### QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is in its 46th season with a 827-540 (.604) all-time record.
- The Wildcats have had great success in Memorial Coliseum, sitting at 450-157 (.741) overall in the historic building, including a 163-31 (.840) mark under head coach Matthew Mitchell.
- For the ninth time under head coach Matthew Mitchell, including the third straight season, the Wildcats have started the year with four straight wins. UK's best start under MM is 11-0 three times.
- Kentucky is currently ranked No. 13 in the AP Top 25 after starting its season ranked or receiving votes for the 11th time under Mitchell.
- The Wildcats are 19-4 record all-time when ranked 13th in the nation, including winning 15 of its last 17 games while ranked at No. 13.
- It has been a tale of two halves for Kentucky this season. UK is shooting 31% from the field in the first half, including 21% from 3. In the second half, UK is shooting 38% from the field and 33% from 3.
- UK's 50-47 win at Virginia marked the first time UK has scored 50 points or fewer in a win since defeating Louisville Dec. 2, 2012. UK scored 48 points in that game.
- Kentucky has forced every opponent this season into 20 turnovers or more, including forcing a season-high 28 turnovers vs. Mount St. Mary's. The Wildcats have forced 93 turnovers this season and scored 90 points off those miscues amassing 36% of its total scoring.
- The Wildcats rank 13th nationally and first in the SEC in scoring defense this season, limiting opponents to 47.8 points per game. UK is the only team in the league that has limited each of its opponents this season to 52 points or less.
- Rhyn Howard leads UK averaging 15.0 points and 7.0 rebounds per game. Howard has recorded two double-doubles this season.
- In 45 years, Kentucky has 92 wins over ranked opponents, including 51 of those wins coming under Mitchell.
- Matthew Mitchell became UK WBB's all-time winningest head coach in March of 2013 and now has 284 career wins at UK. Including the storied history of the UK MBB program, he is the fifth Kentucky basketball head coach to win 250 games with the Wildcats joining Adolph Rupp, Joe B Hall, Tubby Smith and John Calipari.

## RHYNE HOWARD • 6-2 • SOPHOMORE • GUARD • CLEVELAND, TENN.

- Game-high 24 points against Stetson for her 11th career 20+ point game. Has led UK in scoring 18 times during her career, including twice this year.
- Has recorded two double-doubles this season, including 13 points and 11 rebounds at Virginia. Hit two clutch free throws vs. :02 left to win game.
- Unanimous National Freshman of the Year last season leading the team with 16.4 points and 6.6 rebounds per game adding 75 assists, 68 steals.



## SABRINA HAINES • 5-10 • RS-JUNIOR • GUARD • PHOENIX, ARIZ.

- Leads the team with eight 3s this season, including going 4-of-6 from long range against Middle Tennessee for 12 points.
- Led Kentucky in scoring in its win at Virginia with 17 points, adding three rebounds. Has hit at least one 3-pointer in every game this season.
- Played in 75 career games with 38 starts at Arizona State before her third season was cut short after only nine games due to injury.



## AMANDA PASCHAL • 5-7 • RS-SENIOR • GUARD • BROOKLYN, N.Y.

- Led Kentucky against Middle Tennessee scoring a team-high 16 points with six rebounds and three assists. Scored 12 of her 16 in the second half.
- Best game last year vs. Florida grabbing a career-high nine rebounds with six points on two 3s, earning a block, a steal and an assist
- Won a national championship in junior college at Gulf Coast State College. Graduated in May 2019



## KEKE MCKINNEY • 6-1 • JUNIOR • FORWARD • KNOXVILLE, TENN.

- First career double-double against Stetson with 10 points and 10 rebounds in 32 minutes of play. Leads UK this season with nine blocks.
- Played 34 minutes against Middle Tennessee with 6 rebounds, 4 blocks and team-best 4 assist. Leads the team with 13 rebounds this season.
- Led UK with 29 blocks while she added 33 steals and 34 assists last season scoring five or more points in 15 games with two 10+ performances.



## TATYANA WYATT • 6-2 • JUNIOR • FORWARD • COLUMBUS, GA.

- Started all four games this season averaging 7.8 points and 6.0 rebounds. Career-high tying 10 rebounds against Stetson with nine points.
- Played and started 32 of the Wildcats' 33 games averaging 20.2 minutes per game with 6.9 points per game with 3.8 rebounds per game.
- Had five or more rebounds in 13 games including accomplishing the feat in four of her last six games. Hit nine 3s during the year.



