HEAD COACH NICK MINGIONE



Nick Mingione – who was named Kentucky’s head coach on June 13, 2016 – has already made his mark after just three seasons in Lexington, becoming an irreplaceable piece of the UK Baseball program and local community.

In his rookie season as a head coach, Mingione proved a quick study as the 2017 Wildcats etched their name all over the school’s record books. The program made a trip to the NCAA Tournament Super Regionals for the first time and finished ranked in the Top 10 of every major college baseball poll.

Additionally, the Cats’ 43 wins were just two shy of the school record and the most for any first-year coach in the program’s history. The 19 wins in Southeastern Conference play were the second-most in school history, just one shy of the 2006 championship team’s 20, which Mingione also was a part of as an assistant coach. In 2018, the Cats spent the majority of the season in the Top 25, including ten weeks in the Top 10. The 77 victories in Mingione’s first two seasons are the most in a two-year period at UK since John Cohen won 78 games in 2007-08.

The success has carried over to the Major League Baseball Draft, where Mingione and his staff’s ability to groom players for a professional career has led to 24 players being selected in the past three MLB Drafts. The 21 players selected in the 2017 and 2018 drafts were the most of any program in the country and Mignione has helped mentor two top 20 overall picks in first baseman Evan White (17th, 2017) and left-handed pitcher Zack Thompson (19th, 2019).

In 2018, 13 Cats were selected in the draft, the highest total of any program in the country. The total set a new program-record for most draftees in a single year, shattering the previous mark of nine. Coupled with eight in 2017 the program has two more than any other school in the past two drafts. Additionally, UK now has had 13 players drafted in the first 10 rounds over the past three seasons. The 14 underclassmen who have been drafted and signed during Mingione’s tenure have garnered a total of \$10,435,000 million in signing bonus money, nearly \$750,000 per draftee.

Mingione – who spent eight seasons as an assistant to Cohen at Mississippi State – was an immediate hit with fans and community leaders. He made it a point to have his team involved in the community, part of his “Student. Person. Player.” guiding principle of the program, participating in numerous philanthropic events in Lexington while also taking time for more than 100 local speaking engagements.

In his first season at UK his ethos for the program was on full display as UK players earned SEC Pitcher of the Year, SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year and SEC Community Service Team honors.

“Nick Mingione is exactly the kind of coach we hoped to hire when we began our search,” UK Director of Athletics Mitch Barnhart said. “His passion, tactical mind and tireless recruiting efforts made him an important part of Mississippi State’s staff during some great years for the program. More than that, he is a man of substance who is committed not only to developing young men as baseball players, but as students and people.”

His impact on the Commonwealth culminated in being named a Kentucky Colonel on Oct. 23, 2017. The designation is the highest honor a civilian can receive in Kentucky.

Mingione took over the Kentucky program after serving as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Cohen at Mississippi State starting before the 2009 season. Working with the team’s outfielders, first

basemen and hitters, Mingione helped lead MSU to an incredible run of success, including the program’s first Southeastern Conference regular-season championship since 1989 in 2016, a runner-up finish in the College World Series in 2013 and an SEC Tournament championship in 2012.

“This is an opportunity I’ve dreamed about for more than a decade,” Mingione said. “From the moment I first stepped foot on campus I knew it would be a place I could call home. What an incredible feeling to be back. Kentucky is a special place and this baseball program has had great moments over the years, including some that I have been a part of.”

Prior to his time at Mississippi State, Mingione spent two seasons at UK as an assistant under Cohen in 2006-07. UK won 33 SEC games in those two seasons, including in 2006 when UK claimed its first SEC championship. After the historic regular season, the Wildcats hosted an NCAA Regional for the first time. Mingione worked extensively at UK with the likes of All-American Collin Cowgill and John Shelby III.

