Starting Five

- The Buckeyes are 1,157-415 all-time when playing in the state of Ohio (.736) ... against Ohio teams, Ohio State is 237-79 (.749) all-time, regardless of location. The Buckeyes faced a pair of intrastate foes this season. Ohio State defeated Cincinnati Nov. 6 at Value City Arena (64-56) and then Kent State Nov. 25 at St. John Arena (W, 72-51). Ohio State is 179-30 vs. Ohio teams in Columbus (.856). In the state of Nevada, Ohio State is 1-1 all-time. The No. 7 Buckeyes defeated No. 12 Georgetown 71-60 at the Thomas and Mack Center on the UNLV campus Dec. 22, 1990 and then fell to No. 2 UCLA Dec. 17, 2016 in the CBS Sports Classic at T-Mobile Arena.
- Three current Buckeyes were named Mr. Basketball in their respective states. Junior Kaleb Wesson was named Ohio Mr. Basketball as a senior at Westerville South High School ... freshman D.J. Carton was named Mr. Basketball in Iowa in 2019 as a senior at Bettendorf High School and freshman E.J. Liddell was named Illinois Mr. Basketball in both 2018 and 2019 after leading Belleville High School to back-to-back state titles.
- Andre and Kaleb Wesson are one of 16 sets of brothers playing in NCAA Division I this season and one of three sets in the Big Ten. Iowa (McCaffery) and Maryland (Mitchell) also have siblings on the roster.
- Ohio State has 58 players all-time with 1,000 or more career points, the ninth most nationally and the most of any Big Ten school (research credit: Duke). Kaleb Wesson is the next Buckeye on schedule to reach the milestone with 963 career points over his career.
- Locking down the opponent's leading scorer has been key to Ohio State's success this season. The Buckeyes' 11 opponents' leading scorers have shot 32% (41-128) from the field and 24.4% (11-45) from 3-point range. Ohio State has limited the

Buckeyes Among Leaders in Home Wins

Ohio State is No. 2 nationally for the most home wins with a 171-30 (.851) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 13 with 156 wins. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes own the third-most home victories with 186 wins over 219 games (186-33). The Buckeyes also have played the eighth-most ranked teams in the country since 2005. Ohio State has played 146 (61 wins/11th) opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 during that span.

Off the Bench

- In the first NCAA NET rankings of the year, released Monday, Ohio State was rated the No. 1 team nationally after its 9-1 start. The Buckeyes were ranked No. 1 in the first NET rankings a year ago as well. This year, Ohio State is 2-1 in Quad 1 games with a total of 17 Quad 1 (10) and Quad 2 (7) games remaining on the schedule.
- When the No. 5 Buckeyes tip vs. the No. 6 Wildcats Saturday in Las Vegas, the Wesson family will reach 300 games played as Buckeyes. Keith Wesson, who lettered for Ohio State from 1983-87, played in 115 games. Senior Andre Wesson has appeared in 107 games while junior Kaleb Wesson has taken the court as a Buckeye 76 times. In 298 games played, the Wessons have scored 1,860 points for an average of 6.2 a game.
- In three seasons as Ohio State head coach, Chris Holtmann teams have made 10 or more 3s 20 times (14-6 rcd.). Ohio State made 10+ from distance five times in 2017-18 and posted a 4-1 record in those games. The Buckeyes were 5-5 in 2018-19 and are 5-0 this year when make 10+ 3-pointers.
- The Buckeyes have made 30 or more field goal attempts six times this year (6-0) after doing so three times a season ago (3-0). Chris Holtmann Ohio State teams have scored 30 or more FGs in 21 games during his tenure (20-1) after doing so 12 times in his first year (12-1). Ohio State has won its last eight games when reach at least 30 FGs made.

• Ohio State has won its last three home games by 32 or more points with wins over Morgan State (90-57, +33), Penn State (106-74, +32) and Southeast Missouri State (80-48, +32). The last time the Buckeyes downed three-consecutive home opponents by 32 or more points was in 2014 vs. North Carolina A&T (97-55, +42), Miami, Ohio (93-55, +38) and Wright State (100-55, +45). Ohio State, 9-0 at home, has downed the last eight opponents by at least 19 points and own six wins by 25 or more. The Buckeyes have a scoring margin of 32 or more points in 48 wins in Value City Arena History.

Kaleb Wesson Nears Exclusive Club

Ohio State junior Kaleb Wesson is close to entering both the 1,000 career point and 500 career rebound club with 963 points and 484 boards. Wesson would become the 29th Buckeye all-time with both 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in a career.

