Media Information

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Requests for single-game credentials should be made as far in advance as possible and no later than five days prior to game day online at sportssystems.com/Kentucky.

CREDENTIAL CRITERIA

The University of Kentucky's decision to issue credentials to a media outlet for the purposes of covering a UK basketball home or away event is determined by a variety of factors. They include the following:

- Amount of coverage given to Kentucky throughout

- Amount of coverage given to Kentucky throughout the season intention/ability to cover all 22 sports at Kentucky Distribution/size of publication: free, subscription, sale on newstands, website traffic, etc. Radio or TV station program format and size of audience Length of existence of the publication, amount of original copy generated, number of full-time employees of the publication and the journalistic experience of the reporter(s) Attendance at Kentucky media sessions, including Olympic sport opportunities Space availability Professionalism, which includes but is not limited to conduct at games, press conferences, practices, on social media, etc.

The University of Kentucky has the right to revoke credentials under its own discretion.

INTERVIEW POLICIES-GENERAL

All interviews with University of Kentucky basketball players or staff members must be arranged through the Communications and public relations office. Media should never contact a player or coach directly.

The Wildcat Coal Lodge, dormitories, team locker rooms and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate university personnel.

PRACTICE/PRESS CONFERENCES
Other than announced exceptions, UK basketball practices are closed to the media. UK will accept requests to attend practice. All requests must be made by 10 a.m. the day before the practice. In cases in which practices are open to the media, no cell phones are allowed in the practice facility.

Player interviews are conducted prior to practices the day before a game and will be available to all UK media in the Joe Craft Center lower-level lobby. UK will accept requests for player interviews, but they must be submitted 24 hours prior to the scheduled availability.

Coach John Calipari or an assistant coach will meet with members of the media immediately following player interviews in the lower level lobby of the Joe Craft Center.

Gameday shoot-arounds are closed to the media.

TELEPHONE PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Telephone interviews are available to the media on a call-back basis. Individual player and coach telephone numbers will not be given to members of the media.

Players are instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted directly by telephone. The communications and public relations office will arrange for telephone interviews at a time most convenient for the student-athlete.

Other special requests are handled on a case-by-case basis.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Following each game, there is a cooling-off period, during which time the players shower and dress. Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, Coach Calipari conducts his postgame press conference while a player is taken to the UK Sports Network.

Following Coach Calipari's press conference and the cooling-off period, selected UK players are brought to the media interview room.

Sestina to Miss Approximately Four Weeks with Left Wrist Fracture

Forward Nate Sestina is expected to miss approximately four weeks after fracturing his left wrist in practice on Tuesday. He had surgery Wednesday morning.

"We haven't been a full team in over a month," UK head coach John Calipari said. "Nate goes to shoot a layup, it gets blocked, he falls back, goes to stop himself (and) breaks his wrist/hand. He's out ... approximately four weeks. Now we regroup. Next man up."

Sestina, a graduate transfer from Bucknell, has played a key part in Kentucky's 5-1 start, providing valuable on-court production, leadership and experience.

The 6-foot-9, 234-pound forward is averaging 7.3 points and 7.2 rebounds, including a double-double (12 points and 11 rebounds) vs. Eastern Kentucky and a critical 3-pointer in the second half of the win over then-No. 1/1 Michigan State.

Sestina has played 30 or more minutes in four of six games, an especially important contribution with a thin front court that was magnified with the three-game game absence of forward EJ Montgomery (Eastern Kentucky, Evansville and Utah Valley games).

Last season, his first as a starter at Bucknell, Sestina averaged 15.8 points, a team-high 8.5 rebounds and 1.1 blocks. He shot 53.6% from the floor and made 41 3-pointers at a 38.0% clip. The All-Patriot Second Team selection ranked sixth in the league in scoring and second in rebounding. Sestina scored in double figures in 27 of 31 games and posted 11 double-doubles last season. He scored 20 or more points in 10 games, including his final two games that led to Patriot League All-Tournament Team honors.

Eight different Wildcats on the roster have dealth with injuries this season, severely testing the Wildcats' depth. More information on that below.

Sestina is the third graduate transfer under Calipari, joining Reid Travis from last season and Julius Mays in 2012-13. He transferred to UK to pursue a master's degree after graduating with his undergraduate degree in geography from Bucknell.

Wildcats Banged Up

Kentucky's depth has been tested by a number of injuries this season with Nate Sestina's left wrist fracture continuing a rash of misfortune. Including freshman Dontaie Allen and redshirt freshman Zan Payne, who are working their way back from previous injuries, eight different Wildcats have dealth with injuries this season.

The Wildcats have only had nine full-time basketball scholarship players available in three games thus far. Kentucky Cruises Past Lamar for Third Straight Win

Tyrese Maxey had a breakout performance in Kentucky's season opener and it took five games for the freshman guard to duplicate the outing against Michigan State. Maxey scored 21 points -- five shy of his career high -- and the Wildcats made a season-high 10 3-pointers in an 81-56 victory over Lamar on Sunday night.

The freshman guard made a career-high four 3-pointers, surpassing the three he made in the Wildcats' opening victory over Michigan State. Ashton Hagans added 15 points for Kentucky (5-1). Immanuel Quickley had 11, and Nick Richards added 10 points, 13 rebounds and a career-high seven blocks. Davion Buster led Lamar (4-2) with 19 points.

Kentucky opened and closed the first half in impressive fashion. The Wildcats raced to a 15-2 lead and closed with a 22-2 run. The scoring spree came after the Cardinals tied it at 19 with 8:52 remaining.

"We played better today," John Calipari said. "(We did) a lot of good stuff today. A lot of good stuff. Of the teams we've played, other than Michigan State, this team was as good as any of them, if not better than most of them or all of them. We played better."

Maxey sparked the decisive spree with a career-high four 3-pointers and led the Wildcats with 12 points in the half. Lamar managed just one field goal in the final eight minutes. Calipari said Maxey's treys "stretched the game out."

"Like, those baskets (were) like bang, bang, bang," Calipari said. "He knows, if it's in transition, he can take it. Like, if we throw it ahead and he's open in transition, don't drive it, just shoot that ball."

- In addition to blocking a career-high seven shots, Richards posted his third double-double of the season, becoming the fourth Kentucky player of the Calipari era to post at least three double-doubles within the team's first six games of the season (Patrick Patterson, 2009-10; Terrence Jones, 2010-11; Julius Randle, 2013-14)
- With 15 points and a season-high nine assists, Hagans is averaging 19.0 points, 7.3 assists, 5.0 rebounds and 57.1% shooting over the last three games

Time to Hone In

A fast a furious start to open the season, the game schedule will ease up over the next month-plus, giving way to an important opportunity for more time on the practice court.

After playing six games in 20 days to begin the season, including three in seven days last week, Kentucky will play six through the rest of 2019. Going all the way up until the conference opener on Jan. 4, the rest of Kentucky's nonconference schedule features just six games over the next 40 days.

What does that all mean? More practice opportunities and more time for John Calipari to really get his hands on this team. This is usually the time of the season when Calipari's teams make the biggest leap in terms of development because Calipari particularly enjoys being able to work in practice for a week, play a game, evaluate, and then return to practice for a week to continue to build.

"We have time now," Calipari said after the Lamar game. "We play next Friday, the following (Saturday). I've got practice days. I can get them in there. We can scrimmage and talk through all the things that we're trying to do on the run."

