also spent a year in 1996 on the South Florida coaching staff, helping build the Bulls in the start-up of the program before the 1997 kickoff.
Co-offensive coordinator Darin Hinshaw is originally from Punta Gorda, Florida and was a standout quarterback at Central Florida from 1991-94. He set numerous school records for the Knights, finishing as the career leader in every major passing category, including yards (9,000) and TDs (82).
Florida running backs coach Greg Knox coached at Ole Miss (1995-98) and Auburn (1999-2008) with Eddie Gran under head coach Tommy Tuberville. Gran was the special teams coordinator and running backs coach while Knox was the receivers coach and recruiting coordinator.
Sophomore receiver Josh Ali and Florida's Khairi Clark attended Chamindale-Madonna at the same time.

A UK WIN WOULD...

- End Florida's 31-game winning streak in the series, giving UK its first win over Florida since 1986 (UK 10, UF 3) and first win in Gainesville since 1979 (UK 31, UF 3).
Mark the Cats' fifth win in Gainesville all-time.
Give UK its first win over a top-25 ranked team in the AP poll since defeating No. 11 Louisville (UK 41, UL 38) on the road in 2016.
Give UK its first win over a ranked Florida team for the first time since upsetting the 15th-ranked Gators 28-9 in 1976 in Lexington.
Give UK its first win in school history over a ranked Florida team in Gainesville.
Give Mark Stoops his third win over a ranked team (Louisville and Missouri), including second over a conference foe.
Move UK to 2-0 for the second straight season and fourth time in past five years.
Make it two consecutive seasons the Cats have won their SEC road opener. The Cats defeated South Carolina last season in Columbia.

MILESTONES TO WATCH

- Junior RB **Benny Snell Jr.** has 2,549 career rushing yards and is seventh all-time on Kentucky's career rushing list. He needs 69 yards to tie Derrick Locke (2,618 from 2007-10) for sixth.
- Snell has 13 career 100-yard rushing games which is tied second on UK's career chart. He needs one more 100-yard game to move into second alone and five more to tie Sonny Collins (1972-75). He's currently tied with Rafael Little (2004-07) and Moe Williams (1993-95).
- Snell had 1,333 rushing yards last season, which ranks third at UK for a single-season.
- Snell had seven 100-yard rushing games last season, which ranks tied for second at UK. The school record is eight set by Artose Pinner in 2002.
- Senior WR **Dorian Baker** has 89 career receptions and needs just 11 more to become the 16th player to reach 100 for his UK career. He needs 40 to crack UK's career top 10 list.
- Baker has 1,036 career receiving yards, ranking 27th in school history. He needs 16 yards to tie Derek Homer (1,052 from 1997-2000) for 26th.
- Senior TE **C.J. Conrad** counts nine touchdowns among his 53 career receptions, giving him a scoring grab once in every 5.9 catches.
- Senior S **Mike Edwards** has eight career interceptions. With two more he'd move into a tie for fourth with Larry Carter (1977-79), Buzz Burnam (1970-72) and Marcus McClinton (2004-08).
- Edwards has 238 career tackles and needs 62 to join the UK 300-tackle club. He would be the 19th member of that exclusive club.
- Senior LB **Josh Allen** has 15.5 career sacks. He needs two to tie Jeremy Jarmon (2006-08) for fourth on UK's all-time list. Allen needs 11 sacks in 2018 to overtake Oliver Barnett (1986-89) for the most in school history.
- Senior CB **Derrick Baity Jr.** has 18 career pass breakups and needs seven more to match Leonard Burress (2000-03), Eric Kelly (1997-2000) and Van Hiles (1993-96) for third on UK's career list.

BIG GAMES VS. FLORIDA

- 1950 - One of Kentucky's big wins in its national championship season was a 40-6 home victory over No. 17 Florida. All-America quarterback Vito "Babe" Parilli threw two touchdown passes and led the Wildcats to 459 yards total offense.
- 1976 - Kentucky played seven ranked teams in the 1976 season, winning four of those games. One of those victories was a 28-9 home win over No. 15 Florida as the Wildcats eventually won the Southeastern Conference championship. Coach Fran Curci termed Kentucky's effort, "The most complete game I have ever been associated with as a coach."
- 1986 - Kentucky's last win over Florida came in 1986 as the Wildcats defeated the Gators, 10-3, on a cold, drizzly day in Lexington. Quarterback Bill Ransdell completed 20-of-23 passes for 161 yards as the Kentucky offense controlled the ball for 41 minutes. Mark Higgs rushed for 95 yards and scored the game's only touchdown on a one-yard run in the first quarter.

IN OUR LAST MEETING AGAINST FLORIDA

- Kentucky fell to Florida 28-27 at Kroger Field in 2017.
- The Wildcats had a chance to win on the game's final play, but Austin MacGinnis came up just short on a 57-yard field goal attempt as time expired.
- After the teams traded punts to start the game, Kentucky got the scoring started on its second drive. The Wildcats marched 75 yards in eight plays, culminating with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Johnson to Blake Bone. MacGinnis nailed the point after to give Kentucky a 7-0 lead.
- The Wildcats took that lead into the second quarter, but that's when Florida scored its first points. The Gators went 58 yards in just four plays, with Kadarius Toney rushing 36 yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 7-7 with 14:16 left in the second quarter.
- UK regained the lead later in the second quarter, when Johnson connected with Garrett Johnson on a nine-yard fade in the corner of the end zone to make it 14-7 UK.
- UF answered later in the quarter when, on fourth down and three from the 45 yard line, quarterback Feleipe Franks found a wide-open Tyrie Cleveland to tie the score 14-14 with 3:16 left in the half.
- The Cats had a chance to take the lead into the locker room right before the half, but MacGinnis' 48-yard field goal glanced off the right upright with 16 seconds remaining, and the score remained 14-14 at the break.
- Florida received the second-half kickoff, but went three-and-out, as the Wildcat defense forced a punt. Kentucky took over on its own 38 and went 62 yards in just four plays. And when Johnson hit tight end C.J. Conrad with a 23-yard scoring pass, the Cats grabbed a 21-14 advantage.
- Kentucky extended its lead later in the quarter on a 42-yard MacGinnis field goal, giving the Wildcats a 24-14 lead with 5:51 left in the third quarter.

