

UK is 3-1 this season vs. AP Top 25 opponents

Kentucky is making its 19th alltime appearance on ESPN College GameDay, tied for the second most among all schools. The Wildcats are 8-10 as the featured GameDay matchup but have won three straight

Nick Richards was named the NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week and the SEC Co-Player of the Week after averaging 22.0 points, 11.0 rebounds and 3.5 blocks per game in wins over Georgia and Texas Tech

Richards ranks among the national leaders in field-goal percentage (fifth), blocks per game (24th) and double-doubles (26th)

Ashton Hagans ranks among national leaders in assists (sixth) and steals (24th) per game

Media Information

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Requests for single-game credentials should be made as far in advance as possible and no later than five days prior to game day online at sportssystems.com/Kentucky.

CREDENTIAL CRITERIA

The University of Kentucky's decision to issue credentials to a media outlet for the purposes of covering a UK basketball home or away event is determined by a variety of factors. They include the following:

- Amount of coverage given to Kentucky throughout

- Amount of coverage given to Kentucky throughout the season intention/ability to cover all 22 sports at Kentucky Distribution/size of publication: free, subscription, sale on newstands, website traffic, etc. Radio or TV station program format and size of audience Length of existence of the publication, amount of original copy generated, number of full-time employees of the publication and the journalistic experience of the reporter(s) Attendance at Kentucky media sessions, including Olympic sport opportunities Space availability Professionalism, which includes but is not limited to conduct at games, press conferences, practices, on social media, etc.

The University of Kentucky has the right to revoke credentials under its own discretion.

INTERVIEW POLICIES-GENERAL

All interviews with University of Kentucky basketball players or staff members must be arranged through the Communications and public relations office. Media should never contact a player or coach directly.

The Wildcat Coal Lodge, dormitories, team locker rooms and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate university personnel.

PRACTICE/PRESS CONFERENCES
Other than announced exceptions, UK basketball practices are closed to the media. UK will accept requests to attend practice. All requests must be made by 10 a.m. the day before the practice. In cases in which practices are open to the media, no cell phones are allowed in the practice facility.

Player interviews are conducted prior to practices the day before a game and will be available to all UK media in the Joe Craft Center lower-level lobby. UK will accept requests for player interviews, but they must be submitted 24 hours prior to the scheduled availability.

Coach John Calipari or an assistant coach will meet with members of the media immediately following player interviews in the lower level lobby of the Joe Craft Center.

Gameday shoot-arounds are closed to the media.

TELEPHONE PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Telephone interviews are available to the media on a call-back basis. Individual player and coach telephone numbers will not be given to members of the media.

Players are instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted directly by telephone. The communications and public relations office will arrange for telephone interviews at a time most convenient for the student-athlete.

Other special requests are handled on a case-by-case basis.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Following each game, there is a cooling-off period, during which time the players shower and dress. Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, Coach Calipari conducts his postgame press conference while a player is taken to the UK Sports Network.

Following Coach Calipari's press conference and the cooling-off period, selected UK players are brought to the media interview room.

Cats Sink Commodores With Strong Second Half

LEXINGTON, Ky. - Just as Vanderbilt was poised to take control for good, No. 13 Kentucky seized momentum and the game by getting stops and turning them into baskets. The Wildcats ended up maintaining their roll and handed the Commodores a record they didn't want to discuss.

Tyrese Maxey scored 10 of his 17 points in the second half, and Kentucky used a 23-12 run to rally past Vanderbilt for a 71-62 victory Wednesday night that dealt the Commodores their record 25th consecutive Southeastern Conference regular season loss.

Kentucky's effort followed a subtle reminder from coach John Calipari to take charge better than they did during a nerve-wracking first half featuring breakdowns on both ends.

"Why did you think I didn't go crazy in the first half and I didn't in the locker room?" he said. "It's your team. You want to lose, go ahead. I'm fine. It's your team. If you play harder and put it on them a little bit and make them make tough plays and get back in it, you will be fine."

The Wildcats (16-4, 6-1 SEC) trailed 40-30 early in the second half before mounting the big run over 8:45 to lead for good at 53-52 on two Immanuel Quickley free throws with 8:33 remaining. Three-point plays by Ashton Hagans, EJ Montgomery and Quickley helped the surge, and Richards added consecutive baskets for a little more breathing room. Maxey took over from there, scoring nine of Kentucky's next 10 points, including six consecutive to make it a seven-point cushion.

The Wildcats improved from 38.5% shooting in the first half to hit 53.3% in the second and finished at 46.4% overall (26 of 56). They also outrebounded the Commodores 37-29 and finished 11-0 in second-chance points.

Asked what sparked the turnaround, Maxey said, "just our competitive spirit and then Nick, honestly. And just to go out there, be competitive defensively and get multiple stops in a row."

Richards had 15 points and 11 rebounds despite foul trouble that limited him to just five minutes in the first half. He recorded 14 points and 10 rebounds after halftime for his ninth double-double of the season and fifth in his last nine games.

Hagans added 12 points, and Quickley 11 as the Wildcats won their fourth consecutive game and eighth in the last nine.

"Whether I was on the court or not, the guys would've stepped it up," Richards added. "Everybody would've found their rhythm, everybody would've made shots, we'd have found a way to get back in the game."

Meanwhile, the Commodores (8-12, 0-7) broke the SEC mark for futility it briefly shared with Sewanee, which dropped 24 in a row from 1938-40 before leaving the conference. Vanderbilt also dropped its seventh in a row to Kentucky. Remarkably, four of those losses to Kentucky have featured double-digit leads by the Commodores.

- This marked UK's first double-digit comeback win since Feb. 26, 2019, at home vs. Arkansas. It's the fourth straight season UK has rallied from a double-digit deficit to defeat Vanderbilt
- Kentucky is 14-0 this season when outrebounding the opponent

- UK is 182-7 (.963) under Calipari when keeping the opponent to 63 points or less.

Auburn-Kentucky Evolving into Marquee Matchup; College GameDay on Site

After meeting three times a season ago, including an overtime thriller for a spot in the 2019 Final Four, the Kentucky-Auburn matchup is evolving into must-see TV. After the Wildcats won 18 straight from 2001 to 2015, the series is tied 3-3 over the last six meetings. Highlighting the intrigue of Saturday's matchup, ESPN's College GameDay will originate from Auburn, Alabama, for the first time in its history.

This will be the 19th time Kentucky has appeared on GameDay, tying North Carolina for second most in show history. It will mark the 11th straight season UK has made an appearance. The Wildcats are 8-10 in College GameDay appearances and have won their last three matchups.

Although Kentucky owns an all-time record of 94-20 against the Tigers, including a 31-15 edge in Auburn, the series has been deadlocked for the last four seasons. Three of those matchups have been decided by six points or less. Including Saturday's matchup, each of the last five meetings have seen both of the teams either appearing in the Associated Press Top 25, or sitting just outside with receiving votes.

Saturday's game will mark Kentucky's fifth AP Top 25 matchup of the season. UK is 3-1 thus far this season in such games.

Beginning with a 75-70 Auburn win in January of 2016 in which UK was rated No. 14 in the country, the matchup between the two teams have provided some classics. That game saw the Tigers rally from a five-point halftime deficit for the win despite UK's Tyler Ulis nearly registering a triple-double with 17 points, 10 rebounds and eight assists. The 2017 matchup endured UK guard De'Aaron Fox fouling out with 7:23 to play and nearly 50 fouls called, but Kentucky rallied to win by 20 points. In 2018, Auburn assembled a 13-2 run to turn a four-point deficit into a 68-61 lead with 3:57 remaining as the No. 10 Tigers held off a rally by the young Wildcats.

Last season, Kentucky won both regular-season meetings. The first came at Auburn with the No. 12 Wildcats surviving the No. 14 Tigers as Tyler Herro scored 10 points over the final 5:23 to stave off a 17-point rally by the home team. In Lexington, UK earned a dominating 80-53 win, but it would spark quite the run by the Tigers. Auburn went on to win 11 straight games, including a Southeastern Conference Tournament crown and wins over Kansas and North Carolina in the NCAA Tournament to meet the Cats in the Elite Eight. Auburn's winning streak continued as it rallied from a 10-point first-half hole and forced overtime on a Bryce Brown layup with 38 seconds to go. The Tigers pulled away in the extra minutes for a six-point win to advance to the program's first Final Four, despite 28 points and 13 rebounds from Kentucky's PJ Washington.

This year's matchup is once again a top-20 showdown with Kentucky owning a No. 13 ranking and the Tigers at No. 17. Auburn ranks ninth in the nation in rebounds per game (41.1) and 15th in offensive rebounding (13.30). Auburn scores 31% of its points from long range and owns a 14-game home winning streak dating back to last season.

Samir Doughty leads the Tigers in scoring at 14.8 points per game, while Austin Wiley has seven double-doubles and is averaging 10.1 points and 9.2 rebounds per game.

UK Participating in Coaches Powering Forward

Saturday at Auburn, Kentucky's coaches will join fellow coaches from around the country to help raise awareness for autism through Coaches Powering Forward for Autism benefiting Autism Speaks. UK's coaches will be wearing the blue puzzle piece pin on their suit jackets.

The symbolic act is a part of college basketball's autism awareness weekend, an effort started by Towson head coach Pat Skerry and South Florida assistant coach Tom Herrion. It has since gone national with support from the National Association of Basketball Coaches and Autism Speaks.

What is it About Double-Digit Comebacks Against Vanderbilt?

For the first time this season, Kentucky came back from a 10-point deficit to earn a victory against Vanderbilt by a 71-62 score. It was the first double-digit comeback victory since Feb. 26, 2019, at home against Arkansas last season.

UK utilized a 7-0 run during the second half to slowly chip away at the deficit. A pair of Immanuel Quickley free throws gave UK its first lead of the second half at 53-52 with 8:33 to play. The Wildcats eventually pulled away by double digits in the final minutes thanks to strong play from Tyrese Maxey and a Nick Richards dunk-fest.

The victory marked the fourth time during a seven-game winning streak vs. the Commodores that UK has won despite facing a double-digit deficit. Also, Kentucky faced its largest halftime deficit (seven points) of the season and the second-highest deficit (17 vs. Utah) during any game.

