TIPOFF TIDBITS

- Ole Miss enters Tuesday's game ranked No. 37 in the NET with four Quadrant 1 victories.
- The Rebels currently have the 11th-best turnaround season in the country after only 12 wins last year.
- Prior to tipoff, Ole Miss will honor its three seniors who all hail from the state of Mississippi: D.C. Davis (Purvis), Terence Davis (Southaven) and Bruce Stevens (Louin); all three have played in each game this season.
- Senior guard Terence Davis ranks seventh in school history in three-pointers made (167), 10th in steals (135) and 14th in scoring (1,460 points).
- No. 6 Kentucky is the highest ranked team to play in The Pavilion since Jan. 28, 2017 (No. 5 Baylor).
- In last year's matchup in Lexington, five returners scored 70 of the team's 78 points: Terence Davis (26), Bruce Stevens (13), Breein Tyree (13), Dominik Olejniczak (10) and Devontae Shuler (8).
- Bruce Stevens registered his first double-double as a Rebel at Kentucky last year, scoring 13 points with a careerhigh 13 rebounds.
- The Rebels' last three games have been decided by a total of four points; the game-defeating bucket came with less than six seconds left in the two losses.
- On Monday, Breein Tyree was named as a finalist for the Howell Trophy (best men's college basketball player in the state of Mississippi); a Rebel has won the award five of the past six seasons.
- With 34.3 ppg in conference play, Breein Tyree and Terence Davis make up the highest scoring duo in the SEC.
- Ole Miss has secured a conference record of .500-or-better for the seventh time in the last eight years; looking ahead to the SEC Tournament, the Rebels can finish anywhere from the No. 4 seed to the No. 9 seed.
- The Rebels lead the SEC and rank seventh nationally in free throw percentage (77.5); Ole Miss has shot over 85.0 percent from the free throw line in 10 games this season, including 93.0 percent-or-better in four games.
- Terence Davis and Breein Tyree account for 44.4 percent of the Rebels' scoring on the season.
- Tyree is the only player in the SEC to rank in the conference's top 10 in scoring (3rd-18.3 ppq), free throw percentage (3rd-83.2), field goal percentage (5th-48.4) and three-pointers made (7th-2.2 per game).





- Ranks 132nd all-time in career wins and 31st among active head coaches
- · Nine seasons of 24 or more wins as a head coach
- · Eight-time conference coach of the year
- First coach in Ole Miss history to win his first three SEC games
- Second coach in Ole Miss history to win 13 of his first 15 games as the Rebels' head coach
- Winningest head coach in Middle Tennessee history
- Winningest head coach in Sun Belt Conference history
- Coached Middle Tennessee to 179 wins in the last seven seasons, the most by any school in the state of Tennessee during that span
- Won nine conference championships (seven regular season, two conference tournaments) at Middle Tennessee over the past nine seasons
- Last season, led the Blue Raiders to a nation-best 12 road wins as Middle Tennessee went 12-2 in true road games

INTERVIEW POLICY

All interview requests — coaches and players — MUST be coordinated through the Communications Office. During the week, head coach Kermit Davis and Rebel players will generally be available for interviews at the Tuohy Center or The Pavilion before practice on Mondays, unless arranged otherwise. Please email or text your player requests to Adam Kuffner by 1 p.m. of the day prior to interviews. There will be no gameday player interviews until after the game.

PRACTICE POLICY

Some Ole Miss basketball practices may be opened to the media. If you would like to attend, contact Adam Kuffner for availability and more information.

WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE

The Southeastern Conference conducts teleconferences 2-3 times per month with all 14 men's basketball head coaches beginning in January and running through the end of the season. Contact the SEC Media Relations office or the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office for dates and times.

PARKING

Media parking is located in the garage or at the Ole Miss Track Complex. Media members should request parking in advance. POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Both team locker rooms are CLOSED to the media following the game, by facility policy. Visiting coach and player interviews will address the media in the media workroom following a cooling off period approximately 10 minutes after the game. Ole Miss head coach Kermit Davis and selected Ole Miss players will address the media following the visiting team.

MAKING THE MARCH TOWARDS MARCH MADNESS

In the first year under head coach **Kermit Davis**, the Rebels are making their presence known in conversations regarding the NCAA Tournament. In the new NET, a metric the NCAA Tournament Selection Committee looks at to determine at-large berths, Ole Miss is ranked 37th with four Quadrant 1 victories and three Quadrant 2 wins. The Rebels have played 13 Quadrant 1 games thus far. Andy Katz of NCAA.com has Ole Miss projected to be a No. 8 seed come March (Feb. 26). CBS Sports Bracketologist Jerry Palm has the Rebels as a No. 9 seed in his current NCAA Tournament projections (March 4). According to ESPN Bracketlogoist Joe Lunardi, Ole Miss is a No. 10 seed (March 3). The Rebels will look to remain on the right side of the bubble as March begins.

SCOUTING KENTUCKY

No. 6 Kentucky enters Tuesday's matchup with a 24-5 record, including 13-3 in SEC play. The Wildcats saw their fourgame winning streak come to an end at No. 7 Tennessee on Saturday with a 71-52 setback in Knoxville. The streak started with a victory over the Volunteers at Rupp Arena (Feb. 16) when they were ranked No. 1 in the nation. Kentucky is one of the best teams in the country in rebounding. The Wildcats' rebounding margin of +9.5 leads the SEC and ranks third nationally. UK has balanced scoring with four Wildcats averaging double figures led by PJ Washington's 14.9 ppg. Freshman Tyler Herro adds 13.9 ppg, and Keldon Johnson records 13.4 ppg. Graduate transfer Reid Travis is averaging 11.3 ppg. John Calipari is in his 10th season as Kentucky's head coach. With 702 wins through 27 seasons, Calipari has previously coached Memphis (2001-09), the New Jersey Nets (1997-99) and UMass (1989-96).

CERIFC HICTORY

Tuesday's game will be the 120th meeting between the two schools. The Wildcats hold a 106-13 lead in the series, but two of the Rebels' 13 all-time wins have come in the last 13 meetings. Ole Miss has 10 victories in Oxford, but Kentucky has won the last nine matchups. In the only contest between the two programs at The Pavilion, UK's Isaiah Briscoe produced a triple-double to lead No. 8 Kentucky to a 99-76 win (Dec. 29, 2017).

LAST TIME WE MET

The Wildcats protected their home floor in last year's meeting. Kevin Knox had 22 points and Quade Green added 18, including eight during a 15-5 second half run that helped No. 23 Kentucky pull away from Ole Miss 96-78 (Feb. 28, 2018). **Terence Davis** had a game-high 26 points, and **Breein Tyree** tallied 13. **Bruce Stevens** produced a double-double with 13 points and a career-high 13 rebounds. **Dominik Olejniczak** added 10 points, while **Devontae Shuler** scored eight. Shai Gilgeous-Alexander had 17 points, Wenyen Gabriel 15 and PJ Washington 10 as the Wildcats won their third consecutive game and home finale. Kentucky shot 56 percent after halftime and 50 percent overall in a game that was chippy at times, resulting in five technical foul calls and the quick ejection of Ole Miss senior forward Marcanvis Hymon after just 3 1/2 minutes.

WHAT A WIN WOULD DO

- It would be the Rebels' highest ranked victory since knocking off No. 6 Alabama 84-56 to end the 2001-02 regular season.
- Ole Miss would have its third victory over a top 25 team this season, the most wins over ranked teams since earning four during the 2001-02 campaign; it would also be the second win over a top 10 team, also the most since 2001-02.
- The Rebels would snap a nine-game losing streak to the Wildcats.
- Ole Miss would beat Kentucky for the first time since a 71-69 victory at Tad Smith Coliseum (Feb. 1, 2011).
- The Rebels would remain in a tie for fourth in the SEC standings; the top four earn a double bye into the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament.
- Ole Miss would secure a winning conference record for the fifth time in the last seven years.
- The Rebels would post their 10th 20-win season through the past 13 years.

THE ROAD TO NASHVILLE

With two games left in the regular season, the SEC Tournament (March 13-17) is just around the corner. Ole Miss boasts a 9-7 conference mark, tied for fourth with four other teams (Auburn, Florida, Mississippi State, South Carolina). The Rebels can finish anywhere between fourth and ninth. The top four seeds earn a double bye into the quarterfinals. If the tournament started today, due to tiebreaker scenarios, Ole Miss would hold the No. 6 seed and face the winner of the No. 11-14 matchup, which currently pits Texas A&M against Vanderbilt.