The Ohio State vs. Kentucky Series

Ohio State and Kentucky are meeting for the 21st time with the Wildcats holding an 11-9 record vs. the Buckeyes to date. Ohio State leads the series

6-3 in neutral-site games with the last such meeting going the way of the Buckeyes Dec. 19, 2015 in Brooklyn, New York, as part of the CBSSports Classic. Ohio State, unranked at the time, knocked off No. 4 Kentucky 74-67. The game Saturday will be the first in the last five meetings that one of the teams was outside the Top 5. In the last four games, UK has been ranked No. 5, 3, 11 and 4. Ohio State was No. 1 in 2011 in a 62-60 loss in the NCAA East Regional Semifinals in Newark, New Jersey. Ohio State defeated the Wildcats in three-consecutive NCAA Midwest Regional from 1961, '62 and '68. The Buckeyes advanced to the Final Four each of those seasons, making it to the title game in both '61 and '62.

- The Buckeyes outbounded Southeast Missouri 44-25.
- Ohio State shot 8-for-16 (.500) from the 3-point line in the second half and 13-for-27 (.481) for the game.
- Seven different Buckeyes made at least one 3-pointer.
- Ohio State improves to 520-153 all-time when ranked in the Associated Press Top 25.
- The Buckeyes improve to 16-0 against teams currently representing the Ohio Valley Conference.
- Ohio State has now held its opponent to 20 or fewer made field goals seven times this season.
- The Buckeyes were credited with 23 assists on 31 made baskets vs. the Redhawks. Ohio State has posted 20 or more assists seven times in the Holtmann era (7-0). In the last three seasons, the Buckeyes are 28-2 when recording 16 or more assists.

- With 16 points and 10 rebounds, Kaleb Wesson recorded his 10th career double-double.
- Wesson has now scored in double-digits in 10 consecutive games.
- D.J. Carton put up 10 points, marking his seventh game scoring in double-digits this season.
- Andre Wesson went 6-for-8 (.750) from the floor and 3-for-4 (.750) from 3-point range.
- Kyle Young was perfect from the floor (4-for-4).

- Southeast Missouri State (16-60/.267) is the 13th team to be held under 27% shooting in Value City Arena history and the 29th held under 30%.

- CJ Walker was credited with six assists vs. SEMO while the Redhawks recorded five as a team. The last Buckeye to hand out more assists than the opponent was JaQuan Lyle (11) vs. Jackson State (9) Nov. 23, 2016. Against SEMO, freshman D.J. Carton had five assists to tie SEMO's team total.
- The Buckeyes have eight wins this season by 20 or more points after the 32-point win over SEMO. The last time an Ohio State team won eight or more games by 20+ points in a season was in 2014-15 when Ohio State bettered 11 foes by 20 or more.
- Ohio State has held 57 foes to under 50 points at Value City Arena following the 80-48 win over SEMO. The Buckeyes are 57-0 in those games.

Kaleb Wesson on Honors Lists

Junior Kaleb Wesson was tabbed a member of the **2019-20 Preseason All-Big Ten** squad by conference media Oct. 2. He was one of three unanimous selections on the squad of 10 league players. Wesson also was listed as one of 20 preseason candidates for the **Karl Malone Award**, given annually by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame to the best power forward in the country. Wesson, listed as a center with the Buckeyes, could play his way on to the **Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award** list for the country's best center when the award lists are reduced to 10 in mid-February and to five in March. He was named to the preseason Top 50 watch list for the **Wooden Award** Nov. 6. He was also named by the U.S. Basketball Writers

The Last Time vs. Kentucky

Ohio State 74, No. 4 Kentucky (12/19/15)

BROOKLYN, N.Y. -- Keita Bates-Diop scored 14 points and Ohio State held off a furious second-half rally by No. 4 Kentucky for a 74-67 victory in the CBS Sports Classic at Barclays Center. The Buckeyes led by 16 points with 11:26 to play and withstood Kentucky's rally. Freshman Jamal Murray had a season-high 33 points for the Wildcats and kept the rally going with 3-pointer after 3-pointer. He finished 7-of-9 from beyond the arc, all the makes in the second half. A 3 by Alex Poythress brought Kentucky within 63-60 with 4 minutes to play. The Buckeyes, who had missed three of their last five free throws, suddenly started making them. Kam Williams made two and so did Daniel Giddens and the lead was back to 67-60 with 2:54 left. Murray, with a 3 and a drive, got Kentucky within 4 twice but Jae'Sean Tate scored down low and there were three more free throws after Kentucky misses and Ohio State had the upset. Marc Loving added 14 points for the Buckeyes, while JaQuan Lyle had 11 and Trevor Thompson 10. Marcus Lee had 12 points and nine rebounds for the Wildcats, who trailed 37-25 at halftime.

