## BULLDOG BITES

- With Mississippi State currently 10-1 in SEC play, the Bulldogs have their sights set on a third consecutive SEC title, a feat that no program has accomplished outright since 2001-04.
- Sunday's game marks the third-straight matchup against a ranked foe for the Bulldogs. A win would mark the first time MSU has defeated three ranked opponents in a row since State defeated NC State (21), UCLA (9) and Louisville (3) during its second National Finalist run during the 2017-18 campaign.
- Freshman **Rickeya Jackson** leads all SEC freshmen in scoring (16.6 ppg) and ranks second in field goal percentage (.471) during SEC play. For the year, she leads the team in scoring (14.2 ppg) and is third in rebounding (4.7 rpg). She has scored in double figures in 18 games on the year.
- Jackson marks the first true freshman to start the season for Schaefer since 2014-15 with **Victoria Vivians**, who was second team All-SEC during her first season after averaging 14.9 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. With five 20-point games during conference play, Jackson is the first MSU freshman to post multiple 20-point games in SEC play since Vivians had three.
- Graduate guard **Jordan Danberry** leads the team steals (2.7 spg) while ranking second in assists (3.2 apg) and third in scoring (12.6 ppg). She ranks 16th among Division I players in total steals (68) and 26th in steals per game to pace a Mississippi State defense that leads the SEC in turnovers forced per game (21.8).
- With the departure of SEC Player of the Year **Teaira McCowan**, Mississippi State had a major void to fill in the post this season. Sophomore forward **Jessika Carter** has helped answer that need, averaging 13.3 points, 9.0 rebounds and 1.9 blocks per game. As a sophomore, McCowan averaged 8.7 points, 7.1 rebounds and 1.5 blocks per game.
- Carter has been one of the nation's top rebounders this season, especially on the offensive end of the floor. She is averaging 4.3 offensive rebounds per game, which ranks 11th in the Division I. Her 225 rebounds are the 38th most in the country.
- During SEC play, State has three players that rank inside the top 10 in field goal percentage. Carter ranks second with a .644 clip, while Danberry (.504) is seventh and Jackson (.471) is 10th. As a team, MSU ranks second in the SEC with a .468 clip in league play.

**DANBERRY DOMINATING ON BOTH ENDS OF THE COURT**

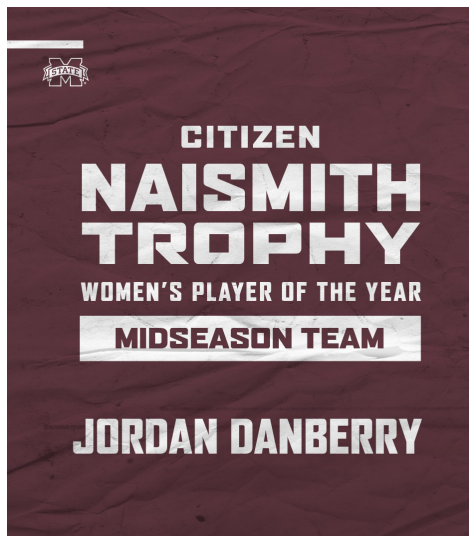
- **Jordan Danberry** has been one of the best players on both ends of the floor in the SEC and the country this season.
- Danberry has made the most of her final season so far. The do-it-all guard leads the team in steals (2.7 spg) and ranks second in assists (3.2 apg) and third in scoring (12.6 ppg).
- Offensively, the Conway, Ark., native is shooting an impressive .516 percent clip from the field on the year and has posted four 20-point performances. She has scored in double figures in 13 of the last 16 games.
- On the defensive end of the floor, Danberry has recorded multiple steals in 18 games this season and has nine contests with four or more steals, including four during league play. Her 68 steals ranks 16th in the nation and second in the SEC.

