GAME 11 NOTEBOOK

- Carolina is 3-1 in the CBS Sports Classic. UNC beat Ohio State, 82-74, on 12/20/14 in Chicago; beat UCLA, 89-76, on 12/19/15 in Brooklyn; lost to Kentucky, 103-100, on 12/17/16 in Las Vegas; and beat Ohio State, 86-72, on 12/23/17 in New Orleans.
- Carolina is 4-3 in Chicago, including 3-1 in the United Center and 1-2 in Chicago Stadium. This is the Tar Heels' first appearance in the United Center since beating Ohio State in the CBS Sports Classic on 12/20/14. UNC also has wins in the United Center over Louisville (12/3/97) and Valparaiso (12/20/08).
- Luke Maye scored 20 points against Gonzaga to become the 77th player to score 1,000 points for Carolina (77 have scored 1,000 or more points playing for Carolina; Cameron Johnson reached the 1,000-point mark earlier this year after scoring 583 points in three seasons at Pitt. Johnson has scored 489 in less than two seasons as a Tar Heel).
- Carolina's 77 1,000-point scorers are the most in NCAA history. Louisville is second with 68.
- Maye leads the ACC in rebounding at 10.1 per game. Last year, the Huntersville, N.C., native was second in the league in rebounds per game at 10.1.
- Cameron Johnson earned ACC Player of the Week honors for his play against Gonzaga. It was Johnson's first career ACC honor. He is the second active Tar Heel to have won ACC Player of the Week honors (Luke Maye was a three-time recipient in 2017-18).
- Johnson has led UNC in scoring five times in 10 games; he did that three times a year ago.
- The win over Gonzaga marked the first time in five games that UNC won when opponents scored 80 or more points and the first time in five games that UNC won when the opponent shot 50 percent from the floor.
- Carolina shot 57.1 percent from the floor, including 52.0 from three-point range, and 80.0 percent from the free throw line in its win over Gonzaga. That was the first time UNC shot 50/50/80 since an 85-64 win over Pittsburgh on 2/14/2016 (.556/.533/.867). Cameron Johnson scored three points in 13 minutes for the Panthers in that game in the Smith Center.

leigh; and 0-1 in Newark and Las Vegas.

- Roy Williams is 8-6 against Kentucky at North Carolina and 9-9 overall.
- This is the 24th time Carolina has played the Cats as a top-10 team in the AP poll. The Tar Heels are 14-9 in those games.
- This is the 17th time the Tar Heels enter the game as the higher-ranked team in the AP poll. UNC is 11-5 against UK in those games.
- Carolina is 0-1 against Kentucky in the CBS Sports Classic, dropping a memorable 103-100 decision in Las Vegas on 12/17/16. Malik Monk scored 47 and De'Aaron Fox had 24 points and 10 assists to offset a career-high 34 points by Tar Heel junior Justin Jackson.
- That game was just the second in UNC history, and the first in a regulation-length game, in which the Tar Heels lost when scoring 100 points.
- Luke Maye came off the bench to hit two three-pointers and scored a then-career-high 11 points. Kenny Williams started and matched his then-career-best with five assists.

LAST TIME: CAROLINA 75, KENTUCKY 73 MARCH 26, 2017, MEMPHIS, TENN.

- Sophomore forward Luke Maye hit a jump shot with 0.3 seconds to play to give No. 1 seed North Carolina a 75-73 win over No. 2 seed Kentucky to win the South Regional in Memphis.
- The win advanced the Tar Heels to the Final Four in Arizona, where UNC beat Oregon and Gonzaga to win the 2017 NCAA championship.
- Maye's basket was the fourth last-second shot to secure a Final Four berth since 1985: Christian Laettner (Duke vs. UConn, 1990), Laettner (vs. Kentucky, 1992) and Scottie Reynolds (Villanova vs. Pitt, 2009).

- Maye was named Most Valuable Player of the South Regional after scoring a career high for the second straight game, including a game-winning shot from just inside the three-point line with 0.3 seconds to play. He had 17 points against Kentucky, two days after setting a career high with 16 in the Sweet 16 vs. Butler.
- Kennedy Meeks grabbed a career-high 17 rebounds.
- All-America and ACC Player of the Year Justin Jackson led all scorers with 19 points.

MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES

- The Tar Heels lead the nation in rebound margin (+14.1), are third in scoring (94.3 ppg), fifth in assists (19.9) and 13th in scoring margin (+19.0).
- Carolina's rebound margin of 14.1 per game not only leads the nation, but is ahead of UNC's school-record margin of 12.3 set in 2016-17.
- Carolina has finished in the top in the nation in rebound margin in nine of Roy Williams' first 15 seasons at UNC, including No. 1 in the country in 2008, 2012 and 2017. The Tar Heels have finished ninth, ninth, first and third in the nation in the last four years.
- Carolina leads the ACC in scoring, rebound margin and assists, is second in rebounds per game and offensive rebounding, fourth in field goal percentage and three-pointers made and fifth in three-point percentage.
- KenPom ranks the Tar Heels third in the nation behind Savannah State and FIU in shortest average length of offensive possessions (13.3 seconds) and eighth in tempo (most possessions per game).
- Carolina has scored 100 or more four times (and 90 or more in seven games). This is the first time since the national championship season in 2008-09 the Tar Heels reached triple digits four times and 90 or more points seven times in the

- Carolina has led by double digits in all 10 games, including its losses to Texas and Michigan.
- UNC led Texas 17-4 less than 5:00 into the game before the Longhorns went on a 25-11 run over the next 10:00 to take the lead. Texas hit a three at the buzzer to take a 43-42 lead at the half.

- UNC led Michigan 21-11 with 12:37 to play in the first half. The Wolverines went on an 11-0 run to take the lead. UNC led 35-33 with less than a minute to play in the half before a 3FG with 0:02 to play gave UM a 39-35 advantage at the break.

- Led by Cameron Johnson's 26 three-pointers in 10 games (2.6 per game, the fourth most in the ACC) and Coby White's 21 threes in nine games (2.3 per game), the Tar Heels are making 8.5 threes per game. UNC's single-season record is 8.3 in 2002-03, one of only two seasons in school history in which Carolina made at least 8.0 per game (8.2 in 2017-18).

- Carolina is averaging 18.3 second-chance points, almost double what the opponents are averaging (9.7). That includes a 27-0 margin against Gonzaga.

- The Zags did score 24 fastbreak points, a season high for the opponents, many of which came among the Zags' 29 points off UNC's 23 turnovers. Gonzaga scored as many fastbreak points as Texas, UCLA, Michigan and UNCW combined to score (24).

- Sophomore forward Garrison Brooks has won defensive player of the game honors four times. No other Tar Heel has won more than one time. No player qualified for the award in three games.

AP POLL NOTES

- Carolina is ranked No. 9 in the Associated Press poll and 10th in the coaches poll.
- Carolina is ranked this week in an AP poll for the 903rd time, more than any other school in college basketball history.
- This is the 87th consecutive AP poll the Tar Heels have been ranked, dating back to mid-conference play in the 2013-14 season.
- UNC began the year No. 8 in the preseason AP poll. It was the 13th time in 16 seasons under Roy Williams UNC was ranked in the preseason Top 10.
- This season is the 56th time in 71 seasons the Tar Heels have been ranked in the top 10 in at least one week of the poll.

- UNC finished the year in the AP poll top 10 in 10 of Williams' first 15 seasons.
- Carolina has finished in the top 10 37 times, including 26 of the last 38 years. UNC has finished the season ranked in the AP poll 50 times.

NUMBER ONE IN WINS PER SEASON

- This is the 109th season of Carolina Basketball. The Tar Heels have won 2,240 games, third most in NCAA history.
- Carolina has won an average of 20.7 games per season. UNC is the only school in the top 10 in all-time NCAA wins that has averaged at least 20 wins per season.

ROY WILLIAMS COURT

- On 8/23/18, Carolina officially dedicated the Tar Heels' home floor as Roy Williams Court at the Dean E. Smith Center.
- The dedication was part of a two-day Carolina Basketball reunion of more than 300 players, coaches, managers and staff.

WILLIAMS INKS EIGHT-YEAR CONTRACT EXTENSION

- Carolina announced on Dec. 20 that head coach Roy Williams has signed a contract extension through the 2027-28 season.
- Williams is in his 16th season as the head coach at his alma mater. He is the first coach to win three national championships at his alma mater (2005, 2009, 2017).
- Williams' previous contract ran through 2020.

NO. 1 SCHEDULE IN THE COUNTRY

- Carolina's complete 2018-19 schedule is rated the No. 1 most difficult schedule in the country by NCAA.com.
- Eight opponents are in the AP top 25 this week (No. 2 Duke, No. 4 Michigan, No. 5 Virginia, No. 8 Gonzaga, No. 11 Florida State, No. 13 Virginia Tech and No. 19 Kentucky).
- Carolina and Florida are the only two schools in the country that play six non-conference games against teams that played in the 2018 NCAA Tournament (Texas, UCLA, Michigan, Gonzaga, Kentucky and Davidson).
- UNC also plays eight ACC teams that played in the 2018 NCAA Tournament.
- KenPom has ranked Carolina's final strength of schedule in the top six in the country in each of the last four seasons, including the most difficult in 2014-15 and 2017-18 (No. 6 in 2015-16 and 2016-17).

