• Vanderbilt returns to West End this Saturday to face the SEC East rival Kentucky. The Commodores and Wildcats will kick off at 2:30 p.m. in Vanderbilt Stadium.

• Vanderbilt has played only two other schools -- Tennessee and Ole Miss -- more than Kentucky. This marks the 92nd meeting between the Commodores and Wildcats, with Kentucky holding a slim 45-42-4 series advantage. Vanderbilt is looking for its first victory in the rivalry since 2015.

• Vanderbilt is seeking its sixth November win against an SEC opponent since 2015 when Kentucky visits campus. In the last three years, the Commodores have defeated Ole Miss (2016, 2018) and Tennessee (2016-18) in the month of November.

• Vanderbilt Athletics will honor members of the U.S. Armed Forces and Middle Tennessee first responders with Salute to Service activities at the Kentucky game. Scheduled pregame activities include a military flyover from personnel at Fort Campbell, located in Clarksville, and arrival of the game ball from Army Golden Knights' paratroopers. The Nashville Firefighter Pipe and Drum Corps will perform the national anthem, with solders from Fort Campbell joining Vanderbilt Naval ROTC students and members of fallen soldiers holding a large American flag on the field. Some 5,000 t-shirts honoring 21 fallen soldiers through the Memories of Honor organization will be distributed at stadium entrances.

• Seventeen student-athletes have earned their first collegiate starts for the Commodores this season: BJ Anderson (R-Fr., CB), Ben Bresnahan (R-Fr., TE), Daevion Davis (Fr., DT), Dan Dawkins (R-Fr., OG), Mo Hasan (R-Jr., QB), Brendon Harris (R-Fr., safety), Randall Haynie (R-So., CB), Kenny Hebert (R-Jr., OLB), Dashaun Jerkins (R-Fr., safety), Cam Johnson (R-Fr., WR), Jaylen Mahoney (Fr., CB), Sean McMoore (R-Jr., C), Grant Miller (R-So., C), Harrison Smith (R-Fr., nutrer), Tyler Steen (R-Fr., OT), Jonathan Stewart (R-So., OT) and Deuce Wallace (R-Jr., QB). Four more were first-time starters in a Vanderbilt uniform: Riley Neal (Gr., QB), Justice Shelton-Mosley (Gr., WR), Cam Watkins (Gr., CB) and DC Williams (Jr., CB).

• Twenty-two student-athletes have logged their first action as Commodores this season: Ben Bresnahan (R-Fr., TE), Keyon Brooks (Fr., RB), Camden Coleman (R-Fr., S), Pierson Cooke (So., K), Daevion Davis (Fr., DT), Tre Douglas (R-Fr., CB), Rowan Godwin (Gr., OL), Justin Harris (Fr., S), Gabe Jeudy (Fr., CB), Brandon Maddox (Jr., DT), Jaylen Mahoney (Fr., CB), Salua Masina (R-Fr., LB), Elijah McAllister (R-Fr., OLB), Scott Meyer (Gr., LS), Riley Neal (Gr., QB), Anferee Orji (Fr., S), Leshawn Paulino-Bell (R-So., OLB), Mitchell Pryor (So., RB), Javan Rice (R-Fr., K), Justice Shelton-Mosley (Gr., WR/PR), Cam Watkins (Gr., CB) and DC Williams (Jr., CB).

• Ke'Shawn Vaughn (R-Sr., RB) has entered Vanderbilt's all-time top 10 for rushing touchdowns, rushing yards and 100-yard rushing games in just 21 appearances. He ranks tied for fourth in rushing touchdowns (18), tied for fourth in 100-yard rushing games (8) and ninth in rushing yards (2,034). Vaughn is averaging 90.9 yards/game, third among SEC running backs. He ranks 13th among active NCAA backs with 3,086 career rushing yards. At Florida, Vaughn was limited to 28 rushing yards on 15 carries.

• One year after the graduation of 43-game starting quarterback Kyle Shurmur, the Commodores have faced a revolving door at the position. Due to a string of injuries, three quarterbacks have earned starts this season: Riley Neal (Gr.), Mo Hasan (R-Jr.) and Deuce Wallace (R-Jr.). A fourth quarterback, Allan Walters (R-So.) also has played this season.

• Vanderbilt's starting defense against Florida did not include a senior. It marks the fourth consecutive game without a senior in the starting defensive unit. Against Florida, the defensive starters included four juniors, four sophomores, two redshirt freshmen and a true freshman.

• Saige Young (Sr., OL) is the only Commodore from Kentucky. Young has started 20 games at guard in his Vanderbilt career, including seven this season at left guard.

• Of Vanderbilt's top 16 tacklers, only three -- Tae Daley (S), Dimitri Moore (LB) and Dayo Odeyingbo (DL) -- started more than five games a year ago. Linebacker Caleb Peart is the only senior among Vanderbilt's top dozen tacklers.

• Vanderbilt has faced four ranked opponents this season: No. 3 Georgia, No. 4 LSU, No. 22 Missouri and No. 10 Florida.

• An 82-hour fundraiser for Turner's Heroes that started at kickoff of the Vanderbilt-LSU game in mid-September surpassed its goal of \$50,000 early in the contest. The non-profit was founded this summer by Vanderbilt senior tight end Cody Markel to honor the legacy of former teammate and classmate Turner Cockrell. The money will fund a discovery grant focused on innovative pediatric cancer research in honor of Cockrell, who passed away Nov. 29, 2018, after a lengthy battle with melanoma. Vanderbilt head coach Derek Mason and his wife, LeighAnne, committed \$25,000 to the effort. For more information, visit TurnersHeroes.org.

• Vanderbilt defensive line coach Jovan Haye will be honored as the Commodores' SEC Football Legend during SEC Championship Weekend activities Dec. 6-7 in Atlanta. Haye was an All-SEC defensive end during his Vanderbilt playing career from 2002-04. Haye became a sixth-round pick in the 2005 NFL Draft and spent six years in the league.

• Longest Vanderbilt win streak: 9, 1896-1918

• This marks the 92nd meeting between Vanderbilt and Kentucky.

• The Commodores and Wildcats have met annually since 1953.

• The Vanderbilt-Kentucky series ranks 15th among most frequently played in the SEC. The Commodores have played only two schools more frequently: Tennessee (113) and Ole Miss (94).

• Vanderbilt controlled the infancy of the Kentucky rivalry, holding a 16-0-1 record against the Wildcats in the first 17 games played (1896-1938).

1901 • In a 22-0 win, Vanderbilt back John Tigert scored one of the Commodores' three touchdowns. Later, Tigert would go on to become a Rhodes Scholar, University of Florida president and U.S. Commissioner of Education (1921-28). He also served as a professor at the University of Kentucky where he worked as the Wildcats' head basketball coach in 1913 and head football coach from 1915-16. Tigert was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame in 1970.