Big-Game Cal, Cats

John Calipari's teams aren't just good against the best teams in the country, they're great. Not only does Kentucky own a 62-32 record (.660) vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams under John Calipari, UK is 7-4 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five.

All-time, Calipari is 13-8 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five. When both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25, Calipari's all-time record is 85-55, including a 54-28 mark at Kentucky. When both are ranked in the top 10 he has a 27-19 record, including 16-12 at UK.

Kentucky has answered the bell of big-time showdowns again this season. UK is 3-1 vs. AP Top 25 teams, including 2-1 vs. top-five teams at the time.

By defeating top-ranked Michigan State to start the season, UK knocked off the No. 1 team in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. Last season, Kentucky downed Tennessee on Feb. 19, 2019. With the win over MSU, the Wildcats now have nine victories over the No. 1 team in 25 tries.

Calipari improved to 6-4 vs. the No. 1 team in his career with the win vs. Michigan State, including 3-2 at Kentucky. According to ESPN, Calipari is the only coach with a winning (.600) percentage against No. 1 ranked teams with a minimum of 10 games faced against the No. 1.

Nick and Quick at the Heart of Recent Run

Beginning with the Louisville game, Kentucky has won eight of its last nine games and is playing like one of the best teams in the country. The Wildcats have wins over ranked opponents, key road victories in hostile environments and have put themselves near the top of the Southeastern Conference race during the stretch.

It's been a team effort, but two players in particular have stood out as the Wildcats have re-emerged on the national scene: Nick Richards and Immanuel Quickley. They're playing at an All-SEC-caliber level beginning with the Louisville win.

Confident Richards Writing His 'Own (Dominant) Story'

Every player is on their own timetable, John Calipari has repeated throughout his time at Kentucky. For some that means breaking through after their freshman season. For others it may mean two, three or four years of development. Maybe no player is a better example of that than Nick Richards.

The junior forward is not only enjoying the most productive season of his career, he's producing one of college basketball's best stories of the season. After averaging 4.5 points, 3.9 rebounds and 1.1 blocks over 13.4 minutes a game in the first two seasons of his career, he has emerged as a leading candidate for Southeastern Conference Player of the Year and All-America honors.

Richards leads the team in scoring (14.4 per game), rebounding (8.3 per game), blocks (2.4 per game) and double-doubles (nine) while shooting a conference-high .673 percentage. That mark is also good for fifth in the nation, through games on Jan. 29, and just barely trails Marcus Lee's 2015-16 single-season school-record mark of 68.0% (minimum 150 attempts).

The centerpiece of a frontline that entered the season with questions about its depth and talent after losing PJ Washington and Reid Travis to the pros, Richards has squashed any and all concerns about his ability to produce.

"How many guys have 7-footers that can do what that kid does?" John Calipari said after the Texas Tech game. "Not many."

Case in point: Richards is one of just two players in the country averaging at least 14.0 points per game, at least 8.0 rebounds and at least 2.0 blocks while shooting at least 65.0% from the floor.

In a program headlined by one-and-done success stories, Richards stuck to his own timetable. He didn't start playing basketball until midway through his teenage years, so not only was he behind the traditional development curve, he also lacked the demonstrated performance of his peers. Now that he's built his own confidence, he is playing like one of the best players in the country -- and was awarded as on Jan. 27, winning his second national player of the week award and his second SEC Player of the Week honor.

"Everybody has their own story," Richards said after the Texas Tech game. "Just because I go to a school that's known for one-and-done doesn't mean I



have to be one-and-done. It took me time to develop over the past three years. I've had the best time of my life. Meeting incredible people, having the best coaching staff in the world training me to be the player I am right now and to be a better player for times to come.'

Richards played well early in the season, but his recent meteoric rise began vs. Louisville and has continued into the conference season. Despite impressive early numbers, Richards had yet to fully break through vs. consistent, upper-level competition. Against Louisville's front line, one of the best in the country, Richards delivered. The 6-foot-11 big man from Jamaica secured a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds, but it was how he did it that impressed the most.

Playing the final 8:53 of regulation and all five minutes of overtime with four fouls, Richards took two momentum-changing charges and scored seven straight points in overtime with the game on the line. With Louisville leading 68-65 with 2:21 to go in overtime, Richards snared an offensive rebound (one of six in the game) and converted the traditional three-point play to even the score once again. His free throws with 27 seconds remaining gave the Wildcats a 72-70 lead they would not relinquish. Richards also drew a game-high 11 fouls to get Kentucky to the free-throw line, a key difference in the outcome. His defense was a difference maker.

The double-double for Richards was his first against a ranked opponent in his three seasons. In 20 games prior against ranked foes, Richards averaged 3.8 points and 3.9 rebounds per game. He had never recorded double-digit scoring or rebounding numbers against a ranked opponent. Now he's done it in two straight after a monster 25-point, 14-rebound, four-block game at Texas Tech.

In the game in Lubbock, Texas, Richards became just the second Wildcat in the Calipari era to post at least 25 points, 14 rebounds and four blocks in a game. National Player of the Year Anthony Davis did it in 2012.

Richards was dominant from start to finish vs. the Red Raiders. After setting the tone early in the game with a thunderous block and a handful of intimidating swats, he took over in overtime with seven points, including the game-winning free throws with 10 seconds left and nearly 15,000 hostile fans screaming at him to miss.

Over the last nine games, Richards is averaging a team-high 17.3 points, 9.9 rebounds and 2.6 blocks with five double-doubles. In SEC play, Richards is tallying a team-high 16.9 points, 9.3 rebounds and 2.6 blocks per game.

As Richards goes, so does UK. Kentucky 15-1 this season when he scores in double figures, 9-0 when he grabs double-digit rebounds and 6-1 when he blocks at least four shots.

Quickley Emerging as Go-To Option

John Calipari called Immanuel Quickley the most improved player on the 2018-19 team, but his development from last season to this one might be even more impressive.

Quickley, now a sophomore, has scored in double figures in 15 of the 19 games he's played. Overall, he's averaging 13.8 points per game and proven to be Kentucky's best perimeter shooter. He's made a team-high 34 3-pointers -- including making a 3 in 17 of 19 games he's played -- and shooting a team-high 39.5% from behind the arc after a slow start.

Emerging as one of the Wildcats' go-to threats down the stretch, Quickley has hit a number of big shots late in games, including a step-back jumper at South Carolina to tie the game -- two of seven straight points he scored in the final minute -- key 3-pointers in second-half rallies vs. Louisville, at Georgia, vs. Alabama and at Arkansas, and clutch free throws to close out games vs. Louisville, Alabama and Texas Tech.

Quickley's torrid shooting streak finally cooled off in the game at Arkansas, but he is still averaging a 16.9 points per game to go along with 5.1 rebounds and 22 3-pointers over the

'The kid lives in the gym," Calipari said. "He's kind of like Tyler (Herro). He's like Shai (Gilgeous-)Alexander, those guys. He's just like them."

After Tyler Herro set a new school record at the free-throw line last season, Quickley is threatening to make it a short-lived mark. Quickley is currently making 91.5% at the line, just behind Herro's 93.5%. He's ranked first in the Southeastern Conference (through games on Jan. 29) and sixth in the nation. He had a stretch of 24 consecutive makes.

Quickley really emerged in the rivalry game vs. Louisville. After scoring 16 points in three previous games for his career high, Quickley set a new mark with 18 points in the win over No. 3/4 Louisville. Quickley made two key 3-pointers and was 8 of 8 from the free-throw line, including two in the final seconds of overtime to seal the outcome.

The Maryland native earned the opportunity for a career game offensively because of a stellar day defensively. Calipari told his team that whoever could guard Louisville's leading scorer, Jordan Nwora, would get significant playing time. Quickley answered the call and took on the majority of the assignment. Nwora, who came into the game averaging 21.2 points per contest, was held to just eight points on 2-of-10 shooting. He currently ranks as "excellent" in Synergy Sport's defensive rankings and among the best guards in the country.

Quickley is on a career-best nine-game double-figure scoring streak, including a career-high 23 points vs. Missouri that included a 4-of-4 day from behind the 3-point line. He's scored 20 or more points three times during the stretch and made three or more 3-pointers four times, including a career-high five vs. Alabama.

Hagans One of the Best Point Guards in the Country

Ashton Hagans certainly has the confidence of his head coach in year two as Kentucky's starting point guard.

"We could say there are better point guards in the country, but you got to tell me who you're talking about," John Calipari said.

With the way Hagans is playing, there are few rebuttals.

Hagans has been the consummate point guard in his sophomore season, doing a little bit of everything to affect the game. He is averaging 13.2 points, 7.2 assists, 4.3 rebounds and 2.2 steals per game while grabbing the leadership reins of a talented but once again young team. He's the only player in the nation averaging at least 13.0 points, 7.0 assists, 4.0 rebounds and

The Cartersville, Georgia, native has boasted double-figure scoring in 15 of 20 games, including a career-high 26-point performance in the win over Utah Valley. He's dished out three or more assists in every game and has five or more in 18 of the 20, including a career-high-tying 12 vs. UAB. His streak of 10 games with six or more assists was snapped with five dimes at Georgia. It was the best run by a Wildcat under John Calipari and the best run since Roger Harden dished six or more in 12 straight from Jan. 11 to Feb. 15, 1986.

For the season, Hagans is averaging 7.2 assists per game, ranked sixth in the country, tops in the league (through games on Jan. 29) and ahead of Tyler Ulis' 2015-16 school-record pace (7.0 per game). With 144 assists and 67 turnovers, Hagans' 2.2 assist-to-turnover ratio is second in the conference (through games on Jan. 29).

Hagans has flirted with a triple-double on a number of occasions this season, the latest of which was a 15-point, nine-assist, nine-rebound game vs. Alabama, Underscoring his coach's ability in him, Hagans posted that line and Calipari wasn't satisfied.

'That's how much I think of (him)," Calipari said. "You're a triple-double, and I'm saying you're better.'

The reigning Southeastern Conference Defensive Player of the Year remains UK's best onball defender with a team-high 44 steals, and even those numbers don't really do him justice. His ability to disrupt opposing teams' offense was on full display in road wins at Georgia and

Hagans posted three steals vs. the Red Raiders, but it was the plays that didn't show up as steals that helped preserve the win. Down the stretch, he forced three key turnovers, including knocking the ball off a defender's foot on the sideline, running the length of the floor to tip away what would have been a transition alley-oop dunk, and swatting away the potential game-tying shot in the closing seconds of overtime.

