HEAD COACH GARY CONELLY



ary Conelly begins his 17th season at the helm of the University of Kentucky swimming programs. The women's squads have compiled a 100-60 record since Conelly began coaching the squad in 1991-92.

The men, whom he started coaching in 1992-93, have amassed a record of 78-69, bringing his overall coaching record to 178-129.

In 2006-07, Conelly's women's squad claimed a school-best 12th place finish at the 2007

NCAA Championships to highlight another quality season for the Wildcats. Conelly guided the 200-freestyle relay team to its first ever topeight national performance after watching the quartet win the school's first ever relay SEC Championship in February. The women finished fourth for the third consecutive season, while the men placed eighth.

In 2005-06, the Cats were once again a force in the pool. Highlighting the men's accomplishments was senior Steven Manley becoming the school's first SEC Champion in a freestlye event since 1957 when he captured the 200-freestyle crown. The women had a record-breaking season by registering a school-best 597 points, good for a second-consecutive fourth-place finish, at the SEC Championships. The women continued to

set new highs at the NCAA Championships by placing 13th and earning 98.5 points.

The 2004-05 season marked one of the best in Conelly's outstanding career at UK. The men had their highest-ever finish at the SEC Championships placing fourth, while the women had their best finish since 1998-99. The men continued their success at the NCAA Championships finishing 12th, the top mark in school history. The women produced the program's third-best NCAA Championships showing by placing 18th.

Conelly's 2003-04 men's squad sent the largest men's contingent in school history to the NCAA Championships, with eight different Wildcats heading to East Meadow, N.Y. The 2004 squad earned 15th place, marking the best finish in the history of the program at the time. His UK women's squad sent three student-ath-

letes to the NCAA Championships and moved up three spots to sixth place at the SEC Championships.

In 2002-03, Conelly guided the men's team to its second-highest finish ever in the NCAA championships, a 17th-place showing. Conelly's 2001-02 men's team placed 16th at NCAAs, its highest-ever finish at the time. At the SEC Championships, the men had the second-highest point total in school history (282), finishing in sixth-place. Competing at the NCAAs for the men were juniors Clayton Moss, Roger Watkins and sophomore Joey Faltraco. Faltraco's 11th-place finish in the 200-yard backstroke earned him honorable mention All-America, the first UK athlete to earn the honor in the event, while Moss was an All-American on the one- and three-meter springboards and the platform. The women also competed at the national championships, continuing a string of 10 consecutive appearances.

During the 2000-01 year, Conelly coached the men's team to a NCAA 17th-place finish. UK also attained its highest SEC finish in 18 years, taking fifth. Five individuals from the men's team competed at the NCAAs, seniors Dave Tweedie, Macon White, Aaron Workman and Shaun Zitani and sophomore Roger Watkins, all five of them earning All-America honorable mention. Conelly also guided the women to the NCAAs, where they placed 39th. Seniors Melissa Olson and Jaime Siegele competed at the championships, with Siegele earning All-America honorable mention in the 50-freestyle.

During the 1999-2000 season, Conelly led the men's team to a top-20 finish and had two men qualify for the NCAA championships, both earning honorable mention All-America honors. Four women qualified for the NCAA Championships. The women's 800-freestyle relay captured 12th and earned the women honorable mention All-America honors in addition to competing individually. Following the season, nine Wildcats participated in the 2000 Olympic trials.

In 1998-99, Conelly steered both the men's and women's teams to top-25 finishes at the NCAA Championships. The men finished at No. 24, while the women finished 21st, their fifth consecutive top-25 showing. The women's squad had 10 athletes advance to the NCAA meet, the most in school history.

Conelly and the 1996-97 men's team achieved a 26th-place NCAA finish and Nat Lewis finished third in the 1,650 freestyle and still ranks as the second-highest NCAA finisher in school history. The women secured 24th place and had three team members earn All-America honors.

In the 1995-96 season, Conelly directed the women's team to a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships, the highest finish in school history. In 1994-95, Conelly led the women's team to a fourth-place finish at the SEC Championships and a second straight 19th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Conelly was named 1995 SEC Women's Coach of the Year for his efforts.

In Conelly's 15 years with UK, the swimming and diving programs have made great strides. In 1990, Conelly coached the team's first female All-American and NCAA finalist, Kellie Moran. Since then, 26 more Wildcat swimmers have garnered All-America accolades under Conelly's tutelage.

Prior to becoming head coach at Kentucky, Conelly spent

three years with UK as a graduate assistant coach.

Conelly came to the University of Kentucky from the West Florida Lightning Aquatics USS team in Largo, Fla. During his seven years at West Florida, Conelly directed 150 swimmers and produced three Olympic Trial qualifiers, two National Sports Festival team members, and one Sports Festival champion in the 100-backstroke.

As a swimmer, Conelly was a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team, and he participated on the world record-setting 400-meter freestyle relay team. An Indiana University alumnus, Conelly was a 15-time NCAA All-American and is a member of the Indiana Swimming Hall of Fame. In 1973, Indiana honored him with the Balfour Award for excellence in swimming, leadership, and scholarship.

Conelly is married to Kathleen Healey and has two children, Cody and Emily.

oach Michael

guided perhaps the best diver in school history, Taryn Ignacio, to her fourth and fifth SEC Titles, including a three-peat on platform to highlight another outstanding season in 2007. Capping a stellar career, Ignacio placed third on the platform while her teammate Kari Retrum earned her first two All-America honors at the NCAA Championships.

Lyden, who is an inspiration to all student-athletes for his courage and inner-strength, notched perhaps the greatest season in his coaching tenure in 2006. At the NCAA Championships, Ignacio became his and the school's first ever NCAA champion in the platform event. Ignacio set a school and NCAA record with a score of 335.20 in the finals. The 2006 SEC championships were historic for the UK lady divers. Ignacio became the first Wildcat to repeat as a diving champion on the platform. In that same event, senior Jessica Thompson and junior Joey Brown finished second and third respectively. On the three- and onemeter board UK placed four women in the top seven of each event.

Success is nothing new to Lyden since joining UK in 1993. As coach, Lyden has guided the Wildcats to diving prominence, as 11 Wildcats have earned 45 All-America selections. Lyden coached Kentucky's first All-American, Tina

Johnson, who earned All-America platform honors in 1994, and the Cats' first single-season three-time All-American, Clayton Moss, in 2002 and 2003.

Last season came off the heals of the 2004-05 season, which was one of the best in UK's history. Wildcat women divers swept the SEC Championships with Ignacio taking home the platform and one-meter title, along with Thompson capturing the three-meter title. Both divers went on to compete in the NCAA championships where Thompson took 11th in the three-meter and 15th on the platform, and Ignacio placed 17th in the one-meter event.

In 2004-05, Lyden's summer team including, UK's SEC Diver of the Year Taryn Ignacio, succeeded at the Senior Nationals Diving Championships in Huntersville, N.C. Ignacio finished ninth on the platform and won the bronze medal by finishing third on the one-meter.

The 2003-04 season was also a memorable one in Lyden's coaching career. The aforementioned Moss placed fourth on the three-meter at the 2004 U.S. Olympic trials, while another former Cat, Aaron Kirkpatrick, took ninth place. Freshman Kari Retrum earned 17th on the platform, and Thompson placed 18th on the three-meter.

