CATS AIM TO REACH BOWL ELIGIBILITY FOR FOURTH STRAIGHT YEAR

Kentucky returns home for the final two weeks of the regular season needing just one victory to become bowl eligible for the fourth consecutive season. The first opportunity comes in the form of UT Martin on Saturday afternoon. The game is set for a 3:30 p.m. ET kickoff and will air on the SEC Network.

The Cats are riding a wave of momentum after grinding Vanderbilt to a pulp in a 38-14 victory in Nashville that saw the rushing attack pile up 401 yards. Moreover, UK erased a 14-3 first quarter deficit in doing so, scoring the game's final 35 points to secure its largest SEC road win since 2001.

Lynn Bowden Jr. continued his onslaught on defenses with his fourth 100-yard rushing game in five starts at quarterback, tying Mike Fanuzzi for the most by a QB in school history. His 723 rushing yards in UK's last five SEC games this season are the most by a Wildcat in the last five SEC games of a season in school history.

The UK defense also has shown stark improvement and continues to give the team a chance to win despite its inexperience on that side of the ball, particularly in the secondary. It has held five consecutive SEC opponents to 305 total yards or less, the best such stretch since 1977, and allowed just 198 total yards to Vanderbilt.

QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is 5-5 on the season and 3-5 in SEC play.
- The Cats dominated on the ground to defeat Vanderbilt 38-14 last Saturday, the largest SEC road win for the program since 2001. Junior center Drake Jackson was named SEC co-Offensive Lineman of the Week as the Cats ran up 401 rushing yards.
- Junior athlete Lynn Bowden Jr. has turned in impressive efforts since shifting over to play quarterback in the last five games. He has delivered three wins, including a virtuoso performance with 196 rushing yards and two touchdowns against Arkansas and 204 rushing yards and two scores against Missouri. Bowden earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors for both of those efforts. In the win over Vanderbilt, he directed UK to 482 yards total offense and five straight touchdown drives during the three quarters he played.
- In five starts at QB, he has recorded four 100-yard rushing games and is averaging 144.6 yards per game on the ground (723 total rushing yards). That ties him with Mike Fanuzzi for the most 100-yard rushing games by a quarterback in school history.
- Bowden, a Paul Hornung Award finalist for the nation's most versatile athlete, ranks 10th nationally and leads the SEC in all-purpose yards, averaging 142.3 yards per game.
- He ranks 10th in school history in career all-purpose yards (3,994) and fifth in most yards before his senior season.
- Bowden is the only player in FBS to lead his team in both rushing and receiving yards this season.
- His 204 rushing yards vs. Missouri were the second-most for a quarterback in UK history. Coupled with his 196 vs. Arkansas he now has two of the top three QB rushing efforts at UK.
- Bowden reached 1,000 career receiving yards in the season opener and charted his 100th career reception vs. Florida.
- Bowden needs 178 more rushing yards to reach 1,000 for the season. He would become just the ninth Wildcat in school history to do so. He needs 116 yards to reach 1,000 for his career and would become the 33rd player in school history to accomplish that feat.
- Junior punter Max Duffy has been sensational, ranking second in FBS in punting at 48.3 yards per kick. He has been named a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award for the nation's top punter after earning Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week twice this season.

- Duffy is the school's all-time leading punter at 46.2 yards per kick.
- With Duffy's punting and hustling coverage by the punt team, UK leads the nation with 45.36 net yards per punt.
- Kentucky has held five consecutive SEC opponents to 305 yards of total offense or less for the first time since 1977.
- Since 2016, UK is 12-6 in games decided by seven points or less.
- The Cats now are 15-8 over their past 23 games.
- UK has a 16-16 SEC record over the past four seasons. It is the first time since 1977-80 that the Wildcats have won at least half of their conference games over a four-year stretch (12-12).
- UK has allowed 24 points or less in 22 of its last 25 games. That is the best such stretch since October 14, 1978 to Sept. 6, 1980. UK allowed 24 points or less in 18 of 19 games in that stretch.
- UK has allowed 34 points or less in 24 straight games, the longest active streak in the nation. It is the longest for Kentucky since a 45-game streak from 1976-80.
- The Cats only allowed a total of three points in the first half of three straight SEC games (at Georgia, Missouri, Tennessee), the best mark since allowing a total of three points against three consecutive SEC opponents (Georgia, Vanderbilt, Florida) in 1988.
- UK is tied for fifth in the FBS, and second in the SEC, in fewest plays from scrimmage of at least 40 yards allowed (four).
- UK is tied for third in the FBS, and tied for first in the SEC, in fewest passing plays of at least 40 yards allowed (one).
- Kentucky is second in the FBS, and second in the SEC, in running plays of at least 20 yards (32).
- UK is tied for first in the FBS, and first in the SEC, in fewest passing touchdowns allowed (six).
- UK's rushing offense ranks second in the SEC and 16th nationally at 231.4 yards per game.
- UK is one of just 22 FBS teams to have three players with a 100-yard rushing game this year.
- Defensive end Calvin Taylor Jr. has a team-high 6.0 sacks, which ranks tied for third in the SEC. His three forced fumbles is tied for the most in the league and 10th nationally.
- This is coach Mark Stoops' seventh season in Lexington and the Wildcats have either matched or exceeded the previous season's win total in each of the past six seasons, making them the only program in FBS to accomplish that feat.
- During Stoops' tenure the Wildcats have had eight different starting quarterbacks win a game.
- Kentucky has played 11 true freshmen (Jared Casey, M.J. Devonshire, Taj Dodson, Moses Douglass, Jalen Geiger, DeMarcus Harris, K.D. McDaniel, Nik Ognenovic, Travis Tisdale, J.J. Weaver and Tra Wilkins) and 14 redshirt freshmen in at least one game this season.
- Stoops has 41 wins during his tenure, tied for the third-most in school history with Jerry Claiborne and Blanton Collier. Stoops also has 30 wins at Kroger Field, the second-most wins in the current stadium.
- Stoops' "recruit and develop" mentality culminated in 2018 with a 10-3 record, UK's best season in 41 years and only the third 10-win season in school history. UK's 5-3 SEC record also was the team's first winning league mark since 1977. The Cats finished second in the SEC Eastern Division.

LAST SATURDAY

- Kentucky dominated Vanderbilt, 38-14, in Nashville for the first road win of the season.
- The Cats erased a 14-3 first half deficit by scoring the game's final 35 points.
- The Cats completed their SEC portion of the schedule with a 3-5 record despite multiple injuries at quarterback throughout the campaign.
- It was UK's largest SEC road win since 18 years. The Cats defeated Vanderbilt 56-30 in Nashville in 2001. It is the third-largest since 1979.
- UK had a season-high 528 yards total offense, best since compiling 601 at Louisville last season.
- UK had 401 rushing yards, most since rushing for 443 at Tennessee in 2016.
- UK allowed just 198 yards, the fifth consecutive SEC game that UK has limited the opponent to 305 or fewer yards. It is the fewest offensive yards allowed since limiting Vanderbilt to 139 yards in 2014.
- Redshirt freshman running back Chris Rodriguez rushed 15 times for a career-high 129 yards and one touchdown.
- Redshirt freshman running back Kavosiey Smoke ran 15 times for a career-high 95 yards. He had 123 all-purpose yards.
- Sophomore safety Yusuf Corker snagged his first career interception in the third quarter, setting up a UK touchdown drive.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN

- UT Martin is 7-4 on the season, including a 6-2 mark in Ohio Valley Conference play.
- This will be the SkyHawks' final game of the regular season.

- The teams have one common opponent - Florida. The SkyHawks lost 45-0 in Gainesville, while UK lost 29-21 in Lexington.
- Quarterback John Bochus has thrown for 2,392 yards and 18 touchdowns against just eight interceptions this season. He also has rushed for three touchdowns.
- Running back Peyton Logan leads the team with 78.4 rushing yards per game and six scores on the ground.
- UT Martin has a pair of dangerous receivers in Terry Williams and Colton Dowell. Williams has hauled in 50 passes but may be even more of a threat in the return game where he has taken two punts back for scores and averages over 23 yards per kick return. Dowell is averaging nearly 21 yards per catch.
- Linebacker T.J. Jefferson stands just 5-foot-8 but he's a monster on the field. He has 91 total tackles, 8.5 TFL, 4.5 sacks, 11 quarterback hurries, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

SERIES VS. UT MARTIN

- Kentucky leads the all-time series 1-0, defeating UT Martin 59-14 to open the 2014 season.
- The victory opened UK coach Mark Stoops' second season at the helm.
- It remains the second-largest margin of victory during Stoops' tenure.
- UK quarterback Patrick Towles passed for 377 yards in that game, the second-highest total of the Stoops era and second-most since 2007.
- Former Wildcats Za'Darius Smith and Bud Dupree are tearing up the NFL these days but both players were on the field in blue that day. Dupree logged two sacks among his four tackles while Smith tallied five tackles.
- Former UK running back Braylor Heard rushed two times for 116 yards, scoring on both rush attempts, including a 73-yarder.

