- The Kentucky series is UT's oldest and most-played among SEC opponents. The Vols and Wildcats first met on Feb. 5, 1910, and have clashed 226 times over the years.
- On 11 different occasions—first in 1950 and most recently in 2017—Tennessee has defeated a Kentucky team ranked in the AP top five.
- No program in college basketball has logged more wins over Kentucky than Tennessee (71).
- Kentucky is one of only two SEC schools (along with Alabama) to lead its all-time series against the Volunteers.
- Four Tennessee All-Americans were Kentucky natives:
 Allan Houston, Chris Lofton, Danny Schultz and Paul "Lefty" Walther.
- Tennessee has 14 all-time wins over the Wildcats at Thompson-Boling Arena, including three straight.

THE VOLS MAKE FOR A HOT TICKET

- Tennessee's nine true road games this season have drawn an average of 14,412 fans, which comes out to an average capacity of 95.9 percent.
- Games at Memphis, Florida, Vanderbilt, South Carolina, Kentucky, LSU and Ole Miss were at or above capacity.

SECOND TIME'S A CHARM

- Over the last two seasons, Rick Barnes and his staff have guided the Volunteers to a 9-0 record in regular-season rematch games (SEC Tournament games not included).
- Tennessee was 5-0 when facing SEC foes for a second time last season, and the Vols are 4-0 so far this year (wins over Missouri, Florida, South Carolina and Vanderbilt).

PROGRAM-RECORD WIN STREAK

- Tennessee strung together a program-record 19-game win streak from Nov. 28 through Feb. 13. When it ended, with a loss at fifth-ranked Kentucky on Feb. 16, it was the longest active win streak in Division I.
- The Vols' eight-game win streak in <u>true road games</u> was the second-longest in program history.
- Tennessee's 24-game <u>home</u> win streak remains the third-longest active streak in Division I. Houston has won 33 straight at home; Buffalo has won 25 straight home contests.

TENNESSEE'S FIELD-GOAL PERCENTAGE THROUGH THE ROOF

- During last season's SEC title run, Tennessee shot better than 50 percent from the field in nine games.
- This season, the Vols have shot better than 50 percent in 17 games—including seven SEC games.
- The Vols lead the SEC and rank third in the country in field-goal percentage (.505).
- Tennessee's top shooting performance this season came at Texas A&M on Feb. 2, when the Big Orange shot .645 (40-62).
- In that win in College Station, the Vols shot 74 percent (31 of 42) on two-point field goals.

TENNESSEE RANKS AMONG NATION'S BEST, STATISTICALLY

- Tennessee ranks second in the country in assist/ turnover ratio (1.68) and third in field-goal percentage (.505) and. The Vols rank fourth nationally in assists per game (18.9 apg) and sixth in blocks per game (5.4 bpg). UT is eighth in scoring margin (15.1 ppg).
- The Big Orange also rank prominently nationally in scoring offense (15th, 83.2 ppg) and free-throw percentage (13th, .765).
- According to KenPom, Tennessee ranks third nationally in offensive efficiency.

FRESHMEN SCORING FREEZE

- No freshman has scored a point for Tennessee this season.
- True freshman D.J. Burns (who should technically be a high school senior) is redshirting, and redshirt freshman Zach Kent is working his way back from preseason surgery.
- The last Tennessee team to go an entire season with a single point scored by a freshman was the 1972-73 squad. Ironically, that was the first year that freshman were eligible to compete on the varsity team.