Under Lyden's direction, Retrum became the first Kentucky freshman to claim an SEC diving title when she captured the platform event at the 2004 SEC Championships. Moss ended his brilliant Wildcat career in 2003 with a runner-up finish on the three-meter and third and fourthplace finishes on the one-meter and platform, respectively, at the NCAA championships. During the 2001-02 season, Lyden helped Moss successfully defend his SEC one-meter title, the first UK diver to win consecutive titles in an event at the conference championships. He became an All-American on all three boards, as Moss placed second on the one-meter, fifth on the three-meter and sixth on the platform. For all of his accomplishments, Moss was named the SEC Male Diver of the Year, also a first for UK.

Lyden is also credited with developing the collegiate success of Kirkpatrick, who won silver on both the one- and three-meter springboards and placed seventh on the platform at the conference championships.

His run of success with the duo began in the 2000-01 season when Moss became the third UK man to be an SEC Champion, winning the one-meter, and followed it up with a fourth-place finish on the three meter and a 10th-place finish on the platform, earning All-American honors on both. Kirkpatrick also enjoyed a successful season under Lyden's guidance. The junior garnered honorable mention All-America status with a 12th place finish on the three-meter springboard at the NCAA championships.

Kentucky's transformation into one of the nation's most prominent diving programs is all credited to Lyden. At the 1994 NCAA Championships, Tina Johnson became UK's first diving All-American on the platform, placing eighth, and Jenny Baker earned honorable mention All-America in two events.

During the 1999-2000 season, Lyden guided junior Carrie Knoeber's and Moss' qualification for the NCAA Championship meet. Knoeber earned honorable mention All-American honors on the three-meter while Moss secured All-American honors on the onemeter, three-meter, and platform. Moss' honors were the first for a freshman in UK history.

In 1998, Paco Rivera became the first male UK diver to claim a Southeastern Conference title, winning the platform event and attaining All-SEC honors. Rivera advanced to the NCAA Championships, where he was named an All-American in three events and placed second on the platform.

In 1997, Lyden steered Christy Soulakis to the SEC three-meter springboard championship and SEC Female Diver of the Year honors. Soulakis and Rivera both locked-up All-America honors.

In 1996, Leake and Soulakis joined Baker and Johnson in earning All-America honors. Leake finished second on the one-meter and fourth on the three-meter, Johnson finished third on the one-meter and platform, and Baker finished seventh on the platform. Lyden was honored as the Southeastern Conference and NCAA Women's Diving Coach of the Year for his diver's accomplishments.

Before arriving at UK, Lyden spent nine seasons at Eastern Michigan where he was the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year nine times. He then traveled to LSU where he received SEC Women's Coach of the Year four times consecutively and was the 1992 SEC Men's Coach of the Year. During Lyden's tenure at LSU his divers won an incredible 15 of 24 possible SEC titles.


Along with his college coaching, Lyden also

coaches various Kentucky Diving Clubs and has led seven age group divers to 18 national championships. The Junior World Diving Championships chose Lyden as a coach in the summer of 2002 held in Aachen, Germany. At that event he coached one member to a seventh-place finish in the one-meter and three-meter boards. In addition, Lyden served as the National Team Coach in 1988-90, 1992, 1994-96, 1998-2000, and directed divers in competitions in Italy, Austria, Mexico, Canada, Spain, China, France, and Holland.

At the 2005 Junior Nationals, Lyden coached his daughter, Jessica, who captured her first national championship by winning the one-meter. Jessica finished third in the three-meter event. Jessica went on to win the one-meter at the Pan American Junior Championships in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.

In addition to coaching, Lyden has been a member of the U.S. Diving Rules Committee, the U.S. Olympic International Diving Committee and is a lifetime member of U.S. Diving. In 1993-94 and 1997-99, Lyden served on the NCAA Rules Committee.

A 1980 graduate of Western Michigan University, Lyden is married to Emily Joan Sullivan of Toledo, Ohio. They have three children — Jessica Ann, 16, John Tyler (Jack), 14 and Brittany Barbara, 8.

ASSISTANT COACHES



SHAUN ZITANI Associate Head Coach

Shaun Zitani enters his second year as associate head coach and third season overall at the University of Kentucky as a member of the

coaching staff.

Zitani is responsible for the Wildcat sprint program and helped guide the women's 200-free relay team to a school-first SEC Championship in 2007. Wildcat sprinters have earned five All-America distinctions under his tutalge. Zitani is also a valiant recruiter and has brought some of the top recruits to Kentucky in his three seasons.

A five-time All-American from 1997-2001, Zitani returns to his alma mater after serving three seasons as an assistant swim coach at Indian River Community College in Ft. Pierce, Fla. Zitani helped continue the tradition of excellence for the 31-time national-champion Pioneers, leading Indian River to three national titles while coaching the sprint swimmers to seven national-record finishes. At Indian River, Zitani coached Tim Patrick, who broke Zitani's 50-yard freestyle record this past season at Kentucky. Zitani coordinated all dry-land and weight-room programs for the Pioneers and served as the head age-group coach for the River Rats swim team.

Zitani brings a wealth of experience as a former student-athlete in addition to his coaching expertise. He placed 12th in the 50-freestyle at the 2000 NCAA Championships to earn an honorable-mention All-America selection and swam on the first Kentucky men's relay teams to compete at the NCAA Championships in 2001. Zitani helped lead the Cats to 13th place in the 200-medley relay and the 800-freestyle relay, 14th place in the 200-freestyle relay and 15th place in the 400-freestyle relay to collect four more honorable-mention All-America honors.



JOHN BRUCATOAssistant Coach

John Brucato is in his 10th season with the UK swimming program. Brucato works primarily with the middle distance group and breaststrokers.

Brucato comes to UK via the USS club team Wildcat Aquatics in Lexington. Brucato joined WA in the spring of 1990 and has established himself as a leader in the Kentucky swim coaching community.

During his tenure with WA, Brucato has produced numerous Top-16 qualifiers, Junior National qualifiers, Junior National Qualifiers, Junior National Champions, Senior National qualifiers, and an Olympic Gold Medalist. He is a former Kentucky Swimming Coach of the Year, in addition to being a Select Camp Coach and an Olympic Festival Coach.

In 1992, Brucato coached Megan Kleine to a gold medal in the 1992 Olympic Games as part of the United States' 400-meter medley relay. Kleine, who swam for six years under Brucato at WA, won Senior Nationals twice in the 100-meter breaststroke. Kleine went on to swim at the University of Texas at Austin.

A native of Covington, Ky., Brucato began his coaching career at the Covington YMCA and then spent two years with the Covington Clippers Swim Team. In 1985, he took over the helm at the Nashville Aquatic Club where he spent five successful years as the Head Age Group Coach before being hired on as the WA Senior Head Coach.

Brucato is a 1985 graduate of Northern Kentucky University where he received a degree in psychology. He lives in Lexington with his wife Jan, and their daughter, Katie.



MARGO LYNCH Assistant Coach

UK swimming alumna Margo Lynch begins her third season as assistant coach after being elvated to the position in December of 2005.

Lynch had spent the previous four seasons working as the staff assistant.

Lynch is responsible for coordinatin of all aspects of recruiting for the men's and women's swimming teams. In addition to recuritment, Lynch oversees events for all aquatic events and special events in relation to the varsity team.

Her vigorous promotion of the UK swimming and diving teams helped produced an attendance record for a UK dual meet bringing in 1,000 spectators.

In the pool, she primarily works with the middle and distance swimmers.

Lynch swam for the Wildcats from 1991-95 and served as the team captain during her junior and senior seasons. Lynch can be found on the all-time top-10 UK lists in three events; 200-freestyle, 500-freestyle and 1650-freestyle solidifying her expertise in the distance swimming events.

Born in Melbourne, Australia, Lynch came to Kentucky from her family's adopted home of Pittsburgh, Pa.

