

Gary Conelly Head Coach

Gary Conelly is in his eighth year as head coach of the Wildcats, with an overall dual meet record of 79-69 (48-30 women/ 31-39

men). Conelly was named UK's head women's coach in 1991-92 and men's head coach before the 1992-93 season.

Last season, Conelly led both the men's and women's teams to top-25 finishes at the NCAA Championships. The men registered their highest finish ever, coming in at No. 24, while the women finished 21st, their fifth consecutive top-25 showing. The women's squad had 10 athletes advance to the NCAA meet, the most in school history. Senior diver Paco Rivera finished second in platform diving, becoming the top NCAA finisher in school history.

In 1996-97, Conelly led the men's team to a 26th-place finish, at the time the men's best

finish ever. Nat Lewis finished third in the 1,650 freestyle and ranks as the second-highest NCAA finisher in school history. The women finished in 24th place and had three team members earn All-America honors.

In the 1995-96 season, Conelly led the women's team to a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships, the highest finish in school history. In 1994-95, Conelly led the women's team to a fourth-place finish at the SEC Championships and a second straight 19th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Conelly was named 1995 SEC Women's Coach of the Year for his efforts.

Prior to becoming head coach at Kentucky, Conelly spent three years with UK as a graduate assistant coach. In Conelly's 11 years with UK, the swimming and diving programs have made great strides. In 1990, Conelly coached the team's first female All-American and NCAA finalist, Kellie Moran. Since then, seven more Wildcat athletes have garnered All-America accolades under Conelly's tutelage.


Conelly came to the University of Ken-

tucky from the West Florida Lightning Aquatics USS team in Largo, Fla. During his seven years at West Florida, Conelly directed 150 swimmers and produced three Olympic Trial qualifiers, two National Sports Festival team members, and one Sports Festival champion.

In 1987-88, Conelly became the first swim coach at St. Petersburg Junior College. He has also coached at the Charleston Swim Association in South Carolina and served as head coach of the Union Deportivo swim team in Las Palmas, Spain.

As a swimmer, Conelly was a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team and participated on the world record-setting 400-meter freestyle relay team. An Indiana University alumnus, Conelly was a 15-time NCAA All-American and is a member of the Indiana Swimming Hall of Fame. In 1973, Indiana honored him with the Balfour Award for excellence in swimming, leadership and scholarship.

Conelly is married to Kathleen Healey and has two children, Cody and Emily.



Michael Lyden **Diving Coach**

The 1998-99 season marks Michael Lyden's sixth season as diving coach at the University of Kentucky.

Since joining the Wildcats, Lyden has led UK to diving prominence. At the 1994 NCAA Championships, Tina Johnson became UK's first diving All-American on the platform and Jenny Baker earned honorable mention All-American in two events. In 1995, both divers earned All-America status and Lyden was named SEC Diving Coach of the Year for his efforts.

In 1996, Beth Leake and Christy Soulakis joined Baker and Johnson, with all four earning All-America honors. For his accomplishments, Lyden was honored as 1996 SEC and NCAA Women's Diving Coach of the Year.

In 1997, Lyden led Soulakis to the SEC three-meter springboard championship and SEC Female Diver of the Year honors, while Soulakis and Paco Rivera claimed All-America awards.

Last season, Rivera became the first male UK diver to claim an SEC championship, winning the platform event and garnering All-SEC honors. Rivera advanced to the NCAA Championships, where he was named All-American in three events.

Before arriving at UK, Lyden spent nine seasons at Eastern Michigan, where he was named Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year every season. He then moved to LSU, where he received SEC Women's Coach of the Year four times in four seasons and SEC Men's Coach of the Year in 1992. While at LSU, Lyden's divers won 15 of 24 possible SEC titles.

Lyden served as a U.S. National Team coach in 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996 and 1998, and has directed Junior and Senior divers in competitions in

Italy, Austria, Mexico, Canada, Spain and China.

