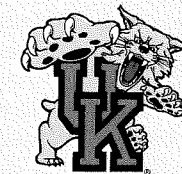

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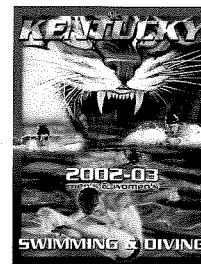

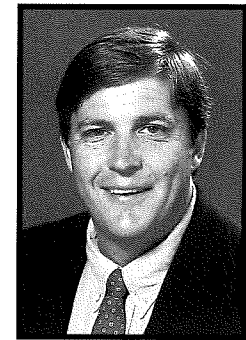
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## Coaching Staff

### Gary Conelly Head Coach



The dawn of the 2002-03 season brings about Gary Conelly's 12th at the helm of the University of Kentucky swimming and diving programs. The women's squads have compiled a 72-39 record since Conelly began coaching that squad in 1991-92. The men, whom he started coaching in 1992-93, have put together a record of 49-54, bringing his overall coaching record to 121-93.

For the second consecutive season, Conelly led the 2001-02 men's team to its highest-ever finish at the NAAs, placing 16th. At the Southeastern Conference Championships, the men had the second-highest point total in school history (282), finishing in sixth-place. Competing at the NAAs for the men were juniors Clayton Moss, Roger Watkins and sophomore Joey Faltraco. Faltraco's 11th-place finish in the 200-yard backstroke earned him honorable mention All-America honors, the first UK athlete to earn the honor in the event, while Moss was an All-American on the one- and three-meter springboards and the platform. The women also competed at the national championships, continuing a string of 10 straight appearances.

During the 2000-01 year, Conelly led the men's team to a NCAA 17th-place finish. UK also achieved its highest SEC finish in 18 years, placing fifth. Five individuals from the men's team competed at the NAAs, seniors Dave Tweedie, Macon White, Aaron Workman and Shaun Zitani and sophomore Roger Watkins, all five of them earning All-America honorable mention. Conelly also coached the women to the NAAs, where they placed 39th. Seniors Melissa Olson and Jaime Siegele competed at the championships, with Siegele earning All-America honorable mention in the 50 freestyle.

During the 1999-2000 season, Conelly led the men's team to a top-20 finish and had two men qualify for the NCAA championships, both earning honorable mention All-America honors. Four different women qualified for the NCAA Championships. The women comprised the 800 freestyle relay that finished 12th and earned the

women honorable mention All-America honors in addition to competing individually. Following the season, nine Wildcats participated in the 2000 Olympic trials.

In 1998-99, Conelly led both the men's and women's teams to top-25 finishes at the NCAA Championships. The men finished at No. 24, while the women finished 21st, their fifth consecutive top-25 showing. The women's squad had 10 athletes advance to the NCAA meet, the most in school history. Senior diver Paco Rivera finished second in platform diving, becoming the top NCAA finisher in school history.

Conelly led the 1996-97 men's team to a 26th-place NCAA finish and Nat Lewis finished third in the 1,650 freestyle and still ranks as the second-highest NCAA finisher in school history. The women finished in 24th place and had three team members earn All-America honors.

In the 1995-96 season, Conelly led the women's team to a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships, the highest finish in school history. In 1994-95, Conelly led the women's team to a fourth-place finish at the SEC Championships and a second straight 19th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Conelly was named 1995 SEC Women's Coach of the Year for his efforts.

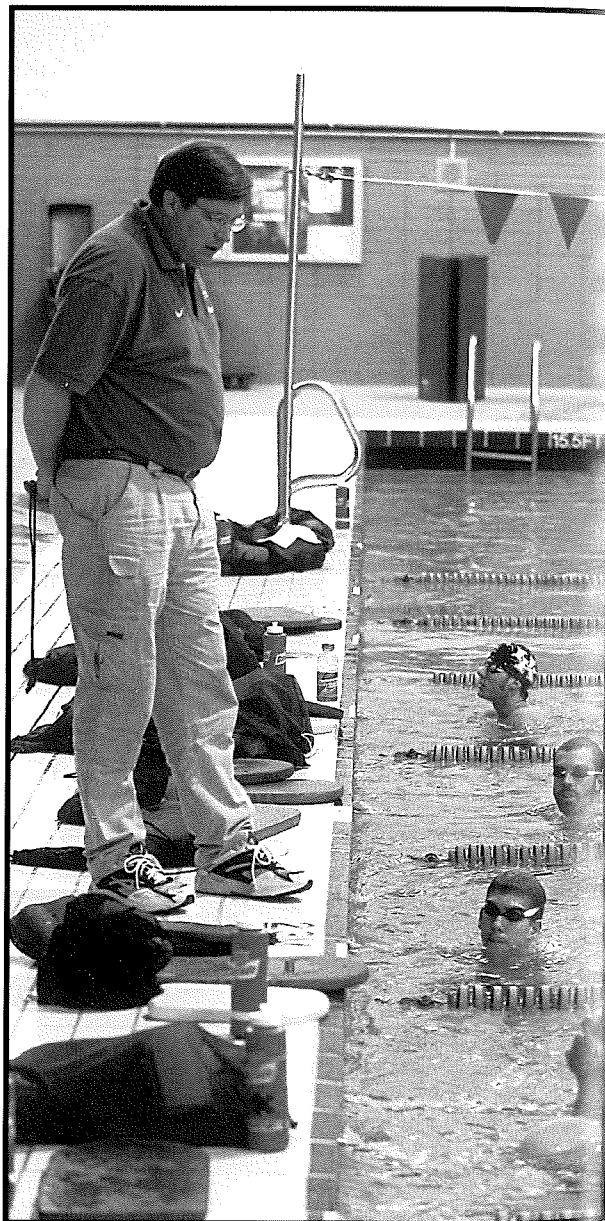
Prior to becoming head coach at Kentucky, Conelly spent three years with UK as a graduate assistant coach. In Conelly's 11 years with UK, the swimming and diving programs have made great strides. In 1990, Conelly coached the team's first female All-American and NCAA finalist, Kellie Moran. Since then, 19 more Wildcat swimmers have garnered All-America accolades under Conelly's tutelage.

Conelly came to the University of Kentucky from the West Florida Lightning Aquatics USS team in Largo, Fla. During his seven years at West Florida, Conelly directed 150 swimmers and produced three Olympic Trial qualifiers, two National Sports

Festival team members, and one Sports Festival champion in the 100 backstroke.

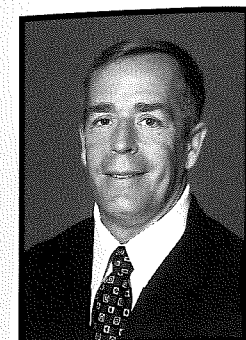
As a swimmer, Conelly was a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team and he participated on the world record-setting 400-meter freestyle relay team. An Indiana University alumnus, Conelly was a 15-time NCAA All-American and is a member of the Indiana Swimming Hall of Fame. In 1973, Indiana honored him with the Balfour Award for excellence in swimming, leadership, and scholarship.

Conelly is married to Kathleen Healey and has two children, Cody and Emily.



## Coaching Staff

### Michael Lyden Diving Coach



The 2002 Southeastern Conference Men's Diving Coach of the Year, Michael Lyden begins his 10th season as diving coach at the University of Kentucky. Since joining UK in 1993, Lyden has led the Wildcats to diving prominence, coaching

UK's first All-American, Tina Johnson in 1994 on the platform, and the Cats' first single-season three-time All-American, Clayton Moss in 2002.

The past two seasons have been extremely fruitful for Lyden and his divers. During the 2001-02 season, he helped Moss successfully defend his SEC one-meter title, the first UK diver to win consecutive titles in an event at the conference championships, and become an All-American on all three boards, as Moss placed second on the one-meter, fifth on the three-meter and sixth on the platform. For all of his accomplishments, Moss was named the SEC Male Diver of the Year, also a first for UK.

Lyden also aided in the success of senior Aaron Kirkpatrick, who won silver on both the one- and three-meter springboards and placed seventh on the platform at the conference championships.

His run of success with the duo also included the 2000-01 season when Moss became the third UK man to be an SEC Champion, winning the one-meter, and followed it up with a fourth-place finish on the same board and a 10th-place finish on the platform, earning All-American honors on both. Kirkpatrick also had a successful season under Lyden's tutelage. The junior garnered honorable mention All-American status with a 12th-place finish on the three-meter springboard at the NCAA championships.

Since joining the Wildcats, Lyden has led UK to diving prominence. At the 1994 NCAA Championships, Tina Johnson became UK's first diving All-American on the platform, placing eighth, and Jenny Baker earned honorable mention All-America in two events. In 1995, both divers earned All-America status, with Baker finishing eighth on the one-meter and Johnson finishing second on the platform. He had a third diver, Beth Leake, qualify for the meet, but Leake tore her medial collateral ligament in a training

session prior to the competition.

During the 1999-2000 season, Lyden had junior Carrie Knoeber and freshman Moss qualify for the NCAA Championship meet. Knoeber earned honorable mention All-American honors on the three-meter while Moss earned All-American honors on the one-meter, three-meter, and platform. Moss' honors were the first for a freshman in UK history.

In 1998 Paco Rivera became the first male UK diver to claim a Southeastern Conference title, winning the platform event and garnering All-SEC honors. Rivera advanced to the NCAA Championships, where he was named as an All-American in three events, including a second place finish on the platform.

In 1997, Lyden coached Christy Soulakis to the SEC three-meter springboard championship and SEC Female Diver of the Year honors. Soulakis and Rivera both earned All-America honors.

In 1996, Leake and Soulakis joined Baker and Johnson in earning All-America honors. Leake finished second on the one-meter and fourth on the three-meter, Johnson finished third on the one-meter and platform, and Baker finished seventh on the platform. For his divers' accomplishments, Lyden was honored as the Southeastern Conference and NCAA Women's Diving Coach of the Year.

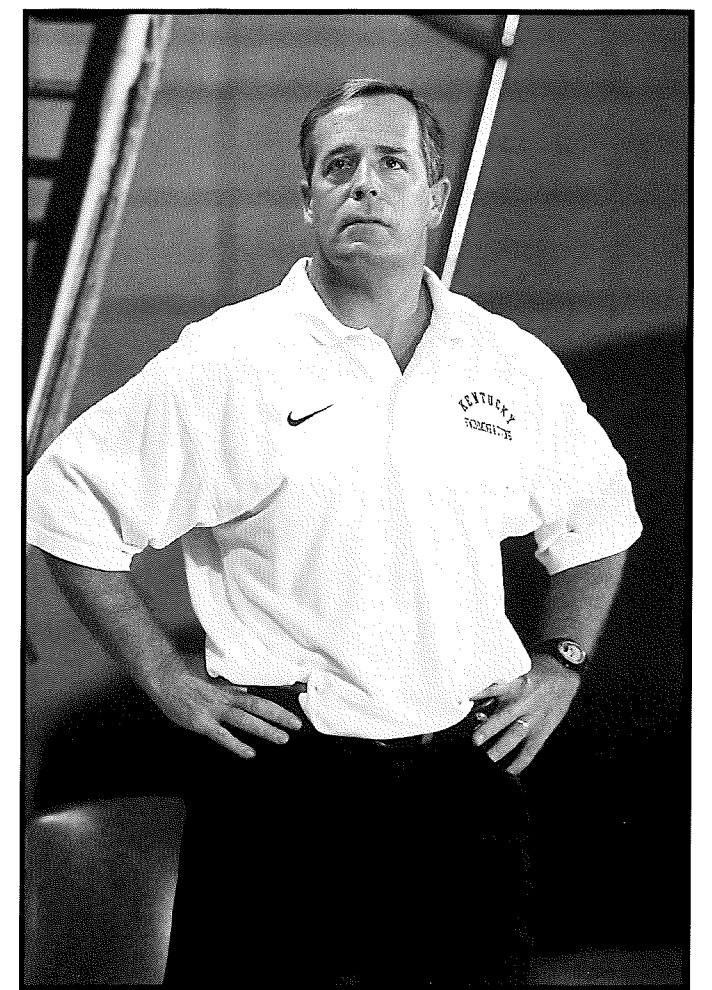
Before arriving at UK, Lyden spent nine seasons at Eastern Michigan where he was the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year nine times. He then moved to LSU where he received SEC Women's Coach of the Year four times consecutively and was the 1992 SEC Men's Coach of the Year. During Lyden's tenure at LSU his divers won 15 of 24 possible SEC titles.