It is plays like those that have put Hagans on the midseason watch list for the Naismith National Defensive Player of the Year award for a second season in a row and a big reason why the Wildcats are plus-212 this season with him on the floor, a team high.

"He's the most indispensable player on this team," ESPN analyst Jay Bilas recently said. "Without Ashton Hagans, a lot of fight goes out of this Kentucky team."

Said national writer Jeff Goodman: "Lots of great defensive players out there, but I'll take Ashton Hagans over all of them."

Hagans has done all this while fighting through a pair of nagging injuries this season. He battled lower leg pain for the first handful of games to start the season and played through a left ankle sprain early in the SEC season.

Maxey at his Best Against the Best

Expectations for Tyrese Maxey escalated after he shot the roof off Madison Square Garden in his college debut in early November.

After scoring 26 points in front of a national audience vs. the No. 1 team in the country at the time, Michigan State, many expected him to do that on a nightly basis. It was a high bar for a freshman who would have to endure the same ups and downs just about every freshman has to that puts on a Kentucky uniform.

Now 20 games into the season, what everyone has found out is that Maxey still has that potential. It just tends to come out when the stakes are at their highest.

Highlighted by a career-high 27-point performance in the victory over No. 3/4 Louisville, Maxey is averaging 18.8 points and 5.3 rebounds while shooting 46.9% from the field, 42.1% from 3-point range and 84.0% from the free-throw line in UK's four games vs. ranked foes.

Maxey's 26 points in the 1-2 matchup vs. Michigan State topped Terrence Jones' 25 points against East Tennessee State in 2010 for the most points by a freshman in their debut as a Wildcat. In that game, Maxey's first points didn't come until just after the midway point of the first half, but he scored seven straight points to help Kentucky earn an 11-point halftime lead. From the 10:03 mark of the second half until a pair of Ashton Hagans' free throws with 37 seconds to play, Maxey scored or assisted on 14 straight UK points to hold off the Michigan State rally.

There was no bigger shot that night though than his final 3-pointer with a minute to play. Michigan State had cut the lead to just two and momentum seemed to be swinging to the veteran-laden Spartans. In front of two former UK stars, John Wall and Jones, as well as NBA champion Kevin Durant, Maxey took 6-foot-6 Aaron Henry off the dribble and launched a shot four feet behind the 3-point line. With one swish of the net, Maxey etched his name into Kentucky record books and introduced himself to the nation.

Against Louisville, he made a career-high nine field goals (on 14 shots), sunk a career-best four 3-pointers and tied a career high with seven rebounds. His 27 points are the most by a UK freshman vs. Louisville and the most by a Wildcat in the rivalry since Jodie Meeks score 28 on Jan. 4, 2009.

Highlighted by three 20-point performances, Maxey -- a three-time Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week selection -- is averaging 13.2 points per game. He's scored in double figures in 13 games with 22 3-pointers. He flirted with a triple-double in his first true road test at Georgia on Jan. 7. Maxey had 17 points, seven rebounds, a career-high eight assists, a career-high four blocks and a steal in 39 minutes against the Bulldogs.

The importance of Maxey on the court was evident in the loss at South Carolina. Maxey suffered a leg contusion that limited him to 15 minutes in the second half. With Kentucky leading

by 13 with 11:39 to play, Maxey exited with his injury. When he returned to the floor with 7:46 to play, the lead was just three for the Wildcats. He also sparked the decisive 15-0 second-half run at Arkansas with five straight points. Maxey had 10 second-half points to lead a double-digit comeback effort at home against Vanderbilt.

Maxey's defense has made huge strides, including holding Georgia Tech's leading scorer Michael Devoe, who entered the game averaging 21.4 points per game, to just five points. Maxey's defense was so good that ESPN analyst Jay Bilas called Maxey the player of the game despite going 0 for 9 from the floor.

Sestina Nearing 1,000 Career Points

Kentucky's most veteran player, Nate Sestina, is nearing a career milestone. Sestina needs 12 more points to reach 1,000 collegiate points for his career split between Bucknell and UK.

Sestina, considered one of UK's team leaders for his floor presence and energy, is averaging 6.6 points and 4.7 rebounds per game. His career-high five 3-pointers against No. 5 Ohio State appeared to help spearhead a resurgence from long range for the Cats, who have drained six or more in five of the last 10 games beginning with the Ohio State contest.

Sestina a Candidate for Senior CLASS Award

Nate Sestina is one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award. Honoring student-athletes who excel both on and off the court, the candidates must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence in community, classroom, character and competition to be eligible for the award.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

Ten finalists will be named in February and placed on the official ballot for a nationwide vote from fans, coaches and media. The winner will be announced during the 2020 NCAA Men's Final Four in Atlanta in April.

Sestina graduated from Bucknell University in May with a degree in geography before transferring to Kentucky as a graduate student this summer. He is enrolled in UK's master's program in health promotion with an emphasis in sport leadership. While at Bucknell, he was a 2019 Patriot League Academic Honor Roll member during his senior season as well as being a part of the dean's list.

Throughout his collegiate career, Sestina has been a mainstay in the community. In just a few short months at Kentucky, he's already participated in serving the Salvation Army, packing lunches, distributing to a local school and playing backyard games with a local elementary school as a part of God's Pantry.

He also participated in a similar project while at Bucknell. One of his favorite community service projects while at Bucknell involved coordinating and executing a local marathon with other student-athletes. Sestina is also active at home while he is visiting family during his breaks from college. He can often be found offering motivational speeches to the football and basketball teams at his former high school. He pops in and reads to the elementary school

students. Sestina also volunteers at his church, where he packs and organizes donations and distributes the items to families. During the holiday season, he joins his family in singing carols and helping decorate at The Manor, a local assisted living facility.

A native of Emporium, Pennsylvania, Sestina was the first athlete from his hometown to earn an athletic scholarship to a Division I program since the 1970s.

Sestina's freshman season ended prematurely due to a shoulder injury just as he was working his way into the lineup. He chipped away at playing time and eventually carved a starting role during his senior season.

He was an All-Patriot League Second Team and PL All-Tournament Team selection his senior season despite not starting a single game prior to his final season at Bucknell. Adding to his successful senior campaign, he was a National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District Team selection. He ranked second on the team and sixth in the Patriot League in scoring at 15.8 points per game. He paced the Bison and ranked second in the league in rebounding at 8.5 boards per outing. He shot 53.6% from the field, 38.0% from 3-point range and 80.8% from the free-throw line. He's scored in double figures more than 40 times in his career and has 10-plus games with a double-double.

This season, Sestina is averaging 6.6 points and 4.7 rebounds per game for the Wildcats. He's connecting on 44.6% of his field goals, as well as career highs from both 3-point range (41.0%) and the charity stripe (81.5%).

And the Award Goes to ... Kentucky!

Nick Richards was named the NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week and the Southeastern Conference Co-Player of the Week on Monday.

It's the second time Richards has won a national player of the week honor and the second time he's earned the conference player of the week award. Following the game vs. Louisville on Dec. 28, he won both U.S. Basketball Writers Association and SEC honors.

The Wildcats have won four national honors this season. In addition to Richards' two, Tyrese Maxey took home both NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week and USBWA Wayman Tisdale National Freshman of the Week honors following the U of L game.

Kentucky has dominated the weekly Southeastern Conference awards under John Calipari. UK has won more SEC honors (106) than any school during the Calipari era, including 83 SEC Freshman of the Week honors and 23 SEC Player of the Week awards.

This season, Tyrese Maxey is a three-time SEC Freshman of the Week winner (Nov. 11, Dec. 30, Jan. 13), Nick Richards is a two-time SEC Player of the Week winner (Dec. 30, Jan. 27) and Immanuel Quickley has one SEC Player of the Week honor (Jan. 13).

S-E-C! S-E-C! S-E-C!

Kentucky is the Southeastern Conference's gold standard. Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats are the most dominant team in the league, recording a 1,003-282 mark (.781) in regular-season conference play. Only one other team has won more than 750 regular-season SEC games (Alabama), and no other team owns a better winning percentage.

- Kentucky has averaged 11.6 wins and only 3.3 losses per season in 86 seasons in the SEC
- UK has won 48 SEC titles and 31 SEC Tournament championships
- The Wildcats have won 16 of the last 28 SEC Tournaments
- Kentucky has captured at least a share of five of the last 10 SEC regular-season championships under head coach John Calipari
- UK has played in the championship game of the SEC Tournament in eight of Calipari's 10 seasons, winning six times
- Kentucky won its 1,000th game in SEC regular-season action vs. Alabama on Jan. 11. Kansas has won 1,000 conference games when combining its records in the Big 6, Big 7, Big 8 and Big 12, but no team in the country has won 1,000 or more regular-season league games in one conference alone
- Seven teams made the 2019 NCAA Tournament field, tied for the second most of any league in the country
- The SEC had two teams in the Elite Eight, one in the Final Four and went 12-7 in NCAA Tournament games in 2019

Kentucky Picked to Win 49th SEC Title

Eleventh-year head coach John Calipari has often described Kentucky as the hunted within the ranks of the Southeastern Conference. With more regular-season and tournament titles than the entire league combined, it's not a far-fetched mantra. If the 2019-20 preseason media poll conducted by the league's media proves true, Kentucky will once again be the pursued.

UK was voted to win their sixth regular-season title under Calipari by the league's media members. Should Kentucky achieve the feat, it would mark the program's 49th overall regular-season title.

It's the 15th time since the 1998-99 season the Wildcats are the overall preseason favorite. Calipari has directed his teams to regular-season SEC crowns in 2010, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2017. Kentucky has claimed the SEC Tournament title six times under his direction in 2010, 2011, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018.

Each school selected media members that cover their team and additional media from across the nation were selected by the conference office to comprise the voting panel. Points were compiled on a 14-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis. Each media member also voted for two All-SEC teams.

Kentucky Trio Preseason All-SEC

In a league as talented as it's ever been, sophomores Ashton Hagans and EJ Montgomery and freshman Tyrese Maxey were tabbed preseason All-Southeastern Conference picks by both the league's media and its coaches.