In addition to coaching, Lyden is a member of the U.S. Diving Rules Committee, the U.S. Olympic International Diving Committee, a senior representative of the Southern Local Diving Committee, and a lifetime member of U.S. Diving. In 1993-94, Lyden served on the NCAA Member Rules Com-

A 1980 graduate of Western Michigan University, Lyden is married to Emily Joan Sullivan of Toledo, Ohio. They have three children - Jessica Ann, John Tyler and Brittany Barbara.

Assistant Coach

Pete Knox is in his seventh year as an assistant coach after serving four years as UK's graduate assistant. Often described

as a vigorous and intense leader, Knox primarily works as a sprint coach, coaching such swimmers as 1996 NCAA qualifier Rick Barber. Knox brings his vocal and energetic approach to every practice and has an

exceptional ability to motivate his swimmers. With an exercise physiology and research background, Knox facilitates an ongoing weight-training program.

Knox came to Kentucky from Brandon, Fla., where he coached the Brandon High School men's and women's teams from 1980 to 1988. While at Brandon, his teams consistently placed in the top 10 at the Florida High School Championships. Knox also developed two All-America high school swimmers and had several Junior and Senior National qualifiers. An assistant coach with the Brandon Blue Wave USS Team from 1981 to 1988, Knox was selected Hillsborough County Coach of the Year in 1987.

. A native of Norfolk, Va., Knox graduated with honors from the University of Florida in 1978 with a degree in health education. Knox is currently working toward a master's degree in exercise physiology with an emphasis directed toward the application to swim-

Kevin Antshel is in his fifth season with the UK swimming Antshel served as a graduate assistant for two sea-

sons before becoming a full-time assistant in 1996. Antshel works primarily with the dis-

Antshel was a four-year letterman for UNC's varsity swim program and was a GTE Academic All-American from 1990-92. He received the 1992 Richard E. Jamerson Most Improved Swimmer Award and the

1992 Robert F. Osterneck Unsung Hero psychology doctoral candidates currently Award.

Antshel came to UK after receiving a M.A. in sport psychology and a B.A. in psychology and political science from the University of North Carolina. completing his master's at UNC, Antshel was an assistant coach for the varsity men's and women's swimming teams and a teaching assistant for the Kinesiology Department, winning the UNC Undergraduate Teaching Excellence Award in 1994. In his five seasons of coaching, he has coached 14

Antshel is a Ph.D. candidate and is currently working on his dissertation. He is believed to be one of the few, if not the only,

coaching at a Division I institution.



Leslie Ramsey Assistant Coach

Leslie Ramsey is in her fourth season with the University of Kentucky swimming program and her third year as a graduate assis-

tant. Ramsey will serve as an individual medley and butterfly coach.

While swimming under UK assistant coach Kevin Antshel's guidance at the University of North Carolina, Ramsey trained for the 1996 U.S. Olympic Trials, where she swam a personal best and reached the consolation finals, finishing 14th.

The 1995 graduate of UNC earned All-America honors in the 200 butterfly her junior and senior seasons. She also earned honorable mention All-America honors in the 500 and 1,650 freestyles while at North

During her junior season, Ramsey was named Atlantic Coast Conference Female Swimmer of the Year. She was an ACC Champion in the 200 butterfly her freshman and junior seasons. Ramsey also won team awards for Most Dedicated Swimmer her junior and senior years, Most Outstanding Swimmer and Most Valuable Swimmer her junior year. She did her club swimming with

the Coast Guard Blue Dolphins in York-

Ramsey has coached at UNC Swim camps and travels frequently. She accompanied Coach Gary Conelly on a coaching trip to Heidelberg, Germany during the summer of 1996, and traveled to eastern Africa in 1997 on a teaching excursion.

Ramsey, a biology and sports science major, was a two-time member of the ACC's Academic Honor Roll. She is currently pursuing a master's degree in sport management

Wynn Paul Aquatics Director

A former UK men's and women's swimming and water polo coach, Wynn Paul has been a member of the UK staff for more than

30 years. He relinquished his coaching duties in 1991, when he accepted his current position of Aquatics Director, where he oversees facilities operations and event management at the Lancaster Aquatic Center.