- In the fourth, MacGinnis added to the lead with a season-long 50-yard strike, giving Kentucky a 27-14 lead with 11:33 left in the game. It was MacGinnis' 58th career field goal, breaking the Kentucky record of 57 previously held by Joe Worley.
- But Florida was not done. The Gators took the ensuing kickoff and marched 80 yards in seven plays, keyed by a Toney end around pass to Cleveland for 50 yards. Brandon Powell finished the drive with a six-yard rush out of the wildcat formation to cut Kentucky's lead to 27-21 with 7:58 left in the game.
- After a Kentucky punt, the Gators mounted what turned out to be the game-winning drive. Florida assembled a 13-play, 58-yard drive that ended with a Luke Del Rio five-yard scoring pass to Freddie Swain. Eddie Pineiro nailed the extra point to give Florida a 28-27 lead with just 43 seconds remaining.
- UK was able to drive the ball into Florida territory on its final possession of the game. And with three seconds left, MacGinnis' attempt came up just short, ending the game.

HELLO, I'M NEW HERE

Although Kentucky is one of the more experienced teams in the country this season a new wave of talent is on the way, with 16 players making their Wildcat debut in the 2018 opener vs. Central Michigan.

- Offense: WR Allen Dailey Jr., OL Austin Dotson, QB Gunnar Hoak, OL, Darian Kinnard, OL E.J. Price, TE/FB Drew Schlegel, WR Brett Slusher, OL Naasir Watkins and QB Terry Wilson.
- Defense: S Tyrell Ajian, S Yusuf Corker, LB Jamin Davis, DB Michael Nesbitt, LB Chris Oats and LB DeAndre Square
- Special Teams: P Max Duffy

FIRSTS AND FOREMOST

The Central Michigan game was a day of firsts for the Wildcats, who saw some new faces make their presence known by logging career milestones they won't soon forget.

- QB Gunnar Hoak tossed his first career touchdown pass, a 24-yard strike to David Bouvier to give the Cats the lead for good with 41 seconds remaining in the first half.
- When WR David Bouvier hauled in Hoak's pass and sprinted across the goal line it marked his first career touchdown reception, just weeks after earning a scholarship after arriving at UK as a walk-on.
- RB A.J. Rose has always had outstanding talent and he finally got loose, scoring his first touchdown on a 55-yard scamper that doubled as the Wildcats' first points of the season. Rose finished the game with 104 rushing yards on eight carries, giving him his first 100-yard game.
- LB DeAndre Square, S Yusuf Corker and S Tyrell Ajian all recorded their first career tackles.

OFFENSIVE PREVIEW

- "Balance" has been the hallmark of the Kentucky offense the last two seasons under Eddie Gran, UK assistant head coach for offense.
- The Wildcats have rushed for more than 2,000 yards and passed for more than 2,000 yards in each of the previous two campaigns, the first time in school history that UK has done so in back-to-back seasons.
- UK has a solid base for repeating that achievement for a third consecutive season in 2018. Five players return in the offensive line who have been full- or part-time starters during their careers. A deep set of running backs is led by Benny Snell, a two-time 1,000-yard rusher.
- There will be some re-tooling in the passing game following the departure of the starting quarterback and four senior receivers. All-SEC tight end C.J. Conrad and wide receivers Dorian Baker and Tavin Richardson will be prime targets for the new quarterback.

- Quarterbacks coach Darin Hinshaw has a big challenge this season, as no quarterback on the roster has thrown a pass in a major-college game. What they lack in experience, however, the coaches believe the QBs will more than compensate with ability.
- Junior-college transfer Terry Wilson (sophomore eligibility) started the season opener vs. Central Michigan. He completed 11 of 18 passes for 78 yards while adding 38 rushing yards. Wilson, who redshirted as a freshman at Oregon, threw for 2,133 yards and 26 touchdowns last season in juco and has shown excellent speed when running the ball.
- Sophomore Gunnar Hoak saw his first UK action, entering the game in the second quarter and directing a touchdown drive just before halftime, capped by his own 24-yard TD toss to David Bouvier.
- Redshirt freshman Danny Clark displayed a strong arm in practice last season. Another redshirt freshman, Walker Wood, missed most of last year with an injury, but has displayed a penchant for making plays with his arm and his legs throughout his career.
- The quarterbacks are vying to replace Stephen Johnson, a tenacious leader who posted a 14-10 record as the primary QB and led UK to two bowl games in the last two seasons.

Running Backs

- The UK backfield is headlined by Benny Snell Jr., but goes much deeper than UK's All-SEC ballcarrier.
- Snell (125 yards) and sophomore A.J. Rose (104) each surpassed the century mark and scored two touchdowns vs. Central Michigan. It was a career-high performance for Rose, who scored from 55 yards away on his first carry of the season.
- Snell rushed for 1,333 yards and a school-record 19 touchdowns a year ago. Combined with a 1,000+ frosh campaign – the first player in school history to reach the millennium mark in consecutive seasons – he is already seventh in school history with 2,549 career yards and owns the school record for rushing TDs with 34. Snell has a remarkable combination of bullish strength, determination, endurance and underrated speed packed into his powerful frame.
- Senior Sihiem King is a more-than-capable backup, with 604 yards, four touchdowns and a 5.6-yard average during his career. He has the speed to go the distance from anywhere on the field.
- Coaches also are eager to get a look at a pair of freshman signees, Chris Rodriguez and Kavosiey Smoke.