GAME PROMOTIONS

- Saturday's game captain is former Wildcat Jacob Tamme. The Danville, Kentucky native was a consensus first-team All-SEC tight end as a junior and senior. His career totals featured 133 catches for 1,417 yards, most ever by a UK tight end, along with 11 TD receptions. He helped UK to Music City Bowl wins in 2006 and '07 which culminated in an outstanding senior season with 56 catches for 619 yards and six TDs, earning fourth-team All-America honors. He also excelled in the classroom, earning First-team Academic All-America honors and winning a National Scholar-Athlete Award from the National Football Foundation. Additionally, he was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year in football. Tamme was named to the National Good Works Team for community service and received Bobby Bowden Award as FCA National Player of the Year. He went on to play nine NFL seasons with Indianapolis, Denver and Atlanta.
- Kentucky will host Youth Sports & Activities Day Saturday. Youth athletes or youth club members can purchase specially priced \$10 tickets, with family and friend tickets priced at \$20. Two youth football organizations will be chosen to play a halftime scrimmage on the field, and all other organizations in attendance will be recognized on the video board. MILESTONES TO WATCH

- Junior athlete **Lynn Bowden Jr.**, ranks 10th in school history in career all-purpose yards (3,994) and fifth in most before their senior season. He needs 86 more to tie George Adams (1981-84) at No. 9 (4,080) and 129 to jump two spots on the career all-purpose yards list to No. 8 with Sonny Collins (1972-75) with 4,123.
- Bowden is 178 yards away from reaching the 1,000-yard rushing mark for a single season. He would become just the ninth player in school history to accomplish that feat, joining former UK running back legends Benny Snell Jr., Boom Williams, Rafael Little, Artose Pinner, Moe Williams, Mark Higgs, George Adams and Sonny Collins. He would be the first UK quarterback to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season.
- Bowden is 116 yards away from becoming the 38th player to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Bowden has 723 rushing yards as a quarterback this season. He needs 49 yards to move into second place for a single-season by a quarterback and 187 to break Mike Fanuzzi's record of 909 set in 1974.
- Bowden Jr. has 114 career receptions and is the 17th Wildcat player to catch at least 100 passes in his career. He ranks 13th on the school's all-time list and needs 17 more to break into UK's top 10 list and tie Rafael Little at No. 10 with 131 (2004-07).
- Bowden became the 30th player in school history to reach 1,000 career receiving in the season opener and now has 1,303 in his career. He needs 22 more to move past James Whalen (1997-99) into 17th place on all-time UK list.
- Bowden has returned two punts for a touchdown in his career, both coming during the 2018 season. With one more return to the house he would join Dicky Lyons Sr. (1966-68) and Larry Carter (1976-79) in a tie for second on the career list with three punt return touchdowns. Derek Abney (2000-03) holds the school record with six.
- Bowden has 1,608 kickoff return yards in his career, which ranks fourth on UK's all-time list. Derek Abney holds the record with 2,315. He needs 61 more to move up to No. 3 with Kio Sanford (1,669 - 1994-97).
- Bowden is just the third player in school history to have at least 1,500 career kickoff return yards and 1,000 career receiving yards (Derek Abney and Keenan Burton).
- Head coach **Mark Stoops** has 41 career victories at Kentucky, tying him with Blanton Collier (1954-61) and Jerry Claiborne (1982-89) for third on the school's all-time list. He needs six more wins to tie Fran Curci (1973-1981) at No. 2.

- UT Martin has two players from the Commonwealth on its roster: OL Chris Jackson (Lexington) and DB Jack Lucas (Louisville).

BOW DOWN TO BOWDEN

- Junior athlete Lynn Bowden Jr. has taken his explosive playmaking and versatility to another level since shifting to quarterback full-time the past five games. He has twice been named SEC Offensive Player of the Week while delivering two of the top three rushing performance for a quarterback in school history and just the ninth-ever 200-yard rushing game by a UK player.
- Bowden is a finalist for the Paul Hornung Award for the nation's most versatile athlete.
- Bowden ranks 10th nationally and leads the SEC, averaging 142.3 all-purpose yards per game.
- In five starts at QB, he has tallied 723 rushing yards, the most by a Wildcat in the last five SEC games of a season in school history.
- In five starts at QB, he has recorded four 100-yard rushing games and is averaging 144.6 yards per game on the ground (723 total rushing yards).
- His four 100-yard rushing games as a quarterback ties Mike Fanuzzi for the UK career record.
- He is currently averaging 7.0 yards per rush, right in line with Stanley "Boom" Williams' school-record 7.1 pace. The 7.0 yards per carry ranks third nationally this season.
- In UK's rain-soaked 29-7 win over Mizzou on Oct. 26 he rushed for 204 yards and two scores. It was the top single-game rushing performance by an SEC player this season at the time.
- It is the most rushing yards for a Wildcat vs. an SEC opponent since Artose Pinner ran for 224 yards at Vanderbilt in 2002.
- It is the second-most for a UK quarterback in school history. Mike Fanuzzi ran for 208 yards vs. Miami (Ohio) in 1974.
- His 204-yard performance vs. Missouri is one of just four 200-yard rushing games by an SEC player this season.

Because of his dominant performance, he earned SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week, his second Paul Hornung Award Weekly Honor Roll honor and the Manning Award National Quarterback of the Week ... He is the first UK QB with two rushing and one passing touchdowns in a game since Patrick Towles vs. Mississippi State in 2014.
- Against Vanderbilt he both rushed and passed for over 100 yards.
- FBS players since 2000 to have at least 20 rushing attempts, 10 passing attempts, and a punt return in the same game: Antwaan Randle El (Indiana), Julian Edelman (Kent State), Bowden.
- Bowden is a First-Team Midseason All-America selection as an all-purpose player by ESPN and the Associated Press.

PASCHAL NAMED NOMINEE FOR MAYO CLINIC COMEBACK PLAYER OF THE YEAR AND CAPITAL ONE ORANGE BOWL-FWAA COURAGE AWARD

- Joshua Paschal, a sophomore outside linebacker, has made an inspiring return to the football field after overcoming a malignant melanoma that appeared on the bottom of his right foot just before training camp was to open in July of 2018. He underwent three surgeries and monthly immunotherapy treatments for more than a year before being cleared in August. His final treatment was Aug. 7, 2019. He's now a nominee for both the Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Award and the Capital One Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award.
- He battled back to return on a limited basis for the final three games of the 2018 season and has made an immediate impact this season. Paschal, who was voted a team captain by his peers, has started in all 10 games for the Wildcats this season. He has totaled 29 tackles, 6.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, a pass breakup, a forced fumble and his second career blocked punt in his return. Kentucky football players Blake Best and Mason Wolfe have been named to the 2019 Academic All-District® Football Team, selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), it was announced Thursday. The award recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom.

BEST, WOLFE NAMED TO COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

- Blake Best and Mason Wolfe have been named to the 2019 Academic All-District® Football Team, selected by CoSIDA. The award recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom.
- Best and Wolfe were named First-Team Academic All-District® honorees and now advance to the CoSIDA Academic All-America® ballot. First- and second-team (if applicable) Academic All-America® honorees will be announced in early December.
- Best, a senior from Duluth, Georgia, serves as UK's starting long snapper for the fourth straight season. He is perfect on all snaps and holds in his Wildcat career and has carried that perfect mark in the classroom. Best graduated summa cum laude in December of 2018 with a double major in economics and finance with a perfect 4.0 grade point average. He is currently working on a master's degree in finance. Best was a second-team Academic All-American last season and is a seven-time member of the Dean's List. He also is a three-time member of the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll.
- Wolfe, a native of Henderson, Kentucky, is a senior offensive guard. He has seen action in 34 career games, including all 10 this season. He graduated with a 3.623 GPA in May of 2019 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a minor in criminology. He is currently working on a master's degree in sport leadership. Wolfe is a three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll and was named to the First-Year SEC Honor Roll as a freshman in 2015. He also is a two-time member of the Dean's List.

BOWDEN, DUFFY NAMED MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICANS; DUFFY NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR RAY GUY AWARD

- Kentucky juniors Lynn Bowden Jr. and Max Duffy were named midseason All-Americans by The Associated Press and ESPN. On the AP team, Bowden was named to the first team as an all-purpose player, while Duffy earned second-team honors as a punter.
- Duffy was also named a midseason All-American by Sporting News and recently was named one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award for the nation's top punter.

YOUNG NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA NATIONAL GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Junior offensive tackle has been selected to the 2019 Allstate AFCA (American Football Coaches Association) Good Works Team®, an annual award given to college football players for the impact they make off the field. His one of just 11 players from the FBS named to the team.
- His numerous community service projects include volunteering at a local nursing home, speaking to youth organizations, volunteering at Habitat for Humanity and traveling to Ethiopia for a one-week service trip to help the people of Addis Ababa and Korah.



OFFENSE

- “Balance” has been the hallmark of the Kentucky offense under Eddie Gran, UK assistant head coach for offense. The Wildcats have totaled more than 2,000 rushing yards and 2,000 passing yards in all three seasons that Gran has been here. Prior to Gran’s arrival, this had been accomplished in only two seasons total in school history.
- The Cats have averaged at least 25.5 points per game in all three seasons, only the third time in school history UK averaged at least 25.5 in three straight years.
- In the Gran era, UK has rushed for 7,738 yards, best three-year total since the 1970s, when Kentucky ran the ball almost exclusively.
- UK has had a 1,000-yard rusher in three straight seasons (Boom Williams, Benny Snell Jr.); prior to this, UK had never had 1,000-yard rushers in back-to-back seasons, let alone three straight seasons.
- Despite having starting quarterbacks who had never played in a major-college game in 2016 (Stephen Johnson) and 2018 (Terry Wilson), UK won 24 games over three seasons and went to three straight bowl games.
- The Cats have had eight different starting quarterbacks win a game during coach Mark Stoops’ tenure.
- Two wide receivers (Garrett Johnson and Dorian Baker) and one tight end (C.J. Conrad) became 1,000-yard career receivers during the last three seasons.
- UK has won 24 games in three seasons (2016-18), the most in school history since 1949-51.