Learning will be at its peak near the end of December with the start of what Calipari likes to call "Camp Cal." During this time period, when there are no restrictions on practice hours and the Wildcats are free of any academic responsibilities, the Wildcats often practice two times a day and sometimes even three if one includes a workout session with strength and conditioning coach Robert Harris. With no responsibilities outside of practice, Calipari likes the team to be together focusing on basketball for as much of the break as possible.

In between practices, Calipari will sometimes have the players over to his house to eat and rest. In the evenings, the team will go out together to eat almost every night. The team will basically eat, sleep and drink basketball during Camp Cal.

That will begin once finals end the week of Dec. 16 and the team returns from its trip to Las Vegas and a few days at home for the holidays.

The season-ending results clearly show the improvement of Calipari's teams in December. As successful as Calipari's teams have been in the nonconference portion of their schedule every season, UK has won five regular-season Southeastern Conference titles in 10 seasons under Calipari and another six SEC Tournament championships.

BBN Showcase

Kentucky's game vs. UAB is the final of four consecutive games the Wildcats will play as a part of the BBN Showcase.

The BBN Showcase is a multi-team event. In addition to Friday's matchup, UK already defeated Utah Valley (82-74), Mount St. Mary's (82-62) and Lamar (81-56).

All four games were played in Rupp Arena.

Dynamic Hagans Stuffing the Stat Sheet

Ultimately the game of basketball is about who can score the most points, but if John Calipari was to write down some of the most important things that affect a basketball game, scoring would not be near the top of the list.

No player had a bigger impact than Ashton Hagans doing the "other" things a season ago.

The reigning Southeastern Conference Defensive Player of the Year remains UK's best on-ball defender with a team-high 10 steals. And although his steals numbers are down, it's important to note he was dealing with a lower-leg injury over the first several games of the season. That's not stopped him from finding other ways to affect the game.

Hagans is averaging 13.7 points, 5.5 assists, 4.3 rebounds, and 1.7 steals per game. He nearly had a triple-double against Mount St. Mary's with 16 points, seven assists and a career-high-tying seven rebounds, and he followed that vs. Lamar with 15 points, nine assists and a career-high three 3-pointers.

The Cartersville, Georgia, native has boasted double-figure scoring in five of six games, including a career-high 26-point performance in the win over Utah Valley. He's dished out three or more assists in all six games and has five or more in four of the last five.



CATS IN THE NBA

At the beginning of the 2019-20 season, 29 former Wildcats were on an opening-day roster, more than any other school in the country. Kentucky has enjoyed unprecedented success at putting players in the NBA under John Calipari. In the 10 seasons of the Calipari era, 38 players have been selected in the NBA Draft, more than any other school. Included in the recent run are 29 first-round picks, three No. 1 overall selections and 21 lottery selections.

Over the last three games, Hagans is averaging 19.0 points, 7.3 assists, 5.0 rebounds and 57.1% shooting.

Where he's made the biggest improvement: reading the defense, taking what he can get and getting to the free-throw line. He's drained 29 of 32 on the season, good for a 90.6% clip. He's made 23 straight. Hagans was 12 of 12 from the line against Utah Valley, becoming the first Wildcat to make at least 12 perfectly since Jodie Meeks, who was 14 of 14 at Tennessee on Jan. 13, 2009 (his UK single-game record 54-point night).

Confident Richards Playing His Best Basketball

John Calipari has said that every player is on their own timetable. For some that means breaking through after their freshman season. For other players it may mean two, three or four years of development.

Maybe no player in recent memory is a better example of that than Nick Richards.

The junior forward is enjoying the most productive stretch of his career. He is averaging 14.0 points, a team-high 8.2 rebounds and a team-best 2.5 blocks per game over the first six games of 2019-20. He's shooting a team-high 63.0% from the floor with a team-high three double-doubles.

With all due respect to the rest of Kentucky's talented roster, he's arguably been the Wildcats' most consistent performer in the early-going and perhaps its most important piece with the thin front line that's been magnified by injuries.

"So much better than a year ago," Calipari said after the Eastern Kentucky game. "Then you say, `You must really be pumping him up, saying great things.' No. He's in the greatest shape he's ever been, and he has built his own confidence. It doesn't matter what I say now."

Richards appears more confident and assertive than at any other point in his UK career.

"I've been patient," Richards said after the Lamar game. "My coaches just kept saying, 'Keep getting better, keep getting better, your time will come. Don't even worry about it.' Of course they're still going to coach me - they're going to get on me to be better — but it's a process and you just gotta be patient with it. Some people aren't really patient until they get the end result. I don't think I'm at the end result of my development as a basketball player yet."

If that's the case, the rest of the nation better beware because Richards has come a long way already.

Entering this season, Richards was averaging 4.5 points, 3.9 rebounds and 1.1 blocks over 13.4 minutes a game for his career. He is averaging 14.0 points, 8.2 rebounds, 2.5 blocks and shooting 63.0% this season in 30.3 minutes per game.

He entered the season with just one career double-double and already has three this season, becoming the fourth player of the Calipari era at Kentucky to post at least three double-doubles in the first six games of a season (Patrick Patterson, 2009-10; Terrence Jones. 2010-11: Julius Randle. 2013-14).

Among the highlights for Richards so far:

- 21 points and 10 rebounds with four blocked shots vs. Eastern Kentucky, prompting EKU head coach A.W. Hamilton to call him a "superstar" and declare UK a national title favorite if he plays every game like that
- Against Utah Valley, Richards went 8 of 11 from the floor and 5 of 5 from the free-throw line en route to another 21-point, 10-rebound game
- 19 points, six rebounds and three blocks against Mount St. Mary's
- 10 points, 13 rebounds and a career-high seven blocks vs. Lamar, the most blocked shots by a Wildcat since Karl-Anthony Towns denied seven shots on Jan. 20, 2015, vs. Vanderbilt

Immanuel Off to a Quick(ley) Start

John Calipari called Immanuel Quickley the most improved player on the 2018-19 team, but his development from last season to this one might be even more impressive.

Quickley, now in his sophomore campaign, is the only Wildcat to score in double figures in every game that he's played. Overall, he's averaging 13.2 points per game and shooting a team-best 92.0% from the free-throw line.

The 6-foot-3 guard has drained a 3-pointer in every game he's played and is affecting the game in a number of ways. He dished out a career-high five assists in a win over Eastern Kentucky and then narrowly missed on a double-double with a career-high nine boards against Evansville.

Maxey Shows Star Potential in Big Debut

Since John Calipari took over the reins of the program, 27 freshmen have been drafted into the NBA. Of those selections, 25 were taken in the opening round. Twenty-one went in the lottery. Thirteen were top-10 picks. And three have been selected No. 1 overall.

None of those players had the debut that Tyrese Maxey produced vs. the then-No. 1 team in the country, Michigan State. Even more impressive: It happened in a 1-2 matchup on the grandest of stages in Madison Square Garden in New York.

A day removed from his 19th birthday, Maxey came off the bench to ignite the Wildcats past the nation's top-ranked team at the time. He scored 26 points on 7 of 12 from the field with a trio of 3-pointers. That mark topped Terrence Jones' 25 points against East Tennessee State in 2010 for the most points by a freshman in their debut as a Wildcat.

