STORYLINES

- BACK HOME: No. 18/17 Tennessee returns to Neyland Stadium for the first of back-to-back home contests beginning with Kentucky at noon ET Saturday on SEC Network. The Vols have won 17 straight against the Wildcats in Neyland Stadium, a streak that dates back to 1986. Gameday seating will be at approximately 25 percent of the venue's full capacity. Both of UT's home games this season have been noon kickoffs. The Vols host No. 2 Alabama next week at a time to be announced. Tennessee has won nine of its last 11 games dating back to last season with the losses coming to No. 1 Alabama (2019) and No. 3 Georgia (2020).
- NEYLAND STREAKING: The Vols carry a five-game home winning streak into the contest. UT has outscored opponents 154-60 in those five games with all five victories coming in double-digit fashion. The streak began Oct. 12 last season with a 20-10 win over Mississippi State. Opponents have managed only three touchdowns in the last 14 quarters in Neyland Stadium dating back to the South Carolina contest on Oct. 26. 2019 (1 by UAB in 4Q. 1 by Vandy in 4Q. 1 by Mizzou in 3Q). The Vols have not surrendered a first-half touchdown in their last three home games. Offensively, UT has put up at least 28 points in its last four home contests. Jeremy Pruitt owns a 10-6 record as a head coach in Neyland Stadium.
- BOUNCING BACK: Tennessee saw its then-Power-5 and SEC-best winning streak come to an end at eight games with a 44-21 loss at No. 3 Georgia last Saturday in Athens. The streak finished as UT's secondlongest since the 1998 national championship season (won 11 in a row 2015-16). Behind a dramatic goal-line stand as time expired in the second quarter and a fumble recovery for a touchdown by Kivon Bennett on the first series, the Vols took a 21-17 lead into halftime. However, Georgia outscored UT 27-0 in the second half. Josh Palmer hauled in two touchdowns, a 36- and a 27-yarder from Jarrett Guarantano in the second quarter. UT has won its last two games following a loss under Jeremy Pruitt.
- YEAR 3 PRUITT ERA: Head coach Jeremy Pruitt is in his third season at the helm after orchestrating the Vols' turnaround in 2019 that included six straight wins and a TaxSlayer Gator Bowl win over Indiana. Pruitt, a five-time national champion assistant, owns a 15-13 mark overall and a 9-10 record in SEC play. Pruitt is the 26th head coach in UT history. On Sept. 24, 2020, UT announced a contract extension with Pruitt through the 2025 season. Pruitt has coached 59 NFL Draft selections, including 16 first-round picks and 22 All-Americans. He guided the nation's No. 1 defense in 2017, 2016 and 2013. He signed a top-10 recruiting class for the Vols in the spring of 2020, and UT currently has the sixth-best class nationally for 2021. The 2020 season is the 13th year for Pruitt coaching in the SEC. Pruitt led the Vols to a 5-3 record in SEC play in 2019, representing the program's first above .500 mark in conference games since going 5-3 in 2015.
- TO'O TO'O THE LEADER OF THE DEFENSE: After a freshman All-America campaign, So. LB Henry To'o To'o is the leader of the Vol defense in 2020. To'o To'o is tops on the squad in tackles with 23, including a careerbest 11 last week at No. 3 Georgia. Two of those 11 were TFLs. He ranks 15th in the SEC in tackles. In the season-opening win at South Carolina, he recorded his first career interception and returned it 32 yards for a touchdown. He is one of four FBS linebackers with a pick six this season. To'o To'o ranked second among SEC freshmen last season with 72 tackles, a mark that also ranked fourth among FBS freshmen.
- TURNOVER MARGIN: Tennessee owns a +2 turnover margin this season, which ranks third in the SEC and 20th in the FBS. The Vols have forced five turnovers through three games (three fumbles, two interceptions).

MEDIA INFORMATION

In response to the global COVID-19 pandemic, the Southeastern Conference and the University of Tennessee have adopted several new policies and restrictions related to in-person media coverage of Tennessee football games this fall. Press box seating will be limited to no more than 50 percent of capacity, sideline access will be restricted and the field-level media center will be closed. These changes, guided by public health authorities and CDC recommendations, mean that some outlets that have previously been approved for credentials may not receive access this fall. All credentials will be issued on a single-game basis for Tennessee home games. Our hope is that the current restrictions are only required for one season and that we can return to our traditional credentialing/ media access procedures in the fall of 2021.

