QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is in its 45th season of with a 799-532 (.600) all-time record.
- The Wildcats have had great success in Memorial Coliseum, sitting at 440-156 (.738) overall in the historic building, including a 150-27 (.847) mark under head coach Matthew Mitchell.
- The Wildcats return 10 of the 13 players that saw time last season and bring in four newcomers and junior forward Ogechi Anyagaligbo, who missed last season due to injury. In all, Kentucky brings back 80 percent of its made field goals from last season, 75 percent of its made 3s, 74 percent of its rebounding, 80 percent of its assists and 81 percent of its scoring.
- Each of the top four scorers will be back for UK starting with guard Maci Morris, who paced the Wildcats with 17.3 points per game and finished second in the nation in 3-point field-goal percentage at 47.5 percent. Fellow guard Taylor Murray also returns her 11.5 points per game and team best 136 assists and 67 steals.
- Kentucky has added one of the nation's best recruiting classes to mix in guards Rhyne Howard and Blair Green. Howard and Green made up the 18th-best class in the nation according to All Star Girls Report. Both players were named McDonald's All-America Game nominees and Naismith High School All-America Honorable Mention last season. Howard, who was recently tabbed one of 12 players to the Team USA U18 roster, was named Tennessee's Miss Basketball and the Gatorade Player of the Year. Green was a finalists for Miss Kentucky Basketball and was tabbed first-team all-state this season.
- In 45 years, Kentucky has 88 wins over ranked opponents, including 47 of those wins coming under Mitchell.
- Matthew Mitchell became the all-time winningest head coach in Kentucky women's basketball history in March of 2013 with his 139th win at UK. The win at Florida was Mitchell's 250th at Kentucky. Including the storied history of the UK MBB program, he is the fifth Kentucky Basketball head coach to win 250 games with the Wildcats joining Adolph Rupp, Joe B Hall, Tubby Smith and John Calipari.

TAYLOR MURRAY • 5-6 • SENIOR • GUARD • ODENTON, MD.

- Has 977 career points needing just 23 more to join Kentucky's 1,000-point club.
- Became the first UK player to ever record 20 points and 10+ assists in a SEC game when she accomplished the feat against Alabama last year.
- Finished second on the team with 11.5 points per game and 4.3 rebounds per game last season.



MACI MORRIS • 6-0 • SENIOR • GUARD • BELL COUNTY, KY.

- Has 1220 career points which ranks 19th most all-time in school history. She needs 98 more to tied for 18th.
- Has hit 180 career 3s which ranks third most in program history and currently sits tied for first in career 3-point field-goal percentage at 39.7.
- Was the only player in the SEC last season to score 20+ points in seven straight games against league opponents.



RHYNE HOWARD - FRESHMAN - GUARD - CLEVELAND, TENN.

- Scored 15 points in her first varsity game which was the fifth most points scored in a varsity debut in program history.
- Spent time in the summer of 2018 playing for USA Basketball's U18 National Team, helping USA win gold and was named the tournament's MVP.
- Named 2018 Tennessee Gatorade Player of the Year and Tennessee Miss Basketball after a brilliant senior season at Bradley Central High School.



KEKE MCKINNEY • 6-1 • SOPHOMORE • FORWARD • KNOXVILLE, TENN.

- Had seven points and seven rebounds in the season opener vs. Alabama State.
- Led Kentucky in rebounding and blocks six times and in steals three times with 5+ rebounds in 13 games and 7+ points in 12 games.
- First double-figure performance was 12 points with seven rebounds against South Carolina before 12 points and five rebounds against Alabama.



TATYANA WYATT • 6-2 • SOPHOMORE • FORWARD • COLUMBUS, GA.

- Missed eight games last season due to injury but played in 24 games with four starts throughout the season averaging 6.6 points and 3.5 boards.
- Shot 42.2 percent from the field as a freshman including 32.6 percent from long range hitting 15 3-pointers.
- Came off the bench to score 11 points and hit a season-best three 3s vs. Arkansas with all 3s coming in the second half after UA had tied the game.



LASHAE HALSEL • 6-0 • SENIOR • FORWARD • BOWLING GREEN, KY.

