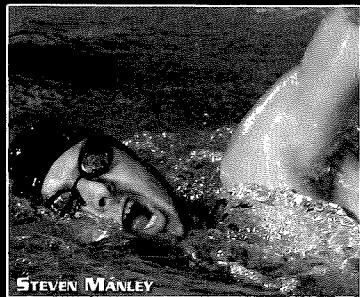


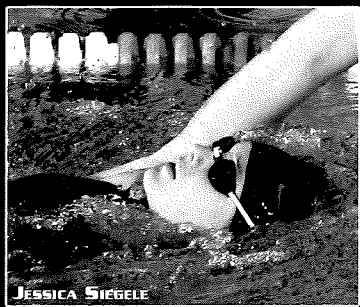

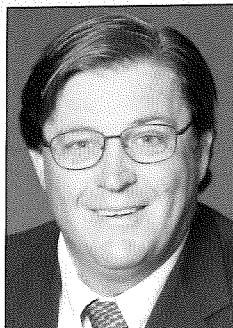
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HEAD COACH GARY CONELLY



The 2004-05 season marks the 14th campaign for Gary Conelly as the University of Kentucky head swimming coach. The women's squads have compiled an 80-51 record since Conelly began coaching that squad in 1991-92.

The men, whom he started coaching in 1992-93, have put together a record of 59-61, bringing his overall coaching record to 139-109.

Conelly's 2003-04 men's squad sent the largest men's contingent in school history to the NCAA Championships, with eight different Wildcats heading to East Meadow, N.Y. The UK men placed 15th, marking the best finish in the history of the program. His UK women's squad sent three student-athletes to the NCAA Championships and moved up three spots to sixth place at the SEC Championships.

In 2002-03, Conelly led the men's team to its second-highest finish ever in the NCAA championships, a 17th-place showing. Conelly's 2001-02 men's team placed 16th at NAAs, its highest-ever finish at the time. At the Southeastern Conference Championships, the men had the second-highest point total in school history (282), finishing in sixth-place. Competing at the NAAs for the men were juniors Clayton Moss, Roger Watkins and sophomore Joey Faltraco. Faltraco's 11th-place finish in the 200-yard backstroke earned him honorable mention All-America honors, the first UK athlete to earn the honor in the event, while Moss was an All-American on the one- and three-meter springboards and the platform. The women also competed at the national championships, continuing a string of 10 straight appearances.

During the 2000-01 year, Conelly led the men's team to a NCAA 17th-place finish. UK also achieved its highest SEC finish in 18 years, placing fifth. Five individuals from the men's team competed at the NAAs, seniors Dave Tweedie, Macon White, Aaron Workman and Shaun Zitani and sophomore Roger Watkins, all five of

them earning All-America honorable mention. Conelly also coached the women to the NAAs, where they placed 39th. Seniors Melissa Olson and Jaime Siegele competed at the championships, with Siegele earning All-America honorable mention in the 50 freestyle.

During the 1999-2000 season, Conelly led the men's team to a top-20 finish and had two men qualify for the NCAA championships, both earning honorable mention All-America honors. Four women qualified for the NCAA Championships. The women comprised the 800 freestyle relay that finished 12th and earned the women honorable mention All-America honors in addition to competing individually. Following

the season, nine Wildcats participated in the 2000 Olympic trials.

In 1998-99, Conelly led both the men's and women's teams to top-25 finishes at the NCAA Championships. The men finished at No. 24, while the women finished 21st, their fifth consecutive top-25 showing. The women's squad had 10 athletes advance to the NCAA meet, the most in school history. Senior diver Paco Rivera finished second in platform diving, becoming the top NCAA finisher in school history.

Conelly led the 1996-97 men's team to a 26th-place NCAA finish and Nat Lewis finished third in the 1,650 freestyle and still ranks as the second-highest NCAA finisher in school history. The women finished in 24th place and had three team members earn All-America honors.

In the 1995-96 season, Conelly led the women's team to a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships, the highest finish in school history. In 1994-95, Conelly led the women's team

to a fourth-place finish at the SEC Championships and a second straight 19th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Conelly was named 1995 SEC Women's Coach of the Year for his efforts.

In Conelly's 13 years with UK, the swimming and diving programs have made great strides. In 1990, Conelly coached the team's first female All-American and NCAA finalist, Kellie Moran. Since then, 26 more Wildcat swimmers



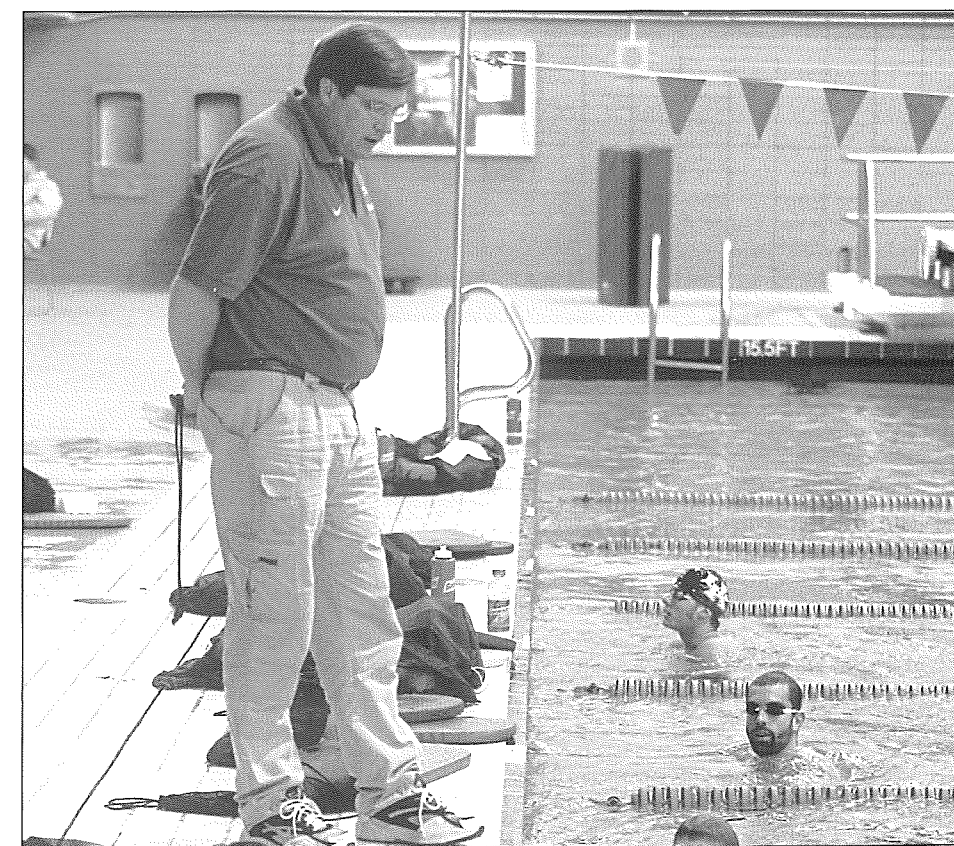
have garnered All-America accolades under Conelly's tutelage.

Prior to becoming head coach at Kentucky, Conelly spent three years with UK as a graduate assistant coach.

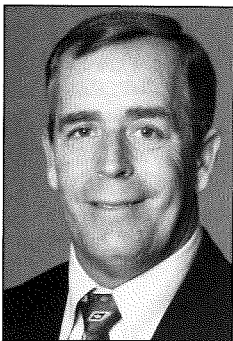
Conelly came to the University of Kentucky from the West Florida Lightning Aquatics USS team in Largo, Fla. During his seven years at West Florida, Conelly directed 150 swimmers and produced three Olympic Trial qualifiers, two National Sports Festival team members, and one Sports Festival champion in the 100 backstroke.

As a swimmer, Conelly was a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team and he participated on the world record-setting 400-meter freestyle relay team. An Indiana University alumnus, Conelly was a 15-time NCAA All-American and is a member of the Indiana Swimming Hall of Fame. In 1973, Indiana honored him with the Balfour Award for excellence in swimming, leadership, and scholarship.

Conelly is married to Kathleen Healey and has two children, Cody and Emily.



DIVING COACH MICHAEL LYDEN



The 2003 Southeastern Conference Men's Diving Coach of the Year, Michael Lyden begins his 12th season as diving coach at the University of Kentucky. Since joining UK in 1993, Lyden has led the Wildcats to diving

prominence, as 10 Wildcats have earned 44 All-America selections. Lyden coached Kentucky's first All-American, Tina Johnson, who earned All-America platform honors in 1994, and the Cats' first single-season three-time All-American, Clayton Moss, in 2002 and 2003.

The past four seasons have been productive for Lyden and his divers. The aforementioned Moss placed fourth on the three-meter at the 2004 U.S. Olympic trials, while another former Cat, Aaron Kirkpatrick, took ninth place. Sophomore Kari Retrum took 17th on the platform, and junior Jessica Thompson placed 18th on the three-meter.

Under Lyden's direction, Retrum became the first Kentucky freshman to claim an SEC diving title when she captured the platform event at the 2004 SEC Championships. Moss ended his brilliant Wildcat career in 2003 with a runner-up finish on the three-meter and third and fourth-place finishes on the one-meter and platform, respectively, at the NCAA championships. During the 2001-02 season, Lyden helped Moss successfully defend his SEC one-meter title, the first UK diver to win consecutive titles in an event at the conference championships, and become an All-American on all three boards, as Moss placed second on the one-meter, fifth on the three-meter and sixth on the platform. For all of his accomplishments, Moss was named the SEC Male Diver of the Year, also a first for UK.

Lyden also aided in the collegiate success of 2002 senior Aaron Kirkpatrick, who won silver on both the one- and three-meter springboards and placed seventh on the platform at the conference championships.

His run of success with the duo also included the 2000-01 season when Moss became the third UK man to be an SEC Champion, winning the one-meter, and followed it up with a fourth-place finish on the three-meter and a 10th-place finish on the platform, earning All-American honors on both. Kirkpatrick also had a successful season under Lyden's tutelage. The junior garnered honorable mention All-America

status with a 12th-place finish on the three-meter springboard at the NCAA championships.

Since joining the Wildcats, Lyden has transformed Kentucky into one of the nation's most prominent diving programs. At the 1994 NCAA Championships, Tina Johnson became UK's first diving All-American on the platform, placing eighth, and Jenny Baker earned honorable mention All-American in two events. In 1995, both divers earned All-America status, with Baker finishing eighth on the one-meter and Johnson finishing second on the platform. He had a third diver, Beth Leake, qualify for the meet, but Leake tore her medial

collateral ligament in a training session prior to the competition.

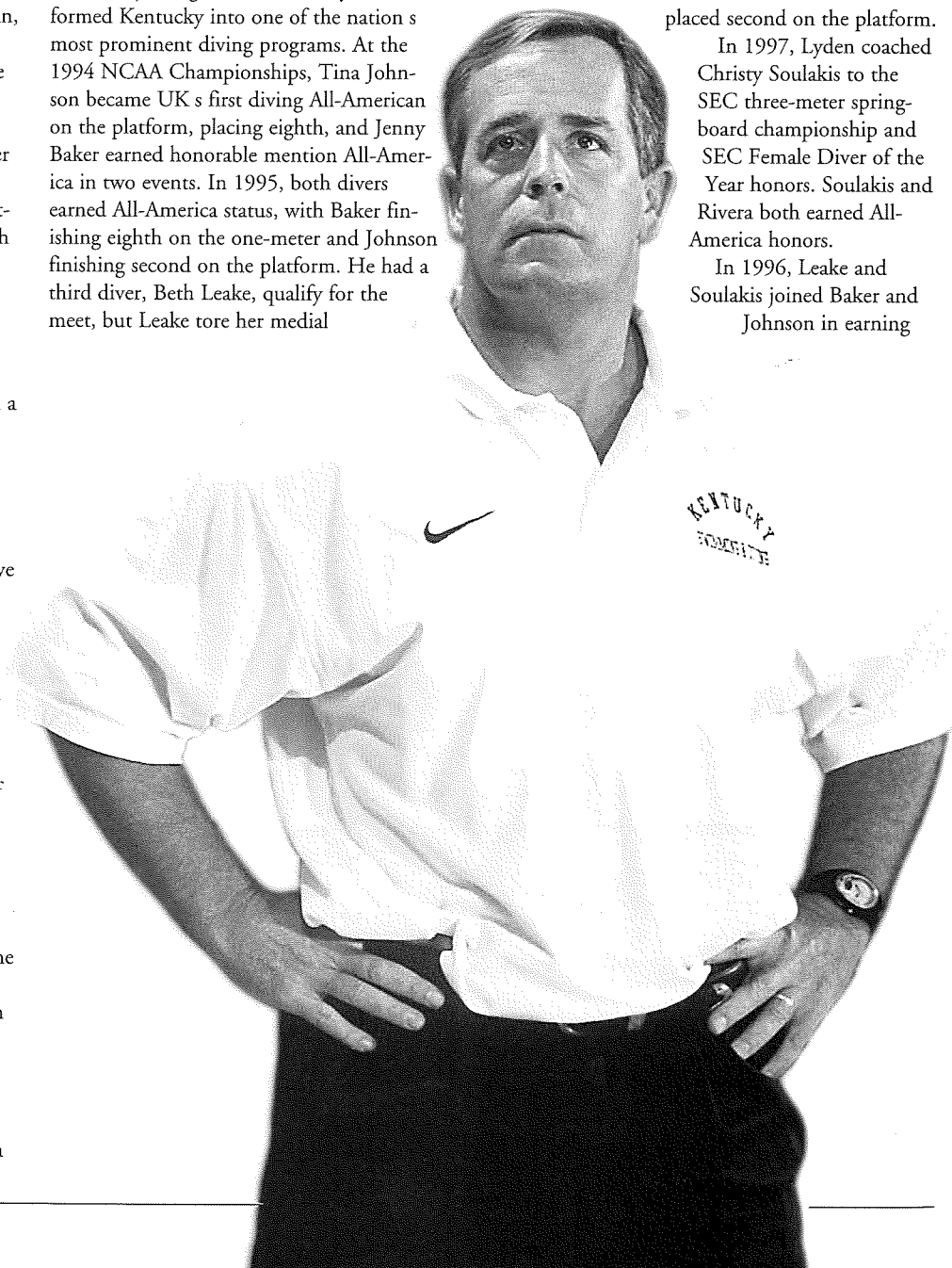
During the 1999-2000 season, Lyden had junior Carrie Knoeber and freshman Moss qualify for the NCAA Championship meet. Knoeber earned honorable mention All-American honors on the three-meter while Moss earned All-American honors on the one-meter, three-meter, and platform. Moss' honors were the first for a freshman in UK history.

In 1998, Paco Rivera became the first male UK diver to claim a Southeastern Conference title, winning the platform event and garnering All-SEC honors. Rivera advanced to the NCAA Championships, where he was named as an All-American in three events and

placed second on the platform.

In 1997, Lyden coached Christy Soulakis to the SEC three-meter springboard championship and SEC Female Diver of the Year honors. Soulakis and Rivera both earned All-America honors.

