QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is in its 46th season with a 833-541 (.606) all-time record.
- The Wildcats have had great success in Memorial Coliseum, sitting at 455-157 (.743) overall in the historic building, including a 168-31 (.844) mark under head coach Matthew Mitchell.
- For the fifth time under head coach Matthew Mitchell and the first since 2015-16, UK started its season with 10 straight wins. UK's best start under MM is 11-0 three times. The previous four times UK has won its first 10 games they have advanced to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 all four years and the NCAA Elite Eight twice.
- Kentucky is currently ranked No. 14 in the AP Top 25 after starting its season ranked or receiving votes for the 11th time under Mitchell.
- Sunday loss vs. top-10 ranked Louisville concluded a 7-game home-stand for UK. During that stretch, UK averaged 80.4 points per game hitting 48.6 percent from the field and 42.9 percent from long range. UK scored 80 or more points in five of the games with 126 assists and just 78 turnovers. Defensively, UK held teams to just 47.4 points per game, 35.5 percent from the field and 23.4 percent from 3.
- The Wildcats have hit 10 or more 3-pointers in each of the last four games, which is the longest stretch in school history of hitting 10 or more 3s in a game. For the year, UK is hitting 37.7 percent from 3.
- UK has forced 9 of their 11 opponents into 20+ turnovers. The Wildcats have forced 256 turnovers this year and scored 272 points off those miscues amassing 33% of its total scoring.
- The Wildcats rank 3rd nationally and first in the SEC in scoring defense, limiting opponents to 47.5 points per game. UK started the season by limiting 10 straight opponents to 54 points or less, which was a program record. UK is the only team in the league that has limited each of its opponents this season to 67 points or less.
- In 45 years, Kentucky has 92 wins over ranked opponents, including 51 of those wins coming under Mitchell.
- Matthew Mitchell became UK WBB's all-time winningest head coach in March of 2013 and now has 291 career wins at UK. Including the storied history of the UK MBB program, he is the fifth Kentucky basketball head coach to win 250 games with the Wildcats joining Adolph Rupp, Joe B Hall, Tubby Smith and John Calipari.

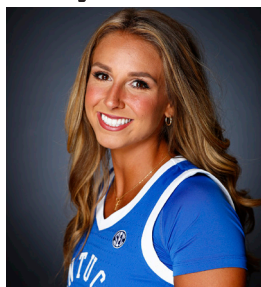

RHYNE HOWARD • 6-2 • SOPHOMORE • GUARD • CLEVELAND, TENN.

- Scored 20+ points in 6 games this season including setting a new career high with 30 points vs. Samford. Leads team with 20.2 ppg and 5.5 rpg.
- Has recorded two double-doubles this season, including 13 points and 11 rebounds at Virginia. Had 14 points and 11 boards vs. The Mount.
- Named SEC Player of the Week on Dec. 10 after scoring 29 points vs. Charlotte and 30 points vs. Samford. Had 26 points vs. UofL (20 in first half).



SABRINA HAINES • 5-10 • RS-JUNIOR • GUARD • PHOENIX, ARIZ.

- Is 24-of-51 from 3 this season, including going 4-of-6 from long range against Middle Tennessee for 12 points. Has 10+ points in eight games.
- Led Kentucky in scoring in its win at Virginia with 17 points, adding three rebounds. Has hit at least one 3-pointer in every game this season.
- Played in 75 career games with 38 starts at Arizona State before her third season was cut short after only nine games due to injury.



AMANDA PASCHAL • 5-7 • RS-SENIOR • GUARD • BROOKLYN, N.Y.

- Led Kentucky against Middle Tennessee scoring a team-high 16 points with six rebounds and three assists. Had career-high 8 assists against MSU.
- Has 44 assists this season. Recorded a team-best five assists against Charlotte and Winthrop and has led UK in assists five times this season.
- Won a national championship in junior college at Gulf Coast State College. Graduated in May 2019



KEKE MCKINNEY • 6-1 • JUNIOR • FORWARD • KNOXVILLE, TENN.

- First career double-double against Stetson with 10 points and 10 rebounds in 32 minutes of play. Leads UK this season with 23 blocks.
- Played 34 minutes against Middle Tenn. with 6 rebounds, 4 blocks and team-best 4 assist. Has 5+ rebounds in 5 games, 7+ points in 6 games.
- Led UK with 29 blocks while she added 33 steals and 34 assists last season scoring five or more points in 15 games with two 10+ performances.



TATYANA WYATT • 6-2 • JUNIOR • FORWARD • COLUMBUS, GA.

- Started 10 games this season averaging 7.9 points and 5.5 rebounds. Career-high tying 10 rebounds against Stetson with nine points.
- Was 5-of-8 from the field and 2-of-3 from 3 against Louisville with 12 points and five rebounds in a season-high 28 minutes of play.
- Strong performance against Winthrop with 10 points and six rebounds going 4-of-8 from the field and 2-of-2 from 3. Is 4-of-7 from 3 this year.



BLAIR GREEN • 6-0 • SOPHOMORE • GUARD • HARLAN COUNTY, KY.