Along with his college coaching, Lyden has also coached U.S. Diving Clubs and has had numerous All-Americans and has coached

six age group divers to 17 national championships. He was chosen to coach at the Junior World Diving Championships in the summer of 2002 held in Aachen, Germany. At that event he coached one member to a seventh place finish in the 1-meter and 3-meter boards. Lyden has served as the National Team Coach in 1988-90, 1992, 1994-96, 1998-2000 and has directed divers in competitions in Italy, Austria, Mexico, Canada, Spain, China, France, and Holland.

In addition to coaching, Lyden has been a member of the U.S. Diving Rules Committee, the U.S. Olympic International Diving Committee and is a lifetime member of U.S. Diving. In 1993-94 and 1997-99, Lyden served on the NCAA Rules Committee.

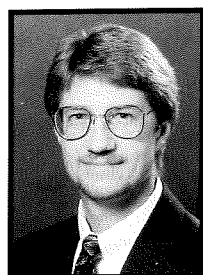

## Coaching Staff

**Pete Knox**  
Assistant Coach



Pete Knox enters his 11th year as assistant coach after serving four years as UK's graduate assistant. Often described as a vigorous and intense leader, Knox primarily works as a sprint coach and has developed many Wildcats swimmers, such as 1996 NCAA qualifier Rick Barber. Knox brings his vocal and energetic approach to every practice and has an exceptional ability to motivate

his swimmers. With an exercise physiology and research background, Knox specializes in an ongoing weight-training program.

Knox came to Kentucky from Brandon, Fla., where he coached the Brandon High School men's and women's teams from 1980 to 1988. While at Brandon, his teams consistently placed in the top 10 of the Florida High School Championships. Knox also developed two All-America high school swimmers and had several Junior and Senior National qualifiers. An assistant coach with the Brandon Blue Wave USS Team from 1981 to 1988, Knox was selected Hillsborough County Coach of the Year in 1987.

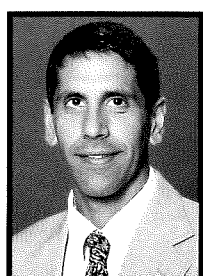
In his tenure at Kentucky, Knox has coached Shaun Zitani to the fastest time in school history

in the 50 and 100 freestyle, as well as the school's fastest 100-fly time. He has also coached Roger Watkins to the all-time top position in the record books for the 100- and 200-breaststrokes, while leading Jaime Siegele to the fastest 50-freestyle time.

A native of Norfolk, Va., Knox graduated with honors from the University of Florida in 1978 with a degree in health education and completed his Master's Degree in the spring of 1999. Knox is currently working toward a master's degree in exercise physiology with an emphasis directed toward the application to swimming.

Knox is married to former Wildcat swimming standout Wendy Hipskind.

**John Brucato**  
Assistant Coach



John Brucato is in his fourth season with the UK swimming program. Brucato works primarily with the middle distance group and breaststrokers.

Brucato comes to UK via the USS club team Wildcat Aquatics in Lexington. He is in his 12th season with Wildcat Aquatics. Brucato joined WA in the spring of 1990 and has established himself

as a leader in the Kentucky swim coaching community.

During his tenure with WA, Brucato has produced numerous Top-16 qualifiers, Junior National qualifiers, Junior National Champions, Senior National qualifiers, and an Olympic Gold Medalist. He is a former Kentucky Swimming Coach of the Year, in addition to being a Select Camp Coach and an Olympic Festival Coach.

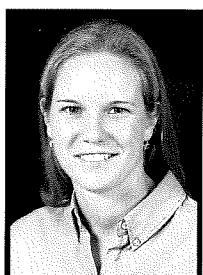
In 1992, Brucato coached Megan Kleine to a gold medal in the 1992 Olympic Games as part of the United States' 400-meter medley relay. Kleine, who swam for six years under Brucato at WA, won Senior Nationals twice in the 100-meter breaststroke. Kleine went on to swim at the University

of Texas at Austin.

A native of Covington, Ky., Brucato began his coaching career at the Covington YMCA and then spent two years with the Covington Clippers Swim Team. In 1985, he took over the helm at the Nashville Aquatic Club where he spent five successful years as the Head Age Group Coach before being hired on as the WA Senior Head Coach.

Brucato is a 1985 graduate of Northern Kentucky University where he received a degree in psychology. He lives in Lexington with his wife Jan, and their daughter, Katie.

**Azurdee Engel**  
Assistant Coach



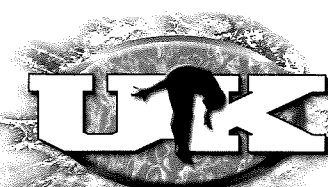
Azurdee Engel enters her first season with the University of Kentucky swimming program. She works primarily with the middle distance and distance swimmers.

Engel, a native of Duluth, Ga., comes to Kentucky from the Uni-

versity of Tennessee, where she swam from 1997-2001. She was captain of the UT swim team from '99-'01 and owns the sixth-fastest 200-freestyle time in school history. Engel graduated from Tennessee in 2002 with a degree in Art History.

Engel gained coaching experience working at the Stanford University swim camps this past summer with Stanford head coach Skip Kenney and coaching the Tennessee Masters swim team last year. She worked with several Ironman Triathletes in her time with the Masters swim team, while also working swimming camps at UT.

Engel, 23, resides in Lexington.



## Support Staff

**Wynn Paul**  
Aquatic Director



Wynn Paul has been a member of the UK staff for almost 40 years, formerly serving as coach of both the men's and women's swimming squads as well as the former water polo program. He relinquished his coaching duties in 1991 to devote his full time to the position of Aquatic Director, overseeing facilities operations and event

management at the Lancaster Aquatic Center.

Paul was named UK's men's coach in 1964 and assumed the duties of women's head coach when it became a varsity sport at Kentucky in 1983. During his coaching tenure, Paul compiled an impressive 135-61 dual meet record with the men's program and a 48-30 mark with the women's program.

During his reign as coach of the varsity men's water polo team from 1965-82 Paul amassed a remarkable 140-66 record, winning the 1977 Midwest Conference Championship, before the program was dropped in 1983.

Paul's success as a coach is a testament to his extensive involvement and experience in all

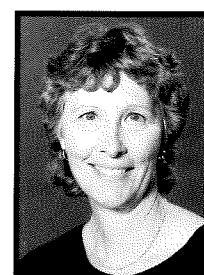
aspects of swimming. He has served as meet director for the Southeastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships, the NCAA Zone "B" Qualifying Meet, the World Games Diving Trials, the Kentucky High School Championships, the Kentucky Special Olympics and the Kentucky USS Championships. He serves as meet director for all UK home meets.

A 1962 Louisville graduate, Paul was captain of his U of L swim team. He was the Cardinals' high point scorer for three years and held 12 varsity records. After graduating from U of L, Paul attended graduate school at UK.

Paul is married to Helen Pennington, an Assistant Professor of Nursing at Eastern Kentucky University.

**Micki King**

Assistant Athletics Director/  
Senior Women's Administrator



Micki King enters her 10th year with the UK Athletics Association. Before being named Assistant Athletics Director and Senior Women's Administrator, King served as Special Assistant to the Athletics Director. She oversees the men's and women's swimming and diving programs, women's basketball, men's and women's tennis, rifle, and the cheerleading and pom squads.

A native of Pontiac, Mich., King served 26 years in the United States Air Force, retiring with

the rank of colonel in 1992. During her years of service, King saw assignments in Michigan, California, Washington, Colorado, Kentucky, and Germany. In fact, in 1973, King was the first woman to teach physical education at a military academy when she served at the United States Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs.

Along with her military service, King was an accomplished diver. She graduated in 1966 from the University of Michigan, where she was coached by five-time U.S. Olympic coach Dick Kimball. King was the 1972 springboard diving Olympic gold medalist. She missed a chance at the gold medal in the 1968 Summer Games where she dropped from first to fourth when she hit the board and broke her arm during the Olympic finals.

In her decorated career, King competed in two Pan American Games and won international div-

ing titles in 15 countries. She is an inductee in seven Halls of Fame, including the prestigious United States Olympic Hall of Fame.

King turned to coaching at the conclusion of her diving career, serving at the Air Force Academy from 1973-77. She was also a commentator for NBC sports in the 1976 Olympics. King returned to the Academy in 1983 and was named assistant athletics director and diving coach. During her tenure as diving coach, she was named NCAA Division II Coach of the Year on three occasions. Under King's tutelage, 11 divers were honored as All-Americans and two claimed national titles. In 1988 King traveled to the Seoul Games as a staff member of the U.S. Olympic diving team, and later served in the same capacity at the Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta.

King resides in Lexington and has two children, Michelle and Kevin.

**Letitia Hollingsworth-Gray**

Pool Manager



Letitia Hollingsworth-Gray begins her seventh season as Lancaster Aquatic Center Pool Manager. Prior to her stint as pool manager, Hollingsworth served as the UK swim team's Staff Assistant. At UK home meets she serves as the technical manager for the electronic timing system and scoreboard.

The UK alumna and Lexington, Ky. native swam for the Wildcats from 1982-86 and was the captain of UK's first varsity women's swim team for three years.

Hollingsworth also teaches courses in CPR, lifeguarding, and coaches' safety training, as well as serving as an aquatic examiner for the Red Cross.

Hollingsworth is married to Steve Gray and the two reside in Lexington. They are expecting their first child in November.



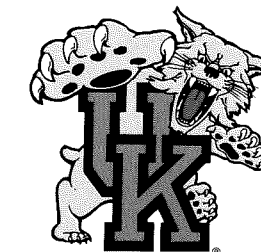

## Women's Outlook

An injury plagued season one year ago led to a disappointing finish for the UK women, but coach Gary Conelly and his staff have reloaded with a talented group of newcomers and are poised for a successful 2002-03. With only three seniors, the youthful Wildcats have several questions to answer this season. But if the young Cats perform as well as Conelly expects, the squad could make great strides from last season's ninth-place finish at the SEC Championships.

