## BULLDOG BITES

- Mississippi State finished second in the SEC by three games after being picked to place third. This marked the sixth-consecutive season that the Bulldogs have finished inside the top three of the conference.
- State had three All-SEC selections this year, as **Jordan Danberry**, **Rickea Jackson** and **Jessika Carter** were all named to the Second Team. Danberry also earned a spot on the All-Defensive Team, while Jackson was tabbed to the All-Freshman Team.
- Jackson made a strong case for being the SEC and National Freshman of the Year. During SEC play, she ranked fifth among all players with 16.5 ppg and eighth in field goal percentage (.480); she was also the team's second-leading rebounder (5.4 rpg).
- Accounted for 22 percent of MSU's scoring during conference games, her six games with 20-plus points matched the most by any freshman in the league. She's the only SEC freshman to score 30 points in a game this season after having 34 at Auburn.
- For the year, Jackson leads the team in scoring (14.8 ppg) and is third in rebounding (5.0 rpg). She has scored in double figures in 22 games, including 17 games with at least 15 points, and has shot 50 percent or better from the field 14 times.
- Danberry leads the team steals (2.4 spg) while ranking second in assists (3.1 apg) and third in scoring (12.7 ppg). Entering the tournament, the Naismith DPOY semifinalist ranks 23rd among Division I players in total steals (73) to pace a Mississippi State defense that leads the SEC in turnovers forced per game (21.0). She ranked fifth among Division I guards in field goal percentage (.520).
- With the departure of SEC Player of the Year **Teaira McCowan**, Mississippi State had a major void to fill in the post this season. Carter helped answer that need, averaging 13.6 points, 8.9 rebounds and 1.8 blocks per game. As a sophomore, McCowan averaged 8.7 points, 7.1 rebounds and 1.5 blocks per game. Carter is considered one of the most improved players in the country after significantly increasing her scoring (10.4 ppg) and rebounding (5.8 rpg) from last season.
- The sophomore forward ranked 10th in Division I in field goal percentage and 19th in offensive rebounds per game entering the event.
- Redshirt sophomore guard **Myah Taylor** is one of the best help-side defenders in the country. With 44 charges drawn and 62 steals, she's forced 106 turnovers this year, which accounts for 16 percent of MSU's turnovers forced. On the other end of the floor, her 2.72 assist/turnover ratio ranked 13th in the country and third in the SEC entering the tournament.
- Aliyah Matharu** is the reigning SEC Freshman of the Week after averaging 21.0 ppg, 5.5 rpg and 2.5 apg vs. Arkansas and Ole Miss.

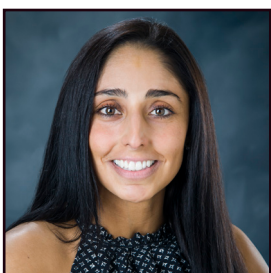

## JACKSON HAVING IMPRESSIVE FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN

- Mississippi State knew it was going to rely on newcomers early and often this season, and McDonald's All-American **Ricke Jackson** has been stellar in her first season with the Bulldogs.
- The Second Team All-SEC selection leads the squad in scoring (14.5 ppg) and is third rebounding (4.8 rpg). The freshman forward is shooting 48 percent from the field and 40 percent from beyond the arc on the year.
- The Detroit, Mich., native has finished with double-digit scoring in 12 of State's 16 conference games and 21 times overall.
- The SEC All-Freshman Team performer ranked second among SEC freshmen in scoring (16.5 ppg) and field goal percentage (.480). She was the only freshman in the conference who ranked inside the top 10 overall in both scoring (5th) and field goal percentage (9th) during league play.
- Her six games with 20-plus points during SEC play were tied for the most by any freshman in the league. Jackson surpassed **Victoria Vivians** (3) for the most 20-point efforts in conference play by a freshman Bulldog under Schaefer.
- Jackson has been named the SEC Freshman of the Week three times this season, most recently receiving the honor after going off in State's second matchup against Auburn, dropping a career-high 34 points on 14-of-22 shooting. It was tied for the second-most ever by an MSU freshman and marked the most since Victoria Vivians had 39 vs. Kentucky on Feb. 12, 2015.
- She earned MVP honors in the Duel in the Desert tournament after notching the first double-double of her career with 17 points and 10 rebounds vs. USF and posting a team-high 17 points against Virginia.
- Jackson marked the first true freshman to start the season since 2014-15 with Vivians, who was second team All-SEC during her first season after averaging 14.9 points and 5.0 rebounds per game.

