Need to Know

- Kentucky was picked to win the SEC regular-season title by the league's media members. Reid Travis was tabbed to the preseason All-SEC First Team while PJ Washington was a second-team pick
- The Wildcats will begin the season ranked No. 2 in the Associated Press Top 25, behind Kansas. UK picked up 19 of the possible 65 first-place votes. It is the sixth time in John Calipari's 10 seasons the Wildcats have been ranked in the preseason top two
- Five Wildcats were named to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame positional award watch lists. Tyler Herro (shooting guard), Keldon Johnson (small forward), Travis (power forward), Washington (power forward) and Nick Richards (center) were all selected
- UK went 4-0 during its preseason exhibition tour in the Bahamas

Last Time Out

- Kentucky played its annual Blue-White Game in Rupp Arena for the 11th consecutive season on Sunday
- The two teams combined to shoot 54.2 percent from the floor
- The attendance was 15,377, the third-largest Blue-White crowd
- Guard Tyler Herro scored a game-high 34 points with four 3-pointers. He scored 21 after halftime
- Forward Reid Travis posted a double-double with 27 points and 13 rebounds
- PJ Washington totaled 23 points, four rebounds, two steals and two assists
- Nick Richards posted 16 points, a game-high 16 rebounds and a game-high five blocks
- EJ Montgomery scored 21 points and had eight rebounds
- Quade Green scored 17 points and just missed out on a double-double with a game-high nine assists

Media Information

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Requests for single-game credentials should be made as far in advance as possible and no later than five days prior to game day online at sportssystem.com/Kentucky.

CREDENTIAL CRITERIA

The University of Kentucky's decision to issue credentials to a media outlet for the purposes of covering a UK basketball home or away event is determined by a variety of factors. They include the following:

- Amount of coverage given to Kentucky throughout the season
- Intention/ability to cover all 22 sports at Kentucky
- Distribution/size of publication: free, subscription, sale on newsstands, website traffic, etc.
- Radio or TV station program format and size of audience
- Length of existence of the publication, amount of original copy generated, number of full-time employees of the publication and the journalistic experience of the reporter(s)
- Attendance at Kentucky media sessions, including Olympic sport opportunities
- Space availability
- Professionalism, which includes but is not limited to conduct at games, press conferences, practices, on social media, etc.

The University of Kentucky has the right to revoke credentials under its own discretion.

INTERVIEW POLICIES-GENERAL

All interviews with University of Kentucky basketball players or staff members must be arranged through the Communications and public relations office. Media should never contact a player or coach directly.

The Wildcat Coal Lodge, dormitories, team locker rooms and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate university personnel.

PRACTICE/PRESS CONFERENCES

Other than announced exceptions, UK basketball practices are closed to the media. UK will accept requests to attend practice. All requests must be made by 10 a.m. the day before the practice. In cases in which practices are open to the media, no cell phones are allowed in the practice facility.

Player interviews are conducted prior to practices the day before a game and will be available to all UK media in the Joe Craft Center lower-level lobby. UK will accept requests for player interviews, but they must be submitted 24 hours prior to the scheduled availability.

Coach John Calipari or an assistant coach will meet with members of the media immediately following player interviews in the lower level lobby of the Joe Craft Center.

Gameday shoot-arounds are closed to the media.

TELEPHONE PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Telephone interviews are available to the media on a call-back basis. Individual player and coach telephone numbers will not be given to members of the media.

Players are instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted directly by telephone. The communications and public relations office will arrange for telephone interviews at a time most convenient for the student-athlete.

Other special requests are handled on a case-by-case basis.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Following each game, there is a cooling-off period, during which time the players shower and dress. Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, Coach Calipari conducts his postgame press conference while a player is taken to the UK Sports Network.

Following Coach Calipari's press conference and the cooling-off period, selected UK players are brought to the media interview room.

UK-Transylvania to Honor the Late C.M. Newton

C.M. Newton, a national championship player at Kentucky, former UK athletics director and former Transylvania head coach, will be honored prior to Friday's game. Newton died in June at the age of 88.

Newton was a college athletics giant.

His collegiate career began at Kentucky, where he was a basketball forward and baseball pitcher from 1948-51. He was a letterman on Coach Adolph Rupp's 1951 national champion basketball team and eventually went on to pitch in the minor leagues for the New York Yankees.

Newton served as a lieutenant in the United States Air Force before going into coaching. He was head basketball coach at Transylvania, Alabama and Vanderbilt, winning more than 500 games and several championships while receiving numerous coach of the year honors.

Newton served as athletics director at UK from 1989-2000. His term as AD was marked by the addition of three sports – men's and women's soccer and softball – expansion of facilities and growth in revenues in response to the increasing financial pressures of college athletics.

Arriving at UK during a troubled time for the men's basketball team, Newton's hiring of Rick Pitino rejuvenated the program, eventually leading to a national championship in 1996 and then another NCAA title in 1998 under Orlando "Tubby" Smith. Newton's hiring of Smith and Bernadette Mattox marked the first two African-American head coaches for UK men's and women's basketball.

Over the years, Newton became known as a pioneer of racial integration. In addition to the hiring of Smith and Mattox at UK, Newton also recruited the first African-American basketball players at Transylvania and Alabama.

Newton received numerous accolades over the years. In addition to being named SEC Coach of the Year in 1972, '76, '78, '88 and '89, and NACDA Athletic Director of the Year in 1999, Newton was given the Naismith Award by the Atlanta Tipoff Club for his contributions to basketball; the John Bunn Award by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame for his contributions to the game; and finally, was an inductee to the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame in 2000.

