» TRENDING

- » The fourth-ranked Duke men's basketball team opens the program's 114th season with a marquee showdown versus second-ranked Kentucky in the State Farm Champions Classic.
- » The Blue Devils and Wildcats are each 4-3 in the seven previous Champions Classics, while Kansas and Michigan State are each 3-4.
- » A match-up between two of the four winningest programs in NCAA history, Duke and Kentucky have met 21 times. The Blue Devils have won seven of the last nine meetings.
- » These two programs lead college basketball in number of former players on 2018 opening-day NBA rosters -- the Blue Devils had 25, while the Wildcats had 31.
- » Duke was picked as the preseason favorite in the ACC, with freshman RJ Barrett tapped the ACC's Preseason Freshman of the Year. Barrett (first team) and Zion Williamson (second team), were each named Preseason All-ACC.
- » Duke welcomes the nation's No. 1 recruiting class this season, headlined by the No. 1 prospect Barrett and No. 2 Williamson. Cam Reddish is No. 3 and Tre Jones is No. 10. The fifth freshman, Joey Baker, was a 2019 Duke commit that reclassified to the 2018 class.
- » Juniors Javin DeLaurier and Jack White have been named captains by Coach K for the 2018-19 season.
- » Ranked No. 4 in the preseason AP poll, Duke is in the AP's preseason top five for a sixth straight year.



» Freshman RJ Barrett averaged 29.4 points and shot .371 from three-point range in Duke's five exhibition games, including the Duke Canada Tour in August.

» TEAM NOTES

114TH SEASON OF BASKETBALL

- » The 2018-19 campaign will mark the 114th season of Duke Basketball. The Blue Devils have compiled a 2,144-881 all-time record to rank fourth all-time in victories.
- » Only Kentucky (2,265), Kansas (2,248) and North Carolina (2,232) have more all-time wins than Duke.
- » Duke's all-time .709 winning percentage is also the fourth-best in NCAA history, behind only Kentucky (.764), North Carolina (.738) and Kansas (.726).

DUKE CAPS EXHIBITIONS 5-0

- » Duke was 5-0 in its exhibition schedule, winning three games on the Duke Canada Tour in August and defeating a pair of Division-II teams in October.
- » Duke averaged 104.6 points in those games with Barrett and Williamson combining for 55 percent of those points.
- » The Blue Devils have traditionally played their exhibition games against the reigning CIAA Champion (Virginia Union) and the reigning NCAA Division II Champion (Ferris State).
- » Duke beat Virginia Union, 106-64, and Ferris State, 132-48.
- » On the Duke Canada Tour in August -- the fifth foreign tour in the Coach K era -- Duke defeated three Canadian colleges in front of sold-out crowds in Toronto and Montreal.

DUKE-KENTUCKY HISTORY

- » Two of the four winningest programs in NCAA history, Duke and Kentucky have met just 21 times with the Wildcats holding a 12-9 series lead.
- » The recent history has favored the Blue Devils, with Duke winning seven of the last nine.
- » In the Champions Classic, the teams have split a pair of meetings -- UK winning, 74-63, in 2015 in Chicago, and Duke winning, 75-68, in Atlanta in 2012.
- » Coach K is 5-2 versus Kentucky.

DUKE IN INDIANAPOLIS

- » Duke and the city of Indianapolis have enjoyed a long and successful history as the Blue Devils are 11-2 when playing in Indiana's capital city.
- » Three of Duke's five national championships have come in Indianapolis (the other two in Minneapolis) -- 1991 at the RCA Dome and 2010 and 2015 at Lucas Oil Stadium.
- » Duke is 2-0 when playing at Bankers Life Fieldhouse, beating UCLA, 84-73, in the 2002 Wooden Tradition and Michigan State, 81-71, in the 2014 Champions Classic.

