## QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is in its 46th season with a 829-540 (.605) all-time record.
- The Wildcats have had great success in Memorial Coliseum, sitting at 452-157 (.742) overall in the historic building, including a 164-31 (.841) mark under head coach Matthew Mitchell.
- For the seventh time under head coach Matthew Mitchell, including the third straight season, the Wildcats have started the year with six straight wins. UK's best start under MM is 11-0 three times.
- Kentucky is currently ranked No. 14 in the AP Top 25 after starting its season ranked or receiving votes for the 11th time under Mitchell.
- The Wildcats are in the midst of a seven-game home stand that will conclude with back-to-back games at Rupp Arena in mid-December.
- After a slow start offensively in its first four games, UK has been clicking on all cylinders the last two games scoring 79 and 81 points. The Wildcats have scored 20 or more points in six of its last eight quarters and is hitting 44 percent from the field. UK has also hit 213 -pointers in its last two games and posted a combined 36 assist.
- Kentucky has forced every opponent this season into 20+ turnovers or, including forcing a season-high 28 turnovers vs. The Mount. The Wildcats have forced 144 turnovers this season and scored 145 points off those miscues amassing $35 \%$ of its total scoring.
- The Wildcats rank 7th nationally and second in the SEC in scoring defense this season, limiting opponents to 46.7 points per game. UK is one of two teams in the league that has limited each of its opponents this season to 54 points or less.
- Rhyne Howard leads UK averaging 18.5 points and 6.5 rebounds per game. Howard has scored 20+ in three of the last four games, including a season-high 27 against Grambling State.
- In 45 years, Kentucky has 92 wins over ranked opponents, including 51 of those wins coming under Mitchell.
- Matthew Mitchell became UK WBB's all-time winningest head coach in March of 2013 and now has 287 career wins at UK. Including the storied history of the UK MBB program, he is the fifth Kentucky basketball head coach to win 250 games with the Wildcats joining Adolph Rupp, Joe B Hall, Tubby Smith and John Calipari.

## BY THE BIG BLUE NUMBERS <br> wins in Kentucky Women's Basketball history

## SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY

- Austin Peay enters Sunday's game with a 5-1 record earning wins this season over Kentucky Wesleyan, Christian Brothers, Mississippi Valley State, Evansville and Chattanooga. The lone loss came to power-5 opponent Illinois on the road. The Govs fell 76-62 to the Illini in Champaign. In its last outing, APSU earned a big road win at Chattanooga, defeating the Mocs 50-49. Senior forward Arielle Gonzalez-Varner led the Governors with 18 points adding five rebounds, while freshman guard Ella Sawyer scored seven points with eight rebounds. ASPU shot 28.4 percent from the field but scored 24 points off turnovers.
- For the season, Austin Peay is averaging 79.5 points per game, while limiting opponents to just 67.2 points per game. The Govs are hitting 41.3 percent from the field, 33.5 percent from 3 and 61.5 percent from the free-throw line with a 5.1 rebounding margin. APSU is forcing opponents into 26.5 turnovers per game and scoring 27.2 points off turnovers per game.
- Individually, Gonzalez-Varner is averaging 13.7 points per game and 7.7 rebounds per game with a team-high 12 steals. Sophomore guard/forward Maggie Knowles is averaging 11.7 points per game with a team-best 18 3-pointers made, while Freshman guard hay-Lee Kirby is averaging 11.5 points per game .


## SERIES HISTORY VS. AUSTIN PEAY

- This is the sixth all-time meeting between Kentucky and Austin Peay in women's basketball with the Wildcats holding a 5-0 record against the Govs. UK is 3-0 against Austin Peay in Lexington with the last meeting coming Dec. 30, 2002 when UK earned a 82-56 win.


## SERIES HISTORY VS. CURRENT ALIGNMENT OF CONFERENCE SWAC

- Kentucky holds a 100-17 all-time record against teams from the current alignment of the Ohio Valley Conference. Austin Peay is the second OVC team UK has played this season. The Wildcats played Morehead State last week in Lexington, earning a 79-54 win.