## BLAIR GREEN • 6-0 • SOPHOMORE • GUARD • HARLAN COUNTY, KY.

- Played a key 24 minutes at Middle Tennessee scoring six points with five rebounds. Also had five rebounds in the season opener vs. The Mount.
- Was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team after scoring 10 or more points in four games with four or more rebounds in five games.
- Best performance last season came at Auburn where she scored 12 points going 5-for-5 from the field and 2-of-2 from 3.



## JAIDA ROPER • 5-6 • SENIOR • GUARD • MEMPHIS, TENN.

- Came off the bench to score 13 points with two assists, two steals and one rebound against Mount St. Mary's. Went 6-of-8 from FT line in game.
- Career-high eight assists against Stetson and leads Kentucky with 12 assists this season, adding six steals.
- Played an instrumental role in win at Tennessee last season, scoring 10 points, including a 3 in the final minute to stretch Kentucky's lead by five.



## EMMA KING • 5-10 • FRESHMAN • GUARD • STANFORD, KY.

- Came off the bench to play 12 minutes and knocked down two 3s in the season opener vs. Mount St. Mary's.
- Impressive shooting guard that came to Lexington with a reputation as a sharp shooter from long range and brings instant offense to the Wildcats.
- Led Lincoln County in scoring as a senior averaging 18.5 points and 7.3 rebounds while hitting 44.3 percent from the field and 38.2 percent from 3.



## CHASITY PATTERSON • 5-6 • JUNIOR • GUARD • HOUSTON, TEXAS

- Mid-year transfer from Texas who will have to sit out the 2018-19 season but be eligible following the fall semester of 2019.
- The top ranked point guard in the class of 2017 according to ESPN.com and the Big 12 Preseason Freshman of the Year last season at Texas.
- Incredible high school career at North Shore High School in Houston where she finished as the school's all-time leading scorer with 3,177 points.



## OGECHI ANYAGALIGBO • 6-1 • RS-SENIOR • FORWARD • MIAMI, FLA.

- Huge 22 minutes in the post at Middle Tennessee with 10 points and seven rebounds, going 5-of-7 from the field.
- Best game came at Tennessee, recording a season-high 13 points on 6-of-7 shooting with three rebounds and a steal.
- Came to UK after winning AEC Rookie of the Year honors at Stony Brook in 2016. Missed 16-17 for transfer rules and 17-18 due to injury.



## NAE NAE COLE • 6-3 • RS-SENIOR • CENTER • GAINESVILLE, VA.

- Played 11 minutes at Virginia - her home state - scoring four points with one rebound. Was a perfect 4-of-4 from the free-throw line in the game.
- Strong, physical post player that helped give the Wildcats depth in practice last season. Missed the 2018-19 season due to NCAA transfer rules.
- Played in 61 career games for the Wolfpack from 2015 to 2018 averaging 7.0 minutes per game during her career.



## KAMERON ROACH • 5-6 • JUNIOR • GUARD • HOPKINS, S.C.

- Played in 13 games in 2018-19 seeing 4.2 minutes per game before she tore her Achilles towards the end of 2018-19.
- Is still recovering from the injury last season but should be available for Kentucky closer to league play.
- Saw six minutes in the 2018-19 season opener vs. Alabama State with three steals, four rebounds and recorded her first 3 in a game



## DEASIA MERRILL • 6-1 • FRESHMAN • FORWARD • VILLA RICA, GA.

- Will miss the 2019-20 season due to an ACL injury in her right knee that she sustained in preseason practice.
- Was a three-time Atlanta Journal-Constitution First-Team All-State performer and was class 5A player of the year as a senior averaging 25.6 points, 15.4 rebounds, 6.3 assists, 5.2 steals and 4.2 blocks per game



## DRE'UNA EDWARDS • 6-2 • SOPHOMORE • FORWARD • LAS VEGAS, NEV.

- Transferred to UK after her freshman season at Utah averaging 11.6 points and 6.7 rebounds en route to Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honors.
- Scored 20 or more points three times for the Utes, including 18 double-digit scoring games. Had 21 points vs. UCLA and Arizona.
- Will miss the 2019-20 season due to NCAA transfer rules and a torn ACL she sustained at the end of the 2019 season.