SENIOR SPOTLIGHTS

Tuesday night will be the final home game for seniors **D.C. Davis, Terence Davis** and **Bruce Stevens**. Each senior has played in all 29 games this season, helping Ole Miss produce one of the nation's biggest turnarounds. Below are some quick notes on each senior Rebel.

- D.C. Davis: 34 games over two seasons, including three starts ... Played five games as a walk-on last year before earning a scholarship heading into his senior season ... Has appeared in all 29 games this season, finding a spot in the rotation and averaging 12.5 minutes per game ... Two-time winner of the Square Jam dunk contest ... As a junior, landed on the SEC First Year Academic Honor Roll ... Will earn his degree in General Studies with an emphasis in Education, Legal Studies and Recreation Administration.
- **Terence Davis**: 117 career games over four seasons, including 79 starts ... 1,460 points (14th in school history) ... Ranks seventh in three-pointers made (167) and 10th in steals (135) on the Ole Miss all-time list ... Ranks fifth among active SEC players in points and steals ... 21 career 20-point games, four career 30-point games, nine career double-doubles ... Led team in scoring a season ago ... SEC Community Service Team ... Will earn his degree in General Studies with an emphasis in Education, Legal Studies and Recreation Administration.
- **Bruce Stevens**: Has played in all 61 games over two seasons since arriving on campus, including 27 starts ... Averaging 9.6 ppg and 4.9 rpg during his Rebel career ... Three career double-doubles ... Has scored double figures in 29 games ... Career-high 27 points against Illinois State last season ... As a junior, earned a spot on the SEC First Year Academic Honor Roll ... Will earn his degree in General Studies with an emphasis in Education, Legal Studies and Recreation Administration.

MISSISSIPPI MADE

Along with head coach **Kermit Davis** (Leakesville), all three Ole Miss seniors hail from the state of Mississippi: **D.C. Davis** (Purvis), **Terence Davis** (Southaven) and **Bruce Stevens** (Louin).

FACING RANKED TEAMS

Ole Miss is 2-3 against ranked teams this season. The Rebels knocked off No. 10 Auburn 82-67 at home (Jan. 9) before going on the road to beat rival No. 14 Mississippi State 81-77 (Jan. 12). It marked the first time in school history that the Rebels won back-to-back games over top 15 teams. The Rebels' losses against ranked teams came at home in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge to No. 24 Iowa State (Jan. 26), which shot 69 percent to earn the win, against No. 21 MSU (Feb. 2) and No. 7 Tennessee (Feb. 27). No. 6 Kentucky is the highest ranked team to play in The Pavilion since No. 5 Baylor made the trip to Oxford (Jan. 28, 2017).

DEFENDING HOME COURT

Winning at home has been a trademark at Ole Miss. Over the past 13 seasons, the Rebels are 154-46 (.770 win pct.) in home games. In three-plus seasons playing in the \$96.5 million Pavilion at Ole Miss, the Rebels hold a 41-20 (.672) advantage against the opposition. Ole Miss has won 279 of its last 357 games (.782 win pct.) in Oxford dating back to the 1996-97 campaign.

PAVILION PACKED

With Tuesday night's game almost sold out, a new average attendance record will be set for The Pavilion. The current attendance mark is 7,704 per game, a 12 percent increase from last season. In the first full season in The Pavilion, the average attendance was 7,396. Moreover, the Rebels have the highest increased home attendance in the SEC for conference games (22.51 percent) this year. For SEC games, the 8,703 average attendance is up significantly from the 7,104 average last season. Last week's game against No. 7 Tennessee was sold out. With four sellouts this season, The Pavilion has eight sellouts in its history (opened in January 2016). After Ole Miss beat a pair of top 15 teams in back-to-back games for the first time in school history, Rebel Nation showed up to The Pavilion to support their nationally ranked team. The following games against LSU (Jan. 15) and Arkansas (Jan. 19) were sold out. The rivalry game against MSU was also a sellout (Feb. 2).

TYREE NAMED HOWELL TROPHY FINALIST

Ole Miss guard **Breein Tyree** has been named a finalist for the 2019 C Spire Howell Trophy, the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame announced Monday (March 4). The Rebels' leading scorer is one of three finalists up for the award, given to the best men's college basketball player in the state of Mississippi. Joining Tyree as finalists are Southern Mississippi's Cortez Edwards and Mississippi State's Quinndary Weatherspoon. The award, named after the legendary Bailey Howell, will be presented to one of the three finalists at a luncheon next week (March 11) at the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame in Jackson. An Ole Miss Rebel has won the Howell Trophy five of the last six seasons. Sebastian Saiz took home the honor in 2017 after Moody was a two-time Howell Trophy recipient (2015, 2016). In 2014, Jarvis Summers claimed the trophy. Before leading the Rebels to a SEC Tournament title and NCAA Tournament berth, Marshall Henderson was the winner of the 2013 Howell Trophy.

HOT SHOT

Ole Miss has shot over 50 percent in nine games, surpassing last season's total. The Rebels eclipsed 50 percent from the field in five games throughout the entire 2017-18 season. The last time Ole Miss recorded nine games shooting better than 50 percent from the field occurred during the 2012-13 campaign, which resulted in a SEC Tournament title. During Saturday's game at Arkansas (March 2), the Rebels shot 53.7 percent (29 of 54) for their best field goal percentage in SEC play this season.

DOWN TO THE WIRE

The Rebels' last three games have been decided by a total of four points. Ole Miss held off Georgia 72-71, forcing a Bulldog miss just before the buzzer. However, the Rebels suffered a pair of heartbreaking losses last week. Grant Williams drove the lane and got a bucket to fall with 4.3 seconds left, allowing No. 7 Tennessee to escape Oxford with a 73-71 victory (Feb. 27). On Saturday (March 2), Ole Miss led by one before Jalen Harris' circus layup with 5.4 seconds on the clock fell high off the glass, flipping the game in favor of Arkansas. On the season, the Rebels are 4-4 in games decided by five points or less.

REBELS FALL TO RAZORBACKS IN CLOSING SECONDS

For the second time in four days, Ole Miss suffered a heartbreaking loss in the waning seconds of a ballgame. A Jalen Harris floater with 5.9 seconds left tumbled around the rim before falling to give Arkansas a 74-73 victory Saturday afternoon (March 2) at Bud Walton Arena. The Rebels were led by **Breein Tyree**, who scored 17 of his 20 points in the second half on 8 of 14 shooting. **Devontae Shuler, Terence Davis**, and **Bruce Stevens** all joined Tyree in double figures with 12 points apiece. Ole Miss' 53.7 field goal percentage was its best in SEC play this season. The Razorbacks were led by Mason Jones, who had 22 points with the help of going 6 of 8 from behind the arc. Daniel Gafford scored 17 points on 7 of 9 shooting, while the team shot 50 percent from three (9 of 18) for the game.

DYNAMIC DUO

Senior Terence Davis and junior Breein Tyree have become a dynamic duo in the Ole Miss backcourt, averaging 44.4 percent of the Rebels' scoring this season. Tyree leads the way at 18.3 ppg to rank third in the SEC, while Davis' 15.5 ppg rank seventh. Combining for 34.3 ppg in conference games, the two Rebels are the highest scoring duo in SEC play just ahead of Tennessee's Grant Williams and Admiral Schofield (33.8 ppg). The pair has recorded 23 20-point games so far this season, including four games in which they both reached the 20-point plateau. They also have three 30-point games to their credit this season, all occurring away from home. Tyree scored a career-high 31 in SEC road victories at Vanderbilt (Jan. 5) and Georgia (Feb. 9), while Davis tallied his season high of 30 at Butler (Nov. 16). Both Rebels also crack the SEC's top 10 in field goal percentage. Tyree leads Ole Miss and is fifth in the conference at 48.4 percent, while Davis ranks eighth at 45.9 percent.

TYREE ON A TEAR

Junior guard Breein Tyree is one the veteran leaders on the floor for Ole Miss. His consistency has allowed him to become the team's leading scorer, averaging 18.3 ppg to rank third in the SEC. Tyree is also second in scoring during conference play (18.9 ppg). He ranks third in the conference in free throw percentage (83.2 percent) as well as fifth in field goal percentage (48.4 percent) and seventh in three-pointers made (2.2 per game), the only conference player to crack the SEC top 10 in scoring and those three shooting categories. The Somerset, New Jersey, native has scored at least 20 points in a team-high 15 games. Over the past 10 games, Tyree has broken the 20-point plateau in seven of them to average 20.5 ppg. He was the first Rebel to score 20 points in five consecutive games since Stefan Moody had 14 straight 20-point games from Nov. 25, 2015 to Jan. 28, 2016. Opening conference play, he exploded for a career-high 31 points against Vanderbilt (Jan. 5) to earn SEC Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career. He matched his career high in the win at Georgia (Feb. 9) to eclipse 1,000 points for his career.

