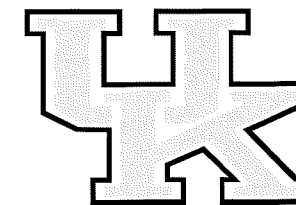

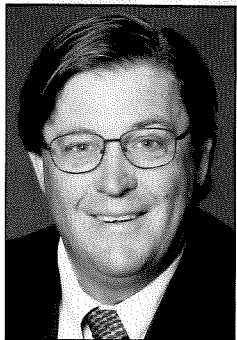

HEAD COACH GARY CONELLY



The 2005-06 season marks the 15th campaign for Gary Conelly as the University of Kentucky head swimming coach. The women's squads have compiled an 87-54 record since Conelly began coaching that squad in 1991-92.

The men, whom he started coaching in 1992-93, have put together a record of 67-62, bringing his overall coaching record to 154-116. The 2004-05 season marked one of the best in Conelly's outstanding career at UK. The men had their highest-ever finish at the SEC Championships placing fourth, while the women had their best finish, fourth, since 1998-99. The men continued their success at the NCAA Championships finishing 12th, the best in school history. The women had the program's

second-best NCAA Championships showing by placing 18th.

Conelly's 2003-04 men's squad sent the largest men's contingent in school history to the NCAA Championships, with eight different Wildcats heading to East Meadow, N.Y. The UK men placed 15th, marking the best finish in the history of the program. His UK women's squad sent three student-athletes to the NCAA Championships and moved up three spots to sixth place at the SEC Championships.

In 2002-03, Conelly led the men's team to its second-highest finish ever in the NCAA championships, a 17th-place showing. Conelly's 2001-02 men's team placed 16th at NCAAs, its highest-ever finish at the time. At the Southeastern Conference Championships, the men had the second-highest point total in school history (282), finishing in sixth-place. Competing at the NCAAs for the men were juniors Clayton Moss, Roger Watkins and sophomore

Joey Faltraco. Faltraco's 11th-place finish in the 200-yard backstroke earned him honorable mention All-America honors, the first UK athlete to earn the honor in the event, while Moss was an All-American on the one- and three-meter springboards and the platform. The women also competed at the national championships, continuing a string of 10 straight appearances.

During the 2000-01 year, Conelly led the men's team to a NCAA 17th-place finish. UK also achieved its highest SEC finish in 18 years, placing fifth. Five individuals from the men's team competed at the NCAAs, seniors Dave Tweedie, Macon White, Aaron Workman and Shaun Zitani and sophomore Roger Watkins, all five of them earning All-America honorable mention. Conelly also coached the women to the NCAAs, where they placed 39th. Seniors Melissa Olson and Jaime Siegele competed at the championships, with Siegele earning All-America honorable mention in the 50 freestyle.

During the 1999-2000 season, Conelly led the men's team to a top-20 finish and had two men qualify for the NCAA championships, both earning honorable mention All-America honors. Four women qualified for the NCAA Championships. The women comprised the 800 freestyle relay that finished 12th and earned the women honorable mention All-America honors in addition to competing individually. Following the season, nine Wildcats participated in the 2000 Olympic trials.

In 1998-99, Conelly led both the men's and women's teams to top-25 finishes at the NCAA Championships. The men finished at No. 24, while the women finished 21st, their fifth consecutive top-25 showing. The women's squad had 10 athletes advance to the NCAA meet, the most in school history. Senior diver Paco Rivera finished second in platform diving, becoming the top NCAA finisher in school history.

Conelly led the 1996-97 men's team to a 26th-place NCAA finish and Nat Lewis finished third in the 1,650 freestyle and still ranks as the second-highest NCAA finisher in school history. The women finished in 24th place and had three team members earn All-America honors.

In the 1995-96 season, Conelly led the women's team to a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships, the highest finish in school history. In 1994-95, Conelly led the women's team to a fourth-place finish at the SEC Championships and a second straight 19th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Conelly was named 1995 SEC Women's Coach of the Year for his efforts.

In Conelly's 14 years with UK, the swimming and diving programs have made great strides. In 1990, Conelly coached the team's first female All-American and NCAA finalist, Kellie Moran. Since then, 26 more Wildcat swimmers have garnered All-America accolades under Conelly's tutelage.

Prior to becoming head coach at Kentucky, Conelly spent three years with UK as a graduate assistant coach.

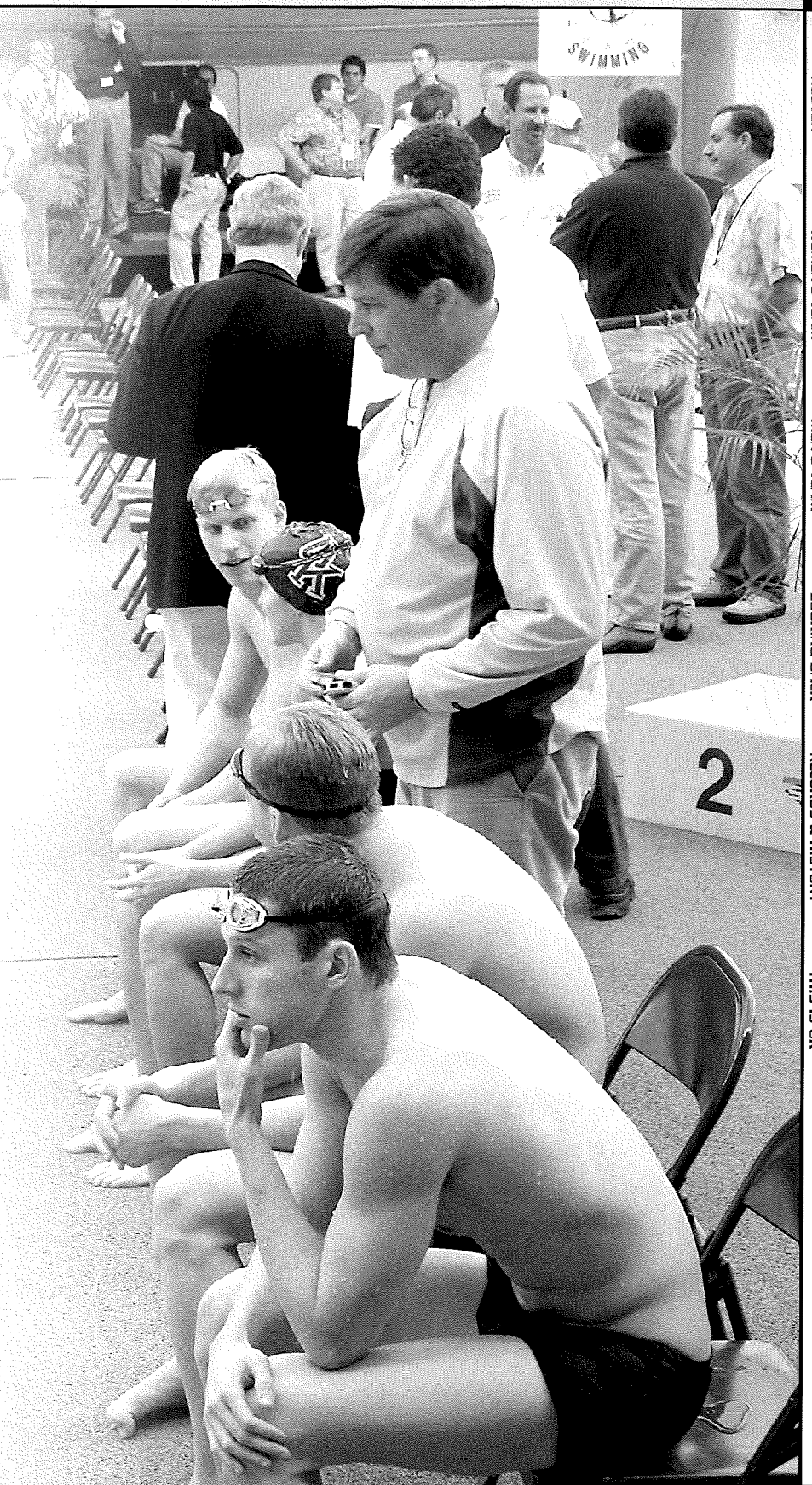
Conelly came to the University of Kentucky from the West Florida Lightning Aquatics USS team in Largo, Fla. During his seven years at West Florida, Conelly directed 150 swimmers and produced three Olympic Trial qualifiers, two National Sports Festival team members, and one Sports Festival champion in the 100 backstroke.

As a swimmer, Conelly was a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team and he participated on the world record-setting 400-meter freestyle relay team. An Indiana University alumnus, Conelly was a 15-time NCAA All-American and is a member of the Indiana Swimming Hall of Fame. In 1973, Indiana honored him with the Balfour Award for excellence in swimming, leadership, and scholarship.

Conelly is married to Kathleen Healey and has two children, Cody and Emily.

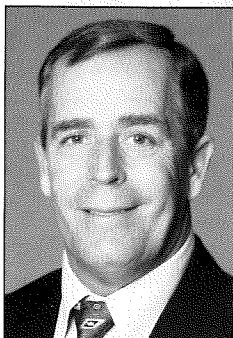

THIS IS UK

DIVING COACH MICHAEL LYDEN



The 2005 Southeastern Conference Men's Diving Coach of the Year, Michael Lyden begins his 13th season as diving coach at the University of Kentucky. Since joining UK in 1993, Lyden has led the Wildcats to diving prominence, as 10 Wildcats have earned 44 All-American selections. Lyden coached Kentucky's first All-American, Tina Johnson, who earned All-America platform honors in 1994, and the

Cats' first single-season three-time All-American, Clayton Moss, in 2002 and 2003.

The past five seasons have been productive for Lyden and his divers, with the 2004-05 season being one of the best in UK's history. Wildcat women divers swept the SEC Championships with sophomore Taryn Ignacio taking home the platform and one-meter title, along with junior Jessica Thompson capturing the three-meter title. Both divers went on to compete in the NCAA championships where

Thompson took 11th in the three-meter and 15th on the platform, while Ignacio took 17th in the one-meter.

In 2004-05, Lyden also coached in the summer a team consisting of UK's SEC Diver of the Year, Taryn Ignacio, at the Senior Nationals Diving Championships in Huntersville, N.C. Ignacio finished ninth on the platform and won the Bronze medal by finishing third on the 1-meter.

The 2003-04 season was also a memorable one in the coaching career of Lyden. The aforementioned Moss placed fourth on the three meter at the 2004 U.S. Olympic trials, while another former Cat, Aaron Kirkpatrick, took ninth place. Sophomore Kari Retrum took 17th on the platform, and sophomore Jessica Thompson placed 18th on the three meter.

Under Lyden's direction, Retrum became the first Kentucky freshman to claim an SEC diving title when she captured the platform event at the 2004 SEC Championships. Moss ended his brilliant Wildcat career in 2003 with a runner-up finish on the three-meter and third and fourth-place finishes on the one meter and platform, respectively, at the NCAA championships. During the 2001-02 season, Lyden helped Moss successfully defend his SEC one-meter title, the first UK diver to win consecutive titles in an event at the conference championships, and become an All-American on all three boards, as Moss placed second on the one-meter, fifth on the three-meter and sixth on the platform. For all of his accomplishments, Moss was named the SEC Male Diver of the Year, also a first for UK.

Lyden also aided in the collegiate success of 2002 senior Aaron Kirkpatrick, who won silver on both the one- and three-meter springboards and placed seventh on the platform at the conference championships.

His run of success with the duo also included the 2000-01 season when Moss became the third UK man to be an SEC Champion, winning the one-meter, and followed it up with a fourth-place finish on the three meter and a 10th-place finish on the platform, earning All-American honors on both. Kirkpatrick also had a successful season under Lyden's tutelage. The junior garnered honorable mention All-America status with a 12th-place finish on the three-meter springboard at the NCAA championships.

Since joining the Wildcats, Lyden has transformed Kentucky into one of the nation's most prominent diving programs. At the 1994 NCAA Championships, Tina Johnson became UK's first diving All-American on the platform, placing eighth, and Jenny Baker earned honorable mention All-America in two events.

During the 1999-2000 season, Lyden had junior Carrie Knoeber and freshman Moss qualify for the NCAA Championship meet. Knoe-

ber earned honorable mention All-American honors on the three-meter while Moss earned All-American honors on the one-meter, three-meter, and platform. Moss' honors were the first for a freshman in UK history.

In 1998, Paco Rivera became the first male UK diver to claim a Southeastern Conference title, winning the platform event and garnering All-SEC honors. Rivera advanced to the NCAA Championships, where he was named as an All-American in three events and placed second on the platform.

In 1997, Lyden coached Christy Soulakis to the SEC three-meter springboard championship and SEC Female Diver of the Year honors. Soulakis and Rivera both earned All-America honors.

In 1996, Leake and Soulakis joined Baker and Johnson in earning All-America honors. Leake finished second on the one-meter and fourth on the three-meter, Johnson finished third on the one-meter and platform, and Baker finished seventh on the platform. For his divers' accomplishments, Lyden was honored as the Southeastern Conference and NCAA Women's Diving Coach of the Year.

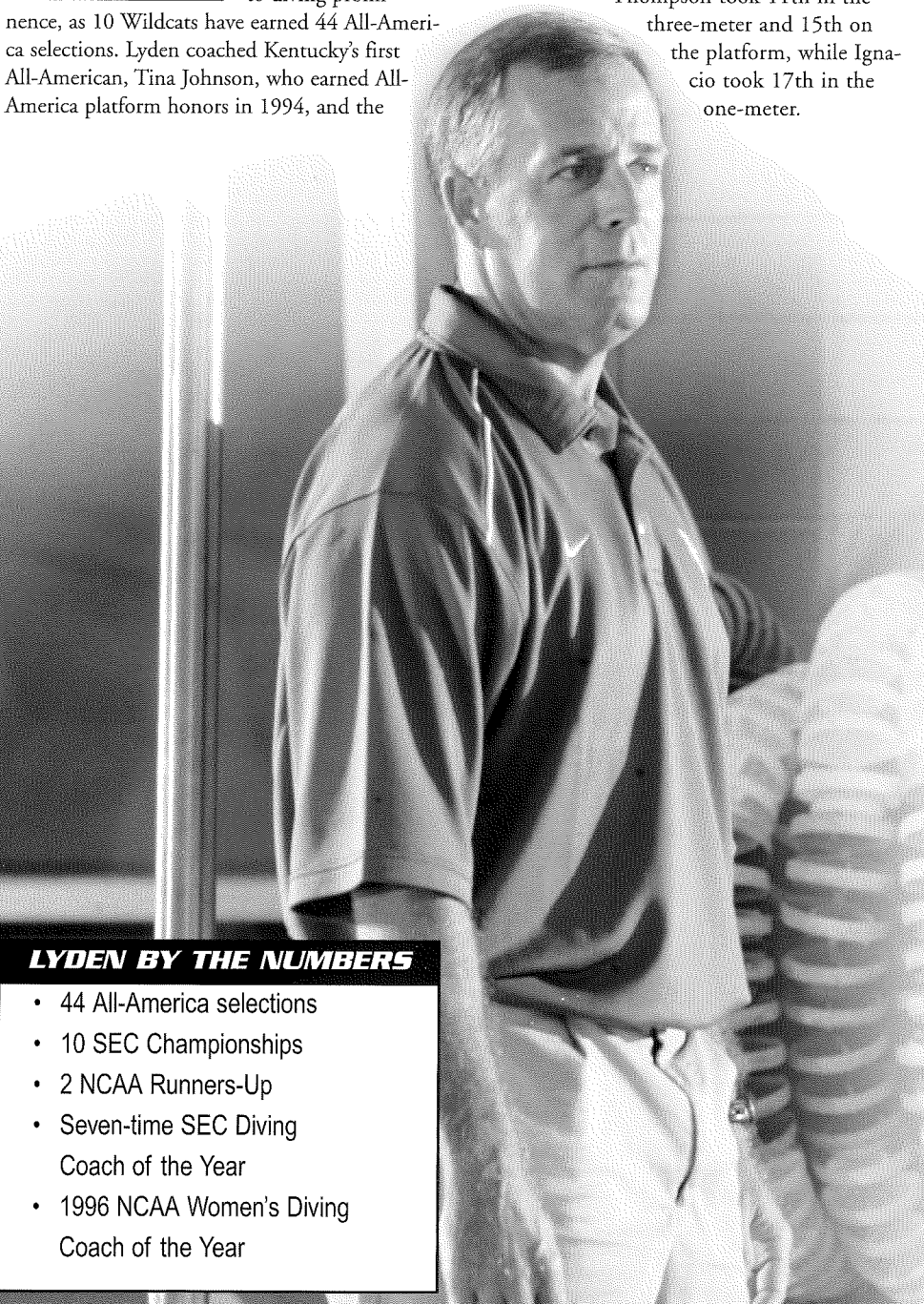
Before arriving at UK, Lyden had spent nine seasons at Eastern Michigan where he was the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year nine times. He then moved to LSU where he received SEC Women's Coach of the Year four times consecutively and was the 1992 SEC Men's Coach of the Year. During Lyden's tenure at LSU his divers won 15 of 24 possible SEC titles.