Quarterbacks

- Junior Terry Wilson won the starting job at the start of the 2018 season and led the Wildcats to their first 10-win season since 1977. The 10 wins were the most for a first-year starting QB in school history.
- Wilson played in two games in 2019 before suffering a season-ending torn patellar tendon in his left knee in the third quarter vs. Eastern Michigan.
- Troy transfer Sawyer Smith stepped in for Wilson at the start of the fourth quarter vs. Eastern Michigan and completed 5 of 9 passes for 76 and two touchdowns. In his first career start vs. Florida, Smith went 23-of-35 for 267 yards and two touchdowns.
- Smith played in all 13 games last season for Troy, starting the final seven games for coach Neal Brown, a former Kentucky wide receiver and offensive coordinator. Smith went 5-2 as the starter, completing 144-of-229 passes for 1,669 yards and 14 touchdowns. He also rushed for 191 yards and a score. The 6-foot-3, 219-pounder graduated from Troy in July 2019 with a degree in social science and is working on a master’s degree in sport leadership at UK.
- After Smith sat out with injuries suffered in the South Carolina game, junior wide receiver Lynn Bowden Jr., who played quarterback in high school, made his first career start at QB against Arkansas on Oct. 12. He has remained in that role and has led UK to a 3-2 record as the starter. All five games have come against SEC opponents.
- Sophomores and Kentucky natives Walker Wood (Lexington) and Kolbe Langhi (Hopkinsville) back up Smith, along with freshman signal caller Amani Gilmore (Amite, La.).
- True freshman Nik Scalzo (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) is also out for the season after suffering a torn ACL in preseason camp.

Running Backs

- The biggest question mark entering the 2019 season was who would succeed UK’s all-time leading rusher and All-American Benny Snell Jr.? Before foregoing his senior season and declaring for the NFL Draft, Snell set just about every rushing record at UK, including becoming the first player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards or more in three straight seasons.
- Kentucky has had a three-headed monster to help answer that question in junior A.J. Rose, and redshirt freshmen Christopher Rodriguez and Kavosiey Smoke.
- Rose has earned the starting nod in all 10 games and has totaled 619 yards and four scores on 126 carries this season. He is averaging 4.9 yards per carry and 61.9 yards per game.
- Rose and Lynn Bowden Jr. each have 10 running plays of at least 20 yards this season. Kentucky is one of two FBS schools to have two players with at least 10 running plays of at least 20 yards this season (Oklahoma State).
- Smoke has proven to be a big-play threat with touchdown runs of 40 and 32 yards already this season. He’s the first back in UK history to have scoring runs of at least 32 yards in each of the first two games of a season. In 10 games, Smoke has 84 rushes for 494 yards and a team-high six TDs.
- Rodriguez had 12 carries for a career-high 81 yards vs. Tennessee and then followed it up with another career effort while piling up 129 yards and two scores on 15 carries vs. Vanderbilt. For the season, he has run for 341 yards and is averaging 6.8 yards per attempt.

PART OF THE GRAN-D DESIGN

- Since taking over the Kentucky running game upon his arrival in 2016, Eddie Gran has fashioned the Cats into one of the more physical and prolific rushing attacks not only in the SEC, but in the country.
- The Cats averaged 234.2 rushing yards per game in 2016, Gran's first in Lexington, 161.7 yards per game in 2017 and 199.4 last year. Those numbers are significant in that only twice in the previous 20 seasons had a UK offense rushed for more than 162 yards per game (2015 and 2009) and not for more than 200 per game since 1993 (210.5).
- Gran has mentored the likes of Benny Snell Jr. and Stanley "Boom" Williams at Kentucky, Chris Thompson, Devonta Freeman and James Wilder Jr. (Florida State), Montario Hardesty (Tennessee), Carnell Williams, Ronnie Brown, Kenny Irons and Rudi Johnson (Auburn) and Deuce McAllister (Ole Miss). During his 23 seasons as a running backs coach he's spent 20 of those against top-shelf competition in the SEC and Atlantic Coast Conference, making the numbers even more impressive.
- Some of the more compelling stats from Gran's 23 seasons at Ole Miss (1995-98), Auburn (1999-2008), Tennessee (2009), Florida State (2010-12), Cincinnati (2013-15) and Kentucky:
 - > 19 seasons averaging at least 150.0 rushing yards per game
 - > 12 seasons averaging at least 172.0 rushing yards per game
 - > 12 individual 1,000-yard rushers.
 - > Nine seasons with a running back who scored at least 10 rushing touchdowns
 - > Four seasons averaging at least 200.0 rushing yards per game
 - > Only once has his running attack averaged less than 100.0 yards per game
 - > Only twice has his running attack averaged less than 125.0 yards per game
- The Wildcats are on pace to add to most of those eye-opening statistics, including Lynn Bowden Jr. just 178 yards away from the 1,000-yard mark for 2019 and 116 away from the 1,000-yard career mark.

Wide Receivers

- Wide receivers coach Michael Smith is in his second season with the Wildcats and is having to rely on a plethora of young talent as three of the top four wideouts from last season are gone.
- Before moving to QB, UK's top target was Lynn Bowden Jr., with 30 catches for 348 yards and one touchdown.
- Helping fill the void of Bowden is junior Josh Ali who has 19 catches for 181 yards and two scores in 10 games.
- Former Iowa basketball player Ahmad Wagner has proven to be a difficult cover (see note below) and is third on the team in catches (14) and second in yards (245).
- Young playmakers such as sophomores Clevan Thomas Jr., (nine catches for 90 yards and a touchdown), Allen Dailey Jr., (seven catches for 75 yards) and redshirt freshman Bryce Oliver (six catches for 111 yards and one TD) are also in the mix.
- UK is currently missing the services of junior Isaiah Epps, who has been out since the summer with a foot fracture.

AHMAD FLAG-NER

- Kentucky's secret weapon on offense might just be the presence of senior Ahmad Wagner, a.k.a. "Ahmad Flag-ner" (h/t Curtis Burch). Wagner, a 6-foot-5, 238-pound receiver, is in his final year of eligibility after transferring from Iowa where he played three seasons on the basketball team.
- Wagner now has been targeted 45 times in his career, with 14 catches for 245 yards and 12 pass interference penalties drawn (one catch and PI occurred on the same play).

- Upshaw sat out last season due to a season-ending knee injury has been impressive with seven catches for 78 yards, including a touchdown catch vs. the Gators.

- Senior Drew Schlegel and redshirt freshman Brenden Bates also see action, primarily in blocking situations.

Offensive Line

- Offensive line coach John Schlarman can be described in one word - tough. The 2018 Capital One Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award nominee was diagnosed with cholangiocarcinoma in July of 2018. Despite his health issues, he has coached through countless chemotherapy treatments and has not missed a practice or a game.
- Schlarman was a four-year starter with the Wildcats from 1994-97. He is in his seventh season at UK.
- The O-line boasts three returning starters in center Drake Jackson, left guard Logan Stenberg and left tackle Landon Young who helped Benny Snell Jr., become the first player in school history with 1,000 rushing yards in three consecutive seasons.
- Young is in his second season as a starter, also the 2017 season. He sat out the entire 2018 season with a knee injury.
- The graduation of George Asafo-Adjei, selected in the seventh round of the NFL Draft by the N.Y. Giants, freed up the right tackle spot. Sophomore Darian Kinnard has handled the starting role in every game this season. Sophomore Naasir Watkins backs up both tackle positions.
- At left guard, three-year starter Logan Stenberg deciding to come back for his senior season was a big boost. He's a preseason second-team All-American by *Sporting News* and provides leadership and experience on the line. He's backed up by redshirt freshman Kenneth Horsey. An interesting note about Horsey - he had open-heart surgery in April of 2018.
- Replacing 2018 First Team All-American and All-SEC performer Bunchy Stallings at right guard is junior Luke Fortner, who started every game at that spot. Senior Mason Wolfe is the backup.
- The center spot is locked up by junior Drake Jackson who has a current streak of 30 consecutive starts under his belt and was named co-SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week for his efforts in the road win over Vanderbilt on Nov. 16. Redshirt freshman Quintin Wilson is an additional option as well.

OFFENSIVE LINE RECOGNIZED BY JOE MOORE AWARD

The Kentucky offensive line has been named a member of the midseason honor roll for the Joe Moore Award, recognizing the Most Outstanding Offensive Line Unit in college football.

Four players have rushed for more than 300 yards (A.J. Rose, Lynn Bowden Jr., Kavosiey Smoke and Christopher Rodriguez Jr.) and the team now has four consecutive seasons of more than 2,000 rushing yards. The Wildcats have done this despite missing three departed starting linemen from a year ago, the school's all-time leading rusher from last season, and this year's top three quarterbacks are all injured – two are out for the season – and the current starting QB is a converted wide receiver.

The Wildcats' running game is averaging a 231.4 yards per game, good for second in the SEC and 16th nationally.

What The Committee Is Saying: "You can tell this is a coachable bunch. They all do a very good job of working their feet into position to get blocks sealed and hand placement has clearly been drilled into them because they are good at it."




SPECIAL TEAMS

- Special teams coordinator Dean Hood brings a wealth of knowledge to the program as he is in his 32nd year of college coaching.
- Looking to replace the production of 2018 senior kicker Miles Butler, is redshirt freshman Chance Poore and junior Matt Ruffolo. Poore is 5-of-9 this season with a long of 46 and 22-of-23 extra points. Ruffolo hit his first career field goal at Mississippi State before drilling a career-long 50-yarder in the win over Arkansas.
- Australian transplant Max Duffy once again handles the punting duties. For the season, he is averaging 48.3 yards per punt, good for second in the nation. UK leads the nation with a team net of 45.36 yards. The 26-year-old arrived in the United States as an early enrollee in January of 2018. See more notes on Duffy below.
- Senior Grant McKinniss handles the kickoff duties and has 32 touchbacks so far this season.
- Senior Blake Best is the snapper for punts, field goals and PATs. He has handled FG/PATs the last three seasons and has added punt snaps this year.
- Lynn Bowden Jr. has handled punt and kickoff returns this season. He is averaging 13.2 yards on punt returns and hopes to add to his two punt return TDs from last season (at Missouri and vs. Penn State in the VRBO Citrus Bowl). He is averaging 25 yards on kickoff returns.
- Since he moved to quarterback, Zach Johnson (31.2 yards per return) has handled kickoffs and Josh Ali (7.4 yards per return) has taken care of punts.