- Impressed the coaches during open tryouts and received a walk-on spot in the fall of 2016 and was given a scholarship in the summer of 2018.
- Played in 10 games during the 2017-18 season scoring in four games with a rebound in three games.
- Has played in 17 career games during her time with Kentucky scoring eight career points.



SABRINA HAINES • 5-10 • RS-JUNIOR • GUARD • PHOENIX, ARIZ.

- Electric guard that will be a scoring threat when she returns to the court after sitting out the 2018-19 season due to NCAA transfer rules.
- Transferred to Kentucky from Arizona State in June of 2018 and spent the summer working out with the team as she returns from a knee injury.
- Played in 75 career games with 38 starts at Arizona State before her third season was cut short after only nine games due to injury.



PAIGE POFFENBERGER • 5-8 • SENIOR • GUARD • MORGANTOWN, W.VA.

- Medically retired from the game of basketball prior to the start of the 2018-19 season but is still in the program and with the team.
- Joined the program as a walk-on in the fall of 2016 and immediately impressed the coaching staff with her hard-nosed style of play.
- Played in 35 career games the last two seasons, averaging 5.6 minutes per game and scoring 32 total points.



BLAIR GREEN • 6-0 • FRESHMAN • GUARD • HARLAN COUNTY, KY.

- Scored 13 points in the season opener, which was tied for the seventh most points by a UK player in their varsity debut in program history.
- Was named 2018 Naismith High School All-America Honorable Mention after scoring 93 points in three games in the KHSAA State Tournament.
- Averaged 26.0 points and 6.5 rebounds as a senior, hitting 59.3 percent from the field and shot 84.4 percent from the free-throw line.



AMANDA PASCHAL • 5-7 • RS-JUNIOR • GUARD • BROOKLYN, N.Y.

- Had seven points, five rebounds and three assists in the season opener vs. Alabama State.
- Played in 30 of the team's 32 games with two starts last year and averaged 4.7 points and 2.1 rebounds per game with 40 assists.
- Shot 44.5 percent from the field and 30.4 percent from long range during the year, scoring in double figures five times.



DORIE HARRISON • 6-3 • SOPHOMORE • CENTER • NASHVILLE, TENN.

- Is out indefinitely for personal health reasons with no timetable on her return.
- Played in 32 games with eight starts last season averaging 6.7 points and 3.8 rebounds per game. Had 10 or more points in eight games.
- Was named the SEC Freshman of the Week once last season after 15 points, five rebounds vs. Alabama and 16 points, four boards vs. Arkansas



OGECHI ANYAGALIGBO • 6-1 • RS-JUNIOR • FORWARD • MIAMI, FLA.

- Had two points, four rebounds and three steals in Kentucky's season opener vs. Alabama State.
- Played six minutes going 2-for-2 from the field in the team's lone exhibition game in 2017-18 before sustaining a season-ending knee injury.
- Came to Kentucky after winning AEC Rookie of the Year honors at Stony Brook in 2016 and sat out the 2016-17 season due to NCAA transfer rules.



KAMERON ROACH • 5-6 • SOPHOMORE • GUARD • HOPKINS, S.C.

- Played six minutes in the season opener with four points and four rebounds adding an assist and three steals.
- Played in 15 games last season as a freshman averaging 7.3 minutes per game.
- Saw a season-high 16 minutes against Sacramento State with three assists, one steal and six points going 4-of-4 from the charity stripe.



JAIDA ROPER • 5-6 • JUNIOR • GUARD • MEMPHIS, TENN.

- Played 22 minutes in the season opener with eight points, three rebounds, six assists, four steals and was very aggressive defensively.
- Set career highs during the 2017-18 season in points, field-goals, free-throws, 3-pointers, total rebounds, assists, blocks, steals and minutes.
- Started 2017-18 by setting three career-high scoring performances with 9 vs. Sacramento State, 10 points vs. Gardner-Webb before 14 at Montana.



NAE NAE COLE • 6-3 • RS-JUNIOR • CENTER • GAINESVILLE, VA.

- Transferred after three years at NC State in May 2018 and spent the summer impressing the coaching staff with her work ethic.
- Strong, physical post player that will help give the Wildcats depth in practice as she sits out the 2018-19 year due to NCAA transfer rules.
- Played in 61 career games for the Wolfpack from 2015 to 2018 averaging 7.0 minutes per game during her career.