COACH PRUITT MEDIA INTERVIEWS

- MONDAY: Coach Pruitt's weekly press conference will be held every Monday of game week at noon ET via Zoom. A Zoom link will be distributed to media. It will also be streamed live on SEC Network+, utsports.com and the UT Athletics YouTube page.
- WEDNESDAY: Coach Pruitt takes part in the weekly SEC Teleconference each Wednesday at 11:50 a.m. ET. Media representatives should contact the SEC for a confidential phone number.
- WEDNESDAY: Coach Pruitt will meet with media members via Zoom following Wednesday's practice as well. A Zoom link will be distributed to media.
- POSTGAME: All SEC postgame press conferences this season will be held via Zoom. A link will be distributed to media

STUDENT-ATHLETE MEDIA INTERVIEWS

- MONDAY or TUESDAY: Tennessee student-athletes will be available via Zoom at approximately 1 p.m. ET on either Monday or Tuesdays depending on the practice schedule for that respective week. A link will be distributed to media.
- POSTGAME: All SEC postgame press conferences this season will be held via Zoom. A link will be distributed to media.
- Media are NOT permitted to contact student-athletes on their own at any time. This includes phone, email, text or through social media platforms. Studentathletes' contact information will not be given out.

PRACTICE COVERAGE

- Due to COVID-19, all practices during the 2020 regular season will be closed to media. The media workroom in the Tennessee Athletic Communications office will also be closed.
- · Photos and footage will be distributed to media for select practices during game week.

NEYLAND GAME DAY INFORMATION

- Media in attendance will be required to wear a face
- All individuals credentialed for any 2020 Tennessee football home game will receive an electronic health questionnaire email via Sports Systems within 48 hours of kickoff. This questionnaire must be completed before arriving on campus. In the event the individual credentialed for the contest becomes ill or is a "close contact" to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, the outlet should contact Kimberly Hood (khood3@utk.edu, 865-974-1211) as soon as possible to arrange for a substitute credentialed representative.
- All credentials and parking passes must be picked up on gameday at the Anderson Training Center loading dock on the north side of Chamique Holdsclaw Drive. Credential pickup will begin 2.5 hours before kickoff. Media should wait in their vehicles along the curb for a medical representative from UT's College of Nursing to conduct a no-contact temperature check. Once cleared (by registering a temperature of 100.3 or lower), the media member will receive their credential and parking pass and can then proceed to their assigned parking location.
- Media will enter the press box through Gate 15A. This new media entrance is located approximately 10 yards north of the traditional media gate. The

press box will open to media starting two hours and 15 minutes before kickoff.

- With the exception of one pool photographer and one pool videographer, there will be no field-level access for external media outlets this fall. The fieldlevel Stokely Family Media Center will be closed to media, and sideline access will be restricted to personnel from each competing school, network TV personnel and the two pool shooters.
- Press box seating will be limited to 50 percent of normal capacity. Seating will be physically distanced (using every other seat) and chairs at unassigned seats will be removed.
- There will be no meals served in the press box this season. A small selection of individually wrapped snacks and bottled beverages will be provided. This season only, security and bag-check personnel will permit media to enter Gate 15A with food and drink (beverages must have an unbroken seal).
- With the exception of flip cards, all media materials will be available digitally in accordance with FWAA recommendations. This includes in-game stats, game notes and final books.
- Photo and video content, representative of both teams, will be provided to media members (including outlets that are not approved for credentials) to assist with remote coverage via a centralized FTP site managed by the SEC.

NOTING THE TENNESSEE-KENTUCKY SERIES

- Tennessee leads the all-time series, 81-25-9, as the two teams will be meeting for the 77th consecutive season dating back to 1944. The Vols have played (116 times) and beaten Kentucky (81 times) more than any other opponent.
- The Vols have won 17 straight over the Wildcats in Neyland Stadium and own a 43-10-6 mark all-time in Knoxville against UK.
- The last time Kentucky won in Knoxville was Nov. 24, 1984, by a score of 17-12 in what was Johnny Majors' eighth season as UT head coach.
- Tennessee has claimed 33 out of the last 35 meetings between the two since that 1984 contest. UK's only wins during that time happened in 2011 and 2017 - both in Lexington.
- Jeremy Pruitt owns a 2-0 record as a head coach against Kentucky, including a 24-7 win over a ranked Wildcats team in his debut season of 2018 in Knoxville.