Mingione has a sterling reputation as a recruiter. Over the 12 seasons at Kentucky and Mississippi State for which recruiting rankings are final, he has helped land classes with an average ranking of 13th, including top-three classes in 2013-15. He also has an unmatched track record of player development, coaching 77 players selected in the MLB Draft, as well as 43 All-Americans and six conference players of the year. His first recruiting class at Kentucky was ranked in the Top 10 of all the major industry outlets.

The Cats also have been dominant in the classroom, having 31 players receive SEC Academic Honor Roll and First-Year Honor Roll in 2018, eight more than any other school in the conference. Zach Logue was named the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2017, Troy Squires won the prestigious Senior CLASS Award in 2018, the first Kentucky player to do so, and Marshall Gei was First-Team Academic All-America

in 2019. In three seasons, the Cats have had 86 players earn All-SEC academic honors.

“Nick Mingione has been preparing for this opportunity for the last 13 years and I absolutely know that he will make the most of it,” Cohen said. “He is one of the nation’s elite recruiters. He is a brilliant tactician of the game. His ability to prepare kids for success in the SEC is of the highest level.

“He will make himself an irreplaceable part of the Kentucky baseball community and his wife is one of the finest people I’ve ever met. You try and surround yourself with people who make you a better coach and a better person. Nick Mingione has been that kind of person for me and like a member of my family.”

Before rejoining Cohen at MSU, Mingione spent a season at Western Carolina as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. There, Mingione helped lead the Catamounts to top-40 national ranking in 11 different offensive categories.

Prior to his first stint at Kentucky, Mingione spent three years as an assistant coach at Embry-Riddle University, his alma mater. The Eagles appeared in the NAIA College World Series in each of those seasons, culminating in a runner-up finish in 2005. Mingione also coached at Florida Gulf Coast in 2002, helping lay the foundation for the program before its inaugural season in 2003. He began his coaching career in 2001 at Mariner High School, his alma mater.

Mingione – born in Tarrytown, N.Y., before growing up in Florida – graduated from Embry-Riddle in 2000 with a degree in aerospace studies, as well as a triple minor in business, psychology and humanities. He was also a four-year letterman on the school’s baseball team.

Away from coaching, Mingione travels often for both speaking engagements and mission trips. In 2013, he and six current and former members of the MSU program helped build houses and run baseball clinics for youth on the Bahamian island of Eleuthera. When he returned stateside, he was inducted into the “Be The Best You Are” Baseball Clinic Speaker Hall of Fame. Other past inductees include Ted Williams (2002), Ron Polk (2003), Leo Mazzone (2006) and Cohen (2008).

Mingione is married to the former Christen Reeves. The couple has one son, Reeves.



THE MINGIONE EFFECT

ASSISTANT COACH DAN ROSZEL

FIRST SEASON AT UK



Dan Roszel comes to Lexington after nearly two decades of high-level success at four programs, including the past nine seasons at East Carolina where the Pirates finished in the nation's top 50 in earned run average seven times. East Carolina advanced to six NCAA Regionals during his nine years on staff.

Upon joining ECU in 2010, Roszel has mentored 14 Major League Baseball draft picks, nine All-Americans and 19 all-conference selections while the program piled up 342 victories, six NCAA Regional appearances and two Super Regional runs. Since 2013, seven of Roszel's pupils have made their MLB debuts, including Seth Maness and Heath Hembree (2013), Mike Wright and Shawn Armstrong (2015), Jeff Hoffman, Richard Bleirer and Jharel Cotton (2016).

"Dan is exactly what we were looking for," Mingione said. "He has a track record of winning, he's committed to helping student-athletes win all areas of their lives, and he's a proven developer of Major League Baseball pitchers. He'll be an invaluable resource for our program."

In 2019, Roszel disciple Jake Agnos was named to six All-America squads and set the American Athletic Conference's single-season strikeout record with 145 in 102.0 innings on his way to being named the 2019 AAC Pitcher of the Year. He was selected by the New York Yankees in the fourth round of this summer's draft.