Newton is also a member of the National Association of College Directors of Athletics Hall of Fame, the College Basketball Hall of Fame, the (state of) Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame, the Transylvania Athletics Hall of Fame, the University of Kentucky Athletics Hall of Fame, the UK College of Education Hall of Fame and the Ft. Lauderdale Sports Hall of Fame.

Wildcats Turn Up for Tune-Ups

Friday's game won't officially count in the official records, but the Wildcats have a knack for taking care of business in exhibition games nonetheless. UK is 134-12 all-time in exhibition games and has won its last 13 exhibitions, dating back to Nov. 2, 2014, vs. Pikeville.

The Wildcats own a 3-0 record in exhibition games vs. Transylvania, having last beaten the Pioneers in November 2013. Officially, in regular-season games, the series is deadlocked at 7-7, but the schools haven't played in a game that's counted since 1911.

Blue-White a First Step to Cal Figuring Cats Out

Tradition holds that Kentucky's first team wears Blue in practice, as well as the annual Blue-White Game that took place on Sunday night. Anyone watching had to put aside thoughts of that tradition, because the Wildcats don't have first and second teams just yet.

On the Blue team, veterans PJ Washington, Quade Green and Nick Richards were flanked by Keldon Johnson and Immanuel Quickley to start the game. They were opposed on white by Ashton Hagans, Jemarl Baker, Tyler Herro, Reid Travis and EJ Montgomery.

The two squads could not have been much more evenly matched, with White taking a 52-51 lead into halftime. In the second half, Coach Cal switched the squads up and matched the freshmen against the veterans. That matchup wasn't quite so even, as the veterans – in spite of a furious late rally by the youngsters – won the second half by a score of 53-44 to send Blue to a 104-96 victory.

All 10 starters scored at least 12 points, led by Herro's 34 points. The silky smooth freshman made 12 of his 16 field-goal tries and four of his six 3-pointers, continuing his run of play on the Big Blue Bahamas foreign exhibition tour that has already made him a fan favorite.

A pair of Wildcats posted double-doubles, with Travis already showing progress toward developing the more versatile game he set out to build when he came to UK as a graduate transfer. Travis made plenty of the kinds of plays that made him a two-time All-Pac 12 performer at Stanford, but also hit a 3-pointer and a couple jumpers in a 27-point, 13-rebound effort.

Travis was matched up with Washington in the first half, causing problems for the sophomore. Washington had four points and zero rebounds at the break, but thrived afterward as the three in a massive frontcourt alongside Travis and Richards to finish with 23 points and four rebounds.

That's true up and down UK's roster, and certainly true of Montgomery and Richards, the other player who posted a double-double with 16 points and 16 rebounds to go with five blocks. Montgomery might have had 21 points and eight rebounds of his own, but Richards gave as good as he got, looking a much improved player from his freshman season.

Richards contested plenty of shots, with Hagans and Johnson frequent victims. Hagans still managed 15 points and six assists while Johnson scored 20 points, further proving the competitiveness that has become an early hallmark of this group. That will leave Calipari with a challenge, as 10 players seem to be deserving of playing time.

Kentucky Picked to Win 49th SEC Title

With a mix of seasoned veterans and another crop of talented newcomers, Kentucky will once again be the hunted. Of course that's the same mantra every season, but a select panel of media confirmed the standard for 2018-19 when it voted the Wildcats to win their sixth regular-season title under 10th-year head coach John Calipari.

Should Kentucky achieve the feat, it would mark the program's 49th overall regular-season title.

It's the 14th time since the 1998-99 season the Wildcats are the overall preseason favorite. Calipari has directed his teams to regular-season SEC crowns in 2010, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2017. Kentucky has claimed the SEC Tournament title in each of the last four seasons and six in all, winning in 2010, 2011, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018.

Each school selected media members that cover their team and additional media from across the nation were selected by the conference office to comprise the voting panel. Points were compiled on a 14-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis. Each media member also voted for two All-SEC teams.

Travis, Washington Tabbed Preseason All-SEC by Media

In a league as talented as it's ever been, Reid Travis and PJ Washington were tabbed preseason All-Southeastern Conference picks by the league's media.

Travis was picked to the first team while PJ Washington was tabbed to the second team. Both players, along with Keldon Johnson, received at least one vote for the preseason pick for SEC Player of the Year.

Travis is joined by Arkansas' Daniel Gafford, LSU's Tremont Waters, South Carolina's Chris Silva and Tennessee's Grant Williams. Williams was the choice of the media for the preseason player of the year. Joining Washington on the second team were Auburn's Bryce Brown and Jared Harper, Florida's Jalen Hudson, Mississippi State's Quinndary Weatherspoon, Missouri's Jontay Porter and Tennessee's Admiral Schofield.

UK Starts Season at No. 2 in AP Top 25

With what appears to be a dangerous blend of talent, unusual experience (for Kentucky) and the momentum of a powerful preseason showing in the Bahamas, UK will start the 2018-19 season ranked No. 2 in the Associated Press Poll. It is the sixth time under John Calipari the Wildcats

will begin the year ranked among the top two.

Kansas was the only team voted ahead of the Wildcats. Gonzaga was voted third. Duke is fourth and Virginia rounds out the top five. UK picked up 19 of the possible 65-first place votes. Kansas tallied 37. Duke received four, Virginia tallied two and Gonzaga, Tennessee and Villanova all notched one apiece.

It's the ninth time in 10 seasons the Wildcats will begin the season ranked among the nation's top five to begin the season. Calipari's squad has been ranked in the top two to open play six times, including in five of the last six seasons. Calipari has had a team ranked among the top 11 in the preseason poll in all 10 seasons at the helm as voted on by a panel comprised of media members throughout the country.

