CATS PUT UNDEFEATED RECORD AT HOME ON THE LINE

- Kentucky opened its new facility, Kentucky Proud Park, with a perfect 5-0 week, including a walk-off win over Northern Kentucky on Feb. 27.
- The Cats rank fourth nationally in stolen bases (35) and lead the SEC.
- The UK pitching staff has struck out 12.1 batters per nine innings to rank seventh nationally.
- Senior INF Alex Rodriguez ranks 13th nationally with 14 walks.
- Jr. LHP Zack Thompson ranks among top 20 active pitchers in strikeouts/9 inn. (12.21, 11th) and hits allowed/9 inn. (6.25, 19th). Both marks are best among SEC pitchers.
- Thompson ranks 10th nationally in strikeouts per nine innings (16.09) this season.
- So. LHP Mason Hazelwood earned national honors for his effort vs. NKU on 2/27: 6.0 IP, H, 0 BB, 11 K
- The Cats are 35-4 at home vs. non-conference opponents during Nick Mingione's tenure.
- The Cats are replacing starters at C, 1B, 2B, SS, 3B, LF, CF, as well as their Friday and Sunday starting pitchers and closer. Only two players with 100 career at bats in blue return this season.
- The Cats are riding a 75-game streak without being shutout and have scored in 148 of the last 149 games (the lone shutout was a seven-inning game). The current streak is eighth-longest in UK history.
- The Cats have had college baseball's most MLB Draft picks (21) and top 10-round picks (12) over the past two years. The 13 selections in last summer's draft also were tops in the nation.
- UK has arguably the most difficult schedule in the country with 24 games against *Baseball America's* preseason top 25, including 20 vs. top 15 and nine vs. top five.

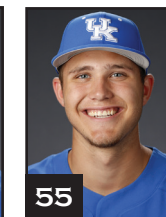

MEDIA INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS

If you have a 2018-19 football or men's basketball season credential it is valid for home baseball games. All other media credential requests should be submitted at least 24 hours prior to home games. Credentials can be picked up the day of a game at the Will Call window at Kentucky Proud Park. Requests should be made through the athletics communications and public relations office by contacting Matt May.

Media may enter the ballpark via the left field gate or main gate behind home plate. Parking is available in the Purple Lot adjacent to the softball/soccer complex at the end of Wildcat Court.

PRESS BOX/RADIO/TV

The Kentucky Proud Park press box sits above the grandstand on level two. You must display credential for entry. There is limited seating in the Press Box with the majority of media seats available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Radio and TV booths are on this level as well. New for 2019, there is a media work room adjacent to the press box.

MEDIA SERVICES

Final box scores will be available shortly following each game. UK ACPR will send postgame summaries, notes, photos (when available) and box scores via email and via UKathletics.com. Season stats will be updated online as quickly as possible.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Interviews with players and coaches are conducted on the field following each game. Please let Matt May or a member of the UK ACPR staff know of any postgame interview requests and we will coordinate for you. For assistance in locating any member of the Kentucky team, find Matt May for help. For assistance with opposing players and coaches, please see the visiting team SID.

PRACTICE/INTERVIEWS

Practices are typically in the afternoon with the exception of Mondays (off day). Head coach Nick Mingione is available for interviews weekday mornings except Mondays, as well as before/after practice and postgame. Players are available for interviews before practice on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. **DUE TO NCAA TIME MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS, PLAYER INTERVIEW REQUESTS MUST BE TURNED IN BY SUNDAY AT 5 P.M. FOR THE FOLLOWING WEEK.** Please arrange all interviews through the UK ACPR office and baseball contact Matt May.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Photographs and headshots are made available to the media for publication use. To obtain photos of any Wildcat player, please contact Matt May in the UK ACPR office. Please credit "UK Athletics" in any usage.