1940 • With Vanderbilt head coach Red Sanders ill in the hospital, fans poured on the field to salute Vanderbilt players after a 7-7 tie with favored Kentucky. Filling in for Sanders was Vanderbilt assistant/line coach Paul "Bear" Bryant. Six years later, Bryant accepted the Kentucky head coaching position, guiding the Wildcats to a 60-23-5 record in eight years.

1970 • Down 17-0, the Commodores roared back behind quarterback Steve Burger and end Jeff Peeples to score 18 second-half points in a 18-17 road victory.

1995 • Tailback Jermaine Johnson rushed for 137 yards and Damian Allen hit Kenny Simon with a touchdown pass in the fourth quarter to help Vanderbilt claim a fifth straight victory in the series.

2000 • Quarterback Greg Zolman and right end Tom Simone hooked up for a 7-yard touchdown pass with 1:34 left to give Vanderbilt a 24-20 win.

2003 • Three touchdown passes from Jay Cutler gave Bobby Johnson his first SEC victory as Vanderbilt's head coach.

2005 • A classic in the series due to individual performances from both teams. Kentucky back Rafael Little produced 372 all-purpose yards. For Vanderbilt, Jay Cutler set team records with 39 completions and five touchdown passes - all to freshman receiver Earl Bennett, who tied a SEC mark in the process.

2008 • Vanderbilt reached six victories and bowl eligibility behind versatile D.J. Moore, who put together one of the most remarkable performances in Commodore and SEC history. Moore posted two interceptions as a cornerback and two catches for touchdowns as a receiver.

2011 • Behind the rushing of Zac Stacy and receiving from Jordan Matthews, the Commodores earn their six victory of the season with an impressive 38-8 home win over the Wildcats. Stacy produced 135 rushing yards and three touchdowns, while Matthews had 131 yards on six catches. The Vanderbilt defense also held Kentucky to nine first downs and 32 rushing yards.

2015 • Using trick plays and two interceptions from linebacker Oren Burks, the Commodores upended Kentucky 21-17. The winning touchdown came off the "Sneaky Pete" trick play - a 37-yard pass from quarterback Kyle Shurmur to wideout Caleb Scott.

Notes

Offense

• Vanderbilt is among four Power 5 teams to feature a 3,000-yard career rusher (Ke'Shawn Vaughn) and 2,000-yard career receiver (Kalija Lipscomb). Minnesota (RB Rodney Smith, WR Tyler Johnson), Ohio State (RB J.K. Dobbins, WR K.J. Hill), and SMU (RB Xavier Jones, WR James Proche) are the others. The Commodores also have a quarterback (Riley Neal) with more than 8,500 career passing yards.

• Vanderbilt shares the SEC lead -- and ranks 10th nationally -- with only three fumbles lost. The Commodore offense has just five fumbles, which ranks second in the NCAA.

•The team's 12 total offensive turnovers lost is tied for fifth in the conference and 39th in the NCAA.

• The Vanderbilt offense struggled at Florida, producing just 12 first downs and 128 total yards (51 rushing/77 passing). It marked the first shutout against the Commodores since a tilt with Alabama on Sept. 23, 2017.

• Keyon Brooks (Fr., RB) paced the Commodores with 34 yards on 11 carries at Florida.

• Vaughn was held to a season-low 28 rushing yards on 15 carries. He also had one catch for 14 yards.

• Two young receivers, James Bostic (R-So.) and Cam Johnson (R-Fr.) each posted a pair of receptions at Florida.

• Vaughn paced the Vanderbilt offensive attack against South Carolina on Nov. 2 with 98 allpurpose yards -- 87 rushing on 20 carries and 11 receiving on two catches.

• Vaughn produced 176 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns in Vanderbilt's 21-14 victory over No. 22 Missouri on Oct. 19. Vaughn's second touchdown against Missouri came on a 61-yard reception, the second longest of his career.

 Since the 2018 season, Vaughn has scored seven touchowns of 60+ yards -- the most among active FBS players.

• Vaughn's 1,066 all-purpose yards is fourth among SEC backs, ranks fith in the league behind Kentucky QB/WR Lynn Bowden Jr., LSU RB Clyde Edwards-Helaire, Georgia RB De'Andre Swift and Mississippi State RB Kylin Hill. He ranks 43rd in the nation.

• Vaughn has 818 rushing yards (fourth in SEC) and six touchdowns (t-8th in SEC) on 166 carries, including a long carry of 52 yards against LSU.

• Vaughn's 818-yard rushing total ranks No. 7 all-time among Vanderbilt senior backs. He is on pace to challenge the team's senior record of 1,141 yards set by Zac Stacy in 2012.

 \bullet In his last seven appearances, Vaughn has 688 rushing yards (98.3 yards/game) and five rushing touchdowns.

• Vaughn has eight 100-yard rushing performances in his Vanderbilt career, which is fourth on the team's all-time list.

• Of Vaughn's 166 carries this season, 26 have resulted in gains of at least 10 yards. He has seven rushes of 20+ yards.

• Vaughn, who ranks fourth in the SEC with a 90.9-yard rushing average, has been one of the nation's most productive backs over the last 12 months. In his last 13 appearances dating to Oct. 27, 2018, Vaughn is averaging 113.2 rushing yards/game. He has also 12 rushing touchdowns over the 13-game span.

• Vaughn's 140 rushing yards and 193 all-purpose yards against UNLV were season highs.

• Vaughn's 53-yard reception on Vanderbilt's first offensive possession against UNLV was the second longest of his Commodore career, trailing only a 75-yard touchdown catch against Florida in 2018.

• Vaughn entered the team's top 10 in career rushing yards earlier this season. With 2,062 yards, he ranks ninth all-time. He needs 34 yards to surpass Lonnie Sadler (1972-75) into eighth place, and 140 yards to move into the team's top five backs.

 In his Ball State and Vanderbilt career, Riley Neal (Gr., QB) has now amassed 8,500 passing yards and 50 touchdown passes. He ranks fourth nationally in career passing yards, behind Mason Fine of North Texas (10,710), Ben Hicks of SMU/Arkansas (9,510) and McKenzie Milton of UCF (8,683).

• Neal, who did not play at Florida, was off to his best start as a Commodore at South Carolina before leaving due to injury. On the team's opening possession, Neal completed 3 of 4 passes for 45 yards, including a 26-yard scoring strike to Cam Johnson (R-Fr., WR) in the brief appearance in South Carolina.

• Seven different receivers had a catch at South Carolina, with C.J. Bolar (So., WR) leading the way with three receptions.

