STARTING FIVE

> Carolina looks for its fourth SEC road win on Tuesday when it travels to face No. 5/5 Kentucky at Rupp Arena. The meeting is the only between the two former SEC East foes this year, and it marks the fourth top-five opponent the Gamecocks have faced this season.

> The Gamecocks look for their third road win in the history of the series on Tuesday. The last Carolina win at Rupp came on Jan. 31, 2009, behind a turnaround jumper from Gamecock great Devan Downey with three seconds remaining in the contest. The only other Carolina win in Lexington came in a 72-66 overtime contest on March 2, 1997, a win which captured the outright SEC title for Carolina. BJ McKie's 22 points, anchored by a 13-of-14 mark at the free throw line, led the Gamecocks in the win.

> Carolina won its third SEC road game of the season, and held steady in fourth place in the league standings with a wire-to-wire 86-80 win at Georgia last Saturday. Senior forward Chris Silva was dominant, especially in the opening half, sharing game-high honors with rookie guard A.J. Lawson, as the duo scored 19 points each. The Gamecocks shot 56.9 percent from the field, including an 11-of-16 (68.8%) mark from 3-point range, with Tre Campbell, Hassani Gravett and Felipe Haase each connecting on a trio of 3s in the win. > Senior forward Chris Silva has been a force in league play to date. He paces the Gamecocks with 16.4 points, 7.1 rebounds and 2.4 blocks per contest. He's also averaging 65.1 percent from the field, and 79.3 percent from the line (46-58), along with three double-doubles. In SEC road contests, Silva is averaging 11.5 points per outing.

> In last season's victory over the Wildcats, Silva led three Gamecocks in double figures with a then-career high 27 points, hitting nine shots from the field and nine at the stripe. The Carolina defense forced 16 Kentucky turnovers, turning those into 15 points on the opposite end. Holding UK to just 1-of-11 from 3-point range was another key in the victory, which broke a string of four-straight Wildcat wins in the series.

#'S TO KNOW

74.5 - South Carolina is 3-1 this season in SEC road games, with wins at Florida, Vanderbilt and most recently at Georgia. The Gamecocks average 74.5 points per game in SEC road matchups this season.

45.5% - In SEC games this season, Carolina is averaging 45.5 percent from the field, led by Silva's 65.1 percent (41-63).

43.9% - Senior guard Hassani Gravett paces Carolina in league play from beyond the arc, as he has connected on 18-of-41 attempts, 43.9 percent.

1 - One of the keys to last season's home win over Kentucky, holding the Wildcats to just 1-of-11 from beyond the arc.

8-1 - Carolina is 8-1 this season when scoring 80+ points.

500+ - With his first made free throw vs. Tennessee last Tuesday night, Silva became the first Gamecock in history to have 500 career free throws and 700 career rebounds. He was 12-of-16 at the charity stripe vs. UT, his second-straight SEC contest with 10+ attempts at the foul line.

COMING UP NEXT

Carolina returns to Colonial Life Arena on Saturday to host Arkansas on Legends Weekend. Tip time for that contest is set for 3:30 p.m. ET on the SEC Network. Longtime Gamecock equipment manager, Mac Credille, who retired in January will be honored on Saturday at halftime.



FRANK MARTIN

> South Carolina head coach Frank Martin is in his seventh season leading the Gamecocks and 12th season overall as a head coach in 2018-19. Martin, the 2017 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year (College-Insider.com), led South Carolina to its first Final Four and a school record 26 wins in 2016-17. In his 11 complete seasons as a head coach, Martin has led his teams to at least 21 wins seven times. Martin is a native of Miami, Fla., and a graduate of FIU.
 > Prior to his time on the sidelines in the college ranks, Martin spent 15 years in high school coaching in Miami, Fla., including the last seven as a head coach. He was part of five state championships as an assistant at Miami Senior High School (1985-93), before earning two titles as the program's head coach (1995-98). Highlighting Martin's stint as the head coach of the program were consecutive 30-win seasons and consecutive Florida 6A State Championships in 1996 and 1997, with his 1997 squad earning a 36-1 overall record and ranking No. 4 in the USA Today Top 25 Poll. He also served as the head coach at North Miami Senior High School (1993-95) and one season at Booker T. Washington High School (1999-2000).
 > Among active Division I head coaches, South Carolina's Frank Martin holds the seventh-highest (tied with Michigan's John Beilein) NCAA Tournament winning percentage (.667) behind only Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, North Carolina's Roy Williams, Kentucky's John Calipari, Kansas' Bill Self, Michigan State's Tom Izzo and Villanova's Jay Wright.
 > Martin led team's are 101-97 (.510) all-time in league play.