Maxey's first points didn't come until just after the midway point of the first half, but he scored seven straight points to help Kentucky earn an 11-point halftime lead. From the 10:03 mark of the second half until a pair of Ashton Hagans' free throws with 37 seconds to play, Maxey scored or assisted on 14 straight UK points to hold off the Michigan State rally.

There was no bigger shot that night though than his final 3-pointer with a minute to play. Michigan State had cut the lead to just two and momentum seemed to be swinging to the veteran-laden Spartans. In front of two former UK stars, John Wall and Jones, as well as NBA champion Kevin Durant, and with the shot clock winding down, Maxey took 6-foot-6 Aaron Henry off the dribble and launched a shot nearly four feet behind the 3-point line. And with one swish of the net, Maxey etched his name into Kentucky record books and introduced himself to the nation.

After his second 20-point game of the season vs. Lamar -- a 21-point outing that included a career-high four 3-pointers -- Maxey is averaging a team-best 16.0 points per game. He's scored in double figures in all but one game, a nine-point outing against Eastern Kentucky.

Wildcats Ink Six in Fall Signing Period

Upon accepting the position of head coach of the Kentucky men's basketball program 10 years ago, John Calipari said one of the reasons he was chosen for the job was because he could recruit the best of the best.

It was a promise kept and a promise on which he continues to deliver. As he begins what he's calling his "second tour" at UK, he hasn't lost his touch.

Calipari and the Wildcats made an emphatic statement during the fall signing period with the additions of six highly skilled, athletic players to the program. UK signed decorated prospects Devin Askew, BJ Boston, Terrence Clarke, Cam'Ron Fletcher, Isaiah Jackson and Lance Ware to national letters of intent.

"I'm really excited about this group of young men," Calipari said. "They recruited us as much as we recruited them. They wanted this culture. They wanted to be with other good players. They didn't need crazy promises. They wanted this. In the past, when we've had groups like that, it's led to success both individually and as a team. When you're building a great team, not only do you need to be talented, you need to have high-character individuals, which we have with this group. These are great kids from good families."

All six players are consensus four- or five-star prospects and all are ranked in the top 50 by the major national recruiting services. Five of the six are on the preseason watch list for the Naismith High School Trophy (Askew was excluded because of his recent reclassification)

With the spring signing class still to go (begins April 15), UK is expected to have one of the nation's top classes yet again. In every season in the Calipari era, the Wildcats have signed a top-three recruiting class according to the Recruiting Services Consensus Index, which tallies major recruiting rankings and plugs them into a formula to calculate a consensus ranking.

Kentucky has now signed 59 top-50 recruits, 48 top-25 players and 24 top-10 players (according to Rivals) in what will now be Calipari's 12 recruiting classes at Kentucky.

UK can only comment on prospective student-athletes who have signed official paperwork to play at Kentucky.

Taking Care of Business

Kentucky's 60-31 record vs. opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 in John Calipari's tenure is impressive, but the Wildcats' ability to beat all-comers can't be overlooked. Under Calipari, UK is 250-41 vs. unranked competition, an .859 winning percentage.

Taking Advantage of Free Points

One of Kentucky's strengths this season has been its success at the free-throw line. UK is earning 26.9% of its points at the charity stripe and connecting at a 78.8% rate. Kentucky's free-throw rate is ranked eighth in the country, according to KenPom.com (through games on Nov. 24), while its make percentage is 23rd in the nation.

Five players are shooting 76.2% or better (with a minimum of 10 attempts), led by Immanuel Quickley's 92.0% (23 of 25). Ashton Hagans has made 23 in a row.

Kentucky's strong performance at the line isn't relegated to its success rate of makes, but also the frequency in which the Cats are getting to the line and the number of makes per game. Through six games, Kentucky is traveling to the line an average of 26.7 times a game. The Wildcats are making an average of 21.0 a game. The opposition is averaging 10.8 makes on an average of 15.5 trips a game.

John Calipari's best free-throw shooting team at Kentucky shot 72.6 percent in 2014-15. The 2013-14 squad averaged the most trips (28.7) and makes (19.5) per game under Calipari's tutelage. It's still very early in the season, but UK's current free-throw percentage of .788 would be the best in school history.

Forever Young

With a combined 50 starts, 27.2% of the scoring, 30.5% of the rebounding and four key players (Ashton Hagans, Immanuel Quickley, Nick Richards and EJ Montgomery) back from the 2018-19 Elite Eight team -- plus a graduate transfer in Nate Sestina -- this is one of the most experienced teams of the John Calipari era.

The key words being the Calipari era.

In comparison to the rest of the country, it's still inexperienced. According to Ken Pomeroy's experience rankings, UK is 333rd in the country out of 353 teams with an average of 1.02 years of experience (through games on Nov. 24). Only five other Power 5 teams check in with less experience in the KenPom.com rankings.

UK features nine newcomers on its roster, so the usual growing pains can be expected. Having said all that, it does rank as one of Calipari's most experienced teams at Kentucky, and that's important. Every team but one in the Calipari era has made the NCAA Tournament, but his best teams have combined young talent with a few returning pieces.

The 2009-10 squad with John Wall and DeMarcus Cousins featured veteran Patrick Patterson. The 2010-11 Final Four team had DeAndre Liggins and Josh Harrellson. The 2011-12 national championship team boasted three key returners in Terrence Jones, Doron Lamb and Darius Miller. The 2013-14 national runner-up squad featured Alex Poythress and Willie Cauley-Stein. And the 2014-15 team that nearly ran the table had both Poythress and Cauley-Stein back in addition to Andrew and Aaron Harrison and Dakari Johnson.

Cats Don't Count on the Long Ball

New rules this season that moved the 3-point line to the international basketball distance of 22 feet, 1.75 inches shouldn't be concerning for the Wildcats. For one, with this guard- and wing-oriented team, the 2019-20 team has capable shooters.

Following a slow start behind the arc, it was easy to wonder if the new line would have a bigger effect than anticipated, if this team couldn't shoot it as well as anticipated or if it was a combination of both.

After making 10 vs. Lamar, those concerns have quieted for the time being. UK is still shooting a John Calipari-era-low 29.6% from beyond the arc, but those numbers made a big leap after the Lamar win

Calipari believes the slow start isn't indicative of things to come. "Probably some of this is mental, game in the balance, are not

ready to be in that position," Calipari said after his team made just one 3-point attempt in 12 tries vs. Utah Valley. "I don't care how good you are. Maybe not ready to be in that position yet. ... "We go through this every year. I think part of it is I've got to figure out maybe there's an offense that we're running that I just say we're trying to get 3s off."

Whether the make percentage goes up or not, Kentucky has never relied on the 3-point shot under Calipari. While the trend nationally has seen teams take more 3-point shots than ever before, UK has bucked the trend and played to the style that's best suited that particular group.

The highest percentage of 3-point shots taken under Calipari was the 2010-11 Final Four team that lofted 32.4% of its shots from beyond the arc. No surprise, that team that consisted of Brandon Knight and Doron Lamb on the perimeter is also Calipari's top 3-point shooting team at Kentucky.

Calipari likes his teams to take between 20 to 24 3-point attempts per game. UK is averaging 16.3 attempts through its first six games with the longer line.