The AP poll isn't the only preseason ranking that's showing confidence in the Wildcats. The Blue Ribbon College Basketball Yearbook and Andy Katz of NCAA.com tabbed UK No. 1 in their preseason rankings. The USA Today Coaches Poll is expected to be released soon.

Seven Kentucky opponents -- three of which UK will play twice -- enter the 2018-19 season ranked, including four top-10 opponents in Kansas (1), Duke (4), Tennessee (6) and North Carolina (8). Four more teams sit just outside the top 25 and received votes.

Showcasing the league's strength, fellow SEC members Tennessee (6), Auburn (11), Mississippi State (18) and LSU (23) were also ranked among the top 25. Additionally, Florida, Alabama and Missouri earned votes.

Five Players on Naismith Hall of Fame Watch Lists

A whopping five Wildcats -- Tyler Herro, Keldon Johnson, Nick Richards, Reid Travis and PJ Washington -- made preseason watch lists for their positional player of the year awards presented by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. No other school featured more than four players.

Herro is on the list for the Jerry West Award (best shooting guard). Johnson was tabbed to the Julius Erving Award list (best small forward). Richards is among the candidates for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award (best center), and Travis and Washington are on the Karl Malone Award list (best power forward).

By mid-February, each watch list of 20 players will be narrowed down to 10. In March, five finalists will be presented to the various awards' committees and the Hall of Fame's selection committee. The winner of the 2018 positional awards will be presented at the ESPN College Basketball Awards Show April 12.

Rewarding Success in 2017-18

By the John Calipari era "gold standard" expectations, 2017-18 was an up-and-down season.

With a historically young team -- the most inexperienced ever, according to Ken Pomeroy -- UK certainly hit a few potholes during the season, most notably the first four-game losing streak of the Calipari era.

But when things mattered most and it was time to land the plane, as Calipari likes to say, the Wildcats straightened the aircraft out and achieved some lofty goals -- the biggest of which was another Southeastern Conference Tournament title.

UK won its fourth straight conference tournament championship with a dominating run in St. Louis. Kentucky won its sixth SEC Tournament title in Calipari's nine seasons and headed into the 2017-18 NCAA Tournament by winning seven of its final eight games.

The Wildcats made their nation-leading 57th all-time appearance and fifth straight in the NCAA Tournament in 2018 (58 on-court appearances as the 1988 appearance was vacated) and its 26th Sweet 16 appearance since 1975 (the first year that all teams in the tournament were required to win at least one game to advance to the Sweet 16). That's the second-most appearances in the country.

Kentucky was selected as the No. 5 seed in the South Region and downed No. 12 seed Davidson 78-73 in the opening-round game before rolling No. 13 seed Buffalo 95-75 in the second round. The Wildcats fell to Kansas State, the No. 9 seed in the region, in the Sweet 16 despite 18 points and a career-high 15 rebounds from freshman forward PJ Washington.

UK has advanced to the Sweet 16 in seven of John Calipari's nine seasons and won six of seven under Coach Cal. Calipari is 11-3 all-time in Sweet 16 games. Kentucky's loss to Kansas State was its first in its last nine appearances in the Sweet 16.

UK Leads Nation with 31 Players on NBA Rosters

Every year the numbers gets bigger and wilder, but the bottom line remains the same: No school can match the Kentucky men's basketball team's ability to develop players and put them in the NBA.

A whopping 31 players on NBA opening-day rosters (including two-way, inactive and suspension lists) played and finished their college basketball careers at the University of Kentucky, the nation's most prolific NBA player-producing program in the country. UK's 31 players were once again the most of any college basketball program, beating the next-closest school (Duke with 25) by six players.

Of the 31 players in the NBA to start the 2018-19 season, 6.3 percent played and finished their college basketball careers at UK. There are actually fewer

teams without a Wildcat (11) than there are NBA teams featuring Wildcats (19).

Kentucky's NBA dominance was best represented in Sacramento, Denver, New Orleans and Oklahoma City, where a combined 13 Wildcats now play at the highest level of the game. Former UK stars Willie Cauley-Stein, De'Aaron Fox, Wenyen Gabriel and Skal Labissiere all call Sacramento their home; Trey Lyles, Jamal Murray and Jarred Vanderbilt play for Denver; Anthony Davis, Darius Miller and Julius Randle are all in New Orleans; and Hamidou Diallo, Nerlens Noel and Patrick Patterson suit up for OKC.

Three other franchises – the Milwaukee Bucks (Eric Bledsoe, Jodie Meeks) the Charlotte Hornets (Michael Kidd-Gilchrist, Malik Monk) and the New York Knicks (Enes Kanter, Kevin Knox) – opened the season with at least two Wildcats apiece.

Of the 31 Wildcats on an opening-day NBA roster, head coach John Calipari has coached 29 of them. With Tyreke Evans (Indianapolis Pacers) and Derrick Rose (Minnesota Timberwolves), who played for Calipari at Memphis, Calipari has coached 31 players on 2018-19 opening-day rosters.

Using figures compiled by basketball-reference.com and spotrac.com, Calipari-coached players only (which includes Rose and Evans but not Meeks or Rondo) have amassed nearly \$1.9 billion in career NBA contracts (\$1.87 billion). In the nine seasons Calipari has been the head coach at Kentucky, his players have totaled more than \$1.5 billion in NBA contracts.

In just the 2018-19 season alone, UK players are slated to make almost \$190 million. Calipari-coached players only (which includes Rose and Evans but not Meeks or Rondo) will make nearly \$195 million.

Four Players Drafted in 2018; Five Make NBA Rosters

Kentucky's aforementioned presence in the NBA was bolstered by yet another strong NBA Draft. Four players -- Hamidou Diallo (45th), Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (11th), Kevin Knox (ninth) and Jarred Vanderbilt (41st) were all selected in the 2018 NBA Draft.