- Tied a career high in scoring against Winthrop with 13 points, going 5-of-13 from the field and 2-of-5 from 3 with four rebounds and two steals.
- Scored 12 points vs. Morehead State and Grambling State, marking the first time she has accomplished the feat in consecutive games in her career.
- Was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team after scoring 10 or more points in four games with four or more rebounds in five games.



JAIDA ROPER • 5-6 • SENIOR • GUARD • MEMPHIS, TENN.

- Amazing performance vs. Winthrop with a career-high 30 points, going 12-of-13 from the field and 3-of-4 from 3 with four assists.
- Came off the bench to score 13 points with two assists, two steals and one rebound against Mount St. Mary's. Went 6-of-8 from FT line in game.
- Career-high eight assists against Stetson and leads Kentucky with 43 assists this season, adding 13 steals. Scored 10+ in five games.



EMMA KING • 5-10 • FRESHMAN • GUARD • STANFORD, KY.

- Played a season-high 17 minutes against Winthrop scoring three points with two rebounds and two assists. Has played in 9 games.
- Came off the bench to play 12 minutes and knocked down two 3s in the season opener vs. Mount St. Mary's. Hit a 3 against Charlotte.
- Led Lincoln County in scoring as a senior averaging 18.5 points and 7.3 rebounds while hitting 44.3 percent from the field and 38.2 percent from 3.



CHASITY PATTERSON • 5-6 • JUNIOR • GUARD • HOUSTON, TEXAS

- Mid-year transfer from Texas who will have to sit out the 2018-19 season but be eligible following the fall semester of 2019.
- The top ranked point guard in the class of 2017 according to ESPN.com and the Big 12 Preseason Freshman of the Year last season at Texas.
- Incredible high school career at North Shore High School in Houston where she finished as the school's all-time leading scorer with 3,177 points.



OGECHI ANYAGALIGBO • 6-1 • RS-SENIOR • FORWARD • MIAMI, FLA.

- Huge 22 minutes in the post at Middle Tennessee with 10 points and seven rebounds, going 5-of-7 from the field.
- Best game came at Tennessee last season, recording a season-high 13 points on 6-of-7 shooting with three rebounds and a steal.
- Came to UK after winning AEC Rookie of the Year honors at Stony Brook in 2016. Missed 16-17 for transfer rules and 17-18 due to injury.



NAE NAE COLE • 6-3 • RS-SENIOR • CENTER • GAINESVILLE, VA.

- Played six minutes against Austin Peay and scored seven points with a rebound going 3-of-4 from the field and 1-of-2 from the free-throw line.
- Played 11 minutes at Virginia - her home state - scoring four points with one rebound. Was a perfect 4-of-4 from the free-throw line in the game.
- Played in 61 career games for the Wolfpack from 2015 to 2018 averaging 7.0 minutes per game during her career.



KAMERON ROACH • 5-6 • JUNIOR • GUARD • HOPKINS, S.C.

- Played in 13 games in 2018-19 seeing 4.2 minutes per game before she tore her Achilles towards the end of 2018-19.
- Is still recovering from the injury last season but should be available for Kentucky closer to league play.
- Saw six minutes in the 2018-19 season opener vs. Alabama State with three steals, four rebounds and recorded her first 3 in a game



DEASIA MERRILL • 6-1 • FRESHMAN • FORWARD • VILLA RICA, GA.

- Will miss the 2019-20 season due to an ACL injury in her right knee that she sustained in preseason practice.
- Was a three-time Atlanta Journal-Constitution First-Team All-State performer and was class 5A player of the year as a senior averaging 25.6 points, 15.4 rebounds, 6.3 assists, 5.2 steals and 4.2 blocks per game



DRE'UNA EDWARDS • 6-2 • SOPHOMORE • FORWARD • LAS VEGAS, NEV.

- Transferred to UK after her freshman season at Utah averaging 11.6 points and 6.7 rebounds en route to Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honors.
- Scored 20 or more points three times for the Utes, including 18 double-digit scoring games. Had 21 points vs. UCLA and Arizona.
- Will miss the 2019-20 season due to NCAA transfer rules and a torn ACL she sustained at the end of the 2019 season.

GAME NOTES

SCOUTING CALIFORNIA

- California enters Saturday's game with a 7-2 record, including a 6-0 mark at home and 1-2 record on the road. After dropping their first two games of the season at Harvard and at top-five ranked UCONN, the Golden Bears have won seven straight including taking down top-25 ranked Arkansas at Haas Pavilion in late November. Cal's other wins are against UC Riverside, San Diego State, North Carolina Central, Long Beach St., Boston and Santa Clara.
- In its last game against Santa Clara, Cal was paced by senior guard Jaelyn Brown, who scored 26 points with 11 rebounds. Freshman forward Evelien Lutje Schiph scored 19 points with nine rebounds while senior center Chen Yue scored 10 points with 10 rebounds, adding a block. The Golden Bears went 0-of-10 from long range in the game but 15-of-20 from the free-throw line and only had four turnovers.
- On the year, California is averaging 72.9 points per game hitting 43.1 percent from the field and 34.8 percent from long range. Cal is limiting teams to just 62.0 points per game, 38.5 percent from the field and 27.4 percent from 3. On top of Cal's 9.4 rebounding margin, it is averaging 14.4 turnovers per game while forcing opponents into 14.8 miscues.
- Brown leads the team in scoring with 15.2 points per game adding 6.8 rebounds per game, while junior forward Alaysia Styles is averaging 10.8 points and 5.1 rebounds per game. Senior guard Sara Anastasieska has hit a team-high 13 3s while senior center CJ West is averaging 9.6 points and a team-best 8.0 rebounds per game. Freshman guard Leilani McIntosh leads the team with 41 assists and 24 steals.