Defense is the Difference Again

Long. Athletic. Interchangeable parts. On paper, Kentucky looks like it has the tools to be an elite defensive team. Although there have been early lapses, the numbers suggest this team could live up to preseason expectations. Some pundits said this could be one of John Calipari's best defensive teams yet -- lofty praise considering the standard his previous teams have set.

Through six games, opponents are making just 35.2% from the floor, ranked 17th in the country (through games on Nov. 24). Opponents are only scoring 61.7 points per game. And unlike last season when it seemed like every opponent early in the schedule caught fire from outside, the opposition is only making 28.0% from behind the arc.

Only one opponent has managed to shoot better than 40% from the field. Utah Valley just barely broke the threshold at 40.6%. Included in that was a spectacular defensive effort vs. the then-No. 1 team in the country, Michigan State, in which UK held the Spartans to just 62 points, 39.3% shooting and 19.2% from 3.

Perhaps the truest indicator of Kentucky's early-season defensive dominance is Ken Pomeroy's adjusted defensive efficiency rankings, where the Wildcat rank fifth (through games on Nov. 24).

Sophomore Ashton Hagans, the 2019 Southeastern Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Year, is once again playing lockdown defensive, even if his steals are down.

Perhaps the biggest early season development on the defensive side of the ball is Nick Richards' continued emergence as a rim protector. The junior is averaging a career-best 2.5 blocks per game after swatting seven shots vs. Lamar, the most blocks by a Wildcat since Karl-Anthony Towns denied seven shots on Jan. 20, 2015.

Hold Them to 55 Points, 40%

Defense has always been a recipe for success for the Wildcats under John Calipari. The special ingredient: 55 points. UK is a perfect 75-0 under Calipari when holding the opponent to 55 points or fewer, including 1-0 this season. The Wildcats are 177-7 (.962) under Calipari when limiting the opponent to 63 points or less. UK is 4-0 thus far this season in the category. Kentucky's 61-59 loss to Tennessee in 2017-18 snapped a 60-game winning streak when holding the opponent to 63 or less.

Kentucky also fares well when it keeps its opponents to 40% or less from the floor. UK is 191-17 (.918) against opponents under



Calipari when its field-goal percent is 40% or less. UK is 4-1 so far this season. Evansville won despite shooting just 38.3%.

Cats Deliver the Knockout Punch

UK is 265-6 (.978) in the John Calipari era when leading by at least 10 points at any time in the contest.

When Kentucky couldn't put away Auburn in the 2019 Elite Eight after leading by as many as 11 points in the first half, it was the first time the Wildcats let a double-digit lead wind up in a loss since losing a 14-point lead to South Carolina in 2017-18. Five of the six losses are to conference opponents.

Perhaps most impressive of all is that 70.9% of games Calipari has coached in at Kentucky have produced 10-point leads at some point during the game for UK. The Wildcats have led by 10 points or more in a whopping 85.5% of Calipari's 310 career wins at Kentucky.

Bounce Back

Kentucky doesn't lose very often during the John Calipari era, but when the Wildcats do, they almost always bounce back. UK is 51-12 under Calipari following a loss (record does not count end-of-season losses).

The Wildcats have only lost back-to-back games 12 times during the Calipari era with three of those losses having come during a four-game losing streak from Feb. 3-14, 2018. That was the first four-game losing streak under Calipari.

Previously, the last time UK lost four games in a row was in February 2009, when the Wildcats dropped four straight games to end the regular season. It was the first time Calipari had lost four straight since the end of the 2004-05 season at Memphis.

UK has never lost back-to-back home games under Calipari.

Kentucky Picked to Win 49th SEC Title

Eleventh-year head coach John Calipari has often described Kentucky as the hunted within the ranks of the Southeastern Conference. With more regular-season and tournament titles than the entire league combined, it's not a far-fetched mantra. If the 2019-20 preseason media poll conducted by the league's media proves true, Kentucky will once again be the pursued.

UK was voted to win their sixth regular-season title under Calipari by the league's media members. Should Kentucky achieve the feat, it would mark the program's 49th overall regular-season title.

It's the 15th time since the 1998-99 season the Wildcats are the overall preseason favorite. Calipari has directed his teams to regular-season SEC crowns in 2010, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2017. Kentucky has claimed the SEC Tournament title six times under his direction in 2010, 2011, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018.

Each school selected media members that cover their team and additional media from across the nation were selected by the conference office to comprise the voting panel. Points were compiled on a 14-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis. Each media member also voted for two All-SEC teams.

Kentucky Trio Preseason All-SEC

In a league as talented as it's ever been, sophomores Ashton Hagans and EJ Montgomery and freshman Tyrese Maxey were tabbed preseason All-Southeastern Conference picks by both the league's media and its coaches.

Hagans was a first-team pick while Maxey and Montgomery were tabbed to the second team. Hagans also received at least one vote for the preseason pick for SEC Player of the Year from the media.

UK has featured at least one player on one of the two end-of-the-season All-SEC teams (media or coaches) since 2006-07.

Kentucky's Schedule Packs a Punch

Kentucky's schedule is always among the toughest in the country and this season will certainly be no different.

UK's nonconference slate alone has seen the Wildcats defeat Michigan State in the State Farm Champions Classic in New York and features upcoming tilts including a two-game trip

in Las Vegas with games against Utah (Dec. 18) and Ohio State (Dec. 21 as a part of the CBS Sports Classic), the annual rivalry vs. Louisville on Dec. 28 in Rupp Arena and takes the Wildcats to Texas Tech to play the Red Raiders on Jan. 25.

Seven of UK's 13 nonconference opponents this season made a postseason tournament in 2019, five of which made the NCAA Tournament. Both Michigan State (1) and Louisville (5) started the season in the top five of the Associated Press Top 25.

That nonconference schedule will give way to one of the toughest league schedules in the country. UK will play its permanent home-and-away opponents of Florida, Tennessee and Vanderbilt twice, plus host and visit both Auburn and Georgia. The SEC's 15 NCAA Tournament selections over the last two years are second most in the nation.

The nonconference and league schedule combined reveals that 15 of the 26 opponents UK will face played in the postseason in 2018-19, including 11 in the NCAA Tournament, five in the Sweet 16 and three in the Final Four.

Seven Kentucky opponents are ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 on Nov. 25, including four nonconference opponents in Louisville (2), Michigan State (3), Ohio State (10) and Texas Tech (12). At the time of the game, Michigan State was ranked No. 1.

Showcasing the league's strength, fellow SEC members Tennessee (17), Auburn (18) and Florida (24) are also ranked among the AP Top 25. Four more teams in LSU, Arkansas, Missouri and Mississippi State sit just outside the top 25 and received votes. Kentucky plays Auburn, Florida and Tennessee twice, resulting in 10 total matchups in 2019-20 against current top-25 opponents.

Jordan First Two-Sport Start Since Braddy

Even with key returners, a deep and talented recruiting class, and the addition of graduate transfer Nate Sestina, Kentucky suffered major losses from last season. Four Wildcats are playing professionally, Jonny David graduated, and Brad Calipari and Jemarl Baker Jr. transferred. Then the injuries started to pile up.

From a numbers standpoint, UK needed more depth. When John Calipari heard there was a 6-foot-9, 250-pound pitcher on the baseball team with considerable basketball talent, he called UK baseball head coach Nick Mingione.

Enter Ben Jordan.

Jordan joined the team just before the Blue-White Game and has been even more important recently because of injuries and ailments to five different players before Thanksgiving.