• Quarterback Mo Hasan became the first Commodore signal caller to earn a win in his first career start since Kyle Shurmur did so against Missouri in 2015. Hasan is the first Commodore quarterback to defeat a ranked opponent in his first start since Mackenzi Adams guided the 2007 Commodores to a win at No. 6 South Carolina.

• Hasan was efficient against Missouri, passing for 120 yards and a touchdown (7-of-11) and rushing for 34 yards on nine carries. His 21-yard rush early in the second quarter led to Vanderbilt's first touchdown.

• Vanderbilt's leading two receivers against UNLV -- James Bostic (R-So., WR) and Keyon Brooks (Fr., RB) -- set single-game highs with four and three catches, respectively.

• Lipscomb caught eight passes for 100 yards vs. Northern Illinois, including his 21st career touchdown reception. It was Lipscomb's fourth career 100-yard receiving performance. He went without a catch against UNLV.

• Remarkably, the Vanderbilt offense played turnover-free football for more than 165+ minutes of game clock until an interception late in the third quarter against UNLV. The stretch included all 60 minutes of action against Northern Illinois and Ole Miss.

• Lipscomb surpassed 2,000 receiving yards against LSU. He now has 2,188 receiving yards as a Commodores. His 21 touchdown catches is tied for second with Dan Stricker (1999-2002) on the team's all-time list, just three behind the record held by Jordan Matthews (2010-13).

• Vanderbilt's 38 points against LSU is its highest scoring output ever against a opponent ranked among the nation's top five.

• Jonathan Stewart (R-So.) earned his first collegiate start against LSU, manning the left tackle position. He later started at right tackle against Missouri.

• The Commodores' scoring average in 2018 (28.5 points/game) was the program's highest scoring average since 2012 (30.1 points/game). It also marked Vanderbilt's fourth highest scoring offense since World War II.

• Vanderbilt's total offense in 2018 (411.2 yards/game) was the most since the 1974 squad averaged 412.8 yards en route to a Peach Bowl appearance. Vanderbilt's 6.29 yards per play ranked fourth in the SEC and 21st nationally.

• The Vanderbilt offense has 12 turnovers (three fumbles, nine interceptions) this season after committing just 14 total turnovers (eight fumbles, six interceptions) in 2018. The Commodores ranked tied for 20th nationally in 2018 with a plus-8 turnover margin. This year, the Commodores are tied for 86th in the NCAA with a minus-3 turnover margin.

• Thirty-five of TE Jared Pinkney's 50 receptions in 2018 resulted in first downs, tops in the SEC. Pinkney's 78.8 grade from a year ago is best among returning SEC tight ends.

• Lipscomb was sensational on third and fourth downs in 2018, catching 74% of his targets. He had an SEC-best 27 receptions, including six touchdowns, on third downs.

• In the final five games of 2018, the Commodore offense averaged 37.0 points and 466.8 total yards (209.8 rushing/235.4 passing).

• Seven offensive players have double-digit career starts: Pinkney (38), Lipscomb (30), Cochran (29), OL Cole Clemens (22), OL Saige Young (20), Vaughn (17), WR Chris Pierce (14) and C.J. Bolar (11).

Defense

 The Vanderbilt defense ranks third in the SEC -- and 15th in the NCAA -- with three defensive touchdowns.

 For the fourth straight game, the Vanderbilt starting defense versus South Carolina did not include a senior. The unit featured four juniors (DL Drew Birchmeier, S Tae Daley, OLB Andre Mintze and DL Cameron Tidd), four sophomores (ILB Feleti Afemui, CB Allan George, ILB Dimitri Moore and DL Rutger Reitmaier), two redshirt freshmen (CB BJ Anderson and S Dashaun Jerkins) and one true freshman (CB Jaylen Mahoney).

• Against Missouri and South Carolina, the Vanderbilt defense has kept opponents without points on four of nine possessions inside the 20-yard line. The unit also held Florida without points on two red-zone possessions in the first half.

• One week after establishing career highs with 12 solo stops and 16 total tackles against South Carolina, Daley became the first Commodore in four years to register two interceptions. Daley's picks ended two Gator scoring threats before intermission. Linebacker Oren Burks was the last Commodore to post two interceptions, coming against Kentucky on Nov. 14, 2015. Daley also had a team-high five solo stops at Florida.

• Moore put together his fourth straight impressive effort at Florida, contributing nine tackles, two defensed passes and a tackle for loss. In his last four games, Moore has amassed 43 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and three defensed passes. He has contributed at least seven tackles in his last seven appearances.

• Moore, who produced his fourth career game of 10+ tackles against the Gamecocks, leads the Vanderbilt defense 34 unassisted tackles and 71 total stops.

• Allan George (R-So., CB) and Andre Mintze (R-Jr, OLB) posted quarterback sacks against Florida. It's was Mintze's fourth sack of the season.

For the seventh straight week, at least 20 Commodore defenders contributed tackles.
 Twenty-one Commodores registered at least one stop against South Carolina. Earlier this season, 26 Commodores posted tackles against LSU.

 Elijah McAllister (R-Fr., OLB), who had two quarterback sacks against Northern Illinois, recovered a fumble against LSU for Vanderbilt's first defensive score of the season. He also had a forced fumble at South Carolina.

• Jaylen Mahoney (Fr., DB) made his first career start at nickel back, contributing five tackles.

• Against No. 22 Missouri, the Commodore defense registered season bests in points allowed (14), total yards allowed (293), yards per play (4.4 yards) and yards per pass (5.4 yards).

• It was the fewest total yards allowed Vanderbilt defense since the unit allowed just 242 yards in a 38-13 victory over Tennessee (Nov. 24, 2018).

• The defense contained Missouri's big three playmakers: quarterback Kelly Bryant, running back Larry Rountree III and wide receiver Jonathan Johnson. Bryant completed just 50% of his passes, threw for only 140 yards and was sacked three times. Rountree was limited to 29 rushing yards on 12 carries. Johnson had just three receptions for nine yards.

• The defense held strong against Missouri on third downs. The unit allowed the Tigers to a 20% success rate on third downs (3-of-15).

• The defense posted a season-high eight tackles for loss against Missouri. They also matched a season high with three quarterback sacks.

• The defense also limited explosive plays in the win against Missouri, holding the Tigers to one play of 30+ yards and just two plays of 20+ yards.

 Dayo Odeyingbo (Jr., DE) was a frequent visitor in the Missouri backfield, registering a career high with three quarterback hurries.

• The Commodore defense held Northern Illinois scoreless into the third quarter. It marked the first time Vanderbilt has kept an opponent off the scoreboard in the first half since the Tennessee regular-season finale in 2018.

• Vanderbilt produced two defensive scores against LSU for the first time since the 2011 season

opener when cornerback Trey Wilson returned two interceptions for touchdowns against Elon. The defensive touchdowns against LSU came on a fumble recovery in the Tiger end zone by McAlister and a 47-yard interception return by Haynie.

