

Coaching Staff

Gary Conelly

Head Coach



The 2001-02 season marks Gary Conelly's 11th year as head coach of the Wildcats' swimming and diving programs. Conelly has compiled a record of 119-89 (75-34-Women/44-55 Men) in dual meets. Conelly was named head women's

coach in 1991-92 and began leading the men's program before the 1992-93 season.

Last season, Conelly led the men's team to its nighest-ever NCAA finish as the Wildcats placed 17th. UK also achieved its highest SEC finish in 18 years, placing fifth. Five individuals from the men's team competed at the NCAAs, seniors Dave Iweedie, Macon White, Aaron Workman and Shaun Zitani and sophomore Roger Watkins, all rive of them earning All-America honorable mention. Conelly also coached the women to the NCAAs, where they placed 39th. Seniors Melissa Olson and Jaime Siegele competed at the championships, with Siegele earning All-America honorable mention in the 50 freestyle.

During the 1999-2000 season, Conelly led the nen's team to a top-20 finish and had two men qualify for the NCAA championships, both earnng honorable mention All-America honors. Four lifferent women qualified for the NCAA Championships. The women comprised the 800 reestyle relay that finished 12th and earned the vomen honorable mention All-America honors in ddition to competing individually. Following the eason, nine Wildcats participated in the 2000 Olympic trials.

In 1998-99, Conelly led both the men's and vomen's teams to top-25 finishes at the NCAA


Championships. The men finished at No. 24, while the women finished 21st, their fifth consecutive top-25 showing. The women's squad had 10 athletes advance to the NCAA meet, the most in school history. Senior diver Paco Rivera finished second in platform diving, becoming the top NCAA finisher in school history.

Conelly led the 1996-97 men's team to a 26th-place NCAA finish and Nat Lewis finished third in the 1,650 freestyle and still ranks as the secondhighest NCAA finisher in school history. The women finished in 24th place and had three team members earn All-Amer-

In the 1995-96 season, Conelly led the women's team to a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships, the highest finish in school history. In 1994-95, Conelly led the women's team to a fourth-place finish at the SEC Championships and a second straight 19th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Conelly was named 1995 SEC Women's Coach of the Year for his efforts.

Prior to becoming head coach at Kentucky, Conelly spent three years with UK as a graduate assistant coach. In Conelly's 11 years with UK, the swimming and diving programs have made great strides. In 1990, Conelly coached the team's first female All-American and NCAA finalist. Kellie Moran. Since then, 19 more Wildcat swimmers have garnered All-America accolades under Conelly's tutelage.

Conelly came to the University of Kentucky from the West Florida Lightning Aquatics USS team in Largo, Fla. During his seven years at West Florida, Conelly directed 150 swimmers and produced three Olympic Trial qualifiers, two National



tival champion in the 100 backstroke.

As a swimmer, Conelly was a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team and he participated on the world record-setting 400-meter freestyle relay team. An Indiana University alumnus, Conelly was a 15-time NCAA All-American and is a member of the Indiana Swimming Hall of Fame. In 1973, Indiana honored him with the Balfour Award for excellence in swimming, leadership, and scholarship.

Conelly is married to Kathleen Healey and has two children, Cody and Emily.

Michael Lyden

Diving Coach



Michael Lyden begins his ninth season as diving coach at the University of Kentucky. Since joining the Wildcats, Lyden has led UK to diving prominence. At the 1994 NCAA Championships, Tina Johnson became UK's first diving All-American on

the platform, placing eighth, and Jenny Baker earned honorable mention All-America in two events. In 1995, both divers earned All-American status, with Baker finishing eighth on the one-meter and Johnson finishing second on the platform. He had a third diver, Beth Leake, qualify for the meet, but Leake tore her medial collateral ligament in a training session prior to the competition.

Last season Lyden had one of his most successful seasons since joining UK. Sophomore Clayton Moss became the third UK man to be an SEC champion as he won the one-meter event. Moss earned All-American status on the one-meter springboard as he placed fourth at the NCAA Championships. He also earned honorable mention All-American for his 10th-place finish on the platform. Aaron Kirkpatrick also had a successful season under Lyden's tutelage. The junior garnered honorable mention All-American status with a 18th-place finish on the three-meter springboard at the NCAA championships.

During the 1999-2000 season, Lyden had junior Carrie Knoeber and freshman Moss qualify for the NCAA Championship meet. Knoeber earned honorable mention All-American honors on the three-meter while Moss earned All-American honors on the one-meter, three-meter, and platform. Moss' honors were the first for a freshman in UK history.

Coaching Staff

In 1998 Paco Rivera became the first male UK diver to claim a Southeastern Conference title, winning the platform event and garnering All-SEC honors. Rivera advanced to the NCAA Championships, where he was named as an All-American in three events including a second place finish on the platform.


SEC three-meter springboard championship and SEC Female Diver of the Year honors. Soulakis and Rivera both earned All-America honors.