**CARTER HAVING A BREAKOUT SEASON**

- **Jessika Carter** has been a major bright spot on Mississippi State's roster and is having a breakout season.
- The sophomore forward ranks inside the top 10 in the league in rebounding (9.0 rpg/3rd), field goal percentage (.589/3rd) and blocks (1.9/5th) and is 13th in scoring at 13.3 ppg.
- The Waverly Hall, Ga., native ranks 11th in the nation in offensive rebounding (4.3 orgp) and is 62nd in rebounding.
- During league play, Carter ranks second in the SEC in field goal percentage, shooting a .644 clip. She's shot 70 percent or better from the floor in five games during conference play.
- Carter has led State in rebounding 14 times and has scored double-figures in 18 contests, including four 20-point performances. She has also posted eight double-doubles and has four games with four blocks.
- Carter was named SEC Player of the Week after dominating in State's wins over Murray State and Troy, averaging 22.0 points, 16.0 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game.
- She grabbed a career-high 21 boards at Marquette to go along with 14 points.
- Carter earned a spot on the Duel in the Desert all-tournament team after posting 13 points and 15 boards against Virginia in the championship game.
- She had a strong couple of games back to back against Vanderbilt and Ole Miss, posting a pair of 20-point games.

**SPLASH SISTERS FROM THREE**

- Because of their shooting from beyond the arc, the duo of **Chloe Bibby** and **Andra Espinoza-Hunter** have been coined the title of splash sisters.
- This season, the pair has knocked down 50 percent (53 of 105) of MSU's threes. Bibby leads the charge with 35 treys, while Espinoza-Hunter is third on the team with 18.
- Bibby has knocked down a 3-pointer in all but six games this season and has nine contests with multiple threes.



- The junior forward is fourth on the team in scoring at 8.4 ppg, with 50 percent of it coming from deep (105 of 209).
- Against USF, Bibby went off from three, dropping five 3-pointers in the first quarter and posting a season-high 21 points.
- Espinoza-Hunter has six games with multiple threes on the year and is averaging 4.7 ppg.
- In last year's SEC Championship game, Espinoza-Hunter knocked down eight 3-pointers, setting the SEC Tournament record and tying State's single-game record for made threes.

**TAYLOR BRINGING ENERGY TO BOTH ENDS OF THE FLOOR**

- **Myah Taylor** has spent the last two seasons learning from the two best point guards in program history in **Jazzmun Holmes** and **Morgan William** and has now stepped into the starting role as this year's floor general.
- So far, Taylor has made her presence felt on both ends of the floor. The redshirt sophomore leads the team in assists (101) and is second in steals (51). Her 2.66 assist/turnover ratio ranks second in the SEC and 13th in the country.
- Taylor is the best help defender on the team and constantly is creating issues for opposing teams as they try to get into their offense. She has led the squad in steals 10 times this year.
- Taylor scored all 16 of her points in the second half in State's win against No. 16 Texas A&M. She's averaging 6.0 ppg while shooting 48 percent from the field.
- But where Taylor has really excelled this season and energized the crowd has been her ability to take a charge. On the year, she already has 40 charges taken while no other person on the team has more than 13.

**JACKSON HAVING STELLAR FRESHMAN SEASON**

- Mississippi State knew it was going to rely on newcomers early and often this season, and McDonald's All-American **Rickey Jackson** has been stellar in her first season with the Bulldogs.
- Jackson leads the team in scoring (14.2 ppg) and is third rebounding (4.7 rpg). The freshman forward is shooting 47 percent from the field and 39 percent from beyond the arc on the year.
- The Detroit, Mich., native has finished with double-digit scoring in nine of State's 11 conference games and 18 times overall this season.
- During league play, she leads all SEC freshmen in scoring (16.6 ppg) and ranks second in field goal percentage (.471).
- Jackson has been named the SEC Freshman of the Week twice this season, most recently receiving the honor last week after averaging 23 points per game and shooting 60 percent from the field in State's wins against Auburn and Georgia.
- Jackson notched a career-high 24 points against Georgia, besting her previous career high of 22 points from the game before against Auburn.
- With five games of at least 20 points during SEC play, Jackson has surpassed **Victoria Vivians** (3) for the most 20-point efforts in conference play by a freshman Bulldog under Schaefer.
- She earned MVP honors in the Duel in the Desert tournament after notching the first double-double of her career with 17 points and 10 rebounds vs. USF and posting a team-high 17 points against Virginia.
- Jackson marked the first true freshman to start the season since 2014-15 with Vivians, who was second team All-SEC during her first season after averaging 14.9 points and 5.0 rebounds per game.

