Career

- Did not miss a game in his four-year career, playing in all 51 games with 35 starts
- Totaled 224 tackles, 41.0 TFL, 31.5 sacks, 15 quarterback hurries, 11 forced fumbles, eight PBUs, two fumble recoveries, one blocked kick and one interception in his four-year career
- Helped lead UK to three straight bowl games for the first time since going to five in a row from 2006-2010
- Helped lead UK to a 10-win season, which included a win over Penn State in the 2018 VRBO Citrus Bowl ... Marked the most wins in 41 years
- Broke UK's career sacks record with 31.5
- Broke UK's single-season sacks record in '18 with 17
- Moved up to No. 9 on the SEC's career sacks list
- Had 41 tackles for loss which ranks second all-time at UK, behind Oliver Barnett's 43
- Forced 11 fumbles, tying Danny Trevathan for the UK career record (forced fumble stats available since 1988)
- Named a consensus First-Team All-American in 2018, UK's first consensus All-American since wide receiver/kick returner Derek Abney in 2002 and the first unanimous selection since defensive lineman Art Still in 197
- Swept the national defensive player of the year awards in 2018 as he was honored with the Bronko Nagurski Award, the Chuck Bednarik Award, the Ronnie Lott IMPACT Trophy and the Jack Lambert Award ... UK's first winner in every category
- SEC Defensive Player of the Year and First-Team All-SEC selection in 2018

2018 - Senior (Team Captain)

- Started in all 13 games
- Had a team-high 88 total tackles, 17 quarterback sacks, 21.5 TFL, seven QB hurries, five forced fumbles, four pass breakups and two fumble recoveries
- Led the SEC in quarterback sacks, tackles for loss, and forced fumbles
- His 17 sacks were the most by an SEC player in a single season since the NCAA started official sack records in 2000
- Ranked second nationally in sacks, fourth in fumbles forced and sixth in TFL
- Thirteen of his 17 sacks were in the second half, four in the third quarter and nine in the fourth quarter

- UK did not allowed a point on all 17 opponent possessions that he had a sack

- Named Walter Camp Football Foundation National Defensive Player of the Week after charting a then career-best 11 tackles (nine solo), including a pair of quarterback sacks both of which caused fumbles, in the win over Missouri
- Named SEC Defensive Player of the Week four times after wins over Florida, Mississippi State, South Carolina and Missouri
- Had a career-high 15 tackles, including a pair of quarterback sacks for -12 yards vs. MTSU
- Had eight tackles, four tackles for loss (-19), including a career-best three quarterback sacks (-17), one fumble caused and one quarterback hurry in the win over South Carolina
- First UK player with three sacks in an SEC game since Marlon McCree vs. South Carolina in 1998
- First UK player with four tackles for loss in any game since Marlon McCree vs. Florida in 1998
- Totaled six tackles, two tackles for loss, a quarterback sack, a pass breakup and a QB hurry in the win over No. 14 Mississippi State
- Had five tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, one QB sack, one fumble caused, one pass breakup and one

- quarterback hurry in the win at No. 25 Florida
- His QB sack on the game's final play caused a fumble that UK returned for a touchdown, clinching the win for the Wildcats ... Also had a key pass breakup on a two-point conversion in the fourth quarter

- Ended the season as UK's seventh-leading tackler with 62
- Led the team and tied for 12th in the SEC in sacks with 7.0
- Third on the team in tackles for loss with 8.5 for 49 yards
- Recorded seven or more tackles in four games, while he had a tackle for loss in nine of Kentucky's 13 games
- Forced four fumbles, leading the SEC in that category
- Made his first career start at Florida

2015 - Freshman

- Played in all 12 games as a reserve linebacker and contributor on special teams
- Had four tackles, including 1.5 tackles for a loss and half a sack

- Explosive prospect led the state of New Jersey in quarterback sacks

- As a defensive end, he had 75 total tackles with 21 tackles for loss plus 22.5 sacks
- Also had six passes defended and one fumble recovery
- Helped Montclair claim its third-straight North Jersey Section 1, Group 5 Championship in 2014

- Key cog in the offensive line unit who blocked for All-American Benny Snell Jr., the first Wildcat to rush for 1,000 or more yards in three straight seasons
- Part of a senior class (2015-18) who totaled 29 wins, the second-most of any senior class since freshmen became eligible in 1972 ... Only the 2009 class, which won 30 games, has more
- Graduated in December of 2018 with a degree in community and leadership development

2018 - Senior (Team Captain)

- Started at right tackle in 12 games ... Did not play in the Louisville game due to injury
- Two-time SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week
- Earned SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week after grading at 90 percent in UK's 24-10 win over South Carolina ... Had two knockdown blocks and 19 blocks at the point of attack .. Had no missed assignments and did not allow a quarterback sack

- or pressure ... Also had a key block to help spring A.J. Rose's 24-yard touchdown run
- Named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time after grading at 89 percent in the win over Vanderbilt ... Had three knockdown blocks and 23 blocks at the point of attack ... Played every offensive snap without an assignment error; also did not have any penalties or allow any quarterback sacks or pressures ... Helped Benny Snell Jr., rush for 169 yards, including a key block on Snell's game-winning seven-yard touchdown run

2017 - Junior

- Participated in the Semper Fidelis All-American Bowl in January 2015 after being named a Semper Fidelis All-American

- Totaled 148 tackles, 25 PBUs, 6.0 TFL, six interceptions, two forced fumbles, and two quarterback hurries in his career
- Helped the senior class win 29 games over the last four seasons, the second-most of any senior class since freshmen became eligible in 1972, trailing on the 2009 class with 30 wins

One of just 28 members in UK's 1,000-yard receiving club
Graduated in December of 2018 with a degree in community and leadership development

- Had two catches at Louisville, becoming the 16th player with at least 100 receptions in a career