Jordan is the first multi-sport basketball player since Nehemiah "Junior" Braddy, who played four seasons with the basketball team (1990-93) and one with the baseball team (1991). It's worth noting that while former UK basketball player E.J. Floreal played both basketball (2014-16) and track at Kentucky, he didn't begin his track career until after leaving basketball.

Although Jordan is a highly regarded baseball prospect with a lively arm, he's also a talented basketball player. He played at West Carter High School in Olive Hill, Kentucky, where he was the all-time leading rebounder and shot blocker and the eighth all-time leading scorer.

Jordan won Eastern Kentucky Conference Defensive Player of the Year in his senior season in addition to EKC First Team honors. He averaged 12.2 rebounds a contest in his final year.

Jordan is expected to be a major part of the UK baseball team in the spring. A 2016 Under Armour All-American in high school, he appeared in 10 games last season after redshirting in 2018 with an injury. Over the summer, playing for the Gaithersburg Giants of the Cal Ripken College Baseball League, Jordan appeared in seven games with six starts. He went 1-1 with a 2.70 ERA in 26.2 innings, allowing just 14 hits while striking out 36 en route to First Team All-Cal Ripken League honors.

He has made two appearances in the first five games of the season.

S-E-C! S-E-C! S-E-C!

Kentucky has the unquestionable reputation as the league's gold standard. Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats are the most dominant team in the league, recording a 997-281 mark (.780) in regular-season conference play. Only one other team has won more than 750 regular-season SEC games (Alabama), and no other team owns a better winning percentage.

- UK has won 48 SEC titles and 31 SEC Tournament championships

And the Award Goes to ... Kentucky!

As John Calipari's team has dominated the Southeastern Conference during his tenure, so too have his players.

UK has won more weekly SEC honors (101) than any other school during the Calipari era, including 81 SEC Freshman of the Week honors and 20 SEC Player of the Week awards.

Tyrese Maxey collected the first one of the 2019-20 season on Nov. 11 after a sensational debut vs. then-No. 1/1 Michigan State in Madison Square Garden in New York.

Nation-Best 29 Wildcats on NBA Opening-Day Rosters

As the 2019-20 NBA season began, 29 players on NBA opening-day rosters (including two-way and inactive lists) played and finished their college basketball careers at Kentucky.

Underscoring the fact that no other school in the country can match UK's ability to develop players and put them in the NBA, UK's 29 players were again the most of any college basketball program, beating the next-closest school (Duke) by five players.

Of the 496 players in the NBA to start the 2019-20 season, 5.8% played and finished their college basketball careers at UK. There were actually fewer teams without a Wildcat (12) than there are NBA teams featuring Wildcats (18).

Of the 29 Wildcats on an opening-day NBA roster, John Calipari has coached 28 of them. With Derrick Rose (Detroit Pistons), who played for Calipari during the 2006-07 season at Memphis, Calipari has coached 29 players on 2019-20 opening-day rosters.

Kentucky has enjoyed unprecedented success at putting players in the NBA under Calipari. In the 10 seasons of the Calipari era, 38 players have been selected in the NBA Draft, more than any other school. Included in the recent run are 29 first-round picks, three No. 1 overall

selections (Davis, Karl-Anthony Towns and John Wall) and 21 lottery selections.

Calipari's players are not only reaching the next level, they are succeeding when they do. His players have garnered 20 All-Star selections, with Anthony Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. Rose was named MVP in 2011. Five of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (Rose, Wall, Davis, DeMarcus Cousins and Towns), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year (Rose, Tyreke Evans and Towns), and 12 players from Calipari's first nine teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

Using figures compiled by basketball-reference.com and spotrac.com, Calipari-coached players only (which includes Rose but not Rondo) have amassed more than \$2.26 billion in career NBA contracts. In the 10 seasons Calipari has been the head coach at Kentucky, his players have totaled nearly \$1.9 billion in NBA contracts.

In just the 2019-20 season alone, UK players will make more than \$255 million. Calipari-coached players only (includes Rose but not Rondo) will make more than \$260 million.

Among the most noteworthy performances of the season so far:

- PJ Washington hit seven 3-pointers on opening night en route to a rookie franchise-record 27 points in his debut. The seven 3-pointers are the most by any player in an NBA debut in the history of the league. He had 17 points at halftime, the most by a rookie at halftime in a season opener in more than 20 years
- Towns was named the Western Conference's Player of the Week following the opening week of action on Oct. 28. He averaged 32.0 points, 13.3 rebounds and 3.0 steals per game in three wins for the Timberwolves. According to NBA Stats, he is just the sixth player in NBA history to record at least 35 points and 10 rebounds in each of his first two games of the season
- On Oct. 29, Davis became the sixth different player in Lakers history with at least 40 points and 20 rebounds in a game, and the first since Shaquille O'Neal in 2003. He was believed to be the first player to record 40 points and 20 rebounds in 30 minutes or less
- Tyler Herro scored 29 points against the Hawks on Oct. 29 for a franchise record for a rookie off the bench. It's the most points for a Heat rookie since Dwyane Wade in 2004. He recorded 19 points on 5-of-6 shooting in the second quarter to become the first Heat rookie to score 19 points in a quarter since Caron Butler in 2003
- Davis earned Western Conference Player of the Week honors on Nov. 4 after logging 32.0 points, 13.0 boards and 2.7 blocks per game. It's his sixth such honor, the second most by a Wildcats, behind only Wall. It's the first time former UK players have gone back-to-back since Towns and Davis in November 2017
- In scoring 40 points on 15-of-19 shooting in Phoenix's win over the previously undefeated Philadelphia 76ers, Devin Booker notched a handful of milestones. According to the Suns, he became the eighth-youngest player in NBA history to reach 6,000 points and moved into second place in franchise history with 10 40-point games

Big-Game Cal, Cats

John Calipari's teams aren't just good against the best teams in the country, they're great. Not only does Kentucky own a 60-31 record (.659) vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams under John Calipari, UK is 7-4 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five following the win over No. 1 Michigan State.

All-time, Calipari is 13-8 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five. When both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25, Calipari's all-time record is 83-54, including a 52-27 mark at Kentucky. When both are ranked in the top 10 he has a 27-18 record, including 16-11 at UK.

Last season, Kentucky answered the bell of big-time showdowns after an early season lesson vs. Duke. UK was 7-5 vs. AP Top 25 teams, including three victories over top-10 foes. UK is 1-0 in such games thus far this season.

By defeating the top-ranked Spartans, UK knocked off the No. 1 team in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. Last season, Kentucky downed Tennessee on Feb. 19. With the win over MSU, the Wildcats now have nine victories over the No. 1 team in 25 tries.

Calipari improved to 6-4 vs. the No. 1 team in his career with the win vs. Michigan State, including 3-2 at Kentucky. According to ESPN, Calipari is the only coach with a winning (.600) percentage against No. 1 ranked teams with a minimum of 10 games faced against the No. 1.

Best in the Bluegrass

Kentucky defeated the first of two in-state foes it will welcome to Rupp Arena in 2019-20 vs. Eastern Kentucky.

UK has dominated teams in the state under John Calipari. Kentucky is 18-2 against in-state foes with Calipari at the helm.

