

KEY STORYLINES

TENNESSEE HOSTS KENTUCKY AT NEYLAND STADIUM

- · VOLS WELCOME 'CATS: Tennessee will host Kentucky in the 114th meeting in the series. The Vols have played the Wildcats more than any other opponent and their 79 wins are the most versus any team. UT holds a 79-25-9 record overall against UK, including a 42-10-6 mark at home. The Vols have won 16 straight in Neyland Stadium over the Wildcats, dating back to 1984. UT has won 31 of the last 33 games overall in the series.
- SIMILAR STARTS: Jeremy Pruitt and Mark Stoops were both top defensive coordinators before being hired for their first head coaching jobs at SEC East schools. In fact, after Kentucky hired Stoops in 2013, Florida State tabbed Pruitt to replace Stoops as defensive coordinator and he helped lead FSU to the national championship that season.
- · VOLS ALL-TIME: Tennessee has an all-time record of 837-388-53, which ranks 10th all-time in wins among NCAA Division I programs. The Vols hold an all-time record of 466-130-17 at Neyland Stadium, boasting the secondmost wins of any school at a current stadium.
- SALUTE TO SERVICE: The Vols will honor military members for its annual Salute to Service game on Saturday. Planned moments during the game include a half-time performance by the Marine Drill Team, veteran Jim Cundall being honored as the Volunteer of the Game and a recognition of Gold Star families pregame.

LAST TIME OUT...

· VOLS DEFEAT 49ERS, 14-3: Stifling defense and an 82yard punt return TD by junior WR Marquez Callaway led UT past Charlotte, 14-3. Redshirt sophomore QB Jarrett Guarantano completed 16-of-21 passes for 172 yards and one TD to sophomore **Josh Palmer**.

- Freshman CB Bryce Thompson had his team-leading third interception and recorded his first-career sack. Thompson is the first Vol freshman to record three interceptions in a season since Eric Berry in 2007. He is tied for second in the SEC in interceptions.
- UT won its 30th straight home game against a non-Power 5 opponent and its 11th consecutive game against a non-conference opponent at Neyland Stadium.

RECENT GAMES VS. KENTUCKY

- FOUR FORCED FUMBLES NOT ENOUGH: Despite forcing and recovering four fumbles, the Vols fell to Kentucky, 29-26, in Lexington in 2017. RB Ty Chandler rushed for 120 yards and two TDs, while PK Brent Cimaglia made four
- DOBBS LEADS IN NEYLAND: The last time Kentucky traveled to Neyland Stadium, the Vols captured a 49-36 win on Nov. 12, 2016 behind five total TDs from QB Joshua Dobbs and 599 yards of total offense, including 416 rushing yards.

GUARANTANO'S ACCURACY RANKS HIGH

- QB Jarrett Guarantano has completed 128 of 195 passes (65.6%) for 1,571 yards and nine touchdowns this season. His completion percentage ranks fourth in the SEC.
- Guarantano's career 64.1 completion percentage is No. 1 in UT history (No. 2 is Darryl Dickey - 63.0, No. 3 Peyton Manning - 62.5) and his 1.20 interception percentage also ranks first (No. 2 Dickey - 1.23). He hasn't thrown and interception in his last 126 pass attempts.
- Guarantano has 7 TDs, 0 INTs and is averaging 192.5 yards per game on 67.6% passing the last four games (vs. Charlotte, at South Carolina, vs. No. 1 Alabama, at No. 21 Auburn).

BY THE NUMBERS

With a 10-yard TD catch vs. No. 1 Alabama, Ty Chandler became the first UT running back to ever have a receiving TD in three straight games.

UT has thrown only two interceptions this season the lowest of any Power 5 team. Only Georgia Southern (0) and North Texas (1) have less among FBS teams.

Junior **LB Daniel Bituli** leads the Vols with 57 total stops this season. He led the Vols with 90 tackles in 2017.

UT is one pace to set a school record for punt return defense. The Vols have allowed one yard on seven punts for a 0.14 average that ranks third in the nation.

No. 12 Kentucky will be the sixth opponent in 10 games the Vols have faced that has been ranked or is currently ranked, joining No. 1 Alabama, No. 5 Georgia, No. 7 West Virginia, No. 19 Florida, and Auburn, who was No. 21 when game was played.

Tennessee Edged by Kentucky, 29-26

LEXINGTON, Ky. -- Tennessee came out strong against Kentucky as the Volunteers forced four fumbles in the game and rushed for a season-high 155 yards in the first half on Saturday, but the Wildcats held on for a 29-26 final at Kroger Field. Tennessee (3-5, 0-5 SEC) now holds a 79-25-9 all-time record against Kentucky

(6-2, 3-2 SEC), including a 37-15-3 record in Lexington.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Jarrett Guarantano completed 18 of 23 passes for a career-high 242 yards in a contest that turned into a battle between two young running back corps. Tennessee's duo of freshman Ty Chandler and sophomore Carlin Fils-aime combined for 193 yards and two touchdowns while Kentucky sophomore Benny Snell ran for 180 yards and three touchdowns.

The Vols' defense opened Saturday's game with a forced fumble on the Wildcats' first drive. Redshirt senior defensive lineman Kendal Vickers stripped the ball from UK's Snell on a rush and sophomore defensive back Nigel Warrior recovered it at Kentucky's 15-yard line. The play set up freshman kicker Brent Cimaglia's first field goal of the night that put the Vols up, 3-0.

Kentucky then used a three-minute, 60-yard drive to score the first touchdown of the game before Cimaglia made a 24-yarder to pull UT within one point.

To start the second quarter, the Wildcats capped a five-play sequence with a two-yard rushing touchdown, taking a 14-6 advantage.

With 11:15 left in the second, Tennessee marched 75 yards down the field, gaining 11 yards or more on four plays, before Chandler ran the ball into the end zone to trim UK's lead to 14-13.

After Kentucky extended its lead to 21-13 on a rushing touchdown by Snell, the Vols made it a one-point game with 1:14 left in the half. UT put together a 10-play, 71-yard drive that ended with Chandler's second touchdown of the night.