**OFFENSE: EFFICIENT & HIGH-SCORING**

**STATE'S OFFENSE AMONG BEST IN THE COUNTRY**

- Although Vic Schaefer's teams are widely known for their defense, Mississippi State has established itself as one of the best offensive teams in Division I.
- This season, State ranks sixth in the nation in scoring margin (+22.1) and 11th in scoring offense at 80.0 ppg.
- With four players shooting over 50 percent from the field, the Bulldogs rank ninth in the country and top the SEC in field goal percentage with a .471 clip.
- Another key to MSU's offensive success has been its ability to take care of the ball and make the extra passes for better shots. State ranks fourth in the SEC in assists per game (14.0 apg) and fifth in assist/turnover ratio (1.09).
- When the Bulldogs aren't knocking down shots, State is crashing the glass to get a second opportunity at a basket. With 347 offensive rebounds on the season, Mississippi State has gotten the rebound on 40 percent of its missed baskets and turned that into 370 second-chance points.

**BULLDOGS SET MSU SINGLE-GAME SCORING RECORD**

- In its win against Murray State, Mississippi State's offense exploded for 124 points against the Racer, breaking the MSU single-game scoring record.
- Standing for 33 years, the previous record was set on February 24, 1986, when Mississippi State defeated Judson College, 117-35.
- The 124 points also marks the fourth-highest scoring performance of any Division I team so far this season.
- State was just one point shy of tying the program record for margin of victory, which stands at 82 points set in the

contest against Judson College.

- MSU has now scored at least 100 points 23 times in Schaefer's eight seasons and has eclipsed the 110-point margin seven times with him at the helm.

- Under Schaefer, Mississippi State has developed into one of the top scoring offenses in the nation.
- His teams have ranked inside the top 25 in scoring during each of the last three seasons, and his Bulldogs currently boast the NCAA's 11th-ranked scoring offense.

**SECRETARY OF DEFENSE**

- Vic Schaefer's teams have always had a major emphasis on one area: defense. If you want to play for him, you have to play lockdown, tenacious and suffocating defense for 40 minutes every game. It's this expectation and mentality that has earned Schaefer the nickname "Secretary of Defense."
- So far this season, State's relentless defense has forced opponents into turning the ball over 545 times for an average of 21.8 turnovers per game. That number ranks eighth in the nation and tops the SEC. The Bulldogs have forced at least 20 turnovers in 20 games this season.
- The Bulldogs have been solid at rejecting shots with an average of 4.7 blocks per game, which is 29th in Division I. **Jessica Carter** has led the charge by posting 1.9 bpg this season to rank 45th in the country and fifth in the SEC.
- State's on-ball pressure has been suffocating all year, especially in the press. MSU ranks second in the SEC with 10.0 steals per game. **Jordan Danberry** is pacing the team in the category with 2.7 spg to rank second in league and 26th in the nation.
- While there is no ranking for the stat, Mississippi State certainly ranks amongst the country's best teams at drawing charges. So far, the Bulldogs have taken 83 charges, led by 40 from **Myah Taylor**.

**BULLDOGS SHUTDOWN STANFORD'S WILLIAMS**

- Stanford point guard **Kiana Williams** is one of the top point guards and players in the country, earning spots on the Naismith Trophy, John R. Wooden Award and Ann Meyers Drysdale Award preseason watch lists.