The overall mark also includes a 10-2 record vs. Louisville. Two of the victories over the Cardinals were in postseason play. UK's four-game winning streak was snapped in 2016-17 but the Wildcats won all five meetings played in Rupp Arena, including a 29-point blowout in 2017-18, the third-biggest margin of victory in the history of the series. Louisville's two wins

Kentucky at No. 1

on Nov. 11.

For the seventh season in the 11-year John Calipari era, the Kentucky men's basketball team earned a No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25

After defeating Michigan State, the previous No. 1 team, in the State Farm Champions Classic and then following it up with a dominating 42-point victory vs. Eastern Kentucky the Wildcats were named the March Madness Team of the Week and then moved atop the AP Top 25 for the first time since

No other school has reached No. 1 in seven of the last 11 seasons while Calipari has been at Kentucky. According to STATS, only three other programs (Duke, North Carolina and UCLA) have ever been ranked No. 1 in seven different seasons during an 11-year span.

The Wildcats' stay at No. 1 was brief after a shocking loss to Evansville. It marked just the third loss ever by Kentucky in 57 games in Rupp Arena as the No. 1 team in the country. UK fell to 69-8 as the AP top-ranked team under

The Wildcats own an all-time record of 220-31 (.876) at No. 1 in the AP Top 25. UK has appeared at the top of the AP poll 24 different seasons in school history, and the latest stay marked the program's 125th week at No. 1, third most in college basketball (Duke has 144 as of Nov. 18 and UCLA, thanks in large part to its dynasty in the 1960s and 1970s, has 134).

Calipari, one of only two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking, is no stranger to the top spot. Dating back to his time at Memphis, Calipari-coached teams have reached No. 1 in eight of the last 13 seasons. Including his tenure at UMass, his teams have ranked No. 1 in 10 different seasons.

Cousins Inducted into UK Athletics Hall of Fame

DeMarcus Cousins was inducted into the UK Athletics Hall of Fame as a member of the 2019 class in September.

Cousins was one of the key players on the 2009-10 Kentucky team that went to the Elite Eight in John Calipari's first season at UK. Cousins was named an NCAA Consensus Second Team All-American, including first-team recognition from the Associated Press, the 2010 Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year by the league's coaches, and an All-SEC First Team (AP and coaches) selection.

While at UK, Cousins led the Wildcats to a No. 1 national ranking, an SEC regular-season championship and an SEC Tournament championship. He averaged 15.1 points and 9.9 rebounds and concluded freshman season with eighth-most rebounds in a single season in UK history with 375.

Following his one season in Lexington, Cousins was selected by the Sacramento Kings with the fifth overall pick in the 2010 NBA Draft. He's since gone on to a highly successful NBA career. He is a four-time NBA All-Star, was named to All-NBA Second Team in 2015 and 2016, and averaged double figures in all of his nine seasons in the league, including 20-plus points in five of them.

Family Returns Home for Alumni Weekend

Kentucky has held a number of alumni functions in recent seasons, including alumni games, Big Blue Madness and reunions for elite teams, but UK welcomed back any and everyone with ties to the program for an alumni weekend Oct. 18-19. Former players, coaches, staff members, managers and more were invited back.

Festivities included the Blue-White Game, tours of the practice facility

Saturday morning, lunch, practice and a reception Saturday night. Approximately 90 former players, coaches and staff members -- plus their family and friends -- spanning eight different decades were in attendance.

Success Rate

The Wildcats received an NCAA award in the spring of 2019 for placing in the top 10% of all men's basketball teams in the country in the NCAA's annual Academic Progress Rate. UK scored a perfect 1,000. It's the fifth straight year the men's basketball team received the award and the sixth time since 2009.

The APR provides a real-time look at a team's academic success by the progress of each student-athlete on scholarship. The APR measures academic eligibility, retention and graduation. The scores are a four-year composite, covering the 2014-15 through 2017-18 school years.

Every Division I sports team across the nation calculates its APR each academic year, similar to a report card. Scholarship student-athletes each semester earn one point for remaining eligible and one point for staying in school or graduating.

UK has received a perfect 1,000 mark in each of the last six single-year

The NCAA cut score to compete in the 2019-20 postseason is a 930 fouryear APR. Teams scoring below 930 can face consequences intended to direct additional focus on academics. Those penalties can include practice restrictions and playing-season reductions.



Cats Rock at Rupp

The Wildcats are 598-70 (.895) in Rupp Arena. Among the most notable marks of dominance as the nation's toughest venue to play include:

- School record 54-game winning streak to begin the John Calipari era
- UK is 321-41 (.887) in regular-season SEC games in the building
- Kentucky set a new program home record of 19 wins in 2014-15
- UK has gone undefeated at home in five of Calipari's 11 seasons
- The Wildcats have a perfect mark in 13 of Rupp Arena's 44 seasons

Cal Owns Longest Win Streaks in Rupp

With UK's 2011-12 season-opening victory over Marist, UK head coach John Calipari recorded his 34th consecutive win in Rupp Arena as UK's head coach. It broke former UK head coach Rick Pitino's longest streak of 33 games in the venue.

The winning streak reached as long as 54 games. Calipari didn't suffer his first loss in Rupp Arena until losing to Baylor in his fourth season. The 54-game run, however, was his longest career winning streak. He also had the second-longest streak in the arena as the Cats won 42 straight from March 4, 2014 to Nov. 25, 2016.

Pack the House

Kentucky has led the nation in average home attendance in 20 of the last 24 seasons. That number includes a Rupp Arena record of 24,110 in John Calipari's first season (2009-10) as head coach.

- Kentucky averaged 21,695 fans during the 2018-19 season
- UK averaged 23,000-plus fans in seven of Calipari's first 10 seasons
- The Wildcats led the nation in average attendance in 2017-18

New Chairbacks, Fewer Seats

After receiving a \$16 million upgrade over the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons that enhanced the fan experience with the likes of a new Daktronics center-hung scoreboard, ribbons boards, new corner video boards and a new audio system, Rupp Arena is undergoing an additional transformation as a part of UK's new leasing agreement with the Lexington Center.

Chair-back seating in the upper-level sideline was installed in sections 211-217 and 228-234 for the 2019-20 season. Club areas will be available to season ticket holders starting with the 2020-21 season.

The new seating reduced Rupp Arena's capacity to 20,500.

The Top-Ranked Team at Home

Kentucky has lost just four times at home as the Associated Press topranked team in the history of the program and just three times in Rupp Arena. Prior to the losses to Evansville (Nov. 12) and UCLA (Dec. 3, 2016), both by three, the other two losses came by just one point.

The Wildcats are 54-3 all-time as the AP No. 1 team in Rupp Arena since its opening in 1976. The first loss was to Auburn, 53-52, on Jan. 9, 1988.

Coach Cal in Rupp Arena

It's been downright difficult to beat the Wildcats in Rupp Arena during the John Calipari era. UK is 171-10 (.945) in Rupp Arena under Calipari.

- UK is 20-5 (.800) vs. ranked opponents in Rupp in the Calipari era
- The Wildcats are 151-5 (.968) vs. unranked teams in Rupp under Cal
- UK is 90-4 (.957) at home vs. nonconference foes under Calipari
- Calipari notched his 100th career win in Rupp Arena as UK's coach with the Wildcats' 110-75 rout of Auburn on Feb. 21, 2014. It took Calipari just 104 games to reach the century mark at home, the fastest of any UK coach

Cal Passes Hall for Rupp Record

With a 101-70 victory over Cleveland State on Nov. 23, 2016, John Calipari passed former UK head coach Joe B. Hall for wins in Rupp Arena history.