Tight Ends

- Kentucky returns a mixture of talent at the tight end spot in 2018, highlighted by All-SEC tight end C.J. Conrad. The 6-5, 252-pound senior returns in full force after suffering a season-ending foot injury vs. Georgia on Nov. 18. The valuable run blocker and pass catcher was second on the

team in receiving yards with 16 catches and four TDs prior to his injury. He has now totaled 53 receptions for 706 yards and nine TDs in his three-year career.

- Conrad is joined by junior Justin Rigg (6-6, 257), who saw action in all 13 games last season in a backup role. Despite battling nagging injuries throughout his career, Rigg has shown he has the size and speed to compete at this position. Newcomers Brenden Bates (6-4, 240, Fr.-HS) and Keaton Upshaw (6-5, 234, Fr.-HS) add to the tight end talent pool in 2018.

Wide Receivers

- The Kentucky wide receivers will be somewhat younger this season after the departure of four key contributors, but a pair of veterans and several gifted youngsters give UK the ability to have a capable receiving corps.
- It was bad news at the time, of course, but senior Dorian Baker's season-ending injury in August, 2017, has enabled him to return for a fifth year. Baker has caught 89 passes for 1,036 yards and six touchdowns during his career. He will be counted on for leadership among the wideouts.
- Junior Tavin Richardson played his best ball at the end of last season with 11 of his 27 catches coming in the last three games. Appropriately, he had his career-best showing in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, with five catches for 88 yards.
- A set of sophomores, Josh Ali, Lynn Bowden Jr., Isaiah Epps, Zy'Aire Hughes and Clevan Thomas Jr., all have seen game action. Bowden saw the most action last season, catching 17 balls for 210 yards. Four freshman signees could work their way into playing time. The "X" factor is Ahmad Wagner, a 6-5 transfer who played three years of basketball at the University of Iowa before deciding to return to football, where he displayed eye-popping ability in high school.

Offensive Line

- Offensive line coach John Schlarman enters his sixth season at Kentucky and once again his line looks ready and able as the line combines for 46 career starts among them, including 45 from 2017. The line boasts four returning starters who helped Benny Snell Jr. become the first player in school history with 1,000 rushing yards in back-to-back seasons.
- After the loss of All-SEC center Jon Toth to graduation in 2016, Jervontius "Bunchy" Stallings (6-3, 305, Sr.-2L) was asked to take over the job for the first four games of the 2017 season. Stallings was moved back to right guard for the final eight games and that opened the door for sophomore Drake Jackson out of Woodford County High School to take over. The 6-2, 303-pounder had patiently waited his turn and he finally got the call to start at center the last seven games of the season, showing consistency and a competitive spirit. Looking to back him up in 2018 are junior Mason Wolfe and true freshman Quintin Wilson.
- Backing up Stallings at right guard are redshirt freshmen Sebastien Dolcine (6-4, 318) and Austin Dotson (6-6, 322).
- Senior George Asafo-Adjei (6-5, 315) has seven consecutive starts at right tackle. Behind him is true freshman Darian Kinnard (6-5, 357).
- The Wildcats got a bad break during August practice when junior Landon Young, a returning starter at left tackle, sustained a knee injury and is out for the season. Redshirt freshman Naasir Watkins started vs. Central Michigan, splitting time with E.J. Price. It was Price's first game at UK after sitting out a year via transfer from Southern California.
- Junior Logan Stenberg (6-6, 320) was a staple at left guard in all 13 games last season, while sophomore Luke Fortner (6-6, 293) provides depth in the rotation.

SPECIAL TEAMS PREVIEW

- Special teams coordinator Dean Hood brings a wealth of knowledge to the program as he enters his 31st year of college coaching.
- Senior kicker Miles Butler made all five extra points in the opener. He is succeeding four-year starter Austin MacGinnis (2014-17), UK's all-time scoring leader with 359 points.
- True freshman Chance Poore as shown a long-distance leg and could be called upon for long field goals. He was the No. 1 punter/kicker in the 2018 class by ProKicker.com.
- For the second-consecutive season, UK has an Australian transplant handling the punting duties. Max Duffy did quite well in his first game, averaging 50 yards on four punts, with two inside the 20-yard line. He arrived in the United States as an early enrollee in January and used the off-season to learn American football rules, how to say "ya'll" and how to put on his pads correctly. Another Aussie, Matt Panton, was UK's punter in 2017.
- Hood's special teams blocked three kicks in 2017, two of which were crucial plays in Wildcat wins. UK special teams did not allow any blocked kicks nor allow a punt or kickoff return for a touchdown.
- Junior Grant McKinniss, the starting punter in 2016, handled kickoff duties in the opener.
- Senior Tristan Yeomans returns to handle the long snapping for punts, while junior Blake Best is the snapper for field goals and PATs.
- The kickoff return specialist, Lynn Bowden Jr., set UK records last season for most kickoff returns in a season (37), game (7 vs. Louisville) and most kickoff yards in a season (869). His 869 kickoff return yards ranked eighth most in SEC history.
- Senior David Bouvier was the punt returner in the opening game.