## DEPTH EVIDENT EARLY FOR WILDCATS

- In Kentucky's season opener against Mount St. Mary's, three Wildcats - Rhyne Howard, Tatyana Wyatt and Jaida Roper - scored in double figures. Against Middle Tennessee, UK also had three players in double figures in Sabrina Haines, Amanda Paschal and Ogechi Anyagalgibo. It marked the first time since 2015-16 that the Wildcats have had three or more different players score in double figures in its first two games of the season.
- UK currently has 10 players who are healthy and eligible to play and all 10 have scored at least six points this season. Eight of the 10 have scored 10+ in at least one game.


## OFFENSE COMING TOGETHER AT RIGHT TIME

- Kentucky finally got the offense it has been looking for against Morehead State and Grambling State, scoring a season-high 79 points against the Eagles and then besting that with 81 points against the Tigers.
- After three quarters vs. the Eagles, UK had scored 71 points and was shooting 48 percent from the field and were 11-of-24 from long range. The Wildcats started with 27 points in the first quarter, which was its most in the first quarter this season and the second most scored in any quarter this year. Four Wildcats scored in double-figures in the game. UK had a sea-son-high tying 18 assists and a season-low six turnovers in the game.
- It was a full 40-minute offense against Grambling with UK shooting 49.1 percent from the field and again recording 18 assists. The Wildcats hit 103 -pointers in the game.
- In its last eight quarters of play, the Wildcats have scored 20 or more points in six quarters.
- In the last two games, UK is shooting 43.8 percent from the field, 34.4 percent from 3 with 36 combined assists.


## WILDCATS FIND SHOOTING TOUCH IN THIRD QUARTER AT MTSU

- After a subpar shooting night to start the season against Mount St. Mary's, going just 22-for66 from the field, UK started slow again in the first half against Middle Tennessee. The Wildcats went just 7 -for- 28 from the field in the first 20 minutes against the Blue Raiders. UK answered in a big way in the third quarter, scoring 31 points which was the most points UK has ever scored in the third quarter of a game since going to quarter format in 2015. The Wildcats hit 13-of-20 from the field in the third stanza, including 4-of-5 from long range.
- UK scored 45 second-half points against Middle Tennessee, which was its most since scoring 46 against Murray St. last season. UK also scored 46 second-half points last season at UofL.


## DEFENSE POWERING CATS EARLY

- The Kentucky defense has been fantastic to start the season, helping Kentucky to a 6-0 record. UK has allowed just 46.7 points per game which ranks top-10 nationally and second in the SEC. UK and South Carolina are the only teams in the league to limit every team they have played this season to 54 points or less.
- In 24 quarters of play this season, UK has limited its opponent to 10 points or less in 8 quarters and 12 points or less in 18 quarters.
- Teams are shooting just 32.9 percent from the field against UK and 23.1 percent from long range against the Wildcats.
- Against Grambling State, UK limited the Tigers to a season-low 35 points. The Tigers scored five points in the second quarter and six points in the third quarter, marking the second and third lowest quarter scoring output in a game this season.


## TURNOVERS TELL THE TALE

- In six games, Kentucky has forced 144 turnovers and scored 145 points off turnovers. The points off turnovers stats comprises 35.2 percent of UK's total points.
- UK ranks top-15 nationally and second in the SEC in turnover margin at 10.3 per game while it is also top-20 nationally and second in the SEC in turnovers forced per game at 24.0.
- UK has scored 20 or more points off turnovers in five games and has forced 20 or more turnovers in every game.
- Against Morehead State, UK forced 25 turnovers and scored a season-high 35 points off those miscues. The Wildcats forced 25 turnovers vs. Grambling State.