In 1996, Leake and Soulakis joined Baker and Johnson in earning All-America honors. Leake finished second on the one-meter and fourth on the three-meter, Johnson finished third on the one-meter and platform, and Baker finished seventh on the platform. For his divers' accomplishments, Lyden was honored as the Southeastern Conference and NCAA Women's Diving Coach

Before arriving at UK, Lyden spent nine seasons at Eastern Michigan where he was the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year nine times. He then moved to LSU where he received SEC Women's Coach of the Year four times consecutively and was the 1992 SEC Men's Coach of the Year. During Lyden's tenure at LSU his divers won 15 of 24 possible SEC titles.

Along with his college coaching, Lyden has always coached U.S. Diving Clubs and has had numerous All-Americans and has coached six age group divers to 17 national championships. Lyden has served as the National Team Coach in 1988-90, 1992, 1994-96, 1998-2000 and has directed divers in competitions in Italy, Austria, Mexico, Canada, Spain, China, France, and Holland

In 1997, Lyden coached Christy Soulakis to the



In addition to coaching, Lyden has been a member of the U.S. Diving Rules Committee, the U.S. Olympic International Diving Committee and is a lifetime member of U.S. Diving. In 1993-94 and 1997-99, Lyden served on the NCAA Rules Committee.

A 1980 graduate of Western Michigan University, Lyden is married to Emily Joan Sullivan of Toledo, Ohio. They have three children - Jessica Ann (11), John Tyler (Jack) (9) and Brittany

Pete Knox

Assistant Coach

Pete Knox is in his 10th year as assistant coach after serving four years as UK's graduate assistant. Often described as a vigorous and intense leader, Knox primarily works as a sprint coach and has developed many Wildcats swimmers, such as 1996 NCAA qualifier Rick Barber. Knox brings his vocal and energetic approach to every practice and has an exceptional ability to motivate his swim-

mers. With an exercise physiology and research background, Knox specializes in an ongoing weight-training program.

Knox came to Kentucky from Brandon, Fla., where he coached the Brandon High School men's and women's teams from 1980 to 1988. While at Brandon, his teams consistently placed in the top 10 of the Florida High School Championships. Knox also developed two All-America high school swimmers and had several Junior and Senior National qualifiers. An assistant coach

with the Brandon Blue Wave USS Team from 1981 to 1988, Knox was selected Hillsborough County Coach of the Year

A native of Norfolk, Va., Knox graduated with honors from the University of Florida in 1978 with a degree in health education. Knox earned a master's degree in exercise physiology with an emphasis directed toward the application to swimming from UK in 1999.

Knox is married to former Wildcat swimming standout Wendy Hipskind.



John Brucato

Assistant Coach

John Brucato is in his third season with the UK swimming program. Brucato works primarily with the middle distance group and breaststrokers.

Brucato comes to UK via the USS club team Wildcat Aquatics in Lexington. He is in his 11th season with Wildcat Aquatics. Brucato joined WA in the spring of 1990 and has established himself as a leader in the Kentucky swim coaching community.

During his tenure with WA, Brucato

has produced numerous Top-16 qualifiers, Junior National qualifiers, Junior National Champions, Senior National qualifiers, and an Olympic Gold Medalist. He is a former Kentucky Swimming Coach of the Year, in addition to being a Select Camp Coach and an Olympic Festival Coach.

In 1992, Brucato coached Megan Kleine to a gold medal in the 1992 Olympic Games as part of the United States' 400-meter medley relay. Kleine, who swam for six years under Brucato at WA, won Senior Nationals twice in the 100-meter breaststroke. Kleine went on to

A native of Covington, Ky., Brucato began his coaching career at the Covington YMCA and then spent two years with the Covington Clippers Swim Team. In 1985, he took over the helm at the Nashville Aquatic Club where he spent five successful years as the Head Age

Group Coach before being hired on as

the WA Senior Head Coach.

Brucato is a 1985 graduate of Northern Kentucky University where he received a degree in psychology. He lives in Lexington with his wife Jan, and their 13-year-old daughter, Katie.

Wynn Paul

Aquatics Director



A former coach of the UK men's and women's swimming squads and the water polo team, Wynn Paul has been a member of the UK staff for more than 35 years. He relinquished his coaching duties in 1991 to devote full time to the position of Aquatics

Director, overseeing facilities operations and event management at the Lancaster Aquatic Center.

Paul was named UK's men's coach in 1964 and assumed the duties of women's head coach when it became a varsity sport at Kentucky in 1983. During his coaching tenure, Paul compiled an impressive 135-61 dual meet record with the men's program and a 48-30 mark with the women's program.

Paul also was the men's varsity water polo coach from 1965-1982. His water polo teams had an outstanding 140-66 record, including the 1977 Midwest Conference Championship, before the program was dropped in 1983.

Paul's success as a coach is a testament to his extensive involvement in all aspects of swimming. Paul has served as meet director for the South-

eastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships, the NCAA Zone "B" Qualifying Meet, the World Games Diving Trials, the Kentucky High School Championships, the Kentucky Special Olympics and the Kentucky USS Championships. He serves as meet director for all UK home meets.

A 1962 Louisville graduate, Paul was captain of his U of L swim team. He was the Cardinals' high point scorer for three years and held 12 varsity records. After graduating from U of L, Paul attended graduate school at UK.

