#### SEASON IN REVIEW

Kentucky won its 49th SEC regular-season crown in 2020. UK's 49 titles are 38 more than the next-closest school and nearly as many as the rest of the SEC combined (53)

The Wildcats' SEC title was their sixth regular-season championship in 11 seasons under John Calipari, who has won 16 regular-season conference titles in his career

UK finished the season No. 8 in the AP Top 25 and No. 7 in the USA Today Coaches Poll

Kentucky ended the season at No. 21 in the NCAA Evaluation Tool rankings with a 9-3 record vs. quadrant one teams and a 14-5 mark vs. quadrant one and quadrant two teams

The Wildcats were 8-2 in true road games this season. The only teams with a better winning percentage finished 1-5 in the final NET

UK headlined the league's annual awards (as awarded by the coaches) with Immanuel Quickley winning SEC Player of the Year and Calipari capturing SEC Coach of the Year. Nick Richards was also named to the All-SEC First Team, Tyrese Maxey was tabbed All-SEC Second Team and SEC All-Freshman Team, and Ashton Hagans made the SEC All-Defensive Team

Quickley was tabbed All-America Third Team by The Athletic, CBS Sports and Bleacher Report

Kentucky held opponents to 39.4% from the floor this season, ranked 20th in the country. In 18 of 31 games, UK limited the opposition to 40% or less, including eight of the final 12

Led by Quickley's 92.3% mark, the Wildcats shot 79.7% at the free-throw line this season, a school record that ranked second nationally. UK shot 75% or better in all of the final 14 games



# POLLS, STATS, MEDIA INFO

## Media Information

### CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Requests for single-game credentials should be made as far in advance as possible and no later than five days prior to game day online at [sportssystem.com/Kentucky](http://sportssystem.com/Kentucky).

### CREDENTIAL CRITERIA

The University of Kentucky's decision to issue credentials to a media outlet for the purposes of covering a UK basketball home or away event is determined by a variety of factors. They include the following:

- Amount of coverage given to Kentucky throughout the season
- Intention/ability to cover all 22 sports at Kentucky
- Distribution/size of publication: free, subscription, sale on newsstands, website traffic, etc.
- Radio or TV station program format and size of audience
- Length of existence of the publication, amount of original copy generated, number of full-time employees of the publication and the journalistic experience of the reporter(s)
- Attendance at Kentucky media sessions, including Olympic sport opportunities
- Space availability
- Professionalism, which includes but is not limited to conduct at games, press conferences, practices, on social media, etc.

The University of Kentucky has the right to revoke credentials under its own discretion.

### INTERVIEW POLICIES-GENERAL

All interviews with University of Kentucky basketball players or staff members must be arranged through the Communications and public relations office. Media should never contact a player or coach directly.

The Wildcat Coal Lodge, dormitories, team locker rooms and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate university personnel.

### PRACTICE/PRESS CONFERENCES

Other than announced exceptions, UK basketball practices are closed to the media. UK will accept requests to attend practice. All requests must be made by 10 a.m. the day before the practice. In cases in which practices are open to the media, no cell phones are allowed in the practice facility.

Player interviews are conducted prior to practices the day before a game and will be available to all UK media in the Joe Craft Center lower-level lobby. UK will accept requests for player interviews, but they must be submitted 24 hours prior to the scheduled availability.

Coach John Calipari or an assistant coach will meet with members of the media immediately following player interviews in the lower level lobby of the Joe Craft Center.

Gameday shoot-arounds are closed to the media.

### TELEPHONE PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Telephone interviews are available to the media on a call-back basis. Individual player and coach telephone numbers will not be given to members of the media.

Players are instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted directly by telephone. The communications and public relations office will arrange for telephone interviews at a time most convenient for the student-athlete.

Other special requests are handled on a case-by-case basis.

### POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Following each game, there is a cooling-off period, during which time the players shower and dress. Approximately 10 minutes after the game ends, Coach Calipari conducts his postgame press conference while a player is taken to the UK Sports Network.

Following Coach Calipari's press conference and the cooling-off period, selected UK players are brought to the media interview room.

## Wildcats Won 49th SEC Regular-Season Crown in 2019-20

Kentucky won the 2020 Southeastern Conference regular-season championship in 2019-20, the 49th in school history and the sixth in 11 seasons under head coach John Calipari.

The Wildcats wrapped up the title on Feb. 29 with a victory over Auburn and with three games to spare. With a season-ending victory at Florida, UK finished the season three games ahead of second place.

Kentucky's 49 SEC titles are 38 more than the next-closest school (LSU with 11) and nearly as many as the rest of the league has combined (53). It's worth noting UK would have 50 titles had the 1988 championship not been vacated by the league due to violations.

Although it was UK's sixth in 11 seasons under Calipari, it did snap a minor two-season drought. The last regular-season SEC title was in 2017.

The championship marked Calipari's 16th all-time regular-season conference crown, including his time at Memphis and UMass. Including his 15 league tournament titles, Calipari has 31 combined conference championships in his career. That trails only Mark Few of Gonzaga (35 titles) among all active coaches. All-time, only the great Adolph Rupp (41) and Few have more.

## Kentucky Was Primed for Postseason Run

Had there been an NCAA Tournament this season, Kentucky would have surely made its 59th all-time appearance and done so as one of the tournament favorites. The Wildcats were one of the hottest teams in the country down the stretch, winning the Southeastern Conference regular season by three games. Although no one will ever know what the bracket would have looked like on Selection Sunday, there's a good chance UK would have been a four seed or better.

Kentucky finished at No. 21 in the NCAA Evaluation Tool's final rankings, but the Wildcats had an impressive 9-3 record vs. quadrant one teams, including solid wins vs. Michigan State at a neutral site, Louisville and Auburn at home, and Texas Tech and Florida on the road. UK's 14-5 record vs. both quadrant one and two teams was among the best winning percentages in the country. Kentucky was also 4-2 vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams at the time of the game.

The Wildcats were in every game in 2019-20, something few other teams can say. UK lost its six games by a combined 32 points, an average margin of 5.3 points. Of UK's six losses, five were to teams in the top two quadrants.

What could have ultimately separated UK from its competition was its impressive play on the road. Kentucky finished the season 8-2 in true road games, including 3-1 during a gauntlet that included four straight Saturday road games vs. Arkansas, Texas Tech, Auburn and Tennessee and an 18-point comeback victory at Florida. UK's .800 winning percentage on the road ranked as the sixth-best mark in the country. The only five teams with better winning percentages were ranked 1-5 in the final NET.

Although the NCAA doesn't use the a team's recent record as a measuring tool when evaluating teams, Kentucky was 8-2 over the last 10 games and 17-3 over the last 20.

The way the Wildcats played late in the season, especially after an emphatic 18-point come-from-behind victory at Florida, convinced head coach John Calipari he had the team to beat in postseason.

"I felt this was a vibe that my best teams have had," Calipari said. "Things that happened down the end of the stretch, fate intervenes sometimes. Sometimes good, sometimes bad. How do you respond to it? This team and individuals on the team responded so positively that it was crazy. Our energy, our vibe, their togetherness. I looked at my staff and said, 'Guys, we could be winning this whole thing.'"

## Quickley Wins SEC Player of the Year, Cal Coach of the Year

Kentucky headlined the league's end-of-the-season awards with Immanuel Quickley winning SEC Player of the Year and John Calipari earning SEC Coach of the Year distinction, as picked by the league's coaches.

Four Kentucky players and Calipari were decorated with SEC honors following a 25-6 regular season that included a 15-3 league record, an 8-2 record on the road and a top-10 national ranking.

Quickley was joined on the All-SEC First Team by Nick Richards (coaches and Associated Press) while freshman guard Tyrese Maxey made the All-SEC Second Team (coaches). Maxey was also tabbed to the SEC All-Freshman Team (coaches).

Ashton Hagans, the 2019 SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year, made the SEC All-Defensive Team (coaches) for a second consecutive season. Richards joined him on the five-man team.

With four players and a coach totaling eight SEC honors from the league's coaches, UK won more league awards than any other school. All 14 conference head coaches voted on the league's All-SEC squads. Ties were not broken.

Quickley is the ninth player in school history to win the coaches' SEC Player of the Year award and the fourth in 11 seasons under Calipari (five counting Malik Monk's AP honor in 2017), who captured his fourth SEC Coach of the Year award at Kentucky. It's Calipari's 10th season in 28 years as a college head coach he's won conference coach of the year honors.

With three Wildcats on the coaches' All-SEC teams, Calipari has coached 28 players (29 total honors) who have earned All-SEC first- or second-team accolades. At least one player has been named to the All-SEC Freshman Team in each of Calipari's 11 seasons, including 27 total.

Nine players have earned 11 SEC All-Defensive honors under Calipari's watch.

Nate Sestina was named to the SEC Community Service Team for his exemplary service in the community.

## Wildcats Haul in a Number of Other Postseason Awards

## Quickley Emerged as UK's Go-To Option in 2019-20

John Calipari called Immanuel Quickley the most improved player on the 2018-19 team, but his development during his sophomore season was on another level.

Quickley played in all 37 games during the 2019 Elite Eight season, but he did so primarily from a reserve role. After starting seven of the first eight games of the season, Quickley came off the bench the rest of the season and averaged 5.2 points per game with 30 3-pointers in 18.5 minutes per game.

One of four key returners on the 2019-20 squad, Quickley was expected to play a much larger role this season, but no one predicted he would transform into one of the best guards in the country. He wasn't picked for any preseason all-conference teams or player of the year watch lists.

Quickley's steady approach and belief in what coaches call "the process" proved everybody wrong. By season's end, Quickley had won Southeastern Conference Player of the Year honors (as awarded by the league's coaches), earned All-America Third Team status from CBS Sports, The Athletic and Bleacher Report, and was named the U.S. Basketball Writers Association District IV Player of the Year.

The Maryland native vaulted himself into the national conversation with a dominant last two-and-a-half months. He finished the season on a career-best 20-game double-figure scoring streak -- the best run since Malik Monk scored in double figures in 30 straight games during the 2016-17 season -- scoring 20 or more points eight times with three or more 3-pointers seven times during the stretch.

Overall, Quickley averaged a team-high 16.1 points per game and proved to be Kentucky's best scorer and go-to option late in games. He made a team-high 62 3-pointers -- including making a 3 in 28 of 30 games played and 11 straight to finish the season -- and shot a team-high 42.8% from behind the arc.