Hagans was a first-team pick while Maxey and Montgomery were tabbed to the second team. Hagans also received at least one vote for the preseason pick for SEC Player of the Year.

UK has featured at least one player on one of the two end-of-the-season All-SEC teams (media or coaches) since 2006-07.

Kentucky's Schedule Packs a Punch

Kentucky's schedule is always among the toughest in the country and this season will certainly be no different.

UK's nonconference slate alone saw the Wildcats defeat Michigan State in the Champions Classic in New York, endure a tough trip to Las Vegas vs. Utah and Ohio State, included the annual rivalry vs. Louisville in Rupp Arena, and took the Wildcats to Texas Tech.

Seven of UK's 13 nonconference opponents this season made a postseason tournament in 2019, five of which made the NCAA Tournament. Michigan State (1), Louisville (3) and Ohio State (5) were all ranked in the top five of the Associated Press Top 25 at the time of the meeting. It's the first time UK has played three AP top-five opponents before January since the 1979-80 season. The Wildcats went 2-1 vs. those three opponents.

That nonconference schedule has given way to one of the toughest league schedules in the country. UK will play its permanent home-and-away opponents of Florida, Tennessee and Vanderbilt twice, plus host and visit both Auburn and Georgia. The SEC's 15 NCAA Tournament selections over the last two years are second most in the nation.

The nonconference and league schedule combined reveals that 15 of the 26 opponents UK will face played in the postseason in 2018-19, including 11 in the NCAA Tournament, five in the Sweet 16 and three in the Final Four.

Four Kentucky opponents are ranked in the Jan. 27 Associated Press Top 25, including two nonconference foes in Louisville (6) and Michigan State (14). Texas Tech and Ohio State are receiving votes.

SEC members Auburn (17) and LSU (22) are also ranked among the AP Top 25 and Florida and Arkansas are receiving votes.

Cats Deliver the Knockout Punch

Kentucky is 276-7 (.975) in the John Calipari era when leading by at least 10 points at any time in the contest.

Ironically, two of the last three instances UK has let a double-digit slip away came on the road at South Carolina. The Wildcats led by as many as 14 in Columbia, South Carolina, on Jan. 15, but the Gamecocks rallied behind a buzzer-beating 3-pointer for the 81-78 win. It was the first time UK let a double-digit lead slip away since Auburn rallied for an overtime win in the 2019 Elite Eight. Prior to that, UK's last loss was another 14-point advantage at South Caro-



lina during the 2017-18 season.

Six of the seven losses are to conference opponents.

Perhaps most impressive of all is that 71.5% of games Calipari has coached in at Kentucky have produced 10-point leads at some point during the game for UK. The Wildcats have led by 10 points or more in a whopping 86.0% of Calipari's 321 career wins at Kentucky.

Taking Advantage of Free Points

One of Kentucky's strengths is its success at the free-throw line. UK is earning 24.3% of its points at the free-throw line, has a free-throw rate of 41.8% and is connecting at 77.4%. All are among the national leaders.

Kentucky's free-throw distribution percentage is ranked eighth and free-throw rate is rated 13th, according to KenPom.com (through games on Jan. 29). After spending much of the early stages of the season in the top 10, the Wildcats' make percentage is 13th in the nation. Five players are making 73.0% or better (with a minimum of 10 attempts), led by Immanuel Quickley's 91.5% (75 of 82).

Kentucky's strong performance at the line isn't relegated to its success rate of makes, but also the frequency in which the Wildcats are getting to the line and the number of makes per game. UK is traveling to the line an average of 23.7 times a game. The Wildcats are making an average of 18.4. The opposition is averaging 11.8 makes on an average of 17.7 trips a game.

As a matter of fact, UK has made more free throws (367) than its opponents have taken (354). Kentucky's plus-6.6 points per game at the line ranks sixth in the country as of Jan. 29. Utah currently leads the country with a plus-7.5 differential. UK is sixth in the country in points per possession off of free throws at 0.094. Maryland leads that category with 0.109 points per possession coming from the stripe.

John Calipari's best free-throw shooting team at Kentucky shot 72.6% in 2014-15. The 2013-14 squad averaged the most trips (28.7) and makes (19.5) per game under Calipari's tutelage. There's still a long way to go in the season, but UK's current free-throw percentage of .774 would be just shy of the school record of 77.6% by the 1978-79 team.

UK has made its free throws when they matter the most. The Wildcats are 57 of 69 (82.6%) at the line when it's a two-possession game (six points or less) or less at any point with three minutes to play (including overtime).

Cats Don't Count on the Long Ball

New rules this season that moved the 3-point line to the international basketball distance of 22 feet, 1.75 inches shouldn't be concerning for the Wildcats. For one, with this guard- and wing-oriented team, the 2019-20 team has capable shooters.

Kentucky got off to an extremely slow start from 3 with the Wildcats shooting less than 30% from behind the arc for most of the November and December schedule. Throughout the struggles, John Calipari maintained that this team can shoot.

"I believe we've got good shooters," Calipari said after a 2-for-17 performance vs. Utah.

It appears as if his unwavering faith is coming true. After averaging just 4.2 3-pointers an outing and shooting 27.5% from behind the arc in the first 10 games of the season, the Wildcats are averaging 5.4 treys and shooting 37.5% over the last 10 games.

Percentage wise, the Wildcats strung together its two best performances against Georgia and Alabama in back-to-back victories. After making 50% (6 of 12 at Georgia), Kentucky made 60% (9 of 15) in the home win vs. Alabama.

Whether the recent trend continues or not, Kentucky has never relied on the 3-point shot under Calipari. While teams nationally are taking more 3-point shots than ever before, UK has bucked the trend and played to the style that's best suited that particular group.

The highest percentage of 3-point shots taken under Calipari was the 2010-11 Final Four team that lofted 32.4% of its shots from beyond the arc. No surprise, that team that consisted of Brandon Knight and Doron Lamb on the perimeter is also Calipari's top 3-point shooting team at Kentucky.

Calipari likes his teams to take between 20 to 24 3-point attempts per game. UK is averaging 14.8 attempts through its first 20 games with the longer line.

Further emphasizing Kentucky's ability to win without shooting a ton of 3-pointers, the Wildcats improved to 9-1 under Calipari when making one or fewer 3-pointers in the home win vs. Georgia.

Forever Young

With a combined 50 starts, 27.2% of the scoring, 30.5% of the rebounding and four key players (Ashton Hagans, Immanuel Quickley, Nick Richards and EJ Montgomery) back from the 2018-19 Elite Eight team -- plus a graduate transfer in Nate Sestina -- this is one of the most experienced teams of the John Calipari era.

The key words being the Calipari era.

In comparison to the rest of the country, it's still inexperienced. According to Ken Pomeroy's experience rankings, UK is 337th in the country out of 353 teams with an average of 0.98 years of experience (through games on Jan. 29). Only four other Power Five teams check in with less experience in the KenPom.com rankings.

UK began the season with nine newcomers on its roster, so growing pains are expected. Having said all that, it does rank as one of Calipari's most experienced teams at Kentucky, and that's important. Every team but one in the Calipari era has made the NCAA Tournament, but his best teams have combined young talent with a few returning pieces.

The 2009-10 squad with John Wall and DeMarcus Cousins featured veteran Patrick Patterson. The 2010-11 Final Four team had DeAndre Liggins and Josh Harrellson. The 2011-12 national championship team boasted three key returners in Terrence Jones, Doron Lamb and Darius Miller. The 2013-14 national runner-up squad featured Alex Poythress and Willie Cauley-Stein. And the 2014-15 team that nearly ran the table had both Poythress and Cauley-Stein back in addition to Andrew and Aaron Harrison and Dakari Johnson.

Bounce Back

Kentucky doesn't lose very often during the John Calipari era, but when the Wildcats do, they almost always bounce back and its extremely rare for the Wildcats to drop more than one in a row. UK is 53-13 under Calipari following a loss (record does not count end-of-season losses) following the win at Arkansas on Saturday.

Kentucky's back-to-back losses to Utah and Ohio State marked just the 13th time the Cats have lost consecutive games during the Calipari era and the most recent since dropping four in a row from Feb. 3-14, 2018. That stretch was the first four-game losing streak under Calipari and the only time Kentucky has lost more than two games in a row under Calipari.

Previously, the last time UK lost four games in a row was in February 2009, when the Wildcats dropped four straight games to end the regular season. It was the first time Calipari had lost four straight since the end of the 2004-05 season at Memphis.

UK has never lost back-to-back home games under Calipari.

Taking Care of Business

Kentucky's 62-32 record vs. opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 in John Calipari's tenure is impressive, but the Wildcats' ability to beat all-comers can't be overlooked. Under Calipari, UK is 259-43 vs. unranked competition, an .858 winning percentage.

Defense is the Difference Again

Long. Athletic. Interchangeable parts. Like so many of his past teams, this Kentucky squad is once again stingy defensively.

Through 20 games, opponents are making just 38.9% from the floor, ranked 29th in the country (through games on Jan. 29). Opponents are only scoring 65.0 points per game. And unlike last season when it seemed like every opponent early in the schedule caught fire from outside, the opposition is only making 28.9% from behind the arc.

Included in the early defensive play was a spectacular effort vs. the then-No. 1 team in the country, Michigan State, in which UK held the Spartans to just 62 points, 39.3% shooting and 19.2% from 3. The Wildcats limited Louisville to 35.5%.

Sophomore Ashton Hagans, the 2019 Southeastern Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Year, is once again playing lockdown defense with 2.2 steals per game and is a midseason

candidate for the Naismith National Defensive Player of the Year.

Perhaps the biggest development on the defensive side of the ball is Nick Richards' continued emergence as a rim protector. The junior is averaging a career-best 2.4 blocks per game with seven games of four or more rejections, including seven swats vs. Lamar, the most blocks by a Wildcat since Karl-Anthony Towns denied seven shots on Jan. 20, 2015.

Richards and Immanuel Quickley rank among the best defenders in the country according to Synergy Sports' defensive rankings.

Hold Them to 55 Points, 40%

Defense has always been a recipe for success for the Wildcats under John Calipari. The special ingredient: 55 points. UK is a perfect 77-0 under Calipari when holding the opponent to 55 points or fewer, including 3-0 this season. The Wildcats are 182-7 (96.3%) under Calipari when limiting the opponent to 63 points or less. UK is 9-0 thus far this season in the category. Kentucky's 61-59 loss to Tennessee in 2017-18 snapped a 60-game winning streak when holding the opponent to 63 or less.