TENNESSEE-KENTUCKY CONNECTIONS

- Three members of the Vols' on-field staff have served as assistant coaches at Kentucky.
- Tennessee assistant head coach/passing game coordinator/WRs coach Tee Martin was the Wildcats' wide receivers coach in 2010 and 2011. In 2011, he also served as their passing game coordinator.
- UT defensive coordinator **Derrick Ansley** coached defensive backs at Kentucky on Mark Stoops' staff from 2013-15.
- First-year UT defensive line coach and co-defensive coordinator Jimmy Brumbaugh coached four seasons in the same role on Mark Stoops' UK staff from 2013-16. Brumbaugh coached the likes of NFL performers Bud Dupree and Za'Darius Smith. Both Ansley and Brumbaugh coached at Kentucky together for three seasons. Second-Half Surge, Goal-Line Stand Lead Vols Past Kentucky, 17-13

LEXINGTON, Ky. – A goal-line stand on fourth-and-goal by the Tennessee defense sealed a 17-13 victory over Kentucky at Kroger Field on Saturday night.

"Well, from the reality of it, it means we're 5-5, which is exactly where we were this time last year," head coach Jeremy Pruitt said. "We didn't finish the way we wanted to finish, they know that. I'm happy for these guys. They've been tremendous leaders. I'm glad to see them have some success."

After Tennessee stifled three consecutive Wildcat runs from inside the 6-yard line, Kentucky quarterback Lynn Bowden Jr. ran for the end zone on fourth down and was stopped by the Vols' Daniel Bituli and **Ja'Quain Blakely** with 1:17 remaining.

When the Vols got the ball back, redshirt junior quarterback **Jarrett Guarantano** put the game away with a 10-yard run on third-and-four to allow Tennessee to run the clock out.

Led by Guarantano, Tennessee came back from a 13-0 first-half deficit to win. It was the largest deficit that a UT team has overcome to win since Sept. 4, 2017 against Georgia Tech. Guarantano came off the bench to start the second half under center and engineered back-to- back touchdown drives in the third quarter, completing his first seven passes in the process.

Marquez Callaway collected 104 yards and one touchdown through the air, his third 100-yard receiving game of the season. Josh Palmer had a season-high-tying 55 receiving yards and caught his first touchdown of the season, a spectacular 12-yarder in the third quarter that proved to be the game-winning score.

The Tennessee defense held the Wildcats to 327 yards of total offense and 25 yards passing, while collecting a pair of sacks and an interception. Daniel Bituli led all players in tackles, tallying a season-high 19 stops.

SEASON NO. 124

- The 2020 season marks the 124th football season in Tennessee history.
- Tennessee's all-time record is 848-396-53 (.674), which puts the Vols ninth nationally and second in the SEC in all-time victories. With its win against Missouri on Oct. 3, UT surpassed Southern Cal for ninth all-time
- For the first time in program history, the Vols are playing 10 conference games in a season. They host five SEC teams for the first time since 1959.
- Four of UT's 10 opponents are currently ranked in the top 20 of the Coaches poll.
- The original schedule prior to COVID-19 called for Oct. 17 to serve as the Vols' open week.

POLLING: SIX STRAIGHT WEEKS RANKED

- Tennessee is ranked for the sixth consecutive week, coming in at No. 17 in the Amway Coaches poll and No. 18 in the Associated Press Top 25 on Oct. 11. That is the program's longest streak since it opened the 2016 season ranked for eight consecutive weeks.
- The Vols opened the season ranked in the AP Top 25 for the 42nd time in their history. That mark ranks 10th all-time nationally and second in the SEC.
- Including the Oct. 11 poll, Tennessee has made 588 appearances in the AP Top 25, which ranks 14th all-time nationally.
- UT owns a 2-1 record as a ranked team under head coach Jeremy Pruitt.

DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS LEAD NATION

- Tennessee already owns two defensive touchdowns this season, which is tied for the SEC and national lead.
 The Vols are one of seven programs with multiple defensive scores this year, joining Georgia, Texas Tech,
 Army, Syracuse, Tulane and Wake Forest.
- LB **Henry To'o To'o** had a 32-yard pick six in Week 1 at South Carolina, while LB/edge **Kivon Bennett** recovered a fumble in the end zone at Georgia in Week 3.
- Tennessee has produced five defensive touchdowns (three pick sixes and two fumble returns) in the **Jeremy Pruitt** era (since 2018):

FIVE DEFENSIVE TAKEAWAYS

- A point of emphasis this offseason by Jeremy Pruitt's defensive unit was forcing more turnovers. Through
 three games, the Vols have done just that with five, which ranks fifth in the SEC. Two of those five were
 defensive touchdowns. UT has recorded three fumbles gained and two interceptions.
- Tennessee has won the turnover battle in two of three games this season and is 2-0 when doing so (South Carolina +2, Missouri +1).
- With the fumble recovery at Georgia in Week 3, Tennessee has now forced at least one turnover in three straight games. In the 28 games under **Jeremy Pruitt**, the Vols have forced a turnover in 20 of those.

CIMAGLIA IN THE RECORD BOOKS

- Brent Cimaglia enters his senior season as a consensus preseason first-team All-SEC selection and candidate for the Lou Groza Award. He finished his junior season with second-team All-SEC honors by the league's coaches.
- Cimaglia ranks second in Tennessee history in field goal percentage at 75.0 percent (42-of-56) (min. 25 made). He is also a perfect 81-of-81 on extra points.
- Cimaglia ranks 11th nationally in career field goals made (42) among active FBS players.
- Cimaglia made 23 field goals last season, which tied for the third-most made field goals in a single season in program history. He is 1-of-3 in 2020.
- Cimaglia has made 13 of his last 18 field goal attempts of 40 or more yards dating back to the end of the 2018 season. He has made three field goals of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 53-yarder against UAB on Nov. 2. 2019.
- For his career, Cimaglia's 42 career made field goals ranks eighth in school history, nine shy of sixth place.

JG IN THE RECORD BOOKS

- Redshirt senior QB Jarrett Guarantano made his 28th career start against Georgia in Week 3. He surpassed Jimmy Streater (1977-79) for eighth in program history in career starts and is three starts shy of seventh place held by Andy Kelly (1998-91).
- Through three games this season, Guarantano has rushed for a touchdown and passed for a touchdown in the same game in two of those (South Carolina, Missouri). He became the first Vol to achieve that feat since Joshua Dobbs did so in back-to-back games vs. Kentucky (Nov. 12) and Missouri (Nov. 19) in 2016. It's the first time in Guarantano's career that he has rushed for a touchdown and passed for a touchdown in the same game.
- Guarantano ranks sixth in program history for career completion percentage with a 61.0 percent rate, coming in just outside of the top five behind Joshua Dobbs.
- Guarantano also ranks eighth in program history in career passing yards with 5,726. He is 141 yards shy
- Guarantano heads into Week 4's Kentucky game with 5,633 yards of total offense, which ranks eighth in UT history.
- · Guarantano has tossed only 14 interceptions in 732 career attempts and his 1.93 interception percentage is the lowest in school history (min. 400 attempts). Guarantano saw a streak of 80 consecutive passes without an interception end with a pick on the second drive of the third quarter at Georgia on Oct. 10.
- Guarantano has accounted for 40 touchdowns in his career 36 passing and four rushing.

- With his two touchdown passes at Georgia in Week 3, he joined three other Vols in a tie for sixth place in UT career touchdown passes with 36.
- In the season-opener at South Carolina, Guarantano became the eighth player in Tennessee history to go over 400 completions in a career. He enters the Kentucky game with 447.

BEST 1-2 RB PUNCH IN SEC?