The Nov. 6 date with the Bearcats in Columbus was second only to the Nov. 5, 2004 opener, the first game of the Thad Matta era, vs. Towson State in the Guardian's Classic at Value City Arena. Ohio State won that game 74-53.

Matta Enters Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame

Thad Matta, the all-time winningest coach in Ohio State history, was selected to enter the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame during a ceremony Sept. 6. The 13th coach in program history, Matta recorded 337 career wins, made nine NCAA Tournament appearances, five "Sweet Sixteens," three "Elite Eights" and two Final Fours over 13 seasons (2005-17).

Kaleb Wesson Tests NBA Waters, Returns for Junior Year

Kaleb Wesson elected to enter his name into the 2019 NBA Draft process to gain feedback into his goal of becoming a professional basketball player. After going through the process he elected to return to Ohio State for his junior year. Wesson made the decision in late May.

Sueing Selects Ohio State, Eligible in 2020-21

Justice Sueing joined the Ohio State program in May of 2019 following a transfer from the University of California. Sueing, a 6-foot, 6-inch forward from Honolulu, Hawaii, will have two years of eligibility with the Buckeyes after sitting out the 2019-20 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. Sueing played 31 games for the Golden Bears a season ago. He averaged 14.3 points and 6.0 re-

bounds while shooting better than 78 percent from the foul line (129-165).

Diebler Added to Coaching Staff

Jake Diebler, who spent three seasons with the Buckeyes as the team's video coordinator (2014-2016) was hired as an assistant coach with the Buckeyes after spending the last two years as an assistant at Vanderbilt. Diebler, older brother of Ohio State great Jon Diebler, is a 2009 graduate of Valparaiso. He was a standout high school player at Upper Sandusky (Ohio).

Diallo Picks Ohio State

Ibrahima Diallo, a 6-foot, 10-inch center from Senegal, signed a letter of intent to play for Chris Holtmann and the Buckeyes in mid-April 2019. Diallo enters the 2019-20 season along with a stellar freshman class. He joins forwards Alonzo Gaffney and E.J. Liddell and guard D.J. Carton. Diallo played a season ago at Prolific Prep in California where he averaged 11 points, 11 rebounds and nearly four blocks a game.

Buckeyes Enter 2019-20 Campaign with 20+ Wins in 14 of the Last 15 Seasons

Ohio State has 29 seasons with 20 or more wins and three with 30 or more. Holtmann has won at least 20 games in each of his two years at Ohio State and the Buckeyes have won 20 or more in 14 of the last 15 seasons.

Noting the 2019-20 Ohio State Schedule

- Ohio State played its first seven games of the season, plus an exhibition, at home with six at Value City Arena and one at St. John Arena. Three of the four non-Big Ten games in December are outside Columbus (vs. North Carolina in Big Ten/ACC Challenge (W, 74-49), vs. Kentucky in CBS Sports Classic (Las Vegas) and vs. West Virginia in Cleveland Classic).
- Now in its sixth year, Ohio State will again play in the CBS Sports Classic. The event will take place in Las Vegas Saturday. The Buckeyes take on Kentucky while North Carolina and UCLA play in the second game.
- Villanova traveled to Ohio State Nov. 13. The game was part of The Gavitt Games, which pits members of the Big Ten vs. Big East opponents.

The Buckeyes downed the No. 10 Wildcats 76-51.