In 1996, Leake and Soulakis joined Baker and Johnson in earning



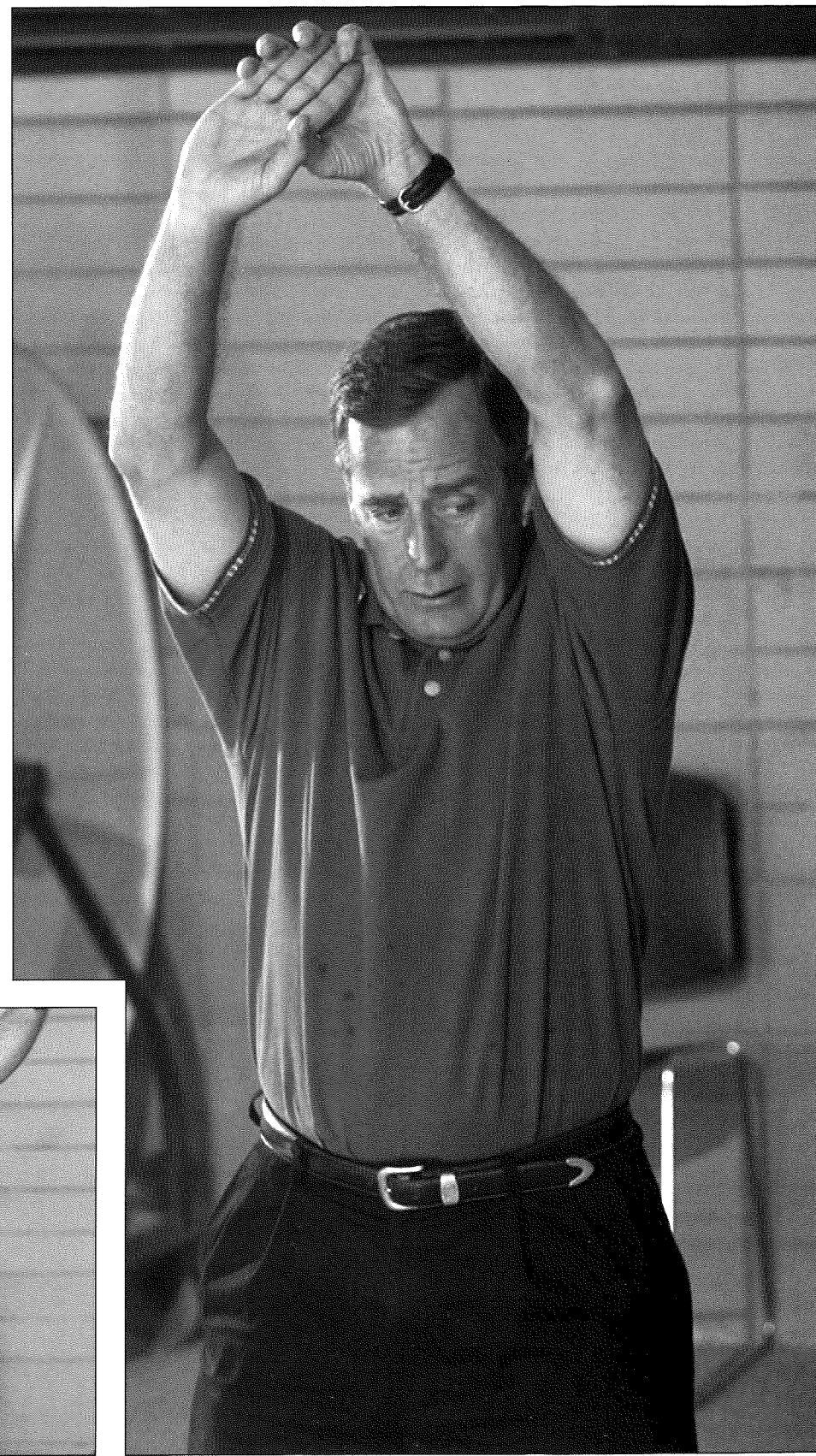
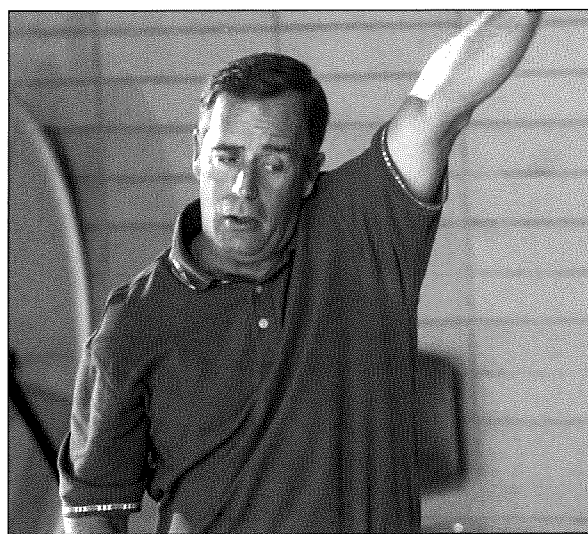
All-America honors. Leake finished second on the one-meter and fourth on the three-meter, Johnson finished third on the one-meter and platform, and Baker finished seventh on the platform. For his divers' accomplishments, Lyden was honored as the Southeastern Conference and NCAA Women's Diving Coach of the Year.

Before arriving at UK, Lyden had spent nine seasons at Eastern Michigan where he was the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year nine times. He then moved to LSU where he received SEC Women's Coach of the Year four times consecutively and was the 1992 SEC Men's Coach of the Year. During Lyden's tenure at LSU his divers won 15 of 24 possible SEC titles.

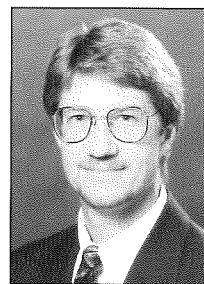
Along with his college coaching, Lyden has also coached U.S. Diving Clubs, has had numerous All-Americans and has coached six age group divers to 17 national championships. He was chosen to coach at the Junior World Diving Championships in the summer of 2002 held in Aachen, Germany. At that event he coached one member to a seventh-place finish in the 1-meter and 3-meter boards. Lyden has served as the National Team Coach in 1988-90, 1992, 1994-96, 1998-2000 and has directed divers in competitions in Italy, Austria, Mexico, Canada, Spain, China, France, and Holland.

In addition to coaching, Lyden has been a member of the U.S. Diving Rules Committee, the U.S. Olympic International Diving Committee and is a lifetime member of U.S. Diving. In 1993-94 and 1997-99, Lyden served on the NCAA Rules Committee.

A 1980 graduate of Western Michigan University, Lyden is married to Emily Joan Sullivan of Toledo, Ohio. They have three children — Jessica Ann, John Tyler (Jack) and Brittany Barbara.



ASSISTANT COACHES



PETE KNOX
Assistant Coach

Pete Knox enters his 13th year as assistant coach after serving four years as UK's graduate assistant. Often described as a vigorous and intense leader, Knox

primarily works as a sprint coach. Among the many Wildcat swimmers he has helped develop are 2004 NCAA qualifiers Daniel Cruz, Daniel Farnham and Tim Patrick. In 1996, he helped develop NCAA qualifiers Rick Barber and Shaun Zitani.

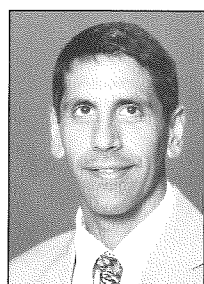
Knox brings his vocal and energetic approach to every practice and has an exceptional ability to motivate his swimmers. With an exercise physiology and research background, Knox specializes in an ongoing weight-training program.

Knox came to Kentucky from Brandon, Fla., where he coached the Brandon High School men's and women's teams from 1980 to 1988. While at Brandon, his teams consistently placed in the top 10 of the Florida High School Championships. Knox also developed two All-America high school swimmers and had several Junior and Senior National qualifiers. An assistant coach with the Brandon Blue Wave USS Team from 1981 to 1988, Knox was selected Hillsborough County Coach of the Year in 1987.

In his tenure at Kentucky, Knox has coached Shaun Zitani to the fastest time in school history in the 50 and 100 freestyle, as well as the school's fastest 100-fly time. He has also coached Roger Watkins to the all-time top position in the record books for the 100- and 200-breaststrokes, while leading Jaime Siegle to the fastest 50-freestyle time.

A native of Norfolk, Va., Knox graduated with honors from the University of Florida in 1978 with a degree in health education and completed his Master's Degree in the spring of 1999. Knox is currently working toward a master's degree in exercise physiology with an emphasis directed toward the application to swimming.

Knox is married to former Wildcat swimming standout Wendy Hipskind.



JOHN BRUCATO
Assistant Coach

John Brucato is in his sixth season with the UK swimming program. Brucato works primarily with the middle distance group and breaststrokers.

Brucato comes to UK via the USS club team Wildcat Aquatics in Lexington. He is in his 12th season with Wildcat Aquatics. Brucato joined WA in the spring of 1990 and has established himself as a leader in the Kentucky swim coaching community.

During his tenure with WA, Brucato has produced numerous Top-16 qualifiers, Junior National qualifiers, Junior National Champions, Senior National qualifiers, and an Olympic Gold Medalist. He is a former Kentucky Swimming Coach of the Year, in addition to being a Select Camp Coach and an Olympic Festival Coach.

In 1992, Brucato coached Megan Kleine to a gold medal in the 1992 Olympic Games as part of the United States' 400-meter medley relay. Kleine, who swam for six years under Brucato at WA, won Senior Nationals twice in the 100-meter breaststroke. Kleine went on to swim at the University of Texas at Austin.

A native of Covington, Ky., Brucato began his coaching career at the Covington YMCA and then spent two years with the Covington Clippers Swim Team. In 1985, he took over the helm at the Nashville Aquatic Club where he spent five successful years as the Head Age Group Coach before being hired on as the WA Senior Head Coach.

Brucato is a 1985 graduate of Northern Kentucky University where he received a degree in psychology. He lives in Lexington with his wife Jan, and their daughter, Katie.



AZURDEE ENGEL-CHRISTENSEN
Assistant Coach

Azurdee Engel-Christensen begins her third season with the University of Kentucky swimming program. She works primarily with the middle distance and distance swimmers. She also serves as the program's recruiting coordinator.

Engel-Christensen, a native of Duluth, Ga., came to Kentucky from the University of Tennessee, where she swam from 1997-2001. She was captain of the UT swim team from '99-'01 and owns the sixth-fastest 200-freestyle time in school history. Engel-Christensen graduated from Tennessee in 2002 with a degree in Art History.

Engel gained coaching experience working at the Stanford University swim camps during the summer of 2002 with Stanford head coach Skip Kenney and coaching the Tennessee Masters swim team in 2001. She worked with several Ironman Triathletes in her time with the Masters swim team, while also working swimming camps at UT.

Engel-Christensen, 25, lives in Lexington with her husband, Robert.

LETITIA HOLLINGSWORTH-GRAY
Aquatic Director

Letitia Hollingsworth-Gray begins her first season as aquatic director with the Kentucky swimming and diving program. Tish oversees facilities operations and event management at the Lancaster Aquatic Center. Hollingsworth-Gray served eight years as the Lancaster Aquatic Center pool manager before assuming the title of aquatic director. Prior to her stint as pool manager, Hollingsworth served as the UK swim team's Staff Assistant.

The UK alumna and Lexington, Ky. native swam for the Wildcats from 1982-86 and was the captain of UK's first varsity women's swim team for three years.

Hollingsworth also teaches courses in CPR, lifeguarding, and coaches safety training, as well as serving as an aquatic examiner for the Red Cross.

Hollingsworth-Gray is married to Steve Gray and the two reside in Lexington. They have a son, two-year-old Cooper.

Hollingsworth-Gray replaces Wynn Paul, who retired in 2004 after 40 years of service in Lexington.



MICKI KING
Assistant Athletics Director/Senior Women's Administrator

In her 13th year with the UK Athletics Department, Micki King is Assistant Athletics Director and the Senior

Women's Administrator.

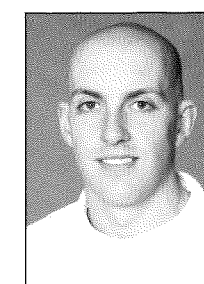
King, who previously held the title of Special Assistant to the A.D., oversees the sports of women's basketball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, volleyball, rifle, cheerleaders and dance team. For two years, she also managed marketing efforts for the women's basketball team while serving as game director for all home contests.

A native of Pontiac, Mich., King served 26 years in the United States Air Force before retiring with the rank of colonel in 1992. During her years of service, King had assignments in Michigan, Arizona, California, Washington, Colorado, Kentucky, and Germany. In 1973, King was the first woman to teach physical education and coach at a military academy when she served at the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs.

An accomplished diver, King attended the University of Michigan and graduated in 1966.

She won the gold medal for springboard diving in the 1972 Olympic Games. Four years earlier, she just missed a gold medal when a freak accident in the finals of the '68 Olympics dropped her from first to fourth in the standings. During her illustrious career, she also competed in two Pan American Games, won 10 U. S. national championships, and won international diving honors in 15 countries. She is an inductee in seven Halls of Fame, including the prestigious United States Olympic Hall of Fame.

After her diving career, King turned to coaching at the Air Force Academy in 1973-77. After assignments in Arizona and Germany, King returned to the Academy in 1983 and was named assistant athletics director and diving coach. During this stint, she was named NCAA Division II Coach of the Year three times. King's divers won 11 All-America honors and two claimed national titles. In 1988, King traveled to the Seoul Games as a staff member of the U. S. Olympic diving team and served in the same capacity in the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta. She attended the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney on behalf of the U.S. Olympic Committee, her eighth appearance at the summer games as either a participant or staff member.



ERIC ATNIP
Pool Manager

Eric Atnip begins his first season as pool manager at the Lancaster Aquatic Center. Atnip began a stint as a lifeguard at the Lancaster Aquatic Center in 1999

and has since served as a lifeguard supervisor and the strength and swim coach for the Wildcat Aquatics swim team. As a student, this amateur triathlete and cyclist helped start the University of Kentucky triathlon club.

Atnip is a two-time graduate of the University of Kentucky after earning a bachelor's degree in political science in 2000 and a master's degree in health promotion in 2003.

UK swimming alumna Margo Lynch rejoined the UK swimming & diving program in Sept. of 2002 as a staff assistant. During home meets, Lynch serves as the scoreboard and

timing systems operations manager.

Born in Melbourne, Australia, Lynch came to Kentucky from her family's adopted home of Pittsburgh, Pa. Lynch swam for the Wildcats from 1991-95 and served as the team captain during her junior and senior seasons. Lynch can be found on the all-time top-10 UK lists in three events; 200-freestyle, 500-freestyle and 1650-freestyle.

Prior to returning to her alma mater, Lynch served as a buyer for Phillip Gall's Outdoor & Ski in Lexington.