- Entering the game against Mississippi State, the All-Pac-12 performer ranked seventh in the country with an impressive 4.43 assist/turnover ratio. Against the Bulldogs, Williams had eight turnovers and just one assist.
- Eight turnovers marked the most in the junior's 79-game career with the Cardinal.

### MISSISSIPPI STATE IN THE AP RANKINGS

- On Nov. 24, 2014, the Associated Press voted Mississippi State back into the top 25 for the first time in four years. With MSU earning a spot in the preseason poll heading into the 2019-20 season, the Bulldogs have now spent 109 consecutive weeks inside the AP Top 25, marking the longest streak in program history.
- During the stretch, State was ranked inside the top 10 for 68 total weeks, including 10 weeks this season.
- Since beginning the streak, MSU has been ranked as a top-five team for 33 weeks, including a stretch of 14 straight weeks during the 2017-18 season.

### DEEP DIVE INTO STATE'S SPECIALTY STATS

- When it comes to specialty stats, Mississippi State leads its opponents in all five categories this year.
- The Bulldogs have been able to score at will down low this season. MSU has posted 1132 of its points in the paint, which accounts for 57 percent of the team's total scoring. State has scored at least 50 points in the paint seven times.
- With defense being a top priority, Mississippi State has been able to turn its 545 turnovers forced into 616 points. That accounts for nearly a third of the team's scoring this year.
- MSU is one of the best teams in the country when it comes to field goal percentage, but when it does miss, State has been able to get an offensive rebound on 40 percent of its missed shots, which the Bulldogs have capitalized on and turned into 370 second-chance points.
- While MSU has three starters that are averaging double-digit scoring, Mississippi State's bench has also provided a much-needed spark in several games this season. With 677 bench points this year, State is getting an average of 27.1 points per game from the reserves. During SEC play, MSU's bench has outscored opponents in all but two games.
- When the Bulldogs get a turnover, one of the things that MSU wants to do is turn that into quick points in transition. So far, State has 369 fast break points this season.

### MSU BRINGS HOME DUEL IN THE DESERT TITLE

- After posting wins against USF and Virginia, Mississippi State brought home the Duel in the Desert title.
- The Bulldogs posted double-digit wins against both of their opponents en route to the team's first regular-season tournament championship since 2017, when State won the 2017 edition of the Duel in the Desert.
- MSU opened with a wire-to-wire victory against USF. **Chloe Bibby** knocked down five 3-pointers in the first quarter to fuel the offense. **Ricke Jackson**, who earned tournament MVP honors, posted the first double-double of her career with 17 points and 10 rebounds.
- Against Virginia, **Jessika Carter** finished with 13 points and 15 boards to earn a spot on the all-tournament team.

### BULLDOGS PLACE 2ND IN GREATER VICTORIA INVITATIONAL

- Competing against a stacked field, Mississippi State finished second in the Greater Victoria Invitational after going 2-1.
- The Bulldogs won its first two games against San Francisco and Green Bay before falling in the championship to No. 3 Stanford, 67-62.
- MSU erased a double-digit deficit in the fourth quarter to have a chance to tie the ballgame with less than 30 seconds remaining but the rally against the Cardinal came up short.
- After facing State, Green Bay went on to defeat No. 18 Syracuse to earn a third-place finish in the tournament, while San Francisco claimed a pair of victories over Bowling Green and Houston to take fifth place.
- Jordan Danberry** earned a spot on the all-tournament team after averaging 15.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 1.7 assists, and 1.7 steals per game.

### BULLDOGS SIGN TWO TOP-100 PLAYERS IN 2020 CLASS

- Once again, Vic Schaefer and the Mississippi State women's basketball team found success on the recruiting trail, landing a pair of top-100 players in five star guard **Madison Hayes** and four star forward **DeYona Gaston**.
- Hayes, who is State's second-ever McDonald's All-American

signee, is rated as the No. 29 player in the country by espnW. The 2019 USA Today Tennessee Player of the Year is the third top-30 prospect to sign with MSU in the last two classes.