Wenyen Gabriel went undrafted but proved himself worthy of a chance with a team with a great summer of workouts and NBA Summer League showing. Ultimately the Sacramento Kings signed him to a two-way deal.

In nine seasons with John Calipari at the helm, Kentucky has churned out three No. 1 selections, 26 first-rounders, 19 lottery picks and 35 total players in the NBA Draft. The 35 draft picks are nearly twice as many as the next school (Duke). With another surge of first-round picks, Kentucky has more first-round selections (36) than any other school in the NBA lottery era (since 1985).

Not the Same Old (Young) Story

It seems like with every John Calipari team, youth is the story -- and there is certainly plenty of it on this year's team as well -- but this season's bunch does have some familiar faces on it.

The Wildcats return three key pieces from last season's Southeastern Conference Tournament championship team in PJ Washington, Quade Green and Nick Richards. Washington was UK's third-leading scorer (10.8 points per game) last season and leading rebounder (5.7 rpg). Green's scoring average was just below double figures (9.3) while dishing out 2.7 assists per game and making 41 3-pointers. Richards started every game and proved to be a reliable scorer, rebounder and shot blocker.

The trio accounted for 2,224 minutes, 905 points, 434 rebounds, 157 assists and 64 blocks a season ago. They combined for 80 starts in 2017-18. That's a lot by the Calipari era standard.

As a matter of fact, throw in the returning reserves Brad Calipari and Jonny David and UK returns its highest percentage of minutes (33.1 percent), points (32.0 percent) and rebounds (30.6) since the 2014-15 team that went 38-1 and advanced to the Final Four.

Every team but one in the Calipari era has made the NCAA Tournament, but Calipari's best teams have always combined young talent with a few returning pieces.

The 2009-10 squad with John Wall and DeMarcus Cousins had veteran Patrick Patterson. The 2010-11 Final Four team had DeAndre Liggins and Josh Harrellson. The 2011-12 national championship team boasted three key returners in Terrence Jones, Doron Lamb and Darius Miller. The 2013-14 national runner-up squad featured Alex Poythress and Willie Cauley-Stein. And then the 2014-15 team that nearly ran the table had both Poythress and Cauley-Stein back again in addition to Andrew and Aaron Harrison and Dakari Johnson.

As for the young talent ...

But, Expect Growing Pains

"Experienced" by John Calipari era standards team this may be, but the 2018-19 squad will still be young in comparison to the rest of the nation. Six true freshmen dot the roster, plus redshirt freshman Jemarl Baker Jr., who missed all of last season with a knee injury.

The six-man freshman class includes guards Ashton Hagans, Tyler Herro and Immanuel Quickley, forwards Keldon Johnson and EJ Montgomery, and guard/forward Zan Payne (Payne is expected to redshirt this season as he recovers from a knee injury).

suffered late in his high school senior season).

Officially the class is ranked No. 2 in the country -- making Calipari 10 for 10 when it comes to top-three ranked recruiting classes -- but even the No. 2 ranking might not do this class justice.

Talent aside -- and this one has plenty of it -- this collection of prospects could be one of Calipari's best because of its versatility. Calipari checked just about every box in putting this class together.

There are shooters. There are playmakers. There is athleticism and toughness. Yes, there is a nice mix of guards and forwards, but this class is once again made up of "position-less" players, giving the Wildcats a number of options to attack teams.

And it doesn't even officially include newcomer Reid Travis, a two-time All-Pac-12 graduate transfer from Stanford (more on him below).

Of the six incoming freshmen, five are consensus five- or four-star prospects, three played in the McDonald's All American Game, two in the Jordan Brand Classic and two in the Nike Hoop Summit.

With all those new faces, growing pains are expected. Although it won't be a historically young team like last year's, it will still be one of the youngest.

According to one NCAA survey, UK is one of just 16 schools with one or fewer scholarship players that are seniors or graduate transfers. That same survey revealed that Kentucky is tied nationally for the second-most players who are sophomores or younger on scholarship.

So while these collective Cats are more experienced based on recent UK history, there is still plenty of growing to do.

The Grown Man: Reid Travis

The one very obvious and hard-to-miss counter to Kentucky's youth comes with a serious punch: Reid Travis.

A grown man, as John Calipari likes to call him, Travis will not only give Kentucky experience, he brings some decorated credentials with him from Stanford, where he received his undergraduate degree.

The two-time All-Pac-12 First Team selection was one of the Pac-12's best players over the last two seasons, averaging 17.4 points and 8.9 rebounds in 2016-17 and 19.5 points and 8.7 rebounds last season. He is one of three individuals in Stanford history with at least 1,400 points and 700 rebounds in less than 100 career games.

Travis was a three-year captain for Stanford and graduated 16th on Stanford's career scoring list with 1,427 points and 758 rebounds. He was a National Association of Basketball Coaches First Team All-District selection as well as a U.S. Basketball Writers Association All-District pick in 2017-18.

Dependably dangerous is what the Wildcats will get with Travis. He scored in double figures in all but one game a season ago and recorded double-digit rebounds in 16 games. All 16 of those double-figure rebounding efforts resulted in double-doubles, including the final seven games of the season. He scored 20 or more points in 18 games, including a career-high 33 late in the season.

The addition of Travis is UK's first incoming transfer since Mychal Mulder in 2015-16.

Big Blue Bahamas Provided Wildcats Headstart

Kentucky's four-game performance in the Bahamas for its foreign exhibition tour did nothing to temper expectations and hype for this team's dangerous mix of young talent and experience. In fact, it may have heightened the ceiling of expectations.

Playing against professional teams from Argentina, the Bahamas, Canada and Serbia -- teams John Calipari predicted would knock off UK at least once or twice -- the Wildcats rolled in all four with an average margin of 29.0 points per game.