DOMINANT DUFFY

- UK punter Max Duffy continues to be an absolute weapon for the Cats, dominating the field position game with his booming and accurate leg. The Australian punter, who is averaging a UK career record 46.2 on 102 career kicks, is a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award.
- Duffy was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week for both week five and week nine.
- In week five, he set two school records in the Sept. 28 game against South Carolina: He broke his own single-game school record (min. 8 punts), averaging 51.1 yards on nine kicks...For the game, had four punts inside the 20 with no touchbacks and his net average was 51.3 yards per punt...Created a turnover as he had one punt that hit a South Carolina player and was recovered by the Wildcats...All five punts that originated from at least the UK 27-yard line ended up inside the Gamecock 20 ... During that game he also became UK's career punting average leader.
- Against Missouri, he was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week. He punted five times for 262 yards and a 52.4 average, had a career-best 70-yard punt and pinned Mizzou inside its own 20-yard line three times. Duffy's 70-yard punt was the longest by a UK player in an SEC game since Ryan Tydlacka vs. Ole Miss in 2010 (73 yards)... Duffy also scampered 26 yards for a first down on a fake punt. It kept the drive alive that set up Kentucky's final touchdown.
- Duffy made a huge impact in Kentucky's win over Toledo ... Punted six times for a 54-yard average, the second-highest single-game average in school history (min. 5 punts) ... Became the fifth different SEC punter since 2000 to average at least 54 yards per punt in a single game (min. six punts), and the first to do so since Florida's Johnny Townsend vs. Georgia on Oct. 28, 2017 ... Every punt was at least 53 yards, other than a 46-yarder that was downed on the 3-yard line ... Toledo did not score on those possessions and UK scored 24 points on subsequent possessions.
- His punting also made a huge impact in Kentucky's win over EMU ... Punted three times, with the three punts forcing Eastern Michigan

WOODSON ELECTED TO UK ATHLETICS HOF

The University of Kentucky Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2019 consisting of DeMarcus Cousins (men's basketball), Henri Junghanel (rifle), A'dia Mathies (women's basketball), Vic Nelson (cross country/track and field), Don Weber (cross country/track and field and Andre' Woodson (football), were inducted during Hall of Fame Weekend, Sept. 13-14, in conjunction with the football home game vs. Florida.

Andre' Woodson, Football (2004-07)

Kentucky's Most Valuable Player in 2006 and '07, leading the Wildcats to a pair of eight-win seasons and victories in the Music City Bowls ... Also MVP of both bowl wins ... Led UK to six fourth-quarter/overtime come-from-behind wins as a junior and senior, including victories over No. 9 Louisville and No. 1 LSU ... Threw for 9,360 yards and 79 touchdowns in his career ... Magnificent senior season, completing 63 percent of his passes for 3,709 yards and 40 TDs ... Set NCAA record for most consecutive passes without an interception ... Set SEC record for most TD passes in a season (40) and lowest interception ratio in a career ... All totaled, set two NCAA records, four SEC records and three UK records.

to start on its own 8, 11 and 13-yard lines ... Average starting field position for EMU after Duffy's punts was inside its own 11-yard line ... EMU did not score following any of his punts, helping set up UK touchdowns on both of its subsequent possessions (a third EMU possession ended the half).

- Duffy was a First-Team Midseason All-America choice by ESPN and The Sporting News and Second-Team Midseason All-America selection by the Associated Press.

DEFENSE

- Kentucky has a new defensive coordinator in Brad White, who joined the staff in 2018 as outside linebackers coach. White was promoted after Matt House accepted the linebackers position with the Kansas City Chiefs.
- White has significant rebuilding on defense with only four starters returning from 2018.
- UK has allowed 24 points or less in 22 of its last 25 games. That is the best such stretch since October 14, 1978 to Sept. 6, 1980. UK allowed 24 points or less in 18 of 19 games in that stretch.
- UK has allowed 34 points or less in 24 straight games, the longest active streak in the nation. It is the longest for Kentucky since a 45-game streak from 1976-80.
- Kentucky ranks ninth nationally in passing yards allowed per game (174.7). They are tied for No. 1 nationally, with Clemson and Ohio State, with only six touchdown passes against in 10 games.



- The Cats only allowed a total of three points in the first half of three straight SEC games (at Georgia, Missouri, Tennessee), the best mark since allowing a total of three points against three consecutive SEC opponents (Georgia, Vanderbilt, Florida) in 1988.
- UK is tied for fifth in the FBS, and second in the SEC, in fewest plays from scrimmage of at least 40 yards allowed (four).
- UK is tied for third in the FBS, and tied for first in the SEC, in fewest passing plays of at least 40 yards allowed (one).
- Last season, UK ranked sixth nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 16.8 points per game. The defense also ranked 23rd nationally and fourth in the SEC in total defense yards per game (338.2), 18th in passing yards allowed (188.3) and 36th nationally in team passing efficiency defense (119.06 rating points).
- The 16.8 points per game in 2018 was the best since the 1979 defense allowed 13 points per contest.
- The positions where a starter from 2018 does not return are outside linebacker (Josh Allen), two cornerback spots (Derrick Baity and Lonnie Johnson Jr.), strong safety (Mike Edwards), free safety Darius West, weakside linebacker (Jordan Jones) and defensive tackle (Adrian Middleton).

Linebackers

- The biggest task on defense has been replacing outside linebacker Josh Allen, who was National Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-American last season after compiling these impressive numbers in 2018 - team-high 88 tackles, 21 TFL, 17 sacks, 7 QBH, 5 FF, 4 QBH, 2 FR and 1 blocked kick. However, junior outside linebackers Josh Paschal and Jamar "Boogie" Watson along with sophomore outside linebacker Jordan Wright are narrowing the gap.
- Watson has 8.0 tackles for loss, 3.5 quarterback sacks and a team-high seven QB hurries.
- Paschal, who played in all 13 games as a true freshman in 2017, redshirted last season due to battling melanoma in his right foot. He has 6.0 tackles for loss and his sixth in total tackles with 29.
- Senior middle linebacker Kash Daniel is the team's leading returning tackler from 2018. He had 75 tackles along with 7.5 TFL and five QBH, despite playing most of the season with a broken left hand. He's currently the team's No. 4 tackler with 41 and has added 4.0 TFL, an interception, three PBU and two QBH.
- Backing up Daniel is sophomore Chris Oats who has 37 tackles.
- Sophomore DeAndre Square has emerged as a big-play performer this season. He is currently UK's leading tackler with 61 and has 5.0 TFL, 1.5 sacks, one interception and three QBH.

Defensive Line

- Defensive line coach Derrick LeBlanc, a former defensive lineman at Northwestern State known for his toughness, is in his third season at Kentucky. His line features seven returning letter winners, including two returning starters in nose guard Quinton Bohanna and 6-foot-9 defensive end/tackle Calvin Taylor Jr. Taylor leads the down linemen with 28 tackles, including seven for loss and a team-high 6.0 sacks. He was named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week after notching two sacks in the win over Missouri.
- Bohanna has 16 tackles, two tackles for loss, including a sack.
- End T.J. Carter is having his best year as a senior with 19 tackles, including three for loss.
- Noseguard Marquan McCall (13 tackles, one TFL, one fumble recovery), end Kordell Looney (eight tackles), and tackle Abule Abad-Fitzgerald (three tackles) have provided quality depth.
- UK has missed the services of senior tackle Phil Hoskins, a fine pass rusher, who is out indefinitely because of a knee injury.

Secondary

- Coach Steve Clinkscale might have one of the hardest jobs as he has had to replace five talented defensive backs, including all four starters, from 2018. Gone are safeties Mike Edwards, now with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and Darius West as well as cornerbacks Derrick Baity, Lonnie Johnson Jr., now the Houston Texans' starting corner, and Chris Westry. The five combined for 161 career starts, 853 tackles, 77 PBUs and 24 interceptions.
- Kentucky received a big blow in late July when junior and Lexington native Davonte Robinson suffered an injury to his right quadriceps muscle that required surgery and has forced him to miss the season. The safety played in all 13 games last season with three starting assignments. He showed big-play potential last season, charting 42 tackles (sixth on the team) and, on the final play of the game at Florida, returned a fumble 30 yards for a touchdown.
- At strong safety, Jordan Griffin, who has played in 42 career games with 12 starting assignments, is the lone senior in the secondary. In nine games played this season, he has 20 tackles, 1.0 TFL/sack, and



two PBUs. He leads the team in turnovers with two, one interception and a fumble recovery. Griffin missed most of two games because of injury, with junior college transfer Quandre Mosely starting in his place. Mosely had an interception in his first start at Mississippi State.

- Sophomore Tyrell Ajian is involved in the nickel package. He has 15 tackles in eight games with his first career INT coming against No. 9 Florida.
- Sophomore free safety Yusuf Corker, who saw action in eight games last season, is the team's second-leading tackler in 2019 with 60. He also has four PBUs and one fumble recovery. He recorded a career-high 11 tackles at Georgia and made his first career interception at Vanderbilt.
- Junior college transfer Brandin Echols is the starter at one cornerback spot and has shined with 42 tackles (third on the team) and a team-high eight PBUs. True freshmen M.J. Devonshire serves as his backup.
- The other cornerback starter is sophomore Cedric Dort Jr., who is backed up by redshirt freshman Jamari Brown. Brown is second on the team in pass breakups with six.