Calipari currently has 171 victories inside the historic venue. Hall won 122.

UK vs. AP Ranked Foes Under Cal Second Tour: Calipari, UK Agree to New Long-Term Contract

John Calipari, who owns more wins, more NCAA Tournament wins, more Final Four appearances, more Elite Eight berths and more Sweet 16 showings than any other coach since his arrival at Kentucky, signed a new long-term contract with the school in June that offers the opportunity to end his career in Lexington.

The new deal, with total guaranteed compensation – which includes base salary and media/endorsement payments – is valued at \$86 million over the lifetime of the contract. With a base salary of \$400,000 per season from the university, Calipari will make \$8 million in total compensation over the next two seasons with increases starting in 2021-22 (\$8.5 million per year for four seasons) and 2025-26 (\$9 million per year for four seasons).

The only incentive included in Calipari's new contract remains the performance of the men's basketball team in the Academic Progress Rate, a metric created by the NCAA to measure academic eligibility, retention and graduation. The bonus will remain unchanged at \$50,000 from the previous contract for meeting the threshold of 975. The men's basketball team has earned an NCAA award in five straight seasons for finishing among the top 10% of Division I men's basketball schools.

Calipari's new contract will no longer include a retention bonus. Beginning with the sixth contract year of the agreed upon terms, Calipari has the option to step down as the head coach and become special assistant to the athletics director/university representative. He would receive \$950,000 in annual compensation for the position.

Calipari is calling the start of his second decade at Kentucky his "second tour" after unprecedented success in his first decade. His goal is for the program to build on that success and do even bigger things on the second tour. First, let's take a look back at his first one ...

A Decorated Decade

Through 10 years at Kentucky (entering 2019-20), John Calipari's time in Lexington has been every bit as successful -- and more -- as fans hoped when he agreed to become the head coach at Kentucky back in the spring of 2009.

By just about every measure, he's the most successful coach in college basketball during the last decade. Among schools who have been to at least two Elite Eights and a Final Four since 2009-10, Calipari ranks:

- First in wins (310), through games on Nov. 24
- First in NCAA Tournament wins (31)
- Fourth in NCAA titles (one)
- First in Final Four appearances (four)
- First in Elite Eight appearances (seven
- First in Sweet 16 appearances (eight
- Third in regular-season conference titles (five)
- Second in league tournament titles (six)

Moving Up the Kentucky Career Wins List

With an 80-53 victory vs. Auburn on Feb. 23, John Calipari moved past Joe B. Hall for the second-most wins in program history. Calipari trails only the legendary Adolph Rupp (876 wins) for the most wins at UK and earned win No. 300 at Ole Miss on March 5. When Calipari tied Hall with his 297th win at Missouri on Feb. 19, he did so 32 games faster than Hall and just two games slower than Rupp

Although he's still climbing the charts, he's doing it nearly as fast as anyone else in NCAA history. With the win over Ole Miss, Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 300 wins (369 games) at one program in NCAA history. Only Bill Self (358 games at Kansas), Claire Bee (359 games at Long Island) and Rupp (366 at UK) got there faster.

Calipari passed Tubby Smith on Dec. 1 for the third-most coached games at UK. Smith's 10-year career with the Wildcats ended with his 346th game. Calipari and UK's win over UNC Greensboro on Dec. 1 marked the 347th career game he's been at the helm. Rupp is obviously first in games coached with a 42-year tenure spanning 1,066 career games.

First-Ballot Hall of Famer

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in September 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on the first ballot.

Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate honors in the sport. The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Bevetta, Wildcat Louie Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and JoJo White.

700 Victories and Counting

With Kentucky's win over UIC on Nov. 26, 2017, John Calipari reached 700 on-court wins. At the time he was one of just 41 coaches, regardless of NCAA level of classification, to reach that barrier. Only 29 coaches have done it with at least 10 seasons at the Division Llevel.

Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 700 on-court wins ever. Only Adolph Rupp (836 games), Jerry Tarkanian (876 games) and Roy Williams (879 games) did it faster.

Calipari is currently the only coach in NCAA history with at least 189 victories at three different schools.

Calipari Unrivaled in Conference

John Calipari has won 15 league regular-season championships (including five Southeastern Conference titles) seven more than the next-closest coach in the SEC (Bruce Pearl has eight). Calipari has won six SEC Tournament championships in 10 seasons at Kentucky and owns 15 conference tournament titles in his career, 11 more than his closest competitors (Ben Howland, Kermit Davis).

He's tallied a 344-104 (.768) all-time record within conference play as a head coach and owns a 136-38 (.782) record since joining the SEC. His 136 total wins are the second most among Division I coaches since 1996-97 over their first 10 seasons with a program, while his winning percentage ranks third. Only Adolph Rupp (.833) had a better winning percentage through his first 10 seasons in league play in Kentucky's history.

Although he's been publicly outspoken against conference tournaments -- only because he doesn't favor playing three or more games on consecutive days to win the tournament -- his teams have gotten up for them. Calipari's teams at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky have been to 19 conference championship games in his 27-year career, winning a remarkable 15 of them. Calipari is 57-12 (.826) all-time in conference tournaments, including 23-4 (.852) at UK.

Calipari in Elite Company with Conference Championships

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari added another first to his Hall of Fame career in 2017.

When Kentucky clinched at least a share of the 2017 Southeastern Conference championship by beating Vanderbilt on Feb. 28, 2017, he made history as a head coach. Calipari became the first NCAA Division I coach to lead three different programs (UMass, Memphis, Kentucky) to five on-court regular-season league titles five different times. He won the Atlantic 10 at the helm of UMass in 1992, 93, 94, 95 and 96. Memphis claimed the Conference USA crown in 2004, 06, 07, 08 and 09. Kentucky has captured the SEC five times in 2010, 12, 15, 16 and 17.

Perhaps more impressive is that Calipari has 30 combined regular-season and tournament championships after the 2018 SEC Tournament title. That trails only Mark Few of Gonzaga (33 titles with the West Coast Conference regular-season title in 2019) among all active coaches. All-time, Calipari trails only the great Adolph Rupp (41) and Few.

With a 71-67 win over Mississippi State on Feb. 9, John Calipari achieved another feat in his decorated coaching career. With his 20th victory in 2019, he secured his 25th consecutive on-court 20-win season. He leads all active coaches with that streak, ahead of Mike Krzyzewski (23) and Bill Self (21).

With a Sweet 16 win over Houston in the 2019 NCAA Tournament, Calipari and the Cats clinched a 30-win season for the fifth time as UK's head coach. Calipari has 11 seasons with 30 or more on-court wins. Only Krzyzewski (15) and Roy Williams (12) have more 30-win seasons as an active head coach. Calipari is the first coach in NCAA Division I history to record five straight on-court 30-win seasons, notching 30 wins in consecutive seasons from 2005-06 to 2009-10.

There's No Place Like Home

Since his 1991-92 season at UMass, John Calipari-coached teams have posted a 381-32 (.923) record at home. At UK, Coach Cal is 171-10 (.945) in Rupp Arena.

In five of Calipari's 11 seasons at Kentucky, the Wildcats have posted an undefeated record at home, including a school-record 19-0 mark during the 2014-15 season.

