

MEDIA INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS

If you have a 2019-20 football or men's basketball season credential it is valid for home baseball games. All other media credential requests should be submitted at least 24 hours prior to home games. Credentials can be picked up the day of a game at the Will Call window at Kentucky Proud Park. Requests should be made through the athletics communications and public relations office by contacting Matt May.

Media may enter the ballpark via the left field gate or main gate behind home plate. Parking is available in the Purple Lot adjacent to the softball/soccer complex at the end of Wildcat Court.

PRESS BOX/RADIO/TV

The Kentucky Proud Park press box sits above the grandstand on level two. You must display credential for entry. There is limited seating in the Press Box with the majority of media seats available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Radio and TV booths are on this level as well. There is a media/photo work room adjacent to the press box.

MEDIA SERVICES

Final box scores will be available shortly following each game. UK ACPR will send postgame summaries, notes, photos (when available) and box scores via email and via UKathletics.com. Season stats will be updated online as quickly as possible.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Interviews with players and coaches are conducted on the field following each game. Please let Matt May or a member of the UK ACPR staff know of any postgame interview requests and we will coordinate for you. For assistance in locating any member of the Kentucky team, find Matt May for help. For assistance with opposing players and coaches, please see the visiting team SID.

PRACTICE/INTERVIEWS

Practices are typically in the afternoon with the exception of Mondays (off day). Head coach Nick Mingione is available for interviews weekday mornings except Mondays, as well as before/after practice and postgame. Players are available for interviews before practice on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. <u>DUE TO NCAA</u> TIME MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS, PLAYER INTERVIEW REQUESTS MUST BE TURNED IN BY SUNDAY AT 5 P.M. FOR THE FOLLOWING WEEK. Please arrange all interviews through the UK ACPR of-fice and baseball contact Matt May. PLEASE DO NOT REACH OUT DIRECTLY TO PLAYERS ON SOCIAL MEDIA.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Photographs and headshots are made available to the media for publication use. To obtain photos of any Wildcat player, please contact Matt May in the UK ACPR office. Please credit "UK Athletics" in any usage.

During games, photographers and videographers may shoot from anywhere on the Kentucky Proud Park concourse, terraces and grass berms, provided <u>NO SPECTATOR'S SIGHTLINE IS BLOCKED</u>. Dedicated photo/video areas have been established on each side of the concourse level near where the terrace and berm meet. NEW FOR 2020, THE PHOTO WELLS AT THE END OF EACH DUGOUT WILL BE RE-STRICTED TO INSTITUTION STAFF AND TELEVISION. A photo/video stadium map will be available in the press box for reference.

INTERNET ACCESS (*NEW FOR 2019*)

• There are several options for wireless internet access. Anyone can self-register and connect to ATH-GUEST, which is good for 90 days.

• You also can connect to the ATHMEDIA network at KPP, which requires a unique username and password. KEEPIN' IT 100

Kentucky fans have quickly created a bond with **Nick Mingione**, whose infectious and unrelenting enthusiasm and down-to-earth personality has earned legions of new fans. Although it is certainly an ingredient in Mingione's on-field success, getting the best out of his players has been the biggest factor in the success he's achieved everywhere he's been...In 17 years of coaching the teams he's been involved with have averaged 38 victories a year and advanced to the postseason 10 times with two national runner-up finishes.

Mingione had a brilliant playing career at Embry-Riddle - he ranks 10th on its career hits list - where he helped lead the program to 154 victories and three NAIA World Series appearances in three seasons as an assistant. When he arrived at Kentucky in 2006 he was immediately part of what is still the Cats' only SEC championship club, then smelled success at Mississippi State before returning to the one place he had always wanted to be a head coach - UK. First season, first Super Regional appearance for the Cats.