## NOW SLOWING HOWARD DOWN

- It has been a strong start to the 2019-20 season for the reigning national freshman of the year as she is averaging 18.5 points per game with 6.5 rebounds per game, 15 assists, 7 blocks and 13 steals.
- It has been an impressive stretch lately for Howard, who has scored 20 or more points in three of her last four games. The stretch started with 24 points against Stetson before a dou-ble-double against Virginia with 13 points and 11 rebounds. In the last two games, Howard scored 24 points against Morehead State hitting five $3 s$ while she scored a season-high 27 points against Grambling with four made 3s and five rebounds.
- Has 636 career points, needing 364 more to join 1,000 point club. Although she will not become the fastest to 1,000 career points in program history - Valerie Still accomplished the feat in 44 games (!!!) - she needs to average just 13 points over the next 28 games to become the second fastest to 1,000 career points (Leslie Nichols scored 1,000 in 66 games).
- In 38 career games (she missed one game last season due to injury), Howard is already the leading career point scorer on the team and also has recorded some impressive numbers:
* Hit at least one 3-pointer in 33 career games
* Made three or more 3-pointers in 14 games
* Scored 10+ points in 31 games
* Scored 15+ points in 25 games
* Scored 20+ points in 13 games
* Led UK in scoring in 20 games
* Led UK in rebounding in 21 games


## WILDCATS RETURN 11 LETTERWINNERS FROM LAST SEASON

- Head coach Matthew Mitchell, who was named the Co-SEC Coach of the Year last season, returns a lengthy list of players for the 2019-20 season, including the reigning unanimous national freshman of the year in Rhyne Howard. In total, the Wildcats return 63 percent of its scoring, 62 percent of its made 3 -point field goals, 87 percent of its offensive rebounding, 81 percent of its total rebounding, 60 percent of its assists, 77 percent of its blocks and 58 percent of its steals.
- UK returns 11 letterwinners in total, including three starters in Howard, KeKe McKinney and Tatyana Wyatt. McKinney averaged 4.3 points and 4.9 rebounds per game last season while Wyatt averaged 6.9 points and 3.8 rebounds per game. Also returning is Jaida Roper, who averaged 6.5 points per game, and Blair Green, who averaged 5.3 points per game. Ogechi Anyagaligbo, Amanda Paschal and Kameron Roach also return. Anyagaligbo played in 28 games last season while Paschal played in 33 games with six starts.


## KENTUCKY RANKED INSIDE TOP 20 IN BOTH MAJOR POLLS

- For the 11th time under head coach Matthew Mitchell, UK began the season ranked or receiving votes in the Associated Press Top 25 and/or USA Today/Coaches' Top 25. The Wildcats sit at No. 14 in the AP listing while they are No. 14 in the coaches' poll.

- In the AP poll, UK will face No. 5 South Carolina (twice), No. 6 Texas A\&M, No. 8 Louisville, No. 10 Mississippi State, No. 20 Tennessee, No. 25 Arkansas and Cal, who is receiving votes. In the coaches' poll, UK is scheduled to play No. 6 South Carolina (twice), No. 7 Texas A\&M, No. 8 Mississippi State, No. 9 Louisville, No. 24 Arkansas and No. 25 Tennessee.
- Louisville, Tennessee, South Carolina and Mississippi State will all make trips to Lexington this season, setting the stage for some of the biggest games of the season to happen in front of the Big Blue Nation.
- UK started the season ranked No. 13 in the AP poll and No. 16 in the coaches' poll, which was the highest preseason rankings for the Wildcats since the 2014-15 team started at No. 11 in the AP Top 25 and No. 10 in the Coaches' Top 25. UK has finished its season ranked in the top 25 of both major listings nine of the last 10 seasons under Mitchell.
- Kentucky has been a mainstay in the AP poll over the last 10 years. In the last 196 polls, the Wildcats have been ranked or receiving votes 179 times only being left out of 17 polls.

## MORRIS, MURRAY HEADLINE DEPARTING SENIORS FROM 2018-19

- Point guard Taylor Murray and shooting guard Maci Morris have been mainstays in the Kentucky women's basketball program the past four seasons with one of them in the starting lineup in every game but one since the start of the 2015-16 season.
- Morris started all 129 games she played in, missing two games in her career, while Murray played in 127 games with 93 starts. Combined the two scored 3,051 points the past four seasons with 640 assists, 877 rebounds, 409 steals and 3103 -pointers made.