• The 47-yard interception return for a touchdown by Haynie against LSU was the first by a Commodore defender since LB Oren Burks went 30 yards with a pick against Kentucky on Nov. 14, 2015. It was Haynie's second career interception.

• Six defenders have earned their first collegiate starts this year: BJ Anderson (R-Fr., CB), Daveion Davis (DT), Harris (S), Hebert (OLB), Jerkins and DC Williams (Jr., CB).

• This year, the defense has created nine turnovers (five interceptions, four fumbles), including three that have resulted in touchdowns. In 2018, Vanderbilt produced the fourth-largest increase nationally in takeaways from the previous year. The 2018 defense caused 22 takeaways, 13 more than in 2017. It also marked the most takeaways by a Commodore defense since 2013.

• The Commodores have featured six new starters at cornerback -- graduate transfer Cam Watkins, Williams, sophomore Allan George, Haynie, Anderson and Mahoney. The Commodores are working to replace both starting cornerbacks from a year ago: Donovan Sheffield and current New England Patriot Joejuan Williams.

• The Vanderbilt secondary faced a different task in September. The unit has opposed veteran signal callers in multi-year starters Jake Fromm (Georgia), Elijah Sindelar (Purdue), Joe Burrow (LSU) and Ross Bowers (Northern Illinois). Both Fromm and Burrow are leaders of undefeated, top-5 teams and rank among the early candidates for Heisman Trophy consideration. Sindelar, who missed Purdue's most recent game, ranks among Big Ten leaders in various passing categories. Bowers is a graduate transfer from California where he threw for 3,039 yards as a 12-game starter in 2017.

Special Teams

• Devin "Fitz" Fitzsimmons has brought energy and plenty of buy-in through the Commodore roster in his first year as special teams coordinator.

• Senior Ryley Guay is 7-of-9 on field goals the season. Guay is off to the best start by a Vanderbilt kicker since Bryant Hahnfeldt opened the 2008 season with seven successful field goal conversions.

• Guay is 5-of-6 on field goals beyond 40 yards this season, including a 48-yarder against UNLV. He has also hit from 48, 46, 43 and 41 yards. Guay's only misses came from 46 yards against UNLV and 50 yards at Florida.

• Vanderbilt placekickers are 80% (8-of-10) on field goals on the season. Besides Guay's successful conversions, Javan Rice (R-Fr.) also converted a 28-yard field goal against Northern Illinois.

• Harrison Smith (R-Fr.) averaged 42.6 yards on nine punts at Florida, including two of more than 50 yards.

• Smith earned SEC Special Teams Player of the Week after the win over Missouri. He averaged 43.1 yards on eight punts, with six punts of 40+ punts. He also had three efforts land inside the Missouri 20-yard line.

• Smith's 66-yard punt in the first half versus LSU is a career long. It was also the longest punt by a Commodore since Tommy Openshaw boomed a 78-yarder against Missouri on Oct. 24, 2015.

• Graduate transfer Justice Shelton-Mosley, a FCS All-American in 2017 and two-time Alllvy first team recipient as a Harvard undergrad, averaged 12.5 yards on four punt returns, including a season-long of 31 yards.

• Shelton-Mosley is averaging 10.8 yards on 10 returns this season.

 Sophomore Pierson Cooke has handled Vanderbilt's kickoff role against UNLV, Ole Miss, Northern Illinois, Missouri and Florida. Opponents have returned just four of Cooke's 18 kicks. • Gerry Gdowski moved into the offensive coordinator role for the Dores this year. Gdowski is the longest-tenured Vanderbilt assistant, having been on campus since Derek Mason's first year in 2014. For the last three years, Gdowski served as quarterbacks coach, helping mold three-year starter and current Kansas City QB Kyle Shurmur into the Commodores' all-time leading passer.

• Four coaches are new to Derek Mason's staff: Devin "Fitz" Fitzsimmons, Jovan Haye, Tim Horton and Matt Weikert. Fitzsimmons serves as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator. Haye enters his first year as defensive line coach. Horton comes to the staff as running backs coach after extremely successful SEC tenures. Weikert serves as outside linebackers coach, coming from an 12-year tenure at Air Force.

 In 2018, Derek Mason became just the second Vanderbilt head coach to guide multiple Commodore squads to postseason bowls. During his tenure, Mason has led the Commodores to the 2018 Texas Bowl and the 2016 Independence Bowl. Mason and James Franklin (2011-13) as the only Vanderbilt head coaches to oversee multiple bowl appearances. Mason's tenure also has been highlighted by successes in regional matchups. Under Mason's direction, the Commodores have won their last eight consecutive games against teams located in the state of Tennessee, including three straight versus cross-state rival Tennessee.

 Coming off one of the best seasons ever produced by a Vanderbilt running back, Doak Walker Award candidate Ke'Shawn Vaughn is putting together another superb campaign in his final season in black and gold.

• Vaughn ranks 13th in the NCAA with 3,086 career rushing yards. He has gained 2,062 of the rushing yards as a Commodore back.

• In SEC games against team ranked in the nation's top-5 this year (vs. Georgia, vs. LSU), Vaughn has rushed for 204 yards (102 yards/game) and a pair of touchdowns.

• Vaughn second second among SEC backs (and ranks 10th nationally) with 248 receiving yards. He is one of two backs in the NCAA with at least two receptions of 50+ yards.

• In 21 appearances in a Vanderbilt uniform, Vaughn is averaging 98.2. rushing yards. He has scored 21 touchdowns (18 rushing, 3 receiving).

• Since the 2018 opener, Vaughn has produced produced 18 rushes of 30+ yards, tops among all SEC backs. He also has 16 plays of 40+ yards, 10 plays of 50+ yards, eight plays of 60+ yards and two plays of 70+ yards.

• As a Commodore running back, Vaughn has produced 13 carries of 40+ yards, which is tied with Memphis' Darrell Henderson as the most in the NCAA among active running backs since the 2018 opener. Vaughn's 40+ carries include a scoring rush of 52 yards this year against LSU. In 2018, he scored from 78 yards against Tennessee State, 69, 68 and 66 yards against Baylor in the Texas Bowl, 65 yards at Missouri and 63 yards at Arkansas. In 2018, Vaughn also led the SEC with six carries of 60 or more yards.

• The senior put together a tremendous close to the 2018 campaign, amassing 749 yards (149.8 yards/game) and seven touchdowns in his last five appearances. He capped the year even more remarkably, rushing for 243 yards and two touchdowns on just 13 carries in the Texas Bowl. Always saving his best for last, Vaughn averaged an amazing 8.5 yards/rush in fourth-quarter plays.