Calipari owns both of UK's longest winning streaks in the arena. He began his career at UK with a 54-game winning streak at Rupp Arena. It was the longest winning streak since the arena opened in 1976. With a win over Georgia on Feb. 9, 2016, he secured the second-longest streak in the storied building at 34 games (which ended at 42).

Life Away From Home Isn't So Bad Either

As good as John Calipari's team's have been at home, they're pretty good in hostile environments on the road. Dating back to the 2005-06 season, Calipari has recorded a 100-45 (.690) record on the road. At neutral-site venues, Kentucky is 78-21 (.788) all-time under Calipari.

Calipari at No. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking.

Calipari has led seven of his 11 UK teams to the No. 1 ranking and eight of his last 13 teams to the top (he's done it 10 times overall). When Coach Cal's teams are at the top, they're difficult to knock off:

- Calipari is 110-13 (.894) as the top-ranked Associated Press Top 25 coach in the country
- He's 69-8 (.896) when his team is atop the AP Top 25 as UK's head coach
- Calipari tallied a 32-4 mark at UMass at No. 1 and he was 9-1 at Memphis
- He (110) trails only Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (218) in active coaches with victories at No. 1
- Calipari has coached 123 career games as a No. 1 team, fourth most in NCAA history, trailing Krzyzewski (252), John Wooden (228) and Adolph Rupp (127)
- Among coaches who have owned a No. 1 ranking in at least 119 games, Calipari's winning percentage of .894 trails only Wooden (.952) and is ahead of active coach Krzyzewski (.865)
- Calipari is 6-4 vs. the AP top-ranked team in the land, including 3-2 at Kentucky after defeating Michigan State on Nov. 5
- According to ESPN, his .600 winning percentage against the No. 1 ranked team is the best for any head coach

The Success Rate

John Calipari has graduated 100% of the players (20 of 20) who have been eligible to receive their diploma by the end of their senior years and exhausted their athletic eligibility. Of that group, Brad Calipari, Patrick Patterson, Jarrod Polson and Alex Poythress completed their degrees in three years.

In the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, which measures eligibility, retention and graduation, Kentucky has posted a single-year Academic Progress Rate of 977 or higher in every season under Calipari, including a perfect 1,000 in the last six single-year reports. UK's four-year composite score in the most recent report, which was released in May 2019, was a 1,000, earning the team an NCAA academic award for the fifth year in a row for finishing in the top 10% of Division I men's basketball programs.

Dream Maker

As someone who prides himself on helping young men reach their dreams, John Calipari has helped 49 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his college coaching career, including 38 in his first 10 seasons at Kentucky, more than any other coach.

- Four No. 1 overall selections (Derrick Rose, John Wall, Anthony Davis and Karl-Anthony Towns) during the nine drafts from 2008 to 2016. No other coach has more than three No. 1 picks
- In 2010, five of his UK players were selected in the first round for the first time in NBA history
- His six players in the 2012 and 2015 NBA drafts are the most in the two-round era
- Churned out 38 NBA Draft picks, 29 first-rounders, three No. 1 overall selections, seven top-five picks and 21 lottery picks at Kentucky
- Of the 60 players who have finished their college careers at Kentucky under Calipari, 38 have been selected in the NBA Draft, a 63.3% success rate. Another five of those made the NBA, and the majority of the rest were walk-ons
- Of the 27 players at UK who have declared for the NBA Draft after their freshman seasons, 25 have been first-round picks. All 27 have played a game in the NBA. He is 29 for 31 in that regard when including his players from Memphis
- Only coach to produce the top two picks in the same draft (2012 Anthony Davis and Michael Kidd-Gilchrist)
- Produced a top-10 pick in 12 straight drafts since 2008, the only school to do so during that time period

Recruiting Trail

The Wildcats have signed more top-25 players under John Calipari's leadership than any other school. Nearly a quarter of all Rivals' top-10 prospects nationally over the past 11 classes have signed with Coach Cal and the Cats. The following list does not include transfers (freshman signees only).

Developing Talent

John Calipari hasn't just signed the best talent in the country while he's been at Kentucky; he's been the best at developing that talent and getting it ready for the next level.

Of the 35 top-25 Rivals.com players Kentucky has signed and have completed their college eligibility at UK, 31 were drafted and 25 were selected in the first round. But that's only half the story. Calipari's players don't just make it to the pros; they're better prepared than anyone else. The proof is in the numbers.

Over the course of his career, Calipani's 50-plus NBA pros have amassed more than \$2.26 billion in NBA contracts, which doesn't include endorsement deals and overseas contracts. Of his UK players in the NBA, they've earned just shy of \$1.9 billion in guaranteed contracts.

There's more: Of UK's 21 lottery picks in the Calipari era, 14 have earned second contracts in the NBA with seven of them cashing in on max contracts. Of the seven who haven't earned contracts, all have been drafted in the last three years and are still on their rookie deal. Over the last 10 years, there have been 22 lottery picks who earned max contracts in the NBA. Seven of them attended Kentucky.

Double-Digit Win Streaks

John Calipari's teams have posted 19 streaks of 10 or more wins at Kentucky, Memphis and UMass, including seven at UK.

They have won 15 or more straight games nine times, 20 or more six times, 25 or more five times, and 30 or more one time. Of course, the most famous streak was the 38-0 start during the 2014-15 season.

A "players-first" coach with a penchant for helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, has guided six teams to the Final Four, led one to a national championship and helped 49 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his 27-year college coaching career.

Calipari guided Kentucky to its eighth national championship and his first national title in 2012. In becoming only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four, he has racked up more than 700 on-court victories, 20 NCAA Tournament on-court appearances, six Final Fours and numerous national coach of the year honors.

From UMass to Memphis and now Kentucky, Calipari's career has been successful throughout, but his most recent run in Lexington has been the best stretch of his career. During Calipari's 10 seasons at UK, he leads all coaches in total wins (305), NCAA Tournament wins (31), Final Fours (four), Elite Eights (seven) and Sweet 16s (eight).

In 2015, Coach Cal led college basketball's first ever 38-0 team, and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of the season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

While building a program out of obscurity at Massachusetts, laying the foundation at Memphis and restoring luster at the sport's greatest program at Kentucky, he totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

Quite honestly, though, Calipari's on-court success overshadows a much more significant picture. In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped more than 50 young men realize their dreams and reach the NBA level with 49 players earning NBA Draft selections, including a record five first-round draft picks in 2010. Two years later, six Wildcats heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. UK, with Calipari's help, would tie those six picks again in 2015, including a record-tying four lottery selections. His four No. 1 overall picks are more than any other coach, and he's had 38 players drafted during his first 10 years at Kentucky, including 29 first-round picks.

Calipari's players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 20 All-Star selections, with Anthony Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011. Five of his players have been tabbed All-NBA, three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year, and 12 players from Calipari's first nine teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80 percent, Calipari has stressed academics. Fifteen of his last 18 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor's degrees, and all 18 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including four players who earned their degree in just three years. Calipari's teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point average of 3.0 or better.

Calipari has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need in the Commonwealth and beyond. He has had a particular passion to assist those impacted by natural disasters. For instance, in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, and in 2017, for victims of Hurricane Harvey.

Calipari launched his foundation in 2012, and since then the foundation has worked with several key partners and donated more than \$1.5 million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller "Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out," Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that "it's never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it's about how high you bounce back."