ABOUT KENTUCKY

PJ Washington

- John Calipari's squad has been playing the best basketball of any team in the country as of late, winning 14 of its last 15 games. In non-conference play, UK logged ranked wins over North Carolina. Louisville and Kansas. Kentucky dropped its first matchup of the SEC slate but responded by winning its next nine.
- Sophomore forward **P.J. Washington** (15.0 ppg, 7.8 rpg, 1.1 bpg) has inserted himself into the National Player of the Year conversation with his impressive play lately. As the team's leading scorer and rebounder, Washington has scored at least 20 points in seven of the last 10 games and has recorded three of his seven double-doubles during that stretch.
- Forward **Keldon Johnson** (13.6 ppg, 5.7 rpg, 1.6 apg) gave the Vols fits in the first matchup with 19 points. He is one of several talented freshmen on the team. The backcourt duo of **Ashton Hagans** (7.6 ppg, 4.4 apg, 2.2 rpg, 1.9 spg) and Tyler Herro (14.2 ppg, 4.4 rpg, 2.3 apg, 1.0 spg) leads Kentucky in assists and steals per game and has been crucial in the maturation of the team.
- · In a freshman class that featured multiple guards, UK needed some depth in the frontcourt and landed graduate transfer forward and All-Pac 12 performer **Reid Travis** (11.3 ppg, 6.9 rpg, .516 FG%) from Stanford. Travis also brings much-needed experience to the Wildcats, who also returned several pieces from last season's SEC Tournament Championship squad.
- Kentucky plays a similar style to Tennessee. UT ranks first in the SEC in field-goal percentage and fieldgoal percentage defense, while UK ranks second (.480 FG%, .402 FG% defense). In scoring defense, the Wildcats are second in the conference, holding opponents to an average of 64.9 points per game.

LAST MEETING VS. KENTUCKY

- After the best run in program history, Tennessee's 19-game win streak came to an end on Feb. 16, 2019, with an 86-69 loss against No. 5 Kentucky in Rupp
- The Wildcats opened the second half with a 14-0 run and never looked back, handing the Vols their first loss in conference play.
- Jordan Bone was the leading scorer for UT, finishing with 19 points and six assists. Admiral Schofield added 17 points and six rebounds. Grant Williams was Tennessee's other double-digit scorer with 16 points, eight rebounds, two assists and two steals.
- · Kentucky was on fire in the first 3:24 of the second half, building a 20-point lead. Tennessee used a 13-0 run to cut the deficit to 11 points, but the swing in momentum was too much for UT to overcome.
- Kentucky sophomore PJ Washington led all scorers with 23 points on 9-of-12 shooting, while freshman **Keldon Johnson** added 19 points for the Wildcats.
- Tennessee struggled out of the gate, shooting 3-of-10 from the floor compared to Kentucky's 7-of-12. Overall for the period, the Wildcats outshot the Vols 59 percent to 47 percent. Despite the slow start, UT was able to keep the game within striking distance with several timely shots.
- · Kentucky found plenty of success on the glass in the opening half, out-rebounding the Big Orange, 17-11. Washington was a force in the paint for UK, posting 13 points of 6-of-7 shooting to go along with three boards and two blocks. Johnson also had 13 points in the half behind a trio of 3-pointers.
- · Williams hit a pair of clutch threes earlier in the half to counter the Wildcats' momentum. He, along with Bone and Schofield, led the Vols in scoring with eight points each, as Kentucky hit seven of its final eight shots to take a 37-31 lead into halftime.

MEMORABLE VOL PERFORMANCES AGAINST KENTUCKY

- Kevin Punter Jr.'s 27 points were the most scored by a Vol against the Kentucky in 10 years as Tennessee defeated the Wildcats, 84-77, Feb. 2, 2016, in Knoxville. The senior point guard made three 3-pointers and was 11-of-12 at the free-throw line.
- · Chris Lofton reeled off 31 points, Major Wingate scored 12 and longtime NBA point guard C.J. Watson added 10 as No. 11 Tennessee beat Kentucky 75-67 at Rupp Arena on Feb. 7, 2006.
- Beating the Wildcats was three times as nice during the 1978-79 season. UT notched program win No. 900 in Lexington on Jan. 20, 66-55, before topping UK 101-84 in Knoxville on Feb. 17. Then the Vols won the 1979 SEC Tournament with a 75-69 win over UK in Birmingham, Alabama, on March 3. Current Vol Network radio analyst Bert Bertelkamp was a junior on that Tennessee team.
- As **Bernard King** walked off the court at Memorial Gym after a deflating 88-82 loss on Jan. 13, 1975, a Kentucky fan flipped a lit cigarette into the Tennessee legend's hair. Outraged, King vowed he would never lose to Kentucky again. He vigorously carried out that promise, finishing his career 5-1 against the Wildcats.