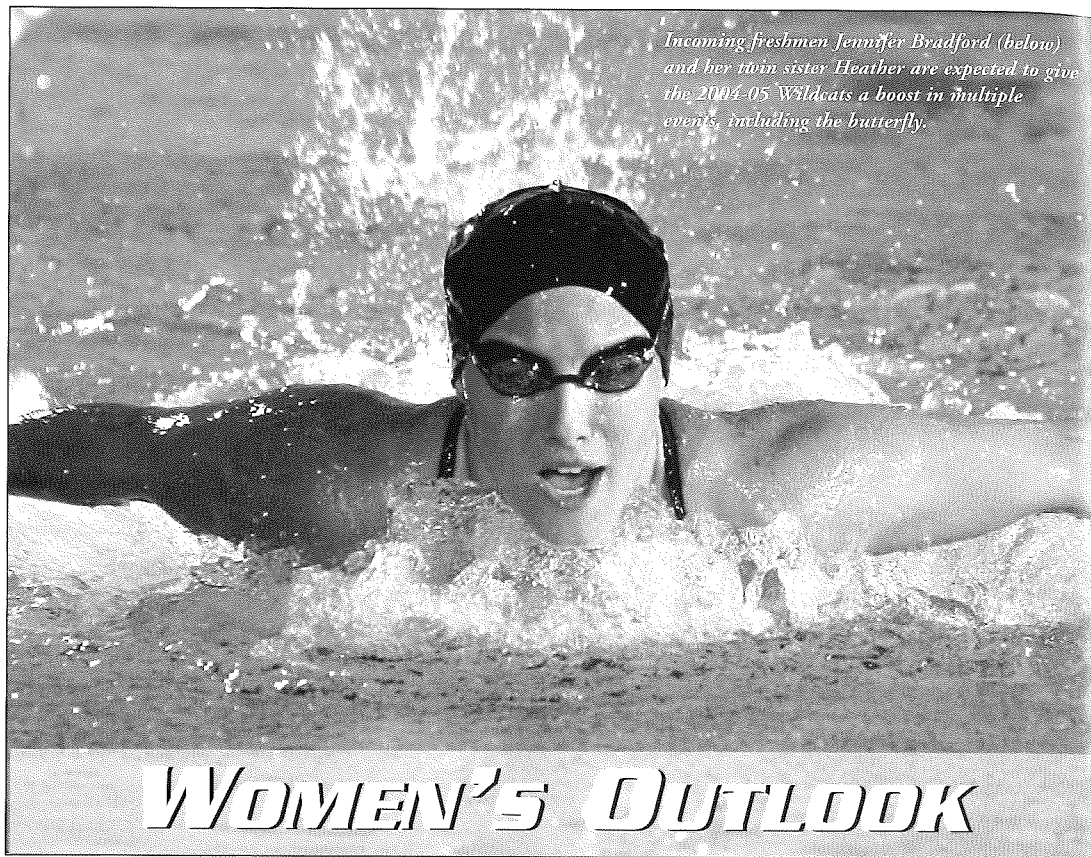

Meet the Wildcat Women

The 2003-04 Kentucky women's squad entered its season with minimal expectations but turned in a solid dual-meet record and a sixth-place finish at the SEC Championships. The 2004-05 squad returns all but three letter winners from the previous season and figures to make another climb in the final team standings at the SEC Championships.

"We were a relatively weak team, and we wound up beating a lot of people we shouldn't have beaten," Conelly said. "So, all we're going to do is add to that. We lost important people like Kendra Trahan, Amanda Bourgeois and Shawna Sechrist to graduation, but I think we've brought enough in with our freshman class and our transfer to fill the void."

Kentucky finds itself in a position to build even further in the near future; as with the 2003-04 squad, Conelly will lose only three seniors to graduation after the 2004-05 season.

WOMEN'S OUTLOOK

BACKSTROKE

Jessica Siegele enters her senior season looking to build upon her 35th-place showing in the 100 backstroke at the NCAA Championships. The Wexford, Pa., native also placed 10th in the event at the SEC Championships with a time of 55.38, which broke her own school record. Conelly likes Siegele's chances of continued success in the event.

"I think she'll qualify to go to the NCAA Championships and she will be really competitive in the conference meet. She should be in the top 10 in the 100 backstroke and will approach a top eight in that event and the 200 backstroke."

Conelly will count on added depth from juniors Joanna McLean and Brennan Moore and freshmen Heather Bradford, Jill Southerlan and Blair Barrett.

"They are sub-60 point backstrokers, so that will be a good thing for us. They can all swim a pretty good 200 backstroke, too, so backstroke will be a little bit stronger than last year."

Butterfly

Conelly expects improvement in the butterfly and will find help in the form of twins Heather and Jennifer Bradford.

"Both of the Bradford girls are very strong butterflyers. Heather is a 55.6 and Jenny is a 57.7 in the 100 butterfly, so that will help us a lot there. That also helps the medley relay quite

a bit. Last year, our best backstroker and our best butterflyer were the same person, Jessica Siegele. This year, we can put Jessica in the back on the relay and we can put Heather in the fly. We'll be in better shape than we've been in a long time there, and that will be a really solid push for us."

Sophomore Sunny Gibson will see action in the 200 butterfly and may be joined by senior Marci Vrooman and the aforementioned Myhre. Conelly expects the versatile Shantel Commander to see time in the event, as well.

"You may find that Shantel Commander swims that event more often," Conelly said. "She's a pretty good butterflyer, and she's very strong upper-body wise. She's not afraid of the event and enjoys swimming it."

BREASTSTROKE

The 100 and 200 breaststroke events were solid areas for the Kentucky women a season ago, and there's little reason to expect anything different in 2005. The Cats lost Kendra Trahan, a 13th-place finisher in the 200 breaststroke at the SEC Championships, but Commander and junior Laura Graham return to solidify this event for Kentucky.

Graham found her sophomore campaign much to her liking, claiming school records in the 100 and 200 breaststroke events while plac-

ing fourth and fifth, respectively, at the SEC Championships. The E. Sussex, England native registered the top NCAA finish for the UK women, placing 18th in the 200, while also adding a 20th-place showing in the 100.

Commander came on strong at the SEC Championships, taking 13th in the 100 and ninth in the 200. Graham and Commander may find an equally solid breaststroker in freshman Lindsay Myhre.

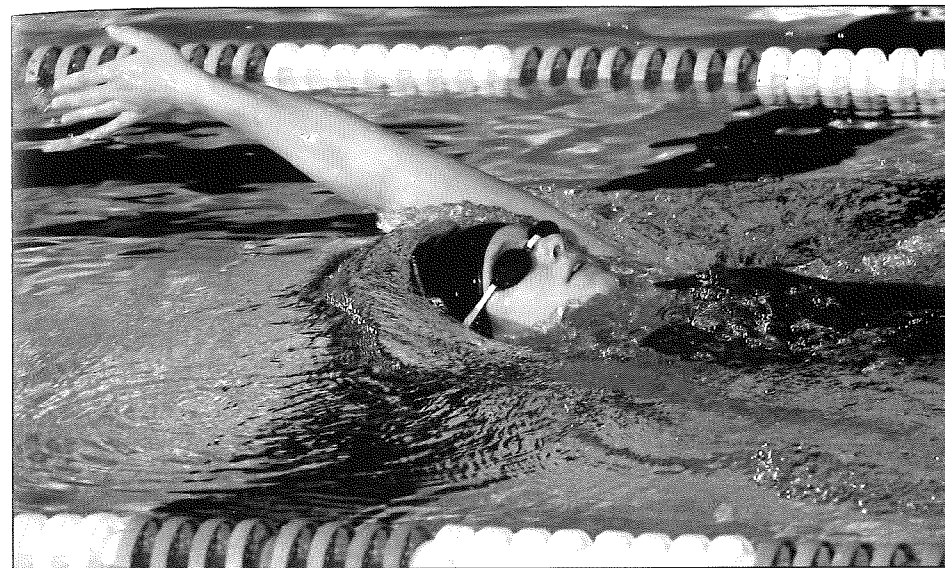
"Lindsay is coming in as fast as either Laura or Shantel when they first showed up on campus," Conelly said. "She will really take off. She is built very similar to Laura, and if she has any sort of improvement like Laura has, we'll be in a position to finish one-two-three in some meets."

Conelly will count on junior Cassie Wit to add further depth in the event.

FREESTYLE

Sophomore Nikia Deveaux returns to Lexington fresh off of a stint at the 2004 Summer Olympic Games in Athens, Greece. Deveaux represented the Bahamas in the preliminary rounds of the 50-meter freestyle event. Deveaux looks to build upon a 35th-place showing in the event at the SEC Championships.

As in other events, Kentucky will welcome contributions from Heather and Jennifer Bradford. Jennifer took part in the 50-meter freestyle

at the U.S. Olympic trials last summer, and Heather comes to Lexington as a noted sprinter, as well. Freshmen Sarah Kunz and Kelley Morrison also will have the opportunity to bolster the 50 freestyle for Kentucky, and the Bradfords figure also to solidify the 100 freestyle.

Conelly welcomes his new-found depth in the 50 freestyle.

A lot of times, we've put Jessica Siegele in there to cover the bases. Now, we can concentrate Jessica in some other events that might be more advantageous to scoring well in a meet. You'll see not only the freestyles get better, but the 200 free relay and the 400 free relay also will improve.

Conelly has a proven veteran in the middle-distance events in senior Marci Vrooman, but a lingering shoulder injury could prove costly for Kentucky.

We still are a little bit weak in the middle-distance area, and we've got to keep our fingers crossed that Marci's shoulder is not going to give her troubles this year and she can get back to the form she was in during her freshman year. She showed signs of getting there toward the end of last season, so that's a really big piece of the equation for us. Marci is a real key for us in the 200 and the 500.

Kentucky will depend upon senior Caitlin Muldoon and junior Brennan Moore in the distance freestyle events. The pair brings experience to the event, as Moore took 15th and Muldoon placed 18th in the 1650 freestyle at the SEC Championships.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

Kentucky loses an individual-medley veteran from the 2003-04 squad in Kendra Trahan, but the Cats still will rely upon Laura Graham, Shantel Commander, Brennan Moore and

Caitlin Muldoon to fill out the event. Bolstered by her success in the breaststroke events, Graham added a point for Kentucky at the SEC Championships by finishing 16th in the 200 IM. Freshman Lindsay Myhre figures to add further depth in this area.

RELAYS

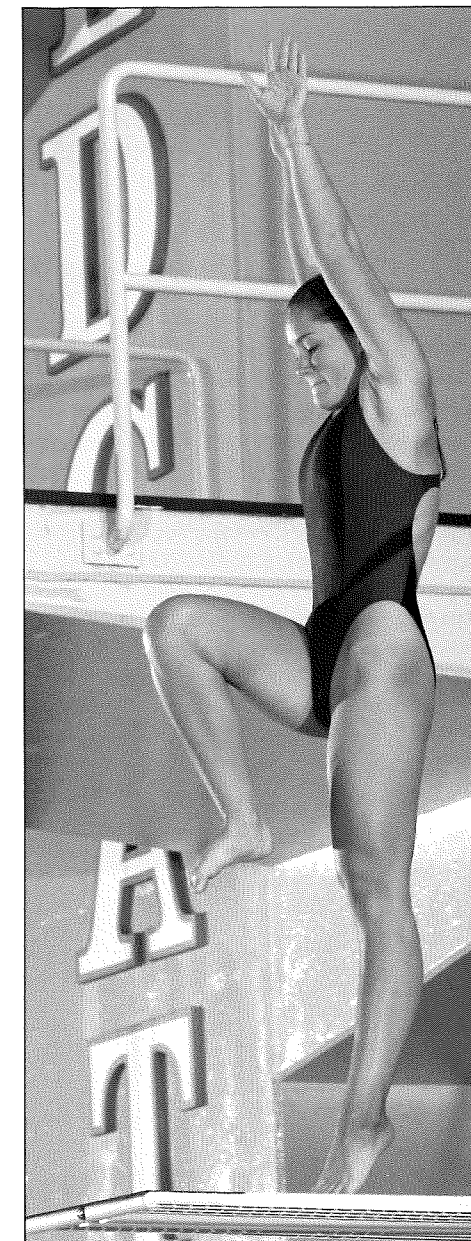
The single-most improved discipline of the 2004-05 Kentucky women's squads appears to be the relay events, according to Conelly.

The big difference in the team this year is going to show up in all of the relays, Conelly said. The 200 free will be a whole lot better because the Bradford twins can both swim the freestyle so well. The 200 medley becomes extraordinarily improved because one of the Bradford twins can swim freestyle, one can swim butterfly, and then Jessica (Siegele) can swim the backstroke. Then, you've got either Laura (Graham) or Shantel (Commander) swimming breaststroke. So, that will be a real good relay for us, as will be the 400 medley relay. Each of these can be in the top four at our conference meet.

Diving

UK Diving Coach Mike Lyden welcomes back a sensational group of veterans to his 2004-05 squad. Sophomore Kari Retrum made an immediate impact a year ago, becoming the first Kentucky freshman to win an SEC diving conference title. The Noblesville, Ind., native went on to place 17th on the platform at the U.S. Olympic trials.

Junior Jessica Thompson took 17th on the platform, 26th on the one meter and 36th in the three meter at the NCAA Championships before taking 18th on the three meter at the SEC



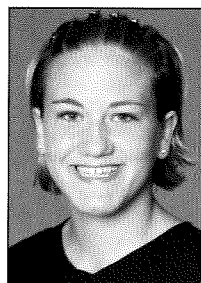
Sophomore Kari Retrum returns to defend her SEC platform diving title from a year ago.

We have the potential to do very well this season, and if all five of them avoid injuries and get to the conference meet, we will hold our own, Lyden said. In terms of work ethic, they give me 110 percent, and that's all I can ask for as a coach.

Meet the Wildcat Men

The excitement and accomplishments generated during an exceptional 2003-2004 swimming and diving season have galvanized and focused this year's squad on climbing higher up the NCAA ladder. As Coach Gary Conelly will tell you, the men's squad is looking to conquer new challenges in 2005.

"They're all excited about what they did last year, but they are really adamant about getting back into the water, knocking off teams we haven't beaten before and setting a whole new set of records," Conelly said. "We expect to approach the top 10 at the NCAA Championships."

Conelly will have plenty of help in sending Kentucky to new heights in NCAA competition. The Cats lost only three seniors, Fernando Barros, Darron Berquist and Eddie Clement, from the 03-04 squad and return eight All-Americans, including a top-five NCAA finisher in senior Daniel Cruz.