Kentucky also fares well when it keeps the competition to 40% or less from the floor. UK is 197-18 (.916) vs. opponents under Calipari when its field-goal percent is 40% or less. The Wildcats are 10-2 this season.

Sharing is Caring

After John Calipari voiced displeasure with his team's low assist numbers in the first few games -- especially after a six-assist night in the stunning upset to Evansville -- UK responded.

The Wildcats are now sharing the ball at a Calipari-era record rate. UK had dished out at least 15 assists in nine of the last 14 games. The Wildcats' current assist rate (number of baskets that are assisted) is 55.6%, the best mark of the Calipari era.

Of course, it helps to have a distributor like Ashton Hagans running the point. He ranks sixth in the country with 7.2 assists per game, through games on Jan. 29. He's posted five or more assists in all but two games this season and seven or more 13 of the last 16 games.

Kentucky's depth has been tested by a number of injuries this season. Ten current Wildcats have dealt with injuries or are rehabbing old ones, oftentimes limiting UK's depth in games.

Jordan First Two-Sport Star Since Braddy

Even with key returners, a deep and talented recruiting class, and the addition of graduate transfer Nate Sestina, Kentucky suffered major losses from last season.

From a numbers standpoint, UK needed more depth. When John Calipari heard there was a 6-foot-9, 250-pound pitcher on the baseball team with considerable basketball talent, he called UK baseball head coach Nick Mingione.

Enter Ben Jordan.

Jordan joined the team just before the Blue-White Game and has been even more important recently because of injuries and ailments to five different players before Thanksgiving.

Jordan is the first multi-sport basketball player since Nehemiah "Junior" Braddy, who played four seasons with the basketball team (1990-93) and one with the baseball team (1991). It's worth noting that while former UK basketball player E.J. Floreal played both basketball (2014-16) and track at UK, he didn't begin his track career until after leaving basketball.

Although Jordan is a highly regarded baseball prospect with a lively arm, he's also a talented basketball player. He played at West Carter High School in Olive Hill, Kentucky, where he was the all-time leading rebounder and shot blocker and the eighth all-time leading scorer.

Jordan won Eastern Kentucky Conference Defensive Player of the Year in his senior season

in addition to EKC First Team honors. He averaged 12.2 rebounds a contest in his final year.

Jordan is expected to be a major part of the UK baseball team in the spring. A 2016 Under Armour All-American in high school, he appeared in 10 games last season after redshirting in 2018 with an injury. Over the summer, playing for the Gaithersburg Giants of the Cal Ripken College Baseball League, Jordan appeared in seven games with six starts. He went 1-1 with a 2.70 ERA in 26.2 innings, allowing just 14 hits while striking out 36 en route to First Team All-Cal Ripken League honors.

Adebayo, Davis Named Selected to NBA All-Star Game

Two former Kentucky men's basketball players will appear in the 69th NBA All-Star Game on Feb. 16 at the United Center in Chicago. Anthony Davis (New Orleans Pelicans) was voted in as a starter and Bam Adebayo (Miami Heat) was selected by the league's coaches as reserves. Kentucky's two NBA All-Star selections are tied for the most of any college.

While Davis will be making his seventh overall appearance – most all-time among former UK players – and his fourth as a starter, it will mark the first for Adebayo, putting an official stamp on his breakthrough season.

Teams will be set by the All-Star starters who led their respective conferences in fan votes during NBA All-Star voting, LeBron James (Los Angeles Lakers) and Giannis Antetokounmpo (Milwaukee Bucks) will serve as this year's captains.

The team rosters for the 69th NBA All-Star Game will be revealed on TNT in a special NBA All-Star eraft on Feb. 6 at 7 p.m. The game will air Feb. 16 at 8 p.m. ET on TNT and ESPN Radio.

Nation-Best 29 Wildcats on NBA Opening-Day Rosters

As the 2019-20 NBA season began, 29 players on NBA opening-day rosters (including twoway and inactive lists) played and finished their college basketball careers at Kentucky.

Underscoring the fact that no other school in the country can match UK's ability to develop players and put them in the NBA, UK's 29 players were again the most of any college basketball program, beating the next-closest school (Duke) by five players.

Of the 496 players in the NBA to start the 2019-20 season, 5.8% played and finished their college basketball careers at UK. There were actually fewer teams without a Wildcat (12) than there are NBA teams featuring Wildcats (18).

Of the 29 Wildcats on an opening-day NBA roster, John Calipari has coached 28 of them. With Derrick Rose (Detroit Pistons), who played for Calipari during the 2006-07 season at Memphis, Calipari has coached 29 players on 2019-20 opening-day rosters.

Kentucky has enjoyed unprecedented success at putting players in the NBA under Calipari. In the 10 seasons of the Calipari era, 38 players have been selected in the NBA Draft, more than any other school. Included in the recent run are 29 first-round picks, three No. 1 overall selections (Davis, Karl-Anthony Towns and John Wall) and 21 lottery selections.

Calipari's players are not only reaching the next level, they are succeeding when they do.

His players have garnered 22 All-Star selections, with Anthony Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. Rose was named MVP in 2011. Five of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (Rose, Wall, Davis, DeMarcus Cousins and Towns), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year (Rose, Tyreke Evans and Towns), and 12 players from Calipari's first nine teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

Using figures compiled by basketball-reference.com and spotrac.com, Calipari-coached players only (which includes Rose but not Rondo) have amassed more than \$2.26 billion in career NBA contracts. In the 10 seasons Calipari has been the head coach at Kentucky, his players have totaled nearly \$1.9 billion in NBA contracts.

In just the 2019-20 season alone, UK players will make more than \$255 million. Calipari-coached players only (includes Rose but not Rondo) will make more than \$260 million.

A full breakdown of the current Wildcats in the NBA can be found later in the notes.

Kentucky at No. 1

For the seventh season in the 11-year John Calipari era, the Kentucky men's basketball team earned a No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25 on Nov. 11.

After defeating Michigan State, the previous No. 1 team, in the State Farm Champions Classic and then following it up with a dominating 42-point victory vs. Eastern Kentucky the Wildcats were named the March Madness Team of the Week and then moved atop the AP Top 25 for the first time since December 2016.

No other school has reached No. 1 in seven of the last 11 seasons while Calipari has been at Kentucky. According to STATS, only three other programs (Duke, North Carolina and UCLA) have ever been ranked No. 1 in seven different seasons during an 11-year span.

The Wildcats' stay at No. 1 was brief after a shocking loss to Evansville. It marked just the third loss ever by Kentucky in 57 games in Rupp Arena as the No. 1 team in the country. UK fell to 69-8 as the AP top-ranked team under Calipari.

The Wildcats own an all-time record of 220-31 (.876) at No. 1 in the AP Top 25. UK has appeared at the top of the AP poll 24 different seasons in school history, and the latest stay marked the program's 125th week at No. 1, third most in college basketball (Duke has 145 and UCLA, thanks in large part to its dynasty in the 1960s and 1970s, has 134).

Calipari, one of only two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking, is no stranger to the top spot. Dating back to his time at Memphis, Calipari-coached teams have reached No. 1 in eight of the last 13 seasons. Including his tenure at UMass, his teams have ranked No. 1 in 10 different seasons.

2012 Title Team Voted Team of the Decade

Kentucky led college basketball in the 2010s in NCAA Tournament wins, Final Four appearances and NBA Draft picks. According to the Associated Press, the Wildcats also featured the best team of the decade.

The AP Top 25 panel tabbed the 2011-12 championship squad the best college basketball team of the decade. The 26-member panel voted UK ahead of the 2017-18 Villanova title team.

The 2012 national championship team was dominant in every sense of the word. En route to a 38-2 season, the Wildcats captivated the nation with a smothering defense, unselfish play, depth, balance and talent. Led by freshman Anthony Davis, the 2012 team snapped a 14-year title drought with the program's eighth national championship.

Davis, who won all but one of the major national player of the year awards, was the most dominant player in the country, not because of his offense — which was still superb — but because of his defensive abilities and rebounding prowess. The 6-foot-10 forward set a school record for blocked shots with 186, in addition to averaging a team-best 14.2 points and 10.4 rebounds per game.

The national championship game by Davis underscored the story of the 2012 Wildcats. Although Davis was 1 for 10 from the floor, he was named the Final Four Most Outstanding Player after taking over the title game vs. Kansas with 16 rebounds, six blocks and three steals.

Of course, Davis had plenty of help. Five other players on the team were selected in the NBA Draft just a few months later, including Michael Kidd-Gilchrist – arguably the emotional heartbeat of the team – who would later make history with Davis by becoming the first college teammates to go 1-2 in the draft.

Senior Darius Miller, sophomores Terrence Jones and Doron Lamb, and freshman Marquis Teague provided an unstoppable cast that lost its two games by a combined eight points, one of which was on a buzzer beater.

Memorable victories included a December showdown with preseason national title favorite North Carolina, avenging the first loss of the season with a victory over Indiana in the Sweet 16 and defeating archrival Louisville in the Final Four.

The championship marked John Calipari's first and was a part of four Final Four appearances in five seasons, one of just three schools to accomplish that feat.

Kentucky's 38 wins in 2011-12 is still tied for the most in NCAA Division I history, as are the six NBA Draft picks. Both marks were later tied by the 2014-15 UK team.

The Sporting News also voted John Calipari its College Basketball Coach of the Decade. More on that in the Calipari section below.

UK-Michigan Ink Three-Year Series Starting in London

Kentucky has signed a three-year deal with Michigan that will take the Wildcats to London next season and add a marquee home-and-home series for the following two years.

Beginning with a trip to O2 Arena in London in December of 2020 – exact date to be announced at a later time – the Wildcats and Wolverines will play three consecutive seasons. UK will travel to Ann Arbor, Michigan, for the Dec. 4, 2021 game, and Kentucky will host Michigan in Rupp Arena on Dec. 3, 2022.

The neutral-site game between the two schools will be hosted by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and serve as a fundraiser for the Hall. It will be the first NCAA Division I college basketball game to be played in one of the world's most popular venues. All further details on play date, game time, television partner, ticket pricing, ancillary events and ticket on-sale will be announced in January of 2020.