Redshirt junior defensive back Rashaan Gaulden then forced Tennessee's third fumble which was recovered by senior linebacker Evan Berry in the third. The turnover led to a 30-yard field goal by Cimaglia and gave UT a 23-21 lead.

To start the fourth quarter, Cimaglia hit a 45-yard field goal after Vickers forced his second fumble of the night to put the Vols up, 26-21.

Kentucky rallied back with 4:43 left, scoring the final touchdown of the game with 0:33 seconds on the clock. The Wildcats opted for a two-point conversion, successfully completing a pass from quarterback Stephen Johnson to Snell for the 29-26 final.

Tennessee attempted a final drive as the clock wound down, moving the ball 72 yards down the field to the UK three-yard line. On the final play, Guarantano connected with redshirt senior wide receiver Jeff George for 48 yards.

NOTING THE VOLS

VOLS TAKE ON RANKED KENTUCKY TEAM

- · Kentucky enters this Saturday's contest ranked No. 12 in both the AP Poll and Coaches' Poll.
- · Saturday's game marks the first time that Tennessee will face a ranked Kentucky team since 1977. The No. 7 Wildcats defeated the unranked Vols that season, 21-17.
- Tennessee is 3-2 all-time against ranked Kentucky squads (1949, 1950, 1951, 1953, 1977).

UT-UK SERIES TRENDS

- Tennessee is looking to claim its 17th straight win over Kentucky in Knoxville. The Wildcats haven't won in Neyland Stadium since 1984.
- The Vols have won 31 of the past 33 overall meetings with Kentucky.
- · Tennessee has played Kentucky more than any other opponent. The 2018 matchup between the Vols and Wildcats will be the 114th between the two program. The first meeting came in 1893.
- · Tennessee's 79 wins against Kentucky are its most against any school.

VOLS ON PACE TO SET SCHOOL RECORD IN PUNT RETURN DEFENSE

- · Through nine games, Tennessee is on pace to set a new school record in punt return defense. The Vols have allowed a total of one punt return yard on seven punts returned this season, good for an average of 0.14 yards.
- · The current record is an average of 3.67 yards, set in 2004
- Vols punter Joe Doyle has been a large part of the team's punt return coverage success. Of Dovle's 45 punts this season, 17 have resulted in fair catches and 19 have been pinned inside the 20-yard line (which ranks second in the SEC).

THOMPSON SNAGS THIRD INT

- · Defensive back Bryce Thompson's fourth quarter interception against Charlotte was the true freshman's third interception of the season. Thompson also picked off a passes in Tennessee's wins over ETSU and Auburn.
- Thompson's three picks are the most by a freshman
- · Thompson's three interceptions are the most by a Tennessee true freshman since Eric Berry had five in
- · Thompson is one of five Vols with an interception this season. The Irmo, S.C. native has 26 tackles this year and also has four TFLs and a team-leading three pass breakups.

PHILLIPS SHINES AGAINST CHARLOTTE

- Tennessee senior defensive end Kyle Phillips led the Vols' defense with a career-best-tying two tackles for loss, including one sack, and a career-high two pass breakups.
- · For the season, Phillips has now set new career highs in tackles (37), sacks (3.0) and TFLs (5.0), surpassing his previous bests from the 2017 season of 35 tackles, two sacks and 4.5 TFLs.
- · Phillips has recorded a sack in two straight games and has posted TFLs in three of the last four.
- · The Nashville native also made his first-career interception two weeks ago vs. Alabama and returned it 27 yards for a touchdown.

NO TOUCHDOWNS FOR YOU

- · Tennessee has held three opponents this season without a touchdown, marking the first time since 2008 that the Vols have accomplished that feat.
- This season, the Vols defense has held ETSU, UTEP and Charlotte to three points or less, the first time that a UT defense has done that since 2002.

VOLS IMPROVE ON INT TOTALS

- Through the first nine games of the 2018 season, Tennessee has tallied seven interceptions, eclipsing 2017's season total of five.
- Tennessee's seven interceptions this season have come from five different players. True freshman Bryce Thompson is the team's lone defender with more than one interception to his credit for the season (three)
- Thompson is the first Tennessee player with three INTs in a season since Todd Kelly Jr. had three in 2015.

HOUSE CALL FOR CALLAWAY

- Marquez Callaway's 82-yard punt return touchdown in the first guarter of the team's win over Charlotte (11/3) was Tennessee's first true punt return score since Nov. 5, 2016, when Callaway registered a 62yard touchdown return against Tennessee Tech.
- Callaway's 82-yard return is tied for the 12th longest punt return in Tennessee history, and the longest since **Cameron Sutton** had an 85-yard touchdown return on Nov. 28, 2015, against Vanderbilt.
- Callaway's score made the Charlotte game the fourth game this season (also ETSU, Auburn, Alabama) that Tennessee has had a non-offensive touchdown.

VOLS START TRUE FRESHMAN CORNERBACK DUO

- Bryce Thompson and Alontae Taylor are the only true freshman cornerback duo in the SEC to start a game together this season.
- Thompson (seven starts) and Taylor (six starts) have started four games together during the 2018 season.
- Thompson and Taylor are joined by Patrick Surtain II (Alabama; six starts), Christian Tuitt (Auburn; one start), Trey Dean (Florida; five starts), Tyson Campbell (Georgia; nine starts) and Jaycee Horn (South Carolina; seven starts) as the only true freshman cornerbacks to record a start this season in the SEC.

PRUITT FOLLOWED STOOPS AT FSU

- · Prior to taking the head coaching job at Kentucky, Mark Stoops served as the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach at Florida State from
- When Stoops left FSU for Kentucky after the 2012 season, Jeremy Pruitt was tabbed as the new defensive coordinator in Tallahassee. In Pruitt's first season, the Seminoles won the national championship.

TUTTLE TALLIES FIRST INT & BLOCKS KICK AGAINST GAMECOCKS

- · Senior defensive tackle Shy Tuttle tallied his firstcareer interception in the first quarter against South Carolina, pulling in a Jake Bentley pass that was tipped by junior linebacker Daniel Bituli.
- It was the sixth interception of the season for the Vols and second straight week a defensive lineman had an interception after fellow senior Kyle Phillips had a pick-six versus Alabama.
- Tuttle continued to make his presence known in the first quarter by blocking an extra point. It was the first blocked extra point for UT since Nov. 11, 2017 at Missouri when Nigel Warrior blocked a PAT.