## WILDCATS LOOKING TO CONTINUE 3-POINT SHOOTING

- Kentucky shot 36.4 percent from 3 last season which was the fourth-best 3-point field goal percentage for a season in program history and the second best ever during Coach Mitchell's tenure. UK hit 234 3-pointers, which was the second most in a season in program history.
- The Wildcats are looking to continue that 3-point production this season as it returns three of its top four 3-pointer shooters from last season. UK also adds some talented deep shooting threats to the squad in Chasity Patterson, Sabrina Haines and Emma King.
- Maci Morris has led Kentucky in 3-point shooting three of the last four seasons, including hitting 75-of-166 last season for 45.2 percent.
- So far this season, UK is 44-of-144 from 3 for 30.6 percent. Howard leads UK with 17 makes, while Haines is 13 -for- 27 .


## MCKINNEY, WYATT KEY IN POST FOR UK

- Kentucky's two junior posts - KeKe McKinney and Tatyana Wyatt - are going to be key to the Wildcats' success this season. Both figure to get a majority of the post minutes for the Wildcats. McKinney is averaging 28.4 minutes per game while Wyatt is averaging 17.9. Both have started all six games this season.
- Both players have played great so far this season. McKinney ranks third on the team in rebounding and recorded her first career double-double against Stetson with 10 points and 10 rebounds. McKinney led Kentucky with four assists against Middle Tennessee. The forward missed the final minutes of the UVA game due to injury but returned and started against Morehead State. She has a team-best 17 blocks this season, which ranks high nationally and has recorded four or more blocks in three games.
- Wyatt scored 10 points in the opener with five rebounds and followed with seven points and five rebounds against Middle Tennessee. The junior nearly had a double-double against Stetson with 10 rebounds and nine points and Morehead with 10 points and eight rebounds. Wyatt has scored seven or more points in five games and has five or more rebounds in five games. She is second on the team with 6.2 rebounds per game and third with 8.0 ppg .
- McKinney played in 31 games with 28 starts last season and averaged 4.3 points per game and 4.9 rebounds per game. The forward led Kentucky in blocks with 29. McKinney scored in double figures twice last season with 10 points vs. USF and 13 vs. Middle Tennessee. She had five or more rebounds in 18 games.
- Wyatt played and started in 32 games but has been banged up a bit this preseason with a lingering foot issue. When healthy, Wyatt is a big weapon for the Wildcats with her ability to
stretch the floor and play inside and out. The forward averaged 6.9 points last season and 3.8 rebounds, hitting 9 -of- 32 from beyond the arc. Wyatt scored $10+$ in eight games, including 16 points and six rebounds against Western Carolina.


## HAINES FITTING RIGHT IN FOR CATS

- Sabrina Haines has been a perfect fit for the Wildcats so far, sitting second on the team with 11.2 points per game. Haines is 13 -of- 27 from long range for 48.1 percent, while she is averaging 4.8 rebounds per game with 9 assists.
- Haines started her season with seven points and eight rebounds against Mount St. Mary's, while she had 12 points going 4-of-6 from the 3-point line against Middle Tennessee. After recording eight points and six rebounds against Stetson, Haines led Kentucky in scoring at Virginia with 17 points, going 6-of-12 from the field and 2-of-4 from long range. She had 14 points and five rebounds against Morehead State.


## HOWARD NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC BY MEDIA, COACHES

- Sophomore guard Rhyne Howard has been tabbed Preseason All-SEC First Team by league media and league coaches. Howard received several player of the year votes by the media.
- Howard is coming off an incredible first season at Kentucky where she was named a unanimous national freshman of the year by espnW, USBWA and WBCA. The national honors were added to her already lengthy list of honors last season as the SEC Freshman of the Year by league coaches and SEC Newcomer of the Year by the Associated Press. She was also named WBCA All-America honorable mention, first-team All-SEC, SEC All-Freshman Team and sec-ond-team All-SEC by the AP.


