Coaching Staff



Gary Conelly Head Coach

Gary Conelly is in his ninth year as head coach of the Wildcats, with an overall dual meet record of 97-83 (62-32 women/ 35-51 men). Conelly was named UK's head women's coach in 1991-92 and men's head coach before the 1992-93 season.

Last season, Conelly led the women's team to a third-place finish at the SEC Championships, the highest finish for a UK women's squad in school history. Conelly coached Rachel Komisarz to a second place finish in the 1,650 freestyle at the NCAA Championships. The women's team finished 21st at the NCAA Championships, their sixth consecutive top-25 showing. On the men's side, Macon White qualified for the NCAA Championships in two events and narrowly missed qualifying for the consolation heat.

In the 1998-99 season, Conelly led both the men's and women's teams to top-25 finishes at the NCAA Championships. The men registered their highest finish ever, com-

ing in at No. 24, while the women finished 21st. The women's squad had 10 athletes advance to the NCAA meet, the most in school history.

In 1996-97, Conelly led the men's team to a 26th-place finish, at the time the men's best finish ever. Nat Lewis finished third in the 1,650 freestyle and ranks as the second-highest NCAA finisher in school history. The women finished in 24th place and had three team members earn All-America honors.

In the 1995-96 season, Conelly led the women's team to a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships, the highest finish in school history. In 1994-95, Conelly led the women's team to a fourth-place finish at the SEC Championships and a second straight 19th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Conelly was named 1995 SEC Women's Coach of the Year for his efforts.

Prior to becoming head coach at Kentucky, Conelly spent three years with UK as a graduate assistant coach. In Conelly's 11 years with UK, the swimming and diving programs have made great strides. In 1990, Conelly coached the team's first female All-American and NCAA finalist, Kellie Moran. Since then, seven more Wildcat

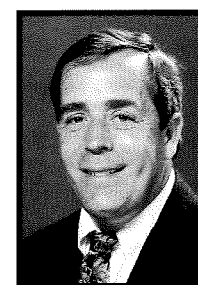
athletes have garnered All-America accolades under Conelly's tutelage.

Conelly came to the University of Kentucky from the West Florida Lightning Aquatics USS team in Largo, Fla. During his seven years at West Florida, Conelly directed 150 swimmers and produced three Olympic Trial qualifiers, two National Sports Festival team members, and one Sports Festival champion.

In 1987-88, Conelly became the first swim coach at St. Petersburg Junior College. He has also coached at the Charleston Swim Association in South Carolina and served as head coach of the Union Deportivo swim team in Las Palmas, Spain.

As a swimmer, Conelly was a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team and participated on the world record-setting 400-meter freestyle relay team. An Indiana University alumnus, Conelly was a 15-time NCAA All-American and is a member of the Indiana Swimming Hall of Fame. In 1973, Indiana honored him with the Balfour Award for excellence in swimming, leadership and scholarship.

Conelly is married to Kathleen Healey and has two children, Cody and Emily.



Michael Lyden Diving Coach

The 1999-00 season marks Michael Lyden's seventh season as diving coach at the University of Kentucky.

Since joining the Wildcats, Lyden has led UK to diving prominence. At the 1994 NCAA Championships, Tina Johnson became UK's first diving All-American on the platform and Jenny Baker earned honorable mention All-American in two events. In 1995, both divers earned All-America status and Lyden was named SEC Diving Coach of the Year for his efforts.

In 1996, Beth Leake and Christy Soulakis joined Baker and Johnson, with all four earning All-America honors. For his accomplish-

ments, Lyden was honored as 1996 SEC and NCAA Women's Diving Coach of the Year.

In 1997, Lyden led Soulakis to the SEC three-meter springboard championship and SEC Female Diver of the Year honors, while Soulakis and Paco Rivera claimed All-America awards.

Rivera became the first male UK diver to claim an SEC championship, winning the platform event and garnering All-SEC honors. Rivera advanced to the NCAA Championships, where he was named All-American in three events including a second-place finish on platform.

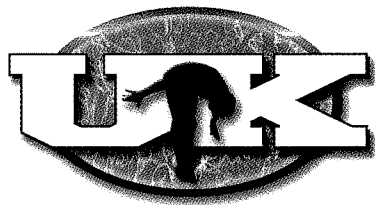
Before arriving at UK, Lyden spent nine seasons at Eastern Michigan, where he was named Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year nine times. He then moved to LSU, where he received SEC Women's Coach of the Year four times in four seasons and SEC Men's Coach of the Year in 1992. While at

LSU, Lyden's divers won 15 of 24 possible SEC titles.

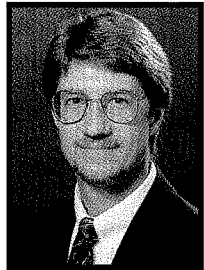
Lyden served as the U.S. National Team coach in 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996 and 1998, and has directed Junior and Senior divers in competitions in Italy, Austria, Mexico, Canada, Spain and China.

In addition to coaching, Lyden is a member of the U.S. Diving Rules Committee, the U.S. Olympic International Diving Committee, a senior representative of the Southern Local Diving Committee, and a lifetime member of U.S. Diving. In 1993-94, Lyden served on the NCAA Member Rules Committee.

A 1980 graduate of Western Michigan University, Lyden is married to Emily Joan Sullivan of Toledo, Ohio. They have three children - Jessica Ann, John Tyler and Britany Barbara.



Assistant Coaches



Pete Knox
Assistant Coach

Pete Knox is in his eighth year as an assistant coach after serving four years as UK's graduate assistant. Often described as a vigorous and intense leader, Knox primarily works as a sprint coach, coaching such swimmers as 1996 NCAA qualifier Rick Barber. Knox brings his vocal and energetic approach to every practice and has an excep-

tional ability to motivate his swimmers. With an exercise physiology and research background, Knox facilitates an ongoing weight-training program.

Knox came to Kentucky from Brandon, Fla., where he coached the Brandon High School men's and women's teams from 1980 to 1988. While at Brandon, his teams consistently placed in the top 10 at the Florida High School Championships. Knox also developed two All-America high school swimmers and had several Junior and Senior National qualifiers. An assistant coach with the Brandon Blue Wave USS Team from

1981 to 1988, Knox was selected Hillsborough County Coach of the Year in 1987.

A native of Norfolk, Va., Knox graduated with honors from the University of Florida in 1978 with a degree in health education. Knox is currently working toward a master's degree in exercise physiology with an emphasis directed toward the application to swimming.