Quickley won SEC Player of the Week in back-to-back weeks in late February/early March, becoming the first Wildcat in school history to win SEC Player of the Week consecutively (dating back to the 1984-85 season). He won three times total this season.

During the 20-game double-figure scoring stretch, Quickley averaged 18.6 points to go along with 4.6 rebounds per game and 50 3-pointers while shooting 47.2% from long range. He poured in a career-high 30 points at Texas A&M and sunk a career-best eight 3-pointers to become the first UK player with 30 or more points since Shai Gilgeous-Alexander scored 30 on Jan. 30, 2018, vs. Vanderbilt. He was also the first player with back-to-back 25-plus-point games since Monk from Feb. 25-28, 2017. The eight 3s tied Monk, Jamal Murray and Eric Bledsoe for the most 3-pointers in a game during the Calipari era.

What those stats don't fully reveal was just how clutch Quickley was. He became Kentucky's best option late in games, breaking the will of more than a handful of opponents with shots from beyond the arc and clutch free throws.

Two of the best examples were at LSU and at home vs. Florida. He scored 14 of his team-high 21 points in the second half in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, which included making all five field-goal attempts and dishing a pair of assists. At home vs. Florida, he scored 22 points in the second half, including 20 of Kentucky's 28 points when the Wildcats fell behind 40-33. He finished with a game-high 26 points vs. the Gators.

ESPN's Jay Bilas said during the LSU game: "That young man has got ice water in his veins." Karl Ravech added: "On a team that has (Tyrese) Maxey and (Nick) Richards and (Ashton) Hagans, Quickley has become the go-to guy."

Over the course of UK's eight-game winning streak in February, in the second half alone, Quickley averaged 14.9 points, shot 56.4% from the field, 57.7% from 3-point range and 93.3% from the charity stripe.

"The kid lives in the gym," Calipari said. "He's kind of like Tyler (Herro). He's like Shai (Gilgeous-)Alexander, those guys. He's just like them."

After Herro set a new school record at the free-throw line last season, Quickley nearly broke it. He finished at 92.3% at the line, just behind Herro's 93.5%, ranking first in the league and third in the nation. He enjoyed four different stretches of 17 or more consecutive makes (with a high of 24 straight) and missed more than one free throw in a game just once this season.

Further illustrating his cool, calm, clutch demeanor, Quickley was 30 of 31 at the free-throw line this season when it was a two-possession game at any point with 3:00 or less to go or the game is in overtime. Against Mississippi State, Quickley made all 14 of his free-throw attempts, tying a school record for makes without a miss. He made eight of them in the final minute as Mississippi State tried to extend the game.

Quickley's emergence began in the rivalry game vs. Louisville. After scoring 16 points in three previous games for his career high, Quickley set a new mark with 18 points in the win over No. 3/4 Louisville. He made two key 3-pointers and was 8 of 8 from the free-throw line, including two in the final seconds of overtime to seal the outcome.

The 6-foot-3 guard earned the opportunity for a career game offensively because of a stellar day defensively. Calipari told his team that whoever could guard Louisville's leading scorer, Jordan Nwora, would get significant playing

time. Quickly answered the call and took on the majority of the assignment. Nwora, who entered the game averaging 21.2 points, was held to eight points on 2-of-10 shooting.

Mirroring his even-keel approach, Quickly was Kentucky's most consistent performer in hostile territory. He averaged a team-best 19.1 points in addition to 4.8 rebounds and 29 3-pointers (on 59.2% shooting) in UK's 10 true road games.

## Richards Writes His 'Own (Dominant) Story'

Every player is on their own timetable, John Calipari has repeated throughout his time at Kentucky. For some that means breaking through after their freshman season. For others it may mean two, three or four years of development. Maybe no player was a better example of that than Nick Richards this season.

The junior not only enjoyed the most productive season of his career, he produced one of college basketball's best stories of the season. After averaging 4.5 points, 3.9 rebounds and 1.1 blocks over 13.4 minutes a game in the first two seasons of his career, Richards turned into an All-Southeastern Conference First Team player in 2019-20.

Richards led the team in rebounding (7.8 per game), blocks (2.1 per game) and double-doubles (10) to go along with a conference-high .644 field-goal percentage and 14.0 points per game. His field-goal percentage ranked fourth in the nation.

The centerpiece of a frontline that entered the season with questions about its depth and talent after losing PJ Washington and Reid Travis to the pros, Richards squashed any and all concerns about his ability to produce.

"How many guys have 7-footers that can do what that kid does?" John Calipari said after the Texas Tech game. "Not many."

Case in point: Richards was one of four players in the country to average at least 13.5 points per game, at least 7.5 rebounds and at least 2.0 blocks while shooting at least 60.0% from the floor. He was in the 98th percentile of offensive efficiency in the Synergy national rankings and in the 88th percentile on defense.

In a program headlined by one-and-done success stories, Richards stuck to his own timetable. He didn't start playing basketball until midway through his teenage years, so not only was he behind the traditional development curve, he also lacked the demonstrated performance of his peers. Once he built his own confidence, he played like one of the best players in the country -- and was awarded as such. He was an All-SEC First Team selection by the league's coaches, was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 20 First Team, won two national player of the week honors in 2019-20 and was a two-time SEC Player of the Week honor.

"Everybody has their own story," Richards said after the Texas Tech game. "Just because I go to a school that's known for one-and-done doesn't mean I have to be one-and-done. It took me time to develop over the past three years. I've had the best time of my life. Meeting incredible people, having the best coaching staff in the world training me to be the player I am right now and to be a better player for times to come."

Richards played well early in the season, but his meteoric rise began vs. Louisville and continued into the conference season. Despite impressive early numbers, Richards had yet to fully break through vs. consistent, upper-level competition. Against Louisville's frontline, one of the best in the country, Richards delivered. The 6-foot-11 big man secured a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds, but it was how he did it that impressed the most.

Playing the final 8:53 of regulation and all five minutes of overtime with four fouls, Richards took two momentum-changing charges and scored seven straight points in overtime with the game on the line. With Louisville leading 68-65 with 2:21 to go in overtime, Richards snared an offensive rebound (one of six in the game) and converted the traditional three-point play to even the score once again. His free throws with 27 seconds remaining gave the Wildcats a 72-70 lead they would not relinquish. Richards also drew a game-high 11 fouls to get Kentucky to the free-throw line, a key difference in the outcome. His defense was a difference maker.

The double-double was Richards' first against a ranked opponent in his three seasons. In 20 games prior vs. ranked foes, Richards averaged 3.8 points and 3.9 rebounds per game. He

had never recorded double-digit scoring or rebounding numbers against a ranked opponent. Richards did it again vs. nationally ranked Texas Tech with a monster 25-point, 14-rebound, four-block performance.

In the game in Lubbock, Texas, Richards became just the second Wildcat in the Calipari era to post at least 25 points, 14 rebounds and four blocks in a game. National Player of the Year Anthony Davis did it in 2012.

Richards was dominant from start to finish vs. the Red Raiders. After setting the tone early in the game with a thunderous dunk and a handful of intimidating swats, he took over in overtime with seven points, including the game-winning free throws with 10 seconds left and nearly 15,000 hostile fans screaming at him to miss.

Other noteworthy performances included a 27-point, 11-rebound game vs. Mississippi State, featuring 25 points in the second half.

Richards also led the Wildcats with 66 blocks, including 18 games with multiple rejections. He blocked seven shots vs. Lamar, the first Wildcat with seven or more swats since Karl-Anthony Towns in 2014-15, and blocked six at LSU.

As Richards went in 2019-20, so did UK. Kentucky was 22-2 when he scored in double figures, 10-0 when he grabbed double-digit rebounds and 7-1 when he blocked at least four shots.

## Maxey at his Best Against the Best

Expectations for Tyrese Maxey escalated after he shot the roof off Madison Square Garden in his college debut in early November.

After scoring 26 points in front of a national audience vs. the No. 1 team in the country at the time, Michigan State, many expected him to do that on a nightly basis. It was a high bar for a freshman who would have to endure the same ups and downs just about every freshman has to that puts on a Kentucky uniform.

What everyone has discovered by the end of the season is that Maxey plays his best when the stakes are at their highest.

Highlighted by a career-high 27-point performance in the victory over No. 3/4 Louisville, Maxey averaged a team-high 19.0 points to go along with 5.3 rebounds in UK's six games vs. Associated Press Top 25 foes.

In true road games, Maxey ranked second on the team with an average of 14.4 points. He also added 4.4 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.0 blocks per game in hostile territory.

Maxey's 26 points in the 1-2 matchup vs. Michigan State topped Terrence Jones' 25 points against East Tennessee State in 2010 for the most points by a freshman Wildcat in their debut. In that game, Maxey's first points didn't come until just after the midway point of the first half, but he scored seven straight points to help Kentucky earn an 11-point halftime lead. From the 10:03 mark of the second half until a pair of Ashton Hagans' free throws with 37 seconds to play, Maxey scored or assisted on 14 straight UK points to hold off the Michigan State rally.

There was no bigger shot that night though than his final 3-pointer with a minute to play. Michigan State had cut the lead to just two and momentum seemed to be swinging to the veteran-laden Spartans. In front of two former UK stars, John Wall and Jones, as well as NBA champion Kevin Durant, Maxey took 6-foot-6 Aaron Henry off the dribble and launched a shot four feet behind the 3-point line. With one swish of the net, Maxey etched his name into Kentucky record books and introduced himself to the nation.

Against Louisville, he made a career-high nine field goals (on 14 shots), sunk a career-best four 3-pointers and tied a career high with seven rebounds. His 27 points were the most by a UK freshman vs. Louisville and the most by a Wildcat in the rivalry since Jodie Meeks score 28 on Jan. 4, 2009.

Highlighted by six 20-point performances, Maxey averaged 14.0 points per game. He scored in double figures in 22 games and added 4.3 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game. He was named to the All-Southeastern Conference Second Team, the SEC All-Freshman Team and won SEC Freshman of the Week three times in 2019-20.

The Texas native played particularly well late in the season. He averaged 15.5 points per

game on 42.9% shooting over the last 12 games, scoring in double figures in 10 of those.

Included in that stretch, Maxey had 10 second-half points to lead a double-digit comeback effort at home against Vanderbilt. It was Maxey once again to help lead the charge in another double-digit deficit against the Commodores on the road on Feb. 11. He led the Wildcats with 25 points, 15 coming in the second half as UK rebounded from a 14-point first-half hole for a 78-64 win. Maxey posted 17 points vs. 15th-ranked Auburn to help the Wildcats to the SEC regular-season title.