THREE NON-ACC ROAD GAMES

- Carolina opened the season with non-conference road games at Wofford and Elon and plays at Michigan in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on Nov. 28.
- UNC is one of 14 schools in the ACC, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, SEC and Pac 12 that play three or more road games (Stanford is the only one to play four).
- UNC and Georgia Tech are the only ACC schools to play three non-conference road games.
- Including this season, Carolina will have played 42 non-conference, regular season road games in Roy Williams' 16 years as Carolina's head coach. That equals the third most in the ACC behind Georgia Tech (45) and Wake Forest (44). Virginia Tech is tied with UNC with 42.

FOUR IN DECEMBER

- Carolina plays just four times in December – home games against UNCW (12/5), Gonzaga (12/15) and Davidson (12/29) and the CBS Sports Classic vs. Kentucky in Chicago (12/22).
- This is the first time since 1961-62 the Tar Heels have played this few games in December. That season was Dean Smith's first as UNC's head coach; the Tar Heels played only three times in December 1961.

HALL OF FAMERS SCOTT, PERKINS

- Charlie Scott was inducted in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in September.
- Scott is the 10th Tar Heel in the Naismith Hall of Fame, joining Ben Carnevale (inducted in 1970), Frank McGuire (1977), Dean Smith (1983), Billy Cunningham (1986), Bob McAdoo (2000), Larry Brown (2002), James Worthy (2003), Roy Williams (2007) and Michael Jordan (2009).
- Sam Perkins was inducted in the NABC College Basketball Hall of Fame on Nov. 18, in Kansas City.
- Perkins is the 11th Tar Heel in the College Hall of Fame with Brown, Carnevale, Cunningham, Phil Ford, McAdoo, McGuire, Scott, Smith, Williams and Worthy.

VITALE'S MOUNT RUSHMORE

- ESPN's Dick Vitale is commemorating his 40th year in broadcasting with a book titled "Dick Vitale's Mount Rushmores of College Basketball."

POSTGAME NOTES



GAME 1: UNC 78, WOFFORD 67

- Luke Maye led all scorers with 24 points, Garrison Brooks scored 13 of his career-high 20 in the opening half and Cameron Johnson added five three-pointers in UNC's 78-67 win at Wofford.
- The win improved UNC to 97-12 in season-opening games, including 15-1 under Roy Williams.
- It was Maye's 14th career 20-point game.
- Brooks made a career-high nine field goals (previous was five). It was the sixth time he scored in double figures. His previous high was 14 against Northern Iowa in the 2017-18 opener.
- Johnson was 5 for 7 from three-point range. It was the seventh time he made at least five threes in a game (third time as a Tar Heel.)
- Johnson broke a 46-all tie with a three, and added two more threes in a 14-5 UNC run that gave the Tar Heels a 60-51 lead.
- Freshmen Coby White and Nassir Little combined for 15 points and five assists.
- White became the 35th Tar Heel to start his first game as a freshman (the 15th under Roy Williams).

GAME 2: UNC 116, ELON 67

- The 116 points were the most by the Tar Heels since a 116-48 win over UNC Asheville in Chapel Hill on 11/30/2008 and tied the record for most points in the Roy Williams era.
- The 49-point win was the largest road win in the Roy Williams era.
- Carolina held Elon to 16.1 percent shooting from the floor in the second half (5 of 31 field goal attempts). That was the lowest in a half by an opponent in the Roy Williams era (previous low was 16.7 percent by Radford in the second half of an 2009 NCAA Tournament first round game).
- Johnson and Little led the Tar Heels with 21 points apiece.
- Johnson and Little became the third and fourth Tar Heels in the first two games to score 20 or more points (Maye had 24 and Brooks 20 at Wofford). That had not been accomplished at UNC in more than 50 years.
- Little became the first Tar Heel freshman to score 20 points in a game since Justin Jackson had 22 against Virginia in the 2015 ACC Tournament.
- Point guards Seventh Woods, Leaky Black and White combined for 12 assists and one turnover.