SINGLE-SEASON STEALS

Averaging 1.8 steals per game, sophomore Devontae Shuler ranks fourth in the SEC. He has recorded at least three steals in nine different games this season, helping bring his total to 52. Shuler is one steal away from cracking the Ole Miss top 10 for steals in a single season. Senior Terence Davis is not too far behind with 49 steals, averaging 1.7 per game to sit sixth in the conference.

ANOTHER 1,000-POINT SCORER

Although he didn't need all of his career-high 31 points to reach the milestone, Breein Tyree became the 40th Rebel to score 1,000 points at Ole Miss over Georgia (Feb. 9). Tyree now has 1,128 career points through 95 games. He passed Terrance Henry (1,095) and Fred Cox (1,105) with 16 points versus No. 7 Tennessee (Feb. 27) to rank 33rd on the all-time list. Teammate Terence Davis has already reached the historical mark, ranking 14th all-time with 1,460 points. Tyree and Davis are the first Ole Miss duo to take the court as 1,000-point scorers since Jarvis Summers (1,629) and Marshall Henderson (1,293) played together during the 2013-14 season. Last season, Markel Crawford surpassed 1,000 points for his career. However, he recorded the majority of his scoring at Memphis and joined Ole Miss as a graduate transfer for the 2017-18 season.

CONVERTING AT THE CHARITY STRIPE

Shooting 77.5 percent as a team, Ole Miss leads the SEC and ranks seventh nationally in free throw percentage. Seven of the 11 Rebels that have attempted free throws this season are shooting over 75 percent from the stripe. Ole Miss has shot over 85 percent in 10 different games this season, including four games of 93 percent-or-better. Throughout the last 11 games, Ole Miss is 83.4 percent (151 of 181) from the line. In the win over Texas A&M (Feb. 6), Ole Miss went 18 of 19 at the line (94.7 percent). It was the Rebels' best free throw percentage in a game since going 22 of 23 (95.7 percent) versus Baylor during the 2016-17 campaign (Jan. 28, 2017). In the Emerald Coast Classic championship game against Cincinnati (Nov. 24), Ole Miss converted 16 of 17 at the line for a 94.1 percent clip. After going 0 for 1 in the first half at Illinois State (Dec. 8), the Rebels went a perfect 14 of 14 over the final 20 minutes to finish the game at 93.3 percent. In the win at Vanderbilt (Jan. 5), Ole Miss went 14 of 15 in the second half to remain in front down the stretch. Breein Tyree is an 83.2 percent free throw shooter (114 of 137) to rank third in the SEC among qualifiers. Devontae Shuler shoots 84.5 percent (49 of 58) and Bruce Stevens boasts an 81.8 percent clip (27 of 33).

UNDERRATED REBELS

Coming off a season in which they finished 12-20 (5-13 SEC) and last in the conference, the Rebels were predicted to finish 14th in the SEC this year by the media. However, Ole Miss is used to being underrated before the season begins and only took 15 games to surpass last season's win total. With a record of 19-10, the Rebels are off to their best start in four seasons. The seven-game improvement to this point is tied for the 11th-best turnaround nationwide and second best among Power 5 schools (lowa). The 2014-15 team, the last Ole Miss team to make the NCAA Tournament, went 19-10 through the first 29 games. The Rebels have finished above their preseason projection six of the last seven seasons since the league moved away from a divisional format, the outlier being the 2017-18 campaign.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Through 117 career games, senior **Terence Davis** has 1,460 points to rank 14th in Ole Miss history. With a strong finish to the season, he could find himself in the top 10 to end his Rebel career. In his final year on campus, Davis is averaging 15.5 ppg to rank seventh in the conference and shooting at a 45.9 percent clip (eighth in the SEC). The Southaven, Mississippi, native also paces the team in assists (3.4 per game) and rebounding (5.7 per game). With 13 points in the win over Georgia (Feb. 23), Davis passed Eric Laird (1,421) and Ansu Sesay (1,428). Next on his chase up the Ole Miss scoring chart is Murphy Holloway (1,476). John Stroud, one of the analysts for select games on the Ole Miss Sports Network (radio), is the Rebels' all-time scoring leader with 2,328 points. Davis also ranks sixth all-time in three-pointers attempted (494), seventh in three-pointers made (167) and 10th in steals (135).

TURNING DEFENSE INTO OFFENSE

Perhaps the biggest key to Ole Miss winning five of its last eight games is the team's pressure defense that has forced a plethora of turnovers. Throughout the five victories, the Rebels forced 19.2 turnovers per game. They converted them into an average of 22.6 points off turnovers per game. Ole Miss began the winning streak by turning 12 Texas A&M miscues into 31 points. The Rebels forced 20 turnovers at Georgia (Feb. 9) and 14 more at Auburn (Feb. 13) to earn back-to-back road victories. In the win over Missouri, Ole Miss scored 32 points off 25 Tiger turnovers. It was the most turnovers forced by Ole Miss in a game since causing 25 turnovers in win over Bradley (Nov. 28, 2015). The last time the Rebels forced 25 turnovers in an SEC game was 12 years ago in an 82-59 win at Auburn (Feb. 3, 2007). Ole Miss forced 19 turnovers versus Georgia (Feb. 23), turning them into 19 points on the other end.

STEPPING UP IN SEC PLAY

Breein Tyree has played better in SEC games in all three seasons as a Rebel. This year, he ranks second in the SEC in scoring during conference play, averaging 18.9 ppg after recorded 17.7 ppg in non-conference games. Last year, he improved his scoring for the second straight year in conference action, going from 8.3 ppg in non-conference to 12.3 ppg in SEC play. As a freshman, Tyree emerged to rank fourth on the team in scoring at 9.3 ppg in SEC contests, up from his 2.1 ppg before the start of conference play.

STAT-STUFFING SHULER

Sometimes the biggest jumps are from one's freshman to sophomore year. After playing in all 32 games last year, primarily coming off the bench, sophomore Devontae Shuler has

become an important piece in the Ole Miss lineup. Starting 28 games at point guard, he has stuffed box scores by leading the Rebels in steals (1.8 per game). Shuler ranks in the SEC's top 10 in three categories, sitting at fourth in steals as well as seventh in assist/turnover ratio (1.7) and ninth in playing time (32.2 minutes per game). In the Emerald Coast Classic versus Cincinnati (Nov. 24), he tallied a career-high 24 points to best his previous high of 19 last season against South Dakota State. In Jackson, Shuler scored a team-high 19 points to lead the Rebels to a win over Southeastern Louisiana (Dec. 12). At Auburn (Feb. 13), he tied a career high by making four three-pointers en route to a 17-point night, his most points in an SEC game through this point of his career. Shuler followed that up with a career-high five steals in the win over Missouri (Feb. 16).

A NEW ERA OF OLE MISS BASKETBALL

The 2018-19 season is the dawn of a new era for Ole Miss Basketball. A new head coach took the reins of the program when **Kermit Davis** was hired on March 15, 2018. Davis, the winningest coach in Middle Tennessee history, returns to his home state with years of success. A native of Leakesville, Mississippi, Davis guided the Blue Raiders to league titles in seven of his last nine years in Murfreesboro, between Conference USA and the Sun Belt. Middle Tennessee was one of five programs he led to conference championships in 36 years as an assistant and head coach. An eight-time conference coach of the year, Davis is 31st among active Division I head coaches with 488 career wins (422 in Division I), including stints at MT, Idaho and Texas A&M. He ranks 11th nationally in winning percentage over the last three years and 13th over the last seven.

FAST START FOR KERMIT DAVIS

With the victory over No. 14 Mississippi State (Jan. 12), head coach **Kermit Davis** became the first coach in program history to win his first three SEC games. He was also just the second coach in Ole Miss history to win 13 of his first 15 games and the third to win 19 of his first 29 games guiding the Rebels. The Mississippi native joined the likes of former Ole Miss coach Homer Hazel (1926-30), who won 20 of his first 22 games and 25 of his first 29 games. Hazel's run extended into his second season as head coach after going 16-2 during the entire 1925-26 campaign. George Bohler (1936-38) won 20 of his first 29 games, going 11-9 during the 1935-56 campaign before starting the 1936-37 season with 11 straight victories.