Paul is married to Helen Pennington, an Assistant Professor of Nursing at Eastern Kentucky University.

Micki King

Assistant Athletic Director/ Senior Women's Administrator



Micki King enters her ninth year with the UK Athletics Association. Before being named Assistant Athletics Director and Senior Women's Administrator, King served as Special Assistant to the Athletics Director. She oversees the men's

and women's swimming and diving programs, women's basketball, men's and women's tennis, rifle, and the cheerleading and pom squads.

A native of Pontiac, Mich., King served 26 years in the United States Air Force, retiring with

the rank of colonel in 1992. During her years of service, King saw assignments in Michigan, California, Washington, Colorado, Kentucky, and Germany. In fact, in 1973, King was the first woman to teach physical education at a military academy when she served at the United States Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs.

Along with her military service, King was an accomplished diver. She graduated in 1966 from the University of Michigan, where she was coached by five-time U.S. Olympic coach Dick Kimball. King was the 1972 springboard diving Olympic gold medalist. She missed a chance at the gold medal in the 1968 Summer Games where she dropped from first to fourth when she hit the board and broke her arm during the Olympic finals.

In her decorated career, King competed in two Pan American Games and won international diving titles in 15 countries. She is an inductee in seven Halls of Fame, including the prestigious United States Olympic Hall of Fame.

After her diving career, King turned to coaching and served at the Air Force Academy from 1973-77. She was also a commentator for NBC Sports in the 1976 Olympics. King returned to the Academy in 1983 and was named assistant athletics director and diving coach. During this time, she was named NCAA Division II Coach of the Year three times. Under King's tutelage, 11 divers were honored as All-Americans and two claimed national titles. In 1988, King traveled to the Seoul Games as a staff member of the U.S. Olympic diving team, and later served in the same capacity at the Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta.

King resides in Lexington and has two children, Michelle and Kevin.



Women's Swimming & Diving Outlook

he UK women's team was disappointed after it finished the 2000-01 season sixth in the Southeastern Conference and 39th at the NCAAs. And although key members from last year's team are gone after swimming for the Cats for four years, Coach Gary Conelly is confident the Cats can improve both in the conference and nationally as he has brought in a large freshman class.

"We lost four very important girls, but we are bringing in nine new promising ones, so we should make up in quantity what we lost in quality," said Conelly, who begins his 11th season coaching the UK women's team.

Backstroke

Senior Sarah Carter, already sixth on UK's top-10 list in the 200, returns to lead the backstroke group. Carter ended the 2001 season with a strong finish, swimming to her career best in the 200 (2:02.29) at the SEC Championships.

Sophomores Jenaca Pumphrey, who will compete in the 200, and Shawna Sechrist, a sprinter and a middle distance backstroker, return. Along with freshman Jessica Siegele they form a solid three-deep behind Carter. Sechrist (2:02.63) and Pumphrey (2:04.60) both set career-bests last season that put them on UK's all-time list in the 200 at seventh and ninth respectively.

"It looks to me like we are going to be at least three deep in most events this year," said Conelly. "That means that very often we will have a 1-2-3 sweep or stand a good chance of three in the top four of many dual meets."


Butterfly

"I think both Debra (Hinsley) and Carolyn

(Rader) could be NCAA qualifiers in the 200 this year," says Conelly. Rader, who ranks third on the UK top-10 list in the 200 butterfly (1:59.69) and fourth in the 100 (55.59), is considered an all-around swimmer who can compete in all freestyle and butterfly events. Hinsley, who is fifth on UK's top-10 list in the 200 (2:01.17), could be the main force in the butterfly this year as Rader could be shifted around to fill holes in other events.

There also are high expectations surrounding incoming freshman Xenavee Pangelinan. A 2001 World Championship and 1999 Pan Pax participant in both the 100 and 200 butterflies and the 200 and 400 IM's, she could have a big year for the Cats.

"She promises to be a standout in butterfly events along with IM," Conelly said.

Pool Manager



Letitia Hollingsworth enters her sixth season as Lancaster Aquatic Center Pool Manager. Prior to her stint as pool manager, Hollingsworth served as the UK swim team's staff assistant. At UK home meets, she serves as the technical manager for the electronic timing system and scoreboard.

The UK alumna and Lexington, Ky., native swam for the Wildcats from 1982-86

and was the captain of UK's first varsity women's swim team.

Hollingsworth teaches courses in CPR, lifeguarding, and

Hollingsworth is married to Steve Gray and resides in Lexington.

"Kendra made some tremendous strides last year, and should she pick up where she left off last year, NCAA qualifying times are not out of the question," said Conelly.

Trahan will also be looked upon to fill a spot in the 200 and 400 medley relay as well.

Skinner did see significant time in the pool last season, but she will have to drop times in order to be a serious factor for the Cats this season.

Freestyle

A lot of unanswered questions fill the air around the freestylers this season. None of the incoming freshmen are thought to be pure sprint swimmers, so there will be an adjustment period at the beginning of the season. With little experience returning after the loss of NCAA participants Melissa Olson and Jaime Siegele, the young and inexperienced talent will have to work hard to fill the void.