BARNES + CALIPARI = 1,300+ WINS

- · Saturday's game features the two winningest coaches (total career Division I wins) in the SEC.
- John Calipari is the league's active leader in career wins, with 702. Rick Barnes is a close second with 686 victories to his credit.
- · Among all active Division I head coaches, Calipari and Barnes rank sixth and seventh, respectively, in total head coaching wins.
- · Barnes and Calipari became friends while working a Pitt basketball camp in the late 1970s. The star player at that camp? Current Arizona head coach Sean Miller.

PONS' SUFFERS FACIAL FRACTURE

- Sophomore swingman Yves Pons suffered a facial fracture in practice on Feb. 7 and underwent corrective surgery on Feb. 8. He missed the Florida game on Feb.
 9 before returning with a custom facemask.
- Pons is averaging 13.7 minutes per game this year and is shooting a healthy .542 from the field.
- 15 of his 32 made field goals this season are dunks.
- The most athletically gifted player on Tennessee's roster, Pons can guard all five positions.
- Tennessee is 13-0 when Pons is in the starting lineup.

MIDSEASON TURN-AROUND

- Due to a nagging shoulder injury Lamonté Turner was held out the first three games of the season before returning for UT's game against Louisville in the NIT Season Tip-Off. The reigning SEC co-Sixth Man of the Year looked like his old self, dropping 13 points behind a trio of 3-pointers, with four assists and two steals.
- During the next two games, Turner shot 5-of-24 (.208) from the field and 2-of-17 (.118) from beyond the arc. His shoulder was still giving him trouble, so Turner was inactive for Tennessee's next six games.
- He returned to the lineup for the SEC opener against Georgia, quietly scoring six points in the blowout win.
- Since then, Turner has looked like the scoring threat that made him so dangerous off the bench last season.
- Against West Virginia on Jan. 26, he made his first start since his freshman season and totaled 23 points, five assists, two steals and a block.
- In SEC games, he is shooting 44 percent from the floor, 33 percent from 3-point range, has hit multiple 3-pointers nine times and is averaging 11.3 points per game.

THE DOUBLE-DOUBLE CLUB

- Four different players on Tennessee's roster have combined to record 15 double-doubles this season.
- Grant Williams leads the way with six, followed by Admiral Schofield with four. Kyle Alexander and Jordan Bone each have three. Each of Bone's three double-doubles were of the points/assists variety.
- Interestingly, Tennessee's Lady Vols have <u>five</u> players who have logged a double-double this season.

DOUBLE-DIGIT DEFICITS RARE

• Only two teams this season have managed to build a double-digit lead on the Vols.

GRANT'S 'AND-1's' ARE AUTOMATIC

- National Player of the Year candidate Grant Williams has dozens of noteworthy statistics and accomplishments this season, but here is one the most impressive...
- Williams has successfully converted on 29 of 30 "and-1" attempts (.967). If he's fouled on a made basket, the resulting free throw has been almost automatic.

WILLIAMS THRIVES AT DRAWING CONTACT

- One of **Grant Williams'** greatest strengths is his ability to draw contact and get to the free-throw line.
- 32 percent of his points this season (172 of 535) have come at the free-throw line.
- In his career, Williams has attempted 608 free throws, which ranks 20th among active Division I players. He shoots 76 percent from the line (460 for 608).
- No junior in all of Division I has attempted or made more career free throws than Williams.
- Williams ranks 13th in Division I in fouls drawn per 40 minutes (7.0).