During games, photographers and videographers may shoot from anywhere on the Kentucky Proud Park concourse, terraces and grass berms, provided **NO SPECTATOR'S SIGHTLINE IS BLOCKED**. Dedicated photo/video areas have been established on each side of the concourse level near where the terrace and berm meet. Additionally, there is limited space at the end of each dugout for temporary shooting. Non-institutional photo/video may shoot on the secondary platform behind in-house photo/video by entering through the field gate next to the terrace on both sides of the stadium **ONLY IN BETWEEN HALF-INNINGS**. A UK stadium staffer will assist in this process. A photo/video stadium map will be available in the press box for reference.

INTERNET ACCESS (*NEW FOR 2019*)

- There are several options for wireless internet access. Anyone can self-register and connect to ATH-GUEST, which is good for 90 days.
- You also can connect to the ATHMEDIA network at KPP, which requires a unique username and password. This username and password will be valid for the entire season (also, if you have already completed this process for another UK sport, you will not need to do so again), so you should only have to connect once. In order to receive a username and password to access wifi, please provide the following information for yourself to matt.may@uky.edu.
 - Info Needed: First Name, Last Name, email address, cell phone number.
 - How to log in with your username and password: When you arrive at KPP, connect to the ATHMEDIA network. If your Internet browser does not open automatically, open your preferred Internet browser, go to www.uky.edu and type in your unique username and password to connect. This username and password can connect up to three devices. For more information, see a member of UK ACPR.

MINGIONE MAKES A DIFFERENCE

Kentucky fans quickly have fallen in love with **Nick Mingione**, whose infectious and unrelenting enthusiasm and down-to-earth personality has earned legions of new fans. Although it is certainly an ingredient in Mingione's on-field success, the fact he can flat out coach and get the best out of his players has been the biggest factor in the success he's achieved everywhere he's been (see graphic to the right).

Mingione had a brilliant playing career at Embry-Riddle - he ranks 10th on its career hits list - where he helped lead the program to 154 victories and three NAIA World Series appearances in three seasons as an assistant. When he arrived at Kentucky in 2006 he was immediately part of what is still the Cats' only SEC championship club, then smelled success at Mississippi State before returning to the one place he had always wanted to be a head coach - UK. First season, first Super Regional appearance for the Cats.

He has the most overall and SEC wins through his first two seasons of any UK coach:

With 85 career wins, he already has the third-most and is on pace to break the mark for most wins through three seasons: Cohen (97), Madison (92).

NO PLACE LIKE HOME (PLATE)

Kentucky's offense has been one of the nation's elite the past two seasons under Mingione and his staff, in particular renowned hitting guru Todd Guilliams. The Cats have been a devastating offensive club under Guilliams' direction, leading the SEC in a total of 12 offensive statistical categories, while also producing five All-Americans.

In 2018, UK led the SEC in home runs per game, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, scoring, doubles per game and sacrifice bunts, while ranking in the nation's top 20 in five of those six categories - and top 10 in three. In 2017, the Cats registered the most hits in a single-season (706) in UK history and ranking near the top of the single-season charts in numerous other categories. The offense also ranked in the top 12 nationally in doubles (2nd), hits (4th), hit by pitches (4th), on-base percentage (7th), walks (10th), sacrifice bunts (10th), slugging percentage (11th) and batting average (12th).

THE MINGIONE EFFECT

In 16 seasons as a collegiate coach Mingione has produced a sparkling track record. Those teams have averaged 39 victories a year and advanced to the postseason 10 times with two national runner-up finishes.

BIGGIE BOX

One of the pillars of UK's offense is working its game goals in search of the big inning - "Biggie Box" - which is defined as any inning where the Cats put four or more runs on the scoreboard. The approach has been so effective the lineup has its "Biggie Box" 75 times since the current staff took over (37 in 2017 and 31 in 2018) and have already recorded seven such innings this season. The Cats also are 66-11 under Mingione when scoring six or more runs. (See page 9 for chart on 2019 big innings)

FRESH-FACED CATS

No team in America had as many players selected in the 2018 Major League Draft than Kentucky, a staggering total of 13 that brought the program's two-year total to a national-high of 21. With that comes roster turnover, as the program welcomes 22 newcomers this season, including 16 true freshmen.