"The freshmen sort of hold the cards for success this season," Conelly said. "If they respond well then we'll have an outstanding year."

### Backstroke

The backstroke could be the team's strongest spot because of depth, Conelly said. The coach expects junior Shawna Sechrist (56.47) and sophomore Jessica Siegele (56.51) to lead the way. The two already rank second and third, respectively, in the UK record book in the 100 backstroke. Junior Jenaca Pumphrey (58.33) and freshman Jamie Saxe (58.89) could also lend support in the event.

Saxe (2:03.77) is primarily a 200-yard backstroker, along with fellow freshman Joanna Chet-

cuti-McLean (2:07.95). The two will be heavily counted upon in the event, as will freshman Brennan Moore (2:02.30). The two newcomers should complement returnees Sechrist (2:00.36), Jessica Siegele (2:04.33) and Pumphrey (2:04.60).

"We have a nice group of competitors in the backstroke this season. If everyone trains hard we will have several women who are capable of stepping in and swimming well," said Conelly.

### Butterfly

Jessica Siegele will be counted on to lead the way in the butterfly. While depth is the strength of the backstroke group, it is a weakness in the butterfly.

"Jessica (57.42) will be crucial in the 100 fly because we just don't have a lot of women to swim the event," Conelly said.

Senior Emily Johnston (58.00), along with sophomores Marci Vrooman (58.09), Cami Miller (59.00) and Amanda Bourgeois (59.09), will provide support for Siegele. Johnston will be key in the 200 fly. Her best time of 2:01.86 ranks sixth all-time at UK.

"Emily has to step up and be consistent in the 200 for us this year," said Conelly. "She is a

strong swimmer and she should lead the way in this event."

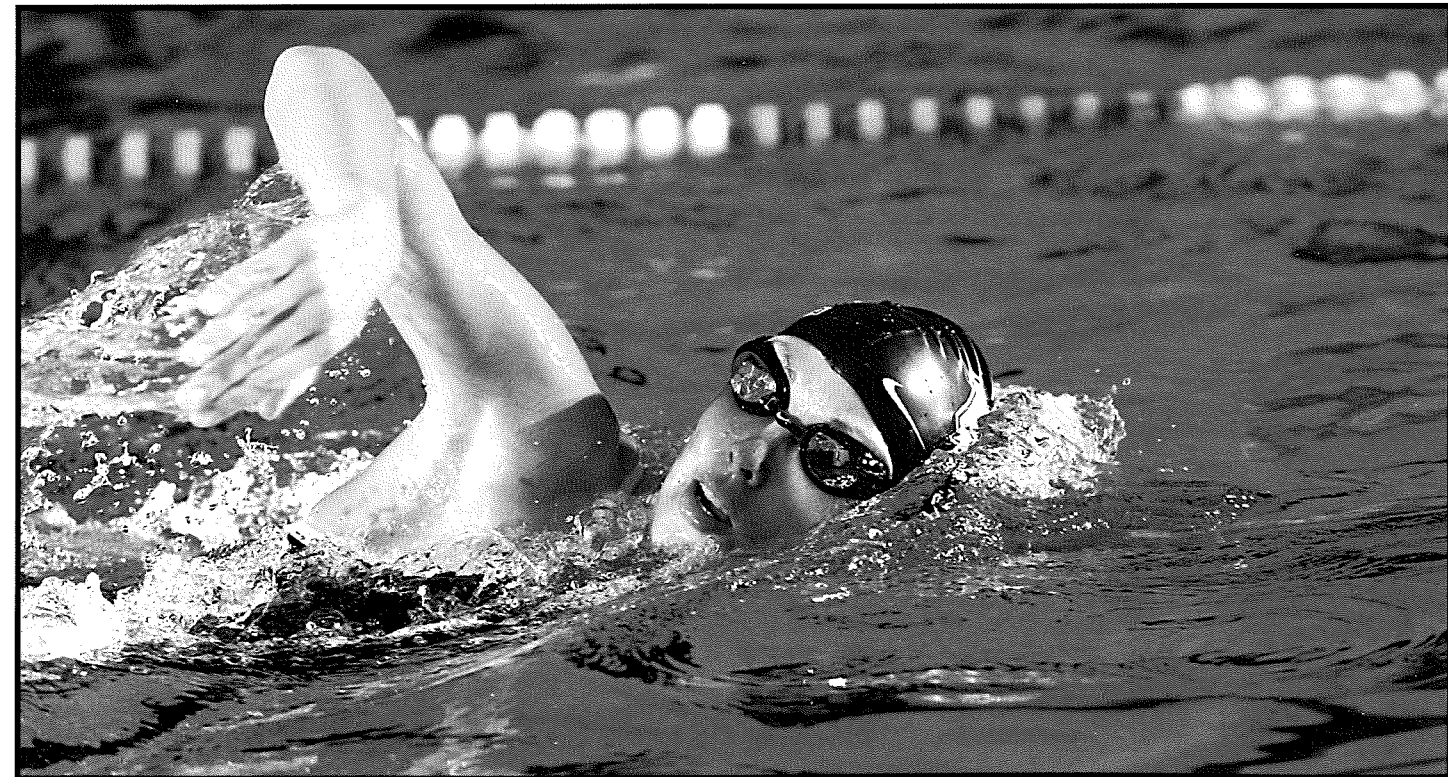
The supporting cast in the 200 will be very similar to that of the 100 with Cami Miller (2:05.90), Vrooman (2:06.99), Bourgeois (2:07.99) and sophomore Audrey Johnson (2:11.78) all competing to add depth in the event.

### Breaststroke

Junior Kendra Trahan is the top returnee in the breaststroke. She ranks seventh all-time in both the 100 (1:05.65) and 200 (2:20.95). Taking a lot of the pressure off Trahan this season will be key newcomers Shantel Commander and Laura Graham. The two freshmen enter the fray with high expectations. "Commander (1:04.76) and Graham (1:04.89) give us the potential to have three girls under 1:05 for the first time," Conelly said. "Those two should really help Kendra and greatly improve our depth in an event where we weren't very deep last season."

The story is much the same in the 200, with Trahan, Commander (2:18.29) and Graham (2:19.11) giving UK its best breaststroke corps ever.

"We should be very strong in the 200, giving

us a chance to make a big move in a dual-meet setting," said Conelly. "Having three strong competitors in the breaststroke will make it an interesting and an exciting event for us."

### Freestyle

Newcomers will be key in the freestyle events. "Again, the freshmen will have to step up and respond for us to have a successful year in the freestyle," said Conelly.

Joanna Chetcuti-McLean will look to help top returnees Chrissy Miller and Marci Vrooman in the sprints. "Joanna comes to us with some impressive times in the 50 (23.95) and 100 (52.13)," Conelly said. "With the training and competitive opportunities in front of her we look for her to have a very solid career here."

Senior Kelly Neal, along with Sechrist, Siegele and freshman Kelly Hoffrage are expected to add depth in the sprints.

The Cats also have strength in numbers in the middle distance this season with Vrooman and Miller leading the surge. "With good seasons, Marci and Chrissy are both capable of making the NCAAs in the 200 and 500," Conelly said.

Vrooman (1:49.41) ranks sixth all-time at UK in the 200, while Miller (1:50.31) stands in ninth place. Saxe, Bourgeois and Sechrist should provide strong support in the 200. The same cast of characters will be the strength of the 500 freestyle as well.

Sophomore Caitlin Muldoon highlights the distance group for the upcoming campaign. "Caitlin Muldoon (17:00.96) has the potential to make it to NCAAs in the 1,650-free if she trains hard," Conelly said. Chrissy Miller, Johnson and Moore will complement Muldoon as distance swimmers in dual meets as well.

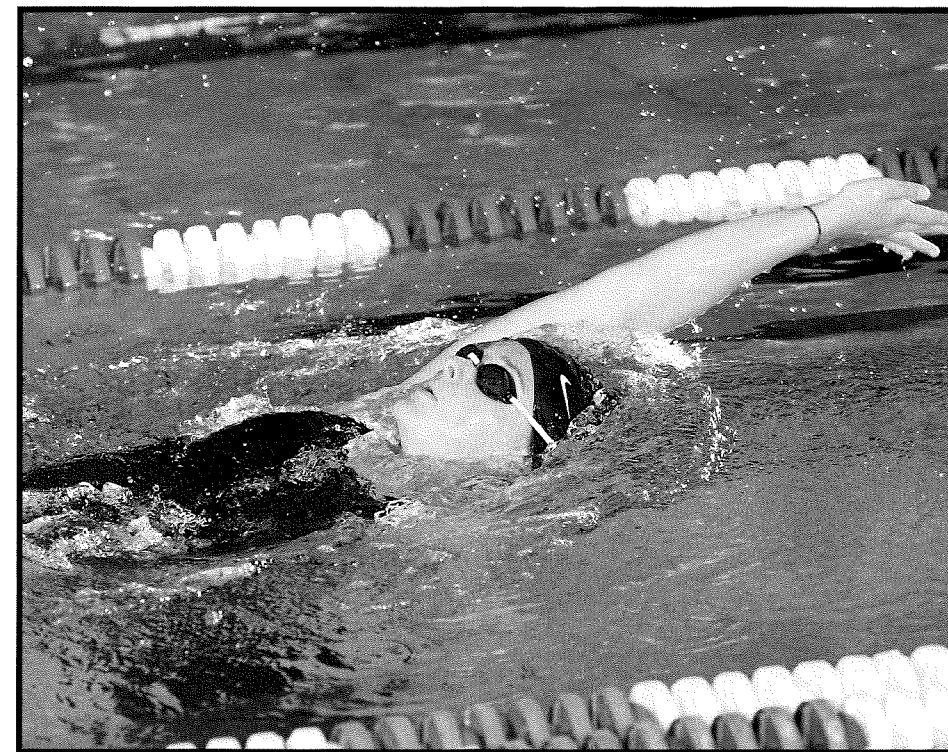
With Vrooman, McClean, Chrissy Miller, Saxe, Hoffrage and Bourgeois, the coach looks for the 400 and 800 freestyle relays to be very strong. "The 800 freestyle relay should be our strongest event and have the best shot of making an NCAA bid," he said.

### Individual Medley

The IM is an event that provides perhaps the biggest question mark for the season. Freshmen Graham, Commander, Saxe and Hoffrage are the potential leaders in the 200, but all need improvement in their times, according to Conelly.

"We have three or four girls right there together in the IM, but they are going to have to train hard and bring their times down in order for us to compete," he said. "They are all talented and have great potential, so we certainly expect to be competitive in the event."

Saxe (4:24.91), Muldoon (4:30.34) and



Sophomore Jessica Siegele currently holds the fastest time in the 100-y backstroke (56.51) and the ninth fastest-time in the 200-y backstroke (2:04.33) in UK history.

Moore (4:31.27) will most likely be the top competitors in the 400. Muldoon ranks ninth in the UK record book for the 400. If the freshmen can rise to the occasion, there is potential for the IM to be a strong event this winter.

### Diving

Diving coach Mike Lyden looks to the 2002-03 campaign with guarded optimism as three newcomers join returning senior Kelli Frost. Lyden sees potential for a strong team by the end of the season.

"I would like to see steady improvement over the course of the entire season," Lyden said. "I think by the end of the year this team can be in a position to really do some positive things."