- Two Big Ten Conference games were played in December after the league expanding to a 20-game, regular-season slate in 2018-19. Ohio State played Penn State in Columbus Dec. 7 (W, 106-74) and traveled to Minnesota Sunday (L, 84-71).
- The Buckeyes are 5-1 in December conference games the last three years with wins at Wisconsin and vs. Michigan in 2017 and victories over Minnesota in Columbus and Illinois in Chicago in 2018. The Buckeyes knocked off Penn State 106-74 this year in Columbus Dec. 7 and fell at Minnesota Sunday, 84-71.
- The annual Big Ten Tournament will be contested in Indianapolis in 2020, Chicago in 2021 and then back to Indianapolis in 2022.
- The Buckeyes will have 18 home games in 2018-19 plus an exhibition contest vs. Cedarville Oct. 30.
- Seven Big Ten teams (Minnesota, Indiana, Michigan, Penn State, Maryland, Wisconsin and Nebraska) battle the Buckeyes twice during the regular season with three (Illinois, Purdue, Rutgers) traveling only to Columbus. Ohio State hits the road to face Iowa, Michigan State and Northwestern this year.
- Ohio State will play 19 regular-season games against 13 teams that advanced to postseason play in 2019. Fifteen games are scheduled vs. 2019 NCAA Tournament teams (Maryland-2, Minnesota-2, Michigan State-1, Michigan-2, Wisconsin-2, Villanova-1, Purdue-1, Cincinnati-1, Iowa-1, Kentucky-1, North Carolina-1) while four contests pit the Buckeyes vs. 2019 NIT squads (Indiana-2, Nebraska-2).
- Every Ohio State game will be televised or streamed. CBS will feature the Buckeyes five times, FOX/FS1 will carry eight OSU games, ESPN Networks will broadcast nine games with

108 Years in Big Ten

Ohio State celebrated 108 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2020. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over 108 seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 29 NCAA Tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 55 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

CBS Sports Classic-Year 6

CBS Sports has brought together four of the nation's most prestigious college basketball teams the last four years and will do so again this year in 2019-20. Kentucky, North Carolina, Ohio State and UCLA, meet for a college basketball showcase, the CBS SPORTS CLASSIC again this season. CBS Sports televises the doubleheader and

Roster Grows for 2020-21 Buckeyes

Chris Holtmann, now in his third year as the head coach of the Ohio State men's basketball team, announced the addition of two student-athletes to the program's roster for the 2020-21 season.

Eugene Brown III, a 6-6, 185-pound guard from Southwest Dekalb (Georgia) High School, and Zed Key, a 6-8, 230-pound forward from Long Island (New York) Lutheran High School, signed NCAA National Letters of Intent in early November.

Brown III was the first player from the class of 2020 to commit. Brown, a native of Decatur, Georgia, averaged 9.1 points, 4.6 rebounds and 1.3 assists over his first three years of his high school career, despite a leg injury sidelining him for most of his junior season. In five games as a junior he averaged 13.4 points, 5.4 rebounds and 2.8 assists.

"We are really excited about Eugene," Holtmann said. "He is a gifted perimeter player who has developed a great skill set thanks to many hours in the gym as a coach's son. He plays the game with the energy and competitiveness we want in our student-athletes."

Key, who hails from Brookville, New York, averaged 15.9 points and 8.5 rebounds his junior season. He also was a part of the 2019 New York State Federation Class AA State Championship team (25-2), who defeated Chris The King, 51-31, last March. Key played in four games at the 2019 National Basketball Players Association Top 100 camp, averaging 13.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game.

"Zed is a great addition to our university and program," Holtmann said. "He plays the game with a high level of physicality and understanding of the game. He has been a part of championship teams in New York and it became clear early on in the recruiting process how important winning is to him."

has done so since the first year of the event in Chicago (2014). These four schools have combined to win 26 national championships and are among the winningest college basketball programs of all-time. The event debuted at the United Center in Chicago Dec. 20, 2014. North Carolina faced Ohio State and UCLA took on Kentucky. The CBSSPORTS CLASSIC moved to Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York, Dec. 19, 2015, where the Buckeyes knocked off No. 4 Kentucky 74-67. The teams traveled to Las Vegas in 2016 where the Buckeyes fell to UCLA. Ohio State took on North Carolina Dec. 23, 2017 in New Orleans (L, 86-72). The Buckeyes defeated UCLA Dec. 22, 2018 of this year at the United Center in Chicago. The Buckeyes meet Kentucky this year in Las Vegas (Saturday/5:15 p.m./CBS).

Holtmann Era in Columbus

June 9, 2017 marked the first day of the Chris Holtmann era at Ohio State. After six seasons as a head coach, including three at Butler, Holtmann

became the 14th head coach in Ohio State men's basketball history. In his young career to date, Holtmann already has earned coach-of-the-year honors in the Big South Conference (2013), where he spent three seasons coaching Gardner-Webb (2001-13), and in the Big East (2017) in the final of three seasons with the Bulldogs. His first game in Columbus, a win over Robert Morris, was the 200th of his head coaching career. Holtmann was named the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year, has won at least 20 games in each of his two seasons in Columbus, has taken the Buckeyes to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and has won an NCAA game each season.