Paul was named UK's men's coach in 1964

and assumed the duties of women's head coach when it became a varsity sport at Kentucky in 1983. During his coaching tenure, Paul compiled an impressive 135-61 dual meet record with the men's program and a 48-30 mark with the women's program.

Paul also was the men's varsity water polo coach from 1965-1982. His water polo teams had an outstanding 140-66 record, including the 1977 Midwest Conference Championship, before the program was dropped in 1983.

Paul's success as a coach is a testament to his extensive involvement in all aspects of swimming. Paul has served as meet director for the Southeastern Conference Swimming

and Diving Championships, the NCAA Zone "B" Qualifying Meet, the World Games Diving Trials, the Kentucky High School Championships, the Kentucky Special Olympics and the Kentucky USS Championships. He serves as meet director for all UK home meets.

A 1962 University of Louisville graduate, Paul was captain of his U of L swim team. He was the Cardinals' high point scorer for three years and held 12 varsity records. After graduating from U of L, Paul attended graduate school at UK.

Paul is married to Helen Pennington, an Assistant Professor of Nursing at Eastern Kentucky University.



Micki King Special Assistant to the Athletics Director

Micki King enters her sixth year with the UK Athletics Association. Since being named Special Assistant to the

Athletics Director in 1992, King has overseen the men's and women's swimming and diving teams, men's and women's tennis teams, rifle team, and cheerleading and pom squads.

A native of Pontiac, Mich., King served 26 years in the United States Air Force before retiring with the rank of colonel in 1992. During her years of service, King saw


assignments in Michigan, California, Washington, Colorado, Kentucky, and Germany. In fact, in 1973, King was the first woman to teach physical education at a military academy when she served at the United States Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs.

Prior to her military service, King was an accomplished diver. She graduated from the University of Michigan in 1966, where she was coached by five-time U.S. Olympic coach Dick Kimball. King was the 1972 springboard diving Olympic gold medalist and also participated in the 1968 Summer Games, where she finished fourth. In her decorated career, King also competed in two Pan American Games and won international diving titles in 15 countries. She is an inductee in seven Halls of Fame, including the

prestigious United States Olympic Hall of Fame.

After her diving career, King turned to coaching and served at the Air Force Academy from 1973-77 before taking a leave to work as a commentator for NBC Sports. King returned to the Academy in 1983 and was named assistant athletics director and diving coach. During this stint, she was named NCAA Division II coach of the year three times. Under King's tutelage, 11 divers were honored as All-Americans and two claimed national titles. In 1988, King traveled to the Seoul Games as a staff member of the U.S. Olympic diving team, and later served in the same capacity at the Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta.

King resides in Lexington and has two children, Michelle and Kevin.

Letitia Hollingsworth enters her third season as Lancaster Aquatic Center Pool Manager. Prior to her stint as pool manager, Hollingsworth served as the UK swim team's staff assistant.

Hollingsworth teaches courses in CPR and swimming safety and serves as an examiner for the Red Cross. She is currently pursuing her MBA at UK.

1998-99 Women's Swimming & Diving Outlook

ollowing a season in which the UK women's swimming and diving team broke 13 school records, sent 10 studentathletes to the NCAA Championships, finished 8-1 in dual meets, claimed 13 All-America awards and posted a top 25 NCAA finish, some observers might feel there is no room for improvement. Coach Gary Conelly disagrees.

"This year's team should be even better because of their experience level. We have in there as well," Conelly remarked. seven of our 10 NCAA competitors back, along with several more who just missed the NCAA cuts. We've also brought in some talented athletes who should more than replace those we lost," Conelly said.

Conelly's claims. UK returns SEC champion and three-time team MVP Rachel Komisarz, two-time honorable mention All-American Melissa Olson, sprint and relay star Annabel Kosten and 1997 SEC Diver of the Year Christy Soulakis, along with other standouts.