## GAME NOTES

### SCOUTING MOREHEAD STATE

- Morehead State enters Thursday's game with a 2-2 record. The Eagles lost their first two games of the season at Bowling Green and vs. Stetson before winning its last two games vs. Saint Francis (Pa.) and Midway (Ky.). In its last outing vs. Midway, Morehead State scored a season-best 107 points while limiting MU to just 55 points. Tomiyah Alford and Alyssa Nieves each scored 20 points in the game with Alford adding seven rebounds. Ariel Kirkwood scored 16 points with nine rebounds while Jaleesa Avery had 13 points and Lakeita Chappel had 10 points.
- Overall this season, Morehead State is averaging 73.0 points per game while allowing opponents to score 61.5 points per game. The Eagles are hitting 38.7 percent from the field and 28 percent from long range. MSU is outrebounding teams by 4.0 rebounds per game while they are turning the ball over 16.5 times per game. Conversely, the Eagles have had success turning teams over forcing 25.5 turnovers per game.
- Kirkwood leads the team with 12.8 points per game, adding 9.5 rebounds per game and leads the team with eight blocks. Alford is averaging 10.8 points per game with a team-high 13 steals while Breuna Jackson and Ellie Jo Johnson are each averaging 8.8 points per game. Nieves has hit a team-best nine 3-pointers this season.

### SERIES HISTORY VS. MOREHEAD STATE

- Kentucky leads the all-time series in games played against Morehead State, 31-4, including a 21-1 mark in games played in Lexington. The Wildcats have won 14 games in a row against the Eagles and the two teams have played 10 of the last 11 seasons.

### LAST TIME VS. MOREHEAD STATE

- The Wildcats and Eagles played last season in Memorial Coliseum on Nov. 28 with Kentucky earning a 87-57 victory. UK scored 52 points in the first half to take control of the game with a 52-23 lead at halftime. The game was more even in the second half with UK only outscoring the Eagles, 35-34.
- Maci Morris led Kentucky in the game with 31 points, going 12-of-20 from the field and 4-of-8 from long range. Rhyne Howard had 17 points in the game with 10 rebounds, while Jaida Roper scored 14 points - going 10-of-10 from the free-throe line - while KeKe McKinney scored 13 points with six assists. UK shot 46 percent from the field in the game, forcing MSU into 25 turnovers and scoring 38 points off those miscues.

### SERIES HISTORY VS. CURRENT ALIGNMENT OF CONFERENCE OVC

- Kentucky holds a 99-17 all-time record against teams from the current alignment of the Ohio Valley Conference. Morehead State is the first of two OVC teams the Wildcats are scheduled to face this season with the other being Austin Peay on Dec. 1 in Memorial Coliseum.
- Morehead State is the OVC opponent that teams have played the most all-time.

### DEPTH EVIDENT EARLY FOR WILDCATS

- In Kentucky's season opener against Mount St. Mary's, three Wildcats - Rhyne Howard, Tatyana Wyatt and Jaida Roper - scored in double figures. Against Middle Tennessee, UK also had three players in double figures in Sabrina Haines, Amanda Paschal and Ogechi Anyagalgibo. It marked the first time since 2015-16 that the Wildcats have had three or more different players score in double figures in its first two games of the season.
- Furthermore, UK currently has 10 players who are healthy and eligible to play and all 10 have scored at least six points this season.

### WILDCATS FIND SHOOTING TOUCH IN THIRD QUARTER AT MTSU

- After a subpar shooting night to start the season against Mount St. Mary's, going just 22-for-66 from the field, UK started slow again in the first half against Middle Tennessee. The Wildcats went just 7-for-28 from the field in the first 20 minutes against the Blue Raiders. UK answered in a big way in the third quarter, scoring 31 points which was the most points UK has ever scored in the third quarter of a game since going to quarter format in 2015. The Wildcats hit 13-of-20 from the field in the third stanza, including 4-of-5 from long range.
- UK scored 45 second-half points against Middle Tennessee, which was its most since scoring 46 against Murray St. last season. UK also scored 46 second-half points last season at UofL.
- It has been a tale of two halves for Kentucky this season. UK is shooting 31% from the field in the first half, including 21% from 3. In the second half, UK is shooting 38% from the field and 33% from 3.



