LOUISVILLE FACTS

The University of Louisville football team closes the 2018 season with a visit from intra-state rival Kentucky on Saturday in a 7 p.m. contest at Cardinal Stadium.

- ▶ The Cardinals dropped their eighth-straight game, falling to NC State 52-10 on Nov. 17 at Cardinal Stadium. The eight-game losing streak is tied for the sixth-longest in school history. The Cardinals finished 0-8 in the league, their second-longest conference losing streak in school history.
- ▶ The Cardinals rushed for a season high 254 yards in the loss to NC State the most yards on the ground since running for 346 yards in defeating Kentucky 44-17 last season. The Cardinals are 105-8 when rushing for over 200 yards in a game.
- ▶ Quarterback **Malik Cunningham** rushed for a game high 100 yards on 14 carries, becoming only the second quarterback in school history to register two or more 100-yard rushing games in a season. Cunningham rushed for 129 yards in a win over Western Kentucky on Sept. 15.
- The Cardinals averaged 6.7 yards a rush in the loss Quarterback Malik Cunningham became the to NC State last weekend, carrying 38 times for 254 yards. Second quarterback in school history to rush
- Running back **Jeremy Smith** added 10 carries for a season high 74 yards in the loss, while **Colin Wilson** added 44 yards on seven carries.



- ▶ Through the air, Cunningham was 8 of 14 for 90 yards, and **Jawon Pass** was 5 of 11 for 67 yards and one interception.
- ▶ Wide receiver **Jaylen Smith** led the Cardinals with three receptions for 56 yards, with **Seth Dawkins** added two receptions for 34 yards.
- Defensive end **Tabarius Peterson** led the Cardinals with eight tackles and one sack, while **Henry Famurewa** added a career high seven tackles.
- The Cardinals allowed 52 points, the sixth time this season that they have given up 50 or more points in a game. Louisville has yielded a school record 473 points besting the old mark of 429 points allowed in 1985.

Lamar Jackson accounted for 372 yards and two passing touchdowns, Reggie Bonnafon rushed for two scores and Louisville coasted past rival Kentucky 44-17 to reclaim the Governor's Cup. The Cardinals (8-4) led 31-10 at halftime and easily avenged last year's 41-38 upset loss to the Wildcats. Play was chippy throughout, and tempers flared early as Heisman winner and Jones clashed after Lonnie Johnson Jr. knocked Jackson out of bounds at Kentucky's 1 following a 9-yard run. Dae Williams' 1-yard TD soon after play resumed made it 14-0 for Louisville and set the stage for its third straight victory.

ABOUT THE KENTUCKY WILDCATS

- ▶ Benny Snell, Jr. rushed 26 times for 116 yards and a pair of touchdowns, and Kentucky won its eighth game of the season, topping Middle Tennessee 34-23 on Saturday at Kroger Field.
- ▶ It was the fifth time this season that Snell has rushed for at least 100 yards, and the 17th such game in his UK career. Snell's two touchdowns give him 44 for his career, the second-most rushing touchdowns of any player in SEC history prior to his senior year. Only former Georgia Heisman Trophy winner Herschel Walker had more career touchdowns prior to his senior season (49).
- ▶ Josh Allen had two sacks, breaking a pair of school records in the process. Allen set UK's career record for sacks with 26.5, while also breaking the Kentucky single-season record with 13. Allen registered a career-high 15 tackles in the game.
- ▶ Kentucky enters the game at 8-3, its first eight win season since 1984.

THE LAST TIME OUT

Ryan Finley threw for 316 yards and a career-high four touchdowns as North Carolina State cruised to a 52-10 victory over Louisville.

Louisville interim coach Lorenzo Ward made his debut after Bobby Petrino was fired Sunday. FIVE KEY STORYLINES

- ▶ Lorenzo Ward took over on an interim basis for Bobby Petrino after serving as the associate head coach for the last two seasons. Ward joined the staff in January 2017 as associate head coach and secondary coach. Ward has over 21 years of coaching experience, spending four of his six years as a defensive coordinator in the Southeastern Conference at South Carolina. Prior to joining Petrino's staff at Louisville, Ward served one season as Fresno State's defensive coordinator.
- The Cardinals will say goodbye to 11 seniors who have combined to secure a 27-23 overall record during their four seasons. The Cardinals appeared in three bowl games during that time, playing in the Music City Bowl (2015), Citrus Bowl (2016), and TaxSlayer Bowl (2017).
- Facing one of nation's stinglest defenses in Kentucky, the Cardinals are coming off a game where they rushed for 245 yards in the loss to NC State. **Malik Cunningham** became only the second quarterback in school history to rush for over 100 yards in a game for the second time in a season.
- Wide receiver **Jaylen Smith** puts the final chapter on a great collegiate career. The Pascagoula, Mississippi, native has caught 150 passes for 2,474 yards and 15 touchdowns. He leads the team with 34 receptions for 519 yards and one score.
- ▶ Redshirt sophomore **Tabarius Peterson**, who recorded eight tackles versus NC State, has recorded 11 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks in the last two games.