Frost ranks third in UK history on the 1-meter board (six dives), fourth on the 3-meter (six dives) and fifth on the platform (nine dives). Junior transfer Michelle Brown joins the team after placing ninth on the three-meter board at the Pac 10 Championships while competing for UCLA before her arrival on the UK campus. Brown was also a four-time high school All-American and a National Champion prior to college. Freshmen Jessica Thompson and Jillian Becker round out the roster. Both are good athletes and potential contributors.

"Jessica is a strong diver who could be a key contributor, and Jillian is a great athlete with

nothing but upside," said Lyden. Becker comes in as a four-time state finalist in Kentucky, while Thompson was a two-time state champion and All-American in North Carolina.

"I'm excited about the season," Lyden said. "Kelli Frost is going to be a great leader for us. She's very capable of a top-8 finish at the SECs and qualifying for the NCAAs."

### Schedule

The women will face another difficult schedule this season. The coaching staff expects the opening meet against perennial SEC power Georgia to be a telling sign of how the season will go.

"Georgia won the SECs last year, so that first dual meet against them will really go a long way in telling us what our young team is made of," said Conelly.

With the likes of Indiana, LSU, Tennessee and South Carolina also on the schedule, this year's team should be well seasoned by the post-season competition.

Conelly is looking for marked improvement from his team this season. "I think it's possible that we could have four in the NCAAs, which would be pretty successful. If six could make it to the NCAAs it would be a great season for us. As a team we certainly are capable of being competitive in the conference if the new faces step up to the challenge."

## Men's Swimming & Diving Outlook

Returning the nucleus of a team that finished sixth at the SEC Championships and 16th at the NAAs, the 2002-03 edition of UK swimming and diving is prepared for a very successful campaign. The 16th-place finish at the NCAA Championships topped the 17th-place finish from the previous year as the best in school history. With a combination of key returnees and a strong group of newcomers, this year's team is looking to build on those finishes. Depth and versatility will be the theme of this season's team, as several swimmers are capable of posting competitive times in multiple events.

Head Coach Gary Conelly, entering his 12th year with the program, is excited about the possibilities of the upcoming year.

"We are fortunate enough to be returning most of our key competitors from last season as well as adding a few impact freshmen, so we're picking up where we left off last season," he said. "I think this year's team stands a great chance at making a major jump at both the SECs and NAAs."

### Freestyle

The freestyle is expected to be a strong event for this year's team. Junior Fernando Barros and sophomore Clay Gasparovich return as the leading sprinters in the freestyle. Barros (20.57) ranks sixth on the all-time list at UK in the 50 free, while Gasparovich (20.81) worked his way into the top 10 in the event as a freshman.

"Barros was great last year and can be better," Conelly said. "Gasparovich dropped his time significantly last season and is a very motivated swimmer, so they should provide us with a great one-two punch."

Freshman Daniel Farnham will be counted on heavily to help out in the sprints. "We are expecting great things from Farnham," the coach said. "There's a strong possibility that we could have eight-to-10 guys that swim the 50 free in less than 21.00, which would be a great strength."

The squad features a great deal of depth in the 100 as well. Freshman Steven Manley (44.75), a native of Dublin, Ireland, who looks to be the biggest-impact freshman, has the fastest time on paper. He should get plenty of help from Farnham (45.34), Barros (45.36) and sophomore Daniel Cruz (45.81).

"The 100 is another strong point for us, but it's also a strong point for everyone in the conference, so our guys will have to work hard to be successful," said Conelly.

Manley appears to be the leader in the middle distance event. His high school time of 1:37.46 in the 200 free would rank him second on the all-time list at UK.

"If Steven adapts to all his new surroundings here he has the potential to be a great swimmer for us," Conelly said. "He has a chance to break the school record in the 200 as a freshman. I think he'll surprise a lot of people early in the season."

Cruz (1:39.39), Farnham (1:40.63), Gustafson (1:41.23) and junior Joey Faltraco (1:42.14) are all capable of providing support in the 200 as well.

The Cats will look to Manley (4:28.10) and Faltraco (4:32.12) to lead the way in the 500. The

only true distance swimmer in the freestyle is sophomore Chris Mance, the lone returnee in the 1,000 (9:44.72) and 1,650 (16:16.25).

Conelly is expecting great things from his freestyle relay teams. "The 400 relay is very encouraging and has an excellent shot at qualifying for the NAAs," the coach said. "I also see a lot of potential for us in the 800 relay, where we have some strong swimmers competing. This year's team is extremely deep and I'm very encouraged about our overall look, especially in the relay events."

### Backstroke

Faltraco, Barros and senior Cody Nath return to swim the backstroke this season. Faltraco holds the school record in the 100 (49.66), but is not a true sprinter, so Conelly isn't sure he'll be used in the event. Barros (50.81) is close behind him with Nath (51.97) also lending support. Farnham (51.63) could turn out to be helpful in the sprint as well. "Right now our backstroke sprints are sort of up in the air," said Conelly. "The best thing about this team is that it has a great deal of versatility, so we can move some people around to best fit our needs."

The 200 backstroke should be a very solid event this season. Faltraco (1:43.96) returns as the school's all-time record-holder in the event. He will get plenty of help from the likes of Nath (1:51.88), junior Darron Berquist (1:53.96) and sophomore Dave Roberts (1:57.20). "We should be solid all the way around in the backstroke," said Conelly. "Joey is real strong and the other guys are all very capable if they work hard."

### Breaststroke

The breaststroke should be a highlight event this year, according to Conelly. Senior Roger Watkins comes off a stellar season in which he set school records in both the 100 (54.84) and 200 (1:59.86). "I expect that Roger will be an NCAA qualifier and be ranked in the top 20 nationally in both the 100 and 200," said Conelly.

Behind Watkins is fellow senior Aaron Cuker, who ranks sixth in the 100 (57.21) and third in the 200 (2:01.82) on the all-time UK records list. "With Aaron and Roger I think we're going to be very strong in the breaststroke," Conelly said. "We also should get good support from Drew Goodall, Eddie Wollong and Tom Vogt."

Goodall, a freshman, will look to improve on his time in the 100 (59.06) as well as the 200 (2:10.19) in order to be the third competitor along with Watkins and Cuker. Junior Wollong and senior Vogt are also expected to be in the mix in both events.

### Butterfly

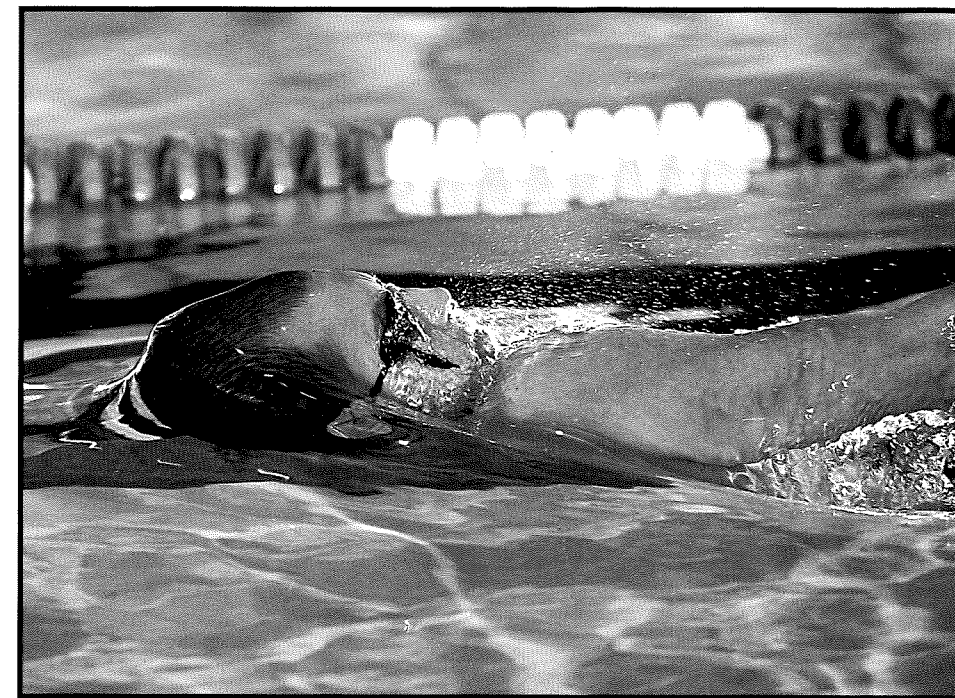
Depth and versatility are again a big part of the picture in the butterfly. Faltraco, Barros and Cruz will lead a large group of swimmers that could compete in the event. Perhaps the biggest question mark for the team is the availability of senior Eddie Clement. Clement would potentially be a strong middle distance freestyler, but his status is unknown because he is enlisted in the army reserves. The possibility exists that he will miss the season while on duty in the armed forces. Part of the success will depend on the status of Clement, who is strong in both the 100 and 200 fly. Cruz (49.50) ranks third in school history in the 100 and is joined in the top 10 by Barros (50.08, seventh) and Clement (50.18, eighth). Conelly is left with several options as Farnham (50.32), Watkins (51.29), Gasparovich (51.47) and Nilson (51.64) are all very capable.

Faltraco also holds the UK record in the 200 at 1:46.82, while Clement is right behind him at 1:47.44. Nilson (1:49.65) and Cruz (1:50.00) provide depth in the event. "We will be strong in the fly at both distances," said Conelly. "We are especially flexible in the 200 because we have a lot swimmers who can swim competitive times in that event."

### Individual Medley

The versatile Faltraco holds school records in the 200 IM (1:49.17) and 400 IM (3:49.81).

"Joey is very strong in the medley and leads what should be a good event for us this season," said Conelly. Manley is very capable in the IM as well, with a best time of 1:50.67 in the 200.

Clement would stand to be a strong supporter also. Depth is provided by Cuker, Cruz, Nilson and Nath. "The IM is another event where we have a number of capable swimmers, so we're able to move some people around and fill in some gaps," Conelly added. "Faltraco has the potential to qualify for the NAAs and the other guys should make it a good event for us."

### Diving

Senior Clayton Moss returns as a three-time All-American and a 2002 national runner-up on the 1-meter board to lead coach Mike Lyden's diving squad this year. The Doerun, Ga. native became the first Wildcat diver to earn All-America recognition in all three boards in one season.

"Clayton is a five-time All-American over the last three years and one of the best divers in the nation," said Lyden. "If he were to repeat last season's effort it would be a great year, and if he improves in a couple of minor areas he could easily be a national champion."

Moss was named "Male Diver of the Meet" at the SEC Championships last spring when he won gold on the 1-meter, silver on the platform and bronze on the 3-meter. He already holds the school's best marks on the 1-meter (6 dives), 1-meter (11 dives) and 3-meter (11 dives), while being second best currently on the 3-meter (6 dives) and platform (10 dives).

The only other diver on the men's roster this season is sophomore Mario Rodriguez, a native of Mexico City who Lyden is counting on to support Moss on the boards. "Mario has a lot of

upside," said Lyden. "If he adds a little strength and puts in the proper work he could be an SEC finalist and a NCAA qualifier."