> South Carolina is in its 111th season of varsity basketball in 2018-19.

> Gamecock head coach Frank Martin is joined on the sidelines by assistant coaches Perry Clark (6th season), Bruce Shingler (3rd season) and Chuck Martin (2nd season). Andy Assaley is in his seventh season as the director of operations.

> South Carolina is one of 13 DI schools nationally that have two or more former DI coaches serving as an assistant coach. Perry Clark served as the head coach at Tulane, Miami (Fla.) and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, while Chuck Martin was the head coach at Marist for five campaigns.

> Carolina looks for its seventh SEC win of the season on Tuesday at Kentucky. Should the Gamecocks win, it would be just the 10th time Carolina would hit the seven-win mark since joining the SEC for the 1992 campaign.

> Carolina's NET is listed at 103 (as of Feb. 4) and the Gamecocks have five combined Q1 and Q2 wins. South Carolina's strength of schedule is listed at 21.

> Senior forward Chris Silva paces Carolina in several categories, including points (14.1), rebounds (7.0), and blocked shots (2.0) per game, and also in total free throws made (102) and attempted (136).

> Over the course of the last five games, Silva paces Carolina with 20.2 points and 8.4 rebounds per outing. Gravett is averaging 2.2 3-pointers made as well.

> Also over the last five, Gamecock opponents have hit just 29.1 percent from 3-point range (32-110).

> Graduate student guard Tre Campbell has hit a trio of 3s in each of his last two outings, and also dished a career best seven assists (against just two turnovers) in the road win at Georgia.

Lawson (freshman/guard), T.J. Moss (freshman/guard) and Nathan Nelson (freshman/forward).

> Kentucky is 18-3 on the season, and the Wildcats are 12-0 at home.

> Head coach John Calipari is in his 10th season at Kentucky.

> UK rides an eight-game win streak into Tuesday's matchup, with their last loss coming in the SEC opener at Alabama on Jan. 5.

> In homes games, Kentucky averages 80.6 points per game.

Gamecocks upset ranked Wildcats

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) - Kentucky coach John Calipari thought his freshmen looked like freshmen for the first time all season. South Carolina's Chris Silva continued to look like a major force in the Southeastern Conference who led the Gamecocks' dramatic second-half comeback against the Wildcats.

Silva tied his career high he set earlier this month with 27 points as South Carolina (12-6, 3-3 SEC) rallied from 14 points down in the second half to top No. 18 Kentucky 76-68 on Tuesday night.

Silva "was the difference," Calipari said. "He manhandled everyone we put on him."

It didn't look like it would have an impact midway through the second half when Kevin Knox's short jumper with 12:28 to go put the Wildcats ahead 54-40. But that's when South Carolina, fueled by the powerful, 6-foot-9 Silva, got going and outscored Kentucky (14-4, 4-2) 36-14 the rest of the way to pull off the upset.

Silva had 12 points in that stretch to lift the Gamecocks.

As well as Silva played, Kentucky's vaunted group of freshmen began trying to make the splashy, dramatic play instead of the smart one, Calipari said. As South Carolina gradually cut into the margin, the Wildcats shrunk from the challenge.

"All of a sudden, you've got a bunch of young guys that don't know how to grind it," Calipari said.

That was evident when Wesley Myers' driving layup tied the game at 65-all and he followed that with a second straight layup for the Gamecocks' first lead of the second half, this one ruled good when Kentucky's Nick Richards was called for goaltending.

Maik Kotsar made four straight foul shots to give South Carolina a 71-67 lead and Kentucky could not respond.