ON THIS DATE

- » November 6th marks the earliest start to a season in Duke's history. The Blue Devils have never played a game earlier than November 8th.
- » The 2013-14 season began on November 8 -- a 111-77 win over Davidson at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2018-19

- » Duke's 114th season of basketball will open with a marquee matchup as the Blue Devils and Kentucky battle in the State Farm Champions Classic in Indianapolis.
- » The game is set for Tuesday, Nov. 6 on ESPN, coinciding with the new start of the college basketball season.
- » The Blue Devils will play in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational on Thanksgiving week. It marks Duke's sixth appearance in Maui, where the Blue Devils are undefeated (16-0) with titles in 1992, 1997, 2001, 2007, and 2011.
- » This Maui field includes Duke, Arizona, Auburn, Gonzaga, Illinois, Iowa State, San Diego State, and Xavier.
- » In the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, Duke hosts Indiana on Nov. 27 at Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- » Other featured non-conference games include a Dec. 20th date with Texas Tech at Madison Square Garden, and a home game in February versus St. John's

TOUGH NON-CONFERENCE SLATE

- » Duke's non-conference schedule features four teams that reached last year's NCAA Tournament, with a potential for two more based on results in the Maui Invitational.
- » The four games against NCAA Tournament squads rank as the third-most in the nation.
- » North Carolina and Florida are each set for six against NCAA Tournament teams, while Kansas, Kentucky, Creighton, Canisius and Northeastern will play five.

SUSTAINED SUCCESS

- » Last season marked Duke's 53rd 20-win season.
- » Duke has won 20 or more games in 22 consecutive seasons, including the 2017-18 campaign.
- » The Blue Devils have recorded 30 or more wins an NCAA-record 14 times under Coach K.
- » Duke, Kansas and Gonzaga are the only programs to have won 25 or more games in each of the last 11 seasons.

PRESEASON POLL STREAK EXTENDS

- » Duke is ranked No. 4 in the preseason AP poll, which was announced on Oct. 22.
- » It marks the sixth straight year that Duke has debuted in the top five and the 11th straight season in the top 10.
- » The Blue Devils have been the preseason No. 1 team five times since 2002 (2002, 2006, 2011, 2017, 2018).
- » Duke is the only team to be ranked in every preseason poll over the last two decades, and the Blue Devils average ranking of 5.5 is also the nation's best in that time.

DUKE IN NBA ARENAS

- » For a college team that has produced the second-most current NBA players (25), Duke has been tough to beat when playing in NBA venues.
- » The Blue Devils are 78-31 (.716) in current NBA venues, which includes a 34-18 mark at Madison Square Garden.
- » Duke has won nine of its last 11 at NBA venues, including a 4-2 record last season.

DUKE AWAY FROM CAMERON

- » In the Coach K era, Duke is 245-140 (.636) in true road games and 263-75 (.778) in neutral site games, for a combined mark of 508-215 (.703) in all games outside of Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- » In ACC regular season play, Duke is 176-115 (.605) away from home under Coach K. The Blue Devils are 120-62 (.659) in ACC road games since the 1996-97 season.
- » Coach K has also won 15 road games against AP top-five teams, the most in the history of the AP poll.

THREE-POINT STREAK

- » Duke has connected on at least one three-pointer in 1,021 straight games, the third-longest streak in the nation.
- » Kentucky held the top spot previously, before their streak of 1,047 games was snapped late last season.
- » The last time Duke was held without a three-point field goal was Dec. 30, 1989 versus Hawaii.

DUKE VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- » Duke is 222-146 (.603) vs. ranked teams under Coach K, with a 142-73 (.669) mark since the 1996-97 season.
- » The Blue Devils were 6-4 versus ranked teams in 2017-18.
- » Duke is 82-47 (.636) against ranked ACC teams and 60-26 (.698) vs. ranked non-league foes since 1996-97.
- » The Blue Devils are 79-57 (.581) overall under Coach K when both teams are ranked in the top 10 -- Duke has won 48 of its past 75 top-10 matchups.
- » Duke is 28-15 (.651) under Coach K when both teams are ranked in the top five.