Along with his college coaching, Lyden has also coached Kentucky Diving Clubs, has had numerous All-Americans and has coached seven age group divers to 18 national championships. He was chosen to coach at the Junior World Diving Championships in the summer of 2002 held in Aachen, Germany. At that event he coached one member to a seventh-place finish in the 1-meter and 3-meter boards. Lyden has served as the National Team Coach in 1988-90, 1992, 1994-96, 1998-2000 and has directed divers in competitions in Italy, Austria, Mexico, Canada, Spain, China, France, and Holland.

At the 2005 Junior Nationals, Lyden coached his daughter, Jessica, who captured her first national championship by winning the 1-meter. Jessica also finished third in the 3-meter event. Jessica went on to win the 1-meter at the Pan American Junior Championships in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.

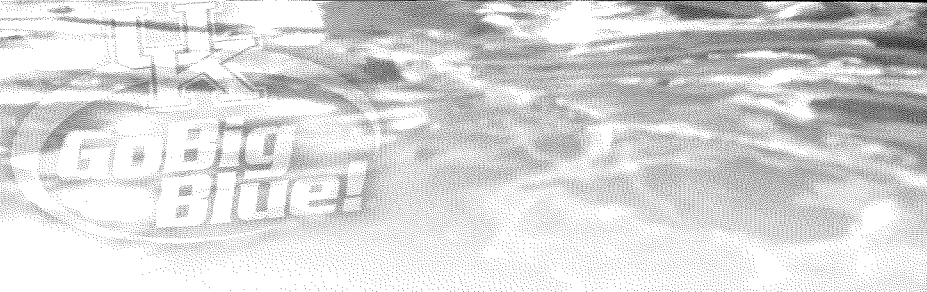
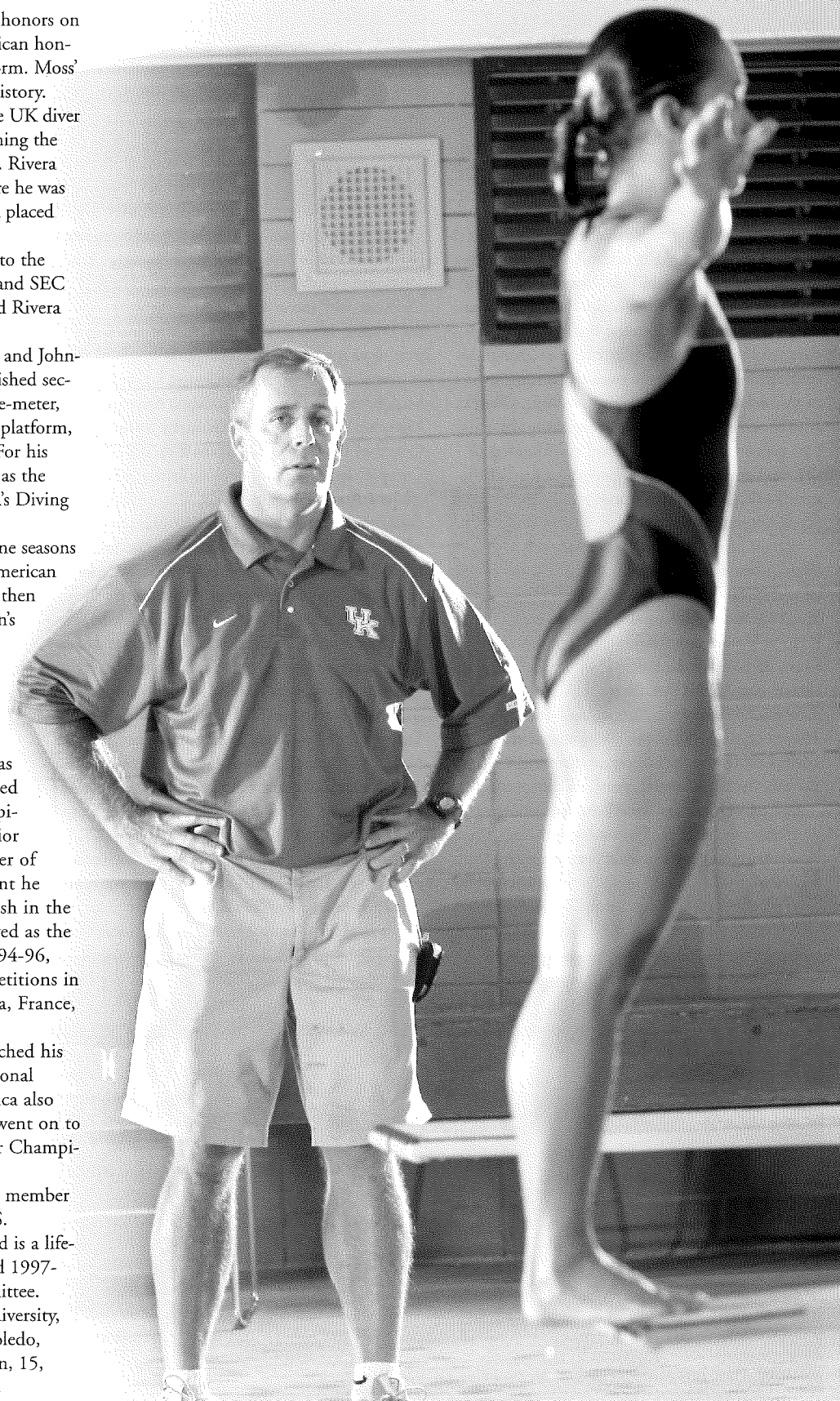
In addition to coaching, Lyden has been a member of the U.S. Diving Rules Committee, the U.S. Olympic International Diving Committee and is a lifetime member of U.S. Diving. In 1993-94 and 1997-99, Lyden served on the NCAA Rules Committee.

A 1980 graduate of Western Michigan University, Lyden is married to Emily Joan Sullivan of Toledo, Ohio. They have three children — Jessica Ann, 15, John Tyler (Jack), 13 and Brittany Barbara, 7.

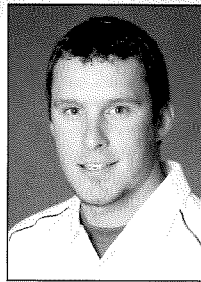

Assistant Coach

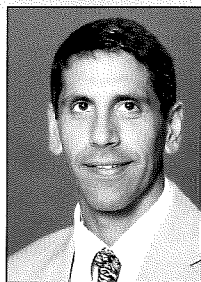
Shaun Zitani enters his first year as assistant coach at the University of Kentucky.

A five-time All-American from 1997-2001, Zitani returns to his

alma mater after serving three seasons as an assistant swim coach at Indian River Community College in Ft. Pierce, Fla. Zitani helped continue the tradition of excellence for the 31-time national-champion Pioneers, leading Indian River to three national titles while coaching the sprint swimmers to seven national-record finishes. At Indian River, Zitani coached Tim Patrick, who broke Zitani's 50-yard freestyle record this past season at Kentucky. Zitani coordinated all dry-land and weight-room programs for the Pioneers and served as the head age-group coach for the River Rats swim team.

Zitani brings a wealth of experience as a former student-athlete in addition to his coaching expertise. He placed 12th in the 50 freestyle at the 2000 NCAA Championships to earn an honorable-mention All-America selection and swam on the first Kentucky men's relay teams to compete at the NCAA Championships in 2001. Zitani helped lead the Cats to 13th place in the 200-medley relay and the 800-freestyle relay, 14th place in the 200-freestyle relay and 15th place in the 400-freestyle relay to collect four more honorable-mention All-America honors.

Zitani replaces former assistant coach Pete Knox, who left Kentucky to enter private business.



JOHN BRUCATO
Assistant Coach

John Brucato is in his seventh season with the UK swimming program. Brucato works primarily with the middle distance group and breaststrokers.

Brucato comes to UK

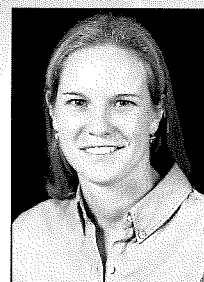
via the USS club team Wildcat Aquatics in Lexington. Brucato joined WA in the spring of 1990 and has established himself as a leader in the Kentucky swim coaching community.

During his tenure with WA, Brucato has produced numerous Top-16 qualifiers, Junior National qualifiers, Junior National Champions, Senior National qualifiers, and an Olympic Gold Medalist. He is a former Kentucky Swimming Coach of the Year, in addition to being a Select Camp Coach and an Olympic Festival Coach.

In 1992, Brucato coached Megan Kleine to a gold medal in the 1992 Olympic Games as part of the United States' 400-meter medley relay. Kleine, who swam for six years under Brucato at WA, won Senior Nationals twice in the 100-meter breaststroke. Kleine went on to swim at the University of Texas at Austin.

A native of Covington, Ky., Brucato began his coaching career at the Covington YMCA and then spent two years with the Covington Clippers Swim Team. In 1985, he took over the helm at the Nashville Aquatic Club where he spent five successful years as the Head Age Group Coach before being hired on as the WA Senior Head Coach.

Brucato is a 1985 graduate of Northern Kentucky University where he received a degree in psychology. He lives in Lexington with his wife Jan, and their daughter, Katie.



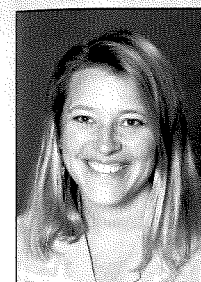
AZURDEE CHRISTENSEN
Assistant Coach

Azurdee Christensen begins her fourth season with the University of Kentucky swimming program. She works primarily with the middle distance and distance swimmers. She also serves as the program's recruiting coordinator.

Christensen, a native of Duluth, Ga., came to Kentucky from the University of Tennessee, where she swam from 1997-2001. She was captain of the UT swim team from '99-'01 and owns the sixth-fastest 200-freestyle time in school history. Christensen graduated from Tennessee in 2002 with a degree in Art History.

Engel gained coaching experience working at the Stanford University swim camps during the summer of 2002 with Stanford head coach Skip Kenney and coaching the Tennessee Masters swim team in 2001. She worked with several Ironman Triathletes in her time with the Masters swim team, while also working swimming camps at UT.

Christensen, 25, lives in Lexington with her husband, Robert.



LETITIA HOLLINGSWORTH-GRAY
Aquatic Director

Letitia Hollingsworth-Gray begins her second season as aquatic director with the Kentucky swimming

and diving program. "Tish" oversees facilities operations and event management at the Lancaster Aquatic Center. Hollingsworth-Gray served eight years as the Lancaster Aquatic Center pool manager before assuming the title of aquatic director. Prior to her stint as pool manager, Hollingsworth served as the UK swim team's Staff Assistant.

The UK alumna and Lexington, Ky. native swam for the Wildcats from 1982-86 and was the captain of UK's first varsity women's swim team for three years.

Hollingsworth also teaches courses in CPR, lifeguarding, and coaches' safety training, as well as serving as an aquatic examiner for the Red Cross.

Hollingsworth-Gray is married to Steve Gray and the two reside in Lexington. They have a son, three-year-old Cooper.



MICKI KING
Assistant Athletics Director

In her 14th year with the UK Athletics Department, Micki King is Assistant Athletics Director.

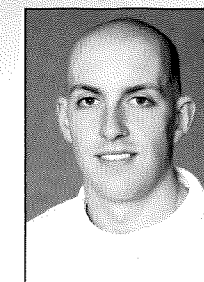
King, who previously held the title of Special Assistant to the A.D., oversees the sports of men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, rifle, cheerleaders and dance team. For two years, she also managed marketing efforts for the women's basketball team while serving as game director for all home contests.

A native of Pontiac, Mich., King served 26 years in the United States Air Force before retiring with the rank of colonel in 1992. During her years of service, King had assignments in Michigan, Arizona, California, Washington, Colorado, Kentucky, and Germany. In 1973, King was the first woman to teach physical education and coach at a military academy when she served at the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs.

An accomplished diver, King attended the University of Michigan and graduated in 1966.

She won the gold medal for springboard diving in the 1972 Olympic Games. Four years earlier, she just missed a gold medal when a freak accident in the finals of the '68 Olympics dropped her from first to fourth in the standings. During her illustrious career, she also competed in two Pan American Games, won 10 U. S. national championships, and won international diving honors in 15 countries. She is an inductee in seven Halls of Fame, including the prestigious United States Olympic Hall of Fame.

After her diving career, King turned to coaching at the Air Force Academy in 1973-77. After assignments in Arizona and Germany, King returned to the Academy in 1983 and was named assistant athletics director and diving coach. During this stint, she was named NCAA Division II Coach of the Year three times. King's divers won 11 All-America honors and two claimed national titles. In 1988, King traveled to the Seoul Games as a staff member of the U. S. Olympic diving team and served in the same capacity in the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta. She attended the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney on behalf of the U.S. Olympic Committee, her eighth appearance at the summer games as either a participant or staff member.



ERIC ATNIP
Facility Manager

Eric Atnip begins his second season as pool manager at the Lancaster Aquatic Center. Atnip began a stint as a lifeguard at the Lancaster Aquatic Center

in 1999 and has since served as a lifeguard supervisor and the strength and swim coach for the Wildcat Aquatics swim team. As a student, this amateur triathlete and cyclist helped start the University of Kentucky triathlon club.

Atnip is a two-time graduate of the University of Kentucky after earning a bachelor's degree in political science in 2000 and a master's degree in health promotion in 2003.

UK swimming alumna Margo Lynch begins her fourth season as staff assistant.

Lynch serves as a recruiting assistant and media relations liaison.

She is also certified to coach swimming.

Born in Melbourne, Australia, Lynch came to Kentucky from her family's adopted home of Pittsburgh, Pa. Lynch swam for the Wildcats from 1991-95 and served as the team captain during her junior and senior seasons. Lynch can be found on the all-time top-10 UK lists in three events; 200-freestyle, 500-freestyle and 1650-freestyle.

WOMEN'S OUTLOOK

The 2004-05 Kentucky women's squad ended last year strong. The team had their best Southeastern Conference finish, fourth, since 1998-99, when they finished third. The NCAA Championships finish of 18th was the women's second highest finish in UK history.