There is no getting around the fact the Cats will be young and inexperienced in 2019. Designated hitter T.J. Collett (125 at bats before injury) and outfielders Ryan Johnson (132 ABs) and Ryan Shinn (81 ABs) are the only returning players with more than 53 at bats and left-handed starting pitcher Zack Thompson is the only member of the pitching staff to have pitched at least 50 innings in college.

UK must replace a total of 381 career starts from its position players, including seven players who made at least 46 career starts. The offense was hit especially hard with at least 76 percent of its production graduating or being drafted in runs, hits, doubles, triples, home runs, RBI, total bases, walks and stolen bases.

One area the Cats expect to enter the season with veteran presence is in the bullpen, where sophomores Carson Coleman (RHP), Daniel Harper (RHP), Mason Hazelwood (LHP), Brett Marshall (RHP) and Jimmy Ramsey (RHP) each had double-digit appearances and gained valuable experience a year ago.

THOMPSON NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Zack Thompson was named Preseason First-Team All-America by Baseball America, an honor determined by Major League Baseball scouting directors. He also was voted First-Team Preseason All-SEC by the league's coaches and is on the Golden Spikes Award watch list.

The junior left-hander shined on an international stage over the summer and is considered one of the top pitching prospects for the 2019 Major League Baseball Draft. Ranked among the top 10 draft-eligible college players by every major scouting publication, Thompson is poised for a breakout season as the anchor of a young, but talented, Wildcats pitching staff.

Thompson spent the summer with the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team that went 12-3 overall in three series against Chinese Taipei, Japan and Cuba. He made three appearances (one in each series) with one start, going 1-0 with a spotless ERA of 0.00 in 8.2 innings while allowing just three hits and struck out seven. He also earned the win in series-clinching game of the 7th annual USA-Cuba International Friendship Series, working 2.2 innings while allowing two hits and striking out one.

The 6-foot-3, 220-pounder ranks in the top 20 of all active pitchers with at least 75.0 innings in both strikeouts per nine innings (12.21, 11th nationally) and hits allowed per nine innings (6.25, 19th), both of which are currently the best career marks among active SEC pitchers.

Thompson's 166 career strikeouts in just two seasons leaves him needing just 34 to become the 14th UK pitcher to reach 200 and 49 shy of moving into the school's all-time top 10. He currently ranks second on the program's all-time hits allowed per nine innings chart.

CAT BURGLAR

Kentucky has wasted no time making the stolen base an integral part of its offensive attack to start the 2019 season, taking off at any and all opportunities thus far and ranking fourth in the NCAA and first in the SEC through three weeks. Even by those standards though, junior outfielder Jaren Shelby put the rest of the NCAA on notice when he stole five bases against Eastern Kentucky on Feb. 26.

The five steals were the most for any SEC player in 25 years, dating back to 1994 when Vanderbilt's Boomer Whipple swiped five against Western Kentucky. Shelby stole second, third and home in the fifth inning against ECU and then second and third again an inning later. The NCAA single-game record for stolen bases is eight.

HAZELWOOD STAGES SUMMER BREAKOUT

Sophomore left-hander Mason Hazelwood showed flashes of his vast potential as a true freshman in 2018 but it was what he did last summer in the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League that really turned heads on a national level. The 6-foot-5 southpaw was named a First-Team Summer Collegiate All-American by Rawlings/Perfect Game after going 5-1 with a 1.80 ERA in 50 innings pitched for the Elmira Pioneers, which also earned him the PGCBL's Pitcher of the Year honor.

Hazelwood appeared in 11 games with eight starts and set a new PGCBL summer record with 84 strikeouts, an absurd 15.12 per nine innings pitched. Opponents hit just .189 off him and scored more than two earned runs just once, which helped him earn an appearance in the PGCBL All-Star Game, where he struck out all three hitters he faced. His five wins led the league and he was named the top MLB draft prospect in the PGCBL by Perfect Game.