## CARTER RECORDING A BREAKOUT SEASON

- Jessika Carter** has been a major bright spot on Mississippi State's roster and is having a breakout season.
- The Second Team All-SEC honoree ranks inside the top 10 in the league in field goal percentage (.601/3rd), rebounding (8.9 rpg/4th) and blocks (1.8/6th) and is 12th in scoring at 13.9 ppg.
- The Waverly Hall, Ga., native ranks 10th in Division I in field goal percentage and 19th in offensive rebounds per game (4.0).
- During league play, the sophomore forward led the SEC in field goal percentage, shooting a .648 clip. She shot 70 percent or better from the floor in seven games during conference play.
- Carter has led State in rebounding 17 times and has scored double-figures in 22 contests, including five 20-point performances. She has also posted 11 double-doubles and has four games with four blocks.



- Carter was named SEC Player of the Week after dominating in State's wins over Murray State and Troy, averaging 22.0 points, 16.0 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game.
- She grabbed a career-high 21 boards at Marquette to go along with 14 points.
- Carter earned a spot on the Duel in the Desert all-tournament team after posting 13 points and 15 boards against Virginia in the championship game.
- She had a strong couple of games back to back against Vanderbilt and Ole Miss, posting a pair of 20-point games.

## DANBERRY STRONG ON BOTH ENDS OF THE COURT

- Jordan Danberry** is one of the best players on both ends of the floor in the SEC.
- Danberry has made the most of her final season so far, earning her a spot on the All-SEC Second Team. The do-it-all guard leads the squad in steals (2.4 spg) and ranks second in assists (3.1 apg) and third in scoring (12.5 ppg).
- Offensively, the Conway, Ark., native is shooting an impressive .520 percent clip from the field on the year, which ranks fifth among Division I guards.
- Danberry has posted four 20-point performances and has scored in double figures 20 times overall.
- On the defensive end of the floor, the SEC All-Defensive Team selection has recorded multiple steals in 19 games this season and has nine contests with four or more steals, including four during league play.
- Her 73 steals ranks 23rd in the nation and second in the SEC.

## TAYLOR BRINGING ENERGY TO BOTH ENDS OF THE FLOOR

- Myah Taylor** spent the last two seasons learning from the two best point guards in program history in **Jazzmun Holmes** and **Morgan William** and has now stepped into the starting role as this year's floor general.
- Now in the starting spot, Taylor has made her presence felt on both ends of the floor. The redshirt sophomore leads the team in assists (139) and is second in steals (60). Her 2.67 assist/turnover ratio ranks third in the SEC and 13th in the country.
- She finished conference play ranked second in assist/turnover ratio at 2.8.
- The Olive Branch, Miss., native has posted seven straight games with five or more assists and has eclipsed that mark 14 times overall on the year.
- One the best help defender in the country, Taylor is constantly creating issues for opposing teams as they try to get into their offense. She has led the squad in steals 13 times this year.
- Where Taylor has really excelled this season and energized the crowd has been her ability to take a charge. On the year, she has drawn 43 charges while no other person on the team has more than 15.
- Taylor scored all 16 of her points in the second half in State's win against No. 16 Texas A&M. She's averaging 5.7 ppg while shooting 46 percent from the field.
- She notched a career-high 10 assists in the Bulldogs' final game of the regular season at Ole Miss.

## TRIO OF BULLDOGS EARN SEC HONORS

- With the announcement of the 2020 SEC Women's Basketball awards, **Jordan Danberry**, **Rickea Jackson** and **Jessika Carter** were recognized by league coaches for their impressive play this season.
- All three Bulldogs were tabbed Second Team All-SEC after helping Mississippi State go 25-5 in the regular season, 13-3 during conference play and earn a second-place finish. Danberry also earned a spot on the All-Defensive Team, while Jackson was named to the All-Freshman Team.
- Three players named to the All-SEC teams matched the most in a season under head coach Vic Schaefer, bringing his total of All-SEC selections to 15.
- Danberry was the 10th All-Defensive honoree under Schaefer, who has had someone tabbed to the squad during each season since arriving at Mississippi State. Jackson was the fifth individual to earn a spot among the SEC's top freshmen.
- Jackson also marked State's first freshman to receive All-SEC recognition since 2015, when **Victoria Vivians** earned second team honors.