ACC PRESEASON HONORS

- » For the third consecutive year, Duke topped the ACC's preseason media poll, receiving 52 of 121 first-place votes.
- » Virginia (47 first-place votes) placed second in the predicted order of finish, followed by North Carolina (20), Syracuse (one), Virginia Tech, Clemson (one) and Florida State among the top seven.
- » Freshman **RJ Barrett** was voted the ACC's preseason Freshman of the Year. The top three vote-getters for ACC Freshman of the Year were Blue Devils -- Barrett (66 votes), **Zion Williamson** (43) and **Cam Reddish** (4).
- » Barrett (first team) and Williamson (second team), were each selected to the preseason All-ACC squad.
- » Duke was picked as the ACC preseason favorite for the 18th time in the 50-year history of the poll and the 17th time under Coach K.

- » Duke's freshman class of **RJ Barrett**, **Tre Jones**, **Cam Reddish**, **Zion Williamson** and **Joey Baker** enter the program as the nation's No. 1 class.
- » Barrett, a native of Mississauga, Ontario, is the class' overall No. 1 prospect, followed by No. 2 Williamson, No. 3 Reddish and No. 10 Jones.
- » It is the third consecutive season that Duke has landed ESPN's No. 1-ranked recruit, as Barrett's signing followed **Marvin Bagley III** in 2017 and **Harry Giles** in 2016.
- » The top four were each rated as five-star recruits and each was a McDonald's All-American. Baker was a four-star prospect in the 2019 class.

FRESHMEN STARTERS

- » Along with junior **Marques Bolden**, Duke started four freshmen -- **RJ Barrett**, **Tre Jones**, **Cam Reddish**, and **Zion Williamson** -- in its two exhibition games against Virginia Union and Ferris State.
- » If that starting lineup holds for the regular season opener against Kentucky, it would mark the second straight season, and just third for Coach K since the 1982-83 season, that Duke would start four freshmen.
- » Last season's four were **Marvin Bagley III**, **Wendell Carter Jr.**, **Trevon Duval** and **Gary Trent Jr.**. It was **Johnny Dawkins**, **Mark Alarie**, **Jay Bilas** and **David Henderson** starting 23 times together in 1982-83.
- » Of Coach K's 1,306 games as Duke's coach, only 53 times have four freshmen started together (30 in 2017-18) and in only 97 games have three or more freshmen started.

» DUKE IN THE NBA [25]*



- » A total of 75 former Duke players have appeared on NBA rosters.
- » Overall, 38 Duke players have been selected in the first round of the NBA Draft in the Coach K era, including 20 in the past eight years.
- » The 25 Duke players on current NBA rosters are the most by any ACC school in a single season in the history of the league.
- » Three Duke players have been selected No. 1 in the NBA Draft -- **Art Heyman** (1963), **Elton Brand** (1999) and **Kyrie Irving** (2011).
- » In 2018, Duke had four players drafted, bringing its total to 61 under **Mike Krzyzewski**.
- » Duke has had 25 players selected in the NBA Draft Lottery, the most in the nation since the system was put into place in 1985.
- » Overall, between Duke and USA Basketball, Coach K has coached 103 NBA players -- 54 of whom are active.
- » In 1999, Duke became the first program in the history of the NBA Draft to have four players from the same school selected in the first round. Three of the four -- **Elton Brand** (Chicago), **Trajan Langdon** (Cleveland) and **Corey Maggette** (Seattle) -- were lottery picks.
- » In 2002, **Jason Williams** (2nd overall) and **Mike Dunleavy** (3rd) became the first college teammates in the history of the NBA Draft to be the first two collegians selected.
- » Five former Duke players -- **Jeff Mullins** (Golden State, 1975), **Danny Ferry** (San Antonio, 2003), **Shane Battier** (Miami, 2012 and 2013), **Kyrie Irving** (Cleveland, 2016) and **Dahntay Jones** (Cleveland, 2016) -- have been part of NBA championship teams.
- » Duke players who've played under Coach K have earned approximately \$1.37 billion in NBA contracts. That figure includes roughly \$150 million by active Duke NBA players.