• Vaughn racked up 2018 SEC Newcomer of the Year from the Associated Press, becoming the first Commodore to claim the award. He also earned Big Ten Newcomer of the Year in 2015 at Illinois.

• Vaughn finished the 2018 season with 1,244 rushing yards, second in the SEC behind only Kentucky's Benny Snell. He also posted 12 rushing touchdowns, third most in the league.

• Vaughn, a product of Pearl-Cohn High School in Nashville, became the sixth Vanderbilt back to reach 1,000 rushing yards in a season. His 1,244-yard rushing is the team's second highest total, trailing only the 1,283-yard total amassed by Ralph Webb in 2016.

• Vaughn displayed remarkable explosiveness in 2018, topping the conference with a 7.9-yards/carry average (second-highest average by a 1,000-yard SEC back since 2000). He is averaging 5.4-yards/carry as a senior.

• Vaughn's 7.9-yard/rush in 2018 is the highest average by a modern-day Commodore running back.

• Vaughn's breakaway percentage of 60.1% in 2018 topped all SEC backs.

• Vaughn averaged a SEC-best 5.28 yards after contact in 2018. In the Texas Bowl alone, 161 of Vaughn's 243 rushing yards came after contact.

• Vaughn produced 32 rushes of 10+ yards in 2018.

• Vaughn produced 749 rushing yards and seven touchdowns in the final five games of 2018, averaging 149.8 yards/game.

• Coming off one of the best seasons ever achieved by a Commodore, Kalija Lipscomb has a chance to cap his career as one of the top receivers in league history. Lipscomb experienced a break-through campaign in 2018, hauling in 87 passes for 916 yards and nine touchdowns. Lipscomb's receptions total topped the SEC. His season totals for receiving yardage and touchdown catches also ranked among league leaders.

 Lipscomb is the league's active leader with 184 catches and 2,226 receiving yards. He is second to Alabama's Jerry Jeudy with 21 touchdown catches. He ranks eighth among active NCAA players in receptions. Lipscomb's teammate Justice Shelton-Mosley, a graduate transfer from Harvard, ranks among the NCAA top 25 with 2,004 career receiving yards.

• Lipscomb, who had a career-high 174 receiving yards and two touchdowns vs. Tennessee State on Sept. 29, 2018, registered at least four catches in 11 of 13 games, including a 11-catch performance at Notre Dame.

• Lipscomb needs four touchdown catches to break the career school record held by Jordan Matthews (2010-13).

Jared Pinkney enters his final season as a candidate for the Walter Camp Award, John
Mackey Award and Biletnikoff Award

 Pinkney, who earned second-team All-SEC recognition from the Associated Press last season, is the SEC's top returning tight end in terms of receptions, receiving yards and touchdown receptions. The three-year starter from Norcross, Georgia, hauled in 50 catches (second-most nationally by a returning tight end) in 2018, good for 774 receiving yards (most nationally by a returning tight end) and seven touchdowns (most by a returning SEC tight end). His 32 receptions on first downs in 2018 topped all returning tight ends.

• Pinkney's 2018 reception and yardage totals were the most by a Vanderbilt tight end since Chuck Scott had 70 catches and 54 catches in 1983 and 1984, respectively. A 35-game career starter, Pinkney has amassed 107 catches, 1,470 receiving yards and 12 touchdowns. He has 15 catches for 157 yards this season.

• Pinkney received John Mackey Award Tight End of the Week twice in 2018. Pinkney's initial recognition came after a five-catch, 111-yard, one-touchdown effort at Notre Dame, where he became just the third SEC tight end in last four years to post 100+ receiving yards vs. a top-10 team. It was also the first 100-yard receiving game by a SEC tight end on the road vs. a top-10 foe since 2014.

• The Commodores did not commit a turnover versus Ole Miss, marking the team's second consecutive games without an interception or fumble. The last time Vanderbilt played back-to-back games without turnovers was in 2018 -- at Arkansas (Oct. 27) and at Missouri (Nov. 10).

• The Ole Miss-Vanderbilt game was played with a turnover by either team. One week earlier, the Commodores and Northern Illinois game ended withut a turnover. According to STATS, it marks the first time that Vanderbilt has played back-to-back games with either team committing a turnover since 1996.

• Two young safeties, Dashaun Jerkins (R-Fr.) and Brendon Harris (R-Fr.), are among Commodores' leading tacklers with 53 and 44 stops, respectively.

• Dayo Odeyingbo (Jr., DE) has six a team-high six tackles for loss this season and ranks as the Commodores' active leader with 17 tackles for loss and six quarterback sacks.

• The 2018 defense produced nine fumble recoveries, seven more than in 2017. The unit also had 13 interceptions, the most of the Derek Mason era. The takeaways have helped Vanderbilt to a positive turnover margin, a statistical category historically important to Vanderbilt team success. The Commodores had a fumble recovery and interception against LSU.

Turner Cockrell

• The Commodores remember Vanderbilt student-athlete Turner Cockrell, who passed away on Nov. 29, 2018, after a long battle with cancer. He was 21.

• Cockrell, a third-year tight end on the Commodores' football team, fought bravely after being diagnosed with melanoma in his lymph nodes in November 2017. Despite surgery and treatment that winter, scans determined that the cancer had spread to Cockrell's lungs last summer.

• Cockrell, a native of Acworth, Georgia, is survived by his parents, Randy and Noelle, and two siblings, brother Parker and sister Katheryn.

• The Commodores also wore helmet stickers with Cockrell's No. 82 during a 38-13 victory over Tennessee in the regular-season finale and at the 2018 Texas Bowl.

• In the LSU game, the Commodores introduces a new custom uniform known as the "Battle Ready" apparel. A matching helmet for the uniform is donned with 82 rivets to honor Cockrell.

• Cody Markel, one of Cockrell's fellow tight ends on the roster and among his close friends, has founded "Turner's Heroes," a non-profit that creates hero capes and related activities for ailing youngsters being treated in children's hospital. Turner's parents are members of the non-profit.

• An 82-hour fundraiser for Turner's Heroes, a non-profit effort aiming to support pediatric patients and fund research grants, started at kickoff of the Vanderbilt-LSU game and continued to Sept. 24. The non-profit was started this summer by Vanderbilt senior tight end Cody Markel to honor the legacy of former teammate and classmate Turner Cockrell.

• The initial \$50,000 fundraiser goal, anchored by a \$25,000 match from Coach Mason and his wife, LeighAnne, was reached early in the Vanderbilt-LSU game. The organization then increased the fundraising target to \$82,000. The effort ended with more than \$70,000 raised from nearly 400 donors.

• In July, at Vanderbilt Children's Hospital, Markel saw his vision come to life, a vision that included sights not normally associated with either hospitals or college football: plenty of glitter, stickers and glue guns, and giggling children running around in colorful, personalized superhero capes.