## DANBERRY TABBED A SEMIFINALIST FOR NAISMITH DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- After establishing herself as one of the nation's top defenders, **Jordan Danberry** was named a semifinalist for the 2020 Naismith Women's Defensive Player of the Year by the Atlanta Tipoff Club on Tuesday morning.
- Danberry ranks inside the top 35 in the nation in both

total steals and steals per game on the year despite defending the opposing team's best guard every game.

- Danberry was one of 10 players from across the country to be selected as a semifinalist.
- She also earned a spot on the Naismith Trophy Women's Player of the Year Midseason Team.

## JACKSON, MATHARU BOAST SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS

- Entering the season, Mississippi State knew it would have to rely on freshmen in order to succeed and the group has lived up to the hype as the highest-rated signing class in program history. During conference play, **Rickea Jackson** (3x) and **Aliyah Matharu** (2x) have been tabbed the SEC Freshman of the Week a total of five times.
- Matharu earned the final recognition of the season as a result of back-to-back career games against Arkansas and Ole Miss. She averaged 21 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and one steal per game for the week. She set career highs in points (24), field goals made (8), 3-pointers made (5), rebounds (7) and assists (4) to help MSU finish the regular season on a high note.
- Jackson brought home the second to last weekly honor after posting a career-high 34 points on 14-of-22 shooting in State's win at Auburn. It was tied for the second most points ever by a freshman Bulldog and marked the best scoring performance by an SEC this season.
- A freshman has been recognized for the weekly honor by the SEC 16 times under head coach **Vic Schaefer**.

## MISSISSIPPI STATE IN THE SEC TOURNAMENT

- Mississippi State is 24-39 all time during the SEC Tournament. However, the Bulldogs have been much more successful as of recently, going 9-3 in the last four tournaments and posting a 10-6 record overall in **Vic Schaefer's** first seven seasons.
- State won its first SEC Tournament Title last year, topping Arkansas in the championship game, 101-70. It was the fourth year in a row that MSU advanced to the championship.
- Under his watch, MSU has been a top-3 seed in the SEC Tournament for six straight seasons now. That includes four years in a row of being one of the top two seeds, a feat the Bulldogs had never accomplished prior to Schaefer's arrival.
- Prior to Schaefer's arrival, MSU had only won more than one game in a single tournament just once (2000). That 2000 campaign also marked the program's first ever run to the championship. The Bulldogs have achieved both of these feats four straight years entering this season's event.

**OFFENSE: EFFICIENT & HIGH-SCORING**

**STATE'S OFFENSE AMONG BEST IN THE COUNTRY**

- Although Vic Schaefer's teams are widely known for their defense, Mississippi State has established itself as one of the best offensive teams in Division I.
- This season, State ranks ninth in the nation in scoring margin (+19.3) and 12th in scoring offense at 79.8 ppg.
- With four players shooting over 50 percent from the field, the Bulldogs rank ninth in the country and top the SEC in field goal percentage with a .478 clip.
- Another key to MSU's offensive success has been its ability to take care of the ball and make the extra passes for better shots. State ranks fourth in the SEC in assists per game (14.5 apg) and fifth in assist/turnover ratio (1.08).
- When the Bulldogs aren't knocking down shots, State is crashing the glass to get a second opportunity at a basket. With 39% offensive rebounds on the season, Mississippi State has gotten the rebound on 39 percent of its missed baskets and turned that into 429 second-chance points.

**BULLDOGS SET MSU SINGLE-GAME SCORING RECORD**

- In its win against Murray State, Mississippi State's offense exploded for 124 points against the Racer, breaking the MSU single-game scoring record.
- Standing for 33 years, the previous record was set on February 24, 1986, when Mississippi State defeated Judson College, 117-35.
- The 124 points also marks the fourth-highest scoring performance of any Division I team so far this season.
- State was just one point shy of tying the program record for margin of victory, which stands at 82 points set in the

contest against Judson College.

- MSU has now scored at least 100 points 23 times in Schaefer's eight seasons and has eclipsed the 110-point margin seven times with him at the helm.