Komisarz won the 200 butter-

fly at the 1998 SEC Championships and claimed All-SEC honors. She followed up her impressive conference showing a few weeks later at the NCAA Championships, where she claimed four All-America awards. Conelly said that Komisarz is strong in all strokes, especially the fly. "Rachel's strength and power make her a deadly force in the fly."

Melissa Olson returns after a phenomenal freshman season in which she shattered three school records, posted three top 20 finishes at the NCAAs and won more than 10 events in dual meets. "Melissa just destroyed our records in the IM events," Conelly said. "She has been a great addition to our squad."

A sprint freestyle specialist, Annabel Kosten set a new UK record in the 50 freestyle. She also swam on four recordbreaking relay teams, claiming All-America honors at the NCAA meet.

Christy Soulakis will return to strengthen the diving contingent. Soulakis placed third on the platform at the SEC meet, but narrowly missed the NCAA cut. Soulakis hopes to rebound this season, and diving coach Mike Lyden expects nothing less. "Christy is my veteran," Lyden

said. "She is strong in all the diving events. I am expecting big things from her this year."

In addition to the returning Cats, UK has added a strong freshman class to bolster the corps. The UK staff is counting on fast times from many of the younger swimmers. "Carolyn Rader should really contribute this season. Tracy Sullivan came to us with some fast times, and Deborah Hinsley should be

UK's squad will be strong in many events, but its strength may be the sprints. Jaime Siegele and Jenny Priester return to join Kosten after claiming All-America honors in sprint relays at the 1998 NCAA Champi-A quick scan of the roster supports onships. Conelly is happy with his stable of

sprinters. "Jaime and Jenny are both strong racers and competitors. Rachel Komisarz is as good a sprinter as anyone on the team and Tracy Sullivan and Sarah Hoppe will factor in as well. We're deep in the sprint events."

As the distances increase, the Cats remain strong. "Rachel will be able to help us in the middle-distance freestyle swims, and some freshmen may contribute as well," Conelly said. "Kelley Miller has swum the 1,650 at the SEC meet for two years and Carolyn is a strong distance swimmer as well."

The aquatic Cats should also score big in the breaststroke events this season. Conelly said, "We have two NCAA breaststrokers back in Emily Grass and Jennifer Clifford. We feel pretty good about the breaststroke."

Taryn Kannegeisser, Kristi Lohmeier and Melissa Olson should carry the load in the backstroke. Each already owns a spot in UK's alltime top five in one or more backstroke event.

SEC champion Rachel Komisarz will handle butterfly duties, along with junior Emily Buske. Buske ranks in UK's all-time top 10 in both butterflies and Conelly expects an improvement this season. "Emily hasn't reached her best yet. She should be even stronger this year," he said.

Joining Komisarz and Buske will be senior Emily Grass and freshmen Carolyn Rader and Debra Hinsley. Conelly conceded, "We're in pretty good shape in the fly events."

Sophomore Melissa Olson should continue her record-setting ways in the individual medley events and will get help from senior Emily Grass and frosh Carolyn Rader. Olson shattered UK's old IM records and Grass ranks in UK's all-time top five in both IMs. Rader may lack experience on the collegiate level, but her high school swims impressed the UK coaches.

The UK diving squad will be as strong as ever, with Soulakis joining sophomores Carrie Knoeber and Sarah Fields on the boards. Soulakis is a proven competitor and diving coach Mike Lyden is confident Carrie Knoeber and Sarah Fields are ready to contribute.

"Carrie is as talented as anyone in the country. She improved a lot last year, and when she is on she can be one of the best divers in the country," Lyden said. "And Sarah did really well last year, too. She was fourth on the platform at the SECs. She's as steady as they get."

"All three could make top eight at the SECs," Lyden continued, "And the SEC dominates at the NCAAs. I expect a great year."