## DEFENSE POWERING CATS EARLY

- The Kentucky defense has been fantastic to start the season, helping Kentucky to a 4-0 record. UK has allowed just 47.8 points per game which ranks top-15 nationally and first in the SEC.
- In 12 quarters of play this season, UK has limited its opponent to 10 points or less in six quarters and 12 points or less in 13 quarters.

## TURNOVERS TELL THE TALE

- In four games, Kentucky has forced 94 turnovers and scored 90 points off turnovers.
- UK ranks top-30 nationally and second in the SEC in turnover margin at 7.7 per game while it is also top-30 nationally and second in the SEC in turnovers forced per game at 23.5.
- UK has scored 20 or more points off turnovers in three of its four games and has forced 20 or more turnovers in every game.

## NOW SLOWING HOWARD DOWN

- It has been a strong start to the 2019-20 season for the reigning national freshman of the year as she is averaging 15.0 points per game with 7.0 rebounds per game, 10 assists, six blocks and nine steals. Howard started the season with 14 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and five steals against Mount St. Mary's before nine points against Middle Tennessee. Against Stetson, Howard scored 18 of Kentucky's 32 first-half points and finished the game with 24 points, five rebounds and two assists.
- In 36 career games, Howard is already the leading career point scorer on the team and also has recorded some impressive numbers:
  - \* Hit at least one 3-pointer in 31 career games
  - \* Made three or more 3-pointers in 12 games
  - \* Scored 10+ points in 29 games
  - \* Scored 15+ points in 23 games
  - \* Scored 20+ points in 11 games
  - \* Led UK in scoring in 18 games
  - \* Led UK in rebounding in 21 games

## WILDCATS RETURN 11 LETTERWINNERS FROM LAST SEASON

- Head coach Matthew Mitchell, who was named the Co-SEC Coach of the Year last season, returns a lengthy list of players for this upcoming season, including the reigning unanimous national freshman of the year in Rhyne Howard. In total, the Wildcats are set to return 63 percent of its scoring, 62 percent of its made 3-point field goals, 87 percent of its offensive rebounding, 81 percent of its total rebounding, 60 percent of its assists, 77 percent of its blocks and 58 percent of its steals.
- UK returns 11 letterwinners in total, including three starters in Howard, KeKe McKinney and Tatyana Wyatt. McKinney averaged 4.3 points and 4.9 rebounds per game last season while Wyatt averaged 6.9 points and 3.8 rebounds per game. Also returning is Jaida Roper, who averaged 6.5 points per game, and Blair Green, who averaged 5.3 points per game. Ogechi Anyagaligbo, Amanda Paschal and Kameron Roach also return. Anyagaligbo played in 28 games last season while Paschal played in 33 games with six starts.

## KENTUCKY RANKED INSIDE TOP 20 IN BOTH MAJOR POLLS

- For the 11th time under head coach Matthew Mitchell, UK began the season ranked or receiving votes in the Associated Press Top 25 and/or USA Today/Coaches' Top 25. The Wildcats sit at No. 13 in the AP listing while they are No. 14 in the coaches' poll.
- In the AP poll, UK will face No. 5 South Carolina (twice), No. 6 Texas A&M, No. 8 Louisville, No. 10 Mississippi State, No. 20 Arkansas and No. 23 Tennessee. In the coaches' poll, UK is scheduled to play No. 6 South Carolina (twice), No. 7 Texas A&M, No. 8 Mississippi State, No. 9 Louisville, No. 18 Arkansas and Tennessee, who is receiving votes.
- Louisville, Tennessee, South Carolina and Mississippi State will all make trips to Lexington this season, setting the stage for some of the biggest games of the season to happen in front of the Big Blue Nation.
- UK started the season ranked No. 13 in the AP poll and No. 16 in the coaches' poll, which was the highest preseason rankings for the Wildcats since the 2014-15 team started at No. 11 in the AP Top 25 and No. 10 in the Coaches' Top 25. UK has finished its season ranked in the top 25 of both major listings nine of the last 10 seasons under Mitchell.
- Kentucky has been a mainstay in the AP poll over the last 10 years. In the last 195 polls, the Wildcats have been ranked or receiving votes 178 times only being left out of 17 polls.