With 103 career wins and 39 in SEC play, Mingione is the winngest UK coach during the first three seasons of his tenure:

COGGIN, ROSZEL JOIN COACHING STAFF

The UK coaching staff has a new look to it this season with the additions of Will Coggin and Dan Roszel as assistant coaches, the first changes to Mingione's staff during his tenure in Lexington. Coggin will work in concert with volunteer assistant coach Todd Guilliams on the hitting side of things, as well as serve as the recruiting coordinator, while Roszel is the pitching coordinator.

Roszel has a long-established track record of excellence, which includes mentoring 30 pitchers who have signed professional contracts, 11 who have made the major leagues and a pair of Top 15 overall MLB draft picks in Jeff Hoffman and Boston Red Sox star Chris Sale. He spent the past nine seasons at East Carolina, where the Pirates finished in the nation's top 50 in ERA seven times.

Coggin spent time with Mingione at Mississippi State and has proven to be a winner at every stop of his playing and coaching career. The Mississippi native has worked with 2017 SEC Player of the Year Brent Rooker, SEC all-time hits leader Jake Mangum, and current big-leaguers Nate Lowe and Myles Straw as part of 38 draft picks in relatively short coaching career that began as a student assistant with the Bulldogs in 2009.

BIGGIE BOX

One of the pillars of UK's offense is working its game goals in search of the big inning - "Biggie Box" - which is defined as any inning where the Cats put four or more runs on the scoreboard. The approach has been so effective the lineup has opened its "Biggie Box" 94 times since Mingione took over (37 in 2017 and 31 in 2018) and recorded 20 such innings last season. The Cats also are 81-16 under Mingione when scoring six or more runs. (See page 10 for chart on 2020 big innings)

Kentucky's offense has been one of the nation's elite the past three seasons under Mingione and his staff, in particular renowned hitting guru Todd Guilliams. The Cats have been a devastating offensive club under Guilliams' direction, leading the SEC in a total of 14 offensive statistical categories, while also producing five All-Americans.

In 2018, UK led the SEC in home runs per game, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, scoring, doubles per game and sacrifice bunts, while ranking in the nation's top 20 in five of those six categories - and top 10 in three. In 2017, the Cats registered the most hits in a single-season (706) in UK history and ranking near the top of the single-season charts in numerous other categories. The offense also ranked in the top 12 nationally in doubles (2nd), hits (4th), hit by pitches (4th), on-base percentage (7th), walks (10th), sacrifice bunts (10th), slugging percentage (11th) and batting average (12th).

YOU CAN PUT IT ON THE BOARD

UK recently set the school record with 127 consecutive games without being shutout. In fact, the Cats scored in 203 consecutive nine-inning games, the lone exception being a loss to LSU in the 2017 SEC Tournament that was halted after seven innings, before the streak was snapped by UNC Wilmington on Feb. 28.

ON-BASE MACHINE

Sophomore infielder Austin Schultz was a catalyst at the top of the lineup last season as a rookie, using his combination of hitting ability and patience at the plate to find his way onto the bases. In fact, there have been only eight instances since the beginning of 2012 where a UK player has reached base safely in at least 25 consecutive games. Schultz is the only freshman to have accomplished the feat during that time.

Schultz has reached base safely in 50 of his past 53 games, and recently had a 22-game streak snapped. Through 11 games he already has eight extra-base hits, including three home runs (he had two all of 2019), 11 runs, 14 RBI and five stolen bases.

One of the tenets of Mingione's philosophy for the UK progam is that young men in it are students first, people second an players third. Senior 1B T.J. Collett was honored for the person part of that by being named to both the 2018 and 2019 SEC Community Service Teams. He also was recently inducted, along with Carson Coleman, into UK's prestigious Frank G. Ham Society of Character.