NEXT ON THE HARDWOOD

Before heading to Nashville for the SEC Tournament, the Rebels will hit the road for a matchup with Missouri (March 9). Ole Miss won the first meeting of the season 75-65 in Oxford (Feb. 16). Tipoff from Columbia is set for 2:30 p.m. on SEC Network. The contest will have major seeding implications for the Rebels in the Music City.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE DAVIS

No Rebel recorded a double-double in any of the first 13 games of the season, but **Terence Davis** has emerged with three in SEC play thus far. The Southaven, Mississippi, native tallied 27 points and 12 rebounds, both team highs, to lead Ole Miss past No. 10 Auburn 82-67 (Jan. 9). The next time Davis took Craddock Court at The Pavilion, he produced another double-double with 21 points and 10 boards against LSU (Jan. 15). At Florida (Jan. 30), he recorded team highs in points (26) and rebounds (12). Davis now has nine double-doubles for his career to pace the Rebels.

OLE MISS BEATS GEORGIA TO SWEEP SEASON SERIES

Behind a strong second half from junior guard **Breein Tyree**, Ole Miss got back to its winning ways with a 72-71 victory over Georgia at The Pavilion (Feb. 23). Tyree scored 14 of his game-high 17 points in the final 20 minutes, including his own 7-0 run that turned a one-point deficit into a six-point lead for the Rebels. The pressure of the Ole Miss 1-3-1 zone defense forced a missed three pointer by the Bulldogs at the buzzer to secure the win. Sophomore guard **Devontae Shuler** added 16 points. The Irmo, South Carolina, native knocked down four three-pointers, including a game-tying long ball with 1:22 to go. **Terence Davis** added 13 points with a team-high three steals, helping cause 19 Georgia turnovers throughout the game. **KJ Buffen** added eight points off the bench, while **D.C. Davis** also came in to add a career-high five rebounds and steal that led to a dunk.

CRACKING THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

With 10 straight wins, including back-to-back wins over top 15 teams, the Rebels found themselves back in the national rankings for the first time in six years (Jan. 14). Prior to that, Ole Miss last cracked the top 25 in 2013 (AP-Jan. 28; Coaches-Feb. 4). The Rebels were ranked 20th in both polls Jan. 21, appearing in the top 20 for consecutive weeks for the first time since exactly 11 years ago during the 2007-08 season (Jan. 14, Jan. 21).

REBELS BEAT MIZZOU FOR FOURTH STRAIGHT WIN

Converting 25 turnovers into 32 points on the other end of the floor, Ole Miss won its fourth straight game with a 75-65 victory over Missouri at The Pavilion (Feb. 16). The Rebels tallied 13 steals in the defensive effort, including a career-high five by sophomore **Devontae Shuler**. Ole Miss was led in scoring by a pair of Rebels coming off the bench. Senior forward **Bruce Stevens** scored a team-high 17 points, matching his season best, to go along with a trio of three-pointers. Freshman **KJ Buffen** added 14 points on 5 of 7 shooting with career highs in assists (4) and steals (3) through 32 minutes on the floor. The 31 points from Stevens and Buffen were the most points scored by the Ole Miss bench since tallying 32 in the season-opening win over Western Michigan (Nov. 10). The Rebels knocked down their free throws, a common theme throughout the season, going 20 of 23 (87.0 percent) from the stripe. **Breein Tyree** went to the line the most, making six of his eight attempts as part of his 14-point afternoon. Shuler added 12 points as the fourth Rebel to reach double figures. Jordan Geist tallied a game-high 23 points to pace Missouri in the loss.

OLE MISS SWEEPS AUBURN BEHIND LOCKDOWN DEFENSE

The Rebels completed the regular season sweep of Auburn behind a dominant defensive effort at Auburn Arena (Feb. 13). Ole Miss held the Tigers to a season-low field goal percentage (32.7 percent) and point total in a 60-55 victory. The Rebels were led by stellar guard play led by **Breein Tyree** and **Devontae Shuler**. Tyree scored 20 points for the sixth straight game behind four three-pointers. **Devontae Shuler** added 17 of his own with a career-high tying four three-pointers, three coming when the shot clock was expiring. **Terence Davis** fought through foul trouble to add eight points on 3 of 3 shooting, all in the second half. Ole Miss got production off the bench with **Blake Hinson** out. **Zach Naylor** scored a career-high tying five points, playing crucial minutes in the second half. The Rebels shot 39 percent from the three-point line, making a season-high 13 three-pointers, the eighth-most in school history; the 33 attempts were the fifth-most in school history. Both were two away from tying school records

TAMING THE TIGERS

With the win over Auburn (Feb. 13), the Rebels swept the season series and won for the 12th time over the last 14 matchups between the conference foes. Auburn only led for 21 seconds during the two games. Ole Miss produced a wire-to-wire victory at The Pavilion (Jan. 9), and the Tigers held an early 4-3 lead for 21 seconds on Wednesday. The Rebels held Auburn to their lowest point total (55) and field goal percentage (32.7) this season, besting their previous low (67 points, 32.8 field goal percentage) from the first matchup. Auburn entered Wednesday's game leading the SEC in three-point percentage (37.7 percent) and ranking fourth nationally with 11.3 three made per game. Ole Miss stretched its defense and limited the Tigers to going 5 of 20 (25.0 percent) from long distance.

TYREE'S CAREER DAY LEADS REBELS TO ROAD WIN

Breein Tyree broke the 1,000-point threshold en route to a career-high 31 points, leading Ole Miss to an 80-64 victory over Georgia (Feb. 9). The Rebels capped off a perfect week by winning in Athens for the first time in seven years. Ole Miss had three double-figure scorers including Tyree. Freshman Blake Hinson added 13 points of his own with three made three-pointers. Senior Terence Davis was all over the stat sheet for the second straight game, scoring 12 points with five rebounds, four assists and four steals. Bruce Stevens pulled down a season-high nine rebounds to go along with six points, including 4 of 4 from the line. Ole Miss was very active on the defensive end, grabbing 10 steals and forcing 20 turnovers that led to 19 points on the other end. With the help of 13 offensive rebounds, the Rebels held a 21-5 advantage in second chance points.

CRASHING THE GLASS

In the win over Georgia (Feb. 9), Ole Miss controlled the boards against the SEC's best rebounding team. The Rebels out-rebounded Georgia 38-32, including 13-9 on the offensive glass. The 13 offensive rebounds led to a 21-5 advantage in second chance points.

REBELS GET BACK ON TRACK

Taking advantage of steals and converting at the free throw line, Ole Miss got back on the winning track with a 75-71 victory over Texas A&M (Feb. 6) at The Pavilion. The Rebels recorded 14 steals and produced 31 points off turnovers, while shooting 94.7 percent (18 of 19) from the charity stripe, to rally from a nine-point second half deficit and earn a

hard-fought win. Ole Miss knocked down 17 of 18 free throw attempts in the second half behind the duo of **Terence Davis** and **Breein Tyree**. Davis made all six of his free throws, while Tyree sank all five of his own. The pair of Rebels combined for 41 of the team's 75 points with Tyree's 22 leading the way. Davis was a stat machine throughout the night, scoring 19 points with team highs in rebounds (8), steals (7) and assists (5). His seven steals were a career-high and the most by a Rebel in two seasons. **Blake Hinson** added 11 points and a pair of steals, while **Devontae Shuler** tallied at least three steals for the fourth consecutive game. **Dominik Olejniczak** scored six points that including a crucial pair of free throws late as well as a big-time block with 1:05 remaining in the game.

STEALS STAT

Ole Miss recorded 14 steals in the win over the Aggies (Feb. 6), the most by the Rebels in an SEC game since Feb. 14, 2017 versus LSU. Senior **Terence Davis** led the way with a career-high seven steals, the first Rebel to reach that mark since Rasheed Brooks accomplished the feat during the 2017 Valentine's Day win over the Tigers.

CLUTCH FREE THROWS

Despite going the final 5:32 without making a field goal, while only attempting three shots during the span, the Rebels put Texas A&M away by converting at the free throw line. Starting with **Breein Tyree**'s free throws with 4:50 to go, Ole Miss made its final 12 free throws to put the game on ice. Four Rebels contributed to the perfection from the stripe. Tyree went 4 for 4, while **Blake Hinson** and **Dominik Olejniczak** made two apiece. With his team up by three, **Terence Davis** kept the Aggies out of reach by making all six of his free throws over the final 31 seconds of the contest to lock up the victory.

BUFFEN'S BIG GAME OFF THE BENCH

Freshman **KJ Buffen** provided a huge spark off the bench for Ole Miss at Florida (Jan. 30). In 29 minutes, he scored a career-high 17 points on 4 of 7 shooting that included his second three-pointer of the season. Entering the game as a 61.7 percent free throw shooter, Buffen was a perfect 8 for 8 from the charity stripe. Coming off the bench in all 20 games, the Gainesville, Georgia, native ranks second on the team in rebounding with 4.6 boards per game.