Knox is married to former Wildcat swimming standout Wendy Hipskind.



Leslie Ramsey
Assistant Coach

Leslie Ramsey is in her fifth season with the UK swimming program and her second season as an assistant after serving for three years as a graduate assistant. Ramsey will work primarily with the I.M.ers and butterflyers.

At the 1996 U.S. Olympic Swimming Trials, Ramsey swam a personal best and reached the consolation heat of the 200-meter butterfly, finishing 14th.

The 1995 University of North Carolina

graduate earned All-America honors in the 200 butterfly in her junior and senior seasons in Chapel Hill. She also earned honorable mention All-America honors in the 500 and 1,650 freestyles while at UNC.

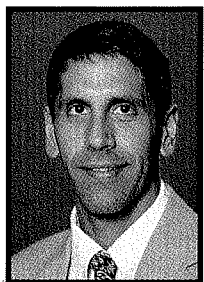
During her junior season, Ramsey was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Female Swimmer of the Year. She was the ACC Champion in the 200 butterfly her freshman and junior seasons. Ramsey also won team awards for Most Dedicated Swimmer her junior and senior years, Most Outstanding Swimmer and Most Valuable Swimmer her junior year. As an age-group swimmer, she swam for the Coast Guard Blue Dolphins in Yorktown, Va.

Ramsey, who coached at the UNC

Swim Camp, is no stranger to traveling. She accompanied Coach Gary Conelly on a coaching trip to Heidelberg, Germany during the summer of 1996, and traveled to eastern Africa in 1997 on a teaching excursion.

As a biology and sports science major, Ramsey was a two-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll. She is currently pursuing a master's degree in sports management at UK.

Ramsey is single and resides in Lexington.



John Brucato
Assistant Coach

John Brucato is beginning his first season with the UK swimming program. Brucato will be working primarily with the middle distance group and the breaststrokers.

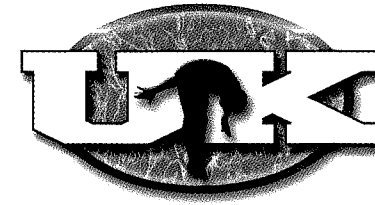
Brucato comes to UK via the U.S.S. club team Wildcat Aquatics in Lexington. He is in his 10th season with Wildcat Aquatics. Brucato came to WA in the spring of 1990 and has established himself as a leader in the Kentucky swim coaching community.

During his tenure with WA, Brucato has produced numerous Top-16 qualifiers, Junior National qualifiers, Senior National qualifiers, and an Olympic Gold Medalist. He is a former Kentucky Swimming Coach of the Year, in addition to being a Select Camp Coach and an Olympic Festival Coach.

In 1992, Brucato coached Megan Kleine to a gold medal in the 1992 Olympic Games as part of the United States' 400-meter medley relay. Kleine, who swam for six years under Brucato at WA, won Senior Nationals twice in the 100-meter breaststroke. Kleine went on to swim at the University of Texas at Austin.

A native of Covington, Ky., Brucato began his coaching career at the Covington YMCA and then spent two years with the Covington Clippers Swim Team. In 1985, he took over the helm at the Nashville Aquatic Club where he spent five successful years as the Head Age Group Coach before being hired on as the WA Senior Head Coach.

Brucato is a 1978 graduate of Northern Kentucky University where he received a degree in psychology. He lives in Lexington with his wife Jan, and their 11-year-old daughter, Katie.

Wynn Paul
Aquatics Director

A former UK men's and women's swimming and water polo coach, Wynn Paul has been a member of the UK staff for more than 35 years. He relinquished his coaching duties in 1991, when he accepted his current position of Aquatics Director, where he oversees facilities operations and event management at the Lancaster Aquatic Center.

Paul was named UK's men's coach in 1964

and assumed the duties of women's head coach when it became a varsity sport at Kentucky in 1983. During his coaching tenure, Paul compiled an impressive 135-61 dual meet record with the men's program and a 48-30 mark with the women's program.

Paul also was the men's varsity water polo coach from 1965-1982. His water polo teams had an outstanding 140-66 record, including the 1977 Midwest Conference Championship, before the program was dropped in 1983.

Paul's success as a coach is a testament to his extensive involvement in all aspects of swimming. Paul has served as meet director for the Southeastern Conference Swimming

and Diving Championships, the NCAA Zone "B" Qualifying Meet, the World Games Diving Trials, the Kentucky High School Championships, the Kentucky Special Olympics and the Kentucky USS Championships. He serves as meet director for all UK home meets.

A 1962 University of Louisville graduate, Paul was captain of his U of L swim team. He was the Cardinals' high point scorer for three years and held 12 varsity records. After graduating from U of L, Paul attended graduate school at UK.

Paul is married to Helen Pennington, an Assistant Professor of Nursing at Eastern Kentucky University.



Micki King
Special Assistant to the Athletics Director

Micki King enters her seventh year with the UK Athletics Association. Since being named Special Assistant to the Athletics Director in 1992, King has overseen the men's and women's swimming and diving teams, men's and women's tennis teams, rifle team, and cheerleading and pom squads.

A native of Pontiac, Mich., King served 26 years in the United States Air Force before retiring with the rank of colonel in 1992. During her years of service, King saw

assignments in Michigan, California, Washington, Colorado, Kentucky, and Germany. In fact, in 1973, King was the first woman to teach physical education at a military academy when she served at the United States Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs.

Prior to her military service, King was an accomplished diver. She graduated from the University of Michigan in 1966, where she was coached by five-time U.S. Olympic coach Dick Kimball. King was the 1972 springboard diving Olympic gold medalist and also participated in the 1968 Summer Games, where she finished fourth. In her decorated career, King also competed in two Pan American Games and won international diving titles in 15 countries. She is an inductee in seven Halls of Fame, including the

prestigious United States Olympic Hall of Fame.

After her diving career, King turned to coaching and served at the Air Force Academy from 1973-77 before taking a leave to work as a commentator for NBC Sports. King returned to the Academy in 1983 and was named assistant athletics director and diving coach. During this stint, she was named NCAA Division II coach of the year three times. Under King's tutelage, 11 divers were honored as All-Americans and two claimed national titles. In 1988, King traveled to the Seoul Games as a staff member of the U.S. Olympic diving team, and later served in the same capacity at the Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta.

King resides in Lexington and has two children, Michelle and Kevin.