In his 19 seasons as a coach, Roszel has seen 30 of his pitchers sign professional contracts, headlined by MLB all-star Chris Sale, who he coached while at Florida Gulf Coast. Sale, who has finished in the top five of the American Cy Young Award vote six times, was selected 13th overall by the Chicago White Sox in the 2010 draft. In 2014, Hoffman became Roszel's highest draft pick when taken ninth overall by the Toronto Blue Jays.

After completing his playing career at the University of North Florida, Roszel broke into the coaching ranks and within three seasons had joined Gardner-Webb University, where he saw two first-day draftees in four years. From there, Roszel went to Florida Gulf Coast for two seasons, helping the Eagles win an Atlantic Sun Conference title in its first season at the Division I-A level, the only team in NCAA history to accomplish that feat. Before settling at East Carolina, he spent two seasons at College of Charleston, where three of his pitchers were selected in the 2010 MLB Draft as the Cougars came within one win of a Super Regional appearance.

"My family and I are extremely excited to join the UK family," Roszel said. "Nick Mingione's vision for the program of developing young men as students, people and players, his leadership style and the Lexington community were all important factors in our decision. This is a dream come true. We can't wait to get to work,

invest in the community and start building lasting relationships." Roszel, a 2000 graduate of North Florida, and his wife Melissa have three children, Madyson, Makenna and Clayton. Roszel received his degree in criminal justice with a minor in political science.

ASSISTANT COACH WILL COGGIN

FIRST SEASON AT UK



Will Coggin, a former player and coach in the Southeastern Conference, is in his first season on Kentucky's baseball staff.

Coggin will reunite with Mingione after the duo had a successful tenure together at Mississippi State. The former Bulldogs infielder and assistant coach has proven his salt as a recruiter and hitting guru who has helped develop multiple big leaguers.

"I'm ecstatic to welcome Will to Kentucky," Mingione said. "I watched his transition from player to coach first hand and then his evolution into one of the elite recruiting coordinators in the country."

"He's a winner. He's won at every step of his career: he's been to Omaha as a player, he won multiple conference championships while coaching at St. Johns River State College and the SEC title at Mississippi State. He was an integral part of the success we enjoyed in Starkville and will be an indispensable piece of reaching our goal at Kentucky of reaching Omaha."

"I'm excited for and appreciate the opportunity to reunite with Coach Mingione," Coggin said. "The University of Kentucky is a special place and I can't wait to get started."

Coggin was a staff member on the 2016 club that won the SEC championship, was a national seed in the NCAA Tournament and saw 11 players selected in the Major League Baseball Draft. It was his second stint in Starkville, having played for the Bulldogs from 2007-08 and served on former UK and Mississippi State coach John Cohen's staff from 2009-12. He spent three seasons at St. Johns River State College in Palatka, Florida before returning to State before the 2016 season.

During that 2016 season, the Bulldogs showed drastic offensive improvement, as their team batting average improved by 42 points (.271 to .313), on-base percentage jumped from .372 to .407 and slugging percentage exploded by 91 points. The club hit 30 more home runs, 60 more extra-base hits and scored 90 more runs on the way to 20 more wins.

Perhaps most impressive was Coggin's work with then-freshman outfielder Jake Mangum, who took the batting title en route to becoming the first Mississippi State player to win SEC Freshman of the Year and first freshman to win the C Spire Ferriss Trophy, which is awarded to the best college baseball player in Mississippi. Mangum, of course, would go on to become the SEC's all-time hits leader in leading the program to back-to-back trips to the College World Series in 2018 and 2019.

He also played an important role in the development of 2017 SEC Player of the Year and First-Team All-American Brent Rooker, who won the SEC's Triple Crown for batting average, home runs

and RBI on his way to being named the Roy F. Kramer SEC Male Athlete of the Year.

Following the 2016 campaign, Coggin, a native of Booneville, Mississippi, was promoted to the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator role Mingione held before accepting the Kentucky job. The two worked hand-in-hand at State for five seasons, during which time the program went to two Super Regionals and won the SEC regular season title and conference tournament title (in different seasons).