UK shot 49.8 percent from the floor, outrebounded its opponents by an average of 12.5 boards per game, dished out 17.0 assists per contest and committed just 11.3 turnovers, largely with a new team.

Five Wildcats averaged double figures, led by freshman Tyler Herro with 17.3 per game. PJ Washington averaged 14.5 points and 7.5 rebounds, and Reid Travis averaged a double-double with 10.8 points and 10.3 rebounds per game. And those were just the headliners.

Keldon Johnson averaged 13.3 points per game; Nick Richards looked dominant at times, Quade Green was on fire after a slow start; Immanuel Quickley posted 18 assists with just two turnovers; and Ashton Hagans was a defensive difference maker.

The NCAA allows teams to take a foreign exhibition tour every four seasons. The last Calipari team to utilize the window was the 2014-15 team that experienced similar success in the Bahamas. That group went 5-1, propelling it to 38 straight wins in the regular season, a Southeastern Conference championship and a Final Four berth.

Kentucky's Schedule as Good as it Gets

Kentucky's schedule is always among the toughest in the country but this season's might be the best of the John Calipari era.

UK will face the likes of Duke (Nov. 6) in Indianapolis in the State Farm Champions Classic, North Carolina (Dec. 22) in Chicago in the CBS Sports Classic and Kansas (Jan. 26) in Rupp Arena as a part of the SEC/Big 12 Challenge. Plus there's the annual rivalry game at Louisville (Dec. 29) in the Derby City, Seton Hall (Dec. 8) in Madison Square Garden in the Citi Hoops Classic and Utah (Dec. 15) in Rupp Arena.

And that's just the nonconference slate.

The Southeastern Conference featured eight teams in the NCAA Tournament a season ago. UK will play three of those teams twice.

The Wildcats will face 16 teams that played in the postseason in 2018, including 12 in the NCAA Tournament. UK's competition combined to go 526-356 (.596) last season.

Thirteen teams finished the 2017-18 season with an RPI in the top 50 and seven ended the season in one of the major two polls.

Kentucky's nonconference schedule will see the Wildcats play in premier venues such as the United Center in Chicago (vs. UNC), Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis (vs. Duke) and Madison Square Garden in New York (vs. Seton Hall), plus a difficult road game at Louisville.

Seven Kentucky opponents enter the 2018-19 season ranked in the Associated Press Top 25, including four top-10 opponents in Kansas (1), Duke (4), Tennessee (6) and North Carolina (8). Four more teams sit just outside the top 25 and received votes.

Historic 3-Point Streak Over

Kentucky's historic streak of consecutive made 3-pointers came to an end in 2017-18.

UK entered the 2018 NCAA Tournament having made a least one 3-pointer in a nation-leading 1,047 straight games. With an 0-for-6 performance from behind the arc in a 78-73 opening-round win over Davidson, the historic streak came to an end.

The Wildcats had hit at least one 3-pointer for nearly 30 consecutive years dating back to Nov. 28, 1988, vs. California. Previously, UK's last game without a 3 came against Seton Hall on Nov. 26, 1988. UK was 807-240 during the streak.

Since the inception of the 3-pointer beginning in the 1986-87 season, UK's win over Davidson marked the first time in program history the team won a game without making at least one 3-pointer.

Kentucky passed UNLV for the nation's longest active streak of consecutive games with a made 3-pointer in its final game of 2015-16. UNLV's streak is still active.

Cats Deliver the Knockout Punch

UK is 233-5 (.979) in the John Calipari era when leading by at least 10 points at any time in the contest.

When Kentucky failed to put away South Carolina in 2017-18 after leading by as many as 14 points in the second half, it was the first time the Wildcats let a double-digit lead wind up in a loss since losing two such games in the 2015-16 campaign.

UK also blew two double-digit leads during the 2012-13 season. Four of the five losses have been to conference opponents.

Perhaps most impressive of all is that 70.2 percent of games Calipari has coached in at Kentucky have produced 10-point leads at some point during the game for UK. The Wildcats have led by 10 points or more in a whopping 84.7 percent of Calipari's 275 career wins at Kentucky.

Big-Game Cal, Cats

John Calipari's teams aren't just good against the best teams in the country, they're great. Not only does Kentucky have a 52-26 record (.667) vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams, UK is 5-3 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five under Calipari.

All-time, Calipari is 11-7 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five. When both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25, Calipari's all-time record is 75-49, including a 44-22 mark at Kentucky. When both are ranked in the top 10 he has a 24-15 record, including 13-8 at UK.

Taking Care of Business

Kentucky's 52-26 record vs. opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 in John Calipari's tenure is impressive, but the Wildcats' ability to beat all-comers can't be overlooked. Under Calipari, UK is 223-38 vs. unranked competition, an .854 winning percentage.

Bounce Back

The Wildcats don't lose very often during the John Calipari era, but when they do, they almost always bounce back. UK is 44-12 under Calipari following a loss.

The Wildcats have only lost back-to-back games 12 times during the Calipari era with three of those losses having come during a four-game losing streak from Feb. 3-14, 2018. That was the first four-game losing streak under Calipari.

Previously, the last time UK lost four games in a row was in February 2009, when the Wildcats dropped four straight games to end the regular season. It's the first time Calipari had lost four straight since the end of the 2004-05 season at Memphis.

Always Efficient

According to Ken Pomeroy's calculations on kenpom.com, UK's teams under John Calipari have consistently ranked among the most efficient teams in the country per possession.

S-E-C! S-E-C! S-E-C!

Kentucky has the unquestionable reputation as the league's gold standard. Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats have been the most dominant team in the league, recording a 982-278 mark (.779) in regular-season conference play. Only two other teams have won more than 700 regular-season SEC games (Alabama and Tennessee), and no other team has a better winning percentage.