This year's team looks to pick up where they left off last season and push the program to new heights with the return of all but four letterwinners. UK will be led by swimmers Heather and Jenny Bradford, Shantel Commander and Laura Graham all who garnered All-America honors last season. The diving squad looks to have its best group in school history with three SEC Champions on its roster in Taryn Iganacio, Kari Retrum and Jessica Thompson.

With the core group of last year's successful team and the addition of talented newcomers like Leah Harms, Haleigh Kerns and Kelly Rames, this team has the potential to leave a lasting mark in the program's great history.

"The women have a really good chance to be one of the top teams in the SEC," head coach Gary Connelly said. "If things fall into place we can have our best women's season ever."

BACKSTROKE

Despite the loss of school-record holder Jessica Siegele, Connelly is encouraged by the production of UK's returning backstrokers. Sophomore Jill Southerlan found her stroke late in her freshman season and figures to have a breakout season in 2006.

"Jill is capable of going to the NCAAs in the 100 and 200 backstroke events," Connelly said. "If she comes anywhere close to what she was doing toward the end of last season, you'll see her do really well."

Connelly also will count on seniors Joanna McLean and Brennan Moore, who have spent most of their time at UK in sprint and distance freestyle events, respectively.

"I think Brennan can go to the NCAAs in this event," Connelly said. "She has been flirting with going less than two minutes (in the 200 backstroke) for quite a while, and I think she is going to be a standout."

Freshman Leah Harms also will contribute in this event.

BUTTERFLY

As with the backstroke, the butterfly discipline is an area that raises some question marks by Siegele's departure. However, Heather and Jenny Bradford are poised to fill the void, particularly in the 100 butterfly.

Connelly also expects some help in this area from a couple freshmen.

"Kelly Rames is really going to help us in the 200 fly," Connelly said. "She should make it under two minutes and will have a chance to qualify for the NCAA Championships."

Freshman Kristina Sledge also will see time in the 100 butterfly.

BREASTSTROKE

The breaststroke discipline presents a tremendous strength for Kentucky in 2005-06. Senior All-American Laura Graham, UK's record holder in the 100 and 200 breaststroke events, returns for her final season after placing seventh in the 100 and 15 in the 200 at the 2005 NCAA. Senior Shantel Commander excelled, as

well taking 30th place in the 100 and 14th in the 200 at the 2005 NCAAs.

"Laura is our top breastroker, but Shantel is right behind her and had an incredible summer clocking some of her best times," Connelly explained. "I think you'll see a lot of one-two finishes from those ladies in dual meets."

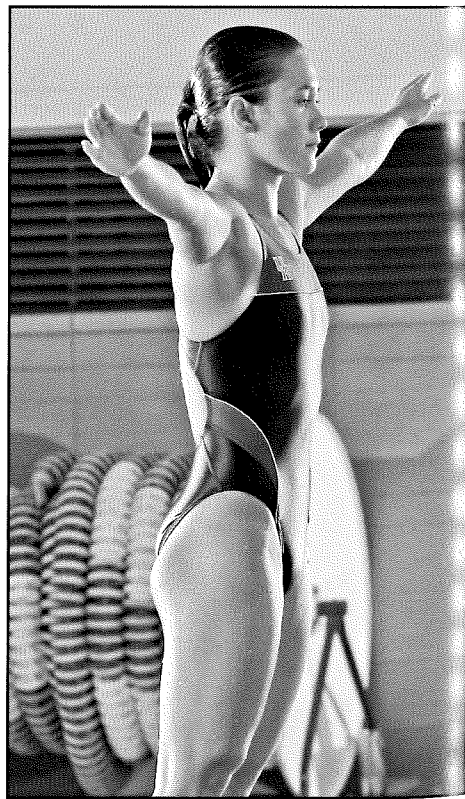
Sophomore Lindsay Myhre began to flourish late in her freshman season and will use her experience to her advantage in 2005-06.

"Lindsay had some trouble early on with the intensity of SEC competition, but by the end of last year, she got that under control," Connelly said. "Depending on her progress, we may place one, two, or three often in this event."

FREESTYLE

Heading the Kentucky freestyle corps is the potent sprint combination of Jenny and Heather Bradford. After placing 11th and 22nd respectively at the NCAA and SEC Championships a season ago, the twins look to do bigger and better things in 2006.

"Jenny and Heather had pretty good seasons, last year, but I think they both would tell you they were a little disappointed they didn't do better," Connelly said. "I think they're excited to be back and training with the team, and the year of experi-

ence will show as they continue to improve."

A young group of swimmers will fill out the middle-distance group. Returning sophomore Kelley Morrison will be joined by freshmen Haleigh Kerns and Kelly Rames.

Senior Brennan Moore leads the distance contingent and will be joined by Kerns and Harms.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

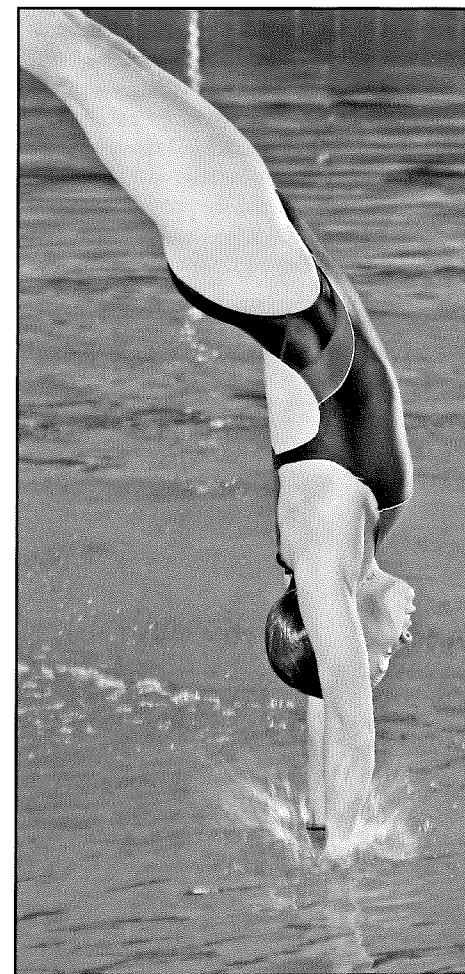
The Kentucky individual medley looks to be a strong event with many experienced and talented returners. Seniors Shantel Commander, Laura Graham, and Brennan Moore look to be counted on to lead a group that has young swimmers like sophomores Chelsea Bailey, Blair Barrett, Lindsay Myhre, Blair Barrett, as well as newcomers freshman Kelly Rames and junior transfer Wesley Swafford.

"Overall the medley relays are going to be really strong for us," Connelly said.

RELAYS

Despite the loss of Jessica Siegele, much of the Kentucky relay lineups will remain intact. Heather and Jenny Bradford will fill half of the freestyle slots in the freestyle relays, while the remaining two spots will be filled with various swimmers throughout the season. Jenny Bradford will take the freestyle leg on the medley relays, while Heather Bradford will occupy the butterfly area.

Laura Graham will maintain a firm grip on the breaststroke leg in the medley relays and may occasionally be relieved by Commander or Myhre. Look for sophomore Jill Southerlan to step in to the backstroke position.

DIVING

An undisputed strength of the Kentucky women's team is its group of versatile divers, led by coach Mike Lyden. The only coach to lead a sweep of the SEC women's diving championships, Lyden engineered a sweep of the conference meet last season and has all of the pieces in place to accomplish a similar feat in 2006.

Junior Taryn Iganacio captured the three-meter and platform-diving titles at the SEC Championships in her first season a Wildcat last year and later competed at the NCAA Championships. Senior Jessica Thompson began the Wildcat sweep in Gainesville with a conference victory on the one meter and also qualified for the NCAA meet.

Returning for her sophomore season is Kari Retrum, who redshirted the 2004-05 season to recover from a shoulder injury. The first current Wildcat diver to win a conference title, Retrum took top league honors on the platform in 2004, becoming the first UK women's swimming and diving freshman to capture an SEC title.

Junior Joey Brown returns after a solid sophomore campaign during which she was a finalist at the SEC Championships.

Lyden welcomes the challenge of sweeping the SEC Championships for a second consecutive year.

"I don't know how realistic that is, but we certainly can handle the challenge," Lyden said. "As good as we were in sweeping each event, we only had one finalist on in all three events. We are much further ahead than we were last year, and I'm looking for our women to have a great year."

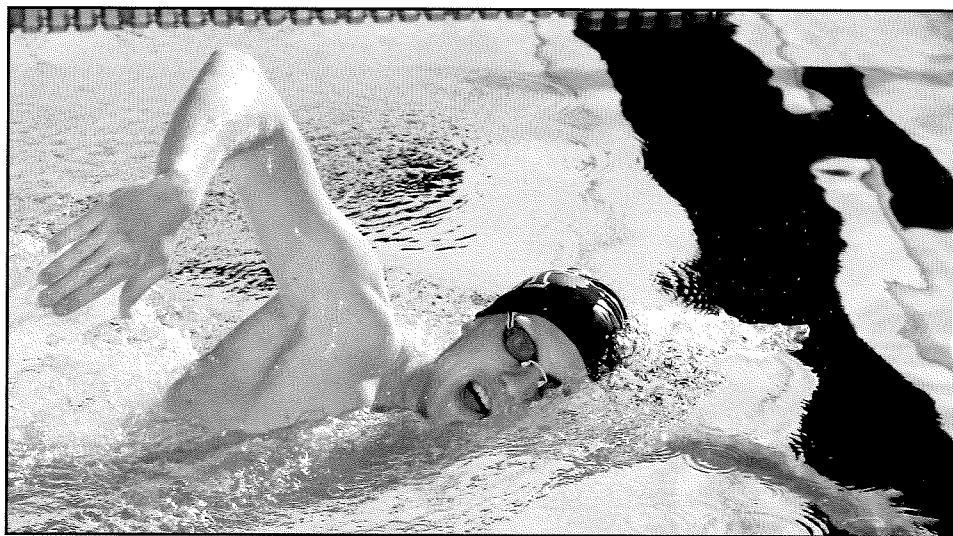
MEET THE WILDCAT MEN

MEN'S OUTLOOK

The men's swimming and diving team is coming off a year where they finished 12th in the NCAA championships, the highest in school history. Replacing ten seniors including All-Americans Daniel Cruz, Jerram Chudleigh, Clay Gasparovich, and Tim Patrick is a tough challenge for any program, but it is one this year's Wildcats look forward to taking on. Head coach Gary Connelly enters the season confident returning All-Americans Daniel Farnham and Steven Manley will lead a group consisting mainly of sophomores and freshmen to continue to reach the high levels of excellence that this program has established.



Returning All-American Daniel Farnham will be counted on to continue his high level of performance in the freestyle and relay events.

FREESTYLE

The Kentucky freestyle corps lost an All-American in Tim Patrick, a second place finisher in the 50 freestyle at the SEC Championships, as well as Daniel Cruz, who added significant depth to the freestyle, particularly in relay events. However, a vital cog in the Cats' freestyle lineup remains in seniors Steven Manley and Daniel Farnham.

"You can count on Steven and Daniel in any event we put them in," Connelly said. "We figure we can put them in two individual events each and count on winning four events - the 50, 100, 200 and 500 freestyles."

A 10-time All-American, Manley returns for his final campaign to once again lead the Wildcat freestylers in middle distance and distance events. Manley can expect to see competition in the 400-medley relay, as well as the 200 and 500-freestyle events.

"Steven has felt every year that he has swam pretty well, but I also think that he believes he has not had as great of a year as he is capable of producing," explained Connelly. "He is really going to focus on finishing strong. I think you are really going to see him step up and have a lot of good swims."

Farnham, a 13 place finisher in the 100 freestyle at the 2005 NCAA Championships,

will take on a greater role in the 50 freestyle while leaving the 100 freestyle as the premier event in his repertoire.

"Last year, Daniel had Tim Patrick in front of him in the 50 freestyle, but he has always been our best in the 100 freestyle," noted Connelly. "He had a very good summer, and I think by the end of the year he will own a few school records."

Though Farnham and Manley will carry the load in the sprint freestyle events, Connelly will count on additional help from several Wildcats with great potential. Sophomore Grant Nelson and junior Eric Weber enjoyed solid 2004-05 seasons and will enjoy even more important roles in 2005-06.

"Grant had a really good summer, and I think he is going to make an even bigger impact in the 200, 500 and the 1000," Connelly said. "Eric had a nice summer of training, and I think he is really focused on doing well in the 500 and the 1000 for us. Those two are really going to help us on the distance side of things."

Connelly is counting on junior Mark Doyle to add depth in the sprint freestyle events.

"Mark's talent is an element that gets overlooked quite a bit," Connelly said. "He has to step up and help us this year because we really need him in the 100 and 200. We don't want

everything on Steven's (Manley) or Daniel's (Farnham) shoulders."

Freshman James Batley, who came at the same high school in England as UK senior Laura Graham, may add significant help in the middle distance events for Kentucky.

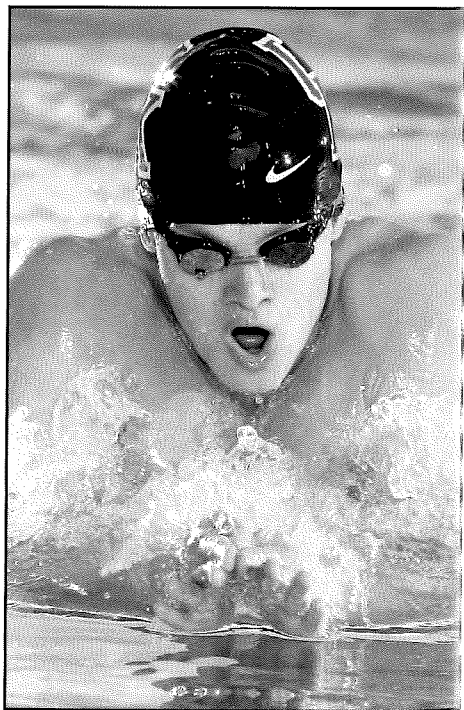
"James will be a key swimmer for us in the 200 and 500 freestyles, and he can offer help in the 1000 if we need it," Connelly said. "Also, if our 800 free relay is going to be at the same level as it was last season, we will need him to step up as a freshman."

Freshmen Warren Grobbelaar, Lance Bowman, Sean Smith, Vince Tortora also expect to contribute in the freestyle.

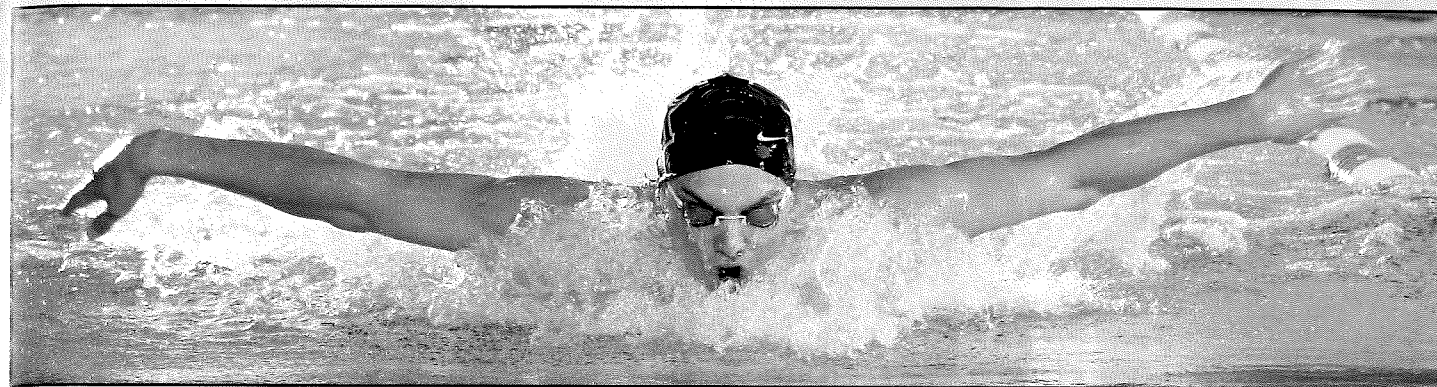
BACKSTROKE

Despite the loss of Jerram Chudleigh, Kentucky figures to benefit from a solid, though youthful backstroke lineup. Senior Daniel Farnham may swim backstroke events throughout the season, but the backstroke discipline figures to be manned mainly by freshmen.