Prior to returning to her alma mater, Lynch served as a buyer for Phillip Gall's Outdoor & Ski in Lexington.



EMILY HISLE Staff Assistant

Emily Hisle begins her second season as staff assistant for the UK swimming and diving program. A Louisville, Ky. native, Hisle began her duties

in Janurary 2006.

Hisle's primary responsibilities include coordinating and planning recruiting weekends, setting up and running timing systems and computers for all UK home meets and planning team travel.

A 2005 graduate of the University of Kentucky with a degree in English, Hisle spent time as an undergraduate working at the Lancaster Aquatic Center and assisting at UK dual meets.

She resides in Lexington with her husband, Jared.

Dan Childs is in his sixth year working with Kentucky's student-athletes in the Center for Academic and Tutorial Services (CATS). Childs works directly with

Kentucky's swimming and diving athletes to ensure they are making strong progress towards their degrees and helping them with their postgraduate aspirations. Childs also serves as the advisor for the Kentucky track and field teams as well as the men's tennis program.

Childs earned a bachelor's degree in Public Relations from Eastern Kentucky University and a master's degree in Sports Administration from Xavier University. Childs resides in Lexington.



JOHN CROPP Associate Director of

John Cropp is in his 16th year at the University of Kentucky and his 32nd overall involving collegiate athletics.

As Associate Athletics

Director, Cropp oversees the administration of seven of UK's 22 athletic teams, including swimming and diving. He assumed his current responsibilities in April 1995, after having served previously as Assistant AD for Special Projects (1993-95), Athletics Recruiting Coordinator (1992-93) and Assistant Football Coach (1991).

SUPPORT STAFF

Athletics

For the first 22 years of Cropp's athletics career he was involved in coaching football. His first head coaching position came at Tennessee High School in Bristol, Tenn. Cropp's squads compiled an impressive 48-15-3 record with two state AAA titles (1971-72) and the '72 mythical national championship.

Cropp returned to his alma mater, Vanderbilt, in 1973 as an assistant coach under Steve Sloan. He followed Sloan as an assistant to Texas Tech (1975-77), Ole Miss (1978-82) and Duke (1983). In 1984, Cropp returned to Vanderbilt under head coach George MacIntyre. He entered private business for two years (1986-88) before returning to Vanderbilt for a third time. Cropp served as Assistant Athletics Director for Compliance at Vanderbilt for three years before coming to Kentucky.

Cropp earned three varsity letters at Vanderbilt as a guard/linebacker. He received the Wade-Looney Memorial Award as a senior and graduated in 1961. He earned his masters of arts in teaching in 1962.

Cropp and his wife, Mary Ann, have two grown children, Karen and David, and two grandchildren, Kate and Baxter.

Letitia Hollingsworth-Gray begins her fourth season as aquatic director with


the Kentucky swimming and diving program.

WOMEN'S OUTLOOK

The 2007-08 Kentucky Wildcats are looking to continue their emergence as a top women's swimming and diving program, hoping to improve off a school-best 12th place finish at the NCAA Championships last year in Minneapolis.

This year's squad boasts a strong group of senior leaders that Coach Gary Conelly believes will have very good endings to their careers.

"Our seniors all seem to be really focused and want to go out on a high point in their senior years," said Conelly. "Sometimes you'll see seniors who kind of letdown because it's their senior seasons, but not these girls. I think you're going to see really good swims from them across the board."

Seniors Heather and Jenny Bradford are a part of the 200-free relay team that won the school's first-ever SEC Championship relay event and have combined for 22 All-America distinctions.

"I think the Bradfords should have their best seasons ever," Conelly commented. "The focus this year is to try and get them to flow at the same time. I think there's a very distinct possibility that they will go to the NCAA's with a chance to be All-Americans in all three individual events and all four of their relay events. We're very optimistic that this will be a really good year for them, and they've had three terrific ones already."

The team will utilize that strong leadership and experience to carry them back to the NCAAs, in search of a top-10 finish.

"Expectations are high," Conelly admitted. "We lost some good swimmers and divers, but in a lot of respects we feel like we reloaded more than what we had before. The truth of the matter is in the SEC, getting beyond fourth is going to be tough. But we have a real good group, and I think we'll have some legitimate chances to do that."



DIVIN

With departed All-American Taryn Ignacio graduated, Coach Mike Lyden will now look to senior Kari Retrum, who returns after another excellent season. Retrum the 2004 SEC Freshman Diver of the Year, made her first career appearance at the NCAA Championships last season. She earned All-America distinctions on both the one-meter and platform events.

The goal does not change this season, as defending SEC Coach of the Year Lyden fully expects Retrum to contend for an SEC title on all three boards.

Joining Retrum, is freshman Jessica Snowden who comes to UK after an outstanding high school career.

BACKSTROKE

Sophomore Chatham Penrod returns as a top-candidate for a breakout season after a freshman campaign that saw her succeed in several events, including team top times in both the 100- and 200-events. Joining the ranks is senior Jill Southerlan who endured an injury-plagued junior season.

"Right now Jill's training very well," said Conelly. "If she can train at the level she's at right now over the course of the season, I think she's going to have a great season, and I think she could make both cuts in the 100 and 200."

Adding some depth to the backstroke event will be senior Blair Barrett. "As a senior, Blair is very focused on wanting to go out with a bang," Conelly said. "She's training very well right now and seems poised to have a really good year. Her pacing in practice is faster than anything she's ever had before."


BUTTERFLY

Heather and Jenny Bradford are a one-two punch in the 100-fly. Heather ranks at the top in Kentucky record books and earned a seventh place finish at the NCAA Championships a season ago.

They will be assisted in the longer heats by sophomore Megan Pulskamp, who led the team last year in the 200-fly, and looks to sneak up on some people this upcoming season.

"If you talk about a surprise factor, she might be that," said Conelly. "She swam very well last year, but I think she's going to swim even better this year. She's one that I don't think can just get to the NCAAs, but she can score there. She is focused and motivated and I think she'll just have a great year and be a scorer on the national level for us."

Junior Kelly Rames is also among the candi-



dates to pace the distance fly events and while sophomores Christina Morgan and Anna Sirmon will provide added depth to the event.

BREASTSTROKE

Senior Lindsay Myhre is the lone senior and top returnee. Myhre recorded the two top times for the Wildcats during last season. She also made her first career appearance at the NCAA Championships and was among a third-place 200-medley relay at the SEC Championships a season ago.

"Lindsay did a really nice job over the summer in her training and I think she's going to do really well this season," Conelly said.

Additional swimmers in the breaststroke events are sophomore Casey Miller and freshmen Lindsey Graessle and Danielle Weiss.

FREESTYLE

Much of the distance freestyle events will be placed on the shoulders of junior returnee Haleigh Kerns, who will look to improve off of a season in which she led the team in multiple events. The potential is there for her to have a tremendous season and gain recognition for a trip to her first career NCAA Championships.

Junior Kristina Sledge paces the Wildcats in the mid-distance range after having a break-out season as a sophomore and making her first ever trip to NCAAs, Sledge is poised for a continual trek of improving times. Adding to the depth in the distance swims is junior Leah Harms who is also on the verge of having an outstanding season. The sprinters are led by an array of seniors that include the Bradfords, Kelley Morrison, Beth Parsons and Lauren Willis. The five will be looked upon to form a potent sprint group. Willis made the NCAA Championships a season ago and was a member of the 200-free relay team that made history. Parsons is motivated to

All three will provide much needed depth in a grueling event, something the team has lacked the past few seasons.