In his first collegiate start on Feb. 27 vs. Northern Kentucky the Saliva, Ky. native was flat out dominant in six nearly perfect innings of work. He retired the first 16 batters he faced and allowed just one batter to reach base. He struck out a career-high 11 hitters and did not walk anyone.

SHELBY CONTINUES FAMILY TRADITION

When UK began recruiting Jaren Shelby it had history and location on its side. The junior outfielder hailed from Lexington, played his prep baseball just down the street at Tates Creek High School and had spent much of his childhood watching older brothers John III and JaVon putting up big numbers for the Wildcats. The first family of Lexington baseball, which includes patriarch John Shelby, had a deep connection to the blue and white that proved to be too much for Jaren, the youngest brother, to pass up coming out of State College of Florida last season.

KENTUCKY PROUD PARK

Kentucky baseball has moved into a new home for the 2019 season, opening the \$49 million Kentucky Proud Park, a state-of-the-art facility immediately considered one of the top facilities in all of college baseball. The Wildcats won their first game in their new home, defeating Eastern Kentucky, 7-3, on Feb. 26, 2019.

The stadium features permanent seating for nearly 2,500 fans with additional space on grass berms to accommodate 5,000 fans for regular season games. Beyond the outfield wall, temporary bleachers can be installed for NCAA Tournament games to bring the seating capacity to more than 7,000. Fan amenities also include suites and a new club area.

The team areas were a priority and give our players and coaches everything they need to compete at a high level in a single location. The facility features a team lounge, locker room, training area, indoor hitting and pitching areas, and coaching offices, as well as a recruiting room. All spaces are either new to UK baseball or significantly larger than previous ones.

The playing surface is the AstroTurf® Rootzone Diamond Blend, which will allow the team to maximize usage in all weather conditions. The pitcher's mound will remain dirt.

The video board that looms large beyond the right-centerfield wall measures 48 feet wide by 30 feet tall, making it the eighth-largest in college baseball.

The name is a tribute to farmers and businesses of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the Big Blue Nation. Kentucky Farm Bureau secured the rights to name the stadium from JMI Sports, UK Athletics' multimedia rights partner. In turn, Kentucky Farm Bureau elected to name the stadium for Kentucky Proud, the state's official agricultural marketing program housed at the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. No state taxpayer dollars were used in funding the agreement. The Kentucky Proud program is funded through the generosity of the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund. The fund is directed by the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board and administered by the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy.

Jaren, a former Kentucky Gatorade Player of the Year in 2016, opted to follow in the footsteps of his brothers, both of whom were all-conference players with the Cats. John III played at UK from 2004-06, was on the program's first SEC championship team and served as a student assistant coach in 2018, while JaVon wore blue from 2014-16. He was named First-Team All-Suncoast Conference last season after hitting .343 with 65 runs, 70 RBI, 30 extra-base hits and 35 steals.

MLB TRAINING GROUND

Kentucky has made its presence felt in the Major League Baseball Draft the past two years with 21 players selected, the most of any college program in the country over that span. With exceptional player development a calling card of Mingione and his staff the draft results are even more impressive upon closer inspection:

- 12 Wildcats were selected in the first 10 rounds, also the most in the country
- Five were selected in the first five rounds, including first-rounder Evan White (2017)
- The 13 picks in 2018 are the second-most for any school in a single draft since 2006
- The 13 underclassmen drafted during that span earned \$7.435 million in signing bonus money, an average of \$573,300 per player
- All but one draftee was selected higher than prior to working with the current staff (and the one exception redshirted his lone season in Lexington as a transfer)
- 13 of the draftees had not previously been drafted



COLLETT'S COMMUNITY SERVICE

One of the tenets of Mingione's philosophy for the UK program is that young men in it are students first, people second and players third. Junior 1B T.J. Collett was honored for the person part of that by being named to the SEC's Community Service Team last season.