DEFENSIVE PREVIEW

- The Kentucky defense will be one of the most experienced in the Southeastern Conference and the nation this season, with depth and size at each level of the unit. Seniors Josh Allen, Derrick Baity Jr., Mike Edwards, Jordan Jones, Adrian Middleton, Darius West and Chris Westry all have extensive resumes of quality play and give UK a chance to continue building on last season's successes

Linebackers

2017 Starters Returning/Lost: 2/2

- New outside linebackers coach Brad White inherited one of the nation’s top pass rushers, Josh Allen, when he came on board in the spring, as well the energizer bunny, Jordan Jones. Both seniors have earned their stripes in the SEC by combining to make 314 total tackles, 42.5 tackles for loss and 20.5 sacks but will need to help bring along the next generation of Wildcats this season.
- Rush end/linebacker Josh Allen has been a force on the outside, improving his numbers each season even as he sees more and more attention from opponents. The senior could have left for the NFL Draft but decided to come back for his final year, giving the Cats one of scariest pass rushers in the country. Allen began his senior year with a bang -- a career-high 10 tackles, three for loss, including a quarterback sack. He made eight tackles in the opener.
- Weakside linebacker Jordan Jones had eight tackles in the opener, including 1.5 for loss. He missed four games last season due to injury but is looking to return to his 2016 form when he totaled 109 tackles and earned All-SEC honors.
- Sophomore Jamar “Boogie” Watson started the opener at strongside linebacker and had a career-high six tackles, along with a pass breakup.
- Junior middle linebacker Kash Daniel is the successor to the graduated Courtney Love after a two-year apprenticeship. Daniel led the Wildcats in tackles against Central Michigan with a career-high 11 stops.
- Senior Kengera Daniel has shown the versatility to play both defensive end and outside linebacker but is slated to be mostly used as a linebacker in 2018. He logged his

first career sack vs. Eastern Michigan last season and has 11 career tackles in 24 games.

- Redshirt freshmen who could make an impact include Chris Whittaker and Jordan Wright outside, and Jamin Davis and Alex King inside. Also, keep an eye on true freshman inside linebackers Chris Oats and DeAndre Square.

Secondary

2017 Starters Returning/Lost: 4/0

2017 Letterwinners Returning/Lost: 9/2

- Coach Steve Clinkscale is in his third season as the secondary coach and will be joined by Dean Hood, who is sliding from linebackers to work with the defensive backs. The pair will have nine experienced players to utilize, which gives UK one of the deepest units in the SEC at cornerback and safety.
- Senior safety Mike Edwards has earned a reputation as one of the league’s top defensive backs, proving strong in run support while being an adept pass defender. He has totaled 197 tackles the past two seasons (100 in 2016, 97 in 2017) with 9.5 tackles for loss and 8 career interceptions, including a team-high four last season. Edwards flirted with declaring for the NFL Draft a year early but returned and will be a stabilizing force on the back end of the defense.
- Senior Darius West returned in full form last season after suffering a season-ending knee injury during fall camp of 2016. West ranked third on the team in total tackles with 86 and had a knack for producing turnovers and big plays in important moments. He twice had double-digit tackles, caused two fumbles and picked off a pass.
- Sophomore Davonte Robinson (19 tackles) gained experience in 2017 and will look to carve out a larger role at safety this season.
- Seniors Derrick Baity Jr. and Chris Westry are back together for a final season as two of the most experienced players in the SEC. The two

have played in 78 combined games with 63 starts and snatched eight interceptions. Both players have more than 100 career tackles and at least 13 pass breakups. Baity was named SEC co-Defensive Player of the Week after having a hand in three turnovers in the second half of the Cats’ 23-13 road win at South Carolina last season.

- Junior Jordan Griffin has been a luxury for the Cats the past two seasons, a player capable of starting who gave the defense three legitimate SEC cornerbacks against offenses increasingly deploying more receivers. Griffin picked off his first pass in a win over Vanderbilt and made 22 tackles in 13 games.
- Junior college transfer Lonnie Johnson Jr. showed big-time playmaking ability at cornerback in his first season at UK with 41 total tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack and five pass breakups. He also blocked an extra point against Eastern Kentucky and started the final five games of the season. With a year of experience he is considered an important piece of the defensive puzzle in 2018.
- The Wildcats have a great deal of talented youth in the defensive backfield, including sophomore Cedrick Dort Jr. and redshirt freshmen Tyrell Ajian and Yusuf Corker. Ajian and Corker made their career debuts vs. Central Michigan in the 2018 opener.

Defensive Line

2017 Starters Returning/Lost: 3/0

2017 Letterwinners Returning/Lost: 7/3

- In his second season on the UK staff defensive line, coach Derrick LeBlanc has to like what he sees entering the fall. Despite not having a senior starter in 2017 the Cats held six opponents to less than 100 yards rushing, the first time a UK defense had done that since 1949.
- Senior Adrian Middleton is entering his third season as the starting defensive tackle. He has 69 tackles, including 8.5 for loss, during his career.
- Junior T.J. Carter really came on the second half of the 2017 season with three tackles for loss and three sacks over the final five games of the regular season. The defensive end started 12 games and recorded 18.0 tackles to go along with the tackles for loss and sacks. He also had two quarterback hurries and a pass breakup.
- UK was hit with heartbreaking news in fall camp when sophomore defensive end Josh Paschal was diagnosed with melanoma in his right foot. Paschal is undergoing treatment and his return is uncertain. Last season, he showed flashes of brilliance with 4.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks and had bulked up to 278 pounds in the offseason. He had a critical blocked punt in the win over Eastern Michigan and was named SEC Special Teams Player of



the Week.

- The towering presence on the UK defensive line is Calvin Taylor Jr., who stands 6-foot-9. The junior earned his first start against Northwestern in the Music City Bowl and finished the 2017 season with 22 tackles, 1.0 tackle for loss and 1.0 sack.
- Senior Tymere Dubose is part of the Youngstown-Lexington pipeline and should see significant time at tackle this season. In 22 career games he has 14 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack.
- Sophomore nose guard Quinton Bohanna opened some eyes in 2017 as a true freshman, stepping in and playing very well without having any collegiate experience. The 340-pounder started the final five games of the season and was credited with 14 tackles on the year.
- Junior Phil Hoskins and sophomore Kordell Looney showed flashes in 2017 and will provide much-needed depth on the interior of the line.