- Kentucky has averaged 11.6 wins and only 3.3 losses per season in 85 seasons in the SEC
- UK has won 48 SEC titles and 31 SEC Tournament championships
- The Wildcats have won 16 of the last 26 SEC Tournament titles
- Kentucky has won at least a share of five of the last nine SEC regular-season championships under head coach John Calipari
- UK has played in the championship game of the SEC Tournament in eight of Calipari's nine seasons, winning the tournament six times, including each of the last four
- The SEC won the Big 12/SEC Challenge for the first time with a 6-4 margin in 2018

- Eight teams made the 2018 NCAA Tournament field, the second most of any league in the country and a new conference record. The league went 8-8
- Five teams begin the 2018-19 season ranked in the top 10 of the Associated Press Top 25 with three more receiving votes

Hold Them to 55 Points and 40 Percent from the Field

Defense has always been a recipe for success for the Wildcats under John Calipari. The special ingredient: 55 points. UK is a perfect 64-0 under Calipari when holding the opponent to 55 points or fewer. The Wildcats are 152-7 under Calipari when limiting the opponent to 63 points or less. Kentucky's 61-59 loss to Tennessee in 2017-18 snapped a 60-game winning streak when holding the opponent to 63 or less.

Kentucky has also fared well when it keeps its opponents to less than a 40-percent field-goal clip from the floor. UK is 164-15 against opponents under Calipari when its field-goal percentage is 40 percent or lower.

Davis Inducted into UK Athletics Hall of Fame

Anthony Davis was inducted into the UK Athletics Hall of Fame as a member of the 2017 class in September.

Davis led UK to the 2012 national championship with one of the most dominating seasons by a freshman in college basketball history. A winner of virtually every major national award, Davis was tabbed, among others: National Player of the Year, NCAA Final Four Most Outstanding Player, NCAA Consensus First Team All-American, National Freshman of the Year, Southeastern Conference Player of the Year, SEC Defensive Player of the Year and SEC Freshman of the Year.

The 2011-12 Wildcat guided UK to a 38-2 record and an SEC regular-season championship while shattering the single-season school record for blocks in a season with 186, which ranks as the fourth in NCAA history.

Davis was selected No. 1 overall in the 2012 NBA Draft and is now in his seventh season in the league. He's a five-time NBA All-Star, a three-time All-NBA First Team member, the 2017 NBA All-Star MVP and a 2012 Olympic gold medalist.

Best in the Bluegrass

Kentucky has been dominant against teams in the state under John Calipari. UK is 16-2 against in-state foes with Calipari at the helm.

The mark also includes a 9-2 mark vs. Louisville. Two of the victories over the Cardinals came in postseason play. UK had its four-game winning streak snapped in 2016-17 but has won all five meetings played in Rupp Arena, including a 29-point blowout in 2017-18, the third-biggest margin of victory in the history of the series. Louisville's two wins have come by a combined six points.

Success Rate

The Wildcats received an NCAA award in the spring of 2018 for placing in the top 10 percent of all men's basketball teams in the country in the NCAA's annual Academic Progress Rate. UK scored a perfect 1,000.

It's the fourth straight year the men's basketball team received the award and the fifth time since 2009.

The APR provides a real-time look at a team's academic success by the progress of each student-athlete on scholarship. The APR measures academic eligibility, retention and graduation. The scores are a four-year composite, covering the 2013-14 through 2016-17 school years.

Every Division I sports team across the nation calculates its APR each academic year, similar to a report card. Scholarship student-athletes each semester earn one point for remaining eligible and one point for staying in school or graduating.

UK has received a perfect 1,000 mark in each of the last five single-year APR rates. The NCAA cut score to compete in the 2017-18 postseason is a 930 four-year APR. Teams scoring below 930 can face consequences intended to direct additional focus on academics. Those penalties can include practice restrictions and playing-season reductions.

Cats Rock at Rupp

The Wildcats are 577-68 (.895) in Rupp Arena. Among the most notable marks of dominance as the nation's toughest venue to play include:

- A school record 54-game winning streak to begin the John Calipari era
- The Wildcats are 309-42 (.880) in regular-season SEC games in the building
- Kentucky set a new program home record of 19 wins in 2014-15
- The Wildcats have gone undefeated at home in five of John Calipari's nine complete seasons
- Overall, UK has posted a perfect mark in 13 of Rupp Arena's 42 seasons

Cal Owns Longest Win Streaks in Rupp

With UK's 2011-12 season-opening victory over Marist, UK head coach John Calipari recorded his 34th consecutive win in Rupp Arena as UK's head coach. It broke former UK head coach Rick Pitino's longest streak of 33 games in the venue.

The winning streak reached as long as 54 games. Calipari didn't suffer his first loss in Rupp Arena until losing to Baylor in his fourth season. The 54-game run, however, was his longest career winning streak. He also had the second-longest streak in the arena as the Cats won 42 straight from March 4, 2014 to Nov. 25, 2016.

Pack the House

Kentucky has led the nation in average home attendance in 20 of the last 23 seasons. That number includes a Rupp Arena record of 24,110 in John Calipari's first season (2009-10) as head coach.

- Kentucky averaged 21,875 fans during the 2017-18 season
- UK has averaged 23,000 or more fans in seven of Calipari's nine complete seasons
- The Wildcats led the nation in average attendance in 2017-18

The Top-Ranked Team at Home

Kentucky has lost just three times at home as the Associated Press top-ranked team in the history of the program and just twice in Rupp Arena. Prior to the loss to UCLA by three on Dec. 3, 2016, the other two losses came by just one point.