GAME 3: UNC 90, STANFORD 72

- Johnson led all scorers with 17 and Maye had 16 points and eight rebounds.
- The Tar Heels shot 60 percent from the floor (21 of 35), turned the ball over only five times and held the Cardinal to 35.5 percent shooting in building a 52-26 advantage at the half.
- Carolina improved to 102-7 in home openers, including 30-2 in the Smith Center.
- UNC has won 86 of its last 88 home openers, including 17 in a row.
- Carolina is 12-0 against Stanford, the second-most wins by UNC against any opponent without a loss (19-0 vs. The Citadel).

GAME 4: UNC 108, TENNESSEE TECH 58

- Carolina won for the 200th time against non-conference opponents in the Smith Center in 216 games.
- Carolina had season highs in assists (29), blocks (8), steals (16), free throws (21 for 26), rebound margin (54-24) and scoring margin (108-58).
- The Tar Heels shot 55.5 percent from the floor.
- The Tar Heels were credited with 29 fastbreak points, more than any game in at least three seasons. The season-high last year was 21.
- Carolina scored 30 second-chance points, most since scoring 36 against Nicholls on 12/19/2011.
- The 50-point margin of victory was UNC's largest since beating NC State by 51 on 1/8/2017.
- Woods had a career-high eight assists (previous was six against Long Beach on 11/15/2016).
- Woods made a three-pointer and scored seven points, all in the first half. It was the third 3FG of Woods career. He last made a three at Hawai'i on 11/18/16.
- Maye led six Tar Heels in double figures with 15 points.
- Sterling Manley scored a season-high 13, the second-most points in his career. He tied his career high with six field goals (also against Bucknell on 11/15/2017).

GAME 5: UNC 101, SAINT FRANCIS 76

- Carolina improved to 5-0 for the third year in a row and the seventh time in 16 seasons under Roy Williams.
- Carolina went on an 11-0 run after Saint Francis out-scored the Tar Heels, 16-6, to begin the second half to close within 58-52.
- It was the first time UNC scored 100 points in consecutive games since the 2016 Maui Invitational against Chaminade and Oklahoma State.
- Johnson led UNC in scoring with 20 points. It was his second 20-point game of the season and the 10th of his career.
- Maye had his first double-double of the season with 11 points and 11 rebounds.
- Williams tied his previous career high in assists with six in the first half and finished with a career-best nine.

GAME 6: TEXAS 92, CAROLINA 89

- White scored 33 for UNC and Kerwin Roach II had 32 for the Longhorns. It was the first time a player on each team scored 30 or more points since Carolina's previous game in Las Vegas, against Kentucky on 12/16/2017 (Justin Jackson had 34 for the Tar Heels and Malik Monk scored 47 for UK).
- Carolina shot 44.3 percent from the floor, its lowest in the first six games.
- Carolina made a season-high 11 threes and allowed a season-high 11 threes.
- Texas became the first opponent to shoot 50 percent from the floor (.525) against the Tar Heels this season.
- Texas scored 31 points off 17 Tar Heel turnovers, the most since Vanderbilt scored 31 in San Juan on 11/21/2010.
- White's 33 points were the most by a UNC freshman since Harrison Barnes scored 40 against Clemson on 3/12/2011 in the ACC Tournament. It is the third-most points ever by a UNC freshman.

- White made seven three-pointers, the second most by a UNC freshman (Raymond Felton made eight, which equals the school record, against NC State on 1/26/2003).
- Johnson scored 16 points and hit the 1,000-point mark in his career.
- Brooks tied his career high with five offensive rebounds and total rebounds with eight.
- Carolina trailed at the half for the first time this year.

GAME 7: UNC 94, UCLA 78

- Carolina won its 12th consecutive game against the Pac-12 and improved to 13-1 against Pac-12 opponents under Roy Williams.
- Carolina committed a season-low six turnovers, including only one in the second half.
- Carolina scored 53 points on 41 possessions in the second half – a season-best 1.29 points per possession for a half.
- Carolina tied its season high with 11 three-pointers.
- It was the fifth time in the first seven games UNC scored 90 or more points.
- Williams scored a season-high 15 points.
- White had 19 points and a season-high eight assists against UCLA.
- Brandon Robinson tied his career high with four assists (and had no turnovers) in 14 minutes of action.
- Johnson and Maye combined for seven first-half points and 23 in the second half.
- Johnson finished with 14 points, 11 of which he scored in the second half. He scored UNC's first nine points of the second half.