Letitia Hollingsworth
Pool Manager

Letitia Hollingsworth enters her fourth season as Lancaster Aquatic Center Pool Manager. Prior to her stint as pool manager, Hollingsworth served as the UK swim team's staff assistant. At UK home meets, she serves as the operation manager for the electronic timing system and scoreboard.

The UK alumna and Lexington, Ky., native swam for the Wildcats from 1982-86 and was the captain of UK's first varsity women's swim team.

Hollingsworth teaches courses in CPR and swimming safety and serves as an examiner for the Red Cross. She is currently pursuing her MBA at UK.

Hollingsworth is married to Steve Gray and resides in Lexington.

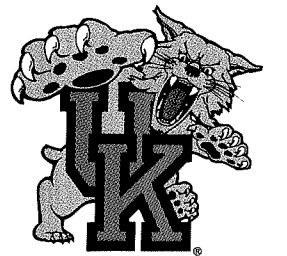

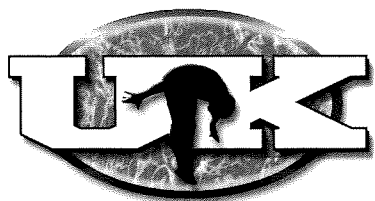

1999-00 Women's Swimming & Diving Outlook

When the 1999-2000 season begins for the UK women's swimming & diving team, the squad will be looking to build on one of the most successful seasons in school history. In 1999, the UK women's team finished third at the Southeastern Conference Championships, the highest finish at the conference meet in school history.

Can the Cats come up big again? To do so, UK will have to overcome the loss of several key swimmers, including three-time SEC champion and SEC Swimmer of the Year Rachel Komisarz. However, returning NCAA qualifiers Annabel Kosten, Melissa Olson and Carolyn

both the 50 and 100 freestyle, will have quality help around her.

The versatile Olson is the UK record holder in the 400 individual medley, finishing second at the 1997 SEC meet and 13th at last year's NAAs, earning honorable mention All-America honors.

Rader returns after a stellar freshman campaign in which she met the NCAA automatic cut in the 200 butterfly. Rader, a butterfly and distance freestyle specialist, also picked up four NCAA "B" standards and swam three events at the NCAA meet. She will be relied upon heavily in the dual-meet season to compete in several events.

Rader, combine with a strong incoming freshman class, that should be enough to keep UK among the SEC's elite.

"We take a real big hit losing some of our seniors," said UK coach Gary Conelly, who enters his ninth year coaching the Wildcats. "The good thing is we have a pretty talented freshman class."

Conelly called 1999 "a phenomenal year" for Kosten. She qualified for the NCAA Championships and competed in the 50- and 100-yard freestyles along with the 100 butterfly. Kosten, the UK record holder in



Freestyle Events

"The short freestyles are going to be the strength for us," Conelly said. "We have the possibility of having four girls break 23 seconds in the 50 freestyle."

Kosten leads the charge after finishing second at the SEC Championships in the 50 freestyle and fourth in the 100 freestyle. Kosten, a native of the Netherlands, anchors the 200- and 400- freestyle relays for the Cats.

Junior Jaime Siegele is another threat in the sprint freestyles. Last season at the SEC meet, Siegele scored in the 50 freestyle and was a member UK's school record setting 200- and 400-freestyle relays. Senior Jenny Priester, a former NCAA qualifier and honorable mention All-American, adds more depth to the

sprint events.

Incoming freshman Kelly Neal should make an impact in the sprint freestyle relays. Conelly believes Neal's potential is unlimited and said, "Kelly could be our next Annabel."

Sophomores Sarah Hoppe and Tracy Sullivan, along with freshman Lisa Beavers, give UK one of the deepest sprint corps in the SEC.

The middle distance freestyle events will be handled primarily by Rader and senior Kelley Miller.

"Carolyn has one of the nicest strokes I've ever seen," Conelly said. "She's a hard trainer and she also is very competitive. She should be way under 1:50 in the 200 freestyle."

Rader owns the team's fastest times in the 200 and 500 freestyle heading into the season and should improve in each event.

Miller made the NCAA "B" cut in the 500 freestyle in her freshman year and Conelly said she could also go under 1:50 in the 200 freestyle. Kosten was a member of the 800-freestyle relay that broke the team record last season and is capable of going under 1:50 in the 200

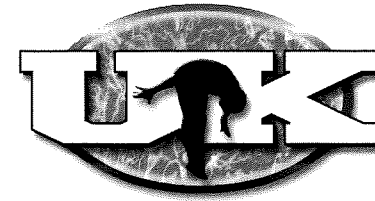
free. Conelly said he thinks Kosten, "will step up and do a real nice job."

According to Conelly, Sullivan will be much improved and counted upon to swim the 200 freestyle in dual meets. Debra Hinsley broke five minutes last season in the 500 freestyle and adds depth for UK.

However, the Wildcats are not as deep in the distance events.

"Emily Johnston (a freshman) is our only true distance swimmer," Conelly said. "I think we'll be okay in dual-meet situations but once we get to SECs, we'll find that we are not scoring as many points in the mile as we have in the past."

Rader scored in the 1,650 last season at SECs and qualified for the NCAA meet.



However, Conelly would like to be able to keep her in the butterfly and middle distance events for dual meets. That leaves Hinsley and Miller to shore up UK's chances in the distance events.

Deep Backstroke

Backstroke will be one of the bright spots for the Cats this season and leading the pack is senior Taryn Kannegeisser who is coming off her best season. She had the team's best times in the 100 backstroke and met the NCAA "B" cut in the 200 backstroke last season. The Sacramento, Calif., native scored in the top 12 in both events at SECs and will make an impact on both medley relays this season.

"Taryn had a great year and has a realistic shot at making the NCAA meet this year," Conelly said. "Her strong suit is the 200 back and she's the one that we're pinning a lot of our hopes on as far as how the medley relays do."

Olson holds the UK record in the 200 backstroke after finishing fifth at the SEC Championships in 1997. Olson and Kannegeisser provide UK with a strong one-two punch in the distance backstroke.

Swimming alongside Kannegeisser in the 100 backstroke will be Siegele, who scored at the SECs last season. Sarah Carter, coming off a solid freshman campaign, adds depth to both backstroke events.

Thin Breaststroke

While the Wildcats are deep at backstroke, the opposite holds true at breaststroke.

"Breaststroke is going to be a tough area for us," Conelly admitted. "It's good that we've got Jen Clifford who went to NAAs two years ago."

