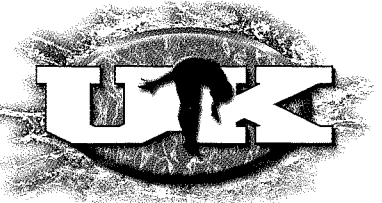

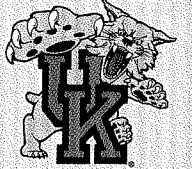

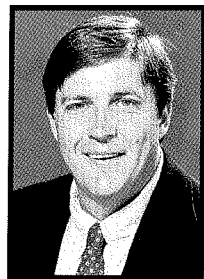

Coaching Staff

Gary Conelly

Head Coach



Gary Conelly is in his 10th year as head coach of the Wildcats, with an overall dual meet record of 108-85 (69-32 - Women/39-53 - Men). Conelly was named UK's head women's coach in 1991-92 and head men's coach before the 1992-93 season.

Last season, Conelly led the men's team to its best-ever NCAA finish, placing in the top 20 and had two men qualify for the NCAA championships, Macon White and Shaun Zitani. They garnered honorable mention All-America honors as well, White for the 200 Freestyle and Zitani for the 50 Freestyle. Four different women, Annabel Kosten, Carolyn Rader, Melissa Olson, and Kelley Miller qualified for the NCAA Championships. The women comprised the 800 freestyle relay that finished 12th and earned the women honorable mention All-America honors in addition to competing individually. Capping off the season, 12 current and former Wildcats participated in the 2000 Olympic trials.

In the 1998-99 season, Conelly took men's

swimmer Macon White and six women to the NCAA Championships. White, who qualified for the meet in both the 200 and 500 freestyles, placed 17th in the 200 and 37th in the 500. Rachel Komisarz finished second in the 1,650 freestyle and sixth in the 500 freestyle. Melissa Olson, Carolyn Rader and Annabel Kosten qualified in individual events. Jenny Priester and Jaime Siegle joined their teammates as relay members.

In the 1997-98 season, Conelly led both the men's and women's teams to top 25 finishes at the NCAA Championships. The men came in at No. 23, while the women finished 21st, their fifth consecutive top 25 showing. The women's squad had 10 athletes advance to the NCAA meet, the most in school history. Senior diver Paco Rivera finished second in platform diving, becoming the top NCAA finisher in school history.

Conelly led the 1996-97 men's team to a 26th-place finish, at the time their best finish ever. Nat Lewis finished third in the 1,650 freestyle and ranks as the second highest NCAA finisher in school history. The women finished in 24th place and had three team members earn All-America honors.

In the 1995-96 season, Conelly led the women's team to a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships, the highest finish in school history. In 1994-95, Conelly led the women's team to a fourth-place finish at the SEC Championships

and a second straight 19th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Conelly was named 1995 SEC Women's Coach of the Year for his efforts.

Prior to becoming head coach at Kentucky, Conelly spent three years with UK as a graduate assistant coach. In Conelly's 11 years with UK, the swimming and diving programs have made great strides. In 1990, Conelly coached the team's first female All-American and NCAA finalist, Kellie Moran. Since then, seven more Wildcat athletes have garnered All-America accolades under Conelly's tutelage.

Conelly came to the University of Kentucky from the West Florida Lightning Aquatics USS team in Largo, Fla. During his seven years at West Florida, Conelly directed 150 swimmers and produced three Olympic Trial qualifiers, two National Sports Festival team members, and one Sports Festival champion in the 100 backstroke.

As a swimmer, Conelly was a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team and he participated on the world record-setting 400-meter freestyle relay team. An Indiana University alumnus, Conelly was a 15-time NCAA All-American and is a member of the Indiana Swimming Hall of Fame. In 1973, Indiana honored him with the Balfour Award for excellence in swimming, leadership, and scholarship.

Conelly is married to Kathleen Healey and has two children, Cody and Emily.

mention All-America honors on the three-meter while Moss earned All-American honors on the one-meter, three-meter, and platform. Moss' honors were the first for a freshman in UK history.

In 1998 Paco Rivera became the first male UK diver to claim a Southeastern Conference title, winning the platform event and garnering All-SEC honors. Rivera advanced to the NCAA Championships, where he was named as an All-American in three events including a second place finish on the platform.

In 1997, Lyden led Christy Soulakis to the SEC three-meter springboard championship and SEC Female Diver of the Year honors, in addition to the All-America honors Soulakis and Rivera received.

In 1996 Leake and Soulakis joined Baker and Johnson with all four earning All-America honors. Leake finished second on the one-meter and fourth on the three-meter, Johnson finished third on the one-meter and platform, and Baker finished seventh on the platform. For his divers' accomplishments, Lyden was honored as the Southeastern Conference and NCAA Women's Diving Coach of the Year.

Before arriving at UK, Lyden spent nine sea-

sons at Eastern Michigan where he was the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year nine times. He then moved to LSU where he received SEC Women's Coach of the Year four times consecutively and was the 1992 SEC Men's Coach of the Year. During Lyden's tenure at LSU his divers won 15 of 24 possible SEC titles.

Along with his college coaching, Lyden has always coached U.S. Diving Clubs and has had numerous All-Americans and has coached six age group divers to 15 national championships. Lyden has served as the National Team Coach in 1988-90, 1992, 1994-96, 1998-2000 and has directed divers in competitions in Italy, Austria, Mexico, Canada, Spain, China, France, and Holland.

In addition to coaching, Lyden has been a member of the U.S. Diving Rules Committee, the U.S. Olympic International Diving Committee and is a lifetime member of U.S. Diving. In 1993-94 and 1997-99, Lyden served on the NCAA Rules Committee.

A 1980 graduate of Western Michigan University, Lyden is married to Emily Joan Sullivan of Toledo, Ohio. They have three children - Jessica Ann (10), John Tyler (8) and Brittany Barbara (2).

Pete Knox

Assistant Coach

Pete Knox is in his ninth year as assistant coach after serving four years as UK's graduate assistant. Often described as a vigorous and intense leader, Knox primarily works as a sprint coach, coaching such swimmers as 1996 NCAA qualifier Rick Barber. Knox brings his vocal and energetic approach to every practice and has an exceptional ability to motivate his swimmers. With an exercise physiology and research background, Knox specializes in

an ongoing weight-training program.

Knox came to Kentucky from Brandon, Fla., where he coached the Brandon High School men's and women's teams from 1980 to 1988. While at Brandon, his teams consistently placed in the top 10 of the Florida High School Championships. Knox also developed two All-America high school swimmers and had several Junior and Senior National qualifiers. An assistant coach with the Brandon Blue Wave USS Team from 1981 to 1988, Knox was selected Hillsborough County Coach of the Year in 1987.

A native of Norfolk, Va., Knox graduated with honors from the University of Florida in 1978 with a degree in health education. Knox is currently working toward a master's degree in exercise physiology with an emphasis directed toward the application to swimming.

Knox is married to former Wildcat swimming standout Wendy Hipskind.



John Brucato

Assistant Coach

John Brucato is in his second season with the UK swimming program. Brucato will be working primarily with the middle distance group and breaststrokers.

Brucato comes to UK via the U.S.S. club team Wildcat Aquatics in Lexington. He is in his 10th season with Wildcat Aquatics. Brucato came to WA in the spring of 1990 and has established himself as a leader in the Kentucky swim coaching community.

During his tenure with WA, Brucato has produced numerous Top-16 qualifiers, Junior National qualifiers, Junior National Champions, Senior

National qualifiers, and an Olympic Gold Medalist. He is a former Kentucky Swimming Coach of the Year, in addition to being a Select Camp Coach and an Olympic Festival Coach.

In 1992, Brucato coached Megan Kleine to a gold medal in the 1992 Olympic Games as part of the United States' 400-meter medley relay. Kleine, who swam for six years under Brucato at WA, won Senior Nationals twice in the 100-meter breaststroke. Kleine went on to swim at the University of Texas at Austin.