THE GOVERNOR'S CUP

- The Governor's Cup was created in 1994 as the trophy for the winner of the Louisville-Kentucky game. Donated by The Kroger Company at a cost of \$23,000, the Governor's Cup stands 33 inches tall and weighs 110 pounds. The trophy's base and upright columns are hand-milled black marble. The glass components are optic-grade crystal. All metal parts are 23-karat, gold-plated brass. The cup itself is made of pewter with a 23- karat gold-plated finish.
- ▶ The cup was designed by Kendall Costner and sculpted by James Corcoran of Bruce Fox, Inc. The Kroger Company also is involved in supporting academic pursuits at the schools. Kroger is donating \$10,000 to each school for each year the game is played. Kroger's donations now total \$420,000 \$210,000 to each school.

SENIOR FAREWELL

▶ A total of 11 players will be playing their final game of their career when the Cardinals host Kentucky on Saturday at Cardinal Stadium. The senior class owns a career record of 27-23 and appeared in three bowls during their four seasons with the Cardinals.

- ▶ The Cardinals (8-4) led 31-10 at halftime and easily avenged last year's 41-38 upset loss to the Wildcats. Play was chippy throughout, and tempers flared early as Heisman winner and Jones clashed after Lonnie Johnson Jr. knocked Jackson out of bounds at Kentucky's 1 following a 9-yard run.
- ▶ Jackson bumped Jones after getting up, and the two players exchanged shoves before wrestling on the ground and igniting several smaller skirmishes. Jackson, Cardinals running back Malik Williams, Jones and Johnson were penalized for unsportsmanlike conduct but remained in the contest.
- ▶ Dae Williams' 1-yard TD soon after play resumed made it 14-0 for Louisville and set the stage for its third straight victory. Bonnafon rushed 11 yards for his second score, Jackson followed with a 29-yard TD pass to Dez Fitzpatrick and the Cardinals rolled to their biggest victory margin in the series since a 59-28 win in 2006.
- ▶ Jackson completed 15 of 21 passes for 216 yards and rushed 18 times for 156 to earn his second Howard Schnellenberger Most Valuable Player award for the game. Louisville evened the series at 15 and earned Bluegrass bragging rights for the sixth time in seven meetings.
- ▶ Benny Snell rushed 29 times for a career-high 211 yards and two TDs for Kentucky. But Wildcats (7-5) never got closer than 14-7 and were outgained 562-338 in losing their third of four games on a day they honored 25 seniors.

LOUISVILLE VERSUS THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

- ▶ Louisville is 20-38-1 all-time versus schools from the Southeastern Conference.
- The Cardinals are 7-6 versus the SEC in the last 13meetings after dropping a 31-27 to Mississippi State in the 2017 TaxSlayer Bowl and opening the season with a 51-14 loss to No. 1 Alabama.
- The Cardinals are 3-1 versus Kentucky since the two schools moved the rivalry game to the end of the season. The Cardinals are 1-1 at home in the final game versus the Wildcats, winning 44-40 in 2014 and dropping a 41-38 decision in 2016.
- ▶ Louisville is 1-3 versus Alabama; 0-2 versus Auburn; 1-2 versus Florida; 0-1 versus Georgia; 15-15 versus Kentucky; 0-1 versus LSU; 2-2 versus Mississippi State; 0-1 versus Missouri; 0-5 versus Tennessee; 1-3 versus Texas A&M and 0-2-1 versus Vanderbilt.

SERIES VERSUS KENTUCKY

- ▶ With last season's Louisville win, the series is tied at 15-15.
- ▶ Louisville leads the series 10-8 in games played in Lexington, having won four straight. The Cardinals are just 5-7 in games played in Louisville, losing 41-38 during the 2016 season.
- ► Kentucky stormed into Papa John's Cardinal Stadium in 2016 and secured a thrilling 41-38 last-second victory over the No. 11 Cardinals, ending a five-game losing streak to Louisville in the process.
- The win was the Wildcats' first road win over a ranked team since 2002, which also came against

- ▶ Louisville faced Alabama, the No. 1 team in the nation, and faced No. 2 Clemson on Nov. 3 the first time the Cardinals have played the top two ranked teams in the same season. The Cardinals faced a pair of top-five opponents in the same year for the first time since 2016 beating No. 2 Florida State 63-20 and falling 42-36 at No. 5 Clemson.
- ▶ When Louisville hosts No. 17 Kentucky, the cardinals are playing their fourth AP-ranked team this season for the second time ever. The Cards went 1-3 against ranked teams in 1993, losing to No. 24 West Virginia, No. 7 Tennessee, and No. 11 Texas A&M, after winning 35-17 vs. No. 23 Arizona State.
- ▶ The Cardinals have lost seven-straight games versus ranked foes, the last win coming in 2016, a 63-20 win over No. 2 Florida State.