YOUNGSTERS ON OFFENSE

- Tennessee has one of the youngest offenses in the entire country.
- The Vols are the only team in the FBS to not have a single senior start at any position on offense this season.
- UT and Auburn are the only two teams in the SEC that have not had a senior start a game on the offensive line this season.

WR JOSH PALMER

Sophomore wide receiver **Josh Palmer** had a game-high 71 receiving yards on four catches including one touchdown in the Vols' 14-3 victory over Charlotte last Saturday.



NOTING THE VOLS

VERSATILE CHANDLER MAKES HISTORY

- With his 10-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter vs. Alabama, Ty Chandler became the first Tennessee running back to ever have a touchdown reception in three consecutive games.
- Chandler had a 35-yard catch and run for a score at No. 2 Georgia on Sept. 29 and a 42-yard touchdown reception at No. 21 Auburn on Oct. 13.
- On the season, Chandler has 19 catches for 183 yards and three touchdowns. Only Virginia's Olamide Zaccheaus has more receiving TDs (6) among FBS running backs this season.

CALLAWAY SETS NEW CAREER-HIGH

- Junior wide receiver Marquez Callaway recorded a new career high with nine receptions against South Carolina for 86 yards on Oct. 27.
- That total broke Callaway's previous career best of six catches, which he achieved versus West Virginia in the season opener on Sept. 1 in Charlotte.
- Callaway had an 82-yard punt return for a touchdown against Charlotte on Nov. 3, which was a career-long.
- Callaway leads the team in catches (30) and is second on the team in receiving yards (402) through nine games.
- He also had five receptions for 78 yards, including a career-long 51-yard reception, against ETSU (9/8).
- The Warner Robins, Ga., native led the Vols in receiving yards (406) and receiving touchdowns (five) in 2017, while ranking third in receptions with 24.

QB1: GUARANTANO CONTINUES TO IMPROVE & LEAD VOLS' OFFENSE

- Tennessee QB Jarrett Guarantano has continued to show improvement with each passing start for the Vols.
- The redshirt sophomore currently ranks fourth among SEC starting QBs in passing efficiency (146.5) and also ranks fourth in the league in completion percentage (65.6%).
- Guarantano finished 27-of-39 for 207 yards and tied a career-high with two touchdown passes at South Carolina (10/27).
- Guarantano has been especially effective when it comes to protecting the football. He has not thrown an interception in 15 of his 18 games played and has thrown just four total INTs during his career (15 starts). UT has not committed a turnover in eight of Guarantano's 15 career starts.

CIMAGLIA FOR THREE

- Sophomore kicker **Brent Cimaglia** drilled a 45-yard field goal to put the Vols ahead 24-16 late in the third quarter against South Carolina. The kick tied Cimaglia's season-long kick (45 at Auburn) and tied for the second longest of his career (career-best 51 at Florida in 2017).
- Through nine games Cimaglia is 8-for-11 on field goals, including 4-for-6 on kicks of 40+ yards this season. Cimaglia is also 25-for-25 on extra points for the year.

VOLS' OFFENSE SHOWING BIG-PLAY ABILITY

- Through nine games this season, Tennessee has had 38 offensive plays go for 20-plus yards. UT has just 38 20-plus yard offensive plays all of last season.
- Last season, the Vols converted just four plays of at least 50 yards. This season, UT already has six plays of such yardage.
- UT had a 51-yard pass from **Jarrett Guarantano** to TE **Austin Pope** in the second quarter vs. Florida.
- The Big Orange had two plays with more than 50 yards against UTEP -- highlighted by an 81-yard rushing touchdown by Ty Chandler in the third

- quarter. The rush marked the longest since 2006, when **LaMarcus Coker** had an 87-yard rushing touchdown against Vanderbilt.
- Against ETSU, UT connected on three passes of at least 50 yards, covering distances of 50 yards and a pair that went for 51 each.
- Josh Palmer has reeled in two catches this season that have gone for more than 50 yards, including a career-long 53-yard reception against UTEP.

RECEIVING CORPS STEPPING UP

- Tennessee's group of wide receivers is starting to emerge as one of the deeper units on the team.
- Fifteen different players have caught a pass, while Marquez Callaway, Josh Palmer and Dominick Wood-Anderson all caught multiple passes for the Vols against Charlotte last Saturday.
- Palmer finished with a game-high 71-yards on four receptions against the 49ers.
- Tennessee has six players with 100 receiving yards or more this season.
- Palmer leads the team with 414 yards and is averaging an incredible 23.0 yards per catch.
- Callaway leads the team in receptions with 30 and ranks second in average yards per game with 44.7.
- Ty Chandler and Jauan Jennings currently lead the team with three touchdown catches.

JENNINGS RESURGENCE CONTINUES

- Wide receiver **Jauan Jennings** continued his resurgent year with his third touchdown catch of the season at South Carolina (10/27).
- Jennings has caught 26 passes for 335 yards and three touchdowns for the Vols, with 10 of those receptions resulting in first downs or touchdowns.
- The redshirt junior wideout had a career-hightying six catches for 102 yards against top-ranked Alabama on Oct. 20.
- The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native was the first receiver to go for more than 100 yards against the Crimson Tide defense since Auburn's Ryan Davis had 139 yards on Nov. 25, 2017.
- Jennings' 102 receiving yards also marked a seasonhigh for the redshirt junior and gave Tennessee its first 100-yard receiving game of the season.
- Jennings was named to the PFF College SEC Offensive Team of the Week for the second consecutive week after his performance against the Crimson Tide.

UT DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS

- At the 5:17 mark in the third quarter, senior defensive end Kyle Phillips picked off a pass from Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts and returned it 27 yards for a touchdown, marking the second-consecutive game the Volunteer defense has scored a touchdown.
- Three weeks ago, Alontae Taylor recovered a fumble in the end zone at Auburn for a score. Phillips was responsible for forcing that fumble.
- This marks the first time since 2007 that Tennessee has scored a defensive touchdown in back-to-back games. That year, *Antonio Reynolds* returned an interception 70 yards for a touchdown against Louisiana-Lafayette on Nov. 3, and *Jerod Mayo* had a 34-yard interception return for a score against Arkansas on Nov. 10.
- UT now has three defensive touchdowns on the season. The other one came on a 33-yard interception return by Darrin Kirkland Jr. against ETSU on Sept. 8.
- Phillips' interception return for a touchdown also marked the first time that a team returned an interception for a score against Alabama since Oct. 21, 2017 – when Vols linebacker Daniel Bituli recorded a 97-yard pick six.