DOUBLE DIPPING

- There are only five schools in FBS/Division I that maintain at least three straight seasons of playing in a bowl game and the basketball program earning a bid to the NCAA men's basketball tournament. Kentucky has done so in three consecutive years after making the TaxSlayer Bowl, Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl and VRBO Citrus Bowl.

A unique partnership with Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky (TMMK), the Kentucky College of Engineering and the Kentucky Children's Hospital will bring special guests to the Cat Walk presented by Chevy this season as the Kentucky football team arrives at Kroger Field.

COUCH NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HOF BALLOT

Former Kentucky quarterback Tim Couch has been named to the ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame, the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame. Couch is one of 76 players and five coaches from the Football Bowl Subdivision and 101 players and 33 coaches from the divisional ranks.

A storied name of the Kentucky program, Couch, was the team's quarterback from 1996-98. After giving up his senior season of eligibility, he was drafted as the No. 1 pick by Cleveland in the 1999 NFL Draft. In 1998, the junior quarterback was named a first-team All-American and consensus Southeastern Conference Player of the Year. Couch completed 400 of 553 passes for 4,275 yards and 36 touchdowns and led the nation in pass completions while ranked second in completion percentage, passing yardage and touchdown passes, and fourth in total offense. After guiding the Wildcats to the Outback Bowl, UK's first New Year's Day bowl appearance in 47 years, Couch finished fourth in Heisman Trophy balloting. He was also a finalist for the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award as a junior and sophomore. His breakout sophomore campaign featured 363 of 547 passes completed for 3,884 yards and 37 touchdowns while leading the nation in pass attempts, completions, yardage, and completion percentage. Also during his sophomore year, Couch earned second-team All-SEC honors and finished ninth in Heisman voting. He played in seven games as a true freshman, with two starts. Career wise, Couch completed 795 passes on 1,184 attempts for 8,435 yards and 74 touchdowns. The legend ended his career with seven NCAA records, 14 SEC records, and 26 school records.

The announcement of the 2020 Class will be made in January 2020 in the days leading up to the College Football Playoff (CFP) National Championship in New Orleans. The 2020 College Football Hall of Fame Class will officially be inducted during the 63rd NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 8, 2020, at the New York Hilton Midtown. They will also be honored at their respective schools with an NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the 2020 season.

CATS IN THE NFL DRAFT

The 2019 NFL Draft was one for the history books as Kentucky saw five of its players, Josh Allen, Lonnie Johnson Jr., Mike Edwards, Benny Snell Jr., and George Asafo-Adjei selected. UK had a player chosen in each of the first four rounds, a UK first. The only other schools to accomplish that feat in this year's draft were Alabama, Ohio State and Oklahoma.



- UK's five draft picks were the most since eight players (James Ramsey, Jim Kovach, Kelly Kirchbaum, Rod Stewart, Bob Winkel, Robert Hawkins, Dan Fowler and David Stephens) were chosen in 1979
- Josh Allen, selected as the seventh overall pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars, was the 17th player in UK history selected in the first round.
- Allen was UK's highest draft pick since Dewayne Robertson was selected as the fourth pick by the Jets in 2003.
- Allen was the 11th player in UK history chosen in the top 10 and the first since Dewayne Robertson was selected as the fourth pick by the Jets in 2003.
- Allen was the sixth player drafted under head coach Mark Stoops at Kentucky and the second first-round pick, joining Bud Dupree (Pittsburgh Steelers) in 2015.
- Since 2001, Coach Stoops has recruited and developed 12 first-round draft picks.
- Kentucky has had a linebacker drafted in five of the last six NFL drafts (2019 - Josh Allen, 2016 - Josh Forrest, 2015 - Bud Dupree, 2015 - Za'Darius Smith, 2014 - Avery Williamson).
- UK is the only school in the nation to have first-round picks in the 2019 NFL (Josh Allen, Mike Edwards, Lonnie Johnson Jr., Benny Snell Jr., George Asafo-Adjei), MLB (Zack Thompson), and NBA Draft (P.J. Washington, Tyler Herro and Keldon Johnson).

THREE WILDCATS TRAVEL TO ETHIOPIA FOR SERVICE TRIP

- In May of 2019, three Wildcats, defensive end Calvin Taylor Jr., offensive tackle Landon Young and linebacker Jamar "Boogie" Watson, were chosen by the athletic department to participate in a service/educational trip to the Ethiopia. During the week-long trip, they delivered essential nutrition, supplies, hope and love to families living in Korah, a slum made up of all the trash accumulated in Addis Ababa. With the care packages delivered, it could prevent them from digging for two weeks to a month; visited an orphanage with approximately 80 children; took teenagers from Korah to play arcade games and see the Avengers movie; paired with a feeding program that supplies meals to government schools in Cherkos, a poorer region in Addis Ababa. The program began as a result of kids fainting and lack of focus in the classroom due to malnutrition at home, often missing breakfast in the morning and at night only leaving them with one meal per day.
- UK has taken football student-athletes to Ethiopia on a service trip since 2011. Due to the state department's travel ban to Ethiopia in 2017, the Cats visited the DR.

#BRINGIT

- #BringIt is UK's mantra for the 2019 season. It originated from the VRBO Citrus Bowl win over Penn State, when the Nittany Lions unsuccessfully tried a fourth-down fake punt on the game's first possession. Coach Mark Stoops was seen on the sideline shouting, "Bring it on!" The inspirational moment helped spark the Wildcats toward the upset victory.

COACHING CHANGES

- UK defensive coordinator, Matt House, was hired to be the linebackers coach for the Kansas City Chiefs in February of 2019. That move prompted head coach Mark Stoops to promote outside linebackers coach Brad White to defensive coordinator and hire a former Wildcat, Jon Sumrall, to coach the inside linebackers.

KENTUCKY'S YOUNGSTOWN BOYS

A neighbor of Pittsburgh, a.k.a. Steel City USA, Youngstown, Ohio has a reputation as a blue collar community defined by hard work and relationships forged over generations that are stronger than steel. Kentucky's football program is, in many ways, defined by that bond as it creates a southern alumni club from Youngstown, the hometown of head coach Mark Stoops and several other key members of the program. DID YOU KNOW?

- Kentucky was the only school in the nation to have first-round picks in the 2019 NFL (Josh Allen), MLB (Zack Thompson), and NBA (PJ Washington, Tyler Herro, Keldon Johnson) drafts.
- This is the 129th season of intercollegiate football for Kentucky.
- Kentucky is in its seventh season under head coach **Mark Stoops**, who has energized the UK fan base with record-setting recruiting classes, facility upgrades and an influx in talent.
- A picture of longevity, UK Equipment Manager **Tom Kalinowski** is in his 42nd season in that role. A group of former players, staff members and current UK coaches pitched in during the summer of 2017 to surprise him with a new Ford Escape. He also was a student manager in 1974-77, giving him 46 years in UK football. He has worked more than 500 consecutive games.
- The Kentucky cheerleaders have won an unprecedented 24 national cheerleading championships, including 20 of the last 24, at the annual Universal Cheerleaders Association championships.
- UK is one of only 10 schools that have won an NCAA men's basketball championship while also having a claim on a national championship in football.
- UK is one of only seven universities in the U.S. that have programs in agriculture, engineering, law, medicine and pharmacy on a single campus.



KROGER FIELD

On game day, Kroger Field often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.



- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 301 games within the friendly confines of newly-named Kroger Field. UK has a 166-135-4 record (.551), 30-19 under Mark Stoops.
- UK set a new Kroger Field attendance record when 63,543 fans packed the stadium for the Nov. 3, 2018 game vs. No. 6 Georgia.
- Two of the top five crowds in Kroger Field history came in 2018.
- UK announced its first sellout since 2015 when 62,945 fans attended the Florida game on Sept. 23, 2017.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 62,382 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance in 14 of the last 16 seasons.
- The playing surface is named C.M. Newton Grounds at Kroger Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

KROGER FIELD

Commonwealth Stadium was renamed to Kroger Field in May of 2017. The agreement--which is between Kroger and JMI Sports, UK's multimedia rights partner--begins at approximately \$1.85 million annually with a term of up to 12 years. With the partnership, Kroger becomes the Official Fuel Partner of the University of Kentucky and the Official Grocery Partner of Move-In at UK while also providing additional engagement opportunities with UK students. Per the agreement, Kroger is also the Official Nutrition and Pharmacy Partner of UK Athletics.

Kroger Field was transformed into a state-of-the-art facility after a \$126-million reinvention which was completed prior to the 2015

season. The project was handled by HNTB. The outside of the stadium underwent a dramatic external facelift, receiving a modern look, but one that remained uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Kroger Field was reduced over the course of the two-year project to approximately 61,000, but the value of all remaining seats were increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses were revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and security. Players and coaches reaped the benefits of the new Kroger Field as well, as home-team facilities were built, and a multi-purpose recruiting room hosts future Wildcats on their on-campus visits.

FACTS AND FIGURES

Seating Capacity: 61,000, including the Commonwealth Suites. New bench-back seating has been installed in the South upper level of Kroger Field.

Playing Field: UK switched from natural grass to synthetic turf for the 2015 season. Other SEC schools with a turf surface are: Arkansas, Mississippi State, Missouri and Vanderbilt.

Video Boards: Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage. The interior seating bowl also has LED ribbon boards.

Sound System: Sportsound system delivers pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

GAME DAY EXPERIENCES

The "Cat Walk" on Talbott Todd Way: With the unveiling of the new \$45 million Kentucky Football Training Facility in August of 2016, the headquarters of the program moved next door to Kroger Field. That means the Cat Walk presented by Chevy will still begin outside Gate 1 two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff, but the team roeeds past Gate 1 and between Kroger Field and Nutter Field House which has been dedicated to former Wildcat Talbott Todd (1963-65). Todd, who passed away from ALS in August of 2017, was an avid supporter of the program. From Talbott Todd Way the team will walk to the locker room in the Joe Craft Kentucky Football Training Facility.