A native of Covington, Ky., Brucato began his coaching career at the Covington YMCA and then spent two years with the Covington Clippers Swim

Team. In 1985, he took over the helm at the Nashville Aquatic Club where he spent five successful years as the Head Age Group Coach before being hired on as the WA Senior Head Coach.

Brucato is a 1980 graduate of Northern Kentucky University where he received a degree in psychology. He lives in Lexington with his wife Jan, and their 12-year-old daughter, Katie.



Leslie Ramsey

Assistant Coach

Leslie Ramsey is in her sixth season with the UK swimming program. Ramsey served as a graduate-assistant for three years before becoming full time two years ago. Ramsey works primarily with the I.M.ers and butterflyers in addition to her duties as the recruiting coordinator.

At the 1996 U.S. Olympic Swimming Trials, Ramsey swam a personal best and reached the consolation heat of the 200-meter butterfly, finishing 14th.

The 1995 University of North Carolina graduate, earned All-America honors in the 200 butterfly in her junior and senior seasons in Chapel Hill. She also

earned honorable mention All-America honors in the 500 and 1,650 freestyles while at UNC.

During her junior season, Ramsey was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Female Swimmer of the Year. She was the ACC Champion in the 200 butterfly her freshman and junior seasons. Ramsey also won team awards for Most Dedicated Swimmer her junior and senior years, Most Outstanding Swimmer and Most Valuable Swimmer her junior year. As an age-group swimmer, she swam for the Coast Guard Blue Dolphins in Yorktown, Va.

Ramsey has coached at the UNC Swim Camp and is no stranger to traveling. She accompanied Coach Gary

Conelly on a coaching trip to Heidelberg, Germany during the summer of 1996, and traveled to eastern Africa in 1997 on a teaching excursion.

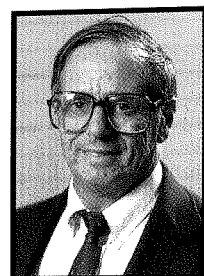

Letitia Hollingsworth enters her fifth season as Lancaster Aquatic Center Pool Manager. Prior to her stint as pool manager, Hollingsworth served as the UK swim team's staff assistant. At UK home meets, she serves as the technical manager for the electronic timing system and scoreboard.

The UK alumna and Lexington, Ky., native swam for the Wildcats from 1982-86 and was the captain of UK's first varsity women's swim team.

Hollingsworth teaches courses in CPR, lifeguarding, and coaches' safety training and serves as an aquatic examiner for the Red Cross.

Hollingsworth is married to Steve Gray and resides in Lexington.

Paul was named UK's men's coach in 1964 and assumed the duties of women's head coach when it became a varsity sport at Kentucky in 1983. During his coaching tenure, Paul compiled an impressive 135-61 dual meet record with the men's program and a 48-30 mark with the women's program.

Paul also was the men's varsity water polo coach from 1965-1982. His water polo teams had an outstanding 140-66 record, including the 1977 Midwest Conference Championship, before the program was dropped in 1983.

Paul's success as a coach is a testament to his extensive involvement in all aspects of swimming. Paul has served as meet director for the South-

eastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships, the NCAA Zone "B" Qualifying Meet, the World Games Diving Trials, the Kentucky High School Championships, the Kentucky Special Olympics and the Kentucky USS Championships. He serves as meet director for all UK home meets.

A 1962 Louisville graduate, Paul was captain of his U of L swim team. He was the Cardinals' high point scorer for three years and held 12 varsity records. After graduating from U of L, Paul attended graduate school at UK.

Paul is married to Helen Pennington, an Assistant Professor of Nursing at Eastern Kentucky University.

service, King saw assignments in Michigan, California, Washington, Colorado, Kentucky, and Germany. In fact, in 1973, King was the first woman to teach physical education at a military academy when she served at the United States Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs.

Along with her military service, King was an accomplished diver. She graduated from the University of Michigan in 1966, where she was coached by five-time U.S. Olympic coach Dick Kimball. King was the 1972 springboard diving Olympic gold medalist. She missed a chance at the gold medal in the 1968 Summer Games where she dropped from first to fourth when she hit the board and broke her arm during the Olympic finals. In her decorated career, King competed in two Pan American Games and won international diving titles in 15 countries. She is an inductee in seven Halls

of Fame, including the prestigious United States Olympic Hall of Fame.

After her diving career, King turned to coaching and served at the Air Force Academy from 1973-77. She was also a commentator for NBC Sports in the 1976 Olympics. King returned to the Academy in 1983 and was named assistant athletics director and diving coach. During this time, she was named NCAA Division II Coach of the Year three times. Under King's tutelage, 11 divers were honored as All-Americans and two claimed national titles. In 1988, King traveled to the Seoul Games as a staff member of the U.S. Olympic diving team, and later served in the same capacity at the Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta.

King resides in Lexington and has two children, Michelle and Kevin.

Women's Swimming & Diving Outlook

With a strong freshman class and experienced veterans, the 2000-01 University of Kentucky swimming and diving teams hope to improve on their performances last season. Last summer provided extra incentive for training as a number of the swimmers prepared for the Olympic trials.

"The tone for the whole year is that we are deeper in everything," UK coach Gary Conelly said. "I am expecting a very good year from all of these ladies."

Freestyle

Though middle and long distance freestyle events are shaping up to be strong for Kentucky, the sprint events are a bit shallow. With the graduation of Annabel Kosten, an alternate for the Netherlands Olympic team, the squad lost a strong sprinter and will have to search for a replacement. One person who could end up with the job is senior co-captain Jaime Siegele, who dropped quality time in the 50 and 100 freestyles over the summer. Siegele finished 39th in the 100 freestyle at the Olympic trials. Freshman Shawna Sechrist may also prove to be the answer to Kosten's departure.

"I really have the sense that Sechrist is going to be a kid who really blossoms in college," Conelly said. Sarah Hoppe, a junior, could step up in the 50 and 100 free, as could sophomore Kelly Neal.

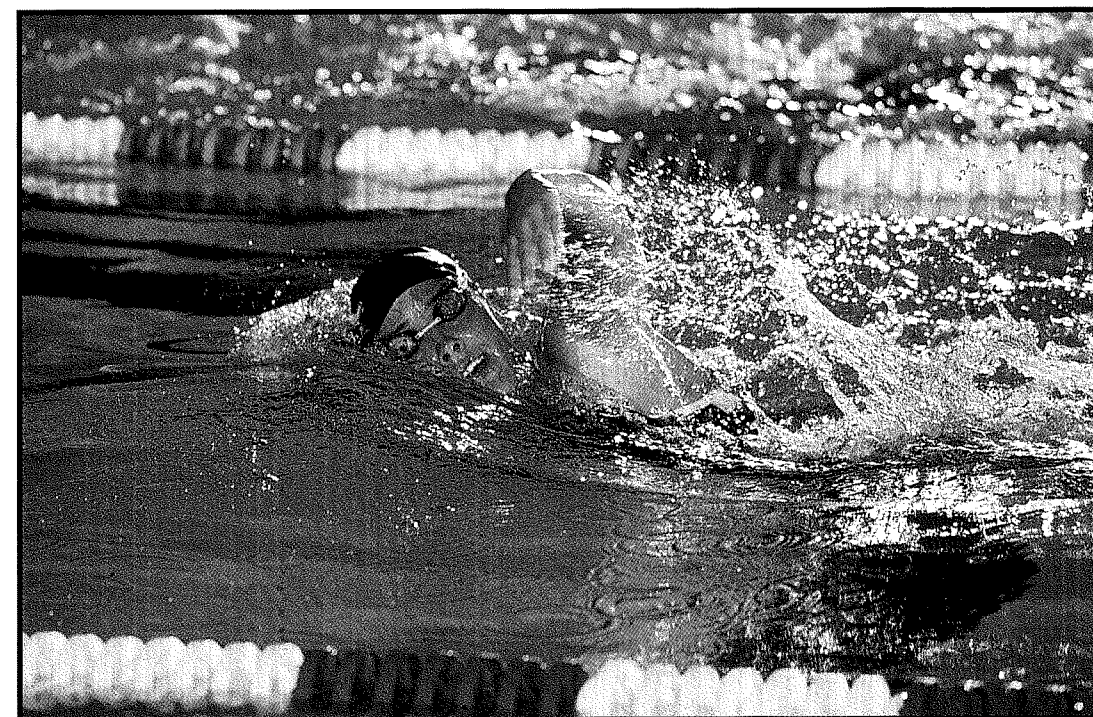
Middle distance will be solid for the Wildcats this season. Junior co-captain Carolyn Rader should lead this group in the 2000-01 season. Rader performed well both last year and this summer, despite shoulder problems. She competed in the Olympic trials, finishing 40th in the 200 freestyle and 26th in the 400 freestyle.