"We are taking a wait-and-see approach with our backstroke swimmers," Connelly said. "We have three guys - Sean Smith, Joe Retrum and Shane Eliason - who are going to do really well for us in this event, but it's interesting that they are all freshmen. You have to hope they can grow up really fast and take on the burden of being key players on the team."

BREASTSTROKE

Sophomores Will Vietti and Kristian Outinen will continue to supply Kentucky's strength in this discipline after surprising freshman seasons.

"We're excited about having a lethal one-two punch in the breaststroke between Will and Kristian," Connelly said. "Kristian tends to be a little bit more of a sprinter than Will, but I think both of those guys are going to make the NCAAs this year."

Senior Steven Manley will contribute in the breaststroke, as well, but will focus more on freestyle events.

BUTTERFLY

The graduation of Daniel Cruz and Jerram Chudleigh left a massive void in the butterfly. Cruz captured a conference title in the 200 fly and placed third at the NCAA Championships, while Chudleigh also medaled at the SEC championships, taking third. Sophomore Grant Nelson figures to be the most likely returning letter winner to help keep the butterfly a solid area for the Wildcats.

"Grant came very close to making the Olympic trials in the 200 butterfly and went to the senior nationals this past summer," Connelly said. "He scored in the 200 butterfly senior national long course, so he is an ace in the hole for us."

Connelly also will count on freshman Warren Grobbelaar, a native of South Africa who has successfully recovered from a lung illness.

"Warren has done really well in the short-distance events after recovering from his illness," Connelly said. "He's really going to be the guy to step up and do a good job for us there."

Connelly also expects some help from sophomore Kristian Outinen, who bolstered Kentucky's production in the breaststroke a season ago.

"Though Kristian is a really good butterflyer, we would like to save him for the breaststroke events," Connelly explained. "However, Kristian has

very good pullouts, starts and turns. He might be a good option for us in the 200 medley relay."

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

The individual medley returns two swimmers who placed at last year's SEC championships in junior Eric Weber and sophomore Will Vietti. Weber added two points to last season's SEC championships score with a 14th-place finish. Adding to the group's depth in this event will be Kristian Outinen and Steven Manley.

RELAYS

This upcoming season's relay team faced one of the team's greatest challenges in replacing three All-Americans. Gone from the 200, 400, and 800 freestyle relays are Jerram Chudleigh, Daniel Cruz, Clay Gasparovich, and Tim Patrick. However, the Wildcats still have seniors Daniel Farnham and Steven Manley who have been All-American in these events the past three years.

Contending to join Farnham and Manley on the relay teams will be a variety of young swimmers. Freshmen James Batley, Lance Bowman, Warren Grobbelaar, as well as sophomore Grant

Nelson all look to be the keys to continuing UK's excellence of recent years in this event.

"Relays were really great for us last year," Connelly said. "We have a really good mix of swimmers competing to be on the relays. Like many events, it will depend on the freshmen to see how good we become this year."

DIVING

With the loss of All-American Mario Rodriguez, coach Mike Lyden will turn to a pair of newcomers to carry the load in 2006.

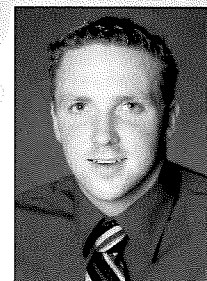

Unsatisfied by productive 2003-04 seasons, the 2004-05 Kentucky swimming and diving squads set out in search of bigger things last October. The Cats didn't take long to produce the results they had in mind.

Hosting Michigan State for the season's first meet, the Cats took control of the meet and never let up, posting easy victories over MSU's men's and women's squads. After narrow losses at Tennessee, the Cats hit the road for Bloomington, Ind., where they matched up with Indiana. Though the UK women fell on the short end of a defeat, the Kentucky men registered a dominant performance, as coach Gary Connelly knocked off his alma mater

once again, beating the Hoosiers by over 50 points.

Two weeks later, a record crowd of nearly 1,000 fans filled the Lancaster Aquatic Center to see the Cats easily defeat the men's and women's squads from Alabama. Kentucky tallied similar results in the first meet of the new year, as UK scored commanding victories over the LSU men and women.

Two days later, UK split a mid-January date with South Carolina, as the UK women lost but the Kentucky men posted a solid victory in Columbia. The Kentucky women ended the season with dominant victories over Arkansas, Louisville and Cincinnati, while the UK men

made short work of the Cards and the Bearcats.

Mike Lyden's women's diving corps made history at the ensuing SEC Diving Championships, as Kentucky became only the second school in conference history to sweep the conference meet. Sophomore Taryn Ignacio took the three-meter and platform titles, while junior Jessica Thompson captured the one-meter event.

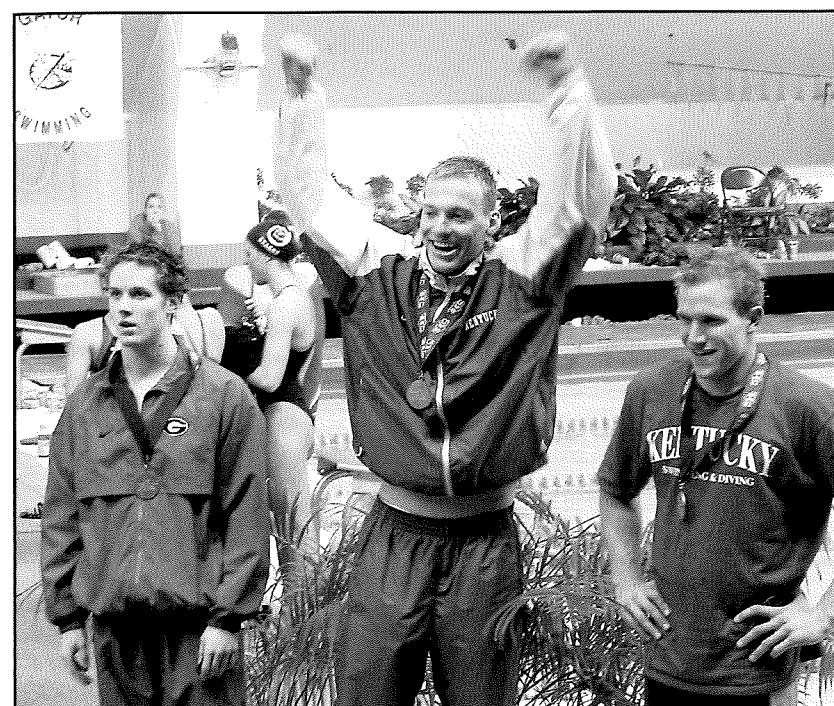
Not to be outdone, the Kentucky men's and women's swim squads posted fourth-place finishes. Senior Daniel Cruz produced a historical feat of his own, becoming Kentucky's first SEC men's swimming champion in 48 years when he captured the 200 butterfly.

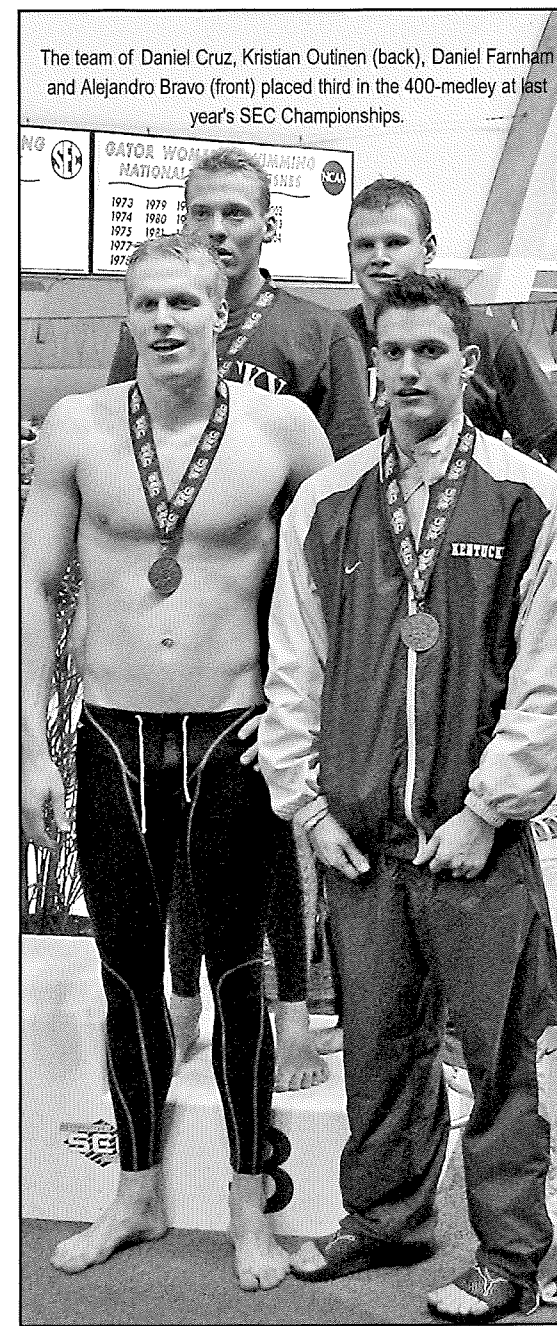

2005 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS RECAP

The Kentucky men's and women's swimming and diving squads turned in the best combined NCAA showing in the history of the program at the 2005 NCAA Championships.

The Kentucky women capped a superb regular season with an 18th-place finish at the NCAA Championships, marking the best NCAA finish for the UK women in nine seasons. Graham became the first Kentucky women's swimmer to tally four All-America honors at a single NCAA meet.

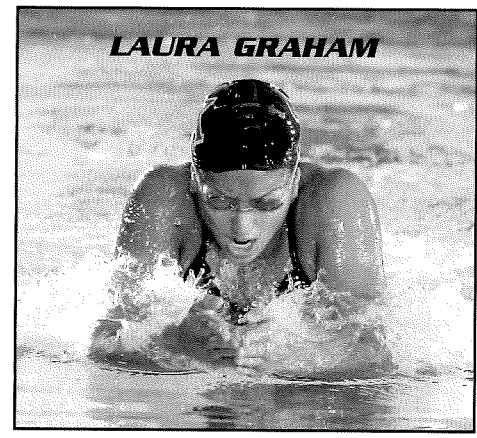
The Kentucky men matched the women's final regular-season ranking with a program-best 12th-place showing. Cruz charted the top individual finish for the Cats, duplicating his third-place swim from the 2004 NCAA Championships with another in 2005.

SALUTING RACHEL KOMISARZ



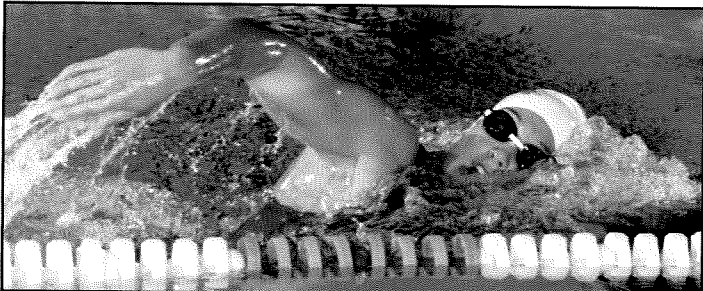
Six All-America honors and three SEC championships were only the beginning for former Wildcat Rachel Komisarz. The Warren, Mich., native swam at Kentucky from 1996-99 before entering the international swim scene, where she continued to flourish. Komisarz reached the pinnacle of her sport at the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens, Greece when she helped Team USA to a gold medal in the 800 freestyle relay and a silver medal in the 400 medley relay. Komisarz swam the preliminary round of each event to earn her first Olympic medals.

Komisarz owns UK swimming records in the 200 freestyle, 1000 freestyle, 1650 freestyle and the 100 and 200 butterfly events in addition to four records at UK's Lancaster Aquatic Center. Komisarz also co-owns school records in the 200 and 400 medley relays and 200 and 800 freestyle relays.

Komisarz currently swims for the Lakeside Swim Team in Louisville under Coach Mike DeBoor where she continues to make waves on the international scene. Her most recent achievement was being named to the 2006 United States World Championship team.



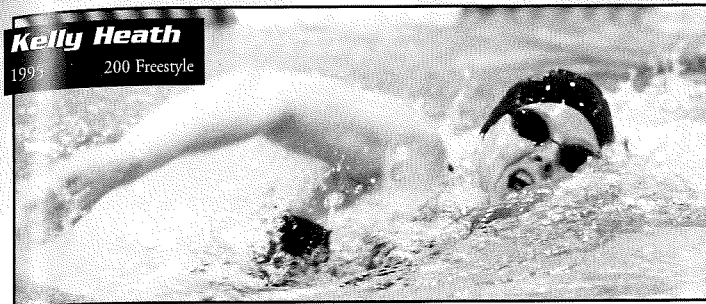

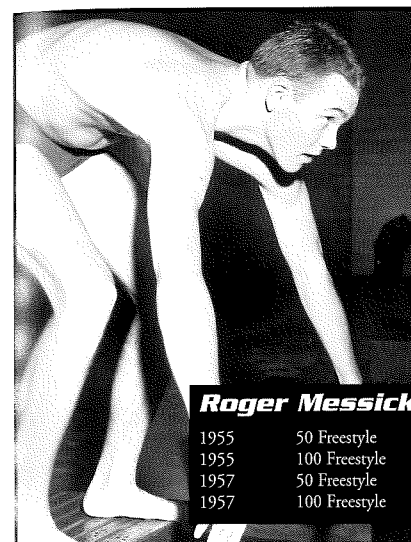
Rachel Komisarz celebrates after winning the 100-meter butterfly at the 2004 U.S. Olympic Swimming Trials last summer.