RELAYS

"At the very highest levels, when talking about NCAA's, we feel like we can get all our relays there, and I think that four of the five we should be able to get into the top-eight," said Conelly.

Conelly undoubtedly believes the strength of this team is the relays. The 200-free SEC winning team brings all but one member back, returning both Bradford sisters and Willis.

"We lost Nikia (Deveaux), which was a big part of that 200 free-relay that won SECs," he said. "But we should have some great competition to insert another strong swimmer in there. I think that group is a legitimate threat to win conference again, and I don't think it's out of the realm of possibility that they could be in the top-three at NCAA's."

MEN'S OUTLOOK

In the sports world it is a known cliché that disappointment spurns motivation toward achieving higher goals. The University of Kentucky men's swimming and diving are aiming to make the cliché a reality during the 2007-08 season.

Fresh off a season in which the team finished eighth in the Southeastern Conference championships and 39th in the NCAA, Coach Gary Conelly is excited about his team's chances for the upcoming season and expects them once again to compete among the nation's elite teams.

"We have some pretty lofty expectations for this team, because we really would like to be in the top four of the conference," said Conelly. "We are a much stronger team this season. I think we are going to see a lot more production out of the sophomore class which will really help us achieve our goals."

Still a relatively young squad that owns just three seniors, the wealth of talent makes up for the lack of seniority. Since the conclusion of the SEC Championships, the men's team has taken great strides on an international level. Junior Warren Grobbelaar won the South African national championship in the 100-butterfly, sophomore Elvis Burrows participated with the Bahamian national team in the World University Games, while the team collectively achieved eight Olympic time trial cut times in varying national events this summer.

"Everybody has trained so well this summer, and the team comes back to us for pre-season conditioning exponentially better," Conelly said. "I would be really surprised if we didn't have one of the best seasons ever."



BACKSTROKE

Junior Shane Eliason is coming off a breakout season in which he placed in the top-16 in
both backstroke events for the Wildcats as a
sophomore at the conference meet. For a stretch
during the dual meet season Eliason captured
wins in both back events in three consecutive
meets. This season the older and more experienced Eliason needs to continue his upward
climb and become an NCAA participant in the
discipline. Conelly feels after a season in which
Eliason gained confidence and a strong summer
of training, Eliason is on the verge of another
outstanding season.

"Shane had a great summer, and he's the kind of guy who doesn't always recognize how talented he really is," said Conelly. "I think as he continues to go in his career he is starting to believe in himself more and more. He is on course to have another outstanding year for us."

Providing some added depth to the backstroke events is senior Kristian Outinen, sophomores Alex Forbes and Kyle Greene, and freshman Chris Upchurch. Outinen spent some time on medley relays in the backstroke discipline, while Greene and Forbes have each seen time in the back events during their careers.

BREASTSTROKE

Senior Will Vietti is one of the favorites heading into the 2007-08 season in the SEC in the 100-breaststroke after finishing second a season-ago. Vietti already owns school records in both the 100- and 200-events. He placed fourth in the 200-breast as a junior in the conference meet, and participated in the NCAA Championships for the first time in his career.

"He is a pure racer," Conelly said. "I don't think Will ever climbs up on the block thinking that he will lose."

Adding to the promise of his final season at Kentucky was the tremendous summer he enjoyed, in which he placed seventh in the 100-breast at the National Championships while also earning Olympic time trial cuts in both swims.

Outinen returns to the breaststroke lineup as well, with a summer to refresh and recharge the batteries of a two-time NCAA participant in both breast events. Rounding out the lineup is sophomore Julio Vallette who Conelly feels is on

the verge of taking some major strides propelling his career this season.

BUTTERFLY

Grobbelaar enjoyed a stellar sophomore season and summer as he pushed his career-best times in the 100-fly to new limits. He placed seventh in the conference a year ago, and then won the South African national championship in the event in May.

"He is an incredibly talented swimmer," Conelly said. "He has impressed me over and over again, with the things he can do. Warren is a real threat for us; a real stand-out sprinter."

Burrows, Forbes, junior Matt Bierwirth and freshman Kevin Knezevich will provide depth in the sprint event.

Senior Grant Nelson leads the grueling 200fly group. Nelson has continued to improve with every season and would like nothing more than to finish his career with best times and finishes in an event that has become his marquee swim.

"Grant is tremendously motivated, focused and determined to have a good year," Conelly said. "He is going to have to have a significant drop to make NCAAs in the 200-fly, but I think he is on course to do that. He's doing some things in practice already that he's never done before as far as conditioning."

Nelson placed seventh in the event at the conference meet as a junior while setting a career-best time. Junior Joe Retrum placed 10th and will also be looked to for leadership and improvement in this discipline.

FREESTYLE

Conelly describes the sprint freestyle group as perhaps his most talented and deep group of swimmers. Grobbelaar is the holder of the top times in both the 50-free and 100-free among the returnees, however Forbes, Greene and classmate Eric McGinnis are all returning after impressive freshmen seasons.

"This group understands what the expectations are and what the level of commitment is to achieve our goals," Conelly said. "They are a group on a mission."

McGinnis and Grobbelaar each earned Olympic time trial cuts this summer at the Senior National Championships. McGinnis entered the meet with an 88th placement and rose to 13th in the country in the 50-free one of the most impressive stories of the summer.

Among other returnees likely to see time in the sprint group are Burrows, sophomores Travis Muzzillo, Chris Richard and Drew Robinson.



Freshman Tyler Reed highlights the newcomers in this area. Reed a Kentucky native holds numerous state records and was one of the most highly recruited sprinters in the country. Conelly feels Reed will impact his team immediately.

"I think Tyler Reed is going to rock some people," said Conelly. "Everybody knows he is out there, but I don't think they really know what to expect. Tyler is a guy who goes as hard as he can go until he can't go anymore. I think as he goes through his career and learns to have a little more finesse and technique I think he is going to be a force to be reckoned with."

Matt Barbiea, Max Clark, Colin Faris, Reinhardt Strijdom and Chris Upchurch all come to UK with a history of sprint swims.

In the middle distance and distance swims Conelly will look to a wealth of experience. Sophomore Marco Iemmola has entered pre-season conditioning in excellent shape and a desire to improve upon his quality first season.

"Marco had a fantastic summer of training," Conelly said. "I think he is really going to have a good year for us this year. He may surprise some people this year and sneak in with some very good times."

Iemmola scored points for Kentucky in the 1,650-free as a freshman, but will need to score in the 200- and 500- this season. Junior James Batley will be looked to in the 200- to 1,000 range. Nelson and Retrum have also been known to step onto some distance blocks. Sophomore Kevin Ryan will also see time in this discipline.

The goal does not change this season for Lyden, as he wants Smith to score in the topeight in all three events while making the cut for the national meet.

Joining Smith is freshman Stephen Andrews. Andrews comes to Kentucky having enjoyed tremendous success in Florida. He is a two-time Florida state-champion and three-time All-American. Lyden aims for Andrews to impact the Kentucky squad immediately.

2006-07 SEASON IN REVIEW



aoches Gary Conelly and Mike Lyden enjoyed another fantastic season of leading a group of young Wildcats in the Southeastern Conference. Conelly racked up his career win total to over 175 wins, and Lyden received his third consecutive SEC Diving Coach of the Year honor.