Rodriguez, who joined the UK squad in the second semester last season, looks to help replace departed senior Aaron Kirkpatrick, who ranks in the top five on all three boards at UK. While the loss of Kirkpatrick will certainly be a tough one, Lyden sees potential for another successful season.

"With Clayton and Mario we have two great athletes and very capable divers who could taste a great deal of success this season," he said.

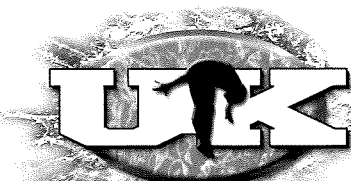
### Schedule

The Cats will again face a difficult and competitive schedule, which is always the case in the SEC. "Having Georgia and Tennessee early will give us a good chance to see where we stand," said Conelly.

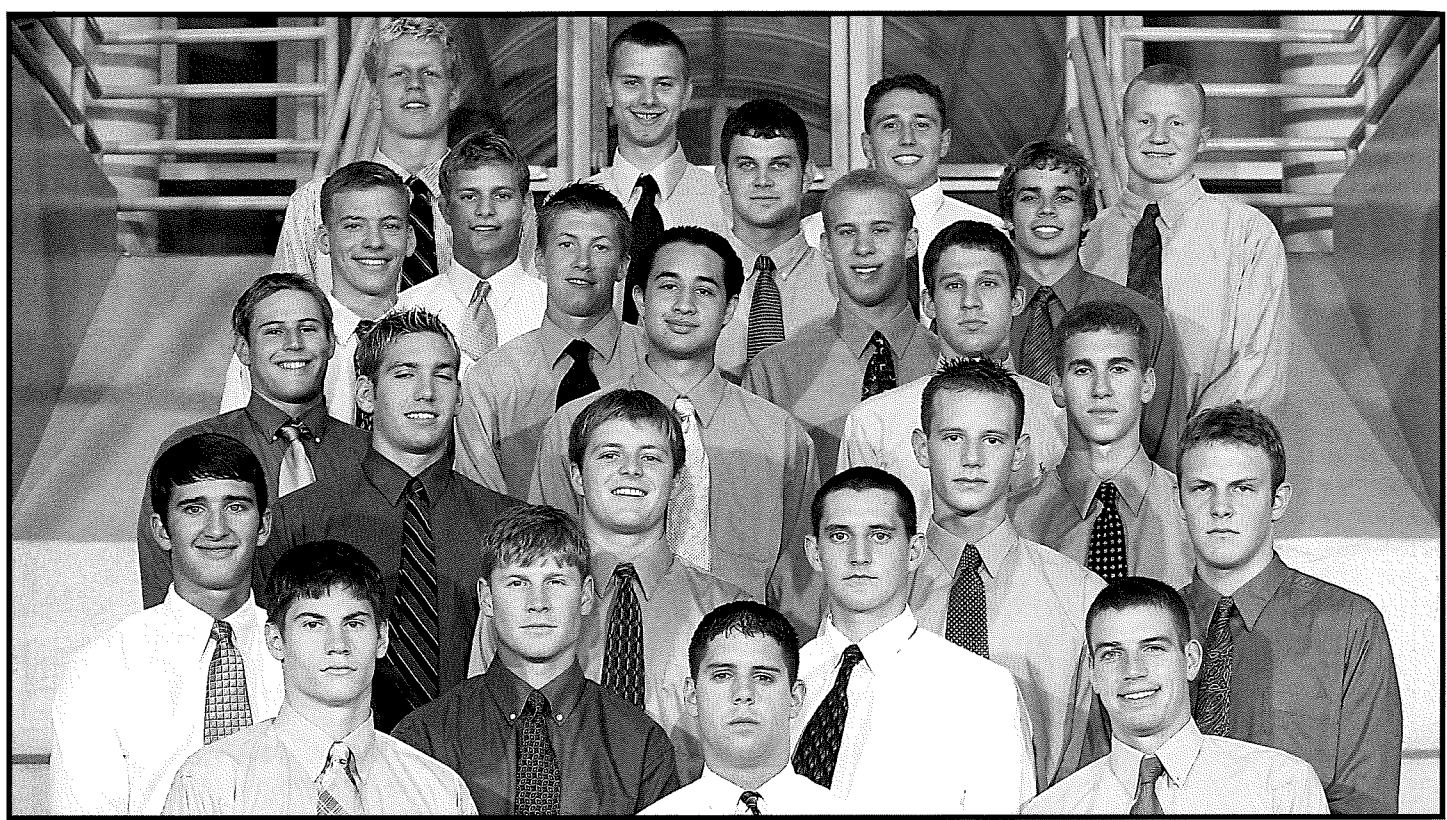
The Cats travel to Chapel Hill, North Carolina for the Nike Cup, an always-challenging event.

"This should be our best finish at the Nike Cup," added Conelly. "We usually compete well down there, but this year I expect to be in the top three."

With the strong newcomers joining a very talented group of returnees, Conelly expects big things from this team by the time the postseason rolls around. "We could be right there close to the top three or four at the SECs and we should produce four to six qualifiers for the NAAs."



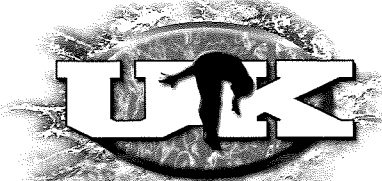

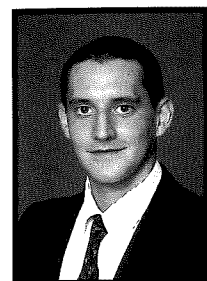

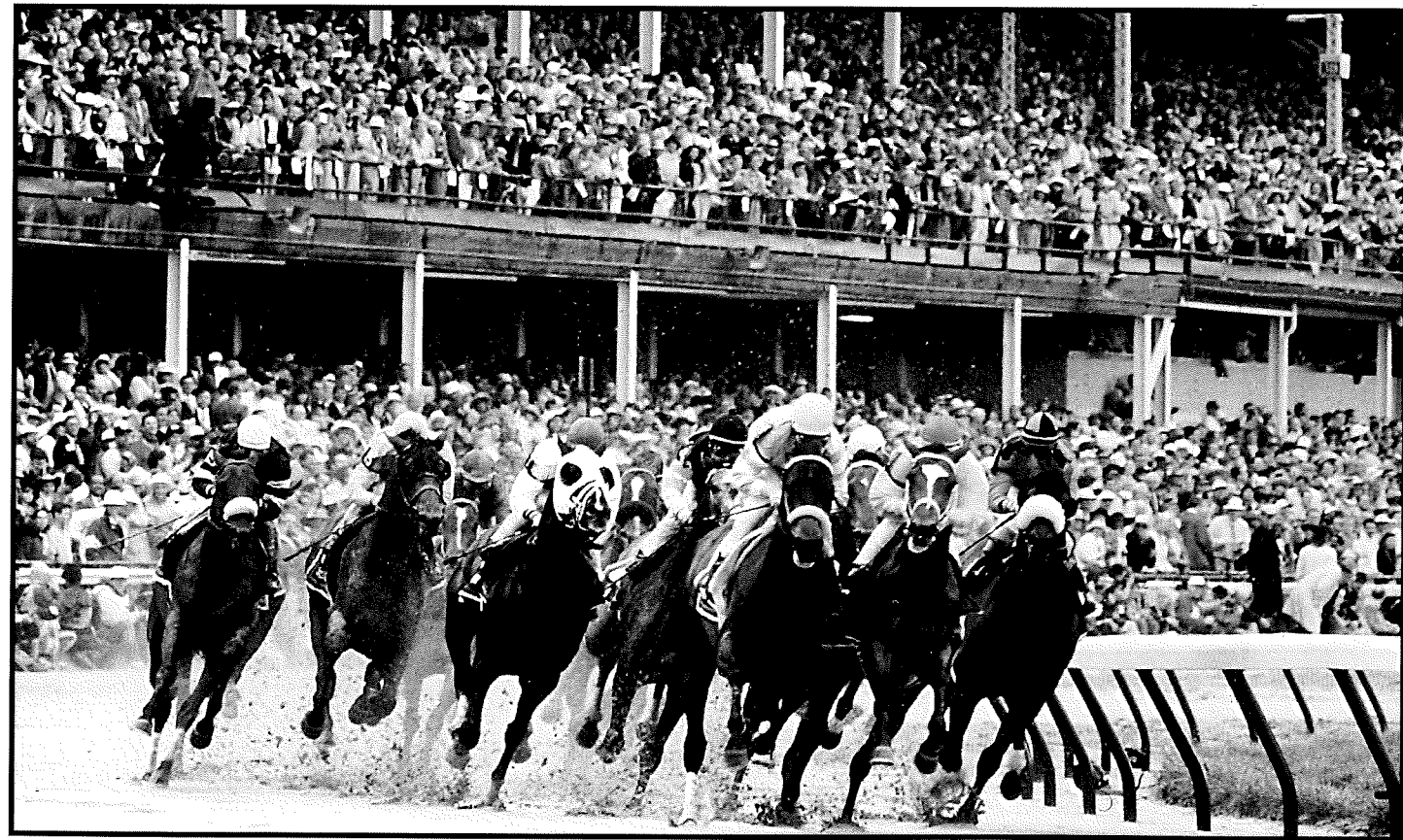
Abraham Lincoln was born in Hodgenville (the one-room cabin is part of a National Historic Site). The plantation home that inspired Stephen

- **Size:** The new library covers 365,350 square feet — more than six football fields. The building is five stories high, plus a basement.

- **Shelf capacity:** If laid end-to-end, the book-shelf space would stretch 198,828 linear feet — that's more than 37 miles of shelf space. The shelves will house 1.2 million books.

- **Seating capacity:** The new library can seat more than 4,000 patrons at one time, a 355 percent increase over the old library. The seating on the fifth floor of the new library equals the capacity of the former library.

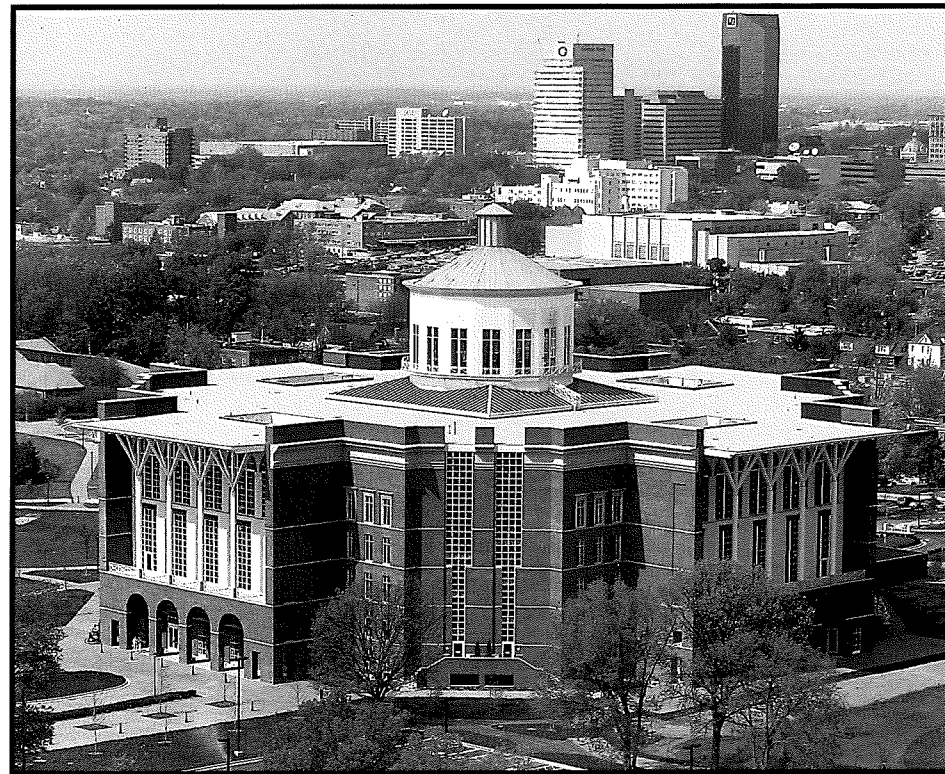
- **Computer connections:** Every study table and study carrel in the new library has an electrical outlet and a computer jack connected to the university's computer system.