Senior Sarah Hoppe and junior Kelly Neal return in the sprint freestyle. Freshmen Marci Vrooman, Jessica Siegele and Chrissy Miller could turn into very good sprint and middle distance freestylers, but they may need time in the pool to adjust to the speed found in the collegiate ranks.

"You have to think Jessica has a good shot of filling the void," said Conelly, noting that Jessica could follow in the footsteps of her sister, former UK standout Jaime.


Senior Carolyn Rader, who ranks on UK's top-10 lists in every freestyle event other than the 50, should be a force in the middle distance once again. Rader, one of the strongest all-

around returnees, was a NCAA qualifier during the 1999 and 2000 seasons, making the "B" cut in the 200 and 500 freestyles last season.

Freshmen Cami Miller and Caitlin Muldoon, combined with senior Debra Hinsley and sophomore Amanda Bourgeois, should make a strong distance freestyle group.

Individual Medley

Freshmen Miller and Pangelinan will look to compensate for the loss of UK's 200 and 400 IM record-holder Melissa Olson. Miller and Pangelinan will most likely swim the 400 IM while Trahan will be asked to step in and try to shoulder some of the load in the 200. Last season Trahan opened up

strong, winning the 200 IM during the Louisville dual meet in her first collegiate event and later in the season placed second in the Arkansas dual meet.

Additionally, Hinsley may help out in the IM's and the versatile Rader, who ranks fifth on UK's top-10 list in the 400 (4:25.15), may step in at times this season as well.

Diving

The divers could once again be a dominating force in the SECs. Diving Coach Mike Lyden is convinced that even though he lost two outstanding divers to graduation in Sarah Fields and Carrie Knoeber, the addition of freshmen Alison Riccobono and Trisha Tumlin-

son might actually bolster the program.

"We have three solid women in Kelli (Frost), Alison and Trisha," says Lyden. "We should be competing for top honors in all dual meets as well as championships."

Frost, who is a junior, had an outstanding dual meet record last season, finishing fourth or higher on the one-meter every time she competed. Riccobono is a two-time Michigan State Champion who finished second on the one-meter at Junior Olympic East Nationals and fifth on the one-meter at JO Summer Nationals. Tumlinson was a high school All-American who won both the one- and three-meter titles at the JO West Nationals, and finished second on onemeter, sixth on three-meter and won the platform at JO Nationals. Tumlinson followed that up by winning the platform at Senior Nationals.

Schedule

The Cats face a traditionally strong schedule. Conelly is counting on the upperclassmen to help the nine new faces prepare to face tough competition.

"Traditionally, age group and high school swimmers think they can only swim fast once a season when they are tapered," he said. "Because the team aspect is so much greater, swimmers find out early on that even during hard training they can swim much faster than expected. Competition is intense in the SEC and

the times are fast."

Conelly is looking for improvement in the team's SEC finish this year. "A fifth-place finish would be doable as we are battling Tennessee, LSU, Arkansas, South Carolina and Alabama. We stand a good chance of improving one or even two places at the meet this year."

Men's Swimming & Diving Outlook

espite the loss of four of the strongest swimmers in school history, UK's holdovers and 13 incoming freshmen will try to build on the momentum of last year's squad. The 2001 team finished 17th at the NCAA Championships, the highest finish by a UK men's squad, and earned fifth-place at the Southeastern Conference tournament, the highest in 18 years.

"The men had such a great season that we want to try and consolidate that and get above that level," said Coach Gary Conelly, beginning his 10th season coaching the Wildcat men. "Our goal is to step it up even with the losses we have had. We are as strong as we were last year, just in different areas, which should give us a completely different look in dual and championship meets."

Freestyle

The biggest hit came in the freestyle event, which lost four seniors. Conelly said the four competitors were among the strongest freestylers – both sprint and middle distance — to ever fill the lanes at Lancaster Aquatic Center.

Junior Aaron Cuker, who ranks third in the 200 and sixth in the 100 breaststrokes on UK's all-time list, will be an integral part of the Wildcats this season. Fortunately, Conelly recruited well the last two years with the intention of filling those voids. Sophomores Daniel Wimer, Fernando Barros and Jamie Peterkin are expected to step up.

"All three had moderately successful seasons, but they were always in the shadow of Aaron (Workman) and Shaun (Zitani)," Conelly said. "Now they have to take a lot on their shoulders and cannot sit back."

Competing in the SEC, one of the premier sprint conferences in the country, makes the losses tougher as two of the sprinters are among those that are no longer with the team. Team co-captain Roger Watkins will be looked upon to lead the sprinters with the aid of Barros. Watkins had an excellent sophomore campaign as he improved his sprint time to rank fifth (20.58) on the UK all-time list. Barros also joined UK's top-10 list in the 50 freestyle (20.82).

"The hope is that we will see progress from the newcomers quickly this year," Conelly said, referring to the large group of freshman freestylers, both sprint and distance.