BENNY IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Throughout his career, Benny Snell Jr. has continued to etch his name into the Kentucky record books:

- Finished the 2017 regular season leading the SEC in rushing before ultimately finishing third in total rushing yards and rushing yards per game (102.5)
- Led the SEC in rushing touchdowns with 19
- Rushed for 1,333 yards, school record for most rushing yards by a sophomore
- First player in school history over 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons
- Already ranks seventh on the UK career rushing list (2,549 yards); only the fifth player in SEC history to reach 2,400 career yards prior to his junior season
- Set school record for career rushing touchdowns (32)
- Set school record for most total touchdowns in a season (19) and most rushing touchdowns in a season (19)
- Set school record for most points in a season (116)
- Already ranks seventh on the UK career scoring list (194 points)
- Has 2,549 rushing yards as a Wildcat, becoming just the ninth player in school history to reach 2,000 in his career
- Had 1,333 rushing yards last season and is the first player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons. He ran for 1,091 last year
- Has 34 rushing touchdowns as a Wildcat, breaking the career record of 26 by Sonny Collins and Moe Williams
- His 19 rushing touchdowns last season are a new school-record, surpassing Moe Williams' school record of 17 in 1995

BENNY AS A FRESHMAN:

- In 2016, Snell earned All-SEC Freshman honors last season after rushing a team-high 186 times for 1,091 yards and 13 touchdowns, averaging 5.9 yards per carry.
- The 1,091 rushing yards is a school record for most ever by a freshman in a season for UK. Moe Williams had 928 rushing yards as a freshman in 1993.
 - With 13 rushing touchdowns last season, he broke Randall Cobb (2008)'s record for most

rushing TDs by a UK freshman (7) and most total touchdowns (9).

- Snell had the most rushing TDs in a single season (13) since Artose Pinner had 13 in 2002.
- With 152 yards against Austin Peay, he eclipsed 100 yards on the ground for the fifth time in 2016, setting the school's freshman record for most 100-yard rushing games in a season.
- Snell is the first UK player with a rushing touchdown in three consecutive games since Derrick Locke in 2010 and first freshman with a rushing touchdown in three consecutive games since Randall Cobb in 2008.
- Snell was the first freshman in school history to have 100 rushing yards and a rushing touchdown in three consecutive games.
- His career-high 192 yards rushing vs. Mizzou set a school record for most rushing yards by a freshman in a single game. The previous high was Derick Logan's 186 yards against Mississippi State on Nov. 9, 1996.
- The 192 rushing yards tie for the ninth most in a single game in school history and the most since Rafael Little rushed for 198 yards vs. Vanderbilt on Nov. 12, 2005.
- His 38 carries vs. Mizzou were the most since Derick Logan had 41 attempts vs. Mississippi State in 1996.
- His five rushing TDs in the first four games of 2016 were the most by a UK player in his first four games of his freshman season in school history.
- Snell had one of the best rushing touchdown-to-carry ratios by any Kentucky player since rushing TDs were tracked at UK beginning in 1949 (min. 100 career carries):

BENNY THE BULLDOZER

- Benny Snell Jr., has earned a reputation as one of the nation's fiercest runners, flashing the speed to take it the house but also an

ability and willingness to run through defenders for the touch yardage that moves the chains. The proof is in the YAC (yards after contact):

- Snell accumulated 897 rushing yards after contact in his his first two seasons, which includes yardage lost on negative rush plays.
- The total ranked eighth nationally in 2017 according to *Pro Football Focus*.
- Snell leads all returning SEC running backs with 44 missed tackles forced on his rushing attempts, 14 more than Alabama's Damien Harris and Mississippi State's Aeris Williams.

LIVING ON THE EDGE

- Kentucky pass rushing aficionado Josh Allen has taken up residence in opposing quarterbacks' minds for several years but now has a young protege who is looking to be the Cats' next great edge rusher.
- Allen has 15.5 sacks and 22.5 tackles for loss in 39 career games. He also has forced six fumbles, picked off a pass and registered nine quarterback hurries.
- Josh Paschal, from Olney, Maryland, was promoted to full "Blitz Bro" status after a strong freshman campaign. Paschal finished with 17 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss this season, including 3.5 sacks, and blocked a punt. He is currently out due to a melanoma in his foot.

DOUBLE DIPPING

- Heading into the 2018 season there are only seven schools in FBS/Division I that maintain at least two straight seasons of playing in a bowl game and the basketball program earning a bid to the NCAA men's basketball tournament. Kentucky has done so in consecutive years after making the TaxSlayer Bowl and Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl:

SNAP TO IT

- Kentucky entered the season without any quarterback on its roster having ever stepped on the playing field during a game, as none of the Cats' top four projected quarterbacks have taken an FBS snap. Furthermore, this as the first time since 2000 that the Cats open a season without a quarterback having thrown a single pass.
- The Cats are one of the few programs in the country in that position this season, with Minnesota and Nebraska also opening the year without any experience. For Kentucky, returnees Danny Clark, Gunnar Hoak and



Walker Wood all watched the 2017 season, while signee Terry Wilson came from junior college after a redshirt season at Oregon. Nebraska will have a transfer with FBS experience on its roster but he is sitting out as a transfer, while Minnesota has only freshmen and redshirt freshmen.

START ME UP

- Although Kentucky must replace quarterback Stephen Johnson, linebacker Courtney Love and kicker Austin MacGinnis, amongst others, the Cats still rank among the leaders in most starters returning for the 2018 season. BRING THE WHOLE CREW

- The UK defense will have arguably its most experienced and deepest unit yet since coach Mark Stoops took over, returning 14 of its top 19 tackles from 2017, including five of the top six. Led by senior safeties Mike Edwards and Darius West, the returning Cats totaled 573 tackles, 40.5 tackles for loss and 19.5 sacks a year ago. Edwards (97.0/4.0/1.0) and West (86.0/4.0 TFL) give the defense consistent playmaking and a presence at the back end of the unit.
- In addition to those two, All-SEC linebacker Josh Allen opted against entering the National Football League Draft early and is back, bringing his 65 total tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks with him. Add senior linebacker Jordan Jones (64 tackles, 7.5 TFL, 2.0 sacks) and you've got an intimidating linebacker corps.