In between his two stints at Mississippi State, Coggin helped St. Johns River State College post 122 victories in three seasons, including a 57-14 mark in the Mid-Florida Conference. The 122 wins from 2013-15 were the most by a Florida junior college and the program spent time in the top five nationally in 2014 before being ranked No. 1 for much of the 2015 campaign. The Vikings won a school-record 47 games in 2015, won three straight league titles for the first time since 1966-68 and won their first Florida State Tournament game in 38 years.

While at SJRSC, Coggin's calling card was player development, where 25 players went on to sign with Division I-A programs and 45 with four-year schools. Current big-leaguer Nate Lowe earned NJCAA First-Team All-American honors in 2015 after hitting .372 with 59 runs, 53 RBI and 17 home runs in 56 games before signing with Mississippi State.

Before getting into coaching, Coggin was a middle infielder on Mississippi State's 2007 and 2008 teams after two seasons at Northeast Mississippi Community College. He earned his bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2010 from Mississippi State before adding a master's degree in sports administration in 2012.

ASSISTANT COACH TODD GUILLIAMS

FOURTH SEASON AT UK



Todd Williams, who has an extensive history of coaching outstanding hitters during his career, again worked his magic since his arrival at Kentucky. The Cats have been a devastating offensive club under Williams' direction, as the Wildcats led the Southeastern Conference in a total of 14 offensive statistical categories, while also producing five All-Americans.

In 2018, UK led the SEC in home runs per game, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, scoring, doubles per game and sacrifice bunts, while ranking in the nation's top 20 in five of those six categories - and top 10 in three.

In 2017, the Cats registered the most hits in a single-season (706) in UK history and ranking near the top of the single-season charts in numerous other categories. The offense also ranked in the top 12 nationally in doubles (2nd), hits (4th), hit by pitches (4th), on-base percentage (7th), walks (10th), sacrifice bunts (10th), slugging percentage (11th) and batting average (12th).

As the offense hummed along, every player in UK's everyday lineup had career years. Riley Mahan, Tristan Pompey and Evan White each were named All-Americans and were voted first- or second-team All-SEC. Catcher Troy Squires also earned second-team All-SEC, while Zach Reks hit .352 for the season. Mahan, Pompey and White all ranked among the nation's elite hitters, with Pompey ranking second in hits and fifth in runs nationally.

White became just the fifth UK player selected in the first round of the MLB Draft - no. 17 overall by the Seattle Mariners - and Mahan was taken in the third round - no. 89 overall by Miami - to give the Cats two picks in the top 100 selections. A year later, Pompey was selected in the third round, while catcher/first baseman Kole Cottam - an All-American and arguably the top hitter in the SEC in 2018 - was taken in the fourth. Former JUCO transfer Luke Heyer, who was not a starter with UK in 2017, became one of the country's elite power hitters as a senior and played his way into a Top 10-round pick under Williams' tutelage.

"Coach Williams has coached at the collegiate level for 28 seasons and has been a part of every facet of baseball - coaching catchers, infielders, outfielders, hitters and calling pitches," UK head coach Nick Mingione said. "His overall wealth of knowledge will be invaluable."

"I've known Coach Williams since he began recruiting me in 1995. He's a faithful man, a family man. He's been a winner everywhere he's been, he's a developer of players and, even more important, a developer of men. Coach Williams has an unmatched track record of developing people as well as players."

Williams and Mingione first became associated at Embry-Riddle University, where Williams coached during Mingione's playing days.

Williams came to Kentucky after one season at Western Carolina, where he was the hitting coach and ran the offense, in addition to coaching the catchers. In 2016, the WCU offense ranked in the nation's top 25 teams in

batting average (.304, 24th in the nation), runs scored (453 runs, 18th) and home runs (72 HR, 9th).

Individually, first baseman Matt Smith hit .388 with 10 home runs and 55 RBI while being named second-team All-Atlantic Region by the American Baseball Coaches Association. Outfielder Bryson Bowman hit .326 with 19 homers and 60 RBI and was selected third-team All-America by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and second-team All-Atlantic Region.