WILLIAMS HAS CHANCE TO JOIN ELITE SEC COMPANY

- **Grant Williams** has the opportunity to join a prestigious group of players in SEC history this year by being named SEC Player of the Year in back-to-back seasons.
- Williams, who was named the SEC POY by the league coaches last year, would be the first player to do so since Arkansas' Corliss Williamson in 1994 and 1995.
- In total, only nine players have accomplished the achievement since the award was first started in 1965, including VFLs Bernard King and Dale Ellis and other alltime greats such as Williamson, Pete Maravich and Shaq.
- If Williams were to win the award again, he would tie the Volunteers with LSU for the most players by a team (3) to earn the achievement in back-to-back seasons in SEC history.
- And IF Williams were to win the award again this season, he would have a chance to join an even more exclusive and elite group of players during his senior campaign. King (1975-77) and Maravich (1968-70) are the only players to ever win the award in three consecutive seasons.

 He is the highest-rated prospect to sign with UT since current Los Angeles Clippers forward Tobias Harris signed with the Vols in November of 2009.
- James is the eighth Tennessee signee ever to earn McDonald's All-America honors and the first of Rick Barnes' four-year tenure on Rocky Top.

BOWDEN PLAYS TO HIS STRENGTHS

- Junior wing **Jordan Bowden** is one of Tennessee's top perimeter defenders and shooters
- The Knoxville native is shooting .351 from 3-point range and is 61-for-69 (.884) from the free-throw-line.
- Bowden owns a 2.48 assist/turnover ratio, having recorded 62 assists and 25 turnovers.
- A starter all of last year, Bowden transitioned to a bench role five games into this season and has provided a spark off the bench.
- The absence of Lamonté Turner (shoulder) during the month of December led to Bowden logging minutes as Jordan Bone's backup at the point guard position.

TENNESSEE TIES ITS SECOND-LARGEST SEC MARGIN OF VICTORY

- In this year's SEC opener on Jan. 5, Tennessee posted a convincing win over Georgia, defeating the Dawgs by 46 points, 96-50.
- The Vols scored more points in the first half (53) than UGA scored in the entire game (50).

MUSIC CITY LINE DANCE

- Grant Williams enjoyed a record-setting night at the free-throw line on Jan. 23 to lead the Vols to an overtime road win at Vanderbilt's Memorial Gym.
- Williams was a perfect 23-of-23 at the line, setting an SEC record for most free-throw makes without a miss in a single game.
- It was the second-most makes ever in a single game by an SEC player and the third-most makes ever in an SEC intraconference game.
- It also was the most makes without a mess in a single game by a Division I player in 60 years (since Oklahoma State's Arlen Clark went 24-of-24 on March 7, 1959.
- Williams drew an incredible 14 fouls in the win, and he attempted and made more free throws than Vanderbilt's entire team (13 of 21).

FUTURE FOES

- Tennessee this season announced upcoming homeand-home series with Cincinnati and Wisconsin. Both series will begin next season, when the Vols travel to Cincinnati and host the Badgers.
- The Vols also are set to join Florida State, Purdue and VCU at the 2019 Emerald Coast Classic in Niceville, Florida, during Thanksgiving Weekend.
- Tennessee also will host in-state foe Memphis next season for the second of three games under the current series contract.

STRENGTH COACH MEDENWALD WAS A TWO-SPORT STANDOUT

- Vols strength and conditioning coach Garrett Medenwald has an impressive history as a two-sport collegiate student-athlete.
- At Division III Wisconsin-Stevens Point, he was an outfielder for the baseball team, which won the Midwest Regional and finished fifth at the 2010 NCAA Division III College World Series.
- As a football running back at Division III Wisconsin-Whitewater, he helped lead the Warhawks to back-toback national championships in 2010 and 2011.
- Medenwald finished his football career at Whitewater holding several program weight room records in cleans, snatch, split jerk, bench press, pro agility, broad jump, vertical jump and 40-yard dash.
- Also an elite powerlifter, Medenwald was a national qualifier in Olympic weightlifting.

VOLS ENJOYED BEST-EVER SEC START

 Tennessee's 11-0 start to SEC play was its best start in program history.