## Hagans One of the Best Point Guards in the Country

Ashton Hagans certainly had the confidence of his head coach in year two as Kentucky's starting point guard.

"We could say there are better point guards in the country, but you got to tell me who you're talking about," John Calipari said.

Hagans was the consummate point guard in his sophomore season, doing a little bit of everything to affect the game. He averaged 11.5 points, 6.4 assists, 3.9 rebounds and 1.9 steals per game while grabbing the leadership reins of a talented but once again young team.

The second-year guard boasted double-figure scoring in 20 games, including a career-high 26-point performance in the win over Utah Valley. He dished out three or more assists in every game he played and recorded five or more in 22 outings, including a career-high-tying 12 vs. UAB. His streak of 10 games with six or more assists midway through the season was the best run by a Wildcat since Roger Harden dished six or more in 12 straight in 1986.

With 351 career dimes, Hagans ranks 12th in program history in assists. His 5.24 career assist average ranks fourth in school history. Hagans' assist average this season ranked 16th in the country and tops in the league.

The 2019 Southeastern Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Year was once again UK's best on-ball defender with a team-high 58 steals and even those numbers didn't do him justice. His ability to disrupt an opposing team's offense was on display in the win at Texas Tech.

Hagans posted three steals vs. the Red Raiders, but it was the plays that didn't show up as steals that helped preserve the win. Down the stretch, he forced three key turnovers, including knocking the ball off a defender's foot on the sideline, running the length of the floor to tip away what would have been a transition alley-oop dunk, and swatting away the potential game-tying shot in the closing seconds of overtime.

It was plays like those that underscored why Hagans was a Naismith National Defensive Player of the Year finalist. He made the SEC All-Defensive Team for a second straight season in 2019-20.

"You're not going to find a player that is better on the defensive end on and off the ball than Ashton Hagans," ESPN analyst Jay Bilas said.

Said national writer Jeff Goodman: "Lots of great defensive players out there, but I'll take Ashton Hagans over all of them."

With 119 swipes in 67 career games, Hagans is averaging 1.776 steals per game for his career. That ranks third in program history, trailing only Rajon Rondo and Derek Anderson.

Hagans did all that while fighting through nagging injuries this season. He battled lower leg pain for the first handful of games to start the season, played through a left ankle sprain early in the SEC play and suffered a left thigh contusion late in the season that limited him.

## Balanced Attack

Part of what made this Kentucky team dangerous was the balance.

Six different players led the Wildcats in scoring. Immanuel Quickley led the team in scoring 11 times and Tyrese Maxey and Nick Richards led in eight games.

Five players scored at least 25 points a total of nine times this season, but ironically the last one to do it was the Wildcats' leading scorer, Quickley, who averaged 16.1 points per game. He joined the 25-point club with 26 points at home vs. Florida, making this the first UK team with five players to score 25 points or more since the 2015-16 squad. He then became the first UK player since Malik Monk in 2016-17 with back-to-back games of 25 or more points with a career-high 30 at Texas A&M.

This group was the first Kentucky team with three players to average 14.0 points or more since John Wall, DeMarcus Cousins and Patrick Patterson in 2009-10.

## Sestina Joins 1,000-Point Club

Kentucky's most veteran player, Nate Sestina, topped 1,000 career points (including at Bucknell) this season.

Sestina, considered one of UK's team leaders for his floor presence and energy, averaged 5.8 points and 3.8 rebounds per game for the Wildcats. He scored in double figures four times with a double-double vs. Eastern Kentucky and really came on late in the season as Kentucky played its best basketball.

He scored nine or more points in three of the last six games, beginning with a breakthrough at LSU when he recorded 11 points and added eight rebounds. He also scored 11 in the conference championship-clinching win vs. Auburn on Feb. 29 and provided 26 important minutes in the 18-point comeback win at Florida with nine points and six boards to close the season.

There have been 60 1,000-point scorers in school history but not one since Terrence Jones, Doron Lamb and Darius Miller all eclipsed the mark in 2011-12. Sestina does not make it into the school's official 1,000-point club because of his split career.

## Juzang Enters NCAA Transfer Portal

Johnny Juzang has entered his name in the NCAA transfer portal and will have the ability to transfer to any school without any restrictions, per NCAA rules.

"This last year at Kentucky was one of the best experiences of my life," Juzang said. "I grew so much not only as a player, but as a young man as well. I'd like to thank all my coaches, my brothers, the trainers, the staff, BBN and everyone who made this year so special. From the bottom of my heart I'm going to miss this place. With lots of thought and consideration, I've decided to put my name into the transfer portal."

Juzang appeared in 28 games with two starts in 2019-20. He scored 82 points, grabbed 54

rebounds, and shot 37.7% from the field and 32.6% from 3-point range.

The Los Angeles native played well late in the season, scoring in double figures twice over the final nine games, including 10 points and two 3-pointers in the 18-point comeback win at Florida. He made 10 of his last 20 3-point shots to end the season. Juzang also scored a season-high 13 points with three 3-pointers in the win at Tennessee.

"I talked to Johnny ... along with his family and let him know if he wants to come back here that this option is always open to him," UK John Calipari said. "Johnny had a great year and really got better as the season went on. I always enjoyed coaching him, and if there's an opportunity to continue to do so, I would welcome it with open arms because Johnny is a great kid and a skilled basketball player with a bright future.

"When we spoke ... his family talked about Johnny going back to the West Coast, which I understand. If this is what he ultimately decides to do, we wish him all the best. He has our full support."

Juzang was a late add to the 2019 signing class after reclassifying. Ranked the No. 34 prospect by the Recruiting Services Consensus Index, Juzang averaged 23.0 points, 8.5 rebounds and 3.4 assists per game during his final season at the Harvard-Westlake School.

The 6-foot-6 guard was an All-California Interscholastic Federation First Team pick in his final season in high school. Juzang led Harvard-Westlake to the CIF championship and the Mission League Championship for the first time since 2011 last year.

## UK Continued SEC Awards Dominance in 2020

Kentucky has dominated the weekly Southeastern Conference awards under John Calipari. UK has won more SEC honors (108) than any school during the Calipari era, including 83 SEC Freshman of the Week honors and 25 SEC Player of the Week awards.

Kentucky won eight total SEC honors this season with five SEC Player of the Week awards and three SEC Freshman of the Week honors. When Immanuel Quickley won on March 2, he became the first Wildcat in school history to win consecutive SEC Player of the Week honors (dating back to the 1984-85 season).

Quickley won three total SEC Player of the Week honors (Jan. 13, Feb. 24, March 2) this season and Nick Richards was a two-time SEC Player of the Week winner (Dec. 30, Jan. 27). Tyrese Maxey won SEC Freshman of the Week three times (Nov. 11, Dec. 30, Jan. 13).

The Wildcats won four national honors this season. Richards was named the U.S. Basketball Writers Association Oscar Robertson Trophy National Player of the Week after the win over Louisville and the NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week after back-to-back wins vs. Georgia and at Texas Tech. Maxey took home both NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week and USBWA Wayman Tisdale National Freshman of the Week honors following the U of L game.

## Cats in a Close One

Kentucky fans may want to schedule an appointment with a cardiologist after this season. The Wildcats' penchant for playing in close games surely had an effect on the collective blood pressure of Big Blue Nation.

Although UK sported an impressive 25-6 record, 15 of those wins were by single digits. Six of the double-figure victory margins took place in the first nine games.

Put another way, in 24 of 31 games this season, the margin was seven or fewer points in the last seven minutes. Of those, 17 games were within one possession in the final six minutes.

Overall, UK was 4-3 in games decided by five points or less and 2-0 in overtime games.

The flip side of the close margins is that they likely had an impact on Kentucky's NCAA Evaluation Tool ranking, which, had the NCAA Tournament taken place, could have hurt UK's seed. Despite an impressive profile, the Wildcats were ranked No. 21 in the final NET. The NET factors in margin of victory.

Further illustrating just how close most of Kentucky's games were in 2019-20, UK's six losses were by a combined 32 points.

## Taking Advantage of Free Points

One of Kentucky's strengths this season was its success at the free-throw line, which was one for the record books.

The Wildcats shot 79.7% at the charity stripe this season, crushing the previous school record of 77.6% in 1978-79. The mark also

ranked second in the country.

UK earned 24.3% of its points at the free-throw line, had a free-throw rate of 40.8% and connected at 79.7%. All were among the national leaders.

Kentucky's free-throw distribution percentage of 24.3% ranked third nationally and its free-throw rate of 40.8% rated 18th, according to KenPom.com. Five players made 75% or better (with a minimum of 30 attempts), led by Immanuel Quickley's 92.3% (144 of 156). The Wildcats concluded the season by making at least 75% in 14 straight games.

Kentucky's strong performance at the line wasn't relegated to its success rate of makes, but also the frequency in which the Wildcats got to the line and the number of makes per game. UK took an average of 22.7 free throws a game and made an average of 18.1. The opposition averaged 12.9 makes on an average of 18.8 attempts a game. Opponents shot only 23 more free throws than the Wildcats made.

UK made its free throws when they mattered the most. The Wildcats were 99 of 114 (86.8%) at the line when it was a two-possession game (six points or less) or less with three minutes or less to play (including overtime). Quickley was 30 of 31 (96.8%) on the season.

## S-E-C! S-E-C! S-E-C!

Kentucky is the Southeastern Conference's gold standard. Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats are the most dominant team in the league, recording a 1,012-284 mark (.781) in regular-season conference play. Only two other teams have won more than 750 regular-season SEC games (Alabama and Tennessee), and no other team owns a better winning percentage.