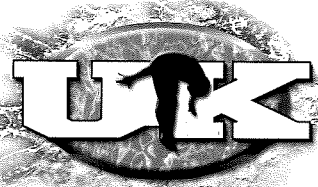

## University of Kentucky Swimming History

In 1936, the thought of having a swimming program at the University of Kentucky was just an idea tossed around by a group of water-lovers with skill and determination.

At that time, a pair of athletes named Bob Freeburg of Chicago and Sherman Hinkebein of Louisville went about the campus in search of talent among the student body. Organizing a squad of men who loved to swim was easy, but other obstacles stood in their way.

The first UK swim team was known as the "dry land swimming team" because UK did not have a pool. And since the University did not recognize swimming as a sport, the group had to purchase their own swimsuits and travel to Eastern State (now Eastern Kentucky University) in Richmond just to practice. Nevertheless, their determination paid off as some of the swimmers borrowed automobiles to travel to practice and meets, while others hitchhiked. Thus, UK's first men's swim team was formed.

Hinkebein, a UK track and football (team captain 1938) star, became coach and captain of the team at its inception. He turned over coaching duties when the UK Athletic Council recognized swimming as a varsity sport, to another student swimmer, Lloyd Ramsey, who lettered two years in basketball under Adolph Rupp. Hinkebein continued to swim for the Wildcats, and it was under Ramsey that the team won its first Kentucky State Intercollegiate Meet.

During its first three years of existence, the UK swim team had built up an enviable record, never losing a dual or state meet in Kentucky and being defeated only four times by outside competition. The pride of the UK squad was the medley team, undefeated in three years, that was made up of Hinkebein, Ramsey and James "Bud" Scott of Chicago. Two years later, UK would compete in its first SEC Championship Meet and finish seventh.

UK discontinued its swimming program in 1942, but in 1951, one year after the completion of Memorial Coliseum and UK's first swimming pool, the program was reinstated. Alfred M. Reece, a health and physical education instructor, was selected as coach and guided the team to third place in the 1954 SEC Championships. Reece's teams fared well against in-state schools with comparable programs, but were no match for institutions that offered full scholarships. UK offered only two tuition scholarships.

The University realized a renewed interest in swimming in 1964, when it hired Wynn Paul as head coach. Paul, a top-class swimmer at the University of Louisville, was undefeated in the 200 breaststroke and was named the Outstanding Swimmer in Kentucky by The Courier-Journal in 1958 and 1959. Paul introduced water polo to UK in 1964. The water polo program was discontinued in 1982 to make way for the newly created women's varsity swim program.

Ron Huebner, a UK swim letterman who graduated in 1968, succeeded Paul that fall and produced winning teams during a four-year tenure. Paul returned to the helm of the program in 1973, and it was under his direction that the team won the Kentucky Intercollegiate Swim Championships in 1975 for the second time in UK swim history.

From 1970 to 1983 the UK women's swim team competed only as a club sport. Originally included as one of six sports chosen to become varsity in 1974, the team was nudged out by field hockey because UK's then 20-year-old pool was inadequate and too overcrowded to accommodate the addition of another varsity team.

In 1980, the then-volunteer women's swim coach filed a sex discrimination Civil Rights Title IV complaint to the federal government, which led to the ruling that UK needed to sponsor an additional team for women. Thus, the creation of UK's first women's varsity swimming program occurred on July 1, 1983, with Paul named head coach.

The program has continued a strong combination of academics and competitiveness. The swimmers boast a winning record in the classroom, as over 95 percent of the swim Cats have graduated.

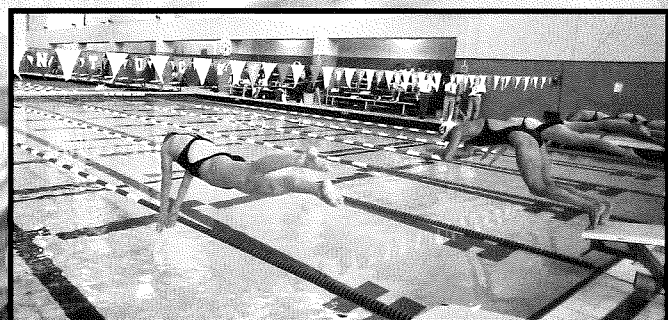
Kentucky's swimming program is recognized as a force to be reckoned with in the SEC.

## Lancaster Aquatic Center

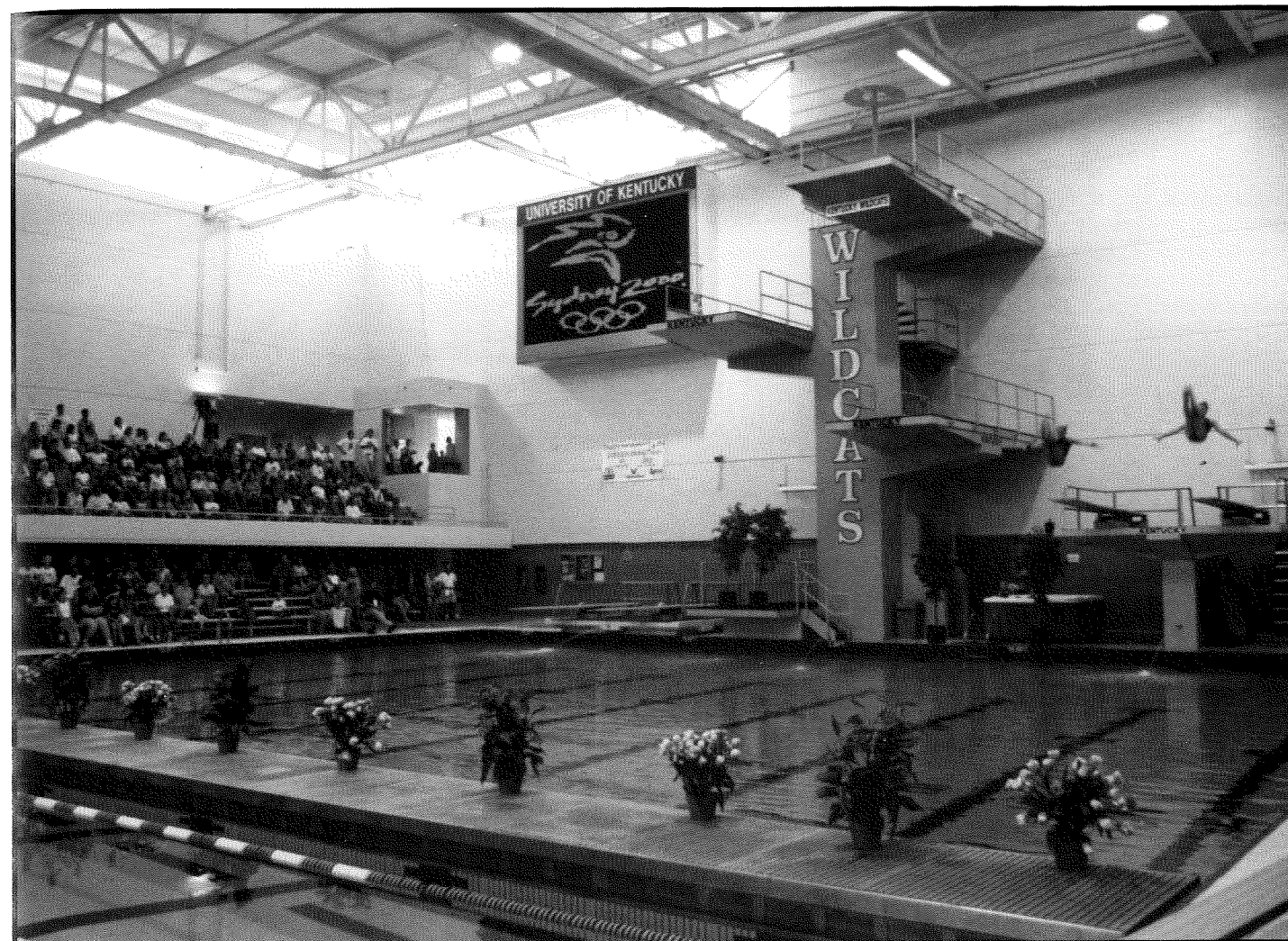
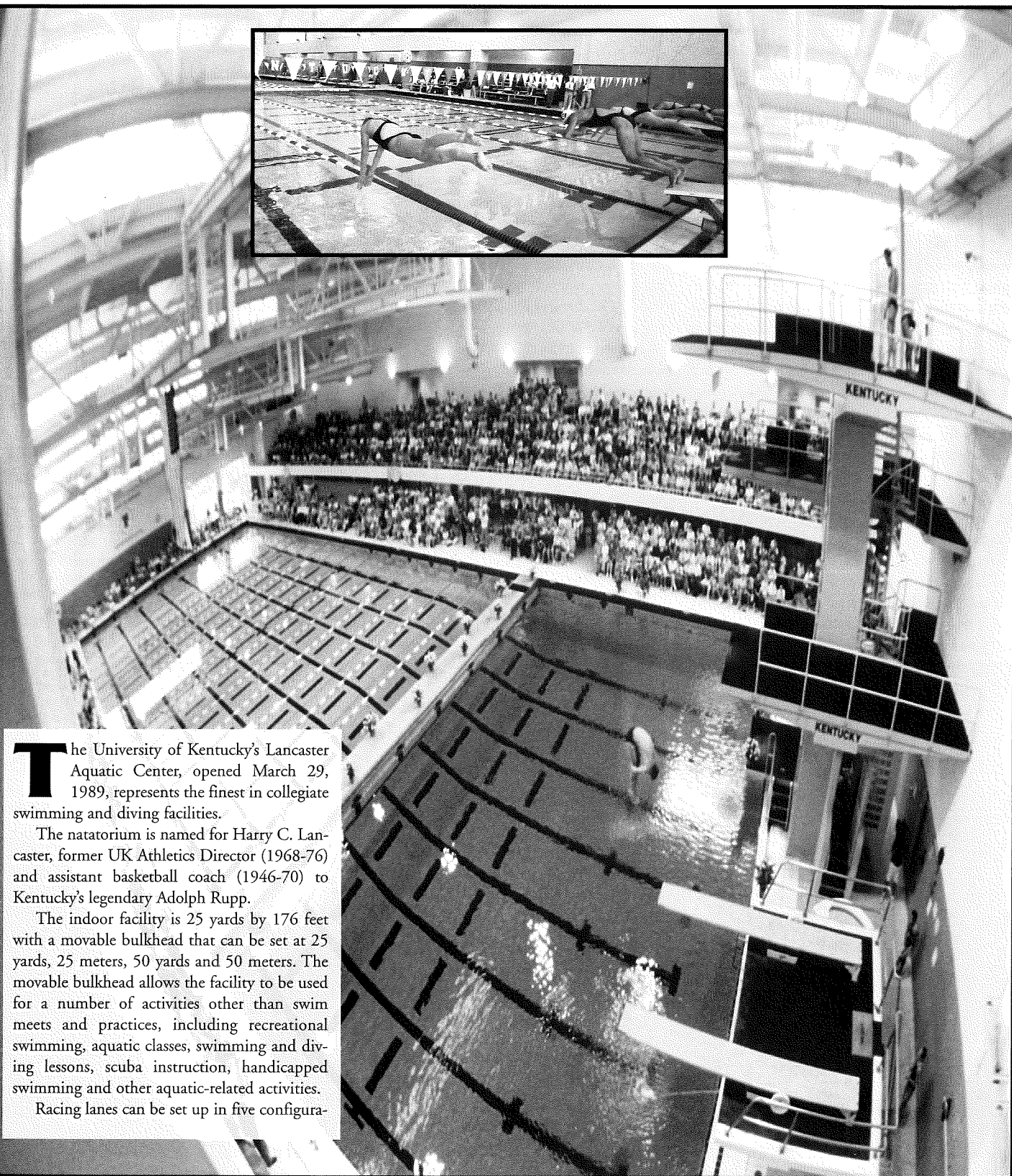