The middle distance position also has question marks, as two of the departed, David Tweedie and Macon White, were middle distance freestylers. None of the returnees have solid collegiate experience, so incoming freshmen Daniel Cruz, who

also will compete in the sprint, and Ryan Bowman, both of whom have excellent potential, will be asked to produce in the 200 and 500 freestyles.

The distance freestyle will be one of the weaker spots on the team this year. Senior Dave Kuendig has been good in the distance, but there is little depth behind him. Sophomore Darron Berquist had a good freshman year and will be expected to help out. Freshman Dave Roberts could be the final piece to the distance puzzle.

Backstroke

Possibly the most exciting and most improved component of the team, the backstroke, also could be one of the strongest. Sophomore transfer Joey Faltraco, who swam for SEC-foe South Carolina two seasons ago, was a finalist during the 2000 Summer Olympic Trials and placed at the NCAA Championships his freshman year. His fastest time in the 200 backstroke, 1:44.66, is faster than any time ever recorded at UK (1:47.22).

Junior Cody Nath is primarily a backstroke specialist, which is evidenced by the fact that he ranks on UK's all-time list in both the 100 (51.97) and 200 (1:52.12) backstrokes and is the most accomplished of the returnees in both events. Barros is also a strong competitor in the 100, ranking fourth on UK's all-time list (51.67). Berquist and Roberts

will be asked to step up to give the team a solid foundation and possibly lead some of the medley relay squads.

Butterfly

Losing the school's 100 butterfly record-holder is not good news, but welcoming the return of Eddie Clement and Matt Nilson certainly softens the blow. And newcomer Daniel Cruz arrives at UK with expectations of filling the shoes of the departed All-American Shaun Zitani.

"I think Daniel will be as good as Shaun was in the 100 fly," Conelly said of the talented freshman whose best times in both the 100 (49.59) and 200 (1:50.09) already would rank him on the school's top-10 list.

Depth is a key in the butterfly. Clement holds the team record in the 200 butterfly (1:48.04) and Nilson is ranked fourth (1:49.65) on that list. Both are also very solid in the 100. All three could add a major spark to the medley relay teams. Faltraco could contribute here as well.

Breaststroke

Watkins, who set the team record in both the 100 (54.84) and 200 (2:00.52) breaststroke events last year, and Aaron Cuker should push each other and their teammates all season. Tom Vogt and Eddie Wolling also are very capable.

Incoming freshman Mike Arce, a Swimmer of the Year in Georgia, will provide depth.


"Watkins, who qualified as part of a relay, was the first alternate at the NCAAs in the 100, so as a junior he is expected to qualify as an individual," Conelly said. "He had a fabulous year last year, but I think it will be even better this year. He is very focused on his goals and is training very well."

Individual Medley

The distance individual medley could be another strong event for the Wildcats. Clement, Cuker, Faltraco and Nilson create a very deep and experienced 400 IM squad with both Clement (3:55.79) and Cuker (3:59.00) ranking among UK's top 10.

But with the SEC being such a strong speed conference, the 200 IM could turn out to be a difficult event for the Wildcats.

"We may get down to the conference championship and realize that we don't have the speed to get past some of these teams and pull our guys out of the water in the 200 and use them in other events," Conelly said.



Diving

Quite possibly the strongest pair of divers to ever be on UK's roster at the same time are returning All-American Clayton Moss and All-America honorable mention Aaron Kirkpatrick, both scorers at the 2001 NCAAs. Three times last season the duo combined to go 1-2 in dual meets while two other times they finished second and third.

Moss, who became just the third Wildcat to ever capture an SEC title, had an outstanding season, finishing fourth on the one-meter at the NCAA Championships to earn All-America honors, while garnering honorable mention for a 10th-place finish on the platform. The junior also placed 18th on the three-meter. He rounded out his year by earning a spot on the Senior National Team on the three-meter and platform.

Kirkpatrick, a senior, was just as strong, finishing eighth on the one-meter and three-meter at the Senior Nationals. At the NCAA Championships, he finished 12th on the three-meter, garnering All-America honorable mention accolades, 22nd on the platform and 27th on the one-meter.

Newcomer John Collier adds talented depth, creating the possibility that the trio could finish 1-2-3 in dual meets.

Schedule

The SEC always offers strong competition and this season is no different. The test comes early as the team travels to Florida in October for

the SEC East Extravaganza.

"The majority of the good SEC teams are in this division," notes Conelly. "We expect to see some very fast swimming early in the year. The freshmen don't really understand how fast SEC swimming is until they experience it first hand. (The SEC East Extravaganza) will give us a good idea of how good the freshmen will really be."

Other dual meets figure to be just as intriguing as the SEC East meet. The Wildcats travel to Knoxville to face both LSU and Tennessee.

"In the past," Conelly says, "the Volunteers have been so strong that at one point they were able to bring anyone and beat us. Now they have to think twice about who they bring."

As always, the regional match-ups bring a lot of excitement. Louisville, Cincinnati and Indiana are all usually good meets. Last year, UK finally defeated the Hoosiers for the first time.

Another test of the team's resolve will come in mid-November when UK travels to North Carolina for the Nike Cup. Conelly sees this event as a good indicator of how his swimmers will perform in the conference championship while providing an excellent opportunity to collect some NCAA cuts early in the season.