- Tennessee redshirt sophomore QB Jarrett Guarantano is having a career year so far this season.
- The New Jersey native has already set career highs in passing yards (1,571) and passing touchdowns (nine) and ranks fourth in the SEC with a 65.6 percent completion percentage.
- The Vols' signal caller is one of the best in the SEC at protecting the football, having thrown just four interceptions in 18 career games.



NOTING THE VOLS

FULMER PART OF SEC LEGENDS CLASS

- Tennessee Director of Athletics Phillip Fulmer was announced as part of the 2018 AT&T SEC Football Legends class
- The class, an assemblage of former football standouts, will be honored at events surrounding the SEC Football Championship Game in Atlanta in December.
- Fulmer served as head coach of the Tennessee Volunteers from 1992 to 2008, compiling a 152-52 record while leading the Vols to the 1998 BCS National Championship.
- Tennessee's 20th head coach, Fulmer is the second winningest football coach in Tennessee history and the third UT coach to capture a national title.
- Fulmer's 1997 and 1998 teams won consecutive SEC Championships, and Tennessee racked up a fouryear record of 45-5 from 1995-98.
- The 2018 Football Legends Class includes 14 former stars who excelled on the gridiron and helped write the rich history of the sport at their respective institutions. This year's class includes All-Americans, All-SEC selections and Academic All-Americans. The group represents teams that won National and SEC Championships and are represented in state, school and college football halls of fame.

TRUE FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTIONS

- Through nine games, four true freshmen have started for Tennessee -- three of them in the defensive backfield
- Bryce Thompson (cornerback) and Alontae Taylor (cornerback) both started in the secondary for the Vols in their first true SEC road games against then No. 2 Georgia on Sept. 29.
- Trevon Flowers (safety) and Taylor (cornerback) both started in the season-opener against No. 17 West Virginia, while Jerome Carvin (right guard) and Thompson (cornerback) got the start against ETSU.
- 12 true freshmen have played through nine games for the Vols: Jeremy Banks, Paxton Brooks, Jerome Carvin, Kurott Garland, Greg Emerson, Trevon Flowers, Kingston Harris, John Mincey, J.J. Peterson, Alontae Taylor, Cedric Tillman and Bryce Thompson.

VOLS DEFENSE STEPS UP IN SECOND QUARTER AGAINST ALABAMA

- The Volunteer defense stepped up in the second quarter, forcing the Crimson Tide offense into back-toback three-and-outs and a punt to begin the period.
- The back-to-back three-and-outs were the first the Tide had suffered with quarterback Tua Tagovailoa running the offense this season. It was also just the third time this season the Tide had been forced to a three-and-out on back-to-back drives.
- UT forced Alabama to punt twice on Saturday. The Crimson Tide had punted just one time over the course of its previous three games (vs. Missouri).

FRESHMEN STEPPING UP ON DEFENSE

- Tennessee's freshmen on the defensive side of the ball have made their presence known to everyone.
- Defensive backs Alontae Taylor, Bryce Thompson and Trevon Flowers have combined for 62 total tackles, six pass breakups, three forced fumbles, three interceptions and a touchdown through nine games this season.
- Taylor leads all freshmen on defense with 27 tackles and two forced fumbles

GUARANTANO SHINES AT AUBURN

 Jarrett Guarantano had the best game of his Tennessee career on Oct. 13 leading the Vols to a 30-24 upset victory over No. 21 Auburn on the Plains.

- The Lodi, N.J., native set career highs in passing yards (328), passing touchdowns (two), completions (21) and attempts (32).
- Guarantano was also incredibly efficient on third down, completing 11-of-14 passes, including going 8-of-8 on third-and-8 or longer.
- Thanks to his clutch performance on the Plains, Guarantano has racked up numerous honors that week, being named the Maxwel Award National Player of the Week, SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week and earning a spot on the PFF College National Team of the Week, among others. (See sidebar on Page 6)

JOE DOYLE RULES

- Redshirt freshman punter **Joe Doyle** has had an impressive debut season through eight games. Doyle is a product of Knoxville's Farragut High School.
- So far this season, Doyle has placed 17 punts inside the 20-yard line (second in the SEC) while also registering 10 punts of 50 yards or more.
- Against South Carolina, Doyle had two punts for 102 yards for a 51.0 average, including a 54-yard boot. He placed both punts inside the 20.
- Doyle had six punts for 228 yards against No. 1 Alabama to average 38.0 yards per punt.
- In UT's win at No. 21 Auburn, Doyle placed three of his four punts inside the 20, including a 64-yarder that was downed at the Tigers' 2-yard line in the second quarter.
- Against Georgia, Doyle booted a career-long 71-yarder to end Tennessee's second drive of the first quarter. The punt is the longest by a Volunteer since *Trevor Daniel* produced a 72-yard punt against South Carolina on Oct. 14, 2017.
- Doyle finished the game against Georgia with a 47.1 yard punting average, marking a career-best. His previous career-high of 45.7 was set vs. ETSU in the 2018 home opener at Neyland.
- Doyle's 71-yard punt against the Bulldogs ranks as the 10th-longest in the country and second-longest in the SEC this season.

KIRKLAND RETURNING TO FORM

- After missing the entire 2017 season due to injury, linebacker **Darrin Kirkland Jr.** ranks third on the team in tackles through nine games of the 2018 season.
- Kirkland Jr. has registered 38 stops along with one sack, one pass breakup and one interception so far this season, showing the talent that earned him Freshman All-SEC honors in 2015.
- The redshirt junior from Indianapolis had a career-high 10 stops against No. 17 West Virginia in the season opener, recorded his first-career touchdown with a pick six against ETSU, and then had his fifth-career sack against UTEP in Week 3.