## HOWARD ADDS NATIONAL WATCH LISTS TO PRESEASON HONORS

- On day it was the John R. Wooden Award Top 30, the next day was the Citizen Naismith Trophy Top 50 and the three-day span ended with the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Wade Watch List, putting Rhyne Howard on all three major national player of the year watch lists this preseason.
- Howard was one of 30 players on the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Watch List and one of 50 players on the Citizen Naismith Trophy Preseason Watch List. The sophomore was also named to the 2020 Cheryl Miller Award Preseason Watch List in late October. The John R. Wooden Award and Citizen Naismith Trophy are presented to the player of the year in women's college basketball while the Cheryl Miller Award is presented to the nation's best smal forward.


## KENTUCKY PICKED TO FINISH 4TH BY LEAGUE COACHES, MEDIA

- A panel of league media and all 14 league coaches voted the Wildcats to finish fourth in the SEC this season in the annual preseason poll. If the Wildcats do grab a top-four finish in the league, it will be the 11th time in Matthew Mitchell's 13 -year tenure the Wildcats have finished in the top tier of the league.
- The complete coaches' poll was: TAMU, SC, MSU, UK, ARK, LSU, UT, AU, MU, UGA, BAMA, VU, MISS, UF.

## DEASIA MERRILL SUSTAINS KNEE INJURY, WILL MISS 2019-20 SEASON

- Freshman forward Deasia Merrill sustained a torn anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee during preseason practice and will miss the 2019-20 season.
- Merrill enrolled at UK this summer as a true freshman after being one of the best players in the state of Georgia in high school. The native of Villa Rica, Ga., was a three-time Atlanta Journal-Constitution First-Team All-State performer and was class 5A player of the year as a senior averaging 25.6 points, 15.4 rebounds, 6.3 assists, 5.2 steals and 4.2 blocks per game. Merrill was a four-star prospect by ESPN.com, which ranked her the 66th best prospect and eighth best forward in the 2019 class.


## HOWARD WINS BACK-TO-BACK GOLDS FOR TEAM USA

- In the summers of 2018 and 2019, Rhyne Howard traded in her UK Blue and White for USA Red, White and Blue and shined on the international stage.
- In 2018, Howard played in the FIBA U18 Women's Americas Championship earning MVP honors for the event after averaging 8.5 points and 4.7 rebounds per game. Howard hit 45.5 percent from the field and 31.8 percent from long range in the event with 18 assists, 11 steals and 8 blocks.
- The following summer, Howard continued her successful stretch playing for Team USA as she led the Red, White and Blue in scoring on its way to winning the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup

championship in Bangkok, Thailand. For her efforts, Howard was tabbed to the all-tournament team. Howard, who had 10 points, seven rebounds, three assists, two steals and two blocks in the championship game, led the USA in scoring throughout the week averaging 13.1 points per game with 5.1 rebounds per game and hitting 44.7 percent from long range.

## THE MAGIC "80"

- The Wildcats hold a remarkable 350-23 (.938) record since 1974 when scoring 80 points or more. The last loss came at South Carolin on Feb. 26, 2017 when the Cats fell 95-87 in the regular-season finale. UK is 104-5 (.954) under Mitchell when scoring 80 points or more.


## UK IN OVERTIME

- UK is 30-27 all-time in overtime games, including a 11-5 mark under Mitchell, who is 13-6 in his 11 -year career as a head coach in OT. UK is 0-0 this season.


## KENTUCKY ALL-TIME

- Kentucky is 829-540 (.605) in its 46th year of varsity women's basketball, including 287-125 (.696) in 13 seasons under Matthew Mitchell.


## KENTUCKY ALL-TIME AT HOME

- Kentucky is 479-173 all-time at home for a winning percentage of .734. UK is 452-157 (.742) all-time in Memorial Coliseum and 27-18 (.600) all-time in Rupp Arena
- If you do the math, you will notice UK's losses in Memorial Coliseum and Rupp Arena are two more than UK has home losses. That reason is because UK's NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 game vs. Washington at Rupp Arena on March 25, 2016 and its NCAA Tournament game vs. Indiana on March 18, 1983 at Memorial Coliseum cannot count towards UK's home record.