LANCASTER AQUATIC CENTER



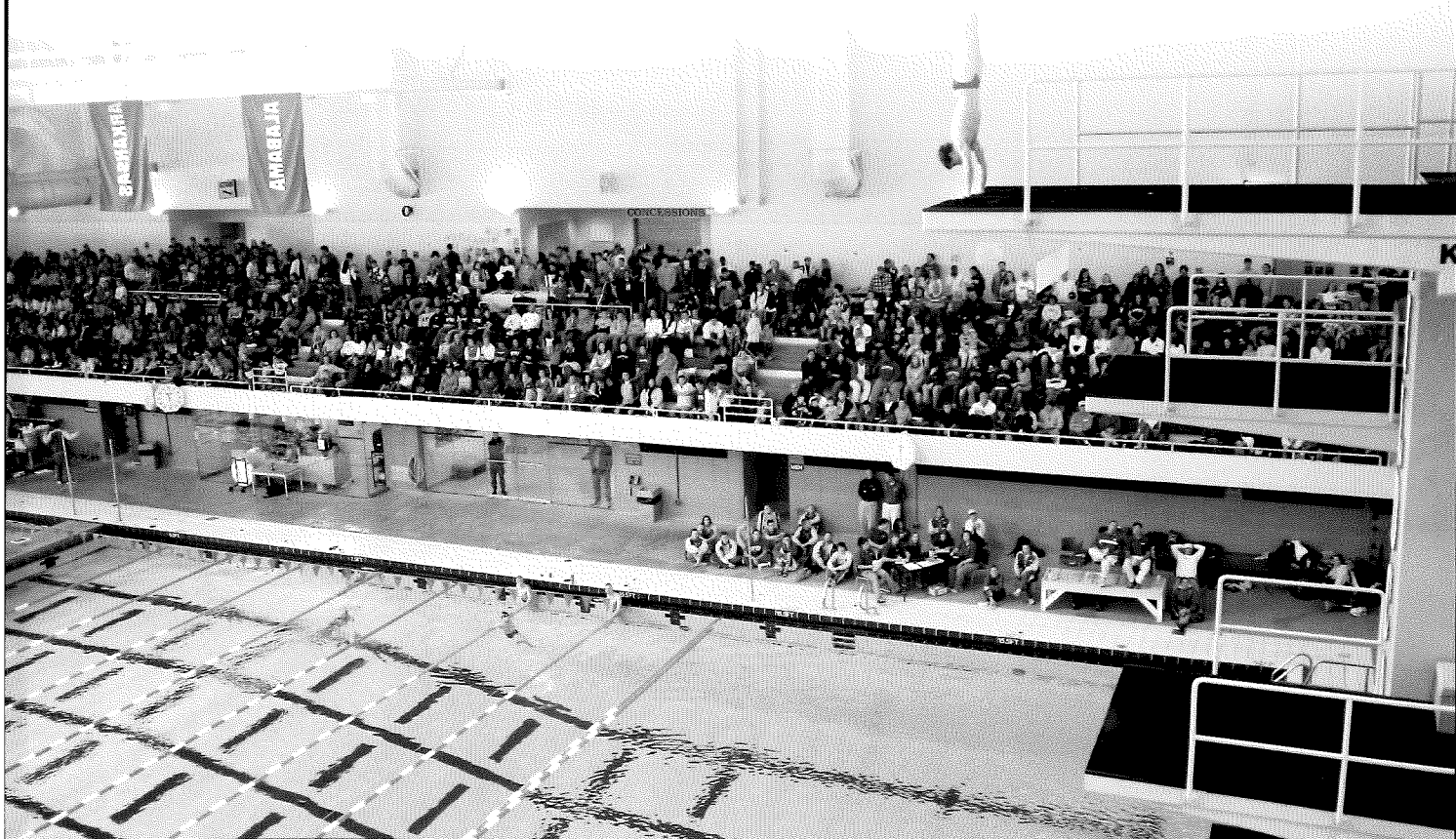
The University of Kentucky's Lancaster Aquatic Center, opened March 29, 1989, represents the finest in collegiate swimming and diving facilities.

The natatorium is named for Harry C. Lancaster, former UK Athletics Director (1968-76) and assistant basketball coach (1946-70) to Kentucky's legendary Adolph Rupp.

The indoor facility is 25 yards by 176 feet with a movable bulkhead that can be set at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. The movable bulkhead allows the facility to be used for a number of activities other than swim meets and practices, including recreational swimming, aquatic classes, swimming and diving lessons, scuba instruction, handicapped swimming and other aquatic-related activities. The addition of the second bulkhead will take place in 2006, creating an even faster racing facility.

Racing lanes can be set up in five configurations: across-the-pool racing at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. Two 25-yard courses can be utilized for large swim meets. Eighteen swimming lanes are available while diving events are in progress. Long course racing will have eight full-size lanes for the 50-meter distance.

The swimming tank, which holds 1,025,000 gallons of water, has a raised deck gutter with a large overflow. This gutter design is similar to the Indi-



anapolis Natatorium design. Pool depth varies from 4.3 feet to 6.5 feet at the shallow end, utilizing a movable floor of 35 by 75 feet. Water under the diving boards and tower is 17 feet deep. The natatorium features Daktronic automatic timing for swim meets. A 16-by-23 foot wall-mounted scoreboard allows full display of information for eight-lane and 16-lane swim meets. The scoreboard can also display graphics and animation sequences.

The diving facilities are among the best in the world. The facility has two 1-meter boards and two 3-meter boards set on concrete platforms. Each platform is eight feet wide with lengths from 23 feet to 28 feet.

The facility won the 1990 Association of General Contractors Award for Structures. There is a 40-foot dryland diving area permanently set up with a trampoline, Portapit diving board and two diving/tumbling harnesses for somersaulting and twisting practice.

The Aquatic Center has a full training room equipped with two treatment tables, EGS and ultrasound machine, hydrocollator, and ice machine. There is a trainer on duty at all times.

In the adjacent Seaton Physical Education building are exercise physiology labs that are utilized for the testing of swimmers and divers.

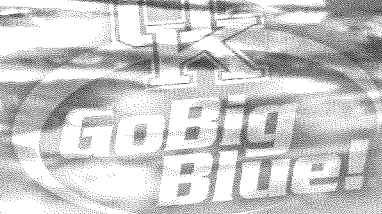
The second balcony of the Aquatic Center accommodates up to 500 spectators and has a concession stand area.

On March 14-15, 2002, the Aquatic Center was host to the NCAA Zone B Diving Championships.

In July of 2000, the United States Olympic Divers put on two exhibitions before embarking upon their trip to Sydney to compete in the 2000 games.

In 1999, UK hosted the Southeastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships at the Aquatic Center. Pool records fell left and right as some of the nation's most talented divers and fastest swimmers competed at the Aquatic Center, Feb. 17-20.

In addition to hosting the 1996 U.S. Olympic Diving Team, the Aquatic Center annually hosts the premier swimming and diving events in the state of Kentucky. These events include all UK home meets, the Kentucky State High School Championships, the Kentucky USS Championships, Zone and Regional Age Group and Senior Diving meets, Kentucky Special Olympics, and Bluegrass Games Diving meets. Highlights at the Aquatic Center have been the 1991 and 1999 Southeastern Conference Championships, the 1995 Southeastern Conference Diving Championships, the 1995 NCAA Zone B Diving Championships and the 1990 World Games Diving Team Trials.



UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY SWIMMING HISTORY

In 1936, the thought of having a swimming program at the University of Kentucky was just an idea tossed around by a group of water-lovers with skill and determination.

At that time, a pair of athletes named Bob Freeburg of Chicago and Sherman Hinkebein of Louisville went about the campus in search of talent among the student body. Organizing a squad of men who loved to swim was easy, but other obstacles stood in their way.

The first UK swim team was known as the "dry land swimming team" because UK did not have a pool. And since the University did not recognize swimming as a sport, the group had to purchase their own swimsuits and travel to Eastern State (now Eastern Kentucky University) in Richmond just to practice. Nevertheless, their determination paid off as some of the swimmers borrowed automobiles to travel to practice and meets, while others hitchhiked. Thus, UK's first men's swim team was formed.

Hinkebein, a UK track and football (team captain 1938) star, became coach and captain of the team at its inception. He turned over coaching duties when the UK Athletic Council recognized swimming as a varsity sport, to another student swimmer, Lloyd Ramsey, who lettered two years in basketball under Adolph Rupp. Hinkebein continued to swim for the Wildcats, and it was under Ramsey that the team won its first Kentucky State Intercollegiate Meet.

During its first three years of existence, the

UK swim team had built up an enviable record, never losing a dual or state meet in Kentucky and being defeated only four times by outside competition. The pride of the UK squad was the medley team, undefeated in three years, that was made up of Hinkebein, Ramsey and James "Bud" Scott of Chicago. Two years later, UK would compete in its first SEC Championship Meet and finish seventh.

UK discontinued its swimming program in 1942, but in 1951, one year after the completion of Memorial Coliseum and UK's first swimming pool, the program was reinstated. Alfred M. Reece, a health and physical education instructor, was selected as coach and guided the team to third place in the 1954 SEC Championships. Reece's teams fared well against in-state schools with comparable programs, but were no match for institutions that offered full scholarships. UK offered only two tuition scholarships.

The University realized a renewed interest in swimming in 1964, when it hired Wynn Paul as head coach. Paul, a top-class swimmer at the University of Louisville, was undefeated in the 200 breaststroke and was named the Outstanding Swimmer in Kentucky by The Courier-Journal in 1958 and 1959. Paul introduced water polo to UK in 1964. The water polo program was discontinued in 1982 to make way for the newly created women's varsity swim program.

Ron Huebner, a UK swim letterman who graduated in 1968, succeeded Paul that fall and

produced winning teams during a four-year tenure. Paul returned to the helm of the program in 1973, and it was under his direction that the team won the Kentucky Intercollegiate Swim Championships in 1975 for the second time in UK swim history.

From 1970 to 1983 the UK women's swim team competed only as a club sport. Originally included as one of six sports chosen to become varsity in 1974, the team was nudged out by field hockey because UK's then 20-year-old pool was inadequate and too overcrowded to accommodate the addition of another varsity team.

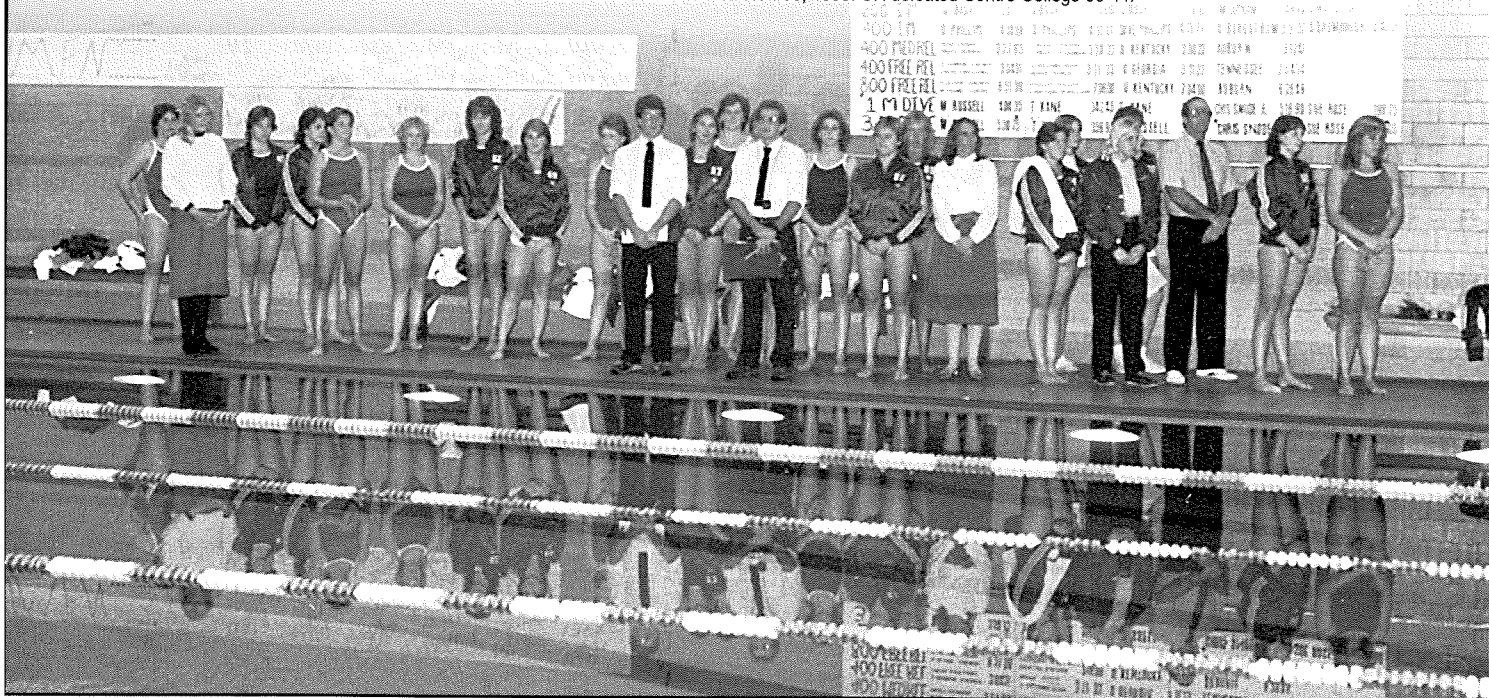
In 1980, the then-volunteer women's swim coach filed a sex discrimination Civil Rights Title IV complaint to the federal government, which led to the ruling that UK needed to sponsor an additional team for women. Thus, the creation of UK's first women's varsity swimming program occurred on July 1, 1983, with Paul named head coach.

The program has continued a strong combination of academics and competitiveness. The swimmers boast a winning record in the classroom, as over 95 percent of the swim Cats have graduated.

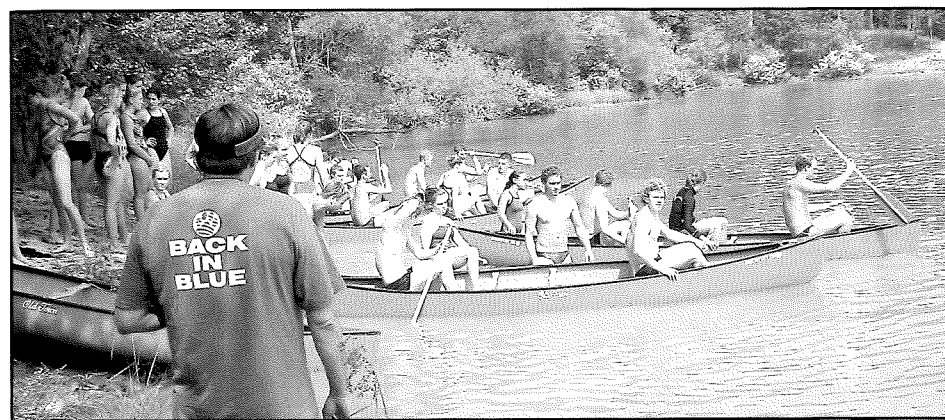
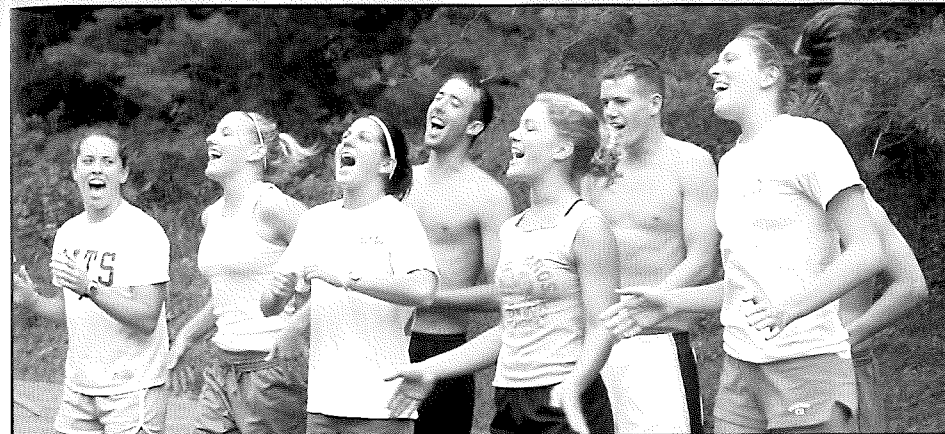
Kentucky's swimming program, now under the guidance of 14th-year coach Gary Conelly, is recognized as a force to be reckoned within the SEC.

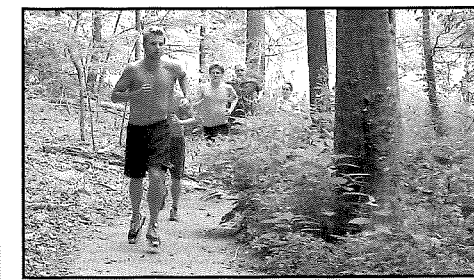
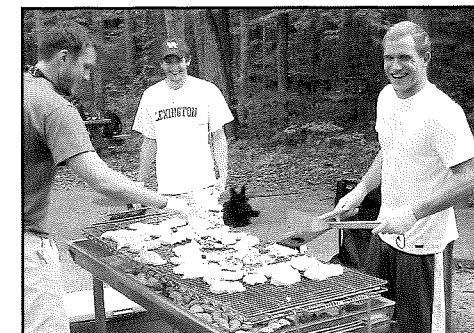
The first women's swim meet at UK was held on Nov. 30, 1983. UK defeated Centre College 86-44.