THE DUKE EFFECT

- » Duke's home win over North Carolina last season was the most-watched college basketball game of the regular season, drawing nearly 3.4 million viewers on ESPN.
- » For the regular season, Duke played in three of the four most-watched games, four of the top seven and seven of the top 20.
- » Duke was in an NCAA-leading 21 regular-season games with at least one million viewers last season.
- » In the postseason, the Duke/Kansas game in the Elite Eight was the highest-rated Elite Eight game since 2005 (9.2 rating, 15.44 million viewers). That overtime thriller drew a higher TV rating than every non-Finals NBA game since 2002, while also topping every MLB telecast, excluding the World Series, since 2009. Viewership of Duke/Kansas peaked at 24.9 million -- highest of any NCAA Tournament game in 2018 (including the national title game).
- » Duke played 11 road games in 2017-18, and the attendance at each of those games was that team's largest crowd of the season and surpassed that team's season average.
- » Nine of the games, including 19,812 at Madison Square Garden versus St. John's, were capacity crowds.

DUKE TIES SCHOOL'S DRAFT RECORD

- » Duke matched a program record with four selections during the 2018 NBA Draft, including two of the top seven picks and three first-round selections.
- » Freshman **Marvin Bagley III** went second overall to Sacramento, classmate **Wendell Carter Jr.**, went seventh to Chicago, senior **Grayson Allen** was the 21st pick by Utah, and freshman **Gary Trent Jr.**, went in the second round to Portland.
- » The Blue Devils now boast 44 all-time first-round picks - the third-best total in history.
- » Bagley and Carter in the lottery gave head coach **Mike Krzyzewski** 25 lottery selections - extending the record for most lottery picks for a school and coach. Duke has boasted a top-three pick in each of the last five NBA Drafts, surpassing the record of four straight by UCLA between 1974 and 1977.
- » Going undrafted, but showing well in the NBA Combine and the NBA Summer League for Houston, Duval inked a two-way contract with Milwaukee.
- » Duke has 25 former players on active NBA rosters -- the most of any team in a single season in the history of the ACC.

- » Senior **Brennan Besser** completed a 3,500-mile bike trip from Seattle to New York City in late July as he looks to raise \$1 million for Walk On America.
- » Besser founded the Walk On America campaign to raise money and awareness of the Intellectual and Developmental Disability (IDD) community. Brennan and his sister Rachel were compelled to action by the challenges faced every day by their sister Jacqueline, who is non-verbal.
- » Nearly \$350,000 has been raised thus far as Besser rolled into New York City in August to complete his 3,553-mile, 64-day trek. He stopped at nearly 50 cities, meeting fans and conducting basketball clinics over his two-month adventure from coast to coast.

Now in his 39th season at Duke, Mike Krzyzewski - a Naismith Hall of Fame coach, five-time national champion and 12-time Final Four participant - has built a dynasty that few programs in the history of the game can match.

The numbers that illustrate Coach K's career are simply staggering:

- Five national championships (1991, 1992, 2001, 2010, 2015)
- Six gold medals as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team
- Eight National Players of the Year (10 honors)
- Six National Defensive Players of the Year (nine honors)
- 10 consecutive top-10 AP poll finishes (1997-06)
- 12 National Coach of the Year honors (eight seasons)
- 12 Final Four appearances (tied for most in NCAA history)
- 12 ACC regular season championships
- 14 ACC Tournament championships (most in league history)
- 25 NBA Lottery picks (most in Draft history)
- 32 All-America selections (46 honors)
- 34 NCAA Tournament bids (most by one coach)
- 61 NBA Draft selections, including 38 first-round picks
- 62 ACC Tournament wins (most in league history)
- 94 NCAA Tournament wins (most in NCAA history)
- 116 weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 474 ACC wins (most in league history)
- 515 weeks ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)

Coach K became the Division I men's career wins leader on Nov. 15, 2011, at Madison Square Garden, moving past his former coach Bob Knight with his 903rd victory. His historic 1,000th career victory came against St. John's at The World's Most Famous Arena on Jan. 25, 2015, as he became the first Division I men's basketball coach to achieve a four-figure win total.

Krzyzewski's 1,027 victories at Duke are an NCAA record by a coach at one school. With 1,027 of the Blue Devils' 2,144 all-time victories, Coach K has presided over nearly half (48 percent) of the men's basketball wins in Duke history.

Krzyzewski has won a league-record 474 ACC games (regular season and tournament), passing former North Carolina head coach Dean Smith (422) on Feb. 4, 2015. He has also won an ACC-record 176 conference road games.