TAYLOR HAS BREAKOUT GAME VS. UGA

- Redshirt junior linebacker Darrell Taylor put together one of his best performances as a Vol during Tennessee's game at No. 2 Georgia on Sept. 29.
- Taylor racked up three sacks over the course of the game -- the most by a Tennessee defender in a single game since former Vol and current Philadelphia Eagles defensive end **Derek Barnett** also had three at South Carolina on Oct. 29, 2016.
- The Virginia native also forced two fumbles in the loss to the Bulldogs and now has amassed four forced fumbles over his career.
- For the season, Taylor has registered 17 tackles and a team-leading three sacks and two forced fumbles.

VOLS WITH NFL DADS

- Six players on Tennessee's current roster have fathers who have either played or coaches in the National Football League:
- LB Dillon Bates: Father, Bill Bates, played in the NFL for the Dallas Cowboys for 15 seasons from 1983-97, winning three Super Bowl titles.
- DL Kivon Bennett: Father, Cornelius Bennett, was the No. 2 overall pick in the 1987 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts. He was a 3-time All-Pro, 2-time AFC Defensive Player of the Year (1988 & 1991) and played in five Super Bowls over his 14-year career.
- DB Baylen Buchanan: Father, Ray Buchanan, played in the NFL from 1993-2004 with the Indianapolis Colts, Atlanta Falcons and Oakland Raiders. He was a 2-time All-Pro (1994 & 1998).
- QB Keller Chryst: Father, George Chryst, is currently the tight ends coach for the Denver Broncos and had also had coaching stops in Chicago, Arizona, San Diego. Carolina and San Francisco.
- DB Todd Kelly Jr.: Father, Todd Kelly Sr., played a combined four seasons with the San Francisco 49ers, Cincinnati Bengals and Atlanta Falcons.
- DB Nigel Warrior: Father, Dale Carter, was a first round draft pick by the Kansas City Chiefs in 1992 before going on to win the NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year Award. Carter was a 4-time Pro Bowler (1994-97) and 2-time All-Pro (1995 & 1996).

BREAKOUT YEAR FOR PHILLIPS

- Senior DE Kyle Phillips has been a defensive force for the Vols this year, already setting career highs in tackles (37), TFLs (5.0) and sacks (3.0).
- No. 5 had a career-best 2.0 TFLs and also had a sack in UT's win over Charlotte (11/3).
- Phillips had six tackles, half a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss at South Carolina (10/27).
- He made his first-career interception and broke numerous tackles to return it 27 yards for a touchdown vs. No. 1 Alabama (10/20).
- The Nashville native set a new career high and led the Vols with nine tackles during UT's win at No. 21 Auburn (10/13).
- Phillips also had half a sack and forced his first-career fumble, which was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown by **DB Alontae Taylor** in the third quarter against the Tigers.
- Phillips currently is tied for the team lead with three sacks and is tied for fourth on the team in tackles (37).



NOTING THE VOLS

JOHNSON SHINES ON AND OFF THE FIELD

- Redshirt sophomore offensive lineman Ryan Johnson has started at center since the ETSU game after starting the season opener at right guard.
- Johnson moved to center after Brandon Kennedy was lost for the season with a knee injury at practice last week. Johnson helped paved the way for 512 yards of total offense for the Vols against UTEP.
- He has started 12 straight games dating back to last year, logging starts at left guard, right guard and center along the way.
- The Brentwood, Tenn., native is perhaps most impressive off the field, where he is set to graduate with a degree in civil engineering this December in two-and-half years. Johnson was also named to the 2017 SEC Academic Honor Roll.

CHANDLER HAS CAREER-BEST DAY

- Sophomore running back Ty Chandler rushed for over 100 yards for the second time in his career during Tennessee's 24-0 win over UTEP, tallying a career-high 158 rushing yards. He previously rushed for 120 yards at Kentucky on Oct. 28, 2017.
- Chandler's 158 rushing yards are the most by a Tennessee player in a single game since quarterback Joshua Dobbs had 190 yards against Missouri on Nov. 19, 2016.
- Chandler's showing also marks the most yards by a UT running back in a single game since *Rajion Neal* had 169 against South Alabama on Sept. 28, 2013.
- In the third quarter alone, Chandler rushed for 100 yards, tying for 11th all-time in Tennessee history for most rushing yards in a quarter. It's the most since Dobbs rushed for 110 yards in the fourth quarter vs. Missouri on Nov. 19, 2016.
- Chandler opened Tennessee's first drive of the third quarter with a career-long 81-yard rushing touchdown. It's the longest rush for the Vols since Nov. 18, 2006 when *LaMarcus Coker* recorded an 87yard touchdown run at Vanderbilt.
- That same season, Coker rushed for an 89-yard score vs. Marshall in Neyland Stadium (Sept. 23, 2006). Chandler's run is the longest at Neyland since then.

VOLS IMPROVING DESPITE INJURIES

- Tennessee has been able to persevere through a number of injuries this season.
- DB Trevon Flowers, who has been a key contributor as a freshman in the UT secondary, has missed the last four games after sustaining a collarbone injury during the team's bye week.
- Senior DB Micah Abernathy has missed the past four games as well.
- Redshirt junior OL Brandon Kennedy and senior OLB Jonathan Kongbo have been ruled out for the remainder of the season with knee injuries.
- Sophomore OL Trey Smith will be out indefinitely as well after physicians discovered blood clots in his lungs on Wednesday before the Vols' game at South Carolina.

OFFENSIVE MILESTONES

 Tennessee totaled a season-high 512 yards of total offense in Week 3 against UTEP. It was the most in a game for UT since tallying 521 yards of total offense against Nebraska in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl on Dec. 30, 2016.

- RB Ty Chandler had a 10-yard touchdown catch from Keller Chyrst vs. Alabama to become the first Vol running back with a touchdown catch in three straight games.
- Redshirt sophomore quarterback Jarrett Guarantano set career highs in passing yards (328), passing touchdowns (two), completions (21) and attempts (32) in UT's 30-24 win at No. 21 Auburn (10/13).
- Guarantano connected with sophomore wide receiver Josh Palmer on a season-long 53-yard pass in the second quarter against UTEP. It marked a career-long reception for Palmer. His previous career-long of 51 was record in the 2018 home opener against ETSU on Sept. 8.
- Sophomore running back Ty Chandler rushed for a career-best 158 yards in UT's win over UTEP. His 81-yard touchdown run on the Vols' first play of the second half was the longest since Nov. 18, 2006 when LaMarcus Coker went 87 yards to the house at Vanderbilt. He also set a new career best with five catches for 62 yards in the Vols' win at Auburn (10/13).