NOTING THE NC STATE GAME

- The Cardinals opened the game with a nine-play, 40-yard scoring drive capped by a 32-yard field from Blanton Creque. It marked just the second time in 11 games this season Louisville has scored on its opening drive. The Cardinals scored a touchdown on the first drive against Wake Forest.
- ▶ The 411 yards of total offense versus NC State marked the fifth time this season Louisville has gained 400 yards or more. Each of those five performances have occurred in the last seven games.
- ▶ The Cardinals registered a season-high 254 yards rushing on 38 attempts. Louisville has attempted 38 or more rushes in five games this season. The 6.7 yards per rush for Louisville on Saturday marked the highest average per carry this season.
- **▶ Malik Cunningham** rushed for 100 yards on eight carries becoming just the second quarterback in Louisville history to run for at least 100 yards in a single game twice. Lamar Jackson had 23 games with at least 100 yards rushing.
- ▶ Cunningham's 408 yards rushing this season ranks fourth among Louisville quarterbacks for a single season and seventh on the career list.
- With his field goal and extra point versus NC State on Nov. 17, **Blanton Creque** moved into sixth place on Louisville's career scoring list with 249 points. Creque moved past Michael Bush, who scored 248 points from 2003-06.
- Nunning back **Jeremy Smith** had career highs in rushing attempts (10) and rushing yards (74) versus the Wolfpack.
- **Blanton Creque's** streak of nine consecutive made field goals ended in the first quarter when his 50-yard attempt was blocked.
- **Tabarius Peterson** led the Cardinals with eight tackles, just one shy of his career high total. Peterson registered a sack in for the second straight game and has 2.5 sacks on the season.

- Henry Famurewa matched a career high totaling seven tackles for the second straight game.
- **▶** Anthony Johnson had a career high six tackles against the Wolfpack after entering the game with six total tackles this season.

200 YARDS RUSHING

- The Cardinals have struggled this year running the football at times, averaging 133.8 yards on the ground through 11 games. However, the Cardinals found some success on the ground versus Syracuse and NC State. The Cardinals registered 203 yards rushing versus the Orange, their second highest total, and added a season-best 254 yards in the loss to NC State on Nov. 17.
- ▶ With the loss to the Wolfpack, Louisville fell to 105-8 when rushing for at least 250 yards. Four of the eight losses have come in the last three seasons.
- ▶ The Cardinals have found their running game in the last two weeks, totaling an average of 228.5 yards on the ground. Louisville has totaled 457 yards on 77 carries, averaging 5.9 yards per carry.
- ▶ In the loss to NC State on Nov. 17, the Cardinals averaged 6.7 yards per rush, which marked the highest average per carry this season.
- ▶ Quarterback Malik Cunningham rushed for 100 yards on eight carries against NC State on Nov. 17, becoming just the second quarterback in Louisville history to run for at least 100 yards in a single game twice. Lamar Jackson had 23 games with at least 100 yards rushing.
- Dunningham's 408 yards rushing this season ranks fourth among Louisville quarterbacks for a single season and seventh on the career list. He leads the team in rushing and would it would mark the fourth-straight season that a quarterback led the team in rushing. Jackson led the Cardinals in rushing from 2015-17.
- Nunning back Jeremy Smith had career highs in rushing attempts (10) and rushing yards (74) versus NC State.
- Redshirt freshman **Colin Wilson** earned his first career start in the loss to NC State, carrying seven times for 44 yards. The Florida native has carried 17 times for 86 yards in the last two games.
- The Cardinals have totaled 17 rushing touchdowns this year, which would be the fewest since registering 18 in 2013. Louisville is averaging 3.9 yards a carry, the lowest average since the 2014 season when the team averaged 3.6 yards carry.

MAKING MORE PLAYS

- The Louisville offense hasn't been able to get on track for much of the season, but the Cardinals might be finding their stride in these last two contests. Louisville has surpassed the 400-yard plateau in each of the last two games, totaling 413 yards versus Syracuse and 411 against NC State. The Cardinals are averaging 356.9 yards per game, an average of 5.2 yards per play.
- In the last two games, the Cardinals have averaged 6.19 yards per play in losses to Syracuse and NC State. More impressive has been the work on the ground, averaging 5.9 yards per carry in those last two contests. Louisville averaged 6.7 yards per rush against NC State in totaling a season best 254 yards rushing.