HISTORICAL GAME

History took place Jan. 26 as two top 25 teams battled on Craddock Court for the first time in the four-year history of The Pavilion. No. 20 Ole Miss hosted No. 24 Iowa State for the SEC/Big 12 Challenge. In fact, it was the first time a top 25 matchup took place in Oxford since No. 22 Ole Miss defeated No. 19 Vanderbilt 74-58 in Tad Smith Coliseum 11 years ago (Jan. 30, 2008).

REBELS ROLL PAST RAZORBACKS IN SOLD OUT PAVILION

No. 18 Ole Miss jumped out to a 7-0 lead and never looked back, cruising to an 84-67 wire-to-wire win over Arkansas (Jan. 19). After their 10-game winning streak was snapped to hand them their first SEC loss earlier in the week, the Rebels bounced back with a convincing victory in front of a sellout crowd at The Pavilion. Ole Miss caused havoc on defense, converting 17 turnovers (13 steals) into 22 points. The Razorbacks were limited to a 36.7 percent (11 of 30) clip in the second half, and 6 of 23 (26.1 percent) from three throughout the entire game. The Rebels also controlled the paint 44-28, holding Arkansas leading scorer Daniel Gafford to a then-season-low nine points. Ole Miss had balanced scoring with four Rebels in double figures. Breein Tyree tallied a game-high 22 points, scoring 11 in each half. The junior guard was 7 of 15 from the floor and made all six of his free throw attempts. Senior Terence Davis stuffed the stat sheet with 18 points, nine rebounds, seven assists and five steals. Classmate Bruce Stevens added 14 points and seven rebounds off the bench, going 6 of 7 from the floor. Fellow big man Dominik Olejniczak played his best game of the season, scoring a season-high 13 points going up against Gafford. The Torun, Poland, native also pulled down five rebounds and defended the rim with a pair of blocks.

BIG GAME FOR THE BIG MEN

In the win over Arkansas in January, the five spot came up big on both sides of the court. **Dominik Olejniczak** and **Bruce Stevens** combined for 27 points and 12 rebounds, while limiting Arkansas leading scorer Daniel Gafford to nine points (season low at the time). The duo went 11 of 14 from the floor (78.6 percent), helping the Rebels hold a 44-28 advantage in the paint. Olejniczak got the Rebels off to a fast start, scoring nine of the team's first 19 points. The junior center tallied a season-high 13 points, all coming in the first half. Meanwhile, Stevens produced in the second half by scoring 10 straight points for the Rebels late in the game. The Louin, Mississippi, native missed just one shot, going 6 of 7 from the field and 2 of 3 from beyond the arc. He also grabbed seven rebounds in 18 minutes off the bench.

D.C. STEPS UP

Senior guard **D.C. Davis**, a former walk-on who earned a scholarship over the summer, got his second career start in the game versus Arkansas (Jan. 19). With **Devontae Shuler** nursing a foot injury, Davis stepped in and delivered. The Purvis, Mississippi, native scored seven points, his most in an SEC game, and dished out a career-high four assists without committing a turnover. Davis played a career-high 27 minutes, surpassing his total playing time (16 minutes) all of last season, although he did earn a start versus Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (Dec. 19, 2017). This season, Davis has played in all 20 games and averages 11.9 minutes per contest.

WHAT A WEEK

Ole Miss had quite the week in early January, shining in the national spotlight by beating top 15 teams in back-to-back games for the first time in school history. The Rebels knocked off No. 10 Auburn 82-67 at home (Jan. 9) before going on their rivals' home floor and walking away with an 81-77 win over the No. 14 Bulldogs (Jan. 12). The performance had both the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and NCAA.com's Andy Katz tab the Rebels as their NCAA Team of the Week. It was the first time Ole Miss beat ranked teams in consecutive games since 2002-03 when the Rebels went to No. 23 LSU (Jan. 18, 2003) and won 67-57 before taking down No. 15 Alabama 76-57 at home (Jan. 21, 2003).

LET'S GO 3-0

Ole Miss started 3-0 in SEC play for just the fifth time in program history, including the third over the last 20 seasons. The Rebels also won their first three conference games during the 2012-13, 2005-06, 1997-98, 1973-74 and 1936-37 seasons. Three of those seasons (2012-13, 2000-01 and 1997-98) resulted in NCAA Tournament berths. Ole Miss captured the 2013 SEC Tournament title and advanced to the round of 32. A Sweet 16 appearance combined with an SEC Wester Division crown highlighted the 2000-01 campaign. During the 1997-98 season, The Rebels won SEC Western Division and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

WWWWWWWWW

Starting at the end of November and running through the first three games of SEC play, the Rebels won 10 consecutive games for the first time since opening up the 2007-08 season with 13 straight victories. At the time, the winning streak was tied for the fourth-longest active winning streak in the country. Seven of the 10 Ole Miss wins during the streak were by

double digits. During the Rebels' 10-game winning streak, they outscored the opposition by an average of 15.6 ppg (82.1-66.5). The Rebels shot 52.2 percent from the floor, while going 40.9 percent from beyond the arc. Ole Miss shared the basketball during the streak, averaging 17.5 assists per game.

PERFECTION FROM BUFFEN

Against LSU (Jan. 15), KJ Buffen scored 13 points on a perfect 5 of 5 shooting to become the first Rebel to go perfect from the floor (minimum of five shots) since Marcanvis Hymon went 6 of 6 at Middle Tennessee last season (Dec. 9, 2017). In 19 minutes off the bench, the freshman also pulled down five rebounds to go along with a career-high three steals.

HINSON HIGHLIGHTS RIVALRY WIN

Blake Hinson saved his best game for his first taste of the rivalry with Mississippi State (Jan. 12). Scoring a career-high 26 points, Hinson led Ole Miss to an 81-77 win over the No. 14 Bulldogs in Starkville. After recording a team-high 10 points in the first half to keep the Rebels within striking distance down two, he scored 11 of the team's first 12 second half points. Ole Miss trailed by nine early in the final period, and Hinson drilled three straight three-pointers. He connected on five from long range throughout the afternoon, the most by a Rebel since the second game of the season when Terence Davis hit six at Butler (Nov. 16). Hinson's 26 points were the most by an Ole Miss freshman in a game since Jarvis Summers scored 27 points at Penn State (Dec. 4, 2011). The game-high output was the most by a Rebel freshman in an SEC game since March 2, 2011 (30 by Dundrecous Nelson at Auburn).

TERENCE DAVIS EARNS SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

After averaging 19.5 ppg and leading the Ole Miss men's basketball team to a pair of victories over top 15 teams, senior guard **Terence Davis** was named SEC Player of the Week by the conference office. Through the first two weeks of conference play, both SEC Players of the Week have been Rebels. **Breein Tyree** earned his first career SEC Player of the Week honor last week following a career-high 31 points at Vanderbilt (Jan. 5). Davis collects his second weekly conference accolade after becoming SEC Player of the week as a sophomore (Jan. 23, 2017). Davis recorded team highs in points (27) and rebounds (12), earning the first double-double by a Rebel this season, as Ole Miss upset No. 10 Auburn 82-67 last week (Jan. 9). Going 9 of 15 from the floor, it was the 19th 20-point game of his career and moved Davis into the top 25 of the Ole Miss all-time scoring list. With the help of four three-pointers, the senior moved into the Ole Miss top 10 in threes made for a career as well (140 in 103 career games). He hit two more Saturday, going 5 of 10 from the floor for 12 points in the 81-77 victory at No. 14 Mississispipi State (Jan. 12). The win marked the first time Ole Miss beat back-to-back ranked teams since the 2002-03 season.

REBELS DOWN RIVAL MSU BEHIND HINSON'S 26

In the most hostile environment yet this year, Ole Miss outlasted No. 14 Mississippi State at Humphrey Coliseum (Jan. 12). The Rebels clawed back into the game towards the end of the first half and controlled the game late against the Bulldogs en route to an 81-77 victory. Blake Hinson led the Rebels with a career-high 26 points on 8 of 16 shooting, including a career-high five made threes. The Rebels had four double-digit scorers. Breein Tyree, after going down with an injury early in the game, scored 19 points and was 8 of 9 from the free-throw line. Tyree added the game-winning bucket with less than a minute remaining. Terence Davis and Devontae Shuler had 12 and 10, respectively. Tying a season high with 12 made threes, the Rebels beat ranked opponents in back-to-back games for the first time since the 2002-03 season.

TOP-10 WIN

Snapping a four-game skid versus top-10 teams, the victory over No. 10 Auburn was the Rebels' first win over a top-10 opponent since beating No. 10 Missouri 63-49 at home during the 2012-13 season (Jan. 12, 2013).