With an experienced group of returning swimmers and divers and a talented crop of newcomers, UK figures to improve on last year's fourth-place SEC finish. To add to UK's chances, the Wildcats host the conference meet this year.

"Our kids are really comfortable with this pool," Conelly admits. "It's a lot like a home football game. You know all the quirks about the pool. It can only help. Last time we hosted the SECs, we did very well. I am hoping for the same this time."

As far as season goals, the team is looking to improve on last year's 21st place finish. "We would like to improve our NCAA scores and place a little higher," Conelly said.

The Wildcats' talent and experience make Conelly's goal seem very attainable.

1998-99 Men's Swimming & Diving Outlook

▶he 1997-98 season was a banner year for the University of Kentucky men's swimming & diving team. The aquatic Cats posted their highest ever NCAA finish, cracking the top 25 for the first time, finishing 24th. Diver Paco Rivera, who has graduated, also gave UK its first individual men's platform diving crown.

Despite last season's successes, this year's focus is not on repeating last year's accomplishments. The Wildcats are looking to better last season's marks.

Head coach Gary Conelly has high hopes for this year's squad. "My goal for us this season is to qualify more guys for the NCAA meet," Conelly said. "What's important is how fast we swim. That's what gets a team to the NCAA Championships."

If speed is what Conelly wants, he should be happy with this team.

Sophomores Shaun Zitani and Aaron Workman return to anchor a speedy group of sprinters. Zitani swam UK's fastest 50 and 100 freestyles of the 1997-98 campaign and jumped into UK's all-time top five in both events. Workman won the 50 freestyle against Louisville in his first collegiate competition and improved throughout the season. "Shaun and Aaron are our most exciting swimmers," Conelly said.

Jarrod Rush is back for his senior season and will be striving to leave his mark on the program. "Jarrod is the 'old man' of the bunch," Conelly joked. "But he has an incredibly quick start. It may be the fastest I've seen."

"We have a good batch of sprinters. They all really enjoy what they're doing," Conelly


Junior Ben Fowler is back after sitting out last year with a medical redshirt and appears ready to hit the water flying. "I expect a lot from Ben this year," Conelly said. "He trained really hard this summer and I think he'll have a big year."

Fowler already ranks in UK's all-time top five in four freestyle events and has competed at the NCAA Championships.

"Ben has a good shot at breaking our records," Conelly said.

Helping Fowler in the middle-distance events will be sophomore David Tweedie and freshman David Kuendig. Tweedie emerged as a star last season, finishing in the top eight in the 500 free at SECs, where he shaved 12 seconds off his previous personal best the event.

Kuendig arrives on the UK campus from SEC champion in 41 years, claiming the Port Orange, Fla., boasting high school times that would place in UK's all-time top ten in multiple events. "We're really excited about David," Conelly said

The Cats lost breaststroker Jan Bjork to graduation, but according to Conelly, "The freshman class is strong with breaststrokers."

Freshmen Josh Waldrop and Nick Zeckets appear to have the early lead in the breaststroke race. "Josh and Nick are strictly breaststrokers, and I think they'll do well on the collegiate level," Conelly said. "They're both big, strong guys and I think they'll turn in some fast times."

In the backstroke, freshmen John Dennis and Shawn Cismowski will challenge for spots with seniors Greg Hengel and Brian Plitnick anchoring the squad.

"Greg Hengel and Brian Plitnick are a great duo in the backstroke," Conelly said. books," Conelly concluded.

"They are very dependable and will come through for us in dual meets."

Hengel ranks in UK's all-time top five in both backstrokes and recorded UK's fastest 100 backstroke last season.

Plitnick, one of UK's most versatile swimmers, swam UK's fastest 200 backstroke last year and dominated dual meets in the event. Because of his strength in multiple events, Plitnick figures to see individual medley duties this season as well.

"Brian is our best IMer," Conelly said. "He is just so versatile."

The only question mark on the squad is the butterfly. Matt Hampton and Shaun Zitani are strong in the 100 fly, but the 200 is still up in the air.