- Kentucky has averaged 11.6 wins and only 3.3 losses per season in 87 seasons in the SEC
- UK has won 49 SEC regular-season titles and 31 SEC Tournament championships
- The Wildcats have won 16 of the last 28 SEC Tournaments
- Kentucky has captured at least a share of six of the last 11 SEC regular-season championships under John Calipari
- UK has played in the championship game of the SEC Tournament in eight of Calipari's 11 seasons, winning six times (the 2020 tournament was not played due to the COVID-19 pandemic)
- Kentucky won its 1,000th game in SEC regular-season action vs. Alabama on Jan. 11. Kansas has won 1,000 conference games when combining its records in the Big 6, Big 7, Big 8 and Big 12, but no other team in the country had won 1,000 or more regular-season league games in one conference alone
- Seven teams made the 2019 NCAA Tournament field, tied for the second most of any league in the country
- The SEC had two teams in the Elite Eight, one in the Final Four and went 12-7 in NCAA Tournament games in 2019
- The SEC has held its own in the annual Big 12/SEC Challenge. The conferences are 20-20 over the last four seasons in the yearly January showdown
- Twelve SEC schools ranked in the top 100 and six in the top 50 in the final NCAA' Net Evaluation Tool rankings

## Kentucky's Schedule Packed a Punch

Kentucky's schedule is always among the toughest in the country. This season was no different.

UK's nonconference slate saw the Wildcats defeat Michigan State in the Champions Classic in New York, endure a tough trip to Las Vegas vs. Utah and Ohio State, included the annual rivalry vs. Louisville in Rupp Arena, and took the Wildcats to Texas Tech.

Seven of UK's 13 nonconference opponents made a postseason tournament in 2019, five of which made the NCAA Tournament. Michigan State (1), Louisville (3) and Ohio State (5) were all ranked in the top five of the Associated Press Top 25 at the time of the meeting. It's the first time UK played three AP top-five opponents before January since the 1979-80 season. The Wildcats went 2-1 vs. those three opponents.

That nonconference schedule gave way to one of the toughest league schedules in the country. UK played its permanent home-and-away opponents of Florida, Tennessee and Vanderbilt twice, plus hosted and visited both Auburn and Georgia. The SEC's 15 NCAA Tournament selections over the last previous years are second most in the nation.



Fifteen of Kentucky's 26 opponents played in the postseason in 2018-19, including 11 in the NCAA Tournament, five in the Sweet 16 and three in the Final Four.

Four Kentucky opponents ranked in the final Associated Press Top 25, including three non-conference foes in Michigan State (9), Louisville (14) and Ohio State (19). SEC foe Auburn (20) also ranked among the AP Top 25.

## Cats Deliver the Knockout Punch

Kentucky is 281-8 (.972) in the John Calipari era when leading by at least 10 points at any time in the contest.

Ironically, two of the last four instances UK has let a double-digit lead slip away came on the road at South Carolina. The Wildcats led by as many as 14 in Columbia, South Carolina, on Jan. 15, but the Gamecocks rallied behind a buzzer-beating 3-pointer for the 81-78 win. It was the first time UK let a double-digit lead slip away since Auburn rallied for an overtime win in the 2019 Elite Eight. Prior to that, UK's last loss was another 14-point advantage at South Carolina during the 2017-18 season.

Seven of the eight losses are to conference opponents.

Perhaps most impressive of all is that 71.0% of games Calipari has coached in at Kentucky have produced 10-point leads at some point during the game for UK. The Wildcats have led by 10 points or more in a whopping 85.2% of Calipari's 330 career wins at Kentucky.

## Cats Don't Count on the Long Ball

New rules that moved the 3-point line to the international basketball distance of 22 feet, 1.75 inches had an impact on college basketball this season. The Wildcats were not immune.

Kentucky shot 34.3% from behind the arc, ranked 122nd in the country. Those numbers were a stark improvement from the first half of the season when UK ranked in the bottom third of the country.

The Wildcats ranked near the bottom nationally in both 3-point field goals per game (ranked 336th with 5.1 per game) and 3-point scoring distribution (only 20.4% of UK's points came from 3s, which was 349th out of 353 teams) and took 236 fewer 3-pointers than the opposition. Additionally, the Wildcats made four or fewer 3-pointers in 12 games.

But, if you've followed John Calipari's teams over the years, Kentucky has never relied on the 3-point shot. While teams nationally are taking more 3-point shots than ever before, UK has bucked the trend and played to the style that's best suited for that particular group.

The highest percentage of 3-point shots taken under Calipari was the 2010-11 Final Four team that lofted 32.4% of its shots from beyond the arc. No surprise, that team consisted of Brandon Knight and Doron Lamb on the perimeter is also Calipari's top 3-point shooting team at Kentucky.

Calipari typically likes his teams to take between 20 to 24 3-point attempts per game but believed this team was better suited to take closer to 15 to 20. UK averaged 14.8 attempts from long distance per game.

Not relying on the 3 certainly didn't hurt the Wildcats. UK is 10-1 all-time under Calipari when making one or fewer from long range, including 3-0 this season. Extended to three or fewer 3-pointers, Kentucky was 8-1 this season.

UK's 3-point numbers were on the rise late in the season. The Wildcats shot 37.3% from behind the arc in regular-season conference games, which ranked second in the SEC. For all the attention on this group's 3-point woes, this team ended up making a better percentage than the 2013-14 and 2009-10 teams.

Oddly enough, Kentucky shot the ball from deep considerably better in hostile territory. The Wildcats made 47.2% from long range in true road games but only 28.9% at home and 25.9% in their three neutral-site games.

## Forever Young

With a combined 50 starts, 27.2% of the scoring, 30.5% of the rebounding and four key players (Ashton Hagans, Immanuel Quickley, Nick Richards and EJ Montgomery) back from the 2018-19 Elite Eight team -- plus a graduate transfer in Nate Sestina -- this Kentucky team entered the season as one of the most experienced groups of the John Calipari era.

The key words being the Calipari era.

In comparison to the rest of the country, it was still inexperienced. According to Ken Pomeroy's experience rankings, UK finished the season 335th in the country out of 353 teams with an average of 0.99 years of experience. Only four other Power 5 teams had less experience in the KenPom.com rankings.

UK began the season with nine newcomers on its roster, so growing pains were expected. Having said all that, it did rank as one of Calipari's most experienced teams at Kentucky, which likely would have been important in the postseason had the NCAA Tournament not been canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Calipari's best teams have combined young talent with a few returning pieces.

The 2009-10 squad with John Wall and DeMarcus Cousins featured veteran Patrick Patterson. The 2010-11 Final Four team had DeAndre Liggins and Josh Harrellson. The 2011-12 national championship team boasted three key returners in Terrence Jones, Doron Lamb and Darius Miller. The 2013-14 national runner-up squad featured Alex Poythress and Willie Cauley-Stein. And the 2014-15 team that nearly ran the table had both Poythress and Cauley-Stein back in addition to Andrew and Aaron Harrison and Dakari Johnson.

## Defense the Difference Again

Long. Athletic. Interchangeable parts. Like so many of his past teams, this Kentucky squad was a menace defensively.

Opponents made just 39.4% from the floor vs. UK in 2019-20, ranked 20th in the country. And unlike last season when it seemed like every opponent early in the schedule caught fire from outside, the opposition only made 30.7% from behind the arc this season.

Kentucky held 18 opponents to 40% or less from the field, including eight of the final 12. UK was 15-3 in those games. Of the six Associated Press Top 25 opponents Kentucky played at the time, the Wildcats held three of them to less than 40% from the floor.

Sophomore Ashton Hagans, the 2019 Southeastern Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Year, was one of the best defenders in the country again and averaged 1.9 steals per game. He was a Naismith National Defensive Player of the Year finalist. Immanuel Quickley evolved into a defensive stopper as well, ranking in the 85th percentile in the Synergy Sports defensive rankings.

When opponents were able to get by the likes of Hagans and Quickley, Nick Richards was there as a rim protector. The junior posted a career-best 2.1 blocks per game with eight games of four or more rejections, including seven swats vs. Lamar, the most blocks by a Wildcat since Karl-Anthony Towns denied seven shots on Jan. 20, 2015. Richards ranked in the 88th percentile in Synergy.

## Hold Them to 55 Points, 40%

Defense has always been a recipe for success for the Wildcats under John Calipari. The special ingredient: 55 points. UK is a perfect 77-0 under Calipari when holding the opponent to 55 points or fewer, including 3-0 this season.

The Wildcats are 185-7 (96.4%) under Calipari when limiting the opponent to 63 points or less. UK was 12-0 this season in the category. Kentucky's 61-59 loss to Tennessee in 2017-18 snapped a 60-game winning streak when holding the opponent to 63 or less.

Kentucky also fares well when it keeps the competition to 40% or less from the floor. UK is 202-19 (91.4%) vs. opponents under Calipari when its field-goal percent is 40% or less. The Wildcats were 15-3 this season. UK held eight of the last 12 opponents to 40% or less.

## Big-Game Cal, Cats

John Calipari's teams aren't just good against the best teams in the country, they're great. Not only does Kentucky own a 63-33 record (.655) vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams under John Calipari, UK is 7-4 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five.

All-time, Calipari is 13-8 when both teams are ranked in the AP top five. When both teams

are ranked in the AP Top 25, Calipari's all-time record is 86-56, including a 55-29 mark at Kentucky. When both are ranked in the top 10 he has a 27-19 record, including 16-12 at UK.

Kentucky answered the bell of big-time showdowns again this season. UK was 4-2 vs. AP Top 25 teams, including 2-1 vs. top-five teams at the time.

By defeating top-ranked Michigan State to start the season, UK knocked off the No. 1 team in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. Last season, Kentucky downed Tennessee on Feb. 19, 2019. With the win over MSU, the Wildcats now have nine victories over the No. 1 team in 25 tries in program history.

Calipari improved to 6-4 vs. the No. 1 team in his career with the win vs. Michigan State, including 3-2 at Kentucky. According to ESPN, Calipari is the only coach with a winning (.600) percentage against No. 1 ranked teams with a minimum of 10 games faced against the No. 1.

## Taking Care of Business

Kentucky's 63-33 record vs. opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 in John Calipari's tenure is impressive, but the Wildcats' ability to beat all-comers can't be overlooked. Under Calipari, UK is 267-44 vs. unranked competition, an .859 winning percentage.

## Always Efficient

According to Ken Pomeroy's calculations on kenpom.com, UK's teams under John Calipari have consistently ranked among the most efficient teams in the country per possession.

## Bounce Back

Kentucky doesn't lose often during the John Calipari era, but when the Wildcats do, they almost always bounce back, and it's extremely rare for the Wildcats to drop more than one in a row. UK is 55-13 under Calipari following a loss (record does not count end-of-season losses).

The Wildcats did it once this season, lost two straight in Las Vegas, but UK bounced back in a big way by closing the regular season with wins in 17 of its final 20 games, including the Southeastern Conference regular-season championship.