SUSTAINABILITY

- The Vols have had 10 scoring drives of 10 plays or more so far this season.
- The Big Orange have had at least one scoring drive of 10-plus plays in seven of their ninw games this year.
- Redshirt sophomore **Jarrett Guarantano's** touchdown pass to junior tight end **Dominick Wood-Anderson** on 4th-and-goal from the 1-yard line in the season opener against West Virginia capped a 17-play drive that lasted 8:47. It brought the Vols within three, 10-7, with just over six minutes left in the first half.
- That 17-play touchdown drive was the Vols' longest touchdown drive since a 17-play drive on Nov. 2, 2002 versus South Carolina. Casey Clausen capped the 17-play, 90-yard drive with a five-yard run for Tennessee on it's way to an 18-10 win over the Gamecocks.
- On its second drive of the game vs. UTEP on Sept. 15, Tennessee drove the ball 60 yards in 15 plays over nearly eight minutes (7:41) of play to get the Vols into scoring position for their first points of the game as sophomore placekicker Brent Cimaglia put one through the uprights from 38-yards out. It marked the second time this season the Volunteers capped off a drive of least 15 plays with a score.
- In their first possession of the second quarter the Vols marched 71 yards in 15 plays, taking almost eight minutes (7:53) of play to take a then 14-3 lead over South Carolina on the road when Guarantano connected with Jauan Jennings for his second touchdown pass of the night.

Jeremy Pruitt was introduced as the 26th head coach in Tennessee football history on Dec. 7, 2017, taking the helm of the Volunteers after cementing himself as the nation's top defensive coordinator during stints at Alabama (2016-17), Georgia (2014-15) and Florida State (2013).

Pruitt comes to Rocky Top with five national championships to his credit, including the 2018 College Football Playoff National Championship victory he helped lead Alabama to a month after taking the UT job. He also was part of three national championships (2009, 2011, 2012) on the staff of the Crimson Tide from 2007 to 2012 and was the defensive coordinator during the Seminoles' undefeated national championship season in 2013. Pruitt was a standout high school coach before joining the Alabama staff as the Director of Player Development. He played collegiately for coaching legends Boots Donnelly, at Middle Tennessee State, and for Gene Stallings, at Alabama, after growing up in Rainsville, Ala., a town just 45 minutes south of Chattanooga.

Pruitt is a teacher at heart, spending time as a physical education instructor right out of college while serving as an assistant football coach for his father at Plainview and Fort Payne high schools. In his introductory press conference, Pruitt joked that he taught every kid in Fort Payne. Ala., how to tie their shoes from 2001-04.

Former players he recruited and coached swear by Pruitt years later, including NFL All-Pro cornerback Jalen Ramsey, Heisman Trophy winner Derrick Henry, Pro Bowl linebacker Telvin Smith and Redskins linebacker Ryan Anderson to name a few

He owns a 96-13 (.881 winning percentage) record as a collegiate assistant coach and is a two-time Broyles Award finalist in addition to being named National Recruiter of the Year by 247Sports in 2012.

He has coached 44 NFL draft picks and 18 All-Americans. The list of players coached by Pruitt reads like a who's who of college football's top defensive players this decade and includes 2017 National Defensive Player of the Year Minkah Fitzpatrick, 2016 Butkus Award (nation's top LB) winner Reuben Foster, 2016 National Defensive Player of the Year Jonathan Allen, top 10 NFL draft picks Ramsey, Roquan Smith, Leonard Floyd, Mark Barron and Dee Milliner, and current NFL stars Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, Dre Kirkpatrick, Lamarcus Joyner and Telvin Smith.

- The Pittsburgh Steelers have five VFLs on their roster in Joshua Dobbs, Ramon Foster, Justin Hunter, Daniel McCullers and Cameron Sutton, while the Kansas City Chiefs boast three VFLs in Eric Berry, Dustin Colquitt and Kahlil McKenzie.
- The Vols had three players selected in the 2018 NFL Draft in Rashaan Gaulden, John Kelly and Kahlil McKenzie.

BARNETT WINS SUPER BOWL

- In his first NFL season, Tennessee's all-time sacks leader and current Philadelphia Eagles' defensive end Derek Barnett helped lead a powerful Eagles defense to a Super Bowl LII victory over the New England Patriots.
- Barnett's key fumble recovery with 2:16 remaining in the fourth quarter helped seal the Eagles' 41-33 win.
- Over the course of his rookie season and the playoffs, Barnett finished with 20 total tackles and six sacks.

- The Vols had three former players participate in the 2017 Pro Bowl, held in Orlando, Fla.
- Running back Alvin Kamara, defensive lineman Malik Jackson, and tight end Jason Witten all took part in Pro Bowl festivities.
- Witten's appearance was the 11th of his career, while Kamara and Jackson made their Pro Bowl debuts.

THE NFL DRAFT



The Vols have one of the most storied histories of producing NFL players:

354 drafted players, third most in SEC and ninth among all schools.

At least one former Vol has played in 25 of the last 26 Super Bowls, with a total of 39 playing in the big game since 2000. For Super Bowl LII, VFL Derek Barnett was on the roster for the Philadelphia Eagles.

Sixteen former Vols have been selected in the first round of the NFL Draft since 2000, while 77 UT players have been selected overall in that time frame.

UT is third in the SEC and seventh in the nation with 46 all-time first-round draft picks.

UT sack king Derek Barnett was selected by the Philadelphia Eagles with the 14th overall pick of the 2017 NFL Draft, making him the Vols' first NFL first-round pick since the Miami Dolphins selected Ja'Wuan James with the 19th overall selection in 2014. He also became Tennessee's first defensive player selected in the first round since 2010, when the Kansas City Chiefs selected Eric Berry with the fifth pick and the Arizona Cardinals selected Dan Williams with the 26th pick.