EARNED NOT GIVEN

- A trio of Wildcats earned the ultimate sign of respect from the coaching staff, being rewarded with full scholarships after arriving in Lexington as walk-ons. Senior wide receiver David Bouvier, senior kicker Miles Butler and junior running back Zach Johnson all were placed on scholarship in a team meeting during training camp, sending teammates into a frenzy of happiness.
- Bouvier (Lexington, Ky.) is a local product who has shown an aptitude for special teams and caught a nine-yard pass in the 2016 TaxSlayerBowl. The 5-foot-9, 168-pounder is a three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll and three-time Dean's List honoree.
 - Butler (Paducah, Ky.) has the most playing experience of the three, having handled punt duties during the Vanderbilt game last season, when he averaged 38.7 yards on three kicks, with all three punts being placed within the 20-yard line. In 2015, he made all four of his field goal attempts and 11 of 12 PATs. His career long field goal is 46 yards.

The 5-foot-9, 165-pounder has been named to the Dean's List for seven semesters and earned SEC Academic Honor Roll for 2015-17.

- Johnson (Cincinnati, Ohio) is in his third season with the program after opting to walk on out of Colerain High School. The 5-foot-10, 185-pound back saw action in eight games last season on special teams and returned a pair of kickoffs for 35 yards.

HERE, THERE, EVERYWHERE

- While most college football programs recruit regionally, Kentucky has expanded its reach as far west as Colorado, east to New Jersey, north to Michigan and south to Florida. Furthermore, the Cats have a second punter/kicker in as many years from Australia, tapping into the ranks of young men who have a history with Australian rules football.
- The Cats' geographic roster breaks down in 17 different states and Australia: Ohio (28), Kentucky (27), Florida (19), Georgia (11), Maryland (3), Oklahoma (3), Tennessee (3), Alabama (3), Louisiana (2), Michigan (2), Colorado (1), Indiana (1), Mississippi (1), New Jersey (1), North Carolina (1), Virginia (1), South Carolina (1) and Australia (1).

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

- UK's uniform preparers have a little extra work to do this season and a little less space with which to do it. The Cats have 10 players whose names have "Jr." in it, two that are hyphenated and three that could stump even the top finishers in the National Spelling Bee.
- The 10 players who are a "Jr." include: Derrick Baity Jr., Lynn Bowden Jr., Allen Dailey Jr., Christopher Rodriguez Jr., Cedrick Dort Jr., Lonnie Johnson Jr., E.J. Price (Edward Junior), Benny Snell Jr., Calvin Taylor Jr., and Clevan Thomas Jr.
- The Cats also have Abule Abadi-Fitzgerald, who has 16 characters in his last name, as well as George Asafo-Adjei and three Berezowitz brothers (Brayden, Bryan and Zac).

CATS TIE/IMPROVE WIN TOTAL

Five UK football players have earned a spot on a national award watch lists. They are: Josh Allen (Bednarik Award Watch List and Butkus Award Watch List); Lynn Bowden Jr.

(Paul Hornung Award Watch List); C.J. Conrad (2018 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, Mackey Award Watch List, Wuerffel Trophy Watch List); Mike Edwards (Bednarik Award Watch List, Thorpe Award Watch List, Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List; Benny Snell Jr. (Doak Walker Award Watch List, Maxwell Award Watch List, Walter Camp Player of the Year Watch List).

- Allen, the 2017 Butkus Award semifinalist, totaled 65 tackles (fourth on the team) in helping lead UK to its second-straight bowl appearance. He also had a team-high 9.5 tackles for loss, 7.0 sacks, a team-high four quarterback hurries, three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and one interception. Allen was named second-team All-SEC by the Associated Press last season and was a third-team All-SEC choice by Phil Steele.
- Snell Jr., led the SEC in rushing touchdowns (19) and ranking third in total rushing yardage (1,333) and rushing yards per game (102.5) last season. His 1,333 rushing yards set a school record for most rushing yards by a sophomore. He also became the first player in school history to record 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons.
- Snell, who already ranks eighth on the UK career rushing list (2,424 yards), is only the third player in SEC history to have at least 2,424 yards and at least 31 career rushing touchdowns before his junior season, joining Georgia's Herschel Walker and LSU's Leonard Fournette. He also holds the school records for total rushing touchdowns (32), most rushing touchdowns in a season (19) and most points in a season (116). In just 26 career games, Snell has climbed up to No. 7 on UK's career scoring list.
- Bowden Jr., is a versatile performer who has returned kickoffs, played wide receiver and served in the feature-back role in the Wildcat formation. As a freshman, he caught 17 passes for 210 yards, averaging 12.4 yards per reception. He also rushed 12 times for 37 yards while completing 3 of 4 passes for 92 yards in the Wildcat formation. As UK's primary kickoff returner, he set the school records for kickoff returns in a season (37) and in a game (7 vs. Louisville) as well as kickoff return yards in a season (869). His 23.5 kick return average ranked seventh in the SEC and his 85.8 all-purpose yards per game were the second highest among all SEC freshmen. Bowden, who was named to the Coaches' All-SEC Freshman Team, earned SEC Freshman of the Week following the Missouri game when he totaled 128 all-purpose yards in the win over the Tigers. He had a career-high 192 all-purpose yards in the win at Vanderbilt, including a 93-yard kickoff return that was UK's longest runback since 2009.
- Despite suffering a season-ending foot injury in the Georgia game on Nov. 18, Conrad ended the season ranking second on the team with

ELEVEN-YEAR OLD LUKE KLAUSING SIGNS WITH UK FOOTBALL

- Head coach Mark Stoops announced the signing of 11-year-old wide receiver Luke Klausing of St. Agnes Catholic School in Louisville, Kentucky to a national letter of intent on Aug. 1.
- Klausing was named the newest member the Kentucky football team during an inspirational Team IMPACT Signing Day celebration at Kroger Field. The event was sponsored by Vertex Pharmaceuticals.
- Klausing is one of 30,000 patients in the United States living courageously with cystic fibrosis (CF), a disease predominantly diagnosed in children by the age of 2. He was diagnosed at five days old. By sponsoring Signing Days of children with CF, Vertex Pharmaceuticals helps spread awareness for the disease—and the life-long, positive effects Team IMPACT has on these children.
- Team IMPACT is a national nonprofit that connects children facing serious and chronic illnesses with local college athletic teams, forming lifelong bonds and life-changing outcomes. Through the support of Vertex Pharmaceuticals, children who have CF, like Luke sign with local college athletic teams and become an official member of the team to support the child's physical, social and emotional needs. By being a part of the Kentucky Football program, Luke will attend Wildcats practices, games, team dinners, events and more.
- His bio is located in the Player Bio section of the game notes.