SERIES HISTORY VS. CALIFORNIA

- Sunday will be the second all-time meeting between the two teams in women's basketball with Cal winning the first meeting 62-52 in Lexington on Dec. 21, 2017.

SERIES HISTORY VS. CURRENT ALIGNMENT OF PAC-12

- Kentucky is 8-10 all-time against a team from the current alignment of the Pac-12. Cal is the only Pac-12 team that UK is scheduled to face this season.
- This is the fifth straight year that the Wildcats have played a team from the Pac-12 in regular season non-conference play. The run started vs. Arizona State and Colorado in 2015-16 and 2016-17, before it faced Washington State and Cal in 2017-18 and UCLA in 2018-19.

LAST TIME VS. CALIFORNIA

- Maci Morris scored 21 points and grabbed eight rebounds, but Kentucky lost to No. 24 California 62-52 on Dec. 21, 2017 at Memorial Coliseum.
- Tatyana Wyatt added 10 points, while Alyssa Rice led all players with 10 rebounds in the game. Kentucky controlled the glass, grabbing 43 rebounds to just 31 for Cal. The Wildcats had 25 offensive rebounds, leading to 19 second-chance points, while Cal had just eight second-chance points. Kentucky also got 20 bench points, while Cal had just one.
- Cal had four players in double figures, including 17 points from Asha Thomas and 15 from Mikayla Cowling. Kianna Smith had 14 points while Penina Davidson had 13. Cal went 21-of-44 from the field and 8-of-14 from long range in the game.

BEST STARTS UNDER MITCHELL

- Kentucky started its season with 10 straight wins for the fifth time under Matthew Mitchell. The best start to a season under Mitchell has been 11-0 three times. Below is a look at the best starts under Mitchell and how the season ended.
- 2019-20: UK started 10-0 before falling to Louisville at Rupp Arena.
- 2015-16: UK started 11-0 before falling to Auburn to start league play. The Wildcats finished 25-8, 10-6 SEC that season and lost to Washington in the Sweet 16 at Rupp Arena.
- 2013-14: UK started 11-0 before falling to No. 2/2 Duke at Rupp Arena. The Wildcats finished 26-9, 10-6 SEC that season and lost to Baylor in the Sweet 16 in South Bend.
- 2011-12: UK started 10-0 before falling to No. 3/3 Notre Dame on the road. The Wildcats finished 28-7, 13-3 SEC and won the league regular-season title before falling to UCONN in the Elite Eight in Kingston, R.I.
- 2009-10: UK started 11-0 before falling at Middle Tennessee. The Wildcats went 28-8, 11-5 SEC that season and lost to Oklahoma in the Elite Eight that year in Kansas City.

STRONG EFFORT VS. LOUISVILLE NOT ENOUGH

- In front of 11,256 fans at Rupp Arena, Kentucky put together a strong effort against No. 7 Louisville - including a 40-31 lead at halftime - before falling in the final seconds, 67-66.
- Rhyne Howard scored 26 points - 20 in the first half - to be the game's leading scorer. The sophomore guard had a 3 pointer at the buzzer that bounced off the back of the rim that would have won the game. Two other Wildcats scored in double figures with Sabrina Haines



scoring 12 points and going 3-of-6 from 3, while Tatyana Wyatt also had 12 points going 5-of-8 from the field with two 3s.

- Kentucky had its biggest lead of the game at 55-45 with just over 3:00 to go in the third quarter before the Cardinals went on a 17-2 run over the next 8:00 of play to put them in the driver's seat for the win.

HISTORIC NIGHT IN A HISTORIC VENUE VS. WINTHROP

- It was the Jaida Roper show for Kentucky in its win vs. Winthrop on Wednesday in Rupp Arena as the senior guard scored a career high 30 points - doubling her previous high of 15. Roper went 12-of-13 from the field in the game for 92.3% which is the third best field-goal percentage by a player in a single game in program history. Roper is the first UK player to hit over 90 percent from the field in a game since Jennifer Humphrey vs. Mississippi State on Jan. 25, 2007.
- As a team, Kentucky scored a season-best 91 points and went 33-of-63 from the field and 13-of-23 from long range. The 13 3s made were one off the most 3s made in a game in program history, while UK hit 11 3-pointers in the first half which tied the program record for most 3s hit in the first half. UK also hit 11 3s against Detroit on Dec. 1, 1993. UK hit 13 3s last season against Southern.