- Through three weeks of the SEC season, Sr. Ty Chandler and So. Eric Gray have made a case as the best 1-2 running back tandem in the SEC. UT is the one of three schools with two running backs in the SEC's top 12 of rushing yards per game.
- · Chandler ranks ninth in the SEC at 62.3 yards per game rushing. With his 103 all-purpose yards against Missouri, Chandler moved into 10th place on UT's career all-purpose yards list, surpassing Peerless Price (1995-98). Chandler enters the Kentucky game with 2,953 all-purpose yards, 47 yards shy of becoming the 10th Vol to go over 3,000 in a career. He is 50 yards shy of tying Cedric Houston (2001-04) for ninth place.
- Gray has been spectacular in his last five games dating back to 2019. During that span he has combined for seven total touchdowns - six rushing and one receiving - and 502 total rush yards. He is averaging 100.4 yards per game on the ground in the last five games.
- · Gray went over the 100-yard rushing mark for the second time in his career with 105 yards in the win against Missouri on Oct. 3. He rushed for a touchdown and caught a touchdown vs. the Tigers, becoming the first Vol to achieve that feat in the same game since Alvin Kamara did so on Nov. 26, 2016.
- Gray owns a rushing touchdown in four out of his last five games. He became the first UT player to record a rushing TD in four straight games since QB Joshua Dobbs in 2016 (Sept. 10 - Oct. 1).

DEANDRE JOHNSON SEC DEFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK (SEPT. 30)

- · After a career-best performance in the season-opening win at South Carolina, Sr. linebacker/edge rusher **Deandre Johnson** captured SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors.
- · Johnson finished with a career-high six tackles, a career-best 2.5 sacks for a loss of 11 yards and one forced fumble. The 2.5 sacks led all SEC players in Week 1 and were the most by a Vol since Darrell Taylor had four against Kentucky on Nov. 10, 2018. Johnson's forced fumble in the second guarter stalled a Gamecocks drive. Two of his sacks came on third down, including a critical one in the fourth guarter. The 2.5 sacks were also the most by a Vol in a season-opener since 2007.
- · Johnson was the first Vol to earn SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors since Kyle Phillips did so on Oct. 15, 2018.

NOTEBOOK

Through three weeks of SEC play, Johnson leads the SEC in sacks with 3.5.
He added another in the Missouri win in Week 2, which is one better than
the second place of Azeez Ojulari (UGA), Kingsley Enagbare (SC) and Trajan
Jeffcoat (MU). For his career, Johnson owns nine career sacks for a loss of
53 yards.

16 MAKE DEBUT, 13 TRUE FRESHMEN IN 2020

- Newcomers and true freshmen seeing action early is a common theme in the Jeremy Pruitt era. A total of 16 Vols have made their debut this season, including 13 true freshmen (7 offensive players, 5 defensive players, 1 specialist).
- A total of 14 made their debut in the season-opener against South Carolina, including 12 true freshmen. The opener debuts included: Fr. WR Jimmy Calloway, Fr. WR Jimmy Holiday, Fr. WR Jalin Hyatt, Fr. RB Jabari Small (on special teams coverage), Fr. OL Cooper Mays, Fr. OL Javontez Spraggins, Fr. LS Will Albright, Fr. LB Tyler Baron, Fr. LB Morven Joseph, Fr. DB Key Lawrence, Fr. DB Doneiko Slaughter, Fr. DL Omari Thomas, WR/RS Velus Jones Jr. and So. LS Matthew Salansky.
- In the last two season-openers, a combined 20 Vol true freshmen have seen action.
- Two other Vols made their debuts in the home opener against Missouri on Oct. 3, including Jr. OL Cade Mays, who started at right tackle, and Fr. WR Malachi Wideman. Mays was ruled eligible by the SEC earlier that week.

EIGHT FIRST-TIME STARTERS IN 2020

- In the season-opening win at South Carolina, a total of five Vols earned their
 first career starts two on offense and three on defense. So. WR Ramel
 Keyton, R-Jr. TE Princeton Fant, R-Jr. LB Kivon Bennett, R-Fr. DL Elijah
 Simmons and Fr. S Doneiko Slaughter all made their first career starts on
 Sept. 26.
- A week later in a 35-12 win over Missouri on Oct. 3, Jr. OL Cade Mays got the start at right tackle in his UT debut, while R-So. Jacob Warren made his first start at tight end.
- During a week 3 loss at No. 3 Georgia on Oct. 10, WR Cedric Tillman made his first career start.