Collett, who hails from Terre Haute, Indiana, is heavily involved with the NEGU/Jessie Rees Foundation, whose mission is connecting with families of young cancer patients, bringing awareness to their stories, offering them a network of helpful resources and sending the entire family encouragement throughout their journey. NEGU, which stands for Never Ever Give Up, has worked with Collett on bringing children and their families to UK home baseball games to experience pregame activities on the field and in the dugout, as well as be announced during the game. As part of his work with NEGU, Collett has spearheaded an effort where members of the UK baseball team delivery Joy Jars to young cancer patients. The jars are stuffed with toys, games, and other things to brighten patients' days while fighting the disease. More information on NEGU can be found at negu.org.

NEGU and UK's Dance Blue both will be part of Pediatric Cancer Awareness Weekend, which will be held during the Georgia series (March 28-30). UK players will wear yellow wristbands, as well as yellow ribbon helmet stickers on their batting helmets.

DANDY DOZEN: CATS LEAD THE SEC IN WEEKLY HONORS

Although the strength of our TEAM is our TEAM, the Cats have had standout individual performances that have caught the attention of observers across the country and in the SEC offices. Since the beginning of the 2017 season, UK players have been named either SEC Player or Pitcher of the Week **TWELVE** times, the most for any school in the conference.

CATS FEATURED ON NATIONAL BROADCASTS

The Kentucky baseball team will be featured on national television nine times this season, including the Southeastern Conference's Thursday night showcase game. Additionally, all of the Wildcats' 32 home games and 30 conference games will be available via SECN+. The Cats first appear on national television when Georgia comes to Lexington on Mar. 28. Airing on the SEC Network, the game is the league's featured Thursday night game that week. UK also will appear on the SEC Network on April 13 (at Ole Miss), April 27 (at Florida), May 7 (vs. Indiana), May 10-12 (at South Carolina) and May 14 (vs. Michigan). The April 28 game at Florida is slated for ESPN2.

#BBN AND BASEBALL: A LOVE STORY

Although not often mentioned in the same breath with baseball hotbeds around the country there is a deep and longstanding bond with the game in the Bluegrass region, particularly the "triangle" extending the Lexington to Cincinnati to Louisville. The Cats have ranked in the top 25 in home attendance each of the past two seasons, ahead of more traditional powers such as Miami, Arizona State, Wichita State, Tulane, Long Beach State, North Carolina and Stanford.

In 2018 the program sold its entire allotment of season tickets for the first time in school history and ultimately saw 91,551 fans passing through the gates. The number set a school-record for total season attendance, an average of 3,270 fans per game, and placed the Cats in the nation's top 20 in attendance. Furthermore, the **TEN** largest crowds in school history have come the past two seasons and **FIVE** times the program set either a regular season or postseason attendance record since Nick Mingione took over as head coach. The top **EIGHT** regular season crowds came in 2018.

Pitching coach Jim Belanger has only been coaching for a relatively short time but he already has made quite a name for himself with his development of young pitchers. Dedicated to tailoring individual pitching plans to suit each pitcher's strengths the results have been undeniable, particularly as it relates to preparing them for professional baseball. Belanger has had 21 of his pupils selected in the Major League Baseball Draft with an eye-popping 19 of them being drafted higher than previously taken before working with him. Twelve of those 21 players had previously been undrafted and 11 of the 21 were taken in the first 10 rounds of the draft. In two years at UK, Belanger has mentored nine players selected in the draft (Justin Lewis was selected in both 2017 and 2018).