Kentucky has only lost more than two games once under Calipari losing four straight during the 2017-18 season. Previously, the last time UK lost four games in a row was in February 2009, when the Wildcats dropped four straight games to end the regular season. It was the first time Calipari had lost four straight since the end of the 2004-05 season at Memphis.

UK has never lost back-to-back home games under Calipari.

## Jordan First Two-Sport Star Since Braddy

Even with key returners, a deep and talented recruiting class, and the addition of graduate transfer Nate Sestina, Kentucky suffered major losses from last season.

From a numbers standpoint, UK needed more depth. When John Calipari heard there was a 6-foot-9, 250-pound pitcher on the baseball team with considerable basketball talent, he called UK baseball head coach Nick Mingione.

Enter Ben Jordan.

Jordan joined the team just before the Blue-White Game and served an important role early in the season when injuries mounted.

Jordan became the first multi-sport basketball player since Nehemiah "Junior" Braddy, who played four seasons with the basketball team (1990-93) and one with the baseball team (1991). It's worth noting that while former UK basketball player E.J. Floreal played both basketball (2014-16) and track at UK, he didn't begin his track career until after leaving basketball.

Although Jordan is a highly regarded baseball prospect with a lively arm, he's also a talented basketball player. He played at West Carter High School in Olive Hill, Kentucky, where he was the all-time leading rebounder and shot blocker and the eighth all-time leading scorer.

Jordan won Eastern Kentucky Conference Defensive Player of the Year in his senior season in addition to EKC First Team honors. He averaged 12.2 rebounds a contest in his final year.

Jordan was expected to be a major part of the UK baseball team in the spring but the COVID-19 pandemic forced cancellation of most of the season. A 2016 Under Armour All-American in high school, he appeared in 10 games last season after redshirting in 2018 with an injury. Over the summer, playing for the Gaithersburg Giants of the Cal Ripken College

Baseball League, Jordan appeared in seven games with six starts. He went 1-1 with a 2.70 ERA in 26.2 innings, allowing just 14 hits while striking out 36 en route to First Team All-Cal Ripken League honors.

## Nation-Best 29 Wildcats on NBA Opening-Day Rosters

As the 2019-20 NBA season began, 29 players on NBA opening-day rosters (including two-way and inactive lists) played and finished their college basketball careers at Kentucky.

Underscoring the fact that no other school in the country can match UK's ability to develop players and put them in the NBA, UK's 29 players were again the most of any college basketball program, beating the next-closest school (Duke) by five players.

Of the 496 players in the NBA to start the 2019-20 season, 5.8% played and finished their college basketball careers at UK. There were actually fewer teams without a Wildcat (12) than there are NBA teams featuring Wildcats (18).

Of the 29 Wildcats on an opening-day NBA roster, John Calipari coached 28 of them. With Derrick Rose (Detroit Pistons), who played for Calipari during the 2006-07 season at Memphis, Calipari coached 29 players on 2019-20 opening-day rosters.

Kentucky has enjoyed unprecedented success at putting players in the NBA under Calipari. In the 10 seasons of the Calipari era, 38 players have been selected in the NBA Draft, more than any other school. Included in the recent run are 29 first-round picks, three No. 1 overall selections (Davis, Karl-Anthony Towns and John Wall) and 21 lottery selections.

Calipari's players are not only reaching the next level, they are succeeding when they do. His players have garnered 23 All-Star selections, with Anthony Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. Rose was named the league's MVP in 2011. Five of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (Rose, Wall, Davis, DeMarcus Cousins and Towns), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year (Rose, Tyreke Evans and Towns), and 12 players from Calipari's first nine teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

Using figures compiled by basketball-reference.com and spotrac.com, Calipari-coached players only (which includes Rose but not Rondo) have amassed more than \$2.26 billion in career NBA contracts. In the 10 seasons Calipari has been the head coach at Kentucky, his players have totaled nearly \$1.9 billion in NBA contracts.

In just the 2019-20 season alone, UK players will make more than \$255 million. Calipari-coached players only (includes Rose but not Rondo) will make more than \$260 million.

A full breakdown of the current Wildcats in the NBA can be found later in the notes.

## Wildcats Shine at NBA All-Star Weekend

It wasn't just the number of former Kentucky men's basketball players -- six in all -- at NBA All-Star weekend that made it an impressive weekend, it was also how they performed.

The Wildcats had their fingerprints all over Chicago, highlighted by Anthony Davis making the game-winning free throw in the All-Star Game and Bam Adebayo winning the Skills Challenge.

Davis (Los Angeles Lakers) made the deciding free throw in the new format of the All-Star Game. With the first team to 157 points (24 more points than the leading team heading into the fourth quarter, a tribute to the late Kobe Bryant), Davis stepped to the line needing to make one of two to end the game. He missed long on the first, but in front of his hometown crowd, Davis calmly sunk the second. He scored 20 points to go along with nine rebounds and three blocks in the Team LeBron win.

Davis was making his seventh All-Star Game appearance and was joined by two other Wildcats in the game, Adebayo and Devin Booker, who made their NBA All-Star debuts. Adebayo (Miami Heat) scored eight points and Booker (Phoenix Suns) totaled six. UK's three representatives were more than any other school.

A night earlier, Adebayo dominated all three rounds of the NBA Skills Challenge to become the second Wildcat to win the competition. Karl-Anthony Towns won it in 2016.

Not long after, Booker nearly made it 2-for-2 for the Kentucky Wildcats at the NBA All-Star Saturday Night in the 3-Point Contest. The 2018 champion scored 27 in the first round and 26 in the championship round but was edged by Buddy Hield on the final shot by a point.

A former Kentucky player has won a major award in five straight NBA All-Star weekends. Towns won the Skills Challenge in 2016, Davis captured MVP honors in the All-Star Game and Jamal Murray won MVP in the Rising Stars Challenge in 2017, Booker took home 3-Point Contest honors in 2018, Hamidou Diallo won the Slam Dunk Contest last season, and Adebayo was crowned the Skills Challenge champion this year.

Three Wildcats played in the Rising Stars Challenge. Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (Oklahoma City Thunder) scored 16 points and PJ Washington (Charlotte Hornets) recorded eight points and five rebounds. Tyler Herro (Miami Heat) was also selected for the game but sat out due to injury.

## Kentucky at No. 1

For the seventh season in the 11-year John Calipari era, the Kentucky men's basketball team earned a No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25 on Nov. 11.

After defeating Michigan State, the previous No. 1 team, in the State Farm Champions

Classic and then following it up with a dominating 42-point victory vs. Eastern Kentucky the Wildcats were named the NCAA March Madness Team of the Week and moved atop the AP Top 25 for the first time since December 2016.

No other school has reached No. 1 in seven of the last 11 seasons while Calipari has been at Kentucky. According to STATS, only three other programs (Duke, North Carolina and UCLA) have ever been ranked No. 1 in seven different seasons during an 11-year span.

The Wildcats' stay at No. 1 was brief after a shocking loss to Evansville. It marked just the third loss ever by Kentucky in 57 games in Rupp Arena as the No. 1 team in the country. UK fell to 69-8 as the AP top-ranked team under Calipari.

The Wildcats own an all-time record of 220-31 (.876) at No. 1 in the AP Top 25. UK has appeared at the top of the AP poll 24 different seasons in school history, and the latest stay marked the program's 125th week at No. 1, third most in college basketball (Duke has 145 and UCLA, thanks in large part to its dynasty in the 1960s and 1970s, has 134).

Calipari, one of only two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking, is no stranger to the top spot. Dating back to his time at Memphis, Calipari-coached teams have reached No. 1 in eight of the last 13 seasons. Including his tenure at UMass, his teams have ranked No. 1 in 10 different seasons.

## **2012 Title Team Voted Team of the Decade**

Kentucky led college basketball in the 2010s in NCAA Tournament wins, Final Four appearances and NBA Draft picks. According to the Associated Press, the Wildcats also featured the best team of the decade.

The AP Top 25 panel tabbed the 2011-12 championship squad the best college basketball team of the decade. The 26-member panel voted UK ahead of the 2017-18 Villanova title team.

The 2012 national championship team was dominant in every sense of the word. En route to a 38-2 season, the Wildcats captivated the nation with a smothering defense, unselfish play, depth, balance and talent. Led by freshman Anthony Davis, the 2012 team snapped a 14-year title drought with the program's eighth national championship.

Davis, who won all but one of the major national player of the year awards, was the most dominant player in the country, not because of his offense – which was still superb – but because of his defensive abilities and rebounding prowess. The 6-foot-10 forward set a school record for blocked shots with 186, in addition to averaging a team-best 14.2 points and 10.4 rebounds per game.

The national championship game by Davis underscored the story of the 2012 Wildcats. Although Davis was 1 for 10 from the floor, he was named the Final Four Most Outstanding Player after taking over the title game vs. Kansas with 16 rebounds, six blocks and three steals.

Of course, Davis had plenty of help. Five other players on the team were selected in the NBA Draft just a few months later, including Michael Kidd-Gilchrist – arguably the emotional heartbeat of the team – who would later make history with Davis by becoming the first college teammates to go 1-2 in the draft.

Senior Darius Miller, sophomores Terrence Jones and Doron Lamb, and freshman Marquis Teague provided an unstoppable cast that lost its two games by a combined eight points, one of which was on a buzzer beater.

Memorable victories included a December showdown with preseason national title favorite North Carolina, avenging the first loss of the season with a victory over Indiana in the Sweet 16 and defeating archrival Louisville in the Final Four.

The championship marked John Calipari's first and was a part of four Final Four appearances in five seasons, one of just three schools to accomplish that feat.

Kentucky's 38 wins in 2011-12 is still tied for the most in NCAA Division I history, as are the six NBA Draft picks. Both marks were later tied by the 2014-15 UK team.

The Sporting News also voted John Calipari its College Basketball Coach of the Decade. More on that in the Calipari section below.

## **Payne Tabbed to A STEP UP Hall of Fame 2002 Class**

Associate head coach Kenny Payne has been named to the A STEP UP Assistant Coaches Hall of Fame Class of 2020.

A STEP UP, Inc., was founded by Johnny and Felicia Allen and provides professional development designed to help coaches discover new coaching insights and develop strategies, techniques and tactics to help them reach their full coaching potential.

Payne is joined in the 2020 class by Bill Brock (Baylor), Al Brown (Duke), Bill Guthridge (North Carolina), Karl Hobbs (Rutgers), Jollette Law (South Carolina), Tommy Lloyd (Gonzaga) and Bob Starkey (Texas A&M).