Men's Swimming & Diving Team

tions: across-the-pool racing at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. Two 25-yard courses can be utilized for large swim meets. Eighteen swimming lanes are available while diving events are in progress. Long course racing will have eight full-size lanes for the 50-meter distance.

The swimming tank, which holds 1,025,000 gallons of water, has a raised deck gutter with a large overflow. This gutter design is similar to the Indianapolis Natatorium design. Pool depth varies from 4.3 feet to 6.5 feet at the shallow end utilizing a movable floor of 35 by 75 feet. Water under the diving boards and tower is 17 feet deep. The natatorium features Daktronic automatic timing for swim meets. A 16-by-23 foot wall-mounted scoreboard allows full display of information for eight-lane and 16-lane swim meets. The scoreboard can also display graphics and animation sequences.

The diving facilities are among the best in the world. The facility has two 1-meter boards and two 3-meter boards set on concrete platforms. Each platform is eight feet wide with lengths from Championships. 23 feet to 28 feet.

The facility won the 1990 Association of General Contractors Award for Structures. There is a 40-foot dryland diving area permanently set up with a trampoline, Portapit diving board and two diving/tumbling harnesses for somersaulting and twisting practice.

The Aquatic Center has a full training room equipped with two treatment tables, EGS and ultrasound machine, hydrocollator, and ice machine. There is a trainer on duty at all times.

The Aquatic Center has a weight room for swimmers and divers equipped with Cybex weight training machines. In the adjacent Seaton Physical Education building are exercise physiology labs that are utilized for the testing of swim-

The second balcony of the Aquatic Center accommodates up to 750 spectators and has a concession stand area.

In 1999, UK hosted the Southeastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships at the Aquatic Center. Pool records fell left and right as some of the nation's most talented divers and fastest swimmers competed at the Aquatic Center, Feb. 17-20.

In addition to hosting the 1996 U.S. Olympic Diving Team, the Aquatic Center annually hosts the premier swimming and diving events in the state of Kentucky. These events include all UK home meets, the Kentucky State High School Championships, the Kentucky USS Championships, Zone and Regional Age Group and Senior Diving meets, Kentucky Special Olympics, and Bluegrass Games Diving meets. Highlights at the Aquatic Center have been the 1991 and 1999 Southeastern Conference Championships, the 1995 Southeastern Conference Diving Championships, the 1995 NCAA Zone B Diving Championships and the 1990 World Games Diving Team Trials.

America's Next Great University

he University of Kentucky was founded in 1865 as a land-grant institution, and the present name dates to 1916.

The campus in Lexington has 687 acres and is located just south of downtown. It consists of a graduate school, the University of Kentucky Hospital, UK Children's Hospital and 16 colleges. The colleges are agriculture, allied health professions, architecture, arts and sciences, business and economics, communications and information studies, dentistry, education, engineering, fine arts, human environmental sciences, law, medicine, nursing, pharmacy and social work. The graduate school offers 94 master's degree programs, three specialists degrees and 56 doctoral programs.

Enrollment is more than 32,000 and includes students from every Kentucky county, every state and 115 countries. Full-time faculty number

1,889. Approximately 98 percent of the full-time faculty hold the highest possible degrees in their fields. UK's faculty and staff attract more than \$160 million annually in grants, gifts and contracts.

The University attracts excellent students. The average ACT score for first-year students is four points above the national average. Meanwhile, UK students compete successfully for prestigious scholarships, such as the \$30,000 Truman Scholarships.

Since the mid-1990s, the University has pursued an ambitious goal to become a top-20 public university by the year 2020. UK's new president, Dr. Lee T. Todd Jr., has embraced this goal in a way that promises an impact on every Kentucky resident.

"The campus of the University of Kentucky encompasses the area within the boundaries of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. We have a responsibility as a landgrant university to help this state move forward," Todd says.

The University is taking aggressive steps to fulfill its top-20 goal. To date, UK boasts 60 national rankings for quality education and research. Last year, officials launched The Campaign for the University of

Kentucky, a \$600 million fund-raising effort to enhance faculty, students, facilities, academic programs and public service. The campaign, the largest in state history, expects to reach its goal by June 2003. As of June 2001, UK has raised more than \$400 million.

UK also offers great facilities to advance the scholarship of its students and the endeavors of its scientists. The William T. Young Library, only three years old, already has assumed a position among the world's leading research libraries; its book endowment is the largest among public universities, and ranks second only to Harvard's. Its broad scope of technology offers students, faculty and Kentucky residents special access to the most up-to-date information from online journals, government publications and private studies, as well as more traditional materials.

For a decade, UK has ranked among America's leaders in supercomputing and in sharing its capacity with researchers across the nation. The campus' current supercomputer can process more than 100 billion calculations per second. Advances will place UK third among the world's research university supercomputers this fall.

Meanwhile, UK maintains 24 research centers that conduct applied research in areas as diverse as tobacco and health, aging, cancer, toxicology, equine health, mineral production, manufacturing systems and public policy.