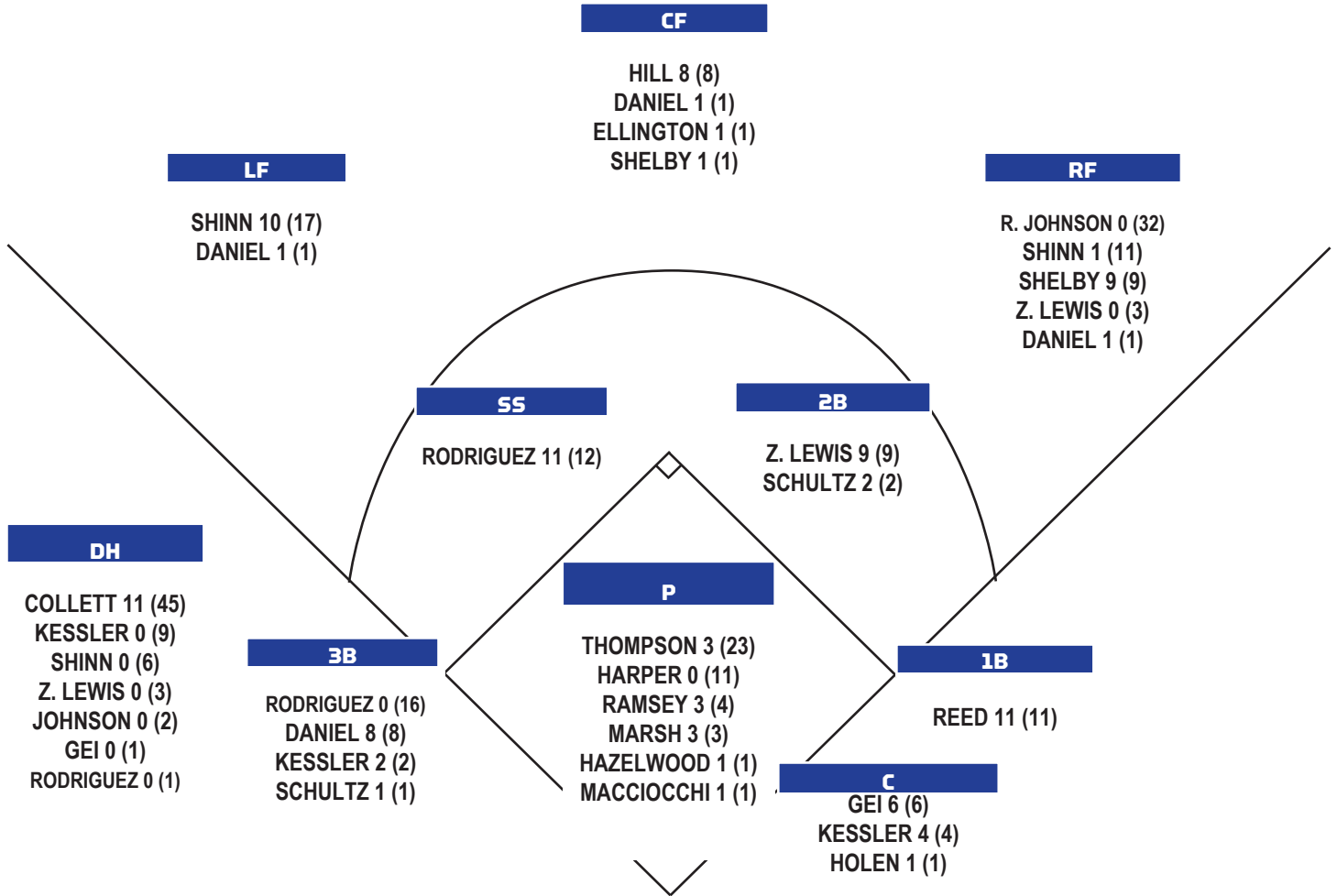

CHALLENGING ROAD TO OMAHA

The Wildcats' 56-game slate features 35 total games against 14 teams who made the NCAA Tournament last season and 24 against teams ranked in Baseball America's pre-season Top 25, including 20 vs. the Top 15 - 13 of which will be on the road - and nine vs. the top five. Among the 35 games against teams who made the 2018 NCAA Tournament are 15 against Super Regional teams and nine against teams that advanced to the College World Series. Thirteen of the final 14 games of the regular season are against 2018 tournament clubs, including midweek non-conference showdowns with Indiana (May 7) and Michigan (May 14), a preseason top 25 team that was the lone team in the stretch not to make last season's NCAAs.