Collett, who hails from Terre Haute, Indiana, is heavily involved with the NEGU/Jessie Rees Foundation, whose mission is connecting with families of young cancer patients, bringing awareness to their stories, offering them a network of helpful resources and sending the entire family encouragement throughout their journey. NEGU, which stands for Never Ever Give Up, has worked with Collett on bringing children and their families to UK home baseball games to experience pregame activities on the field and in the dugout, as well as be announced during the game. As part of his work with NEGU, Collett has spearheaded an effort where members of the UK baseball team delivery Joy Jars to young cancer patients. KENTUCKY PROUD PARK

Kentucky baseball moved into a new home for the 2019 season, opening the \$49 million Kentucky Proud Park, a state-of-the-art facility immediately considered one of the top facilities in all of college baseball. The Wildcats won their first game in their new home, defeating Eastern Kentucky, 7-3, on Feb. 26, 2019.

The stadium features permanent seating for nearly 2,500 fans with additional space on grass berms to accommodate 5,000 fans for regular season games. Beyond the outfield wall, temporary bleachers can be installed for NCAA Tournament games to bring the seating capacity to more than 7,000. Fan amenities also include suites and a new club area.

The team areas were a priority and give our players and coaches everything they need to compete at a high level in a single location. The facility features a team lounge, locker room, training area, indoor hitting and pitching areas, and coaching offices, as well as a recruiting room. All spaces are either new to UK baseball or significantly larger than previous ones.

The playing surface is the AstroTurf® Rootzone Diamond Blend, which will allow the team to maximize usage in all weather conditions. The pitcher's mound will remain dirt.

The video board that looms large beyond the right-centerfield wall measures 48 feet wide by 30 feet tall, making it the eighth-largest in college baseball.

The name is a tribute to farmers and businesses of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the Big Blue Nation. Kentucky Farm Bureau secured the rights to name the stadium from JMI Sports, UK Athletics' multimedia rights partner. In turn, Kentucky Farm Bureau elected to name the stadium for Kentucky Proud, the state's official agricultural marketing program housed at the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. No state taxpayer dollars were used in funding the agreement. The Kentucky Proud program is funded through the generosity of the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund. The fund is directed by the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board and administered by the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy.

ALL RHODES LEAD TO LEXINGTON

UK coach Nick Mingione isn't big on hyperbole so when both he and hitting guru Todd Guilliams talk about the talent of freshman infielder/outfielder John Rhodes you're bound to pay a little closer attention. Rhodes, a 6-foot, 200-pounder from the Chattanooga, Tennessee area is an athletically-built five-tool player with a big future.

"John Rhodes is special," Mingione said. "He's a guy I think we're going to be sitting here looking back one day going, 'Wow, that's one of the better players we've had come through here."

Rhodes flashed his prodigious talent last summer when he tore up the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League despite being just weeks removed from high school. He was named the Most Valuable Player of the league's all-star game and the No. 11 overall prospect in the collegiate summer league after hitting .316 with 24 runs, 24 RBI, 15 extra-base hits and six steals in 36 games.

RUN, CATS, RUN

In the first year of Kentucky Proud Park, a more spacious home venue than Cliff Hagan Stadium, the Cats played to its identity, running at every opportunity on the way to 85 stolen bases for the season. That total is the seventh-highest dating to 1985 and the third-most in the past 23 seasons, with four different Cats swiped at least 10 bags. The coaching staff contends the 2020 team is the fastest team they've been a part of and will continue to heavily incorporate it in the gameplan.

Outfielder Jaren Shelby put his speed tool on display last season when he stole five bases against Eastern Kentucky in the first game ever played at Kentucky Proud Park. The five steals were the most for any SEC player in 25 years, dating back to 1994 when Vanderbilt's Boomer Whipple swiped five against Western Kentucky. Shelby stole second, third and home in the fifth inning against EKU and then second and third again an inning later.



MLB TRAINING GROUND

Kentucky has made its presence felt in the Major League Baseball Draft the past three years with 24 players selected, including 21 in 2017 and 2018, which was the most of any college program in the country over that span. In Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019) the Cats have had two first-round selections under coach Nick Mingione. In the last three drafts:

• 13 Wildcats were selected in the first 10 rounds.

• Six were selected in the first five rounds, including first-rounders Evan White (2017) and Zack Thompson (2019).