Conelly said, "John Dennis will be one of our guys in the 200, but someone else will have to step up to help."

SEC platform diving champion and conference record-holder Paco Rivera is gone, but the cupboard of divers is far from bare. Diving coach Mike Lyden has brought in two newcomers to fill the void left by Rivera's graduation.

Aaron Kirkpatrick joins the UK squad after claiming the 1998 Indiana state high school diving championship. Kirkpatrick excites coach Lyden. "He comes from a great diving program. He's made tremendous leaps in the last two years and could be a top six finisher at the SECs this year," Lyden said. "I can't wait to see how good he gets."

Kyle McDuffie joins the Cats as a transfer from the University of Virginia, where he was named All-ACC as a freshman. "Kyle is a very talented diver," Lyden said. "He should make an impact at SECs, too.

"Our men's team should do very well this year," Lyden concluded.


The combination of experience and youth should help the UK squad in dual meets and in championship competition. The potential is there.

"I would like to see us take five guys to the NCAA meet," Conelly said. "I'd also like to see us move up the conference ladder and score some more points at the SECs.

"I think these guys can rewrite our record

Racing lanes can be set up in five configurations: across-the-pool racing at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. Two 25yard courses can be utilized for large swim meets. Eighteen swimming lanes are available while diving events are in progress.

timing for swim meets. A 16-by-23-foot at all times. wall-mounted scoreboard allows full display of information for eight-lane and 16-lane swim meets. The scoreboard can also display graphics and animation sequences.

The diving facilities are among the best in the world. The facility has two 1-meter boards and two 3-meter boards set on concrete platforms. Each platform is eight feet

The Aquatic Center has a weight room for swimmers and divers equipped with Cybex weight training machines. In the adjacent Seaton Physical Education building are exercise physiology labs that are utilized for the testing of swimmers and divers.

The second balcony of the Aquatic Center accommodates up to 750 spectators and

has a concession area.

In addition to hosting the 1996 U.S. Olympic Diving Team, the Aquatic Center annually hosts the premier swimming and diving events in the state of Kentucky. These events include all UK home meets, the Kentucky State High School Championships, the Kentucky USS Championships, Zone and Regional Group Senior Diving meets,

Kentucky Special Olympics, and Bluegrass Games Diving meets. Highlights at the Aquatic Center have been the 1991 Southeastern Conference Championships, the 1995 Southeastern Conference Diving Championships, the 1995 NCAA Zone B Diving Championships and the 1990 World Games Diving Team Trials.

This season, Lancaster will serve as the site for the Southeastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships, with Kentucky serving as the host school.



Long course racing will have eight full-size lanes for the 50-meter distance.

The swimming tank, which holds 1,025,000 gallons of water, has a raised deck gutter with a large overflow. This gutter design is similar to the Indianapolis Natatorium design. Pool depth varies from 4.3 feet to 6.5 feet at the shallow end utilizing a movable floor of 35 by 75 feet. Water under the diving boards and tower is 17 feet deep. The

wide with lengths from 23 to 28 feet.

The facility won the 1990 Association of General Contractors Award for Structures. There is a 40-foot dryland diving area permanently set up with a trampoline, Portapit diving board and two diving/tumbling harnesses for somersaulting and twisting practice.

The Aquatic Center has a full training room equipped with two treatment tables, EGS and ultrasound machine, hydrocollator, natatorium features Daktronic automatic and ice machine. There is a trainer on duty






The University of Kentucky

ne University of Kentucky was founded in 1865. The campus in Lexington has 673 acres and is located just south of downtown. It consists of a graduate school program, the University hospital and 16 colleges. The colleges are: allied health professions, architecture, arts and sciences, agriculture, business and economics, communications and information studies, dentistry, engineering, education, fine arts, human environmental sciences, law, medicine, nursing, pharmacy and social work. The graduate school offers 97 master's degree programs and 60 doctoral programs.