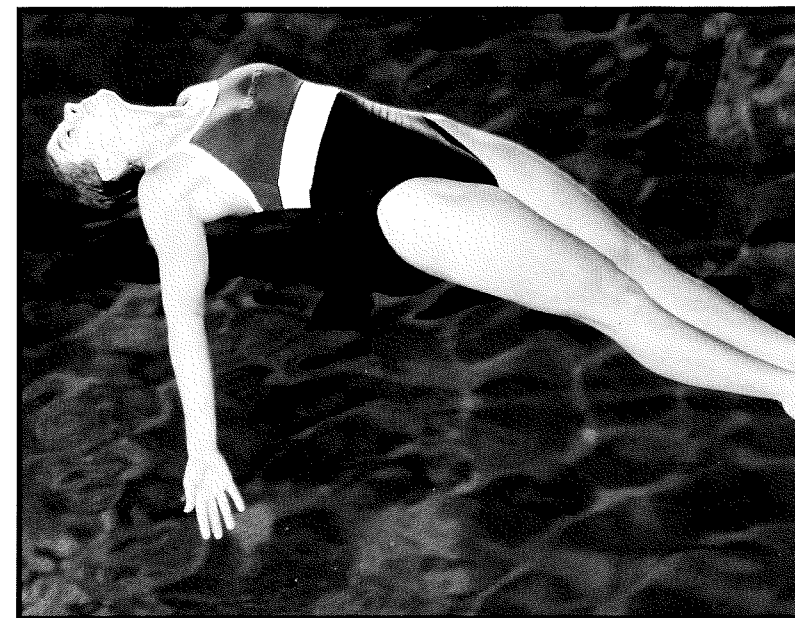
Clifford broke the UK school record in the 100 breaststroke in 1997 while Olson, a former UK record holder in the 200 breaststroke, adds depth in the 200 event but won't see action in the 100 breaststroke. Conelly said if it becomes a necessity to find another 100 breaststroker, Kosten might be the prime candidate.

Strong Butterfly

The butterfly duties will be handled by Rader, who met the NCAA automatic time standard last season in the 200 butterfly.

"I think we're in real good shape in butterfly with Carolyn," Conelly said. "She is going to hold that 200 fly record before she is done here."

Hinsley is strong in both butterflies, along with senior Emily Buske, both of whom rank in the UK all-time top 10 in both events. The Cats are five deep in the 100. Kosten qualified for NAAs, while Kannegeisser was

somewhat of a surprise in the 100 fly last season after scoring in the event at SECs, narrowly missing the NCAA "B" cut.

Individual Medley

The individual medley events will be Olson's to own. Olson was an All-American selection in the 400 IM in 1997. The West Virginia native owns four solid strokes making herself a prime IM threat.

"Melissa is just a heck of an IM swimmer," Conelly said. "She's such a big ace in the hole for us."

Emily Johnston complements Olson in the 400 IM while Kannegeisser and Clifford are capable of stepping up for the Cats in the 200 IM.

Divers Deep

The always strong UK diving squad returns experience and welcomes two talented newcomers. Juniors Carrie Knoeber and Sarah Fields return for UK diving coach Mike Lyden, giving the Cats two seasoned divers under his tutelage.

Lyden, in his seventh year coaching the UK divers, calls last year an "up and down" season for Knoeber, who finished second at the SEC Championships on the one-meter event and made the finals on platform. Lyden said Knoeber should finish in the top eight in all three events at SECs and qualify for the NCAA Championships in Indianapolis.

"When Carrie is on, she's potentially one of the best divers in the country," Lyden said. "If her consistency is there, then she will be really successful."

Consistent is the best way to describe Fields. Lyden says she's steady and does not make many mistakes. If the trend continues, Fields should have another excellent year.

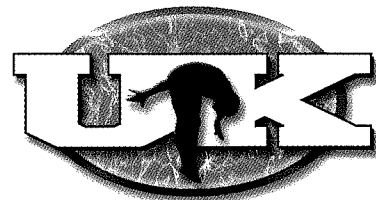
"If Sarah works like I expect and improves like she should, then she should

be knocking at making it to NAAs and should finish in the top eight in all three events at conference," Lyden said.

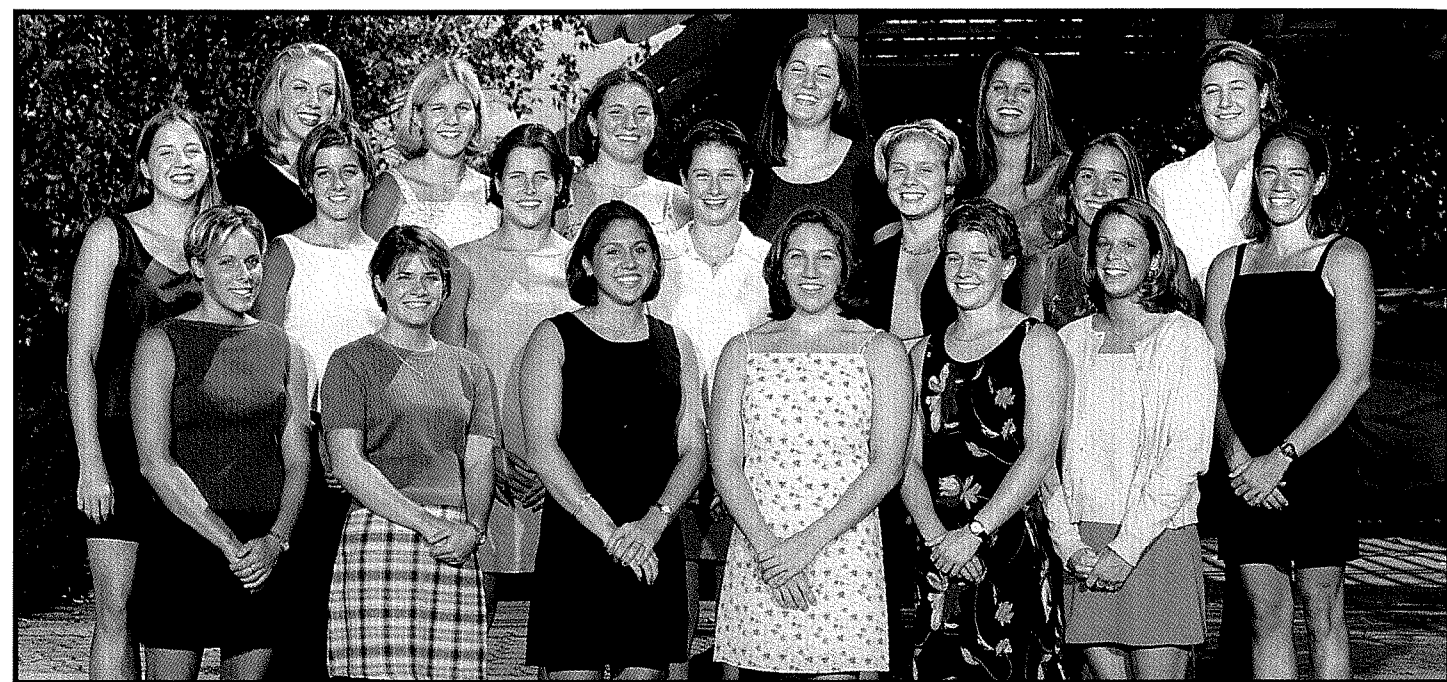
Newcomer Kelli Frost adds to the talent pool. Frost's strength lies on the three-meter and Lyden is confident she can learn a list on the tower to become a triple threat in all three diving events. Michelle Glowatch, a sophomore transfer from Georgia, is familiar with Lyden and the UK team after training under Lyden as an age-group diver while at Tates Creek High School in Lexington.