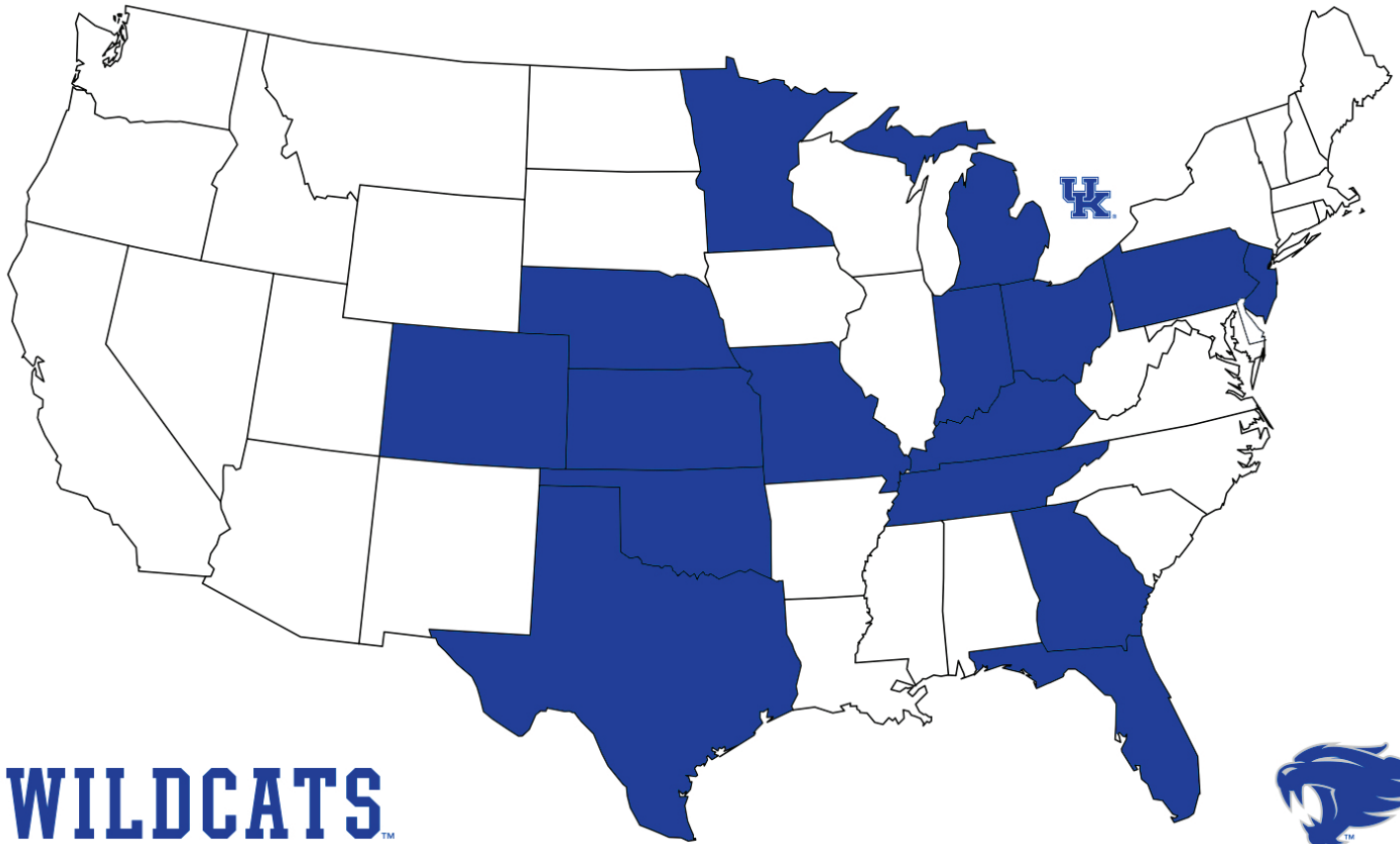