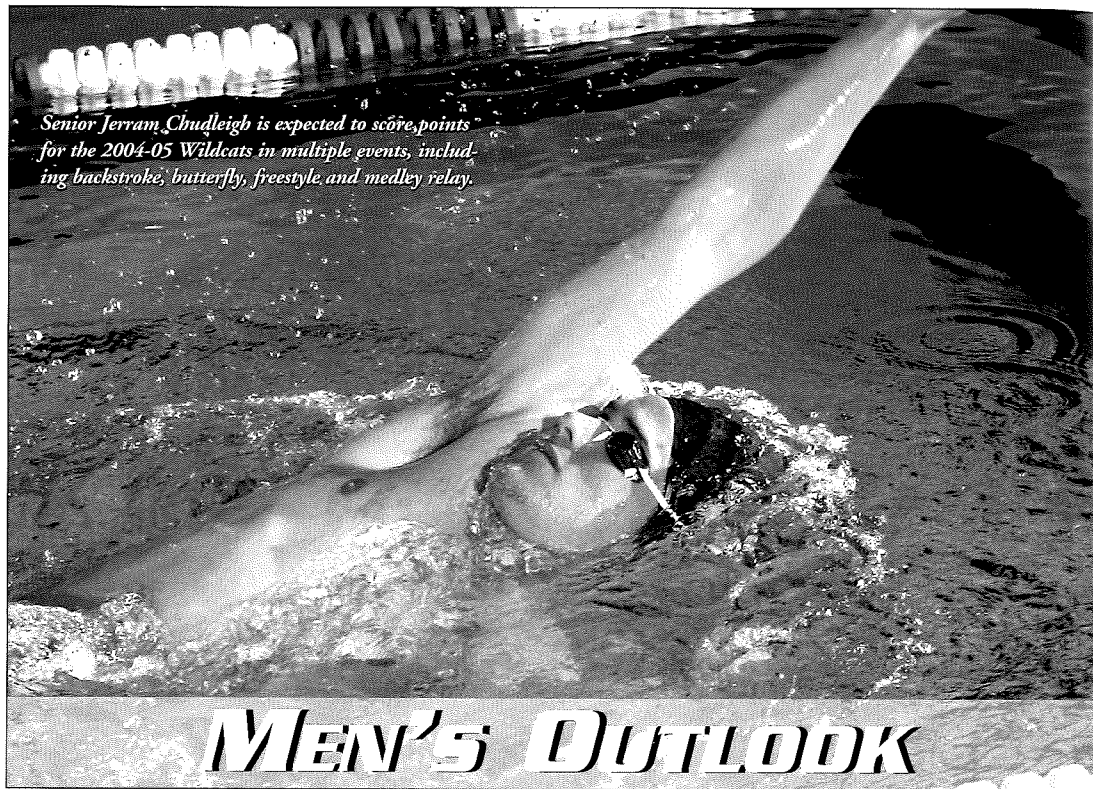
FREESTYLE

As is the case in several events, the freestyle serves as a deep area for the Wildcats. Junior Daniel Farnham leads a strong sprint-freestyle contingent. The Rome, Ga., native took seventh in the 50 freestyle and fifth in the 100 freestyle at the SEC Championships. His 43.92 split in the 400 freestyle relay at the 2004 SECs set a new school record in the 100 freestyle. He went on to place 23rd in the 50 freestyle and 30th in the 100 freestyle at the NCAA Championships.

Senior Tim Patrick followed closely behind Farnham in the sprint freestyle events. Patrick placed eighth in the SEC Championships and 41st at the NCAA Championships in the 50 freestyle. Senior Clay Gasparovich took 12th in the 50 freestyle at the 2004 SECs and joined Farnham and Patrick in the event at last summer's U.S. Olympic trials. Also contributing to Kentucky's success in sprint freestyle will be senior Jon Cardledge and sophomores Alejandro Bravo and Mark Doyle. Junior Steven Manley, who owns the fastest 100 freestyle-relay split in school history, also figures to make an impact in the sprints.

Manley enters 2004-05 as one of the SEC's top 200 freestylers. His fourth-place time of 1:35.72 set a new school mark, one of two he set a season ago. Manley covered 200 meters in 1:46.98 at the NCAA Championships, good for 10th place, nationally.

"I think he should have a real good year," Conelly said. "He's a little bit disappointed he didn't

make it to the Olympics on the Irish team. I think he's really focused on having an outstanding year, not only for himself but for the team."

Daniel Farnham, senior Daniel Cruz and senior Jerram Chudleigh figure to contribute in the 200 freestyle this season and are capable of winning the event in any given meet. The quartet expects to be the backbone of the Wildcat 800 freestyle relay team.

The 500 freestyle presents another deep discipline for Kentucky. Manley claimed second place in the event at the SEC Championships and will likely be joined by Chudleigh, sophomores Mark Doyle and Eric Weber and freshman Grant Nelson.

"This is a flexible area for us," Conelly said. "We'll be able to shift people around in our lineup, allowing us to maximize our chances of scoring in more events."

Conelly is encouraged by the potential of freshman Grant Nelson to provide depth in the 1000 freestyle.

"The best news here is Grant comes in with a 9:20 1000 freestyle time, which would put him ahead of Steven (Manley) in the 1000," Conelly said. "That's a great thing in a dual-meet situation because in some cases last season, we had to swim Steven in the 1000 and turn around and swim him in the 200 free or the 200 IM. With Grant on the team, we won't have to do that. So, our distance events will be stronger than they have been lately. We're not enormously strong there, but we still have a pretty solid lineup."

Conelly expects more of the same in the 1650-

freestyle event. The sophomore Weber tried his hand in the event a season ago and added a point to the Kentucky tally at the SEC championships.

BACKSTROKE

The backstroke lacks the depth of other areas, but nonetheless, Kentucky is stocked with SEC point scorers in the event. Senior Jerram Chudleigh, sophomore Alejandro Bravo and senior Dave Roberts each chipped in crucial points at the conference meet, and with another year under their belts, Kentucky will count on even more production from the backstroke contingent.

Conelly foresees Chudleigh being the centerpiece of this discipline for the Wildcats, but also expects positive things from Bravo.

"Jerram will find himself swimming the 400 medley quite a bit with the 100 back leg, and he is, by far, our best 200 backstroker," Conelly said. "Alejandro (Bravo) did a nice job last season. While Alejandro had tremendous drops in his times last year, I expect him to equal or surpass those time drops this year. He has a serious shot at making it to the NCAA Championships."

Senior Dave Roberts continues to progress and is a likely point scorer at 2005 SECs.

BREASTSTROKE

Lack of depth in the breaststroke plagued Kentucky in 2003-04, but the addition of some key freshmen in this area makes the breaststroke a solid event for the Wildcats.

"This is the most where you'll find the most

significant difference from last year's team and this year's team," Conelly said. "We had to patch together the breaststroke and we only had a couple of guys that swam it. Our best breaststroker was also our best 200 freestyler, Steven Manley. So, we focused heavily on bringing in a breaststroker, and I think we've picked up two really good ones."

Conelly expects the biggest splash from freshman Kristian Outinen, a native of Copenhagen, Denmark. His 100-breaststroke times, when converted to yards, threaten the current school record, and his 200 breaststroke times dip below two minutes.

"Kristian shows every sign of breaking both team records in the breaststroke events. With just marginal drops to his converted times, he should be an NCAA qualifier in his freshman season."

Conelly is also excited about his freshman from small-town Wyoming, who, like Outinen, came a long way to get to Kentucky.

"The guy that may be the biggest surprise is Will Vietti. He came out of a very small program and was not really a year-round swimmer. I think he will really take off. He's very enthusiastic about competing in college and he's pretty excited about the whole process, given the fact he will be surrounded by guys like Kristian. I think he'll do a real nice job for us."

Conelly also welcomes returning veterans Mike Arce and Dane Redinger, who played a vital role in the Cats' narrow victory over Indiana last season. Senior Cameron Moore also figures to see time in the breaststroke.

BUTTERFLY

The butterfly is led by Kentucky's top NCAA finisher from a year ago, senior All-American Daniel Cruz. The Palm Coast, Fla., native took seventh in the 200-meter butterfly over the summer at the U.S. Olympic trials. He captured school records in the 100 and 200 butterfly events on his way to a third-place finish in the 200 and a 13th-place showing in the 100 at the NCAA championships. Cruz was edged out by .03 seconds in the 200 fly final at the 2004 SEC Championships and took seventh in the 100 butterfly.

Jerram Chudleigh combines with Cruz for a formidable one-two punch in the event, as he won the consolation final at the SEC championships and qualified in each butterfly event for the NCAA championships a season ago. The Wildcats will enjoy extra support in the butterfly from seniors Tim Patrick, Chris Collins and Clay Gasparovich and sophomore Alejandro Bravo.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

The versatility of junior Steven Manley will pay dividends for Kentucky in the individual-medley events. However, Conelly expects some welcome assistance to shore up the event this season.

"Our best is Steven, but Jerram (Chudleigh) is

not far behind him, Kristian (Outinen) is not far behind him and Daniel is not far behind him. Once again, we're in a good situation where we have, worse-case scenario, at least two solid individual-medley swimmers in a dual meet. It might be really difficult for people to come up with a plan to beat us in dual meets."

Conelly expects greater challenges in the 400 individual medley.

"The 400 IM is a little bit tougher for us. It's not because we don't have good 400 IMers, but because our 400 IMers have other events they swim in which they are more productive. Steven could do a great 400 IM, as could Daniel Cruz and Jerram Chudleigh and possibly Kristian. However, even though we have four very strong IMers, the odds are very slim that any of them will ever swim this event at the SEC or NCAA Championships. All four have better events and, at best, the 400 IM is the fifth best event for any of them."

Eric Weber, Mike Arce and Dane Redinger are expected to compete in this event for the Wildcats at the conference championships.

RELAYS

Once again, the addition of breaststroker Kristian Outinen will make a significant impact in yet another discipline. Conelly sees some much-improved medley relays in the near future for the UK men.

"Now with the addition of Kristian and Will (Vietti) in the breaststroke slots, we will be able to put together medley relays that will be very competitive at the SEC and national levels. Some of the spots have yet to shake out. You could see Jerram (Chudleigh) or Alejandro (Bravo) in the back slot and Tim (Patrick) or (Daniel) Cruz in the fly, and Tim (Patrick) or (Daniel) Farnham on the free leg. You should see both the 200 and 400 medley relay team records fall this year.

"If Daniel Farnham doesn't swim the free, he swims the fly. If not the fly, than Daniel Cruz or Clay Gasparovich or Tim Patrick takes the fly. Jerram takes the backstroke, and then Kristian

fills in the breaststroke. I think we're in great shape there."

The 400 medley relay team features a similar lineup, with the possibility of sophomore Alejandro Bravo filling in on the backstroke.

With a number of interchangeable parts available, Conelly sees great success ahead for his 200, 400 and 800 freestyle relay teams.

"The 200 and 400 free relays will be outstanding for us, as will the 800 free relay. The 800 freestyle relay is in tact with Manley, Cruz, Farnham and Chudleigh. The key is since Farnham tends to be focused on tapering for his speed events, the trick is to make sure he has enough gas in the tank to go 200. But, all of those guys are capable of splitting faster than 1:37, which would make it a pretty impressive relay."

DIVING

What Coach Mike Lyden's men's diving corps lacked in depth it made up for in performance last season. Senior Mario Rodriguez, the lone men's diver from a season ago, qualified for the NCAA championships and placed 12th on the one meter, 13th on the platform and 27th on the three meter to score two All-America honors. The Mexico City native also excelled at the conference meet, taking seventh on the platform, eighth on the three meter and 11th on the one meter.

"This is a young group of divers, but we're fortunate to have a senior like Mario with good leadership qualities," Lyden said.

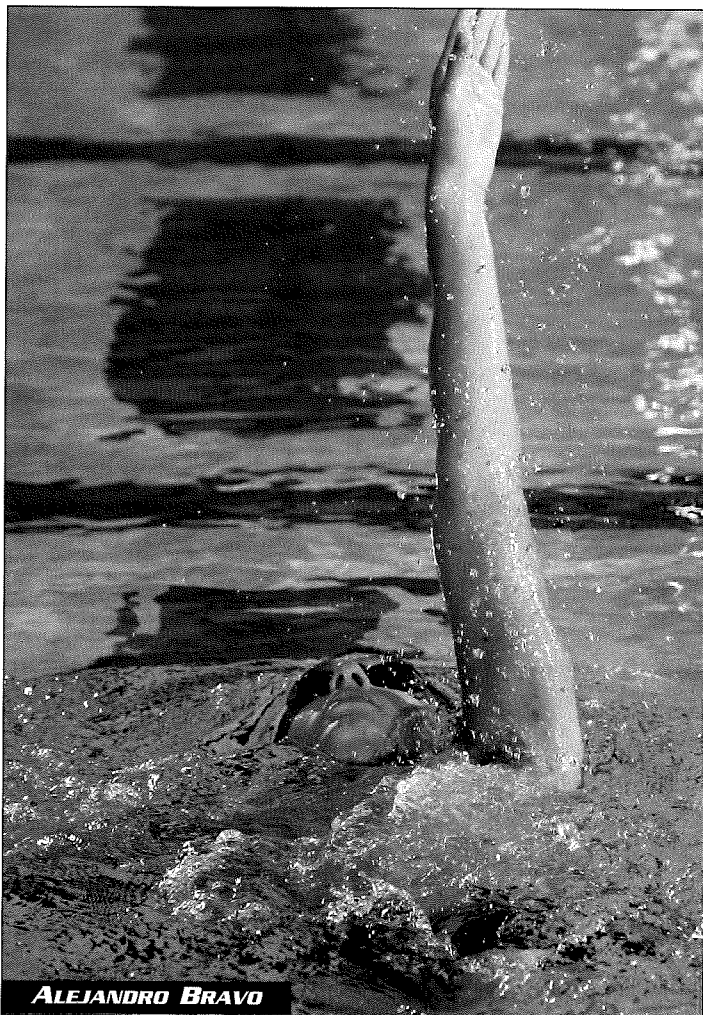
Lyden welcomes the addition of freshman Ben Starchuk, a Canadian Olympic trial participant.

Looking Back



The 2003-04 season marked another year of progress for the Kentucky men's and women's swimming and diving squads, as the Cats rewrote 11 school records, crowned an SEC diving champion, significantly improved their standing at the conference championships and sent 11 student-athletes to the NCAA championships, where eight earned All-America honors.

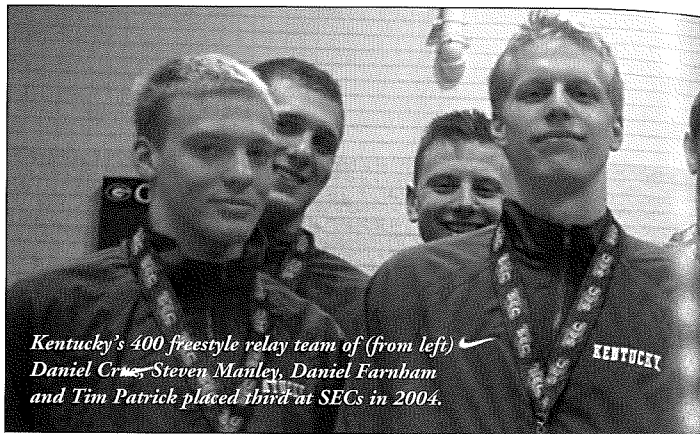
After suffering season-opening losses to Tennessee, the Cats went on the offensive, as the UK men posted victories over No. 19 Indiana and Louisville, and the UK women easily handled Houston and Louisville.