GAME 8: MICHIGAN 84, UNC 67

- The Wolverines shot 59.3 percent in the second half and 57.4 percent for the game, while UNC made only 12 of 37 shots in the second half (.324).
- Carolina led 21-11 before an 11-0 UM lead gave the Wolverines the lead. It was UNC's second straight loss when leading early in the game by double figures.
- Carolina committed only 10 turnovers, but Michigan converted them into 18 points.
- The Tar Heels scored only 26 of its 67 points in the paint.
- Carolina had season lows in points (game and in a half), field goal percentage (game and half), free throws made, attempted and percentage, assists, blocks and steals.
- Michigan had opponent highs for the first eight games in field goals, FG percentage, three-pointers and 3FG percentage, defensive boards and blocked shots.
- Maye had a season-high 15 rebounds, most by any Tar Heel in the first eight games. It was the seventh time in his career he grabbed at least 15 rebounds.
- White led UNC with 12 points and four assists. It was his third consecutive game as Carolina's leading scorer. Joel Berry II was the only Tar Heel to accomplish that last season. White is the first UNC freshman to do that since Harrison Barnes led four games in a row (twice) in 2010-11.
- It was Carolina's first game ever in Ann Arbor.
- Michigan's two offensive rebounds tied the fewest by an opponent in the Roy Williams era.

GAME 9: UNC 97, UNCW 69

- Johnson led UNC in scoring for the fourth time this season with 21 points. It was his 11th career 20-point game (sixth at UNC and third this season).
- Williams had a game-high eight assists. It was the second time this year he had eight or more assists (his previous high in his first three seasons was six). It was the fifth time this season he has led or tied for the team lead in assists. He did that four times in his first three seasons.
- Woods tied his season high with seven points, all in the second half.
- Manley grabbed a season-high 10 rebounds. It was the third time in his career he had double-figure rebounds and the first since the 2018 NCAA first round vs. Lipscomb.
- Brandon Huffman scored a season-high seven points.
- Carolina had 23 assists, including 15 on UNC's 18 field goals in the first half.
- The Tar Heels scored 34 points off UNCW's 25 turnovers; it was Carolina's most points off turnovers since scoring 37 against NC State on 1/8/2017.
- The Tar Heels scored 90 or more points for the sixth time in the first nine games.
- UNC scored 53 points in the second half, the eighth time Carolina has scored 50 or more points in a half in the first nine games.
- White did not play due to a sore left ankle; Robinson did not play due to a sore shoulder.
- Carolina made its first change to the starting lineup with Woods replacing White. It was Woods' first career start.
- Carolina improved to 168-18 against in-state, non-ACC teams.

GAME 10: UNC 103, GONZAGA 90

- The 103 points were UNC's second-most ever against an AP top-five team (105 vs. No. 4 Louisville in Final Four consolation game, 3/25/1972; 103 vs. No. 4 Gonzaga; and 101 vs. No. 2 Virginia, 1/15/1983)
- It was the sixth time in 25 games all-time under Roy Williams that UNC won when allowing 90 or points.
- UNC had lost the previous four games when it allowed 80 points. Also had lost the previous four times the opponents shot 50 percent from the floor.
- Carolina improved to 27-22 when playing host to an AP top-five opponent, including 7-1 against top-five, non-conference opponents.
- Out-scored Gonzaga, 27-0, in second-chance points. The 27 second-chance points were the third most in UNC's first 10 games.
- Gonzaga was first opponent to score zero second-chance points since Clemson on 1/16/2018.
- Carolina made a season-high 13 three-pointers (previous high 11 vs. Texas and UCLA).
- UNC committed a season-high 23 turnovers. It was the first time UNC won when committing 20 or more turnovers since committing 20 vs. Syracuse on 1/26/2015.
- Gonzaga's 29 points off UNC turnovers were the second most vs. UNC this year (31 by Texas).
- Maye had 20 points and 16 rebounds. His 20th point was his 1,000th career point.
- It was the 15th 20-point game of Maye's career, 21st double-double and eighth time with 15 or more rebounds.
- Maye was 7 for 7 from the free throw line, the best game of his career (previous best perfect game was 5 for 5 vs. Pitt as a junior)

- Johnson led all scorers with 25 points, the 12th 20-point game of his career, but only the second game with 25 or more.
- Johnson tied his career high with six three-pointers (fifth time in his career...twice at Pitt, three times as a Tar Heel)
- Woods scored a career-high 14 points (had 11 to set a career high just in the first half).
- Woods made six field goals – his previous high in a game was three on three occasions.
- Woods made two three-pointers for the first time in his career (he had made three in his career in 67 previous games).
- Brooks had a career-high nine rebounds (previous was eight). He tied his career high with five offensive rebounds.