"We weren't listening to nothing the coaches were saying," Knox acknowledged.

The Gamecocks broke a four-game losing streak to Kentucky, which managed just three points over the final 6 minutes.

South Carolina coach Frank Martin talked with Silva at halftime, urging him to go straight up and over Kentucky's defenders instead of putting up shots away from the basket. "He told me to go strong and finish," Silva said.

All the Gamecocks seemed to follow Silva's lead.

"Our guys took ownership," Martin said as the Gamecocks won for third time in four games after opening SEC play 0-2.

Frank Booker added 18 points for South Carolina.

Knox led Kentucky with 21 points. No other Wildcat had more than 10 points.

GAMECOCKS ADD THREE DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

> South Carolina head coach Frank Martin announced the signing of Trey Anderson (F - 6-7 - 185 - San Diego, Calif./Mater Dei/Woodstock Academy), Trae Hannibal (G - 6-2 - 200 - Hartsville, S.C./Hartsville) and Wildens Leveque (F - 6-10 - 230 - Brockton, Mass./Gould Academy) to national letters of intent during the early signing period. The trio will join the Gamecocks in 2019.



NUMBER TO KNOW

> The Gamecock defense has put together some impressive stretches of holding opponents without a field goal in SEC play. Carolina held Florida without a field goal the final 7:17 of that contest, and held Auburn without a field goal the final 4:01 of the Jan. 22 win.

17 - Senior guard Hassani Gravett led the Gamecocks in the second half of the big SEC road win at Vandy (Jan. 16), scoring all 17 of his points in the final 20 minutes of action, including nine of Carolina's final 11 points over the final 1:38 of the contest.

14/12 - In their first two road wins this season, the Gamecocks overcame double-digit deficits in each. Carolina was down 14 to Florida with 11:05 to play, and down 12 to Vanderbilt in the first half.

48 - Rookie guard A.J. Lawson scored 25, and senior guard Hassani Gravett added 23, when the Gamecocks posted an 85-79 win over Coastal Carolina Nov. 30. The duo combined for 48 of Carolina's 85, with both guards hitting a career high in the win. Lawson was also 11-of-15 at the line, and Gravett scored the bulk of his points with a 4-of-7 mark from 3-point range.

44 - Carolina scored a then-season high 44 points in the paint in the Dec. 8 matchup at No. 5 Michigan. Leading the charge were the 19 made 2-point baskets by Kotsar (7), Silva (6) and Bryant (2).

2,728 - Carolina's two-game road swing at Wyoming and then at Michigan in early December totaled 2,728 nautical miles roundtrip from Columbia, to Laramie, to Ann Arbor, and back to Columbia..

6 - Junior forward Maik Kotsar blocked a career high six shots in Carolina's Dec. 31st win over North Greenville. His previous career high was three blocks, which he had done twice.

71 - Florida led the SEC in scoring defense entering the matchup in Gainesville on Jan. 5, allowing opponents to register just 59.8 points per game. Carolina's 71 points marked the second-most given up by the Florida defense to that point this season (81 vs. FSU).

81.0% - Through the first seven games of the season, rookie guard A.J. Lawson hit just 57.4 percent (27-47) of his attempts at the foul line, but in the last 14 games, he has connected on 33-of-43 attempts at the line, 76.7 percent.

700/1,000 - Senior forward Chris Silva pulled down seven rebounds in the Dec. 22 matchup vs. Clemson, bringing his career total in the category to 705. Silva became just the 10th Gamecock all-time to record 700 rebounds, and the eighth to pull down 700 and score at least 1,000 points in his career.

7:17 - South Carolina's defense was locked in during the final minutes of the road win at Florida, holding the Gator offense without a made field goal the final 7:17 of the contest.

70 - The trio of Hassani Gravett (23-26), Felipe Haase (19-24) and Chris Silva (46-58), have combined to go 88-of-108 (81.4%) from the free throw line through the first eight games of league play.