## MITCHELL MOVES INTO ELITE SEC COMPANY

- Kentucky's dominating 89-57 victory over Ole Miss on Jan. 26, 2017 was an historic one for Kentucky head coach Matthew Mitchell. The win was his 97 th all-time in SEC play as a head coach, which ranked him 10th all-time on the SEC's career wins list. UK's win at Arkansas on Feb. 16 was Mitchell's 100th career SEC win.
- Since arriving in Lexington in 2007, Mitchell has led Kentucky to unprecedented success. On top of leading UK to its first SEC Regular Season Championship in 30 years in 2012, Mitchell has four SEC Tournament title game appearances, 10 top-four finishes in the league and has coached 21 all-conference performances, including four SEC Player of the Year honorees.


## MITCHELL TURNS PROGRAM AROUND

- In 2009-10, Coach Mitchell implemented the "40 minutes of dread" style of play and it started Kentucky on an impressive run of success over the last 10 seasons.
- Advanced to a school-record eight straight NCAA Tournaments (2010-2017), including three Elite Eight trips during that span with 15 NCAA Tournament wins.
- Ten top-four SEC finishes, including winning the SEC regular season title in 2012, its first in 30 years.
- Advanced to the SEC Tournament championship game four times


## 20+ WIN SEASONS UNDER MITCHELL

- The Wildcats have won 20 or more games 19 times in 46 years of varsity basketball, including a school-record eight in a row from 2010-2017. It's important to note that UK had just 10 20-win seasons in its first 33 years of varsity women's basketball, but has nine in 13 seasons of the Matthew Mitchell era.


## MATHIES ENSHRINED IN HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2019

- A'dia Mathies was enshrined in the UK Athletics Hall of Fame in September of 2019 becoming the second Matthew Mitchell coached player to be inducted into the prestigious hall of fame. Victoria Dunalp was the first. Below is a recap of Mathies career at Kentucky.
- AP All-American second team (2013) and third team (2012) ... Two-time finalist for the John R. Wooden Award and the Naismith Trophy ... SEC Player of the Year as a junior and senior ... UK's all-time leader in steals (320), games played (140) and started (139), while ranking second in scoring $(2,014)$ and 3 FG made $(177)$, third in FG made $(712)$, FT made $(413)$ and ninth in assists (349) ... First player in UK history (men or women) to accumulate over 2,000 points, 600 rebounds, 300 assists and 300 steals in a career... Part of UK's all-time winningest class with an overall 111-30 (.787) record ... Helped UK claim an SEC regular-season title for the first time in 30 years in 2012 ... Advanced to four NCAA Tournament Sweet 16s and three Elite Eights.

## VALERIE STILL IN WBB HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2019

- The all-time leading scorer in both men's and women's basketball history at Kentucky Valerie Still - was officially inducted into the prestigious Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in the summer of 2019.
- Still is the first UK player to be inducted into the WBB Hall of Fame for her playing days at Kentucky. Ceal Barry, who was one of the first ever female scholarship athletes at Kentucky, was inducted into the 2018 class for her work as a coach and administrator. Former UK head coach Mickie DeMoss was also inducted into the 2018 class.
- Although Still played long ago (1979-83), she remains the top Wildcats in UK's women basketball annals. She was honored as such on Jan. 12, 2003 with a jersey retirement ceremony at halftime of the Alabama game. She became the first female letter winner in any UK sport to have her jersey retired.


## THE KENTUCKY WBB COACHING STAFF HAS ...

- Combined the Kentucky women's basketball staff has compiled over 80 years of experience at the Division I level, including coaching or playing in a combined 42 NCAA Tournaments with eight Final Fours, four national championships and a WNBA Championship.
- Elzy and Butts are in their second stint in Lexington after serving on Mitchell's staffs before. Butts was an associate head coach on Mitchell's first staff at Kentucky before Elzy joined the staff for four successful seasons. Amber Smith is in her second year as an assistant coach but has been a part of the Kentucky program for nearly a decade.
- Dunn, who is a Women's Basketball Hall of Famer, has over 40 years of coaching experience, including three decades in the collegiate ranks. Dunn is now the special assistant to the head coach after serving as an assistant coach the last two seasons.