After a three-week break, the Cats headed for the Nike Cup in Chapel Hill, N.C., where they rewrote the record books. Daniel Cruz claimed school and Nike Cup records in the 100 and 200 butterfly events, while Jessica Siegele set a new school record in the 100 backstroke. Brennan Moore added a win in the 400 individual medley, and Laura Graham scored a victory in the 200 breaststroke. Divers Jessica Thompson, Kari Retrum, Joey Brown and Jillian Becker placed one through four, respectively, in the three-meter event at the Indiana Invitational.

The Cats brought in the new year with a trip to Gainesville, Fla., to meet Florida, who dealt Kentucky a pair of tough losses. After easy victories over Indian River and Ball State, Kentucky collected its first conference victories of the season over South Carolina. The Cats traveled to Georgia Tech and Auburn after a three-week break and earned a weekend split. The Kentucky

fourth-place finish in the 200 freestyle. Daniel Farnham chipped in a fifth-place finish in the 100 freestyle. The Cats placed third in the 400-freestyle relay and scored fourth-place showings in the 200 and 800-freestyle relays.

Kentucky sent three women and a program-best eight men to the 2004 NCAA Championships. Jessica Thompson led the UK women with a 17th-place finish in the platform-diving event. The UK men crowned eight All-Americans and totaled 83 points for a 15th-place finish. Cruz led Kentucky with a third-place finish in the 200 butterfly after finishing only .18 seconds behind Texas' Rainer Kendrick.

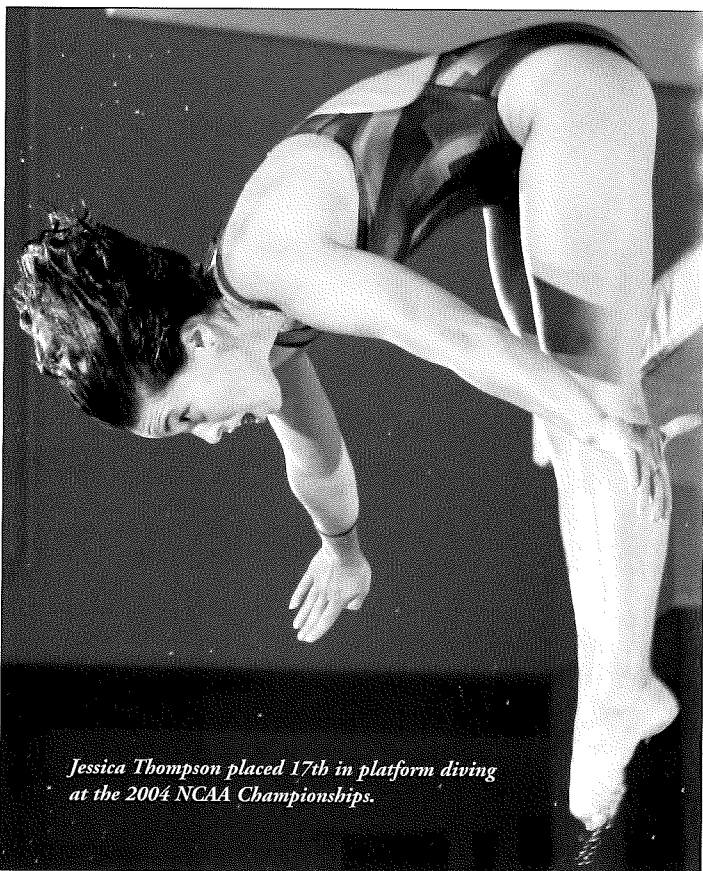

men and women turned in convincing victories over the Yellow Jackets but were no match for the defending NCAA champion men and women of Auburn. Kentucky closed out the regular season with convincing Senior Day victories over Cincinnati at the Lancaster Aquatic Center.

Kentucky capped a solid regular season with a terrific performance at the SEC Championships at Georgia's Gabrielsen Natatorium. After finishing ninth at the 2003 SEC Championships, the UK women made a significant climb toward the upper echelon of the conference with a sixth-place finish. Kari Retrum became the first Kentucky freshman to win an SEC diving title, as the Noblesville, Ind., native led from start to finish to capture the women's platform crown. Jessica Siegele, Laura Graham, Sunny Gibson and Nikia Deveaux turned in a fifth-place finish in the 400 medley relay, and Graham added fourth and fifth-place showings in the 100 and 200-breaststroke events, respectively.

The Kentucky men improved from their 2003 SEC showing by moving up one spot to fifth place. Kentucky scored seven top-five finishes. Daniel Cruz took second in the 200 butterfly after being edged out by Auburn's Jeremy Knowles for top honors by .03 seconds. Steven Manley added a runner-up finish in the 500 freestyle and also contributed a

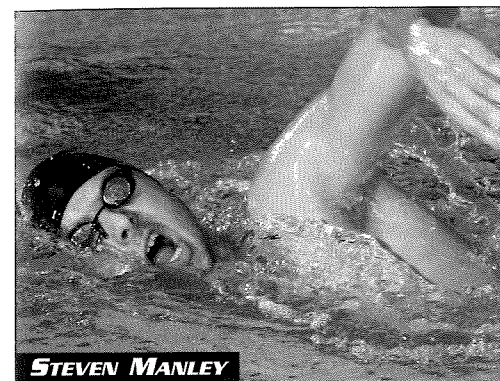
2004 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS RECAP

The Kentucky men's swimming and diving squad turned in the best NCAA showing in the history of the program at the 2004 NCAA Championships in East Meadow, N.Y. A school-record eight representatives from the men's team recorded a program-best 15th-place overall finish. Daniel Cruz led the Cats with a third-place finish in the 200-meter butterfly, and Steven Manley added a 10th-place finish in the 200 freestyle. Daniel Farnham, Fernando Barros, Tim Patrick and Clay Gasparovich chipped in a 10th-place finish in the 200 freestyle relay.

The Kentucky women sent three competitors to the 2004 NCAA Championships in College Station, Texas. Jessica Thompson placed 17th in the platform-diving event, while Laura Graham took 18th in the 200 breaststroke.

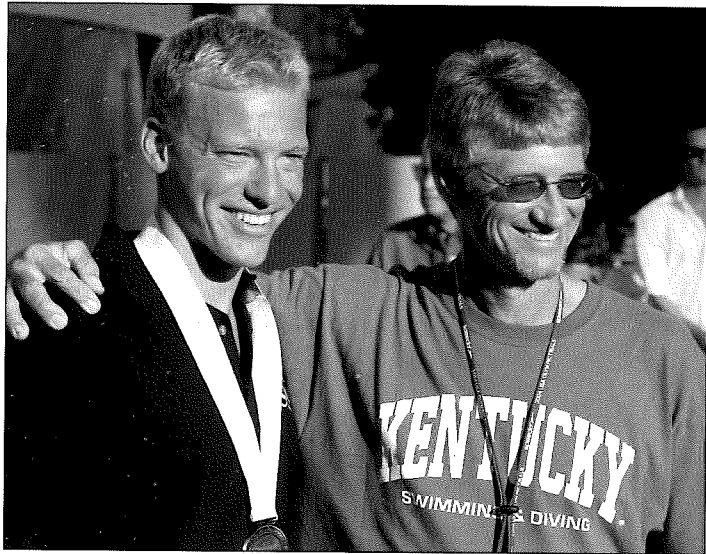

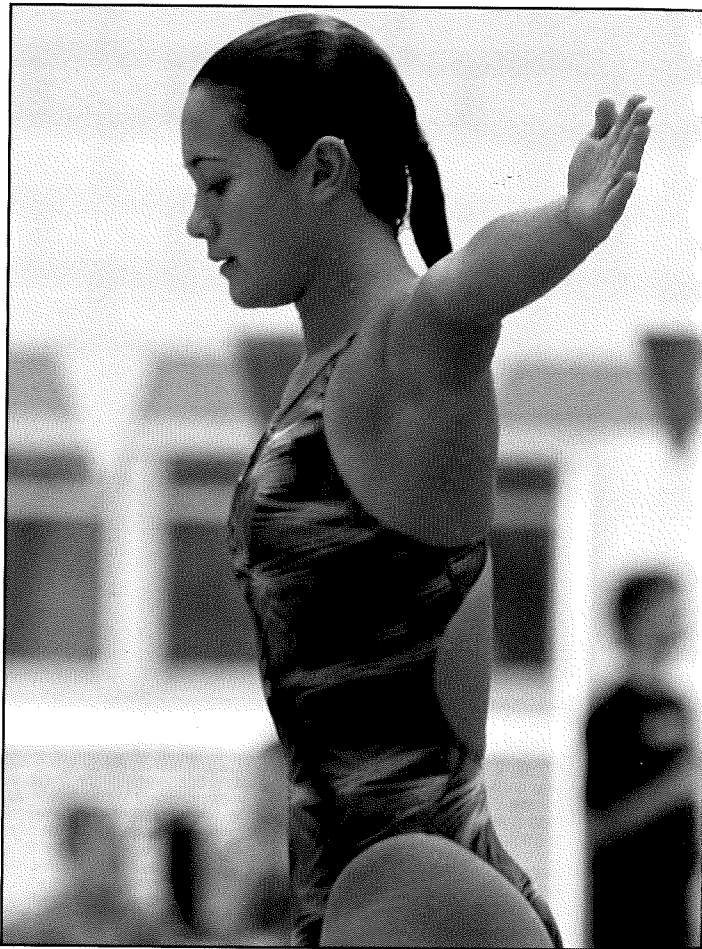
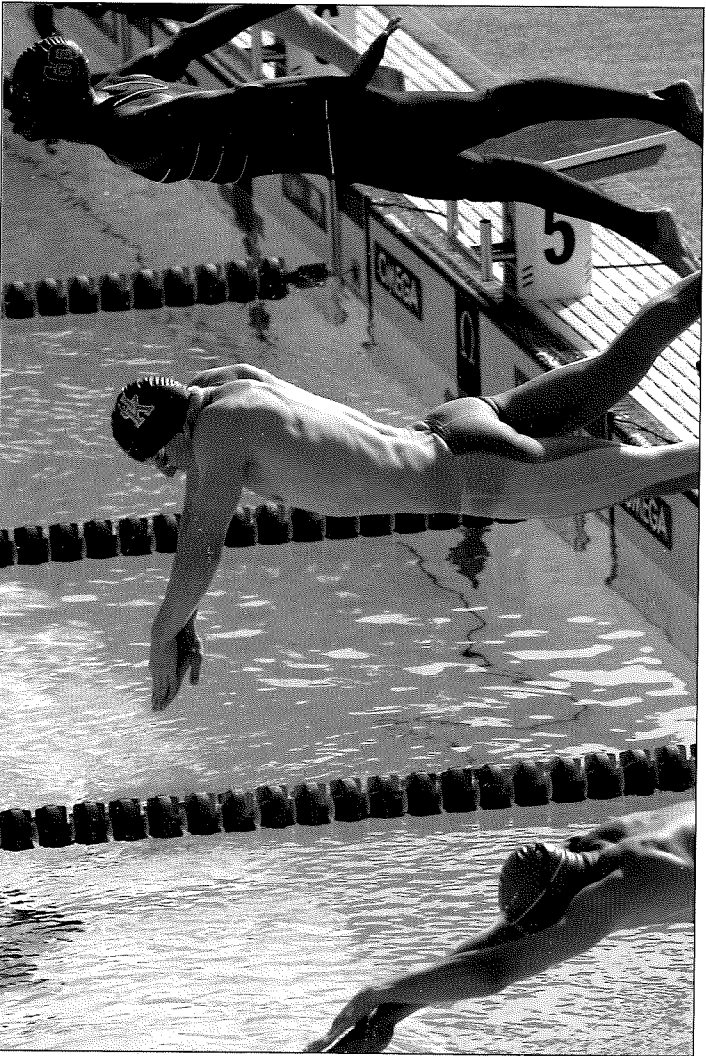
Six current and former Wildcats participated in the U.S. Olympic Swimming Trials, held last July in Long Beach, Calif. Former Cat Rachel Komisarz led the Kentucky contingent with a win in the 100-meter butterfly along with a sixth-place time of 2:00.23 in the 200-meter freestyle and a 10th-place showing in the 400-meter freestyle.

Daniel Cruz tallied a sixth-place finish in the 200-meter butterfly and an 18th-place showing in the 100-meter butterfly. A trio of returning Wildcats took part in the 50-meter freestyle. Daniel Farnham placed 20th, while Tim Patrick followed closely behind in 23rd, while Clay Gasparovich took 36th place. The lone current UK women's swimmer to participate, Shantel Commander, placed 31st in the 200-meter breaststroke.

Several of Mike Lyden's current and former UK divers enjoyed strong showings at the U.S. Olympic Diving Trials, held last June in St. Peters, Mo.

Clayton Moss, an 11-time All-American from 1999-03, took fourth in the three-meter springboard event and third in the three-meter synchronized competition. Aaron Kirkpatrick, another former Wildcat All-American, placed ninth in the three-meter springboard event and fifth in the three-meter synchronized event.

A trio of current Wildcats also took part in the trials. Taryn Ignacio led the Kentucky contingent with an 11th-place showing on the platform, while Kari Retrum followed in 17th place. Jessica Thompson placed 18th in the three-meter springboard event.

SALUTING RACHEL KOMISARZ



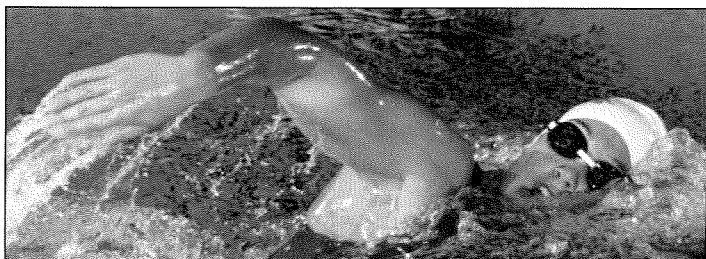
Six All-America honors and three SEC championships were only the beginning for former Wildcat Rachel Komisarz. The Warren, Mich., native swam at Kentucky from 1996-99 before entering the international swim scene, where she continued to flourish. Komisarz reached the pinnacle of her sport at the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens, Greece when she helped Team USA to a gold medal in the 800 freestyle relay and a silver medal in the 400 medley relay. Komisarz swam the preliminary round of each event to earn her first Olympic medals.

Komisarz owns UK swimming records in the 200 freestyle, 1000 freestyle, 1650 freestyle and the 100 and 200 butterfly events in addition to four records at UK's Lancaster Aquatic Center. Komisarz also co-owns school records in the 200 and 400 medley relays and 200 and 800 freestyle relays.

Komisarz currently swims for the Lakeside Swim Team in Louisville under Coach Mike DeBoor.