The combination of experience and talent on the swimming and diving team should provide the Cats with everything they need to continue their chase for the SEC Championship.

"I think the key for us is staying real positive about the season," Conelly said. "When the workouts get longer and days get more limited by swimming, they just need to stay positive and keep their focus."



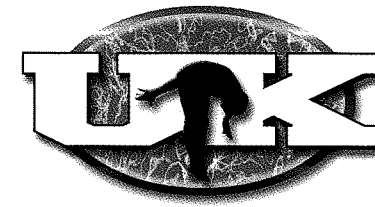

1998-99 Men's Swimming & Diving Outlook

A year of rebuilding is over. For the 1999-2000 University of Kentucky men's swimming and diving team, a combination of veterans and newcomers means the future has arrived. "The men's team really comes down to two classes, the junior and the freshman class," said UK coach Gary Conelly, entering his eighth year at the helm of the men's team. "This could be the best men's team we've had here at UK in quite a while."

Leading the junior class is freestyle specialist Macon White. Last season, White competed in the 200- and 500-yard freestyles at the NCAA Championships, finishing 17th and 37th respectively. The Huntington, W.Va., native shattered the nine-year-old UK school record in the 200 freestyle by nearly two seconds last season.

Sprint freestyler Shaun Zitani broke former UK standout Rick Barber's 50-freestyle record and just missed being invited to the NCAA meet. The junior met the NCAA "B" cut in the 50 and 100 freestyle and will anchor UK's sprint-freestyle relays.

"I think Zitani is real exciting because he's the first guy we ever had break 20.0 in the 50 freestyle," Conelly said. "He is doing things that have never been done here before."

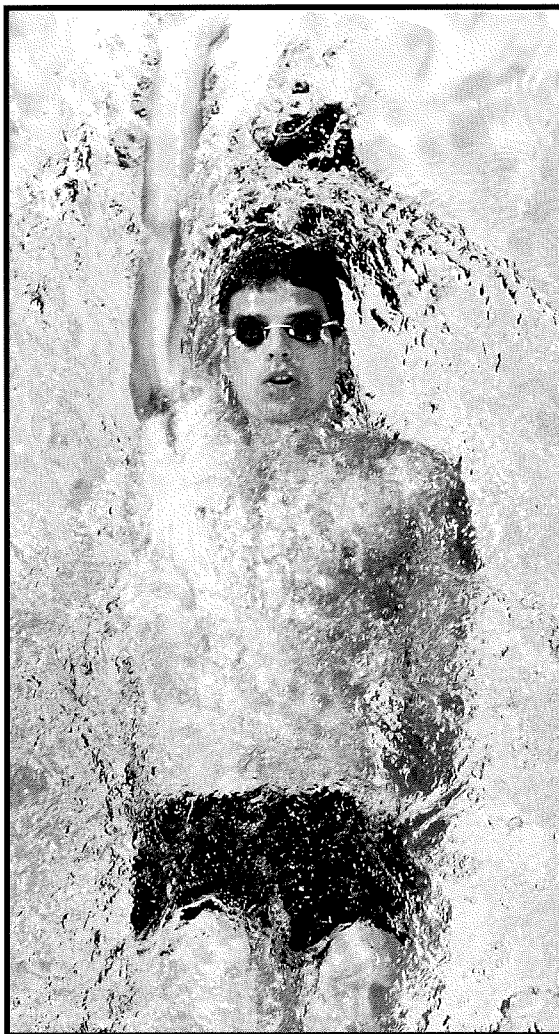
Along with Zitani in the sprint corps is junior Aaron Workman. Workman narrowly missed the NCAA "B" cut in the 50 freestyle last season and was a key member of UK's school record-breaking freestyle relays.

"I've got a lot of confidence in Aaron," Conelly said. "He's really motivated to do well."

Dave Tweedie had a breakout year during his freshman year, but his sophomore season was a bit bumpy according to Conelly. If Tweedie can duplicate his 1998 campaign, big things could be in store for the Granger, Ind., native.

"Those four guys are a really good group," Conelly said. "They are the ones we're going to be looking to for team leadership. The direction those guys go in is the direction this team goes in."

To go along with the junior class is a rookie class that Conelly says is, "probably the best freshman class we've ever signed."



Freshman Eddie Clement will anchor the individual medley and butterfly events for the Cats this season.

Eddie Clement, a native of Essex, England, heads the youth movement.

"Eddie Clement is probably the best recruit we've ever signed coming out of high school," Conelly said. "He has a great attitude and is a very competitive young man. If he wasn't a swimmer, he'd probably be a boxer because he likes a fight."

Along with Clement, five other freshmen round out a class long on talent and short on maturity.

"There's so much potential in this freshman class that if everything clicks, we could make a move in the SEC," said Conelly,

whose Wildcats finished eighth in the Southeastern Conference last season. "They are real bright guys and I think that will reflect in their approach to swimming and school. You are going to see that they are pretty serious about what they're doing."

Loaded Freestyle

Like the UK women's squad, the sprint freestyle events should be the strength of the men's team.

"The sprint freestyles are probably the best events, the deepest events, and most exciting events for us," Conelly said.

Zitani is arguably the most talented UK sprinter to perform in Lancaster Aquatic Center for the Cats. At the SEC Championships last season, Zitani finished ninth in the 50 freestyle and 12th in the 100 freestyle.