PENALTIES A PROBLEM

- Penalties have been a problem all season, but its been a habitual problem all season. In the last three games, the Cardinals have committed 39 penalties for 293 yards in the loss. The Cardinals committed 17 infractions for 125 yards in the 54-23 defeat. The 17 penalties were one away from equaling the school record of 18 versus Cincinnati in 1998 and Connecticut and Tulane during the 2000 season.
- The 17 penalties were the most since equaling that number against Army on Sept. 21, 2002.
- ▶ The Cardinals are averaging 8.0 penalties per game, which ranks 117th in the country. Louisville has committed 10 or more penalties in four games this season, including 29 for 193 yards in the last two contests.
- For the season, the Cardinals have committed 89 penalties for 727 yards.

PETERSON EXCELS IN LARGER ROLE

- Defensive end **Tabarius Peterson** has excelled as his playing time has increased this season. Playing in all 11 games, the native of Tucker, Ga., has registered 48 tackles, which is more than the 26 he was credited in 12 games a year ago.
- In the last two games, Peterson has recorded 11 tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks versus Syracuse and NC State. He registered eight tackles, the third time this season registering eight or more tackles in a game, versus NC State. Peterson recorded a season high 2.0 tackles for loss and one sack in the loss at Syracuse on Nov. 9. Peterson leads the team with 6.5 tackles for loss and is tied for the team lead with 2.0 sacks this season.

TRIPLE DIGIT GAMES

- ▶ Since the beginning of the 2014 season (63 games), the Cardinals have turned in 69 100-yard performances on offense (41 individual 100-yard rushers and 28 individual 100-yard receivers).
- Thus far in 2018, **Malik Cunningham** has been the only player to rush for over 100 yards, totaling 129 yards in a win over Western Kentucky on Sept. 15 and 100 in the loss to NC State on Nov. 17.
- Wide receivers **Jaylen Smith** and **TuTu Atwell** each tallied 100-yard games, totaling 107 and 132 yards, respectively, in the loss to Wake Forest, only the third 100-yard games this season. From 2014-17, the Cardinals tallied 27 100-yard games, including seven in 2016 and 2017.
- ▶ In terms of passing, Louisville's quarterbacks turned in 17 300-yard games from 2014-18. Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson passed for over 300 yards 10 times over the 2016-17 seasons. **Jawon Pass** picked up the first 300-yard passing game of the season in the loss to Florida State on Sept. 29 and added another last weekend versus Wake Forest, throwing for a career high 358 yards in the 56-35 loss.

SPREAD THE SCORING

- Scoring has been an issue for the Cardinals, totaling 227 points in the first 10 games of the season. However, when the Cardinals do score they tend to spread the scoring around throughout the offense. Fourteen different players have scored offensive touchdowns this season after **Colin Wilson** scored his first career touchdown on a four-yard run against Syracuse on Nov. 9.
- Nunning backs Hassan Hall and Trey Smith and quarterback Malik Cunningham lead the team in touchdowns scored with four after Cunningham scored from 20 yards out against NC State. Smith took the lead briefly after scoring a career high three times in the loss to Wake Forest on Oct. 27. Smith delivered his second collegiate touchdown on the longest run of his career as the redshirt junior went 52 yards for a score on a fourth and one play in the first quarter.
- The scoring run by Smith marked the longest rush of the season for Louisville and twice as long as the previous long of 26 yards by Colin Wilson against Indiana State. Smith became the first Louisville running back to rush for three touchdowns in a game since Brandon Radcliff had three versus Wake Forest on Nov. 12, 2016.
- ▶ Wide receiver **Dez Fitzpatrick** tallied his third touchdown on the season when he scored on a 13-yard touchdown pass versus Syracuse on Nov. 9. Quarterback **Malik Cunningham** scored once against Clemson to total his third touchdowns on the season. Wide receiver **TuTu Atwell**, quarterback **Jawon Pass**, tight end **Kemari Averett**, and running bacsk **Dae Williams** are the other players with two touchdowns.
- ▶ Smith, Atwell and Averett are the three players who have scored multiple touchdowns this season. Smith tallied three scores versus Wake Forest on Oct. 27, while Averett tallied two scores in the opener versus Alabama and Atwell scored twice versus Georgia Tech on Oct. 5.
- ▶ Placekicker **Blanton Creque** leads the team in scoring with 53 points, going 9 of 11 on field goals and 26 of 29 on extra points.

ATWELL SETS FRESHMAN, SCHOOL RECORD; CONTINUES TO BE TOP RECEIVER

- Wide receiver **Tutu Atwell** continues to show why he was one of the stars of the 2018 recruiting class. In the loss to Wake Forest, Atwell's 132 yards receiving set a Louisville record for most receiving yards in a game by a true freshman, breaking the previous record of 106 yards by Eli Rogers achieved at Cincinnati on Oct. 15, 2011. Atwell's 132 receiving yards are the most for a Louisville player this season.
- ▶ Before the breakout game last weekend, the former Miami-Dade Player of the Year caught a personal best four passes for 79 yards, including a pair of 29-yard touchdown receptions. He opened the scoring when **Jawon Pass** connected with him on a 3rd-and-11 play to trim the lead to 21-7. Atwell caught the first career touchdown pass from **Jordan Travis** in the fourth quarter.
- Atwell, a native of Miami, Fla., is third on the team with 24 receptions for 406 yards and two touchdowns, and is leading the team with a 16.9 yards per catch average the fifth-highest total among freshmen nationally.
- >> The speedster leads the team with eight receptions of over 20 or more yards this season.