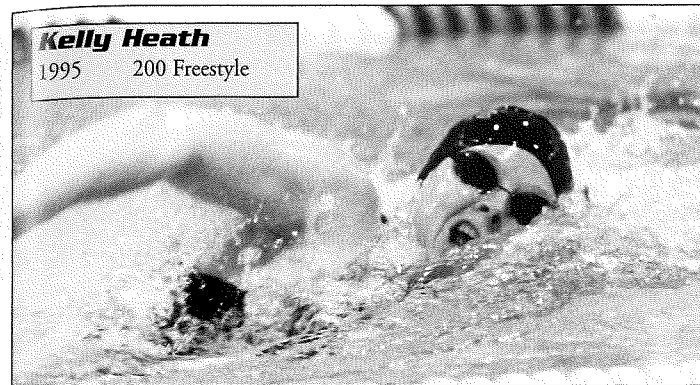

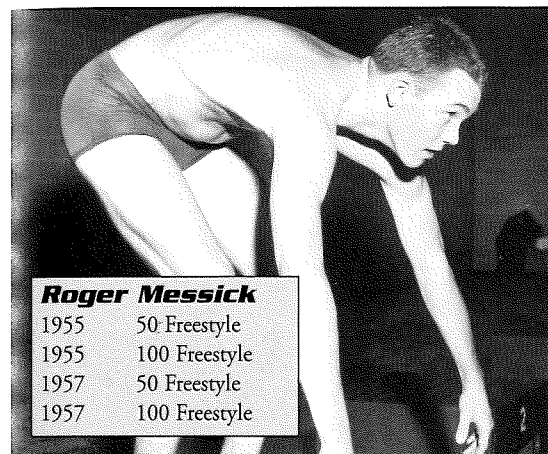
Rachel Komisarz celebrates after winning the 100-meter butterfly at the 2004 U.S. Olympic Swimming Trials last summer.

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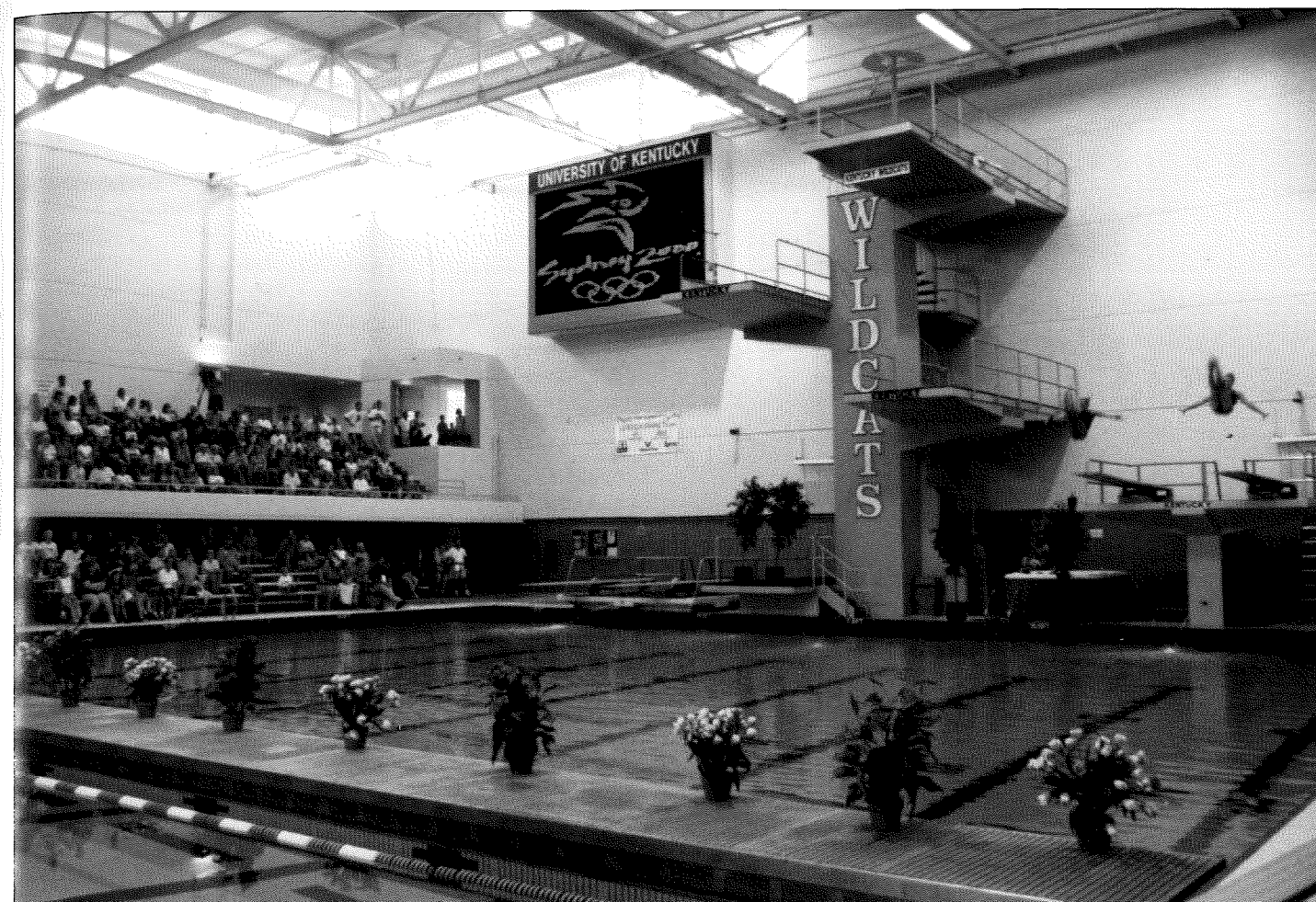
LANCASTER AQUATIC CENTER



The University of Kentucky's Lancaster Aquatic Center, opened March 29, 1989, represents the finest in collegiate swimming and diving facilities.

The natatorium is named for Harry C. Lancaster, former UK Athletics Director (1968-76) and assistant basketball coach (1946-70) to Kentucky's legendary Adolph Rupp.

The indoor facility is 25 yards by 176 feet with a movable bulkhead that can be set at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. The movable bulkhead allows the facility to be used for a number of activities other than swim meets and practices, including recreational swimming, aquatic classes, swimming and diving lessons, scuba instruction, handicapped swimming and other aquatic-related activities.



Racing lanes can be set up in five configurations: across-the-pool racing at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. Two 25-yard courses can be utilized for large swim meets. Eighteen swimming lanes are available while diving events are in progress. Long course racing will have eight full-size lanes for the 50-meter distance.

The swimming tank, which holds 1,025,000 gallons of water, has a raised deck gutter with a large overflow. This gutter design is similar to the Indianapolis Natatorium design. Pool depth varies from 4.3 feet to 6.5 feet at the shallow end, utilizing a movable floor of 35 by 75 feet. Water under the diving boards and tower is 17 feet deep. The natatorium features Daktronic automatic timing for swim meets. A 16-by-23 foot wall-mounted scoreboard allows full display of information for eight-lane and 16-lane swim meets. The scoreboard can also display graphics and animation sequences.

The diving facilities are among the best in the world. The facility has two 1-meter boards and two 3-meter boards set on concrete platforms. Each platform is eight feet wide with lengths from 23 feet to 28 feet.

The facility won the 1990 Association of General Contractors Award for Structures. There is a 40-foot dryland diving area permanently set up with a trampoline, Portapit diving board and two diving/tumbling harnesses for somersaulting and twisting practice.

The Aquatic Center has a full training room equipped with two treatment tables, EGS and ultrasound machine, hydrocollator, and ice machine. There is a trainer on duty at all times.

The Aquatic Center has a weight room for swimmers and divers equipped with Cybex weight training machines. In the adjacent Seaton Physical Education building are exercise physiology labs that are utilized for the testing of swimmers and divers.

The second balcony of the Aquatic Center accommodates up to 750 spectators and has a concession stand area.

On March 14-15, 2002, the Aquatic Center was host to the NCAA Zone B Diving Championships.

In July of 2000, the United States Olympic Divers put on two exhibitions before embarking

upon their trip to Sydney to compete in the 2000 games.

In 1999, UK hosted the Southeastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships at the Aquatic Center. Pool records fell left and right as some of the nation's most talented divers and fastest swimmers competed at the Aquatic Center, Feb. 17-20.

In addition to hosting the 1996 U.S. Olympic Diving Team, the Aquatic Center annually hosts the premier swimming and diving events in the state of Kentucky. These events include all UK home meets, the Kentucky State High School Championships, the Kentucky USS Championships, Zone and Regional Age Group and Senior Diving meets, Kentucky Special Olympics, and Bluegrass Games Diving meets. Highlights at the Aquatic Center have been the 1991 and 1999 Southeastern Conference Championships, the 1995 Southeastern Conference Diving Championships, the 1995 NCAA Zone B Diving Championships and the 1990 World Games Diving Team Trials.

UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY SWIMMING HISTORY

In 1936, the thought of having a swimming program at the University of Kentucky was just an idea tossed around by a group of water-lovers with skill and determination.

At that time, a pair of athletes named Bob Freeburg of Chicago and Sherman Hinkebein of Louisville went about the campus in search of talent among the student body. Organizing a squad of men who loved to swim was easy, but other obstacles stood in their way.

The first UK swim team was known as the "dry land swimming team" because UK did not have a pool. And since the University did not recognize swimming as a sport, the group had to purchase their own swimsuits and travel to Eastern State (now Eastern Kentucky University) in Richmond just to practice. Nevertheless, their determination paid off as some of the swimmers borrowed automobiles to travel to practice and meets, while others hitchhiked. Thus, UK's first men's swim team was formed.

Hinkebein, a UK track and football (team captain 1938) star, became coach and captain of the team at its inception. He turned over coaching duties when the UK Athletic Council recognized swimming as a varsity sport, to another student swimmer, Lloyd Ramsey, who lettered two years in basketball under Adolph Rupp. Hinkebein continued to swim for the Wildcats, and it was under Ramsey that the team won its first Kentucky State Intercollegiate Meet.

During its first three years of existence, the UK swim team had built up an enviable record, never losing a dual or state meet in Kentucky and being defeated only four times by outside competition. The pride of the UK squad was the medley team, undefeated in three years, that was made up of Hinkebein, Ramsey and James "Bud" Scott of Chicago. Two years later, UK would compete in its first SEC Championship Meet and finish seventh.

UK discontinued its swimming program in 1942, but in 1951, one year after the completion of Memorial Coliseum and UK's first swimming pool, the program was reinstated. Alfred M. Reece, a health and physical education instructor, was selected as coach and guided the team to third place in the 1954 SEC Championships. Reece's teams fared well against in-state schools with comparable programs, but were no match for institutions that offered full scholarships. UK offered only two tuition scholarships.

The University realized a renewed interest in swimming in 1964, when it hired Wynn Paul as head coach. Paul, a top-class swimmer at the University of Louisville, was undefeated in the 200 breaststroke and was named the Outstanding Swimmer in Kentucky by The Courier-Journal in 1958 and 1959. Paul introduced water polo to UK in 1964. The water polo program was discontinued in 1982 to make way for the newly created women's varsity swim program.

Ron Huebner, a UK swim letterman who graduated in 1968, succeeded Paul that fall and produced winning teams during a four-year tenure. Paul returned to the helm of the program in 1973, and it was under his direction that the team won the Kentucky Intercollegiate Swim Championships in 1975 for the second time in UK swim history.

From 1970 to 1983 the UK women's swim team competed only as a club sport. Originally included as one of six sports chosen to become varsity in 1974, the team was nudged out by field hockey because UK's then 20-year-old pool was inadequate and too overcrowded to accommodate the addition of another varsity team.

In 1980, the then-volunteer women's swim coach filed a sex discrimination Civil Rights Title IV complaint to the federal government, which led to the ruling that UK needed to sponsor an additional team for women. Thus, the creation of UK's first women's varsity swimming program occurred on July 1, 1983, with Paul named head coach.

The program has continued a strong combination of academics and competitiveness. The swimmers boast a winning record in the classroom, as over 95 percent of the swim Cats have graduated.

Kentucky's swimming program, now under the guidance of 14th-year coach Gary Conelly, is recognized as a force to be reckoned with in the SEC.

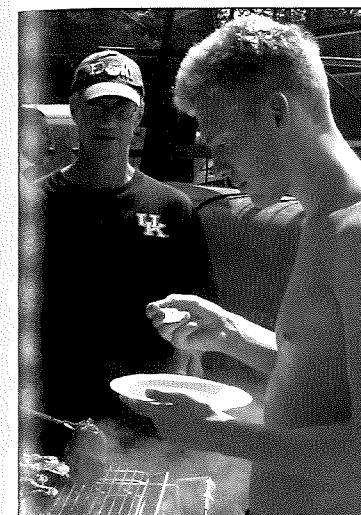

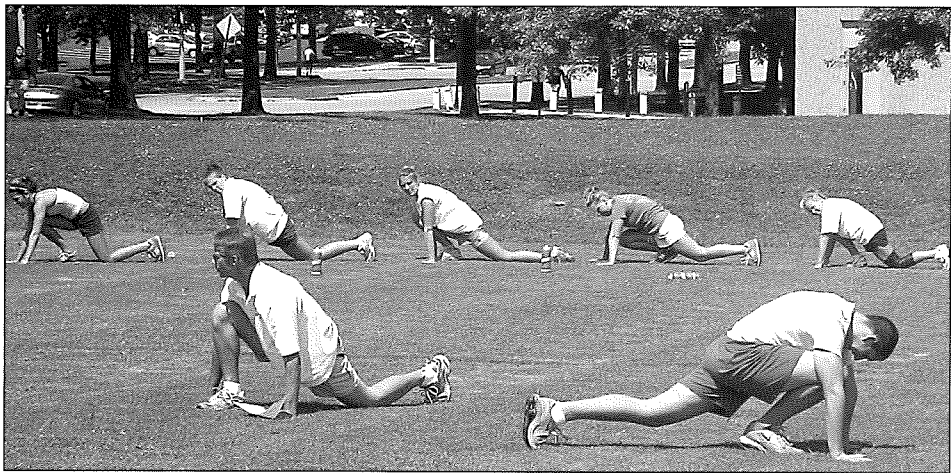

UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY

A Place to Dream and Succeed

The innovation and creativity of the teaching, research, medical care and community service underway at the University of Kentucky enhance the lives of people throughout the state, the nation, and the world, while its museums, libraries and special events enrich the culture of the entire Commonwealth.

Founded in 1865 as a land-grant institution adjacent to downtown Lexington, UK is nestled in the scenic heart of the unique Bluegrass region of Kentucky. From its early beginnings, with only 190 students and 10 professors, UK's campus now covers more than 687 acres and is home to over 25,000 students and nearly 11,000 employees.

PROGRAMS

Students can choose from some 200 majors and degree programs in 16 academic and professional colleges: Agriculture, Arts and Sciences, Business and Economics, Communications and Information Studies, Dentistry, Design, Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Health Sciences, Law, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Public Health, and Social Work.