Several centers excel in the services offered to the public. The Center for Manufacturing Systems has helped more than 500 small and midsized industrial firms in Kentucky. The Gluck Equine Research Center is one of only three of its kind in the world, offering research into diseases of the horse.

The UK College of Medicine is consistently ranked among the top schools nationally in the quality of primary-care training. The UK College of Pharmacy is ranked third in the country by U.S. News & World Report and is one of the few pharmacy schools in the country with the capability of developing a drug "from bench to bedside."

The University has demonstrated its commitment to partnerships with business, evidenced in part by its Coldstream Research Campus. This 750-acre complex provides space and buildings for production facilities of private companies, including some of the nation's leading high-tech firms. Seven companies currently operate commercial facilities at the campus, which also offers an advantageous location for distribution of products to dozens of states.

University of Kentucky scholars - students, faculty and alumni - have been honored by Nobel, Pulitzer, Rhodes, Fulbright, Guggenheim, Grammy, Metropolitan Opera and other prestigious panels. Mindful of their responsibility to the world, they are guiding citizens and nations through the challenges of this new century.

nanimously voted president-elect of the University of Kentucky on Jan. 23, 2001, Dr. Lee T. Todd Jr. officially began his term as UK's 11th President on July 1, 2001.


Dr. Todd was Senior Vice President of Lotus Development, where he led the Messaging and Collaboration Business Unit, one of three business units at Lotus. In this capacity, he was responsible for

the traditional Lotus Products such as Notes, Domino, SmartSuite, and related products. In addition, he oversaw the new collaborative offerings such as Sametime and QuickPlace.

Dr. Todd received his bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering from the University of Kentucky and his master of science and doctoral degrees in electrical engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. While a graduate student at MIT, he received six U.S. patents in the area of high-resolution display technology. It was during that time that he began proposing the application of telecommunications and high-resolution displays for data conferencing.

Dr. Todd began his career in 1974 as a University of Kentucky professor in the electrical engineering department, where he taught for nine years. During that time, he published numerous research articles, gave many conference presentations and won several teaching awards, including the UK Alumni Association Great Teacher Award. He holds eight U.S. patents in the area of large-

Dr. Todd founded Projectron, Inc., in 1981 to manufacture projection cathode ray tubes for the flight-simulation industry. In 1990, Projectron was sold to Hughes Aircraft Company. Dr. Todd was



Dr. Todd also founded Data-Beam Corporation. Since its founding in 1983, DataBeam has been the world's leading provider of real-time collaboration and real-time distant

learning software and development platforms. DataBeam was acquired by IBM in 1998, and now reports into Lotus Development Company.


Dr. Todd speaks frequently about the benefits of technology in economic development and education. He founded the Kentucky Science and Technology Corporation, a not-for-profit organization focused on increasing university research capacity, developing science and technology education (K-12) programs, and encouraging an entrepreneurial economy in Kentucky. Various Kentucky governors have appointed him to statewide committees related to education and economic development.

He was formerly on the Council on Postsecondary Education that oversees operations of all Kentucky universities, community colleges, and vocational schools. He also chaired the Distant Learning Advisory Committee that is responsible for the development of the Kentucky Commonwealth Virtual University and the Commonwealth Virtual Library. KCVU went "on-line" in the fall semester of 1999 and presently has the largest enrollment of any similar institution in the country. He previously chaired the Technology and Workforce Committees of the Governor's Quality and Efficiency Task Force that resulted in the initiation of the Kentucky Information Highway and the formation of the CIO position in state government.

Dr. Todd serves on the board of several organizations, is chairman of the Kentucky Science and Technology Council, and an advisory board member of Louisville Gas & Electric Corporation.

Dr. Todd has received numerous awards and recognitions, including Junior Achievement Business Laureate, Lane Report Leadership in Science and Technology, UK Engineering Hall of Distinction, Beta Gamma Sigma Outstanding Business Leader of the Year, Phi Delta Kappa Service to Education Award, Telecon Magazine Hall of Fame, Industrial Science Award from the Kentucky Society of Professional Engineers, and the Governor's New Product Award.

Dr. Todd is married to the former Patricia Brantley and they have two children, Troy and



arry W. Ivy is in his second year as Athletics Director at the University of Ken-■tucky, his 33rd year at the school where he has earned widespread recognition as one of the top administrators in collegiate athletics.

Ivy faced major challenges in his first year as athletics director. When the possibility of rules violations arose in the UK football program, Ivy took decisive action. He spearheaded a thorough investigation that revealed improprieties, resulting in a change of leadership for the football program. Ivy's promotion of Guy Morriss to head coach in February was well-received by the players, the public and the media.

Following those challenges, Ivy is focusing his efforts more on the general operations of the UK Athletics Association and its \$41 million annual budget, 22 varsity sports and 150 employees. It is an area for which he is well prepared, after having spent three decades at the University.

When C.M. Newton announced in December 1999 that he would retire as the UK Athletics Director after ushering the department through its most successful decade in school history, the comment "hard act to follow" resonated throughout the collegiate sports landscape. But when an advisory committee began reviewing potential candidates for Newton's replacement, the mere

mention of Larry Ivy prompted enthusiastic endorsements from athletics administrators, coaches, private industry leaders, media and seemingly everyone who had an opinion to voice.