The Class of 2020 was set to be inducted into the Hall of Fame on May 5 in Charlotte, North Carolina, during the Symposium's Hall of Fame Induction breakfast. However, the event has been postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The A STEP UP Assistant Coaches Hall of Fame Committee received recommendations from individuals, coaches, the media and other professionals across the nation. Voting was based on the candidates track record of success, outstanding and significant contributions to the game as well as high character, integrity and respect among colleagues. A STEP UP, Inc., became the first to exclusively recognize NCAA men and women's assistant college coaches with the distinction of Hall of Fame honor.

UK's associate head coach is certainly worthy of this honor. Having just completed his 10th season with the Wildcats, Payne has helped the Cats to four Final Fours. This season, Kentucky went 25-6 and won the regular-season Southeastern Conference title.

Payne is well known in the basketball community and among current and former players

as a players-first coach. His relationships with players, his straightforward and direct approach with the kids, and his legendary workouts have helped build Final Four contenders at Kentucky and mold countless NBA Draft selections.

## **UK-Michigan Ink Three-Year Series Starting in London**

Kentucky has signed a three-year deal with Michigan that will take the Wildcats to London next season and add a marquee home-and-home series for the following two years.

Beginning with a trip to The O2 Arena in London on Dec. 6, the Wildcats and Wolverines will play three consecutive seasons. UK will travel to Ann Arbor, Michigan, for the Dec. 4, 2021 game, and Kentucky will host Michigan in Rupp Arena on Dec. 3, 2022.

The neutral-site game between the two schools – the Basketball Hall of Fame Showcase – will be hosted by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and serve as a fund raiser for the Hall. The UK-Michigan and Marist-UMBC games – taking place prior to the Kentucky game – will be the first NCAA Division I college basketball games in The O2 Arena.

Kentucky has played internationally on a number of occasions for foreign exhibition tours, but the London trip will mark UK's third regular-season game outside the U.S. and first in Europe.

London played host to the 1948 U.S. Olympic team that consisted of a handful of Wildcats. After winning the 1948 national championship – UK's first NCAA title – five Wildcats represented the U.S. in the 1948 Olympics in London. The Kentucky-led team won all eight of its games to win the gold medal.

UK leads the all-time series with Michigan 5-2. The most memorable matchup of the bunch – at least in the eyes of Big Blue Nation – was the most recent in March 2014 in Indianapolis. The Wildcats edged the Wolverines 75-72 in a classic in the Elite Eight. Aaron Harrison hit the second of three straight game-winning 3-pointers to advance UK to the Final Four. Howard's Wolverines knocked off Kentucky 81-78 in overtime in the 1993 Final Four to advance to the national championship game.

The on-campus visits in 2021 and 2022 will mark the first in the series since UK's 1970 trip to Ann Arbor and the 1968 UK Invitational Tournament in Memorial Coliseum. The series is tied 1-1 in Lexington, but the Wildcats lead Michigan 2-0 in Ann Arbor and 2-1 at neutral sites.

## **Best in the Bluegrass**

Kentucky defeated both of its in-state foes in 2019-20 (Eastern Kentucky and Louisville), continuing its domination of teams in state under John Calipari. Kentucky is now 19-2 against in-state foes with Calipari at the helm.

The overall mark also includes an 11-2 record vs. Louisville. Two of the victories over the Cardinals were in postseason play. UK's four-game winning streak was snapped in 2016-17 but the Wildcats have won all six meetings played in Rupp Arena, including a 29-point blowout in 2017-18, the third-biggest margin of victory in the history of the series. Louisville's two wins are by a combined six points.

## **Wildcats Sign Six in Fall Period**

Upon accepting the position of head coach of the Kentucky men's basketball program 10 years ago, John Calipari said one of the reasons he was chosen for the job was because he could recruit the best of the best.

It was a promise kept and a promise on which he continues to deliver. As he begins what he's calling his "second tour" at UK, he hasn't lost his touch.

Calipari and the Wildcats made an emphatic statement during the fall signing period with the additions of six highly skilled, athletic players to the program. UK signed decorated prospects Devin Askew, BJ Boston, Terrence Clarke, Cam'Ron Fletcher, Isaiah Jackson and Lance Ware to national letters of intent.

"I'm really excited about this group of young men," Calipari said. "They recruited us as much as we recruited them. They wanted this culture. They wanted to be with our good players. They didn't need crazy promises. They wanted this. In the past, when we've had groups like that, it's led to success both individually and as a team. When you're building a great team, not only do you need to be talented, you need to have high-character individuals, which we have with this group. These are great kids from good families."

All six players are consensus four- or five-star prospects and all are ranked in the top 60 by the major national recruiting services. Five of the six were on the preseason watch list for the Naismith High School Trophy (Askew was excluded because of his recent reclassification).



# NOTES

With the spring signing class still to go (begins April 15), UK is expected to have one of the nation's top classes yet again. In every season in the Calipari era, the Wildcats have signed a top-three recruiting class according to the Recruiting Services Consensus Index, which tallies major recruiting rankings and plugs them into a formula to calculate a consensus ranking.

Kentucky has now signed 59 top-50 recruits, 46 top-25 players and 25 top-10 players (according to Rivals) in what will now be Calipari's 12 recruiting classes at Kentucky.

UK can only comment on prospective student-athletes who have signed official paperwork to play at Kentucky.

## Leach, Ledford Honored by NSMA

It's only fitting that "The Greatest Tradition in the History of College Basketball" has some of the greatest broadcasters calling the action for Big Blue Nation.

Tom Leach, the current "Voice of the Wildcats" and Cawood Ledford, one of Leach's predecessors, were honored this season by the National Sports Media Association. Ledford, the 39-year voice of Wildcats football and men's basketball, was named to the NSMA Hall of Fame while Leach was chosen as the Kentucky SportsCaster of the Year. They will be recognized at the annual NSMA Awards Banquet, slated for June 29 in Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

Ledford called UK games from 1953 until his retirement in 1992. His work with the Wildcats were more than enough to gain national fame, but his impact was felt far beyond the Commonwealth. He handled the radio call of the NCAA Final Four for 18 years and was four times named the top college basketball announcer in the nation. Ledford also was prominent in horse racing, handling 22 Kentucky Derby broadcasts, and winning numerous awards for his coverage of that sport. He was the Kentucky SportsCaster of the Year by the NSMA 22 times. He is a member of the UK Athletics Hall of Fame and the Kentucky Athletics Hall of Fame.

Leach has been a member of the UK Athletics broadcast team since 1989 and has been the play-by-play voice of Wildcats football since 1997 and men's basketball since 2001. This is the sixth time he has been named the Kentucky SportsCaster of the Year. Like Ledford, he is known for his expertise in horse racing and has won two Eclipse Awards for his coverage. He received the 2019 Tom Hammond Media Award from the Bluegrass Sports Commission and was named a distinguished alumnus of the University of Kentucky School of Journalism and Media.

## LCC Announces Naming Rights Agreement with Central Bank

Lexington Center Corporation announced a landmark naming rights agreement with Central Bank, rebranding Lexington-Central Kentucky's premier convention, meeting, sports and entertainment complex as Central Bank Center. The iconic Rupp Arena will be Rupp Arena at

Central Bank Center.

The agreement is between Central Bank and JMI Sports, and UK/LCC's multimedia rights partner. This agreement bolsters Central Bank's existing relationship with JMI Sports and UK to an annual average investment of \$4.1 million with a term of 14 years, expiring in 2033. Upon completion of the renovation, the portion of this investment associated with naming rights will be \$1.5 million. The opportunity to sell naming rights with other media rights is part of LCC's and the university's Right of Use Agreement executed in February 2018 and transferred media rights ownership to UK.

A key part of the agreement is the naming rights to the Lexington Convention Center complex, which is currently undergoing a major expansion. To preserve and honor the history and tradition of the legendary basketball program led by Adolph Rupp, the arena will be known as Rupp Arena at Central Bank Center. The Central Bank Center brand will be on interior, exterior and directional signage, as well as collateral materials related to the Convention Center and Rupp Arena. New graphics are being designed which will be fully integrated into the expansion project and other areas of the facility.

## Cousins Inducted into UK Athletics Hall of Fame

DeMarcus Cousins was inducted into the UK Athletics Hall of Fame as a member of the 2019 class in September.

Cousins was one of the key players on the 2009-10 Kentucky team that went to the Elite Eight in John Calipari's first season at UK. Cousins was named an NCAA Consensus Second Team All-American, including first-team recognition from the Associated Press, the 2010 Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year by the league's coaches, and an All-SEC First Team (AP and coaches) selection.

While at UK, Cousins led the Wildcats to a No. 1 national ranking, an SEC regular-season championship and an SEC Tournament championship. He averaged 15.1 points and 9.9 rebounds and concluded freshman season with eighth-most rebounds in a single season in UK history with 375.

Following his one season in Lexington, Cousins was selected by the Sacramento Kings with the fifth overall pick in the 2010 NBA Draft. He's since gone on to a highly successful NBA career. He is a four-time NBA All-Star, was named to All-NBA Second Team in 2015 and 2016, and averaged double figures in all of his nine seasons in the league.

## Success Rate

The Wildcats received an NCAA award in the spring of 2019 for placing in the top 10% of all men's basketball teams in the country in the NCAA's annual Academic Progress Rate. UK scored a perfect 1,000. It's the fifth straight year the men's basketball team received the award and the sixth time since 2009.

The APR provides a real-time look at a team's academic success by the progress of each student-athlete on scholarship. The APR measures academic eligibility, retention and graduation. The scores are a four-year composite, covering the 2014-15 through 2017-18 school years.

Every Division I sports team across the nation calculates its APR each academic year, similar to a report card. Scholarship student-athletes each semester earn one point for remaining eligible and one point for staying in school or graduating.

UK has received a perfect 1,000 mark in each of the last six single-year APR rates.

The NCAA cut score to compete in the 2019-20 postseason is a 930 four-year APR. Teams scoring below 930 can face consequences intended to direct additional focus on academics. Those penalties can include practice restrictions and playing-season reductions.

## Whitney Leaves Program

Freshman forward Kahlil Whitney left the program on Jan. 24 to pursue other options.