**SECRETARY OF DEFENSE**

- Vic Schaefer's teams have always had a major emphasis on one area: defense. If you want to play for him, you have to play lockdown, tenacious and suffocating defense for 40 minutes every game. It's this expectation and mentality that has earned Schaefer the nickname "Secretary of Defense."
- So far this season, State's relentless defense has forced opponents into turning the ball over 629 times for an average of 21.0 turnovers per game. That number ranks 16th in the nation and tops the SEC. The Bulldogs have forced at least 20 turnovers in 21 games this season.
- State's on-ball pressure has been suffocating all year, especially in the press. MSU ranks second in the SEC with 9.6 steals per game. **Jordan Danberry** is pacing the team in the category with 2.4 spg to rank second in league and 39th in the nation.
- The Bulldogs have been solid at rejecting shots with an average of 4.8 blocks per game, which is 26th in Division I. **Jessika Carter** has led the charge by posting 1.8 bpg this season to rank 51st in the country and sixth in the SEC.
- While there is no ranking for the stat, Mississippi State certainly ranks amongst the country's best teams at drawing charges. So far, the Bulldogs have taken 92 charges, led by 43 from **Myah Taylor**.

**STATE STIFLES DUNGEE FROM ARKANSAS**

- Tabbed one of the top 25 players in the country by espnW, Arkansas' **Chelsea Dungee** is in the running for multiple player of the year honors, including Naismith Trophy, John R. Wooden Award and Ann Meyers Drysdale Award.

- Entering the game against State, the All-SEC performer had posted 23 double-digit scoring efforts and 10 games with 20-plus points this season. Against the Bulldogs, Dungee was held to a season-low four points on 1-of-13 shooting.
- Already in the top 10 in program scoring history, Dungee's four points marker her fewest points during an SEC game since joining the Razorbacks.

### MISSISSIPPI STATE IN THE AP RANKINGS

- On Nov. 24, 2014, the Associated Press voted Mississippi State back into the top 25 for the first time in four years. With MSU earning a spot in the preseason poll heading into the 2019-20 season, the Bulldogs have now spent 112 consecutive weeks inside the AP Top 25, marking the longest streak in program history.
- During the stretch, State was ranked inside the top 10 for 70 total weeks, including 13 weeks this season.
- Since beginning the streak, MSU has been ranked as a top-five team for 33 weeks, including a stretch of 14 straight weeks during the 2017-18 season.

### DEEP DIVE INTO STATE'S SPECIALTY STATS

- When it comes to specialty stats, Mississippi State leads its opponents in all five categories this year.
- The Bulldogs have been able to score at will down low this season. MSU has posted 1368 of its points in the paint, which accounts for 57 percent of the team's total scoring. State has scored at least 50 points in the paint nine times.
- With defense being a top priority, Mississippi State has been able to turn its 629 turnovers forced into 712 points. That accounts for nearly a third of the team's scoring this year.
- MSU is one of the best teams in the country when it comes to field goal percentage, but when it does miss, State has been able to get an offensive rebound on 39 percent of its missed shots, which the Bulldogs have capitalized on and turned into 429 second-chance points.
- While MSU has three starters that are averaging double-digit scoring, Mississippi State's bench has also provided a much-needed spark in several games this season. With 777 bench points this year, State is getting an average of 25.9 points per game from the reserves. During SEC play, MSU's bench outscored opponents in 11 games.
- When the Bulldogs get a turnover, one of the things that MSU wants to do is turn that into quick points in transition. So far, State has 424 fast break points this season.

### MSU BRINGS HOME DUEL IN THE DESERT TITLE

- After posting wins against USF and Virginia, Mississippi State brought home the Duel in the Desert title.
- The Bulldogs posted double-digit wins against both of their opponents en route to the team's first regular-season tournament championship since 2017, when State won the 2017 edition of the Duel in the Desert.
- MSU opened with a wire-to-wire victory against USF. **Chloe Bibby** knocked down five 3-pointers in the first quarter to fuel the offense. **Ricke Jackson**, who earned tournament MVP honors, posted the first double-double of her career with 17 points and 10 rebounds.
- Against Virginia, **Jessika Carter** finished with 13 points and 15 boards to earn a spot on the all-tournament team.