GRAD TRANSFER VELUS JONES JR. IMPACT

- In the spring of 2020, grad transfer wide receiver/return specialist Velus
 Jones Jr. enrolled at Tennessee after four seasons at Southern Cal. UT
 Assistant Head Coach and former USC assistant Tee Martin recruited Jones
 and coached him for three seasons with the Trojans.
- Jones Jr. made his Tennessee debut at South Carolina on Sept. 26, logging five catches for 29 yards and returning two kickoffs for 66 yards, including a 40-yarder that put him over 2,000 return yards for his career.
- Jones Jr. finished his USC career second all-time in school history in kickoff return yards with 1,947, just 194 shy of the USC record.
- Jones Jr. racked up 63 yards in kickoff returns at Georgia on Oct. 10, including a 31-yarder. He enters Week 4 vs. Kentucky with 2,076 career kickoff return yards, which ranks third among active FBS players.

PLAYCALLING CONTINUITY

Tennessee returns both of its playcallers in 2020. Offensive coordinator
 Jim Chaney returned to Rocky Top last season, while defensive coordinator
 Derrick Ansley begins his third season during his second stint with the
 program. Chaney, who is in his 35th year coaching, improved the Vols' total
 offense, passing yards, rushing, scoring offense, third down conversions and
 turnover margin in 2019. Ansley's 2019 Vol defense was exceptional, allowing
 only 334.5 yards per game – their best mark in a decade and finishing in the
 top 25 nationally.

MAYS, GARLAND BROTHERS

Knoxville natives Cade Mays and Cooper Mays will see action together
on the offensive line this season, continuing a family legacy of Vols. Cade
and Cooper's father, Kevin, was an All-American SEC guard and offensive
captain on the Vols' 1994 squad. Both Cade and Cooper prepped at Knoxville
Catholic where they played together in high school.

- Cade Mays' waiver was approved and he was granted eligibility by the SEC on Sept. 30. Mays' waiver was approved by the NCAA on Sept. 17. Mays made his UT debut as the starting right tackle two days after the SEC cleared him against Missouri on Oct. 10. He started at right guard in Week 3 in his return to Georgia.
- During his college career, including his two seasons at Georgia, he has started 21 games - two at left tackle, two at left guard, 13 at right guard and three at right tackle. Mays' last start at Georgia was at left tackle in the Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1, 2020. Cade was selected as a second-team preseason All-American by the Sporting News, and he is a candidate for the Outland Trophy.
- Kurott Garland and Kwauze Garland are also brothers on the same Vol team
 this season. Kurott has played in 20 career games, while Kwauze has played
 in three contests.

LIMITING BIG PLAYS

- A hallmark of Jeremy Pruitt defenses is limiting big plays. In the last three seasons combined (including three games of 2020), Tennessee has allowed only 34 plays of 30+ yards, which is the third fewest in the FBS behind only Washington (23) and Georgia (32).
- The Vols led the nation in fewest 30+ yard plays allowed a year ago with 10. In the five seasons prior to Pruitt's tenure, UT allowed 137 and ranked 72nd in the FBS during that span.
- Tennessee also ranks fifth nationally since 2018 in fewest 40+ yard plays allowed with 17 behind Washington (8), Wyoming (14), Kentucky (15) and Mississippi State (16).

STOUT OFFENSIVE LINE

- Tennessee's offensive line is one of the elite units in the country led by preseason All-Americans Sr. Trey Smith and Jr. Cade Mays.
- Looking the part: A total of 13 Vol offensive linemen come in at over 310 pounds.
- Experience: The entire offensive line has combined for 131 career starts (includes the 18 starts made by **Cade Mays** at Georgia).
- Four players on the offensive line were five-star prospects coming out of high school, including starting So. LT Wanya Morris, starting Sr. LG Trey Smith, So. tackle Darnell Wright and Jr. starting RT Cade Mays.
- Four players on the offensive line were once freshman All-America selections during their careers (Trey Smith, Wanya Morris, Cade Mays, Darnell Wright).
- ESPN and SEC Network's Cole Cubelic rated Tennessee's unit as one of the top five offensive lines in the country heading into the 2020 season.
- Trey Smith elected to return for his senior season and is listed among the top offensive line prospects for the 2021 NFL Draft. Smith has started 34 career games and did not allow a sack all of last season.
- Sr. C **Brandon Kennedy** is one of two SEC transfers on the offensive line. Kennedy played at Alabama before graduating and joining the Vols where he has served as UT's starting center the last two seasons. Kennedy is on pace to earn three degrees during his collegiate career.