He and Workman help form the backbone of the sprint group. Workman ranks among UK's all-time top-five in the 50 and 100 freestyles and both swimmers were major contributors during the dual meet season.

"With Zitani and Workman, I think you are going to see them go one-two in a lot of dual meets," Conelly said. "They are clearly the two premier guys, but Macon will be right there, too. On a good day, if we get it worked out for Macon to swim the 100, then I think we could go one-two-three."

Adding depth to the sprint events will be Tweedie, who swam the team's fourth fastest 50 freestyle time last year. Sophomore Derek Perkins had a tremendous freshman campaign and makes the sprint group even deeper.

The middle distance freestyles are led by White, who Conelly says is his most consistent performer.

"Macon isn't a guy that just swims fast at the end of the year," Conelly said. "He swims fast all year long. I think this year you are going to see him go under 1:40 in the 200 freestyle consistently in dual meets. Macon is a swimmer that could go from not

scoring at NCAAs to being in the top eight."

Tweedie will see quality time in the 200 and 500 freestyles as well. He and White combine to form a solid middle distance tandem.

However, as the distance increases, the freestyle depth decreases.

"We've got David Kuendig coming back and he's a real good dual meet swimmer," Conelly said. "But he's the only true distance swimmer we have. We're going to be filling in there with Macon, Tweedie and Clement."

Backstroke

Freshman Cody Nath will anchor both backstroke events for the Cats. Conelly is excited about the Wichita, Kan., native and believes the 6-foot-2 backstroker has the ability to become an accomplished swimmer.

"I'm really excited about Cody Nath and what he can do in the 200 backstroke," Conelly said. "He's a real late bloomer and he's fired up about coming to school here."

Clement as well as sophomore Bernard Fowler will be called upon to serve in the 200 backstroke.

Nath, along with senior Brett Palmer, will handle most of the 100 backstroke duties.

Improving Breaststroke

Traditionally one of UK's weakest events, the Cats plan on making waves in the event with two incoming breaststrokers.

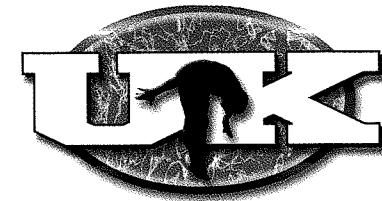
"We have Aaron Cuker and Roger Watkins who I think are really going to help us out in the breaststroke," Conelly said.

Cuker is a talented breaststroker whose specialty could be the 200. Along with Roger Watkins, the duo should solve the recent depth problems UK has had in the breaststroke events while Josh Waldrop returns to add depth in the 100 and 200.

Fast Fly

UK returns its best 100 butterfly in Zitani who came within a half second of breaking his second school record of the year. Palmer and Perkins will give the Cats quality depth in the 100 butterfly along with freshman Matt Nilson. However, the 200 is not quite as sound.

"We have notoriously been a weak 200



butterfly team," Conelly said. "It's still going to be a little bit rough for us. Eddie is going to be the guy that really helps us out."

Clement's best 200 butterfly converted from short course meters (the standard distance swam in England) to yards is faster than the existing UK 200 butterfly record held by Martyn Wilby. Nilson, Palmer, and Perkins will also compete in the 200 butterfly for UK.

Individual Medley

"IM should be a strong spot for us because we've got Eddie, who was second in the 400 IM at the Short Course Nationals in England last year," Conelly said.



Freshman Clayton Moss brings an impressive resume and unlimited potential to the UK lineup.

Clement should be one of the top IMers in the SEC this year, especially in the 400 where he excels. His best 400 IM converted from short course meters to yards would put him in UK's all-time top two. Clement should be strong in the 200 IM as well.

Helping solidify the IM races for UK will be two breaststrokers - Cuker and Watkins - both solid in the 200 and 400 IM events.

Talented Divers

Returning for UK on the boards this season are sophomore Aaron Kirkpatrick and

junior Kyle McDuffie. Talented Clayton Moss joins Kirkpatrick and McDuffie, giving the Cats one of their most solid diving teams in the last five years.

Kirkpatrick returns after what coach Mike Lyden calls "a tremendous freshman year." The Pendleton, Ind., native excels on the one-meter and three-meter springboards. He ranks in UK's all-time top-five on the one-meter and three-meter springboard events.

"His springboard skills are potentially great," Lyden said. "He did not make the finals at the SECs but at the NCAA qualifying meet, he was the alternate to make NCAAs. I could see him making the finals on both springboard events at SECs this year."

McDuffie, in his second season after transferring from Virginia, made steady contributions last season, finishing 10th on the three-meter at the SEC Championships.

"Kyle is a very talented and acrobatic athlete," Lyden said. "Acrobatically, he could compete with anyone in the country. He needs to develop a little more confidence in his skills and learn how to compete a little better."

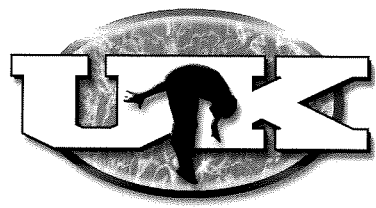
The highly recruited Moss comes to Lexington from the prominent Moultrie (Ga.) Diving Club, which has produced some of the nation's best divers. Lyden calls the three-meter springboard Moss' strongest event, but he is also strong on the one-meter and platform.