Holtmann Reaches 50 Wins as a Buckeye

Chris Holtmann is working on 300 games as a head coach (279/169-110) and is off to a 10-1 start this year at Ohio State. He won game No. 50 as a Buckeye Nov. 22 in an 85-46 win over Purdue Fort Wayne at Value City Arena. Holtmann needed 74 games to reach 50 wins at Ohio State, the fourth fastest among the 14 head coaches in OSU history.

Ohio Mr. Basketball at Ohio State

Junior Kaleb Wesson, a 6-9 center from nearby Westerville, Ohio, was named Mr. Basketball in the state of Ohio following his senior year at Westerville South High School in 2017. Wesson earned the 12th Ohio Mr. Basketball award among nine players to sign with the Buckeyes out of high school and the 13th among those to ultimately play for Ohio State. Tony Stockman earned the honor in 2000 but elected to start his career at Clemson. He later transferred to Ohio State and played in Columbus in 2004 and 2005.

Six Seasons with 20 Wins for Holtmann

Holtmann teams have won 20 or more games in each of his last six full years as a head coach. Ohio State finished 20-15 overall after the win vs. Iowa State and the loss to Houston in the 2019 NCAA Tournament. Gardner-Webb won 21 games in 2013 with Holtmann at the helm. Butler reached 23, 22 and 25 wins over the three seasons before Holtmann took over at Ohio State in 2017-18. Of Ohio State's 14 head coaches in the history of men's basketball, only Gary Williams and Thad Matta won 20 games in their first season in Columbus. The Buckeyes were 25-9 in 2017-18. Williams was 20-13 in 1987 and took the Buckeyes to the NCAA Tournament, where the team defeated Kentucky for its 20th win of the season before losing to Georgetown. Matta was 20-12 in 2005 but the Buckeyes were ineligible for postseason competition that year. The Buckeyes won their 20th game in the Big Ten Tournament over Penn State before ending the season with a loss to Wisconsin. Holtmann is the first Ohio State coach in history to win 20 regular-season games in his first year in Columbus. The 25 wins in 2017-18 is an Ohio State record for most wins by a first-year coach.

Ohio State's 29 20-Win Seasons

The win over Iowa State in the opening round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament gave the Buckeyes win No. 20 for the 2018-19 season. The feat marked the 29th time in Ohio State men's basketball history the Buckeyes reached 20 victories in a season. The first was in 1950 when William H.H. Dye led the Buckeyes to a 22-4 record in his final of four seasons on the Ohio State sidelines. Fred Taylor was the next coach in Columbus to guide Ohio State to the 20-win plateau with a 25-3 season in 1960, the

year the Buckeyes reached and won the NCAA title game. Taylor led Ohio State to six 20-win seasons in his career, including a streak of four-consecutive from 1960-1963. Taylor's last 20-win campaign was in 1971. Eldon Miller led Ohio State to four 20-win campaigns from 1980-85 before Gary Williams coached two seasons with 20-13 records in 1987 and 1988. Randy Ayers's 1991 and 1992 seasons both ended with 20 or more wins with 27 and 26 respectively. The Thad Matta era (2005-2017) included 12-consecutive 20-win seasons from 2005-2016. Chris Holtmann has reached 20-plus wins in each of his seasons in Columbus to give the Buckeyes a total of 29 in Ohio State history.

The Cincinnati Opener

Ohio State opened the 2018-19 season officially Nov. 7, 2018 at Cincinnati, the first meeting against the Bearcats on either team's campus since 1921 (Columbus/L, 33-17/Dec. 10, 1921) and the first time at Cincinnati since the 1920 season (Cincinnati/W, 35-13/Jan. 3, 1920). Ohio State earned a 64-56 win in the first game at renovated Fifth-Third Arena last year and is 8-4 all-time vs. the Bearcats after winning by the identical score, 64-56, Nov. 6 in Columbus. Three of the last six meetings have come in the NCAA Tournament. Cincinnati defeated the Buckeyes for the national championship in both 1961 and 1962. Ohio State defeated UC in the 2006 Wooden Tradition in Indianapolis (72-50) and then most recently in the 2012 NCAA East Regional Semifinals in Boston (81-66).

Throwback Game at St. John Arena

Ohio State played Kent State as part of the 2019 Ohio State Classic at historic St. John Arena Nov. 25.