BRAGGING RIGHTS

- Tennessee has won its most recent regular-season meeting against 10 of 13 SEC opponents.
- Auburn, Kentucky and LSU are the only teams to hand the Vols a loss in their last regular-season clash.

LANIER GIVES VOLS ADDITIONAL HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Rick Barnes isn't the only person on Tennessee's bench with Division I head coaching experience.
- Associate head coach **Rob Lanier** was the head coach at Siena from 2001-05.
- During that span, the Saints posted a 58-70 mark, and advanced to one NCAA Tournament and one NIT.
- Under Lanier, Siena also won the 2002 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Tournament Championship.

VOLS LOGGED SIGNATURE WIN OVER TOP-RANKED GONZAGA

- Admiral Schofield exploded for a career-high 30 points—with 25 coming in the second half—to lift Tennessee past No. 1-ranked Gonzaga in Phoenix on Dec. 9. Schofield also drained a career-high six 3-pointers.
- Tennessee held the high-powered Bulldogs to 73 points. On the season, Gonzaga ranks third in the country with a scoring offense of 94.1 points per game.
- Schofield became just the second Vol ever to score 30 or more points against the nation's top-ranked team.
- **Grant Williams** flirted with a triple-double, finishing with 16 points, 12 rebounds and seven assists before fouling out with 2:30 left to play.
- The win was Rick Barnes' first head coachign victory over the nation's top-ranked team, and it marked Tennessee's fifth all-time win over the nation's No. 1 team. All-American Carl Widseth scored 32 in a triumph over No. 1 Kentucky on Jan. 23, 1954).
- **Jordan Bone** dished out nine assists (that led directly to 25 points) and also scored five points on his own.
- The Bulldogs were led by Rui Hachimura (21 points, eight rebounds) and Brandon Clarke (21 points, nine rebounds).
- This season marked the first time in program history that Tennessee played multiple opponents ranked in the top five of the Associate Press poll before the start of conference play. Tennessee fell in overtime to No. 2 Kansas in New York City on Nov. 23 before upsetting top-ranked and previously unbeaten Gonzaga.
- Following the win, Tennessee was named the NABC Division I National Team of the Week, and Schofield was named the Oscar Robertson National POW.

NEW THROWBACK UNIFORMS

- When the Vols took the court in Brooklyn for the NIT Season Tip-Off, they debuted a brand new throwback uniform that resembled those worn by Tennessee teams in the 1980s and 90s.
- Some notable VFLs who wore similar unis—which feature the arc'd words "Tennessee Volunteers" in orange lettering above and below the jersey numbers—include all-time leading scorer Allan Houston (1989-93) and third-leading scorer Tony White (1983-87).
- The Vols are 10-0 this season in their throwback threads, with wins over Louisville, Wake Forest, Georgia, Arkansas, Alabama, West Virginia, Missouri, Florida, South Carolina and Vanderbilt.
- In that uniform, Tennessee averages 81.9 points per game and owns a +16.3 scoring margin.

VOL FANS EAGER TO PACK TBA

- Two of Tennessee's home games this season sold out before the end of October: West Virginia (Jan. 26) and Kentucky (March 2)
- UT's home games against Georgia (Jan. 5), Alabama (Jan. 19) and Florida (Feb. 9) also each sold out before the start of SEC play.
- Last season, three of the Vols' home games were sellouts: North Carolina (Dec. 17), Kentucky (Jan. 6) and Georgia (March 3)

20,000 STRONG

- Since Rick Barnes was named head coach prior to the 2015-16 campaign, Tennessee has played in front of nine home crowds of 20,000 or larger. That includes six games this season.
- Tennessee has played in front of 59 home crowds larger than 20,000 over the last 13 seasons.