DEPTH EVIDENT EARLY FOR WILDCATS

- In Kentucky's season opener against Mount St. Mary's, three Wildcats - Rhyne Howard, Tatyana Wyatt and Jaida Roper - scored in double figures. Against Middle Tennessee, UK also had three players in double figures in Sabrina Haines, Amanda Paschal and Ogechi Anyagalibo. It marked the first time since 2015-16 that the Wildcats have had three or more different players score in double figures in its first two games of the season.
- UK currently has 10 players who are healthy and eligible to play and all 10 have scored at least 15 points this season. Eight of the 10 have scored 10+ in at least one game.
- UK had five players score in double figures against Austin Peay and Winthrop and have had three or more players in double figures in seven of its 10 games this season.
- Roper was the second UK player this season to score 30 or more points after Howard scored a career-high 30 in Kentucky's win vs. Samford. It is the first time since 2009-2010 (Victoria Dunlap, Adia Mathies), that Kentucky has had at least two different players score at least 30 points in a game in the same season. It is the first time two different players have scored 30 points in consecutive games since Karen Mosley and Leslie Nichols in 1983.
- Kentucky scored 50 bench points against Winthrop marking the first time UK has scored 50 bench points in a game since it had 50 against East Tennessee State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on March 20, 2015.

OFFENSE COMING TOGETHER AT RIGHT TIME

- The home stretch for Kentucky has brought the Wildcat offense back to life after a slow start to the season offensively in its first four games. During the seven-game homestand, UK has bested or tied its season high in points five times. The stretched started with 79 points against Morehead State before 81 points against Grambling State and Austin Peay. UK scored 86 points against Charlotte, who was 6-1 to start the game and has two wins over Power 5 schools in Boston College and Wake Forest, before 79 points against Samford. UK posted a season-high 91 points against Winthrop.
- Against Austin Peay, UK shot a season-best 56.7 percent from the field with 21 assists. Against Charlotte, UK scored 29 points in the first quarter, which was the most in a first quarter this season and the second most in any quarter this year before the Wildcats busted open the gates against Winthrop with 32 first-quarter points. The 32 points were the most in any quarter this season for UK. UK had a season-best 23 assists against Samford.
- UK scored 54 first-half points against Winthrop, which was a season high.
- In its last 28 quarters of play, the Wildcats have scored 20 or more points in 16 quarters.
- In the last seven games, UK is hitting 48.6 percent from the field. The Wildcats have also hit 69 3-pointers during that stretch and posted a combined 126 assists with just 78 turnovers. UK has had 40+ first-half points in each of the last seven games and had 20+ point halftime leads in six of those games. Prior to 79 points against Samford, this was the first time UK has scored 80 or more points in three straight games since 2015-16.
- Howard has been huge during the stretch, averaging 23.1 points per game, hitting 46.7 percent from the field, 42.6 percent from 3 and going 25-of-30 from the free-throw line.

IT'S RAINING 3S!

- After a slow start, UK has found its range from outside siting 92-for-244 from 3-point range this season for 37.7 percent. The 92 makes ranks top-15 nationally and second in the SEC, while the percentage also ranks first in the league and top-20 nationally.
- The Wildcats have hit 10 or more 3s in four straight games for the first time in program

history. The stretch started with 10 against Charlotte before 11 against Samford and a season-best 13 against Winthrop. Kentucky had 10 3s against UofL. UK has already hit 10 or more 3s in six games this season. Kentucky hit 10 or more 3s in seven games last season.

- In the last six games, UK is 59-of-142 from 3 for 41.5 percent. During that stretch, Howard is 22-of-49, Haines is 13-of-30, Roper is 9-of-20 and Green is 7-of-17.
- Overall this year, Howard leads UK with 31 3s made for 37.3 percent. She ranks top-20 nationally in total 3s made and second in the league in 3s made and 3s per game and is fifth in 3-point percentage. Haines is 24-of-51 from long range for 47.1 percent, which ranks first in the league and top-25 nationally.
- Kentucky shot 36.4 percent from 3 last season which was the fourth-best 3-point field goal percentage for a season in program history and the second best ever during Coach Mitchell's tenure. UK hit 234 3-pointers, which was the second most in a season in program history. Currently, UK is on track to hit 234 3s this season.

DEFENSE POWERING CATS EARLY

- The Kentucky defense has been fantastic to start the season. UK has allowed just 47.5 points per game which ranks third nationally and first in the SEC. UK is the only team in the league to limit every team they have played this season to 67 points or less. UK limited the first 10 opponents they played this season to 54 points or less, which was a new program record.
- In 44 quarters of play this season, UK has limited its opponent to 10 points or less in 17 quarters and 12 points or less in 30 quarters.
- Teams are shooting just 34.8 percent from the field against UK and 24.4 percent from long range against the Wildcats. UK's field-goal percentage defense and 3PFG defense ranks top-40 nationally and top four in the SEC.
- Against Grambling State, UK limited the Tigers to a season-low 35 points. The Tigers scored five points in the second quarter and six points in the third quarter, marking the second and third lowest quarter scoring output in a game this season.
- Austin Peay entered the Dec. 1 game vs. Kentucky averaging 79.5 points per game with the Wildcats holding the Govs to just 52 points.
- UK held Charlotte - who has two wins over Power 5 schools and entered the game averaging 69 points per game - to a season-low 39 points. The Wildcats locked down Winthrop on defense, allowing just 36 points with the Eagles hitting just 29.8 percent from the field and 16.7 percent from long range. UofL's 67 points was its second fewest this season.