The year began with a double-dip loss to Indiana as both the men and women fell to the Hoosiers. The teams spent another week on the road visiting a trio of SEC-foes. In a tri-meet with Tennessee and South Carolina the men took another two losses, while the women outdualed the Lady Gamecocks, but dropped their first match-up with the Lady Volunteers. From there the Wildcats tacked on a trip to Athens, Ga., where they stared down the Bulldogs, however ultimatly walked away with a pair of losses. Junior Jenny Bradford's continual battle with Olympian and Lady Bulldog Kara Lynn Joyce heightened when Bradford defeated Joyce in the 50-free, their first match-up of the season.

Next up for the Wildcats was their annual trip to the prestigious Nike Cup Invitational. Bradford highlighted the trek to North Carolina besting the field in three events, while setting two UK records and personal-best times, as well as enshrining her name atop the UNC Koury Natorium record books in the 50-free. Later that week Bradford was honored as the National Swimmer of the Week for her efforts. On the men's side, breaststrokers proved dominant as sophomore Mickey Malul and junior Will Vietti claimed gold in the 100- and 200-breast events, respectivley. Fifty-seven percent of Conelly's veteran swimmers bettered at least one top-time and 100 percent of the freshmen returned to the Bluegrass with career-best times.


After rejuvinating their season at the Nike Cup, Kentucky finally returned to the friendly confines of the Lancaster Aquatic Center and hosted their first event of the season. The men welcomed No. 24 Texas A&M and the women hosted SEC-newcomer Vanderbilt. The men pulled off what would become a commonoccurance an upset, as they overcame the visiting Aggies. Senior Eric Weber shined in the distance events winning the 500- and 1000-free events. The women notched their second win of the season with a dominating performance.

UK enjoyed a month-long break from dual meet competition with their annual training-trip

in Florida at the start of the New Year. Upon a return home the Blue and White hosted Alabama in mid-Janurary. The men pulled off another upset win over a ranked opponent behind the trio of sophomore winners James Batley, Shane Eliason and Warren Grobbelaar. The women racked up their third win of the season behind senior diver Joey Brown's double win on the boards. Brown later was named SEC Diver of the Week.

In the final two weeks of the season UK faced state-rival Louisville and wrapped up the year with a battle against Cincinnati. Against Louisville, the Wildcats said goodbye to their senior class and then rolled to victories. Junior Heather Bradford led the women in a win over Cincinnati claiming first in two events. Bradford was honored as SEC Swimmer of the Week at the conclusion of the week. The men easily handled the Bearcats to wrap up dual-meet season on a four-meet win streak.

On a roll to end the season, Kentucky excitidly welcomed the nation's elite swimmers and divers to the Lancaster Aquatic Center for the SEC Championships. Behind a multitude of athletes the women again recorded a fourth




place showing in the conference, edging out the Volunteers. Senior Taryn Ignacio concluded her career by winning two more SEC titles, that included a three-peat in the platform event and her first-ever medal (silver) on the three-meter. The Bradford sisters each took a silver medal, Jenny in the 50-free and Heather in the 100fly. Capping off a stellar meet was the first championship relay title in school history when the Bradfords teamed with senior Nikia Deveaux and junior Lauren Willis to take the 200-free relay. For the men, Vietti etched his name in the UK record books taking silver in the 100-breast and fourth in the 200-breast while setting school record times to highlight the men's week. Grobbelaar finished with three top-10 finishes to aide in the men's cause of eighth place in the conference.

At the NCAA Championships, Kentucky's Lady Wildcats were poised for a run at the top-10 in the country, despite falling just short of that goal the women turned in their school-best finish of 12th and saw many firsts in school annals. Jenny Bradford earned her second consecutive top-eight finish in the 50-free when she placed seventh. Heather Bradford recorded her first ever individual All-America nod when she took seventh in the 100-fly and followed that with 16th in the 50-free. The 200-free relay

team became the first 200-free squad to place in the top-eight in the country tapping in seventh on their way to setting a school record time. The 400-free relay team posted a 15th place showing to cap off the week for the swimmers. Ignacio and junior Kari Retrum were once again outstanding on the boards. Ignacio earned her second consecutive top-eight finish on the onemeter placing seventh. She defended her national title with a third place showing on platform. Retrum placed in the top-16 on both the onemeter and platform claiming her first All-America honorable mention nominations.

On the men's side Vietti and Malul were the lone representatives for the the Wildcats. Vietti scored a 16th place finish in the 100-breast to score UK's only point. The men will look to new heights in the 07-08 season with bulk of their team returning.

Many Wildcats participated in international and national competition in the team's off-season. Highlighting the team's success was Malul who took sixth overall at the World Championship Games in the 50-breast, while Grobbelaar recorded a win in the 100-fly in the South African National Championships.

IGNACIO SET A NCAA AND SCHOOL-RECORD FOR POINTS SCORED IN THE EVENT. THIS IS A DIARY WRIT-TEN BY GNACIO DEPICTING HER EMOTIONS, THOUGHTS AND EXPERIENCES LEADING UP TO HER HISTORICAL FEAT.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT (MARCH 15, 2006)

I've made it to the biggest meet of the year, NCAAs. I am both excited and honored to be here. Actually, I'm lucky to be here after such a poor performance at the Zone qualifying meet. Don't let me fail! A viral infection has left me feeling weak, but I have to rise above it. Our team has to compete well. We've trained too hard and experienced too many emotional ups and downs this year, finding out coach Mike has cancer, to fail now. He's trained and mentored us well year after year and this year is no different. Coach Lyden's expert coaching is in our blood. If we aren't ready to meet the challenge now, we never will be ... Let me have the strength to rise above my physical weakness and my nerves so I can do my job.

THURSDAY MORNING (MARCH 16, 2006)

Having coach here with us at the University of Georgia is inspirational. His diagnosis of cancer earlier this year has prevented him from both coaching and attending every meet. I can not let him down! He is the reason I am here. When I didn't want to practice, he pushed me harder, when I didn't want to learn a new dive, he pushed me harder, and when I wanted to give up he pushed me harder. Mike Lyden is the reason I'm here; he's the reason I've developed into the diver I am. I have to show him what a good teacher he is and has been and how much he has meant to me. As a team, we have learned that life can be full of surprises, so it's important to give your best each day. God, give me the strength to dive my best this weekend and make Coach proud to be my coach. Focus on one dive at a time, stay warm, and stretch in between each dive. I can do this!

THURSDAY EVENING (MARCH 16, 2006)

I made it through one-meter. I gave it all I had. I earned All-American status after placing eighth. Coach Lyden's been through a lot this year, but I know he's proud of my accomplishment. Next, I have to dive tower. This is



SATURDAY MORNING (MARCH 17, 2006)


The worst is over...I made it to finals on platform.

UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY SWIMMING HISTORY

■ n 1936, the thought of having a swimming program at the University of Kentucky was just an idea tossed around by a group of waterlovers with skill and determination.

At that time, a pair of athletes named Bob Freeburg of Chicago and Sherman Hinkebein of Louisville went about the campus in search of talent among the student body. Organizing a squad of men who loved to swim was easy, but other obstacles stood in their way.

The first UK swim team was known as the "dry land swimming team" because UK did not have a pool. And since the University did not recognize swimming as a sport, the group had to purchase their own swimsuits and travel to Eastern State (now Eastern Kentucky University) in Richmond just to practice. Nevertheless, their determination paid off as some of the swimmers borrowed automobiles to travel to practice and meets, while others hitchhiked. Thus, UK's first men's swim team was formed.

Hinkebein, a UK track and football (team captain 1938) star, became coach and captain of the team at its inception. He turned over coaching duties when the UK Athletic Council recognized swimming as a varsity sport, to another student swimmer, Lloyd Ramsey, who lettered two years in basketball under Adolph Rupp. Hinkebein continued to swim for the Wildcats, and it was under Ramsey that the team won its first Kentucky State Intercollegiate Meet.