CUNNINGHAM PICKS UP SECOND START

- Reserve quarterback **Malik Cunningham** has made the most of his opportunities this season, and showed up in his second start versus NC State. Cunningham completed 8-of-14 passes for 90 yards, Cunningham also became the second quarterback in school history to rush for over 100 yards in a season, joining Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Thomas. Cunningham carried 14 times for 100 yards and one score in the loss to the Wolfpack. He rushed 20 yards in the fourth quarter to trim the lead to 45-10.
- The Montgomery, Ala., native leads the team in rushing with 408 yards and four scores, while averaging 5.5 yards per carry. Against Syracuse on Nov. 9, Cunningham rushed six times for 64 yards, including a career long 61-yard run.

- ▶ He ran for a career best 129 yards versus Western Kentucky on Sept. 15 and 54 yards and one score coming off the bench versus Indiana State.
- ▶ As a passer, Cunningham is completing a solid 59.3 percent of his throws, passing for 409 yards and one score.

HEALTHY PEETE PROVIDES SPARK

- ▶ Injuries have slowed the promising career of junior wide receiver **Devante Peete**, but the Pompano Beach, Fla., product might be finding his stride in 2018. Entering the season with only 15 catches for 226 yards and one score. Peete has shown promising production.
- ▶ The 6-foot-6 wideout is sixth on the team with 20 receptions for 247 yards. He's averaging 12.4 yards per reception, including a season-high 37-yarder versus Florida State. He has caught at least one pass in all 10 games this year.
- ▶ Peete recorded a career high four receptions for 37 yards in the loss to Boston College on Oct. 13.

TURNOVERS AND LACK OF TURNOVERS KILLING THE CARDINALS

- In order for the Cardinals to return to their winning ways, they must stop turning the football over, and must find a way to take the ball away from the opposition. Through 11 games, the Cardinals are -14 in turnover margin turning the ball over 25 times, while just causing 11 miscues.
- The Cardinals are tied for 128th in turnover margin 125th in turnovers lost and 111thin turnovers gained through 11 games. The Cardinals turned the ball over four times in the second quarter against Syracuse, three times twice in the losses to Georgia Tech and Clemson.
- Teams have capitalized on the miscues, turning the 25 turnovers into 135 points, while the Cardinals 11 forced turnovers have resulted in 16 points. Clemson returned an interception on Nov. 3 and returned it for a 27-yard touchdown.
- Cornerback **Rodjay Burns** intercepted a pass and returned it 34 yards to the Virginia three-yard line on Sept. 22. However, the Cardinals had to settle for a **Blanton Creque** 20-yard field goal. The Cardinals turned a pair of turnovers against Boston College into 13 points in the 38-20 loss to the Eagles on Oct. 13.
- Cornerback **Rodjay Burns** intercepted a pass and returned it 34 yards to the Virginia three-yard line on Sept. 22. However, the Cardinals had to settle for a **Blanton Creque** 20-yard field goal. The Cardinals turned a pair of turnovers against Boston College into 13 points in the 38-20 loss to the Eagles on Oct. 13.
- The Cardinals have had multiple turnovers in eight of 11 games and have turned the ball nine times in the last three games.


WILSON SHOWS PROMISE

- Running back **Colin Wilson** hasn't seen the playing time that he had hoped to see this season, but the redshirt freshman made the most of his opportunity against Syracuse on Nov. 9. In the loss to the Orange, Wilson rushed a career high 10 times for 42 yards and his first career touchdown run a four-yard score in the fourth quarter. This season, Wilson has rushed 37 times for 174 yards and one touchdown and is averaging a solid 4.7 yards per carry.
- In the last three games, Wilson has rushed 25 times for 112 yards and a touchdown. He carried eight times for 26 yards, which equaled the team leader in the 77-16 loss to Clemson. He also caught one pass for two yards. Appearing in only his fifth game of the year, Wilson has produced 88 yards on 20 carries this year.
- Last season, the Green Cove Springs, Florida, native carried six times for 69 yards before tearing his ACL. He rushed three times for 36 yards, with a long rush of 21 yards versus Murray State last season.