TURNOVERS TELL THE TALE

- In 11 games, Kentucky has forced 256 turnovers and scored 272 points off turnovers. The points off turnovers stats comprises 33 percent of UK's total points.
- UK ranks fourth nationally and first in the SEC in turnover margin at 10.45 per game while it is also top-15 nationally and first in the SEC in turnovers forced per game at 23.27.
- UK has scored 20 or more points off turnovers in nine games and has forced 20 or more turnovers in every game by two (Samford - 18; Louisville - 15).
- Against Morehead State, UK forced 25 turnovers and scored 35 points off those miscues. The Wildcats forced 25 turnovers vs. Grambling State.
- Against Winthrop, UK forced a season-high 35 turnovers and scored a season-high 46 points off turnovers. The 46 points scored off turnovers was the most for UK since scoring 51 points off turnovers vs. Alabama State in the season opener last year.

NOW SLOWING HOWARD DOWN - SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (12/10)

- It has been a strong start to the 2019-20 season for the reigning national freshman of the year as she is averaging 20.2 points per game with 5.5 rebounds per game, 27 assists, 11 blocks and 25 steals. Howard ranks second in the SEC and 13th nationally in field-goals made, sixth nationally and second in the SEC in total points, 15th nationally and second in the SEC in points per game and 18th nationally and second in the SEC in 3s made.
- Howard has scored 20+ points six times this year and became the first Mitchell player to post 20+ points five times in the first nine games of a season. She also has two double-doubles with 14 points and 11 rebounds vs. The Mount and 13 points and 11 rebounds at UVA.
- Howard shined against Charlotte and Samford earning SEC Player of the Week honors on Dec. 10 for the first time in her career. After tying her career high in points with 29 against



Charlotte, Howard set a new high the following game vs. Samford with 30 points. Against Charlotte, Howard went 10-of-18 from the field and 7-of-8 from the free throw line, adding seven rebounds and four steals. She followed that performance by going 11-of-19 from the field and 5-of-8 from 3 against Samford with six rebounds, three assists and three steals.

- Howard has 747 career points, needing 253 more to join the 1,000 point club. Although she will not become the fastest to 1,000 career points in program history - Valerie Still did it in 44 games (!!!) - she needs to average just 12 points over the next 23 games to become the second fastest to 1,000 career points (Leslie Nichols scored 1,000 in 66 games).
- In 43 career games (she missed one game last season due to injury), Howard is already the leading career point scorer on the team and also has recorded some impressive numbers:
 - * Hit at least one 3-pointer in 38 career games
 - * Made three or more 3-pointers in 16 games
 - * Made five or more 3-pointers in 7 games
 - * Scored 10+ points in 36 games
 - * Scored 15+ points in 28 games
 - * Scored 20+ points in 16 games
 - * Led UK in scoring in 24 games
 - * Led UK in rebounding in 23 games

MCKINNEY, WYATT KEY IN POST FOR UK

- Kentucky's two junior posts - KeKe McKinney and Tatyana Wyatt - have been key to the Wildcats' success this season. Both figure to get a majority of the post minutes for the Wildcats. McKinney is averaging 27.9 minutes per game while Wyatt is averaging 18.7. McKinney has started every game while Wyatt has started every game but one.
- Both players have played great so far this season. McKinney is posting 7.0 points and 4.5 rebounds per game while she recorded her first career double-double against Stetson with 10 points and 10 rebounds. McKinney led Kentucky with four assists against Middle Tennessee. The forward missed the final minutes of the UVA game due to injury but returned and started against Morehead State. She has a team-best 23 blocks this season, which ranks high nationally and has recorded four or more blocks in three games.
- Wyatt scored 10 points in the opener with five rebounds and followed with seven points and five rebounds against Middle Tennessee. The junior nearly had a double-double against Stetson with 10 rebounds and nine points and Morehead with 10 points and eight rebounds. Wyatt has scored seven or more points in seven games and has five or more rebounds in seven games. Against UofL, she scored 12 points with five rebounds hitting two 3s. She is averaging 5.5 rebounds and 7.9 points per game this season.

HAINES FITTING RIGHT IN FOR CATS

- Sabrina Haines has been a perfect fit for the Wildcats so far, sitting second on the team with 11.6 points per game. Haines is 24-of-51 from long range for 47.1 percent, while she is averaging 4.7 rebounds per game with 23 assists. She has hit a 3 in every game.
- Haines started her season with seven points and eight rebounds against Mount St. Mary's, while she had 12 points going 4-of-6 from the 3-point line against Middle Tennessee. After recording eight points and six rebounds against Stetson, Haines led Kentucky in scoring at Virginia with 17 points, going 6-of-12 from the field and 2-of-4 from long range. She had 14 points and five rebounds against Morehead State. Against Charlotte, Haines scored 16 points going 3-of-4 from long range with five rebounds and three assist. She had 12 points with four rebounds against Samford, going 4-of-4 from the free-throw line.