GAME NOTES

SCOUTING SOUTHERN

- Southern enters the game Sunday with a 2-0 record after wins over Millsaps College and Wiley College to start the season. Both games were at home and started head coach Carlos Funchess' tenure off in style.
- The Jaguars are averaging 71 points per game so far this season while limiting opponents to just 36 points per game. SU is shooting 41.5 percent from the field and 31.4 percent from long range in its first two games. Southern has limited its turnovers early on with just 17.5 per game while they have forced 28 miscues per game.
- Brittany Rose leads the team in points per game at 14 while she is 8-of-16 from long range in the early going. Amani McWain is averaging 10 points per game adding 3.5 rebounds per game. Sarai Blissett is the team's leading rebounder at 6.5 per game while adding 8.5 points per game.
- Funchess is in his first season as head coach after former head coach Sandy Pugh led the Jaguars for 18 seasons, highlighted by 15 winning seasons and seven regular season titles, their most recent awarded just last season.

SERIES HISTORY VS. SOUTHERN

- Kentucky leads the all-time meeting with Southern 1-0. The lone meeting was in December 2006 when the Wildcats posted a 70-44 victory inside Memorial Coliseum over the Jaguars.

SERIES HISTORY VS. CURRENT ALIGNMENT OF THE SWAC

- Kentucky is 14-0 all-time against teams that make up the current alignment of the SWAC.
- Southern is the second SWAC opponent that UK has faced this season after defeating Alabama State 87-35 in the season opener.

DEFENSE SHINES IN SEASON OPENING WIN VS. ALABAMA STATE

- UK forced 42 turnovers - the fourth most in a game in program history - and scored 51 points off those miscues to earn their 10th straight win in a season or home opener on Wednesday against Alabama State.
- Senior guard Taylor Murray led all scorers with 16 points going 7-of-12 from the field with five assists and six steals. Fellow senior Maci Morris had 11 points and hit three 3s.
- UK had 23 steals in the game, which is the sixth most steals in a game in program history. It was the first time Kentucky had recorded 20 or more steals since 24 vs. Georgia Southern on Nov. 13, 2013.

ROOKIES HAVE HISTORIC DEBUT

- Both of Kentucky's freshmen scored 13 or more points in their varsity debut against Alabama State, which is the first time in program history that two freshmen scored 13 or more in their varsity debuts.
- Freshman guard Rhyne Howard scored 15 points in the game, adding six rebounds, three assists, three blocks and two steals. Howard's 15 points were the fifth most in a player's varsity debut in program history.
- Freshman guard Blair Green had 13 points in the game, going 5-of-10 from the field and 1-of-3 from long range. Green's 13 points tied the seventh most in a player's varsity debut in program history.

WILDCATS SHAKE OFF RUST IN LONE EXHIBITION VS. LMU

- Behind a disruptive full-court defensive effort that allowed the Wildcats to force 31 turnovers and score 41 points off those miscues, the University of Kentucky women's basketball team overpowered Lincoln Memorial 101-64 in its lone exhibition of the season.
- Kentucky used a strong effort on both ends of the court to earn the victory on Friday shooting 48.8 percent from the field on 41-of-84 shooting while LMU shot 42.4 percent and was forced into 31 turnovers. The Wildcats limited their miscues with just seven turnovers and allowed just five points off those turnovers.
- True freshman Blair Green led Kentucky in scoring going 8-of-17 from the field for 17 points. The native of Harlan County, Ky., added four rebounds, one assists, one steal and one block. Fellow freshman Rhyne Howard scored 15 points with five assists, five rebounds, three steals and two blocks.
- Five Wildcats scored in double figures in total, including 16 points from sophomore Tatyana



Wyatt, who went 6-of-10 from the field with nine rebounds – eight offensive – and three blocks. Senior guard Taylor Murray had 14 points and a team-best six assists, while fellow senior guard Maci Morris had 11 points, five rebounds and four assists.

KENTUCKY IN SEASON/HOME OPENERS

- UK is 37-8 all-time in season openers, including winning 10 in a row.
- The Wildcats are 41-4 all-time in home openers and have won 10 in a row as well.