"She is a great competitor and I think she should easily qualify for NCAAs and score as well," Conelly said.

Junior Tracy Sullivan made great improvements last season and is swimming with confidence.

Freshman Amanda Bourgeois, with some good time drops, could also rival Sullivan. "Any of the five swimmers could be under 1:50, which would be an awesome 800-free relay," Conelly said.

Distance events will be strong for UK, with some middle distance swimmers stepping up to join the pure distance swimmers the squad boasts. Sophomore Emily Johnston is a true distance swimmer who has trained hard and is expected to



improve significantly this season. Versatile freshman Kendra Trahan, a breaststroke recruit, could see time in these events as she had Junior National cuts her sophomore and junior year in the 1650.

The 1999-2000 800 freestyle relay, comprised of Kosten, Rader, Kelley Miller, and Olson received honorable mention All-America honors last season, while the 400 freestyle relay broke the school record. Its members were Jenny Priester, Kosten, Rader, and Siegele.

Backstroke

The top returnee in backstroke is senior Melissa Olson, a co-captain who holds the team record for the 200 backstroke. She improved in the 100 backstroke last year, but prefers the longer 200 backstroke, her best event.

"She is a very dependable person in competition," Conelly said.

Freshman Jenaca Pumphrey is expected to contribute much to this team "She is one of those swimmers who I think has kind of been waiting for the situation to be right to pull everything together," Conelly said.

Sarah Carter will also be a big contender in backstroke for the Cats after dropping quality time last season. "She is somebody that I would say early in the season if she trains as well as she did last year, she has a chance to make top 16 at SECs and has a real good chance to qualify for NCAAs," Conelly said. Sechrist may swim backstroke as

well and could prove to be the answer for sprint backstroke for the Cats.

Butterfly

Rader will lead the squad in butterfly in addition to swimming freestyle. She also swam the 200 butterfly in the Olympic trials, placing 52nd.

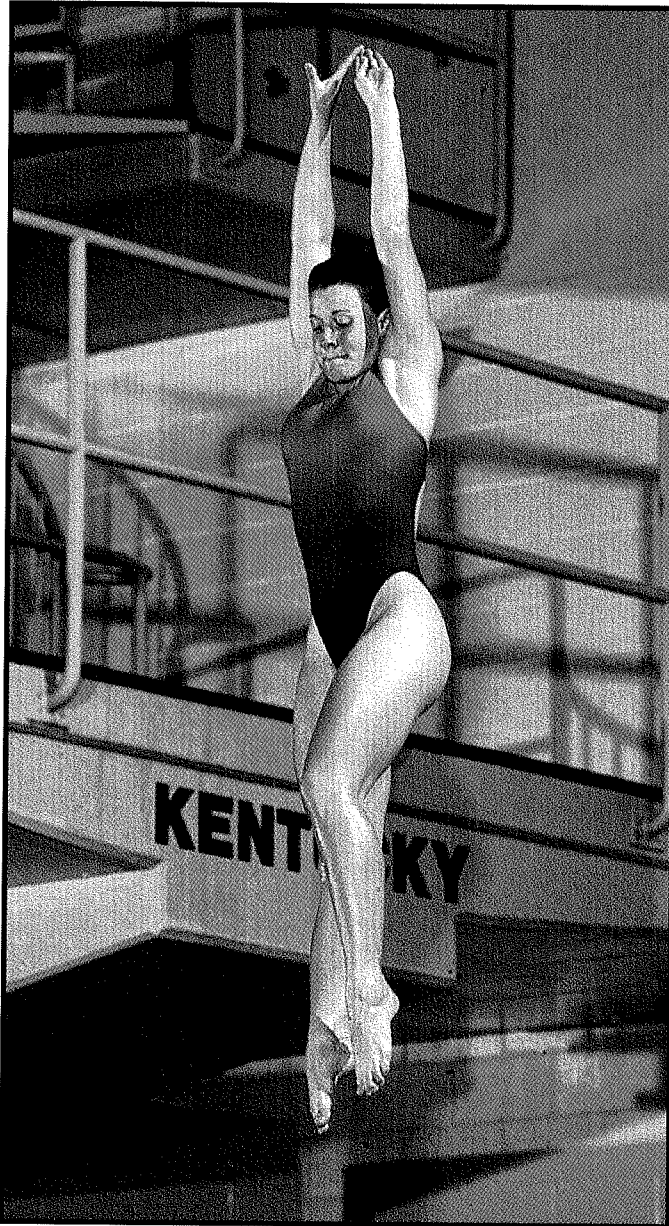
"Carolyn has the potential to win SECs in the 200 fly. She is going to have to swim a smart race and we are going to have to hope that her rehabilitation for her shoulder goes well, but she could really shock a lot of people," Conelly said.

Debra Hinsley also will be a force in the butterfly events this year. A steady dual meet competitor, Hinsley has had her best performances at the conference championships. "She has the potential to be on the NCAA team. To qualify it will take a pretty good swim, two minutes or less and she is capable of doing that," Conelly said. Hinsley, a native of Shipley, England, competed in England's Olympic trials where she finished 12th in the 100 butterfly and 14th in the 200 butterfly.

While both Rader and Hinsley are accomplished in butterfly events, both prefer the 200. Emily Johnston, much like Rader, does double-



duty in freestyle and butterfly and she too is more of a distance flyer. Junior Sarah Hoppe may see time in the 100 butterfly as well, especially in dual meets. Olson could move into the butterfly events as well, but due to the depth in those events, Conelly has few spots to fill.



Sophomore diver Kelli Frost is in the top-10 on UK's all-time list in the one- and three-meter (championship and dual) and the platform.

Fields, who broke the team record for the three-meter (dual) in 1999. Both divers rank in the top 10 in the one-meter (dual and championship), three-meter (championship), and the platform (dual and championship). Knoeber qualified for the NCAA championships last year, an act that Coach Mike Lyden thinks she will repeat, and Fields hopes to qualify for the first time.

"These two as leaders should make for a good year," Lyden said.

Sophomore Kelli Frost also earned a spot in the top 10 on UK's all-time list in both the one- and three-meters (championship and dual). The squad

lost only one student-athlete from last season and gains Emily Koglin, a transfer from Illinois State, who Lyden describes as "talented, but green." Lyden expects that two or three of the divers will make finals at the SEC championships and should qualify for the NCAA championships as well. "The SEC is strong, but we are experienced," Lyden said.

Schedule

As with any SEC school, UK's schedule is filled with talented teams. Most of the home meets are in the fall semester as the Cats play host to Louisville and Tennessee, in addition to the Blue/White intrasquad meet. The team will travel mid-November to the Texas A & M Invitational, where they will compete against a small number of teams. Conelly wishes the opponent pool could be larger.

"I would like for them to have a little bit more of a challenge for our swimmers when they go there, make them worry a little more about coming back for finals at night," Conelly said. "I am afraid some of the swimmers might be tempted to not put forth much effort in the prelims since they may not feel the need to go all out on the morning swim in order to return to the finals at night. Overall, it is a pretty good situation for them and I think we will swim real fast at that meet."

Tennessee is always a close meet and usually comes down to the last relay. Indiana is expected to be a tough meet as second-year coach Dorsey Tierney is developing a solid program. LSU, too, is always a tight meet and generally comes down to the final relay.