The Wildcats are 53-2 all-time as the AP No. 1 team in Rupp Arena since its opening in 1976. The first loss was to Auburn, 53-52, on Jan. 9, 1988.

Coach Cal in Rupp Arena

It's been downright difficult to beat the Wildcats in Rupp Arena during the John Calipari era. UK is 150-8 (.949) in Rupp Arena under Calipari.

- UK is 17-4 (.810) vs. ranked opponents in Rupp in the Calipari era
- The Wildcats are 133-4 (.971) vs. unranked teams in Rupp under Cal
- UK is 77-3 (.963) at home vs. nonconference foes under Calipari
- Calipari notched his 100th career win in Rupp Arena as UK's coach with the Wildcats' 110-75 rout of Auburn on Feb. 21, 2014. It took Calipari just 104 games to reach the century mark at home, the fastest of any UK coach

Cal Passes Hall for Rupp Record

With a 101-70 victory over Cleveland State on Nov. 23, 2016, John Calipari passed former UK head coach Joe B. Hall for wins in Rupp Arena history.

Calipari currently has 150 victories inside the historic venue. Hall won 122.

Entering Year No. 10

Entering year No. 10 at Kentucky, John Calipari's time in Lexington has been every bit as successful -- and more -- as fans could have hoped when he agreed to become the head coach at Kentucky back in the spring of 2009.

By just about every measure, he's been the most successful coach in college basketball during his time at Kentucky as he gets ready to put the first decade behind him.

Among schools who have been to at least two Elite Eights and a Final Four since 2009-10, Calipari ranks ...

- Second in wins (278)
- First in NCAA Tournament wins (28)
- Fourth in NCAA titles (one)
- First in Final Four appearances (four)
- First in Elite Eight appearances (six)
- First in Sweet 16 appearances (seven)
- Third in regular-season conference titles (five)
- Second in league tournament titles (six)

700 Victories and Counting

With Kentucky's win over UIC on Nov. 26, 2017, John Calipari reached the 700 on-court win plateau. He is one of just 41 coaches, regardless of NCAA level of classification, to reach that barrier. Only 29 coaches have done it with at least 10 seasons at the Division I level.

Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 700 on-court wins ever. Only Adolph Rupp (836 games), Jerry Tarkanian (876 games) and Roy Williams (879 games) did it faster.

Moving Up the Kentucky Career Wins List

With a 78-65 victory vs. Mississippi State on Jan. 23, John Calipari notched his 264th career win at Kentucky, moving him past Tubby Smith, who finished his UK career with a 263-83 mark. Calipari trails only the legendary Adolph Rupp (876 wins) and Joe B. Hall (297) for most wins at Kentucky. Calipari currently has 275 wins at Kentucky.

Although he's still climbing the charts, he's doing it faster than anyone else in school history. With a thrilling 75-73 victory over rival Louisville on Dec. 26, 2015, John Calipari captured his 200th career win at Kentucky faster than any coach in UK history -- and nearly faster than anyone has ever done it at any school.

Calipari reached the 200-win plateau in his 240th career game at Kentucky. Rick Pitino, previously the fastest to 200 wins at UK prior to Calipari, didn't capture his 200th Wildcat win until his 249th game. Rupp reached 200 during his 250th game.

Not only did Calipari reach the 200-win mark in record pace at Kentucky, he also nearly set the all-time Division I mark. With the win over U of L, he became the second-fastest Division I men's basketball coach to reach 200 victories at a single school, behind only LIU-Brooklyn's Clair Bee, who achieved the feat in 231 games.

Calipari is only the fifth UK coach to reach the 200-win plateau. He's currently the only coach in NCAA history with at least 189 victories at three different schools.

Calipari reached his 250th career win at Kentucky with a 73-63 come-from-behind victory vs. Utah Valley for the 2017-18 season opener. Calipari reached 250 wins at UK faster than any other Wildcat coach. It took Rupp 312 games to reach 250 wins, whereas it took Calipari just 303.

First-Ballot Hall of Famer

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in September 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on the first ballot.

Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate honors in the sport. The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Bevetta, Wildcat Louie Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and JoJo White.

Calipari in Elite Company with Conference Championships

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari added another first to his Hall of Fame career in 2017.

When Kentucky clinched at least a share of the 2017 Southeastern Conference championship by beating Vanderbilt on Feb. 28, 2017, he made history as a head coach. Calipari became the first NCAA Division I coach to lead three different programs (UMass, Memphis, Kentucky) to five on-court regular-season league titles five different times. He won the Atlantic 10 at the helm of UMass in 1992, 93, 94, 95 and 96. Memphis claimed the Conference USA crown in 2004, 06, 07, 08 and 09. Kentucky has captured the SEC five times in 2010, 12, 15, 16 and 17.

Perhaps more impressive is that Calipari has 30 combined regular-season and tournament championships after the 2018 SEC Tournament title. That trails only Mark Few of Gonzaga (32 titles) among all active coaches. All-time, Calipari trails only the great Adolph Rupp (41) and Few.

Calipari Unrivaled in Conference

John Calipari has won 15 league regular-season championships (including the 2010, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2017 SEC championships) seven more than the next-closest coach in the SEC (Bruce Pearl has eight conference titles). With a 2018 SEC Tournament championship -- Calipari's fourth straight and sixth at UK -- he owns 15 conference tournament titles, 11 more than his closest competitors (Ben Howland and Kermit Davis).

He's tallied a 329-101 (.765) all-time record within conference play as a head coach and owns a 121-35 (.776) record since joining the SEC.

Although he's been publicly outspoken against conference tournaments -- only because he doesn't favor playing three or more games on consecutive days to win the tournament -- his teams have gotten up for them. Calipari's teams at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky have been to 19 conference championship games in his 26-year career, winning a remarkable 15 of them.