## MORRIS, MURRAY HEADLINE DEPARTING SENIORS FROM 2018-19

- Point guard Taylor Murray and shooting guard Maci Morris have been mainstays in the Kentucky women's basketball program the past four seasons with one of them in the starting lineup in every game but one since the start of the 2015-16 season.
- Morris started all 129 games she played in, missing two games in her career, while Murray played in 127 games with 93 starts. Combined the two scored 3,051 points the past four seasons with 640 assists, 877 rebounds, 409 steals and 310 3-pointers made.

## WILDCATS LOOKING TO CONTINUE 3-POINT SHOOTING

- Kentucky shot 36.4 percent from 3 last season which was the fourth-best 3-point field goal percentage for a season in program history and the second best ever during Coach Mitchell's tenure. UK hit 234 3-pointers, which was the second most in a season in program history.
- The Wildcats are looking to continue that 3-point production this season as it returns three of its top four 3-pointer shooters from last season. UK also adds some talented deep shooting threats to the squad in Chasity Patterson, Sabrina Haines and Emma King.
- Maci Morris has led Kentucky in 3-point shooting three of the last four seasons, including hitting 75-of-166 last season for 45.2 percent.

## MCKINNEY, WYATT KEY IN POST FOR UK

- Kentucky's two junior posts - KeKe McKinney and Tatyana Wyatt - are going to be key to the Wildcats' success this season. Both figure to get a majority of the post minutes for the Wildcats. McKinney is averaging 26.5 minutes per game while Wyatt is averaging 17.1. Both have started all four games this season.
- McKinney played in 31 games with 28 starts last season and averaged 4.3 points per game and 4.9 rebounds per game. The forward led Kentucky in blocks with 29. McKinney scored in double figures twice last season with 10 points vs. USF and 13 vs. Middle Tennessee. She had five or more rebounds in 18 games and will need to dominate the boards again for UK this season.
- Wyatt played and started in 32 games but has been banged up a bit this preseason with a lingering foot issue. When healthy, Wyatt is a big weapon for the Wildcats with her ability to stretch the floor and play inside and out. The forward averaged 6.9 points last season and 3.8 rebounds, hitting 9-of-32 from beyond the arc. Wyatt scored 10+ in eight games, including 16 points and six rebounds against Western Carolina.
- Both players have played great so far this season. McKinney ranks second on the team in rebounding and recorded her first career double-double against Stetson with 10 points and 10 rebounds. McKinney led Kentucky with four assists against Middle Tennessee. The forward missed the final minutes of the UVA game due to injury and her status is unknown for the Morehead State game.
- Wyatt scored 10 points in the opener with five rebounds and followed with seven points and five rebounds against Middle Tennessee. The junior nearly had a double-double against Stetson with 10 rebounds and nine points.

## HAINES FITTING RIGHT IN FOR CATS

- Sabrina Haines has been a perfect fit for the Wildcats so far, sitting second on the team with 11.0 points per game. Haines is 8-of-15 from long range for 53.3 percent, while she is averaging 4.8 rebounds per game with seven assists.
- Haines started her season with seven points and eight rebounds against Mount St. Mary's, while she had 12 points going 4-of-6 from the 3-point line against Middle Tennessee. After recording eight points and six rebounds against Stetson, Haines led Kentucky in scoring at Virginia with 17 points, going 6-of-12 from the field and 2-of-4 from long range.

## HOWARD NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC BY MEDIA, COACHES

- Sophomore guard Rhyn Howard has been tabbed Preseason All-SEC First Team by league media and league coaches. Howard received several player of the year votes by the media.
- Howard is coming off an incredible first season at Kentucky where she was named a unanimous national freshman of the year by espnW, USBWA and WBCA. The national honors were







added to her already lengthy list of honors last season as the SEC Freshman of the Year by league coaches and SEC Newcomer of the Year by the Associated Press. She was also named WBCA All-America honorable mention, first-team All-SEC, SEC All-Freshman Team and second-team All-SEC by the AP.