• According to Cockrell's parents, Markel could not have devised a more perfect way to honor their son than through Turner's Heroes, the non-profit created by Markel. Markel, a non-scholarship senior from Middleton, Wisconsin, has been nominated for the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works team and National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy.

Feeding Nashville's Homeless

• Wanting to help feed Nashville's homeless and disadvantaged communities, junior quarterback Mo Hasan turned to the Vanderbilt training table for assistance.

• Through his non-profit Second Spoon effort, Hasan, teammates and other Vanderbilt student-athletes have devised a system to deliver extra food from the athletes' dining hall to the homeless living on Nashville's streets.

• This past summer, Hasan and his Commodore helpers spent Friday afternoons at the Nashville mission distributing up to 150 meals to those in need.

 In early October, Hasan also received recognition on another front, for his inclusion in Nashville Lifestyles' Most Beautiful People edition. He was joined in the magazine by former Vanderbilt football player Andrew East.

Academic Achievement

• Off the field, the Vanderbilt football team topped the SEC with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 95 for the 2018-19 academic year. The Dores scored among the highest five teams in the GSR data - and ranked second among programs affiliated with a Power 5 conference.

• 59 student-athletes on the 2018 football team earned a grade-point average of 3.0 or higher, including 18 on the dean's list (3.5 or higher) and four with a perfect 4.0.

• Forty Commodores landed on the 2018-19 SEC Academic Honor roll, and Vanderbilt scored a 991 in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate scores, the highest of any SEC program and fourthbest among Power 5 schools.

Set the Expectation Season Opener

 Vanderbilt's season-opening tilt with Georgia was designated as the program's "Set The Expectation" game. Vanderbilt became the first SEC program to host a "Set The Expectation" game. The event originated in June, when Brenda Tracy, a registered nurse from Oregon, shared with the football team her devastating personal story and vital message of preventing sexual violence. Tracy also serves on the NCAA's Commission to Combat Campus Sexual Violence. Tracy, who calls her campaign "Set The Expectation," was recognized during the Vanderbilt-Georgia game.

Commodores Overseas

• Three members of the football team -- Kenny Hebert (R-Jr., OLB), Braden Kopp (R-Jr., TE) and Andre Mintze (R-Jr., OLB) -- spent last May studying in France.

Horton a Perfect Fit

 Mentoring All-SEC backs like Ke'Shawn Vaughn isn't new to first-year Commodore running backs coach Tim Horton. In previous stints with Auburn and Arkansas, Horton worked with some of the nation's top backs, including Tre Mason, Cameron Artis Payne and Kerryon Johnson at Auburn and Darren McFarren, Felix Jones and Knile Davis at Arkansas.

Half-Dozen Graduate Transfers

• The Vanderbilt roster includes six graduate transfers: OL Rowan Godwin (South Alabama), LS Scott Meyer (Alabama), QB Riley Neal (Ball State), WR/R Justice Shelton-Mosley (Harvard), CB Cam Watkins (Illinois) and DT Eddie Zinn-Turner (Marist).

West End Pipelines

 Four high schools -- St. Thomas Aquinas (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.), Brentwood Academy (Brentwood, Tenn.), Pearl-Cohn (Nashville) and Andalusia (Ala.) -- are well represented on the Vanderbilt roster.

 Six graduates of St. Thomas Aquinas, a perennial power in south Florida, are on the Commodore roster: Frank Coppet (R-Jr., S), Julian Hernandez (Fr., OL), Grant Miller (R-So., OL), Lashawn Paulino-Bell (Jr., OLB), Tyler Steen (R-Fr., OL) and DC Williams (Jr., CB).

• Four players are from Pearl-Cohn in Nashville: Brayden DeVault-Smith (R-So., ILB), Jayden Harrison (Fr., WR), Ke'Shawn Vaughn (R-Sr., RB) and Cam Watkins (Grad., CB).

• Four players also attended Brentwood Academy just south of Nashville: Nate Clifton (Fr., DL), Cam Johnson (R-Fr., WR), Gavin Schoenwald (R-Fr., TE) and Harrison Smith (R-Fr., P).

• Andalusia (Ala.) has three graduates with Vanderbilt: BJ Anderson (R-Fr., CB), Will Clark (So., FB) and Allan George (R-So., CB).

Aloha from West End

• The Vanderbilt roster includes three residents of Hawaii: offensive linemen Sean McMoore (Kapolei) and Jonah Buchanan (Honolulu), and inside linebacker Feleti Afemui (Kahului). Afemui is the first player from his high school conference to earn a scholarship in the SEC.

Vanderbilt University • Vanderbilt Athletics

• Vanderbilt is ranked 15th among national universities by U.S. News & World Report. It ranks seventh in best value schools by the magazine.

• According to the 2019 Princeton Review, Vanderbilt ranks third for best quality of life, happiest students and most beautiful campuses in the nation.

• The university was founded in 1873 with a \$1 million gift from "Commodore" Cornelius Vanderbilt. Kirkland Hall, which continues as the main administration building on campus, is the only original structure that remains today.

• Vanderbilt teams have captured five NCAA championships, all since 2007. The Commodore baseball team won the most recent national trophy, claiming the 2019 College World Series in June. It was the second NCAA title for head coach Tim Corbin and the Vanderbilt baseball team. Other NCAA titles have been earned by women's bowling (2007, 2018) and women's tennis (2015).

• In 2018-19, Vanderbilt had the smallest undergraduate enrollment (6,861) and total enrollment (12,824) in the Southeastern Conference.

• Vanderbilt is a charter member of the Southeastern Conference.

• Vanderbilt Athletics is the only Power 5 Conference member with an African American in the key roles of athletics director (Malcolm Turner), football head coach (Derek Mason) and men's basketball head coach (Jerry Stackhouse).

 Less than 10% of 34,313 high school applications were accepted for admission to Vanderbilt in 2018-19.

• The largest college on campus is Arts & Science with 4,036 undergraduates. The Blair School of Music is the smallest college with 217 students.

 Ninety percent of students live on campus, which features 20 residential halls and apartments.

• There are more than 139,000 living alumni of the university.

• The 330-acre Vanderbilt campus, situated in an urban setting just two miles from business and governmental core of Nashville, is designated as an arboretum, and features approximately 190 species of trees and shrubs.

• Sixty-five percent of Vanderbilt undergraduates receive some sort of financial aid.

• The Jean and Alexander Heard Library system contains over eight million items across 10 libraries on campus and stands as one of the nation's top research libraries.