COACHING CHANGES

- Dean Hood switched responsibilities from outside linebackers to defensive backs. He remains the special teams coordinator.
- Michael Smith, a 25-year coaching veteran, was hired as wide receivers coach, replacing Lamar Thomas. Smith had spent much of his career at Kansas State before the past five years at Arkansas as the receivers coach.
- Brad White, who spent the past six seasons as an assistant coach with the NFL's Indianapolis

286 receiving yards on 16 catches to go along with a team-high four touchdowns. His 17.9 yards per catch average ranked second on the team. In the first two games of the 2017 season, he had a receiving TD, becoming the first UK tight end with a receiving touchdown in consecutive games since Jacob Tamme on Nov. 24 and Dec. 31, 2007. In his three-year career, Conrad has totaled 697 receiving yards with nine scores.

- Edwards led Kentucky and ranked 10th in the SEC in tackles per game with 7.5. He also had a team-high four interceptions to go along with a team-high seven pass breakups. Edwards is just the fourth player in school history to lead the team in both interceptions and tackles in the same season, joining Darryl Bishop in 1972, Quentus Cumby in 2002 and Danny Trevathan in 2011. After charting a season-high 11 tackles vs. Ole Miss, Edwards now has nine games with double-digit tackles.

UK ADEPT AT HOLDING THIRD-QUARTER LEADS

- Kentucky has won 38 of its past 40 games when staked to a lead at the end of the third quarter, dating back to a 2008 loss vs. South Carolina.
- UK is 21-2 in the Mark Stoops era when holding a third-quarter lead. The only losses were in 2016 vs. Georgia and 2017 vs. Florida.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Kentucky currently has two players on its roster who have already earned their undergraduate degrees in David Bouvier and Adrian Middleton.
- Twelve Wildcats (**George Asafo-Adjei, Dorian Baker, Blake Best, Miles Butler, C.J. Conrad, Tymere Dubose, Mike Edwards, Lonnie Johnson, Bunchy Stallings, Calvin Taylor, Darius West and Tristan Yeomans**) are all

expected to graduate in December with their undergraduate degrees

- Last season, Kentucky had 20 total graduates, including three who earned a master's degree (Dylan Greenberg, Jacob Hyde, Austin MacGinnis).
- Last season, UK had 27 players on the 2017 SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.
- Several players have strong cume GPAs over their academic careers, including Miles Butler (4.0), Brayden Berezowitz (4.0), Bryan Berezowitz (4.0), Luke Fortner (3.965), Brett Slusher (3.881), Donald Smith (3.690) and David Bouvier (3.564).



THREE WILDCATS DO SERVICE WORK IN ETHIOPIA

- In May of 2018, three Wildcats, offensive tackle George Asafo-Adjei, offensive guard Bunchy Stallings and long snapper Tristan Yeomans, were chosen by the athletic department to participate in a service/educational trip to the Ethiopia. During the week-long trip, they interacted with residents of impoverished communities, visited and helped paint a preschool, constructed wooden shoe-shining boxes, delivered blankets to widows.
- UK has taken football student-athletes to Ethiopia on a service trip since 2011. Due to the state department's travel ban to Ethiopia in 2017, the Cats visited the Dominican Republic.

DID YOU KNOW?

- This is the 128th season of intercollegiate football for Kentucky.
- Kentucky is in its sixth season under head coach **Mark Stoops**, who has energized the UK fan base with record-setting recruiting

classes, facility upgrades and an influx in talent.

- A picture of longevity, UK Equipment Manager **Tom Kalinowski** is in his 41st season in that role. A group of former players, staff members and current UK coaches pitched in during the summer of 2017 to surprise him with a new Ford Escape.
- The Kentucky cheerleaders have won an unprecedented 23 national cheerleading championships, including 19 of the last 23, at the annual Universal Cheerleaders Association championships.
- Kentucky is one of only 10 schools that have won an NCAA men's basketball championship while also having a claim on a national championship in football.
- UK is one of only seven universities in the U.S. that have programs in agriculture, engineering, law, medicine and pharmacy on a single campus.



COUCH NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HOF BALLOT

Former Kentucky quarterback Tim Couch has been named to the 2019 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame, the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame announced. Couch is one of 76 players and six coaches from the Football Bowl Subdivision and 100 players and 32 coaches from the divisional ranks.

- A storied name of the Kentucky program, Couch, was the team's quarterback from 1996-98. After giving up his senior season of eligibility, he was drafted as the No. 1 pick by Cleveland in the 1999 NFL Draft. In 1998, the junior quarterback was named a first-team All-American and consensus Southeastern Conference Player of the Year. Couch completed 400 of 553 passes for 4,275 yards and 36 touchdowns and led the nation in pass completions while ranked second in completion percentage, passing yardage and touchdown passes, and fourth in total offense. After guiding the Wildcats to the Outback Bowl, UK's first New Year's Day bowl appearance in 47 years, Couch finished fourth in Heisman Trophy balloting. He was also a finalist for the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award as a junior and sophomore. His breakout sophomore campaign featured 363 of 547 passes completed for 3,884 yards and 37 touchdowns while leading the nation in pass attempts, completions, yardage, and completion percentage. Also during his sophomore year, Couch earned second-team All-SEC honors and finished ninth in Heisman voting. He played in seven games as a true freshman, with two starts. Career wise, Couch completed 795 passes on 1,184 attempts for 8,435 yards and 74 touchdowns. The legend ended his career with seven NCAA records, 14 SEC records, and 26 school records.
- The announcement of the 2019 Class will be made Monday, Jan. 7, 2019, in Santa Clara, Calif. The city is serving as the host for the CFP National Championship, which will be played later that day at Levi's Stadium.