SILVA GARNERS PRESEASON ACCOLADES

> Following a standout junior season, senior forward Chris Silva garnered numerous preseason accolades entering the 2018-19 campaign. The Libreville, Gabon, native was named to the Preseason All-SEC First Team by the media and league coaches, while also being named to the Karl Malone Award Watch List, as well as the Naismith Trophy Watch List and the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List as well. For his career, Silva has 16 double-doubles, 56 double-figure scoring games and 39 games with two or more blocks.

LAWSON NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

> Rookie guard A.J. Lawson was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Nov. 19. The Toronto, Ontario, Canada, native averaged 15.7 points, 6.3 rebounds and 5.3 assists against Norfolk State, Providence and George Washington the previous week, including a 19-point, nine rebound, five assist effort in Carolina's win over GW. He began the week tying for game-high honors with 18 points while dishing out a season-high eight assists against Norfolk State, before posting double-figures in both games at the Mohegan Sun Arena. The weekly honor was the first of Lawson's career. It was the first Freshman of the Week award for a Gamecock since Sindarius Thornwell during the 2013-14 campaign.

SILVA NAMED CANDIDATE FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

> South Carolina senior forward Chris Silva has been named one of 30 candidates for the 2018-19 Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

Silva maintains a strong GPA in the classroom as an integrated information technology major at Carolina, along with his accomplishments on the court and in the community. He has participated in numerous community outreach events during his time in the Garnet and Black. On the court, Silva is Carolina's top returning scorer and rebounder from a season ago, and is currently averaging 10.3 points and a team high 5.8 rebounds per contest.

SEC TOURNAMENT

> The SEC Tournament returns to the Music City when Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tenn., hosts the event from March 13-17, 2019. The event was last held in Nashville in 2017. The Gamecocks are 6-7 all-time in SEC Tournament games played at the venue.

Frank Martin was named the head men's basketball coach at the University of South Carolina on March 27, 2012, becoming the 32nd head coach in the history of the South Carolina program, which is in its 111th season as a varsity sport in 2018-19. Martin owns a 230-144 (.614) overall record as a head coach, entering his 12th season overall, and a 113-90 (.556) record entering his seventh season at South Carolina. Martin was named the 2017 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year after leading the Gamecocks to the best season in school history during the 2016-17 campaign, as the squad advanced to the program's first Final Four and recorded a school record 26 wins.

The 2016-17 campaign would go on to be the best season in school history, as the Gamecocks set a school record with 26 wins, advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004, posted the first program win in the NCAA Tournament since 1973, and advanced to the school's first Final Four, falling by just four points, 77-73, to Gonzaga in the national semifinals in Phoenix. South Carolina captured back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since a string of three-straight 20-win campaigns from 2003-2006, and the Gamecocks posted double-digit league victories for just the fifth time since joining the SEC in 1992. South Carolina was ranked in the AP poll for nine weeks and in the coaches poll for 10 weeks during the regular season, and the Gamecocks were ranked No. 6 in the final USA Today Coaches Poll following the Final Four run. Carolina rose to as high as 16th in the AP Poll, which was its highest rank since the Gamecocks were ranked 14th in the final poll of the 1997-98 season.

South Carolina completed its fourth-consecutive winning season in 2017-18, finishing the campaign with a 17-16 mark. The

Gamecocks collected upset wins over No. 18/16 Kentucky and No. 10/11 Auburn at home, while also capturing a road victory at No. 20/22 Florida during league action. Junior forward Chris Silva excelled during the year, leading the Gamecocks in points (14.3) and rebounds (8.0) per game, en route to being named to the All-SEC First Team, the All-Defensive Team and co-Defensive Player of the Year by league coaches.

Silva's First-Team selection marked the third straight season that Carolina has held a place on the First Team, following Michael Carrera's 2016 honor, and Sindarius Thornwell's 2017 selection.

Statistically last season, Carolina ranked among the nation's best, leading the SEC and ranking 23rd nationally with 12.58 offensive rebounds per game. The Gamecocks also excelled at the free throw line, ranking 20th in the nation in free throw attempts and 31st in attempts made at the line. Following the season, seven Gamecocks earned academic laurels from the SEC, continuing Carolina's success in the classroom.