• Notable Vanderbilt alumni include PGA Tour FedEx Cup winner Brandt Snedeker, LPGA golfer and 2019 Solheim Cup USA team member Marina Alex, NBA champions Will Perdue, Festus Ezeli and Damian Jones, numerous Major League Baseball standouts such as David Price, Sonny Gray, Dansby Swanson and Walker Buehler, and more than 20 players active in the NFL such as cornerbacks Casey Hayward and Joejuan Williams, wide receiver Jordan Matthews, linebackers Zach Cunningham and Oren Burks, lineman Stephen Weatherly and receiver Trent Sherfield.

• Off the field, other prominent alumni include NBC Sunday Morning Show host and MSNBC's Morning Joe co-host Willie Geist, country music star Dierks Bentley, best-selling author James Patterson, FOX Sports commentator Skip Bayless and ESPN baseball expert Buster Olney.





Vanderbilt Drops Opener

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt could not slow down Georgia's ground game in the Commodores' season opener, as the third-ranked Bulldogs opened the season with a 30-6 win.

Vanderbilt debuted a new starting quarterback in Riley Neal along with new offensive coordinator Gerry Gdowski. The Commodores also had Ke'Shawn Vaughn, the SEC's top returning rusher who ran for 1,244 yards last season, and the league's top returning receiver in Kalija Lipscomb.

But the Commodores were without three starters, including two on the offensive line with both left tackle Devin Cochran and left guard Saige Young out with injuries. That left Neal with little time to throw against a Georgia defense that returned seven starters on a unit that was 15th nationally giving up just 19.2 points a game last season.

Neal finished 15 of 25 for 85 yards before being replaced by Deuce Wallace for the final possession. Vaughn was held to 74 yards on 15 carries.

Vanderbilt managed a pair of field goals by Ryley Guay of 26 and 46 yards.

D'Andre Swift ran 16 times for 149 yards, and Brian Herrien added 65 and a touchdown run as the Bulldogs rolled up 326 yards rushing. Georgia finished with a 481-225 edge in total offense, and the Bulldogs also had two sacks and recovered a fumble.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Vanderbilt's late fourth-quarter touchdowns weren't enough in a loss to Purdue, 42-24, at Ross-Ade Stadium.

Vanderbilt quarterback Riley Neal set up the game's opening score in the first quarter with a 49-yard pass to Kalija Lipscomb, putting the ball on the Purdue 4. Ke'Shawn Vaughn scored on a 1-yard touchdown.

The Commodores were outscored, 28-14, in the second half. The Boilermakers scored quickly after taking the second-half kickoff to take a 21-10 edge.

Sindelar's 20-yard touchdown pass to Brycen Hopkins, from Nashville, pushed the lead to 28-10. The play was set up after a 15-yard penalty for helmet targeting by Vanderbilt cornerback Randall Haynie, who was disqualified.

Vanderbilt closed the deficit to 28-16 on Neal's 10-yard touchdown pass to Cam Johnson early in the fourth quarter.

Moore's 34-yard touchdown grab gave Purdue a 35-16 lead.

Vandy's final score came on Neal's 75-yard touchdown pass to Chris Pierce and a two-point conversion, closing the deficit to 35-24.

Vanderbilt's Ryley Guay stayed perfect to start 2019 with a 48-yard field goal with 53 seconds left in the first half.

Neal threw for 378 yards for two touchdowns as the Commodores had an improved offensive effort from its opening 30-6 loss to Georgia

Purdue had just seven yards on nine carries until the final play of third quarter.

Commodores Stumble Against LSU

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt's Ke'Shawn Vaughn ran for 130 yards and two touchdowns but Vanderbilt could not slow No. 4 LSU, falling 66-38, in its second Southeastern Conference game at Vanderbilt Stadium.

Vanderbilt (0-3, 0-2) scored on its opening drive for the first time this season, but couldn't stop the high-powered offense of LSU (4-0, 1-0).

Vaughn moved into a tie for eighth place in Commodore history with 15 rushing touchdowns. He is tied with Khari Blasingame (2016-18) and Jeff Jennings (2004-08). Vaughn also eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the first time this season and sixth at Vanderbilt.

The Commodores scored their most points this season while adding at least one touchdown in every quarter. Kalija Lipscomb hauled in his 20th career touchdown reception, moving into a tie for third with Earl Bennett (2005-07) and Chuck Scott (1981-84) in Commodore history.

Lipscomb also surpassed 2,000 yards receiving for his Vanderbilt career after hauling in five catches for 68 yards.

Vanderbilt's defense forced two turnovers, both which resulted in points. The Commodores recovered a fumble at the end of the second quarter in the end zone for a touchdown and returned an interception for six points in the second half.

Vanderbilt kicker Ryley Guay stayed perfect on the season after converting a 41-yard field goal in the first half for his fourth field goal this season.

The Tigers came in second in the SEC defending the run, giving up just 80.3 yards a game. They gave up a 41-yarder to Vaughn on Vandy's first offensive play, and he broke loose for a 52-yard touchdown run in the third quarter — the longest run this season for the SEC's top returning rusher. Vaughn finished with 20 carries for 130 yards.

The Commodores came in as the only FBS team without a sack this season. Jaylen Mahoney sacked Joe Burrow early in the second quarter. Kenny Hebert also got a sack, and Elijah McAlister recovered an Edwards-Helaire fumble for a touchdown in the final minute of the first half.

Dores Handle Northern Illinois

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Ke'Shawn Vaughn rushed for 138 yards and one touchdown, Riley Neal threw for 189 yards and a touchdown and Vanderbilt defeated Northern Illinois, 24-18.

The victory was the first of the season for the Commodores (1-3), who dropped their first three games to Power Five teams, two of which came against top-five ranked opponents in No. 3 Georgia and No. 4 LSU.

Vanderbilt's Keyon Brooks and Vaughn scored rushing touchdowns on the first two Vanderbilt drives of the game.

On Vanderbilt's opening drive, Brooks broke loose for a 61-yard touchdown run, the freshman's first of the season. He had only one more carry of the game. Entering the game, Brooks had just eight carries for a total of seven yards in two games this season.

The Huskies pulled to within four in the third quarter after posting points on their first two drives of the second half. John Richardson kicked a 39-yard field goal to get Northern Illinois on the scoreboard, and then Mitchell Brinkman had a 38-yard touchdown reception. But Vanderbilt answered right back 1:49 later when Neal found Kalija Lipscomb with a 38-yard touchdown pass.

Vanderbilt improved its record to 8-2 against Mid-American Conference opponents, including 4-0 against Northern Illinois.

Early in the fourth, the Huskies cut the deficit to six following a one-yard touchdown run by Marcus Jones and a two-point conversion reception by Brinkman, but the Commodore defense denied the Huskies on their final drive, and the Vanderbilt offense was able to run out the remaining three minutes to seal the victory.

The Commodores allowed the Huskies to convert just four of 13 third down opportunities in the game.