LIGHTING UP THE PAVILION

The offense has put up some record shooting percentages early in the first year under **Kermit Davis**. In the first five home games of the Davis era, Ole Miss boasted the top three shooting performances in The Pavilion. Going 32 of 52 (61.5 percent) in a victory versus Chattanooga (Dec. 16), Ole Miss tallied its best shooting percentage since going 28 of 45 (62.2 percent) in a 78-51 win at LSU nearly eight years ago (Jan. 22, 2011). The Pavilion record broke the previous best mark of 61.1 percent (33 of 54) in a win over San Diego last month (Nov. 28). In this year's season opener versus Western Michigan (Nov. 10), the Rebels shot 54.1 percent (33 of 61) to match the previous top Pavilion percentage (Feb. 14, 2017 vs. LSU). No opposing team has shot better than 53 percent in The Pavilion.

BIG MEN MAKING BIG FREE THROWS

With the Rebels taking a season-high 37 free throws versus No. 10 Auburn (Jan. 9), 23 of them were attempted by frontcourt members **Dominik Olejniczak** and **KI Buffen**. Both Rebels set career highs in makes and attempts from the charity stripe as the duo combined to go 17 of 23 (73.9 percent). Olejniczak went 9 of 12 from the line, while Buffen converted 8 of 11.

REBELS UPSET NO. 10 AUBURN WITH WIRE-TO-WIRE VICTORY

In front of a rowdy crowd at The Pavilion, senior **Terence Davis** scored 27 points and grabbed 12 rebounds to lead Ole Miss to an 82-67 victory over No. 10 Auburn (Jan. 9). The Rebels controlled the game from the tip, leading throughout to secure their ninth straight win and earn a signature victory in the first SEC home game under head coach **Kermit Davis**. The win gave Ole Miss its longest winning streak since the 2012-13 campaign, and the Rebels improved to 2-0 in SEC play for just the fourth time in the last two decades. It was also Ole Miss' first victory over a top 10 team in six years. **Terence Davis**' double-double led the way, while freshman **KJ Buffen** added 16 points off the bench. **Devontae Shuler** reached double figures as well, tallying 14 points. Junior center **Dominik Olejniczak** recorded 11 points and seven rebounds, helping Ole Miss hold a 45-37 advantage on the boards. The Rebels also dominated the paint by outscoring the Tigers 30-12 in that area.

TYREE NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After leading the Rebels to an 81-71 win at Vanderbilt to begin conference play, Ole Miss junior guard **Breein Tyree** was named SEC Player of the Week (Jan. 7). Scoring the most points by any SEC player over the weekend, Tyree earned the accolade from the conference office for the first time in his career. With a career-high 31 points, Tyree put the team on his back and led the Rebels to their eighth straight victory. Tyree's output was the most points scored by a Rebel and a Vanderbilt opponent this season. No other player scored more than 23 points in an SEC opener. Making a career-high 11 shots, Tyree went 11 of 16 from the floor for a 68.6 percent clip. He got off to a hot start, draining his first six shots from the field and scoring 17 of his team's 35 first half points. The Somerset, New Jersey, native produced his first career 30-point game and has scored at least 20 points in seven of the last 10 games. He was a perfect 6 of 6 from the line, making four free throws during the final six minutes to help keep Ole Miss ahead late in the game. Tyree is the first Rebel to be named SEC Player of the Week since teammate **Terence Davis** earned the honor as a sophomore (Jan. 23, 2017).

OLE MISS EARNS ROAD WIN IN SEC OPENER BEHIND TYREE'S BIG NIGHT

Breein Tyree scored a career-high 31 points, and the Ole Mis men's basketball team took its winning streak into SEC play with an 81-71 win over Vanderbilt in the conference opener at Memorial Gymnasium (Jan. 5). The Rebels won their eighth straight game, marking their longest winning streak in six seasons. Four Rebels scored in double figures led by Tyree. Terence Davis, who scored all of his points in the second half, shot 50 percent from the field with a pair of three-pointers. Devontae Schuler had 11 of his own, going 7 of 8 from the charity stripe with seven rebounds and six assists. Blake Hinson scored in double figures (11) for the fourth time this season. The Rebels cashed in at the free throw line, going 19 of 22 (86.4 percent) for the game, including 14 of 15 (93.3 percent) in the second half which allowed Ole Miss to keep the lead down the stretch.

A DECEMBER TO REMEMBER

The Rebels went 6-0 in the month of December, going undefeated in the final month of the calendar for just the third time since 1950. Ole Miss went 5-0 during December 2015, while posting a 7-0 December record during the 2007-08 NIT Final Four campaign. Prior to 1950, four games or less were played during the final month of the calendar year each season.

REBELS WIN SEVENTH STRAIGHT, SOAR OVER EAGLES

Ole Miss finished off a perfect month of December with an 87-57 victory over Florida Gulf Coast in front of 7,551 fans in The Pavilion (Dec. 29). The wire-to-wire win was the Rebels' seventh consecutive victory, their longest since the end of the 2015 calendar year. Five Rebels scored in double figures led by **Terence Davis**, who tallied 10 points in each half for his 18th career 20-point game. **Breein Tyree** added 14 points to go along with a season-high six assists and a career-best four steals. **Blake Hinson, Devontae Shuler** and **Bruce Stevens** tallied 11 points apiece. Ole Miss shot 51.7 percent (31 of 60) from the field, boasting a field goal percentage above 50 percent for the seventh straight game. The Rebels also knocked down a season-high 12 3-pointers (12 of 25) in their largest margin of victory (30) since the 2016-17 campaign (92-58 win over South Alabama on Dec. 22, 2016).

REBELS ROLL BLUE RAIDERS FOR SIXTH STRAIGHT VICTORY

In his first meeting against his former team, head coach **Kermit Davis** led Ole Miss to a 74-56 victory over Middle Tennessee at Bridgestone Arena (Dec. 21). Behind **Breein Tyree**'s big night, as well as double figure performances from post players **Dominik Olejniczak** and **Bruce Stevens**, the Rebels won their sixth straight game. Tyree finished with a gamehigh 24 points on 10 of 13 shooting, including a career-high tying four made three-pointers. Olejniczak scored a season-high 10 points after getting the start, while Stevens added 12 points of his own with a pair of threes. The Ole Miss defense held Middle Tennessee to just 33.9 percent shooting as the Rebel offense stayed hot as of late, shooting over 50 percent for the sixth straight game.

REBELS USE 28-0 RUN TO DOWN MOCS

An incredible 28-0 run early in the second half flipped the game in favor of Ole Miss, as the Rebels rallied for a 90-70 victory over Chattanooga at The Pavilion (Dec. 16). Trailing by six with less than 17 minutes to go, the Rebels held the Mocs scoreless for nearly seven minutes en route to scoring 28 straight points and earning their fifth consecutive victory. Ole Miss also shot over 50 percent for the fifth game in-a-row, setting a new Pavilion record with a 61.5 percent (32 of 52) clip. Terence Davis and Breein Tyree scored 40 of the team's 90 points with 20 apiece. Davis also added team highs in assists (7) and rebounds (5), while Tyree sparked the big run with 18 of his 20 points coming in the second half. The junior guard was limited to eight minutes in the first half due to foul trouble, but he brought a spark coming out of the locker room. Bruce Stevens recorded 15 points off the bench on 6 of 7 shooting. Junior center Dominik Olejniczak scored seven points, while proving to be a big threat on the defensive end of the floor with team highs in steals (3) and blocks (2).

WHAT A RUN!

Trailing 45-39 against Chattanooga (Dec. 16) with 16:52 to go in the game, the Rebels went on a 28-0 run over 6:38 to take a 22-point lead. The 28 consecutive points serve as the second-largest run in college basketball this season. Auburn holds the top spot, leading Mississippi College 68-45 before going on a 35-0 run to make it a 58-point game (Nov. 14). Following Ole Miss, Northwestern is third thanks to a 25-0 second half run in a comeback victory over DePaul (Dec. 8).

HOOPS IN THE STATE CAPITAL

Playing in the state capital for the first time in 11 years Wednesday night, Ole Miss made sure it was a victorious return to Mississippi Coliseum with a 69-47 win over Southeastern Louisiana. The Rebels won their fourth straight game behind their best defensive performance in four seasons. Limiting the Lions to 47 points, Ole Miss allowed its fewest number of points since the 2014-15 campaign (Jan. 31, 2015 vs. Missouri). On the offensive side of the floor, the Rebels shot over 50 percent for the fourth consecutive contest. Behind 7 of 10 shooting from sophomore **Devontae Shuler**, Ole Miss converted 28 of 53 (52.8 percent) from the field. Shuler scored a team-high 19 points in the wire-to-wire victory with 14 of them coming in the first half. **Terence Davis** added 15 points, while **Blake Hinson** and **Dominik Olejniczak** contributed nine points apiece.