**T**he University of Kentucky's Lancaster Aquatic Center, opened March 29, 1989, represents the finest in collegiate swimming and diving facilities.

The natatorium is named for Harry C. Lancaster, former UK Athletics Director (1968-76) and assistant basketball coach (1946-70) to Kentucky's legendary Adolph Rupp.

The indoor facility is 25 yards by 176 feet with a movable bulkhead that can be set at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. The movable bulkhead allows the facility to be used for a number of activities other than swim meets and practices, including recreational swimming, aquatic classes, swimming and diving lessons, scuba instruction, handicapped swimming and other aquatic-related activities.

Racing lanes can be set up in five configura-



tions: across-the-pool racing at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. Two 25-yard courses can be utilized for large swim meets. Eighteen swimming lanes are available while diving events are in progress. Long course racing will have eight full-size lanes for the 50-meter distance.

The swimming tank, which holds 1,025,000 gallons of water, has a raised deck gutter with a large overflow. This gutter design is similar to the Indianapolis Natatorium design. Pool depth varies from 4.3 feet to 6.5 feet at the shallow end, utilizing a movable floor of 35 by 75 feet. Water under the diving boards and tower is 17 feet deep. The natatorium features Daktronic automatic timing for swim meets. A 16-by-23 foot wall-mounted scoreboard allows full display of information for eight-lane and 16-lane swim meets. The scoreboard can also display graphics and animation sequences.

The diving facilities are among the best in the world. The facility has two 1-meter boards and two 3-meter boards set on concrete platforms. Each platform is eight feet wide with lengths from 23 feet to 28 feet.

The facility won the 1990 Association of General Contractors Award for Structures. There is a 40-foot dryland diving area permanently set up with a trampoline, Portapit diving board and two diving/tumbling harnesses for somersaulting and twisting practice.

The Aquatic Center has a full training room equipped with two treatment tables, EGS and ultrasound machine, hydrocollator, and ice machine. There is a trainer on duty at all times.

The Aquatic Center has a weight room for swimmers and divers equipped with Cybex weight training machines. In the adjacent Seaton Physical Education building are exercise physiology labs that are utilized for the testing of swimmers and divers.

The second balcony of the Aquatic Center accommodates up to 750 spectators and has a concession stand area.

On March 14-15, 2002, the Aquatic Center was host to the NCAA Zone B Diving Championships.

In July of 2000, the United States Olympic

Divers put on two exhibitions before embarking upon their trip to Sydney to compete in the 2000 games.

In 1999, UK hosted the Southeastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships at the Aquatic Center. Pool records fell left and right as some of the nation's most talented divers and fastest swimmers competed at the Aquatic Center, Feb. 17-20.

In addition to hosting the 1996 U.S. Olympic Diving Team, the Aquatic Center annually hosts the premier swimming and diving events in the state of Kentucky. These events include all UK home meets, the Kentucky State High School Championships, the Kentucky USS Championships, Zone and Regional Age Group and Senior Diving meets, Kentucky Special Olympics, and Bluegrass Games Diving meets. Highlights at the Aquatic Center have been the 1991 and 1999 Southeastern Conference Championships, the 1995 Southeastern Conference Diving Championships, the 1995 NCAA Zone B Diving Championships and the 1990 World Games Diving Team Trials.

# University of Kentucky

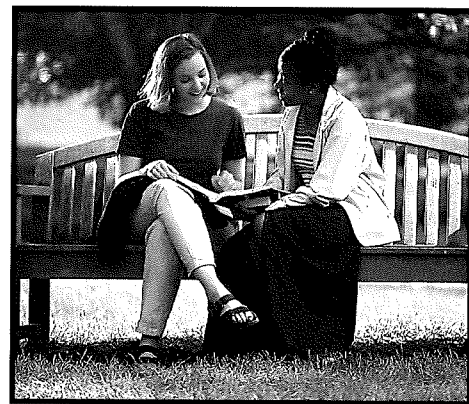
The University of Kentucky was founded in 1865 as a land-grant institution, and the present name dates to 1916.

Located in the heart of the beautiful Kentucky Bluegrass region, UK's 687-acre campus is adjacent to downtown Lexington, and is one of only a few universities in the country with a teaching and research campus, a medical center and a community college all in one central location.

The University consists of a graduate school, the UK Hospital, UK Children's Hospital and 16 colleges. The colleges are Agriculture, Architecture, Arts and Sciences, Business and Economics,

Communications and Information Studies, Dentistry, Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Health Sciences, Human Environmental Sciences, Law, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy and Social Work. UK offers 88 bachelor's level, 93 master's level and more than 60 doctoral, specialist and professional degree programs.

Enrollment is more than 34,000, up 5 percent from the previous year, and stands at an all-time high. Students hail from every Kentucky county, every state and some 115 countries. Full-time faculty number 1,875 and approximately 95 percent of them hold the highest possible degrees



in their fields. UK's faculty and staff attract more than \$175 million annually in grants, gifts and contracts.

The University attracts excellent students. The average ACT score for first-year students is four points above the national average. Meanwhile, UK students compete successfully for prestigious scholarships and awards. In 2002, UK was selected as one of 13 universities nationwide to participate in the Beckman Foundation Scholars program. This program allows UK to award grants of \$17,600 to students to support their own research projects. UK also had two recipients of \$30,000 Harry S. Truman Scholarships and a \$50,000 Marshall Scholarship recipient.

Since the mid-1990s, the University has pursued an ambitious goal to become a top-20 public university by the year 2020. UK President Lee T. Todd Jr. has embraced this goal in a way that promises an impact on every Kentucky resident.

"The campus of the University of Kentucky encompasses the area within the boundaries of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. As the land-grant institution, we have a responsibility to help this state move forward," Todd says.

The University is taking aggressive steps to fulfill its top-20 goal. During the last fiscal year, UK achieved expenditures exceeding \$212 million. These numbers place the University 47th on the list of all institutions and 32nd among public universities. To date, UK boasts 73 national rankings for quality education and research.

In 2000, officials launched The Campaign for the University of Kentucky, a \$600 million fundraising effort to enhance faculty, students, facilities, academic programs and public service. The campaign, the largest in state history expects to reach its goal by June 2003. As of September, UK has raised more than \$500 million.

UK also offers great facilities to advance the scholarship of its students and the endeavors of its scientists. The William T. Young Library, only

four years old, already has assumed a position among the world's leading research libraries; its book endowment is the largest among public universities ranking second only to Harvard's, among all universities. Its broad scope of technology offers students, faculty and Kentucky residents special access to the most up-to-date information from online journals, government publications and private studies, as well as more traditional materials.

Meanwhile, UK maintains more than 50 research centers and institutes. The centers conduct applied research in areas as diverse as tobacco and health, aging, cancer, toxicology, equine health, mineral production, manufacturing systems and public policy.

Several centers excel in the services offered to

the public. The Center for Manufacturing Systems has helped more than 500 small and mid-sized industrial firms in Kentucky. The Gluck Equine Research Center is one of only three of its kind in the world, offering research into diseases of the horse.

The UK College of Medicine is ranked 43rd among 125 accredited medical schools in the area of primary care in U.S. *News & World Report's* "Best Graduate Schools



2003" annual ranking. The 473-bed UK Hospital is supported by more than 500 faculty physicians and dentists, 400 resident physicians and a staff of 3,200 health professionals committed to high-quality patient care. As the only Level 1 Trauma Center in Central and Eastern Kentucky, UK Hospital cares for the most critically injured and ill patients in this half of Kentucky.

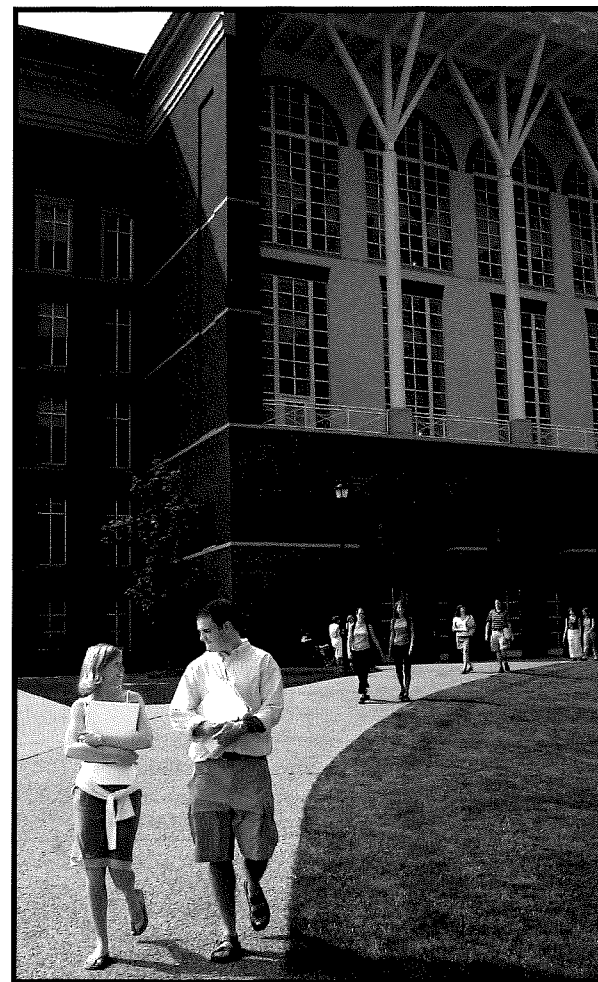
The University of Kentucky has demonstrated its commitment to partnerships with business and other institutions of higher learning. In Lexington, UK is shaping a better relationship with the community by becoming more active in life throughout the city, especially downtown.