"It is one of those schedules where we may get to the end and the women may be undefeated. We might get to the end and they might have three losses. It just depends on how they come together as a team," Conelly said. "I think they should do well in the dual meets. Conference meet, I think, is the challenge that really faces them."

Though the Cats had a strong finish in the 1999 championship meet, the squad slipped a bit last season.

Both the quantity and quality of last season's losses are high, and the coaches have recruited capable replacements. But the question remains—Can the freshmen step up where they are needed and the veterans provide leadership? Conelly says it depends on how committed the team is to working hard toward its goals.

Breaststroke

UK recruited heavily to fill this event, so the young swimmers will lack experience. Despite the youth and collegiate inexperience of the breaststroke corps, it will be a group of very talented swimmers. Freshmen Kelli Stein and Kendra Trahan will fill the graduated Jen Clifford's spot and allow Olson to concentrate on other areas. While Trahan did not swim in the Olympic trials, she is already proving herself to be hard trainer and tough competitor.

"These girls are going to surprise a lot of people," Conelly said. "Some people probably noticed Kelli because she swam at the Olympic trials and did real well there, but I think she is going to get even better in college."

Stein finished 30th in the 100 breaststroke at trials. While this stroke has produced more distance competitors in the past, the freshman should excel in both events. Amanda Skinner, another freshman, could see time there as well.

Individual Medley

Olson begins her fourth and final year as the leader in these events.

"Her 400 I.M. will continue to be real solid, but she may make some big drops in her 200 I.M.," Conelly said.

"As she has gotten older and stronger she has developed more speed over the years, so I think she may take some big drops in the shorter race." Olson swam both the 200 and 400 I.M.s at the Olympic trials, finishing 24th and 19th, respectively. Trahan also will swim this event and will be a big help in addition to Stein and Sechrist, who could compete in these events. Last season, the squad depended on Olson to be strong in the I.M. but with the freshmen, these events are deeper and will allow Olson to try other events.

Diving

With two seniors and two sophomores returning, the divers have the depth and experience to find great success this year. Returning seniors are Carrie Knoeber, who garnered honorable mention All-America honors on the three-meter, and Sarah

Men's Swimming & Diving Outlook

The University of Kentucky men's swimming and diving team enjoyed a successful season in 1999-2000, finishing in the top 20 in the NCAA championship meet with one All-American and three honorable mention All-America honors. The team lost only one swimmer from last year — the graduated Brett Palmer — and adds a promising freshman class that includes one Olympian.

Freestyle

In the sprint freestyle events, UK coach Gary Conelly hopes to combine newcomers with veterans to solidify these events. Conelly expects freshmen Fernando Barros, Daniel Wimer, and Jamie Peterkin to grow stronger and enhance their special talents as the season progresses.

"All those guys have really got some ability, but I don't think it has been tapped into much yet," Conelly said. "I think that they are really going to take off."

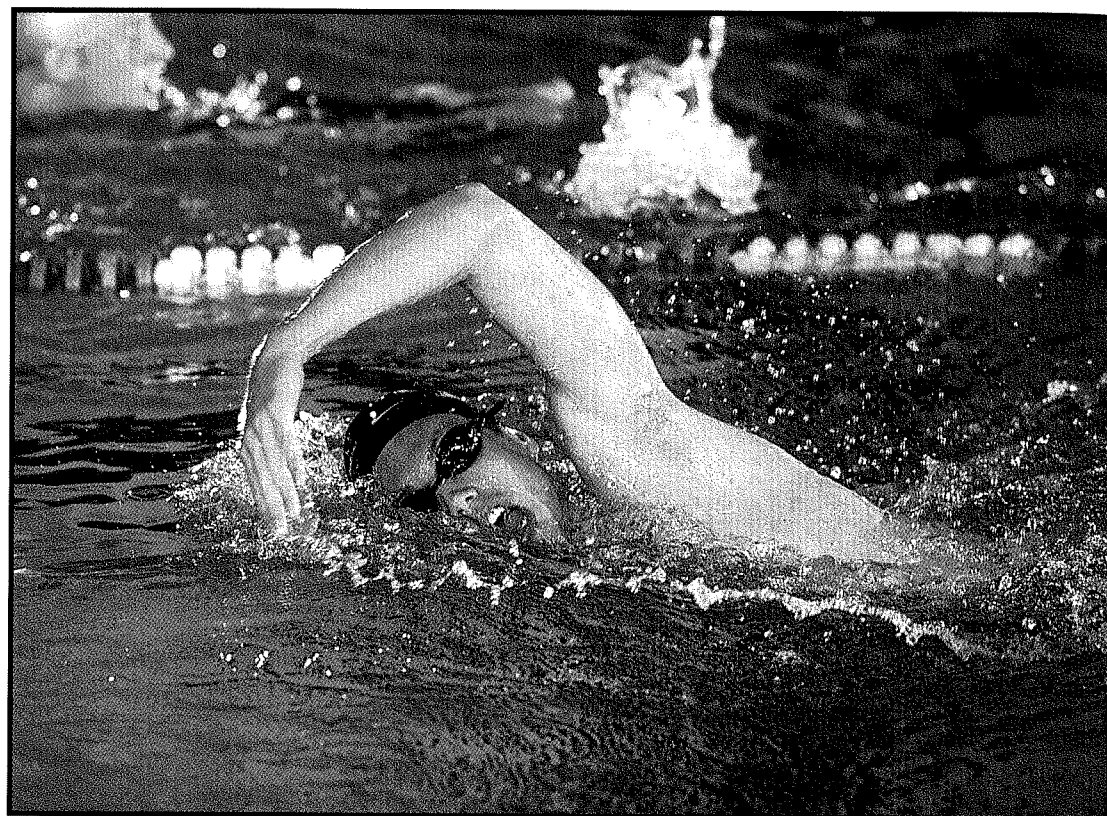
Barros participated in his native Brazil Nationals and swam some outstanding times without benefit of a weight program or year-round training. Peterkin competed in the 2000 Sydney Olympics for St. Lucia in the 50 freestyle, finishing 59th.

Returnees in the sprint events are seniors Shaun Zitani, Aaron Workman and Macon White, junior Derek Perkins and sophomore Roger Watkins.

"It is going to be a demanding challenge to make the sprint relay and should make us very versatile in a dual meet situation," Conelly said.

Zitani, an honorable mention All-American in the 50 freestyle, had an outstanding junior season, breaking his own school record in the 50 freestyle. He finished 12th in the 2000 Olympic trials in the 50 free. Only two of the swimmers that finished ahead of him in the trials are still college age, making him a contender for the 2001 national title. Workman, another outstanding sprinter, excels in the 100 freestyle. The sprinters are the deepest part of the team this season and make UK a contender in the Southeastern Conference.

Middle distance boasts two solid performers in honorable mention All-American Macon



White and senior David Tweedie, both of whom swam in the 2000 Olympic Trials. Barros may compete in the 200 freestyle. As a sophomore last season, David Kuendig had a great year and dropped quality time, and may come down from his usual distance events to be a solid competitor in the 500 freestyle and may see some action in the 200 freestyle as well.

"In the 500, Macon White and David Tweedie could approach 4:20 or below, and David Kuendig should be under 4:30, so this is a real strong 1-2-3," Conelly said.

Distance will be the weakest part of freestyle for the Cats this season. Kuendig is a distance specialist, while White and Tweedie may be used here but are more effective in the middle distance events. Freshman Darron Berquist, who improved steadily throughout high school, could be a surprise in distance and freshman Russ Throckmorton might also swim distance events occasionally.

Backstroke

This could be a weak event for the Cats, with only one solid returnee in sophomore Cody Nath. The question is, who will swim behind Nath? Barros and Peterkin are accomplished 100 backstrokers who may need to step up and swim the 200 as well.

Senior co-captain Macon White garnered honorable mention All-America honors in the 200 freestyle and broke his own school record in the 200 freestyle last season.

"We are really kind of open at the 200 spot," Conelly said. "In a dual meet situation, that is going to be a tough event for us."

Depth, not ability, is the problem in backstroke. Nath will have to work to win — not just place. Throckmorton could provide some relief here as well.