### HOWARD ADDS NATIONAL WATCH LISTS TO PRESEASON HONORS

- Tuesday was the John R. Wooden Award Top 30, Wednesday was the Citizen Naismith Trophy Top 50 and Thursday brings the Women’s Basketball Coaches Association Wade Watch List, putting Rhyne Howard on all three major national player of the year watch lists this preseason.
- Earlier this week, Howard was one of 30 players on the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Watch List and one of 50 players on the Citizen Naismith Trophy Preseason Watch List. The sophomore was also named to the 2020 Cheryl Miller Award Preseason Watch List in late October. The John R. Wooden Award and Citizen Naismith Trophy are presented to the player of the year in women’s college basketball while the Cheryl Miller Award is presented to the nation’s best small forward.
- The sophomore started her second season strong, scoring a game-high 14 points with 11 rebounds, five assists, five steals and two blocks in UK’s season-opening win against Mount St. Mary’s. Although Howard didn’t have the best shooting night, the guard found ways to help her team, securing her sixth career double-double.
- In 34 career games, Howard has scored 10 or more points 27 times while she has led UK in scoring in 17 career games and in rebounding in 20 career games.

### KENTUCKY PICKED TO FINISH 4TH BY LEAGUE COACHES, MEDIA

- A panel of league media and all 14 league coaches voted the Wildcats to finish fourth in the SEC this season in the annual preseason poll. If the Wildcats do grab a top-four finish in the league, it will be the 11th time in Matthew Mitchell’s 13-year tenure the Wildcats have finished in the top tier of the league.
- The complete coaches’ poll was: TAMU, SC, MSU, UK, ARK, LSU, UT, AU, MU, UGA, BAMA, VU, MISS, UF.
- The complete media poll was: SC, TAMU, MSU, UK, ARK, UT, AU, LSU, MU, UGA, BAMA, UF, MISS, VU.

### DEASIA MERRILL SUSTAINS KNEE INJURY, WILL MISS 2019-20 SEASON

- Freshman forward Deasia Merrill sustained a torn anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee during preseason practice and will miss the 2019-20 season.
- Merrill enrolled at UK this summer as a true freshman after being one of the best players in the state of Georgia in high school. The native of Villa Rica, Ga., was a three-time Atlanta Journal-Constitution First-Team All-State performer and was class 5A player of the year as a senior averaging 25.6 points, 15.4 rebounds, 6.3 assists, 5.2 steals and 4.2 blocks per game. Merrill was a four-star prospect by ESPN.com, which ranked her the 66th best prospect and eighth best forward in the 2019 class.

### HOWARD WINS BACK-TO-BACK GOLDS FOR TEAM USA

- In the summers of 2018 and 2019, Rhyne Howard traded in her UK Blue and White for USA Red, White and Blue and shined on the international stage.
- In 2018, Howard played in the FIBA U18 Women’s Americas Championship earning MVP honors for the event after averaging 8.5 points and 4.7 rebounds per game. Howard hit 45.5 percent from the field and 31.8 percent from long range in the event with 18 assists, 11 steals and 8 blocks.
- The following summer, Howard continued her successful stretch playing for Team USA as she led the Red, White and Blue in scoring on its way to winning the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup championship in Bangkok, Thailand. For her efforts, Howard was tabbed to the all-tournament team. Howard, who had 10 points, seven rebounds, three assists, two steals and two blocks in the championship game, led the USA in scoring throughout the week averaging 13.1 points per game with 5.1 rebounds per game and hitting 44.7 percent from long range.

### THE MAGIC “80”

- The Wildcats hold a remarkable 349-23 (.938) record since 1974 when scoring 80 points or more. The last loss came at South Carolin on Feb. 26, 2017 when the Cats fell 95-87 in the regular-season finale. UK is 103-5 (.953) under Mitchell when scoring 80 points or more.

### UK IN OVERTIME

- UK is 30-27 all-time in overtime games, including a 11-5 mark under Mitchell, who is 13-6 in his 11-year career as a head coach in OT. UK is 0-0 this season.

## KENTUCKY ALL-TIME

- Kentucky is 827-540 (.604) in its 46th year of varsity women's basketball, including 285-125 (.695) in 13 seasons under Matthew Mitchell.

## KENTUCKY ALL-TIME AT HOME

- Kentucky is 477-173 all-time at home for a winning percentage of .733. UK is 450-157 (.739) all-time in Memorial Coliseum and 27-18 (.600) all-time in Rupp Arena.
- If you do the math, you will notice UK's losses in Memorial Coliseum and Rupp Arena are two more than UK has home losses. That reason is because UK's NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 game vs. Washington at Rupp Arena on March 25, 2016 and its NCAA Tournament game vs. Indiana on March 18, 1983 at Memorial Coliseum cannot count towards UK's home record.