TAMME ELECTED TO UK ATHLETICS HOF

The University of Kentucky Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2018 was announced, with Russ Cochran (men's golf), Anthony Davis (men's basketball), Victoria Dunlap (women's basketball), Dennis Emery (men's tennis coach), Eric Quigley (men's tennis) and Jacob Tamme (football) set to be inducted during Hall of Fame Weekend, Sept. 21-22, in conjunction with the football home game vs. Mississippi State.

KROGER FIELD

On game day, Kroger Field often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.



- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 293 games within the friendly confines of newly-named Kroger Field. UK has a 157-132-4 record (.543), 21-16 under Mark Stoops.
- UK announced its first sellout since 2015 when 62,945 fans attended the Florida game on Sept. 23, 2017.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 62,382 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance in 14 of the last 16 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years.
- The playing surface is named C.M. Newton Grounds at Kroger Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

KROGER FIELD

Commonwealth Stadium was renamed to Kroger Field in May of 2017. The agreement--which is between Kroger and JMI Sports, UK's multimedia rights partner-- begins at approximately \$1.85 million annually with a term of up to 12 years. With the partnership, Kroger becomes the Official Fuel Partner of the University of Kentucky and the Official Grocery Partner of Move-In at UK while also providing additional engagement opportunities with UK students. Per the agreement, Kroger is also the Official Nutrition and

Pharmacy Partner of UK Athletics. Kroger Field was transformed into a state-of-the-art facility after a \$126-million reinvention which was completed prior to the 2015 season. The project was handled by HNTB. The outside of the stadium underwent a dramatic external facelift, receiving a modern look, but one that remained uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Kroger Field was reduced over the course of the two-year project to approximately 61,000, but the value of all remaining seats were increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses were revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and security. Players and coaches reaped the benefits of the new Kroger Field as well, as home-team facilities were built, and a multi-purpose recruiting room hosts future Wildcats on their on-campus visits.

FACTS AND FIGURES

Seating Capacity: 61,000, including the Commonwealth Suites. New bench-back seating has been installed in the South upper level of Kroger Field.

Playing Field: UK switched from natural grass to synthetic turf for the 2015 season. Other SEC schools with a turf surface are: Arkansas, Mississippi State, Missouri and Vanderbilt.

Video Boards: Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage. The interior seating bowl also has LED ribbon boards.

Sound System: Sportsound system delivers pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

GAME DAY EXPERIENCES

The "Cat Walk" on Talbott Todd Way: With the unveiling of the new \$45 million Kentucky Football Training Facility in August of 2016, the headquarters of the program moved next door to Kroger Field. That means the Cat Walk presented by Chevy will still begin outside Gate 1 two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff, but the team proceeds past Gate 1 and between Kroger Field and Nutter Field House which has been dedicated to former Wildcat Talbott Todd (1963-65). Todd, who passed away from ALS in August of 2017, was an avid supporter of the program. From Talbott Todd Way the team will walk to the locker room in the Joe Craft Kentucky Football Training Facility.

Pregame concerts: The Kentucky Football Pregame Concert Series has returned for the 2018 season. Concerts will begin on the stage outside Gate 12 immediately following the Cat Walk and last until 30 minutes prior to kickoff. The Cat Walk takes place two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff.

Coca Cola Fan Zone: Fans of all ages, but especially the younger Wildcats, will enjoy playing at the Fan Zone located in Nutter Field House. It will have inflatable games, free posters, face tattoos and more, available two hours before kickoff.

Looking ripe for an upset because it kept coughing up the football, Kentucky eventually tightened its grip on it as well as Central Michigan.

The Wildcats' depth on both sides of the ball also helped them avoid a potential disaster.

A.J. Rose and Benny Snell, Jr. each rushed for two touchdowns, Gunnar Hoak came off the bench to throw the go-ahead TD pass and Kentucky overcame four first-half turnovers to beat Central Michigan 35-20 in its season opener.

For a while the upset-minded Chippewas seemed poised to make the Wildcats their third Power Five victim in as many seasons by building a 17-7, second-quarter lead and scoring all their points off two interceptions and two fumbles. Kentucky rallied with two TDs over the final four minutes of the half, including Hoak's 24-yard scoring pass to David Bouvier for a 21-20 edge with 14 seconds remaining.

Kentucky shut out CMU from there, limiting the Mid-American Conference team to 97 second-half yards while outgaining them 427-255 overall to improve to 7-0 in the series.

The Wildcats' offense in particular used strength in numbers to overcome those self-inflicted setbacks.

Snell had TD runs of 52 and 11 yards to finish with 125 yards rushing on 20 attempts. Rose, a sophomore, rushed for TDs of 55 and 4 yards on the way to 104 on eight carries and his first career 100-yard game as Kentucky dominated the ground game 299-118.

Hoak meanwhile demonstrated why it's good to have an able backup with a gutsy bailout after starter Terry Wilson left the game with a shoulder injury sustained while throwing his second interception. The sophomore led Kentucky 71 yards in 41 seconds and hit Bouvier down the middle for his first career TD that shifted momentum for good.

Stoops sidestepped a question about using both QBs next week at Florida but stressed the importance of having them ready after seeing it pay off when Kentucky needed it.