SMITH HEADS UP THE LIST

- Wide receiver **Jaylen Smith** was off to a slow start, but after catching eight passes for 107 yards versus Wake Forest on Oct. 27, the senior might be finding his stride. Smith recorded his second 100-yard game of the season and missed equaling his career high with eight receptions.
- After catching eight passes in the first four games, Smith leads the team with 34 receptions for a team high 519 yards and one score. He ranks 104th nationally with his 15.3 yards per catch average.
- ▶ In 47 career games, Smith has caught 150 passes for 2,474 yards and 15 touchdowns. With 56 yards versus NC State, Smith remains in sixth place on Louisville's career list for receiving yards with 2,474 yards. He needs one more reception to tie Ralph Dawkins (1990-93) for 10th on the career receptions list and 146 yards to move into fifth in receiving yards.
- ▶ Smith, a 6-foot-4 senior, caught a 34-yard touchdown pass versus Indiana State on Sept. 8 in the fourth quarter to give him 15 for his career, tying him for ninth on the school's career list for touchdown receptions. He needs one more to tie Mario Urrutia (2005-07) for eight on the school's career list.

- With seven career 100-yard receiving games, Smith needs one more to move into a tie with Mario Urrutia for ninth place on the school's all-time list.
- The senior is one the nation's top wide receivers after just missing a 1,000-yard season a year ago. Despite missing three games last year, Smith caught 60 passes for 980 yards and seven touchdowns, while averaging 16.3 yards per catch.
- A first-team all-ACC performer, Smith totaled four 100-yard receiving games, recording a career-high nine receptions for 183 yards and one touchdown in a 47-35 win over North Carolina. The Pascagoula, Miss., native opened the year with 117 yards on eight receptions versus Purdue, caught six passes for 118 yards in a loss to Boston College, and ended the year with 107 yards in a loss to Mississippi State.

SENIOR TIGHT END FINDING HIS STRIDE

- **>>** It's been a long road for tight end **Micky Crum**. Battling injuries over the last two seasons, Crum had played in only played 16 games, catching nine passes for 106 yards. However, the senior has hit his stride this season. Crum is fifth on the team with 21 receptions for 215 yards and one touchdown.
- ▶ The Columbus, Ohio, native caught a career best eight passes for 47 yards and a four-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter versus Florida State. It was the most caught by the senior tight end since registering six versus Houston in 2015.
- ▶ Crum's touchdown reception was his first since recording a two-yard touchdown catch versus Texas A&M in the Music City Bowl.
- The eight catches were the most by a tight end since Gary Barnidge caught eight versus Connecticut in 2007.

HALL HAS TREMENDOUS FRESHMAN SEASON

- Nunning back Hassan Hall is starting to push for all-freshman accolades heading into the final stretch of the season. The rookie is second on the team in rushing with 272 yards and three scores, while also catching 11 passes for 95 yards.
- ▶ The Atlanta, Ga., native leads the team with 1,147 yards, averaging 104.3 yards per game, which ranks 68th nationally and 10th in the Atlantic Coast Conference. In the loss to Clemson, Hall registered 273 all-purpose yards, which is the most by a UofL

player since Howard Stevens recorded 300 yards versus Southern Illinois in 1971. It was the most all-purpose yards by a freshman in school history.

- ▶ Hall, the Georgia native, has totaled 760 yards in the last five games, after registering 273 all-purpose yards in the loss to Clemson. Hall carried four times for 26 yards and totaled 247 yards on eight kickoff returns. The eight kickoff returns for Hall matched the school record equaling the eight returns for Ira Glass against Memphis in 1969 and the eight returns by Keith Stephens against Florida State in 1986. Hall ranks seventh on Louisville's single season list with 780 kickoff return yards in 2018. He needs just 42 yards to move into fifth place.
- ▶ Hall's 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the third quarter was the first for Louisville since Traveon Samuel's 100-yard scoring return against Clemson on Sept. 17, 2015.
- ▶ Hall has three kickoff returns of 44 yards or more this season a 61-yarder against Alabama and a 44-yarder against Boston College to go along with Saturday's 93-yarder. He ranks 24thrd nationally in kickoff return average, averaging 24.4 yards per return.
- ▶ The Atlanta, Ga., native was the first true freshman to start at running back since Anthony Allen started vs. Syracuse on Oct. 21, 2006.
- ▶ Hall leads the Cardinals with 1,147 all-purpose yards, and need 398 yards to crack the school's single-season top-10 list for all-purpose yards. He's the 61st player to have 1,000 all-purpose yards in a season, Among true freshmen, Hall ranks second behind Keith Stephens, who had 1,206 all-purpose yards in 1986, and is only the second true freshman to reach 1,000 all-purpose yards in a season.