A few notes on the venue:

- Ohio State first played at St. John Arena during the 1956-57 season. The last season the Buckeyes called SJA their home was 1997-98. Ohio State began playing at its current home, Value City Arena, in 1998-99.
- Ohio State has an overall record of 433-151 (.741) at SJA, which includes a 7-0 record in games played at SJA since the end of the 1998 season.
- Ohio State defeated Cleveland State 89-62 Nov. 23, 2018. The Buckeyes had last played at SJA in 2010, an 85-60 win over Western Carolina (12/12/2010).
- The facility is named after former Ohio State director of athletics and men's basketball coach L.W. St. John.
- The first game played at SJA was against Butler (12/1/1956), a 98-82 win for the Buckeyes.
- Capacity is 13,276. The CSU game was a sellout.
- Since the Ohio State men's and women's basketball teams moved to Value City Arena, St. John has been the competition home for the men's and women's volleyball, wrestling, fencing and men's and women's gymnastics teams. Those teams moved out of SJA and into the Covelli Center on Ohio State's campus following the 2018-19 season.
- SJA also is filled to capacity prior to each home football game during "Skull Session" where the

Ohio State Marching Band practices and briefly welcomes the football Buckeyes on their way to Ohio Stadium.

- Between 1960 and 1964, the Buckeyes won 50-consecutive games on their home floor.

Noting Ohio State vs. Ohio teams

- Ohio State improved its record to 237-79 versus teams from Ohio with the 71-52 win over Kent State last Monday in Columbus.
- Chris Holtmann has an 11-5 career record versus teams from Ohio.
- Ohio State is 29-1 vs. Ohio teams since the 1995-96 season. The loss was to Dayton in the 2014 NCAA Tournament. The Buckeyes fell 60-59 (3/20/2014) to the No. 22 Flyers.
- Ohio State is 179-30 in Columbus vs. Ohio teams, 50-41 in road games and 8-8 at neutral sites all-time.

HEAD COACH CHRIS HOLTSMANN

Chris Holtmann took over the Ohio State men's basketball head coaching position June 12, 2017 after a successful three-year stint as head coach at Butler (2015-2017). He was an assistant at Butler during the 2013-14 season after a three-year run as head coach at Gardner-Webb (2011-13).



Holtmann was named conference coach of the year at both his previous stops earning the honor in 2013 in the Big South and then in 2017 in the Big East following a 25-9 campaign with the Bulldogs. He earned the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award as well after a 25-9 overall record and a 15-3 campaign and second-place finish in the Big Ten regular season.

The 14th head coach in Ohio State history, Holtmann is a 1994 graduate of Taylor University, where he majored in Psychology. He also has a master's degree in Athletics Administration from Ball State (2000). He was elected to the Taylor University Athletics Hall of Fame in October of 2018.

As a player at Taylor, he earned NAIA All-American status in 1994 under the direction of Paul Patterson.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Holtmann was an assistant for John Groce (Ohio U.) and Brandon Miller (Butler). Both Groce and Miller were former Ohio State assistant coaches.

No. 10 Ohio State 90, Morgan State 57 Nov. 29, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team topped Morgan State, 90-57, at Value City Arena. Andre Wesson led Ohio State with 19 points and seven rebounds while Kaleb Wesson totaled 13 points and eight boards. Stanley Davis Jr. paced Morgan State with 13 points. Morgan State scored the first four points of the contest and held a 6-5 lead a little over two minutes into the game but Ohio State responded with a 14-2 run over 6:25 to take a 19-8 advantage with 11:31 remaining after three free throws from Andre Wesson. The Buckeyes then outscored the Bears 26-10 the remainder of the half, holding a 14-0 lead in points off turnovers, to take a 45-18 lead into the break. Ohio State held Morgan State at a distance after the break, with the Bears getting no closer than 24 at 55-31 with 15:50 left to play. Eleven Buckeyes scored in the final 20 minutes as Ohio State came away with the 33-point win. For the game, the Buckeyes held a 43-31 advantage on the boards, a 22-1 lead in points off turnovers and a 46-18 edge in bench points.