### BULLDOGS PLACE 2ND IN GREATER VICTORIA INVITATIONAL

- Competing against a stacked field, Mississippi State finished second in the Greater Victoria Invitational after going 2-1.
- The Bulldogs won its first two games against San Francisco and Green Bay before falling in the championship to No. 3 Stanford, 67-62.
- MSU erased a double-digit deficit in the fourth quarter to have a chance to tie the ballgame with less than 30 seconds remaining but the rally against the Cardinal came up short.
- After facing State, Green Bay went on to defeat No. 18 Syracuse to earn a third-place finish in the tournament, while San Francisco claimed a pair of victories over Bowling Green and Houston to take fifth place.
- Jordan Danberry** earned a spot on the all-tournament team after averaging 15.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 1.7 assists, and 1.7 steals per game.

### BULLDOGS SIGN TWO TOP-100 PLAYERS IN 2020 CLASS

- Once again, Vic Schaefer and the Mississippi State women's basketball team found success on the recruiting trail, landing a pair of top-100 players in five star guard **Madison Hayes** and four star forward **DeYona Gaston**.
- Hayes, who is State's second-ever McDonald's All-American

signee, is rated as the No. 29 player in the country by espnW. The 2019 USA Today Tennessee Player of the Year is the third top-30 prospect to sign with MSU in the last two classes.

- Hayes earned a spot on the Naismith Trophy Player of the Year Midseason Team and the USA Today All-USA Preseason Team for the 2019-20 season. As a junior, she averaged 25.2 ppg, 12.2 rpg and 4.0 spg in helping her team to a district championship and received All-Tennessee first team honors by USA Today.
- Rated 95th in the country, Gaston was one of the most highly-touted players in the 2020 class early on. As a freshman at Pearland High School in Texas, she averaged a double-double with 17.5 ppg and 11.3 rpg to go along with 3.0 bpg and 2.0 spg. However, she missed all of her sophomore season due to injuries, dropping her in the rankings.
- Gaston proved she was still one of the best players in the country, posting 18.1 ppg on 52 percent shooting as a junior in 2018-19. She also averaged 9.5 rpg and 1.9 bpg. In two seasons, she's totaled 926 points, 542 rebounds, 128 blocks, 92 steals and 58 assists.
- With the goal of putting together an impressive senior year, Gaston is coming off a campaign where she claimed TGCA 6A District Player of the Year as well as the Defensive Player of the Year honors en route to earning a spot on the All-State team.

### STATE GOING WIRE TO WIRE

- Mississippi State has been quick to get a lead over opponents this year to swing the momentum in its favor. The Bulldogs own eight wire-to-wire victories in which they never trailed.
- Three of the games have come against SEC opponents, including an 80-39 win against Ole Miss that saw MSU open the game on a 12-0 run.
- In six of the wire-to-wire wins, State scored within a minute of the tip to get the offense rolling early.

# MISSISSIPPI STATE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

## ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- Mississippi State's 2019-20 roster features 13 players representing 11 states, Washington, D.C. as well as Australia.
- Players came to Starkville from Arkansas, California, Georgia, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, New York, Tennessee, Virginia, Washington and Wisconsin.
- State has one graduate, four juniors, four sophomores and four freshmen.
- Mississippi State returned three starters from a year ago in **Chloe Bibby**, **Jordan Danberry** and **Andra Espinoza-Hunter**. Danberry was the only one to start all 36 games for the Bulldogs, who must replace three other players that started every game (**Jazzmun Holmes**, **Anriel Howard** and **Teaira McCowan**).

## SCHAEFER BECOMES SECOND-FASTEST COACH TO WIN 200 GAMES AT SEC PROGRAM

- Vic Schaefer** has been one of the most successful coaches in women's basketball since joining Mississippi State. With State's victory at Marquette on Nov. 25, 2019, the two-time National Coach of the Year became the second-fastest coach to reach 200 victories at an SEC school.
- Achieving the milestone in just 256 games, Schaefer ranks behind only Georgia's Andy Landers, who reached his 200th victory in 251 games.
- The next closest coach to have accomplished the feat is Auburn's **Joe Ciampi** (258), while legendary head coach **Pat Summitt** reached victory No. 200 in her 259th game at Tennessee.
- Also worth noting, Schaefer was the fourth-fastest coach to reach the mark amongst active coaches at their current program, trailing only Duke's **Joanne P. McCallie** (240), Baylor's **Kim Mulkey** (245) and Stanford's **Tara VanDerveer** (255).