FITZPATRICK CONTINUES HIS RISE

- ▶ After a slow start, sophomore wide receiver **Dez Fitzpatrick** is back to putting up numbers that made him one of the top receivers a year ago. Catching one pass for seven yards in the loss to NC State on Nov. 17, he's second on the team with 30 receptions for 4 14 yards and leads the team with three touchdowns.
- ▶ In the last eight games, Fitzpatrick has caught 25 passes for 353 yards and three touchdowns, averaging 14.4 yards a reception.
- ▶ For his career, Fitzpatrick has caught 75 passes for 1,133 yards and 12 touchdowns, which ranks 15th in school history.

CREQUE CLIMBING THE CHARTS

- >> Junior **Blanton Creque** continues to climb up the career charts and is becoming one of the best kickers in the history of the school.
- reque connected on one field goal, a 32-yarder in the loss to NC State on Nov. 17. The Shelbyville, Kentucky, native boosted his career field goal total to 42 remaining in fourth place on the school's all-time list. He needs just two more field goals to tie Nate Smith for third all time.
- >> Creque is 9 for 11 on field goal attempts this season after missing a field goal against NC State.
- The left-footed kicker also owns 249 career points, moving into fourth place in school history among kickers and sixth among all players after moving past Michael Bush for sixth place.
- ▶ Connecting on one field goal versus NC State, Creque improved to 42-of-50 on field goal attempts for his career. Creque is the school's career leader in field goal percentage, making kicks at an 84.0 percent clip.
- >> Creque is 8-of-12 on field goals of longer than 40 yards in his career, including a career long 48-yarder versus NC State last year. Creque is 32-of-35 inside of 40 yards in his third season as the team's kicker.
- ▶ Last season, the 5-foot-11 left-footed kicker was 17-of-20 on field goal attempts and 58-of-59 on extra points. The 17 field goals were the third-best total in a single-season.
- Creque scored 109 points last season, which is the fourth-most in school history.
- Ecreque had made 14-straight field goals dating back to last season, which was tied for the second-longest streak (Art Carmody) in school history before missing a field goal at FSU. Art Carmody owns the longest streak in school history by connecting on 16-straight during the 2006 season and he also hit 14 from Oct. 1, 2005 to Sept. 3, 2006.
- As a redshirt freshman, Creque booted 16-of-19 field goals, which was tied for the third-most on the school's single-season list.
- Creque is 123-of-128 on PATs for his career, which is the fourth-most made in school history.

KING CHANGES FIELD POSITION

- ▶ Junior punter **Mason King** has become a major weapon for the Cardinals this season in changing field position and pinning opponents in their own end. The former St. Xavier product has punted 63 times, including a career high nine times versus Boston College on Oct. 13. In a driving rainstorm versus Indiana State on Sept. 15, King was used six times for a 46.5 yard average, including a career long 64-yard punt.
- ▶ He stands 68th nationally in punting average and is eighth in the ACC with a 40.7 average after 11 games.
- ▶ Of his 63 punts, five have been over 50+ yards, 17 have landed inside the opposition's 20-yard line and 23 have been fair caught.
- ▶ King moved into ninth place on the school's career punting yards list with 6,864 yards. He needs 91 yards to move into eighth.
- With his five punts versus NC State, Mason King moved into ninth place on Louisville's career list with 161.
- ➤ The Louisville native has set the school record in consecutive years for punting average in a season at 43.9 yards per punt. Last year, King punted just 43 times, which would have ranked in the top 25 nationally, but didn't qualify based on the minimum requirements.

BURNS RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN PUNT RETURN AVERAGE

- Not only has sophomore **Rodjay Burns** lifted the Cardinals on defense, he's provided a much-needed spark in the return game. The Louisville native ranks fourth nationally and is third in the ACC in punt return average, posting a 15.2 yards per return mark. He added an impressive 45-yard return in the loss to Wake Forest on Oct. 27, the second longest of his career.
- **>>** Burns, an Ohio State transfer, returned a punt 55 yards for a touchdown versus Indiana State on Sept. 8 and added a 36-yard play in the victory over Western Kentucky on Sept. 15.
- After finishing 103rd in the country last season with a 5.13 return average, the Cardinals are 14th nationally with a 15.2 yard average.
- **>>** Burns needs just 109 yards to move into a tie for 10th place on the school's single-season list for punt return yardage.

SMITH ON PACE FOR CAREER YEAR

- Safety **Dee Smith** was voted one of the two defensive captains this season for a reason. The senior has started 10 games, leading the team with 65 tackles. He registered a season high nine tackles in the loss to Boston College on Oct. 13. He led the team in tackles with eight in the loss to Syracuse.
- ▶ The Florence, Ala., native has five games of six or more tackles and ranks 266th nationally, averaging 5.9 tackles per game. He totaled seven tackles against Western Kentucky on Sept. 15 and Florida State on Sept. 29, and also was credited with eight against Virginia. He's the team leader with 60 stops.
- ▶ In 41 career games, Smith has registered 167 stops and two interceptions.