• The 13 picks in 2018 are the second-most for any school in a single draft since 2006 and tied for an SEC record with Texas A&M (2016) and national champion Vanderbilt (2019).

• The 14 underclassmen drafted during that span earned \$10.435 million in signing bonus money, an average of \$745,358 per player.

• All but one draftee was selected higher than previously selected.

• 15 of the draftees had not previously been drafted.



SHELBY CONTINUES FAMILY TRADITION

When UK began recruiting Jaren Shelby it had history and location on its side. The senior outfielder hailed from Lexington, played his prep baseball just down the street at Tates Creek High School and had spent much of his childhood watching older brothers John III and JaVon putting up big numbers for the Wildcats. The first family of Lexington baseball, which includes patriarch John Shelby, had a deep connection to the blue and white that proved to be too much for Jaren, the youngest brother, to pass up coming out of State College of Florida last season.

Jaren, a former Kentucky Gatorade Player of the Year in 2016, opted to follow in the footsteps of his brothers, both of whom were all-conference players with the Cats. John III played at UK from 2004-06, was on the program's first SEC championship team and served as a student assistant coach in 2018, while JaVon wore blue from 2014-16.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

The Wildcats again will face one of the most difficult schedules in the country with 31 games slated against teams that made the 2019 NCAA Tournament, including 11 against College World Series participants and 20 against teams ranked in the preseason top 11.

The season opens on the road against perennial power TCU and after a 15-game homestand the Cats hit the road for the eighth straight season to open SEC play, drawing defending national champion Vanderbilt in Nashville on March 13-15. They will return home to host Florida on March 20-22 before traveling to 2019 College World Series participant Mississippi State to close out March. In all, 15 of the first 18 conference games are against teams ranked 11th or higher in the preseason polls, there is a non-conference home-and-home series with Louisville and road game at Indiana as well.





"THE HOOK"

One of the personal touches to the Wildcats' new home, Kentucky Proud Park, is "The Hook," which is the name of the visting bullpen just beyond the right field wall. The name is a tribute to former UK pitcher Jonathan Hooker, who pitched for the Cats from 1998-2001, and died in the plane crash of Comair Flight 5191 on Aug. 27, 2006 in Lexington.

Hooker and his wife, Scarlett Parsley, were married the night before and were on the early-morning flight headed to their honeymoon when the pilots attempted to take off from the wrong runway and crashed into a neighboring field. Forty-nine of the 50 people on board were killed, including both Hooker and Parsley.

The London, Ky. native was a beloved teammate and member of UK Baseball and his family was honored on Mar. 29, 2019 during an in-game ceremony to officially unveil "The Hook," which features a sign and memorial to the former Wildcat.



Elite power presence...Any swing has chance to leave the yard... Series of injuries has limited him at times but is healthy and has his body in the best shape it's been in his career... Needs 13 hits to join career 100-hit club... Played for Brewster in the famed Cape Cod League last summer, batting .281 with 19 runs scored and six doubles...Tied for the lead league in home runs with nine, the most in the CCBL since 2012...Ranked third in the CCBL with 32 RBI and fourth in the league with a .539 slugging percentage...Posted an .863 OPS in 128 at-bats...Named a 2019 Cape Cod League All-Star...Has hit 10 home runs each of the past two seasons.

6 • JADEN BROWN (FR., IF)

Canadian middle infielder who was selected in last summer's MLB Draft based on natural gifts and potential...Extremely athletic player who can run and has a plus arm...Tireless worker and tough kid...Has flashed 100 MPH exit velocities...Has international experience with Canadian baseball national program... Ranked the No. 58 player overall and No. 15 shortstop in the 2019 class by Perfect Game...Ranked the top player in Canada by Perfect Game...Participated in the 2018 Perfect Game All-American Classic.