KENTUCKY RANKED INSIDE TOP 20 IN BOTH MAJOR POLLS

- For the 11th time under head coach Matthew Mitchell, UK began the season ranked or receiving votes in the Associated Press Top 25 and/or USA Today/Coaches' Top 25. The Wildcats sit at No. 14 in the AP listing while they are No. 13 in the coaches' poll.
- In the AP poll, UK will face No. 5 South Carolina (twice), No. 15 Mississippi State, No. 11 Texas A&M, No. 23 Tennessee and No. 21 Arkansas. In the coaches' poll, UK is scheduled to play No. 6 South Carolina (twice), No. 15 Mississippi State, No. 12 Texas A&M, No. 24 Tennessee, No. 20 Arkansas and LSU, who is receiving votes.
- Tennessee, South Carolina and Mississippi State will all make trips to Lexington this season, setting the stage for some of the biggest games of the season to happen in front of the Big Blue Nation.
- UK started the season ranked No. 13 in the AP poll and No. 16 in the coaches' poll, which was the highest preseason rankings for the Wildcats since the 2014-15 team started at No. 11 in the AP Top 25 and No. 10 in the Coaches' Top 25. UK has finished its season ranked in the top 25 of both major listings nine of the last 10 seasons under Mitchell.
- Kentucky has been a mainstay in the AP poll over the last 10 years. In the last 200 polls, the Wildcats have been ranked or receiving votes 183 times only being left out of 17 polls.

HOWARD NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC BY MEDIA, COACHES

- Sophomore guard Rhyne Howard was tabbed Preseason All-SEC First Team by league media and league coaches. Howard received several player of the year votes by the media.
- Howard is coming off an incredible first season at Kentucky where she was named a unanimous national freshman of the year by espnW, USBWA and WBCA. The national honors were added to her already lengthy list of honors last season as the SEC Freshman of the Year by league coaches and SEC Newcomer of the Year by the Associated Press. She was also named WBCA All-America honorable mention, first-team All-SEC, SEC All-Freshman Team and second-team All-SEC by the AP.

HOWARD ADDS NATIONAL WATCH LISTS TO PRESEASON HONORS

- On day it was the John R. Wooden Award Top 30, the next day was the Citizen Naismith Trophy Top 50 and the three-day span ended with the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Wade Watch List, putting Rhyne Howard on three major national player of the year watch lists this preseason. In early December, Howard was added to the USBWA Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Watch List, which honors the national player of the year in women's college basketball.
- Howard was one of 30 players on the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Watch List and one of 50 players on the Citizen Naismith Trophy Preseason Watch List. The sophomore was also named to the 2020 Cheryl Miller Award Preseason Watch List in late October. The John R. Wooden Award and Citizen Naismith Trophy are presented to the player of the year in women's college basketball while the Cheryl Miller Award is presented to the nation's best small forward.

KENTUCKY PICKED TO FINISH 4TH BY LEAGUE COACHES, MEDIA

- A panel of league media and all 14 league coaches voted the Wildcats to finish fourth in the SEC this season in the annual preseason poll. If the Wildcats do grab a top-four finish in the league, it will be the 11th time in Matthew Mitchell's 13-year tenure the Wildcats have finished in the top tier of the league.
- The coaches' poll: TAMU, SC, MSU, UK, ARK, LSU, UT, AU, MU, UGA, BAMA, VU, MISS, UF.
- The media poll: SC, TAMU, MSU, UK, ARK, UT, AU, LSU, MU, UGA, BAMA, UF, MISS, VU.

DEASIA MERRILL SUSTAINS KNEE INJURY, WILL MISS 2019-20 SEASON

- Freshman forward Deasia Merrill sustained a torn anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee during preseason practice and will miss the 2019-20 season.
- Merrill enrolled at UK this summer as a true freshman after being one of the best players in the state of Georgia in high school. The native of Villa Rica, Ga., was a three-time Atlanta Journal-Constitution First-Team All-State performer and was class 5A player of the year as a senior averaging 25.6 points, 15.4 rebounds, 6.3 assists, 5.2 steals and 4.2 blocks per game. Merrill was a four-star prospect by ESPN.com, which ranked her the 66th best prospect and eighth best forward in the 2019 class.

HOWARD WINS BACK-TO-BACK GOLDS FOR TEAM USA

- In the summers of 2018 and 2019, Rhyne Howard traded in her UK Blue and White for USA Red, White and Blue and shined on the international stage.
- In 2018, Howard played in the FIBA U18 Women's Americas Championship earning MVP honors for the event after averaging 8.5 points and 4.7 rebounds. Howard hit 45.5% from the field and 31.8 percent from long range in the event with 18 assists, 11 steals and 8 blocks.
- The following summer, Howard continued her successful stretch playing for Team USA as she led the Red, White and Blue in scoring on its way to winning the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup championship in Bangkok, Thailand. For her efforts, Howard was tabbed to the all-tournament team. Howard, who had 10 points, seven rebounds, three assists, two steals and two blocks in the championship game, led the USA in scoring throughout the week averaging 13.1 points per game with 5.1 rebounds per game and hitting 44.7 percent from long range.