Coach K's five national championships are the second-most in NCAA history. Krzyzewski and former Connecticut coach Jim Calhoun are the only coaches in NCAA history to win national championships in three different decades.

Coach K has led the Blue Devils into the NCAA Tournament 34 times - more than any other coach in NCAA history. He has taken Duke to the NCAA Tournament in each of the last 23 seasons, the longest active streak by a coach and tied for the longest in NCAA history (Dean Smith, 23).

Krzyzewski holds NCAA Tournament records for games coached (123) and wins (94) while ranking second all-time and leading active coaches with a .764 NCAA Tournament winning percentage (min. 20 games). He has reached the Sweet 16 on 24 occasions, five more than any other coach in NCAA history, and has advanced to the Elite Eight 15 times.

Of the 1,306 games Krzyzewski has coached at Duke, 1,161 - 88.6 percent - have been as a ranked team. The Blue Devils are 946-215 (.815) as a ranked team under Coach K.

Coach K has taken top-ranked Duke teams into games on 235 occasions and compiled a 205-30 (.872) record as the AP's No. 1 team, ranking first in poll history in number of games and second in wins as coach of a top-ranked squad.

Krzyzewski has tutored 61 NBA Draft picks during his time at Duke, including a total of 38 first-round selections that leads all active coaches. Duke has had at least one player taken in 31 of the 38 NBA Drafts during the Krzyzewski Era.

Since the inception of the NBA Draft Lottery in 1985, Coach K and Duke have produced 25 lottery picks - a draft-record total for both a school and a coach.

Through the 2017-18 season, Coach K's former Duke players have accumulated \$1.37 billion in NBA salaries. Lottery selections who played for Krzyzewski at Duke have combined to earn approximately \$950 million, an average of just over \$45 million per individual.

Under Coach K's watch, Duke has produced multiple All-ACC Academic selections in 11 consecutive years. The 2015 NCAA championship team featured a program-high five All-ACC Academic honorees. Quin Snyder, Amile Jefferson and Grayson Allen are the only players in Duke history to earn All-ACC Academic honors four times. Jefferson, a three-time captain, departed the university in 2017 with both bachelor's and master's degrees.

Krzyzewski has had six players collect a total of nine CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, headlined by two-time first-team honorees Battier (2000, 2001) and Mason Plumlee (2012, 2013). Allen became the sixth in 2016 when he garnered second-team accolades.

Fittingly, Coach K has earned nearly every award imaginable. The crown jewel of that haul, however, came in 2001 when he was inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

Since his enshrinement in Springfield, Mass., Krzyzewski has also been inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame (2009), the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame (2010) and the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame (2011).

While establishing Duke as one of college basketball's dynastic programs, Krzyzewski simultaneously spent more than a decade as one of the architects of the revitalization of USA Basketball. During his tenure at the helm of the program, the U.S. National Team amassed an extraordinary 88-1 record and claimed gold medals at the 2007 FIBA Americas Championship, 2008 Beijing Olympics, 2010 FIBA World Championship, 2012 London Olympics, 2014 FIBA World Cup and 2016 Rio Olympics, as well as a bronze medal at the 2006 FIBA World Championship.

Coach K was 24-0 in the Olympics as head coach of the USMNT and his time at the helm ended with the team in the midst of a National Team-record 76-game winning streak that began in 2006.

Giving Back

Krzyzewski has been diligently committed to public service, both locally and nationally, throughout his coaching career. He is currently serving on boards for, while also assuming vital roles with, the Duke Children's Hospital, the Jimmy V Foundation for Cancer Research, the NABC Foundation, the CEO Roundtable on Cancer and the Emily Krzyzewski Center.

Coach K's philanthropic activities also include the establishment and funding of the Emily Krzyzewski Center, a community center in Durham named in honor of his late mother. The Center's mission is to inspire economically disadvantaged students to dream big, act with character and purpose, strive for academic excellence and reach their highest potential as future citizen leaders.

In May 2018, Coach K and his wife Mickie announced their single-largest philanthropic gift, a \$3 million donation to the Emily K Center to kick start a \$15 million fundraising campaign for the Durham-based Center.