"I can't express enough the respect I have for Coach Calipari," Whitney said. "I've learned a lot from him in my short time at UK and will take much of his wisdom with me as I continue on my journey. I am forever thankful for my time at Kentucky and for all the people I've met along the way. I thank the coaches, my teammates, tutors, training staff, advisers and professors for working with and believing in me. I wish Big Blue Nation all the best! I've heard your voices and positive messages, and I thank you for your continued love and support. I will always be cheering for UK's success and for all my brothers on the court."

Whitney played in 18 games with eight starts. He averaged 3.3 points and 1.7 rebounds in 12.8 minutes of action in 2019-20. The 6-foot-6 forward scored a season-high 11 points vs. Eastern Kentucky and nine points vs. Mount St. Mary's.

"First and foremost, Kahlil is a great kid," UK head coach John Calipari said. "This is tough for me because Kahlil is a tremendous person who is going to do great things. I certainly don't want to see him go because I wanted to continue to coach him, but I understand his decision and, as we always do here, will support him in whatever way we can. As I told Kahlil ... I hope he goes on and does his thing and makes us all proud. I know he will stay in touch with us and I know our fans will continue to support him as he takes this next step."

Whitney signed with Kentucky as a McDonald's All American and the No. 11 overall player in the class of 2019 by the Recruiting Services Consensus Index. He scored more than 2,000 points in his high school career at Roselle Catholic (New Jersey) and helped lead his team to a title at the New Jersey Tournament of Champions in his junior season.

The Chicago native was also a Jordan Brand All-American and was named co-MVP of the Allen Iverson Roundball Classic. Whitney was named to the Naismith High School Boys' All-America Third Team after his junior season.



## Cats Rock at Rupp

The Wildcats are 610-71 (.896) in Rupp Arena. Among the most notable marks of dominance as the nation's toughest venue to play include:

- School record 54-game winning streak to begin the John Calipari era
- UK is 329-42 (.887) in regular-season SEC games in the building
- Kentucky set a new program home record of 19 wins in 2014-15
- UK has gone undefeated at home in five of Calipari's 11 seasons
- The Wildcats have a perfect mark in 13 of Rupp Arena's 44 seasons

## UK Reaches 600 Wins at Rupp in Record Time

With a victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 7, 2019 Kentucky reached the 600-win mark at Rupp Arena faster than any other program in NCAA Division I level history. UK needed just 670 games to reach win No. 600 in Rupp Arena.

It took UCLA, which previously owned the fastest pace to 600 wins, 689 games in Pauley Pavilion. Only one other team, Kansas, achieved win No. 600 in fewer than 700 games at its home venue. The Jayhawks reached the significant win in their 699th game.

## Cal Owns Longest Win Streaks in Rupp

With UK's 2011-12 season-opening victory over Marist, UK head coach John Calipari recorded his 34th consecutive win in Rupp Arena as UK's head coach. It broke former UK head coach Rick Pitino's longest streak of 33 games in the venue.

The winning streak reached as long as 54 games. Calipari didn't suffer his first loss in Rupp Arena until losing to Baylor in his fourth season. The 54-game run, however, was his longest career winning streak. He also had the second-longest streak in the arena as the Cats won 42 straight from March 4, 2014 to Nov. 25, 2016.

## New Chairbacks, Fewer Seats

After receiving a \$16 million upgrade over the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons that enhanced the fan experience with the likes of a new Daktronics center-hung scoreboard, ribbons boards, new corner video boards and a new audio system, Rupp Arena is undergoing an additional transformation as a part of UK's new leasing agreement with the Lexington Center.

Chair-back seating in the upper-level sideline was installed in sections 211-217 and 228-234 for the 2019-20 season. Club areas will be available to season ticket holders starting with the 2020-21 season.

The new seating reduced Rupp Arena's capacity to 20,500.

## Pack the House

Until reducing capacity for the 2019-20 season, Kentucky had led the nation in average home attendance in 20 of 24 seasons. That number included a Rupp Arena record of 24,110 in John Calipari's first season (2009-10) as head coach.

Kentucky averaged 20,160 fans during the 2019-20 season, the first season with a reduced capacity at 20,500. UK averaged 23,000-plus fans in seven of Calipari's first 10 seasons

## The Top-Ranked Team at Home

Kentucky has lost just four times at home as the Associated Press top-ranked team in the history of the program and just three times in Rupp Arena. Prior to the losses to Evansville (Nov. 12) and UCLA (Dec. 3, 2016), both by three, the other two losses came by just one point.

The Wildcats are 54-3 all-time as the AP No. 1 team in Rupp Arena since its opening in 1976. The first loss was to Auburn, 53-52, on Jan. 9, 1988.

## Coach Cal in Rupp Arena

It's been downright difficult to beat the Wildcats in Rupp Arena during the John Calipari era. UK is 183-11 (.943) in Rupp Arena under Calipari.

- UK is 22-5 (.815) vs. AP Top 25 opponents in Rupp in the Calipari era
- The Wildcats are 161-6 (.964) vs. unranked teams in Rupp under Cal
- UK is 94-4 (.960) at home vs. nonconference foes under Calipari
- Calipari notched his 100th career win in Rupp Arena as UK's coach with the Wildcats' 110-75 rout of Auburn on Feb. 21, 2014. It took Calipari just 104 games to reach the century mark at home, the fastest of any UK coach

## Cal Passes Hall for Rupp Record

With a 101-70 victory over Cleveland State on Nov. 23, 2016, John Calipari passed former UK head coach Joe B. Hall for wins in Rupp Arena. Calipari currently has 183 wins inside the historic venue. Hall won 122.

## Calipari Named SEC, USBWA District IV, NABC District 20 Coach of the Year

Unflinching to early growing pains when his team stumbled out of the gate and resolute in his belief in his players and the annual process of preparing young teams for March, John Calipari was recognized for another stellar coaching job in 2019-20 by winning Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year, U.S. Basketball Writers Association District IV Coach of the Year and National Association of Basketball Coaches District 20 Coach of the Year honors.

It's Calipari's fourth SEC Coach of the Year award at Kentucky and his 10th conference coach of the year honors in 28 seasons as a college head coach.

Calipari was also a semifinalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year for a second consecutive season. He is one of just two coaches to win the Naismith Coach of the Year three times (Duke's Mike Krzyzewski is the other).

Calipari guided the Wildcats to a 25-6 regular season that included a 15-3 league record, an SEC regular-season championship, an 8-2 record on the road and a top-10 national ranking.

### Calipari Ahead of the Pack at Kentucky

Through 11 years at Kentucky, John Calipari's time in Lexington has been every bit as successful -- and more -- as fans hoped when he agreed to become the head coach at Kentucky back in the spring of 2009.

By just about every measure, he's the most successful coach in college basketball during the last decade. Among schools who have been to at least two Elite Eights and a Final Four since 2009-10, Calipari ranks:

- First in NCAA Tournament wins (31)
- First in Final Four appearances (four)
- First in Elite Eight appearances (seven)
- First in Sweet 16 appearances (eight)
- Second in league tournament titles (six)
- Third in wins (330)
- Third in regular-season conference titles (six)
- Fourth in NCAA titles (one)

### Calipari Named Coach of the Decade

Underscored by more victories than any other coach or program over the last 10 seasons, more Final Four appearances, a record number of NBA Draft picks, and the 2012 national championship, John Calipari was named the College Basketball Coach of the Decade by Sporting News in January.

In a piece penned by national writer Mike DeCourcy, Sporting News credits Calipari for changing the college basketball landscape. Detailing Calipari's success -- what DeCourcy described as a "college basketball revolution" -- DeCourcy wrote that "no one defined the 2010s in the same way as Calipari ... nor achieved the same degree of consistent success."

In an era where kids can enter the NBA Draft at 19 years old, Calipari masterfully balanced the priority of players' long-term professional dreams with individual and team development, leading to on-court success that no other team has matched the last decade.

"I knew we were going to make the program -- and I said it at the press conference -- it was going to be a players-first program," Calipari told Sporting News. "We were going to make decisions based on them and their needs. And it's not just about the name on the front. It'll be about the name on the back. That's how we're going to do this."

### First-Ballot Hall of Famer

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in September 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on the first ballot.

Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate honors in the sport. The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Bevetta, Wildcat Louie Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and JoJo White.

### Moving Up the Kentucky Career Wins, Games Coached List

With an 80-53 victory vs. Auburn on Feb. 23, 2019, John Calipari moved past Joe B. Hall for the second-most wins in program history. Calipari trails only the legendary Adolph Rupp (876 wins) for the most wins at UK and earned win No. 300 at Ole Miss on March 5, 2019. When Calipari tied Hall with his 297th win at Missouri on Feb. 19, 2019, he did so 32 games faster than Hall and just two games slower than Rupp.

Although he's still climbing the charts, he's doing it nearly as fast as anyone else in NCAA history. With the win over Ole Miss, Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 300 wins (369 games) at one program in NCAA history. Only Bill Self (358 games at Kansas), Claire Bee (359 games at Long Island) and Rupp (366 at UK) got there faster.

Calipari recently passed Hall for the second-most coached games at UK. Hall's 13-year career with the Wildcats ended with his 397th game. Calipari and Kentucky's win over Mississippi State on Feb. 4 marked his 398th career game at the UK helm. Rupp is obviously first in games coached with a 41-season tenure spanning 1,066 career games.

### 700 Victories and Counting

With Kentucky's win over UIC on Nov. 26, 2017, John Calipari reached 700 on-court wins. At the time he was one of just 41 coaches, regardless of NCAA level of classification, to reach that barrier. Only 29 coaches have done it with at least 10 seasons at the Division I level.

Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 700 on-court wins ever. Only Adolph Rupp (836 games), Jerry Tarkanian (876 games) and Roy Williams (879 games) did it faster.

Calipari is currently the only coach in NCAA history with at least 189 victories at three different schools.

## ON PACE WITH THE BARON OF THE BLUEGRASS

Legendary coach Adolph Rupp won 876 career games while he was the coach of UK. He also led Kentucky to four NCAA titles during his 41-year tenure. John Calipari is just behind pace with Rupp to begin his career at UK in total victories. Calipari (.811) is slightly behind Rupp (.822) in total UK career winning percentage.

## Calipari Unrivaled in Conference

John Calipari has won 16 league regular-season championships (including six Southeastern Conference titles) eight more than the next-closest coach in the SEC (Bruce Pearl has eight). Calipari has won six SEC Tournament championships at Kentucky and owns 15 conference tournament titles in his career, 11 more than his closest competitors (Ben Howland, Kermit Davis).