THE MAGIC "80"

- The Wildcats hold a remarkable 353-23 (.938) record since 1974 when scoring 80 points or more. The last loss came at South Carolin on Feb. 26, 2017 when the Cats fell 95-87 in the regular-season finale. UK is 107-5 (.955) under Mitchell when scoring 80 points or more.

UK IN OVERTIME

- UK is 30-27 all-time in overtime games, including a 11-5 mark under Mitchell, who is 13-6 in his 11-year career as a head coach in OT. UK is 0-0 this season.

KENTUCKY ALL-TIME

- Kentucky is 833-541 (.606) in its 46th year of varsity women's basketball, including 291-126 (.697) in 13 seasons under Matthew Mitchell.

KENTUCKY ALL-TIME AT HOME

- Kentucky is 483-174 all-time at home for a winning percentage of .735. UK is 455-157 (.743) all-time in Memorial Coliseum and 28-19 (.595) all-time in Rupp Arena.
- If you do the math, you will notice UK's losses in Memorial Coliseum and Rupp Arena are two more than UK has home losses. That reason is because UK's NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 game vs. Washington at Rupp Arena on March 25, 2016 and its NCAA Tournament game vs. Indiana on March 18, 1983 at Memorial Coliseum cannot count towards UK's home record.

MITCHELL MOVES INTO ELITE SEC COMPANY

- Kentucky's dominating 89-57 victory over Ole Miss on Jan. 26, 2017 was an historic one for Kentucky head coach Matthew Mitchell. The win was his 97th all-time in SEC play as a head coach, which ranked him 10th all-time on the SEC's career wins list. UK's win at Arkansas on Feb. 16 was Mitchell's 100th career SEC win.
- Since arriving in Lexington in 2007, Mitchell has led Kentucky to unprecedented success. On top of leading UK to its first SEC Regular Season Championship in 30 years in 2012, Mitchell has four SEC Tournament title game appearances, 10 top-four finishes in the league and has coached 21 all-conference performances, including four SEC Player of the Year honorees.

MITCHELL TURNS PROGRAM AROUND

- In 2009-10, Coach Mitchell implemented the "40 minutes of dread" style of play and it started Kentucky on an impressive run of success over the last 10 seasons.
 - Advanced to a school-record eight straight NCAA Tournaments (2010-2017), including three Elite Eight trips during that span with 15 NCAA Tournament wins.
 - Ten top-four SEC finishes, including winning the SEC regular season title in 2012, its first in 30 years.
 - Advanced to the SEC Tournament championship game four times

20+ WIN SEASONS UNDER MITCHELL

- The Wildcats have won 20 or more games 19 times in 46 years of varsity basketball, including a school-record eight in a row from 2010-2017. It's important to note that UK had just 10 20-win seasons in its first 33 years of varsity women's basketball, but has nine in 13 seasons of the Matthew Mitchell era.

WILDCATS RETURN 11 LETTERWINNERS FROM LAST SEASON

- Head coach Matthew Mitchell, who was named the Co-SEC Coach of the Year last season, returned a lengthy list of players for the 2019-20 season, including the reigning unanimous national freshman of the year in Rhyne Howard. In total, the Wildcats returned 63 percent of its scoring, 62 percent of its made 3-point field goals, 87 percent of its offensive rebounding, 81 percent of its total rebounding, 60 percent of its assists, 77 percent of its blocks and 58 percent of its steals.

MORRIS, MURRAY HEADLINE DEPARTING SENIORS FROM 2018-19

- Point guard Taylor Murray and shooting guard Maci Morris have been mainstays in the Kentucky women's basketball program the past four seasons with one of them in the starting lineup in every game but one since the start of the 2015-16 season.
- Morris started all 129 games she played in, missing two games in her career, while Murray played in 127 games with 93 starts. Combined the two scored 3,051 points the past four seasons with 640 assists, 877 rebounds, 409 steals and 310 3-pointers made.

MATHIES ENSHRINED IN HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2019

- A'dia Mathies was enshrined in the UK Athletics Hall of Fame in September of 2019 becoming the second Matthew Mitchell coached player to be inducted into the prestigious hall of fame. Victoria Dunalp was the first. Below is a recap of Mathies career at Kentucky.
- AP All-American second team (2013) and third team (2012) ... Two-time finalist for the John R. Wooden Award and the Naismith Trophy ... SEC Player of the Year as a junior and senior ... UK's all-time leader in steals (320), games played (140) and started (139), while ranking second in scoring (2,014) and 3FG made (177), third in FG made (712), FT made (413) and ninth in assists (349) ... First player in UK history (men or women) to accumulate over 2,000 points, 600 rebounds, 300 assists and 300 steals in a career... Part of UK's all-time winningest class with an overall 111-30 (.787) record ... Helped UK claim an SEC regular-season title for the first time in 30 years in 2012 ... Advanced to four NCAA Tournament Sweet 16s and three Elite Eights.

THE KENTUCKY WBB COACHING STAFF HAS ...

- Combined the Kentucky women's basketball staff has compiled over 80 years of experience at the Division I level, including coaching or playing in a combined 42 NCAA Tournaments with eight Final Fours, four national championships and a WNBA Championship.