Six Vols were selected in the first four rounds of the 2017 NFL Draft. That marks the most Vols picked in the first four rounds since 2002.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Tennessee fell to No. 17 West Virginia, 40-14, to open the 2018 season Saturday in the Belk College Kickoff at Bank of America Stadium.

All-American West Virginia quarterback Will Grier led a high-powered Mountaineers offense that came to life in the second half—scoring 27 points over the final 30 minutes. Grier finished the game having completed 25 of 34 passes for 429 yards and five touchdowns.

Tennessee won the time of possession and played turnover-free football Saturday but was outgained 547-301 in total yardage. West Virginia averaged 9.0 yards per play on offense and totaled 12 tackles for loss on defense.

After appearing in nine games and making six starts a season ago, redshirt sophomore Jarrett Guarantano earned the opening-day start at quarterback for the Vols and was 19-of-25 passing for 172 yards and a touchdown. His 19 completions were a career-high.

Sophomore running back Tim Jordan enjoyed his best game as a Vol, logging career-highs for carries (20) and rushing yards (118) and scoring his first collegiate touchdown. Marquez Callaway led the Tennessee receiving corps with a career-best six catches for 63 yards.

Linebacker Darrin Kirkland Jr. led UT's defense with 10 tackles, and safety Nigel Warrior added eight stops.

Saturday's game featured an 85-minute halftime due to a weather delay (lightning strikes within an eight-mile radius) that began after the teams left the field.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - Jeremy Pruitt earned his first win as a collegiate head coach in dominant fashion as the Tennessee Volunteers defeated in-state foe ETSU 59-3 Saturday evening at Neyland Stadium.

"To me, I don't see this any different than any game I've ever coached in," Pruitt said. "I'm happy we won, and you'll find out (about me) the more games we win, I'm a little more ticked. There's a standard we want to play to. Everything wasn't perfect this week. Everything wasn't perfect in the last couple of days, and we were trying to get things right. We're learning from it, and I think it'll make us a better football team, and it's going to make us a better football program."

Six Vols recorded the first touchdowns of their respective Tennessee careers in the win, led by running backs Jeremy Banks and Madre London with two rushing scores apiece. Josh Palmer entered the checkerboards on a 20-yard end-around rush, and Jordan Murphy hauled in a 50-yard pass to round out UT's offensive touchdowns.

Junior defensive back Marquill Osborne found the end zone for the first time on a blocked punt return, while redshirt junior linebacker Darrin Kirkland Jr. added a defensive touchdown with his first-career pick-six.

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Jarrett Guarantano led the passing attack for the Big Orange, connecting on 8-of-13 attempts for 154 yards. Grad transfer QB Keller Chryst saw action for the second-straight week and completed all three of his passes for 70 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore RB Tim Jordan led all players with 65 yards in 15 attempts on the ground, while junior wideout Marquez Callaway logged a game-high five catches and 78 yards through the air.

Tennessee (1-1) scored its first touchdown at Neyland Stadium in 2018 on a blocked punt return by Osborne. Recovering his own block at the eight-yard line, the junior DB high-stepped into the end zone to put the Vols ahead 10-0 with 2:49 left in the opening frame.

Junior newcomer Emmit Gooden led Tennessee with eight total tackles on the defensive line, including UT's lone sack and a team-high three tackles for loss. As a unit, the Vols held ETSU to 69 passing yards and limited the Buccaneers to 2-of-15 third-down conversions.

The game entered a weather delay at the 12:01 mark of the second quarter as the clock read 4:52 p.m. Play resumed at 5:40 p.m. for a total delay of 48 minutes.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - Sophomore running back Ty Chandler rushed 12 times for a career-best 158 yards and a touchdown as Tennessee recorded its first shutout since 2016 in a 24-0 victory over UTEP on Saturday afternoon at Neyland Stadium.

A crowd of 87,074 was on hand for the contest, including 1,067 evacuees of Hurricane Florence from North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia. They received complimentary tickets to the game from UT Athletics.

Chandler averaged 13.2 yards per carry, bolstered by an 81-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. His previous best rushing day came at Kentucky last season, when he had 120 yards on 22 attempts. He posted the most yards by a UT running back in a single game since Rajion Neal had 169 against South Alabama on. Sept. 28, 2013.

Sophomore running back Tim Jordan added another rushing TD for the Vols, who rolled up 345 yards on the ground on 50 carries for a 6.9 average on the day. Graduate transfer Madre London contributed a season-high 74 yards to that cause via nine attempts

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Jarrett Guarantano completed 12 of 16 passes for 168 yards and a score, connecting with six different receivers. Redshirt junior wide receiver Jauan Jennings had a four-yard TD reception and finished with three catches for 22 yards. Junior wideout Brandon Johnson led UT with four catches for 51 yards, while sophomore receiver Josh Palmer hauled in two balls for a career-best 64 yards.

UT's defense, meanwhile, limited the Miners (0-3) to only 134 total yards and seven first downs. Junior linebacker Daniel Bituli paced the Vols, tallying six tackles, including a sack Redshirt senior defensive end Alexis Johnson Jr. added five stops and a quarterback hurry,

Tennessee allowed the Miners to cross the 50-yard line only twice during the game, with both times coming in the first half. The Big Orange defense allowed the Miners to convert only two of 13 third-down plays into first downs, helping secure the program's first shutout of any opponent since a 55-0 Homecoming romp over Tennessee Tech on Nov. 5, 2016, and its first blanking of an FBS foe since rolling past North Texas 24-0 in another Homecoming game on Nov. 14, 2015.

KNOXVILLE. Tenn. - Tennessee and Florida were nearly even in total vardage, but six turnovers proved too much for the Vols to overcome in a 47-21 loss to the Gators in front of a crowd of 100,207 Saturday night at Neyland Stadium.

Florida quarterback Feleipe Franks passed for 172 yards and three touchdowns and ran for another score to help the Gators improve to 3-1 overall and 1-1 in the SEC. UT fell to 2-2 overall and 0-1 in league play on a night that saw Tennessee's 1998 National Championship team honored on the field.