COMMITMENT TO BASKETBALL

- Prior to the 2007-08 season, UT added a basketball-only practice facility, Pratt Pavilion, which houses two full-size gyms as well as an athletic training room, weight room and film-study room.
- Construction of Pratt Pavilion also marked the beginning of the "first phase" of renovations to Thompson-Boling Arena. This \$19 million phase included the addition of 32 luxury suites located in the north balcony, a loge area just below the suites that includes 166 side court seats, new seats for the entire arena, a \$3 million center-hung scoreboard and concourse refurbishments, such as graphics and other amenities.
- In the "second phase" of Thompson-Boling Arena renovations, the athletics department overhauled the men's and women's basketball offices during the 2010-11 campaign, creating a new and impressive "front door" for both programs.
- New to Thompson-Boling Arena for the 2013-14 season was a 360-degree LED ribbon board that runs along the bottom of the upper deck.
- In March of 2014, Thompson-Boling Arena became the third college basketball arena to install an LED lighting system, which features fixtures that are smaller, brighter, and up to 85 percent more efficient than conventional arena metal halide lights.
- The weight room in Pratt Pavilion was renovated and expanded to 4,350 square feet in the summer of 2016. Additions include a full-court-length stretch of synthetic turf, a custom rubber floor, a 40-foot, steel-reinforced throwing wall, six Keiser Functional Trainers, four TRUEStretch Cages, three custom, 10foot Power Lift pulley units (ideal for taller student-athletes), seven sets of 90-pound PowerBlocks and a zoned, high-powered stereo system.
- In September 2018, work concluded on a \$5 million locker-room renovation at Thompson-Boling Arena. In addition to the beautifully revamped spaces for the men's and women's teams, the Larry Pratt Basketball Locker Room Complex also includes an athletic training facility featuring world-class hydrotherapy systems.

VOLS WELL REPRESENTED IN THE NBA

- Multiple Tennessee alums will have a presence in the NBA during the 2018-19 season—highlighted by Philadelphia 76ers forward Tobias Harris (2010-11) and Miami Heat guard Josh Richardson (2011-15)
- Harris is in the midst on his eighth NBA season. He
 was the leading scorer for the Los Angeles Clippers
 this season before being traded to Philly on Feb. 6. He
 is averaging a career-best 20.9 points per game this
 season.
- Richardson is in his fourth NBA season—all with Miami. In his first three years in the league, the 25-year-old has appeared in 186 games and averaged 10.3 points, 3.0 rebounds and 2.4 assists. He also shoots at a .376 clip from 3-point range. His averages for points, rebounds and assists have improved every year as a pro, and he earned 81 starting assignments last season.
- Guard Jordan McRae signed a two-way deal with the Washington Wizards this past offseason. McRae won a championship with the Cleveland Cavaliers in 2016.

GRUNFELD, HOUSTON REPPING UT IN NBA FRONT OFFICE ROLES

- A pair of Tennessee alums continue lengthy tenures as NBA front-office executives in 2018-19.
- Washington Wizards President **Ernie Grunfeld** (1973-77) enters his 16th season as the team's top executive.
- And New York Knicks Assistant GM Allan Houston (1989-93) continues to play a key insider's role with that franchise. Houston also serves as GM of the Knicks' NBA G League affiliate, the Westchester Knicks.

THREE VOLS ACTIVE IN NBA G LEAGUE

- Tennessee has three alums currently active in the NBA G League.
- Those players are **Devon Baulkman** (Westchester Knicks), **Scotty Hopson** (Oklahoma City Blue) and **Jarnell Stokes** (Sioux Falls SkyForce).
- Hopson in early December took a break from G-League action and helped the United States qualify for the 2019 FIBA World Cup as a member of USA Basketball's World Cup Qualifying Team.

- True freshman forward D.J. Burns was 17 years old when he enrolled at Tennessee this past summer. He is redshirting this season.
- Born Oct. 13, 2000, he is tied as the seventh-youngest men's basketball player in Division I this season.