NOTEBOOK

FOURTH-DOWN SUCCESS

- During a 35-12 win over Missouri on Oct. 3, Tennessee was a perfect 4-of-4
 on fourth down on the day. Head coach Jeremy Pruitt after the game stated,
 "It's got to be a mindset. I talked to our team about it. We are not living in
 fear. We are sure not going to play in fear or coach in fear."
- The 4-of-4 on fourth down represented the first time since Sept. 21, 2002 (vs. Florida, 4-of-6), that the Vols converted four or more fourth downs in a game.
- The Vols once again experienced success on fourth down at No. 3 Georgia in Week 3, converting 2-of-3.
- For the season, Tennessee is 6-of-8 on fourth down for 75 percent, which ranks 10th in the FBS and third in the SEC. The six conversions lead the SEC.
- The Vols were 2-of-12 (16.7 percent) on fourth down during the entire 2019 season and 5-of-11 (45.5 percent) in 2018 under Pruitt.

PALMER SHINING IN SENIOR SEASON

- One of the biggest question marks entering the 2020 season was how would Tennessee replace the production of wide receivers Jauan Jennings (San Francisco 49ers) and Marquez Callaway (New Orleans Saints), who went onto NFL careers? That question has been answered through three games led by the outstanding play of senior Josh Palmer.
- The 6-foot-2 Palmer leads the Vols in catches (14), receiving yards (227) and receiving touchdowns (3). He ranks fifth in the SEC in TD catches. Palmer had three touchdowns during his first three seasons combined (2017-19).
- Palmer produced the first multi-touchdown game of his career with two spectacular catches at No. 3 Georgia on Oct. 10 - both coming in the second quarter. He went up and hauled in a 36-yarder from Jarrett Guarantano that tied the game at 14 all and added another on the ensuing possession, a 27-yarder that gave the Vols the lead. Of his six career TD catches, three have come against Georgia.
- Palmer is a native of Brampton, Ontario, and is only the sixth Vol to earn a letter from Canada all time. Palmer, whose parents are of Jamaican descent, played his high school football at powerhouse St. Thomas Aquinas High School in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

Now in year three at the helm of Tennessee football, Jeremy Pruitt has proven that he is the man to get the proud program back to the top.

Pruitt's Volunteers authored one of the most impressive in-season turnarounds in the country in 2019, finishing the year with six consecutive victories and seven wins in their last eight games. After starting the season 1-4, Pruitt and Tennessee never blinked en route to an 8-5 overall mark and a 5-3 record in the Southeastern Conference. The Vols capped the season with a remarkable comeback to defeat Indiana, 23-22, in the 2020 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl, becoming the only team in the country to overcome a 13-point deficit in the final five minutes during the 2019 season.

Tennessee finished 23rd in the nation in total defense (334.5) - its best mark in 10 years - and ranked in the top 20 nationally in pass defense (194.0) and interceptions (15), while finishing third in the SEC in sacks (34). Pruitt's defense limited explosive plays as well as any team in the country. The Vols allowed only 10 plays of 30 yards or more in 2019, representing the fewest in the nation.

Tennessee improved by three wins following Pruitt's debut season in 2018 where he led the Vols to upset victories over ranked conference opponents Auburn, on the road, and Kentucky, at home.

Tennessee's quick turnaround under Pruitt comes as no surprise as he has found success at every stop of his career. During his college career as an assistant coach and head coach, Pruitt's teams have produced a 109-25 record, including a 13-12 mark in his two seasons as a head coach with the Vols.

Introduced as the 26th head coach in Tennessee football history on Dec. 7, 2017, Pruitt took the helm of the Vols after collecting five national championships as an assistant and cementing himself as the nation's top defensive coordinator during stints at Alabama (2016-17, 2007-12), Georgia (2014-15) and Florida State (2013).

Pruitt's recruiting prowess was evident during his time as an assistant and it's continued during his tenure as a head coach. The Vols signed a top 10 recruiting class in the spring of 2020 and built momentum toward an elite class for 2021.