Pregame concerts: The Kentucky Football Pregame Concert Series has returned for the 2018 season. Concerts will begin on the stage outside Gate 12 immediately following the Cat Walk and last until 30 minutes prior to kickoff. The Cat Walk takes place two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff.

Coca Cola Fan Zone: Fans of all ages, but especially the younger Wildcats, will enjoy playing at the Fan Zone located in Nutter Field House. It will have inflatable games, free posters, face tattoos and more, available two hours before kickoff.

Lift Them Up: A unique partnership with Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky (TMMK), the Kentucky College of Engineering and the Kentucky Children's Hospital was launched in 2019 that brings special guests to the Cat Walk presented by Chevy this season as the Kentucky football team arrives at Kroger Field. A brand-new and specially built push cart vehicle provides a Kentucky Children's Hospital patient the chance to both accompany the Wildcats on the Cat Walk and attend a game at Kroger Field. A new patient is chosen by the Kentucky Children's Hospital each week to participate.



Terry Wilson threw two touchdown passes, Asim Rose and Kavosiey Smoke each ran for TDs and Kentucky overcame Toledo to pull away 38-24 in the season opener for both schools.

The Wildcats rallied twice against the Rockets to enter the break tied at 14 before taking control in the second half. A third-quarter fumble recovery led to Chance Poore's 46-yard, go-ahead field goal before Bryce Oliver's leaping grab of Wilson's 32-yard TD pass provided a 10-point lead.

Smoke's 40-yard TD run down the left side midway through the fourth made it 31-17. Kentucky then converted DeAndre Square's interception into Wilson's 2-yard TD pass to Josh Ali to clinch the first meeting between the schools.

Wilson completed 19 of 26 passes for 246 yards. Justin Rigg recovered Chris Rodriguez's goal-line fumble in the end zone for Kentucky's first TD and A.J. Rose (16 carries, 64 yards) ran for an 11-yard score. Smoke had 78 yards rushing on seven carries as the Wildcats outgained Toledo 422-347.

Toledo led twice on first-half TD runs of 5 yards by former Kentucky running back Bryant Koback and 21 by quarterback Mitchell Guadagni.

Guadagni left the game in third after his helmet was knocked off after being tackled by Chris Oats, who was ejected for targeting. Replacement Carter Bradley ran for a 7-yard TD with 1:02 remaining.



Backup quarterback Sawyer Smith threw two touchdown passes in relief of injured Terry Wilson, who rushed for a TD before hurting his left leg, and Kentucky rolled past Eastern Michigan 38-17 in Kroger Field.

Wilson's 2-yard TD run in the third quarter put the Wildcats up 24-3 before he was carted off later with the injury following a horse-collar tackle by EMU defensive lineman Turan Rush, who was flagged on a play with offsetting penalties. Wilson exited to cheers after teammates offered supportive handshakes.

Smith, a junior transfer from Troy, came in and hit Ahmad Wagner for a 54-yard touchdown and Lynn Bowden for the final 2-yard TD with 54 seconds remaining. Asim Rose and Kavosiey Smoke rushed for TDs of 8 and 32 yards, respectively, in a game the Wildcats led throughout.

Kentucky outgained the Eagles (1-1) 461-386, including a 239-49 rushing edge. But the Wildcats committed seven penalties for 84 yards, several of which snuffed first-half chances to put the game out of reach.



In his first start at quarterback for Kentucky, Sawyer Smith passed for 251 yards and two touchdowns, but the Cats suffered their first loss of the season, falling to No. 8 Florida 29-21 at Kroger Field.

The game was evenly played throughout before the Gators put it away late. Florida had 438 yards of total offense, while Kentucky had 407. The Cats had 27 first downs, compared to just 21 for the Gators.

The Gators got on the board first, when Feleipe Franks connected with Freddie Swain on a 15-yard touchdown pass, giving them a 7-0 lead with 6:27 left in the first quarter.

Early in the second, UK evened the score when Smith connected with Ahmad Wagner on a spectacular, acrobatic 26-yard TD score.

On UF's next possession, Franks was sacked by Kordell Looney, who forced a fumble that was recovered by UK's Taj Dodson at the UK 46 yard line. From there, the Cats drove and eventually took the lead on a one-yard TD run by Smith with 7:46 left in the first half.

Florida's next drive appeared to be one that would tie the game. However, the Gators' march stalled inside Kentucky territory, and McPherson's 27-yard field goal attempt missed to the right, keeping the score 14-7. That would be the score at halftime.

On the first drive of the second half, Kentucky appeared ready to stretch its lead until Smith was intercepted by Shawn Davis, who returned the pick to the Kentucky 21-yard line. The Gators got to the UK 12-yard line before a penalty backed them up. Eventually, McPherson convert, a 32-yard field goal attempt, cutting Kentucky's lead to 14-10. U K had the answer, marching 75 yards in just six plays, culminating with a 13-yard touchdown pass from Smith to Keaton Upshaw, the first of Upshaw's career. Poore's PAT gave the Cats a 21-10 lead with 5:39 to play in the third quarter. The key play in the drive was an athletic catch by Wagner for 21 yards, which was compounded by a 15-yard penalty on the Gators.

Florida, with backup Kyle Trask playing QB in place of the injured Franks, proceeded to march 62 yards in six plays, and cut into Kentucky's lead when Lamical Perine scored on an eight-yard run. Florida's two-point conversion try was no good, and the Gators trailed 21-16 with 12:41 to play.

After a Smith interception, Florida would re-take the lead with a four-play, 66-yard scoring drive, capped by Trask's four-yard touchdown run. The two-point try failed again, and the Gators led 22-21 with 4:11 to play.

That set the stage for Kentucky's final drive, when the Cats drove deep into Florida territory with less than a minute to play. With 58 seconds left in the game, Poore tried a 35-yard field goal, but missed right.

On Florida's next possession, as the Gators were running out the clock, Josh Hammond broke free and scampered 76 yards for a touchdown to put the game away.



Lynn Bowden Jr. caught seven passes for 129 yards, and A.J. Rose carried nine times for 105 yards, but Kentucky lost at Mississippi State 28-13 on Saturday at Davis Wade Stadium.

Quarterback Sawyer Smith connected on 15 of 41 passing for 232 yards, but no touchdowns. Josh Ali caught a career-high five passes for 61 yards in the game.

Kentucky got the ball to begin the game and after Rose earned a first down on the ground, Smith was intercepted by Willie Gay, who returned the pick 52 yards for a touchdown. Jace Christmann added the PAT and the Bulldogs grabbed a 7-0 lead just 1:25 into the game.

After the teams exchanged punts, Kentucky mounted its first big drive of the game. The Cats went 10 plays, covering 58 yards, and UK got on the board when Chance Poore nailed a 40-yard field goal, cutting the MSU lead to 7-3 with 2:49 remaining in the first quarter. That would be the score after the first 15 minutes of play.

MSU had the answer, marching 75 yards in nine plays, capped by a Kylin Hill nine-yard touchdown rush early in the second quarter. The PAT was good, and the Bulldogs led 14-3 with 13:24 left in the first half.

After another Kentucky punt, MSU drove 80 yards in 10 plays and Hill scored again, this time from two yards out. Christmann's extra point made it 21-3 with 4:45 left in the first half.

Late in the first half, MSU appeared to be ready to add to the lead, but Quandre Moseley intercepted the first pass of his UK career and returned it 39 yards to the MSU 49 yard line with 48 seconds left in the half. But the Cats settled for a 47-yard field goal try that Poore missed to the left, and the teams went to the locker room with the Bulldogs leading 21-3.

Mississippi State took the second half kickoff and immediately drove into Kentucky territory. But Brandin Echols, who led Kentucky with 10 tackles on the day, forced a fumble, which was recovered by UK's Jamari Brown at the UK 20. The Cats took advantage of the turnover, going 80 yards in 11 plays, finishing with a Kavosiey Smoke two-yard touchdown rush. Poore's PAT made it 21-10 MSU with 5:30 left in the third quarter.

After MSU was forced to punt, Kentucky mounted another drive, getting deep inside Bulldog territory early in the fourth quarter. But the Cats could not punch it in, and Poore missed a 26-yard field goal with 12:15 to play.

Kentucky's final points of the game came later in the fourth quarter when Matt Ruffolo attempted, and made, his first career field goal. The 29-yarder cut the MSU lead to 21-13, but the Bulldogs added a late touchdown to provide the final margin of victory.

Christopher Rodriguez Jr. rushed for a career-high 65 yards and his first career touchdown, but Kentucky lost at South Carolina 24-7 at Williams-Brice Stadium.

Kentucky had its struggles on offense all night. Other than Rodriguez, one of the bright spots was Lynn Bowden Jr. who was seemingly all over the field. Bowden had six carries for 44 yards, caught three passes for 18 yards, completed both of his passes for seven yards and returned three kickoffs for 84 yards in the game.

On defense, Jamar Watson led the way with a pair of sacks, while Yusuf Corker had nine tackles and Chris Oats had eight.

South Carolina took the opening kickoff and marched 75 yards in 11 plays, culminating with a Tavien Feaster two-yard touchdown rush. Parker White added the point after and the Gamecocks grabbed a 7-0 lead with 11:09 remaining in the first period.

Kentucky got a first down on its first possession before Sawyer Smith was intercepted near midfield. But the Cats' defense held, forcing a punt. Kentucky punted on its next possession, but the Cats got a break when the punt hit a South Carolina player and was recovered by Brett Slusher at the Gamecock 39. However, the Cats could not convert, giving the ball back to South Carolina.