## NCAA GRANTS DANBERRY FIFTH YEAR OF ELIGIBILITY

- On August 20, the NCAA informed **Jordan Danberry** that she had been granted a fifth year of eligibility after transferring to Mississippi State and not redshirting.
- Danberry sat out an entire year from December 2016 until making her Bulldog debut Dec. 10, 2017, against Little Rock. During this period, Danberry wasn't eligible for a redshirt due to playing in six games at Arkansas before transferring.
- Danberry is currently pursuing an MBA after earning her bachelor's degree in Business Economics last December.
- This past season, Danberry ranked third on the team in scoring with 13.1 ppg and second in assists (125) and steals (65) after starting in all 36 games. The Conway, Arkansas, native was eighth in the SEC in assist/turnover ratio (1.47). She scored in double figures in 13 of 16 SEC games to average 14.3 ppg in league play.

## MCCOWAN IMPRESSES IN FIRST SEASON WITH FEVER

- After being selected third overall by the Indiana Fever in the 2019 WNBA Draft, **Teaira McCowan** made an immediate impact with her new team.
- The former All-American and SEC Player of the Year earned a spot on the WNBA All-Rookie Team.
- McCowan ranked second in the WNBA in rebounding (9.0 rpg), fifth in field goal percentage (51.7) and 10th in blocks (1.29 bpg) – all rookie highs.
- McCowan set the Fever team records for single-season rebounds (305) and consecutive double-doubles (5).
- She was the third-leading rookie scorer with 10.0 ppg.

- Vic Schaefer embarks on his eighth season as the Bulldogs' coach. He owns the second-most victories in program history, and his winning percentage through his first seven campaigns is the best in program annals.
- Schaefer's Bulldogs have posted seven-straight seasons of 20-plus wins after the program had four 20-win campaigns in the 38 years prior to his arrival. His last three squads became the first MSU teams to eclipse 30 wins.
- Schaefer was named the 2019 ESPNW National Coach of the Year after leading Mississippi State to a third consecutive Elite Eight appearance, back-to-back SEC Championships and the program's first SEC Tournament Championship
- In 2018, he was tabbed National Coach of the Year by Naismith, WBCA and USBWA after guiding the Bulldogs to a National Finalist finish for the second year in a row.
- He guided the 2017-18 Bulldogs to a school-record and nation's-best 37 wins, the team also became the first SEC squad to post a perfect regular season since 1998.
- Under his watch, the Bulldogs won the program's first SEC Championship and SEC Tournament Championship, earning him SEC Coach of the Year honors during three of the last five seasons.
- In the last five seasons, his MSU squads have won 159 games, the fourth-most in Division I and the most in the SEC during that time.
- He has produced two All-Americans (Teaira McCowan & Victoria Vivians), one SEC Player of the Year (McCowan) and nine All-SEC performers along with numerous other accolades as well.
- He coached McCowan to a pair of National Defensive Player of the Year accolades by WBCA (2019) and Naismith (2018).
- He helped Vivians bring home the 2018 Naismith Starting Five Ann Meyers Drysdale Award given to the nation's best shooting guard in the country.
- Under his guidance, Mississippi State has spent 111 consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25 rankings, the fifth-longest streak in the country.
- In 2018-19, Mississippi State set program records for total attendance (143,578) and average attendance (8,446), which ranked fourth and fifth in the country, respectively.
- In just his 256th game at State, Schaefer became the second-fastest coach ever to achieve 200 victories with an SEC program ahead of hall-of-fame coaches Joe Ciampi (258 games), Pat Summitt (259), Van Chancellor (263), Jim Foster (280) and Sue Gunter (280). Only Georgia's Andy Landers (251) reached the mark at a faster pace.
- Schaefer also went to the Final Four in his previous two stops at Texas A&M and Arkansas. In nine seasons in College Station, he helped the Aggies to 212 wins and seven NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2011 national championship.
- He was part of 121 wins in six seasons at Arkansas, taking the Razorbacks to the Final Four in his first season. The Razorbacks went to the NCAA Tournament four times and won a WNIT title during his time on the staff in Fayetteville.