7 • DREW GRACE (FR., IF)

Made his collegiate debut on 2/16 as starting SS vs. TCU...Logged first hit and first RBI on 2/18 vs. Southeast Missouri...Staff called him the biggest surprise of the fall and the most improved player from start of camp until end...Has aptitude for the game and a grittiness coaches love...Almost wills good things to happen on the field...Reliable player who brings consistency of effort and production...Will be heavily involved in the middle infield rotation... Rated No. 260 overall by Prep Baseball Report in Class of 2019.

8 • TANNER HOLEN (SR., C)

Recorded first career hit on 2/25 vs. Tennessee Tech...Catcher who can handle the bat...Strong catch and throw defender...Terrific kid who is a hard worker...Has some thump in his bat...Slotted as the backup catcher...Has been through significantly more adversity than most players his age, having nearly died due to an internal infection in 2016 that caused both lungs to collapse and kept him hospitalized for more than a month...Did not see much action in 2019 but had terrific summer in Western Canadian Baseball League, hitting .321 in 190 at-bats with 29 runs, 17 doubles, two triples, six home runs and 47 RBI.

9 • BREYDON DANIEL (SR., IF/OF)

Switch-hitter the staff sees as one of the keys to the offense...Tools are evident...Extremely versatile with the ability to handle either corner infield spot and outfield...Has shown power from both sides of the plate and twice last season hit opposite field home runs off potential top overall 2020 draft pick Emerson Hancock...In 2019, started at five different positions (1B, 3B, LF, CF, RF)...Batted .238 with 32 runs scored, six doubles, a triple, seven home runs and 20 RBI...Drew 23 walks and was hit by 11 pitches...Led the team with 17 stolen bases, the most for a UK player since 2014 and second-most since 2010.

10 • MATT GOLDA (JR., IF)

Has seven hits in first 13 AB, scoring seven runs...Logged first UK hit on 2/16 at TCU as a pinch hitter...Accomplished defensive player who was highly rated coming out of high school...Will play middle infield... Instinctive player...Sought out playing on the SEC stage...Needs experience at this level...Spent some time playing baseball in the Dominican Republic during his development... Played the past two seasons at Western Oklahoma State College...In two seasons, scored 97 runs, had 108 hits, 34 doubles, six triples, four home runs, drove in 72 and stole 24 bases...Drew nearly as many walks (66) as times he struck out (70).

12 • CHASE ESTEP (FR., IF)

Hit first career home run on 2/25 vs. Tennessee Tech...Had first hit 2/22 vs. Appalachian State...Good athlete who was an accomplished multi-sport athlete in high school...Provides competitive at-bats from the left side and played a quality third base defensively in the fall...Staff is extremely high on his potential to be an impact player in his career... In high school was a three-time All-State selection in both baseball and football (2017-19)...Ranked the No. 1 third baseman and No. 7 overall player in the state of Kentucky in Class of 2019 by Perfect Game... Father and uncle both played for the Cats.

13 • BRENDAN HORD (R-FR., C)

Local product in the mold of former catcher Marshall Gei...Relentless worker...Yes-sir, no-sir, do-anything-you-ask guy...Elite student... Earned consideration in vote for team captains as a true freshman... Impact on the team reaches further than just what he does on the field...Not satisfied with just being good locker room guy, wants to be a player...Legit power in his bat... Father's side of the family owned, lived on and serviced a large tobacco farm in Maysville, Ky. for generations.

25 • COLTYN KESSLER (JR., C/IF)

Good athlete who has played both third base and catcher since arriving on campus...Accomplished hitter with impressive bat speed...Exceptional power from the left side...Can still go the other way and may actually have more power to opposite field than pull side...Has shown willingness and ability to work a count and take a walk with strong pitch recognition..as the clutch gene...Was difference maker in Cape Cod League playoffs over the summer as his team won title...In 2019, Batted .297 with 28 runs, 49 hits and 29 RBI in 165 at-bats... Had a team-best 11-game hit streak.