During its first three years of existence, the

UK swim team had built up an enviable record, never losing a dual or state meet in Kentucky and being defeated only four times by outside competition. The pride of the UK squad was the medley team, undefeated in three years, that was made up of Hinkebein, Ramsey and James "Bud" Scott of Chicago. Two years later, UK would compete in its first SEC Championship Meet and finish seventh.

UK discontinued its swimming program in 1942, but in 1951, one year after the completion of Memorial Coliseum and UK's first swimming pool, the program was reinstated. Alfred M. Reece, a health and physical education instructor, was selected as coach and guided the team to third place in the 1954 SEC Championships. Reece's teams fared well against in-state schools with comparable programs, but were no match for institutions that offered full scholarships. UK offered only two tuition scholarships.

The University realized a renewed interest in swimming in 1964, when it hired Wynn Paul as head coach. Paul, a top-class swimmer at the University of Louisville, was undefeated in the 200 breaststroke and was named the Outstanding Swimmer in Kentucky by The Courier-Journal in 1958 and 1959. Paul introduced water polo to UK in 1964. The water polo program was discontinued in 1982 to make way for the newly created women's varsity swim program.

Ron Huebner, a UK swim letterman who graduated in 1968, succeeded Paul that fall and

produced winning teams during a four-year tenure. Paul returned to the helm of the program in 1973, and it was under his direction that the team won the Kentucky Intercollegiate Swim Championships in 1975 for the second time in UK swim history.

From 1970 to 1983 the UK women's swim team competed only as a club sport. Originally included as one of six sports chosen to become varsity in 1974, the team was nudged out by field hockey because UK's then 20-year-old pool was inadequate and too overcrowded to accommodate the addition of another varsity team.

In 1980, the then-volunteer women's swim coach filed a sex discrimination Civil Rights Title IV complaint to the federal government, which led to the ruling that UK needed to sponsor an additional team for women. Thus, the creation of UK's first women's varsity swimming program occurred on July 1, 1983, with Paul named head coach.

The program has continued a strong combination of academics and competiveness. The swimmers boast a winning record in the classroom, as over 95 percent of the swim Cats have graduated.

Kentucky's swimming program, now under the guidance of 15th-year coach Gary Conelly, is recognized as a force to be reckoned within the SEC.



LANCASTER AQUATIC CENTER

The University of Kentucky's Lancaster Aquatic Center, opened March 29, 1989, represents the finest in collegiate swimming and diving facilities. The Center hosted the 2007 Southeastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships.

The natatorium is named for Harry C. Lancaster, former UK Athletics Director (1968-76) and assistant basketball coach (1946-70) to Kentucky's legendary Adolph Rupp.

The indoor facility is 25 yards by 176 feet with a movable bulkhead that can be set at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. The facility has two removable bulkheads which allows the facility to be used for a number of activities other than swim meets and practices, including recreational swimming, aquatic classes, swimming and diving lessons, scuba instruction, handicapped swimming and other aquatic-related activities.

Racing lanes can be set up in five configurations: across-the-pool racing at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. Two 25-yard courses can be utilized for large swim meets. Eighteen swimming lanes are available while diving events are in progress. Long course racing will have eight full-size lanes for the 50-meter distance.

The swimming tank, which holds 1,025,000 gallons of water, has a raised deck gutter with a large overflow. This gutter design is similar to the Indianapolis Natatorium design. Pool depth varies from 4.3 feet to 6.5 feet at the shallow end, utilizing a movable floor of 35 by 75 feet. Water under the diving boards and tower is 17 feet deep. The natatorium features Daktronic automatic timing for swim meets. A 16-by-23 foot wall-mounted scoreboard allows full display of information for eight-lane and 16-lane swim meets. The scoreboard can also display graphics and animation sequences.

The diving facilities are among the best in the world. The facility has two 1-meter boards and two 3-meter boards set on concrete platforms. Each platform is eight feet wide with lengths from 23 feet to 28 feet.

The facility won the 1990 Association of General Contractors Award for Structures. There is a 40-foot dryland diving area permanently set up with a trampoline, Portapit diving board and two diving/tumbling harnesses for somersaulting and twisting practice.

The Aquatic Center has a full training room equipped with two treatment tables, EGS and ultrasound machine, hydrocollator, and ice machine. There is a trainer on duty at all times.

In the adjacent Seaton Physical Education building are exercise physiology labs that are utilized for the testing of swimmers and divers.


The second balcony accommodates up to 500 spectators and has a concession stand area.

The Aquatic Center was host to the NCAA Zone B Diving Championships in 2002 and again in 2006.

In July of 2000, the United States Olympic Divers put on two exhibitions before embarking upon their trip to Sydney to compete in the 2000 games.

In 1999, UK hosted the Southeastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships at the Aquatic Center. Pool records fell left and right as some of the nation's most talented divers and fastest swimmers competed at the Aquatic Center, Feb. 17-20.

In addition to hosting the 1996 U.S. Olympic Diving Team, the Center hosts the premier swimming and diving events in the state of Kentucky. These events include all UK home meets, the Kentucky State High School Championships, the Kentucky USS Championships, Zone and Regional Age Group and Senior Diving meets, Kentucky Special Olympics, and Bluegrass Games Diving meets. Highlights at the Aquatic Center have been the 1991, 1999 and 2007 Southeastern Conference Championships, the 1995 Southeastern Conference Diving Championships, the 1995, 2002 and 2006 NCAA Zone B Diving Championships and the 1990 World Games Diving Team Trials.





STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

The Kentucky swimming and diving team calls Shively Training Center its home for strength and conditioning. The 2,000-square foot complex is under the direction of Coach Stephanie Tracey-Simmons and features a variety of free weight equipment, which complements the training philosophy of the Shively staff.

"Our top goal is to create a comprehensive training program, which encompasses the areas of speed, power, strength, agility, flexibility, balance and nutrition," Tracey-Simmons said. "Through these avenues, we are providing the athletes with the tools they need to reach their athletic potential while remaining injury-free."

The primary focus of the facility is the development of core strength using ground-based, multi-joint lifting through use of the Olympic lifts. By incorporating this explosive style of lifting, athletes become more powerful, resulting in an increase in speed. The core of the athlete's body also is trained and complemented with a variety of lifts, including squats, lunges, plyometrics, presses, pulls, trunk rotation and abdominal exercise. Through the combination of these exercises, the athletes are better able to reach their goals.

Tracey-Simmons attempts to be as sport specific as possible while staying within the structure of the ground-based philosophy. For swimming the upperclassmen are divided into two groups: sprinters and middle distance / distance. The sprint group's main focus is based around explosive lifts that help them use their power off

of the blocks and on their turns.

The middle distance/distance group's main focus is strength endurance to help them maintain their speed and form while battling lactic acid build up in their muscles.

All of the incoming swimmers go through a four-week orientation to ensure that proper technique is used as well as to help lay a solid foundation for strength gains. After this four-week period, they are placed in one of the two upperclassmen's groups depending upon their events. All of the lifts used are put into place to make better swimmers.

Graduate Assistant Scott Willis trains the divers. Their focus is on being as explosive as possible off of the board for maximum jump height. The divers spend a lot of their time working on Olympic style lifts, core strengthening exercises and shoulder pre-habilitation work. It is necessary for divers to be able to control their bodies in space, as well as to be as strong as possible in the overhead position in order to reduce the risk of injury while entering the water.