WILDCATS RETURN CORE FROM LAST SEASON

- Matthew Mitchell and Co. will return a majority of its team from last season, including its top four scorers in Maci Morris, Taylor Murray, Dorie Harrison and Tatyana Wyatt. In all, UK returns 10 of the 13 players that saw time last season, not including redshirt junior Ogechi Anyaligbo, who missed last season due to injury.
- In all, UK returns 81 percent of its scoring, 80 percent of its assists, 74 percent of its rebounding, 75 percent of its 3-point shooting and 80 percent of its made field goals. Morris and Murray lead the returners after Morris averaged 17.3 points last season while Murray averaged 11.5 points.
- The Wildcats lost three players from last season due to graduation in Alyssa Rice, Jessica Hardin and Makenzie Cann. Cann took a graduate transfer season at NAIA school Southeastern University.

WILDCATS LOOKING TO CONTINUE 3-POINT SHOOTING

- Kentucky shot 36.8 percent from long range last season which was the third-best 3-point field goal percentage for a season in program history and the best ever during Coach Mitchell's tenure.
- Most of the high percentage came from Maci Morris, who shot a school-record 47.5 percent (75-for-158) from 3, which ranked second in the nation last season. Morris returns this season and hopes to improve those numbers.
- The Wildcats return 75 percent of their made 3s from last season, including Morris, Taylor Murray (19-55, 34.5%), Tatyana Wyatt (15-46, 32.6%) and Jaida Roper (15-41, 36.6%). UK did lose its second-best 3-point shooter in total makes as Makenzie Cann graduated after hitting 45 3s last season.
- In the season opener, UK went 10-of-25 from long range with Rhyne Howard and Maci Morris each hitting three 3s.

'LAST YEAR, BEST YEAR' FOR MORRIS

- Morris had one of the best seasons in Kentucky women's basketball history last season, averaging 17.3 points per game and ranking second in the nation at 47.5 percent from long range. The high 3-point field-goal percentage was the best in a single season by a UK player in program history.
- The native of Bell County, Kentucky was the only player in the Southeastern Conference to score 20 or more points in seven straight games against league opponents last season. The stretch came against some of the best teams in the country as she scored 22 at Missouri, 21 at Mississippi State, 20 vs. Arkansas, 35 at South Carolina, 20 at Ole Miss, 22 vs. Mississippi State and 25 vs. Alabama.
- Morris, who recorded 10 or more points in 27 of her 31 games played in 2017-18, including 15 or more points in 23 games and 20 or more points in 12 games, posted a career-high 35 points at No. 8 South Carolina on Feb. 18, 2018, with a career-high 13 made field goals. That performance helped her become just the third player in program history to score 35+ points in an SEC game.

MORRIS IN THE CAREER RANKINGS

- Morris has 1,220 career points to rank 19th all-time. She needs 98 more points to tie Bria Goss (2012-15) for 18th all-time.
- Morris ranks tied for third with 180 career 3s made. She needs 17 more to tie Jennifer O'Neill for second all-time.
- Morris has a career 3-point field-goal percentage of 39.7 percent which is currently tied with Kristi Cushenberry for best all-time.

- Named after the first player, male or female, named to the All-America Team in four straight college seasons, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top shooting guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball.
- The selection committee for the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award is composed of top women's college basketball personnel including media members, head coaches, sports information directors and hall of famers. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2019 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award will be narrowed to just 10. In March, five finalists will be presented to Ms. Drysdale and the hall of fame's selection committee.

MURRAY LOOKING FOR MORE IN 2018-19

- Murray had a fantastic junior season for Kentucky finishing second on the team with 11.5 points per game and 4.3 rebounds per game while pacing the team with 136 assists and 67 steals. Murray ranked third in the league in assist-turnover ratio at 2.19 and in free-throw percentage at 83.8 percent.
- The guard had a stretch during league play in 2017-18 where she recorded eight straight double-digit scoring games, including three 20+ scoring games during that stretch. The native of Odenton, Md., became the first UK player to ever record 20 points and 10 or more assists in a SEC game when she accomplished the feat against Alabama last season.
- Murray had some all-around impressive stat lines last season with 14 points, five rebounds and five steals vs. Auburn and 23 points, six rebounds, four assists and three steals vs. Missouri.