## MITCHELL MOVES INTO ELITE SEC COMPANY

- Kentucky's dominating 89-57 victory over Ole Miss on Jan. 26, 2017 was an historic one for Kentucky head coach Matthew Mitchell. The win was his 97th all-time in SEC play as a head coach, which ranked him 10th all-time on the SEC's career wins list. UK's win at Arkansas on Feb. 16 was Mitchell's 100th career SEC win.
- Since arriving in Lexington in 2007, Mitchell has led Kentucky to unprecedented success. On top of leading UK to its first SEC Regular Season Championship in 30 years in 2012, Mitchell has four SEC Tournament title game appearances, 10 top-four finishes in the league and has coached 21 all-conference performances, including four SEC Player of the Year honorees.

## MITCHELL TURNS PROGRAM AROUND

- In 2009-10, Coach Mitchell implemented the "40 minutes of dread" style of play and it started Kentucky on an impressive run of success over the last 10 seasons.
  - Advanced to a school-record eight straight NCAA Tournaments (2010-2017), including three Elite Eight trips during that span with 15 NCAA Tournament wins.
  - Ten top-four SEC finishes, including winning the SEC regular season title in 2012, its first in 30 years.
  - Advanced to the SEC Tournament championship game four times

## 20+ WIN SEASONS UNDER MITCHELL

- The Wildcats have won 20 or more games 19 times in 46 years of varsity basketball, including a school-record eight in a row from 2010-2017. It's important to note that UK had just 10 20-win seasons in its first 33 years of varsity women's basketball, but has nine in 13 seasons of the Matthew Mitchell era.

## MATHIES ENSHRINED IN HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2019

- A'dia Mathies was enshrined in the UK Athletics Hall of Fame in September of 2019 becoming the second Matthew Mitchell coached player to be inducted into the prestigious hall of fame. Victoria Dunalp was the first. Below is a recap of Mathies career at Kentucky.
- AP All-American second team (2013) and third team (2012) ... Two-time finalist for the John R. Wooden Award and the Naismith Trophy ... SEC Player of the Year as a junior and senior ... UK's all-time leader in steals (320), games played (140) and started (139), while ranking second in scoring (2,014) and 3FG made (177), third in FG made (712), FT made (413) and ninth in assists (349) ... First player in UK history (men or women) to accumulate over 2,000 points, 600 rebounds, 300 assists and 300 steals in a career... Part of UK's all-time winningest class with an overall 111-30 (.787) record ... Helped UK claim an SEC regular-season title for the first time in 30 years in 2012 ... Advanced to four NCAA Tournament Sweet 16s and three Elite Eights.

## VALERIE STILL IN WBB HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2019

- The all-time leading scorer in both men's and women's basketball history at Kentucky – Valerie Still – was officially inducted into the prestigious Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in the summer of 2019.
- Still is the first UK player to be inducted into the WBB Hall of Fame for her playing days at Kentucky. Ceal Barry, who was one of the first ever female scholarship athletes at Kentucky, was inducted into the 2018 class for her work as a coach and administrator. Former UK head coach Mickie DeMoss was also inducted into the 2018 class.
- Although Still played long ago (1979-83), she remains the top Wildcats in UK's women basketball annals. She was honored as such on Jan. 12, 2003 with a jersey retirement ceremony at halftime of the Alabama game. She became the first female letter winner in any UK sport to have her jersey retired.

## THE KENTUCKY WBB COACHING STAFF HAS ...

- Combined the Kentucky women's basketball staff has compiled over 80 years of experience at the Division I level, including coaching or playing in a combined 42 NCAA Tournaments with eight Final Fours, four national championships and a WNBA Championship.
- Elzy and Butts are in their second stint in Lexington after serving on Mitchell's staffs before. Butts was an associate head coach on Mitchell's first staff at Kentucky before Elzy joined the staff for four successful seasons. Amber Smith is in her second year as an assistant coach but has been a part of the Kentucky program for nearly a decade.
- Dunn, who is a Women's Basketball Hall of Famer, has over 40 years of coaching experience, including three decades in the collegiate ranks. Dunn is now the special assistant to the head coach after serving as an assistant coach the last two seasons.