Enrollment is approximately 24,200 and includes students from every Kentucky county, state, and more than 100 countries. Full-time faculty numbers 1,796. Approximately 98 percent of the full-time faculty hold the highest possible degrees in their field. UK's faculty and staff attract more than \$120 million in grants, gifts and contracts; and the University has been designated a Research University of the First Class by the Carnegie Foundation — one of just 59 public universities in the country.

The University attracts excellent students. The number of National Merit Scholars entering UK consistently ranks among the top 10 public universities in the country.

The number of UK alumni is more than 145,000. Private supports from alumni and

UK maintains 23 research centers which conduct applied research in areas as diverse as tobacco and health, aging, cancer, toxicology, equine health, mineral production, manufacturing systems, and public policy.

friends of the University exceeds \$30 million

annually.

The UK College of Medicine is ranked third in the country in the quality of primary care training. The UK Hospital is ranked among the top 100 U.S. hospitals in the country by HCIA Inc. and Mercer Management Consultants. The UK College of Pharmacy consistently is ranked third in the country by U.S. News and World Report and is one of the few pharmacy schools in the country with the capability of developing


a drug "from bench to bedside" due to its drug product evaluation unit.

The University is in the process of developing the Coldstream Research Campus, a 750-acre complex designed to attract hightech companies desiring ties to the University. Negitations are under way to execute leases with developers to construct several new commercial facilities on the research

The latest addition to the educational landscape at the University of Kentucky is the new William T. Young Library.

Built at a cost of \$58 million, the Young Library was opened in April 1998. Here are more facts about this magnificent structure:

- Size: 351,350 square feet--more than six football fields
- Shelf capacity: 198,828 linear feet-more than 37 miles of linear shelf space
- Seating capacity: 4,000 patrons--a 355 percent increase over the current UK library.
- Computer connections: every study table and study carrel in the new library has an electrical outlet and a computer jack connected to the university's computer system.





CATS (Center for Academic & Tutorial Services)

he University of Kentucky opened the nation's first academic center for student-athletes in 1981. Center for Academic and Tutorial Services (CATS) is located inside Memorial Coliseum.

Over the years, the services offered by CATS have grown, and so has the need for additional space. The UKAA has responded by constructing a new CATS area, which opened in January, 1998. The new facility is called the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, thanks to a one million dollar grant from the Ohio Casulty Insurance Group.

The new Ohio Casualty Center cost a total of \$2.4 million and was constructed in the old Memorial Pool area. It covers aproximately 20,000 square feet and features a computer room which houses approximately 40 computers, a study area which accomodates 90-100 people, 25 tutoring rooms, a career development library, a community outreach office and staff offices.

UK is fortunate to have outstanding leaders in its academics support system. Bob Bradley, who oversees the CATS program, has been promoted to Associate Athletics Director for Student Services. Bradley is known nationally for

his expertise in academics support services and takes on a new role this year as director of the regional office for the National Consortium of Academics and Athletics.

"CATS is an incredible advantage to a student-athlete," Bradley says. "We are extremely proud of what we have accomplished in the academic arena. The CATS program is focused on

winning in the classroom. We look at each student-athlete's individual needs, set goals and develop strategies to attain those goals. Our Center (CATS) provides our student-athletes with a definite advantage over student-athletes at many other institutions. Our goal is to show that we care about the student as well as the athlete." Bradley also says it helps to have head coaches that place such a strong emphasis on academics. "Many support systems across the nation do an excellent job in helping their studentathletes. I have been blessed at Kentucky," Bradlev said.

CATS is also instrumental in preparing student-athletes for future careers. The Career Development Program helps student-athletes look at the future through a step-by-step process which includes:

- shadowing and internships which help determine career interests
- career counseling
- resume writing
- developing a career plan.

The philosophy at the University of Kentucky is this: Colleges should be able to provide the student-athlete with every opportunity to succeed not only in athletics, but in academics as well. Looking at recent statistics in Academic Honor Roll selections and graduation rates, it is clear that Kentucky is standing by its philosophy.