28 • ORAJ ANU (JR., OF)

Recorded first UK hit on 2/18 vs. Southeast Missouri...Drew game-winning walk-off walk in 15th inning vs. Appalachian State on 2/23...Bigtime raw talent who has twice been selected in the MLB Draft...Physical specimen whose mother was world-class track star and father a college football player...More athletic and quicker than people realize because of his size...Had 12 extra-base hits and 29 RBI over the summer in the Cape Cod League... Played the past two seasons at Wallace-Dothan (Ala.) Community College...In those two seasons hit a combined .390 with 155 hits, 115 runs scored, 37 doubles, one triple, 30 home runs and 125 RBI...Two-time JUCO All-American.

30 • JAREN SHELBY (SR., OF)

Comes from the first family of Lexington baseball...Brothers, John III and JaVon, were both all-conference players at UK...Father, John, has been involved with Major League Baseball for more than four decades...Tremendous power to all fields...Plus speed...Elite leader-ship qualities and presence...Tools are off the charts... In 2019, batted .273 with 22 runs scored, 10 doubles, six home runs and 35 RBI... Posted an .822 OPS...Stole 13 bases in 17 attempts, the second-most steals on the team...Hit .329 with a .946 OPS in non-conference games.

33 • TRAE HARMON (SO., 18/OF)

Homered in all three games of Appalachian State series (2/21-23)... Slugging .909 through first 22 AB...Blasted his first career home run on 2/15 at TCU...Greatest strength is his power from the right side...Has the highest exit velocities on the team...Coaches say he's more than just power threat, can really hit...Has learned to use the whole field...Staff has gained confidence in him as he continues to put up numbers in practice... Has made remarkable transformation with his body...Had a strong summer in the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League, batting .319 with an .845 OPS...Won the PGCBL Home Run Derby.

37 • CAM HILL (SQ., DF)

Out indefinitely after suffering a broken wrist in an outfield collision on 2/23 vs. Appalachian State...Brett Gardner type that gets under opponents' skin...Gritty...Hard-nosed...Intense...Premier defender in outfield...Fearless...Can wreak havoc on the bases and create run...Last summer in Cape Cod League he ranked sixth in the league in stolen bases with 11...Led the CCBL with 10 hit by pitch...In 2019, flourished late in the year, raising his batting average more than 50 points over the final six weeks...Was a human highlight reel in centerfield, routinely providing jaw-dropping catches.

42 • ELLIOTT CURTIS (SR., IF)

Was off to terrific start to season before suffering a fractured and dislocated ankle sliding into second base on 2/25 vs. Tennessee Tech...Out for the remainder of 2020 season...Utility infielder who became one of most consistent offensive threats in lineup over final six weeks last season... Has some pop but also a terrific situational hitter...Hit over .300 in SEC play...Runs well and can bunt...Steady player who is hard to get out of the lineup... Took over as the starting second baseman midway through SEC play last season and batted .309 with an OPS of .841...Struck out just nine times in SEC games...Batted a team-high .286 in 26 games vs. ranked opponents.

44 • JARED PAYNE (FR., C)

Slated to be the team's third-string catcher as true freshman...Had strong summer in a collegiate league...Solid Division I player...Highly skilled but needs to get stronger as he matures...Willing learner and strong teammate... Played for the Oneonta Outlaws of the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League last summer despite being fresh out of high school...Named Second-Team All-PGCBL...Saw action in 29 games, hitting .390 with 15 runs and 23 RBI.

3 • BEN JORDAN (R-SO., RHP)

Didn't log many innings in 2019 regular season but was sensational in summer ball...Joined the UK basketball team in October and split his time between the two but is not expected to re-join the baseball team until basketball concludes its season...Changed his arm angle and action since arrival of new pitching coach and is more consistent with his delivery...Perfect Game tabbed him the top prospect in last summer's Cal Ripken Collegiate Baseball League.