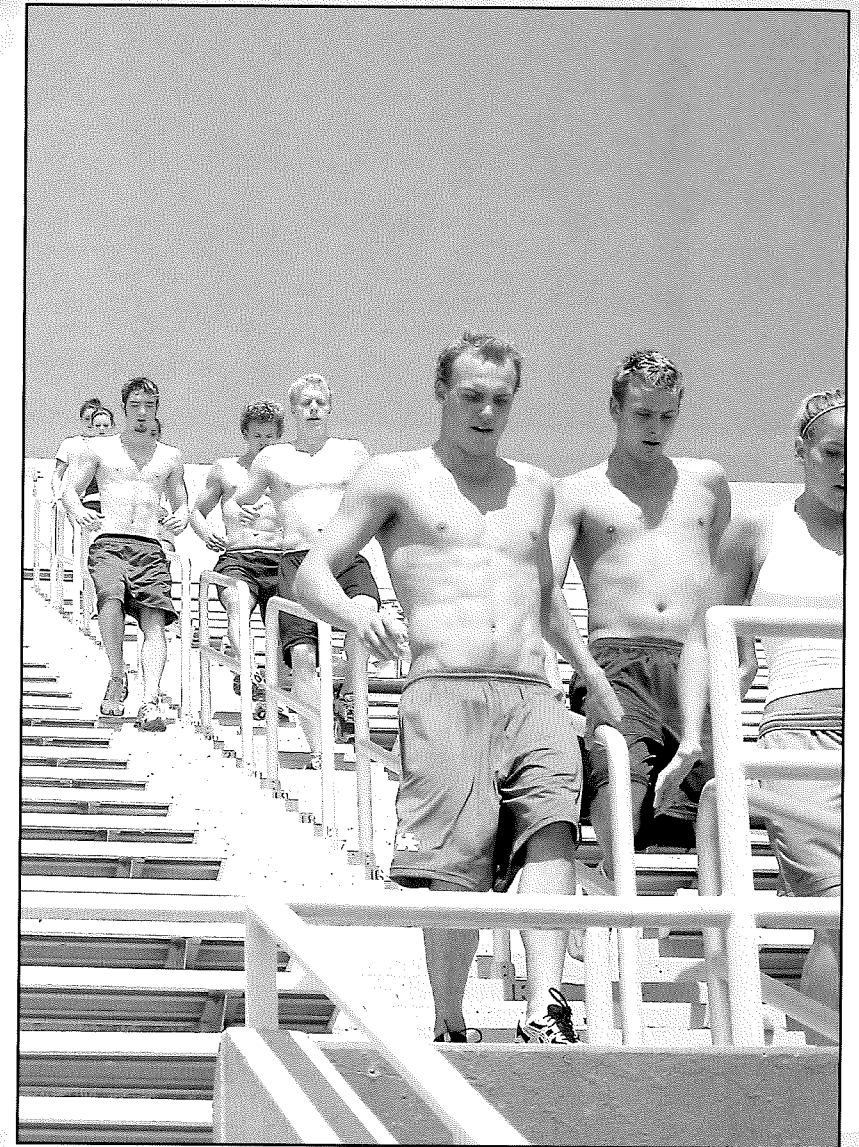
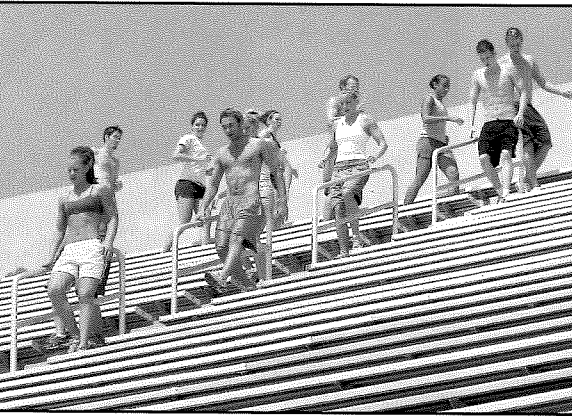

History

Founded in 1865 as a land-grant institution adjacent to downtown Lexington, UK is nestled in the scenic heart of the unique Bluegrass region of Kentucky. From its early beginnings, with only 190 students and 10 professors, UK's campus now covers

more than 687 acres and is home to over 26,000 students and nearly 11,000 employees.

Mission

Since the mid-1990s, UK has pursued an ambitious goal set by the State Legislature to become a top-20 public research university by 2020. UK President Lee T. Todd Jr. has embraced this goal in a way that promises an impact on every Kentuckian resident.

"As the state's flagship institution, the university is mindful of its responsibility to help all Kentuckians," Todd says. "Our land-grant mission calls on us to make a positive impact across the state. We need to be an educational leader, while remaining accessible to all Kentuckians. We need to be a cultural leader, sharing new ideas and opportunities across the state. And we need to be leading Kentucky's charge into the new economy. We are the catalyst for a new Commonwealth."

Students

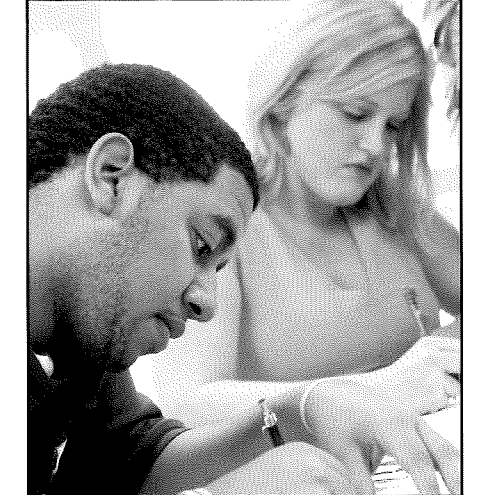
UK's diverse student population represents 117 countries, every state in the nation, and every Kentucky county. The average ACT score for its first-year students is four points above the national average. UK students compete successfully for the most prestigious scholarships and awards, such as the Fulbright, Truman, Goldwater and Marshall. UK was selected as one of only 13 universities nationwide to participate in the Beckman Foundation Scholarship program in 2002 and the grant was renewed in 2005. This prominent program allows UK to award grants of \$17,600 to students to support their own research

projects. UK had its 12th Truman Scholar named this past year.

Outreach

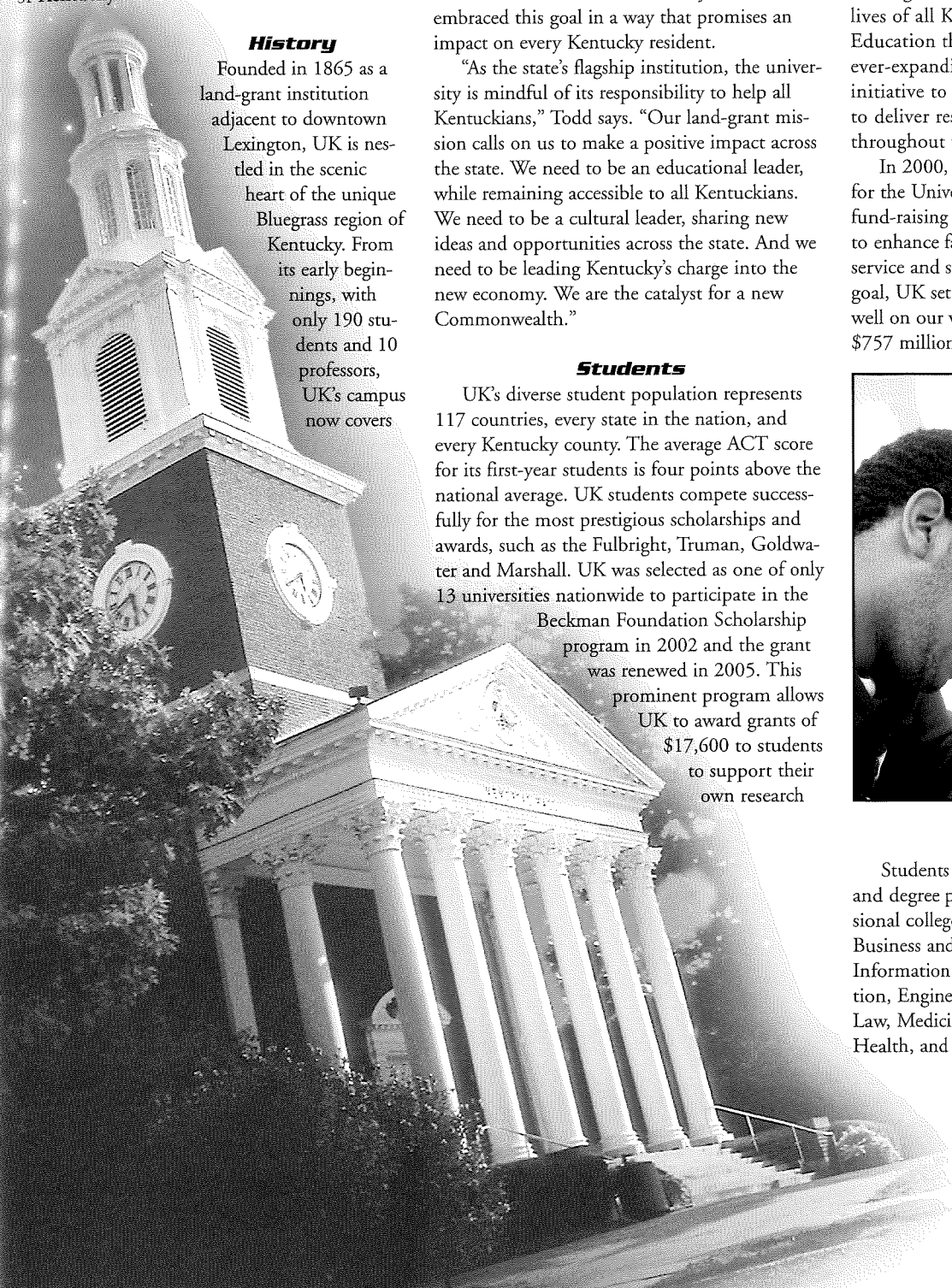
The university is committed to strong public service, reaching out to communities across the Commonwealth, sharing knowledge and making a difference in the towns, cities and lives of all Kentuckians. An example is Health Education through Extension Leadership, an ever-expanding Cooperative Extension Service initiative to enhance extension agents' capacity to deliver research conducted on campus throughout the state.

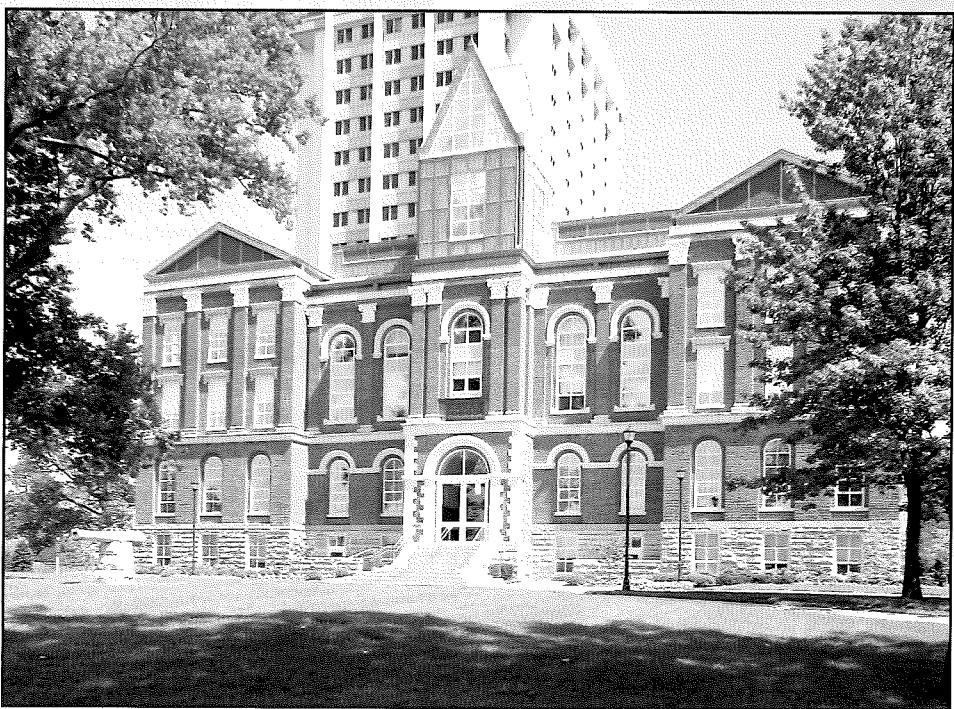
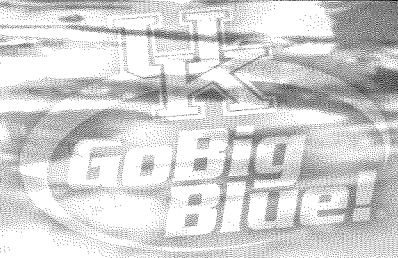
In 2000, officials launched The Campaign for the University of Kentucky, a \$600 million fund-raising effort – the largest in state history – to enhance facilities, academic programs, public service and scholarships. After soaring past that goal, UK set a new mark of \$1 billion. UK is well on our way, having brought in more than \$757 million.



Programs

Students can choose from some 200 majors and degree programs in 16 academic and professional colleges: Agriculture, Arts and Sciences, Business and Economics, Communications and Information Studies, Dentistry, Design, Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Health Sciences, Law, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Public Health, and Social Work.





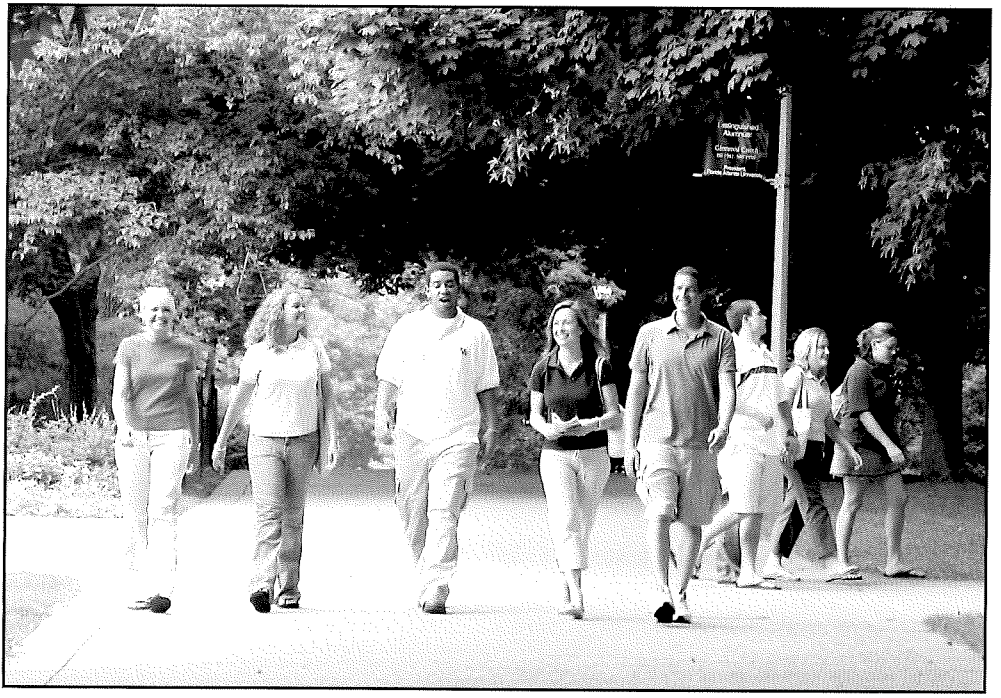
Research

The university is working aggressively to achieve its top-20 research goal. During fiscal year 2004, UK faculty received a record-breaking total of \$238 million in extramural funding for grants and contracts. The achievement marked the third year in a row UK exceeded the \$200 million level in sponsored project awards. In federal expenditures, UK is ranked 28th among all public universities.