Kentucky has played internationally on a number of occasions for foreign exhibition tours, but the London trip will mark UK's third regular-season game outside the U.S. and first in Europe.

London played host to the 1948 U.S. Olympic team that consisted of a handful of Wildcats. After winning the 1948 national championship — UK's first NCAA title — five Wildcats represented the U.S. in the 1948 Olympics in London. The Kentucky-led team won all eight of its games to win the gold medal.

UK leads the all-time series with Michigan 5-2. The most memorable matchup of the bunch — at least in the eyes of Big Blue Nation — was the most recent in March 2014 in Indianapolis. The Wildcats edged the Wolverines 75-72 in a classic in the Elite Eight. Aaron Harrison hit the second of three straight game-winning 3-pointers to advance UK to the Final Four. Howard's Wolverines knocked off Kentucky 81-78 in overtime in the 1993 Final Four to advance to the national championship game.

The on-campus visits in 2021 and 2022 will mark the first in the series since UK's 1970 trip to Ann Arbor and the 1968 UK Invitational Tournament in Memorial Coliseum. The series is tied 1-1 in Lexington, but the Wildcats lead Michigan 2-0 in Ann Arbor and 2-1 at neutral sites.

Best in the Bluegrass

Kentucky defeated both of its in-state foes in 2019-20 (Eastern Kentucky and Louisville), continuing its domination of teams in state under John Calipari. Kentucky is now 19-2 against in-state foes with Calipari at the helm.

The overall mark also includes an 11-2 record vs. Louisville. Two of the victories over the Cardinals were in postseason play. UK's four-game winning streak was snapped in 2016-17 but the Wildcats have won all six meetings played in Rupp Arena, including a 29-point blowout in 2017-18, the third-biggest margin of victory in the history of the series. Louisville's two wins are by a combined six points.

Wildcats Ink Six in Fall Signing Period

Upon accepting the position of head coach of the Kentucky men's basketball program 10 years ago, John Calipari said one of the reasons he was chosen for the job was because he could recruit the best of the best.

It was a promise kept and a promise on which he continues to deliver. As he begins what he's calling his "second tour" at UK, he hasn't lost his touch.

Calipari and the Wildcats made an emphatic statement during the fall signing period with the additions of six highly skilled, athletic players to the program. UK signed decorated prospects Devin Askew, BJ Boston, Terrence Clarke, Cam'Ron Fletcher, Isaiah Jackson and Lance Ware to national letters of intent.

"I'm really excited about this group of young men," Calipari said. "They recruited us as much as we recruited them. They wanted this culture. They wanted to be with other good players. They didn't need crazy promises. They wanted this. In the past, when we've had groups like that, it's led to success both individually and as a team. When you're building a great team, not only do you need to be talented, you need to have high-character individuals, which we have with this group. These are great kids from good families."

All six players are consensus four- or five-star prospects and all are ranked in the top 60 by the major national recruiting services. Five of the six were on the preseason watch list for the Naismith High School Trophy (Askew was excluded because of his recent reclassification).

With the spring signing class still to go (begins April 15), UK is expected to have one of the nation's top classes yet again. In every season in the Calipari era, the Wildcats have signed a top-three recruiting class according to the Recruiting Services Consensus Index, which tallies major recruiting rankings and plugs them into a formula to calculate a consensus ranking.

Kentucky has now signed 59 top-50 recruits, 46 top-25 players and 25 top-10 players (according to Rivals) in what will now be Calipari's 12 recruiting classes at Kentucky.

UK can only comment on prospective student-athletes who have signed official paperwork to play at Kentucky.

Boston, Clarke Selected for McDonald's All American Game

The Kentucky men's basketball team's 2020 signing class will be well represented at the 2020 McDonald's All American Game. Fall signees BJ Boston and Terrence Clarke are the latest "burger boys" who will play in the prestigious all-star game before heading to UK next season. UK is one of three schools with multiple selections.

The 43rd edition of the game is set for April 1 at the Toyota Center in Houston. Tipoff is set for 7 n.m. on ESPN2

With the latest selections, UK has signed 37 players McDonald's All Americans out of high school during the John Calipari era, more than any other school in the country during that time period. Multiple players from each of Calipari's signing classes have been tabbed McDonald's All Americans, including five each in 2013 and 2017.

Kentucky has signed 69 McDonald's All Americans since the game began in 1977, including current Wildcats Nick Richards (2017), EJ Montgomery (2018) and Immanuel Quickley (2018), Tyrese Maxey (2019).

Leach, Ledford Honored by NSMA

It's only fitting that "The Greatest Tradition in the History of College Basketball" has some of the greatest broadcasters calling the action for Big Blue Nation.

Tom Leach, the current "Voice of the Wildcats" and Cawood Ledford, one of Leach's predecessors, were recently honored by the National Sports Media Association. Ledford, the 39-year voice of Wildcats football and men's basketball, was named to the NSMA Hall of Fame while Leach has been chosen as the Kentucky Sportscaster of the Year. They will be recognized at the annual NSMA Awards Banquet, slated for June 29 in Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

Ledford called UK games from 1953 until his retirement in 1992. His work with the Wildcats were more than enough to gain national fame, but his impact was felt far beyond the Commonwealth. He handled the radio call of the NCAA Final Four for 18 years and was four times named the top college basketball announcer in the nation. Ledford also was prominent in horse racing, handling 22 Kentucky Derby broadcasts, and winning numerous awards for his coverage of that sport. He was the Kentucky Sportscaster of the Year by the NSMA 22 times. He is a member of the UK Athletics Hall of Fame and the Kentucky Athletics Hall of Fame.

Leach has been a member of the UK Athletics broadcast team since 1989 and has been the play-by-play voice of Wildcats football since 1997 and men's basketball since 2001. This is the sixth time he has been named the Kentucky Sportscaster of the Year. Like Ledford, he is known for his expertise in horse racing and has won two Eclipse Awards for his coverage. He received the 2019 Tom Hammond Media Award from the Bluegrass Sports Commission and was named a distinguished alumnus of the University of Kentucky School of Journalism and Media.

LCC Announces Naming Rights Agreement with Central Bank

Lexington Center Corporation announced a landmark naming rights agreement with Central Bank, rebranding Lexington-Central Kentucky's premier convention, meeting, sports and entertainment complex as Central Bank Center. The iconic Rupp Arena will be Rupp Arena at Central Bank Center.

The agreement is between Central Bank and JMI Sports, and UK/LCC's multimedia rights partner. This agreement bolsters Central Bank's existing relationship with JMI Sports and UK to an annual average investment of \$4.1 million with a term of 14 years, expiring in 2033. Upon completion of the renovation, the portion of this investment associated with naming rights will

be \$1.5 million. The opportunity to sell naming rights with other media rights is part of LCC's and the university's Right of Use Agreement executed in February 2018 and transferred media rights ownership to UK.

A key part of the agreement is the naming rights to the Lexington Convention Center complex, which is currently undergoing a major expansion. To preserve and honor the history and tradition of the legendary basketball program led by Adolph Rupp, the arena will be known as Rupp Arena at Central Bank Center. The Central Bank Center brand will be on interior, exterior and directional signage, as well as collateral materials related to the Convention Center and Rupp Arena. New graphics are being designed which will be fully integrated into the expansion project and other areas of the facility.

Cousins Inducted into UK Athletics Hall of Fame

DeMarcus Cousins was inducted into the UK Athletics Hall of Fame as a member of the 2019 class in September.

Cousins was one of the key players on the 2009-10 Kentucky team that went to the Elite Eight in John Calipari's first season at UK. Cousins was named an NCAA Consensus Second Team All-American, including first-team recognition from the Associated Press, the 2010 Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year by the league's coaches, and an All-SEC First Team (AP and coaches) selection.

While at UK, Cousins led the Wildcats to a No. 1 national ranking, an SEC regular-season championship and an SEC Tournament championship. He averaged 15.1 points and 9.9 rebounds and concluded freshman season with eighth-most rebounds in a single season in UK history with 375.

Following his one season in Lexington, Cousins was selected by the Sacramento Kings with the fifth overall pick in the 2010 NBA Draft. He's since gone on to a highly successful NBA career. He is a four-time NBA All-Star, was named to All-NBA Second Team in 2015 and 2016, and averaged double figures in all of his nine seasons in the league.

Success Rate

The Wildcats received an NCAA award in the spring of 2019 for placing in the top 10% of all men's basketball teams in the country in the NCAA's annual Academic Progress Rate. UK scored a perfect 1,000. It's the fifth straight year the men's basketball team received the award and the sixth time since 2009.

The APR provides a real-time look at a team's academic success by the progress of each student-athlete on scholarship. The APR measures academic eligibility, retention and graduation. The scores are a four-year composite, covering the 2014-15 through 2017-18 school years.

Every Division I sports team across the nation calculates its APR each academic year, similar to a report card. Scholarship student-athletes each semester earn one point for remaining eligible and one point for staying in school or graduating.

UK has received a perfect 1,000 mark in each of the last six single-year APR rates.

The NCAA cut score to compete in the 2019-20 postseason is a 930 four-year APR. Teams scoring below 930 can face consequences intended to direct additional focus on academics. Those penalties can include practice restrictions and playing-season reductions.

Whitney Leaves Program

Freshman forward Kahlil Whitney left the program on Jan. 24 to pursue other options.

"I can't express enough the respect I have for Coach Calipari," Whitney said. "I've learned a lot from him in my short time at UK and will take much of his wisdom with me as I continue on my journey. I am forever thankful for my time at Kentucky and for all the people I've met along the way. I thank the coaches, my teammates, tutors, training staff, advisers and professors for working with and believing in me. I wish Big Blue Nation all the best! I've heard your voices and positive messages, and I thank you for your continued love and support. I will always be cheering for UK's success and for all my brothers on the court."

Whitney played in 18 games with eight starts. He averaged 3.3 points and 1.7 rebounds in 12.8 minutes of action in 2019-20. The 6-foot-6 forward scored a season-high 11 points vs. Eastern Kentucky and nine points vs. Mount St. Mary's.

"First and foremost, Kahlil is a great kid," UK head coach John Calipari said. "This is tough for me because Kahlil is a tremendous person who is going to do great things. I certainly don't want to see him go because I wanted to continue to coach him, but I understand his decision and, as we always do here, will support him in whatever way we can. As I told Kahlil ... I hope he goes on and does his thing and makes us all proud. I know he will stay in touch with us and I know our fans will continue to support him as he takes this next step."