MORRIS, MURRAY PRESEASON ALL-SEC

- Senior guards Maci Morris and Taylor Murray have been recognized by league coaches as two of the top performers in the Southeastern Conference this preseason as both have been named to the 2018-19 Preseason All-SEC Team.
- Morris was tabbed to the first team after being named to the second team following last season. Murray earned second-team honors for the second straight year after being on the SEC All-Defensive team last season. The Wildcats were picked to finish seventh in the league.

SOPHOMORE CLASS KEY TO SUCCESS

- Kentucky's group of sophomores are going to be key to the success of the 2018-19 season as they all look to improve on strong rookie campaigns.
- With Harrison out indefinitely, more of the focus will be on posts KeKe McKinney and Tatyana Wyatt. McKinney played in 30 games with 17 starts last season averaging 4.7 points and 3.7 rebounds per game, while Wyatt played in 24 games with four starts averaging 6.6 points and 3.5 rebounds per game. With Alyssa Rice gone, McKinney and Wyatt will be relied on heavily to lock down the post and both have worked hard this preseason and look poised for strong sophomore seasons.
- Fellow sophomore guard Kameron Roach figures to add depth to the guard after playing in 15 games last season with 7.3 minutes per game.

NEWCOMERS IMPRESS IN EARLY GOING

- Kentucky welcomes four newcomers to the 2018-19 team in true freshmen Blair Green and Rhyne Howard and transfers Nae Nae Cole and Sabrina Haines. Cole and Haines will miss the 2018-19 season due to NCAA transfer rules. Green and Howard are going to have an immediate impact on the squad as both have performed well during preseason practice and in Italy.
- Howard and Green made up the 18th-best class in the nation according to All Star Girls Report. Both players were named McDonald's All-America Game nominees and Naismith High School All-America Honorable Mention last season. Howard was tabbed one of 12 players to the Team USA U18 roster and was the 2018 Tennessee Miss Basketball and Tennessee Gatorade Player of the Year. Green was a finalist for Miss Kentucky Basketball and was tabbed first-team all-state by multiple media outlets.

HOWARD WINS GOLD, MVP HONORS IN MEXICO CITY FOR TEAM USA

- Rhyne Howard was chosen to play for the USA U18 Team in the 2018 FIBA Americas U18 Championship and helped lead the USA to gold and won MVP honors.
- Howard shined in every game of the tournament, starting with six points, two rebounds, one assist and a steal vs. Argentina before seven points with eight rebounds, three assists, two blocks and a steal vs. Chile. In the final game of pool play vs. Puerto Rico, Howard had 11 points with six rebounds, six steals and one assist. The guard continued to play well in the elimination rounds with eight points, six rebounds, four assists, two blocks and a steal in



the quarterfinals vs. El Salvador before 14 points, including 4-of-7 from long range with five assists, two blocks and two steals against Colombia. She locked up the top honor after five points, four rebounds, four assists and two blocks vs. Canada.

WILDCATS VS. THE RANKED

- Kentucky is scheduled to play 14 games against teams in the Associated Press Preseason Top 25 and USA Today Coaches Top 25. UK will play at No. 5/4 Louisville, at No. 6/6 Mississippi State, home and away vs. No. 10/11 South Carolina, at No. 11/12 Tennessee, at No. 14/13 Georgia, vs. No. 16/14 Missouri, at No. 20/21 Texas A&M, neutral site vs. No. 22/21 South Florida, nr/rv North Carolina and rv/rv UCLA, home and away vs. nr/rv LSU and home vs. nr/rv Florida. UK went 0-11 last year vs. ranked opponents.

MEDIA, COACHES PICK UK TO FINISH SEVENTH IN SEC

- Both the SEC Preseason Media Poll and Coaches Poll picked the Wildcats to finish seventh in the league in 2018-19.
- Kentucky went 6-10 in conference play last season and finished ninth in the league.
- The Wildcats defeated Alabama, who finished eighth, in the second round of the SEC Tournament before falling to Mississippi State in the quarterfinals.