Research at UK is a dynamic enterprise encompassing both traditional scholarship and emerging technologies. In April 2005 the university opened the \$74 million Biomedical Biological Sciences Research Building, affectionately known as the BBSRB. The BBSRB – UK's largest research facility – features an "open-format" design that encourages collaborative research across disciplines.

Medical Center

The UK Chandler Medical Center, opened in 1960, is considered one of the nation's finest academic medical centers. The faculty, students and staff of our young, dynamic Medical Center take pride in achieving excellence in education, patient care, research, and community service. As one of two Level 1 Trauma Centers in Kentucky, UK cares for the most critically injured and ill patients in the region. The 473-bed UK Hospital and UK Children's Hospital are supported by more than 500 faculty physicians and dentists, 400 resident physicians, and a staff of 3,200 health professionals committed to high-quality patient care.



Library

With its well-manicured landscape and landmark buildings, UK's campus offers great facilities that advance the scholarship of its students and the research endeavors of its faculty. The William T. Young Library is among the world's leading research libraries; its book endowment is the largest among public universities and ranks second only to Harvard University among all universities. Its broad scope of technology offers students, faculty and Ken-

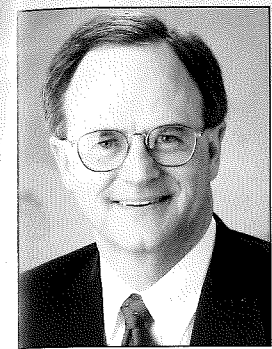

DR. LEE T. TODD JR., PRESIDENT



Lee T. Todd Jr. became the 11th president of the University of Kentucky on July 1, 2001.

A native of Earlington, Ky. and a graduate of UK and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, President Todd is the

fourth UK alumnus to hold the presidency and the first to earn an undergraduate degree from UK. He is a former UK engineering professor; a successful businessman who launched two worldwide technology companies, both based in Kentucky; and a public advocate for research, technology and an entrepreneurial economy in the Commonwealth.

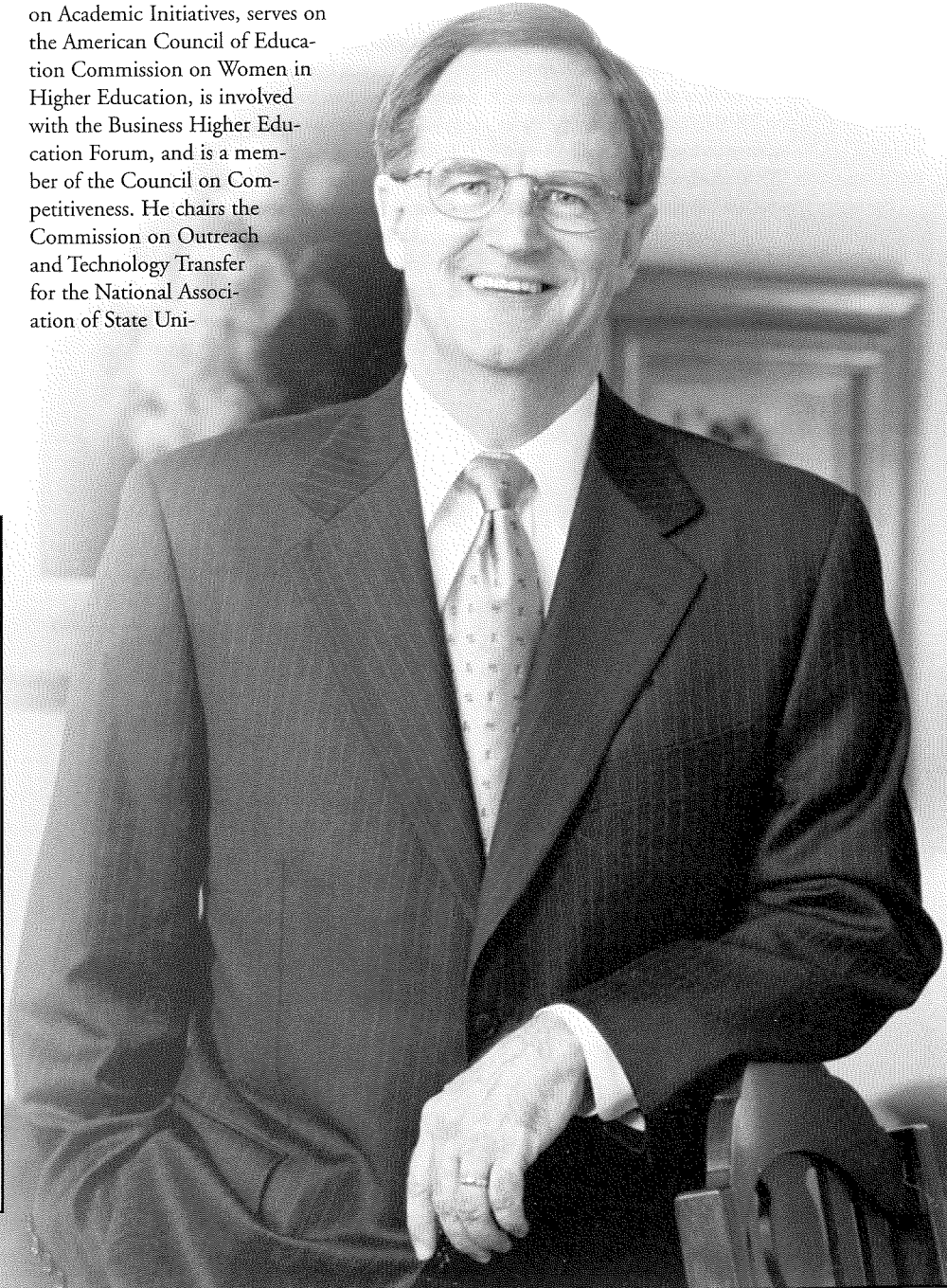
President Todd is noted as an outstanding leader who emphasizes students, strategic planning, and accountability. In July 2003, he developed, and the UK Board of Trustees approved, the University of Kentucky's three-year strategic plan, "The Dream & the Challenge," designed to focus the efforts of administrators, faculty and staff on meeting student needs while advancing

UK's mission to become a top-20 public university by 2020. The plan's success in improving the quality of life across the state of Kentucky relies on the active participation of all university units. The plan lays out six goals: Reach for National Prominence; Attract and Graduate Outstanding Students; Attract, Develop and Retain a Distinguished Faculty; Discover, Share and Apply Knowledge; Nurture Diversity of Thought, Gender and Ethnicity; and Elevate the Quality of Life for Kentuckians.

President Todd currently chairs the Southeastern Conference Committee on Academic Initiatives, serves on the American Council of Education Commission on Women in Higher Education, is involved with the Business Higher Education Forum, and is a member of the Council on Competitiveness. He chairs the Commission on Outreach and Technology Transfer for the National Association of State Uni-

versities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASULGC), and is also a member of the Science and Mathematics Education Task Force, a national committee that reports to the Secretary of Energy.

Dr. Todd is married to the former Patricia Brantley, a UK graduate who earned her master's degree from Simmons College in Boston. They have two grown children, Troy and Kathryn, both graduates of UK.

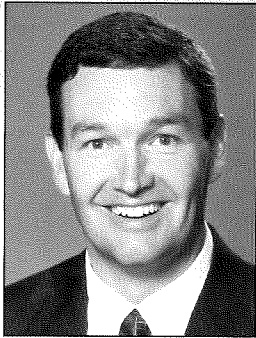

resulted in record K Fund dollars, and a 10-year, \$10-million commitment to help fund the University's general scholarship program. UK has also received approval for a \$30 million expansion of Memorial Coliseum that includes new practice and office space for a variety of sports.

Barnhart's success is based on a five-principle philosophy that he implemented for the University of Kentucky Athletics the day he was hired:

- Operate in a first-class manner
- Possess great integrity
- Keep the focus on the student-athletes
- Provide sound fiscal management
- Compete for championships in all sports

Barnhart's connection to UK's student-athlete is evident by his personal interaction and commitment to provide all support services necessary to meet the needs of these students.

Barnhart came to Kentucky from Oregon State, where he served four years (1998-2002) as athletics director. A strong effort in fiscal management helped reduce the Beavers' operating debt from \$12.5 million to \$4.8 million during his tenure. He also raised \$20 million in capital contributions for new baseball and softball stadiums, an indoor practice center and a basketball arena renovation. Before his tenure at OSU, he worked at Tennessee for 12 years (1986-98), the last four as Senior Associate Athletics Director. Prior to UT, Barnhart served as assistant executive director of the Mustang Club at Southern Methodist University from 1983 to 1986; regional director for the Duck Athletic Fund at University of Oregon in 1983; and was an intern for the Aztec Athletic Foundation at San Diego

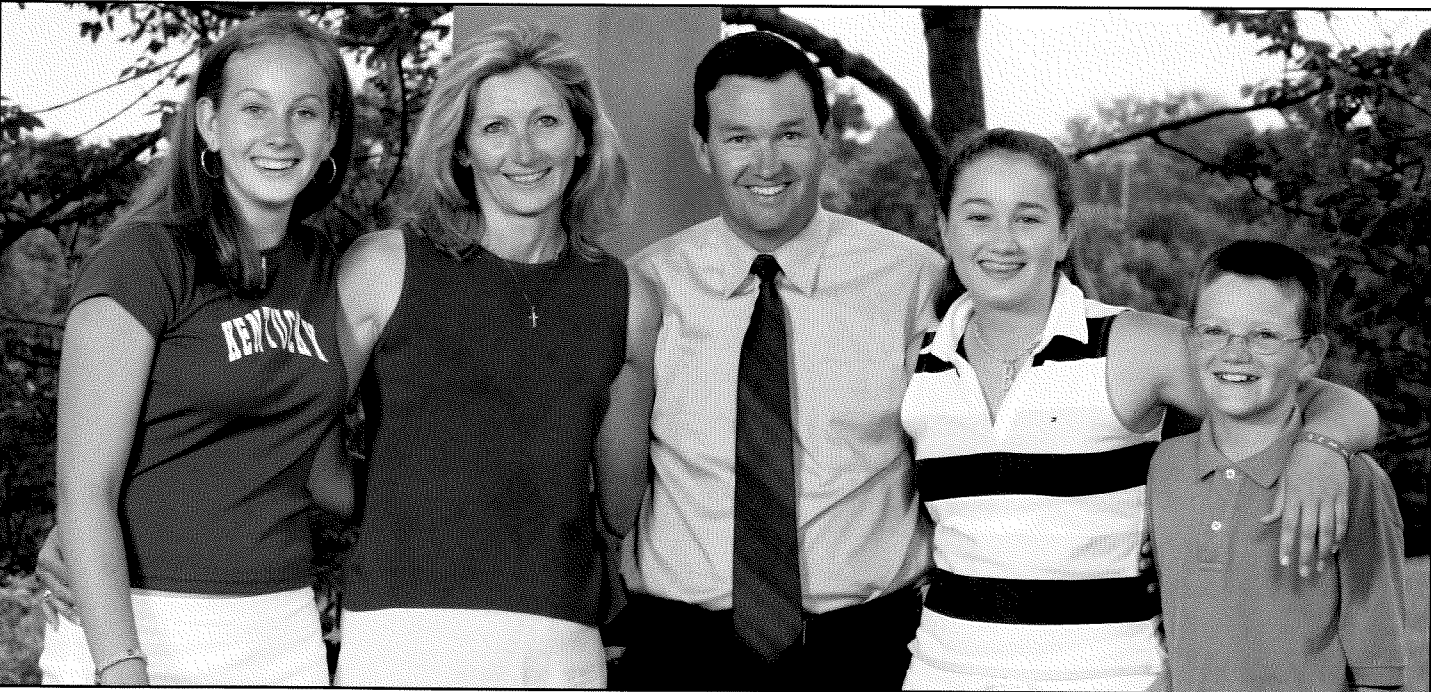

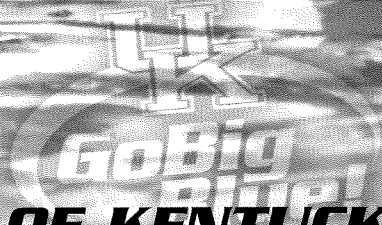
Hired July 15, 2002, Barnhart has made the desire for overall excellence the cornerstone of Wildcat Athletics. His decision to fully fund all 22 varsity sports helped produce a school-record four conference championships during the 2004-05 school year, while also allowing UK to achieve its highest NACDA Directors' Cup finish (35th) in seven years.

Barnhart instructed his staff to seek out new revenue streams, and that resulted in a record \$80 million multimedia rights agreement with Host Communications. The additional resources allow UK to continue its commitment to its student-athletes, a commitment Barnhart takes personally. Athletics spends \$1.5 million annually on its nationally-renowned CATS Academic Center and each spring hosts the CATSPYs, an awards program designed to recognize the very best in UK Athletics.

Other initiatives begun under Barnhart's leadership include the Big Blue Caravan, which connects UK to its vast fan base each spring, a revamping of UK's donor program that has

University of Kentucky Athletics continues to take its place itself among the nation's finest in terms of competitive success and classroom excellence.

The department-wide goal of maintaining a first-class program that features integrity and sound fiscal management has been embraced by all parts of campus. Focusing on the well-being of all student-athletes ensures quality education and opportunities for athletic success in all sports. It is an impressive agenda for a collegiate sports program rich in history and tradition.

While the UK athletics department was incorporated in 1945, organized sports can be traced as far back as 1889, when a mongrelized form of football-rugby was played on a campus field. The first game with a college opponent (an 8-2 victory over Georgetown College) took place on April 10, 1891. Three years later, with football players comprising most of the squad, UK instituted a varsity track program. Many of those same athletes helped start a baseball program in 1896.

Throughout the years, UK's student-athletes have captured much glory on the fields of competition. Its

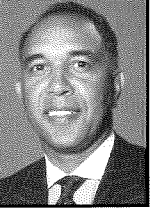
men's basketball program is generally regarded as the best in all of college sports. But UK athletes have excelled in other ways as well. In the last 11 years alone, seven of UKAA's top student-athletes have received post-graduate scholarships, 54 were named to an academic All-American team and 85 percent of those that completed their eligibility have graduated.

Since its first game was played 123 years ago, UK athletics now operates on a \$50 million budget and is one of 51 Division I departments that operate with a profit. It functions without state tax dollars or monies from UK's general fund. In fact, the athletics department has been profitable enough to make contributions to UK's general fund while establishing several scholarship funds in the names of past University presidents that enable UK's brightest undergraduates to attend graduate school at UK.

Now, with a renewed vision of giving every student-athlete the opportunity to compete for a national championship during their UK careers, optimism is high that University of Kentucky athletics will move to higher levels of achievement in the years to come.