- Elzy and Butts are in their second stint in Lexington after serving on Mitchell's staffs before. Butts was an associate head coach on Mitchell's first staff at Kentucky before Elzy joined the staff for four successful seasons. Amber Smith is in her second year as an assistant coach but has been a part of the Kentucky program for nearly a decade.

CATS SHINE IN THE CLASSROOM

- Matthew Mitchell has put an emphasis on academics since arriving on campus as the Wildcats have had a 3.0 team GPA or better each of the last 12 semesters. In the fall of 2016, the Wildcats posted a 3.517 team GPA, which was the highest GPA for a semester in the Mitchell era. UK followed that with a 3.464 team GPA in the spring with four players earning 4.0s. Under Mitchell, 42 Wildcats have been tabbed to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and 100 percent of Mitchell's players have received their degrees.

- Kentucky women's basketball currently has eight alumnae who signed professional contracts to play overseas for the 2019-20 season.

10 STRAIGHT YEARS TOP 20 IN ATTENDANCE

- Big Blue Nation has shown its support once again as the University of Kentucky women's basketball program ranked 18th nationally in average attendance during the 2018-19 season with 4,767 fans per game. This marks the 10th straight year the Wildcats have finished in the top 20 in NCAA national average attendance.
- Throughout 18 home games – two played inside historic Rupp Arena – Kentucky accumulated a total season attendance of 85,807, an increase over last year's previous home attendance of 82,984.
- Kentucky has averaged 4,500 or more fans every year since 2009-10. The Wildcats have continuously pushed the school's attendance numbers to new altitudes. Kentucky was a part of two of the top-15 most attended games in the nation during the 2018-19 season.
- The Wildcats attracted large crowds not only in Lexington, but all across the country. A total of 154,112 fans attended Kentucky games, ranking the team 15th nationally.
- The Southeastern Conference once again led the nation in attendance with an average of 4,277 fans per game and a total attendance of 1,009,427. The Big Ten remained second in the rankings with a total attendance of 957,325.

MATTHEW AND JENNA MITCHELL DONATE \$1 MILLION TO UK ATHLETICS

- In June of 2014, Coach Matthew Mitchell and his wife, Jenna, pledged \$1 million over the next 10 years to the University of Kentucky Athletics Department. The donation will provide UK Athletics \$100,000 per year over the next 10 years to be used for a variety of capital projects, including updates and renovations for football. The donation is the largest ever given by a UK athletics employee to the athletics department.

- The Coliseum was built in 1950 and serves as a memorial to every Kentuckian who lost their life serving their country.
- A massive new LED video board spanning approximately 1,800 square feet with dimensions of 30 feet by 60 feet was installed in Memorial Coliseum in 2018.
- Wildcat fans are passionate about their basketball, that's why UK has ranked in the nation's top 25 and in the SEC's top four in attendance 16 straight years.
- The Cats are 168-31 at Memorial in the Matthew Mitchell Era.
- UK averaged 5,186 fans per game in 2017-18 which ranked 15th nationally.
- UK drew 116,164 fans for its home games in 2015-16 the second-highest total attendance in school history.

Rupp Arena (20,500)

- Rupp Arena is entering its 44th season.
- An awesome structure in sight and scope, the arena is divided into two seating areas. The lower level features 10,000 cushioned theater seats while the upper arena has new chairback seats on the sidelines. The latter can be visually isolated to provide more natural setting for small shows.
- The Wildcats command an exclusive and updated state-of-the-art locker room, while other amenities include six team-size dressing rooms and eight smaller units.
- In 2013-14, UK set the new single-game attendance record when 23,706 fans saw UK face No. 2 Duke in Rupp Arena on Dec. 22, 2013. The attendance marked the largest crowd ever to see a college women's hoops game in the Commonwealth — the previous mark was 22,152 for the first Kentucky-Louisville game played in the KFC Yum! Center on Dec. 5, 2010.
- In 2015-16, Kentucky packed 17,150 fans in Rupp Arena on Dec. 20 against Duke, which was the fourth-largest home crowd in program history. On Dec. 10, the Wildcats had 14,425 fans at the historic arena, which was the sixth-largest home crowd in school history.
- Kentucky will play two games inside Rupp Arena in 2019-20.

- Under his leadership, 42 Wildcats have been SEC Academic Honor Roll members and 100 percent of Mitchell's players have received their degrees. UK has secured a team GPA of 3.0 or better for 12 straight semesters.
- Five WNBA draft picks, including three in the first round - Dunlap was UK's first WNBA first round draft pick when she was chosen as the 11th overall pick in the 2011 WNBA Draft and A'dia Mathies was selected 10th overall by the Los Angeles Sparks in the 2013 draft. Last year, Evelyn Akhator became UK's highest ever pick when she went third overall to the Dallas Wings before Makayla Epps went 33rd overall to Chicago.

- Gave \$100,000 of his new seven-year contract (May, 2012) back to the University of Kentucky for academic purposes.
- In 2014, pledged \$1 million over the next 10 years to UK Athletics through the Mitchell Family Foundation.