COMPREHENSIVE EXCELLENCE

- The Tennessee's men's basketball team entered the season with its highest AP preseason ranking ever at No. 6, but the now-seventh-ranked hoops squad isn't the only team enjoying success on Rocky Top this year.
- Nine UT teams are currently ranked in the 2018-19 top 25 of their respective sports—four ranked in the top 10.
- Those teams include men's basketball (7th, AP), soccer (7th, United Soccer Coaches), softball (7th, NFCA), women's swimming (9th, CSCAA), men's swimming (11th, CSCAA), men's tennis (15th, ITA), volleyball (19th, AVCA), men's golf (20th, GCAA) and women's track (20th, USTFCCCA).

QUICK LOOK BACK AT 2017-18

- Tennessee was tied as the fifth-youngest team in the nation last season (in terms of class/eligibility), and the Volunteers were picked in the preseason to finish 13th in the SEC race.
- In Rick Barnes' third season, the Vols exceeded expectations by winning an SEC regular-season championship, earning a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament and landing at No. 10 in the year-end RPI.

BARNES RECEIVES EXTENSION, RAISE

- Tennessee Director of Athletics Phillip Fulmer and Rick Barnes agreed on a new contract in September that will keep Barnes at the helm of the Volunteers' program through the 2023-24 season and placed him among the 10 highest-paid coaches in the nation.
- Barnes also requested, and was granted, an increased salary pool for his assistants and staff.

BARNES 22nd ON DIVISION I WINS LIST

- With Tennessee's 92-81 win over Louisville in New York City on Nov. 21, 2018, Rick Barnes passed legendary UCLA head coach John Wooden on the all-time Division I wins list.
- It was Barnes's 665th career victory, which ranked 26th all-time.
- Barnes currently ranks 22nd on the list with 686 wins.
- He is now chasing Phog Allen and Don Haskins, each of whom totaled 719 career wins and are tied for 20th.

POSTSEASON RUN COULD PUT BARNES IN ELITE COMPANY

- Rick Barnes has the opportunity to join an elite club this season. If Tennessee were to make the Sweet Sixteen, Barnes would become the 11th head coach to lead at least three different teams to a Round of 16 appearance (Clemson, Texas, Tennessee).
- Barnes is one of five coaches who could potentially lead their third school to the Round of 16 this season, joining Mike Anderson (Arkansas), Cliff Ellis (Coastal Carolina), Mark Gottfried (Cal State Northridge) and Bruce Pearl (Auburn).
- The 10 coaches who have led at least three different schools to the Round of 16 are: Lon Kruger (has done it with four schools), Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Frank McGuire, Ralph Miller, Rick Pitino, Bill Self, Eddie Sutton, Tubby Smith and Bruce Weber.

UNDER BARNES, VOLS ARE 44-11 AS A RANKED TEAM

 Tennessee has played 54 games as a ranked team (AP poll) under head coach **Rick Barnes**, and the Vols are 44-11 (.800) in those contests.

BARNES IS ONE OF SIX

- Rick Barnes led Texas to the No. 1 ranking for two weeks in January 2010.
- He is one of six coaches ever to lead multiple schools to a No.1 ranking: John Calipari, Frank McGuire, Rick Pitino, Eddie Sutton and Roy Williams.

- A finish for the ages ended in Tennessee's favor, as the seventh-ranked Vols rallied to beat top-ranked and previously unbeaten Gonzaga, 76-73, in the Jerry Colangelo Cla at Talking Stick Resort Arena on Dec. 9, 2018.
- Tennessee's Admiral Schofield, who finished with a career-high 30 points, buried a pair
- of 3-pointers from NBA range as part of an 11-5 run over the final 3.17 of play. The senior wing scored all 11 points during the run, knocking down three of his career-high six treys.

 Tennessee handed the Bulldogs their first loss of the season in the nail-biter, marking UT's fifth all-time win against the nation's No. 1 team. Tennessee' defense stepped up to
- hold one of the nation's best offenses to no field goals during the final 4:16 of the game.