Breaststroke

Sophomore Roger Watkins broke the school record in the 100 last season and will lead the team in sprint breaststroke. Sophomore Florida State transfer Tom Vogt will also compete in this event. Olympic trials qualifier sophomore Aaron Cuker will command the 200 breaststroke this season.

"I think Aaron will probably break the team record in the 200 breaststroke this year," Conelly said. "Aaron and Roger are a powerful combination in the 100 or 200."

Both records are in danger of falling this season, and Watkins and Cuker will battle for the spots on the 200 and 400-medley relays.

Butterfly

Zitani will lead the butterflyers in addition to swimming freestyle after breaking the school record in the 100 butterfly last season. Watkins and Barros are also proficient in the 100 butterfly.

Sophomore Matt Nilson is a 200-butterflyer and will be a strong performer this year with one year of college training under his belt.

Sophomore Eddie Clement is a threat in either the 100 or 200 butterfly. Clement set the school record for the 200 butterfly last season and swam in his native England Olympic trials this summer, finishing 13th in the 200 butterfly. Conelly expects him to be sub-1:47 and Nilson will be under 1:50 this year. Kuendig and Tweedie could help out here, as could some freshmen.

"It is really a solid one-two punch with Eddie and Matt," Conelly said.

Individual Medley

Clement, Nilson, and Cuker are all accomplished 200 I.M. swimmers who will lead this area of the team. Cuker broke four minutes in the 400 I.M. last year, surprising everyone and showing that he can perform in both the 200 and 400 I.M.s.

While Clement did not compete in the 400 I.M. at the SEC championships last season, Conelly feels confident that he will be able to easily swim under four minutes this season.

"We have three guys there that we can move in and out, and we others, such as Throckmorton, who may come into play," Conelly said.

Diving

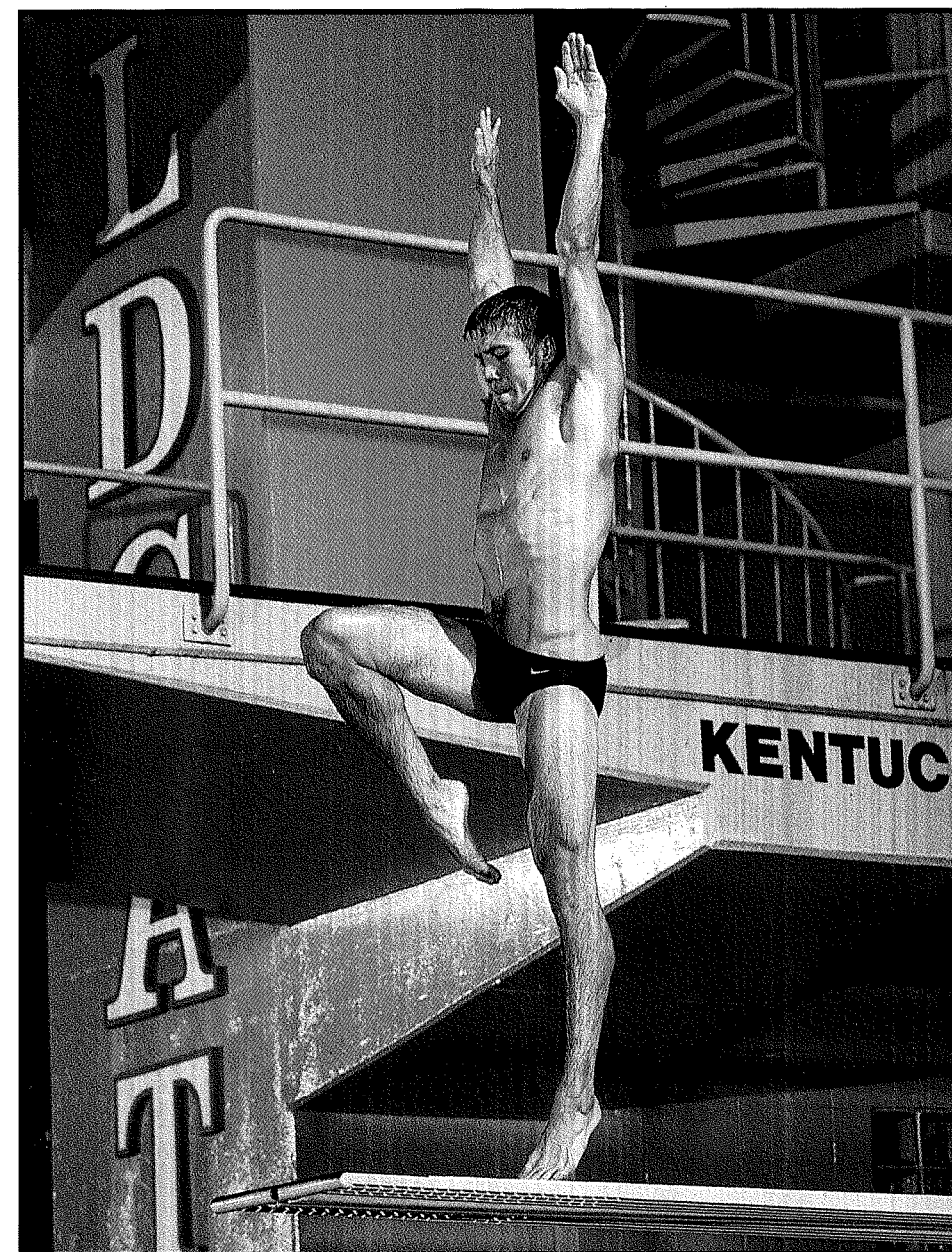
The return of All-American sophomore Clayton Moss and standout junior Aaron Kirkpatrick return to make this season a strong year for UK Diving. With only these two divers competing for the Wildcats, the focus will be on quality, not quantity.

Moss has a great chance to win at the SEC championships and should perform well at the NCAA championships as well. He garnered All-American honors in the three-meter, one-meter (honorable mention), and platform (honorable mention) and finished eighth on the three-meter, 10th on the one-meter, and 13th on the platform at the NCAA championships last season. He also broke the school record for one- and three-meter diving (championship).

Kirkpatrick is also expected to have an outstanding year. His performances last year moved him into UK's all-time top three in the one-meter (dual and championship) and into the top 10 in the three-meter (dual). At SECs last year, he finished ninth on the one-meter.

"This will be Aaron's break-out year," UK coach Mike Lyden said.

This should prove to be a banner year with these two talented divers on the squad.



Schedule

The men finished eighth in the conference last season, but finished 20th in the country, confirming the strength of the SEC.

"It is conceivable that we may be eighth again but still be in the top 20 in NCAAs," Conelly said.

UK has improved with the strengthening of the veterans and the addition of the talented crop of freshmen, but so have other SEC teams.

"We stand a real good chance to score higher in the 200 freestyle, the 200 medley and the 400 freestyle relays, and probably in the 400 medley relay at Conference than we have before," Conelly said. "More importantly, I think we have a very good possibility now to get

our sprint relays to NCAAs, which of course then opens a lot of other doors. We have done well in NCAAs but we haven't been able to carry a big enough team to actually have relays, which is where a lot of points are."

Though the relays have not qualified for NCAAs in the past, last year's squad broke every school relay record except for the 400 medley relay and all the members of those teams are back except for Palmer, who was on the 200 medley relay.

Lancaster Aquatic Center



The University of Kentucky's Lancaster Aquatic Center, opened March 29, 1989, represents the finest in collegiate swimming and diving facilities.

The natatorium is named for Harry C. Lancaster, former UK Athletics Director (1968-1976) and assistant basketball coach (1946-70) to Kentucky's legendary Adolph Rupp.

The indoor facility is 25 yards by 176 feet with a movable bulkhead that can be set at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. The movable bulkhead allows the facility to be used for a number of activities other than swim meets and practices, including recreational swimming, aquatic classes, swimming and diving lessons, scuba instruction, handicapped swimming and other aquatic-related activities.

Racing lanes can be set up in five configura-

ogy labs that are utilized for the testing of swimmers and divers.