There's No Place Like Home

Since the 2000-01 season, John Calipari-coached teams have posted a 303-27 (.918) record at home. At UK, Coach Cal is 150-8 (.949) in Rupp Arena.

In five of Calipari's nine seasons at Kentucky, the Wildcats have posted an undefeated record at home, including a school-record 19-0 mark during the 2014-15 season.

Calipari owns both of UK's longest winning streaks in the arena. He began his career at UK with a 54-game winning streak at Rupp Arena. It was the longest winning streak since the arena opened in 1976. With a win over Georgia on Feb. 9, 2016, he secured the second-longest streak in the storied building at 34 games (which ended at 42).

AHEAD OF THE BARON OF THE BLUEGRASS

- Legendary coach Adolph Rupp won 876 career games while he was the coach of UK. He also led Kentucky to five NCAA titles during his 41-year tenure.
- John Calipari is ahead of the pace set by the legend as far as victories to begin his career at UK. Calipari (.811) is slightly behind Rupp (.822) in total UK career winning percentage.

Life Away From Home Isn't So Bad Either

As good as John Calipari's team's have been at home, they're pretty good in hostile environments on the road. Dating back to the 2005-06 season, Calipari has recorded a 92-43 (.681) record on the road. At neutral-site venues, Kentucky is 72-16 all-time under Calipari.

Calipari at No. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking. Calipari has led six of his 10 UK teams to the ranking and seven of his last 12 teams to the No. 1 ranking (he's done it nine times overall).

When Coach Cal's teams have been at the top, they've been difficult to knock off:

- Calipari is 110-12 (.902) as the top-ranked Associated Press Top 25 coach in the country
- He's 69-7 (.908) when his team is at the top of the AP Top 25 as UK's head coach
- Calipari tallied a 32-4 mark at UMass when the Minutemen were No. 1 and he was 9-1 at Memphis when he had the Tigers at the pinnacle of the rankings
- Calipari (110) trails only Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (205) in active coaches with victories at No. 1
- Calipari has coached 122 career games as a No. 1 team, the fourth most in NCAA history, trailing Krzyzewski (235), John Wooden (228) and Adolph Rupp (131)
- Among coaches who have owned a No. 1 ranking in at least 119 games, Calipari's winning percentage of .902 trails only Wooden (.952) and is ahead of active coach Krzyzewski (.872)

30 is the new 20: Calipari Secures Another 20-Win Season

With an 87-66 win over Missouri on Feb. 24, John Calipari achieved another feat in his decorated coaching career. With his 20th victory in 2018, he secured his 24th consecutive on-court 20-win season. He leads all active coaches with that streak, ahead of Mike Krzyzewski (22) and Bill Self (20) who both also claimed a 20-win season in 2017-18.

With a first-round win over Northern Kentucky in the 2017 NCAA Tournament, Calipari and the Cats clinched a 30-win season for the fourth time in eight seasons as head coach. Calipari has 10 seasons with 30 or more on-court wins. Only Krzyzewski (14) and Roy Williams (12) have more 30-win seasons as an active head coach. Calipari is the first coach in NCAA Division I history to record five straight on-court 30-win seasons, notching 30 wins in consecutive seasons from 2005-06 to 2009-10.

The Success Rate

John Calipari has graduated 100 percent of the players (18 of 18) who have been eligible to receive their diploma by the end of their senior years and exhausted their athletic eligibility. Of that group, Patrick Patterson, Jarrod Polson and Alex Poythress completed their degrees in three years.

In the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, which measures eligibility, retention and graduation, UK has posted a single-year Academic

COACH CALIPARI

A “players-first” coach with a penchant for helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, has guided six teams to the Final Four, led one to a national championship and helped 46 players get selected in the NBA Draft during his 26-year college coaching career.

Calipari guided Kentucky to its eighth national championship and his first national title in 2012. In becoming only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four, he has racked up more than 700 on-court victories, 19 NCAA Tournament appearances, six Final Fours and numerous national coach of the year honors.

In 2015, Coach Cal led college basketball’s first ever 38-0 team, and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of the season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

While building a program out of obscurity at Massachusetts, laying the foundation at Memphis and restoring luster at the sport’s greatest program at Kentucky, he has totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

Quite honestly, though, Calipari’s on-court success overshadows a much more significant picture.

In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped 46 players realize their dreams and guided them to NBA Draft selections, including a record five first-round draft picks in 2010. Two years later, six Wildcats heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. UK, with Calipari’s help, would tie those six picks again in 2015, including a record-tying four lottery selections. His four No. 1 overall picks are twice as many as any other coach, and he’s had 35 players drafted during his first nine years at Kentucky, including 26 first-round picks.

Calipari’s players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 18 All-Star selections, with Anthony Davis winning the game’s MVP honor in 2017. Rose was named MVP in 2011, five players have been tabbed All-NBA, three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year, and 11 players from Calipari’s first nine teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80 percent, Calipari has stressed academics. Fifteen of his last 18 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor’s degrees, and all 17 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including three players who earned their degree in just three years. Another Wildcat, Dillon Pulliam, is set to graduate in May of 2018. Calipari’s teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point averages of 3.0 or better.

His foundation, The Calipari Foundation, has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need in the Commonwealth and across the country. In 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He organized another one in 2012 for victims of Superstorm Sandy and another one in 2017 for victims of Hurricane Harvey.

In 2013, Calipari developed the idea of hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend (the game and the fantasy experience) has generated more than \$1 million for charity every year since, including in 2014 without the funds from an alumni game and 2016 with a celebrity softball game in place of the traditional basketball game.

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men’s U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller “Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out,” Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that “it’s never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it’s about how high you bounce back.”