REBELS RACE PAST REDBIRDS ON ROAD

Behind a combined 42 points from **Breein Tyree** and **Terence Davis**, Ole Miss took its winning ways to the road and emerged with an 81-74 victory over Illinois State Saturday night (Dec. 8). Tyree had a team-high 22 points, including 17 in the second half, for his third straight 20-point game. Davis added 20 points of his own, his third game of the season with 20 points or more. **Dominik Olejniczak** scored a season-high nine points on 4 of 6 shooting to go along with a team-high seven rebounds. Ole Miss shot 93.3 percent from the charity stripe, including a perfect 14 of 14 in the second half that allowed the Rebels to keep the lead for over 30 minutes of game time. The Rebels didn't let the crowd at Redbird Arena phase their hot shooting as of late, shooting over 50 percent for the third straight game.

OLE MISS CRUISES PAST ULM

Ball distribution proved to be a major key to Ole Miss' 83-60 victory over ULM (Dec. 1). The Rebels produced 25 assists on 33 made baskets en route to a wire-to-wire win at The Pavilion. The constant ball movement allowed the Rebels to shoot 52.4 percent (33 of 63) from the floor. Ole Miss used its size to control the boards and the paint throughout the contest. The Rebels outrebounded the Warhawks 41-24, a season high in rebounding margin, and held a 36-18 advantage on points in the paint. For the third time in the last four games, **Breein Tyree** reached the 20-point plateau and led the Rebels in points. Behind Tyree's 20 points, freshmen **Blake Hinson** finished off a strong week by setting new career highs in points (17) and threes (4). **Terence Davis** added 15 points, 13 of them coming in the second half, and a team-high eight rebounds.

SHARING AND SCORING

Ole Miss shared the rock in the 23-point victory over ULM. The Rebels tallied a season-high 25 assists on 33 made field goals, the most in a game since last season versus Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (Dec. 19, 2017). Ten Rebels appearing in the game recorded at least one assist led by point guard **Devontae Shuler**, who matched his career high with a teambest six assists.

REBELS TOP TOREROS

A balanced offense led to a record-breaking night and a win for the Ole Miss men's basketball team Wednesday. Shooting 61.1 percent (33 of 54) from the field, the Rebels had five players score double digits in a 93-86 victory over a solid San Diego squad. **Breein Tyree** continued his strong play as of late, tallying a team-high 22 points on 6 of 7 shooting and a perfect 8 for 8 at the charity stripe. **Terence Davis** was back to his normal self by adding 20 points to go along with a career-high nine assists. Freshmen **KJ Buffen** and **Blake Hinson** had their biggest games as young Rebels, both recording career highs of 15 points apiece. Coming off a career-high game of his own in the Emerald Coast Classic, sophomore guard **Devontae Shuler** had 13 points. Along with balanced scoring, the Rebels found success at the free throw line by shooting 87.0 percent (20 of 23).

TYREE AND SHULER EARN ALL-TOURNAMENT ACCOLADES

Producing career-high games at the beach this past weekend, Ole Miss guards **Breein Tyree** and **Devontae Shuler** earned spots on the Emerald Coast Classic All-Tournament Team. Tyree led the Rebels in scoring over the two games, averaging 21.0 ppg. His big night against Baylor, tallying a career-high 28 points, helped the Rebels beat the Bears to advance to the championship game. He followed that up with a 14-point night versus Cincinnati, scoring 12 of the team's 24 second half points. Despite not having a big scoring night, Shuler played a career-high 38 minutes and picked up a pair of steals versus Baylor before breaking out in the championship game. The sophomore eclipsed the 20-point barrier for the first time in his career, scoring 24 points and pulling down a team-high six rebounds.

OLE MISS BEATS BAYLOR BEHIND TYREE'S BIG NIGHT

A last-minute jersey issue forced **Breein Tyree** to switch from number 21 to number 4. The junior guard may want to keep wearing 21 as he scored a career-high 28 points to lead the Ole Miss men's basketball team to a 78-70 win over Baylor in the Emerald Coast Classic. Tyree scored 17 of his 28 points in the second half, including the final nine to put the game away for the Rebels. The Somerset, New Jersey, native finished 6 of 11 from the floor while knocking down 13 of 17 from the free throw line. **Bruce Stevens** recorded season highs in points (17), rebounds (8) and minutes (33). **Blake Hinson** and **KJ Buffen** added nine points apiece to tally career highs. As a team, the Rebels forced 18 Baylor turnovers and limited the Bears to just 2 of 18 (11.1 percent) shooting from beyond the arc. Ole Miss held a 23-9 advantage in points off turnovers, while also converting 13 second chance points to Baylor's four.

BALANCED SCORING AND DEFENSE LEAD TO WIN OVER NICHOLLS

In the final game before heading to the beach for Thanksgiving, Ole Miss used pressure defense and balanced scoring for a wire-to-wire 75-55 victory over Nicholls (Nov. 20) at The Pavilion. Ole Miss held the Colonels to just 55 points and 33.8 percent shooting (22 of 65) from the field, its best defensive output in 60 games dating back to the 2016-17 season. Six Rebels tallied at least eight points led by **Terence Davis**. The senior guard tallied 14 points to go along with eight rebounds and a career-high four blocks. Davis guarded Jeremiah Jefferson, the leading scorer in the Southland Conference (19.8 ppg), throughout most of the night, keeping him to seven points on 3 of 13 shooting (1 of 7 from three-point land). Fellow senior **Bruce Stevens** added 13 points, while **Breein Tyree** reached double figures for the ninth straight game with 10 points. Tyree matched sophomore guard **Devontae Shuler** with a team-high six assists. Shuler stuffed the stat book by recording nine points, seven rebounds, six assists and three steals. **Blake Hinson** scored a career-high eight points, and senior **D.C. Davis** tallied eight off the bench as well.

TD FOR 3-0

Scoring a game-high 30 points Friday night, senior **Terence Davis** recorded the fourth 30-point game of his career. He also knocked down six 3-pointers for the third time as a Rebel (career best). Davis' 30-point performances are below.

DEFENSE AND DAVIS TRIO LEAD REBELS TO SEASON-OPENING WIN

Converting 24 turnovers into 39 points, a scrappy defense lifted Ole Miss to a 90-64 victory over Western Michigan in the 2018-19 season opener at The Pavilion (Nov. 10). Four Rebels recorded double figures, including a combined 29 from seniors **D.C. Davis** and **Terence Davis**, as Ole Miss won its first game under new head coach **Kermit Davis**. Western Michigan turned the ball over in eight of its first nine possessions, and the Rebels took advantage to jump out to a 20-4 lead that they would never surrender. **Terence Davis** led all scorers with 17 points, all coming in a first half in which the senior guard was 7 of 9 from the floor. **Breein Tyree** followed with 14 points, while **Devontae Shuler** tallied 11 of his 13 points over the final 20 minutes. Off the bench, **D.C. Davis** provided a spark with 12 points on a perfect shooting display.

STEALING THE SHOW

While the Rebels put up 90 points in the season opener, the story of the game was the team's tenacious defense. Ole Miss registered 15 steals throughout the contest, the most in a game in six seasons. The last time the Rebels recorded at least 15 steals in the game, they tallied 20 in a win over Lipscomb (Nov. 23, 2012). The 15 steals in Saturday's win also set a new record in the three-year history of The Pavilion.

NEW SEASON, NEW D.C.

Last season, his first as a Rebel, **D.C. Davis** appeared in five games and scored a total of five points. In 61 seconds against Western Michigan, he surpassed his total from the 2017-18 campaign. With the help of two steals, Davis used a pair of threes and a transition layup to score eight points in just over a minute. His performance led to a career-high 12 points. The Purvis, Mississippi, native went 4 of 4 from the field, 2 of 2 from beyond the arc and also made both of his free throw attempts. On the defensive side of the ball, he tied a team high with three steals.

FRESHMAN STARTER

Earning a start versus Western Michigan, **Blake Hinson** became the first Rebel freshman to start a season opener in 10 years. Terrance Henry, a seven-year pro in Europe, scored 1,095 points over his Ole Miss career and was the last Rebel to start a season opener as a freshman (2008-09 season).