Hayes earned a spot on the Naismith Trophy Player of the Year Midseason Team and the USA Today All-USA Preseason Team for the 2019-20 season. As a junior, she averaged 25.2 ppg, 12.2 rpg and 4.0 spg in helping her team to a district championship and received All-Tennessee first team honors by USA Today.

Rated 95th in the country, Gaston was one of the most highly-touted players in the 2020 class early on. As a freshman at Pearland High School in Texas, she averaged a double-double with 17.5 ppg and 11.3 rpg to go along with 3.0 bpg and 2.0 spg. However, she missed all of her sophomore season due to injuries, dropping her in the rankings.

Gaston proved she was still one of the best players in the country, posting 18.1 ppg on 52 percent shooting as a junior in 2018-19. She also averaged 9.5 rpg and 1.9 bpg. In two seasons, she's totaled 926 points, 542 rebounds, 128 blocks, 92 steals and 58 assists.

With the goal of putting together an impressive senior year, Gaston is coming off a campaign where she claimed TGCA 6A District Player of the Year as well as the Defensive Player of the Year honors en route to earning a spot on the All-State team.

### STATE GOING WIRE TO WIRE

- Mississippi State has been quick to get a lead over opponents this year to swing the momentum in its favor. The Bulldogs own eight wire-to-wire victories in which they never trailed.
- Three of the games have come against SEC opponents, including an 80-39 win against Ole Miss that saw MSU open the game on a 12-0 run.
- In six of the wire-to-wire wins, State scored within a minute of the tip to get the offense rolling early.

### DANBERRY EARNS SPOT ON NAISMITH TROPHY PLAYER OF THE YEAR MIDSEASON TEAM

- In the midst of a stellar final season, **Jordan Danberry** was tabbed to the Naismith Trophy Women's Player of the Year 2020 Midseason Team by the Atlanta Tipoff Club on Tuesday morning.
- Danberry ranks inside the top 30 in the nation in both total steals and steals per game on the year despite defending the opposing team's best guard every game.
- Offensively, she's one of the team's top scorers and ranks second in assists.
- Danberry was one of 30 players from across the country to be selected for the midseason team.
- She also earned a spot on the Naismith Women's Defensive Player of the Year Midseason Team in January.

### JACKSON, MATHARU EARN SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS

- Entering the season, Mississippi State knew it would have to rely on freshmen in order to succeed and the group has lived up to the hype as the highest-rated signing class in program history. During conference play, **Rickea Jackson** (2x) and **Aliyah Matharu** (1x) have been tabbed the SEC Freshman of the Week a total of three times.
- Jackson most recently won the weekly award after averaging 23 points per game and shooting 60 percent from the field in State's wins against Auburn and Georgia.
- Jackson notched a career-high 24 points against Georgia, besting her previous career high of 22 points from the game before against Auburn.
- Matharu received the honor for averaging 12.5 points, 2.5 rebounds and 2.5 steals per game while coming off the bench in State's wins at Vanderbilt and against Ole Miss.
- Down by two possessions entering the fourth quarter at Vanderbilt, Matharu scored 11 of MSU's 22 points to fuel the offense and recorded three steals to spearhead a zone defense by State that held the Commodores to just two points in the period. She finished with 14 points, four rebounds and a career-high four steals.
- The Washington, D.C., native followed that performance up by posting her seventh double-digit scoring effort of the year with 11 points in the win against Ole Miss.
- A freshman has been recognized for the weekly honor by the SEC 14 times under head coach **Vic Schaefer**. Jackson and Matharu are the first freshman duo to win the award in the same season since **Victoria Vivians** and **Morgan William** achieved the same feat during the 2014-15 campaign.