Whitney signed with Kentucky as a McDonald's All American and the No. 11 overall player in the class of 2019 by the Recruiting Services Consensus Index. He scored more than 2,000 points in his high school career at Roselle Catholic (New Jersey) and helped lead his team to a title at the New Jersey Tournament of Champions in his junior season.

The Chicago native was also a Jordan Brand All-American and was named co-MVP of the Allen Iverson Roundball Classic. Whitney was named to the Naismith High School Boys' All-America Third Team after his junior season.



Cats Rock at Rupp

The Wildcats are 606-70 (.896) in Rupp Arena. Among the most notable marks of dominance as the nation's toughest venue to play include:

- School record 54-game winning streak to begin the John Calipari era
- UK is 325-41 (.888) in regular-season SEC games in the building
- Kentucky set a new program home record of 19 wins in 2014-15
- UK has gone undefeated at home in five of Calipari's 11 seasons
- The Wildcats have a perfect mark in 13 of Rupp Arena's 44 seasons

UK Reaches 600 Wins at Rupp in Record Time

With a victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 7, 2019 Kentucky reached the 600-win mark at Rupp Arena faster than any other program in NCAA Division I level history. UK needed just 670 games to reach win

It took UCLA, which previously owned the fastest pace to 600 wins, 689 games in Pauley Pavilion. Only one other team, Kansas, achieved win No. 600 in fewer than 700 games at its home venue. The Jayhawks reached the significant win in their 699th game.

Cal Owns Longest Win Streaks in Rupp

With UK's 2011-12 season-opening victory over Marist, UK head coach John Calipari recorded his 34th consecutive win in Rupp Arena as UK's head coach. It broke former UK head coach Rick Pitino's longest streak of 33 games in the venue.

The winning streak reached as long as 54 games. Calipari didn't suffer his first loss in Rupp Arena until losing to Baylor in his fourth season. The 54-game run, however, was his longest career winning streak. He also had the second-longest streak in the arena as the Cats won 42 straight from March 4, 2014 to Nov. 25, 2016.

Pack the House

Kentucky has led the nation in average home attendance in 20 of the last 24 seasons. That number includes a Rupp Arena record of 24,110 in John Calipari's first season (2009-10) as head coach.

- Kentucky averaged 21,695 fans during the 2018-19 season
- UK averaged 23.000-plus fans in seven of Calipari's first 10 seasons
- The Wildcats led the nation in average attendance in 2017-18

New Chairbacks. Fewer Seats

After receiving a \$16 million upgrade over the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons that enhanced the fan experience with the likes of a new Daktronics center-hung scoreboard, ribbons boards, new corner video boards and a new audio system, Rupp Arena is undergoing an additional transformation as a part of UK's new leasing agreement with the Lexington Center.

Chair-back seating in the upper-level sideline was installed in sections 211-217 and 228-234 for the 2019-20 season. Club areas will be available to season ticket holders starting with the 2020-21 season.

The new seating reduced Rupp Arena's capacity to 20,500.

The Top-Ranked Team at Home

Kentucky has lost just four times at home as the Associated Press topranked team in the history of the program and just three times in Rupp Arena. Prior to the losses to Evansville (Nov. 12) and UCLA (Dec. 3, 2016), both by three, the other two losses came by just one point.

The Wildcats are 54-3 all-time as the AP No. 1 team in Rupp Arena since its opening in 1976. The first loss was to Auburn, 53-52, on Jan. 9, 1988.

Coach Cal in Rupp Arena

It's been downright difficult to beat the Wildcats in Rupp Arena during the John Calipari era. UK is 179-10 (.947) in Rupp Arena under Calipari.

- UK is 21-5 (.840) vs. ranked opponents in Rupp in the Calipari era
- The Wildcats are 158-5 (.969) vs. unranked teams in Rupp under Cal
- UK is 94-4 (.960) at home vs. nonconference foes under Calipari
- Calipari notched his 100th career win in Rupp Arena as UK's coach with the Wildcats' 110-75 rout of Auburn on Feb. 21, 2014. It took Calipari just 104 games to reach the century mark at home, the fastest of any UK coach

Cal Passes Hall for Rupp Record

With a 101-70 victory over Cleveland State on Nov. 23, 2016, John Calipari passed former UK head coach Joe B. Hall for victories in Rupp Arena history.

Calipari currently has 179 wins inside the historic venue. Hall won 122.

UK vs. AP Ranked Foes Under Cal Second Tour: Calipari, UK Agree to New Long-Term Contract

John Calipari, who owns more wins, more NCAA Tournament wins, more Final Four appearances, more Elite Eight berths and more Sweet 16 showings than any other coach since his arrival at Kentucky, signed a new long-term contract with the school in June that offers the opportunity to end his career in Lexington.

The new deal, with total guaranteed compensation – which includes base salary and media/endorsement payments – is valued at \$86 million over the lifetime of the contract. With a base salary of \$400,000 per season from the university, Calipari will make \$8 million in total compensation over the next two seasons with increases starting in 2021-22 (\$8.5 million per year for four seasons) and 2025-26 (\$9 million per year for four seasons).

The only incentive included in Calipari's new contract remains the performance of the men's basketball team in the Academic Progress Rate, a metric created by the NCAA to measure academic eligibility, retention and graduation. The bonus will remain unchanged at \$50,000 from the previous contract for meeting the threshold of 975. The men's basketball team has earned an NCAA award in five straight seasons for finishing among the top 10% of Division I men's basketball schools.

Calipari's new contract will no longer include a retention bonus. Beginning with the sixth contract year of the agreed upon terms, Calipari has the option to step down as the head coach and become special assistant to the athletics director/university representative. He would receive \$950,000 in annual compensation for the position.

Calipari is calling the start of his second decade at Kentucky his "second tour" after unprecedented success in his first decade. His goal is for the program to build on that success and do even bigger things on the second tour.

A Decorated Decade

Through 10 years at Kentucky (entering 2019-20), John Calipari's time in Lexington has been every bit as successful -- and more -- as fans hoped when he agreed to become the head coach at Kentucky back in the spring of 2009.

By just about every measure, he's the most successful coach in college basketball during the last decade. Among schools who have been to at least two Elite Eights and a Final Four since 2009-10, Calipari ranks:

- First in wins (321), through games on Jan. 29
- First in NCAA Tournament wins (31)
- Fourth in NCAA titles (one)
- First in Final Four appearances (four)
- First in Elite Eight appearances (seven)
- First in Sweet 16 appearances (eight)
- Third in regular-season conference titles (five)
- Second in league tournament titles (six)

Calipari Named Coach of the Decade

Underscored by more victories than any other coach or program over the last 10 seasons, more Final Four appearances, a record number of NBA Draft picks, and the 2012 national championship, John Calipari was named the College Basketball Coach of the Decade by Sporting News in January.

In a piece penned by national writer Mike DeCourcy, Sporting News credits Calipari for changing the college basketball landscape. Detailing Calipari's success – what DeCourcy described as a "college basketball revolution" – DeCourcy wrote that "no one defined the 2010s in the same way as Calipari ... nor achieved the same degree of consistent success."

In an era where kids can enter the NBA Draft at 19 years old, Calipari masterfully balanced the priority of players' long-term professional dreams with individual and team development, leading to on-court success that no other team has matched the last decade.

"I knew we were going to make the program — and I said it at the press conference — it was going to be a players-first program," Calipari told Sporting News. "We were going to make decisions based on them and their needs. And it's not just about the name on the front. It'll be about the name on the back. That's how we're going to do this."

First-Ballot Hall of Famer

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in September 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on the first ballot.

Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate honors in the sport. The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Bevetta, Wildcat Louie Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and JoJo White.

Moving Up the Kentucky Career Wins List

With an 80-53 victory vs. Auburn on Feb. 23, 2019, John Calipari moved past Joe B. Hall for the second-most wins in program history. Calipari trails only the legendary Adolph Rupp (876 wins) for the most wins at UK and earned win No. 300 at Ole Miss on March 5, 2019.

When Calipari tied Hall with his 297th win at Missouri on Feb. 19, 2019, he did so 32 games faster than Hall and just two games slower than Rupp.

Although he's still climbing the charts, he's doing it nearly as fast as anyone else in NCAA history. With the win over Ole Miss, Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 300 wins (369 games) at one program in NCAA history. Only Bill Self (358 games at Kansas), Claire Bee (359 games at Long Island) and Rupp (366 at UK) got there faster.

Calipari passed Tubby Smith on Dec. 1 for the third-most coached games at UK. Smith's 10-year career with the Wildcats ended with his 346th game, Calipari and UK's win over UNC Greensboro on Dec. 1, 2018 marked the 347th career game he's been at the helm. Rupp is obviously first in games coached with a 42-year tenure spanning 1,066 career games.

ON PACE WITH THE BARON OF THE BLUEGRASS

Legendary coach Adolph Rupp won 876 career games while he was the coach of UK. He also led Kentucky to four NCAA titles during his 41-year tenure. John Calipari is just behind pace with Rupp to begin his career at UK in total victories. Calipari (.811) is slightly behind Rupp (.822) in total UK career winning percentage.

700 Victories and Counting

With Kentucky's win over UIC on Nov. 26, 2017, John Calipari reached 700 on-court wins. At the time he was one of just 41 coaches, regardless of NCAA level of classification, to reach that barrier. Only 29 coaches have done it with at least 10 seasons at the Division I level.

Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 700 on-court wins ever. Only Adolph Rupp (836 games), Jerry Tarkanian (876 games) and Roy Williams (879 games) did it faster.

Calipari is currently the only coach in NCAA history with at least 189 victories at three different schools.

Calipari Unrivaled in Conference

John Calipari has won 15 league regular-season championships (including five Southeastern Conference titles) seven more than the next-closest coach in the SEC (Bruce Pearl has eight). Calipari has won six SEC Tournament championships in 10 seasons at Kentucky and owns 15 conference tournament titles in his career, 11 more than his closest competitors (Ben Howland, Kermit Davis).