## CATS SHINE IN THE CLASSROOM

- Matthew Mitchell has put an emphasis on academics since arriving on campus as the Wildcats have had a 3.0 team GPA or better each of the last 12 semesters. In the fall of 2016, the Wildcats posted a 3.517 team GPA, which was the highest GPA for a semester in the Mitchell era. UK followed that with a 3.464 team GPA in the spring with four players earning 4.0s. Under Mitchell, 42 Wildcats have been tabbed to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and 100 percent of Mitchell's players have received their degrees.

- Kentucky women's basketball currently has eight alumnae who signed professional contracts to play overseas for the 2019-20season.

## 10 STRAIGHT YEARS TOP 20 IN ATTENDANCE

- Big Blue Nation has shown its support once again as the University of Kentucky women's basketball program ranked 18th nationally in average attendance during the 2018-19 season with 4,767 fans per game. This marks the 10th straight year the Wildcats have finished in the top 20 in NCAA national average attendance.
- Throughout 18 home games – two played inside historic Rupp Arena – Kentucky accumulated a total season attendance of 85,807, an increase over last year's previous home attendance of 82,984.
- Kentucky has averaged 4,500 or more fans every year since 2009-10. The Wildcats have continuously pushed the school's attendance numbers to new altitudes. Kentucky was a part of two of the top-15 most attended games in the nation during the 2018-19 season.
- The Wildcats attracted large crowds not only in Lexington, but all across the country. A total of 154,112 fans attended Kentucky games, ranking the team 15th nationally.
- The Southeastern Conference once again led the nation in attendance with an average of 4,277 fans per game and a total attendance of 1,009,427. The Big Ten remained second in the rankings with a total attendance of 957,325.

## MATTHEW AND JENNA MITCHELL DONATE \$1 MILLION TO UK ATHLETICS

- In June of 2014, Coach Matthew Mitchell and his wife, Jenna, pledged \$1 million over the next 10 years to the University of Kentucky Athletics Department. The donation will provide UK Athletics \$100,000 per year over the next 10 years to be used for a variety of capital projects, including updates and renovations for football. The donation is the largest ever given by a UK athletics employee to the athletics department.
- Matthew and Jenna have been very active in the Lexington community since arriving in Lexington. In October 2016, Matthew and Jenna were presented the Community Service Award by the Urban League of Lexington.

- The Coliseum was built in 1950 and serves as a memorial to every Kentuckian who lost their life serving their country.
- A massive new LED video board spanning approximately 1,800 square feet with dimensions of 30 feet by 60 feet was installed in Memorial Coliseum in 2018.
- Wildcat fans are passionate about their basketball, that's why UK has ranked in the nation's top 25 and in the SEC's top four in attendance 16 straight years.
- The Cats are 163-31 at Memorial in the Matthew Mitchell Era.
- UK averaged 5,186 fans per game in 2017-18 which ranked 15th nationally.
- UK drew 116,164 fans for its home games in 2015-16 the second-highest total attendance in school history.

### Rupp Arena (23,500)

- Rupp Arena is entering its 44th season.
- An awesome structure in sight and scope, the arena is divided into two seating areas. The lower level features 10,000 cushioned theater seats while the upper arena has new chairback seats on the sidelines. The latter can be visually isolated to provide more natural setting for small shows.
- The Wildcats command an exclusive and updated state-of-the-art locker room, while other amenities include six team-size dressing rooms and eight smaller units.
- In 2013-14, UK set the new single-game attendance record when 23,706 fans saw UK face No. 2 Duke in Rupp Arena on Dec. 22, 2013. The attendance marked the largest crowd ever to see a college women's hoops game in the Commonwealth — the previous mark was 22,152 for the first Kentucky-Louisville game played in the KFC Yum! Center on Dec. 5, 2010.
- In 2015-16, Kentucky packed 17,150 fans in Rupp Arena on Dec. 20 against Duke, which was the fourth-largest home crowd in program history. On Dec. 10, the Wildcats had 14,425 fans at the historic arena, which was the sixth-largest home crowd in school history.
- Kentucky will play two games inside Rupp Arena in 2019-20.