OLE MISS HOOPS LANDS TOP 25 RECRUITING CLASS ON SIGNING DAY

Ole Miss head coach Kermit Davis announced the addition of four standouts on National Signing Day. Antavion "Dude" Collum, Rodney Howard, Sammy Hunter and Bryce Wil-

liams all signed their National Letters of Intent on Nov. 14 and will join the Rebels for the 2019-20 season. After being named the 22nd head coach in Ole Miss Basketball history last March, Davis and his staff quickly completed a recruiting class by signing five players within the first two months on the job. This 2019 class, Davis' first full class at Ole Miss, is one of the best in school history coming in at No. 25 in Rivals' national rankings. Collum is a Rivals150 recruit, ranked No. 139 nationally. Howard, the No. 10 player out of the state of Georgia according to 247Sports, adds size to the team with his 6-foot-10 frame. As a senior in his third year in Canada, Hunter is averaging a whopping 30.8 ppg to go along with 7.2 rpg, 1.2 bpg, 1.2 spg and 0.5 apg. Williams, a 4-star junior college guard out of Tampa, Florida, is averaging 18.5 ppg and helped the Falcons win their first four games.

TERENCE DAVIS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Ole Miss senior guard **Terence Davis** was named Preseason Second Team All-SEC when the conference office unveiled the coaches' selections on the opening day of the 2018-19 college basketball season. Davis finds himself on the Preseason All-SEC list for the second consecutive year. Entering his final season as a Rebel, Davis ranks 39th in Ole Miss history with 1,028 career points. The Southaven, Mississippi, native has played in 89 games since arriving on campus, making 52 appearances in the starting lineup. In 13 of those games, Davis eclipsed the 20-point plateau, including a career-high 33 points versus LSU as a sophomore. He burst onto the scene as a sophomore (2015-16) by averaging 14.5 points per game, a significant increase from his 1.8 output as a freshman and the largest scoring increase by any player in the SEC. Last year, Davis led Ole Miss in scoring (13.8 ppg) and rebounding (6.2 rpg). He ranked 20th in the conference in scoring and cracked the SEC top 10 in defensive rebounding by pulling down 4.7 defensive boards per game. Also on the defensive side of the floor, Davis paced the Rebels with 28 blocks and ranked third in steals (29).

MEETING THE STAFF

Building his staff, Kermit Davis brought two coaches with him from Middle Tennessee in assistants Win Case and Ronnie Hamilton, while also adding assistant coach Levi Watkins.

- Case spent the last 10 seasons on Davis' staff at Middle Tennessee, helping the Blue Raiders capture seven conference titles and make three NCAA Tournament appearances. Middle Tennessee won 232 games during Case's decade in Murfreesboro, including six seasons with at least 24 victories. Before joining up with Davis, he made head coaching stops at Redlands College and Eastern Oklahoma State College. Case was head coach at Oklahoma City University for 13 years, posting a 343-127 record and winning the NAIA National Championship in 1994 and again in 1996.
- Hamilton was at Middle Tennessee for four seasons, assisting the program in one of the best runs in school history. He helped produce a stretch in which the Blue Raiders earned three straight Conference USA championships. Before arriving at Middle Tennessee, Hamilton was familiar with Conference USA due to stints at Houston and Tulane. The Oxford, North Carolina, native was a four-year letterman for the Duke football team as a defensive back before deciding to put on his coaching shoes and switch sports.
- Before coming to Ole Miss, Watkins was an assistant coach at Arizona State for three seasons. Last season, the Sun Devils were ranked as high as No. 3 in the AP poll (highest in school history) and were the last undefeated team in Division I men's basketball. Prior to Arizona State, Watkins spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Buffalo, where the Bulls went 42-20 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. As a player at NC State from 2002-05, he helped lead the Wolfpack to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments.

OLE CANADA

The new era of Ole Miss Basketball began outside of the United States, as the Rebels traveled to Canada for their foreign tour. The NCAA allows basketball teams to take an international trip every four years. Although the preseason games do not count towards the 2018-19 NCAA campaign, the week provided an early opportunity for a team mixed with veterans and newcomers to take the floor against some quality opposition. Ole Miss hit the hardwood against four Canadian teams, Aug. 5-9, competing in games for the first time under head coach **Kermit Davis**. With two games apiece in Montreal and Ottawa, the Rebels went 3-1 north of the border. Senior guard **Terence Davis** led Ole Miss throughout the trip, pacing the team in scoring (21.0 ppg), rebounding (8.3 rpg), assists (2.5 apg) and steals (2.3 spg).

- Game 1 (Montreal): Ole Miss 102, McGill 61 Ole Miss held the Redmen to a 28.6 percent (18 of 63) clip from the floor, while shooting 58 percent (40 of 69) on the other side of the court. Davis scored a team-high 20 points, including the Rebels' first nine of the game.
- Game 2 (Montreal): Ole Miss 84, Concordia 77 Thanks, in large part, to the 1-3-1 zone, the Ole Miss defense forced 23 Concordia turnovers throughout the night to combat 15 three-pointers made by the Stingers. Breein Tyree led all scorers with 23 points, including 16 in the second half.
- Game 3 (Ottawa): Carleton 81, Ole Miss 63 Ole Miss faced its toughest test of the 2018 Canada Tour, a Carleton team that has won 13 of the past 16 Canadian national championships. Davis led the way with a game-high 23 points, seven rebounds and three blocks.
- Game 4 (Ottawa): Ole Miss 85, Ottawa 74 Ole Miss rallied from 27 points down, outscoring the Gee-Gees 71-36 over the final three quarters. Davis could not be stopped throughout the night as he posted an impressive double-double (23 points, 16 rebounds).

SCORING RETURNS

Ole Miss returns three of its top four scorers from a season ago in **Terence Davis** (13.8 ppg), **Bruce Stevens** (10.8 ppg) and **Breein Tyree** (10.8 ppg). The last time the Rebels had three returners that averaged double figures the season prior was the when Murphy Holloway (11.2 ppg), Jarvis Summers (10.4 ppg) and Nick Williams (10.1 ppg) returned for the 2012-13 campaign. That season resulted in a 27-9 record, the SEC Tournament title and advancement to the third round of the NCAA Tournament. If history repeats itself, Ole Miss will have one of the nation's biggest turnarounds and be dancing come March.

OLEJNICZAK COMPETES FOR HIS COUNTRY

After spending a week working out back in his native country of Poland this summer, junior center **Dominik Olejniczak** earned a spot on the country's national team to complete the first round of FIBA World Cup European Qualifiers. Olejniczak joined Rebel Basketball alums Tomasz Gielo and Sebastian Saiz in representing their countries in qualifying games across Europe.

NEW REBS

Six freshmen and two junior college transfers make up the 2018-19 newcomers: KJ Buffen, Carlos Curry, Brian Halums, Blake Hinson, John McBride, Franco Miller Jr., Zach Naylor and Luis Rodriguez. All six freshmen joined the team following the hire of new head coach Kermit Davis. All eight newcomers saw action during the Rebels' preseason trip to Canada. Hinson, a four-star wing from Deltona, Florida, led all newcomers in scoring at 9.0 ppg.

GRADUATED REBELS

Ole Miss must replace two starters, including four-year letterman Marcanvis Hymon. The forward ended his Ole Miss career ranked 10th in school history with 97 blocks. The Rebels also lost graduate transfer Markel Crawford, who led the team in minutes and steals. Deandre Burnett, one of the top two scorers in each of the last two seasons, also graduated. Burnett led Ole Miss in assists a season ago.

DAVIS FOLLOWS KENNEDY

When Kermit Davis arrived in Oxford as the Rebels' new head coach, he emphasized the importance of building off the foundation left by longtime Ole Miss coach Andy Kennedy. With 403 wins at the Division I level, Davis recognizes his friend's impact at Ole Miss as the winningest coach in school history. In his 12 seasons guiding Ole Miss Hoops (2007-18), Kennedy held a 245-156 record with 11 postseason wins, eight postseason berths, nine 20-win seasons, two NCAA Tournament appearances, two NIT Final Fours, two SEC West titles and an SEC Tournament Championship. Averaging more than 20 wins per season and a two-time SEC Coach of the Year, Kennedy ranks 18th in conference history with 245 victories.

GREEN LIGHT GUARDS

Ole Miss has proven to develop guards over the past 12 seasons as 12 guards have earned All-SEC accolades to rank third among conference teams during that period. The depth at guard showed in terms of scoring. Ole Miss guards accounted for 70.1 percent of the Rebels' points. Five of the top six scorers on the team were guards led by Terence Davis (13.8 ppg), Deandre Burnett (13.5 ppg), Breein Tyree (10.8 ppg) and Markel Crawford (9.2 ppg). Devontae Shuler added 6.0 ppg (sixth on team).



All three seniors hail from Magnolia State as well as head coach Kermit Davis.