RANKINGS

UK boasts over 80 national rankings for academic excellence. Graduate programs in the College of Pharmacy, Martin School of Public Policy and Administration, College of Law, College of Nursing, College of Medicine, College of Arts and Sciences, College of Education, College of Engineering, College of Health Sciences, and College of Social Work are highly ranked in *U.S. News & World Report's* most recent list of the nation's best. The College of Pharmacy is third, and the Martin School is ranked sixth in the category of public finance and budgeting. The College of Medicine's Rural Medicine program is ranked 20th, the College of Law is ranked among the top 50 public institutions, and the College of Nursing is ranked 29th.

STUDENTS

UK's diverse student population represents 117 countries, every state in the nation, and every Kentucky county. The average ACT score for its first-year students is four points above the national average. UK students compete successfully for the most prestigious scholarships and awards, such as the Fulbright, Truman, Goldwater and Marshall. UK was selected as one of only 13 universities nationwide to participate in the Beckman Foundation Scholarship program in 2002.

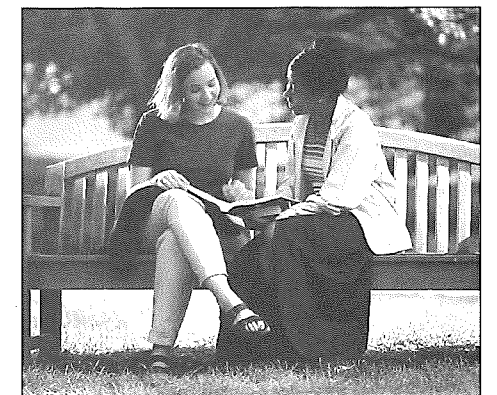
This prominent program allows

UK to award grants of \$17,600 to students to support their own research projects.

MISSION

Since the mid-1990s, UK has pursued an ambitious goal set by the State Legislature to become a top-20 public research university by the year 2020. UK President Lee T. Todd Jr. has embraced this goal in a way that promises an impact on every Kentucky resident.

"As the state's flagship institution, the university is mindful of its responsibility to help all Kentuckians," Todd says. "UK has an obligation



to be inclusive and accessible to all segments of our society by providing scholarships and financial assistance to ease the tuition burden. Through education, Kentucky will move forward."

The university is working aggressively to achieve its top-20 goal. During fiscal year 2003, UK faculty received a record-breaking total of \$222.7 million in extramural funding for grants and contracts, including a \$22 million grant from the National Science Foundation to strengthen and reform primary and secondary education in math and science in Kentucky.

The achievement marked the second year in a row UK exceeded the \$200 million level in sponsored project awards and placed the university 52nd on the National Science Foundation's list of all institutions and 36th among public universities.

RESEARCH

Research at UK is a dynamic enterprise encompassing both traditional scholarship and emerging technologies. The Advanced Science and Technology Commercialization Center in the center of campus, for example, is a hub for multidisciplinary research collaboration. It is just one of over 50 research centers and institutes across campus, including the well-known Sanders-Brown Center on Aging and Markey Cancer Center,

for the University of Kentucky, a \$600 million fund-raising effort - the largest in state history - to enhance facilities, academic programs, and public service. Recently, that goal was surpassed by \$18 million, and university officials announced plans to expand The Campaign by an additional \$400 million over the next four years, bringing the new total goal to \$1 billion.

PUBLIC SERVICE

The university is committed to strong public service, reaching out to communities across the Commonwealth, sharing knowledge and making a difference in the towns, cities and lives of all Kentuckians. An example is Health Education through Extension Leadership, a new partnership between the College of Public Health and the College of Agriculture and its Cooperative Extension Service to enhance extension agents' capacity to deliver valuable health and wellness information throughout the state.

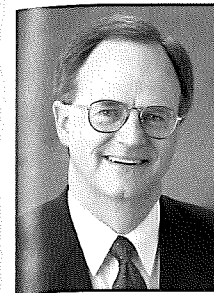
LIBRARY

With its well-manicured landscape and landmark buildings, UK's campus offers great facilities that advance the scholarship of its students and the research endeavors of its faculty. The William T. Young Library, only five years old, is among the world's leading research libraries; its book endowment is the largest among public universities and ranks second only to Harvard University among all universities. Its broad scope of technology offers students, faculty and Kentucky residents access to the most up-to-date information from online journals, government publications, and private studies, as well as more traditional materials.

MEDICAL CENTER

The UK Chandler Medical Center, opened in 1960, is considered one of the nation's finest academic medical centers. The faculty, students and staff of our young, dynamic Medical Center take pride in achieving excellence in education, patient care, research, and community service. As one of two Level 1 Trauma Centers in Kentucky, UK cares for the most critically injured and ill patients in the region. The 473-bed UK Hospital and UK Children's Hospital are supported by more than 500 faculty physicians and dentists, 400 resident physicians, and a staff of 3,200 health professionals committed to high-quality patient care.

DR. LEE T. TODD JR.
University of Kentucky President



Lee T. Todd Jr. became the 11th president of the University of Kentucky on July 1, 2001, after serving as senior vice president of Lotus Development Corp. President Todd is the fourth UK alumnus to

hold the presidency and the first to earn an undergraduate degree from UK.

Since assuming the leadership of the university, President Todd has overseen the conversion of the university from a chancellor system to the provost model and has directed the consolidation of several colleges and campus units to eliminate duplication of course studies and improve the overall quality of academics. President Todd has applied his background as a successful, high tech entrepreneur by emphasizing the university's role as an economic engine.

At UK, President Todd's vision for campus growth led to a record enrollment of more than 35,000 students in fall 2003. The freshman class also was the most academically talented group in UK's history. He successfully led the charge to provide scholarships to all Kentucky Governors Scholars and Governor's School for the Arts students and continues to work on increasing overall scholarship funding.

Through his belief that "the campus of the University of Kentucky is the Commonwealth of Kentucky," President Todd has made community outreach a priority at the university. Under his leadership, UK was awarded a \$22 million grant from the National Science Foundation to improve math and science education in Eastern Kentucky. He also developed the Health Education through Extension Leadership (HEEL) program, a partnership between the College of Medicine and its School of Public Health and the College of Agriculture and its Cooperative Extension Service, to assist in delivering valuable health and wellness information throughout the Commonwealth.

President Todd is noted as an outstanding leader who emphasizes students, strategic planning, and accountability. He has been particularly active and successful in working with student entrepreneurs, starting an e-Club on campus and participating with the Lexington Venture Club.

A native of Earlington, Ky., he earned his bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from UK in 1968 and his master's and doctoral degrees in electrical engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1970 and 1973, respectively. While at MIT, he received six patents for high-resolution display technology and proposed using telecommunications and high-resolution displays for data conferencing.

He returned to UK in 1974 as an electrical engineering professor. He won several teaching awards, including the UK Alumni Association Great Teacher Award. He also served on several university panels, including the University Senate for seven years. He was awarded the Outstanding Alumnus of Kentucky Award in 2002 from the Kentucky Advocates for Higher Education.

While at UK, President Todd founded Projectron Inc. in 1981 to make projection cathode ray tubes for flight simulators. He left UK in 1983 to begin product development at a second company, DataBeam Corp., which he had founded in 1976. In 1990, he sold Projectron to Hughes Aircraft Co. and convinced Hughes to move its other CRT operations in California and New York to UK's Coldstream Research Campus. He sold DataBeam, the world's leading provider of real-time collaboration and real-time distance learning software and development platforms, to IBM.

President Todd also co-founded the Kentucky Science and Technology Corp., a not-for-profit organization focused on increasing university research capacity, developing science and technology education (K-12) programs, and encouraging an entrepreneurial economy in Kentucky. He co-authored the initial proposal that resulted in Kentucky being selected as an EPSCoR (Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research) state. This program has resulted in bringing millions of dollars in research and development funds from federal and state matching sources.

President Todd served on the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education. He chaired the Distant Learning Advisory Committee that is responsible for the development of the Kentucky Commonwealth Virtual University and the Commonwealth Virtual Library.

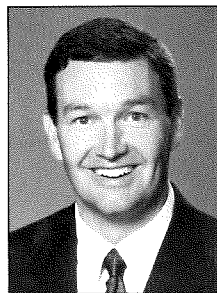
President Todd currently chairs the Southeastern Conference Committee on Academic Initiatives, serves on the American Council of Education Commission on Women in Higher Education, and is involved with the Business Higher Education Forum.

He is married to the former Patricia Brantley, a UK graduate who earned her master's degree from Simmons College in Boston. They have two grown children, Troy and Kathryn, both graduates of UK.



MITCH BARNHART

Director of Athletics



Mitch Barnhart is in his third year as Director of Athletics for the University of Kentucky having set a clear course for making Kentucky one of the top athletics programs in the country.

When UK President Lee T. Todd Jr. selected Barnhart on July 15, 2002, Todd proclaimed: "Mitch has deep passion for working with students, and his philosophies are very much in sync with mine on how to run this program. I believe he has a well-thought-out vision on how to move our athletics department forward."

And, that vision has become a beacon for the coaches, staff and student-athletes who are inspired and motivated by Barnhart's direction. In two years, he has hired five new head coaches, including Rich Brooks (football), Mickie DeMoss (women's basketball), John Cohen (baseball), Mo Muhammad (gymnastics), and Eileen Schmidt (softball).

Barnhart has also instructed his staff to seek out new revenue streams, and that has resulted in the Athletics Board's approval of fund raising for a new multi-purpose recruiting room that will be attached to the Nutter Field House and an expansion of Memorial Coliseum that includes new practice and office space.

His success is based on a five-principle philosophy that he implemented for the University of Kentucky Athletics the day he was hired.

- Operate in a first-class manner
- Possess great integrity
- Keep the focus on the student-athletes
- Provide sound fiscal management
- Compete for championships in all sports

Those principles have been the guiding force as UK has fully-staffed all sports.

Barnhart's connection to UK's student-athlete is evident by his personal interaction and commitment to provide all support services necessary to meet the needs of these students. UK spends \$1.5 million annually on its nationally-renowned CATS Academic Center. Spring 2004 marked the second-annual CATSPYs, an awards program designed to recognize the very best in UK Athletics.

Other initiatives begun under Barnhart's leadership include the Big Blue Caravan, which connect UK to its vast fan base each spring, a revamping of UK's donor program that has resulted in record K Fund dollars, and a 10-year, \$10-million commitment to fund the University's general scholarship program.

Barnhart came to Kentucky from Oregon State, where he served four years (1998-2002) as athletics director. A strong effort in fiscal management helped reduce the Beavers' operating debt from \$12.5 million to \$4.8 million during his tenure. He also raised \$20 million in capital

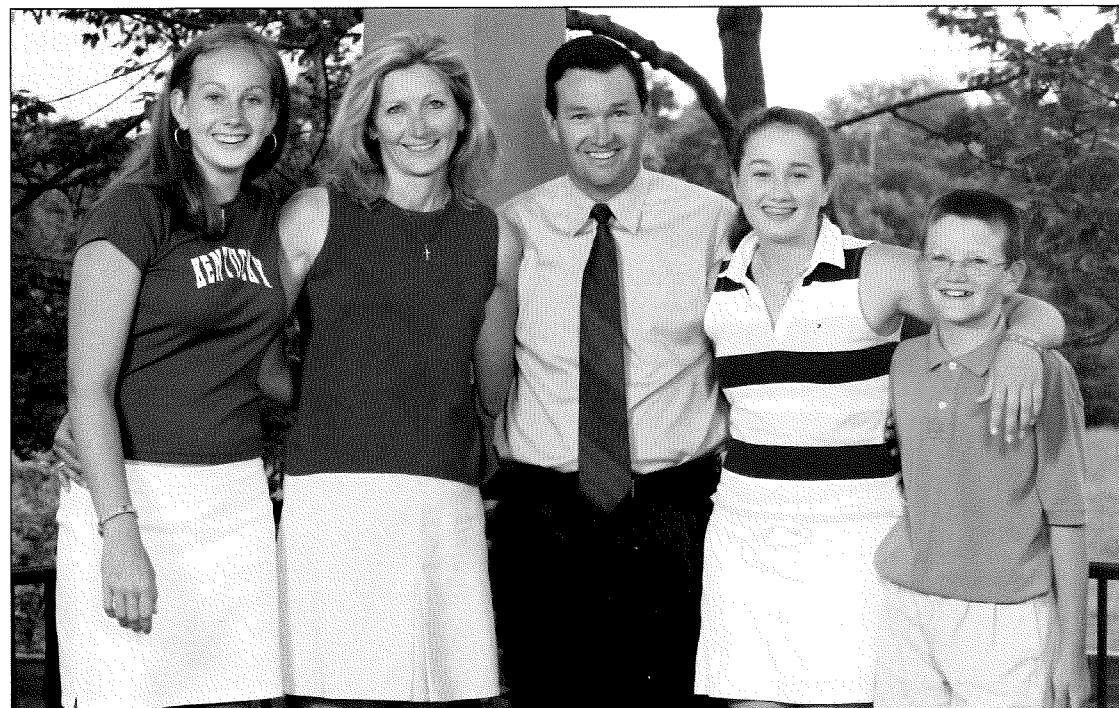

Before his tenure at OSU, he worked at Tennessee for 12 years (1986-98), the last four as Senior Associate Athletics Director. Before his term at UT, Barnhart served as assistant executive director of the Mustang Club at Southern Methodist University from 1983 to 1986; regional director for the Duck Athletic Fund at University of Oregon in 1983; and was an intern for the Aztec Athletic Foundation at San Diego State University in 1982-1983.

Barnhart, 44, is a native of Kansas City, Kan. He received his bachelor of arts degree from Ottawa University (Kansas) in 1981 and a master of science degree in sports administration from Ohio University in 1982.

He and his wife, the former Connie Brown, have three children, Kirby, 16, Blaire, 13, and Scott, 10.

UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY ATHLETICS

University of Kentucky Athletics continues to take its place itself among the nation's finest in terms of competitive success and classroom excellence.

The department-wide goal of maintaining a first-class program that features integrity and sound fiscal management has been embraced by all parts of campus. Focusing on the well-being of all student-athletes ensures quality education and opportunities for athletic success in all sports. It is an impressive agenda for a collegiate sports program rich in history and tradition.

While the UK athletics department was incorporated in 1945, organized sports can be traced as far back as 1889, when a mongrelized form of football-rugby was played on a campus field. The first game with a col-

lege opponent (an 8-2 victory over Georgetown College) took place on April 10, 1891. Three years later, with football players comprising most of the squad, UK instituted a varsity track program. Many of those same athletes helped start a baseball program in 1896.

Throughout the years, UK's student-athletes have captured much glory on the fields of competition. Its men's basketball program is generally regarded as the best in all of college sports. But UK athletes have excelled in other ways as well. In the last 11 years alone, seven of UKAA's top student-athletes have received post-graduate scholarships, 54 were named to an academic All-American team and 85 percent of those that completed their eligibility have graduated.