VOLS IMPROVEMENT UNDER JEREMY PRUITT

Tennessee improved in nearly every statistical category under Jeremy Pruitt in 2019. Most notably, the Vols made dramatic improvements in total offense and total defense each season since 2017. The Vols also have made significant leaps in scoring, rushing, passing, third-down and in opponent scoring and rushing.

No. 16 Vols Topple South Carolina in Opener

No. 16 Tennessee found the end zone in all four guarters during a hard-fought road win over South Carolina at Williams-Brice Stadium. The Volunteers triumphed in seven straight games, dating to last season. A special teams mistake by South Carolina (0-1) in the game's closing moments secured the victory for UT (1-0), as true freshman Jimmy Holiday secured a muffed punt deep in Gamecocks territory. Tennessee's defense shined in the first half and earned the stops it needed in the second to help the Vols open the third season of UT head coach Jeremy Pruitt's tenure on a high note. Henry To'o To'o recorded his first career interception and returned it 32 yards down the sideline for a touchdown in the second quarter. The Vols withstood a third-quarter surge by Carolina, which authored back-to-back touchdown drives to tie the game at 21-21. But Tennessee never allowed its opponent to pull ahead through the final three quarters. Making his 26th career start, Vols' quarterback Jarrett Guarantano completed 19 of 31 passes for 259 yards and one touchdown. The senior graduate also rushed for 12 yards and one score. Guarantano delivered the huge offensive play of the game. With the game tied, it took just four plays and 75 yards when the senior found Josh Palmer for a 32-yard touchdown catch with 9:35 to play. Defensively, Bryce Thompson and Kenneth George Jr. registered a team-high eight tackles apiece. Edge rusher **Deandre Johnson** collected a career-best 2.5 sacks. Two of his sacks came on third down, including a critical one in the fourth quarter, as he earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors.

No. 20 Vols Rush Past Mizzou, 35-12

No. 21/20 Tennessee (2-0) rushed for four touchdowns and used a punishing defensive performance to extend its win streak to eight consecutive games following a 35-12 triumph over Missouri (0-2) on Saturday in Neyland Stadium. UT's eight-game win streak was the second-longest for the program since 1998, and the 23-point win is Tennessee's largest margin of victory over an SEC opponent since a 63-37 victory against Missouri on Nov. 9, 2016. Jarrett Guarantano made an impact for UT in both the passing and rushing game. The redshirt senior signal caller was an efficient 14-of-23 through the air for 190 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions. On the ground, he recorded his first-career game with multiple rushing touchdowns, finishing with two for the day. Sophomore running back Eric Gray was patient and explosive in the run game, rushing for 105 yards and a touchdown on 16 attempts—marking the second time the sophomore has eclipsed 100 yards in his career. Gray also added a receiving touchdown to become the first Vols' player with a rushing and receiving touchdown in a game since Alvin Kamara did so against Vanderbilt on Nov. 26, 2016. Senior running back Ty Chandler added 90 rushing yards and a touchdown of his own, while junior safety Trevon Flowers led the way with 10 total tackles on the defensive side of the ball. The Vols were a perfect 4-of-4 on fourth down, representing the first time since 2002 that they converted four or more in a game.

No. 12 Vols' Win Streak Snapped at No. 3 Georgia

Despite leading third-ranked Georgia at halftime, the 12th-ranked Tennessee football team fell short of pulling off the upset, falling by a score of 44-21 at Sanford Stadium. Georgia held Tennessee scoreless and forced three turnovers in the second half to snap the Vols' eight-game win streak. Tennessee quarterback Jarrett Guarantano threw a pair of touchdown passes to Josh Palmer. Sophomore tailback Eric Gray was Tennessee's leading rusher and receiver, finishing with career-highs in receptions (8) and receiving yards (54). Defensively, preseason All-SEC linebacker Henry To'o To'o led the Big Orange with a career-best 11 tackles, including two for loss. Outside linebacker Kivon Bennett scored his first-career touchdown, recovering an errant snap in the end zone on the game's second play from scrimmage to give UT an early 7-0 advantage. It was the second defensive touchdown of the year for Tennessee.