POFFENBERGER MEDICALLY RETIRES, WILL REMAIN IN PROGRAM

- Senior guard Paige Poffenberger has medically retired from the game of basketball but will remain in the program and be a vital part of the team in other roles.
- Poffenberger, who is majoring in biology with aspirations of going to medical school and eventually work in pediatrics, plans to study aboard in Spain next year prior to graduation in 2020. She plans to participate in Senior Day ceremonies along with Maci Morris, Taylor Murray and LaShae Halsey on Sunday, Feb. 24 against LSU at 2 p.m. ET.
- The native of Morgantown, W.Va., joined the program as a walk-on in the fall of 2016 and immediately impressed the coaching staff with her hard-nosed style of play and intensity on both ends of the court. The guard played in 35 career games the last two seasons, averaging 5.6 minutes per game and scoring 32 total points.

DORIE HARRISON OUT INDEFINITELY FOR PERSONAL HEALTH REASONS

- Sophomore center Dorie Harrison is out indefinitely for personal health reasons.
- Harrison played in 32 games last season with eight starts, averaging 6.7 points per game and 3.8 rebounds per game. The native of Nashville was named the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week after scoring 15 points with five rebounds vs. Alabama and 16 points with four rebounds at Arkansas.
- Mitchell: "Dorie needs to step away from the basketball court to address her personal health. We will give her the time she needs to get healthy and she has our full support. We look forward to her return to the court. We ask everyone to respect her privacy during this time."

CIAO! WILDCATS GAIN EXPERIENCE IN ITALY IN AUGUST

- August was a month of growth for Kentucky WBB as the Wildcats traveled to Italy for its first foreign tour in the Matthew Mitchell Era. UK played three games over 10 days in Italy, going 2-1 on the court and gaining numerous off-the-court benefits. Kentucky is now 22-3 all-time in international play after finishing the trip 2-1.
- The Wildcats started the foreign tour with a 73-41 victory over the Bosnia and Herzegovina National Team in Rome before a 64-46 loss to the TK Hannover professional team. The trip ended with a 81-64 win over Marghera Select. The Wildcats started the tour in Rome for three days before two days in Florence and two nights in Venice before ending the trip in Lake Como.
- "It is such a benefit to have these three games, especially with one of them being against really tough competition where the team could identify what we need to do to be a really

special team,” Mitchell said. “We are not necessarily going to out talent people and roll the ball out. We are really going to have to become a great team and I think we have the makings of that spending so much time together playing in some adverse conditions and being able to actually have a few practices to get a head start on the season are all good things. We are further along this time than we were a year ago. What an unbelievable group of players and young people who have invested each day in making sure this is an experience that they can draw on for the rest of their lives. I have been so impressed with their attitude and their energy. We have just had a fantastic time.”

THE MAGIC “80”

- The Wildcats hold a remarkable 342-23 (.936) record since 1974 when scoring 80 points or more. The last loss came at South Carolin on Feb. 26, 2017 when the Cats fell 95-87 in the regular-season finale. UK is 96-5 (.950) under Mitchell when scoring 80 points or more.

UK IN OVERTIME

- UK is 29-26 all-time in overtime games, including a 10-3 mark under Matthew Mitchell, who is 12-5 in his 11-year career as a head coach in OT.

KENTUCKY ALL-TIME

- Kentucky is 799-532 (.600) in its 45th year of varsity women’s basketball, including 257-117 (.687) in 12 seasons under Matthew Mitchell. Win No. 750 came against Auburn on Jan. 17, 2016 in Memorial.

MITCHELL MOVES INTO ELITE SEC COMPANY

- Kentucky’s dominating 89-57 victory over Ole Miss on Jan. 26, 2017 was an historic one for Kentucky head coach Matthew Mitchell. The win was his 97th all-time in SEC play as a head coach, which ranked him 10th all-time on the SEC’s career wins list. UK’s win at Arkansas on Feb. 16 was Mitchell’s 100th career SEC win.
- Since arriving in Lexington in 2007, Mitchell has led Kentucky to unprecedented success. On top of leading UK to its first SEC Regular Season Championship in 30 years in 2012, Mitchell has four SEC Tournament title game appearances, nine top-four finishes in the league and has coached 18 all-conference performances, including four SEC Player of the Year honorees.