But UK doesn't just work within Fayette County's borders. Researchers at UK and the University of Louisville have developed closer ties and have launched more joint research projects. Today, there are more than 120 research and service projects under way in which UK and U of L faculty are working in close collaboration.

The University also is reaching out to communities across the commonwealth, sharing knowledge and making a difference in the towns, cities and lives of all Kentuckians.

University of Kentucky scholars – students, faculty and alumni – have been honored by Nobel, Pulitzer, Rhodes, Fulbright, Guggenheim, Grammy, Metropol-

itan Opera and other prestigious panels. Mindful of their responsibility to the world, they are guiding citizens and nations through the challenges of this new century.

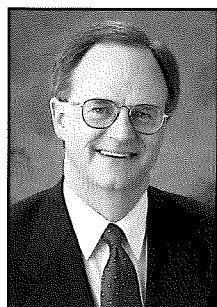

## Dr. Lee T. Todd Jr.

*University of Kentucky President*



Dr. Todd incorporated DataBeam Corporation in 1976, but major financing and product development did not occur until 1983. DataBeam has been the world's leading provider of real-time collaboration and real-time distant-learning software and development platforms. Approximately 160 companies (such as Cisco, Lucent, Microsoft and AT&T) were licensees of DataBeam technology. Investors included many individual investors, venture capitalists, Intel and Cisco Systems. The vast majority of DataBeam's technical staff consisted of UK engineering and computer science graduates. DataBeam was acquired by IBM in June 1998 and now reports to Lotus Development Company, a subsidiary of IBM.

Dr. Todd co-founded Kentucky Science and Technology Corporation (KSTC), a not-for-profit organization focused on increasing university research capacity, developing science and technology education (K-12) programs, and encouraging an entrepreneurial economy in Kentucky. He co-chaired the PRISM Project with Education Commissioner Thomas Boysen. PRISM emerged as the major math and science initiative of KERA. It was funded for five years by the National Science Foundation at nearly \$10 million with \$10 million matching funds from various sources. He co-authored the initial proposal that resulted in Kentucky being selected as an EPSCoR (Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research) state. This program has resulted in bringing more than \$72 million in research and development funds from federal sources and another \$18 million from state matching sources. Federal funding agencies include the National Science Foundation, Department of Defense, National Institutes of Health, Environmental Protection Agency and NASA. Almost all institutions of higher education, both public and private, have participated in this funding. KSTC developed the Kentucky Science and Technology Strategy that formed much of the basis for the recently passed Kentucky Innovation Act legislation. KSTC will also be responsible for implementing major parts of the Act.

Various Kentucky governors have appointed Dr. Todd to statewide committees related to education and economic development. He chaired Governor Collins' Governor's Council on Science

and Technology. He chaired the Technology and Workforce Committees for Governor Jones' Quality and Efficiency Task Force that resulted in the initiation of the Kentucky Information Highway and the formation of the Chief Information Officer position in state government. In addition, he was a member of the Committee for Reform of the Cabinet for Economic Development. In 1997, he was inducted into UK's Engineering Hall of Distinction.

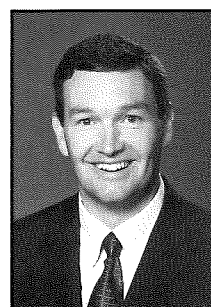
He formerly served on the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education. He chaired the Distant Learning Advisory Committee that is responsible for the development of the Kentucky Commonwealth Virtual University and the Commonwealth Virtual Library. KCVU went on-line the fall semester of 1999 and presently has the largest enrollment of any similar institution in the country. He served on the Academic Affairs Committee and led an effort to develop a Statewide Engineering Program.

Dr. Todd is married to the former Patricia Brantley. She received her B.S. degree from UK in 1968 and her M.S. degree from Simmons College in Boston. She presently serves on the Governor's School for the Arts Advisory Committee and has served on the Lexington Ballet Board. She was the Community Co-chairperson of the Primary School Program for KERA in Fayette County. They have two children: Troy, 26 and Kathryn, 20.



## Mitch Barnhart

*Director of Athletics*



The University of Kentucky Athletics Association embraced a new vision on July 15, 2002, when school president Dr. Lee T. Todd Jr. named Mitch Barnhart the 'Wildcats' Director of Athletics.

"Mitch Barnhart brings to the University of Kentucky a proven record of success, in addition to experience," Dr. Todd stated. "He has deep passion for working with students, and his philosophies are very much in sync with mine on how to run this program. I believe he has a well-thought-out vision on how to move our athletics department forward."

Barnhart's vision was clear at Oregon State, where he served the previous four years (1998-2002) as athletics director. Most notably, a strong effort in fiscal management helped reduce the Beavers' operating debt from \$12.5 million to \$4.8 million during his tenure, a debt that is on schedule for elimination. He raised \$20 million in capital contributions for new baseball and softball stadiums, an indoor practice center and a basketball arena renovation. He developed Beaver Sports Properties, which produced increased revenue for the department through broadcast rights.

And thanks to five new head coaching hires — including the addition of football coach Dennis Erickson, a proven winner, and the school's best finish in the Sears Directors' Cup Standings, 48th — the Beavers' annual fundraising jumped from \$800,000 to \$4.5 million in three years. Erickson's addition assisted the football team in snapping a streak of 28 consecutive losing seasons with back-to-back bowl appearances, including a Pacific-10 championship and a Fiesta Bowl victory in 2000. Football season ticket sales jumped from 6,000 to 23,000, and the Beavers were sold out in nine consecutive games.

Under Barnhart's leadership, Oregon State had the highest GPA for student-athletes since tracking began in 1992, which included 2.91 GPA for 520 student-athletes and 3.0 or better for 173 student-athletes. Barnhart also has served on several sports and working committees of the Pac-10 Conference, NCAA and NACDA, and completed the second cycle of NCAA certification in February 2001.

His prior success can be based on a five-prin-

ciple philosophy that he implemented for the University of Kentucky Athletics Association the day he was hired.

- Operate in a first-class manner
- Possess great integrity
- Keep the focus on the student-athletes
- Provide sound fiscal management
- Compete for championships in all sports

Barnhart becomes the first UK athletics director since 1934 who has not had prior UK ties as a player, coach or staff member. Before his tenure at OSU, he worked at Tennessee for 12 years (1986-98), the last four as Senior Associate Athletics Director. He assisted the athletics director in all aspects of administering a \$35 million budget and in hiring UT's head coaches. As the Volunteers' fundraiser, he was directly responsible for roughly one-third of the annual revenue base of \$12 million in the athletics department with administrative oversight of the baseball, track and swimming programs.

In addition, he created the Volunteer Athletic Scholarship Fund, which is responsible for more than \$53 million in annual cash gifts since 1986,

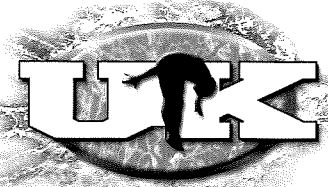
including \$8 million in 1996-1997. Barnhart was responsible for more than \$75 million of capital funding to support facility improvement projects in 1986, including the expansion of Neyland Stadium to 105,000 seats. He also expanded membership in the department's donor fund from 2,200 members to 9,500 with an average gift increase from \$250 to \$950.

Before his term at UT, Barnhart served as assistant executive director of the Mustang Club at Southern Methodist University (Dallas) from 1983-86; regional director for the Duck Athletic Fund at University of Oregon (Eugene) in 1983; and was an intern for the Aztec Athletic Foundation at San Diego State University in 1982-83.

Barnhart, 43, is a native of Kansas City, Kan. He received his bachelor of arts degree from Ottawa University (Kansas) in 1981, where he was a golf letterman, and a master of science degree in sports administration from Ohio University in 1982.

He and his wife, the former Connie Brown, have three children: Kirby, 14, Blaire, 11, and Scott, 8.





## Ohio Casualty Center for Academic & Tutorial Services

One of the cornerstones in the philosophy of University of Kentucky Athletics is a commitment to academic success. Much of the credit for UK's academic success goes to the Athletics Association's academic support system — the Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, or simply, "CATS."

UK opened CATS in 1981, the nation's first academic center dedicated exclusively to student-athletes. Over the years, as the services offered by CATS have grown, so did the need for additional space.

As a result, UK has built a new facility — the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, thanks to a \$1 million dollar grant from the Ohio Casualty Insurance Group. The new Ohio Casualty Center opened in 1998 at a total cost of \$2.4 million.

The new CATS, constructed in Memorial Coliseum, includes:

- 20,000 square feet of space — more than double the size of the former CATS facility;
- a computer room housing 35 computers;
- a study area which accommodates 90-100 people;
- 24 tutoring rooms;
- a career development and life skills resource center;
- a community outreach office; and
- offices for the staff.

Certainly, a facility is a good start, but any program — especially in academics — is only as good as the people who run it. And UK is fortunate to have outstanding leaders in its academics support system. Bob Bradley, Associate Athletics Director for Student Services, oversees

the CATS program. Bradley was named National Academic Advisor of the Year in 1989 and 1992.

CATS has a full-time staff of nine. In addition to Bradley, they are:

- **Barb Deniston**, Director of Academic Services
- **Mike Haley, Christine Jackson, and Amy Craiglow**, Academic Counselors
- **Beth Stice**, Director of Student-Athlete Development
- **Lisa Buchanan**, Outreach Coordinator
- **Michael Stone**, Executive Assistant for the National Consortium of Academics and Sports
- **D' Ann Blankenship**, Staff Support Associate.

CATS also employs six graduate assistants and numerous tutors, both from the University and the surrounding community. UK has budgeted more than \$1,000,000 for the operation of CATS in the coming year.

"We are extremely proud of what we have accomplished in the academic arena," Bradley says. "The CATS program is focused on winning in the classroom. We look at each student-athlete's individual needs, set goals, and develop strategies to attain those goals. Our center provides our student-athletes with a definite advantage over student-athletes at many other institutions. Our goal is to show that we care about the student as well as the athlete."

For the CATS staff, showing you care means more than helping athletes maintain eligibility, graduate, or win awards. The academics staff also prepares student-athletes for life after college with the Wildcat Career Development Program.

The Career Development Program helps student-athletes look to the future through a step-by-step process which includes:

- Mentoring and internships, which help determine career interests
- Career counseling
- Resume writing
- Forming a career plan

The Wildcat Career Development Program works closely with the University's Career Planning and Placement Center in order to provide additional assistance when needed.

Lexington is a city to explore, from shopping and entertainment to one-of-a-kind restaurants and enjoyable accommodations — all within minutes of the UK campus.

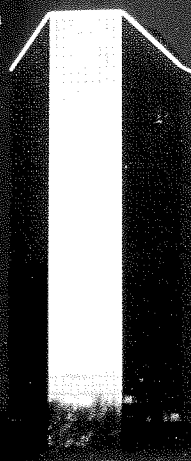
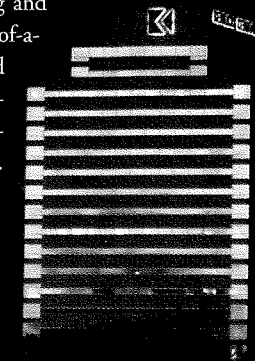