The second balcony of the Aquatic Center accommodates up to 750 spectators and has a concession stand area.

Last July, the United States Olympic Divers put on two exhibitions before embarking upon their trip to Sydney to compete in the 2000 games.

In 1999, UK hosted the Southeastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships at the Aquatic Center. Pool records fell left and right as some of the nation's most talented divers and fastest swimmers competed at the Aquatic Center, Feb. 17-20.

In addition to hosting the 1996 U.S. Olympic Diving Team, the Aquatic Center annually hosts the premier swimming and diving events in the state of Kentucky. These events include all UK home meets, the Kentucky State High School Championships, the Kentucky USS Championships, Zone and Regional Age Group and Senior Diving meets, Kentucky Special Olympics, and Bluegrass Games Diving meets. Highlights at the Aquatic Center have been the 1991 Southeastern Conference Championships, the 1995 Southeastern Conference Diving Championships, the 1995 NCAA Zone B Diving Championships and the 1990 World Games Diving Team Trials.

equipped with two treatment tables, EGS and ultrasound machine, hydrocollator, and ice machine. There is a trainer on duty at all times.

The Aquatic Center has a weight room for swimmers and divers equipped with Cybex weight training machines. In the adjacent Seaton Physical Education building are exercise physiol-

tions: across-the-pool racing at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. Two 25-yard courses can be utilized for large swim meets. Eighteen swimming lanes are available while diving events are in progress. Long course racing will have eight full-size lanes for the 50-meter distance.

The swimming tank, which holds 1,025,000 gallons of water, has a raised deck gutter with a large overflow. This gutter design is similar to the Indianapolis Natatorium design. Pool depth varies from 4.3 feet to 6.5 feet at the shallow end utilizing a movable floor of 35 by 75 feet. Water under the diving boards and tower is 17 feet deep. The natatorium features Daktronic automatic timing for swim meets. A 16-by-23 foot wall-mounted scoreboard allows full display of information for eight-lane and 16-lane swim meets. The scoreboard can also display graphics and animation sequences.

The diving facilities are among the best in the world. The facility has two 1-meter boards and two 3-meter boards set on concrete platforms. Each platform is eight feet wide with lengths from 23 feet to 28 feet.

The facility won the 1990 Association of General Contractors Award for Structures. There is a 40-foot dryland diving area permanently set up with a trampoline, Portapit diving board and two diving/tumbling harnesses for somersaulting and twisting practice.

The Aquatic Center has a full training room

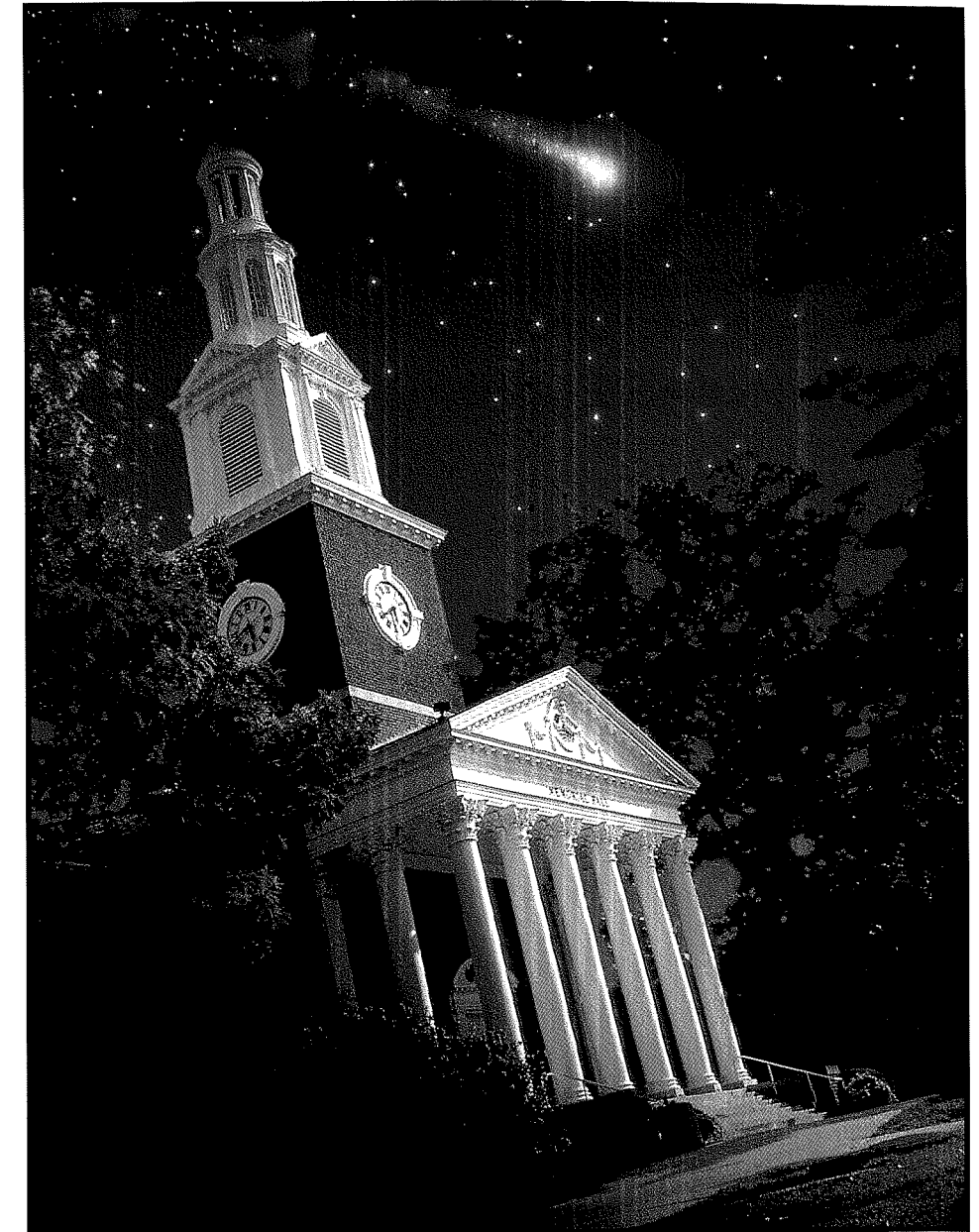

America's Next Great University



The University of Kentucky was founded in 1865 as a land-grant institution, and the present name dates to 1916.

The campus in Lexington has 673 acres and is located just south of downtown. It consists of a graduate school, the University hospital and 16 colleges. The colleges are: allied health professions, architecture, arts and sciences, agriculture, business and economics, communications and information studies, dentistry, engineering, education, fine arts, human environmental sciences, law, medicine, nursing, pharmacy and social work. The graduate school offers 96 master's degree programs and 60 doctoral programs.

Enrollment on the campus in Lexington is more than 30,000 and includes students from every Kentucky county, every state, and more than 100 foreign countries. Full-time faculty numbers 1,833. Approximately 98 percent of the full-time faculty hold the highest possible degrees in their field. UK's faculty and staff attract more than \$130 million annually in grants, gifts and contracts; and the University has been designated a Research University I by the Carnegie Foundation — one of just 59 such public universities in the country.

The University attracts excellent students. The average ACT score for first-year students is four points above the national average.

The number of UK alumni is more than 160,000. Private support from alumni and friends of the University exceeds \$45 million annually.

The new William T. Young Library is a library of tomorrow for Kentuckians of today. The \$58 million structure is a repository of knowledge as well as a symbol of the University's commitment to academic excellence. It is a building that appeals to the eye and the intellect.

"Public buildings, especially libraries, should be something above the ordinary," says President Charles T. Wethington Jr. "We wanted this building to make a statement about the importance of a library. I feel we have done that."

This library, he adds, is a symbol to our students and faculty, now and later, and to all Kentuckians that academic excellence is our top priority, and that we "are committed to becoming one of the nation's top 20 public research universities."

In addition, UK maintains 23 research centers which conduct applied research in areas as diverse as tobacco and health, aging, cancer, toxicology, equine health, mineral production, manufacturing systems, and public policy.