Tennessee out-gained Florida through the air, 208-186, with redshirt junior receiver Jauan Jennings hauling in four catches for a season-high 60 yards. Redshirt sophomore quarterback Jarrett Guarantano finished the evening 7-of-18 passing for 164 yards.

Freshman defensive back Alontae Taylor forced his first-career fumble, which was recovered by Kyle Phillips at the end of the first quarter, and it led to UT's first points of the night after Brent Cimaglia made his first of two field goals in the game.

"And it isn't easy. Our guys kept fighting, which means we're headed in the right direction and that excites me."

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Jarrett Guarantano paced the Vols offensively, completing 13 of 21 passes for 143 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore running back Ty Chandler caught four passes for 53 yards and a touchdown in addition to rushing five times for 27 yards.

Georgia quarterback Jake Fromm completed 16 of 22 passes for 185 yards. Running back Elijah Holyfield led the Bulldogs in rushing with 78 yards on 16 carries, while back-up quarterback Justin Fields scored twice on the ground.

With 11:10 remaining in the final quarter, Chandler took a screen pass from Guarantano 35 yards for a touchdown. The score completed a five-play, 57-yard drive and cut Georgia's lead to 24-12 after Tennessee was unsuccessful on the two-point conversion.

On Georgia's ensuing possession, the Bulldogs took the ball 75 yards in 13 plays while chewing up more than seven minutes of game clock in the process to extend their lead to 31-12. UGA scored once more on its next drive to bring the final score to 38-12.

Tennessee dropped to 2-3 (0-2 SEC) with the loss. Georgia moved to 5-0 (2-0 SEC).

AUBURN, Ala. – Tennessee outscored No. 21/21 Auburn 17-7 in the final two quarters of Saturday's game to earn its first road and SEC win of the season at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

"We beat a really good football team today," head coach Jeremy Pruitt said. "It's like I told them in there, if we learn to execute and raise our level of fight, we've got a chance to have a really good football team. There were times in the game where things didn't go our way. I didn't think we played very well at certain times in the game, but our guys kind of kept their poise. Fought a little bit harder. They played with a little better technique. We got some turnovers and didn't turn the ball over."

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - Tennessee fought back in the second quarter, scoring touchdowns on back-to-back drives, but the Volunteers fell to No. 1 Alabama, 58-21, on Saturday at Neyland Stadium.

"I think we learned a lot about our football team today," UT head coach Jeremy Pruitt said. "There are some guys we had on our team that this game was way too big for them, and I think everyone was able to see that. It helps us, and we'll move on with it. We play a good football team next week, so we have to go back to work tomorrow and get ready for South Carolina.'

Today's "Third Saturday of October" matchup marked the 101st meeting between Tennessee (3-4, 1-3 SEC) and Alabama (8-0, 5-0).

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Jarrett Guarantano completed 5 of 10 passes for 63 yards before exiting the game with an injury in the second quarter. Redshirt senior backup quarterback Keller Chryst entered the game with 8:40 left in the first half and went on to complete 9 of 15 passes for 164 yards and two touchdowns.

Offensively, the Vols were led by redshirt junior wide receiver Jauan Jennings, who caught six passes for 102 yards, and sophomore running back Ty Chandler who had three receptions for 39 yards and a touchdown. Chandler also added 21 yards on the ground. His touchdown reception makes him the first Tennessee running back ever with TD catches in three consecutive games.

Alabama starting quarterback Tau Tagovailoa finished 19 of 29 for 306 yards and four touchdowns. Jalen Hurts entered in the third quarter and finished 2 of 3 for 21 yards with a rushing touchdown and an interception.

Tennessee's two touchdowns during the second quarter were jumpstarted by back-to-back three-and-outs forced by the Vols' defense. During those drives, the Crimson Tide were held to two yards and negative six yards, respectively. The back-to-back three-and-outs were the first the Tide had suffered with Tagovailoa running the offense this season.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. -- Tennessee opened the month of November with a win, topping the Charlotte 49ers 14-3 Saturday evening at Neyland Stadium. It was the fifth-straight Homecoming win for the Volunteers and 73rd overall on the occasion since 1916.

"I was really proud of the way our guys found a way to get a win," head coach Jeremy Pruitt said. "At the end of the day, that's what you're trying to do. I thought defensively we limited some explosive plays, and we kind of made them earn it, so that helped us."

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Jarrett Guarantano paced the Tennessee passing game with 172 yards on 16-of-21 attempts and a touchdown. Sophomore wideout Josh Palmer and junior tight end Dominick Wood-Anderson led the receiving corps with 71 and 53 yards through the air, respectively.

Junior receiver Marquez Callaway opened the scoring with a flash, housing a Charlotte punt 82 yards down the right sideline to put the Vols ahead 7-0 with 7:42 remaining in the first quarter. It was the first punt return touchdown for UT since Callaway accomplished the feat with a 62-yard dash against Tennessee Tech on Nov. 5, 2016.

"We did find a way to create a positive play on special teams, which probably was the difference in the ball game, so I'm glad we had the opportunity to do that," Pruitt said. "Marquez made a good run, and I thought we had some good blocks out there."

Tennessee (4-5, 1-3 SEC) doubled its advantage on a 16-yard scoring connection from Guarantano to Palmer, taking a 14-0 lead with 0:17 left in the opening frame. Guarantano totaled 61 passing yards on the drive, including a 33-yard completion to Wood-Anderson that set the Vols up in the red zone.

Charlotte (4-5, 3-2 C-USA) broke up the shutout late in the first half with a 20-yard field goal off the foot of rookie placekicker Jonathan Cruz. The kick capped off a 12-play, 87-yard drive for the 49ers to make the score 14-3 with 0:17 on the clock in the second quarter.

Neither team added points in the second half, as both sides were unable to eclipse 100 yards over the last 30 minutes of action. The Vols out-gained the 49ers 99-87 in the third and fourth quarters.

Freshman defensive back Bryce Thompson forced the lone turnover of the game, intercepting Charlotte's Evan Shirreffs and downing the ball with 59 seconds left in the fourth quarter to seal the Tennessee victory.

Junior linebacker Daniel Bituli racked up a season-high 13 tackles to lead all players, while senior defensive lineman Kyle Phillips added a pair of tackles for loss and a couple of pass breakups.