"Clayton is probably the best diver I've ever recruited," Lyden said. "He'll

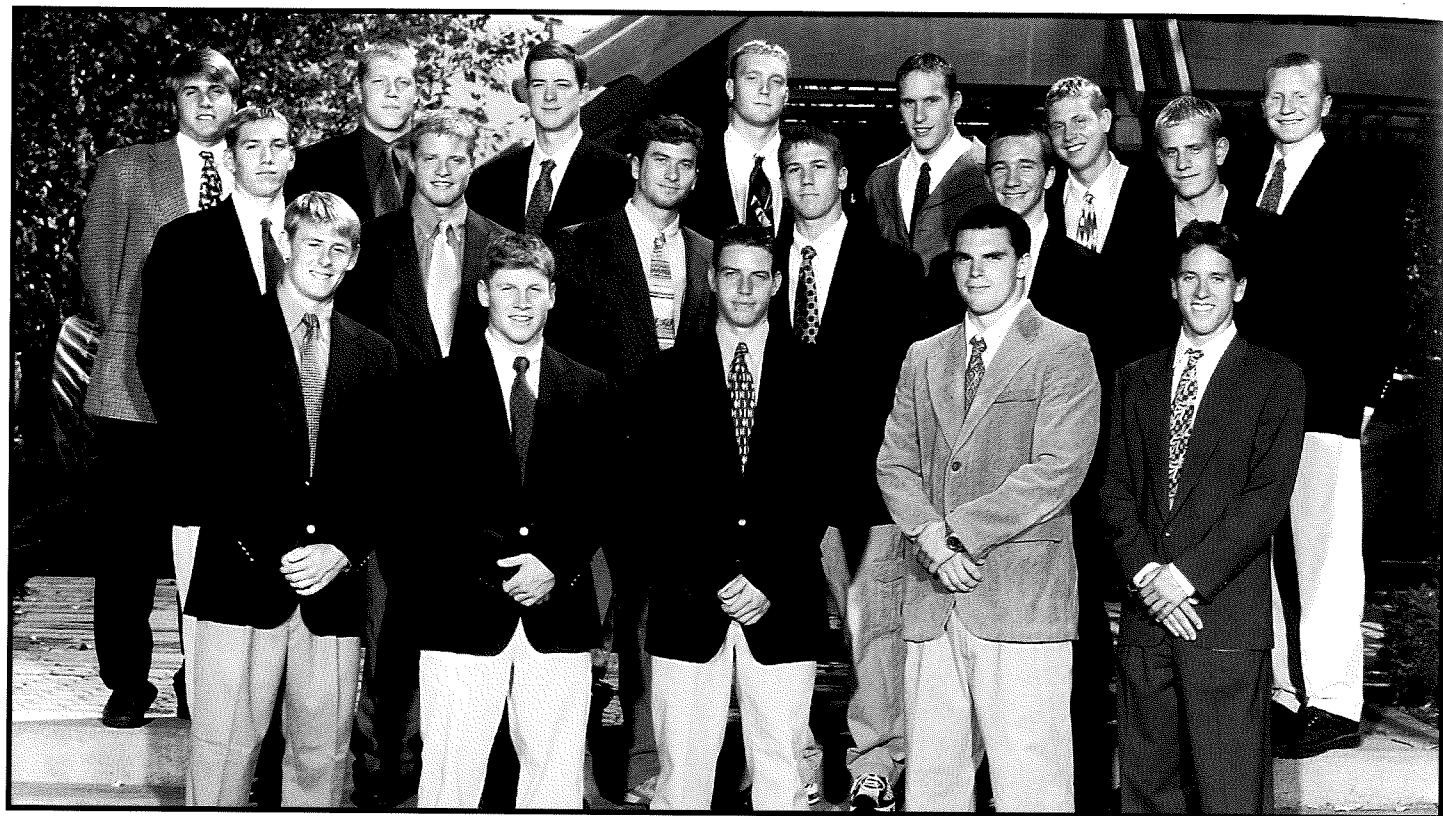
be in the hunt to win a springboard at SECs, but he's in the hunt to win almost any meet he's in. I don't know exactly how good he'll be this year but he should make it to NCAAs. He is good enough to make the finals at NCAAs."

The UK men's team has the potential and ability to move into the SEC's top-five this season. Conelly said he is looking for one of the sprint-freestyle relays and two individuals to get invited to the NCAA meet this year which, "would be a great year."

"A lot depends on the freshman class. They need to have a good sense that they can compete at this level and not be overwhelmed that they're swimming or diving in the SEC. They're real eager to compete and I think they can do it."



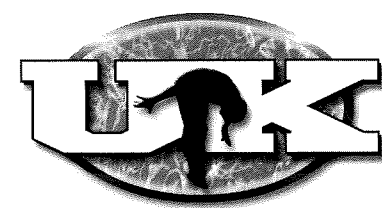

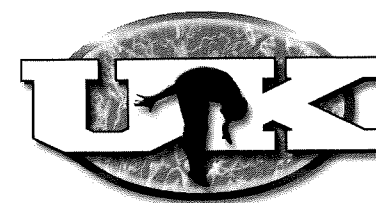
Lancaster Aquatic Center



The University of Kentucky's Lancaster Aquatic Center, opened March 29, 1989, represents the finest in collegiate swimming and diving facilities.

The natatorium is named for Harry C. Lancaster, former UK Athletics Director (1968-1976) and assistant basketball coach (1946-70) to Kentucky's legendary Adolph Rupp.

The indoor facility is 25 yards by 176 feet with a movable bulkhead that can be set at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. The movable bulkhead allows the facility to be used for a number of activities other than swim meets and practices, including recreational swimming, aquatic



classes, swimming and diving lessons, scuba instruction, handicapped swimming and other aquatic-related activities.

Racing lanes can be set up in five configurations: across-the-pool racing at 25 yards, 25 meters, 50 yards and 50 meters. Two 25-yard courses can be utilized for large swim meets. Eighteen swimming lanes are available while diving events are in progress. Long course racing will have eight full-size lanes for the 50-meter distance.

The swimming tank, which holds 1,025,000 gallons of water, has a raised deck gutter with a large overflow. This gutter design is similar to the Indianapolis Natatorium design. Pool depth varies from 4.3 feet to 6.5 feet at the shallow end utilizing a movable floor of 35 by 75 feet. Water under the diving boards and tower is 17 feet deep. The natatorium features Daktronic automatic timing for swim meets. A 16-by-23 foot wall-mounted scoreboard allows full display of information for eight-lane and 16-lane swim meets. The scoreboard can also display graphics and animation sequences.

The diving facilities are among the best in the world. The facility has two 1-meter boards and two 3-meter boards set on concrete platforms. Each platform is eight feet wide with lengths from 23 feet to 28 feet.

The facility won the 1990 Association of General Contractors Award for Structures. There is a 40-foot dryland diving

area permanently set up with a trampoline, Portapit diving board and two diving/tumbling harnesses for somersaulting and twisting practice.

The Aquatic Center has a full training room equipped with two treatment tables, EGS and ultrasound machine, hydrocollator, and ice machine. There is a trainer on duty at all times.



The Aquatic Center has a weight room for swimmers and divers equipped with Cybex weight training machines. In the adjacent Seaton Physical Education building are exercise physiology labs that are utilized for the testing of swimmers and divers.