11 • TRIP LOCKHART (JR., RHP)

Lexington product who showed marked improvement as a sophomore... Likely will remain in similar role to last season when he was a long man out of the bullpen...Perhaps more of a swing guy this season with late-game appearances if command improves...Good breaking ball and change-up...In 2019, ERA was 2.60 before allowing seven runs to Vanderbilt in his final outing of the season, which also was his first career start...In seven games vs. non-conference opponents, posted a 0.96 ERA in 9.1 innings of work...Posted the second-best ERA on the team in road games (3.86).

16 • WILL GAMBINO (R-FR., RHP)

Earned first career save on 2/25 vs. Tennessee Tech with two perfect innings, striking out three...Made collegiate debut on 2/16 at TCU...Former prep outfielder who is relatively new to pitching...Raw but talented, which showed in him being selected in the 2018 Major League Baseball Draft...Strong, athletic build with confident east coast attitude... Had a great fall after redshirting the 2019 season... Ranked the No. 79 right-handed pitcher in the country by Perfect Game and the No. 215 player overall in the Class of 2018.

20 • BRAXTON COTTONGAME (SO., LHP)

Made first collegiate start on 2/18 vs. Southeast Missouri, going 3.2 innings...Tough and competitive left-hander who goes right at hitters... Had a strong second half of his rookie season and then excellent summer in Alaska...As freshman last season he posted a 3.75 ERA in nine SEC games, striking out 10 in 12.0 innings...SEC opponents hit just .190 against him with only two extra-base hits...Ranked the No. 25 left-handed pitcher in the country by Perfect Game and the No. 220 player overall in Class of 2018.

22 • DILLON MARSH (SQ., LHP)

Lefty who won't blow hitters away with power stuff but has knack for missing bats...Advanced pitchability with plus command of three pitches... Appeared in 14 games as a freshman, all starting assignments... Posted a 3-3 record with a 6.43 ERA in 49.0 innings...Struck out 45 hitters against 22 walks.

31 • ALEX DEGEN (SQ., RHP)

Has been lights out so far in 2020, earning his first career save (2/18 vs. SEMO) and striking out 11 batters in 6.2 innings with no walks...Tall, lanky right-hander in the mold of former Wildcats Justin Lewis and Alex Meyer...Terrific athleticism for his size...Throws on downhill plane...Can throw four pitches for strikes and saw his command take leap in the fall... Played for the Savannah Bananas of the Coastal Plain League last summer and was named First-Team All-CPL...Appeared in 17 games out of the bullpen...Went 3-1 with a 1.80 ERA in 20.0 innings and led the team with four saves.

34 • CARSON COLEMAN (R-JR., RHP)

Returned to school despite being selected in last summer's MLB Draft... Selected in the 33rd round by the Tampa Bay Rays...Has made his money by being able to throw high spin rate fastball up in the zone...Served as the Cats' closer last season and logged five saves...Has struck out nearly 13 hitters per nine innings for his career...Has gained experience with back-toback summers in the Cape Cod League.

35 • COLE DANIELS (SO., LHP)

Big, strong left-hander who has an exceptional breaking ball at this point in his career...Extremely tough on lefty hitters...Was the Cats' "fire extinguisher" the early part of last season... Appeared in 28 games in 2019, tied for most on the team...Went 3-0 with a 2.57 ERA...Had the second-lowest ERA on the staff behind only All-American Zack Thompson...Pitched 14.0 innings, allowing just nine hits and four earned runs...Struck out 21 hitters, an average of 13.5 strikeouts per nine innings pitched...Held opponents to a .188 batting average...Was even better in SEC play, posting a 1.29 ERA in 15 appearances.

36 • RON COLE (FR., RHP)

Struck out the side in 1.0 inning of work on 2/22 vs. Appalachian State... Made career debut on 2/16 at TCU...Competitive player with aggressive mentality on the mound...Fastball can reach into the low 90s...Relies mostly on sinker and change-up...Has a developing slider...Raw talent with lots of room for growth as his career moves along... Rated No. 226 overall by Prep Baseball Report in the Class of 2018...Participated in the 2018 Perfect Game National Showcase.