Calipari has tallied a 359-107 (.770) all-time record within conference play as a head coach and owns a 151-41 (.786) record since joining the SEC. In his 11 seasons at UK, his 151 total conference wins are tied for the most among Division I coaches since 1996-97 over their first 11 seasons with a program, while his winning percentage ranks third. Only Adolph Rupp (.847) had a better winning percentage through his first 11 seasons in league play in Kentucky's history.

Although he's been publicly outspoken against conference tournaments -- only because he doesn't favor playing three or more games on consecutive days to win the tournament -- his teams have gotten up for them. Calipari's teams at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky have been to 19 conference championship games in his 28-year career, winning a remarkable 15 of them. Calipari is 57-12 (.826) all-time in conference tournaments, including 23-4 (.852) at UK. Calipari ranks fourth in SEC Tournament wins.

## Calipari in Elite Company with Conference Championships

Kentucky men's basketball coach John Calipari added another first to his Hall of Fame career in 2017.

When Kentucky clinched at least a share of the 2017 Southeastern Conference championship by beating Vanderbilt on Feb. 28, 2017, he made history as a head coach. Calipari became the first NCAA Division I coach to lead three different programs (UMass, Memphis, Kentucky) to five on-court regular-season league titles five different times. He won the Atlantic 10 at the helm of UMass in 1992, 93, 94, 95 and 96. Memphis claimed the Conference USA crown in 2004, 06, 07, 08 and 09. Kentucky has captured the SEC five times in 2010, 12, 15, 16 and 17.

Perhaps more impressive is that Calipari has 31 combined regular-season and tournament championships after clinching the SEC regular-season crown in 2020. That trails only Mark Few of Gonzaga (35 titles) among all active coaches. All-time, Calipari trails only the great Adolph Rupp (41) and Few.

## 30 is the new 20

After defeating Ole Miss 67-62 on Feb. 15, John Calipari secured his 26th consecutive on-court 20-win season. He leads all active coaches with that streak, ahead of Mike Krzyzewski (24), Bill Self (22) and Mark Few (21) who all hit the plateau this season as well.

# COACH CALIPARI

With a Sweet 16 win over Houston in the 2019 NCAA Tournament, Calipari and the Cats clinched a 30-win season for the fifth time as UK's head coach. Calipari has 11 seasons with 30 or more on-court wins. Only Krzyzewski (15) and Roy Williams (12) have more 30-win seasons as an active head coach. Calipari is the first coach in NCAA Division I history to record five straight on-court 30-win seasons, notching 30 wins in consecutive seasons from 2005-06 to 2009-10.

## There's No Place Like Home

Since his 1991-92 season at UMass, John Calipari-coached teams have posted a 392-33 (.922) record at home. At UK, Coach Cal is 183-11 (.943) in Rupp Arena.

In five of Calipari's 11 seasons at Kentucky, the Wildcats have posted an undefeated record at home, including a school-record 19-0 mark during the 2014-15 season.

Calipari owns both of UK's longest winning streaks in the arena. He began his career at UK with a 54-game winning streak at Rupp Arena. It was the longest winning streak since the arena opened in 1976. With a win over Georgia on Feb. 9, 2016, he secured the second-longest streak in the storied building at 34 games (which ended at 42).

## Life Away From Home Isn't So Bad Either

As good as John Calipari's team's have been at home, they're pretty good in hostile environments on the road. Dating back to the 2005-06 season, Calipari has recorded a 108-47 (.697) record on the road. At neutral-site venues, Kentucky is 78-23 (.772) under Calipari.

## Calipari at No. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking.

Calipari has led seven of his 11 UK teams to the No. 1 ranking and eight of his last 13 teams to the top (he's done it 10 times overall). When Coach Cal's teams are at the top, they're difficult to knock off:

- Calipari is 110-13 (.894) as the top-ranked Associated Press Top 25 coach in the country
- He's 69-8 (.896) when his team is atop the AP Top 25 as UK's head coach
- Calipari tallied a 32-4 mark at UMass at No. 1 and he was 9-1 at Memphis
- He (110) trails only Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (219) in active coaches with victories at No. 1
- Calipari has coached 123 career games as a No. 1 team, fourth most in NCAA history, trailing Krzyzewski (254), John Wooden (228) and Adolph Rupp (127)
- Among coaches who have owned a No. 1 ranking in at least 119 games, Calipari's winning percentage of .894 trails only Wooden (.952) and is ahead of active coach Krzyzewski (.862)
- Calipari is 6-4 vs. the AP top-ranked team in the land, including 3-2 at Kentucky after defeating Michigan State on Nov. 5
- According to ESPN, his .600 winning percentage against the No. 1 ranked team is the best for any head coach

## The Success Rate

John Calipari has graduated 100% of the players (20 of 20) who have been eligible to receive their diploma by the end of their senior years and exhausted their athletic eligibility. Of that group, Brad Calipari, Patrick Patterson, Jarrod Polson and Alex Poythress completed their degrees in three years.

In the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, which measures eligibility, retention and graduation, Kentucky has posted a single-year Academic Progress Rate of .977 or higher in every season under Calipari, including a perfect 1,000 in the last six single-year reports. UK's four-year composite score in the most recent report, which was released in May 2019, was a 1,000, earning the team an NCAA academic award for the fifth year in a row for finishing in the top 10% of Division I men's basketball programs.

## Dream Maker

As someone who prides himself on helping young men reach their dreams, John Calipari has helped 49 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his college coaching career, including 38 in his first 10 seasons at Kentucky, more than any other coach.

- Four No. 1 overall selections (Derrick Rose, John Wall, Anthony Davis and Karl-Anthony Towns) during the nine drafts from 2008 to 2016. No other coach has more than three No. 1 picks
- In 2010, five of his UK players were selected in the first round for the first time in NBA history
- His six players in the 2012 and 2015 NBA drafts are the most in the two-round era
- Churned out 38 NBA Draft picks, 29 first-rounders, three No. 1 selections, seven top-five picks and 21 lottery picks at Kentucky
- Of the 60 players who have finished their college careers at Kentucky under Calipari (through the 2018-19 season), 38 have been selected in the NBA Draft, a 63.3% success rate. Another six of those made the NBA, and the majority of the rest were walk-ons
- Of the 27 players at UK who have declared for the NBA Draft after their freshman seasons, 25 have been first-round picks. All 27 have played a game in the NBA. He is 29 for 31 in that regard when including his players from Memphis
- Only coach to produce the top two picks in the same draft (2012 - Anthony Davis and Michael Kidd-Gilchrist)
- Produced a top-10 pick in 12 straight drafts since 2008, the only school to do so during that time period
- Seven of his former players have been named NBA All-Stars (23 total), five have been tabbed All-NBA, three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year, and 12 players from Calipari's first nine teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams. Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011 and Anthony Davis won NBA All-Star MVP honors in 2017

## Developing Talent

John Calipari hasn't just signed the best talent in the country while he's been at Kentucky; he's been the best at developing that talent and getting it ready for the next level.

Of the 35 top-25 Rivals.com players Kentucky has signed and have completed their college eligibility at UK, 30 were drafted and 24 were selected in the first round. But that's only half the story. Calipari's players don't just make it to the pros; they're better prepared than anyone else. The proof is in the numbers.

Over the course of his career, Calipari's 50-plus NBA pros have amassed more than \$2.26 billion in NBA contracts, which

doesn't include endorsement deals and overseas contracts. Of his UK players in the NBA, they've earned just shy of \$1.9 billion in guaranteed contracts.

There's more: Of UK's 21 lottery picks in the Calipari era, 14 have earned second contracts in the NBA with seven of them cashing in on max contracts. Of the seven who haven't earned contracts, all have been drafted in the last three years and are still on their rookie deal. Over the last 10 years, there have been 22 lottery picks who earned max contracts in the NBA. Seven of them attended Kentucky.

## Double-Digit Win Streaks

John Calipari's teams have posted 19 streaks of 10 or more wins at Kentucky, Memphis and UMass, including seven at UK. They have won 15 or more straight games nine times, 20 or more six times, 25 or more five times, and 30 or more one time. Of course, the most famous streak was the 38-0 start during the 2014-15 season.

# COACH CALIPARI

A “players-first” coach with a penchant for helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, has guided six teams to the Final Four, led one to a national championship and helped 49 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his 28-year college coaching career.

Calipari guided Kentucky to its eighth national championship and his first national title in 2012. In becoming only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four, he has racked up nearly 800 on-court victories, 20 NCAA Tournament on-court appearances, six Final Fours and numerous national coach of the year honors.

From UMass to Memphis and now Kentucky, Calipari’s career has been successful throughout, but his most recent run in Lexington has been the best stretch of his career. During Calipari’s first 11 seasons at UK, he’s led all coaches in NCAA Tournament wins (31), Final Fours (four), Elite Eights (seven) and Sweet 16s (eight). He’s in the top three in total wins (330) in that time span.

In 2015, Coach Cal led college basketball’s first ever 38-0 team, and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of the season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

While building a program out of obscurity at Massachusetts, laying the foundation at Memphis and restoring luster at the sport’s greatest program at Kentucky, he totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

Quite honestly, though, Calipari’s on-court success overshadows a much more significant picture.

In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped more than 50 young men realize their dreams and reach the NBA level with 49 players earning NBA Draft selections, including a record five first-round draft picks in 2010. Two years later, six Wildcats heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. UK, with Calipari’s help, would tie those six picks again in 2015, including a record-tying four lottery selections. His four No. 1 overall picks are more than any other coach, and he’s had 38 players drafted during his first 10 years at Kentucky, including 29 first-round picks.

Calipari’s players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 23 All-Star selections, with Anthony Davis winning the game’s MVP honor in 2017. Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011. Five of his players have been tabbed All-NBA, three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year, and 12 players from Calipari’s first nine teams at Kentucky have made the NBA All-Rookie teams.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80%, Calipari has stressed academics. Fifteen of his last 18 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor’s degrees, and all 18 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including four players who earned their degree in just three years. Calipari’s teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point average of 3.0 or better.

Calipari has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need in the Commonwealth and beyond. He has had a particular passion to assist those impacted by natural disasters. For instance, in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, and in 2017, for victims of Hurricane Harvey.

Calipari launched his foundation in 2012, and since then the foundation has worked with several key partners and donated more than \$1.5 million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men’s U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller “Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out,” Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that “it’s never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it’s about how high you bounce back.”