ETHERIDGE LOOKING TO LEAD TEAM IN TACKLES FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT YEAR

- ▶ Linebacker **Dorian Etheridge** is working his way back up to the top of the team tackles list. Despite missing two games with an injury, the native of Charleston, West Virginia, is second on the team with 53 tackles after leading the team with eight tackles in the loss to Wake Forest on Oct. 27. Etheridge recorded six tackles, one sack and a pair of tackles for loss in the loss to NC State on Nov. 17.
- ▶ Etheridge, who totaled 11 tackles versus Boston College, has been credited with 43 stops in the last six games since returning to the lineup after a lower body injury. He was also credited with eight tackles against Florida State, seven against Georgia Tech and the eight against Wake Forest on Oct. 27.
- Appearing in only 22 career games, the 6-foot-3 linebacker has registered 136 stops and is looking to lead the team in tackles for the second-straight season after leading the 2017 squad with 83 tackles.

KHANE PASS ON PACE FOR CAREER YEAR

- ▶ Safety Khane Pass is becoming a solid performer at the safety position. The Columbus, Ga., product is fifth on the team with 47 tackles. He recorded a career high eight tackles in the loss to Georgia Tech on Oct. 5 and totaled seven against Boston College on Oct. 13 and Western Kentucky on Sept. 15.
- ▶ Pass broke his career high for tackles in a season after recording 38 last year and 19 in 2016. For his career, Pass has been credited with 104 tackles and one interception in 33 games.

NO INTERCEPTIONS

- Through 11 games, the Cardinals have only registered four interceptions in 266 pass attempts. **P.J. Mbanasor, Anthony Johnson, Rodjay Burns** and **C.J. Avery** are the only players to record interceptions this year.
- ▶ The four interceptions are the fewest at this point of the season since the 1990 squad recorded four interceptions for the entire season.

Cardinal Stadium already boasts some of the finest amenities to be considered one of the elite college football venues in the country.

Built in 1998, Louisville's home recently finished a \$63.25-million renovation to expand the north end zone – closing off the stadium – and enhancing the Howard Schnellenberger Football Complex. The project is scheduled to be completed in time for the September home opener.

Upon conclusion of the 2016 campaign, crews began construction and the first noticeable phase of the project will be the seating structure for the interior bowl.

Approximately 6,000 additional seats were added with the expansion, creating a unique look in the end zone structure and increasing the total seating capacity to over 60,800. The construction also provides an additional 25,000 square feet of space.

The expansion also includes about 900 modern club seats, 65 premium loge level boxes, and two exclusive field level suites. The club seats will have access to a premier gathering area that will provide viewing access to the field. Fans in that area will have an exclusive view to the players, who will be running onto the gridiron from a middle of the field level entrance after exiting the football complex through a tunnel.

On Jan. 1, 2018, renovations began on the football complex, which includes dramatic changes to the training areas and improving the overall student-athlete experience. An additional 100,000 square feet will allow the team's weight room and conditioning center to double in size, creating space for team workouts, conditioning, and an enhanced athletic training space equipped with a state-of-the-art hydrotherapy area.

A luxurious and spacious players' lounge, improvements for coaches' offices and the team locker room, and expansive theatre-style meeting areas also will be among the major improvements.

Cardinal Stadium, which first opened in 1998, featured a capacity of 42,000 and was expanded in 2010

to the present capacity of 55,000. In the last expansion, approximately 12,000 additional chairback seats were added to a second deck on the east side of the stadium in the UPS Flight Deck. The project included 33 new luxury suites on the Stites & Harbison Suite Level and 2,000 premium loge seats were added to the east side.

A 60-foot wide Norton's Terrace was constructed at the top of the south end zone, connecting the east and west sides of the stadium. Also included in the previous expansion was the PNC Club, a 20,000-square-foot, glass-enclosed area that stretches from end zone to end zone at the loge level on the east side of the stadium.

The temperature-controlled club features a full-service bar, concessions, large-screen televisions, lounge seating and tables. It also has more than 1,700 outdoor seats under cover with heaters and fans.

In addition to being available during football games, the PNC Club is used for other community and campus events throughout the year.

Still in place from the original construction, the impressive Brown and Williamson Club highlights the stadium's west side. The space extends the length of the football field and contains 28 suites. It has served as host to numerous banquets and parties.

Since 1998, the Cardinals are 96-36 at home and compiled a school record 20-game-home winning streak, which was snapped in 2007.

Seating Capacity

Built in 1998, stadium capacity is currently at approximately 60,800, including suites.

Playing Field

Louisville switched from natural grass to Field Turf for the 2003 season and was replaced again in 2014.

Card March

Fans are encouraged to meet the team when the Cardinals arrive for Card March, approximately 2:15 prior to kickoff. The team buses will arrive at Denny Crum Overpass and will unload and walk down the stairs. The players and coaches will make their way through the crowd behind the marching band and cheerleaders before entering the stadium.