## CATS SHINE IN THE CLASSROOM

- Matthew Mitchell has put an emphasis on academics since arriving on campus as the Wildcats have had a 3.0 team GPA or better each of the last 12 semesters. In the fall of 2016, the Wildcats posted a 3.517 team GPA, which was the highest GPA for a semester in the Mitchell era. UK followed that with a 3.464 team GPA in the spring with four players earning 4.0s. Under Mitchell, 42 Wildcats have been tabbed to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and 100 percent of Mitchell's players have received their degrees.

## 10 STRAIGHT YEARS TOP 20 IN ATTENDANCE

- Big Blue Nation has shown its support once again as the University of Kentucky women's basketball program ranked 18th nationally in average attendance during the 2018-19 season with 4,767 fans per game. This marks the 10th straight year the Wildcats have finished in the top 20 in NCAA national average attendance.
- Throughout 18 home games - two played inside historic Rupp Arena - Kentucky accumulated a total season attendance of 85,807 , an increase over last year's previous home attendance of 82,984 .
- Kentucky has averaged 4,500 or more fans every year since 2009-10. The Wildcats have continuously pushed the school's attendance numbers to new altitudes. Kentucky was a part of two of the top- 15 most attended games in the nation during the 2018-19 season.
- The Wildcats attracted large crowds not only in Lexington, but all across the country. A total of 154,112 fans attended Kentucky games, ranking the team 15th nationally.
- The Southeastern Conference once again led the nation in attendance with an average of 4,277 fans per game and a total attendance of 1,009,427. The Big Ten remained second in the rankings with a total attendance of 957,325 .


## MATTHEW AND JENNA MITCHELL DONATE \$1 MILLION TO UK

## ATHLETICS

- In June of 2014, Coach Matthew Mitchell and his wife, Jenna, pledged \$1 million over the next 10 years to the University of Kentucky Athletics Department. The donation will provide UK Athletics $\$ 100,000$ per year over the next 10 years to be used for a variety of capital projects, including updates and renovations for football. The donation is the largest ever given by a UK athletics employee to the athletics department.
- Matthew and Jenna have been very active in the Lexington community since arriving in Lexington. In October 2016, Matthew and Jenna were presented the Community Service Award by the Urban League of Lexington.

- Wildcat fans are passionate about their basketball, that's why UK has ranked in the nation's top 25 and in the SEC's top four in attendance 16 straight years.
- The Cats are 165-31 at Memorial in the Matthew Mitchell Era.
- UK averaged 5,186 fans per game in 2017-18 which ranked 15th nationally.
- UK drew 116,164 fans for its home games in 2015-16 the second-highest total attendance in school history.

## Rupp Arena $\mathbf{( 2 3 , 5 0 0 )}$

- Rupp Arena is entering its 44th season.
- An awesome structure in sight and scope, the arena is divided into two seating areas. The lower level features 10,000 cushioned theater seats while the upper arena has new chairback seats on the sidelines. The latter can be visually isolated to provide more natural setting for small shows.
- The Wildcats command an exclusive and updated state-of-the-art locker room, while other amenities include six team-size dressing rooms and eight smaller units.
- In 2013-14, UK set the new single-game attendance record when 23,706 fans saw UK face No. 2 Duke in Rupp Arena on Dec. 22, 2013. The attendance marked the largest crowd ever to see a college women's hoops game in the Commonwealth the previous mark was 22,152 for the first Kentucky-Louisville game played in the KFC Yum! Center on Dec. 5, 2010.
- In 2015-16, Kentucky packed 17,150 fans in Rupp Arena on Dec. 20 against Duke, which was the fourth-largest home crowd in program history. On Dec. 10, the Wildcats had 14,425 fans at the historic arena, which was the sixth-largest home crowd in school history.
- Kentucky will play two games inside Rupp Arena in 2019-20.