38 • JIMMY RAMSEY (JR., RHP)

Big, physical right-hander...Imposing presence...Sits low 90s...Very deceptive...Has served as both weekend starter and closer in his career...Made 18 appearances with 11 starts last season...Was undefeated in non-conference play...Earned a win in his final appearance after going 5.0 innings against eventual national runner-up Michigan the last week of the regular season...Was the 2020 opening night starter for the Cats at TCU.

39 • HUNTER RIGSBY (SO., RHP)

Has been tremendous to open 2020 season, allowing just one run and striking out nine in 6.2 IP...Big, tall right-hander with a strong two-pitch arsenal featuring a power fastball and curve...Doesn't mess around on the mound, coming right at hitters...Freshman season was slowed by a nagging ankle injury...Had a sensational summer in Alaska, impressing scouts... In the ABL he appeared in 14 games out of the bullpen... Posted a 3-0 record with a 0.64 ERA in 28.1 innings...Was selected as a 2019 Alaska Baseball League All-Star.

41 • ALEX MARGOT (FR., LHP)

Rangy left-handed arm...Isn't afraid to work and improved as his first fall on campus went along...Working to add velocity...Three-pitch arsenal of fastball, change-up and slider...Likely slated for bullpen depth role as a freshman but could pitch his way into more high-leverage situations.

46 • SAM WIBBELS (FR., RHP)

Enrolled in January after a serious medical issue required surgery just before fall classes began...Hard-thrower who was selected in the 2019 MLB Draft...Ceiling is extremely high based on natural ability...Won't back down from a challenge...36th round draft pick of Washington Nationals in 2019 MLB Draft... Perfect Game ranked him the No. 67 right-handed pitcher and top overall prospect in Nebraska...Named 2019 MaxPreps Second-Team Small Schools All-American.

48 • ZACK LEE (FR., RHP)

Made career debut with 0.1 IP on 2/15 at TCU and then pitched 2.1 innings the next day...Struck out four and allowed just one hit in 2.0 IP on 2/22 vs. Appalachian State...Freshman with a big arm who impressed the coaching staff in his first fall on campus...Considered to have one of the best arms on the staff while running his fastball up to the mid-90s...Hard slider and developing change-up...Inexperienced but loads of potential and electric natural stuff... Rated No. 146 overall by Prep Baseball Report in Class of 2019.

49 • COLE STUPP (FR., RHP)

Earned first start on 2/25 vs. Tennessee Tech, striking out seven in 4.0 innings, including five straight...Made sensational debut on 2/15 at TCU, entering game with two on and no outs and getting out of the inning unscathed...Extremely impressive in the fall, so much so the staff considered him to be the most ready to contribute of the new arms...Tremendous pitchability...Terrific athlete...Fastball command is excellent and sits low 90s with sink...Good change-up and slider to complement the fastball... Rated No. 225 overall by Prep Baseball Report in Class of 2019...Named Second-Team Class 7-A All-State by Georgia Dugout Preview.

50 • MASON HAZELWOOD (JR., LHP)

Coaching staff said he had the best fall of anyone on the pitching staff...That comes on the heels of a tremendous showing in the famed Cape Cod League last summer...Really deceptive delivery that hides the baseball and allows it to jump at hitters... Posted a 2-0 record with a 1.80 ERA in 25.0 innings pitched on the Cape...Ranked seventh in the CCBL with 32 strikeouts in regular season play, the third-highest total for a reliever and held opponents to a .169 average...In 2019 vs. non-conference opponents, posting a 2.35 ERA in 23.0 innings, striking out 27 and posting a .139 batting average against.

54 • DANIEL HARPER (JR., RHP)

Experienced arm that has pitched in a multitude of roles through first two seasons...In 2019, appeared in a team-high 28 games...Posted a 3-3 record with a 4.70 ERA and one save in 46.0 innings...Allowed 43 hits, struck out 42 and walked 16 batters...In non-conference games he posted a 2.42 ERA and allowed opponents to hit just .169 against him in 22.1 innings.