With the help of staff nutritionist Jill Kindy, the Shively staff also helps educate the athletes on nutrition and supplement awareness.

Every squad trains together at Shively, promoting team chemistry and teamwork. Through this set-up, teams work on mental toughness, attacking goals and maintaining a positive attitude, keeping everyone moving toward a common goal.

STEPHANIE TRACEY-SIMMONS



Stephanie Tracey-Simmons is in her sixth year at Kentucky as the head strength and conditioning coach for the Olympic sports. She is in her sixth year working with the swimming

and diving team.

She also works directly with women's basketball, volleyball and softball. The other sports that are covered by her staff are men's and women's soccer, gymnastics, men's and women's tennis, and track and field.


Prior to Kentucky, Tracey-Simmons spent four years at UCLA where she coached three national championship teams as well as 10 Olympians. Before leaving UCLA, she served as the associate head strength coach responsible for training women's volleyball, women's soccer, men's and women's water polo, women's swimming, women's basketball, and softball.


A native of Huntsville, Ohio, Tracey-Simmons began her career in strength and conditioning as a graduate assistant at Ohio University where she earned a bachelor's of science degree in journalism as well as a master's degree in physical education. She was also a four-year letter winner on the OU volleyball team where she played the opposite hitter position from 1993-1996.


She is a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) and is Strength & Conditioning Coach Certified (SCCC). She and husband, Matt Simmons, reside in Lexington.

PRESEASON CONDITIONING

The road to success in the SEC and NCAA championships goes beyond the pool in preseason workouts. Late summer days on the UK campus include running sessions in areas like Commonwealth Stadium and in the lawns adjacent to the Lancaster Aquatic Center. For the last two seasons, the Wildcats have participated in an on-going dry land training competition. Activities included the typical training, a scavenger hunt throughout campus and the annual Blue/White meet. The scavenger hunt allows the athletes to show off their creativity with their team names and costumes. Capping off the fall season at the Blue/White meet the team saw the Blue team earn bragging rights, captained by Grant Nelson and Haleigh Kerns.









THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY

rom Paducah to Pikeville, Covington to Cumberland, the University of Kentucky touches lives across the Bluegrass State, providing education, cultural stimulation and economic development in all 120 counties. Considering that residents of all Kentucky counties benefit from the University's medical care, community service, innovative



research and creative teaching and instruction, there's no question UK is The University of Kentucky.

HISTORY

Nestled in heart of Kentucky's scenic Bluegrass region, UK was founded in 1865 as a land-grant university. From its beginnings with only 190 students and 10 professors, UK's campus now covers more than 716 acres in Lexington and is home to more than 27,000 students and more than 13,500 employees. The university also operates remote research laboratories in areas such as Princeton, Ky., and Quicksand, Ky.

MISSION

The University of Kentucky has long embraced its mission to provide excellent education to outstanding resident and non-resident students, recognizing that a knowledgeable populace is the best foundation for a prosperous Commonwealth. This mission has been further enhanced since 1997, when the Kentucky General Assembly mandated that UK become a Top 20 public research university by 2020. President Lee T. Todd, Jr., focused the University on achieving this goal through the development of a Top 20 Business Plan in 2005 that gained national prominence for its vision and detail.

"As the state's flagship institution, UK is mindful of its responsibility to help all Kentuckians," Todd says. "Our land-grant mission calls on us to make a positive impact across the state. We need to be an education leader, while remaining accessible to all Kentuckians. We need to be a cultural leader, sharing new ideas and opportunities across the state. And we need to be leading Kentucky's charge into the new economy. We are the catalyst for a new Commonwealth."

STUDENTS.

Students from 117 countries, every state in the nation and every Kentucky county provide a diverse learning and cultural environment that enriches the educational experience at UK. While the student population has enjoyed steady growth in the past several years, the average ACT score of entering freshmen has continually exceeded the national average and is competitive with UK's benchmark institutions – the top public universities in America. The high quality of UK's students is confirmed by their successful competition for the most prestigious awards, including the

Fulbright, Truman, Goldwater and Marshall scholarships. UK has twice been selected as one of only 13 universities nationwide to participate in the Beckman Foundation Scholarship Program, allowing the University to award grants of \$19,300 to students to support their own research projects. Boasting 12 Truman Scholars, UK has won recognition from the Harry S. Truman Foundation as an honor institution for exemplary participation in the program.

OUTREACH

Thousands of Kentuckians from across the state feel the impact of UK's research and public service annually, through programs aimed at improving industrial productivity, agricultural profitability and home life. Programs like the Health Education through Extension Leadership bring the results of health research to local communities, helping boost the quality of life across the state.


Meanwhile, Kentuckians have responded to the University's commitment to the Commonwealth through their remarkable support of The Campaign for the University of Kentucky. The fund-raising effort – the largest in state history – to enhance facilities, academic programs, public service and scholarships recently surpassed its \$1 billion goal. The generosity of UK's alumni and friends allowed it to fully ultilize its allocation of state support available through Kentucky's Research Challenge Trust Fund program.

PROGRAMS

UK students enjoy an enormous array of choices, with some 200 majors and degree programs in 17 academic and professional colleges available. UK is one of only a few public universities nationally to house colleges of Agriculture, Arts and Sciences, Business and Economics, Communications and Information Studies, Dentistry, Design, Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Health Sciences, Law, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Public Health, and Social Work on a single campus.

RESEARCH

"Determination" is truly the word describing UK's focus on achieving its Top 20 research goal. For the last five years, the University has consistently exceeded \$200 million in sponsored projects awards. UK faculty recently attracted a record-breaking total of \$290 million in extramural funding for grants and contracts. A recent ranking placed UK at 24th among all



public universities for federal expenditures. Meanwhile, the inventiveness of UK faculty continue to earn the University its standing as 17th among land-grant universities, 34th among public universities and 57th overall in licensing income and patents. Another national ranking recently put UK 19th among public institutions for the scholarly productivity of its faculty.

MEDICAL CENTERS

The UK Chandler Medical Center, opened in 1960, stands among the nation's finest academic medical centers. Its faculty, students and staff take pride in achieving excellence in education, patient care, research, and community service. One of two Level 1 Trauma Centers in Kentucky, UK cares for the most critically injured and ill patients in the region. More than 500 faculty physicians and dentists, 400 resident physicians and a staff of 3,200 health professionals provide care in the 473-bed UK Chandler Hospital and Kentucky Children's Hospital.

In spring 2007, ground was broken for a new \$525 million UK Chandler Hospital. This more than 1-million square foot facility, to be completed in 2011, is the cornerstone of a 20-year, \$2.5 billion plan to construct the Commonwealth Medical Campus of the Future. Among the campus' components are a now-under-construction \$120 million pharmacy building, additional research buildings, a new shared Health Sciences Learning Center, and additional buildings to house programs for the colleges of Medicine, Nursing, Health Sciences, Dentistry, and Public Health.

LIBRARIES

No university can provide adequate opportunities to its students – or to the residents of the state it serves – without outstanding

library facilities. The University of Kentucky exceeds expectations because it operates a nationally recognized research library system, with the capstone being the world-class William T. Young Library. UK's book endowment is the largest among public universities. Its library network and technology provide extraordinary service to students in the colleges of Medicine, Law, Engineering, Fine Arts and other programs. Meanwhile, students, faculty and Kentucky residents can use UK Libraries'



President Todd has concentrated his efforts and energies on helping his alma mater achieve a greater level of national prominence. He launched the University of Kentucky's Top 20 Business Plan in December 2005. The plan is a quantitative analysis highlighting what it will take for UK to achieve its state-mandated goal

of building a Top 20 public research university. Widely hailed as the first business plan by a public university in the nation, UK's plan has garnered widespread national attention. It has been featured by national media outlets and recognized by peer institutions, as several higher education leaders have visited UK's campus to learn more about the Business Plan approach. The Top 20 Business Plan has also gained support throughout the Commonwealth, as the Kentucky General Assembly fully funded the plan beginning in 2007-08.