In order to adhere to a level of integrity that we are constantly striving to maintain at the University of Kentucky, we have put into practice several new procedures that will help us in

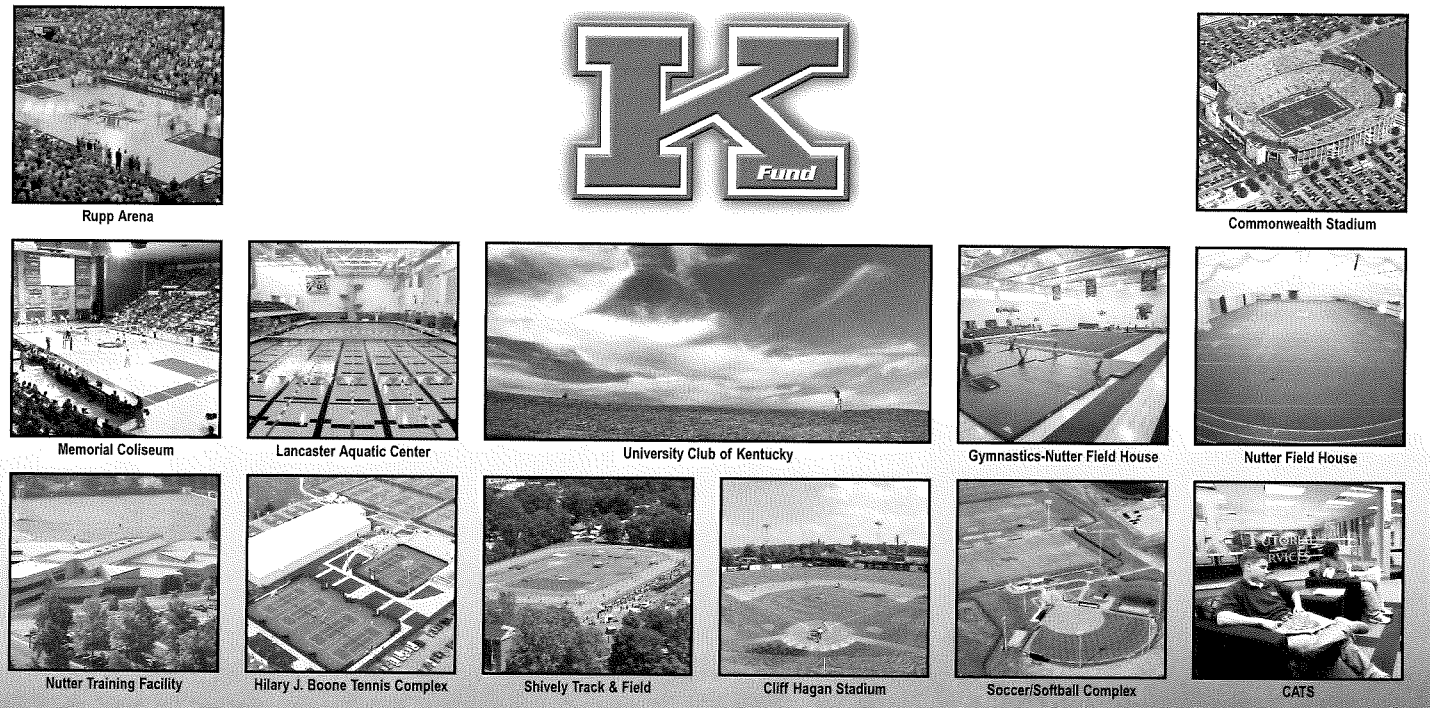
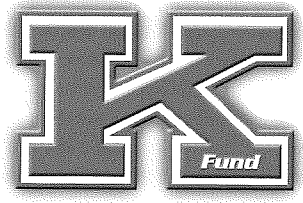
our quest to be the best in the nation. It is imperative that we stay competitive with other schools in the SEC and in the NCAA in terms of both athletics and fund-raising.

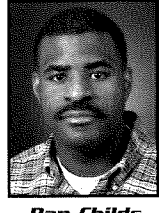

The University of Kentucky has made a commitment to putting the student-athlete at the heart of its athletics program.

That commitment is evident in the support provided to UK student-athletes by the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic & Tutorial Services (CATS). The University of Kentucky opened the nation's first academic center for student-athletes in 1981.

Over the years, the services offered by CATS have grown, and so has the need for additional space. The UKAA has responded by constructing a new CATS area, which opened in January 1998. The new facility is called the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, thanks to a one-million-dollar grant from the Ohio Casualty Insurance Group.

The new CATS, constructed in Memorial Coliseum, includes:

- 20,000 square feet of space - more than double the size of the former CATS facility
- a computer room housing 35 computers
- a study area which accommodates 90-100 people
- 24 tutoring rooms
- a career development and life skills resource center
- a community outreach office
- offices for the staff

Certainly, a facility is a good start, but any program - especially in academics - is only as good as the people who run it. And UK is fortunate to have outstanding leaders in its academics support system.

Bob Bradley, Associate Athletics Director for Student Services, oversees the CATS program. Bradley was named National Academic Advisor of the Year in 1989 and 1992. In 2000 he was selected as the CHAMPS Life Skills Coordinator of the Year by the NCAA Division I-A Athletic Directors Association.

CATS has a full-time staff of 11. In addition to Bradley, they are:

- **Barb Deniston**, Director of Academic Services;
- **Mike Haley**, Director of Advising Services;
- **Amy Craiglow**, **Dan Childs**, **Katrina Sally**, **Jonathan Ross** and **Michael Stone** Academic



The CATS computer center houses 35 state-of-the-art computers. Tutors are on hand to assist the student-athletes daily.

- Counselors;
- **Martina Martin**, Lifeskills Coordinator;
- **D'Ann Blankenship** and **Holly McIntosh**, Staff Assistants.

CATS also employs seven graduate assistants and numerous tutors, both from the University and the surrounding community. UK has budgeted more than \$1,000,000 for the operation of CATS in the coming year.

"We are extremely proud of what we have accomplished in the academic arena," Bradley says. "The CATS program is focused on winning in the classroom. We look at each student-athlete's individual needs, set goals, and develop strategies to attain those goals. Our center provides our student-athletes with a definite advantage over student-athletes at many other institutions. Our goal is to show that we care about the student as well as the athlete."

For the CATS staff, showing you care means more than helping athletes maintain eligibility, graduate, or win awards. The academics staff also prepares student-athletes for life after college with the Wildcat Career Development Program.

The Career Development Program helps student-athletes look to the future through a step-by-step process which includes:

- Mentoring and internships, which help determine career interests;
- career counseling;
- resume writing; and
- forming a career plan.

The Wildcat Career Development Program works closely with the University's Career Planning and Placement Center in order to provide additional assistance when needed.

THE WILLIAM T. YOUNG LIBRARY



In addition to providing the finest in athletic facilities, the University of Kentucky also provides student-athletes with the best in academic facilities. One of the most recent additions to the educational landscape at UK is the \$58 million William T. Young Library.

• **Size:** The library covers 365,350 square feet - more than six football fields. The building is five stories high, plus a basement.

• **Shelf capacity:** If laid end-to-end, the bookshelf space would stretch 198,828 linear feet - that's more than 37 miles of shelf space. The shelves will house 1.2 million books.

• **Seating capacity:** The library can seat more than 4,000 patrons at one time, a 355 percent increase over the old library. The seating on the fifth floor of the new library equals the capacity of the former library.

• **Computer connections:** Every study table and study carrel in the library has an electrical outlet and a computer jack connected to the university's computer system. Virtually the entire library has wireless coverage.

• **Flexibility:** The library has a state-of-the-art electronic infrastructure that will enable UK to take full advantage of current and emerging technology. In addition, the five floors and basement of the structure are designed as open, flexible spaces, enabling the library to adapt its services and facilities to the future changes in needs of UK students.

• **Endowment:** The UK Library has the nation's largest book endowment among public universities and ranks second only to Harvard.

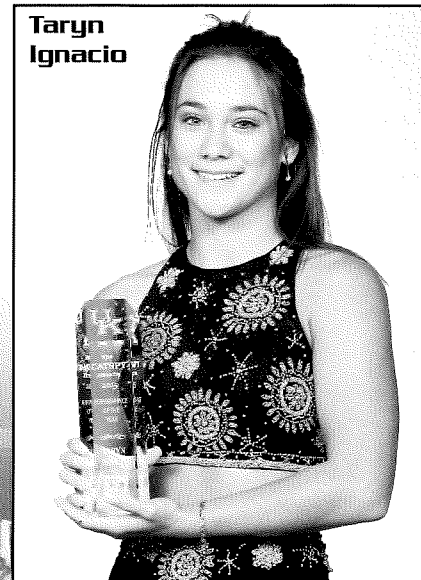

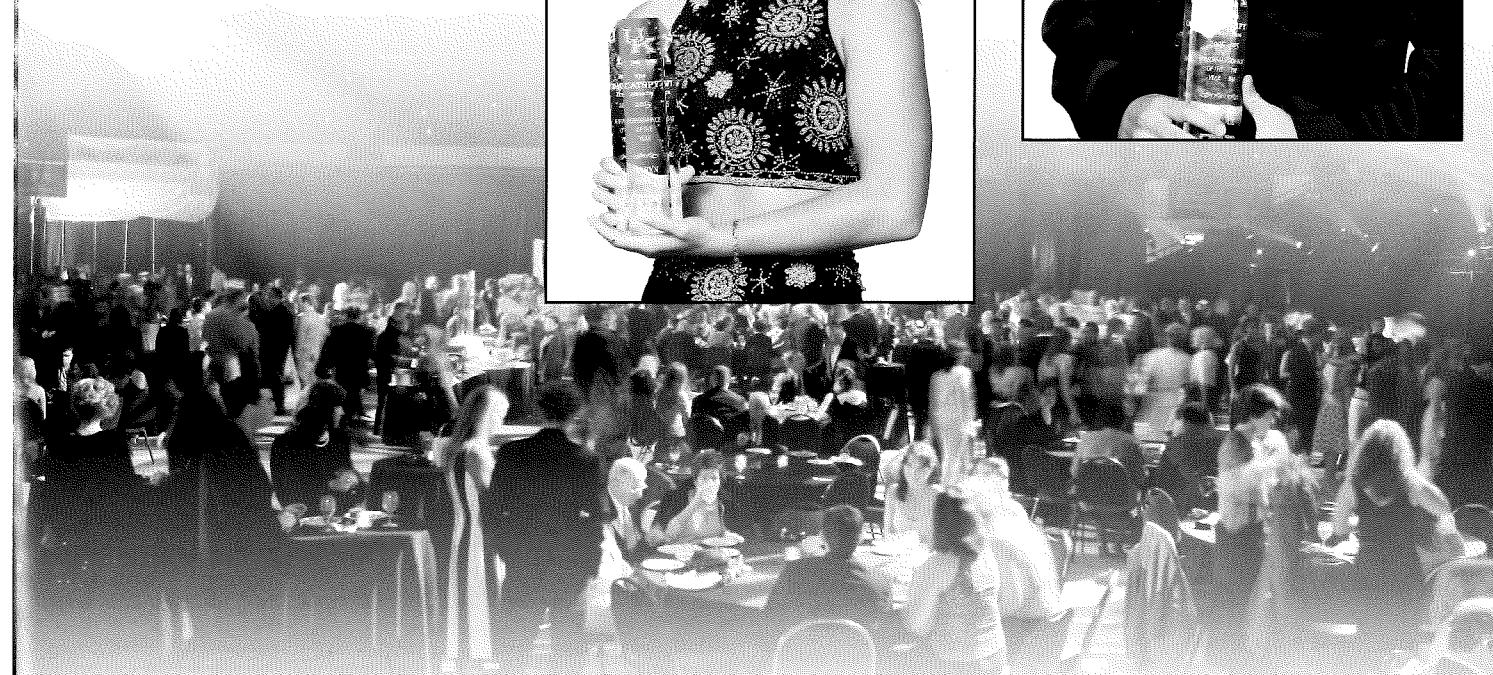
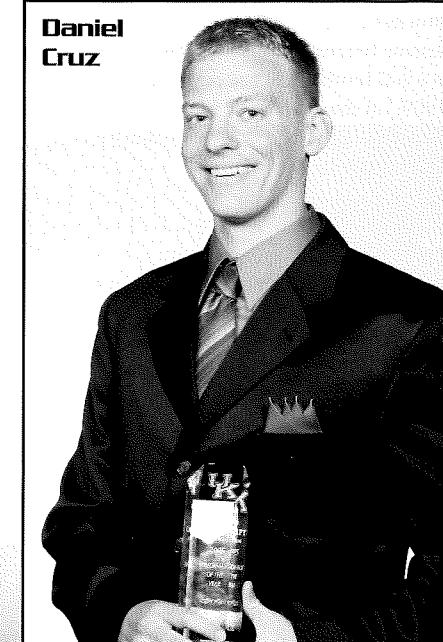

Blue & White

The University of Kentucky adopted blue and white as its official colors in 1892.

Originally, however, UK students had decided on blue and light yellow prior to the Kentucky-Centre College football game on December 19, 1891.

The shade of blue, which is close to a royal blue, was chosen when a student asked the question, "What color blue?"

At the time, Richard C. Stoll (who lettered in football at UK in 1889-94) pulled off his necktie and held it up. The students then adopted that particular shade of blue.

A year later, UK students officially dropped the light yellow color for white.

Wildcats Nickname

The official nickname for the University of Kentucky's athletics teams is "Wildcats." The nickname became synonymous with UK shortly after a 6-2 football victory over Illinois on Oct. 9, 1909, on the road.

Commandant Carbusier, then head of the military department at old State University (UK), told a group of students in a chapel service following the game that the Kentucky football team had "fought like Wildcats."

Later the name Wildcats became more and more popular among UK followers as well as with members of the media. As a result, the nickname was adopted by the University.

Live Mascot

In 2002, the University, in cooperation with the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife, adopted a three-year-old male bobcat to serve as the Wildcats' "official" mascot.

The wildcat has a permanent residence on display at a game farm just west of the state capitol in Frankfort, Ky. The UK Athletics Association sponsored a name-the-wildcat

Internet contest and the final three possibilities were Tucky, Blue and Champ, with Blue earning the final nod after nearly 50,000 votes were cast.

Through the years, UK has had other official live mascots with colorful names. Records indicate that the first wild animal was given to the University in 1921. Named "Tom," this live Kentucky wildcat died quickly from captivity and was replaced by "TNT." Other live mascots followed, including "Whiskers," "Hot Tamale" and "Colonel," only to pass on due to old age or being turned loose in the mountains after they failed to thrive in captivity.

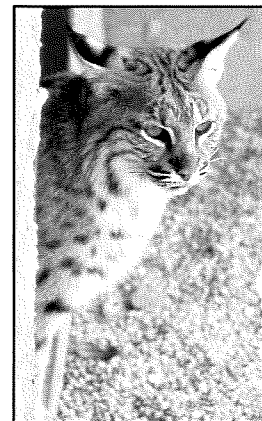
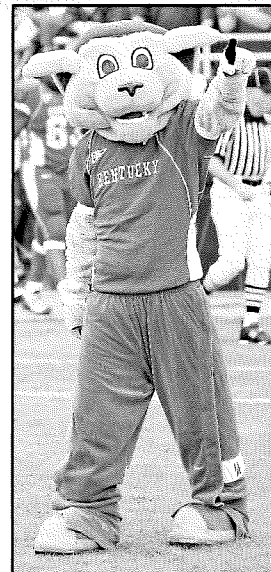

Wildcat Mascot

The Wildcat mascot originated during the 1976-77 academic year at UK. Gary Tanner was the original Wildcat dancing and entertaining thousands of UK fans at Commonwealth Stadium and Rupp Arena during athletic events.

A few years later, he was joined by another Cat – walking on stilts – who made his appearance during UK's twin tower era of Melvin Turpin and Sam Bowie. Even today, the original mascot is joined by Scratch, who's a more child-friendly mascot and serves as the host of UK's official Kids Club.

Today, both mascots attend each football and basketball game, several academic functions and generally serve as friendly ambassadors for the University.