MITCHELL TURNS PROGRAM AROUND

- In 2009-10, Coach Mitchell implemented the “40 minutes of dread” style of play. Although UK doesn’t play that style as much anymore, it started Kentucky on an impressive run of success over the last 10 seasons.
 - Recorded an impressive 224-85 overall record, including a 135-23 mark at home.
 - Eight 20-win seasons, averaging 24.7 wins over the last nine years.
 - Advanced to a school-record eight straight NCAA Tournaments (2010-2017), including three Elite Eight trips during that span with 15 NCAA Tournament wins.
 - Eight top-four SEC finishes, including winning the SEC regular season title in 2012, its first in 30 years.
 - Advanced to the SEC Tournament championship game four times
 - Four SEC Player of the Year Award Winners
 - Two SEC Freshman of the Year Winners

20+ WIN SEASONS UNDER MITCHELL

- The Wildcats have won 20 or more games 18 times in 44 years of varsity basketball, including a school-record eight in a row from 2010-2017. It’s important to note that UK had just 10 20-win seasons in its first 33 years of varsity women’s basketball, but has eight in 10 seasons of the Matthew Mitchell era.

VICTORIA DUNLAP ENSHRINED IN HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2018

- Victoria Dunlap was enshrined in the UK Athletics Hall of Fame in September of 2018 becoming the first Matthew Mitchell coached player to be inducted into the prestigious hall of fame. Below is a recap of Dunlap’s incredible career at Kentucky.
- First-team All-America as a junior and third-team All-America as a senior ... Two-time SEC Player of the Year ... SEC Defensive Player of the Year ... Two-year WBCA All-Region ... THE KENTUCKY WBB COACHING STAFF HAS ...

- Combined the Kentucky women's basketball staff has compiled over 80 years of experience at the Division I level, including coaching or playing in a combined 38 NCAA Tournaments with eight Final Fours, four national championships and a WNBA Championship. Elzy and Butts are in their second stint in Lexington after serving on Mitchell's staffs before. Butts was an associate head coach on Mitchell's first staff at Kentucky before Elzy joined the staff for four successful seasons. Amber Smith is in her first year as an assistant coach but has been a part of the Kentucky program for nearly a decade. Dunn, who is a Women's Basketball Hall of Famer, has over 40 years of coaching experience, including three decades in the collegiate ranks. Dunn is now the special assistant to the head coach after serving as an assistant coach the last two seasons.

RECAPPING THE 2017-18 SEASON

- Kentucky did not have the success it was hoping for in 2017-18 as the Wildcats hit a midseason lull that included an eight-game losing skid. UK responded by winning six league games and was playing better as the season concluded.
- Overall, UK went 15-17, 6-10 in the league and missed postseason play for the first time in Coach Mitchell's tenure.

CATS SHINE IN THE CLASSROOM

- Matthew Mitchell has put an emphasis on academics since arriving on campus as the Wildcats have had a 3.0 team GPA or better each of the last 10 semesters. In the fall of 2016, the Wildcats posted a 3.517 team GPA, which was the highest GPA for a semester in the Mitchell era. UK followed that with a 3.464 team GPA in the spring with four players earning 4.0s. UK earned a 3.3 team GPA in the fall of 2017. Under Mitchell, 38 Wildcats have been tabbed to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and 100 percent of Mitchell's players have received their degrees.

SEVEN CATS PLAYING OVERSEAS

- Kentucky women's basketball currently has seven alumnae who signed professional contracts to play overseas for the 2017-18 season.
 - Azia Bishop is playing for Feko Ilgaz in Turkey.
 - Bria Goss is playing for Maccabi Raanana in Israel.
 - DeNesha Stallworth and Jennifer O'Neill are playing for Sparta&K MR in Russia
 - Janee Thompson is playing for Piastanske C. in Slovakia
 - Evelyn Akhator is playing for Besiktas in Turkey
 - Makayla Epps is playing for Hoops Club in Lebanon.