### STATE ASSISTANTS RECOGNIZED FOR COACHING EFFORTS

- Mississippi State's two associate head coaches have each been recognized for their professionalism, hard work and promise in the coaching field.
- **Johnnie Harris**, who was named the WBCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2018, has been selected to participate in this year's NEXT UP program at the Final Four. This is a competitive program that promotes up-and-coming coaches in women's basketball that are likely to become head coaches.
- Harris has been responsible for coaching some of the best post players in program history at State, including **Teaira McCowan** who she mentored during record-setting senior and junior campaigns in 2017-19.
- **Dionnah Jackson-Durrett** was honored last month at the 2019 Delux Power 100, which recognizes the top 100 professionals and influential leaders from St. Louis. She is considered one of the top up-and-coming coaches in the country.
- An All-America point guard at Oklahoma, Jackson-Durrett's presence in Starkville has been felt since she arrived in 2015. Working with the point guards, Mississippi State recorded its top three assists marks for a single season each of the last three years under her guidance and coached and mentored arguably the two best point guards ever to play for the Bulldogs in **Jazzmun Holmes** and **Morgan William**.

### STATE PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN LEAGUE, DANBERRY AND BIBBY NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-SEC TEAMS BY COACHES

- As two of Mississippi State's top returners from a year ago, **Jordan Danberry** and **Chloe Bibby** earned preseason All-SEC recognition from league coaches.
- Danberry earned first-team honors for her ability to get to any spot on the floor and score as well as her lockdown defense.
- Despite coming off an injury and missing half of last season, league coaches are expecting Bibby to return to full strength and once again take her place among the country's best 3-point shooters, placing her on the second team.
- Mississippi State was picked to finish third in the SEC this season by both the media and coaches. The Bulldogs have placed inside the top three of the conference in each of the last five seasons.

## ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- Mississippi State's 2019-20 roster features 13 players representing 11 states, Washington, D.C. as well as Australia.
- Players came to Starkville from Arkansas, California, Georgia, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, New York, Tennessee, Virginia, Washington and Wisconsin.
- State has one graduate, four juniors, four sophomores and four freshmen.
- Mississippi State returned three starters from a year ago in **Chloe Bibby**, **Jordan Danberry** and **Andra Espinoza-Hunter**. Danberry was the only one to start all 36 games for the Bulldogs, who must replace three other players that started every game (**Jazzmun Holmes**, **Anriel Howard** and **Teaira McCowan**).

## SCHAEFER BECOMES SECOND-FASTEST COACH TO WIN 200 GAMES AT SEC PROGRAM

- Vic Schaefer** has been one of the most successful coaches in women's basketball since joining Mississippi State. With State's victory at Marquette on Nov. 25, 2019, the two-time National Coach of the Year became the second-fastest coach to reach 200 victories at an SEC school.
- Achieving the milestone in just 256 games, Schaefer ranks behind only Georgia's Andy Landers, who reached his 200th victory in 251 games.
- The next closest coach to have accomplished the feat is Auburn's **Joe Ciampi** (258), while legendary head coach **Pat Summitt** reached victory No. 200 in her 259th game at Tennessee.
- Also worth noting, Schaefer was the fourth-fastest coach to reach the mark amongst active coaches at their current program, trailing only Duke's **Joanne P. McCallie** (240), Baylor's **Kim Mulkey** (245) and Stanford's **Tara VanDerveer** (255).

## NCAA GRANTS DANBERRY FIFTH YEAR OF ELIGIBILITY

- On August 20, the NCAA informed **Jordan Danberry** that she had been granted a fifth year of eligibility after transferring to Mississippi State and not redshirting.
- Danberry sat out an entire year from December 2016 until making her Bulldog debut Dec. 10, 2017, against Little Rock. During this period, Danberry wasn't eligible for a redshirt due to playing in six games at Arkansas before transferring.
- Danberry is currently pursuing an MBA after earning her bachelor's degree in Business Economics last December.
- This past season, Danberry ranked third on the team in scoring with 13.1 ppg and second in assists (125) and steals (65) after starting in all 36 games. The Conway, Arkansas, native was eighth in the SEC in assist/turnover ratio (1.47). She scored in double figures in 13 of 16 SEC games to average 14.3 ppg in league play.