President Todd has spearheaded an effort to revitalize health care in Kentucky. In June 2006, UK unveiled the Commonwealth's Medical Campus of the Future, a multi-phased project aimed at providing Kentuckians with cutting-

KENTUCKY AHTLETICS - ON THE RISE


When Kentucky athletics director Mitch Barnhart and his staff took over in Lexington, one of their stated goals was to compete for championships in all sports. By any measure, the Wildcats are on the right path, making it an exciting and rewarding time to be a part of Kentucky Athletics.

In the past three years, Kentucky has seen five coaches named SEC Coach of the Year after guiding their respective teams to tremendous success: John Cohen (baseball-2006), Mickie DeMoss (basketball-2006), Warren Lipka (soccer-2006), Mike Lyden (diving-2005-07) and Craig Skinner (volleyball-2005).

"We are competing in the greatest league in America," UK Deputy Director of Athletics Rob Mullens said. "When you succeed as a team or receive individual recognition, it shows you are competing at a very high level. We are focused on broad-based excellence, and when you have this kind of success, you can see that the vision is working."

Cohen was a unanimous choice for SEC Coach of the Year in 2006, after leading his team to a worst-to-first turnaround and the first SEC title in program history in just his third season at the helm.

Former women's basketball coach Mickie DeMoss led the Wildcats to a 22-9 record and a fourth-place finish in the SEC in the 2005-06 season. The team knocked off No. 1 Tennessee in February to highlight a season that saw the team make the NCAA tournament for the first time since 1999, advancing to the tournament's second round.



Lipka earned the SEC Coach of the Year in the fall of 2006, after his women's soccer team went on an incredible run to close the season and claim the SEC tournament title. The women's soccer team advanced to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2002.

Diving Coach Mike Lyden has garnered the SEC Diving Coach of the Year in three consecutive seasons. During that time he coached his first national champion Taryn Ignacio in 2006. Ignacio's five SEC crowns led the way for an array of divers having success under Lyden's tutelage.

In his first year at the helm in 2005, Skinner inherited a volleyball squad that had not experienced a winning season in five years and hit the ground with the mindset that the timeline for success in the program was immediate. Skinner led the Cats to a 17-12 record, a 10-6 SEC mark and their first NCAA tournament appearance since 1993.

"It is a very exciting time to be a part of Kentucky Athletics," said Mullens. "It is great to see our vision succeeding throughout the whole department. To have five coaches win SEC Coach of the Year honors, it just shows an unbelievable passion and commitment to excellence that our coaches are demonstrating."

he University of Kentucky
has made a commitment to put the student-athlete at the heart of the program.

The cornerstone of that commitment lies in the academic success of the University's studentathletes. And at UK, that success stems from the resources within the Ohio Casualty Group's Center for Academic and Tutorial Services (CATS).

UK opened CATS in 1981. the nation's first academic center dedicated exclusively to srudent-athletes. Over the years, as the services offered by CATS have grown, so did the need for additional space.

As a result, UK built a new facility - the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, thanks to a one-million dollar grant from the Ohio Casualty Insurance Group. The Ohio Casualty Center opened in 1998 at a total cost of \$2.4 million.

Much of the credit for UK's academic success goes to the Athletics Association's academic support system - the Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, or simply, "CATS."

CATS, constructed in Memorial Coliseum, includes:

- 20,000 square feet of space more than double the size of the former CATS facility:
- a computer room housing 35 computers;
- a study area which accommodates 90-100 people;
- 24 tutoring rooms;
- a career development and life skills resource center;
- a community outreach office; and
- offices for the staff.

Certainly, a facility is a good start, but any program - especially in academics - is only as good as the people who run it. And UK is fortunate to have outstanding leaders in its academics support system.

Bob Bradley, Associate Athletics Director for Student Services, oversees the CATS program. Bradley was named National Academic Advisor of the Year in 1989 and 1992. In 2000 he was selected as the CHAMPS Life Skills Coordinator of the Year by the NCAA Division I-A Athletic Directors Association.

CATS has a full-time staff of 11. In addition to Bradley, they are:

CATS also employs seven graduate assistants and numerous tutors, both from the University and the surrounding community. UK has budgeted more than \$1,000,000 for the operation of CATS in the coming year.

"We are extremely proud of what we have accomplished in the academic arena," Bradley says. "The CATS program is focused on winning in the classroom. We look at each student-athlete's individual needs, set goals, and develop strategies to attain those goals. Our center provides our student-athletes with a definite advantage over student-athletes at many other institutions. Our goal is to show that we care about the student as well as the athlete."

For the CATS staff, showing you care means more than helping athletes maintain eligibility, graduate, or win awards. The academics staff also prepares student-athletes for life after college with the Wildcat Career Development Program.

The Career Development Program helps student-athletes look to the future through a stepby-step process which includes:

- Mentoring and internships, which help determine career interests;
- career counseling;
- resume writing; and
- forming a career plan.

The Wildcat Career Development Program works closely with the University's Career Planning and Placement Center in order to provide additional assistance when needed.

THE WILLIAM T. YOUNG LIBRARY

n addition to providing the finest in athletics facilities, the University of Kentucky also provides student-athletes with the best in academic facilities. One of the most recent additions to the educational landscape at UK is the \$58 million William T. Young Library.

- **Size:** The library covers 365,350 square feet, more than six football fields. The building is five stories high, plus a basement.
- Shelf capacity: If laid end-to-end, the bookshelf space would stretch 198,828 linear feet that's more than 37 miles of shelf space. The shelves will house 1.2 million books.
- Seating capacity: The library can seat more than 4,000 patrons at one time, a 355 percent increase over the old library. The seating on the fifth floor of the new library equals the capacity of the former library.
- Computer connections: Every study table and study carrel in the library has an electrical outlet and a computer jack connected to the University's computer system. Virtually the entire library has wireless coverage.

• Flexibility: The library has a state-of-the-art electronic infrastructure that will enable UK to take full advantage of current and emerging technology. In addition, the five floors and basement of the structure are designed as open, flexible spaces, enabling the library to adapt its services and facilities to the future changes in needs of UK students.

• Endowment: The UK Library has the nation's largest book endowment among public universities and ranks second only to Harvard.

LEXINGTON

This is Lexington, home of the University of Kentucky. Located at the heart of Kentucky's famous scenic Bluegrass region, Lexington combines the excitement of a metropolitan area with the hospitality of a Southern hometown atmosphere.

With a population of 263,618, Lexington's size makes for the perfect college environment for the University. The city provides a wide range of activities for UK students and their visiting friends and families. For example, among other activities, Lexington visitors can:

- play golf on championship courses;
- tour the world-famous horse farms or visit the Kentucky Horse Park;
- sample the city's night life at the numerous restaurants and music clubs;

- enjoy horse racing at the Keeneland Race Course and Red Mile Track;
- visit the historic homes;
- cheer on numerous sporting events, including UK's 22 sports teams, the Lexington Legends pro baseball team, and the Lexington Horsemen arena football team.

Thanksgiving through New Year's Eve is an especially beautiful time to visit Lexington, when the Horse Park's animated light display, "Southern Lights," warms the holiday season.