Notes:

- Three Ohio State players scored in double digits: Andre Wesson (19), Kaleb Wesson (13) and CJ Walker (10).
The Buckeyes scored 46 bench points.
The last time Ohio State scored 90 points was in a 90-70 win over Iowa (2/26/19).
Ohio State held Morgan State to 18 points in the first half. The last time the Buckeyes held their opponent to 20 or fewer points in a half was 14 (1) against Stetson (11/18/19). This is the second time the Buckeyes have accomplished the feat this season.
Both Wesson brothers were perfect from the free throw line, combining to go 13-for-13.
Ohio State improved to 3-0 in the all-time series with the Bears.
The Buckeyes led 25-1 in points off turnovers.
Ohio State will be competing in the 2020 Bad Boy Mowers Battle 4 Atlantis along with Creighton, Duke, Memphis, Texas A&M, Utah, West Virginia, and Wichita State. The tournament will take place Nov. 25-27, 2020 on Paradise Island, Bahamas.
Andre Wesson was perfect from the floor and the free throw line, shooting 4-for-4 on 3FG and 3-for-3 for free throws.
Wesson's 19 points and seven rebounds are season highs.
Since joining the starting lineup, Washington has scored a 3-pointer in each of the last six games.

Game 8

No. 6 Ohio State 74, No. 7 North Carolina 49 Dec. 4, 2019, Chapel Hill

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. -- The No. 6 Ohio State men's basketball team used a dominant second half to go on the road to defeat No. 7 North Carolina 74-49 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge at the Dean Smith Center. Duane Washington Jr. led four Buckeyes in double figures with 18 points while E.J. Liddell came off the bench for a career-best 12 points. Kaleb Wesson went for 10 points and nine boards while CJ Walker added 10 points. Cole Anthony paced North Carolina with 15 points while Brandon Robinson chipped in with nine. Ohio State struggled with turnovers in the opening half but took a 29-27 lead into the break. The Buckeyes came out of the half using a 10-3 spurt, capped by layups from Washington Jr. and Kyle Young, to take a 39-30 lead at the 16:49 mark but Anthony responded with a pair of 3-pointers to make it a three-point contest at 39-36 with 15:57 left to play. This time, Ohio State answered with a 15-4 run over the next 4:09, finished by a fast-break dunk by E.J. Liddell, to push its lead to 14 at 52-38 with 11:48 remaining. The Buckeyes then used another 14-0 run over 3:11 to put the game out of reach at 71-47 on a Young layup with 3:40 left in the contest. Ohio State shot 53.6 percent (15-for-28) from the field in the second half and held the Tar Heels to 17-for-62 (27.4 percent) from the field for the game.

Notes:

- The 8-0 start for the Buckeyes is the best for Ohio State since the 2013-14 season when Ohio State opened the season 15-0.
The 25-point margin of victory was the second-largest by an opponent at the Dean Smith Center. The largest margin of victory by an opponent over North Carolina at the Dean Smith Center was a 29-point margin by Duke in an 87-58 win in 2002.
The 27.4 field goal percentage was the lowest by the Tar Heels in the Dean Smith Center.
The 49 points were the third-fewest points by North Carolina at the Dean Smith Center.
Ohio State outscored the Tar Heels by 23 points (45-22) in the second half. The figure is the largest margin by which an opponent has outscored North Carolina in a half at the venue. The previous-highest mark was 22 set by Maryland in 1997 and Temple in 1988.
Ohio State held a 48-32 advantage on the boards, a 25-10 lead in bench points and 30-10 stronghold in points in the paint in the contest.
For the season, Ohio State's bench is outscoring its opponents' bench 244-97.
Ohio State came in limiting its opponents' leading scorers to 10.0 points per game, despite them averaging 15.1 points per game for the season. The Buckeyes continued the trend, limiting Cole Anthony to 15 points on 4-for-15 from the field. Anthony came in averaging 20.7 points per game, the most of any freshman nationally. For the year, Ohio State is holding these opponents to 30.3 percent (30-for-99) from the field and 27.0 percent (10-for-37) from 3-point range.
Four players scored in double figures: Duane Washington Jr. (19), E.J. Liddell (12), CJ Walker (10) and Kaleb Wesson (10).