Several excel in the services offered to the public. The Center for Manufacturing Systems has assisted more than 500 small and mid-sized industrial firms in Kentucky. The Gluck Equine Research Center is recognized as one of only three of its kind in the world, offering continuing research into diseases of the horse.

The UK College of Medicine is consistently ranked among the top schools nationally in the quality of primary care training. The UK College of Pharmacy is ranked third in the country by *U.S.*

News and World Report and is one of the few pharmacy schools in the country with the capability of developing a drug "from bench to bedside" because of its drug product evaluation unit.

The University is in the process of developing the Coldstream Research Campus, a 750-acre complex designed to attract high-tech companies desiring ties to the University. Negotiations are under way to execute leases with developers to construct several new commercial facilities on the research campus.

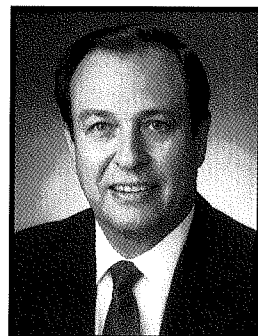

Dr. Charles T. Wethington Jr.

University of Kentucky President



Charles T. Wethington Jr. was elected the 10th president of the University of Kentucky, September 18, 1990. Wethington began his career in higher education in 1965 as a faculty member on the Lexington campus of the University and two years later was named chief administrator of Maysville Community College. In 1971, he moved to Lexington as assistant vice-president, becoming vice president of the Community College System in 1981.

In the University reorganization of 1982, he was named chancellor of the UK Community College System, one of the three major sectors of UK. In 1987, he was given university-wide responsibilities for public and governmental relations in addition to his community college role, and his title changed to Chancellor for the Community College System and University Relations.

Wethington earned his master's and doctoral degrees at the University of Kentucky. The Kentucky native has been active on the national higher educational scene. He serves as chair of the Southeastern Universities Research Association's Council of Presidents and served as president

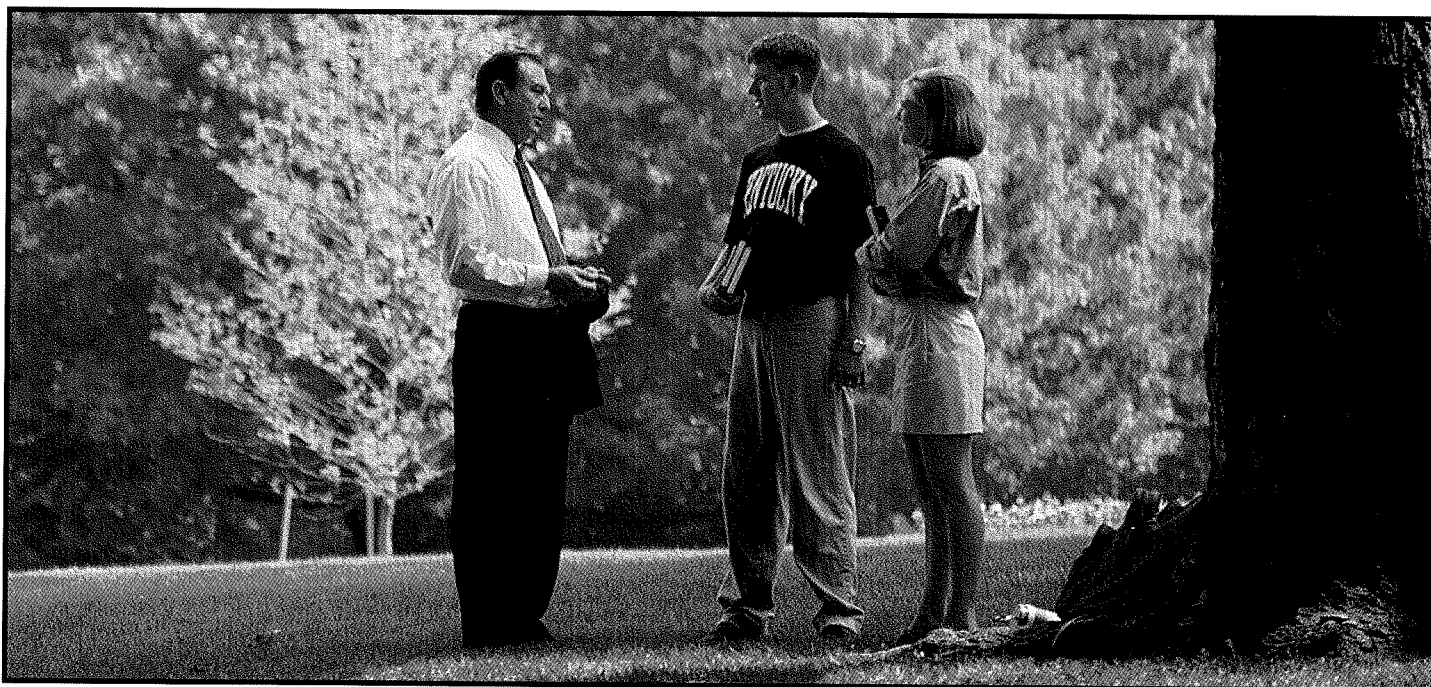
of the Southeastern Conference, 1993-95.

He has been a member of the Executive Council of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools' Commission on Colleges, and served as its vice-chairman. He served as a member of the board of Trustees of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools from 1986-89.

Wethington is a member of the Southern Regional Education Board and the Southern Growth Policies Board.

During 1957-61, he served in the U.S. Air Force Security Service. He studied Russian at Syracuse University, 1958-59.

Wethington is married to Judy Woodrow Wethington, from Danville, Kentucky. They have a son, Kennan, and a daughter, Lisa.

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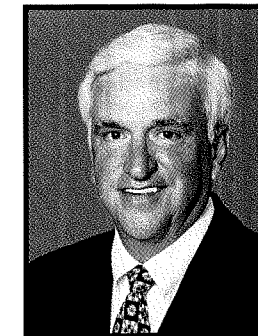
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Larry Ivy

Director of Athletics



Larry W. Ivy begins his first year as Athletics Director at the University of Kentucky, kicking off a new phase in a much-heralded 31-year UK career that has already earned him widespread recognition as one of the top administrators in collegiate athletics.

When C.M. Newton announced in December 1999 that he would retire as the University of Kentucky Athletics Director after ushering the department through its most successful decade in school history, the comment "hard act to follow" resonated throughout the collegiate sports landscape. But when an advisory committee began reviewing potential candidates for Newton's replacement, the mere mention of Larry Ivy prompted enthusiastic endorsements from athletics administrators, coaches, leaders of private industry, media and seemingly everyone who had an opinion to voice.

In an instant, "hard act to follow" was replaced by "perfect choice."

On March 20, the University of Kentucky Athletics Board unanimously approved UK President

Charles T. Wethington's recommendation that the 58-year-old Ivy become UK's new Athletics Director. On April 4, the University's Board of Trustees approved Ivy's appointment, effective July 1, 2000.

As athletics director, Ivy will oversee general operations of the UK Athletics Association and its \$38 million annual budget, 22 varsity sports and 150 employees.

Ivy came to UK in 1969 at the age of 25 as the nation's youngest director of housing. In 1976, he joined the UKAA as an assistant athletics director, overseeing the association's fiscal affairs. When Newton joined UK as Athletics Director in 1989, he promoted Ivy to associate athletics director for internal affairs, making Ivy the top assistant to the AD. Ivy was promoted in 1993 to senior associate athletics director. His responsibilities included overseeing day-to-day operations of the association in the absence of the director, handling operations and serving as game management director for the men's basketball and football teams, and coordinating facilities, maintenance, grounds, tickets, accounting, purchasing and data processing.

Ivy has been a major contributor to the phenomenal growth of the University of Kentucky Athletics Association in his 24 years as an administrator. Since he joined the UKAA in 1976:

- The budget has increased from \$3 million in 1976-77 to \$38 million in fiscal year 2000;
- From nine men's sports to 22 varsity sports today, including the addition of women's sports into UK Athletics;
- From 40 full-time employees to 150.