Commodores Suffer Setback to UNLV

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Ke'Shawn Vaughn had another big day at Vanderbilt Stadium, but a pair of costly Vanderbilt turnovers in the second half thwarted the Commodores' comeback attempt.

Visiting UNLV outscored Vandy 34-3 after falling behind 7-0 to win 34-10. The Rebels (2-4) scored 10 points off Vanderbilt miscues to put the game away late.

Vaughn, meanwhile, rushed for 140 yards in 15 carries (9.3 yards/rush) and also caught a 53yard pass. Those numbers weren't enough to carry the Commodores.

The Commodores began the fourth quarter down 27-10 after Daniel Gutierrez made a 29-yard field goal on the period's first play. Vandy got a big return on the ensuing kickoff and a penalty moved the ball to the UNLV 43.

But the momentum was short-lived. Quarterback Riley Neal was sacked on a third-down play and fumbled - Nate Neal picked it up for the Rebels and took it back to the Commodores' 40.

Six plays later, Chad Magyar ran in a 14-yard touchdown putting the Rebels ahead by 24 with 10:44 to play.

Vandy couldn't find a comeback left in the tank.

The first 30 minutes didn't go very well for the home team either.

After Vandy's opening drive went 76 yards in a little less than three minutes, Vaughn scored on the eighth play with a 4-yard touchdown run making it 7-0.

The Rebels outscored Vanderbilt 24-3 the rest of the way.

Charles Williams scored on a 5-yard run, Gutierrez made a 44-yard field goal, Randal Grimes caught a 63 touchdown pass and tight end Noah Bean hauled in a 5-yard throw, respectively. Vandy kicker Ryley Guay made a 48-yard field goal in between all that leaving the Doors down 24-10 at the break.

Vanderbilt allowed 249 yards on defense and UNLV gained 7.5 yards per play in the first half while converting five of their six third-down opportunities.

Offensively, the Commodores were 1-for-8 on third down. Vaughn averaged 8.4 yards per carry in the first two quarters.

After 13 minutes of scoreless ball in the third quarter, Vanderbilt was putting together a solid drive into UNLV territory. But Neal was picked off by UNLV's Javin White and the senior linebacker took it all the way down to the Vanderbilt 11.

The Rebels ran the clock down and took their 14-point lead into the final quarter. It never got any closer than that.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Riley Neal came off the bench and threw a 21-yard touchdown to Cam Johnson with 8:57 left, and Vanderbilt upset No. 22 Missouri 21-14 with a stifling defensive performance.

Ke'Shawn Vaughn ran for a touchdown and also took a screen 61 yards for another score as Vanderbilt (2-5, 1-3 Southeastern Conference) snapped a three-game skid to Missouri after losing five of the previous seven in this series.

Missouri (5-2, 2-1) came in leading the SEC East waiting for the Tigers' appeal of NCAA sanctions to be heard. The Tigers also played their first game since moving into the Top 25 with a five-game winning streak — all at home.

Vanderbilt held Missouri to a season-low in points with the Tigers 17th nationally averaging 38.8 points a game. The Commodores sacked Kelly Bryant three times, and Allan George intercepted a Bryant pass in the end zone with 6:44 left in the third quarter.

Missouri had a chance to tie except Vanderbilt sacked Bryant for the third time, and Tucker McCann pulled a 48-yarder wide left for his second missed field goal. Neal and Vanderbilt ran out the final 6 minutes for the win.

Neal started the first six games of the season only for Mo Hasan to get the start against Missouri. The walk-on junior college transfer who had thrown only six passes last season as a backup became the third quarterback this season to jump-start the Commodore offense.

Neal drove the Commodores 65 yards and capped the drive with the toss that Johnson took to the end zone for the lead.

The Commodores ended up using all three quarterbacks in this game after Hasan was sent to the locker room for evaluation. Neal came out briefly, forcing Deuce Wallace into the game. Hasan was the surprise starter announced at the end of the pregame warmups. Hasan was 7 of 11 for 120 yards and a TD, and he ran nine times for 34 yards before being knocked out of the game.

Offense Sputters in Loss

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina scored 24 unanswered en route to a 24-7 win over Vanderbilt at Williams-Brice Stadium.

The Gamecocks (4-5, 3-4 SEC) fell in an early, 7-0 hole before rattling off two second-quarter touchdowns and adding a fourth-quarter field goal and fourth-quarter touchdown. The win snapped a two-game losing streak for South Carolina.

The Commodores (2-6, 1-4 SEC) finished with 189 yards of total offense.

Vanderbilt's opening drive of the night was aided by three South Carolina penalties - and the Dores took advantage. Riley Neal's 26-yard touchdown pass to Cam Johnson capped an 11play drive that covered 77 yards and ate up more than six minutes of clock while giving Vandy a 7-0 lead midway through the opening quarter.

Neal left the game with an injury after that series.

The Commodores kept that 7-0 lead into the second quarter thanks, in part, to a forced fumble and recovery by Elijah McCallister with South Carolina threatening at the 9. But the Gamecocks finally dented the scoreboard at the 7:50 mark of the period thanks to Ryan Hilinski's 20-yard strike to Xavier Legette - that tied the game at 7-7.

South Carolina took its first lead of the game just before halftime thanks a 1-yard run on a toss sweep left to Kevin Harris. The Gamecocks took a 14-7 lead into the break.

Vanderbilt backup quarterback Deuce Wallace was intercepted by R.J. Roderick on Vanderbilt's final offensive play of the third quarter. That ultimately led to a 22-yard field goal from Parker White making it 17-7 with 12:18 to play.

Hilinski capped his night with a 25-yard TD strike to Bryan Edwards. That score provided the final margin.

Dores Fail in Disappointing Fashion

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - The Commodores fell behind early and dropped a disappointing 56-0 road decision to the Florida Gators.

Playing with backup quarterback Deuce Wallace and Allan Walters, the Commodores (2-7, 1-5 SEC) generated little offense for the second straight Saturday. Vanderbilt finished the game with 128 yards of total offense,

Florida quarterback Kyle Trask threw for a career-high 363 yards and three touchdowns -- the best passing performance by a Florida quarterback since Tim Tebow's college finale -- to pace the attack.

The Commodore defense held Florida (8-2, 5-2 SEC) to just 14 points prior to halftime, getting off the field by forcing a missed field and connecting two interceptions by safety Tae Daley.

But the Gators responded with a 28-point third quarter to seal the victory. They ended up outgaining Vanderbilt 560-128 and winning their sixth straight in the series.

Vanderbilt Junior Deuce Wallace made his first career start for Vandy but was far from effective. He completed 7 of 18 passes for 60 yards and was sacked six times before giving way to freshman Allan Walters. They were on the field because Mo Hasan and Riley Neal were out with injuries.