Prior to his appointment in Columbia, Martin spent the previous five seasons as the head coach at Kansas State University, leading the Wildcats to the NCAA Tournament four times, including a trip to the Elite Eight, during the 2009-10 campaign when the squad won a school record 29 contests.

A native of Miami, Fla., Martin earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Florida International in 1993. He and his wife, Anya, have three children, Brandon, a freshman on the men's basketball team at USC Upstate, Amalia and Christian.

- > **Feb. 7, 2017** - The Gamecocks would battle Alabama into a four-overtime contest, with the Crimson Tide eventually closing the 90-86 win. Senior guard Sindarius Thornwell scored 44 points and pulled down 21 rebounds in the game. Carolina would go on to its first Final Four in program history later that season.



COLUMBIA (AP) - Senior guard Hassani Gravett and freshman guard A.J. Lawson scored 18 points apiece and South Carolina whipped Norfolk State 81-64 Tuesday night in its final tuneup before the conclusion of the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame Tipoff.

Justin Minaya scored 10 points and Felipe Haase had nine for the Gamecocks (2-1) while the Spartans (2-2) got 15 points from Nic Thomas. South Carolina swished 11 3-pointers just two games after going 0-for-18 from long range, with Gravett connecting on five and Lawson hitting three.

"Good to come out and play well," South Carolina coach Frank Martin said. "Good to see us play through our principles through the first 32, 33 minutes of the game."

Norfolk wilted under the barrage after a first half where it could have stayed closer because of South Carolina foul trouble. Starting bigs Chris Silva and Maik Kotsar were each on the bench but the Spartans were 14-of-22 from the free-throw line, allowing South Carolina to take a 14-point lead into halftime.

"We make those, theoretically, it's a whole different game," Spartans coach Robert Jones said. "We were perfect in the second half."

The lead swelled to as many as 28 in the second half as the Gamecocks cruised to the finish. Norfolk State used a multiple zone look, trying to confuse South Carolina and shut down the reliance on Silva and Kotsar.

It mostly worked, the two combining for 16 points. But when the Gamecocks' guards were firing 3-pointers over the zones, the Spartans had to answer.

They hit 10-of-22 3-pointers but most were at the end with the result already decided. "They weren't making those shots earlier in the year," Jones said.

Martin was glad to see his young team handle another night where Silva and Kotsar weren't large factors.

"When I had the open shot, I shot it," said Gravett, who was one off his career-high. "Everything felt good and it just went in for me."

COLUMBIA (AP) - South Carolina's A.J. Lawson and Hassani Gravett each notched a career-high in points as the Gamecocks held on to beat Coastal Carolina 85-79 on Friday night.

Lawson was scoreless in South Carolina's last game, but with preseason All-SEC selection Chris Silva again in early foul trouble Friday, he shouldered the scoring load with 25 points against the Chanticleers. Gravett added 23.

"We know that this team, right now, the game goes through Silva and (forward Maik) Kotsar," Coastal coach Cliff Ellis said. "You got to make other people beat you. Well, Gravett did what he's supposed to do."

This time, the Cavaliers made it a perfect 10.

Ty Jerome scored a second-high 25 points, Kyle Guy had 18 and No. 5 Virginia beat South Carolina 69-52 on Wednesday night to improve to 10-0 for the first time in four years.

"I think it speaks to our system and experience," Jerome said. "We know if we're not right on any night, we can get beat. So it's just a matter of getting better each day, no matter who we're playing."

Jerome pushed the pace early with 13 points in the first 12 minutes, helping the Cavaliers to a 22-12 lead. But the Gamecocks scored 14 of the next 19 points, pulling within one on Alanzo Frink's first 3-pointer of the season with 3:23 left in the half.

Reed, the team's leading scorer this season, had missed the past three games since spraining his left knee late in a win over St. Peter's on Dec. 4. But he showed few effects of the injury after entering the game about three minutes in helping the Tigers (9-3) open a double-digit lead by halftime.

The Gamecocks (4-7) cut a 16-point Clemson lead 73-68 on Chris Silva's inside bucket with 44.1 seconds left. But the Tigers responded two foul shots by David Skara and a jam by Aamir Simms to seal the win.