In the competitive arena, the Wildcats have won three NCAA Men's Basketball Championships, appeared in six NCAA Final Fours and played in six college football bowl games, among numerous other accomplishments.

Larry Ivy has been the one administrative presence throughout this era of tremendous growth and success.

The Huntsville, Ala., native quickly established himself as one of the most knowledgeable college administrators in the nation. A master organizer, Ivy has served as tournament manager for nine rounds of the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament held in Lexington - including the 1985 Final Four - and for three Southeastern Conference Men's Basketball Tournaments. Ivy has served on numerous committees for the SEC, and currently is chairman of the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament Ticket Committee.

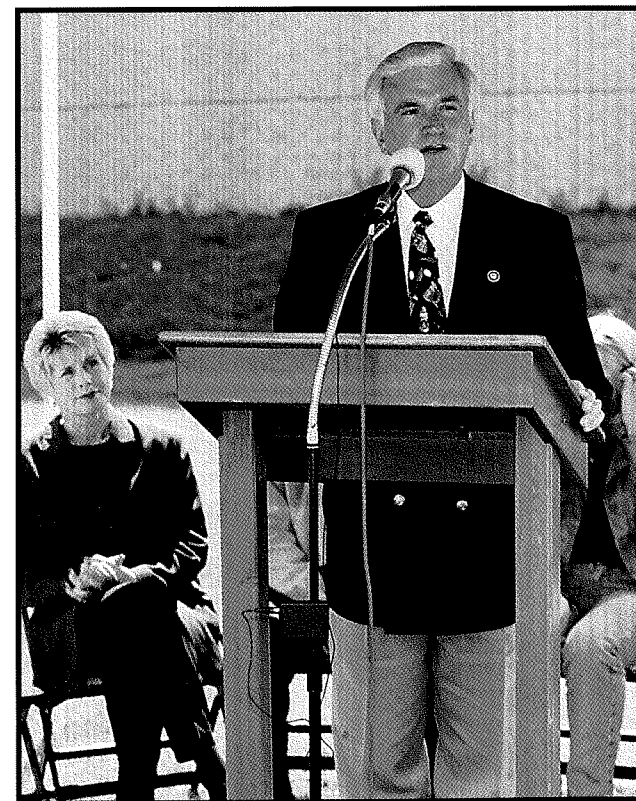
A defining moment for Ivy occurred at the 1995 NCAA Convention, when he was recognized as the 1994 NCAA Business Manager of the Year by the College Athletic Business Managers of America (CABMA), the highest honor given by the group. The national award recognized Ivy's outstanding achievement in managing the finances of the UK Athletics Association. He is an honorary member of Omicron Delta Kappa, an honor society that emphasizes academics and leadership. Ivy, a UK Fellow, earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Alabama in 1967 and a master's in business administration from there in 1968. He and his wife Dorene have two children, Kim Ivy and Rob Manchester.

Ohio Casualty Center for Academic & Tutorial Services

One of the cornerstones in the philosophy of University of Kentucky Athletics is a commitment to academic success. Much of the credit for UK's academic success goes to the Athletics Association's academic support system - the Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, or simply, "CATS."

UK opened CATS in 1981, the nation's first academic center dedicated exclusively to student-athletes. Over the years, as the services offered by CATS have grown, so did the need for additional space.

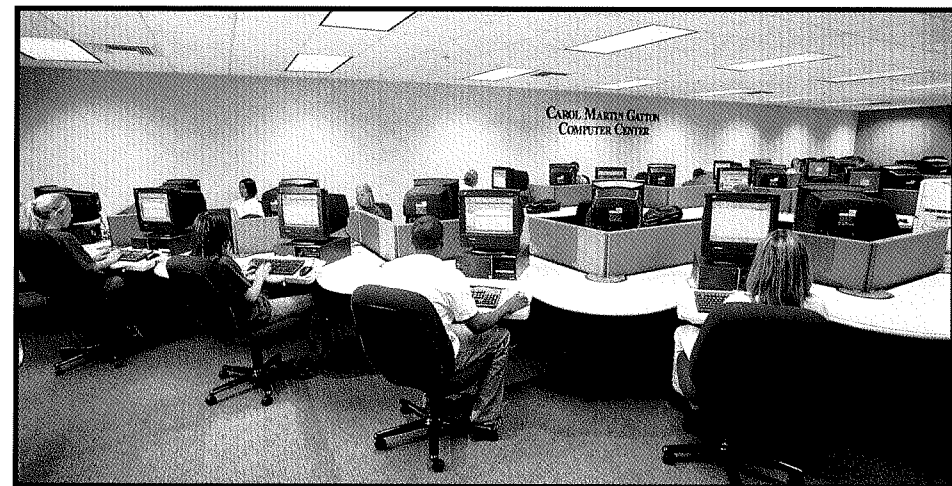
As a result, UK has built a new facility - the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, thanks to a one-million dollar grant from the Ohio Casualty Insurance Group. The new Ohio Casualty Center opened in 1998 at a total cost of \$2.4 million.

The new CATS, constructed in Memorial Coliseum, includes:

- 20,000 square feet of space - more than double the size of the former CATS facility;
- a computer room housing 35 computers;
- a study area which accommodates 90-100 people;
- 24 tutoring rooms;
- a career development and life skills resource center;
- a community outreach office; and
- offices for the staff.

Certainly, a facility is a good start, but any program - especially in academics - is only as good as the people who run it. And UK is fortunate to have outstanding leaders in its academics support system. Bob Bradley, Associate Athletics Director for Student Services, oversees the CATS program. Bradley was

named National Academic Advisor of the Year in 1989 and 1992.

CATS has a full-time staff of nine. In addition to Bradley, they are:

CATS also employs six graduate assistants and numerous tutors, both from the

At CATS, UK student-athletes receive hands-on tutorial services from a first-rate staff of academic counselors and advisors.

University and the surrounding community. UK has budgeted more than \$1,000,000 for the operation of CATS in the coming year.

"We are extremely proud of what we have accomplished in the academic arena," Bradley says. "The CATS program is focused on winning in the classroom. We look at each student-athlete's individual needs, set goals, and develop strategies to attain those goals. Our center provides our student-athletes with a definite advantage over student-athletes at many other institutions. Our goal is to show that we care about the student as well as the athlete."

For the CATS staff, showing you care means more than helping athletes maintain eligibility, graduate, or win awards. The academics staff also prepares student-athletes for life after college with the Wildcat Career Development Program.

The Career Development Program helps student-athletes look to the future through a step-by-step process which includes:

- Mentoring and internships, which help determine career interests;
- career counseling;
- resume writing; and
- forming a career plan.

The Wildcat Career Development Program works closely with the University's Career Planning and Placement Center in order to provide additional assistance when needed.

From exciting night life to a day at the races, Lexington has a lot to offer.

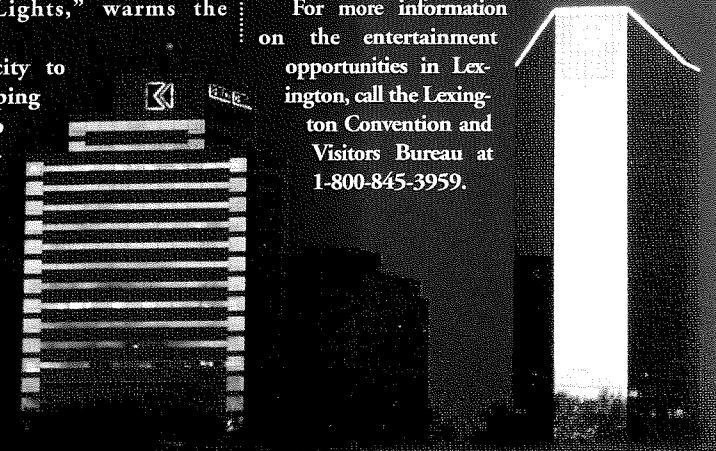
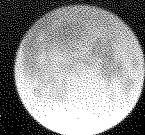
accommodations - all within minutes of the UK campus.