 The Volunteers took a one-point lead into halftime, but the Zags jumped ahead within the first minute of the second half and held on to the their lead until 1:20 left on the clock. Gonzaga pulled ahead by as many as nine points before UT started chipping away
- 25 points on 10-of-17 shooting with five threes. None were bigger than a deep ball that banked off the glass with 1.20 remaining to give the Vols a two-point lead. His swish from beyond the arc on the following possession broke a 73-73 deadlock and ultimately stood as the difference in the game.
- The Zags had two looks during the final 24 seconds to tie the game but both were off line, including an attempt by **Rui Hachimura**, who finished with 21 points and eight rebounds for Gonzaga.
- Grant Williams posted another double-double with 16 points and 12 rebounds to go along with seven assists. **Jordan Bowden** was the other Vol to finish with double-digit scoring, tallying 11 points behind three treys in the second half.

 Schofield finished with 29 points on 8-of-12 shooting to go along with 11 rebounds,
- while helping the Vols' eclipse the 100-point margin for the first time since putting up 103
- against Appalachian State on Nov. 15, 2016.

No. 3 Tennessee led its pre-conference finale wire-to-wire, defeating Tennessee Tech, 96-53, on Dec. 29, 2018, in front of a season-high 21,165 fans.

The Vols powered their way past the Golden Eagles, dunking the ball a season-high 12 times and blocking a season-high 12 shots en route to the 43-point victory. It marked the fifth time this season that Tennessee defeated an opponent by 20-plus points at Thompson-Boling Arena.

 National Player of the Year candidate Grant Williams finished with a game-high 25 points, converting on 10-of-11 attempts from the field. Three other Vols joined Williams in double figures, including point guard **Jordan Bone**, who recorded his second doubledouble in three games, posting 16 points and a game-high 10 assists.

Tennessee finished the day shooting a season-high 6338 percent from the field. For most of the game, the Vols were shooting better than 70 percent, including a 74.4 percent mark in the first half.

 Kingsport, Tennessee, native John Fulkerson ended the game with a career-high 15 boints, with eight coming via dunk. The redshirt sophomore shot 6-of-7 from the field, adding four rebounds, two rebounds and a pair of steals. Williams, Fulkerson and Admiral Schofield (16 points) combined for 56 points in the game, shooting 88.5 percent on 23of-26 shooting.

Tennessee finished with a season-high 12 blocked shots and also a dozen slam dunks (from five different players).

- The Vols' 106 points scored against the Razorbacks marked the most against a conference opponent since Feb. 9, 2000, when they defeated Georgia, 110-83. It was also the first time since Feb. 5, 2008 (104-82 over Florida), that Tennessee scored than 100

- After being held without a point in the first half, Admiral Schofield exploded to open the second half. The senior netted the Vols' first 14 points in the half to help extend the lead to 27 points with 14:06 to play in the game. That stretch tied Schofield for fifth all-time in consecutive points scored by a Vol.
- Arkansas entered the game as the SEC's No. 2 team in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.32). The Vols were able to hold Arkansas to only 16 assists while forcing 19 turnovers

• Tennessee extended its winning streak to a record 19 games while pushing its win streak in SEC regular-season games to 15. UT's now has its best start in SEC play, starting 11-0 to best the 1976-77 team's 10-0 conference start.

 The Vols had a balanced offense throughout the game, as every player who played more than three minutes scored and had at least one assist. National Player of the Year candidate Grant Williams led the team with seven assists to go along with eight points and nine rebounds

After taking a 13-point lead into the second half, the Vols maintained their doubledigit lead throughout the rest of the game. Tennessee started out the second half on fire from the field, knocking down five of its first six shots to build the lead out to 62-46

at the 15:16 mark.

• After being up by as many as 18 points in the first 20 half, UT took a 49-36 lead into halftime.

Schofield scored 16 of his 21 points in the second half, scoring eight of the team's final 10 points in the game to put away the Gamecocks.
 Tennessee dished out 22 assists (on 34 made baskets) as a team against South Carolina,

surpassing 20 assists for the 12th time on the season.