## MCCOWAN IMPRESSES IN FIRST SEASON WITH FEVER

- After being selected third overall by the Indiana Fever in the 2019 WNBA Draft, **Teaira McCowan** made an immediate impact with her new team.
- The former All-American and SEC Player of the Year earned a spot on the WNBA All-Rookie Team.
- McCowan ranked second in the WNBA in rebounding (9.0 rpg), fifth in field goal percentage (51.7) and 10th in blocks (1.29 bpg) – all rookie highs.
- McCowan set the Fever team records for single-season rebounds (305) and consecutive double-doubles (5).
- She was the third-leading rookie scorer with 10.0 ppg.

- Vic Schaefer embarks on his eighth season as the Bulldogs' coach. He owns the second-most victories in program history, and his winning percentage through his first seven campaigns is the best in program annals.
- Schaefer's Bulldogs have posted seven-straight seasons of 20-plus wins after the program had four 20-win campaigns in the 38 years prior to his arrival. His last three squads became the first MSU teams to eclipse 30 wins.
- Schaefer was named the 2019 ESPNW National Coach of the Year after leading Mississippi State to a third consecutive Elite Eight appearance, back-to-back SEC Championships and the program's first SEC Tournament Championship
- In 2018, he was tabbed National Coach of the Year by Naismith, WBCA and USBWA after guiding the Bulldogs to a National Finalist finish for the second year in a row.
- He guided the 2017-18 Bulldogs to a school-record and nation's-best 37 wins, the team also became the first SEC squad to post a perfect regular season since 1998.
- Under his watch, the Bulldogs won the program's first SEC Championship and SEC Tournament Championship, earning him SEC Coach of the Year honors during three of the last five seasons.
- In the last five seasons, his MSU squads have won 159 games, the fourth-most in Division I and the most in the SEC during that time.
- He has produced two All-Americans (Teaira McCowan & Victoria Vivians), one SEC Player of the Year (McCowan) and nine All-SEC performers along with numerous other accolades as well.
- He coached McCowan to a pair of National Defensive Player of the Year accolades by WBCA (2019) and Naismith (2018).
- He helped Vivians bring home the 2018 Naismith Starting Five Ann Meyers Drysdale Award given to the nation's best shooting guard in the country.
- Under his guidance, Mississippi State has spent 109 consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25 rankings, the fifth-longest streak in the country.
- In 2018-19, Mississippi State set program records for total attendance (143,578) and average attendance (8,446), which ranked fourth and fifth in the country, respectively.
- In just his 256th game at State, Schaefer became the second-fastest coach ever to achieve 200 victories with an SEC program ahead of hall-of-fame coaches Joe Ciampi (258 games), Pat Summitt (259), Van Chancellor (263), Jim Foster (280) and Sue Gunter (280). Only Georgia's Andy Landers (251) reached the mark at a faster pace.
- Schaefer also went to the Final Four in his previous two stops at Texas A&M and Arkansas. In nine seasons in College Station, he helped the Aggies to 212 wins and seven NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2011 national championship.
- He was part of 121 wins in six seasons at Arkansas, taking the Razorbacks to the Final Four in his first season. The Razorbacks went to the NCAA Tournament four times and won a WNIT title during his time on the staff in Fayetteville.

- One of only three returning upperclassmen on the roster (Jordan Danberry and Andra Espinoza-Hunter).
- Ranks fourth in MSU history with a 38.2 career 3FG%; Espinoza-Hunter is fifth with a .378 clip.
- Leads the team in threes made with 35.