The teams would then exchange punts near the end of the first quarter, which would end with South Carolina leading 7-0.

Early in the second quarter, South Carolina drove deep into Kentucky territory, but the UK defense stood tall again, forcing a 26-yard field goal that White converted, giving the Gamecocks a 10-0 lead with 11:43 left in the first half. Neither team would score for the rest of the half, and South Carolina took a 10-point lead into the break.

Kentucky received the second-half kickoff, but the Cats turned the ball over, and South Carolina struck immediately, with a 30-yard touchdown rush from Rico Dowdle. The PAT gave the Gamecocks a 17-0 lead with 13:59 left in the third quarter. The Gamecocks added a fourth-quarter touchdown to lead 24-0 before Rodriguez's late touchdown got the Cats on the board.



Lynn Bowden Jr. accounted for three touchdowns in his first start at quarterback, including the go-ahead 24-yard scoring run with 6:53 remaining, to rally Kentucky past Arkansas 24-20 to end a three-game losing streak.

Emotions ran high for the entirety of Jared Lorenzen Day at Kroger Field. Lorenzen's family and teammates were on the field for a pregame ceremony and Wilson led the crowd in 22 seconds of noise in lieu of a moment of silence. The evening ended just as Lorenzen would have wanted: with a dramatic 24-20 win over Arkansas in comeback fashion on the strength of a total team effort.

The Wildcats' top receiver took first-team snaps during the bye while banged-up Sawyer Smith recovered and was announced as the starter before the game. Trailing 13-0, the junior led Kentucky back from a sluggish offensive start with a 3-yard run late in the first half before eventually seizing the lead with a 10-yard TD pass to Clevan Thomas late in the third.

Bowden then directed a 75-yard drive ending with his second TD run and sealed the close victory with a 51-yard run in the final minutes. He finished with a career-best 196 yards rushing on 24 carries and completed 7 of 11 passes for 78 yards.

A.J. Rose added 90 yards rushing on 16 carries as the Wildcats outrushed the Razorbacks (2-4, 0-3) 330-183 and outgained them 418-305 overall.

Rakeem Boyd rushed for 134 yards and two touchdowns, including a 74-yard TD run on the game's second play, as Arkansas took a 13-0 lead. His 2-yard TD put the Razorbacks ahead 20-17 but they ended up losing their 14th consecutive SEC game and third close contest in a row.

"Well, really proud that we got win for in Jared's memory and for his family," Stoops said. "And proud of our team by the way they played and hopefully they kept him in the back of their mind because that's how Jared played. He really laid it on the line for his team each and every week and I was proud of our group tonight in his memory."

Playing in a downpour that created a slick playing surface, Kentucky fell to No. 10 Georgia 21-0 at Sanford Stadium.

Lynn Bowden Jr. rushed for 99 yards in the slippery conditions, while Asim Rose rushed for 37 yards. Bowden, playing quarterback once again in place of the injured Sawyer Smith, completed just two passes in the game for 15 yards through the air.

The Kentucky defense more than held its own against the powerful Georgia offense. The Bulldogs had just 270 yards of total offense in the game, including just 35 yards passing. Yusuf Corker led the Cats with 11 tackles, while DeAndre Square had nine and Chris Oats, playing for the injured Kash Daniel, had seven stops.

Kentucky was shut out for the first time since Nov. 12, 2012, a stretch of 83 games in which the Cats had scored.

The teams were unable to mount much offense in the first quarter. Each team had three possessions in the period, with each possession ending with a punt.

After each team punted to start the second quarter, Georgia had possession and elected to go for it on fourth down and one from the 50 yard line. But the Kentucky defense stood tall, forcing a turnover on downs and giving the Cats the ball in good field position. But Kentucky was unable to convert, and the Cats punted once again.

The teams would go scoreless in the first half, with neither team seriously threatening to score. Georgia had six first downs in the first half to Kentucky's two. The Bulldogs out-gained the Cats 123-52 in total yards in the first half, with all of Kentucky's yards coming on the ground.

Kentucky took the second half kickoff and immediately marched into Georgia territory, largely on the legs of Bowden. The Cats got inside the Georgia 30, but were stifled by a key holding penalty on a third down and were forced to punt.

After the teams exchanged punts again, Georgia broke the scoring drought with a 39-yard rushing touchdown from D'Andre Swift. Rodrigo Blankenship added the PAT to give the Bulldogs a 7-0 lead with 6:20 remaining in the third quarter.

On its next possession, facing a third down and four, Bowden fumbled and Georgia took over at the Kentucky 31. And once again, the Bulldogs took advantage, as Brien Herrien scored on an eight-yard run. Blankenship's PAT was good, and Georgia led 14-0 with 1:54 left in the third period.

On the ensuing kickoff, Kentucky got a 58-yard kickoff return from Zach Johnson, giving the Cats the ball at the Georgia 40. The Cats would drive into the Georgia red zone as the third quarter came to a close. But as the final stanza began, Kentucky was not able to convert on fourth and goal from the eight yard line as Bowden's pass intended for Josh Ali was incomplete.

UGA added another Swift touchdown later in the fourth quarter to close the scoring.

Lynn Bowden Jr. is hard to stop on a dry turf. He proved to be even harder to slow down in a steady downpour.

The Kentucky junior converted quarterback rushed for 204 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Wildcats to a 29-7 win over Missouri.

The two teams combined for seven fumbles and four lost mics in a steady rain that didn't seem to bother Bowden. Going into the second bye week of the season, the Wildcats moved within two wins of bowl eligibility with four games remaining. Kentucky has won five straight over the Tigers.

Making his third consecutive start in the absence of injured starter Sawyer Smith, Bowden was nearly unstoppable. Sparked by Bowden, the Wildcats rushed for 297 yards. Bowden has rushed for 499 yards and four touchdowns since taking over as the team's starting quarterback.

Bowden threw a career-best 44-yard strike to Bryce Oliver that led to a 1-yard touchdown run by Kavosiey Smoke, giving the Wildcats a 6-0 lead. Bowden also contributed to the drive with an 18-yard run.

Smith replaced Bowden for three plays in the second quarter, but returned and rushed for a first down on a fourth-down play that led to a 20-yard score by A.J. Rose. On the next series, Bowden ripped off a 46-yard run that led to a 43-yard field goal by Chance Poore for a 15-0 lead.

A Missouri fumble resulted in a 10-yard touchdown run by Bowden with 10 seconds remaining in the first half, giving the Wildcats a 22-0 advantage at the break.

Clemson transfer Kelly Bryant threw for 130 yards, including a 74-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Badie to open the second half for Missouri (5-3, 2-2). Backup quarterback Taylor Powell replaced Bryant in the third quarter and threw for 34 yards.

TENNESSEE 17, KENTUCKY 13

NOV. 9, 2019 • LEXINGTON, KY.
KROGER FIELD (56,760)



Lynn Bowden Jr. rushed for 114 yards, but the Kentucky quarterback was stopped on a fourth-and-goal inside the final two minutes of the game as Kentucky fell to Tennessee 17-13 at Kroger Field.

Christopher Rodriguez Jr. had a career-high 81 yards rushing, as the Cats ran for 302 yards in the game. But the Cats could not get much done through the air, as Bowden completed just four passes for 25 yards. Conversely, Tennessee had 213 yards passing and just 83 yards on the ground.

Kentucky took the opening kickoff and marched down the field on the legs of Bowden and Asim Rose. The Cats used 17 plays to cover 75 yards, eventually punching it in on a two-yard rush from Rose to break the ice. Chance Poore's extra point was good, and the Cats grabbed a 7-0 lead with 4:42 left in the first quarter. On the drive, Bowden carried seven times for 42 yards, while Rose rushed six times for 12 yards. The drive took 10:18, which was the longest drive for UK all season.

UT's first possession was a three-and-out, then on fourth down, UT punter Paxton Brooks dropped the snap and eventually had his punt blocked by UK's Josh Paschal. Kentucky's Drew Schlegel recovered, and the Cats were again in business.

UK took over on the Tennessee 24, and needed only two plays to score again. This time, it was Kavosiey Smoke rushing it in from 22 yards out to extend the lead. Poore's PAT was blocked and the Cats held a 13-0 advantage with 2:28 left in the first period.

Tennessee got on the board in the second quarter after an 11-play, 71-yard drive, culminating with a 26-yard field goal from Brent Cimaglia, cutting the UK lead to 13-3 with 9:19 left in the first half. Neither team would score for the remainder of the half and the Cats would take a 13-3 lead into the break.

In the second half, Tennessee took the opening kickoff and, as Kentucky did in the first half, marched 75 yards for a touchdown. For the Vols, it was backup quarterback Jarrett Guarantano connecting with Marquez Calloway on a 17-yard touchdown pass with 12:03 left in the third quarter. Cimaglia's PAT was good and Kentucky's lead was cut to 13-10.

After UK was forced to punt on its next possession, the Vols put together another scoring drive, this one covering 68 yards in seven plays and ending with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Guarantano to Josh Palmer. Cimaglia's point after was good, and the Vols led 17-13 with 6:28 to play in the third quarter. That would be the score after three periods.

Midway through the fourth quarter, Tennessee had possession near midfield when Kentucky's Marquan McCall recovered a Tennessee fumble at the UT 45. From there, the Cats drove inside the UT 10, eventually getting to the UT one yard line. But on third down, Rodriguez rushed for a one-yard loss. Then on fourth down, Bowden ran around right end but was held out of the end zone, and UT took over at the two yard line with 1:17 left. From there, the Vols would run out the clock.

Kentucky rushed for a season-high 401 yards and kept its bowl hopes alive with a 38-14 win over Vanderbilt.

Lynn Bowden Jr. and Christopher Rodriguez Jr. both rushed for over 100 yards for the Wildcats.