Williams went to WCU from Valdosta State, where he was part of more than 250 wins, three NCAA regional appearances and two Gulf South Conference championships during his eight seasons there (2008-15).

During his time at Valdosta State, Williams was the team's hitting coach, worked with the catchers and was VSU's Coordinator of Academic Services. He also shared recruiting duties with his brother, head coach Greg Williams. Valdosta State posted a pair of 43-win seasons during Williams' time on staff, doing so in 2009 and 2010. In addition to those two seasons, the Blazers also made the NCAA Tournament in 2013 after their second GSC title.

One of the banner seasons for Williams came in 2009 as the team led the nation with a school-record 113 home runs - the fourth-most in NCAA Division II history. The Blazers finished eighth nationally with 578 runs scored and were 11th with a .561 slugging percentage. As a squad, Williams guided the Valdosta State batters to a .332 batting average, the highest mark by the Blazers since 1986. Williams' approach of plate discipline was also manifested as VSU drew 276 walks on the year, ninth-best in the nation. Overall, the 2009 Valdosta State squad ranked in the top 50, out of 228 schools, in 14 of the 15 offensive categories tracked by the NCAA.

Guilliams' ability to teach the offensive side of the ball also was evident in the personal performance of a pair of Blazers, Brandon Decker and Chase Blackwood, who hit 22 home runs on the year, falling just one short of the school record. Four additional Blazers hit double-digit home runs, giving the 2009 squad a school-record six to accomplish the feat in a single season, while Decker and Matt Costello both hit over .400 on the year.

Guilliams' attack followed up with one of the best offenses in the nation in 2010. The VSU hitters ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation in three different categories -- finishing eighth in runs with 555, seventh in hits with 717 and second in hit by pitch with 119. The Blazers batted a school-record .351 while scoring 9.3 runs per game, the 14th highest total in the nation.

Prior to making the move to Valdosta, Guilliams and his brother built a powerhouse at Embry-Riddle University, an NAIA institution in Daytona Beach, Fla. Together they won 622 games, against just 228 losses, in 15 years at the school and made six NAIA World Series appearances. Todd served as the hitting, catching and outfield instructor for the program, which produced 44 NAIA All-America selections. He was also responsible for calling pitches and serving as the program's strength and conditioning coach while filling the role as Embry-Riddle's athletic fields manager for the school's baseball, track and field and soccer complex. Additionally, he spent time as the school's sports information director as well as the academic enhancement coordinator.

All totaled, Guilliams has been a part or more than 1,100 wins as a collegiate assistant coach. He has been a part of championships at all five schools he coached -- Eastern Kentucky (1989), Embry-Riddle (1995, '96, '99, 2002-06), Dallas Baptist (2000), Valdosta State (2008, '10 and '13) and Western Carolina (2016). He was able to spend 23 of those seasons coaching alongside his brother, Greg, between both Valdosta State and Embry-Riddle.

A 1988 graduate of Eastern Kentucky, earning a degree in sport supervision, Guilliams was an Ohio Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete and twice won the Turkey Hughes Scholarship. He was the Colonels' team captain in 1988 while earning Dean's List recognition. He went on to earn his master's degree in physical education in 1990 while serving as an assistant at his alma mater.

Off the field, Guilliams authored a book entitled High-Scoring Baseball: The Complete Guide to Run Production. He has also been a featured speaker numerous times, including at the ABCA national convention and, most recently, at the Best Ever Coaches Clinic in Toronto in January, 2016. Todd and his wife, the former Julie Dudgeon, are originally from Newark, Ohio. They have three children - Casey, Grace and Wyatt.

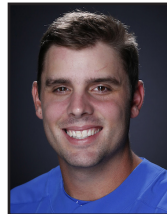

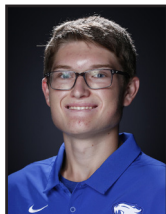