9 STRAIGHT YEARS TOP 15 IN ATTENDANCE

- Big Blue Nation continues to show its massive support for Kentucky WBB as UK ranked 15th in average attendance during the 2017-18 season with 5,187 fans per game, marking the ninth straight year the Wildcats have ranked in the top 15 in average attendance nationally. UK has ranked top 25 in average attendance for 15 straight seasons.
- Overall in 16 home games – including three inside Rupp Arena – Kentucky amassed a total attendance of 82,984, which ranked top-20 nationally in total home attendance for 2017-18. Kentucky did not amass 100,000 for the seventh straight year, but played four fewer home games in 2017-18 than previous years.
- Kentucky's attendance numbers have reached impressive heights the last decade as the Wildcats have averaged 5,000 or more fans every year since 2009-10, while seven of the eight most-attended home games in program history have all come the past few years under head coach Matthew Mitchell.
- The Wildcats drew big crowds all across the country, not just in Lexington, as a total of 147,477 fans saw Kentucky play during the 2017-18 season, which ranked 11th nationally.

A WINNING INSTITUTION

- Both the Kentucky men's and women's basketball team have been national contenders the past few years with great success on the court. UK has tallied a 499-149 combined record between its two programs since 2009-10. That record includes a 285-31 mark in Lexington. UK was one of three schools to have both men's and women's programs as a top four seed



in the 2016 NCAA Tournament.

MATTHEW AND JENNA MITCHELL DONATE \$1 MILLION TO UK ATHLETICS

- In June of 2014, Coach Matthew Mitchell and his wife, Jenna, pledged \$1 million over the next 10 years to the University of Kentucky Athletics Department. The donation will provide UK Athletics \$100,000 per year over the next 10 years to be used for a variety of capital projects, including updates and renovations for football. The donation is the largest ever given by a UK athletics employee to the athletics department.
- Matthew and Jenna have been very active in the Lexington community since arriving in Lexington. In October 2016, Matthew and Jenna were presented the Community Service Award by the Urban League of Lexington.

Memorial Coliseum (8,000)

- The Coliseum covers an entire city block and has as much space as a seven-story office building. It currently has a capacity of 8,000.
- The Coliseum was built in 1950 and serves as a memorial to every Kentuckian who lost their life serving their country.
- A massive new LED video board spanning approximately 1,800 square feet with dimensions of 30 feet by 60 feet is set to be installed in Memorial Coliseum this fall.
- Wildcat fans are passionate about their basketball, that's why UK has ranked in the nation's top 25 and in the SEC's top four in attendance 15 straight years.
- The Cats are 150-27 at Memorial in the Matthew Mitchell Era.
- UK averaged 5,186 fans per game in 2017-18 which ranked 15th nationally.
- UK drew 116,164 fans for its home games in 2015-16 the second-highest total attendance in school history.



Rupp Arena (23,000)

- An awesome structure in sight and scope, the arena is divided into two seating areas. The lower level features 10,000 cushioned theater seats. The upper level has 13,000 seats on epoxy-coated metal bleachers. The latter can be visually isolated to provide more natural setting for small shows.
- The Wildcats command an exclusive and updated state-of-the-art locker room, while other amenities include six team-size dressing rooms and eight smaller units.
- In 2013-14, UK set the new single-game attendance record when 23,706 fans saw UK face No. 2 Duke in Rupp Arena on Dec. 22, 2013. The attendance marked the largest crowd ever to see a college women's hoops game in the Commonwealth — the previous mark was 22,152 for the first Kentucky-Louisville game played in the KFC Yum! Center on Dec. 5, 2010.
- In 2015-16, Kentucky packed 17,150 fans in Rupp Arena on Dec. 20 against Duke, which was the fourth-largest home crowd in program history. On Dec. 10, the Wildcats had 14,425 fans at the historic arena, which was the sixth-largest home crowd in school history.
- Kentucky will play two games inside Rupp Arena in 2018-19 after playing three games inside the historic building last season.

- Became UK's all-time winningest coach on March 3, 2013 with 139 wins in just six seasons.
- Including the storied history of the UK MBB program, he is the fifth Kentucky Basketball head coach to win 250 games with the Wildcats joining Adolph Rupp, Joe B Hall, Tubby Smith and John Calipari.
- Has 108 career SEC wins, which ranks 11th most in league history
- Two-time AP SEC Coach of the Year (2010 & 2012).
- Led UK to postseason play in 10 of his 11 seasons. (2 WNIT, 8 NCAA)
- School-record eight consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances from 2010-2017.