He's tallied a 350-105 (.769) all-time record within conference play as a head coach and owns a 142-39 (.785) record since joining the SEC. Entering the 2019-20 season, his 136 total conference wins were the second most among Division I coaches since 1996-97 over their first 10 seasons with a program, while his winning percentage ranked third. Only Adolph Rupp (.833) had a better winning percentage through his first 10 seasons in league play in Kentucky's history.

Although he's been publicly outspoken against conference tournaments -- only because he doesn't favor playing three or more games on consecutive days to win the tournament -- his teams have gotten up for them. Calipari's teams at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky have been to 19 conference championship games in his 27-year career, winning a remarkable 15 of them. Calipari is 57-12 (.826) all-time in conference tournaments, including 23-4 (.852) at UK.

Calipari in Elite Company with Conference Championships

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari added another first to his Hall of Fame career in 2017.

When Kentucky clinched at least a share of the 2017 Southeastern Conference championship by beating Vanderbilt on Feb. 28, 2017, he made history as a head coach. Calipari became the first NCAA Division I coach to lead three different programs (UMass, Memphis, Kentucky) to five on-court regular-season league titles five different times. He won the Atlantic 10 at the helm of UMass in 1992, 93, 94, 95 and 96. Memphis claimed the Conference USA crown in 2004, 06, 07, 08 and 09. Kentucky

Perhaps more impressive is that Calipari has 30 combined regular-season and tournament championships after the 2018 SEC Tournament title. That trails only Mark Few of Gonzaga (33 titles with the West Coast Conference regular-season title in 2019) among all active coaches. All-time, Calipari trails only the great Adolph Rupp (41) and Few.

30 is the new 20

With a 71-67 win over Mississippi State on Feb. 9, 2019, John Calipari achieved another feat in his decorated coaching career. With his 20th victory in 2019, he secured his 25th consecutive on-court 20-win season. He leads all active coaches with that streak, ahead of Mike Krzyzewski (23), Bill Self (21) and Mark Few (21), as of Jan. 29.

With a Sweet 16 win over Houston in the 2019 NCAA Tournament, Calipari and the Cats clinched a 30-win season for the fifth time as UK's head coach. Calipari has 11 seasons with 30 or more on-court wins. Only Krzyzewski (15) and Roy Williams (12) have more 30-win seasons as an active head coach. Calipari is the first coach in NCAA Division I history to record five straight on-court 30-win seasons, notching 30 wins in consecutive seasons from 2005-06 to 2009-10.

There's No Place Like Home

Since his 1991-92 season at UMass, John Calipari-coached teams have posted a 389-32 (.924) record at home. At UK, Coach Cal is 179-10 (.947) in Rupp Arena.

In five of Calipari's 11 seasons at Kentucky, the Wildcats have posted an undefeated record at home, including a school-record 19-0 mark during the 2014-15 season.

Calipari owns both of UK's longest winning streaks in the arena. He began his career at UK with a 54-game winning streak at Rupp Arena. It was the longest winning streak since the arena opened in 1976. With a win over Georgia on Feb. 9, 2016, he secured the second-longest streak in the storied building at 34 games (which ended at 42).

As good as John Calipari's team's have been at home, they're pretty good in hostile environments on the road. Dating back to the 2005-06 season, Calipari has recorded a 103-46 (.691) record on the road. At neutral-site venues, Kentucky is 78-23 (.772) all-time under Calipari.

Calipari at No. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking.

Calipari has led seven of his 11 UK teams to the No. 1 ranking and eight of his last 13 teams to the top (he's done it 10 times overall). When Coach Cal's teams are at the top, they're difficult to knock off:

- Calipari is 110-13 (.894) as the top-ranked Associated Press Top 25 coach in the country
- \bullet He's 69-8 (.896) when his team is atop the AP Top 25 as UK's head coach
- Calipari tallied a 32-4 mark at UMass at No. 1 and he was 9-1 at Memphis
- He (110) trails only Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (219) in active coaches with victories at No. 1
- Calipari has coached 123 career games as a No. 1 team, fourth most in NCAA history, trailing Krzyzewski (254), John Wooden (228) and Adolph Rupp (127)
- Among coaches who have owned a No. 1 ranking in at least 119 games, Calipari's winning percentage of .894 trails only Wooden (.952) and is ahead of active coach Krzyzewski (.862)
- Calipari is 6-4 vs. the AP top-ranked team in the land, including 3-2 at Kentucky after defeating Michigan State on Nov. 5
- According to ESPN, his .600 winning percentage against the No. 1 ranked team is the best for any head coach

The Success Rate

John Calipari has graduated 100% of the players (20 of 20) who have been eligible to receive their diploma by the end of their senior years and exhausted their athletic eligibility. Of that group, Brad Calipari, Patrick Patterson, Jarrod Polson and Alex Poythress completed their degrees in three years.

In the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, which measures eligibility, retention and graduation, Kentucky has posted a single-year Academic Progress Rate of 977 or higher in every season under Calipari, including a perfect 1,000 in the last six single-year reports. UK's four-year composite score in the most recent report, which was released in May 2019, was a 1,000, earning the team an NCAA academic award for the fifth year in a row for finishing in the top 10% of Division I men's basketball programs.

Dream Maker

As someone who prides himself on helping young men reach their dreams, John Calipari has helped 49 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his college coaching career, including 38 in his first 10 seasons at Kentucky, more than any other coach.

- Four No. 1 overall selections (Derrick Rose, John Wall, Anthony Davis and Karl-Anthony Towns) during the nine drafts from 2008 to 2016. No other coach has more than three No. 1 picks
- In 2010, five of his UK players were selected in the first round for the first time in NBA history
- His six players in the 2012 and 2015 NBA drafts are the most in the two-round era
- Churned out 38 NBA Draft picks, 29 first-rounders, three No. 1 selections, seven top-five picks and 21 lottery picks at Kentucky
- Of the 60 players who have finished their college careers at Kentucky under Calipari, 38 have been selected in the NBA Draft, a 63.3% success rate. Another five of those made the NBA, and the majority of the rest were walk-ons
- Of the 27 players at UK who have declared for the NBA Draft after their freshman seasons, 25 have been first-round picks. All 27 have played a game in the NBA. He is 29 for 31 in that regard when including his players from Memphis
- Only coach to produce the top two picks in the same draft (2012 Anthony Davis and Michael Kidd-Gilchrist)
- Produced a top-10 pick in 12 straight drafts since 2008, the only school to do so during that time period

Recruiting Trail

The Wildcats have signed more top-25 players under John Calipari's leadership than any other school. Nearly a quarter of all Rivals' top-10 prospects nationally over the past 11 classes have signed with Coach Cal and the Cats. The following list does not include transfers (freshman signees only).

Developing Talent

John Calipari hasn't just signed the best talent in the country while he's been at Kentucky; he's been the best at developing that talent and getting it ready for the next level.

Of the 35 top-25 Rivals.com players Kentucky has signed and have completed their college eligibility at UK, 31 were drafted and 25 were selected in the first round. But that's only half the story. Calipari's players don't just make it to the pros; they're better prepared than anyone else. The proof is in the numbers.

Over the course of his career, Calipari's 50-plus NBA pros have amassed more than \$2.26 billion in NBA contracts, which doesn't include endorsement deals and overseas contracts. Of his UK players in the NBA, they've earned just shy of \$1.9 billion in guaranteed contracts.

There's more: Of UK's 21 lottery picks in the Calipari era, 14 have earned second contracts in the NBA with seven of them cashing in on max contracts. Of the seven who haven't earned contracts, all have been drafted in the last three years and are still on their rookie deal. Over the last 10 years, there have been 22 lottery picks who earned max contracts in the NBA. Seven of them attended Kentucky.

Double-Digit Win Streaks

John Calipari's teams have posted 19 streaks of 10 or more wins at Kentucky, Memphis and UMass, including seven at UK. They have won 15 or more straight games nine times, 20 or more six times, 25 or more five times, and 30 or more one time. Of course, the most famous streak was the 38-0 start during the 2014-15 season.

A "players-first" coach with a penchant for helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, has guided six teams to the Final Four, led one to a national championship and helped 49 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his 27-year college coaching career.

Calipari guided Kentucky to its eighth national championship and his first national title in 2012. In becoming only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four, he has racked up more than 700 on-court victories, 20 NCAA Tournament on-court appearances, six Final Fours and numerous national coach of the year honors.

From UMass to Memphis and now Kentucky, Calipari's career has been successful throughout, but his most recent run in Lexington has been the best stretch of his career. During Calipari's first 10 seasons at UK, he led all coaches in total wins (305), NCAA Tournament wins (31), Final Fours (four), Elite Eights (seven) and Sweet 16s (eight).

In 2015, Coach Cal led college basketball's first ever 38-0 team, and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of the season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

While building a program out of obscurity at Massachusetts, laying the foundation at Memphis and restoring luster at the sport's greatest program at Kentucky, he totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

Quite honestly, though, Calipari's on-court success overshadows a much more significant picture. In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped more than 50 young men realize their dreams and reach the NBA level with 49 players earning NBA Draft selections, including a record five first-round draft picks in 2010. Two years later, six Wildcats heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. UK, with Calipari's help, would tie those six picks again in 2015, including a record-tying four lottery selections. His four No. 1 overall picks are more than any other coach, and he's had 38 players drafted during his first 10 years at Kentucky, including 29 first-round picks.

Calipari's players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 22 All-Star selections, with Anthony Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011. Five of his players have been tabbed All-NBA, three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year, and 12 players from Calipari's first nine teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80 percent, Calipari has stressed academics. Fifteen of his last 18 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor's degrees, and all 18 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including four players who earned their degree in just three years. Calipari's teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point average of 3.0 or better.

Calipari has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need in the Commonwealth and beyond. He has had a particular passion to assist those impacted by natural disasters. For instance, in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, and in 2017, for victims of Hurricane Harvey.

Calipari launched his foundation in 2012, and since then the foundation has worked with several key partners and donated more than \$1.5 million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller "Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out," Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that "it's never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it's about how high you bounce back."



DRB% - An estimate of the pct of available defensive rebounds grabbed while on the floor

ORB% - An estimate of the pct of available offensive rebounds grabbed while on the floor

TRB% - An estimate of the pct of all available rebounds grabbed while on the floor

ORtg - Offensive rating - points scored per 100 possessions

DRtg - Defensive rating - points allowed per 100 possessions