Game 9

No. 6 Ohio State 106, Penn State 74 Dec. 7, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 6 Ohio State men's basketball team ran past Penn State, 106-74, in its Big Ten opener at Value City Arena. The Buckeyes eclipsed the 100-point mark against a Big Ten opponent for the first time since 2006. Kaleb Wesson notched his third double-double of the season with 28 points and 10 rebounds while Andre Wesson totaled 15 points and five boards and Luther Muhammad and Duane Washington Jr. scored 14 apiece. Izaiah Brockington paced Penn State with 19 points, while Lamar Stevens, who fouled out with 13:26 remaining, scored 11. Ohio State held an 11-9 lead after a Mike Watkins jumper with 13:55 left to play in the opening half but the Buckeyes went on a 9-0 run over the next 5:01 to push the advantage to 20-9 with 8:54 remaining. Brockington hit a pair of shots later in the half to cut the deficit to seven but a pair of D.J. Carton free throws in the waning seconds of the half gave Ohio State a 46-35 lead at the break. The Buckeyes then caught fire from long distance in the second half. With the Buckeyes up 60-50 with 13:26 remaining, Lamar Stevens, the Nittany Lions' leading scorer, fouled Ohio State's CJ Walker on a shot and then picked up a technical for his fifth foul and the disqualification. Walker followed by making 3-of-4 from the line but Penn State answered right back with a 5-0 spurt of their own to make it a 63-55 game with 12:45 left to play.

Notes:

- The 9-0 start for the Buckeyes is the best for Ohio State since the 2013-14 season when Ohio State opened the season 15-0.
The Buckeyes eclipsed the 100-point mark in a Big Ten game for the first time since a 104-69 victory over Penn State Jan. 5, 2006.
The 106 points are the most since Ohio State scored 107 against Purdue Fort Wayne Nov. 11, 2018.
Ohio State's 14 made 3-pointers and 30 made free throws are both season highs.
Ohio State has outscored its last two opponents by at least 20 points in the second half. The Buckeyes outscored Penn State by 21 points (60-39) after outscoring No. 7 North Carolina by 23 points (45-22).
Ohio State came in limiting its opponents' leading scorers to 10.7 points per game, despite them averaging 15.6 points per game for the season. The Buckeyes continued the trend, limiting Lamar Stevens to 11 points on 4-for-8 shooting. For the year, Ohio State is limiting these opponents to 31.7 percent (34-for-107) from the field and 27.5 percent (11-for-40) from 3-point range.
Four Buckeyes scored in double figures: Kaleb Wesson (28), Andre Wesson (15), Luther Muhammad (14) and Duane Washington Jr. (14).
Ohio State improved to 36-17 all-time against Penn State and 19-5 against the Nittany Lions in Columbus.
Luther Muhammad scored a season-best 14 points against the Nittany Lions.
Walker's seven assists tied his career high set three times, most recently against Villanova Nov. 13.
Kaleb Wesson notched his third double-double of the season, going for a season-high 28 points to go along with 10 boards.
Wesson made a career-high four 3-pointers.

MINNEAPOLIS -- The No. 3 Ohio State men's basketball team suffered its first loss of the season, an 84-71 decision at Minnesota. D.J. Carton led Ohio State, which was playing without second-leading scorer Duane Washington Jr., with a career-high 19 points while E.J. Liddell scored a career-best 14 and Kaleb Wesson scored 12. Minnesota's Marcus Carr scored a game-high 35, including 28 in the second half, to go along with seven assists while Gabe Kalschur scored 15 and Daniel Oturu went for 14 points and 13 boards. The contest was back-and-forth early with Ohio State using a Liddell jumper to take a 14-11 lead with 13:15 remaining in the first half. However, Minnesota responded with a 13-2 run over the next 6:00 to pull ahead 24-16 with 7:15 left to play. The Buckeyes cut the deficit to four at 27-23 on a Kaleb Wesson 3-pointer at the 3:49 mark but the Golden Gophers again answered with a run of their own, this time a 9-2 spurt, to go up 36-25 with 1:10 remaining before taking a 38-29 lead into the break. A Luther Muhammad made 3-pointer made it an eight-point game in the opening minute of the second half but Minnesota hit six of its next seven shots from the field, going on a 15-5 run to push the lead to a game-high 18 at 55-37 with 12:29 remaining. Ohio State scored the next six points to trim the deficit to 12 at 55-43 at the 10:15 mark but the Buckeyes would get no closer than nine the remainder of the way.

Holtmann dropped his first December Big Ten contest and now sits 5-1 in such games.
D.J. Carton scored a career-high 19 points on 6-for-12 shooting.
E.J. Liddell went for a career-best 14 points while tying his career-high five rebounds.
Also blocked two shots and recorded two steals.
Andre Wesson made the start against the Golden Gophers, his first since the season-opener against Cincinnati. Wesson suffered an eye injury in that contest and was forced to miss the following two games.
Kaleb Wesson scored 12 points, marking his ninth-consecutive game scoring in double figures.