Rodriguez led the way, rushing for 129 yards and two touchdowns against the Commodores. Bowden, in his fifth game at quarterback since moving over from wide receiver, added 110 yards rushing and one TD.

Kavosiey Smoke rushed for 95 yards and one TD for the Wildcats in a matchup.

The Wildcats scored 35 consecutive points after falling behind by 11 points early in the game.

It was the largest margin of victory in the series since 2001.

Kentucky rambled for 529 yards in total offense and nearly doubled Vanderbilt in time of possession.

UK scored two touchdowns in 45 seconds to take a 14-3 lead in the first quarter.

Ke'Shawn Vaughn scored on a 5-yard run with 5:21 left in the first quarter and two plays from scrimmage later cornerback Allan George raced to the end zone on a 67-yard fumble return to extend the Commodores' early lead.

No. 1, Mark Stoops, Kentucky

Kentucky might have gone bowling last year [2017], but absolutely no one outside of the biggest blue die-hards could've seen what was coming ... Stoops put together a masterpiece. Ten wins, a victory over Florida for the first time since 1986, a 46-point blowout over Louisville, and a Citrus Bowl win over Penn State – it was a special coaching job.

So wrote Pete Fiutak of CollegeFootballNews.com, who put Mark Stoops atop his list of the nation's best coaching performances of the 2018 season.

Early on, one could sense that the '18 campaign could be special when Stoops' troops won at Florida -- the Wildcats' first victory over the Gators in 32 years -- resulting in UK being named the National Team of the Week by the Football Writers Association of America.

Kentucky went on to win five Southeastern Conference games, including a 28-7 win over No. 14-ranked Mississippi State and a miraculous comeback at Missouri, as Stoops posted UK's first winning SEC record in 41 years.

The regular season concluded with a 56-10 win at in-state rival Louisville, the largest margin of victory in the history of the Governor's Cup series.

A season that featured five victories considered upsets by the experts was fittingly finished with the finale -- a 27-24 triumph over favored, No. 12-ranked Penn State in the VRBO Citrus Bowl.

All totaled, the 10-3 record was Kentucky's best season since 1977 and only the third 10-win season in school history. UK was No. 11 in the final USA Today coaches' poll and No. 12 in the final Associated Press tabulation, the school's first appearance in the final rankings since 1984.

Stoops was well-recognized for Kentucky's breakthrough season. In addition to the No. 1 listing from CollegeFootballNews.com, he was named SEC Coach of the Year by the league coaches, Athlon Sports and The Associated Press. His name also appeared on watch lists for National Coach of the Year honors.

Stoops' individual accolades also extended to his players. Linebacker Josh Allen earned three National Defensive Player of the Year Awards and was a unanimous first-team All-American.



STOOPS AND CO. MAKING A HIT IN RECRUITING

In six seasons at the helm of the Kentucky football program, head coach Mark Stoops and his staff have been making noise on the recruiting trail. Kentucky's seven classes under Stoops have ranked in the top 50 by all four major recruiting services. Below is a look at UK's recruiting success under Stoops and Co.

Offensive guard Bunchy Stallings also was a first-team All-American and running back Benny Snell earned second-team All-American while becoming UK's all-time leading rusher.

The 2018 season continued a remarkable trend – since Stoops took over as coach of the Cats in 2013, UK is the only school in the nation that has tied or improved its win total in each of the last six seasons.

That steady progression has culminated in multiple achievements:

- From 2016-18, UK won at least seven games and finished at least .500 in the Southeastern Conference each season. It's the first time UK won seven games and finished at least .500 in the league in three consecutive seasons since 1949-51.

- The Wildcats placed second in the SEC Eastern Division in 2016 and 2018, the team's best finishes since the league split into divisions in 1992.

- UK's 2016-17-18 bowl appearances are only the third time in school history that the Cats have advanced to a bowl in at least three consecutive seasons.

- UK won three road games in both 2017 and '18. It's the first time UK has won

three road games in back-to-back seasons since 1949-50.

How has Stoops accomplished all of this? The coach would tell you that there's been nothing magical about the process.

True to his blue-collar roots in Youngstown, Ohio, the methodical advancement made by Stoops' teams is a reflection of the coach's rock-steady work ethic, tireless recruiting, and ability to adapt.

Stoops' ability to adjust when necessary shone its brightest at the beginning of the 2016 season. After losing the first two games of the schedule, and seeing his starting quarterback out for the season with an injury, and seeing his defense struggle in the early stages, Stoops didn't retreat. The Wildcat coach chose determination over despair and went back to work, revising the offense for a new QB while becoming more involved in helping coach the defense.

The results? The Wildcats went 7-3 in the last 10 regular-season games, topped by a win at No. 11-ranked Louisville. Stoops was named 2016 SEC Coach of the Year runner-up by Athlon Sports. That was the beginning of a turnaround which resulted in three straight bowl games and culminated in the VRBO

Citrus Bowl victory – representing UK's first New Year's Day bowl game in 20 years.

Stoops came to Kentucky from Florida State, where he was defensive coordinator from 2010-12. He inherited a unit a unit ranked 108th in the nation in total defense and turned it into one of the nation's best. In the 2012 season, the Seminoles were second in the nation in total defense, allowing 254.1 yards per game, and sixth nationally in scoring defense at 14.7 points per game. Playing well against the run and the pass, FSU was third in the country in rushing defense and led the nation in pass defense. FSU led the ACC in seven defensive categories. Stoops also coached the defensive backs under head coach Jimbo Fisher.

Eight Seminoles on defense earned 2012 All-ACC honors, including four first-team selections, highlighted by one of the nation's top defensive end duos in Bjoern Werner and Cornelius Carradine, who combined for 24 sacks and 31 tackles for loss. Werner was a finalist for the 2012 Bronko Nagurski Award as the National Defensive Player of the Year and was among the national leaders in sacks with 13. Stoops also coached cornerback Ronald Darby to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year.

The Seminoles' prowess was a continuation of the 2011 season, when Stoops' defenders led the nation in fewest yards allowed per carry (2.3), ranked fourth in the nation in total defense (275 yards per game), second in rushing defense (82.7 ypg), fourth in scoring defense (15.1 points per game), and eighth in tackles for loss (8.6 per game) and quarterback sacks (3.1 per game). FSU led the ACC in eight defensive categories.

Stoops overhauled the Florida State defense in 2010, his first season as defensive coordinator. The Seminoles gave up 19.6 points per game, third-best in the ACC and 20th nationally. FSU ranked 42nd nationally in total defense that season; in contrast, the

team was 108th nationally in total defense and 94th in scoring defense in 2009, the year before Stoops' arrival. FSU improved its overall defense by more than 80 yards per game, primarily by limiting opponents to 75 fewer rushing yards per game. The Seminoles ranked third in the nation in quarterback sacks and were 21st in tackles for loss. In the secondary, Stoops coached Xavier Rhodes to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors and National Defensive Freshman of the Year accolades.

During Stoops' three seasons, FSU went 10-4, 9-4 and 12-2, including wins over South Carolina in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl, Notre Dame in the 2011 Champs Sports Bowl and Northern Illinois in the 2013 Orange Bowl.

Stoops was defensive coordinator and DBs coach at Arizona from 2004-09, working for his brother, Mike, who was head coach of the Wildcats. During Mark's time there, Arizona's records improved steadily, going 3-8, 3-8, 6-6, 5-7, 8-5 and 8-5. The Wildcats advanced to the Las Vegas Bowl and Holiday Bowl during the last two years. Mark and Mike are also brothers of Bob Stoops, who retired in 2017 after 18 years as the Oklahoma head coach. The eldest Stoops brother, Ron Jr., is special teams coordinator at Youngstown State.

Stoops inherited an Arizona unit that was 109th in the nation in total defense and 107th in scoring defense in 2003, the year before he arrived. By the end of his term at Arizona, the Wildcats ranked in the nation's top 25 in total defense his final two sea-

sons and ranked as high as 33rd in scoring defense.

Prior to Arizona, Stoops coached the defensive backs three years at Miami (Fla.). The 2001 national champion Hurricanes led the nation in pass efficiency defense, scoring defense and turnover margin. That team also established a school record with 27 interceptions and 45 total takeaways.

Stoops' 2002 secondary led the nation in pass defense and pass efficiency defense. Despite having to replace all four starters in the defensive backfield, the 2003 team led the nation in pass defense. In his three seasons, Miami went 35-3, including the 12-0 Rose Bowl title campaign, plus appearances in the Fiesta and Orange bowls. Ten Miami defensive backs who played at least one season under Stoops were eventually selected in the National Football League draft – seven in the first round.

seasons. A highlight of his time there was a school-record 24 interceptions in the '97 season. His first full-time coaching job was in 1996 at South Florida, helping USF in the start-up of its program before the Bulls had their first kickoff in '97.

Stoops has recruited and developed numerous outstanding defensive backs, many of whom went on to National Football League careers. Among the notables are Antoine Cason and Michael Johnson at Arizona, Miami's Philip Buchanon, Kelly Jennings, Brandon Meriweather, Ed Reed, Antrel Rolle, Mike Rumph and Sean Taylor and Wyoming's Brian Lee.

Stoops was raised in Youngstown, Ohio. As did brothers Bob and Mike, Mark played in the secondary at the University of Iowa for Hall of Fame coach Hayden Fry. He participated in four bowl games as a player. Fry hired Stoops as a graduate assistant coach at Iowa in the 1990 and '91 seasons. The Hawkeyes won the 1990 Big Ten title and played in the Rose Bowl, duplicating feats Stoops also achieved as a player. Stoops went on to coach four years in high school before entering the collegiate ranks.

Mark and his wife, Chantel, have two sons, Will and Zack.