Since its first game was played 123 years ago, UK athletics now operates on a \$50 million budget and is one of 51 Division I departments that operate with a profit. It functions without state tax dollars or monies from UK's general fund. In fact, the athletics department has been profitable enough to make contributions to UK's general fund while establishing several scholarship funds in the names of past University presidents that enable UK's brightest undergraduates to attend graduate school at UK.

Now, with a renewed vision of giving every student-athlete the opportunity to compete for a national championship during their UK careers, optimism is high that University of Kentucky athletics will move to higher levels of achievement in the years to come.

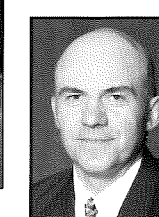

On the Rise

THE K FUND

The University of Kentucky Blue & White Fund was established in 1973 to provide a funding resource for student-athlete scholarships and a means to build and upgrade athletics facilities. In September 2002, UK Athletics began the process of evaluating the Blue & White Fund. The goal was to develop a new funding resource to replace the Blue & White Fund. This new resource should ensure fairness and equity in the season ticket allocation process, keep up with the rising cost of our student-athletes' tuition and maintain a competitive advantage against other SEC and NCAA schools. The product of this process is called the K Fund. Just as the Blue & White Fund provided student-ath-

lete scholarships, the K Fund will do that and more. Our goal is to provide support to the more than 450 Wildcat student-athletes and to ensure their academic and athletic success. Donations given to the K Fund will be used for:

- Student-Athlete Scholarships – tuition, room, board and books
- Academic Support and Career Development
- Athletics Facilities Maintenance

In order to adhere to a level of integrity that we are constantly striving to maintain at the University of Kentucky, we have put into practice several new procedures that will help us in

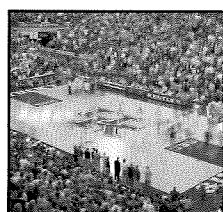

The University of Kentucky golf team has a tradition of excellence on and off the field. In 2002, three UK golfers were named to the NGCA Academic All-American Team.

One of the reasons for UK's academic achievements is the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic & Tutorial Services (CATS). The University of Kentucky opened the nation's first academic center for student-athletes in 1981.

Over the years, the services offered by CATS have grown, and so has the need for additional space. The UKAA has responded by constructing a new CATS area, which opened in January 1998. The new facility is called the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, thanks to a one-million-dollar grant from the Ohio Casualty Insurance Group.

The new Ohio Casualty Center cost a total of \$2.4 million and was constructed in the old Memorial Pool area. The new CATS, constructed in Memorial Coliseum, includes:

- 20,000 square feet of space - more than double the size of the former CATS facility;
- a computer room housing 35 computers;
- a study area which accommodates 90-100 people;
- 24 tutoring rooms;
- a career development and life skills resource center;
- a community outreach office; and
- offices for the staff.

Certainly, a facility is a good start, but any program - especially in academics - is only as good as the people who run it. And UK is fortunate to have outstanding leaders in its academics support system.

Bob Bradley, Associate Athletics Director for Student Services, oversees the CATS program. Bradley was named National Academic Advisor of the Year in 1989 and 1992. In 2000 he was selected as the CHAMPS Life Skills Coordinator of the Year by the NCAA Division I-A Athletic Directors Association.

CATS has a full-time staff of 11. In addition to Bradley, they are:

- **Barb Deniston**, Director of Academic Services;
- **Mike Haley**, Director of Advising Services;
- **Amy Craiglow, Dan Childs, Lisa Mattingly, Beth Kidwell and Michael Stone** Academic Counselors;
- **Martina Martin**, Lifeskills Coordinator;
- **D'Ann Blankenship and Andrea Tinsley**, Staff Assistants.

CATS also employs six graduate assistants and numerous tutors, both from the University and the surrounding community. UK has budgeted more than \$1,000,000 for the operation of CATS in the coming year.

"We are extremely proud of what we have accomplished in the academic arena," Bradley says. "The CATS program is focused on winning in the classroom. We look at each student-athlete's individual needs, set goals, and develop strategies to attain those goals. Our center provides our student-athletes with a definite advantage over student-athletes at

many other institutions. Our goal is to show that we care about the student as well as the athlete."

For the CATS staff, showing you care means more than helping athletes maintain eligibility, graduate, or win awards. The academics staff also prepares student-athletes for life after college with the Wildcat Career Development Program.

The Career Development Program helps student-athletes look to the future through a step-by-step process which includes:

- 20,000 square feet of space -
- mentoring and internships, which help determine career interests;
- career counseling;
- resume writing; and
- forming a career plan.

The Wildcat Career Development Program works closely with the University's Career Planning and Placement Center in order to provide additional assistance when needed.

The philosophy at the University of Kentucky is this: Colleges should be able to provide the student-athlete with every opportunity to succeed not only in athletics, but in academics as well. Looking at recent statistics in Academic Honor Roll selections and graduation rates, it is clear that Kentucky is standing by its philosophy.



WILLIAM T. YOUNG LIBRARY

\$58 Million Facility Showcases the University's Academic Commitment

In addition to providing the finest in athletic facilities, the University of Kentucky also provides student-athletes with the best in academic facilities. The latest addition to the educational landscape at UK is the \$58 million William T. Young Library, which opened in 1998.

- **Size:** The new library covers 365,350 square feet — more than six football fields. The building is five stories high, plus a basement.

- **Shelf capacity:** If laid end-to-end, the book-shelf space would stretch 198,828 linear feet — that's more than 37 miles of shelf space. The shelves will house 1.2 million books.

- **Seating capacity:** The new library can seat more than 4,000 patrons at one time, a 355 percent increase over the old library. The seating on the fifth floor of the new library equals the capacity of the former library.

- **Computer connections:** Every study table and study carrel in the new library has an electrical outlet and a computer jack connected to the university's computer system.

- **Flexibility:** The library has a state-of-the-art electronic infrastructure that will enable UK to take full advantage of current and emerging technology. In addition, the five floors and basement of the structure are designed as open, flexible spaces, enabling the library to adapt its services



and facilities to the future changes in needs of UK students.

- **Endowment:** The UK Library has the nation's largest book endowment among public universities and ranks second only to Harvard.



2004 CATSPYS

The swimming and diving team, as well as all of Kentucky's 22 varsity sports programs, are honored each year at the CATSPY Awards.

Based on the highly popular "ESPY Awards" hosted by ESPN, the CATSPY Awards ceremony is a dinner and awards show honoring UK student-athletes, coaches, and administrators. The event is held each year in April.

Awards are given in 24 categories. Among last year's award winners were men's swimmer Eddie Clement (Blue Heart Award-Comeback of the Year) and women's diver Kari Retrum (Play of the Year by a female athlete). All of the 2004 award-winners are listed below.

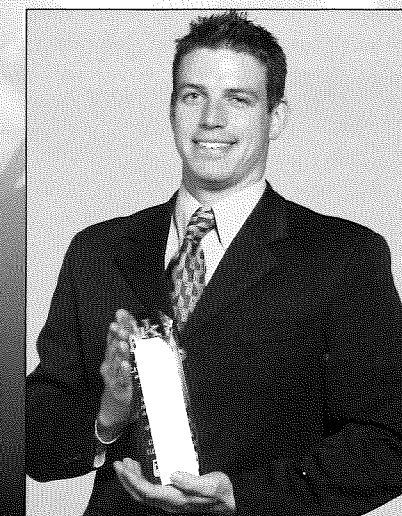

PAGEANTRY

Blue & White

The University of Kentucky adopted blue and white as its official colors in 1892.

Originally, however, UK students had decided on blue and light yellow prior to the Kentucky-Centre College football game on December 19, 1891.

The shade of blue, which is close to a royal blue, was chosen when a student asked the question, "What color blue?"

At the time, Richard C. Stoll (who lettered in football at UK in 1889-94) pulled off his necktie and held it up. The students then adopted that particular shade of blue.

A year later, UK students officially dropped the light yellow color for white.

Wildcats Nickname

The official nickname for the University of Kentucky's athletics teams is "Wildcats." The nickname became synonymous with UK shortly after a 6-2 football victory over Illinois on Oct. 9, 1909, on the road.

Commandant Carbusier, then head of the military department at old State University (UK), told a group of students in a chapel service following the game that the Kentucky football team had "fought like Wildcats."

Later the name Wildcats became more and more popular among UK followers as well as with members of the media. As a result, the nickname was adopted by the University.

Live Mascot

In 2002, the University, in cooperation with the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife, adopted a three-year-old male bobcat to serve as the Wildcats' "official" mascot.

The wildcat has a permanent residence on display at a game farm just west of the state

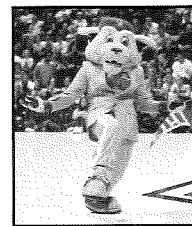


capitol in Frankfort, Ky. The UK Athletics Association sponsored a name-the-wildcat Internet contest and the final three possibilities were Tucky, Blue and Champ, with Blue earning the final nod after nearly 50,000 votes were cast.

Through the years, UK has had other official live mascots with colorful names. Records indicate that the first wild animal was given to the University in 1921. Named "Tom," this live Kentucky wildcat died quickly from captivity and was replaced by "TNT." Other live mascots followed, including "Whiskers," "Hot Tamale" and "Colonel," only to pass on due to old age or being turned loose in the mountains after they failed to thrive in captivity.

The current cat was born in captivity and donated by the Woods and Wetlands of Cadiz Ky. His life expectancy is 15-25 years.

Wildcat Mascot

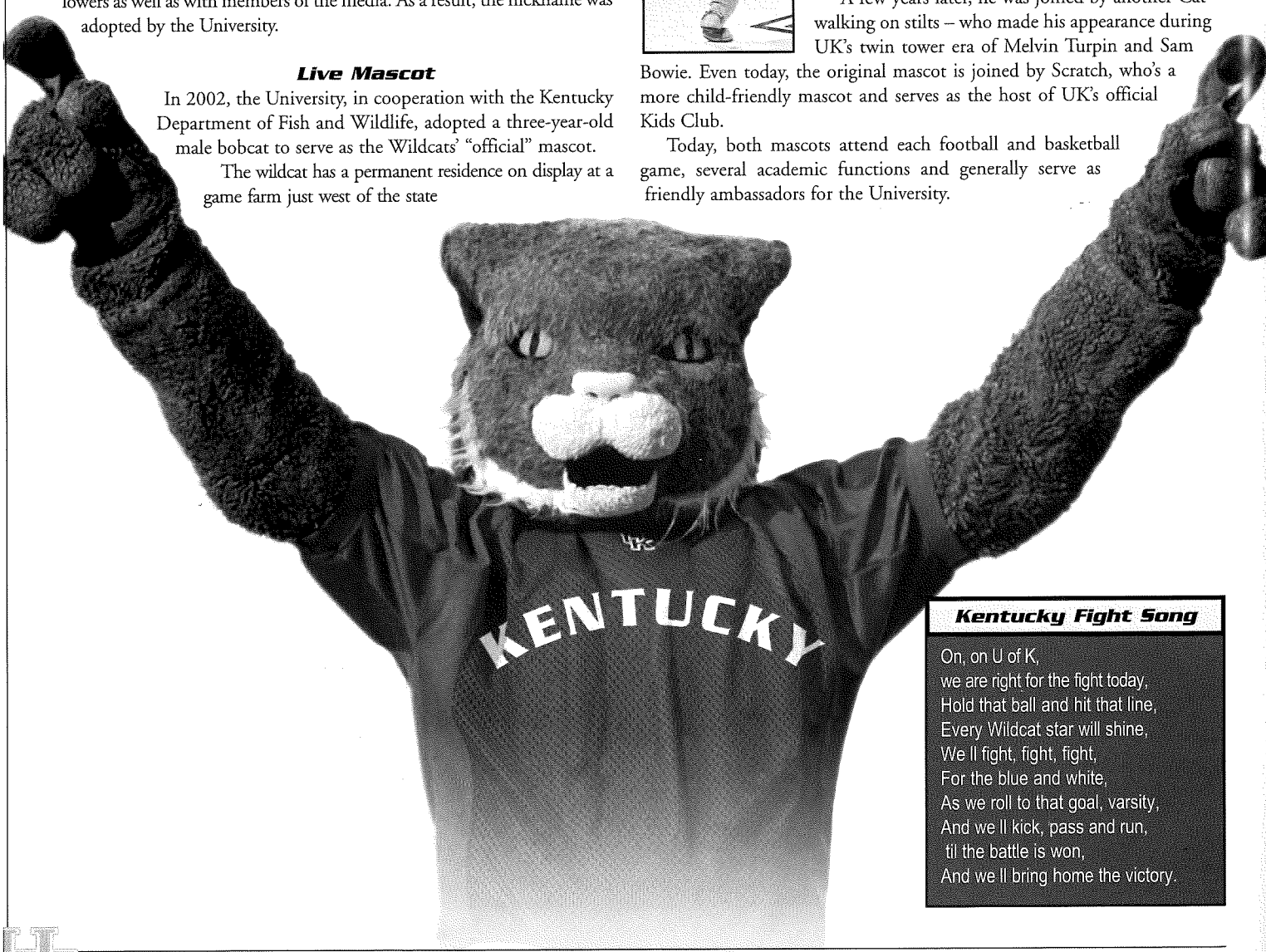


The Wildcat mascot originated during the 1976-77 academic year at UK. Gary Tanner was the original Wildcat dancing and entertaining thousands of UK fans at Commonwealth Stadium and Rupp Arena during athletic events.

A few years later, he was joined by another Cat - walking on stilts - who made his appearance during UK's twin tower era of Melvin Turpin and Sam

Bowie. Even today, the original mascot is joined by Scratch, who's a more child-friendly mascot and serves as the host of UK's official Kids Club.

Today, both mascots attend each football and basketball game, several academic functions and generally serve as friendly ambassadors for the University.

Abraham Lincoln was born in Hodgenville (the one-room cabin is part of a National Historic Site). The plantation home that inspired Stephen Foster to write "My Old Kentucky Home" still stands at a state park of the same name. And the region that 200 years ago gave birth to one of Kentucky's most famous exports bourbon whiskey is dotted with world-famous distilleries.

Though the above words were written by one of Kentucky's favorite sons, any one of the millions of visitors to the Bluegrass State each year might nod in agreement.

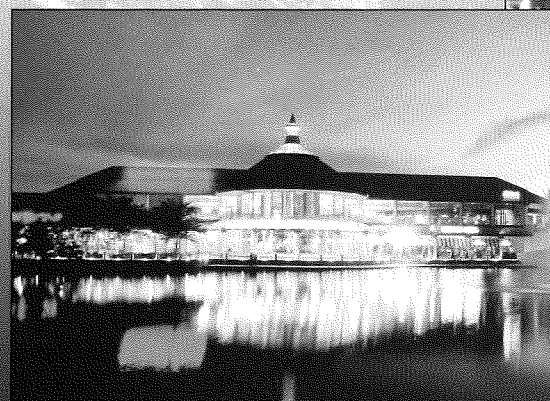
Lexington is a city to explore, from shopping and entertainment to one-of-a-kind restaurants and enjoyable accommodations — all within minutes of the UK campus.