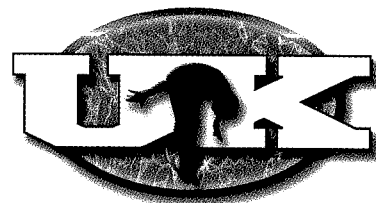
The second balcony of the Aquatic Center accommodates up to 750 spectators and has a concession stand area.

Last season, UK hosted the 1999 Southeastern Conference Swimming and Diving

Championships at the Aquatic Center. Pool records fell as some of the nation's most talented divers and fastest swimmers competed at the Aquatic Center, Feb. 17-20.

In addition to hosting the 1996 U.S. Olympic Diving Team, the Aquatic Center annually hosts the premier swimming and diving events in the state of Kentucky. These events include all UK home meets, the Ken-

tucky State High School Championships, the Kentucky USS Championships, Zone and Regional Age Group and Senior Diving meets, Kentucky Special Olympics, and Bluegrass Games Diving meets. Highlights at the Aquatic Center have been the 1991 Southeastern Conference Championships, the 1995 Southeastern Conference Diving Championships, the 1995 NCAA Zone B Diving Championships and the 1990 World Games Diving Team Trials.

The University of Kentucky was founded in 1865 as a land-grant institution and the present name dates to 1916.

The campus in Lexington has 673 acres and is located just south of downtown. It consists of a graduate school, the University hospital and 16 colleges. The colleges are: allied health professions, architecture, arts and sciences, agriculture, business and economics, communications and information studies, dentistry, engineering, education,

fine arts, human environmental sciences, law, medicine, nursing, pharmacy and social work. The graduate school offers 97 master's degree programs and 59 doctoral programs.

Enrollment on the campus in Lexington is more than 30,000 and includes students from every Kentucky county, every state, and more than 100 foreign countries. Full-time faculty numbers over 1,800, with approximately 98 percent of the full-time faculty holding the highest possible degrees in their field. UK's faculty and staff attract more than

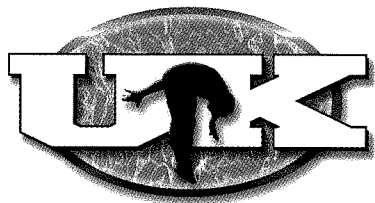
\$120 million annually in grants, gifts and contracts, and the University has been designated a Research University of the First Class by the Carnegie Foundation — one of just 59 such public universities in the country.

The University attracts excellent students. The number of National Merit Scholars entering UK consistently ranks among the top 20 public universities in the country. The average ACT score for first-year students is four points above the national average.

UK alumni numbers more than 160,000 and private support from alumni and friends of the University exceeds \$40 million annually.

"Academic excellence is UK's top priority," says UK President Charles Wethington. "We are committed to becoming one of the nation's top universities."





Ohio Casualty Center for Academic & Tutorial Services

The University of Kentucky opened the nation's first academic center for student-athletes in 1981. The Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services (CATS) is located inside Memorial Coliseum.

Over the years, the services offered by CATS have grown, and so has the need for additional space. The UKAA has responded by constructing a new CATS area, which opened in January 1998. The new facility is called the Ohio Casualty Center for Academic and Tutorial Services, thanks to a one million dollar grant from the Ohio Casualty Insurance Group.

The new Ohio Casualty Center cost a total of \$2.4 million and covers approximately 20,000 square feet. It features a computer room which houses approximately 40 computers, a study area which accommodates 90-100 people, 25 tutoring rooms, a career development library, a community outreach office and staff offices.

UK is fortunate to have outstanding leaders in its academics support system. Associate Athletics Director for Student Services Bob Bradley, who oversees the CATS program, is known nationally for his expertise in academics support services.

"CATS is an incredible advantage to a

student-athlete," Bradley says. "We are extremely proud of what we have accomplished in the academic arena. The CATS program is focused on winning in the classroom. We look at each student-athlete's individual needs, set goals and develop strategies to attain those goals. Our Center provides our student-athletes with a definite advantage over student-athletes at many other institutions. Our goal is to show that we care about the student as well as the athlete."

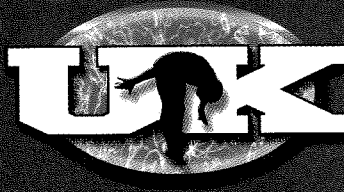
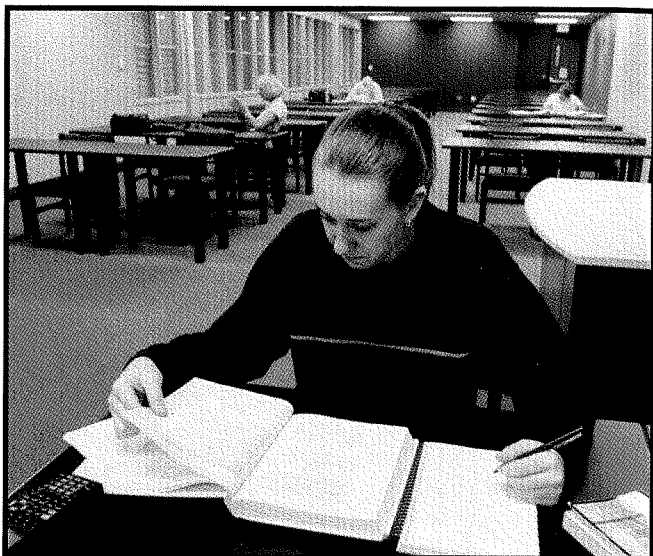
Bradley also says it helps to have head coaches that place such a strong emphasis on academics. "I have been blessed at Kentucky," Bradley said.

CATS is also instrumental in preparing student-athletes for future careers. The Career Development Program helps student-athletes look at the future through a step-by-step process which includes:

- shadowing and internships which help determine career interests

- career counseling
- resume writing
- career plan development.

The philosophy at the University of Kentucky is this: Colleges should be able to provide the student-athlete with every opportunity to succeed not only in athletics, but in academics as well. Looking at recent statistics in Academic Honor Roll selections and graduation rates, it is clear that Kentucky is standing by its philosophy.

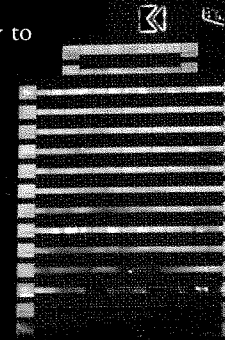

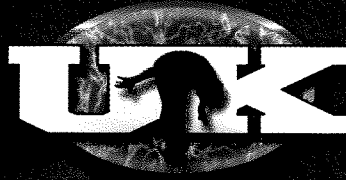