Skara had 14 points and Elijah Thomas had 10 of his 11 points in the second half for Clemson.

Silva had 18 points for South Carolina, which lost its fourth in a row and second straight to an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent following a 69-52 defeat to No. 5 Virginia this past Wednesday night.

Reed warmed up with a brace on his left knee and after entering the game the senior quickly got into the flow with a bucket two minutes later and finished the half with 13 points.

The Tigers struggled at times to control Silva down low - and trailed 30-29 after Silva completed a 3-point play with 5:09 to play.

But Clemson closed the half with a 16-4 run the rest of the half to lead the break ahead 45-34.

Skara had a pair of 3s in the surge while John Newman III and Shelton Mitchell each added a long-range basket.

COLUMBIA (AP) - After a month of defeats, South Carolina was anxious for a win - no matter who it came against.

The Gamecocks got 22 points from freshman A.J. Lawson and 21 from Chris Silva to end a four-game losing streak with a 97-46 rout of Division II North Greenville on Monday.

"This felt really good," Lawson said.

Especially after South Carolina's (5-7) struggles since its last win on Nov. 30, a stretch that included defeats to No. 2 Michigan, No. 4 Virginia and state rival Clemson. It made no difference to the Gamecocks if the opponent was from a lower division or the NBA, they just wanted success.

"It was important," South Carolina coach Frank Martin said. "At this place, losing is unacceptable and no one was in a real good mood."

Things lightened up quickly against the Crusaders, who fell behind 13-2 and never rallied.

Competition will pick up quickly, too, as the Gamecocks start Southeastern Conference play Saturday night.

"We practiced really hard and played really hard at practice," Silva said. "It didn't always translate in the game."

Still, the contest, which North Greenville (1-10) counted as an exhibition, turned into one right away as the bigger, stronger Gamecocks came out fast. Tre Campbell and A.J. Lawson had 3-pointers in the first four minutes as South Carolina opened up a big lead.

There were the predictable, on court moments where South Carolina's SEC pedigree was obvious. North Greenville sophomore guard Daniko Jackson, at 5-foot-10, dribbled to the basket where 6-9 Silva and 7-1 Jason Cudd were waiting.

Jackson's shot attempt was quickly knocked away.

Then again, the Crusaders kept their heads up. After North Greenville's Rodrick Howell blocked 6-9 Felipe Haase shot, he took off down the court and finished an alley-oop bucket after a sweet pass from Ryan Mobley.

By then, South Carolina was ahead by 21 points and not letting up.

These Division II contests have been a tradition of Martin, a high-profile shout out to in-state programs that generally fly under the radar. South Carolina has played Coker, Francis Marion, Lander and Limestone the previous few seasons, all in late December - and all, as expected, sizeable Gamecock wins.

North Greenville coach Chad Lister appreciated the first-class treatment and opportunity his team got from South Carolina. "It was a good day for us," he said. "And that's hard to admit when you lose as bad as we lost."

Caleb Arrington had 13 points to lead North Greenville.

Things turned scary for the Gamecocks in the second half when Silva, a senior who was the SEC's co-defensive player of the year last winter, hit the floor hard and did not get up quickly. Martin and the training staff came out to check and Silva eventually walked it off to the bench. He stayed on the sidelines the rest of the way.

Silva said his knee was fine. "It will be sore," he said.

Bryant had a steal and a dunk, a layup and a jumper to cap a 9-0 run that tied the game at 65.

South Carolina took its first lead since scoring the first point of the game on Silva's dunk with 3:39 remaining.

Noah Locke led Florida with 17 points. KeVaughn Allen and Andrew Nemhard added 10 apiece.

The Gators led by as many as 13 points in the first half thanks mostly to six 3-pointers. But they went cold down the stretch - much like they did late in the game - and allowed South Carolina to whittle the lead to 34-32 on Maik Kotsar's putback with 23 seconds remaining. Allen answered on the other end with a driving layup, making it a four-point game at the break.

It was a sloppy start, with the teams combining to miss 36 shots and turning the ball over 26 times.