In an instant, "hard act to follow" was replaced by "perfect choice."

On March 20, 2000, the University of Kentucky Athletics Board unanimously approved then-UK Pres-

ident Charles T. Wethington's recommendation that Ivy become UK's new Athletics Director. On April 4. the University's Board of Trustees approved Ivy's appointment, and he took the reins on July 1, 2000.

Ivy came to UK in 1969 at the age of 25 as the nation's youngest director of housing. In 1976, he joined the UKAA as an assistant athletics director, overseeing the association's fiscal affairs. When Newton joined UK as Athletics Director in 1989, he promoted Ivy to associate athletics director for internal affairs, making Ivy the top assistant to the AD. Ivy was promoted in 1993 to senior associate athletics director. His responsibilities included overseeing day-to-day operations of the association in the absence of the director, handling operations and serving as game management director for the men's basketball and football teams, and coordinating facilities, maintenance, grounds, tickets, accounting, purchasing and data processing.


Ivy has been a major contributor to the phenomenal growth of the University of Kentucky Athletics Association in his 25 years as an administrator. Since he joined the UKAA in 1976:

- The budget has increased from \$3 million in 1976-77 to \$41 million in fiscal year 2001;
- From nine men's sports to 22 varsity sports today, including the addition of women's sports into UK Athletics:
 - From 40 full-time employees to 150.

In the competitive arena, the Wildcats have won three NCAA Men's Basketball Championships, appeared in six NCAA Final Fours and played in six college football bowl games, among numerous other accomplishments.

Larry Ivy has been the one administrative presence throughout this era of tremendous growth and success.

The Huntsville, Ala., native quickly established himself as one of the most knowledgeable college administrators in the nation. A master organizer, Ivy has served as tournament manager for nine rounds of the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament held in Lexington - including the 1985 Final Four -



and for three Southeastern Conference Men's Basketball Tournaments. Ivv has served on numerous committees for the SEC, and currently is chairman of the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament Ticket Committee.

A defining moment for Ivy occurred at the 1995 NCAA Convention, when he was recognized as the 1994 NCAA Business Manager of the Year by the College Athletic

Business Managers of America (CABMA), the highest honor given by the group. The national award recognized Ivy's outstanding achievement in managing the finances of the UK Athletics Association. He is an honorary member of Omicron Delta Kappa, an honor society that emphasizes academics and leadership. He is also an honorary member of the K-Association, the UKAA letterwinners organization.

Ivy, a UK Fellow, earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Alabama in 1967 and a master's in business administration from there in 1968.

He and his wife Dorene are very active in the Central Kentucky community. While Ivy serves on the YMCA, Lexington Sports Commission and UK Basketball Museum boards, Dorene is on the board of the American Heart Association. Last year, the pair served as chairpersons for the annual Heart Association walk. They have two children, Kim Ivy and Rob Manchester.

Ohio Casualty Center for Academic & Tutorial Services

ne of the cornerstones in the philosophy of University of Kentucky Athletics is a commitment to academic success. Much of the credit for UK's academic success goes to the Athletics Association's academic support system - the Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, or simply, "CATS."

UK opened CATS in 1981, the nation's first academic center dedicated exclusively to student-athletes. Over the years, as the services offered by CATS have grown, so did the need for additional space.


As a result, UK has built a new facility - the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, thanks to a one-million dollar grant from the Ohio Casualty Insurance Group. The new Ohio Casualty Center opened in 1998 at a total cost of \$2.4 million.

The new CATS, constructed in Memorial Coliseum, includes:

- 20,000 square feet of space more than double sees the CATS program. Bradley was the size of the former CATS facility;
- a computer room housing 35 computers;
- a study area which accommodates 90-100 people; • 24 tutoring rooms;
- a career development and life skills resource center; Barb Deniston,
- · a community outreach office; and
- offices for the staff.

Certainly, a facility is a good start, but any program - especially in academics - is only as good as the people who run it. And UK is fortunate to have outstanding leaders in its academics support system. Bob Bradley, Associate Athletics Director for Student Services, over-

tants and numerous tutors, both from the University and the surrounding community. UK has budgeted more than \$1,000,000 for the operation of CATS in the coming year.

"We are extremely proud of what we have accomplished in the academic arena," Bradley says. "The CATS program is focused on winning in the classroom. We look at each student-athlete's individual needs, set goals, and develop strategies to attain those goals. Our center provides our student-athletes with a definite advantage over student-athletes at many other institutions. Our goal is to show that we care about the student as well as

For the CATS staff, showing you care means more than helping athletes maintain eligibility, graduate, or win awards. The academics staff also prepares student-athletes for life after college with the Wildcat Career Development Program.

The Career Development Program helps student-athletes look to the future through a step-bystep process which includes:

- career counseling;
- resume writing; and
- · forming a career plan.

The Wildcat Career Development Program works closely with the University's Career Planning and Placement Center in order to provide additional assistance when needed.
